


The Public Works Department (PWD) rejected her plea, leading the former Delhi chief minister and AAP leader to As of now, Atishi remains in her propose an alternative location. Atishi has now requested that she be allocated a bungalow on Ansari Road in Daryaganj instead.

Atishi currently resides in the AB-17 Mathura Road bungalow, which was initially allocated to her when she served as the Delhi chief minister. According to PWD

officials, she continues to occupy the property, even though it was meant for her tenure as chief minister.

The denial of her request for the Mathura Road bungalow has sparked a new round of discussions on the allocation of government residences. Atishi's proposal for a new bungalow on Ansari Road in Daryaganj indicates her continued need for official accommodation as LoP.

The situation highlights ongoing debates over the use and allotment of official residences to political leaders, particularly following their tenure in office. The PWD's refusal to reassign Atishi, the Leader of Opposition the Mathura Road bungalow underscores the complex process involved in the allocation of government properties to political figures, ensuring that such decisions align with policy and regulations.

After Waqf Bill 'attack' on Muslims, RSS now targeting Christians: Rahul claims

Rahul Gandhi has accused the RSS

of shifting its focus to Christians following the controversial Waqf (Amendment) Bill. This comes after a now-withdrawn article published on the RSS mouthpiece, Organiser, that claimed the Catholic Church is the largest non-governmental landowner in India, surpassing the Waqf Board. Gandhi posted on social media that he had previously warned the Waqf Bill would initially target Muslims but could set a dangerous precedent for future attacks on other communities.

The article, titled "Who has more land in India? The Catholic Church vs Waqf Board Debate," was published on April 3 but is no longer available online. The piece alleged that the Catholic Church

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Friday accused the Bharativa Janata Party (BJP)-led government of allowing private schools in Delhi to "arbitrarily hike" tuition fees by 20% to 82%. AAP pinned the blame on the BJP administration, alleging that the education system in the capi-

BJP MP Kangana Ranaut on Saturday accused the Congress of showing leniency towards Waqf boards, leading to the violation of norms and large-scale land-grabbing. Addressing a Jan Sampark Abhiyan in the Majhvad area of her Mandi constituency, the actor-politician praised



the passage of the Waqf (Amendment) Bill in Parliament, claiming it would address the issue of significant encroachments linked to Waqf boards.

Ranaut alleged that the formation of Waqf boards had been part of a conspiracy even before India's independence, and that this long-standing issue had

been causing harm to the country ever since. According to her, the new legislation would help combat the widespread encroachment of public lands under the guise of Waqf boards, which she described as involving massive land-grabbing activities.

The Waqf (Amendment) Bill, which was passed in Parliament after extensive debate, aims to bring Waqf boards under the purview of the law and curb misuse of the system. The Bill received approval in both the Rajya Sabha and Lok Sabha, with significant majority support. In her address, Ranaut praised Prime Minister Narendra Modi's efforts to clean up

Sitharaman Rejects 'One Nation, One Election' for 2024, Suggests Post-2034 Rollout

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, during a talk at SRM University in Kattankulathur, Tamil Nadu, on April 5, dismissed the possibility of implementing the 'One Nation, One Election' concept in the upcoming elections. She clarified that simultaneous elections would not be introduced before 2034.

Sitharaman pointed out that approximately ₹1 lakh crore was spent on the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, a cost that could be reduced through simultaneous elections. She explained that conducting elections for both the Lok Sabha and state assemblies at the same time could contribute around 1.5% growth to the nation's GDP, which translates to ₹4.50 lakh crore. This, she argued, highlights the tangible economic benefits of the 'One Nation, One Election' initiative.

The Finance Minister also accused certain political parties of spreading misinforma-

India Delivers 442 Metric Tonnes of Food Aid to Earthquake-Hit Myanmar

On Saturday, India delivered a substantial consignment of food aid to Myanmar, following the devastating 7.7 magnitude earthquake that struck the country on March 28. The earthquake, which had its epicenter near the capital, caused over 3,100 fatalities, leaving thousands more in need of immediate assistance. As part of its ongoing humanitarian efforts, India launched Operation Brahma to provide crucial support, including search and rescue operations, medical assistance, and disaster relief.

The aid, which weighed 442 metric tonnes, was delivered via the Indian Navy's Landing Ship Tank (LST) INS Gharial and arrived at Thilawa Port, located about 400 kilometers south of Yangon in Myanmar. The consignment included essential supplies such as rice, cooking oil, noodles, and biscuits, aimed at meeting the immediate food needs of the affected population.

India has been at the forefront of providing humanitarian assistance

to Myanmar in the wake of this catastrophic disaster. Within 24 hours of the earthquake, India had already dispatched the first batch of Humanitarian Aid and Disaster Relief (HADR) materials, including emergency relief items and medical supplies. The delivery on Saturday marks another significant step in Operation Brahma, a mission focused on helping the country recover from the massive devastation.

The handover of the food aid was conducted by Indian Ambassador to Myanmar, Abhay Thakur, who handed the supplies over to U Soe Thein, the Chief Minister of Yangon, and his team. In a statement posted on social media platform X, the Indian Embassy in Yangon highlighted the efforts to meet the urgent needs of those affected by the earthquake.

"Meeting the needs of affected people. This swift response underscores India's commitment to assisting its neighbors in times of crisis, reinforcing its role as a key humanitarian partner in the region.

India's 76-Year Journey in Developing Indigenous Trainer Aircraft

TPN Correspondent | Delhi The recent launch of the Hansa-3 basic trainer aircraft on April 4 marks a significant achievement in India's aviation history. Developed by the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) in collaboration with private industry, the Hansa-3 is the first such aircraft designed by a civilian agency and manufactured by the private sector. This milestone highlights the long and often challenging journey of developing indigenous trainer aircraft in India, which has spanned over 76 years.

