

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu saluted the armed forces for demonstrating the true fighting spirit of the country during Operation Sindoor. *He announced that a rally is being organized across the state in solidarity with the* soldiers, "irrespective of party affiliation." Speaking with pride, he said, "It is a matter of pride to be a grandson of Pingali Venkaiah, the designer of the national flag, who is in the hearts of all of us." Recalling a painful incident, the CM added, "Just hearing the name of Pahalgam brings back memories of that tragedy and makes my blood boil." His statement reflects both his deep respect for the armed forces and his emotional connection to the sacrifices made for the nation.

Deputy Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh, Shri Pawan Kalyan, delivered a powerful message at the Vijayawada Tiranga Rally, warning Pakistan that any attack on India will be met with retaliation inside their own homes. Asserting that Pakistan has consistently disturbed peace since the country's partition in 1947, Pawan Kalyan said their terrorist activities intensified only after witnessing India's growing development.

Joined by Chief Minister Shri Chandrababu Naidu, BJP State President Smt. Purandeshwari, state ministers, MLAs, and leaders of TDP, Jana Sena, and BJP, the Deputy CM took part in the three-kilometer Tiranga Rally from Indira Gandhi Municipal Stadium to Benz Circle on Friday. Thousands of citizens enthusiastically participated, waving national flags and chanting patriotic slogans like "Bharat Mata Ki Jai," echoing their solidarity with the armed forces and celebrating the success of Operation Sindhur.

Speaking at the rally's conclusion, Pawan Kalyan remarked, "We have seen the horrors of Kasab's 72hour attack. Pakistan is responsible for Mumbai,

Coimbatore, Gokul Chat, Jama Masjid, and Lumbini Park blasts. Our patience has been tested long enough. If they attack us, we will strike them in their own homes."

He condemned the role of "pseudo secularists" who undermine the Indian Army and demanded that such voices be firmly silenced. "People who insult the army, regardless of their position, should be shut down. It is our duty to give strength to our soldiers by showing we are behind them."

Pawan Kalyan also took a strong stance on the silence of celebrities in matters of national security, stating, "Celebrities are here to entertain, not govern. Don't expect patriotism from them. Patriots are like 23-year-old Murali Naik, who gave his life for the country. He is the real hero. His soul deserves peace, and we stand with his family."

State Minister Nadendla Manohar, Government Whip in the Legislative Council Pidugu Hariprasad, along with several ministers, MLAs, and alliance leaders, were present at the emotionally charged event.

# Whatever happened was just a trailer...

BrahMos showed "daylight in the dark" to terrorists

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh has issued a powerful warning to Pakistan, declaring that "Operation Sindoor" is far from over and that what the world witnessed was only a trailer. Speaking from the Indian Air Force (IAF) base in Bhuj, Gujarat, Rajnath made it clear that if Pakistan continues to sponsor terrorism, it will be taught a befitting lesson. Addressing the Air Warriors and security personnel alongside Air Chief Marshal AP Singh, the Defence Minister praised the success of Operation Sindoor and emphasized India's evolving defence posture. "What you saw was only the trailer. The full movie will be shown when the time is right," he said, drawing strong applause from the troops.

He came down heavily on Pakistan for continuing to harbor terrorist groups. "Just like we monitor repeat offenders, we have put Pakistan on probation. Ceasefire doesn't mean their activities have stopped. If they continue, our forces will respond decisively—I repeat, decisively," Rajnath warned.

Referring to the recent BrahMos missile operation, Rajnath proudly claimed that India's indigenously developed missile gave a strong signal to Pakistan. "There's a saying—'showing dots in broad daylight'. The BrahMos showed Pakistan daylight in the dark. In just 23 minutes, our Air Force crushed the terror hideouts that Pakistan was nurturing," he revealed, lauding the swift and effective execution of the mission.

### India's Firm Anti-**Terror Doctrine**

Rajnath Singh highlighted the shift in India's security strategy, stating that the country now believes in delivering strong punishment rather than forgiveness for those involved in terrorism. "Operation Sindoor is not just a military name, it is a declaration of India's commitment to fight terror wherever it exists," he said.

He further praised the bravery and determination of the armed forces. "You have shown the world that this was no symbolic strike. **2 PAGE** 

Where Others Saw Policies, **He Saw Opportunities** 

- ₹22,000 crore clean energy project launched in Anantapur
- Nearly 10,000 employment opportunities to be created
- AP aims to generate 72 GW renewable energy by 2029

In a significant stride towards making Andhra Pradesh a clean energy hub, State IT and Education Minister Nara Lokesh performed the Bhoomi Puja for a ₹22,000 crore hybrid integrated renewable energy complex to be developed by Renew Power in Betapalli village, Guntakallu constituency, Anantapur district. The project is expected to generate employment for around 10,000 people and contribute to both industrial growth and the transition to clean energy in the state.

Addressing the gathering, Minister Lokesh said the foundation stone laid today marks not just a project launch but the beginning of a green energy movement. "This project will not just power the grids; it will energize the dreams of our youth. Renewable energy is not an industry—it is a movement and a bridge to future generations," he empha-

sized.

He praised Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu's foresight in shaping policies that attracted leading players in the clean energy sector. "Where others saw policies, he saw opportunities. The ICE (Integrated Clean Energy) policy developed under his guidance has now become the blueprint for India's green revolution," Lokesh stated.

He also recalled that within just eight months, clean energy giants such as Tata Power, NTPC Green Hydrogen, Vedanta Serentika, SAIL Industries, and Brookfield were brought to the state, demonstrating Andhra Pradesh's emergence as a preferred destination for green investments.

### **Employment Scope**

The Renew Power energy complex will be developed in multiple phases. In the initial phase, ₹7,000 crore will be invested in setting up

587 MW solar, 250 MW wind, and 415 MW battery storage units. Eventually, the project will include 1800 MW of solar, 1 GW of wind, and 2000 MW of battery storage capacity. This massive facility is expected to provide approximately 10,000 direct and indirect job opportunities, significantly benefiting the local economy and advancing Andhra Pradesh's renewable energy goals.

