

No CIBIL Score Needed For Rajiv Yuva Vikas: Bhatti



- CIBIL score not a criterion for Rajiv Yuva Vikasam selection
- 57,000 jobs already given; more to come via job calendar

Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu has clarified that beneficiaries under the Rajiv Yuva Vikasam scheme are not selected based on CIBIL score, rejecting social media claims as false and misleading.

Speaking in Tekulapalli Mandal of Bhadradri Kothagudem district, Bhatti called the Rajiv Yuva Vikasam scheme a boon for the unemployed, specifically aimed at empowering youth through self-employment. He stated that the district-level selection process will be completed by May 15, followed by the sanctioning of applications by May 28. Constituency-wise sanction letters will be distributed from June 2, on the occasion of State Formation Day.

The Deputy CM criticised what he described as a misinformation campaign on social media about the CIBIL score requirement. He said the scheme is designed to support new applicants, not those who have already availed loans under SC and other corporations. Bhatti added that while the government has already provided 57,000 government jobs, more will be announced through a job calendar soon. For youth who are yet to benefit, Rajiv Yuva Vikasam offers a unique opportunity for self-reliant growth. Responding to requests from public representatives of Illandu and Mahabubabad, Bhatti announced that surveys have begun for Bayyaram and Thularam water projects, with a sincere goal of ensuring water access to those regions. He also targeted the BJP, accusing the party of wasting its ten-year rule with a surplus budget by failing to create employment opportunities or implement self-employment schemes.

Telangana Adds 17 Lakh Names To Ration Cards After 8 Years



1.51 lakh new ration cards issued since February 13.73 lakh names added to existing cards State to require 6.952 tonnes of extra rice monthly

TPN Correspondent | Telangana In a major welfare move, the Telangana government has added nearly 17 lakh new names to existing ration cards between February and May 2025, expanding access to state-run welfare schemes such as Aarogyasri and subsidised food distribution. After nearly eight years of stagnation, the Congress-led state government began accepting fresh ration card applications through MeeSeva centres in February this year. Since then, 1.51 lakh new ration cards have been issued, under which

3.24 lakh people have been covered. Additionally, 13.73 lakh names were added to existing cards, clearing a large portion of the 21 lakh pending applications received over the years.

According to officials, many of those added had previously been excluded from state health and food security schemes due to the absence of their names on family ration cards. The recent initiative now brings them into the fold of key welfare programmes.

As a result of this inclusion, the state will need an additional 6,952 tonnes of fine rice every month to cater to the new beneficiaries, officials said.

The government has also proposed issuing two types of ration cards – white and pink – to differentiate categories of beneficiaries, but the

implementation of this system is yet to begin.

This large-scale expansion of the public distribution system reflects the Congress government's focus on widening social security coverage and addressing long-pending grievances related to welfare access.

Telangana's Minister for IT and Industries, Duddilla Sridhar Babu, announced that the government will establish skill training centers in all district headquarters across the state. This move is part of a broader roadmap spearheaded by the Young India Skills University to transform Telangana into a skilled talent powerhouse.

The minister visited the university's permanent campus under construction at Meerkhanpet in Kandukur Mandal, Ranga Reddy district, on Tuesday. After inspecting the site, he held a review meeting with contractors and officials, instructing them to complete the project on schedule. The campus is set for formal inauguration on December 9.

Monsoon Advances for Telangana

Rains with lightning expected for four days

The Hyderabad Meteorological Center has issued an orange alert for several districts in western Telangana as the state braces for thunderstorms, lightning, and gusty winds over the next four days. Weather officials attributed the change in conditions to the combined effect of a north-south trough and surface cyclonic circulation, which are triggering cumulonimbus cloud formations.

While daytime temperatures continue to remain high across Telangana, the evenings are bringing in sudden spells of rain, accompanied by thunder and lightning. These conditions are expected to persist in both the northern and southern districts until the end of the week.

Meteorological Department official Dharmaraju said that gusty winds, moderate to heavy rain, and frequent lightning strikes may occur in parts of western Telangana. In light of this, residents in affected districts are urged to remain alert and take necessary precautions during evening hours.

Meanwhile, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) has reported that the southwest monsoon is progressing steadily. By Tuesday afternoon, it had advanced into the south Andaman Sea, Nicobar Islands, and parts of the south Bay of Bengal. The Nicobar Islands have experienced heavy rainfall for two consecutive days, signaling active monsoon movement in the region.

Authorities continue to monitor the weather closely and advise the public to stay updated through official bulletins and alerts issued by the meteorological departments.

Terrorist Arrest Rumour False: TGCSB

TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad The Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB) on Tuesday, May 13, dismissed viral rumours claiming that a terrorist was arrested at Hyderabad's Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA). The Bureau clarified that the circulating video is from a mock drill conducted as part of routine security preparedness.

In a fact-check alert posted on social media, TGCSB labelled the claim as false and misleading, urging citizens not to share or believe unverified content. "The footage being circulated is from a recent mock drill at Hyderabad airport. It is not linked to any real terrorist activity," the Bureau said.

TGCSB also warned that spreading misinformation is a punishable offence and appealed to the public to follow only official sources



for updates.

The Hyderabad airport authorities issued a similar advisory, confirming that the visuals were from a mock drill exercise. They reas-

sured passengers that airport operations are normal, with enhanced security measures in place for everyone's safety. The rumour comes at a time

when the city is hosting the 72nd Miss World pageant, with 115 contestants from across the globe participating in events at various key locations since May 10. Authorities have tightened security at airports, hotels, heritage sites, and other venues involved in the international event.

