



#### Op SINDOOR strikes deep into Pakistan

#### Ceasefire deal reached hours after suspected hit on nuclear site

Following a deadly terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam last month, India launched Operation Sindoor on May 7, targeting terror infrastructure across Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). After four days of coordinated air, drone and artillery strikes, a ceasefire agreement between India and Pakistan came into effect on the evening of May 10. The escalation and eventual ceasefire followed a high-level security meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and attended by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan, and the three service chiefs. Government sources confirmed that major decisions, including targeting sensi-

tive locations, were taken in this meeting. India's Measured Retaliation and Pakistan's Panic

In response to Pakistan's continued support for terror groups, India struck multiple high-value targets. At dawn on May 10, Indian Air Force (IAF) jets launched Brah-Mos-A cruise missiles on key Pakistan Air Force bases, including Chaklala near Rawalpindi, Sargodha in Punjab, and later Jacobabad, Bholari, and Skardu. These bases serve as aviation and logistics hubs for the Pakistani military.

Indian intelligence intercepted urgent alerts across Pakistani defence systems, fearing India might next strike their nuclear command infrastructure. Strategic installations in Rawalpindi reportedly initiated heightened security protocols.

#### Was Pakistan's Nuclear Site Hit?

Unofficial reports indicate that India struck Kirana Hills — believed to be a nuclear storage site — with deep-penetrating missiles. Though there's no official confirmation, the presence of a US Department of Energy aircraft in Pakistan the same day has fueled speculation that the US may be inspecting for radiation or structural damage. In the wake of this, Pakistan reportedly requested urgent intervention from the Unit-



ed States. The US, alarmed by the proximity of the strikes to nuclear assets, stepped in. The National Nuclear Security Administration's B-350 AMS aircraft reportedly landed in Pakistan to inspect any possible nuclear damage. US pressure is believed to have forced Pakistan to initiate contact through the military hotline.

#### Ceasefire After Missile, **Drone & Artillery Offensive**

The ceasefire was agreed upon after Pakistan's DGMO Major General Kashif Abdullah directly called India's DGMO Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai at 3:35 pm IST on May 10. Just hours before, Pakistani drones were intercepted over Srinagar and parts of Gujarat, indicating continued provocation even amid peace efforts. The Indian side warned Pakistan that any further provocation would result in equal or stronger retaliation. "If they fire, we will fire. If they attack, we will attack," sources said, emphasizing that India is not initiating dialogue unless it concerns the handover of PoK or terrorists responsible for past attacks.

#### Air Force Confirms Successful Operations

The Indian Air Force, on May 11, officially confirmed the success of Operation Sindoor. In a post on X (formerly Twitter), the IAF said, "The Indian Air Force has successfully executed its assigned tasks in Operation Sindoor, with precision and professionalism. Operations were conducted in a deliberate and discreet manner, aligned with National Objectives."

The IAF also stated that operations were ongoing and

a detailed briefing would follow. It urged citizens and media to refrain from speculation.

#### **India's Strategic** Messaging

India has decided not to roll back measures like the suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT), taken after the Pahalgam terror attack. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh



declared, "Operation Sindoor was launched to dismantle terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan. The roar of Indian forces reached Rawalpindi." Sources confirmed India will soon present evidence to the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) on Pakistan's terror links. A meeting of the UNSC 1267 Sanctions Committee is expected next week.

## A New Red Line

The armed forces' press conference is expected to mark a new era in India's security posture. Operation Sindoor has not only showcased India's military precision but also challenged global power structures by directly hitting Pakistan's strategic and foreign-backed assets.

Operation Sindoor marks a shift in India's military doctrine. For the first time, India signaled it would not be deterred by Pakistan's nuclear threat. The suspected hit on a nuclear storage site, successful airspace breaches despite Chinese and US-supplied defence systems, and the precision of Indian-made missiles have stunned global observers.

While some countries may express concern, the operation has redefined deter-



rence in the region. The message is clear: a single terror attack can now result in deep, destructive consequences for the perpetrators. The Indian armed forces' performance has set a new precedent. This is not just a tactical success—it is strategic recalibration.

India has demonstrated its resolve. The pause in conflict is not a compromise, but a statement. As a senior source put it: "Silence is strategy. Ceasefire is strength."

#### **Alcohol-Related Diseases Doubled Under Jagan's Rule: Expert Panel**

TPN Correspondent | Andhra Pradesh An expert committee appointed by the Andhra Pradesh government has released a damning report revealing a steep rise in alcohol-related liver and neurological diseases during the tenure of former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy between 2019 and 2024. The panel, formed under the direction of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, based its findings on detailed analysis of medical cases registered under the state's Arogyasri scheme.

According to the report, alcohol-related liver diseases doubled — from 14,026 cases in 2014-19 to 29,369 cases in 2019-24, marking a 100 percent increase. More alarmingly, neurological disorders linked to alcohol rose by 892 percent, from 1,276 to 12,663 cases during the same period.

The committee flagged severe increases in four categories: liver, kidney, neurological, and mental health disorders, all suspected to be heavily influenced by alcohol abuse. These findings have triggered concerns about the effectiveness of the previous government's liquor policy.

Special Chief Secretary of the Health Department acknowledged the gravity of the findings, stating:

"We have noticed an unprecedented increase in the number of liver and neurological patients between 2019-24 as compared to 2014-19." To address the issue, the state is now constituting an advisory board of national and international health experts to review the data and recommend necessary preventive measures.

#### Probe into Liquor Trade **Irregularities**

Parallel to these health concerns, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has registered a case under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), acting on an FIR by the state CID in 2024. Investigations have uncovered suspected irregularities in the liquor trade during the Jagan regime, such as tampered purchase orders, suppression of national brands, and the promotion of local brands allegedly tied to YSRCP-affiliated businesses. The Special Investigation Team (SIT) has reported that brands like Andhra Gold Whisky, Good Friends Whisky, Dare House Brandy, Champion Special Whisky, and Heart's Desire Whisky were pushed beyond regulatory limits, while well-known national brands were deliberately kept out of reach, even when stock was available.

