**¬**elangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy made a strong statement at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi, during a protest organized by BC (Backward Class) organizations demanding enhanced reservations. In a fiery speech, he declared that Telangana will no longer approach Delhi for reservations; instead, Prime Minister Narendra Modi must come to their doorstep to address the issue.

Revanth Reddy accused the

Revanth Reddy further accused the Modi government of repeatedly postponing the 2021 caste census to avoid revealing the true BC population. "For the first time in India, Telangana conducted a caste survey, revealing that backward classes constitute 56.36% of the state's population," he claimed. He challenged the BJP, saying, "If the Centre allows Telangana to increase BC reservations, we will organize a massive rally with 10 lakh people and felicitate Modi."

He issued a direct warning to the Prime Minister: "You must either agree to our demands or step down. If you don't support BC reservations, you will have to leave Delhi and face the people." He also criticized BJP leader Bandi Sanjay, stating, "We don't need your empty promises of sacrificing lives; just increase reservations."

Concluding his speech, Revanth Reddy vowed to continue the fight within Telangana. "We will not come to Delhi again; our battle will be fought on our own soil. We will wage a 'Dharma Yuddham' with 10 lakh people at Parade Grounds," he declared.

Union Minister Bandi Sanjay strongly countered Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's remarks made during the BC Maha Garjana Dharna in Delhi. Revanth had demanded the Central Government's

approval to increase BC reservations to 42% in Telangana. In response, Bandi Sanjay released a statement questioning why the Telangana government was shifting the responsibility to the Centre when it had the power to implement reservations independently.

Sanjay cited Article 243 of the Constitution, which allows states to set up their own dedication commission and implement BC reservations without central intervention. He pointed out that the Congress party itself promised 42% reservations for BCs in its election the Modi government. Now, instead of fulfilling its promise,



Centre, he alleged.

Bandi Sanjay accused the Congress of manipulating BC reservations to benefit Muslims. He stated that the BJP opposes religious-based reservations and criticized the Congress for including over 80% of Muslims in the BC category manifesto without consulting in Telangana. He claimed that while OBCs currently receive 27% reservations from the Centhe Congress was blaming the tre, the Congress-proposed 42%

reservation includes 10% for Muslims, leaving only 5% additional quota for actual BCs.

Sanjay questioned whether this move was justice or injustice to BCs, accusing the Congress of prioritizing Muslim reservations over genuine BC needs. He also criticized BC organizations for remaining silent, alleging that instead of fighting for real BC rights, they were aligning with the Congress and staging political dramas in Delhi.

Finally, he warned that Telangana's BC communities were closely observing the situation and would teach a lesson to those neglecting their real concerns. He urged the Congress government to act with sincerity and implement the promised 42% reservations properly instead of blaming the BJP.


## **Supreme Court Warns Speaker**

The Supreme Court has postponed the hearing on the disqualification case of ten BRS MLAs who defected to the Congress. The case, filed by BRS leaders Padi Kaushik Reddy and KTR, was heard

today by a two-judge bench comprising Justice B.R. Gavai and Justice Augustine George Masih.

During the hearing, Assembly Secretary's counsel Mukul Rohatgi raised objections to the High Court's intervention in the Speaker's decision. However, Justice B.R. Gavai made a sharp remark, questioning whether courts should remain passive on defection cases. He



reminded that in previous cases, even Assembly Speakers had been summoned to court. He also emphasized that courts are not powerless under Article 142 of the Constitution.

Justice Gavai further noted that the Speaker issued notices to the defected MLAs only after receiving a Supreme Court notice, raising concerns over the delay in

#### High Court Halts Government Action in HCU Land Dispute

The Telangana High Court has issued a major directive in the Hyderabad Central University (HCU) land dispute, ordering a halt to all activities, including tree-cutting, for 24 hours in the 400-acre land near Gachibowli. The dispute escalated as the Telangana government attempted to take control of the land, claiming ownership.

The Vata Foundation filed a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) in the High Court, urging the land to be declared a National Park due to its rich biodiversity, including deer and peacocks. The PIL also sought a stay on government auctions of the land, citing environmental concerns.

## Waqf Bill Introduced in Lok Sabha Amidst Controversy

On April 2, 2025, the Indian government introduced the Waqf (Amendment) Bill in the Lok Sabha, proposing significant changes to the management of waqf propertieslands and assets endowed for Muslim religious or charitable purposes. The bill seeks to include non-Muslim members in the Central Waqf Council and state waqf boards, and grants the government authority to determine ownership of disputed waqf properties.

