After nearly one and a half years Meanwhile, Congress leaders, of struggling with administrative hurdles, Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has finally begun taking firm control over the government's mechanism. Although delayed, this strategic move comes at a critical time, with continuous attacks from the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) creating severe discomfort for the Congress government.

The BRS, through negative campaigning and a vigorous social mediapresence, has consistently targeted government


ED Steps In on Bhoodan Land Scam

TPN | V.Krishnakumar Hyderabad, April 29:

In a major development, Telangana witnessed a jolt to its bureaucratic and police elite as 28 senior IAS and IPS officers came under scrutiny over allegations related to illegal transactions of Bhoodan lands. The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has entered the scene, issuing notices and preparing for an extensive investigation.

The issue surfaced from Maheshwaram Mandal's Nagaram village, involving survey numbers 182, 194, and 195, where individuals like Munawar Khan, Khadeer Unnisa, Sarfana, and Sukhoor allegedly created illegal layouts and sold Bhoodan lands, originally intended for landless farmers. The ED has already conducted raids on properties linked to them.

The Telangana High Court, which took serious note of the irregularities, directed an

inquiry into the involvement of senior bureaucrats and police officials. It has issued notices to both the Centre and the State governments, as well as the ED and CBI, stressing the need for a detailed investigation into the alleged forgery of documents and illegal land transfers using revenue department collusion.

Notices have been issued to a slew of top names including IAS/IPS officers Navin Mittal, Gyanamudra (wife of ex-CS Somesh Kumar), Pavani Rao (wife of retired IPS Prabhakar Rao), Aishwarya Raju (wife of E. Vikas Raju), Vasundhara Sinha, AK Mohanty, Om Anirudh (son of Rachakonda Commissioner), and many more including family members of senior police officials and retired DGPs. The ED is set to summon the concerned officers for questioning soon, signaling a major shakeup in Telangana's administrative circles.




High Court Dismisses Cases Against KTR

The Telangana High Court has provided major relief to BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) by quashing defamation and related cases filed against him. The cases stemmed from allegations that KTR made derogatory comments against Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, causing damage to his reputation.

Specifically, a case was filed in Utnoor, accusing KTR of claiming that ₹1.5 lakh crore allocated for Musi river rejuvenation was a "huge scam," and that ₹25,000 crore was allegedly being diverted to Delhi by Revanth Reddy. Another case related to the unauthorized flying of drones over the Medigadda project site. KTR filed a quash petition in the High Court, arguing that there was no substantive evidence to support the charges against him. After hearing arguments from both sides, the



High Court concluded that there was no credible material or sufficient evidence to proceed with the cases. Consequently, the court ordered the cases to be dismissed.

Following the verdict, BRS supporters expressed jubilation, viewing it as a major victory for KTR. This judgment clears KTR of serious accusations that could have posed legal hurdles for him and his party leadership.

Telangana Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy made sensational comments against former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR). Laying the foundation stone for additional blocks at Nalgonda Collectorate, Komatireddy addressed the media, accusing KCR of telling "10,000 lies" during his decade-long rule. He questioned how KCR, who once called Sonia Gandhi a "goddess" and touched her feet after Telangana was granted, now labels the Congress party as villains.

Komatireddy alleged that KCR looted ₹10,000 crores during his tenure and illegally occupied vast tracts of land through the Dharani portal. He also charged KCR with tapping the phones of ministers and officials, misusing government machinery for political gains. Highlighting Telangana's second phase of the statehood movement, he recalled the sacrifices of students and leaders from Nalgonda, including Srikanthachari's martyrdom.

Referring to KCR's recent remarks during the BRS Rajatotsavam in Warangal, Komatireddy ridiculed him for dreaming about regaining power. "It's laughable to hear KCR still dreaming of returning to power after spending ₹500 crores on the rally," he said. Komatireddy criticized KCR for talking about corruption after misgoverning for a decade and pointed out that he never thought about schemes like subsidized rice for the poor during his rule.

He emphasized that the present Congress government is implementing several welfare programs and fulfilling promises made to the poor, countering KCR's accusations of deceitful promises.