### **Government's Mission**

Minister Lokesh said Andhra Pradesh's green energy sector is undergoing a strong revival after five dormant years. "Companies that fled under the previous regime are returning under the people's government. Renew's return is a clear indicator of the Chandrababu brand's credibility," he said.







# Dhanunjay, Krishnamohan **Anticipatory Bail Rejected**

- SC dismissal clears way for arrests in AP liquor scam
- ED seeks statement from Kasireddy, hearing on 19th May

Key developments unfolded rapidly in the high-profile Andhra Pradesh liquor scam investigation on Friday as the Supreme Court dismissed anticipatory bail pleas of two main accused, Dhanunjay Reddy and Krishnamohan Reddy. The apex court observed that granting bail at this stage could obstruct the ongoing investigation, signaling an imminent arrest by police authorities.

Both Dhanunjay and Krishnamohan, allegedly linked with the previous government's Chief Minister's office, have been under intense questioning by the SIT over the past three days. Their arrests have stirred political debates across the state.

In a parallel development, the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) court permitted recording the statement of Raj Kasireddy, a key figure believed



to be the mastermind behind the scam. Kasireddy has been ordered to file a counter affidavit, with the next hearing scheduled for May 19th. The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has also joined the probe, filing a petition to record Kasireddy's statement concerning financial transactions connected to the case. The ED petition will be heard alongside the ACB proceedings on the 19th.

The Andhra Pradesh State High Court has issued orders transferring 39 district court staff members across the state. # **National Workshop on Land Record Digitization**

Union Minister Pemmasani and Minister Narayana attend key session NAKSHA pilot to digitize 9.5 lakh properties across 10 AP municipalities Aerial and field surveys already underway in major towns

A national-level workshop on land record digitization was conducted at the ITC Welcome Hotel in Guntur, bringing together key stakeholders from central and state governments. Union Minister Dr. Pemmasani Chandrasekhar and Andhra Pradesh Municipal Administration Minister Dr. P. Narayana participated in the event, which focused on the NAKSHA program — a flagship initiative of the Centre to modernize and digitize urban land records across the country.

Minister Narayana, addressing the gathering, said the NAK-SHA program is a crucial step toward transparent and efficient urban governance. He emphasized that the initiative complements Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Viksit Bharat

Chandrababu Naidu's Swarna Andhra 2047 mission, both aimed at transformative development.

As part of a pilot project, the Centre has selected 152 municipalities nationwide, including 10 in Andhra Pradesh. The project in the state will cover the digitization of 9.5 lakh properties across these 10 municipalities, spanning 10 square kilometers. An aerial survey has already been completed in eight municipalities, and it is currently underway in Eluru and Mangalagiri-Tadepalli Municipal Corporations.

In addition, field surveys have been completed for over 6,000 government properties in areas like Kuppam, Ongole, and Anantapur. Of the 166 GPS rovers required for the field surveys, 158 have been made operational.

2047 vision and Chief Minister To support the large-scale survey operations, 643 field-level verification teams have been mobilized.

Minister Narayana stated, "Once this mapping program is completed, it will enable systematic planning, improve urban tax collections, and resolve property disputes effectively."

Officials from the Central Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Survey of India, and the State Urban Development Department participated in detailed technical sessions, where they reviewed the progress and shared strategies to complete the digitization work within the given timeframe.

With strong support from the Central government, the state is aiming to successfully complete the pilot project and set a benchmark for land record modernization in the country.

### showrooms in AP

Special Chief Secretary for Handloom and Textiles, R.P. Sisodia, announced major modernization plans for Lepakshi showrooms, aiming to blend traditional handicrafts with modern retail aesthetics. In collaboration with the School of Planning, the government is redesigning showroom spaces to better showcase the richness of Andhra Pradesh's heritage and culture.

On Friday, during a review meeting held at the Lepakshi headquarters in Vijayawada, Sisodia evaluated proposed showroom designs along with representatives from the School of Planning. He specifically reviewed the layout for a new Lepakshi showroom being established in Delhi and gave detailed suggestions. He emphasized that the architectural and interior elements must reflect Andhra's traditional handlooms, handicrafts, and broader Telugu identity.

Similarly, showroom designs for Rajahmundry Airport were also reviewed, and discussions were held on the progress of a new showroom in Tirupati. Sisodia underscored that while embracing modern infrastructure, the core identity of Lepakshi as a custodian of Andhra's art and crafts must be preserved.

Addressing Showroom Losses Despite the organization performing well overall, Sisodia raised concerns over certain showrooms that are currently

running at a loss. He conducted a meeting with showroom managers and reviewed the financial performance of each outlet. Questioning the gap between product quality and actual sales, he urged staff to identify core challenges such as outdated layouts, seasonal footfalls, or marketing gaps. "Every showroom must aim

for profitability. Solutions exist, but they need to be acted upon. I will be personally visiting each showroom to assess conditions on the ground," Sisodia assured.

Highlighting Craftsmanship and Packaging

Sisodia began his visit by exploring the main exhibition center at Lepakshi headquarters, where he observed a wide range of traditional artworks. Organization MD Vishva briefed him on the background and creators of each piece. Impressed by the artisans' craftsmanship, Sisodia stressed the need to make such products accessible across India through Lepakshi showrooms. He also emphasized the role of premium packaging in boosting appeal and sales. "Attractive packaging is a vital aspect of marketing — there should be no compromise here," he said.

State-level showroom managers and officials from Lepakshi's central office also participated in the review meeting. The modernization effort aims to position Lepakshi as a premier destination for authentic Indian handicrafts while enhancing commercial sustainability.

In a strongly-worded statement, the Defence Minister also questioned the International Monetary Fund's (IMF) decision to release a second tranche of \$1.023 billion to Pakistan under the Extended Fund Facility. This is not just a danger to India, but to global peace and stability," he warned, indirectly urging international institutions to reassess their support to Islamabad.

The speech marks a sharp escalation in India's public messaging on its counter-terrorism stance and further cements the government's policy of strategic deterrence through firm military and diplomatic actions.