Minister of Minority Affairs, Kiren Rijiju, who presented the bill, stated that the amendments aim to curb corruption and enhance transparency in the administration of waqf assets. He emphasized that the inclusion of non-Muslim members would promote diversity and accountability within waqf institutions.

However, the bill has faced



strong opposition from various quarters. Critics argue that it could undermine Muslim property rights and lead to government overreach in religious affairs. Opposition parties and Muslim organizations contend that the proposed changes are politically motivated and could result in the confiscation of historic mosques and other waqf properties.

The bill's introduction has sparked heated debates in Parliament, with opposition members demanding a thorough review and consultation with stakeholders before proceeding. #### **High Court Halts Government** Action in HCU Land Dispute

(TGIIC) was violating Supreme Court orders by using bulldozers to clear the land. The lawyer emphasized that even if the land belonged to the government, any deforestation should comply with the Supreme Court's ruling, which mandates an expert committee before clearing forest land. The government, however, proceeded arbitrarily, endangering wildlife.

The High Court took serious note of these claims and directed the Telangana government's legal representatives to submit a detailed explanation by the next hearing. Additionally, it issued temporary orders prohibiting any activity on the disputed land until further notice.

## Telangana Extends LRS Fee **Concession Deadline**

In a major relief to Telangana residents, the state government has extended the deadline for availing the Layout Regularization Scheme (LRS) fee concession. The new deadline has been pushed to April 30, giving applicants additional time to regularize their plots at a discounted rate.

The government issued fresh orders confirming the extension, urging people to take advantage of the opportunity. This decision comes as a response to the lower-than-expected number of registrations despite the previous deadline of March 31.

Under this scheme, pending plot registrations from the past four years can now be completed with a 25% discount on the LRS fee.

The Telangana government had introduced this relief to encourage property owners to complete their registrations without financial burden.

Initially, the government expected a significant response, but the turnout fell short of expectations. Considering this, authorities decided to extend the deadline till April 30 to allow more people to benefit from the scheme.

TPCC General Secretary Charan Koushik Yadav accused BRS and BJP of spreading false propaganda on social media regarding HCU lands. Speaking at a press conference at Gandhi Bhavan, he lashed out at the opposition parties, alleging that they were attempting to create confusion in Telangana.

He clarified that during the second phase of the Telangana movement, then-Prime Minister Indira Gandhi allocated land for the Central University. Initially, land was designated near Golconda Fort, but later, more land was allotted in Gachibowli to meet the university's needs. However, the then-state government did not officially transfer the land to HCU.

During Chandrababu Naidu's tenure as Chief Minister, around 534 acres were allocated to Sherilingampally MRO. Later, an attempt was made to allot 400 acres to IMG Sports. However, when YS Rajashekar Reddy became CM, he revoked this allocation. The IMG group later approached the court, but KCR's government did not pursue the case, leaving it unresolved.

Now, CM Revanth Reddy fought the case in court, leading to the Supreme Court's ruling that the land belongs to the state government. The government has since allocated it to TGIAC. However, BRS and BJP are misleading people by claiming it belongs to HCU and are trying to create unrest in the state, Koushik Yadav alleged.

Former minister and BRS leader Jagadeesh Reddy accused CM Revanth Reddy of taking 400 acres of land with BJP's support. Speaking at Telangana Bhavan, he condemned the police lathi charge on HCU students protesting to protect university land. He criticized the Congress government for mistreating students and filing false cases against social media activists, media personnel, and farmers.

He stated that students and youth helped Congress come to power, but now they are forced to protest against the same government. He alleged that Congress thrives on filing cases and using force and slammed ministers for calling protesting students a "paid batch." Reddy sarcastically questioned if Tamil Nadu Congress MP Karti Chidambaram, actor Prakash Raj, and YouTuber Dhruv Rathee were also speaking out due to pay-

Jagadeesh Reddy recalled that in 2012, Chandrababu Naidu allocated HCU land to private entities, and back then, both Congress and BRS opposed it. However, he alleged that Revanth Reddy, who was in TDP at the time, supported it. He claimed that while KCR implemented "Harithaharam" to protect greenery, Congress is engaged in "Haritha Samharam" (destruction of greenery). He challenged BJP's sincerity, asking why leaders like Kishan Reddy and Bandi Sanjay were not intervening if they truly cared about HCU. He questioned why the government secretly entered the land at midnight if it belonged to the state, alleging a hidden deal.