India's journey in aircraft production began soon after Independence when Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL), a public sector undertaking, received government approval in 1948 to design a basic trainer aircraft. The HT-2, India's first indigenous trainer, made its maiden flight in 1951 and was inducted into service in 1953. It replaced earlier Brit-

HAL's subsequent projects included the HJT-16 Kiran, an intermediate jet-powered trainer designed to fill the IAF's requirements for more advanced training. The Kiran entered pro-

(IAF), Navy, and civilian

duction in the late 1960s and was used for several decades, even in aerobatic teams like the Surya Kiran and Sagar Pawan.

The HPT-32 Deepak, intro-

the HT-2, faced significant

challenges, including engine issues and multiple accidents. It was ultimately grounded in 2009 following a fatal crash, and the Swiss Pilatus PC-7 took its place.

In the 1990s, HAL developed the HJT-36 Sitara to replace the Kiran, but despite its initial promise, it faced critical design flaws that led to delays. After extensive modifications, it was renamed 'Yashas' and is undergoing further evaluation by the

More recently, the HTT-40 basic trainer was introduced to replace the HPT-32, and the IAF has placed an order for 70 units. Looking ahead, HAL is also working on the HLFT-42, a next-generation supersonic trainer for advanced combat training, aimed at replacing the BAE Hawk.

India's journey in developing trainer aircraft is a testament to its evolving aviation capabilities, with each project contributing to the nation's growing expertise in aircraft manufacturing.

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh Flags Off Indian Ocean Ship SAGAR from Karwar Naval Base

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh is set to flag off the Indian Ocean Ship SAGAR (Security and Growth for All in the Region) from the strategically important Karwar Naval Base in Karnataka on Saturday, April 5, 2025. This mission is part of India's ongoing commitment to regional maritime security and fostering international cooperation.

The initiative, which will feature 44 personnel from nine different navies aboard, aims to strengthen ties with maritime neighbours and promote a secure and inclusive maritime environment in the Indian Ocean region. In addition to flagging off the ship, Singh will also inaugurate newly developed infrastructure at the Karwar naval base, which is undergoing expansion under the ambitious Project 'Seabird'.

Justice Varma's Cash Discovery: Delhi Police Commissioner and DCP **Questioned by Probe Panel**

A three-member committee of judges probing the discovery of cash at the residence of Justice Yashwant Varma recorded statements from top Delhi Police officials on Friday. The committee questioned Delhi Police Commissioner Sanjay Arora for approximately two hours and Deputy Commissioner of Police (DCP) Devesh Kumar Mahala for around four hours at the Haryana state guest house in Chanakyapuri, sources said.

Arora appeared before the panel, which was formed

by Chief Justice of India (CJI) Sanjiv Khanna, at around 5:30 pm and left after around two hours, around 7:30 pm. Prior to Arora's statement, the panel recorded the statement of DCP Mahala, who had arrived at around 3:00 pm and departed around 7:30 pm. Additionally, the committee also gathered information from the Additional DCP (New Delhi district) and ACP (Chanakyapuri) during the course of

Delhi Signs MoU with Centre to Implement Ayushman Bharat Health Scheme

In a significant step towards improving healthcare accessibility in the national capital, the BJP-led Delhi government signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Centre on Saturday to roll out the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) in the city. With this agreement, Delhi becomes the 35th state or Union Territory to implement the health insurance scheme, leaving West Bengal as the only state yet to adopt it.

The Ayushman Bharat scheme aims to provide free and cashless treatment for a wide range of medical services, covering 1,961 procedures across 27 specialities. The scheme covers various healthcare expenses, including medicines, diagnostic services, hospitalisation, ICU care, surgeries, and more. Under the scheme, eligible families in Delhi will receive an annual health coverage of up to Rs 10 lakh, with Rs 5 lakh funded by the Centre and the remaining amount provided as a top-up by the Delhi government.

The MoU was signed between the Delhi government and the National Health Authority, with Union Health Minis-

AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan moves SC challenging Waqf Bill

Claims it 'curtails religious autonomy'

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLA Amanatullah Khan from Delhi has approached the Supreme Court, challenging the Waqf (Amendment) Bill. In his petition, Khan describes the Bill as "arbitrary" and "unconstitutional," asserting that it infringes on the religious and cultural autonomy of Mus-

Khan moved a writ petition under Article 32 of the Constitution, which provides for the enforcement of fundamental rights. He contends that the Bill allows for undue executive interference in the management of Waqf properties, which he argues could undermine the rights and freedoms of Muslim communities. According to Khan, the proposed amendments in the Bill do not respect the autonomy of religious minorities and could lead to unjust administrative control over religious institutions and their assets.

The Waqf (Amendment) Bill,



which aims to make changes in the governance of Waqf properties, has faced criticism from various quarters, with detractors arguing that it would give the government too much control over religious affairs. The Bill proposes the creation of a Waqf Tribunal to adjudicate disputes, but Khan claims that such provisions could lead to unnecessary interference in the functioning of Waqf boards, which manage the religious endowments of the Muslim community.

Khan's petition emphasizes that the Bill could harm the democratic rights of minorities, particularly Muslims, by granting the government excessive powers over religious institutions. He has urged the Supreme Court to intervene and strike down the amendments as unconstitutional.

The case has drawn attention to the balance between state control and the autonomy of religious institutions, especially in light of India's commitment to protect the rights of minority communities. As the legal proceedings unfold, the Supreme Court's decision could have significant implications for the future of religious governance in India.

The article, which has since been unpublished, claimed that Catholic institutions in India own 7 crore hectares of land, making them the largest non-governmental landowners in the country.