These developments have ignited a heated public and political debate over the impact of liquor policies implemented during the YSRCP government's rule, with critics blaming them for both deteriorating public health and alleged corruption.

Mr. Surya Narayana questioned how Mr. Suresh Reddy could be involved in the case when he was neither the investigating officer nor part of the ACB at the time. Allegedly, Mr. Suresh Reddy was also involved in threatening Mr. Surya Narayana's wife and daughter, forcing them to return from Hyderabad to Vijayawada.

After demanding an official notice, the police brought one and took the family to Vijayawada to open Mr. Surya Narayana's house for a search. The court eventually dismissed all charges against Mr. Surya Narayana, which were the basis for the searches and inquiries—including the alleged overreach by police officials like Mr. Suresh Reddy.

Mr. Surya Narayana has claimed that Mr. Suresh Reddy is a close associate of Mr. Seeta Ramanjaneyulu, IPS, and acted under his direction. Following the change of government in the state, Mr. Suresh Reddy was transferred to a wing not related to regular law and order, where he continues to work. If an FIR is registered based on Mr. Surya Narayana's complaint, Mr. Suresh Reddy is likely to face suspension.

## **Ceasefire Exposed Within Hours**

- Pawan Kalyan Slams Pakistan
- Pays Tribute to Martyred Agniveer Murali Naik
- ₹50 lakh aid, job, land, and memorial announced by AP govt

Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Shri Pawan Kalyan launched a scathing attack on Pakistan, accusing it of violating the ceasefire agreement within just three hours and inciting terrorism on Indian soil. He made these remarks on Sunday in Kallitanda, Gorantla Mandal, after paying tribute to Agniveer Shri Murali Naik, who was martyred during Operation Sindoor.

"India has never initiated wars. But now, we are forced to fight back to protect our people. The root cause of this situation is Pakistan," Shri Pawan Kalyan stated, while addressing the media after consoling the martyr's family. He said that despite announcing a ceasefire, Pakistan violated it in just three hours and orchestrated attacks through terrorist groups. He accused a Pakistani Army General of instigating terrorists, which ultimately led to the martyrdom of young Agniveer Murali Naik from Andhra



Pahalgam that claimed 26 lives, Shri Pawan Kalyan said, "India retaliated by targeting terrorist camps, but Pakistan responded with gunfire on the borders, escalating tensions across five states. Amidst this, we lost a brave young soldier who had always dreamed of serving the country."

He called for a strong and definitive response from India under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi. "Pakistan's Referring to the recent attack in misdeeds must be stopped somewhere. Our people want a strong lesson to be taught to them," he emphasized.

Shri Pawan Kalyan also announced significant support for the martyr's family. On behalf of the Andhra Pradesh government, he said ₹50 lakh will be granted, along with five acres of land, a 300-yard house plot, and a government job for a family member. A memorial for Shri Murali Naik will also be established. Personally, Shri Pawan Kalyan pledged ₹25 lakh in assistance to the family.

Expressing grief, he said, "It is heartbreaking to know that Murali Naik, who died for the country at just 23, was also my fan. He chose the Army over a railway job to serve India. Losing such a patriot is painful."

Calling on the nation to remain united and vigilant, he warned that terrorism backed by Pakistan continues to pose a serious threat, pointing to past attacks in Delhi, Mumbai, Coimbatore, and Hyderabad. "No one should fall for the illusion of peace through ceasefire agreements with Paki-

As the Congress party launched a campaign highlighting former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's leadership during the 1971 Bangladesh Liberation War, senior party leader and MP Shashi Tharoor struck a contrasting tone, cautioning against comparing that era with the current 2025 ceasefire

scenario with Pakistan. Speaking to ANI, Tharoor acknowledged the historical significance of 1971. "Indira Gandhiji rewrote the map of the subcontinent. It was a great achievement that makes me proud as an Indian," he said. However, he quickly drew a distinction between the past and present, stating, "The circumstances of 1971 are not the circumstances of 2025. There are differences." Amid political reactions to the government's recent ceasefire agreement with Pakistan following deadly border exchanges, Tharoor emphasized the need for strategic restraint. "We had reached a stage where the escalation was needlessly getting out of control. Peace is necessary for us," he said, adding that no one should get away with killing innocent Indian civilians, but war should not be the default response. He warned that the current conflict was heading towards a prolonged and purposeless war. "This is not 1971. We are not liberating a country. Just firing shells without a clear objective would have been reckless," Tharoor argued. He noted that while Pakistan did escalate the situation, India's response was measured, and the decision to agree to a ceasefire was prudent. According to Tharoor, India must prioritize growth, development, and the well-being of its people. "The prosperity of our people is the biggest priority for India today," he said, while also supporting the principle that any attack on Indian lives must be met with accountability.

The Andhra Pradesh government has moved swiftly towards implementing its flagship Annadatha Sukhibhav scheme, one of the major election promises made by the NDA alliance. The scheme promises to provide ₹20,000 annually to each eligible farmer, combining both central and state support. While ₹6,000 will come from the Centre's PM-Kisan scheme, the remaining ₹14,000 will be provided by the state in three installments. Officials have issued clear guidelines for registration and beneficiary verification. Farmers eligible

for the scheme are required to register their details at their nearest Rythu Seva Kendra (RSK) by May 20. The state government is targeting to release the first installment within this month, aiming to assist farmers ahead of the upcoming Kharif season.

with an emphasis on transparency. The registration will involve cross-verification using Webland data, which includes details like survey numbers, land area, and will progress from RSKs to mandal and then district agricultural offices. Any errors found in the Webland records will be rectified

before the data is forwarded to the state level.

## **YCP Women's Wing Slams Police Over Rajini's Arrest**

The YSR Congress Party's Kadapa district women's wing has strongly condemned what it called the inhuman treatment of former minister Vidadala Rajini by the police. Addressing a press meet at the party's district office, women's wing president TP Venkata Subbamma alleged that democracy has collapsed in Andhra Pradesh and has been replaced by what she termed the "Red Book Constitution."

