In a historic and aggressive move, India has suspended the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) with Pakistan following the Pahalgam terror attack on April 22 that killed 26 people, including several tourists. The move, announced on April 23 by the Cabinet Committee on Security chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, comes as a part of a series of measures against Pakistan, which India holds responsible for supporting cross-border terrorism.

"Their evil agenda will never succeed. Our resolve to fight terrorism is unshakable and it will get even stronger," said Prime Minister Modi in his strong condemnation of the Pahalgam attack. The government has now made it clear that the IWT will remain suspended until Pakistan "credibly and irreversibly" ends its support to terrorism.

The Indus Waters Treaty, brokered by the World Jawaharlal Nehru and Pakistan President Ayub Khan, governs the distribution of water from six hydroelectric purposes. rivers — Indus, Ravi, Beas, Sutlej, Jhelum, and

Under the treaty, India had unrestricted rights over three eastern rivers (Ravi, Beas, the maximum, with heightened security in bor-Sutlej), while Pakistan accessed water from the der states like Gujarat, Rajasthan, Punjab, and Bank and signed in 1960 by then Prime Minister western rivers (Indus, Jhelum, Chenab) with provisions for limited Indian usage for domestic and

fectively halted the flow of 39 billion cubic metres of water annually to Pakistan. This decision is expected to cause significant disruption in Pakistan's agriculture, energy sector, and food supply chain, potentially triggering a severe economic and humanitarian crisis.

Hydroelectric power production in Pakistan, especially from key dams like Tarbela and Mangla, which account for nearly 30% of its total electricity, is likely to be affected, with analysts warning of power outages lasting up to 16 hours daily. Adding to the escalation, India also shut down trade at the Attari-Wagah border, which saw bilateral trade worth ₹3,886 crore in 2023–24. Military alert levels along the International Border and the Line of Control (LoC) have been raised to

crisis marks a new low in Indo-Pak relations, as this is the first time the IWT — which had survived three wars and multiple terror attacks has been suspended.

The suspension of the IWT is a bold step, signifying a strategic shift in India's response to terrorism — from diplomatic and military responses to economic and environmental leverage.



Rahul Gandhi: "Opposition fully supports any govt action"

In a rare show of national unity, opposition parties have extended unconditional support to the central government in the wake of the Pahalgam massacre that claimed 26 lives. Following an all-party meeting convened in Delhi, senior opposition leaders condemned the terror attack and assured the Centre of full cooperation for any retaliatory action.

"All political parties have uniformly condemned the attack, and the Opposition has given full support to the government to take any action," said Leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi after the briefing. He also confirmed that he would visit Anantnag district in Jammu and Kashmir tomorrow to meet the injured survivors undergoing treatment. Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge echoed similar sentiments. "We want peace to be restored in Jammu and Kashmir as soon as possible," he said. Trinamool Congress MP Sudip Bandopadhyay also voiced strong support, saying, "We are with the Centre in the fight against terrorism.

The massacre, carried out by a Lashkar-e-Taiba-linked group in the Baisaran meadows—popularly known as "mini Switzerland"—left 26 tourists dead, including one Nepali national. The rest hailed from 14 states across India.



Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Wednesday inaugurated a high-level workshop on "Artificial Intelligence and Emerging Technologies for Government Digital Transformation" at the Andhra Pradesh Secretariat. The workshop brought together top officials and technology experts to explore how innovations like AI, machine learning (ML), and deep learning (DL) can be leveraged to enhance governance and improve service delivery.

In his inaugural address, Chandrababu emphasized the need for Andhra Pradesh to be at the forefront of tech-driven governance. He underscored that Artificial Intelligence and other emerging technologies should be integrated into administration to drive transparency, efficiency, and faster delivery of public services. "Technology is evolving rapidly, and we must keep pace to ensure better governance and outcomes for our people," he said.

Tax Exemption for Swarna Shikhara Donations

Devotees contributing to the Swarna Shikhara development to receive tax benefits under Section 80G

In a significant step aimed at encouraging donations towards the development of the Swarna Shikhara at the Sri Durga Malleswara Swamy Varla Devasthanam on Indrakeeladri, the Government of India has granted income tax exemption under Section 80G(5) of the Income Tax Act. Temple Executive Officer Sri K. Ramachandra Mohan announced that devotees who contribute towards the Swarna Shikhara project will now be eligible for tax deductions. Until now, only donations made towards the Anna Prasadam scheme at the temple were exempt under Section 80G. However, considering the importance of the Swarna Shikhara project for the temple's growth and the overall development of Indrakeeladri, an application was submitted to the Income Tax Department to extend the exemption to this initiative as well.

Sri Ramachandra Mohan said that the department responded positively and issued orders approving the exemption as per the temple's request. He emphasized that the inclusion of Swarna Shikhara donations under Section 80G(5) will be a major encouragement for devotees.