The TGCSB also reminded the public of earlier incidents, such as fake news about Operation Sindoor, where users spread fear-mongering content on-

line. The Bureau stated that it is monitoring social media closely and will take strict action against anyone found spreading false information.

10,000 Chenchu families to receive Indiramma houses

Additional 500–700 houses for ST constituencies in tribal regions

TPN Correspondent Hyderabad The Congress-led Indiramma government, under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, is set to fulfil a long-standing dream of the Chenchu tribal community owning a permanent home. On Tuesday, Revenue, Housing, Information and Civil Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy announced that nearly 10,000 Chenchu families will receive Indiramma houses, bringing an end to their generations-long homelessness.

These houses are being sanctioned in tribal areas under four Integrated Tribal Development Agencies (IT-DAs)-Utnur, Bhadrachalam, Munnanur, and Eturu Nagaram—using the saturation method to ensure no family is left out. The Minister emphasized that this historic initiative is in line with the repeated advice and vision of Governor Jishnu Dev Varma and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who both advocated for permanent housing in tribal areas.

The Chenchus, a primitive tribe dependent on forest-based livelihoods like hunting and gathering forest produce, have traditionally lived in huts within forest belts. Acknowledging their deep-rooted attach-



ment to the land, the government has decided to construct homes at their current locations rather than relocating them—an approach no previous government had taken, the Minister stated.

The following allocation of 9,395 houses was announced across tribal constituencies:

Utnur ITDA: Asifabad - 3,551, Bodh -695, Khanapur – 1,802, Sirpur – 311, Adilabad – 1,430, Bellampalli – 326 Bhadrachalam ITDA: Aswaraopet -105

Munnanur Chenchu Special Project: Achampet – 518, Mahabubnagar – 153 Eturu Nagaram ITDA: Parigi - 138, Tandoor – 184

He further informed that although 3,500 Indiramma houses are being sanctioned per constituenstatewide, су additional an 500 to 700 units will be allocated to tribal constituencies under ITDA limits to address the special needs of these communities. While the beneficiary selection is already completed across the

state, 20% of units will be kept in buffer for each constituency to accommodate pending cases.

The Minister also addressed housing concerns in urban areas, particularly within GHMC limits, where many poor families prefer not to move far from their current slum locations. Referring to past instances where 2BHK houses in Kollur remained unoccupied, he proposed the construction of G+3 apartments within city slum areas, to ensure accessibility and continued livelihood support. Minister Ponguleti concluded by reaffirming the government's commitment to inclusive development and promised continued support to underserved communities.



BRS Tried to Block People's Government

CM to launch ₹12,500 crore Indira Giri Jal Saura Vikasam on May 18 BRS failed to deliver welfare schemes, alleges Bhatti

Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka came down heavily on the previous BRS regime, accusing it of sabotaging the very idea of a people's government. Speaking at a public meeting in Lakshmi Narasimhapuram of Illandu constituency, Mahabubabad district, Bhatti alleged that for the past ten years, BRS exploited public resources and denied the people basic schemes like farmer loan waiver, Indiramma housing, and Rajiv Yuva Vikasam. He recalled how tribal women farmers were tied to trees and beaten when they tried to

cultivate patta lands under the "Despite Forest Rights Act during the

previous Congress tenure. Bhatti announced that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy will launch the Indira Giri Jal Saura Vikasam scheme on May 18 in Chenchu Colony, Achampet (Nagarkurnool district), aimed at providing water security and horticultural development in tribal areas. The scheme will have a budget of ₹12,500 crore, supplying solar pump sets, sprinklers, avocado and palm oil plants free of cost to tribal farmers. Plans are in place to ensure quarterly income for the beneficiaries through the Horticulture Department.

severe financial difficulties, we're bringing schemes worth thousands of crores without burdening the people even by a rupee," said Bhatti. The Deputy CM stated that 3,500 Indiramma houses have been sanctioned per constituency, and a total of ₹22,500 crore is allocated to construct homes for 4.5 lakh beneficiaries, especially focusing on tribal constituencies. He called it a historic achievement at the national level. Bhatti took sharp digs at KCR's BRS government, asking why

they failed to implement schemes that are now being rolled out by the Congress-led

government. "In 10 years, not a single double-bedroom house was given, no land for Dalits, no KG to PG schools were set up, and not even a single large industry like Nagarjunasagar or a water project like SSRSP was built," he said. The Deputy CM said that the state was handed over to the BRS as a revenue-rich entity, yet they pushed it into a debt of ₹7 lakh crore, accusing the KCR family of bankrupting Telangana.

Bhatti listed the current government's achievements in the employment sector — 57,000 government jobs filled in just 18 months and another 30,000 to be filled soon. He



also announced that on June 2, sanction letters under Rajiv Yuva Vikasam will be handed over to five lakh unemployed youth, with a ₹9,000 crore budget to boost self-employment. He questioned why KCR never prioritized youth employment during his decade-long rule, and clarified that no popular scheme like Kalyana Lakshmi was scrapped. In fact, an additional ₹2,000 has been added to Rythu Bharosa.

The Congress-led Praja government waived ₹2 lakh farm loans in just its first year, while the previous regime

failed to even manage ₹1 lakh in a decade, he said. "We've already spent ₹21,500 crore on loan waivers," Bhatti revealed. He also highlighted monthly free rice distribution to 90 lakh families at an expense of ₹13,000 crore, free bus travel for women, and free electricity for those consuming below 200 units as major achievements. A proposal has been submitted to the Union Education Ministry for Young India International Schools to offer world-class education to poor children.