Subbamma described the police's behavior towards Rajini as brutal and shameful, particularly considering that she is not only a woman but also a former minister and a leader from the BC community. "It is the duty of the police to offer protection, not to treat her like a criminal without reason," she said. Subbamma questioned why no FIR had been filed against the police personnel involved in the midnight operation and slammed the authorities for not even informing Rajini about the specific case under which her follower was being ar-

She expressed outrage over the manner in which the arrest attempt was carried out, alleging that the police did not of-

fer any legal clarity or show any respect for her position or rights. "If they had simply explained the case, Rajini would have cooperated. But instead, they pushed and manhandled her," Subbamma stated.

Highlighting what she called a growing trend of harassment under the coalition government, she alleged that women have lost both protection and respect in the new regime. "A woman MPTC member was also arrested illegally at midnight. They didn't even allow her time to change clothes. Is this the promised governance for women?" she asked.

The YCP leader accused the current government of resorting to illegal cases to target YSRCP workers, leaders and former ministers while the country is dealing with sensitive national security matters. "Women voters are watching all this closely. If the government doesn't change its ways, the women of Andhra Pradesh will rise and teach it a fitting lesson," she warned.

Co-option member Marialu, Chennareddy Sunitha, Malleswari and other women leaders were present and echoed similar concerns, calling for immediate action against police personnel involved in the alleged misconduct.

## Should Modi **Now Be Sent** to Pakistan?

CPI National Secretary K. Narayana launched a sharp attack on the BJP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, questioning the government's engagement in peace talks with Pakistan without reclaiming Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). He accused the BJP of double standards and recalled that he had earlier been targeted by the party for advo-

cating peaceful dialogue instead of war.

"In the past, when I said we should resolve issues through talks and not war, BJP leaders mocked me and said I should be sent to Pakistan," Narayana said. "Now, when Prime Minister Modi's government is holding



peace talks with Pakistan without taking control of PoK, should they send Modi to Pakistan too, by their own past logic?" he asked point-

Narayana emphasized that terrorism is a serious threat and must be eliminated without compromise. "Terrorists pose a grave danger to humanity. There should be no leniency in dealing with them, and all necessary measures must be taken to stamp out terrorism," he said. At the same time, he welcomed the progress in peace efforts between India and Pakistan, stating that establishing peace is a positive step forward. However, he expressed frustration over the misinterpretation of his past remarks, asserting, "We have always supported strong action against terrorists. Twisting our statements to paint a different picture is unacceptable."

Narayana reiterated that while peace is essential, it must not come at the cost of national integrity or security, and criticized the BJP for political hypocrisy on such a sensitive issue.

## Tender Scam in **Kadapa Exhibition**

BJP alleges tenders were manipulated to benefit specific individuals

BJP Kadapa District President Jangiti Venkata Subbareddy has levelled serious allegations against the Kadapa Municipal Corporation over irregularities in tenders related to a 45-day exhibition being held in the city. Speaking at a press meet held at the BJP Kadapa District Office on Sunday, he accused officials of bypassing key safety protocols and manipulating tender processes.

He claimed that the exhibition, currently underway, was set up without any fire safety, electricity, or other departmental clearances. "The tenders were first cancelled, then re-issued just to ensure the contract went to people close to certain officials," he alleged.

Subbareddy said that while the re-tendering process initially seemed to promise better revenue for the Corporation, it

eventually ended with a deal being awarded for a mere ₹30 lakh—an amount he called "nominal and shameful" for an event of such scale. He pointed out the inconsistency by citing that over ₹40 lakh was

collected by the Corporation from just a three-day Diwali Tapas Fair, questioning why only ₹30 lakh was charged for an exhibition running for 45 days. "Not only were the tenders not properly executed, but the exhibition is being held without any permission whatsoever. The Corporation officials have clearly failed in their duties," he said.

Subbareddy demanded that immediate action be taken against those responsible for the irregularities and accused the officials of acting with bias and negligence. He also warned that BJP would intensify its protest if no action was taken.

AP Amaravati JAC State President Bopparaju Venkateshwarlu has criticized the Andhra Pradesh coalition government for failing to announce the new Pay Revision Commission (PRC), even after a year since its formation. Speaking to the media in Anantapur on Saturday, Bopparaju expressed deep concern over the prolonged neglect of government employees' legitimate demands. He stated that it is regrettable that no steps have been taken toward announcing the PRC, leaving lakhs of

government employees in uncertainty. "Even after a

year, the coalition government has not responded to our rightful concerns. Employees deserve justice," he said. Bopparaju particularly highlighted the pressure faced by revenue officials and staff who are being forced to implement politically-driven decisions. He said that due to such pressure, officials are falling victim to legal consequences. Citing a



specific incident, he mentioned Deputy Collector Tata Mohan Rao from Guntur, who became an accused in a contempt of court case related to land encroachments. Calling the situation alarming, Bopparaju urged the state government to form a dedicated task force to ensure the safety and protection of revenue employees. He also demanded that the government allocate adequate funds to help them carry out their duties effectively.

He further criticized the government's unequal treatment of employees and teachers, saying such discrimination is unacceptable. "There should be no disparity in addressing the issues of different categories of government staff. Everyone deserves equal respect and support," he added. The Amaravati JAC leader's remarks reflect growing unrest among government employees, and he called on the coalition government to act swiftly and responsibly to resolve their issues.



## 72,519 Avail Rice Card Services **Ahead of WhatsApp Launch**

- New rice card services via WhatsApp from May 15
- 72,519 people already accessed six key services
- · Smart cards to be issued from June free of cost

State Food and Civil Supplies Minister Nadendla Manohar announced that 72,519 citizens have already utilized the newly launched rice card services, and from May 15, these services can be accessed from home through WhatsApp Governance. Citizens can simply send "Hello" to 95523 00009 to begin the process.

Speaking at a press conference at the Tenali Camp Office in Guntur district, the Minister announced that six rice card-related services were launched on May 8. These services include the issuance of new rice cards, division of existing cards, change of address, addition of members, removal of members, and surrender of cards.