He urged devotees to come forward and contribute generously to the full gilding of the temple, where Sri Kanaka Durga Ammavaru resides, and take advantage of the newly granted tax benefit.

'We Were Misled by...

The recent terrorist attack in the picturesque town of Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, has left families shattered and the entire nation in mourning. Madhusudan, a resident of Kavali in Andhra Pradesh, was among the 28 civilians killed in the incident. His wife, who survived the brutal assault. shared a harrowing account of the tragedy with a TV9 correspondent, revealing how they were misled by local shawl sellers and deceived into a false sense of safety. She said they were part of a group of ten people from three families vacationing in Kashmir. After visiting an area known locally as 'mini Switzerland' and having lunch, the group was preparing to leave when they heard gunshots. While they were running in panic, locals selling shawls falsely reassured them that the sounds were part of local festival celebrations. "They told us, 'It's just an anniversary celebration. Stay here, don't worry'," she recalled, her voice breaking. A hotel owner nearby, sensing danger, warned his children and others to flee. Some managed to escape early, but before Madhusudan and his wife

could do so, the terrorists reached them and opened fire. "My husband told me to lie down and not raise my head. We were holding hands. Then someone approached us and asked twice, 'Hindu? Muslim?' We didn't respond. The next moment, I heard a gunshot," she recounted. "His face was covered in blood. I only realised later that the shot was meant for me too."

In the wake of the brutal terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu & Kashmir, which claimed the lives of 28 tourists, the temple town of Tirumala has been placed under high alert. Central intelligence agencies have issued warnings of a possible terror threat, prompting Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) and law enforcement authorities to take up stringent security measures.

Security has been significantly heightened at Alipiri check post, the main entry point to Tirumala. Devotees travelling via ghat roads are being subjected to thorough checks, with both Andhra Pradesh State Road Transport Corporation (APSRTC) buses and private vehicles undergoing intensive inspections. Luggage belonging to devotees is being closely scanned, and random checks are being conducted mid-way along the ghat roads.



Officials confirmed that surveillance has been increased to detect any suspicious activity. To ensure preparedness in the event of an emergency, a mock drill was conducted involving the police, TTD vigilance, and the elite Octopus force. The drill focused on managing emergency situations and safely evacuating devotees from crowded zones. Additional security personnel have been deployed around the Srivari temple. Surveillance has been intensified in critical areas including the Mada streets, Vaikuntam Queue Complex, and other temple premises. She described how she ran for help but found no one around. Eventually, some locals helped her reach an army camp. She witnessed other acts of horrifying brutality—terrorists showed no mercy even when a couple from Jaipur pleaded with them to spare their two-year-old child. "Even when people begged, they were shot mercilessly. They told us, 'Tell Modi' before leaving," she said.

Dispelling rumors, she clarified that Madhusudan was hit by a single bullet and not 46 as some reports claimed. She expressed her sorrow and disbelief: "We thought Kashmir was safe under Modi's rule. But who will bring my husband back? Who will compensate for this loss?" Madhusudan's son, devastated by the incident, said, "Only my mother returned. My father didn't."

Invitation for May 2 Amaravati foundation-laying ceremony 5 lakh people expected to attend the grand event

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu will visit New Delhi on April 25 to officially invite Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the foundation-laying ceremony for Amaravati's development works, scheduled for May 2. Chandrababu will be accompanied by his wife, Nara Bhuvaneshwari, during the visit. The meeting with PM Modi is scheduled for 4:30 PM. During the meeting, Chandrababu will extend a formal invitation for the Prime Minister to attend the Amaravati event as the chief guest and lay the foundation stone for the construction works.

The coalition government aims to launch

developmental projects worth nearly ₹1 lakh crore as part of the Amaravati revival initiative. State Minister P. Narayana announced that approximately five lakh people are expected to attend the event.

Eight roadways have been identified to connect the venue to the national highway, and eleven large parking areas have been arranged. Three platforms will be erected at the venue-one main stage and others for farmers, women, and families of those who died in the capital protection movement.

A 1.1 km roadshow by Prime Minister Modi from the helipad to the venue is also planned. More details about the event will be finalized after the Delhi visit.

YSR Congress Party MLC Duvvada Srinivas has responded to his suspension from the party, expressing disappointment but assuring that this is only a temporary phase. Sharmila blames BJP for security collapse in Pahalgam terror attack

Eradicate Terrorists Wherever They Are: Pawan Kalyan

Pawan visits family of Kavali victim Madhusudhan, offers support Leaders, officials join funeral; emotional farewell in Kavali State government announces ₹10 lakh ex-gratia



TPN Correspondent | Nellore Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan strongly condemned the recent terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, which claimed the life of Madhusudhan, a resident of Kavali in Nellore district. Speaking after visiting Madhusudhan's family and paying floral tributes to the mortal remains, Pawan Kalyan declared that terrorists must be eradicated mercilessly wherever they are in India.