CM Busy with Beauty Contests, Not Farmers

Former Minister T. Harish Rao launched a scathing attack on Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, accusing him of ignoring farmers' distress while giving priority to beauty contests. Addressing a press conference at Telangana Bhavan, Harish Rao said that while jawans protect the country at the borders, farmers are fighting at procurement centers to sell their crops — but the government is nowhere to be seen.

"Revanth Reddy is not reviewing the plight of farmers but is busy holding reviews on beauty contests at the Police Command Control and Jubilee Hills Palace," he said. "Those who should be walking in paddy fields are now walking in fashion shows." Harish Rao alleged that grain procurement in the state has collapsed completely under the Congress regime. "The government said it would buy 70 lakh metric tonnes this Yasangi season, but hasn't crossed even 40 lakh tonnes. Around 4 lakh metric tonnes of grain are lying unsold at procurement centers," he pointed out. He added that ₹4,000 crore payments for purchased paddy and ₹512 crore in bonuses are pending. "Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy promised that payments would be transferred to farmers' accounts within 48 hours of procurement. But even after 10 days, farmers haven't received their dues,' he said. "Farmers are dying waiting at procurement centers under the hot sun. These are not natural deaths — they are government murders," Harish Rao stated emotionally, listing six farmer deaths due to prolonged delays at procurement centers across Telangana. "The so-called ₹18,000 crore investment assistance is yet to be disbursed. Even



after pre-monsoon cuts, Yasangi support hasn't been given," he added. Referring to CM's Assembly claim that there would be no "depreciation" under Congress, Harish Rao said farmers are losing 10 kg per quintal due to false weight deductions, leading to massive losses. "Jetty Raju from Mulugu committed suicide because of this issue," he said. "Farmers are forced to wait for 10 days at procurement centers, exposed to scorching heat without any basic facilities." He blamed the state's neglect for the farmer deaths that occurred at procurement centers Gagulothu Kishan (May 13, Mahabubabad), Jalapathi Reddy (April 15, Jagityala), Hanumandla Premalatha (April 21, Mahabubabad), Birru Venkanna (April 22, Nellikuduru) and Chintakindi Hanumaiah (April 26, Siddipet)

Etela Misusing BC Card for Votes

Chanagani Dayakar says Etela mentally disturbed over BJP politics

TPCC official spokesperson Chanagani Dayakar launched a scathing attack on BJP MLA Etela Rajender, accusing him of using the Backward Class (BC) card solely for electoral gains, while continuing to work against their interests in practice.

Speaking to the media, Dayakar alleged that Etela has become mentally disturbed after being denied the BJP Telangana president post. "He joined BJP not out of ideology, but to protect himself from the cases filed by KCR during his time in BRS," he said. He questioned Etela's commitment to BC welfare, claiming that he did not support the BC caste census, and instead, he was playing politics by posing as BC for votes and OC for business. Highlighting the Jamuna Hatcheries case, Dayakar said that Etela had only secured a stay, and the case was still pending in court. "He escaped KCR's grip by joining BJP, but if he fails to secure a top post there, BRS will throw him out too," he remarked.

Chanagani Dayakar further accused Etela of never welcoming any schemes introduced by the Congress government, especially those benefitting the poor and unemployed youth. 20 accused in cyber fraud arrested in Surat by TG Police

515 cases across India, 60 in Telangana alone

Hyderabad, May 14: In a significant breakthrough, the Telangana Police have successfully concluded a special interstate cyber operation named "Operation Surat", aimed at cracking down on a gang of cyber fraudsters operating from Gujarat. The operation, reminiscent in its intensity to a military-style counteroffensive, followed the successful completion of Operation Sindhur, and resulted in the arrest of 20 individuals who were involved in widespread financial scams targeting common citizens.

According to the Telangana Cyber Security Bureau, the gang members, who were based in Surat, Gujarat, had been involved in duping people through fake investment schemes and fraudulent part-time job offers. With over 515 cases registered against them across the country, including 60 in Telangana, the suspects were under close surveillance.



Following credible leads, two special teams of Telangana police were dispatched to Surat. In a 10-day covert operation, officers meticulously tracked down and arrested all 20 suspects. The accused include private company

employees, traders, and even the Vapi branch relationship manager of DCB Bank, showcasing how deeply embedded the gang had become in legitimate institutions.

The police seized a total of 20

mobile phones, 28 SIM cards, 4 ATM cards, 5 cheque books, 2 rubber stamps, and numerous documents from the accused. These items are believed to have been used to facilitate and conceal their fraudulent transactions.

The arrested individuals have been transported to Hyderabad, where further interrogation is underway. Authorities are now investigating the full extent of the gang's operations and working to identify and assist the victims of their scams. Officials emphasized

that the operation is a major step in curbing cyber crime and promised continued action against such fraudsters, who are exploiting digital platforms to ruin the lives of innocent citizens.

The protesting workers alleged that the management was behaving inappropriately towards women, enforcing humiliating rules such as requiring HR permission for women to use the washroom after every work activity. They also expressed anger over being denied basic employee rights, including leave and regulated working hours. Protesters claimed that the management was acting arbitrarily and unethically, creating a hostile work environment.

Demanding immediate action, the workers urged authorities to intervene and take steps

against the management for the alleged mistreatment of Tension prevailed in front of employees. The protestors included both male and female workers, who raised slogans and held placards highlighting the alleged exploitation.

Upon receiving information about the demonstration, the Panjagutta police arrived at the scene and detained the protesters, stating that the protest was conducted without official permission. The detained workers were taken to the Panjagutta police station.

The incident has brought attention to the working conditions within multiplex chains, especially regarding treatment of staff in high-pressure environments. While no official response has been given by PVR management yet, calls for an impartial investigation into the allegations are growing louder from worker unions and rights activists.