Finally, he said five lakh people supported the "Save HCU" slogan and asked if all of them were a

## Minister Jupalli Krishna Rao Slams Officials for Disobedience

Telangana Excise and Tourism Minister Jupalli Krishna Rao expressed strong displeasure over officials in his departments, accusing them of disregarding his decisions. Speaking at a meeting, he remarked that officials should have either fear or devotion towards their responsibilities, but he observed neither.

Jupalli criticized some officers for not implementing his directives and warned that such behavior would not be tolerated. He stressed the importance of discipline and accountability in governance, stating that without proper adherence to policies, administration would suffer.

Addressing the much-anticipated cabinet expansion, the minister remarked that it is not just about appointing new ministers but also about portfolio reshuffling. He expressed hope that Mahabubnagar district would receive another ministerial position in the expansion, citing the need for further development in the region.

Though Chief Minister Revanth Reddy hails from Mahabubnagar, Jupalli pointed out that his primary focus remains on state-wide governance. Hence, another minister from the district would help accelerate local development.

However, Jupalli refrained from confirming the exact date of the cabinet expansion, clarifying that the decision rests solely with the Congress high command. His remarks come amid growing speculation about imminent political changes in the Telangana government.



#### MP Raghunandan Rao Slams Revanth **Reddy Over HCU Land Issue**

Medak MP Raghunandan Rao made sensational remarks, stating that BJP will strongly oppose Telangana CM Revanth Reddy's land auction plans. Speaking at a BJP protest in front of Telangana Bhavan, Delhi, he accused the Congress government of environmental destruction in the name of development.

He questioned whether Indira Gandhi's rule meant constant land sales and deforestation. He pointed out that the HCU land, home to thousands of trees and animals, was being destroyed for commercial purposes, and Hydra Commissioner Ranganath was turning a blind eye to it.

Raghunandan Rao reminded that in 1973, the Congress government granted 2,400 acres to Hyderabad Central University to suppress the Telangana movement. Now, Revanth Reddy, who claims to bring back Indira's rule, is selling off 400 acres for his own agenda, he alleged. He challenged the CM to reveal who gave him the authority to sell university land.

He also criticized Revanth for opposing land sales during the BRS rule but justifying them after com-

ing to power. BJP strongly condemns this move and will fight against it legally, including filing petitions in the National Green Tribunal (NGT). Furthermore, Raghunandan questioned Rahul Gandhi's silence on the issue, pointing out that he

visited HCU multiple times earlier but is now ignoring student protests and police lathi charges. He dared Revanth and Rahul to visit the university instead of staging protests in Delhi.

He assured that BJP will stand by students and block the land auction at any cost.



#### **MLC Kavitha's Sensational Comments** on 'My Home Vihanga' Lands

She stated that during the BRS rule, no government land was allocated for the construction of 'My Home Vihanga'. Kavitha further alleged that CM Revanth Reddy is struggling to govern the state. She accused him of attempting to sell the 400acre land only because Hyderabad's real estate market has declined due to his policies. She demanded that any land taken from the university should be returned to it.

Highlighting environmental concerns, she warned against turning the already concrete-dense Gachibowli into another corporate hub and urged the government to consider the ecological impact of large-scale construction.



## SLBC Tunnel Rescue Operations to be Completed in 15 Days: Minister Ponguleti

Minister for Irrigation Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy announced that the rescue operations at the SLBC (Srisailam Left Bank Canal) tunnel, being carried out under Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's directives, are progressing at a rapid pace. Telangana IT and Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu appeared before the Nampally court today for a case registered in 2017. The case was filed in Basanth Nagar, Peddapalli district, when he, along with others, demanded fair compensation for families who lost their lands and houses due to the Kaleshwaram Project.

During the protest, the then-BRS government filed cases against Sridhar Babu and 12 others, including Harkara Venugopal, Annayya Goud, and Shashi Bhushan Kache. The charges were registered under IPC Sections 147, 353, and 427 read with 149, despite the protest being peaceful.