Pawan Kalyan, accompanied by ministers Anam Ramanarayana Reddy, Nadendla Manohar, Satya Kumar Yadav, Kavali MLA Krishna Reddy, RTC Chairman Sannapureddy Suresh Reddy, Sarvepalli MLA Somireddy Chandramohan Reddy, District Collector Anand, SP Krishna Kant, and other officials, expressed deep condolences to the grieving family.

The Deputy CM assured the family of full government support and shared their grief with great emotion. "This incident is heartbreaking. The pain of the victim's family cannot be expressed in words. When I think about it, it feels like my own stomach is burning," he said, recalling how the terrorists allegedly asked victims about their religion before shooting them. He said that such brutality could not be tolerated and emphasized that India would never forget this atrocity.

Pawan added, "I am not here to just announce ex-gratia. I came to stand with the family and promise that we will support their children's future." Reflecting on his own past experiences in Kashmir during film shoots from 1986-89, he noted that the region had been



peaceful in recent years. "This attack is a painful reminder of old wounds reopening," he added. He announced that a special meeting would be held in Mangalagiri to discuss this tragic incident and reiterated that the central government will take strict action.

Endowments Minister Anam Ramanarayana Reddy said the terrorists killed 28 people by asking their names, a heinous act aimed at spreading terror and division. "Telling the victims to pass on a message to the Prime Minister before killing them is the height of cowardice," he said. He expressed sorrow that two victims were from Andhra Pradesh and said Kavali MLA Krishna Reddy de-

that the state government has announced ₹10 lakh ex-gratia for Madhusudhan's family. "India, a symbol of peace and harmony, will never accept such violence," he stated.

Health Minister Satya Kumar Yadav called April 22 a dark day in India's history, noting that Jammu and Kashmir had been peaceful for the last ten years. "The incident deeply hurt 145 crore Indians. PM Modi returned swiftly from his Saudi trip, and Home Minister Amit Shah immediately reviewed the situation," he noted, affirming that both central and state governments will stand by the victims' families.

The last rites of Somisetti Mad-

husudhan Rao were conducted with full honours and amid an emotional farewell. Ministers Satya Kumar Yadav and Nadendla Manohar participated in the funeral procession and carried the bier. People of Kavali raised slogans like Madhusudan Rao Amar Rahe' and wept as they paid their last respects.

District Collector Anand, SP Krishna Kant, RTO Vamsi Krishna, and police personnel ensured all arrangements were handled with utmost care.

TDP Misleading Public on Liquor Policy Reforms

YSRCP Nellore City in-charge and MLC Parvatha Reddy Chandrasekhar Reddy launched a scathing attack on the TDP government, accusing it of spreading falsehoods against former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy's transparent liquor policy. Speaking at a press conference held at the YSRCP Nellore district office, Reddy alleged that the TDP is misleading the public as part of a diversion tactic to cover up its own irregularities in liquor dealings. He recalled that during the YSRCP regime, a case was filed in September 2024 which led to the CID raiding 20 dispensaries in Oc tober and investigating for eight months. "Despite a long investigation, the TDP government could not find a single piece of evidence. Yet, they arrested Kasireddy Rajasekhar Reddy based on false statements from Vasudeva Reddy and Satya Prasad Reddy," he said. Reddy revealed that the CID had earlier named Chandrababu Naidu as A3 in a liquor scam based on a complaint filed by Vasudeva Reddy. "Now, the same Vasudeva and Satya Prasad are being used again to file fake cases against YSRCP leaders. This is nothing but diversion politics," he added. He emphasized that the liquor sales under the YSRCP government were handled transparently, with both cash and online transactions strictly deposited daily in APSBC accounts by government-appointed staff. "Can the TDP government deny this? Can they prove otherwise?" he questioned. Reddy reminded that YSRCP did not allow a single new distillery or brand during its term and ensured that each liquor bottle sold was scanned and accounted for,

YCP Leaders Protest Discriminatory Welfare Distribution by TDP

Raising serious concerns over the alleged misuse of welfare schemes and corporation loans, YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) leaders submitted a petition to MPDO Trivikrama Rao, demanding action against Telugu Desam Party (TDP) leaders for pressuring officials to allocate benefits exclusively to their supporters.

MPP Mekala Subbalakshmi, Mandal Sarpanch Association President and Neerpakota Sarpanch Arani Vidyanath Reddy, along with several local leaders, accused the TDP leadership of creating political pressure on administrative officials to divert government welfare schemes and corporation loans solely to party-affiliated individuals.

Speaking to the media after the peti-

tion was submitted, the leaders said that in the past, schemes were distributed impartially to all eligible beneficiaries regardless of political affiliation. "Today, the Telugu Desam leaders in the mandal are using their influence to corner benefits for their own cadre. This is undemocratic and unethical," said MPP Subbalakshmi.