With Operation Sindoor now being hailed as a turning point in India's counter-terrorism efforts, Rajnath Singh's statements serve as a strong signal to both domestic and global audiences that India will not hesitate to act with force when provoked.

### **Cyclone Shakti May Hit AP Soon**

The India Meteorological Department has issued a high alert as Cyclone Shakti begins to take shape in the southern Bay of Bengal. The system, currently forming as a surface depression, is expected to intensify into a low-pressure area between May 20 and 22, and potentially develop into a fullfledged cyclone between May 23 and 28. The impact of this evolving weather system is already being felt across Andhra Pradesh, with the Disaster Management Department predicting moderate to heavy rains in several coastal and Rayalaseema districts over the next 48 hours. Districts including Alluri Seetharamaraju, East and West Godavari, Kadapa, Sri Satya Sai Puttaparthi, and Annamayya Rayachoti are experiencing gusty winds and persistent rainfall.

Rainfall figures recorded so far include 54 mm in Amalapuram (Ambedkar Konaseema), 54 mm in Nidamarru (Eluru), and 42 mm in Kajulur (Kakinada). Amaravati villages have also reported rains with gusty winds.

The weather department stated that the depression is currently active at 1.5 to 7.5 km altitude over the Bay of Bengal. Conditions are highly favorable for it to intensify further, and if it evolves as expected, Cyclone Shakti will be the first major cyclone of the 2025 season.



is expected to affect Odisha and southern West Bengal, with gusty winds and heavy downpours likely across those regions. Neighboring Bangladesh, particularly Khulna and Chattogram, is also expected to face the cyclone's wrath if it strengthens. Additionally, the southwest monsoon is progressing faster than usual, likely to hit the Kerala coast by May 27, four days earlier than its typical onset date of June 1. The monsoon has already spread across parts of the southeast Arabian Sea, Maldives, Comorin region, South Bay of Bengal, and the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.

# **Promotion For Nara Lokesh..?**

- TDP to hold first-ever Mahanadu in Kadapa from May 27
- Buzz grows around creation of new post for Lokesh

The Telugu Desam Party (TDP) is all set to host its flagship annual event, Mahanadu, in Kadapa district — a first in the party's history. ### **Former YCP MLA Attacks Private Bus Conductor**

Tension flared at the Bangalore Bus Stand in Madanapalle town on Thursday when former YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) MLA Nawaz Basha allegedly assaulted a private travel bus conductor, triggering sharp criticism and raising concerns over increasing rivalries among private transport operators.

According to eyewitness accounts and police reports, the incident occurred around 1:30 PM when a private travel bus, operated by conductor Harinath-also known as Madhusudana-arrived at the stand to pick up passengers. Harinath, a resident of Donabail in Madanapalle mandal, has been working as a conductor for a private travels service on the Bangalore-Madanapalle route for several years.

The altercation is said to have stemmed from a longstanding rivalry between Nawaz Basha's bus service and the one operated by Harinath. Sources indicate that both services often clashed over ar-

Senior YSR Congress Party leader and former minister Perni Venkataramaiah (Nani) strongly criticized the Andhra Pradesh state government over the recent liquor case, alleging that it was purely politically motivated. Speaking to the media at the YSRCP central office in Tadepalli, Perni Nani said the case was a deliberate attempt by the ruling alliance to target party chief YS Jagan Mohan Reddy.

He pointed out that the Supreme Court's rejection of the bail petitions of Krishnamehan Reddy and Dhanunjaya Reddy included observations that clearly reflect the partisan attitude of the state administration. "The points raised in the Supreme Court's order clearly expose the intent behind this case. It's evident that the government is acting out of political revenge," he said.

Lashing out at Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, Nani alleged that the same person who was arrested and jailed in the skill development scam is now misusing power to fabricate a liquor scam against YSRCP leaders. "This is nothing but retaliation. Creating such false cases shows the desperation of the TDP-JSP-BJP alliance," he added. He further remarked that it was foolish to think that YS Jagan would be intimidated by these tactics. "They can't scare a leader like Jagan with manufactured cases," he asserted.

Nani accused the coalition government led by Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan of orchestrating the case with the clear aim of implicating and possibly arresting Jagan. He warned that people would see through the political conspiracy and that such actions would only strengthen YSRCP's resolve.

YSR Congress Party leaders, including Venkatagiri Coordinator Nedurumalli Ram Kumar Reddy, MLCs Parvatha Reddy Chandrasekhar Reddy and Meriga Muralidhar, submitted a formal complaint to Nellore District Collector Anand urging immediate action against rampant illegal mining and sand excavation in the district.

The delegation alleged that illegal sand mining is taking place in Saidapuram, and large quantities of sand are being transported unauthorizedly from Nellore city to other states in violation of mining regulations. They presented evidence of these activities, particularly illegal sand transportation from Kaluvai to neighboring states.

The Collector assured that legal action will be taken against those found violating rules. Speaking to the media, Ram Kumar Reddy and Muralidhar reiterated that no one is above the law, stating, "If benamis are involved in these irregularities, they too will be punished."

MLC Parvatha Reddy Chandrasekhar Reddy went further, alleging that since the TDP-led coalition government came to power, looting of sand, quartz, silica, and minerals has intensified. He alleged that rowdies, goons, and even drug addicts are being deployed to terrorize locals and obstruct any attempts to expose these illegal activities.

He linked the rise in murders and rapes in Nellore to the nurturing of anti-social elements by TDP leaders. "More than 20 murders have taken place in the past two months," he stated, blaming alcohol and ganja addiction promoted by unchecked criminal elements supported by the ruling party.

He warned that if these irregularities continue, complaints will be taken to the Central Government, and the YSRCP will begin a mass movement to expose and resist the exploitation and illegalities being committed under the current government. He reaffirmed YS-RCP's commitment to standing by the common people against this alleged injustice.