In response, Gandhi warned that the passage of the Waqf Bill, which targets Muslim Waqf properties, sets a dangerous precedent for other communities. He tweeted, "I had said that the Waqf bill attacks Muslims now but sets a precedent to target other communities in the future. It didn't take long for the RSS to turn its attention to Christians. The Constitution is the only shield that protects our people from such attacks - and it is our collective duty to defend it." Gandhi's remarks were made while sharing a news report based on the controversial article from the Organiser.

Congress leader Ramesh Chennithala also condemned the article, calling it "deplorable." He claimed

that the BJP's next move would be to control the properties owned by the Catholic community. Chennithala pointed out that during debates on the Waqf Bill, both Congress and Rahul Gandhi had warned that Christians might be targeted next. He further stressed that the article's reference to the Catholic Church holding vast land in India was a clear indication of the BJP's future intentions.

The article, titled "Who has more land in India? The Catholic Church vs Waqf Board debate," alleged that much of the land held by Catholic institutions was acquired during British rule under the Indian Church Act of 1927. It also referenced a 1965 government order that invalidated land leased during the colonial era as church property.

Manipur's Meitei, Kuki Representatives Hold Talks With Centre In Delhi

The central government convened a crucial meeting today with representatives from Manipur's Meitei and Kuki communities in a bid to restore peace and normalcy in the state. The discussions were aimed at fostering greater trust and cooperation between the two communities, with a focus on maintaining law and order and facilitating reconciliation.

A six-member delegation from the Meitei community, which included members from the All Manipur United Clubs' Organisation (AMUCO) and the Federation of Civil Society Organisations (FOCS), participated in the meeting. The Kuki community was represented by a nine-member delegation. AK Mishra, a retired special director of the Intelligence Bureau, served as the mediator from the central government.

a recent Lok Sabha debate, shared that the Ministry of Home Affairs had previously held discussions with both the Meitei and Kuki communities, and that separate meetings had been arranged with various organizations representing both sides. He assured that the Ministry would soon convene a joint meeting to further progress toward peace.

Shah emphasized that the government's primary objective was to restore peace and order in the state. While he noted that the situation had improved over the past four months, with no new deaths reported, he acknowledged that the current circumstances were far from satisfactory, as many displaced people still reside in relief camps.

The imposition of President's rule in Manipur on February 13 followed the resignation of the state's Chief

Union Home Minister Amit Shah, in Minister, N Biren Singh, on February 9. Since the ethnic violence erupted in May 2023, over 260 people have lost their lives, and thousands of firearms were looted from police stations during the initial stages of the conflict.

> Governor Ajay Kumar Bhalla, who assumed office on January 3, has been actively engaging with various groups to gather feedback on how to bring stability to the state. He has also taken steps to encourage the surrender of weapons looted during the violence.

DMRC Receives ₹4,309 Crore Loan for Delhi Metro **Phase-4 Expansion**

The Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC) has secured its first loan tranche of ₹4,309.53 crore from the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) to kickstart work on three corridors of Metro Phase-4. The corridors in question are Inderlok to Indraprastha, Saket G Block to Lajpat Nagar, and Rithala - Narela - Nathupur. The loan will facilitate the tendering process for these projects, according to officials familiar with the matter.

The total cost of the Phase-4 project is estimated to be ₹14,600 crore, with JICA contributing ₹6,252.91 crore. The remaining costs will be equally shared by the Government of India and the Delhi government. This loan is a crucial step in achieving financial closure for the three remaining corridors of Phase-4.

In a statement, DMRC confirmed the the Green Line, which connects Baha-

signing of the loan agreement between the Government of India and JICA on March 27, 2025, for an amount equivalent to ₹4,309.53 crore (79,726 million Japanese Yen).

Phase-4 of the project involves constructing 103 kilometers of metro lines across six corridors. Currently, three corridors are already under construction: the Janakpuri West to RK Ashram Marg (Magenta Line extension), Majlis Park to Maujpur (Pink Line extension), and Aerocity to Tughlakabad (new Golden Line).

The 8-kilometer-long Lajpat Nagar to Saket G Block corridor will feature eight stops: Lajpat Nagar, Andrews Ganj, GK-I, Chirag Delhi, Pushpa Bhawan, Saket District Centre, Pushp Vihar, and Saket G Block. The color code for this line has yet to be decided. Meanwhile, the 12-kilometer Inderlok-Indraprastha corridor will extend



durgarh and Kirti Nagar.

Additionally, the Prime Minister laid the foundation stone in January for the extension of the Red Line from Rithala to Narela, continuing on to Haryana's Kondli. This 26.4-kilometer corridor will have 21 elevated stations.

The Phase-4 expansion of Delhi Metro is a significant step toward enhancing the city's public transport network, easing congestion, and offering a more sustainable alternative for commuters.

Heatwave alert over parts of NW India including Delhi until April 8: IMD

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a warning of a gradual rise in maximum temperatures by 3-5°C over parts of northwest and central India until April 8, 2025. The department has forecasted heatwave conditions, with the potential for severe heatwaves in several regions.

On Friday, the highest maximum temperature of 44.5°C was recorded in Bhuj, Gujarat, with many parts of northwest India already experiencing scorching temperatures. The IMD predicts that the heatwave will extend to areas such as Madhya Pradesh, South Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, and parts of west Uttar Pradesh around April 7-8.

The temperature on Friday ranged from 40-44°C in areas like Saurashtra, Kutch, southwest Rajasthan, and north Gujarat, with many regions including Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh,

Bihar, West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, east Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, and Kerala experiencing temperatures between 36-39°C. Punjab, Assam, Odisha, Karnataka, and coastal regions also recorded temperatures ranging from 32-35°C. Meanwhile, the Western Himalayan region recorded cooler temperatures, between 20-25°C.