Telangana's Bhoo Bharati law will serve as a role model for the entire country, declared Minister

for Forests, Endowments, and Environment Konda Surekha. She participated in a Bhoo Bharati awareness conference organized at SSAR private function hall in Daultabad, Hatnur Mandal, along with MP Raghunandan Rao, MLC Anji Reddy, TGIC Chairman Nirmala Jagga Reddy, and District Collector Kranti Valluru.

They paid two-minute silent tribute against terrorist attacks and inaugurated the event by lighting the ceremonial lamp. A video on Bhoo Bharati's features and guidelines was also showcased.

Konda Surekha emphasized that the Bhoo Bharati Act, introduced under Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's leadership, aims to eliminate land disputes and make Telangana a land rights pioneer. She praised the government's effort in introducing reforms benefiting farmers and common people.

The Bhoo Bharati replaces Dharani, offering correc-



tions in land rights records, mandatory land surveys before registration/mutation, resolution of pending Sadabainama applications, and an effective two-level appeals system. Provisions for Aadhaar-linked land Bhudhaar cards and strict penalties for fraudulent record changes have been included.

MP Raghunandan Rao highlighted that out of five crore pending court cases nationally, three crore are land disputes, stressing the need for better land management. TGIC Chairman Nirmala Jagga Reddy criticized past flaws in Dharani and appreciated the inclusive drafting of the new law.

District Collector Kranti Valluru urged farmers and citizens to fully understand the new Act, assuring legal services through district-level authorities and promoting awareness at the village level. Cheques for Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak beneficiaries were also distributed at the event.

Operation Kagar Impact: Maoist Leader Abhay Demands **Peace Talks**

The intensified anti-Maoist campaign, Operation Kagar, is showing strong effects as Maoist leader Abhay issued a sensational letter demanding an immediate halt to the operation and a call for unconditional peace talks. On Monday evening, the letter was publicly released, highlighting the Maoists' willingness for di-

alogue without any preconditions. For the past several weeks, Telangana-Chhattisgarh border areas have witnessed a surge in encounters between security forces and Maoist cadres. Hundreds of Maoists have lost their lives during these operations. While recent confrontations occurred deep within Chhattisgarh forests, the operation has now intensified up to the Bhupalpally district borders, with combing operations even expanding into Karrigutta hills.

Operation Kagar was specifically launched to root out Maoist presence in



these areas and has been rapidly accelerating in its mission. Against this backdrop, the Maoist leadership has urged for peace negotiations, bringing the issue into political debate. Several political leaders have reacted to the situation, condemning the ongoing encounters and voicing their support for peace talks with the Maoists.

As tension continues to rise, all eyes are now on whether the government will consider engaging in discussions or further intensify the counter-insurgency measures.

High Court Shocks Group-1 Petitioners: Heavy Fine Imposed

TPN,Correspondent|Hyderabad In a major blow to the Group-1 petitioners, the High Court has imposed a heavy fine, causing a stir. The Court fined each petitioner ₹20,000 for filing false affidavits and ordered legal action against them. The controversy began when 19 candidates who appeared for the Group-1 exams conducted by the Telangana State Public Service Commission (TGPSC) filed petitions alleging irregularities in the mains paper evaluation.

The petitioners argued that there was a significant mismatch between the marks mentioned in the memo and those updated on the official website. They requested a revaluation of their answer sheets.

However, during the hearing on Monday, the High Court Expressing strong displeasure over the attempt to mislead, took a serious view after the Commission's advocate pointtitioners. Upon reviewing the basic documents, the Court concluded that the candidates had submitted false affidavits, misleading the judiciary.

ED Raids in **Hyderabad Conclude**

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) raids that began early Monday mornacross Hyderabad ing have now concluded. The ED conducted extensive searches at 13 locations in connection with alleged irregularities involving Bhudan land transactions. Key among those raided were the residence, offices, and properties linked to prominent businessman Munawar Khan. In a sensational development, ED officials seized around 40 vintage cars owned by Munawar Khan. They also confiscated crucial documents related to Bhudan land transactions found at his residence. Sources suggest that Munawar Khan allegedly encroached upon hundreds of acres of Bhudan lands — lands meant to be distributed to the poor — and

illegally sold them to realtors and some government officials.