On Thursday, the situation took a violent turn when the former MLA, accompanied by more than 20 followers, allegedly confronted Harinath and physically assaulted him in full public view at the bus stand. Harinath later alleged that he was beaten for allowing his bus to reach before Basha's, and that such intimidation had happened before but never escalated to this level. The injured conductor received treatment at the local government hospital and subsequently filed a complaint with the Madanapalle Town police. Responding promptly, Circle Inspector Chandra confirmed that a case has been registered against Nawaz Basha and his followers. Investigations are currently underway. The incident has sparked outrage among the public and transport workers alike. Many are questioning the use of muscle power by political figures to influence private operations. With hundreds of private buses running between the Telugu states and neighbouring regions, competition among travel operators is known to be intense, but Thursday's events have shed light on the darker side of this rivalry.

Transport union representatives have condemned the incident, demanding swift and impartial legal action. "This is a blatant misuse of political influence and must not be tolerated. Authorities should ensure that justice is delivered without delay," a senior private travel association member stated.

The SP issued key directives to enhance crime control across the dis-

Regular monitoring and record updates of known criminals and rowdy sheeters are essential. Their movements must be assessed closely. Cannabis Eradication Drive:

The district police must act as per the state government's action plan to make Krishna district cannabis-free. Drone patrols should be intensified in deserted areas. Forward and backward links in ganja cases must be un-



covered, and accused arrested swiftly. Summer Theft Prevention:

With schools on holiday and many families out on travel, SP Rao instructed an increase in night beats. Locked houses should be regularly monitored, and CCS teams must step up their vigilance.

#### **Fingerprint Checks**:

Duty constables should check suspects and history-sheeters using the fingerprint MSCD (Mobile Security Check Device). **Traffic and Accidents:** 

Accident-prone zones should have barricades and signage. Officers must analyze accident data, set up visible policing during peak accident times, and ensure continuous vehicle checks to enforce traffic rules.

### ACP Tilak Arrests Accused Who Stabbed Woman 23 Times

# **Star Hotels Planned To Boost Tourism In Vizianagaram**

# **Trump's Global Gambit: A Wartime Display of the 'Art of the Deal'**



In a whirlwind fortnight of dramatic geopolitical shifts, US President Donald Trump has delivered what might be seen as a wartime demonstration of his famed "Art of the Deal" — albeit in ways that many traditional diplomats would call unorthodox.

Trump's actions over the past two weeks have undeniably lowered global tensions, even if the methods have raised eyebrows. From shaking hands with Syria's President Ahmad Al-Sharaa — a man once listed as a global terrorist — to lifting sanctions on Syria in exchange for strategic gains, Trump has made clear he'll deal with anyone, even adversaries, if it means closing a deal. The rumored payoff? A potential Trump Tower in Damascus.

Meanwhile, the process to end the Russia-Ukraine conflict is quietly unfolding in Istanbul. Though Trump offered to at-

tend the summit, President Putin declined. Turkish President Erdogan has taken the reins and even brokered peace with Kurdish separatists, ending a 40-year insurgency.

Trump's moves in the Middle East have been equally abrupt. He halted US operations against Yemen's Iran-backed Houthis after negotiating safe passage for US ships in the Red Sea. He also secured the release of a US hostage from Hamas, though at the cost of bypassing Israel in the talks—effectively allowing hostile forces to continue confronting Israel.

In another diplomatic twist, Trump cooled tensions with China by ending the US-China tariff war after secret talks in Geneva. But perhaps his boldest intervention came in South Asia, where he stepped into a volatile India-Pakistan conflict, averting what could have escalated into nuclear war.

However, India finds itself walking a diplomatic tightrope. Though economically and militarily stronger than Pakistan, it faces rising skepticism from Islamic nations and increasing pressure from Trump, who suggested business retaliation — including discouraging Apple from manufacturing in India.

For India, the path forward is clear: double down on economic growth, scale up manufacturing, and fast-track global trade partnerships. With ongoing trade talks in the US, New Delhi must maintain strategic focus and avoid being boxed in by Trump's transactional approach to diplomacy. In today's global landscape, technological dominance and manufacturing capacity are the real instruments of power — and India is well-positioned to wield both.



### **Tourism and Terrorism Can't Coexist: Why Turkey and Azerbaijan Risk Losing India's Goodwill**

In 2024, Indian tourists became a powerful force in the global tourism market, injecting over ₹4,000 crore into the economies of Turkey and Azerbaijan. However, the growing national sentiment in India, spurred by recent events, is shifting. The April 2025 terror attack in Pahalgam, allegedly backed by Pakistan-based terror groups, and the subsequent support from Turkey and Azerbaijan for Pakistan's stance have led to widespread calls for boycotting travel to these nations.

Both countries, despite reaping substantial financial benefits from Indian tourism, have repeatedly sided with Pakistan, a state recognized globally for its support of terrorism. In the wake of the Pahalgam massacre, in which 26 innocent Indian tourists were killed, Turkey and Azerbaijan's continued solidarity with Pakistan has sparked outrage in India. Instead of condemning the terror attacks, both countries criticized India's military response, Operation Sindoor, which targeted terror camps in Pakistan.

This hypocrisy has led many Indians to reconsider their travel choices. Despite their allure due to scenic beauty, affordability, and social media promotion, Turkey and Azerbaijan have increasingly become symbols of the moral dilemma facing Indian travellers. As a result, a grassroots boycott movement has gained momentum, with travel companies like EaseMyTrip and PickYourTrail suspending bookings to these countries. This boycott could potentially cost Turkey and Azerbaijan billions in lost tourism revenue.

This shift reflects a deeper ideological divide, with Turkey's President Erdoğan embracing a neo-Ottoman worldview, often siding with Pakistan on critical issues, including Kashmir. Azerbaijan, aligned with Turkey, has mirrored this posturing, prioritizing religious bloc politics over global principles like counterterrorism and human rights.

As India asserts its growing global influence, the country's citizens are becoming more conscious of how their choices, including travel, reflect their values. Turkey and Azerbaijan must reconsider their positions, or they risk losing India's goodwill permanently. India's citizens will continue to support destinations that respect its sovereignty and uphold the fight against terrorism.