The delegation also alleged corruption in the recently sanctioned cattle breeding shed schemes, claiming that benefits were extended to individuals who did not even own cattle and that funds were misused without any actual construction taking place.

Further, YSRCP leaders raised objections over the TDP's directive to vacate the ZPTC room used by ZPTC member Arani Pratimareddy's family. They stated that the room was originally



allocated with the consensus of MPP and MPTC members during her tenure and questioned the legitimacy of the TDP's demand to evict them now.

"It is ironic that TDP leaders are questioning the use of the ZPTC room when, even today, elected women representatives across many levels

attend official meetings accompanied by their husbands. This has been the practice across parties. Why the sudden outrage now?" asked Vidyanath Reddy. Backing the statement, Buchinaidu criticized the TDP for taking up development works, including road construction from Kandriga School to the R&B zone using NREGS funds, bypassing the local governing bodies and misusing public resources. The protest saw participation from a wide group of YSRCP leaders, including Deputy Sarpanch KM Raja, Bala Shekhar, Katuru MPTC Ravi, Bhaskaraiah, Shankaraiah, Bhaskar Reddy, Balaji, Giri Reddy, Ramesh, and Puttaiah. Pahalgam Terror Attack: Enough is Enough—India Must Strike Back with Steel

A sunscreen for Earth? Geoengineering for Climate Fixes: **Innovation or Irreversible Risk?**

As the world races against time to combat climate change, a growing number of private companies are exploring extreme geoengineering solutions. These controversial approaches range from injecting sunlight-blocking particles into the atmosphere to brightening clouds and altering ocean chemistry to absorb more carbon. While the goal is to slow global warming or earn carbon credits, the potential unintended consequences of such



altered rainfall patterns, ocean acidification, or the destruction of biodiversity.

Many scientists are calling for caution. They argue that while the urgency to act on climate change is justified, turning to geoengineering without robust scientific assessments and governance mechanisms could create more problems than it solves. Moreover, such projects could divert attention and funding from provintriguing, they remain largely untested en climate solutions like emission reductions, renewable energy, and reforestation.



Redefining Rights: The UK Supreme Court Ruling and Its Implications for Trans Inclusion

On April 16, the UK Supreme Court delivered a landmark verdict in For Women Scotland Ltd v The Scottish Ministers, interpreting the terms "woman" and "sex" in the Equality Act 2010 as referring strictly to biological sex assigned at birth. This ruling, which overrides previous inclusive interpretations, grants organisations the legal right to exclude transgender women — even those with Gender Recognition Certificates (GRCs) — from single-sex spaces such as shelters, hospital wards, and sports categories.

While legally significant, the ruling has sparked widespread concern and debate. Critics argue it is a politically charged decision that rolls back essential protections for trans individuals, particularly trans women. For many, this judgment feels like a legitimisation of exclusion in a society already grappling with transphobia and systemic gender inequality. It intensifies fears of marginalisation in everyday public spaces, where safety and dignity are already precarious for many in the trans community.

The case also invites comparisons with legal frameworks in other countries, such as India, where anti-discrimination protections take a different shape. Unlike the UK, India does not have a standalone anti-discrimination statute. Instead, constitutional rights are generally enforceable only against the state. However, exceptions exist. For instance, Article 15(2) of the Indian Constitution mandates that no citizen shall be denied access to shops, restaurants, hotels, or public entertainment venues based on religion, race, caste, sex, or place of birth. This clause enables a horizontal application of rights — against private individuals or entities — in specific contexts.

Yet, this horizontal protection can sometimes clash with competing freedoms, such as the right to association or religious conscience. While several anti-discrimination bills have been proposed in India to expand and clarify protections, none have been passed into law. Still, the Supreme Court's ruling in Kaushal Kishor v State of UP (2023) emphasized that the Constitution's silence on certain horizontal rights should not be interpreted as a prohibition. Rather, the state bears a responsibility to safeguard citizens' rights and ensure equal access and protection.

PM Modi Vows Unimaginable Punishment for Terrorists

Addressing a gathering in Madhubani, Bihar, he vowed to track and punish every terrorist and their backers, emphasizing that India's spirit "will never be broken by terrorism."

Modi began his speech with a silent tribute to the victims and expressed the nation's collective grief and anger. "From Kargil to Kanyakumari, there is grief and rage. This was not just an attack on innocent tourists; it was an attack on India's soul," he declared.

Taking direct aim at Pakistan, he warned, "The time has come to raze whatever is left of the terror haven. The will of 140 crores will break the back of the masters of terror."



Switching to English to address the global community, Modi made it clear that India will relentlessly pursue terrorists and their sponsors. "We will track them to the ends of the earth.