Mahesh Palawat, Vice President of Climate and Meteorology at Skymet Weather, explained that the region is experiencing unusually early heatwaves, with hot winds from an anticyclone over the Arabian Sea blowing



into Rajasthan and Gujarat. These winds are expected to intensify the heat, including in Delhi-NCR, where temperatures will also rise. This early onset of heatwaves, which began in March, is causing significant concern.

According to the IMD's forecast, Gujarat is under a red-category warning on April 6 and 7, meaning local authorities should take preventive action to avoid heat-related emergencies. Rajasthan is under an orange-category warning, indicating that authorities should prepare for potential action. A yellow-category warning is in effect for parts of northwest India, including Delhi, signaling that authorities should remain vigilant for extreme temperatures.

With the temperature rise expected to continue, residents in affected areas should stay cautious and take appropriate measures to avoid heat-related health issues.

Delhi Leads in Work-Related Hours, Gender Disparity Widens in Some States: Ministry Report

A new report by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation reveals that people in Delhi spend the most time on work-related activities compared to any other region in India. On average, an individual in India dedicates 455 minutes, or just over 7.5 hours, every day to work-related tasks, including commuting. However, in Delhi, this figure rises significantly to 571 minutes, or nearly 9.5 hours, daily.

The Time Use Survey report shows that the time spent on work-related activities also includes commuting to and from the workplace. Following Delhi, Haryana stands next with individuals spending an average of 493 minutes (around 8.2 hours) on employment-related tasks. In Tamil Nadu, the time spent on work-related activities is slightly lower at 484 minutes, or around 8 hours per day. People in states like Odisha, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, and Rajasthan spend an

hours) on work.

The report also highlights significant gender disparities in work hours. In



average of 420-440 minutes (around 7 Uttar Pradesh, women spend 72% less time on work-related activities than men. Bihar follows closely, with women spending 71.6% fewer hours than men. However, Delhi and Kerala show comparatively better gender parity, with only a 22% difference in work hours between men and women. Goa reported the smallest gender gap, with just an 8% difference in working hours.

> Regarding rural and urban divides, people living in rural areas spend

around 424 minutes (7 hours) on work-related activities, while those in urban areas dedicate 494 minutes (8.2 hours) daily. These figures illustrate a clear trend of longer working hours in urban settings, especially in major metropolitan areas like Delhi.

The report sheds light on the growing work culture in India, particularly in urban areas, while also drawing attention to the challenges posed by gender imbalances in employment participation across different states.

7 Women Farm Labourers Die, 3 **Rescued After Tractor Plunges Into Well In Maharashtra**

In a tragic incident in Nanded district of Maharashtra, seven women farm laborers lost their lives when the tractor-trolley they were traveling in plunged into a well early on Friday morning. The accident occurred around 7:30 AM in Asegaon village, under the jurisdiction of Limbgaon police station. The tractor veered off the road and fell into a well filled to the brim with water, according to District Information Officer (DIO) Pravin Take.

A rescue operation was launched immediately by police and local authorities, who pumped out a significant amount of water from the well. Despite their efforts, seven women were found dead, while three others were successfully rescued.

The women were on their way to a farm to harvest turmeric when the accident occurred. All of the deceased

were from Gunj village in Hingoli district's Vasmat tehsil. The victims were identified as Tarabai Satwaji Jadhav (35), Dhrupata Satwaji Jadhav (18), Saraswati Lakhan Burad (25), Simran Santosh Kamble (18), Chaitrabai Madhav Pardhe (45), Jyoti Irabaji Saraode (35), and Sapna Tukaram Raut (25). The three survivors, Parvatibai Burad (35), Purbhabai Kamble (40), and Satwaji Jadhav (55), were rescued from the water.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed his condolences for the tragic loss, announcing a compensation of Rs 2 lakh each from the PM's National Relief Fund (PMNRF) for the families of the deceased. Additionally, Rs 50,000 will be provided to the injured women. "Saddened by the loss of lives in an accident in Nanded, Maharashtra. Condolences to those who have lost their loved ones. May the injured recover soon," the Prime Minister tweeted.

Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis also expressed grief and announced financial assistance of Rs 5 lakh for the families of each of the deceased. He pledged to ensure steps are taken to prevent such accidents in the future and stated that an inquiry into the incident has been ordered. The local administrations of Hingoli and Nanded are providing support to those affected by the tragedy.

IMD Issues Rain and Thunderstorm Warnings for Tamil Nadu

The regional center of the India Meteorological Department (IMD) in Chennai has issued warnings for rain, light thunderstorms, and lightning across several districts in Tamil Nadu. According to IMD predictions, light to moderate rainfall is expected to affect parts of the state, particularly the Nilgiris, Coimbatore, Tiruppur, and Nagapattinam districts, along with the Karaikal area.

The IMD forecast suggests that some areas in Tamil Nadu may experience rain throughout the day. The rainfall could cause waterlogging and slippery road conditions, leading to disruptions in local traffic. The districts likely to be impacted by light to moderate rain include Theni, Tenksasi, Ramanathapuram, and Kanyakumari.

Additionally, the weather department has highlighted the possibility of heavy rainfall in several parts of Tamil Nadu. Heavy rains experienced in Tiruppur on Friday night led to water entering homes, prompting municipal workers to engage in drainage efforts. Tiruppur North recorded 11 cm of rainfall, while Kozhiporvilai in Kanyakumari saw 19 cm. Other areas affected by heavy rain include the Nambiyur weather station in Erode district, Coimbatore, Sulur, and several stations in Theni and Nilgiris, all reporting significant rainfall accumulation ranging



from 5 cm to 9 cm.

The regional center also reported rain in multiple locations across Tamil Nadu, including areas in Puducherry, Karaikal, Kerala, Interior Karnataka, Rayalaseema, and Telangana, as well as isolated showers in Coastal Andhra Pradesh. Meanwhile, Mahe and Yanam remained dry.