The ED teams, working simultaneously at multiple locations, reportedly secured vital evidence regarding fraudulent land dealings. The seized documents and vehicles will undergo detailed examination as part of the ongoing investigation.

Preliminary findings indicate large-scale corruption and violations, with Munawar Khan suspected to be the central figure orchestrating these illegal operations. The ED is focusing on uncovering how Bhudan lands, a part of a social welfare initiative, were misappropriated for personal gain.

Authorities anticipate that more arrests and significant revelations will surface in the coming days as the investigation deepens.

Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy Slams KCR, Highlights Congress Government's Achievements

Peddhi Sudarshan Reddy Questions Security for KCR at Rajasthotsav Event

Former MLA Peddhi Sudarshan Reddy raised concerns over the security arrangements at the Rajasthotsav event in Warangal, where former CM KCR was present. He questioned why there were no police officers available for KCR's protection, even though the event attracted thousands of people. Speaking to the media on Monday, he remarked, "KCR narrowly escaped danger yesterday. From 5 PM onwards, there was not a single police officer available. There were only four policemen despite lakhs of people attending. If something had happened to KCR, who would have been held responsible?" Reddy criticized the current government's handling of the situation, pointing out that while police were present to block vehicles heading to the event, there were no officers available for KCR's security. He called this a serious lapse and demanded accountability from the Chief Minister's government.

Maheshwar Reddy Criticizes KCR and Revanth Reddy's Alleged Alliance

Additionally, by August 15, the government plans to address applications in all 28 districts (excluding Hyderabad).

U.S. Birth Rate Near Record Low, **Raising Long-Term Concerns**

The U.S. birth rate has dropped to near-record lows, with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reporting just 1.6 children born per woman—well below the 2.1 rate needed to maintain population stability. This trend is not new; the decline has been steady since 2007, and recent data only confirms the ongoing demographic shift.

A birth rate of 2.1 children per woman is considered the replacement level, meaning it is the minimum needed to keep a population from shrinking without immigration. The current figure of 1.6 reflects a significant and sustained drop, raising serious questions about the country's future labor force, economic growth, and support for an aging population.

Several factors contribute to this decline. Social and economic pressures, including the high cost of childcare, housing, and education, have led many young adults to delay or reconsider having children.



Shifting societal values, greater career focus, climate concerns, and a desire for personal freedom have also played a role. Additionally, access to contraception and evolving family structures have changed the way people approach parenthood.

The COVID-19 pandemic further impacted fertility trends, causing many to postpone family planning amid uncertainty. Though a brief rebound in birth rates was observed in 2021, the long-term downward trend has since resumed.

The implications of a persistently low birth rate are wide-reaching. A smaller working-age population could strain Social Security and healthcare systems, while slowing economic growth and reducing consumer demand. At the same time, the U.S. may need to increasingly rely on immigration to maintain population levels and meet workforce needs.

Other developed nations, including Japan, South Korea, and many European countries, are experiencing similar challenges, suggesting a global trend in advanced economies. Policymakers are now under pressure to consider measures like paid parental leave, affordable childcare, housing support, and fertility incentives to reverse or at least stabilize the trend. As the birth rate continues to decline, the United States faces a future that could look very different unless effective action is taken. The issue is no longer just a demographic statistic—it is becoming a national priority.

Canada, long viewed as stable and peripheral, is emerging as a frontline defender of liberal democracy, particularly as the United States—once its greatest champion—falters under the influence of populist, anti-democratic forces. The thawing Arctic and Trump's rise have made Canada geopolitically and ideologically central.

Historically, liberalism has been defended not only by democratic states but by a vibrant ecosystem: a free press, universities, NGOs, labor unions, and civil society. Yet, liberalism is now grappling with its own contradictions. Neoliberal policies, unchecked globalization, and



identity politics have fueled inequality and alienation, paving the way for populist backlash. The promise of "equal respect and concern for all" has been undermined.