As part of the legal proceedings, Sridhar Babu appeared before the Judicial First Class Magistrate today. His advocate argued that the cases were politically motivated and filed despite the protest being non-violent.

In December last year, Sridhar Babu had approached the Telangana High Court with a discharge petition, seeking dismissal of the case. However, the High Court rejected the plea but granted an exemption from appearing in the lower court regularly.

With the case now under trial, Sridhar Babu's legal team is expected to continue their fight for justice, arguing that the charges were unfairly imposed. The next hearing is expected to determine further proceedings in the case.



### YouTuber Harsha Sai **Moves High Court Over Betting App Case**

#### **Phone Tapping Case: Fresh** Notices Issued to Shravan Rao

With the fresh summons, the police are determined to uncover the truth behind the case, and Shravan Rao's next move remains to be seen.

### TGPSC Group-1 Mains Exam Under Scrutiny: **Allegations of Irregularities**

The Telangana Group-1 Mains examination conducted by the Telangana State Public Service Commission (TGPSC) has sparked controversy, with several candidates alleging irregularities in the evaluation process. Accusations of bias and lack of transparency have led to legal action, as a group of 23 candidates filed a petition in the Telangana High Court seeking re-evaluation of their answer

The petitioners argue that while the exam was conducted in three languages, the evaluation was reportedly done by experts proficient in only one language, potentially disadvantaging candidates from Telugu and Urdu mediums. The High Court has taken note of the com-



plaints and issued notices to TGPSC, demanding an explanation regarding the evaluation procedure.

In response, TGPSC has denied the allegations, asserting that the evaluation was conducted with full transparency

and fairness. The commission urged candidates not to be misled by false information and assured that the selection process followed standard guidelines. Meanwhile, some media houses have

reported on the controversy, prompting TGPSC to lodge a complaint with the Cyber Crime Police against certain platforms for allegedly spreading misleading news without verifying facts.

As the case unfolds, the fate of the Group-1 Mains results remains uncertain. The High Court's verdict will be crucial in determining whether re-evaluation will be permitted or if the commission's stance will be upheld. The controversy has left thousands of aspirants anxiously awaiting further developments.

#### Commemorating Dr. Keshav Baliram Hegdewar on His Birth Anniversary

Today, we pay tribute to Dr. Keshav Baliram Hegdewar, an extraordinary visionary and statesman often regarded as an unsung Bharat Ratna. #### Selfless Service and Social Transformation



## Delimitation Row: It's Not Just A North vs South Story

Delimitation, the process of reallocating seats in Parliament and state assemblies based on population, has remained dormant for the last 50 years, with its last freeze occurring in 2000 due to a constitutional amendment. The exercise, scheduled for 2026, is now in limbo, awaiting the completion of the Census, which was delayed in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic

On March 22, 2025, a significant meeting in Chennai brought together Chief Ministers from Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Kerala, and Punjab, along with leaders from regional parties. These leaders—MK Stalin (Tamil Nadu), Revanth Reddy (Telangana), Pinarayi Vijayan (Kerala), Bhagwant Mann (Punjab), and others—agreed to propose that the upcoming delimitation exercise either be delayed again or conducted in a manner that ensures fairness. Notably absent from the meeting was Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu, whose earlier stance against delimitation in 2000 raised questions about his current position.

The key takeaway from the Chennai meeting is that the delimitation issue cannot be reduced to a simple North-South divide. A straightforward approach based on population numbers would disadvantage states like those in the South, which have successfully stabilized their populations through family planning initiatives. This could dilute the political strength of these states in Parliament. Leaders from states like Punjab, too, are concerned about the potential erosion of their political representation, fearing their states might align with smaller, less populated neighbors like Haryana.

The BJP has labeled the push for delimitation a political move, suggesting it is a distraction from the government's governance challenges. Despite repeated assurances from Union Home Minister Amit Shah, the concerns voiced at the meeting remain unresolved. The leaders from the meeting are planning to convene again in Hyderabad to continue the discussions.

In the next year, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry, Kerala, Assam, and West Bengal will hold assembly elections, which adds a layer of political significance to Stalin's involvement in the delimitation discussions. The move is seen as a way for Stalin to strengthen his national political profile, especially as he prepares for the future leadership transition of the DMK to his son, Udhayanidhi.