Temperatures in the region have generally been lower than normal, with maximum temperatures in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Telangana, Rayalaseema, and Interior Karnataka dropping by 1 to 6 degrees Celsius. These cooler conditions are expected to persist as the rainfall continues.

Panel clears safety of Pamban bridge; PM Modi to open it on April 6

A five-member high-level committee appointed by the Ministry of Railways has officially cleared the design of the newly constructed Pamban Rail Bridge, certifying that the 2.08-km-long structure is structurally sound. The committee's assessment, conducted after an inspection in January, concluded that the bridge met all necessary design requirements and was safe for use.

The committee, which included experts from the Railways, the Research Designs and Standards Organisation (RDSO), and IIT-Roorkee, carefully reviewed the bridge's design, ensuring it adhered to Indian Railway Standards and the Steel Bridge Code. The committee noted that the bridge had been designed to handle an annual traffic load of 50 million gross tonnes and was built with a lifespan of 100 years. In its report, the panel confirmed that the bridge is structurally secure and capable of serving its intended pur-

Vadodara Crash Accused Rakshit Was Not Drunk, Had Smoked Marijuana: Cops

Rakshit Chaurasia, the accused in the fatal Vadodara crash that left a woman dead and seven others injured last month, was driving under the influence of drugs, according to police on Friday. The primary forensic report from the Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) in Gandhinagar confirmed that Chaurasia tested positive for marijuana, though he was not intoxicated by alcohol at the time of the accident.

Along with Chaurasia, two other individuals—his co-passenger Praanshu Chauhan and another friend, Suresh Bharwad—also tested posi-

tive for drugs. The medical findings, which arrived nearly 20 days after the March 13 incident, revealed the trio had smoked marijuana before the crash.

The police have charged all three men under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985, and have invoked Section 185 of the Motor Vehicles Act, 1988, which makes driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs a criminal offense. While Chauhan has been arrested, Chaurasia remains in custody at the Vadodara Central Jail. The third accused, Bharwad, is still at large.

"We received the results today showing that all three had drugs in their system," said Deputy Commissioner of Police, Zone 4, Panna Momaya. "Chaurasia's co-passenger has been arrested, and we will arrest the third accused soon."

On March 13, Chaurasia, a 23-yearold law student from Prayagraj, crashed the Volkswagen Virtus sedan he was driving into three other vehicles near Amrapali Chaar Rasta in Karelibag, a busy intersection in Vadodara. The crash tragically killed Hemali Patel, a woman traveling in one of the vehicles.

A disturbing video from the scene went viral, showing Chaurasia shouting "Another round, another round!" and "Om Namah Shivay!" while appearing unaffected by the crash. Following the incident, Chaurasia was initially charged with culpable homicide not amounting to murder.

Previously, Chaurasia denied being drunk or speeding and claimed the crash occurred when the car's airbags deployed after hitting a pothole, causing him to lose control. He expressed remorse, stating, "I want to meet the victims' families—it's my fault."

Waqf Amendment Bill 2025: Balancing Justice, Reform, and Rights



The Waqf (Amendment) Bill 2025, officially titled the UMEED Act, represents a landmark step towards streamlining the management of Waqf properties while upholding justice, transparency, and constitutional safeguards. More than a simple amendment, the Act aims to rectify long-standing administrative and legal loopholes in India's Waqf system. The Act abolishes Section 40 of the original 1995 Waqf Act, which allowed Waqf Boards to unilaterally declare any property as Waqf land, often without due process. This provision had led to thousands of disputes and was criticized by the Sachar Committee in 2006 for undermining justice. The 2025 amendment replaces this arbitrary system with a structured legal mechanism: district collectors now have the authority to adjudicate such matters, with a right to appeal to the High Court within 90 days. Home Minister Amit Shah emphasized this during parliamentary debate, underscoring that clause 35(9) of the new bill introduces statutory appeals and aligns with Article 14's principles of equality and Article 32's protection of legal remedies. The claim that the bill undermines Waqf's inalienable status is countered by judicial precedents that distinguish religious practice from administrative functions. In Sardar Syedna Taher Saifuddin Saheb v. State of Bombay (1962), the Supreme Court clarified that

governance tasks do not equate to worship. The 2025 Act introduces a 12-year limitation period for claims, mirroring the Limitation Act, 1963, thus preventing indefinite litigation and potentially unlocking around 9.4 lakh acres of land worth ₹1.2 lakh crore. This land, currently tied up in over 13,000 pending cases, could be redirected towards educational and healthcare initiatives benefiting economically disadvantaged sections of the Muslim community. Another reformative step is the inclusion of two Muslim women on every Waqf Board, addressing the historical underrepresentation—only 2% female participation noted by the Sachar Committee. This democratization aligns with Articles 15(3) and 16(2), which support affirmative action and gender equity in public institutions. The Act also introduces limited representation for non-Muslims—two of the 11 members on a Waqf Board—to enhance transparency, without infringing on religious autonomy, as permitted under S.R. Bommai v. Union of India (1994). Claims under Article 26—that the bill interferes with religious practices—are further dispelled through precedents like Raja Bira Kishore Deb v. State of Orissa (1964) and Durgah Committee, Ajmer v. Syed Hussain Ali (1961), where the Supreme Court upheld state regulation of secular aspects of religious institutions.