Moreover, tech oligarchs like Elon Musk, Jeff Bezos, and Mark Zuckerberg have amassed unprecedented influence, using their platforms to distort truth, support Trump, and undermine democracy—while evading sufficient regulation. In this climate, the defense of Ukraine is symbolic of the wider liberal struggle. Trump's willingness to abandon Ukraine's sovereignty reveals a disregard for international law and democratic values. Supporting Ukraine is not just geopolitical—it is moral.

Ultimately, liberals must organize globally: governments, institutions, and citizens alike. The tools of our resistance must include trade alliances, regulatory cooperation, consumer activism, and civil society solidarity. The enemies of liberalism use the bludgeon; liberals must wield the rapier—with clarity, calm, and truth.

Today, as Trump threatens the liberal world order from within, we must rally around those who stand firm. If 2001 was a moment to declare, "We are all Americans," 2025 may well demand: "We are all Canadians."

Gold prices have made history by breaching the Rs 1 lakh per 10 gram mark in international markets last week, before settling slightly lower. In the Mumbai bullion market, 24-carat gold was quoted at Rs 99,000 per 10 grams, while 22-carat gold stood at Rs 92,000. Despite the slight dip, prices remain near record highs and the bullish trend is expected to continue.

The current surge in gold prices is driven by a complex mix of global economic and political uncertainty. Investor nervousness over former US President Donald Trump's controversial tariff policies and his public criticism of the US Federal Reserve, including threats to remove Chairman Jerome Powell, triggered volatility in global markets. Although Trump later walked back his comments, the damage to investor sentiment

had already been done—prompting a shift towards safe-haven assets like gold.

Historically, gold has served as a hedge against inflation and currency depreciation.



The ongoing depreciation of the US dollar—now at its weakest since 2022—has further boosted gold demand, making it more attractive to global investors. Rising inflation fears, a looming US debt crisis, and uncertainty surrounding the US economic outlook have all contributed to the gold rally. Moreover, consistent buying by China, central banks, and institutional investors has kept up the momentum. Geopolitical tensions, particularly the prolonged war in Ukraine, have added to the unease.

In India, the world's second-largest gold market, the impact is significant. In 2024, gold demand rose to 802.8 tonnes from 761 tonnes in 2023, with the total value surging by 31% to Rs 5.15 lakh crore. Gold holds deep cultural value in India, especially during weddings and festivals, but its rising cost may strain household budgets, particularly in a slowing economy.

Additionally, the high prices could further distort the economy by encouraging gold imports—an unproductive asset—and increase smuggling. Despite repeated awareness campaigns, the tendency to hoard gold remains strong. As India enters the peak wedding season, the gold price surge is likely to create both economic and social ripples.







"Forces Close In On Pahalgam Attackers"

Security forces have located the terrorists involved in the Pahalgam attack at least four times over the past five days, sources told The Indian Express. The Army, Central Armed Police Forces, and J&K Police are jointly conducting intense cordon and search operations across the dense forests of South Kashmir to apprehend the four attackers, including two Pakistani nationals, who killed 26 people at Baisaran meadow on April 21.


"Tahawwur Rana's NIA Custody Extended Again"

A Delhi court has granted the National Investigation Agency (NIA) a 12-day extension of custody for Tahawwur Rana, a key conspirator in the 26/11 Mumbai terror attacks. This extension follows the expiry of Rana's earlier 18-day custody period.

Rana, a Pakistani-origin Canadian businessman, was a close associate of David Coleman Headley, another mastermind of the 2008 attacks that claimed 166 lives over nearly 60 hours. Headley had discussed the attack plan in detail with Rana before visiting India. Further, he had emailed Rana about his assets and the involvement of Pakistani nationals Ilyas Kashmiri and Abdur Rehman in the plot, the NIA told the court.

Initially imprisoned in the US, Rana was extradited to India after the US Supreme Court dismissed his appeal against extradition on April 4. He was brought to India via a special flight on April 10.