### The Rise of Indigenous Defence Under PM Modi:

### A New Era of Strength and Sovereignty



Pakistan launched a large-scale provocation, sending hundreds of drones and missile-like systems across India's western border. This attack, accompanied by artillery shelling, aimed to overwhelm India's defences. However, India's response was swift and measured, with the Armed Forces deploying indigenous missile systems, AI-driven drones, and smart munitions. The retaliation, precise and impactful, marked a significant milestone in India's growing defence sovereignty under Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

procurements, like the Russian S-400 air defence system, which was secured despite external pressures, particularly from the United States. Furthermore, the Rafale fighter jets from France have significantly boosted India's air capabilities, providing a decisive advantage over Pakistan's F-16s.

India's domestic defence manufacturing has grown exponentially. Today, 60% of India's arms and ammunition are produced domestically, a significant rise from a decade ago. Major companies like Adani, Tata, and L&T now manufacture cutting-edge radar systems, artillery, and advanced defence equipment, contributing to India's self-reliance.

The success of the "Make in India" initiative is evident. In FY 2023-24, India's defence production reached Rs 1.27 lakh crore, with defence exports touching a record Rs 21,083 crore, showing a 30-fold increase in the past decade.

Under Modi, India has redefined its defence strategy, strengthening its military autonomy and ensuring a robust, self-sufficient future for its armed forces.



### **After Operation Sindoor: The Growing Threat of 'Al Qaeda India'**

provocations in Operation Sindoor, a new and concerning development has emerged. The group Al Qaeda in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS) has made a chilling declaration, urging Muslims to wage a 'holy war' against the Indian government, which it claims is targeting mosques and settlements in Pakistan. This renewed threat signifies AQIS's attempt to reassert its presence, particularly after a period of relative dormancy.

Formed in 2014 by Ayman Al-Zawahiri, AQIS initially focused on targeting American and Pakistani forces. However, following the death of its leader Asim Umar in 2019, the group shifted its focus, increasingly directing its attacks towards India. This was further evidenced in 2022, when Indian authorities uncovered a network linked to AQIS in Assam, aimed at inciting insurgency in India's eastern regions. The UN's 2024 report also noted the increasing cooperation between AQIS and Pakistan-based terror groups, raising alarms about the growing coordination of these groups under Pakistan's influence.

Following India's swift response to Pakistan's Despite these threats, the international community remains divided on the issue. UN reports have consistently failed to mention key Pakistani-backed groups like Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM), a result of Pakistan's pressure on the body. This manipulation of global narratives to shield terror outfits is part of a long-standing strategy employed by Pakistan, which continues to use terror as a geopolitical tool.

> The resurgence of AQIS and its calls for violence must be taken seriously by India. The group's recent statement, combined with its established networks in Assam and potential support from Pakistan's intelligence agencies, could lead to coordinated attacks within India. Pakistan's motive is clear: to further destabilize India, ignite religious tensions, and force India back to the negotiating table.

India must bolster its intelligence efforts, engage in international consultations, and adopt advanced technologies like AI and facial recognition to monitor and neutralize threats. Vigilance and cooperation are key in countering this new wave of terrorism.

# **India's Big Diplomatic Push: MPs To Brief Countries About Paks Terror Exports**

Launches Diplomatic Offensive to Expose Pakistan's Terror Links

In a significant escalation of its diplomatic outreach, the Indian government is planning to dispatch multi-party delegations of Members of Parliament (MPs) to major world capitals to directly brief foreign governments and institutions about Pakistan's alleged role in the recent Pahalgam terror attack and its broader terror ecosystem.

The move, spearheaded by the Narendra Modi-led government, marks a rare instance where elected representatives across the political spectrum will serve as diplomatic envoys. Their mission: to counter Pakistan's global narrative and build international consensus against cross-border terrorism.

The initiative comes amid heightened tensions following the April 22 Pahalgam attack, which claimed 26 lives, and India's retaliatory precision strikes under 'Operation Sindoor' against terror infrastructure in Pakistan-occupied territories. Officials involved in the planning said the delegations will stress that these strikes were the false narrative Pakistan has



aimed strictly at terror hubs, not been trying to build," a senior govcivilian targets.

### "Blind Lust To": Omar Abdullah, Mehbooba **Mufti's Spat Over Pak Water Pact** CM Omar slams Mehbooba over Tulbul navigation issue

A sharp political spat erupted on social media between Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah and his predecessor Mehbooba Mufti over the revival of the long-stalled Tulbul Navigation Project, following the suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) by India after the Pahalgam terror attack.

Chief Minister Abdullah called for the resumption of the Tulbul Project, which aims to enhance navigability on the Jhelum river and improve downstream hydropower generation. The project, located on the Wular Lake in Bandipora, was halted in 2007 after Pakistan objected under the IWT.

Taking to social media, Abdullah argued that with the treaty suspended, the project should move forward. "The Wular lake project was abandoned due to pressure from Pakistan. With the IWT in abeyance, this is the right time to reclaim our right," he said.

However, Mehbooba Mufti, leader of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), sharply criticised Abdullah's statement, calling it "provocative and irresponsible" at a time when tensions remain high following India's cross-border Operation Sindoor. "Such rhetoric risks reigniting conflict and inter-



nationalising the issue. Water must be a source of life, not a weapon," she posted.

In response, Abdullah accused Mufti of pandering to Pakistani sentiment and ignoring the historic injustice of the IWT to the people of Jammu and Kashmir. "Opposing an unfair treaty is not warmongering. It's about restoring the rights of J&K," he stated, adding that the IWT has long denied the region its rightful use of water resources.

Mufti fired back by questioning the National Conference's shifting political loyalties and invoking Sheikh Abdullah's past political stances. She defended the PDP's consistent opposition to the IWT's terms while emphasizing peaceful means and the return of hydroelectric projects to the state.

The war of words comes amid recent hostilities between India and Pakistan following the Pahalgam attack that killed 26 civilians.

### Public pressure forced govt to announce caste census: Rahul Gandhi in Darbhanga

Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, on Thursday reiterated his commitment to securing reservation for marginalised communities in private institutions, stating that he would "fight until the Central and state governments implement it."