These services are currently available at village and ward secretariats, and from May 15, they will be made accessible via WhatsApp as part of a digital governance initiative.

Minister Manohar said that smart rice cards will be distributed free of cost to eligible households starting in June. These smart cards will also contain details of family members. Single individuals, including those above 50 years of age, people separated from their spouses, orphans, and residents of orphanages, are uals have not completed it.

The Minister also addressed past delays in issuing new rice cards, explaining that they were due to the Election Commission's directives in March 2024 and the mandatory eKYC process. Now, with 95% of eKYC completion, the issuance process has resumed.

He said there are currently 1,46,21,223 rice cards in the state, covering 4.24 crore people. Since children under 5 and the elderly above 80 are exempt from eKYC, around 6.45 lakh individ-

Manohar also highlighted that transgender persons undergoing gender reassignment can apply for rice cards under this system for the first time. Additionally, special AAY cards will be issued to rural artists receiving pensions and marginalized communities such as Chenchus and Yanadis living in hilly regions, who will receive 35 kg of rice per month. He reiterated the government's commitment to streamlining welfare distribution through digital access and inclusion of all eligible categories.

## Nani Seeks ED Probe Into Chinni's **Role in Liquor Scam**

#### Letter submitted to ED citing laundering through Pryde Infracon LLP

Senior politician and former MP Kesineni Nani has formally written to the Enforcement Directorate (ED), urging an extensive investigation into the alleged role of Vijayawada MP Kesineni Sivanath (Chinni) and his close associates in the Andhra Pradesh liquor scam. The letter, addressed to the Additional Director of the ED, outlines serious allegations of money laundering, shell companies, and foreign fund transfers.

The complaint references FIR No.

21/2024 dated 23.09.2024, which is already under investigation by the Enforcement Directorate. It notes that the agency has previously sought related documents from the Vijayawada Police Commissioner. In this context, Kesineni Nani has highlighted what he describes as "a key aspect that requires immediate attention." According to Nani, although MP Kesineni Sivanath has publicly demanded a CBI probe claiming mistrust in the Special Investigation Team (SIT) formed by Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu, evidence suggests that Sivanath himself might be directly involved in the scam. The letter names Raj Kasireddy, a long-time business associate of the MP, as a key figure in the suspi-



cious transactions.

Public records reportedly show that Kesineni Sivanath, his wife Janaki Lakshmi, and Raj Kasireddy are joint partners in Pryde Infracon LLP, along with several other business ventures. Kesineni Nani alleges that these business structures may have been used to funnel and disguise proceeds from the illegal liquor trade, possibly violating provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002.

#### The letter urges the ED to broaden its investigation to cover:

- All LLPs, companies, and trusts linked to the accused and their family members
- Associated real estate, infra-

- structure, and tech firms Any shell entities, benami accounts, or circular transactions used for laundering
- Cross-border fund transfers and undisclosed foreign investments

In a further development, the complaint also ties Kesineni Sivanath and his network to the ₹2,000 crore chain-link scam, currently being investigated under FIR No. 266/2023 dated 16.09.2023 by the Central Crime Station in Hyderabad. According to Kesineni Nani, there is an overlap in the financial structures and people involved in both scams, suggesting a well-organized laundering network. "The scale and depth of these operations make it necessary for the Enforcement Directorate to act independently and uncover the full truth," the letter states.

At the time of this report, MP Kesineni Sivanath has not issued any official response to these serious allegations.

The demand for a federal investigation comes amid heightened political and legal scrutiny in Andhra Pradesh over alleged financial irregularities tied to the liquor trade, making this a significant development in the unfolding saga.

#### Kesineni Nani Alleges Threat to Life and Attack on Residence

TPN Correspondent | Vijayawada Former Vijayawada MP Kesineni Nani has filed a formal complaint with the Commissioner of Police, alleging a threat to his life and a deliberate act of vandalism at his residence — incidents he believes are directly linked to his recent social media revelations involving a sitting MP and the Enforcement Directorate's (ED) probe into a liquor

In his written complaint dated 11th May 2025, Kesineni Nani claimed that he received a missed call at 12:46 PM from the number 8008969677, and when he returned the call at 1:55 PM, the caller identified himself as Chakravarthy Kadiyala. According to the complaint, Chakravarthy used





abusive and threatening language and warned Kesineni to withdraw his complaint and stop naming him and the MP in connection with the ED's investigation. The caller allegedly threatened to kill Kesineni if he did not comply.

"This is a most serious criminal threat and should not be taken lightly," the former MP wrote in his appeal to the police, calling for immediate criminal action.

Further compounding the serious-

ness of the situation, Kesineni recounted a separate incident that occurred on 8th May 2025 at 9:56 PM, wherein an unidentified individual vandalised property at his residence, Kesineni Nilayam, in Vijayawada. The attacker, emerging from a vehicle parked near the east side of the property, removed iron road divider barriers, damaged plants near a pond, and threatened a security guard before fleeing. Though the vehicle number plate could not be clearly identified due to low lighting, the entire incident was captured on CCTV. Kesineni's Executive Assistant Shravan immediately informed the Patamata Police Station, following which ASI Kiran Kumar conducted a preliminary on-site investigation.



## **Property Tax Exemption for Defence Personnel in AP**

#### **Govt Extends Relief to Serving Soldiers Under Panchayat Jurisdiction**

Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan on Sunday announced a significant welfare measure aimed at honouring the sacrifices of India's defence personnel. # How the Indian Air Force Taught Pakistan That the Mythical 'Godzilla' Isn't Extinct After All

The recent conflict between India and Pakistan has proven to be a pivotal moment in modern air warfare, escalating quickly into one of the most significant aerial engagements between the nuclear-armed neighbors since the 1971 war. The Indian Air Force (IAF) emerged as the central force in this battle, playing a pivotal role in shaping the conflict's outcome, demonstrating both military sophistication and operational precision.