The NIA argued that further custody was crucial to retrace the events surrounding the attacks and fully uncover the conspiracy. They emphasized the need to confront Rana with new evidence and investigate his connections with other terrorists and accused individuals. "A detailed investigation is required, and his statements



could lead to additional discoveries," the agency informed the court.

The judge permitted Rana to meet with his lawyer, but only in the presence of NIA officials stationed at a distance to maintain confidentiality. Additionally, Rana is allowed to use only a "soft-tip pen" during his interactions.

The 26/11 attacks saw ten Pakistani terrorists entering Mumbai via the Arabian Sea and launching coordinated strikes at key locations including the CST railway station, two luxury hotels, and a Jewish centre. The

carnage left 166 dead and hundreds injured, marking one of India's deadliest terrorist attacks.

The NIA's extended custody of Rana is seen as vital to piecing together the broader international conspiracy behind the attacks. Investigators hope that further interrogation will reveal more about the network that supported the 26/11 assault and help in bringing other conspirators to justice The case continues to hold deep significance for India's counterterrorism efforts, with authorities determined to ensure all those involved face accountability.


Amit Shah Orders Security Boost In Delhi

Following the Pahalgam terror attack, Union Home Minister Amit Shah held an urgent meeting with Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora on Saturday. During the meeting at the Ministry of Home Affairs, Shah instructed the commissioner to ensure that law and order in the national capital remains intact and that no disruption occurs in the aftermath of the attack, officials said.

The home minister emphasized the need to bolster security measures across Delhi, directing enhanced vigilance to prevent any untoward incidents. Sources added that Shah specifically ordered intensified night patrolling and increased foot surveillance throughout the city.

SC Upholds Honour Killing Convictions



The Supreme Court on Monday strongly condemned honour killings, calling them the "most dishonourable act," and upheld the conviction of 11 individuals involved in the brutal murder of a young couple in Tamil Nadu in July 2003. A bench comprising Justices Sudhanshu Dhulia and Prashant Kumar Mishra refused to interfere with the Madras High Court's June 2022 verdict that confirmed the conviction and sentencing of the accused, including two police officers.

The victims, Murugesan and Kannagi,

both in their early twenties, were poisoned and killed in front of numerous villagers. The masterminds behind this "macabre act" were identified as Kannagi's father and brother, angered by her secret marriage to Murugesan, a Dalit, while she belonged to the Vanniyar community. The court stated that the entrenched caste system was at the root of this crime, and ironically, such heinous murders are termed "honour killings."

Describing the crime as wicked and odious, the bench emphasized that such acts must be met with stringent punishment. It also awarded Rs 5 lakh compensation to Murugesan's family, payable by the Tamil Nadu government, in addition to earlier compensation directed by the lower courts.

Highlighting police misconduct, the bench observed that two police officers deliberately failed in their duty by not registering the initial FIR to protect the accused, violating Section 217 of the IPC and the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act. The case was later transferred to the CBI by the Madras High Court in 2004 due to these lapses.

Despite the incident occurring in 2003, the trial concluded only in 2021, reflecting the inefficiency of the prosecution and defense delays. The court also noted that frequent witness hostility, often due to prolonged trials, further complicated the case.

Out of 15 individuals tried, 13 were convicted — 11 for murder. While one convict initially received a death sentence, others were sentenced to life imprisonment. The court ordered all those out on bail to surrender within two weeks to serve their remaining sentences.

Farooq Abdullah **Urges PM on Pakistan Response**

Following the tragic Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives, senior Jammu and Kashmir leader Farooq Abdullah has called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi to determine an appropriate response to Pakistan. Speaking to reporters, Abdullah said, "Ask the Prime Minister what answer should be given to Pakistan," making it clear that the responsibility of handling international matters, particularly concerning Pakistan, lies with the central leadership.

The Pahalgam attack, which took place on April 21 in the Baisaran meadows, involved four heavily armed terrorists, including two Pakistani nationals. Since the incident, security forces comprising the Indian Army, Central Armed Police Forces, and Jammu & Kashmir Police have been conducting intensive search operations across the dense forests of South Kashmir. Although the attackers have been located multiple times and even briefly engaged by the forces, they have managed to evade capture so far.

