However, in adherence to the principles of natural justice, which emphasize that no individual should be condemned without a fair chance to be heard, the commission has revised its approach. It will now provide KCR an opportunity to present his explanations and defend himself before concluding the investigation. Accordingly, the commission issued formal notices to KCR, Harish Rao, and Etala Rajender, asking them to appear within 15 days. The dates for their hearings have been set: KCR on June 5, Harish Rao on June 6, and Etala Rajender on June 9.

Harish Rao Meets KCR..

Former Minister Harish Rao met former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) at his farmhouse in Erravalli following notices from



the Justice P.C. Ghosh Commission regarding the Kaleshwaram irrigation project inquiry.

The commission, probing alleged irregularities in the project's barrage construction, has summoned KCR for June 5, Harish Rao for June 6, and BJP MP Etala Rajender for June 9. Harish Rao and Etala Rajender held key ministerial roles when the project was executed under KCR's leadership. This inquiry comes after incidents like the Medigadda Barrage pillar collapse and reported quality issues in other barrages. The commission continues to investigate project management, quality, and financial matters.

High-Level Probe Ordered Into Old City Fire That Killed 17

In the wake of the devastating fire near Hyderabad's historic Charminar that claimed 17 lives, the Telangana government has ordered a high-level investigation to probe the incident comprehensively. A six-member committee comprising senior officials has been constituted to examine the causes, evaluate relief efforts, and recommend future preventive measures.

The panel was announced by Hyderabad In-charge Minister and Transport Minister Ponnam Prabhakar on Tuesday. The committee will conduct a de-

Chief Minister Revanth Reddy expressed profound sorrow over the tragedy and emphasized the need for strict preventive steps and public awareness to avoid such disasters in the future. After receiving the committee's report, he along with Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka will hold a high-level review meeting to decide further actions.

The fire erupted near Gulzar House intersection in a building that housed shops on the ground floor and a family on the upper floors. Both Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka and Minister Ponnam Prabhakar visited the site immediately after the incident.

More shocking details have surfaced in the Vizianagaram terror conspiracy case. The National Investigation Agency (NIA) identified Sameer Al-Hind from Boyaguda, Hyderabad, as the mastermind who formed a jihadi group named Ittehadul Musalman and plotted to carry out explosions in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Karnataka.

Sameer recruited six members into the group, including Siraj, a mechanical engineering graduate who had failed to clear SI and Group I exams. Despite being the



son of an ASI in Vizianagaram and brother of an SDF constable, Siraj turned to extremism after multiple career setbacks. While preparing for Group I in Hyderabad, Siraj came in contact with Sameer and later with Farhan Moinuddin of Warangal and Badar from Uttar Pradesh. They began discussing communal issues and injustices online, which slowly turned into radical plans. On November 22, Siraj and Sameer visited Mumbai and met individuals including Adnan Qureshi and Zaheer alias Aman.

Later, on January 26, Sameer traveled to Delhi to meet Shahbaz and Zeeshan. Investigators believe Shahbaz later left the country and met Salman in Manduli. A Saudi-based man named Abu Musab reportedly trained the group remotely through the Signal app. Musab instructed them on bomb-making and gave information on locations for attacks. Following his guidance, Siraj ordered explosives online. Mean-



Hyderabad Metro Reduces Recently Increased Fares by 10%

Good news for Hyderabad Metro commuters as the Metro Rail management has decided to reduce the recently increased fares

by 10 percent. This revision comes following widespread objections from passengers against the fare hike implemented earlier this month.

The fare increase had taken effect from May 17, 2025, with the minimum ticket price raised from Rs. 10 to Rs. 12, and the maximum ticket price increased from Rs. 60 to Rs. 75. Additionally, L&T had announced fare increments ranging from Rs. 2 to Rs. 16 depending on the travel distance. After reconsideration, the Hyderabad Met-



ro Rail management announced that these increased fares will be reduced by 10 percent, and the new fares will be applicable starting May 24, 2025. This move is expected to lessen the financial strain on thousands of daily commuters who rely on the metro for their transport needs. The management's decision has been welcomed by passengers and stakeholders, reflecting responsiveness to public concerns

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Minister to KCR: Why Fear the Kaleshwaram Inquiry?

The Justice PC Ghosh Commission's notices to former Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) over alleged irregularities in the Kaleshwaram project have stirred political debate

in the state. Telangana Minister D. Sridhar Babu reacted to the development and urged the BRS chief to appear before the inquiry panel without fear if he has done no wrong.