Karnataka's Pay Hike for Crorepati Lawmakers


In a move that has sparked widespread criticism, the Karnataka government has approved a sweeping pay hike for its legislators—even as the state grapples with a mounting financial crisis. On March 21, the Congress-led Assembly passed bills doubling salaries and allowances for the Chief Minister, ministers, and members of both legislative houses. The Chief Minister's monthly salary was raised from ₹75,000 to ₹1.5 lakh, while ministers now receive ₹1.25 lakh, up from ₹60,000. MLAs and MLCs have seen their pay double from ₹40,000 to ₹80,000. Even pensions have been hiked from ₹37,500 to ₹75,000 per month. Altogether, this revi-

borrowing to keep basic services running. The decision to reward lawmakers so generously seems all the more tone-deaf when placed against the backdrop of their personal wealth. According to a recent report by the Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR), Karnataka has the highest number of ultra-wealthy MLAs in India, with 31 legislators possessing assets exceeding ₹100 crore. The state's MLAs have an average net worth of ₹63.5 crore, and a staggering 97% of sitting MLAs are crorepatis. Deputy Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar alone has declared assets worth over ₹1,413 crore, making him the richest legislator in the state and

the second richest in India.

Among Congress MLAs, 132 out of 135 are crorepatis, with an average wealth of ₹67.13 crore. BJP MLAs also follow suit—63 of 66 are in the same category, averaging ₹44.36 crore. Janata Dal (Secular) is not far behind, with 18 of its 19 MLAs owning assets worth over ₹1 crore. In this context, the state's generous pay hike appears unnecessary and sends a mes-

sage of detachment from the financial realities faced by ordinary citizens. Meanwhile, the government's welfare schemes are under stress. Payments under flagship initiatives such as the Gruha Lakshmi Yojane have reportedly been delayed for five months. Pending dues to electricity supply companies (Escoms) remain unpaid, and Local Area Development Fund allocations to MLAs are stuck. Public infrastructure projects, including metro and bus services, are struggling due to lack of funds.

This pay hike comes at a time when the state is struggling with debt that has surged past ₹7.6 lakh crore. Despite a record revenue collection of ₹2.6 lakh crore (excluding borrowings) for 2025–26, a major chunk—₹1.6 lakh crore—is earmarked for salaries, pensions, and interest payments. Another ₹2 lakh crore is needed to sustain welfare schemes, leaving just ₹60,000 crore (about 15% of the budget) for infrastructure and development projects. PM Modi Receives Sri Lanka's Top Honour

The award was conferred shortly after Modi landed in Colombo for a three-day official visit. This prestigious honour recognizes Modi's exceptional contributions to strengthening bilateral ties and nurturing the shared cultural and spiritual heritage between India and Sri Lanka. According to the Sri Lankan President's Office, the Mitra Vibhushana medal was specially instituted to acknowledge extraordinary global friendships and reflects the depth of the longstanding ties between the two nations. This event also marks a diplomatic milestone, as Prime

Minister Modi is the first international leader to be officially hosted by Sri Lankan President Anura Kumara Dissanayake since he assumed office in September 2024. The warm welcome and the honour bestowed upon Modi underscore Colombo's strategic emphasis on deepening its engagement with New Delhi. Notably, this is the 22nd international honour Modi has received from a foreign government, further solidifying his stature as a respected global statesman. The recognition from Sri Lanka adds to a growing list of accolades for his proactive foreign policy and leadership in regional cooperation. President Dissanavake highlighted Modi's pivotal role in championing regional unity and acknowledged India's consistent support in areas ranging

from infrastructure development to humanitarian aid and cultural exchange. The medal ceremony also served as a symbolic reaffirmation of the two nations' shared historical legacy rooted in Buddhism, trade, and people-to-people connections. During his visit, PM Modi is expected to hold bilateral meetings with top Sri Lankan leaders, address issues related to economic collaboration, energy partnerships, and regional security, and participate in cultural events celebrating India-Sri Lanka friendship. Violence Erupts at Bokaro Plant Protest

Online ticketing platform BookMyShow has reportedly removed all content related to stand-up comedian Kunal Kamra from its website. The move follows a complaint letter from Yuva Shiv Sena leader Rahool N Kanal, who raised objections to Kamra's controversial content, particularly a recent joke that was labeled as "anti-national" by critics.

According to reports by India Today, Kamra's profile has been removed, and no upcoming shows featuring the comedian are currently listed on the platform.

This action comes in the wake of a letter dated April 2, in which Rahool Kanal urged BookMyShow to refrain from promoting or selling tickets Kamra's performances. Kanal described Kamra as someone with a "documented history of habitual offensive behavior," alleging that his content consistently crosses the line of decency and decorum.

In his letter, Kanal wrote, "I am addressing this letter in my individual capacity as a concerned citizen to bring to your attention a matter of significant public interest concerning the operations of BookMyShow." He went on to say that Kamra has used his platform to engage in a "vili-



fication campaign" targeting prominent public figures, including the Prime Minister, deputy chief ministers, and other leaders.

The controversy reportedly stems from a recent standup routine where Kamra cracked a joke that some interpreted as mocking national sentiment and leadership. Social media users and certain political outfits criticized the content, labeling it "traitorous," sparking calls for a boycott and further amplifying demands for action against the comedian.

While Kunal Kamra has not officially responded to Book-MyShow's action or the political letter, he has been known to defend his right to free speech in the past, often pointing out the role of satire in a healthy democracy.


The incident has once again sparked a debate around censorship, freedom of expression, and political influence in entertainment spaces. BookMyShow has yet to issue a public statement on the matter.

Tensions flared in Bokaro on Mahto's family. The roots of Thursday as a protest demanding employment at the Bokaro Steel Plant (BSP) turned violent, resulting in the tragic death of a 23-year-old youth and injuries to at least 15 others, including one person currently in the ICU.