Speaking at a public rally in Darbhanga, Bihar, Gandhi took sharp aim at Prime Minister Narendra Modi, accusing him of working against the interests of OBCs, EBCs, Dalits, and minorities, who collectively form what he called the "90% of India."

"The current government is not working for the benefit of the majority population. PM Modi is against the 90% — the backbone of this country," Gandhi declared, referring to historically disadvantaged communities.

He said that the Centre's recent move to announce a caste-based census was not an act of political will, but a response to mounting public pressure. "It was only because of the voice of the people — the vast majority — that the



government agreed to the caste census," he claimed.

Rahul Gandhi also outlined his vision for educational reforms, pledging a "complete overhaul" of the country's education system once the Congress comes to power at the Centre and in Bihar. He argued that current policies favour the elite and fail to serve the interests of students from backward and economically weaker sections.

"We will not allow a system that denies opportunity to those from humble backgrounds," he said. "When Congress forms the government, we will ensure that educa-

tion becomes accessible, inclusive, and aligned with the aspirations of every Indian — not just the privileged few."

Calling for affirmative action in the private sector, Gandhi stressed that social justice must extend beyond government jobs. "We need reservations not just in public institutions, but also in the private sector, where opportunities are expanding but inequality persists," he said.

The Congress leader's remarks are part of a broader campaign to position his party as the champion of social equity ahead of upcoming elections in Bihar and nationally.





# **Trump Secures \$200 Billion in UAE Deals, Launches AI Partnership During Abu Dhabi Visit**

In a major diplomatic and economic development, U.S. President Donald Trump on May 15, 2025, announced over \$200 billion in deals with the United Arab Emirates (UAE), including a significant agreement to deepen cooperation in artificial intelligence (AI). The announcement came after Trump's high-profile meeting with UAE President Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan at Qasr Al Watan in Abu Dhabi.

A key component of the package is a \$14.5 billion commitment from Etihad Airways to purchase 28 new Boeing aircraft, including the next-generation 787 and 777X models, powered by GE Aerospace engines. The White House emphasized that this deal would strengthen the longstanding commercial aviation partnership between the two nations, bolster U.S. manufacturing, and drive exports.

Etihad, Boeing, and GE Aerospace have yet to publicly comment on the deal. However, U.S. officials underscored its importance as a strategic win that supports American industry while reaffirming close economic ties with the Gulf state.

During the visit, President Trump was also awarded the UAE's highest civilian honour-the Order of Zayed-by President Sheikh Mohamed, highlighting the symbolic and strategic weight of the trip.

Another headline-grabbing outcome of



"U.S.-UAE AI Acceleration Partnership," a bilateral framework aimed at advancing technological collaboration. Both leaders participated in the unveiling of a massive 5-gigawatt AI campus in the UAE, which, once operational, will be the largest AI-focused facility outside the United States.

The White House stated that the AI agreement includes provisions for the UAE to invest in, construct, or finance data centers in the U.S. that match the size and the visit was the formal launch of the computing power of those in the UAE.

It also includes commitments to align UAE national security regulations with U.S. standards, particularly in protecting sensitive American-origin technologies from diversion or misuse. This marks a turning point for UAE-U.S. tech cooperation, especially after years of limited access to advanced U.S. chips due to the Gulf state's close trade ties with China. With these agreements, the UAE is poised to become a major global AI hub, while the U.S. reinforces its strategic foothold in the region.

# **Russia and Ukraine Hold First Direct Peace Talks in Three Years**

While neither side has outlined specific negotiation points, Turkish officials said the agenda likely includes proposals for a ceasefire, humanitarian access, prisoner exchanges, and the status of contested territories, including the Donbas region and Crimea.

Russian and Ukrainian sources have not confirmed whether any formal agreements were signed or frameworks were adopted during the session. However, both delegations acknowledged the significance of meeting in person after years of bitter fighting and escalating hostilities.



### Lahore High Court Adjourns Imran Khan's Bail Hearings in **May 9 Riot Cases**

The Lahore High Court (LHC) on Thursday adjourned hearings on the bail petitions filed by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) founder and former Prime Minister Imran Khan in eight cases linked to the May 9 riots. The adjournment came after the prosecution requested more time, citing the need to conduct photogrammetric and polygraph tests.

A two-member bench headed by Justice Syed Shahbaz Ali Rizvi presided over the session. During the hearing, the prosecution informed the court that an anti-terrorism court had granted permission for photogrammetric and lie detector tests to be conducted at Rawalpindi's Adiala Jail, where Khan is currently held. They urged the court to delay bail proceedings until these tests are carried out.

However, Imran Khan's legal counsel, Barrister Salman Safdar, strongly opposed the delay. He questioned the relevance of conducting such tests nearly two years after the alleged incidents and argued that investigations can proceed without keeping the accused in custody. Despite the objections, the bench postponed the hearing until May 27 and called for further arguments from both parties.

Earlier, on November 27, an anti-terrorism court had rejected Khan's bail in the same eight cases. His legal team maintains that the prosecution has failed to establish any direct link between Khan and the alleged offenses outlined in the First Information Reports (FIRs). The petitions argue that Khan has been falsely implicated as part of a politically motivated campaign, even though he was in the custody of the National Accountability Bureau (NAB) when the events occurred.

The defense contends that the only charge levied against Khan is one of "abetment," which, according to them, is vaguely defined and unsupported by concrete evidence. They further assert that inconsistencies in the investigative narrative have previously led to the dismissal of similar charges and requested the high court to overturn the trial court's decision and grant bail.

Meanwhile, PTI Chairman Barrister Gohar Ali Khan denied any backdoor deal involving Imran Khan's legal troubles. Speaking outside the Parliament House, he insisted that political issues must be resolved through open dialogue rather than secret arrangements. He confirmed that talks had taken place but declined to share specific details.

For the first time in over three years, Russian and Ukrainian negotiators met faceto-face in Istanbul on Friday, marking a potential turning point in the prolonged conflict that has ravaged Eastern Europe since February 2022. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy emphasized that his government's "number one priority is a full, unconditional and honest ceasefire."