Speaking to reporters in Peddapalli on Tuesday, Minister Sridhar Babu stated, "The notices have just been issued. I believe he will attend the inquiry. If he has not done anything wrong, what is there to be afraid of?" He emphasized that the law is the same for everyone, regardless of position.

Recalling his own experience, Sridhar Babu pointed out that during KCR's tenure, the BRS government had filed illegal cases against him in connection with the Kaleshwaram project. "I fought those cases for eight years. Eventually, the court dismissed them, declaring I had done nothing wrong,' he said.

The Minister's remarks underline the government's

stand that accountability must be upheld in major infrastructure projects like Kaleshwaram, which have come under increased scrutiny following concerns over engineering flaws and cost escalations.

Incentive For Both Differently-Abled Spouses

The Telangana government has announced a significant development for differently-abled citizens by extend-

ing marriage incentives to couples where both partners are differently-abled. Earlier, only couples where one partner was differently-abled were eligible for a Rs. 1 lakh incentive. However, a new Government Order (GO) issued by the Women and Child Welfare Department has now addressed this long-standing issue.

For decades, the existing scheme provided financial assistance only if one part-



ner was differently-abled and the other was not, leaving couples where both partners were differently-abled without support. The differently-abled community had been raising concerns about this exclusion for a considerable time.

Responding to these concerns, Minister for Women, Children and the Elderly, Sitakka, who also oversees the Welfare of the Disabled, took special initiative. She brought this issue to the notice of the concerned authorities, leading to the issuance of the revised GO.

The new order, signed by Anita Ramachandran, Secretary of the Department of Women and Child Welfare, now ensures that couples where both partners are differently-abled will be eligible for the Rs. 1 lakh

marriage incentive. Officials confirmed that this change revises the earlier policy that restricted incentives to only one differently-abled partner in a marriage.

This move has been widely welcomed as a progressive step toward inclusive welfare policies in Telangana, ensuring equal benefits for all differently-abled citizens, regardless of their marital partner's status.

Red Alert in Bengaluru, **Rains Hit Hyderabad Too**

Work from home advised in Bengaluru as city reels under heavy rainfall

Bengaluru is facing a severe weather crisis as heavy rains coupled with thunderstorms have brought normal life to a standstill. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has



issued an orange alert for Bengaluru city and a red alert for Karnataka state, with rainfall expected to continue from May 21 to 26.

In the past two weeks, 23 districts in Karnataka have already recorded 60% more rainfall than average. The Bengaluru Urban district alone received 278 mm of rain from May 1 to 20, which is 157% more than normal. On Monday night and early Tuesday, areas like Rajarajeshwari Nagar (150 mm), Kengeri (144 mm), Vidyapeeth (128 mm), and Nayandahalli (123 mm) experienced intense downpours.

Traffic came to a halt in multiple parts of the city. Roads such as Hosur Road, Silk Board Junction, Kasturi Nagar, Hoodi, Banneghatta Main Road, and Gouraguntapalya saw massive jams. Waterlogging led to the temporary closure of Hosur Road's elevated expressway, which was reopened around 10:45 am. Commuters to Electronic City took over two hours to travel just 7 kilometers, with images and videos circulating widely on social media. In response, major companies along the Outer Ring Road IT corridor, including Infosys, TCS, and Wipro, have either advised or mandated work-from-home for their employees. The situation is grim in low-lying residential areas as well. Many apartments have been inundated. A 35-year-old woman tragically lost her life when the compound wall of an apartment collapsed in BTM Layout. In the same apartment complex, a 12-year-old boy was seriously injured due to an electric shock. While Hyderabad has also been witnessing intermittent rainfall, the city has not reached Bengaluru's crisis level. However, with weather systems active across South India, vigilance is advised in Telangana as well, particularly in urban flood-prone zones.

Govt Releases Rs.16.07 Crore Every Monday For Indiramma Houses

The Telangana government continues its commitment to housing for the underprivileged by releasing funds regularly for the construction of Indiramma houses, despite ongoing financial challenges, said Revenue, Housing, and Information Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy.

On Monday, the government released Rs.16.07 crore for 1,383 houses that have completed basements and 224 houses that have completed wall construction. This is part of the ongoing disbursement process to support beneficiaries at various stages of house construction. So far, a total of Rs.53.64 crore has been released to 5,364 beneficiaries who have progressed in their construction work under the Indiramma scheme. The Minister monitored the payment status during a recent Zoom meeting with

department officials to ensure smooth fund flow. The Indiramma House Scheme's pilot phase has sanctioned 47,335 houses across Telangana. Construction work has begun on 20,104 of these houses. Out of these, 5,140 houses have completed basements, 300 houses have walls constructed, and 10 houses have slabs completed. Minister Ponguleti emphasized that all payments are made directly to the beneficiaries without any involvement of middlemen, ensuring transparency and accountability. The payment schedule is structured in four in-



stallments: Rs.1 lakh after basement completion, Rs.1.25 lakh after wall construction, Rs.1.75 lakh after slab completion, and Rs.1 lakh after the house is fully completed. The Minister also urged officials to expedite the construction work and complete as many houses as possible before the onset of the rainy season to avoid delays and damage. This proactive approach highlights the government's determination to provide affordable housing and improve living conditions for the economically weaker sections in Telangana.