As for the delimitation process itself, there are two primary options: it could proceed based on the 2011 Census or await the results of a new Census, with no clear timeline in sight. Some leaders suggest freezing the exercise for another 25 years, allowing other states time to stabilize their populations. Alternatively, delimitation could occur for state assemblies without affecting the balance in the national Parliament.

Several proposals have emerged from the Chennai meeting to create a more equitable formula, including considering states' fiscal contributions and development levels or increasing the Southern states' representation in the Lok Sabha. Another option includes strengthening the Rajya Sabha to balance the Lower House's composition.

Ultimately, the BJP-led government must work collaboratively with all stakeholders to find a solution that respects India's federal structure. Unilateral actions will only deepen distrust and disrupt the delicate balance of power between the center and states.



## **Indian Army Urges Pakistan to Honor Ceasefire**

The Indian Army has called on the Pakistan Army to adhere to the 2021 ceasefire agreement following a recent skirmish along the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch, Jammu and Kashmir. On Wednesday, a spokesperson from the Army's Jammu-based unit reiterated the importance of maintaining peace and respecting the Director Generals of Military Operations (DGMO) understanding established between the two nations in 2021.

The statement comes after reports of ceasefire violations in the Poonch sector, where Pakistani forces allegedly engaged in unprovoked firing. In response, the Indian Army emphasized its commitment to peace along the LoC while also reaffirming its readiness to protect national security if provoked.

The 2021 DGMO agreement was a significant diplomatic break- in cross-border firing incidents, underscores the need for con-

#### **India, Chile to Begin Talks on Economic Pact**

India and Chile have agreed to commence negotiations for a Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA), marking a significant step toward strengthening bilateral trade and economic cooperation. The announcement came following a high-level meeting between Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chilean President Gabriel Boric Font, who is currently on an official visit to India.

Describing Chile as India's key partner in Latin America, Modi highlighted the growing ties between the two nations and emphasized Chile's role as the "gateway to Antarctica". He stated that discussions will focus on critical minerals, supply chain resilience, and economic diversification, ensuring mutual benefits for both coun-

Modi further outlined key areas of collaboration, particularly in agriculture and food security, where India and Chile will leverage each other's expertise to enhance production and distribution capabilities. Modi emphasized the need for collaborative efforts to combat organized crime, drug trafficking, and terrorism, signaling deeper engagement between Indian and Chilean law enforcement agencies.

The India-Chile CEPA is expected to significantly boost bilateral trade and investment, offering new market opportunities and strengthening economic ties between the two nations. Both leaders expressed optimism about the agreement, viewing it as a milestone in India-Chile relations that will foster long-term growth and stability. As negotiations begin, the partnership between India and Chile is poised to expand across multiple sectors, enhancing diplomatic and economic cooperation on a global scale.

## Savitri **Jindal Becomes** India's Richest Woman

She is now India's third wealthiest individual, trailing only Mukesh Ambani and Gautam Adani, and remains the only woman in India's top 10 billionaires.

Jindal chairs the Jindal Group, a vast conglomerate with interests in steel, power, cement, and infrastructure. The company was founded by her late husband, Om Prakash Jindal, who passed away in a 2005 helicopter crash. Following his death, the business was divided among their four sons, each overseeing different sectors.

Her son Sajjan Jindal, based in Mumbai, leads JSW Steel, JSW Cement, and JSW Paints, and took JSW Infrastructure public in 2023. In 2024, he expanded into the electric vehicle sector, acquiring a 35% stake in MG Motor India, a subsidiary of China's SAIC Motor.

Savitri Jindal's wealth surge highlights the continued expansion of the Jindal Group, which has played a pivotal role in India's industrial growth. Despite inheriting the business under tragic circumstances, she has successfully steered the company's growth and diversification, cementing her status as one of India's most influential business leaders.

#### "Break Up **Bangladesh**": **Tripura Ex-Royal** On "Extension Of **China**" Remark

Bangladesh's interim government adviser, Muhammad Yunus, sparked controversy during a recent four-day visit to Beijing by subtly urging China to "extend" its influence in the region, leveraging the landlocked status of India's northeastern "seven sister states." In a video that surfaced on social media upon his return, Yunus suggested that Bangladesh, as the "guardian of the ocean" for India's northeast, could serve as a strategic base for China. He framed this as an economic opportunity, encouraging Beijing to build infrastructure, market goods, and export through Bangladesh, indirectly pressuring India's isolated states.