The IAF's strategic actions began with precision strikes on terrorist camps in Pakistan, executed despite the absence of the element of surprise. The operations were carried out in high-risk conditions, with a deliberate avoidance of military targets to prevent escalation, which would otherwise have led to civilian casualties. This careful approach allowed the IAF to demonstrate an exemplary escalation management strategy while meeting 100% of the national leadership's intent.

The course of the conflict unfolded with methodical precision, starting with targeted strikes on terrorist nodes, followed by engagements with Long-Range Surface-to-Air Missiles (LR-SAMs), and eventually neutralizing advanced air defence systems like the HQ-9. As the battle intensified, Pakistan responded with desperate strikes against IAF bases, but these were ineffective as Pakistan's air defences had been systematically dismantled. The IAF, maintaining relentless offensive operations, engaged Pakistan's remaining defences, while carefully navigating below nuclear



thresholds to avoid further escalation.

One of the most unprecedented challenges in this conflict was the IAF's ability to ward off waves of drones, missiles, and enemy aircraft over a stretch of more than 1,000 kilometers. This level of sustained defence is unprecedented in modern warfare, particularly given the terrain and the near-peer threat posed by Pakistan. Despite early losses, the IAF successfully neutralized advanced air defence systems, such as the HQ-9, and maintained control of the air. Throughout the conflict, the IAF not only excelled in offensive operations but also exhibited remarkable defensive capability. While global military powers like the United States and Israel have maintained air supremacy in their respective conflicts, the IAF managed to confront a sustained multi-vector threat across such an extended frontier. This coordinated defence effort between IAF and Army air defence units further showcased India's military coordination and preparedness.

Strategically, the IAF's control of the air was the determining factor in

the outcome of the conflict. Pakistan, while possessing nuclear deterrence capabilities, was forced to initiate a ceasefire after being unable to maintain control of the skies. The PAF, the arrowhead of Pakistan's military might, was effectively neutralized by India's air superiority. This shift led to Pakistan's diplomatic overtures through the DGMO hotline, signaling their willingness to de-escalate as a direct result of losing the air battle.

The strategic success of the IAF in this conflict will likely become a case study in modern air power, particularly in

how middle powers can achieve limited strategic objectives while managing escalation in the face of nuclear adversaries. The IAF's ability to combine offensive and defensive operations effectively, while maintaining control of the air and minimizing escalation, highlights the future of warfare, where air power is central to achieving decisive results.

However, despite this impressive performance, introspection is crucial for the IAF to maintain its advantage. The IAF must identify any gaps exposed during operations and accelerate efforts in capability development, indigenous production, and acquisition timelines. A rigorous after-action review process is needed to ensure that India's military can keep pace with evolving threats.

In the aftermath of this conflict, Pakistan's dismissive remarks about India's Rafale fleet—specifically, the comment by a PAF Air Vice Marshal that "Godzilla is extinct"—seems to betray a fundamental misunderstanding. The Rafale, long ridiculed by Pakistan as a "mythical" force, proved its destructive power and capability in the skies. For Pakistan, the "Godzilla" is far from extinct, and its devastating impact on Pakistan's air defence infrastructure is now etched in history.

Ultimately, the IAF's performance in this conflict will be remembered as a defining moment for Indian air power, solidifying its status as a formidable force capable of shaping the outcomes of modern warfare.

## Why Generative AI Won't **Replace Human Creativity**



Despite the hype, generative AI is far from replacing human creativity or making thinking redundant. With every semester, as more students submit bland, AI-generated emails and essays, the limitations of tools like ChatGPT become more obvious. At best, they churn out polite emails, generic responses, filler content, and basic presentations. Even then, their usefulness depends heavily on the quality of the prompt they're given.

This doesn't mean AI lacks value. Its real strength lies in data analysis processing vast datasets quickly and efficiently. AI has proven indispensable in fields like astronomy, medicine, and climate science. From identifying cancer cells to detecting new exoplanets or gravitational waves, AI supports scientific innovation by handling data at a scale and speed beyond human capacity.

However, large language models (LLMs) like ChatGPT function differently. They are not truly thinking or creating; rather, they statistically predict word sequences based on massive text datasets. As tools of pattern recognition, they imitate lan- AI is a powerful tool, much like the guage without understanding it — a point highlighted by researchers like Timnit Gebru and Margaret Mitchell,

who call LLMs "stochastic parrots." Noam Chomsky similarly describes them as statistical engines lacking the intuitive grammar-building capability of a child.

While AI may help a policymaker choose a podcast or summarize a report, it cannot draft original policy or investigate complex societal issues. Compare that to the symbolic power of S.H. Raza's 'bindu,' which evolved over decades of introspection and philosophical engagement. That distinction — between imitation and creation — is what defines the human role in art, science, and innovation.

## **India-Pakistan: Are We Stuck** in an 'Escalation Cycle' Now?

The recent terror attack in Jammu & Kashmir's Pahalgam, which claimed the lives of 26 civilians, marked a significant moment in the ongoing conflict between India and Pakistan. This attack, attributed to The Resistance Front (TRF), an offshoot of Lashkar-e-Taiba, exemplifies the continuing cycle of violence and retaliation between the two nations. India's response, including multiple airstrikes on Pakistani targets, raises the question: Are India and Pakistan now trapped in a dangerous "escalation cycle"?

This cycle is not new. The last time India faced a massive suicide attack was in February 2019, when 40 paramilitary soldiers were killed in a similar incident. India's retaliatory response then, which included an airstrike on the Jaish-e-Mohammad camp in Balakot, was aimed at both exacting revenge and sending a message. The airstrike in Pahalgam, dubbed 'Operation Sindoor,' follows this pattern but represents a significant shift in the choice and range of targets. By hitting at least nine terror sites in Pakistan, including those Yet, while Pakistan's rhetoric may directly linked to the Pakistani army, India signaled that it would not tolfrom its neighbor.

This response could be seen as the "rationality of irrationality" — an emotional reaction driven by the desire to ensure deterrence against future terror attacks, especially those that cause mass casualties. In theory, such retaliations would typically be irrational, as they risk triggering greater losses in a prolonged conflict. However, India's actions have been calculated to prevent future acts of terrorism while maintaining a careful balance between retaliation and escalation management.