Farooq Abdullah's comment reflects growing political pressure on the central government to respond strongly to Pakistan's alleged involvement in cross-border terrorism. His statement highlights a common sentiment within sections of the opposition, urging the Prime Minister to take decisive diplomatic or military measures to ensure justice and prevent future attacks.

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Home Affairs, led by Amit Shah, has directed Delhi Police and security agencies across the country to strengthen vigilance, enhance night patrols, and maintain peace and order, particularly in light of possible tensions following the attack.

The broader political atmosphere remains tense, with citizens, political leaders, and security experts debating the next course of action. Abdullah's remarks signal the opposition's expectation that the government must not only ensure domestic security but also assertively address the external threats that continue to destabilize peace in the region.

With operations ongoing in South Kashmir, authorities have expressed confidence that it is only a matter of time before the attackers are apprehended. However, the larger question raised by leaders like Farooq Abdullah—about how India should engage with Pakistan post this attack—continues to dominate national discussions.







Putin thanks North Korea for sending its troops to fight Ukraine in Kursk region

In a striking development that could significantly alter global perceptions of the Ukraine conflict, Russia's President Vladimir Putin has publicly expressed personal gratitude to North Korean leader Kim Jong Un for deploying North Korean troops to support Russian forces. The announcement came via a Kremlin statement released on Monday, which confirmed the presence of North Korean soldiers in the ongoing war.

Putin specifically credited North Korean forces with helping to push Ukrainian troops out of Russia's Kursk region—a strategically important area near the Ukraine border. "Our Korean friends acted based on a sense of solidarity, justice, and genuine comradeship. We highly appreciate this and are sincerely grateful personally to the Chairman of State Affairs Comrade Kim Jong Un, the entire leadership, and people of the DPRK," the statement said, using the official name for North Korea, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea.

This marks the first official acknowledgment by North Korea that its soldiers are actively involved in combat in the Ukraine war. The North Korean government stated that its troops were sent under the direct orders of Kim Jong Un and that they played a role in reclaiming Russian territory previously occupied by Ukrainian forces.

The involvement of North Korean military personnel in a European war raises serious questions about the widening scope of the Ukraine conflict and the deepening ties between Moscow and Pyongyang. Analysts suggest this could lead to further international condemnation and potentially stronger sanctions against both nations, especially given North Korea's long-standing pariah status and history of defying United Nations resolutions.


Putin Announces Ukraine Ceasefire May 8–10 Amid Global Pressure

Global Reactions Mixed as Putin Offers Short-Term Ukraine Ceasefire

Russian President Vladimir Putin has announced a three-day ceasefire in Ukraine from May 8 to May 10, citing "humanitarian reasons." The move coincides with Russia's Victory Day on May 9, commemorating the end of World War II. The Kremlin urged Ukraine to reciprocate the truce, warning that any violations would be met with an "adequate and effective response" by Russian forces.

This ceasefire follows increasing international pressure, particularly from U.S. President Donald Trump, who took to social media to condemn recent Russian strikes on Kyiv. "Not necessary, and very bad timing. Vladimir, STOP! 5000 soldiers a week are dying," Trump posted. His remarks came amid reports of heavy civilian casualties and sustained bombardment by Russian forces.

Moscow's move is seen by analysts as an attempt to regain favor with Trump, who recently expressed "deep disappointment" over Russia's continued attacks. Trump also



claimed that Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky is prepared to negotiate a peace deal by ceding Crimea, although Kyiv has not officially confirmed such a stance.

Adding to the global alarm, North Korea has, for the first time, confirmed that its troops are actively supporting Russia in the Ukraine conflict. Supreme Leader Kim Jong Un stated their forces aim to "annihilate the Ukrainian neo-Nazi occupiers" and help liberate Russia's Kursk region, a claim that further complicates the geopolitical dynamics. Skepticism surrounds the ceasefire announcement, especially from Ukrainian officials, who argue that a true desire for peace would require a far more significant and sustained commitment. Ukraine responded by stating that if Russia "truly wants peace," it should implement an immediate 30-day ceasefire, not just a symbolic threeday pause.