"The seven states of India... are completely landlocked. They have no way to reach the ocean. We are the only guardian of the region," Yunus stated, adding that this "opens up a huge possibility for China." Defence analysts criticized the remarks as provocative, while Sanjeev Sanyal, a member of PM Modi's economic advisory council, questioned their intent on X, asking, "What exactly is the significance of 7 Indian states being landlocked?"

During his Beijing visit, Yunus held talks with Xi Jinping, securing agreements to deepen China-Bangladesh ties. These include Chinese investment in modernizing Mongla Port with \$400 million, expanding the China Economic and Industrial Zone in Chattogram with \$350 million, and \$150 million for technical assistance. Yunus also sought a 50-year partnership on river water management, praising China as a "master" in the field. Bangladesh requested aid for managing the Teesta River, shared with India, shifting away from previous direct cooperation with New Delhi, and signed a hydrological data-sharing deal for the Yarlung Zangbo-Jamuna River.

The remarks and agreements signal a strategic pivot toward China, raising eyebrows in India. While Yunus thanked Beijing for enhancing maritime and economic collaboration, his comments about India's northeast have drawn scrutiny. As of April 1, 2025, this development underscores Bangladesh's balancing act between its powerful neighbors, with Yunus seemingly testing New Delhi's patience while courting Chinese investment to bolster Dhaka's regional clout.

U.S. President Donald Trump's highly anticipated reciprocal tariffs are set to take effect on April 2, 2025. These tariffs, which will apply to all countries, are expected to significantly impact major trade partners such as India, China, and the European Union.

Trump, a known advocate for protectionist policies, is no stranger to using tariffs as a tool in international trade negotiations. During his first term, he initiated a trade war, primarily targeting China. He imposed tariffs on a wide range of Chinese goods, aiming to reduce

the U.S. trade deficit with China and push Beijing into negotiating more favorable trade terms. In response, China imposed its own retaliatory tariffs on U.S. products, ranging from agricultural goods to automobiles, escalating tensions between the two largest economies in the world.

#### **Consequences to be** 'catastrophic': Russia after Trump's Iran bombing threat

Russia has issued a stern warning following U.S. President Donald Trump's recent threat to bomb Iran's nuclear facilities unless the country agrees to a deal over its nuclear program. Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Sergei Ryabkov condemned the threat, emphasizing the "catastrophic" consequences of any military action against Iran's nuclear infrastructure.

### 'Living In Hell": Monks Clear Rubble From Quake-Hit Myanmar Monastery

Bare-handed monks are slowly clearing the rubble of a historic Buddhist monastery in Mandalay, Myanmar, a heartbreaking reminder of the powerful earthquake that struck the city five days ago. The Thahtay Kyaung Monastery, which housed centuries-old buildings, now lies in ruins.

"Some of these buildings have been around longer than I have," said Wayama, a grey-haired monk, reflecting on the destruction. "It makes me sad to see them destroyed."

Wayama's young colleagues, dressed in simple crimson cloths, worked tirelessly to remove debris. In pairs, they gathered bricks and broken materials, using large pieces of fabric to carry the rubble

ing. Despite the destruction at the monastery, Wayama's concern extended to the city as a whole. "Many buildings that have stood for over 100 years were destroyed here," he said. "It's not just the monastery; I want everyone to be okay."

The deadly earthquake, which has already claimed nearly 3,000 lives, left a devastating impact on the Southeast Asian country, home to over 50 million people. With infrastructure already weakened by years of civil conflict, relief efforts are struggling to cope with the scale of the disaster, and the death toll is expected to rise.

At the time of the quake, Nyo Nyo San, a resident of Mandalay, was inside the monastery. Initially, she thought the tremors were

aside and clear paths for walk- nothing more than minor quakes she had experienced before. However, the shaking intensified, and bricks began falling. "I felt like I was living in hell," she recalled, running outside to escape.

> Mandalay, with over 1.7 million residents, is one of the worst-hit areas. Many people are still sleeping in makeshift tents, unsure of when they will return to their homes. Infrastructure already damaged by years of civil unrest has now suffered further destruc-

> Nyo Nyo San plans to return to her village, but with roads and bridges, including the Sagaing bridge, damaged, she faces uncertainty. "I hope to go home the day after tomorrow," she said, as the region continues to grapple with the aftermath of the disaster.