Five Arrested For Kompally Murder

Business rivalry behind brutal attack at weekly market

Five individuals have been arrested for the murder of a businessman, Syed Siddiq, in Kompally, Hyderabad, on Sunday evening, May 11. The arrests were made by Petbasheerabad police on Monday, May 12.

The accused have been identified as Shaik Ahmad (33), Shaik Rehmath (24), Kodimyala Shashi Kumar (23), Vagmar Raj Kamal (24), and Varikuppala Jampanna (20). While four of them are from Macha Bollaram, Jampanna hails from Old Alwal.

According to police, Siddiq (38),



who ran a battery light rental business with his father for vegetable vendors, was attacked at the weekly market in Kompally. Investigations revealed the murder stemmed from a long-standing rivalry with another businessman, Shaik Mo-

hammad, and his family. In March 2025, a violent altercation at the Medchal market led Siddiq to allegedly assault Ahmad, Shaik Mohammad's son. In retaliation, Ahmad allegedly plotted the murder, involving his brother and three accom-

plices.On May 11 at 7:45 p.m., the group tracked Siddiq's location and launched a planned attack. "Ahmad, Rehmath, and Shashi Kumar stabbed Siddiq repeatedly with knives. Raj Kamal and Jampanna joined in, hitting him with a vehicle key and punching him," a police official said.

Varikuppala Jampanna, one of the accused, has a criminal background with seven property offence and robbery cases registered against him since 2020, police added. All five accused have been remanded to judicial custody as investigations continue.

Dharmoji Kunta, a historic pond located in Survey No. 73 of Shamshabad town, is on the verge of disappearance due to uncontrolled waste dumping and official negligence. Spread across 12 pits over 10 acres, Dharmoji Kunta used to sustain the surrounding agricultural lands. VIP Letters to Be Accepted in Tirumala from May 15

Break darshans allowed for AP, TG public reps' letters

In a key announcement, Andhra Pradesh Endowments Minister Anam Ramanarayana Reddy declared that VIP recommendation letters will once again be accepted in Tirumala from May 15, allowing break darshans based on these letters from public representatives of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana.

This announcement marks a reversal of the earlier decision by the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD), which had suspended break darshans based on recommendation letters from May 1 to July 15, citing overwhelming summer pilgrim rush. The suspension had affected recommendation letters from board members and public representatives, allowing break darshans only for protocol-level VIPs.

Speaking to the media, Minister Anam clarified that the TTD has now decided to reduce the suspension period, and from Thursday, public representatives' recommendation letters will be honored once again for facilitating break darshans.

The initial TTD decision drew considerable attention and concerns, especially from political representatives and officials across the Telugu states. With this latest move, the government appears to be responding to that feedback by reinstating access, albeit slightly delayed.

The break darshan facility is a significant means for elected officials to assist devotees in securing expedited access to the deity, particularly during high-demand seasons such as summer. The revised move is expected to ease tensions and restore a crucial channel for facilitating pilgrim convenience through elected representatives. Further clarification from TTD authorities is expected regarding the updated guidelines and daily quotas for break darshan tickets under recommendation letters.

Streets Lights Out

Streets filled with sewage Locals report health issues, accuse officials of inaction

Serious civic issues have erupted in Muthangi's Vijetha Colony under the Tellapur Municipality of Sangareddy district, where overflowing sewage and non-functional street lights have made life miser-

able for residents. In a letter addressed to the Municipal Commissioner, the Sri Shivalaya Committee has highlighted the grave condition of the locality and demanded immediate action.

According to the committee, the drainage system in several streets of the colony has completely collapsed. As a result, sewage has stagnated on the roads, spreading unbearable stench and leading to an alarming rise in mosquito and fly populations. Residents, particularly young children and the elderly, are reportedly falling ill due to the unhygienic conditions.

Adding to their woes, vehicles are unable to navigate through the flooded streets, effectively bringing traffic to a halt. Emergency services and timely medical assistance have become nearly impossible, further endangering the lives of the residents. Despite repeated complaints to the municipality, the locals claim no corrective measures have been taken. In their letter, they

expressed anger over the silence of political leaders who had made tall promises during elections but have now failed to deliver. The Sri Shivalaya Committee urged the municipal officials to resolve the drainage problem on a war footing, warning that the



upcoming monsoon season could make the situation far worse. They appealed to the Municipal Commissioner to prioritise the health and safety of the residents by restoring the drainage system and fixing street lighting.

With the colony on the brink of a public health crisis, all eyes are now on the municipal authorities and their response to this desperate plea for help.



TG Students Deserve Sainik School Opportunities in AP

Telangana Minister Ponnam Prabhakar has urged the Centre and the Andhra Pradesh government to allow Telangana students to be treated as locals in AP Sainik schools until similar institutions are established within Telangana. He voiced his concerns during a media interaction in Hyderabad, pointing out the plight of nearly 20,000 Telangana students who appeared for the Sainik school entrance exam but were left disheartened due to existing policies and lack of access.

Prabhakar emphasized that while several states in India have Sainik schools, Telangana continues to remain deprived of one, even years after the bifurcation. He stated that the absence of such schools in Telangana is denying young aspirants a fair opportunity to pursue a military education and career, which is affecting their future prospects.

He also made a strong appeal to Union Ministers Kishan Reddy and Bandi Sanjay to intervene immediately in this matter and ensure justice for the state's students. "There should be no delay in establishing Sainik schools in Telangana. Until then, Telangana students should be treated as locals in AP institutions," Prabhakar said.