In response to India's strikes, Pakistan has escalated tensions by increasing cross-LoC artillery shelling



and launching drone strikes targeting Indian cities such as those in Punjab, Jammu, and Kashmir. This retaliation highlights Pakistan's reluctance to back down, as it seeks to reassert its deterrence against India's growing conventional strength. Pakistan's defence minister has even warned of an "existential threat," suggesting that the risk of escalation — potentially even reaching a nuclear threshold — remains very real.

seem exaggerated, the threat cannot be dismissed entirely. On the one erate continued support for terrorism hand, India has retaliated against Pakistan's drone and missile strikes by partially neutralising Pakistani air defences in Lahore, a move intended to both target military assets and manage escalation. On the other hand, Pakistan's continued targeting of Indian civilians and expanding its attacks across the border makes it increasingly difficult to find a way out of this escalating cycle.

> Despite India's successful airstrikes and its claims of achieving its objectives, the situation remains tense. The Indian government's statement following the airstrikes that it would prefer to de-escalate and end hostilities has been contradicted by further retaliatory actions. Both countries are committing more resources and

effort to escalation, signaling a commitment to the cycle of retaliation.

The fragility of deterrence between the two nations is evident. While kinetic actions, such as airstrikes, may offer temporary satisfaction, they are not a long-term solution. In the long run, strategic measures such as suspending the Indus Water Treaty or placing Pakistan back on the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) blacklist may exert pressure on Pakistan to reconsider its support for terrorism. However, the central issue remains the domestic political calculus of Pakistan's military leadership, which continues to influence the broader conflict. With Pakistan's current military leadership and civilian government being among the weakest in recent history, it is uncertain how far deterrence will be effective. The escalation between India and Pakistan raises an important question: Can both nations break out of this cycle of retaliatory violence, or are they doomed to repeat history? As both countries inch forward, the global community must watch closely, for this delicate situation has the potential to spiral into an uncontrollable conflict, with far-reaching consequences beyond their borders. The path ahead is unclear, but the escalation cycle, once set in motion, may prove difficult to halt.





## Indian Navy Was Ready To Strike Karachi, **Kept Pak Ships Confined To Harbour**

The Indian Navy's strategic deployment in the Arabian Sea during Operation Sindoor played a critical role in compelling the Pakistan Navy to remain largely in harbor or close to the coast. This was revealed for the first time by Vice Admiral AN Pramod, who outlined the Navy's role in the counterstrike following the Pahalgam terror attack.

The attack, which occurred on April 22, 2025, had claimed 26 lives, primarily tourists, and prompted a swift and coordinated response from India. Vice Admiral Pramod explained that the Navy had quickly mobilized its assets, including carrier battle groups, surface forces, submarines, and aviation units, all of which were put on full combat readiness within hours of the attack. In a display of military might, the Navy conducted



multiple weapon firings in the Arabian Sea to refine tactics and ensure readiness for potential offensive actions.

"The aim was to revalidate our crew, armaments, equipment, and platforms to deliver precise ordnance on selected targets," said Vice Admiral Pramod. He further revealed that the Indian Navy maintained a "deterrent posture," ready to strike select

targets both at sea and on land, including Karachi, should the situation demand. This forward deployment, according to the senior officer, forced Pakistan's naval and air units into a defensive posture, largely confined to harbors or the coastal regions, a situation that was continuously monitored by India. The Navy's approach, while ready for offensive action, was carefully calibrated to avoid escalation.

"Our response was measured, proportionate, non-escalatory, and responsible from Day 1," Vice Admiral Pramod affirmed. He highlighted that the Indian Navy's operational dominance at sea played a significant role in Pakistan's eventual request for a ceasefire, which came after a series of military actions from the Indian Army and Air Force.

In a broader context, the Indian Armed Forces' response was a coordinated effort. Lieutenant General Rajiv Ghai, Director General of Military Operations, noted that any future violations would be met with a fierce response. Air Marshal AK Bharti, representing the Indian Air Force, echoed similar sentiments, emphasizing the precision and limited scope of India's airstrikes, which were focused solely on Pakistani military installations to avoid civilian casualties.



#### **Army Chief Grants Full Authority to Army Commanders to retaliate** to Pak's violations

In response to Pakistan's violation of the ceasefire arrangement on May 10, Chief of Army Staff General Upendra Dwivedi has granted full authority to Indian Army commanders to take counter-action in the event of any further violations of the understanding reached between India and Pakistan.

India and Pakistan had agreed on Saturday to cease all firing and military actions on land, air, and sea with immediate effect. However, despite this understanding, reports emerged that Pakistan violated the ceasefire during the night of May 10-11, prompting a review of the security situation by the Indian Army leadership.

Following the violation, General Dwivedi convened a meeting with the Army Commanders responsible for the western borders to assess the situation. The Army emphasized that the Chief of Army Staff had given commanders the autonomy to take necessary countermeasures if there were further breaches of the understanding that was agreed upon during the Director-General of Military Operations (DGMO) talks held earlier on May 10.

The Army's statement reiterated India's commitment to upholding the ceasefire arrangement but made it clear that any further violations would be met with a decisive military response. "The Army Chief has granted full authority to the Army Commanders for counteraction in the kinetic domain to any violation of the understanding reached," the Army said.

This move underscores India's readiness to protect its borders and respond to any provocations with military precision. While both nations had previously committed to de-escalating tensions, the Indian Army's clear stance signals that any future violations will not go unanswered, reinforcing the government's resolve to ensure the safety and security of the nation.

#### **Operation Sindoor: Over** 100 terrorists including high-value targets killed in May 7 strikes: says DGMO

In a special briefing on Sunday, India's Director General of Military Operations (DGMO) Lt Gen Rajiv Ghai revealed that the Pakistan Army lost approximately 35-40 personnel between May 7 and May 10 during retaliatory strikes along the Line of Control (LoC). The counterattacks were launched in response to aggressive actions by Pakistan, including drone and aircraft incursions into Indian airspace.