The deceased, Prem Mahto, was part of a demonstration organized by the Visthapit Apprentice Sangh (VAS)—a union representing youth displaced during the establishment of the steel plant. Mahto allegedly succumbed to injuries after being struck on the head during a CISF lathi charge as protesters tried to breach barricades near the plant's main gate. The protest triggered a city-wide shutdown from Thursday night and brought plant operations to a standstill, with thousands of workers stranded inside. Authorities responded quickly to the escalating situation. Bokaro Deputy Commissioner Vijaya Jadhav confirmed that a three-member inquiry committee has been formed to investigate the incident. An order has also been issued for the arrest of the BSP's Chief General Manager. The district administration has announced a velopment. compensation of ₹20 lakh for

the unrest lie in long-standing grievances of displaced families. According to protester Sahdev Sao, the plant was set up in 1967-68 on 34,000 acres of acquired land with promises of over 20,000 jobs for displaced locals. However, many of these promises remain unfulfilled. "We've been demanding jobs since 2016. Back then, we even breached the canal in protest, which led to the arrest of 52 protesters for seven months," said Sao. Another youth, speaking anonymously, stated that in 2016, the government identified 4,328 displaced persons eligible for employment. However, only 1,500 were offered apprenticeships between 2016 and 2022, with the number of recruitments decreasing in each phase. Despite an official meeting held in February, no progress followed. Frustrated by delays, youth and their families launched a fresh sitin protest on April 3, which ultimately culminated in Thursday's violent confrontation. The incident has raised serious concerns over the state's handling of displacement and job promises tied to industrial de-

Waqf Bill Passed, 8.8 Lakh Properties Listed



The waqf (amendment) bill 2025 has been passed by parliament with ease in both houses, ushering in new rules that may affect over 73,000 disputed waqf properties across the country, the bill, which underwent more than 12 hours of debate, marks a major update in how waqf assets—properties endowed by muslims for religious or charitable purposes—are recorded and managed.

according to data from the ministry of minority affairs, there are a total of 8.8 lakh waqf properties listed across 30 states and union territories, based on entries in the waqf assets management system of india (wamsi), the government's official database.

out of the total, more than 6.2 lakh properties—roughly two-thirds—are classified as graveyards, agricultural land, mosques, shops, or houses. graveyards make up 17.3%, while agricultural land and mosques account for 16% and 14%, respectively.


n interestingly, while up has the most waqf properties, punjab has the highest proportion of disputed properties, suggesting sharp regional contrasts in land contention. these disputes now fall under the new framework of the amended legislation.

a waqf is a unique form of property in islamic tradition, where the ownership is believed to rest with god, while the property is managed for a religious, charitable, or community purpose. the amended bill is expected to bring greater transparency, digitization, and dispute resolution mechanisms.

the move has stirred public debate and political activity, particularly in regions with ongoing land disputes involving waqf properties. in some areas, the passage of the bill has even triggered shifts in local political affiliations, including christian groups joining the bjp amid related disputes.

JP Morgan Predicts U.S. Recession Due to **New Tariffs; India's Exports May Be Impacted**

- · U.S. GDP expected to shrink and unemployment may rise to 5.3%.
- Fed Chair Powell warns tariffs could worsen inflation and slow growth.
- India faces a 26% tariff on exports starting April 9.

P Morgan has forecasted that the United States is likely to enter a recession this year, primarily driven by the economic effects of newly imposed tariffs, as announced by President Donald Trump. In a note to investors released on Friday, Michael

Feroli, the firm's chief U.S. economist, predicted that the country's gross domestic product (GDP) will contract due to the weight of these tariffs.

Feroli further stated that this economic downturn could push the U.S. unemployment rate to 5.3%, as a result of reduced economic activity. This prediction comes after President Trump revealed on April 2 that his administration would be imposing reciprocal tariffs on various countries as part of a broader strategy to rebalance trade relations with major U.S. trading partners.

The Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell also voiced concerns over the potential impact of the new tariffs. During a business journalism conference on Friday, Powell warned that these tariffs could cause more significant economic damage than previously anticipated.

He explained that the tariff hikes would likely lead to higher inflation and slower economic growth, complicating the Federal Reserve's ongoing

efforts to control inflation.

According to Trump's tariff plan, a 10% tariff will be applied to imports from all countries beginning on April 5. Additionally, countries with the largest trade deficits with the U.S. will face individualized, higher tariffs starting April 9. India, in particular, will be affected by a 26% tariff on its exports.

Despite this negative outlook, global brokerage firm Jefferies has taken a more optimistic view regarding the impact on India.

The firm noted that key sectors of Indian exports, such as information technology (IT) services, pharmaceuticals, and automobiles, will not be directly affected by the new tariffs.



However, Jefferies warned that a potential slowdown in the U.S. economy could still negatively impact Indian exports, particularly in IT services, due to weakened demand. While the 26% tariff on Indian goods may seem "reasonable" compared to other countries' tariffs, the broader economic challenges in the U.S. could pose greater risks.

Death Toll from Myanmar Earthquake Surpasses 3,300, UN Urges Global Aid

The death toll from the devastating earthquake in Myanmar has risen to over 3,300, according to state media reports on Saturday. The earthquake, which struck on March 28, caused widespread destruction across the country, leaving 3,354 people dead and over 4,500 injured. Additionally, 220 people are still missing, with many survivors left without shelter.

Over a week after the disaster, survivors are still struggling to find adequate housing. Many are sleeping outdoors as their homes were either destroyed or are too unsafe to occupy due to the risk of further collapses. According to a United Nations estimate, more than quake, exacerbating the country's already dire situation, which has been complicated by four years of ongoing civil war.

Trump Imposes 25% Tariff on Imported Vehicles to the U.S.

resident Donald Trump has unveiled a new 25% tariff on cars and car parts that are imported into the United States, marking a significant change from the current 2.5% import tax. This decision is part of the administration's broader economic strategy aimed at boosting domestic production and protecting American industries from foreign competition.

The tariff will apply to vehicles and car components from countries outside the U.S., further intensifying trade tensions with global partners. The new tariff policy follows a series of similar trade measures introduced by Trump since taking office. Purohit pointed out that India's robust economic fundamentals make it resilient to temporary disruptions like rising inflation, tight earnings, and high valuations.