He expressed confidence that with central intervention, the issue can be resolved swiftly. He reiterated the state government's commitment to securing equal opportunities for Telangana's youth and protecting their educational aspirations in national institutions.

TPN Correspondent | Telangana State Forest, Environment and Endowments Minister Smt. Konda Surekha on Monday held a detailed review on forest fire prevention measures and wildlife conservation efforts. The meeting took place at the Secretariat, where the Minister conducted a video conference with Principal Chief Conservators of Forests (CCFs) from various zones and District Forest Of-

ficers (DFOs) across Telangana. Minister Surekha took stock of the preparedness against forest fires, particularly during the ongoing dry summer season. She inquired from the officials about the availability and functionality of fire-fighting equipment, especially to tackle major fire incidents that could cause damage to flora and fauna. She questioned which districts have reported the most forest fire incidents and what steps are being taken to prevent harm to wildlife in such scenarios. The Minister emphasized the importance of vigilance and proactive response in case of emergencies.

In view of the summer, Minister Surekha also sought details on the availability of drinking water facilities for wildlife, including in forest areas and zoos. Officials informed her that 2,168 watering holes have been established across various forest regions to ensure animals do not suffer due to water scarcity. They also explained that water is being transported daily by tractor tankers to refill these watering holes.

Minister Surekha issued specific instructions to pay special attention to the Nehru Zoological Park in Hyderabad and Warangal Zoo Park, given the footfall and animal diversity. She directed the zoo and forest officials to ensure adequate water and nutritious food, especially items with high water content like cucumbers and watermelons, are provided regularly to the animals.

She warned officials not to neglect any aspects of wildlife welfare and instructed them to ensure regular monitoring of food and water supply, especially during the peak summer period.

The video conference was attended by senior officials including PCCF (HoFF) Dr. Suvarna, PCCF (Wildlife) Eel Singh Meru, PCCF (Schemes) Jawahar, Wildlife OSD Sankaran, and Nehru Zoo Park Director Sunil Hiramath, among others.

End of an Era: Kohli and Rohit's **Test Retirements Signal New Transition for Indian Cricket**





In a monumental moment for Indian cricket, Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma have officially retired from Test cricket, closing a defining chapter in the sport's modern history. Kohli, 36, and Rohit, 38, will continue to represent India in ODIs, but their departure from red-ball cricket marks a critical transition phase for the national team — one filled with both challenges and opportunities.

Over the past decade, the duo shaped India's dominance in the Test arena. Kohli, with his aggressive leadership and unwavering commitment to the longest format, redefined India's identity in global cricket. Scoring 9,230 runs in 123 Tests with 30 centuries, he also became India's most successful Test captain with 40 wins. His relentless energy, passion, and fierce support for fast bowlers fueled a new brand of Indian Test cricket that found success overseas, most memorably in Australia in 2018–19.

Rohit Sharma, on the other hand, was a late bloomer in Test cricket. After years of inconsistency, he reinvented himself as an opener in 2019 and brought calmness and class to the top order. With 4,301 runs in 67 Tests, his centuries in

challenging conditions, such as in Chennai and The Oval, showed his maturity in the format. As captain post-Kohli, he led India to the WTC final — falling short, but carrying forward the team's competitive spirit.

Together, Kohli and Rohit bridged two cricketing generations. They stepped up following the retirements of legends like Tendulkar and Dravid, and now leave behind a team in flux. Their exit comes at a time when India lacks similarly experienced successors. Shubman Gill, 25, is expected to take over the Test captaincy. While he and young talents like Yashasvi Jaiswal and Sarfaraz Khan show potential, the team is still finding its new identity.

Their retirements mark more than the end of two great careers — they signify the start of a tough but crucial rebuilding phase for Indian Test cricket.

PM Modi's Firm Doctrine: No Talks, No Trade with Terror

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's powerful address to the nation on Monday night laid down a clear, uncompromising policy direction: India will no longer entertain diplomacy or economic engagement alongside terrorism. His words — "Terror and talks cannot go together, terror and trade cannot go together, and water and blood cannot flow together" have drawn a definitive line in India's geopolitical approach, particularly concerning Pakistan.

This bold message comes on the heels of Operation Sindoor, India's swift and precise military response to the gruesome April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam. The operation, involving the Indian Army, Navy, and Air Force, struck nine terror-linked targets across Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) and deeper inside Pakistani military installations, including Karachi's Malir cantonment and key radar stations in Lahore. The downing of a Pakistani Mirage jet further underscored India's readiness to escalate, if provoked.

Unlike previous retaliations, Operation Sindoor was not about emotional retribution. It was a calculated and restrained military strike, targeting only infrastructure linked to terror operations while deliberately sparing civilian zones. This restraint, paired with devastating effectiveness, speaks volumes about India's evolving military doctrine — rooted in precision, indigenous capability, and strategic clarity.

India's use of homegrown defence systems such as the Akash air defence missile and advanced counter-drone technology showcased the country's growing self-reliance in defence, as well as its tactical edge. The operation sent a message that India no longer relies on external validation or permission to act decisively against threats to its sovereigntv.

Modi also called out Pakistan's public glorification of slain terrorists through state funerals, highlighting the state's complicity in cross-border terror. He made it clear that the only topics India is willing to discuss with Islamabad are the end of terrorism and the return of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. Even foundational treaties like the Indus Waters Treaty are now "on the table," signaling a willingness to reconsider long-standing agreements if terrorism persists.

Importantly, Modi clarified that the ceasefire after Operation Sindoor was initiated at Pakistan's request, countering international speculation of external mediation, including from the United States.