The White House echoed this sentiment. Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt emphasized President Trump's call for a "permanent ceasefire" to halt the bloodshed. "The president remains optimistic that a deal can be made, but both leaders need to negotiate their way out of this," she added.

This is not Russia's first attempt at a unilateral ceasefire. A similar truce in April 2025 during Easter lasted just 30 hours before fighting resumed. Whether this May ceasefire will lead to meaningful dialogue or simply mark another brief pause in a protracted war remains to be seen.

The meeting reflected a shared commitment to strengthening regional stability and deepening bilateral ties. Anand Prakash briefed Muttaqi on specific details of the Pahalgam tragedy, while both sides reiterated the importance of working together to address security threats. The Taliban-led government had already condemned the attack, with its Ministry of Foreign Affairs calling it a serious blow to regional peace efforts and offering condolences to the victims' families.

Abdul Qahar Balkhi, spokesman for Afghanistan's Foreign Ministry, stated: "The Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan categorically condemns the recent attack on tourists in the Pahalgam region of Jammu and Kashmir and expresses condolences to the bereaved families. Such incidents threaten the region's security and stability."

Beyond condemning the attack, the meeting covered broader issues, including trade, transit, and diplomatic relations.


Massive Power Outage Paralyzes Spain and Portugal, Causes Widespread Disruptions

Spain and Portugal were hit by a massive power outage on Monday, crippling public transport systems, snarling traffic, delaying flights, and prompting emergency responses from both governments. The widespread blackout also briefly extended into parts of southern France, raising concerns about the stability of the regional power grid.

Portuguese utility company REN confirmed that the blackout affected the entire Iberian Peninsula and parts of neighboring France. Spanish grid operator Red Eléctrica said it was working closely with regional energy companies and European partners to restore power in a phased manner.

"All plans for the phased restoration of energy supply are being activated,



in coordination with European energy producers and operators," a REN spokesperson stated, adding that investigations into the cause of the outage were underway.

The Spanish and Portuguese governments convened emergency cabinet meetings to manage the crisis. In Madrid, chaos ensued as metro services halted, traffic lights failed, and parts of the city experienced severe congestion. According to local media, some sections of the Madrid underground were evacuated, and people were trapped in metro cars and elevators.

A Reuters eyewitness reported that hundreds of people were evacuated from office buildings in the capital, including the British Embassy located in one of Madrid's four iconic towers. Police were deployed heavily across key areas to manage the disrupted traffic and ensure public safety.

In Portugal, the impact was equally severe. Metro systems in Lisbon and Porto came to a complete standstill, leaving passengers stranded inside stalled trains. Portuguese police confirmed traffic light failures across major cities and halted train services nationwide.

With increasing demand for highspeed internet, Vodafone Idea is aiming to bridge the gap with competitors who launched 5G services earlier. The rollout in Patna and Chandigarh reflects VIL's strategy of targeting high-potential Tier-II cities alongside metro markets.

Industry experts view Vodafone Idea's expanding 5G footprint as critical for the company's long-term viability, especially amid fierce competition from rivals like Reliance Jio and Bharti Airtel. The move also signals VIL's intent to recover ground in India's highly competitive telecom sector by focusing on network quality and user experience.

As the rollout progresses, users across more cities can expect access to high-speed 5G connectivity, transforming everyday digital experiences in both personal and professional domains.

ICRA projects that the overall revenue growth of India's auto component sector—based on a sample of 46 companies with combined annual revenues exceeding ₹3 lakh crore in FY24 will moderate to 6-8% in FY26. The U.S., though significant, accounted for only about 8% of the industry's total revenues in FY24. Nevertheless, exports to the U.S. had grown at a CAGR of 15% between FY20 and FY24.

A reciprocal tariff of 26% on Indian exports to the U.S. has been temporarily paused for 90 days, though a 10% ad valorem duty still applies.