Terrorism will not go unpunished. Justice will be done." He also thanked world leaders who have expressed solidarity with India.

The Prime Minister cut short his Saudi Arabia trip to return to India immediately after the attack. Within hours, he convened a Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) meeting, where key dip-

This decisive diplomatic crackdown signals India's zero-tolerance policy towards terrorism and its commitment to ensuring national security. Modi's speech reaffirmed India's stance: acts of terror will face severe consequences, and those responsible will pay a price they cannot imagine.

India Revokes Visas, **Pakistan Retaliates**



In a major escalation following the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people, India on Thursday revoked all visas issued to Pakistani nationals, including medical visas, and suspended all visa services for Pakistanis. The Ministry of External Affairs announced that all Pakistani citizens currently in India must exit the Minister Shehbaz Sharif. Pakistan ancountry before their visas expire, with most given a 72-hour window to leave.

Rahul Gandhi Visits Pahalgam Attack Victims

Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, is scheduled to visit Jammu and Kashmir on April 25 to meet those injured in the recent Pahalgam terror attack that claimed at least 26 lives. The Congress MP will visit the Government Medical College (GMC) in Anantnag, where several victims are currently being treated, to express solidarity and inquire about their condition. The attack, which took place on April 22 in Baisaran valley near Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag district, involved terrorists opening fire on a group of tourists enjoying a popular meadow. The brutal incident left 26 people dead — including a Nepalese citizen — and 17 others severely injured. The newly emerged militant group "Kashmir Resistance" has claimed responsibility for the attack, saying it opposes what it calls the demographic changes in Jammu and Kashmir due to the influx of outsiders.Rahul Gandhi's visit comes amid nationwide outrage and international condemnation. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who was in Saudi Arabia at the time, cut short his trip and returned to New Delhi, promising that the perpetrators and their sponsors would face unimaginable consequences.

Kashmir Leaders Unite After Pahalgam Attack



In the aftermath of the devastating terrorist attack in Pahalgam that claimed 26 lives, political parties in Jammu and Kashmir came together in a rare show of unity, condemning the violence and calling it a grave assault on Kashmir's identity and India's foundational ideals.

The all-party meeting, chaired by Chief Minister Omar Abdul-Kashmir International Conference Centre (SKICC) in Srinagar on April 24. Leaders from across the political spectrum attended and unanimously passed a joint resolution describing the attack as "a direct assault on the values of Kashmiriyat and the idea of India." The resolution went on to label the attack not just an act of terror, but an attempt to disrupt the peace and cultural integrity of the region. "This act of barbarism was aimed at shattering our unity and damaging the spirit of inclusiveness that Kashmir represents," the resolution read. Chief Minister Omar Abdullah called for "national solidarity" and emphasized that the perpetrators would not succeed in dividing the people. "Kashmiriyat is about compassion, hospitality, and harmony. This attack was not just on innocent lives, but on everything we stand for," he said.

Political leaders, including representatives from the National Conference, PDP, Congress, BJP, and other regional parties, stood together in mourning and resolve. They expressed deep anguish over lah, was held at the Sher-i- the loss of lives, especially as the victims were primarily tourists, including families and children, who had come to experience the scenic beauty of the Valley. The joint statement urged swift and decisive action against those responsible for the attack and stressed the need for heightened security and intelligence coordination to prevent future incidents. The Pahalgam attack, which targeted civilians in one of Kashmir's most popular tourist destinations, has shaken the region and drawn national and international condemnation. However, the unified stance of J&K's political leadership marks a significant step in reaffirming the region's commitment to peace and pluralism amid rising tensions.

These actions come on the heels of five strong measures announced Wednesday, including suspending the Indus Waters Treaty, closing the Attari Integrated Check Post, and expelling Pakistani defence personnel from its High Commission in New Delhi. The staff strength of both High Commissions will be reduced to 30 by May 1.

The Ministry also issued an advisory for Indian nationals to avoid travelling to Pakistan, urging those already there to return immediately.

On Wednesday, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri had stated that Pakistanis will no longer be allowed to travel under the SAARC Visa Exemption Scheme, and those already in India on such visas have 48 hours to leave. The Pakistan also warned that any Indian attempt to restrict water flow under the Indus Waters Treaty would be considered an "Act of War", to be met with full retaliatory force. Additionally, Pakistan announced the closure of the Wagah Border Post, suspended all trade with India, and restricted cross-border transit.

Islamabad has also suspended SAARC visa exemptions for Indians (except Sikh pilgrims), and asked Indian defence advisers to leave by April 30, matching New Delhi's moves. Tensions between the two nuclear-armed neighbours have soared following this latest wave of diplomatic and security escalations.