With Operation Sindoor, India has set a new precedent in regional engagement — one defined not by diplomatic ambiguity but by assertive clarity. The onus now lies squarely on Pakistan to choose peace, or face continued consequences under a new Indian doctrine.







PM Modi pays visit to Adampur Airbase, interacts with soldiers

PM Modi Hails Air Force at Adampur Base, Warns **Pakistan of Retaliatory Doctrine**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday visited the Adampur air base in Punjab, a strategic Indian Air Force facility that recently played a crucial role in retaliatory strikes against Pakistan. Addressing air force personnel, he praised their courage and discipline during the recent escalation and reaffirmed India's unwavering stance on national security and counterterrorism.

Modi lauded the Indian armed forces for their role in Operation Sindoor, calling it a turning point in India's military doctrine. "This is not just an operation; it is a declaration of our strength, policy, and intent," he said, adding that its echoes are being heard globally.

Calling the armed forces the pride of the nation, the Prime Minister said, "Every Indian is proud of you. I have come here to have your darshan; this is a blessing. You have written history." He emphasized that the chant of 'Bharat Mata Ki Jai' is not a war cry but an oath that inspires both action and sacrifice.

Highlighting the impact of India's strikes, Modi said, "We trampled terrorists in their homes. Pakistan tried to target this base but failed. Their plans were crushed. Terrorists now realize there is no safe place for them in Pakistan. Their godfathers know the cost of casting an evil eye on India will be massive destruction."

The Prime Minister also declared

that India would not tolerate nuclear blackmail and that the country makes no distinction between terrorists and those who sponsor them. "India's 'Lakshman Rekha' is clear any terror attack will receive a definitive reply on our terms," he stated, calling Operation Sindoor the "new normal" in India's military posture.

He also commended the forces for taking precautions to ensure civilian air traffic was not affected during India's strikes, emphasizing the professionalism of the Indian military.

Asserting that India is a land of both Gautam Buddha and Guru Gobind Singh, Modi concluded with a stern warning: "If there is another attack, India will respond—firmly, decisively, and on our own conditions."



BJP Launches 10-Day Nationwide 'Tiranga Yatra' to **Honour Armed Forces**,

Opposition Cautions Against Politicisation

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Tuesday, May 13, kicked off a 10-day nationwide 'Tiranga Yatra' to pay tribute to the Indian armed forces and commemorate the success of Operation Sindoor. The campaign, launched in the wake of the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, aims to evoke national pride and celebrate India's military response to cross-border terrorism.

Operation Sindoor, executed on May 7, targeted terror camps across Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) in response to the killing of 25 tourists and a Kashmiri pony operator. The BJP's yatra is designed to amplify the message of national unity and resilience in the face of terrorism.

The yatra, which will continue until May 23, includes bike rallies, flag-hoisting ceremonies, public meetings, and outreach events in towns and cities across India. BJP leaders and cadres are participating in large numbers, waving the national flag and paying homage to the bravery of India's armed forces.

However, the initiative has drawn criticism from opposition leaders

who caution against politicising the military. Tejashwi Yadav, leader of the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD) and former deputy chief minister of Bihar, expressed reservations about the BJP's approach.

"I am proud of our armed forces for their strong response to terrorism," Yadav said, "but I firmly believe that the military should not be dragged into politics. Taking credit for the success of a military operation undermines the professionalism of our defence forces."

Yadav, currently Leader of the Opposition in the Bihar Assembly, reiterated his call for a special session of Parliament to allow all elected representatives — including Prime Minister Modi — to express appreciation for the military in a bipartisan manner.

He acknowledged that other INDIA bloc leaders, like Sharad Pawar, had called for an all-party meeting instead, but stressed that the shared sentiment across parties was clear: to honour and support the armed forces. As the Tiranga Yatra moves forward, it continues to stir debate — symbolising national unity for some and political opportunism for others.

In a significant diplomatic move, India on Tuesday expelled a staff member of the Pakistan High Commission in New Delhi, declaring the individual persona non grata for engaging in activities beyond the scope of their official duties. The official has been ordered to leave the country within 24 hours, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) confirmed in a fence, Naval, and Air advisors statement.

The expulsion comes at a time of heightened tensions between India and Pakistan following Operation Sindoor, a coordinated Indian military response Further intensifying pressure, targeting nine terrorist infrastructures in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK). The strikes were launched after the deadly Pahalgam terror attack on April 22, which claimed the lives of 26 people, mostly civilians and tourists.

India firmly reiterated its unchanged position on the Jammu and Kashmir issue in response to recent remarks made by U.S. President Donald Trump. Addressing the media on May 13, 2025, Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal emphasized that Jammu and Kashmir remains a bilateral issue between India and Pakistan, and there is no room for third-party mediation.

"The Government of India has a long-standing national position that any matters relating to Jammu and Kashmir are to be resolved bilaterally between India and Pakistan. This policy has not changed," Mr. Jaiswal asserted. He added that the only unresolved issue is the vacation of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), which India considers illegally occupied.

The clarification comes in the wake of President Trump's social media claims that the U.S. had successfully mediated a ceasefire between the two nuclear-armed neighbors, following India's Operation Sindoor—a targeted military campaign against terror infrastructure inside Pakistan and PoK. Mr. Trump also linked the ceasefire to the possibility of advancing trade relations between the U.S. and India. Rejecting this claim, the MEA spokesperson stated unequiv-



ocally that no discussions on trade had taken place in the conversations between Indian and U.S. leaders following the operation. "The issue of trade did not arise in any of the discussions between our leadership and their counterparts," Mr. Jaiswal said.