The high-stakes talks, hosted by Turkey, brought representatives from both nations to the negotiation table at Istanbul's historic Dolmabahçe Palace, accompanied by a Turkish delegation. Turkish Foreign Minister Hakan Fidan addressed the gathering at the outset, expressing hope that the discussions could lead to meaningful de-es-

calation and the foundation for a durable peace agreement.

The meeting is the first direct interaction between the two sides since March 2022, when a short-lived peace process collapsed weeks after Russia launched its full-scale invasion. Since then, communication has been limited to indirect channels or third-party mediation.

Ukrainian President Zelenskyy reiterated his nation's stance ahead of the talks, stating, "Our number one priority is a full, unconditional and honest ceasefire that halts all violence, restores security to our citizens, and opens the door for broader reconciliation."

International observers are cautiously optimistic but remain wary. Past attempts at dialogue have faltered amid mistrust, shifting battlefield dynamics, and geopolitical posturing.

Turkey, which maintains strategic ties with both Kyiv and Moscow, is positioning itself as a neutral facilitator, pushing for continued engagement between the two nations. President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan has long advocated for diplomacy over military solutions in the region.

As the war continues to take a heavy toll both in terms of human lives and global stability—the Istanbul talks may represent a fragile but crucial opening for a path toward peace.

### Gaza Death Toll Rises as Trump Ends Middle **East Visit Without Israel Stop**

At least 70 Palestinians, including 22 children, were killed in Israeli airstrikes across Gaza on Friday morning, as U.S. President Donald Trump concluded his Middle East tour without visiting Israel. The fresh wave of bombings, particularly in northern Gaza, adds to the mounting death toll as the conflict enters its third month.

According to Gaza's Health Ministry, at least 50 people, including children, died in strikes around Jabaliya. Indonesian Hospital received 48 bodies, while Nasser Hospital in Khan Younis reported at least 16 more casualties. Strikes also targeted Deir al-Balah and the outskirts of Khan Younis, leaving hundreds displaced and infrastructure in ruins.



The Israeli military has not issued an immediate statement regarding the latest attacks, which extended well into Friday morning. Eyewitnesses described scenes of chaos and panic, with civilians fleeing on foot, by car, or on donkey carts. "The army entered upon us, bombing, killing.

We got out of the house with difficulty... we didn't take anything," said Feisal Al-Attar, a resident displaced from Beit Lahiya.

The renewed assault comes despite earlier hopes that President Trump's tour of Gulf nations could help mediate a ceasefire or reopen humanitarian aid channels into Gaza, which has remained under a strict Israeli blockade since early March. Trump did not include Israel on his itinerary.

U.N. humanitarian chief Martin Griffiths has accused Israel of "deliberately" blocking humanitarian aid, worsening conditions for civilians in Gaza. Meanwhile, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu reiterated his government's commitment to escalating the war until Hamas is "completely destroyed."

### Pakistan minister calls for 'dialogue' with India, warns over Indus Waters Treaty: 'Act of war'

In a significant diplomatic statement, Pakistan's Foreign Minister and Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar has called for a revival of the "composite dialogue" framework with India to resolve long-standing bilateral issues. His remarks come in the aftermath of heightened military tensions between the two nations following India's counterterrorism operation earlier this month.

Addressing the Senate on Thursday, Dar confirmed that the current ceasefire agreement with India has been extended until May 18. However, he emphasized that a political and diplomatic dialogue is inevitable for addressing the "problems" between the two neighbours."

Dar's remarks follow a period of intense hostilities. India launched precision airstrikes under 'Operation Sindoor' on May 7, targeting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan in retaliation for the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives. In response, Pakistan attempted retaliatory strikes on Indian military installations on May 8, 9, and 10. The skirmishes culminated in a temporary ceasefire agreement reached on May 10 after four days of cross-border missile and drone strikes.

While Pakistan is advocating for the resumption of composite dialogue — a structured framework initiated in 2003 under then-President Pervez Musharraf encompassing eight key areas, including Kashmir, Siachen, Sir Creek, terrorism, trade, and people-to-people contacts — India has made it unequivocally clear that talks with Pakistan will only take place on two fronts: the return of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir and ending terrorism.

Dar revealed that the Directors General of Military Operations (DGMOs) of both nations are scheduled to establish contact again on May 18, signaling a potential channel for de-escalation or further coordination on military matters.

## India's Trade Deficit Widens to Five-Month High as Exports Rise by 9%

Tndia's trade deficit widened to USD 26.42 billion in April 2025, reaching its highest point in five months. This increase in the trade gap was driven by a 19.12% rise in imports, which reached USD 64.91 billion compared to USD 54.49 billion in the same month last year. At the same time, exports for April grew by 9.03%, reaching USD 38.49 billion.

The growth in exports was driven by strong performances in sectors such as electronics, engineering goods, tobacco, coffee, marine products, tea, textiles, rice, gems and jewelry, spices, petroleum products, and pharmaceuticals. However, the surge in imports outpaced export growth, particularly due to higher crude oil and fertilizer shipments. The import of crude oil rose by 25.6% to USD 20.7 billion, and gold imports increased by 4.86% to USD 3.09 billion.



Apple Inc. has reaffirmed its commitment to India, continuing with plans to shift a significant portion of iPhone production for the U.S. market from China to India. Despite ongoing global production challenges, the tech giant is moving forward with its strategy, according to sources familiar with the discussions between Apple and the Indian government.

The company's plans for India remain unchanged, with a substantial part of iPhone manufacturing still taking place in China. However, Apple intends to produce iPhones destined for the U.S. market in India. Currently, India's factories, including those run by major contract manufacturers like Foxconn and Tata Electronics, contribute around 40 million units per year, representing approximately 15% of Apple's annual production.

While manufacturing iPhones in the United States is considered too expensive and unfeasible at present, the shift of U.S.-bound production to India aligns with Apple's broader strategy of diversifying its supply chain and reducing dependency on China.