Lt Gen Ghai detailed that on the night of May 8-9, Pakistan made multiple unsuccessful attempts to target Indian military infrastructure using drones and aircraft. These attempts were followed by renewed violations of the LoC, which escalated into intense firefights. The Indian Army, in retaliation, conducted swift and precise counterstrikes, aided by the Indian Air Force, targeting key military facilities.

Operation Sindoor, which was launched as a response to the deadly terror attack in Pahalgam that resulted in the loss of 26 Indian lives, was designed with a clear military objective: to punish the perpetrators and dismantle terror infrastructure. Lt Gen Ghai emphasized that the operation's focus was not on civilian or military casualties but on destroying terror networks that posed a threat to India's security.

Air Marshal AK Bharti, also present at the briefing, elaborated on the extensive strikes carried out by the Indian Air Force, which targeted Pakistani airbases, command centers, and air defense systems. Indian strikes were reportedly carried out on bases including Chaklala, Rafiqui, Rahim Yar Khan, Sargodha, Bhulari, and Jacobabad, sending a strong message of deterrence against further aggression.



# Pakistan Welcomes Trump's Offer to Mediate Kashmir Issue

#### While Indian Opposition Criticizes the Proposal

Pakistan has expressed support for US President Donald Trump's offer to mediate between India and Pakistan on the long-standing Kashmir dispute. Trump's comments, made on Sunday, come after the recent India-Pakistan ceasefire. On his social media platform, Truth Social, Trump took credit for the ceasefire and vowed to work with both nations to address the "thousand years" of issues related to Kashmir.

"I will work with you both to see if, after a 'thousand years,' a solution can be arrived at concerning Kashmir. God Bless the leadership of India and Pakistan on a job well done!!!" Trump wrote.

Pakistan's Foreign Ministry promptly welcomed the offer, emphasizing the importance of resolving the Kashmir issue for regional peace and security. A statement on X (formerly Twitter) said, "We also appreciate President Trump's expressed willingness to support efforts aimed at the resolution of the Jammu and Kashmir dispute—a longstanding issue that has serious implications for peace and security in South Asia and beyond."

While Pakistan welcomed the proposal, leaders of India's opposition parties voiced their strong objections. Congress



MP Manish Tewari criticized Trump's framing of the Kashmir issue as a "thousand-year-old conflict," pointing out that the dispute began in 1947, when Pakistan invaded Jammu and Kashmir shortly after India's independence. Tewari also stated that Kashmir was legally ceded to India by Maharaja Hari Singh in October 1947, highlighting Pakistan's illegal occupation of parts of the region.

Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) MP Manoj Jha further expressed discontent, calling Trump a "new 'sarpanch" and questioning his right to comment on the Kashmir

issue. Jha contended that Trump's involvement undermines the Shimla Agreement, which emphasizes bilateral talks between India and Pakistan. He added that India's national sentiment was akin to the mood during the 1971 India-Pakistan war, suggesting that such matters should be addressed only by India and Pakistan.

Trump's proposal has sparked a divide, with Pakistan showing optimism for international mediation, while India's opposition parties strongly reject foreign involvement in the issue.

## Pope Leo XIV Urges Global Peace in First Message to Crowds, Calling for an End to War

Pope Leo XIV has appealed to the world's major powers to end conflict, urging "no more war" in his first Sunday message to the crowds in St. Peter's Square since his election as the new pontiff. Elected on May 8, Pope Leo used his address to emphasize the need for a global shift toward peace, particularly in conflict-ridden regions such as Ukraine and Gaza.

The pope expressed deep concern over the ongoing war in Ukraine, stating that he carries in his heart the "suffering of the beloved people of Ukraine." He called for "authentic and lasting peace" and emphasized the importance of a ceasefire in Gaza and the immediate release of all Israeli hostages held by Hamas.

Pope Leo also welcomed the recent cease-



it as a hopeful step toward lasting peace. He expressed his prayers for a world where the "miracle of peace" could be achieved, stressing that there is still much work to be done to end global conflict. #### **Trump Signs Executive Order for "Project** Homecoming" Self-**Deportation Program**

US President Donald Trump has signed a new executive order launching "Project Homecoming," a self-deportation program designed to offer undocumented migrants free flights and cash incentives to voluntarily leave the United States. The move, which Trump claims will save taxpayers "billions and billions" of dollars, aims to make it easier for illegal migrants to depart without facing legal consequenc-

In a video posted alongside the announcement, Trump outlined the details of the program. "Today, I signed an Executive Order to launch the first-ever self-deportation program. Illegal aliens who stay in America face punishments, including sudden deportation, in a place and manner solely at our discretion," he said. He further emphasized that any undocumented migrant could show up at an airport, book a free flight via a newly launched app called CBP Home, and leave the country without repercussions.

The program also includes a "very important exit bonus" to encourage migrants to participate in the self-deportation initiative. Earlier this week, the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) announced a \$1,000 stipend for migrants who voluntarily leave. The department asserts that this approach is "70 percent cheaper" than the current cost of detaining and deporting a migrant, which amounts to over \$17,000 per person.

Trump argued that the "deportation bonus" would save American taxpayers billions of dollars, with long-term savings amounting to trillions once all undocumented migrants leave. However, he warned that those who do not comply with the program will face "severe consequences," including jail time, financial penalties, property confiscation, and sudden deportation.

While the program is part of Trump's broader crackdown on immigration, including efforts to end various legal immigration pathways, it reflects his ongoing commitment to strict immigration enforcement since taking office. Trump concluded his announcement by stating that while illegal migrants who comply may face consequences, they could eventually have the opportunity to return to the US under specific conditions.

## "Positive Sign": Ukraine's **Zelensky Welcomes Putin's Call For Peace Talks**

## Sheikh Hasina's Awami League Banned By Bangladesh's Yunus Government

In a significant political move, Bangladesh's interim government has announced the ban of the Awami League, the political party led by former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, amid an ongoing trial related to the violent crackdown on mass protests that led to her ouster in 2024.