We Will Garland KCR If Proven Innocent..



TPN Correspondent | Telangana Congress MLC Addanki Dayakar launched a fierce verbal attack on both the BJP and the BRS over the ongoing Kaleshwaram corruption probe. Speaking to the media, Dayakar said, "BJP doesn't stand for Bharatiya Janata Party, it stands for 'Buthu' Janata Party." He accused the BJP of hypocrisy and silence on key national issues, including Chinese aggression.

Referring to the Kaleshwaram Commission's notices to KCR, Harish Rao, and Etela Rajender, Dayakar welcomed the investigation and emphasized that no one is above the law, adding, "If KCR proves his honesty, I will garland him myself." He said the Congress government is committed to constitutional procedures and is not targeting anyone out of vengeance.

Dayakar also responded to criticisms around Saraswati Pushkaram, clarifying that no public representatives were insulted, and dismissed any need for assigning blame in that matter. Speaking about former minister Etela Rajender, he questioned whether Etela joined BJP just to

protect KCR.

He also attacked both the BRS and BJP, accusing them of turning Telangana into a "den of thieves". "What kind of project sees a pillar collapse within three years? The Minister explained that the ambitious SLBC tunnel project, launched with an initial budget of ₹4,000 crore, had encountered serious setbacks due to structural faults. A section of the tunnel had collapsed, halting the work and delaying the much-needed irrigation benefits for farmers. However, he stated that the current government is determined to complete the project without further delays.

"We are committed to resuming and completing the SLBC tun-

nel work within three years. It is a lifeline for our farmers, and all technical and administrative hurdles are being cleared," Komatireddy said.

CID Takes Over Saroor Nagar Kidney Racket Investigation

- Case initially registered by Saroor Nagar police handed over to CID
- Ten accused including three doctors arrested; mastermind suspected abroad

The Telangana CID has officially taken over the investigation into the kidney transplant racket that was uncovered at Saroor Nagar Alaknanda Hospital. The case was initially registered by the Saroor Nagar police under the Rachakonda Commissionerate on January 21, but following a recent government order, the probe has now been transferred to the CID for a more detailed inquiry.Earlier, the police arrested ten accused, including three doctors involved in the racket. The prime accused, Pawan alias Leon from Visakhapatnam, has been identified as the mastermind behind the operation. Pawan allegedly convinced impoverished individuals from various states to sell their kidneys by promising monetary compensation. He then procured patients who



needed kidney transplants and arranged for doctors from Tamil Nadu and Kashmir to perform the surgeries at the Alaknanda Hospital.

The racket reportedly spans states, includmultiple ing Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, and Telangana. However, Pawan is currently evading arrest, with a lookout circular issued amid hospitals for facilitating these

fears that he may have fled abroad, causing the earlier investigation to stall until the CID took charge. Investigations revealed that around 90 kidney transplant surgeries were conducted in the city by this gang. One significant player, Laxman from Visakhapatnam, acted as a middleman, offering commissions to small

operations. For instance, Dr. Siddamsetty at Janani Hospital, Saidabad, Hyderabad, performed over 40 such operations between 2023 and 2024 after receiving commissions of Rs. 2.5 lakh per surgery.Following the closure of Janani Hospital, another accused, Avinash, pressured Dr. Guntupalli Sumanth, MD of Saroor Nagar Alaknanda Hospital, to conduct these surgeries, paying him Rs. 1.5 lakh per operation and taking a commission of Rs. 1 lakh himself. Subsequently, more than 20 surgeries were done at Alaknanda Hospital, four at Aruna Hospital, and over ten at

another unnamed hospital. The CID is now intensively investigating the full extent of this kidney racket, verifying the total number of surgeries performed and the network involved. Further updates are awaited as the probe progresses.