Further distancing India from any suggestion of nuclear escalation, he declared, "Operation Sindoor was conducted entirely within the conventional domain. We do not respond to or recognize nuclear blackmail." He also warned other nations against endorsing nuclear threat narratives, which, he said, could undermine global stability.

Jaiswal clarified that the ceasefire announced on May 10 was the outcome of direct communication between the Directors-General of Military Operations of India and Pakistan. "There was no role for any third-party mediation in this decision," he stressed.

Operation Sindoor, which began in the early hours of May 8, targeted nine terror camps and infrastructure sites across Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). Tharoor commended the precision and planning of the strikes, calling them "meticulously executed."



"I give full marks to the operation — from its naming to its execution. It was clearly a product of strategic military planning, not a haphazard or impulsive response," he stated.

Tharoor also underscored the importance of the message India has sent through these actions. "The message is clear — we are no longer willing to tolerate cross-border terrorism. The more they (Pakistan) push, the greater the consequences they will face," he warned.

Despite a ceasefire agreement being reached on Saturday at 5 PM, Pakistan reportedly violated the terms within hours, heightening the fragility of the peace. Nevertheless, Tharoor stressed the importance of India's resolve, noting that Pakistan now understands the price of provoking India.

In conclusion, the Congress MP urged the Prime Minister to continue addressing the nation directly during times of national security threats or crises, saying, "Every time the country faces such moments, the people deserve to hear from their leader."





Trump Begins West Asia Tour with Grand Welcome from Saudi Crown Prince

President Donald Trump commenced his four-day West Asia tour on May 13, 2025, with a high-profile visit to Saudi Arabia. The former U.S. President was warmly welcomed by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman at Riyadh's King Khalid International Airport. This visit marks a significant diplomatic engagement between the U.S. and Saudi Arabia, focused on pressing issues like Iran's nuclear ambitions, the Gaza conflict, oil prices, and regional security cooperation.

The Crown Prince is expected to seek deeper cooperation on energy and technology, including arms deals and AI development.

The visit comes amid ongoing instability in the region. While Saudi Arabia has increased oil production to help Trump curb inflation in the U.S., their economy relies on higher oil prices, raising questions about the sustainability of such cooperation. Meanwhile, Trump's diplomatic approach has unsettled Israel, as key decisions such as halting U.S. airstrikes against Yemen's Houthis—have reportedly been made without prior Israeli consultation. Trump's decision to exclude Israel from his first Middle East stop has also drawn attention. Analysts suggest this signals a shift, with Gulf states currently enjoying closer ties to Trump than Israel does. Trump aims Saudi Arabia and Israel, but Saudi demands—like U.S. security guarantees and progress on Palestinian statehood—may hinder swift progress, especially amidst the ongoing Israel-Hamas conflict.

Baloch Rebels Claim 71 Attacks Across Pakistan, **Urge Global Action Against Islamabad**

The Baloch Liberation Army (BLA) has claimed responsibility for a sweeping wave of attacks across Pakistan's Balochistan province, marking one of the most extensive escalations in the region in recent years. In a statement released on Sunday, the BLA said it had conducted 71 coordinated assaults across more than 51 locations as part of its ongoing 'Operation Herof'. The group targeted Pakistani military installations, intelligence hubs, police stations, and key transport routes, calling the campaign a direct response to Islamabad's continued exploitation of Balochistan and its alleged support for global terrorism.





Russia Downed Malaysian Airline MH17 In Ukraine, Rules UN Aviation Body

In a landmark ruling on Monday, May 13, 2025, the United Nations aviation body—the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)-officially held Russia responsible for the 2014 downing of Malaysian Airlines Flight MH17 over eastern Ukraine. The Dutch government confirmed the decision, marking a critical development in the long-standing international effort to seek justice for the 298 passengers and crew members who lost their lives.

Flight MH17 had departed from Amsterdam bound for Kuala Lumpur on July 17, 2014, when it was struck by a surface-to-air missile in airspace controlled by pro-Russian separatists amid intense conflict in eastern Ukraine. The aircraft was flying at cruising altitude when it was shot down, killing all on board. The tragedy drew global condemnation and sparked years of investigations and legal proceedings.

This recent ICAO decision stems from a case initiated by Australia and the Netherlands in 2022. While the ICAO lacks the power to enforce punitive measures, its rulings carry significant moral and diplomatic weight among its 193 member states. In the coming weeks, the

council will deliberate on possible reparations and further diplomatic steps.

Dutch Foreign Minister Caspar Veldkamp welcomed the ruling, calling it "an important step towards establishing the truth and achieving justice and accountability for all victims of Flight MH17, and their families and loved ones." He also emphasized that the verdict sends a strong message to the international community: nations cannot violate international law without consequences.

The ICAO's decision builds on earlier findings. In November 2022, a Dutch court convicted two Russians and a Ukrainian in absentia for their roles in the attack. Moscow dismissed the verdict as "scandalous" and reiterated that it would not extradite its citizens for prosecution.

Australia and the Netherlands are now urging the ICAO to press Russia into negotiations regarding reparations for the victims' families. Though the path forward remains diplomatically complex, the ruling marks a significant moral victory for advocates of accountability and international justice. The ICAO has not yet issued an official public response.

2 Indian Students Killed in Tragic Car Crash in **US, Indian Consulate Extends Support**

Two Indian students studying in the United States lost their lives in a tragic car accident in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, last week. The victims were identified as 23-year-old Saurav Prabhakar and 20-year-old Manav Patel, both enrolled at Cleveland State University in Ohio. The fatal crash occurred on the morning of May 10, when their vehicle veered off the road, collided with a tree, and subsequently struck a bridge along the Pennsylvania Turnpike.