The decision was confirmed by Asif Nazrul, a government advisor on law and justice, who stated that the ban would cover all activities of the Awami League, including those conducted in cyberspace, under the Anti-Terrorism Act. This action will remain in place until the trial of the party and its leaders reaches a conclusion.

The decision comes in the wake of a brutal government crackdown on protests in July 2024, during which up to 1,400 demonstrators lost their lives, according to the United Nations. The crackdown, ordered by Hasina's administration, was aimed at silencing opposition protests. 

## **Adani Power to Supply 1500 MW to Uttar Pradesh from Upcoming Greenfield Power Plant**

## **Indian Economy Expected to** Grow by 6.5% in FY26, Driven by **Private Sector Investments: CII**

I poised to grow by 6.5% in the current financial year, bolstered by strong domestic fundamentals and a revival in private sector investments, according to Sanjiv Puri, the president of the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII). Speaking to PTI, Puri expressed confidence in the nation's growth prospects, citing a solid economic foundation that will help the country navigate global uncertainties.



"We are looking at 6.5% growth, which is achievable due to India's robust economic foundation," Puri said, pointing out key factors that will contribute to this growth, including softening interest rates, declining inflation, new personal income tax relief, and a surge in both public and private sector investments during the latter half of the previous year.

Puri also emphasized the importance of expanding trade partnerships to ensure India's economic growth amidst increasing protectionism globally. He noted that many countries, including the US, have introduced high tariffs and new trade barriers, creating challenges for global trade. To counter this, he advocated for India to strengthen bilateral trade deals with strategic partners, including the United States and the European Union.

"We must focus on bilateral trade agreements that benefit India's long-term interests," Puri stressed.

He further proposed the creation of a three-tier tariff framework for specific sectors to help India stay competitive in the global market and counter evolving trade dynamics.

In terms of domestic priorities, Puri highlighted the need for investments in agriculture, climate adaptation, and sustainability to drive long-term economic resilience. He also noted that while rural demand is picking up, urban consumption remains subdued but is expected to recover in the coming months.

Private sector investment is increasing in key sectors such as energy, transportation, hospitality, metals, and chemicals, although geopolitical uncertainties continue to create some hesitation among investors. However, Puri remains optimistic that with the right policies and strategies in place, India will continue to experience strong growth in the near future.

## **Equity Mutual Fund Inflows** Drop 3.2% in April, SIPs Hit Record High

 $E_{\mathsf{tual}}^{\mathsf{quity}}$ mufunds a slight dip in inflows in April, with a 3.2% month-onmonth decline, according to the latest data from the Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI). Inflows for the month stood at Rs 24,269.26 crore, down from Rs 25,082.01 crore in March.

The drop was seen across vari-

ous segments, including small-cap funds, which experienced a 2.25% decrease in net inflows, totaling Rs 3,999.95 crore in April, compared to Rs 4,092.12 crore in March. Despite the overall decline in equity inflows, the total amount through Systematic Investment Plans (SIPs) reached a record high of Rs 26,631.88 crore, highlighting the resilience of long-term investment strategies.

The decline in equity inflows could be attributed to several market dynamics, including shifting investor sentiment and the overall market conditions in April. However, the record SIP inflows signal continued investor confidence in the Indian equity market, particularly among retail investors who have increasingly turned to SIPs as a way to invest in a disciplined and long-term manner.



The rise in SIP investments is particularly notable, reflecting a growing trend of financial inclusion and investor education in India. SIPs allow investors to participate in the market with smaller, regular investments, making it accessible to a broader population.

Despite the drop in overall equity mutual fund inflows, the consistency in SIP contributions demonstrates the strength of India's mutual fund industry. The trend towards SIPs suggests that investors are looking beyond short-term market fluctuations and focusing on the long-term growth potential of the equity markets.

As investor confidence continues to shift towards more structured and long-term investment avenues, equity mutual funds and SIPs will remain a significant part of the Indian investment landscape.





## TikTok's Dangerous **'#ChromebookChallenge' Sparks Fires** in US Schools, Raising Safety Alarms

Anew and alarming Tik-Tok trend dubbed the "#ChromebookChallenge" is causing serious safety concerns in the United States, as students attempt to damage their school-issued laptops in a bid to gain social media attention. The challenge involves inserting metal objects like paper clips or pencils into the USB ports of Chromebooks, leading to electrical short circuits that can result in smoking devices, small fires, or even explosions.

The challenge has gained momentum on TikTok, and several school districts have already reported incidents linked to the trend. According to NBC News, Prince George's County Public Schools (PG-CPS) in Maryland has reported up to 10 such cases, with students damaging Chromebooks and in some instances to smoke or fire.

daily, he planned to incorporate more balance into his routine, allowing himself breaks when he started to feel fatigued.

With the ceasefire now in place, the BCCI and IPL Governing Council have initiated discussions with franchises, broadcasters, and host associations to finalize the remaining schedule of the tournament.

According to a reliable IPL source, the league will likely restart with the previously scheduled match between Lucknow Super Giants and Royal Challengers Bengaluru in Lucknow. The final, originally slated for June 1 in Kolkata, may be relocated due to a concerning rain forecast for the day. Ahmedabad has emerged as a strong alternative venue if weather concerns



"There will be no change in venues for Qualifier I and the Eliminator, which are set to take place in Hyderabad," the source confirmed. However, Delhi and Dharamsala are unlikely to host any more matches, with all equipment already removed from these locations.

The BCCI is also considering hosting the remaining 16 matches at just four venues to simplify logistics. The potential hosts include Hyderabad, Chennai, Kolkata, Bengaluru, and Lucknow. This move would mean home fixtures for Delhi Capitals, Rajasthan Royals, and Mumbai Indians could be scrapped.

BCCI vice-president Rajeev Shukla

stated that efforts are being made to resume the IPL at the earliest, with BCCI secretary Devajit Saikia confirming that consultation with the Government of India will be a crucial step before the final decision.

The suspended match between Punjab Kings and Delhi Capitals, abandoned midway due to security concerns, may see both teams awarded a point each. Punjab had reached 122/1 in 10.1 overs when the game was halted.