In a high-level meeting chaired by the Prime Minister, the government announced a series of strict diplomatic measures. All visas issued to Pakistani nationals, including medical visas, have been revoked, and new visa services for Pakistanis have been suspended. Indian nationals have been advised to avoid traveling to Pakistan, while those currently there are urged to return.India has also suspended the Indus Waters Treaty and shut down the Integrated Check Post at Attari. Diplomatic ties are being scaled back, with both countries reducing their respective high commission staff to 30 by May 1.

Opposition Backs Govt on Terror Response

In a rare show of unity, the opposition parties extended full support to the Centre's national response to the Pahalgam terror attack during an all-party meeting convened in New Delhi on April 24. The attack in south Kashmir claimed the lives of at least 26 people, mostly tourists, and has triggered nationwide grief and outrage.

The meeting, chaired by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, included top leaders across the political spectrum. The government briefed participants on the security situation in Kashmir, intelligence lapses that led to the attack, and measures being implemented to prevent such incidents in the future.

Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha

Rahul Gandhi affirmed the opposition's backing of the Centre's national response. "The entire opposition is with the government in this hour of crisis. This is a moment for unity, not politics," he said after the meeting. Echoing the sentiment, Rajya Sabha Leader of Opposition Mallikarjun Kharge called for comprehensive steps to restore peace and security in Jammu and Kashmir.

Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju, addressing the media post-meeting, confirmed the united stance. "All parties reiterated that they are with the government and stand firm against terrorism. Intelligence Bureau and Ministry of Home Affairs officials briefed us on what went wrong and what's being done to



plug the gaps," Rijiju stated.

Sources confirmed that the briefings included admissions of security and intelligence failures that allowed the terrorists to strike a group of civilians in a high-tourist zone. The need for enhanced surveillance, stronger coordination among agencies, and reinforcement of local intelligence networks was discussed at length.

The all-party meeting comes amid sweeping diplomatic and administrative actions taken by the government following the Pahalgam attack. These include the revocation of Pakistani visas, suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty, and expulsion of defence staff from the Pakistani High Commission in Delhi.







Global Solidarity Grows as PM Modi, Netanyahu Discuss **Pahalgam Terror Attack**

In the wake of the horrific terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi spoke with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu on Thursday. Israel strongly condemned the attack and expressed deep solidarity with India, according to a statement shared by the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

The MEA confirmed the conversation in a post on social media platform X, stating, "PM @netanyahu of Israel called PM @narendramodi and strongly condemned the terror attack on Indian soil. He expressed solidarity with the people of India, and the families of the victims. PM Modi shared the barbaric nature of the cross-border terrorist attack and reiterated India's firm resolve to bring the perpetrators and their supporters to justice."

The attack, which took place on Tuesday in the scenic Baisaran meadow of Anantnag district, claimed the lives of 26 individuals — 25 Indian nationals and one Nepali citizen — and left several others injured. The incident, among the deadliest in Kashmir since the 2019 Pulwama bombing, has sparked widespread international condemnation.

Israeli Ambassador to India, Reuven Azar, earlier assured India of continued cooperation in combating terrorism, including collaboration in technology, intelligence, and counter-terrorism methods.

The global response has been swift and unified. French Foreign Minister Jean-Noël Barrot called Indian External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar to offer condolences and support. Canadian leaders, including Senator Leo Housakos and Prime Minister Mark Carney, also strongly condemned the attack. Housakos described it as "a barbaric assault on faith and humanity," while Carney labeled it "a senseless and shocking act of violence."

India Suspends Indus Waters Treaty, Shuts Attari Border In Strong Response To Pakistan

In response to the devastating terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam that claimed 26 lives, including that of a foreign national, India's Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) has announced a series of stringent measures against Pakistan. The crackdown follows revelations of cross-border linkages in the attack, which was claimed by The Resistance Front — an offshoot of the banned Lashkar-e-Taiba.

Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri detailed the measures, underscoring the gravity of the situation. Central to the announcement was the immediate suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty of 1960, which had survived multiple wars and decades of hostility between the two nations. Signed under World Bank mediation, the treaty allocated the eastern rivers (Ravi, Beas, Sutlej) to India and the western rivers (Indus, Jhelum, Chenab) to Pakistan. Its suspension is a drastic step, signaling India's deep frustration with Pakistan's continued support for cross-border terrorism.

The implications are significant. Pakistan is already facing severe water stress due to climate change, poor water management, and rapid population growth. This decision could exacerbate an already precarious situation, with Pakistan historically viewing threats to the treaty as akin to an act of war.

Russia Moves to Deepen Ties with Taliban, **Allows Ambassador-Level Representation**

In a significant diplomatic shift, Russia announced on Wednesday that it will allow Afghanistan's Taliban-led administration to appoint an ambassador to Moscow. This development comes shortly after Russia's Supreme Court lifted the official "terrorist organization" designation for the Taliban — a label that had been in place since 2003.