According to local authorities, the incident took place around 7 a.m. near the Reading Interchange in East Cocalico Township. Saurav Prabhakar was driving the car at the time, while Manav Patel was in the passenger seat. Both young men were declared dead at the scene. The Lancaster County Coroner's Office confirmed that they succumbed to multiple traumatic injuries and ruled their deaths as accidental.



A third, unidentified occupant was also present in the vehicle. This individual survived the crash and was transported to Reading Hospital for treatment. Details about their condition have not The incident serves as a somber revet been released.

The news of the students' untimely deaths has sent shockwaves through the Indian community abroad and at

Anthony Albanese was officially sworn in as Prime Minister of Australia for a second term on Tuesday, May 13, 2025, following a sweeping victory by his center-left Labor Party in the recent national elections. The swearing-in ceremony, conducted by Governor-General Sam Mostyn, took place at Government House in Canberra and also included the formal appointment of his cabinet.

Albanese's win marks the formation of the largest Labor government since Australia's federation in 1901. The party secured at least 92 out of 150 seats in the House of Representatives, according to preliminary results from the Australian Electoral Commission. His come-from-behind victory has been attributed to a voter backlash against global instability, much of it linked to policies introduced by U.S. President Donald Trump, particularly in areas of trade, foreign relations, and climate diplomacy.

The opposition Liberal Party faced a major defeat, with its leader Peter Dutton losing his seat. In response, the party appointed Sussan Ley as its new leader, making her the first woman to lead the federal Liberal Party. The Liberals also lost several

urban seats to independent female candidates who campaigned on platforms advocating for climate action and gender equality.

In his new cabinet, Albanese retained key ministers in positions such as treasury, foreign affairs, defence, and trade, signaling a commitment to continuity. Michelle Rowland has taken over as attorney-general, Murray Watt was named environment minister, and Tanya Plibersek was appointed minister for social services.

Industry leaders welcomed the cabinet announcement, with Business Council of Australia CEO Bran Black praising the government's stability and calling for environmental law reforms. He emphasized the importance of international trade to the economy, particularly amid ongoing global geopolitical uncertainties.

Prime Minister Albanese is set to begin his second term with key diplomatic engagements. He will travel to Indonesia on Wednesday and later attend the inauguration mass of Pope Leo XIV in Rome. During the visit, he is also expected to meet European leaders, including European Commission President Ursula von der Leven, to discuss trade and economic cooperation.

Paytm Shares Drop 5% as Ant Group Plans Rs 2,066 Crore Stake Sale



Chares of One97 Communi-**J**cations, the parent company of Paytm, saw a significant decline of 5% during Tuesday morning trading after news emerged that Ant Group, the financial services affiliate of Alibaba, plans to offload up to 4% of its stake in the company, valued at approximately Rs 2,066 crore.

The stock plummeted by 4.99% to Rs 823.10 on the Bombay Stock Exchange (BSE), while at the National Stock Exchange (NSE), it fell by 4% to Rs 830.55.

Sources revealed that Ant Group intends to sell up to 25.5 million shares of One97 Communications through bulk deals on both BSE and NSE on May 13. This sale of 4% of the company's stake would reduce Ant Group's holding in the digital payments firm.

At the end of the March quarter, Ant Group (Netherlands) Holding BV owned 9.85% of Paytm, according to shareholding data. This move by Ant Group is part of its strat-

egy to offload its holdings, which has triggered concerns in the market, leading to the drop in Paytm's stock price.

Goldman Sachs (India) Securities Pvt Ltd and Citigroup Global Markets India Pvt Ltd have been appointed as the placement agents for the stake sale.

Ant Group, previously known as Ant Financial, has been under significant pressure to restructure its investments in several global ventures, including Paytm. The stake sale comes at a time when Ant Group has faced regulatory challenges in China and is looking to optimize its international portfolio.

Investors and market analysts are closely monitoring the developments, as this large-scale sale could impact Paytm's stock price further in the short term. The announcement also underscores the volatility in the fintech space, with major shareholders making strategic adjustments amidst regulatory and market changes.

This surge in cargo traffic was fueled by significant increases across key sectors, including container throughput (up by 10%), fertiliser cargo (up by 13%), petroleum, oil, and lubricants (POL) (up by 3%), and miscellaneous commodities (up by 31%).

In terms of commodity handling, POL topped the charts, with 254.5 million tonnes (29.8% of total cargo), followed by container traffic at 193.5 million tonnes (22.6%) and coal at 186.6 million tonnes (21.8%). Other commodities, including iron ore, pellets, and fertilisers, contributed significantly to the overall growth.

Notably, Paradip Port Authority (PPA) and Deendayal Port Authority (DPA) sur-



passed the 150-million-tonne mark for the first time, solidifying their status as major maritime trade hubs. Additionally, Jawaharlal Nehru Port Authority (JNPA) achieved a record by handling 7.3 million TEUs, reflecting a remarkable 13.5% yearon-year growth.

In terms of port-led industrialization, Indian ports have allocated 962 acres of land, expected to generate Rs 7,565 crore in FY 2024-25, with lessees set to invest Rs 68,780 crore in future developments. Private sector involvement has also grown significantly, with investments in public-private partnership (PPP) projects tripling from Rs 1,329 crore in FY 2022-23 to Rs 3,986 crore in FY 2024-25.

Operationally, the ports saw a 36% improvement in Pre-Berthing Detention (PBD) time compared to FY 2023-24, while the total income of major ports grew by 8% to Rs 24,203 crore. Operating surplus also rose by 7% to Rs 12,314 crore.