BoFA analysts expressed concerns over Nestle India's high valuations relative to its growth outlook and the performance of its peer group. The stock's current price-earnings (PE) ratio stands at 63.07, which the analysts believe is expensive considering the broader market dynamics. The downgrade raised questions about the company's future earnings potential, which led to the significant fall in its share price.

Nestle India, known for its popular brands such as Maggi, Nescafé, and KitKat, has long been considered a stable performer in the FMCG sector. However, the recent downgrade highlights growing concerns about its premium valuation amidst pressures on growth. With the stock now nearing its 52-week low, investors are re-evaluating the company's ability to sustain its market performance.

As the market continues to react to the BoFA downgrade, Nestle India's ability to navigate changing consumer preferences and improve its growth trajectory will be crucial to restoring investor confidence. The company's next quarterly results and any forward-looking statements could further influence its stock performance in the near term.



### Paytm's Stock Rises 3% After Partnership with GHMC for Property Tax Collection

Shares of One 97 Communications, the parent company of Paytm, rose nearly 3% on Wednesday following the announcement of a strategic partnership with the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC). The collaboration will see the deployment of 400 card machines for property tax collection, boosting the company's market visibility and operational reach.

Paytm's stock surged by as much as 2.7% during the day, reaching ₹822.7 per share. The gains were slightly pared by the afternoon, with the stock trading 2.36% higher at ₹820 per share by 1:03 PM, outperforming the Nifty 50 index, which rose by just 0.41% during the same period. Over the past month, Paytm's shares have increased by over 25% from their lows of ₹651 in early March, signal-



ing investor optimism around the company's new initiatives.

This positive movement marks the second consecutive day of gains for Paytm's stock, following a period of sluggish performance. Despite the recent gains, the stock has fallen by 19.5% year-to-date, compared to a relatively modest 1.61% decline in the benchmark Nifty 50. ## **Bharat Electronics Shares Drop 6%** Following Missed Revenue Guidance

The sharp fall in BEL's share price came after the company announced that it had missed its revenue guidance for the financial year 2025 (FY25). BEL reported a provisional and unaudited turnover of approximately ₹23,000 crore for FY25, marking a 16% growth compared to ₹19,820 crore in the previous financial year. While the company achieved growth, it still fell short of its projected targets, which led to investor concerns.

Shares of Bharat Electronics Lim- Despite the missed revenue target, BEL's export sales showed positive growth. The company reported export sales of around \$106 million for FY25, a 14% increase from \$92.98 million in FY24. However, this did little to quell investor disappointment, as the overall financial performance fell short of expectations.

> The revenue shortfall has raised questions about BEL's ability to meet its growth projections, and investors reacted negatively to the news, causing the stock to experience pressure throughout the trading session. BEL's performance is closely watched due to its role in India's defense sector, and any signs of weakness can have a ripple effect on investor sentiment.

# Rishabh Pant's ₹27 **Crore IPL Struggles**

Lucknow Super Giants (LSG) captain Rishabh Pant is under fire after another disappointing batting performance in IPL 2025, putting owner Sanjiv Goenka's ₹27 crore investment into question. In LSG's recent match against Punjab Kings at Ekana Cricket Stadium, Pant managed only 2 runs off 5 balls. Despite a decent total of 171/7, LSG suffered a crushing 8-wicket defeat as Punjab chased the target with 22 balls to spare. This loss marked LSG's second defeat in three matches, amplifying concerns over Pant's form and leadership.

Pant's poor performances—0 (6) vs. Delhi Capitals, 15 (15) vs. Sunrisers Hyderabad, and 2 (5) vs. Punjab Kings—have led to criticism from fans and analysts. Many now question whether Nicholas Pooran would have been a better

choice as captain. Considering his hefty price tag, Pant's lack of significant contributions has become a major talking point.

Goenka, who previously faced backlash for his fallout with ex-LSG captain KL Rahul, looked visibly disappointed as his team faltered again. Last season, Goenka's public outburst after a heavy defeat to SRH led to Rahul's departure. Rahul later joined Delhi Capitals for ₹14 crore and later admitted that the incident affected the entire LSG squad.

With the tournament still in its early stages, Pant has time to turn things around. However, if his struggles continue, questions about LSG's decision-making and Goenka's high-stakes gamble will only intensify.