While the decision stops short of formal recognition of the Taliban government, it signals Moscow's intent to deepen relations with the regime that has ruled Afghanistan since the U.S. troop withdrawal in 2021. The Russian Foreign Ministry confirmed that officials recently held talks with the Taliban's foreign and interior ministers, during which the announcement was formally conveyed.

According to the ministry's statement, "Following the decision announced by the Supreme Court of Russia to suspend the ban on the Taliban movement, the Russian side has decided to upgrade the diplomatic mission of Afghanistan in Moscow to the level of ambassador." The Taliban officials reportedly welcomed the move with "deep gratitude."

Although no country, including Russia, has officially recognized the Taliban regime, Moscow has maintained diplomatic contacts and allowed Taliban representatives to participate in several high-level forums and international events held in



Russia over the past few years.

Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov framed the move as a pragmatic policy shift, stating, "The new authorities in Kabul are a reality. We need to take this into account in order to carry out pragmatic, not ideologised policy."

Analysts view Russia's warming stance as motivated by both regional security interests and economic considerations. Moscow sees potential in engaging with Afghanistan's resource-rich territory, especially at a time when Western powers continue to isolate the Taliban government due to its regressive stance on human rights, particularly those of women and minorities.

Despite the diplomatic upgrade, the Taliban administration remains unrecognized by any country or major international organization, with the United Nations still referring to them as the "de facto authorities" in Afghanistan.

After Pahalgam Attack, India Strikes Back: Pakistan PM **Shehbaz Sharif Convenes Security Meet**

In the wake of India's strong retaliatory measures over the recent terror attack in Pahalgam, Pakistani Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has called an urgent meeting of the National Security Committee (NSC) to deliberate on the escalating situation.

The announcement was made by Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar via a post on X (formerly Twitter), where he stated, "Prime Minister Mohammad Shehbaz Sharif @CMShehbaz has convened the meeting of the National Security Committee on Thursday morning 24th April 2025 to respond to the Indian Government's statement of this evening."

The development comes just hours after India's Cabinet Committee on Security (CCS) unveiled a comprehensive five-point strategy targeting Pakistan, following the deadly terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam. The attack, which killed 26 people including a foreign national, was claimed by The Resistance Front, a group believed to be an offshoot of Lashkar-e-Taiba, a banned Pakistani-based terror organization.

India's response includes suspending the Indus Waters Treaty, shutting down the Attari-Wagah Integrated Check Post, revoking travel privileges for Pakistani nationals un-



der the SAARC Visa Exemption Scheme, expelling Pakistani military advisers from its New Delhi High Commission, and reducing diplomatic staff at both countries' embassies.

The gravity of India's actions and the strong language used by its leadership indicate a decisive shift in bilateral relations. The suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty, in particular, marks a rare and highly symbolic escalation, with potentially severe implications for Pakistan, which is already facing a looming water crisis.

Pakistan's NSC meeting is expected to be a high-stakes session, bringing together senior political, military, and intelligence leadership to chart a course of action. The international community will be watching closely, as tensions between the two nuclear-armed neighbors reach a critical point once again.



Adani Data Networks to Transfer 400 MHz **Spectrum to Bharti Airtel in Strategic 5G Deal**

Adani Data Networks Limited (ADNL), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Adani Enterprises Limited (AEL), has announced



a major strategic move in India's telecom space. On Tuesday, the company signed definitive agreements with Bharti Airtel Limited and its subsidiary Bharti Hexacom Limited to transfer the rights to use 400 MHz of spectrum in the 26 GHz band.

The spectrum spans six key telecom circles: Gujarat (100 MHz), Mumbai (100 MHz), Andhra Pradesh (50 MHz), Rajasthan (50 MHz), Karnataka (50 MHz), and Tamil Nadu (50 MHz). The deal is seen as a win-win for both companies — helping Airtel boost its 5G expansion in high-demand areas while allowing ADNL to realign its digital infrastructure focus.

The agreement, however, is still pending regulatory clearance. "The closing of the transaction is subject to customary statutory approvals," ADNL stated in a stock exchange filing, referencing the conditions outlined under India's Spectrum Trading Guidelines.

ADNL had originally acquired this spectrum during the 5G auctions with an eye on deploying private networks and enhancing enterprise connectivity solutions. This transfer signals a strategic pivot for the Adani Group, indicating a refined approach to its digital connectivity portfolio.

Bharti Airtel, on the other hand, is aggressively scaling up its 5G rollout across the country. The telecom giant, which currently serves around 120 million 5G users out of a total subscriber base of 414 million (as of December), views this acquisition as critical to strengthening its presence in key circles where demand for high-speed data services is rapidly increasing.