Stop Crime, Boost Revenue: **Telangana Excise Dept Review**

DCA Raids Illegal Medical Shop in Alwal, Seizes Medicines Worth Rs. 30,000

Drugs Control Administration (DCA), Telangana, conducted a raid on a medical shop in Alwal, Medchal-Malkajgiri District, found operating illegally without a valid drug license. The raid took place on 19th May 2025 at the premises located at D.No. 1-20-232/NR, Shutter No. 1&2, Bank Colony, West Venkatapuram.

The medical shop, run by Y.V. Subba Rao, was discovered stocking a large quantity of unauthorized medicines for sale. Officials seized 20 varieties of drugs, including antifungal medicines, analgesics, and drugs used for erectile dysfunction, with the stock valued at approximately Rs. 30,000.

Theft at Raj Bhavan: **Techie Held for Stealing** Hard Disks

A theft at Telangana's Raj Bhavan, the official residence of the Governor, has sparked concern over security lapses at one of the state's most high-security zones. Four hard disks were found missing from computers in Sudharma Bhavan, a key building within the Raj Bhavan premises in Punjagutta.

Officials discovered the theft belatedly and reported it to Punjagutta police, who registered a case and launched an immediate investigation. The incident is believed to have occurred on May 13, but only came to light days later when Raj Bhavan staff noticed the missing hardware.

In a swift breakthrough, the police identified the accused as Srinivas, a computer hardware engineer employed at the Raj Bhavan. According to police sources, Srinivas was taken into custody for questioning and confessed to having committed the theft. He was subsequently arrested, produced before court, and sent to judicial remand. Authorities are now working to determine what kind of sensitive information was stored on the stolen hard disks. Given the strategic nature of the Raj Bhavan and its confidential operations, the missing data has raised serious concerns. Police say the investigation is ongoing and are exploring all possible motives behind the act — whether it was financially motivated or involved access to sensitive data. The incident has triggered a review of internal security protocols at the Governor's residence.

TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad Telangana has achieved a national milestone by becoming the top state in India for recovering lost or stolen mobile phones. According to the Central Equipment Identity Register (CEIR) dashboard, a total of 78,114 mobile devices have been recovered in the state as of May 19. CID Director General Shikha Goel announced the achievement on Monday, May 20, noting that Telangana has set a new benchmark in mobile recovery operations. The Hyderabad commissionerate led the effort with 11,879 devices traced, followed by Cyberabad with 10,385, and Rachakonda with 8,681.

Goel attributed this success to the proactive efforts of field officers who actively monitor and respond to citizen complaints through the CEIR platform. The CEIR portal, developed by the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), aims to curb mobile phone theft and block counterfeit devices.

Telangana's integration of the CEIR portal with its Police Citizen Portal has simplified the reporting process for the public. Residents can now easily lodge complaints regarding lost or stolen phones either on the Telangana Police website or directly through the CEIR portal. While CEIR was launched as a pilot in some states on September 5, 2022, Telangana officially adopted the system on April 19, 2023. The initiative is currently active in all 780 police stations across the state, with the CID serving as the nodal agency for its execution.

The impressive results have placed Telangana at the forefront of digital policing and public service delivery in India.

The DCA has warned wholesalers and dealers against supplying medicines to unlicensed shops. Such suppliers are liable for strict action under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act and must ensure that buyers hold valid drug licenses before supply.

Operating without a drug license is a serious offense punishable by imprisonment for up to five years under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act. Further investigations are underway, and the authorities have assured stringent action against all involved in this illegal activity.

Fatal Road Accident Near Villagers block road Demanding **Rangapur in Vikarabad**

A serious road accident occurred near Rangapur in Parigi mandal, Vikarabad district, when a travel bus collided with a parked lorry. The tragic incident claimed the lives of four passengers and left more than 20 others seriously injured.

All the victims were identified as residents of Chandanavelli village in Shabad mandal, Rangareddy district. The accident happened while they were returning from a party in Parigi. At the time of the crash, the bus was carrying 60 passengers. Due to the severity of injuries, six of the critically injured were shifted to a private hospital in Hyderabad for advanced treatment, while others were admitted to the Parigi Government Hospital.

The rescue operation was challenging, with police and locals using a JCB machine to pull out the four bodies trapped inside the bus. The accident caused a significant traffic jam, stretching for several kilometers on the highway.

Police are currently investigating the cause of the accident, considering whether it was due to the lorry being parked without proper signals on the highway or the bus driver falling asleep at the wheel. Further details will be released as the investigation progresses.