Apple has been ramping up its investment in India, with production facilities in Tamil Nadu, where iPhones are assembled by Foxconn, and Karnataka, where Tata Electronics operates Pegatron Corp's manufacturing plants.

Tata and Foxconn are both expanding their production capacity in India, with new plants under construction to accommodate increased iPhone production. This shift is in line with Apple's push to make India a significant manufacturing hub for its products, as the company seeks to mitigate risks associated with its reliance on Chinese manufacturing.

The commitment to India comes despite trade tensions and global supply chain disruptions. Apple's decision reflects its strategic focus on securing a diversified and more resilient manufacturing base, leveraging India's favorable labor costs and growing industrial infrastructure. With these investments, Apple is positioning India as a key player in its global manufacturing ecosystem, ensuring continued growth and supply chain stability.

The widening trade deficit marked the largest gap since November 2024, when it stood at USD 31.77 billion. Despite the rising trade deficit, Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal expressed optimism about the country's export prospects. He highlighted that India had started the year on a strong note and was focused on expanding trade with 20 countries and six key commodities. Barthwal also mentioned that several free trade agreements (FTAs) would be concluded soon, further boosting trade prospects.

In addition to merchandise exports, India's services exports also saw significant growth in April, rising to an estimated USD 35.31 billion from USD 30.18 billion in the same month of for the country's trade sector.

The United Nations has revised India's GDP growth forecast for 2025 to 6.3%, down from the previous projection of 6.6%. The report highlights that global economic conditions are precarious, with heightened trade tensions and increasing policy uncertainty. The recent surge in tariffs, particularly by the United States, threatens to raise production costs, disrupt global supply chains, and exacerbate financial instability. Nevertheless, India's growth continues to be driven by resilient domestic consumption and strong government spending, which are expected to support the economy in 2025, despite the moderation in growth.

While India's GDP growth rate is projected to slow from 7.1% in 2024 to 6.3% in 2025, the country is still set to outpace many other large economies. The report also notes that India's inflation rate is expected to slow to 4.3% in 2025, staying within the central bank's target range. Unemployment in India remains stable, although gender disparities in employment highlight the need for greater inclusivity in the workforce.



On the global front, the report forecasts global GDP growth at just 2.4% in 2025, a sharp decline from 2.9% in 2024. This slowdown is expected to impact both developed and developing economies, with major economies like the United States and China facing growth downgrades. The report also stresses the importance of strengthening multilateral cooperation to tackle global challenges such as trade friction, rising tariffs, and geopolitical tensions.

Despite global challenges, India's economic resilience positions it as a key player in the global economy moving forward.

Tn the annals of political history, Pedro Las-Lcuráin holds a unique and bizarre record serving as Mexico's president for less than an hour. His presidency on February 19, 1913, remains the shortest in world history, lasting between 15 to 45 minutes. While the brevity of his term might sound unbelievable, it was a result of a political crisis that plunged Mexico into turmoil.

Born in Mexico City in 1858, Lascuráin was a lawyer who rose through the political ranks, eventually becoming the mayor of Mexico City in 1910. However, his unexpected leap to the presidency was less about ambition and more about unfortunate timing. In 1913, Mexico was embroiled in chaos after President Porfirio Díaz stepped down, leading to the brief presidency of Francisco Madero. But Madero's administration came to an abrupt end when General Victoriano Huerta orchestrated a coup.

As the foreign minister at the time, Lascuráin was in line to succeed Madero. When Huerta forced Madero and his Vice-President to resign, he needed a figurehead president to legitimize his rise to power. Lascuráin, reluctantly, stepped in and assumed the presidency, only to appoint Huerta as interior minister—a move that paved the way for Huerta's consolidation of power. After completing this act, Lascuráin promptly resigned, handing the reins over to Huerta.

In a shocking betrayal, Huerta had Madero and Vice-President José María Suárez executed, solidifying his authoritarian control. Lascuráin, however, managed to escape the violence and chaos that ensued. Unlike Huerta, who was eventually exiled after facing rebellion, Lascuráin returned to his law practice, living a quiet life until his death in 1952.

Though his presidential term was brief, Lascuráin's involvement in this dramatic political episode left a lasting impact on Mexican history.



### Naveen Chandra's Eleven: A Crime Thriller with Moments of Intrigue but Lacks Pace

Directed by Lokkesh Ajls, the film attempts to deliver a gripping murder mystery set in the coastal city of Vizag. While it offers a few moments of intrigue, it ultimately falls short of being a memorable thriller.

The plot centers around a string of mysterious murders in Vizag, all following a peculiar and similar pattern. ACP Aravind, played by Naveen Chandra, is assigned to crack the case. Initially hitting a dead end,

he finds a crucial clue from one of the victims' bodies. As he digs deeper, Aravind unearths shocking truths about the killer and their hidden motives. The rest of the story follows his pursuit—will he be able to stop the murderer, or does the criminal remain one step ahead?

Naveen Chandra gives a sincere and grounded performance as ACP Aravind. His composed, investigative demeanor suits the role well. The film's concept is solid, and a few twists—especially in the second half—help to raise the tension.

The emotional layer and backstory of the antagonist are also well-conceived, adding some depth to the narrative. Supporting actors like Shashank, Dilipan, and Abirami deliver decent performances that support the film's overall tone.

Despite its promising setup, Eleven suffers from sluggish pacing. The first half in particular moves



at a crawl, lacking the urgency and engagement that a thriller demands. Naveen's subtle performance, though fitting, becomes monotonous at times. Reyaa Hari, who also co-produced the film, is underutilized in a role with minimal impact.

A more gripping screenplay and tighter editing would have significantly improved the film. The lack of sufficient twists in the first half weakens the suspense.

Director Lokkesh Ajls has a clear idea but falters in execution. The cinematography by Karthik Ashokan is functional, and D. Imman's score adds some tension in key scenes. Editing by Srikanth N.B. could have been crisper to avoid the lag.

Eleven offers a few engaging moments and a decent storyline, but its slow pace and underwhelming execution limit its potential. A mildly engaging watch for crime thriller enthusiasts.