In its official statement, Airtel confirmed the deal, stating, "Bharti Airtel and its subsidiary Bharti Hexacom have signed definitive agreements with Adani Data Networks Limited (ADNL), a subsidiary of Adani Enterprises, to acquire the rights to use 400 MHz of spectrum in the 26 GHz band."

The move underscores the shifting dynamics in India's 5G landscape, with companies recalibrating their strategies to balance enterprise ambitions and mass-market connectivity.

SEBI Tightens Insider Trading **Norms: Trading Window Restrictions Extended to Immediate Relatives**

n a significant I move to curb insider trading and enhance compliance, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has extended trading window restrictions to include the immediate relatives of designated persons (DPs) in listed companies. The decision was outlined in a circular issued by SEBI on Monday, April 21, 2025.

Previously, SEBI had mandated, through its September 23, 2024 circular, that stock exchanges develop systems to restrict trading by DPs-individuals likely to possess Unpublished Price Sensitive Information (UPSI). This was implemented by freezing the Permanent Account Numbers (PANs) of such individuals to prevent inadvertent violations of SEBI's Prohibition of Insider Trading (PIT) Regulations.

Building on the framework's success, SEBI has now decided to broaden the scope of restrictions to cover the immediate relatives of DPs. "Considering the effective implementation of the framework to DPs of listed companies and the consultations held with the Stock Exchanges and Depositories, the above framework is hereby extended to immediate relatives of DPs for listed companies," SEBI stated in its latest directive.

This step aims to close a key regulatory gap, as insiders could previously bypass restric-



tions by conducting trades through family members. With the new rules, SEBI enhances market transparency and strengthens oversight over individuals with indirect access to sensitive information.

The circular comes shortly after SEBI took stern action against Gensol Engineering and its promoters. The company and its leadership were barred from trading after it was revealed that business loan funds had been misappropriated and false disclosures had been made to credit rating agencies. The promoters were also found to have traded in company stocks through Wellray Solar, a related party, in violation of insider trading norms. Gensol's association with BluSmart, an electric vehicle ride-hailing company, also came under scrutiny.

SEBI's latest move reinforces its commitment to maintaining integrity in India's capital markets by broadening the definition of who may be considered a potential insider and ensuring tighter surveillance of trading activities.

Vodafone Idea Partners with Cisco to Build Future-Ready High-Speed **Network Infrastructure**

Telecom operator Vodafone Idea (Vi) has announced a strategic partnership with global networking giant Cisco to enhance its network infrastructure, aiming to deliver faster, more reliable internet services across India. AI Cheating Tool Raises \$5.3 Million

A controversial AI startup that enables users **A**to cheat during interviews, exams, and even sales calls has just secured \$5.3 million in preseed funding. The startup, Cluely, was founded by 21-year-old Chungin Lee, a student of Columbia University, who was suspended for his original project, Interview Coder.

Lee, who also goes by "Roy" on social media, developed a covert application that ran invisibly during online technical interviews. It gave real-time AI-generated solutions for coding problems from platforms like LeetCode. The tool gained viral attention after helping users crack interviews at tech giants such as Amazon, Meta, and TikTok.

While the success of Interview Coder drew sharp criticism from the tech industry—and led to Lee's suspension and blacklisting by Amazon—the backlash didn't stop him. Instead, he doubled down and rebranded his work into Cluely, which he calls "the ultimate end-state" of his earlier project.

Cluely reportedly works by opening hidden browser windows that assist users without detection. According to its creators, it's not just limited to coding interviews anymore—it now spans exams and corporate communications



like sales calls.

The startup's latest announcement was posted on Twitter:

"They called calculators cheating. They called Google cheating. The world will say the same about AI. We're not stopping."

The post confirmed that Cluely had raised \$5.3 million in funding to build what Lee calls "the future—faster."

In a separate tweet, Lee reflected on the journey:

"Everyone told me to quit. I didn't. This is the most ambitious project I'll ever build."

While the ethics of Cluely remain heavily debated, the funding success signals that disruptive—if controversial—technologies continue to attract big investment, especially in the highstakes world of AI.

Cake Box at Embassy Sparks Outrage

Tn the wake of the devastating Pahalgam Lerror attack that claimed the lives of 26 people—25 Indians and one Nepalese national—tensions have soared across the country. The timing of the footage has triggered a wave of speculation and debate. While some social media users questioned whether it was a personal delivery or an official visit, others slammed the move as highly insensitive, given the public outrage and grief following the attack.



As protests intensified near the embassy gates, many questioned the man's intent and the nature of the package, with demands for authorities to investigate. However, there has been no official statement from either the Pakistan High Commission or Indian authorities regarding the incident.

This video has become a focal point in the larger discussion surrounding the public's response to cross-border terrorism and diplomatic engagement during national tragedies. With emotions running high, even small gestures are being closely scrutinized, making this seemingly simple act of carrying a cake a viral flashpoint in a moment of mourning and political tension.