Additionally, the Q4 earnings season kicks off with IT giant TCS scheduled to announce its results on April 10.

Cautious Start Amid US Tariff Hikes and Geopolitical Concerns

The new financial year (FY26) has begun on a cautious note, largely driven by the unexpected imposition of higher tariffs by the US, market experts noted on Saturday. While the initial market sentiment remains subdued, any positive developments from the ongoing India-US bilateral trade talks could provide a potential catalyst to support the market's recovery.

Sectors like IT and metals have significantly underperformed compared to the broader market, reflecting growing concerns about the US economy's outlook and the possibility of retaliatory trade actions from other countries. Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Investments Limited, highlighted that investors will be closely watching for any countermeasures taken by global trade partners, which could escalate geopolitical and economic uncertainty. This cautious sentiment is reflected in the rally of gold and bond prices, as investors flock to safe-haven assets in response to the growing risk of a trade war. On Friday, benchmark indices ex-



tended their losses, with the Nifty falling 345.65 points, or 1.49%, to 22,904.45. The fear of a trade war, fueled by US President Donald Trump's reciprocal tariffs, has led to widespread concern that aggressive trade policies could result in retaliatory measures, disrupt global supply chains, and hinder global economic growth.

The broader markets experienced a sharp decline, with the Nifty Midcap 100 and Nifty Smallcap 100 indices dropping 2.91% and 3.56%, respective-

cant losses, particularly IT, Auto, Pharma, PSU Bank, Realty, Oil and Gas, and Metals, which saw declines between 3% and 6%.

Market analysts suggest that the key support level for the Nifty lies around 22,700-22,800. Holding above this level will be crucial for a potential recovery towards the previous week's high of 23,565. However, failure to maintain support could lead to a further decline, potentially reaching 22,300.

In the coming week, investors will also focus on the Reserve Bank of India's monetary policy meeting and the resumption of the Q4 FY25 earnings season. A positive outcome from the MPC meeting could benefit rate-sensitive sectors, while key economic indicators, such as inflation figures and US jobless claims, will offer critical insights into the health of the global economy.

India Ranks 10th in Private AI Investment, **Improves Position in Tech Readiness:UN**

India has emerged as a significant player in the global AI landscape, ranking 10th in private investments in AI in 2023, according to the United Nations' 2025 Technology and Innovation Report. The report, published by the UN Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), highlights that India is one of only two developing countries with substantial private AI investments, alongside China.

The report reveals that the US leads global AI investment, contributing USD 67 billion, which accounts for 70% of worldwide private investment. China follows in second place with USD 7.8 billion, while India ranks tenth with USD 1.4 billion. This marks a notable achievement for India in the evolving field of AI, with the technology expected to reach a market value of USD 4.8 trillion by 2033, transforming industries worldwide.

India has also shown improvement in the UNCTAD's Readiness for Frontier Technologies Index, rising from 48th place in 2022 to 36th in 2024. This index measures a country's ability to adopt and deploy cutting-edge technologies, combining factors like ICT deployment, research and development (R&D), skills, industrial capacity, and access to finance. India performed particularly well in R&D, ranking 3rd globally, but still faces challenges in ICT infrastructure (99th) and skills development (113th).

Despite these challenges, the report notes that India, along with other de-

veloping countries like China and Brazil, is outperforming its income level in technology readiness. The report emphasizes that AI and other frontier technologies, while offering productivity gains, could also exacerbate inequality if not managed properly. To mitigate this risk, the report stresses the importance of investing in workforce reskilling and adaptation.

AI is expected to reshape global economies, and while access to AI infrastructure remains concentrated in a few developed countries, nations like India are beginning to carve out their place in the AI revolution. The future, according to the report, will require global collaboration to ensure that AI benefits not just capital but workers as well, creating new industries and jobs.

Companies defend India's startup proposition after Piyush Goyal's jibe stirs debate

Several prominent Indian entrepreneurs rallied in defense of the startup ecosystem after Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal questioned the value and innovation of Indian startups. His remarks, made at a recent Startup Mahakumbh event, sparked a debate, especially from figures like Zepto CEO Aadit Palicha and Zoho founder Sridhar Vembu, who defended the contributions of startups in India.

Goyal had suggested that Indian startups should shift focus from consumer-based businesses like food delivery and ice cream production to high-tech sectors such as robotics, AI, and semiconductors. He criticized food delivery startups for creating jobs that, in his view, only turned youth into "cheap labor" for wealthy consumers. He further pointed to China's advancements in electric mobility and AI as a model for India to aspire to, urging Indian startups to be bolder in their approach.

Palicha, who co-founded Zepto, hit back, emphasizing that consumer internet companies like his have made significant contributions to job creation, foreign direct investment (FDI), and innovation in India's supply chain. He noted that Zepto alone



had created over 1.5 lakh jobs and contributed more than ₹1,000 crore in taxes annually. "We need to build great local champions in the internet sector," he argued, suggesting that consumer internet companies were integral to scaling technologies like cloud computing and AI, as seen with global giants like Amazon and Face-

Zoho's Sridhar Vembu supported Palicha, viewing Goyal's challenge as a call for engineers to solve India's technological hurdles. Vembu emphasized that smart engineers could overcome these challenges and bring India clos-

er to technological excellence.

Paytm founder Vijay Shekhar Sharma also chimed in, highlighting the maturity differences between India's startup ecosystem and those of more developed markets like the U.S. and China. He noted that India's ecosystem is still evolving, and its startups are playing to their strengths as they gradually mature.

While Goyal's remarks stirred controversy, the entrepreneurs underscored that India's startup ecosystem, though still developing, holds vast potential for future innovation and growth.