Protest withdrawn after ASP assures tender by May 25

Bhadradri Kothagudem: Tension prevailed in Thurubaka village of Dummugudem mandal as BRS leaders and local villagers staged a dharna on the main road, demanding immediate reconstruction of a collapsed bridge. Five Tiger Poachers Detained; 20 Accused in Asifabad

Tiger electrocuted, skin and nails recovered from accused

Forest officials have detained five poachers in connection with the recent electrocution and poaching of a tigress named K8 in Yellur village, Penchikalpet mandal. The investigation revealed nearly 20 habitual hunters linked to poaching networks in Maharashtra were involved. The crime came to light on May 15 when the electrocuted tigress was found. Officials said some poachers tapped power from nearby lines while others set electrified snares to kill the animal. After poaching, they skinned the tiger and extracted its nails and hairs. Officials recovered the tiger's skin buried in a eucalyptus plantation near Penchikalpet and seized nails and hair from suspects in Chinnaraspelli and Penchikalpet mandals. Equipment used for hunting was also recovered.

The area is known as a hotspot for wildlife hunting, with about 100 wild animals killed in similar ways in recent years. The forest department continues to probe to identify the specific roles of each accused.

The female tiger K8 was a long-time resident of the district's forests before falling victim to this brutal poaching incident.

In India, a section of the intellectual class has fallen into a predictable pattern-what one might call the Indian Intellectual Syndrome. This mindset treats government action with automatic suspicion, celebrates contrarianism as a virtue, and mistakes rhetorical superiority for civic duty. The result is a self-reinforcing loop of negativity, where criticism is the only currency and accountability applies to everyone except those

Time for a Reckoning **Final Reflections:** Freedom of Speech vs. **Abuse of Influence**

At the heart of this phenomenon lies a fundamental contradiction: the very intellectuals who champion freedom of speech often misuse that freedom not to enlighten or uplift, but to destabilize and divide. When influential voices consistently defend the indefensible, amplify fringe narratives, and undermine national unity under the pretense of dissent, their impact is not just misguided-it becomes destructive.

Democracy protects dissent. But democracy also expects responsibility from those who influence public thought. When criticism becomes a tool for obstruction rather than reform, when human rights are used to shield terrorists but not their victims, and when free speech is reduced to habitual negativity, it ceases to be a pillar of liberty and becomes a weapon of ideological sabotage.

The role of public intellectuals is to challenge with conscience, Rather than engaging with the speak with balance, and guide ty for theatrics, self-promotion, and polarizing postures. The result is a cultural atmosphere where skepticism is worshipped, but solutions are nowhere in sight.

Why India Needs a Grand **Museum of Hindu Art**

With the spotlight currently on Qatar for hosting ongoing Gaza peace talks, the country's cultural investments—like the stunning Museum of Islamic Art in Doha—are also drawing attention. Opened in 2008 and designed by the legendary architect I.M. Pei, the museum presents a rich and diverse collection of Islamic art spanning continents and centuries. But its scope is broader than it seems—many exhibits hail from pre-Islamic times or regions no longer under Muslim rule. This inclusive narrative is a deliberate counter to perceptions of Islamic iconoclasm, such as the destruction of the Bamiyan Buddhas by the Taliban in 2001.

The Doha museum's brilliance lies in positioning Islamic art not just as religious output but as the cultural expression of regions influenced by Islam. This reframing—presenting "art from the Islamic world" rather than strictly "Islamic art"—reclaims civilizational prestige through art, echoing Christian traditions that link religious belief to artistic excellence, especially in periods



like the Renaissance.

In comparison, other religions have yet to create institutions on this scale. While Jewish and Buddhist art museums exist, none offer the vast civilizational sweep that Doha's museum achieves. Surprisingly, no comparable project exists for Hindu art—despite Hinduism's profound and far-reaching influence on art, architecture, mathematics, and astronomy, especially across South and Southeast Asia.

India is uniquely positioned to correct this omission. A grand Museum of Hindu Art could illuminate the expansive cul-

tural and aesthetic footprint of Hinduism—not only within Indian borders but across ancient trade routes and former Hindu-influenced kingdoms in Southeast Asia, Central Asia, and even parts of the Middle East.

Such a museum would enrich both global understanding and self-perception among Hindus. It could reclaim narratives often limited to Buddhist and Islamic contributions to Indian art, offering a more comprehensive picture. More importantly, it could highlight the ongoing dialogue between Hinduism and other artistic traditions across centuries.

Contrast this with the global intellectual response to the 9/11 attacks in the U.S.-there was criticism, yes, but also a firm moral consensus against terrorism. In India, that moral clarity often goes missing.

Human Rights for Whom?

When convicted terrorist Afzal Guru was hanged for his role in the 2001 Parliament attacks, many Indian intellectuals didn't mourn the victims or examine the terror ecosystem. Instead, they protested Guru's hanging as "judicial murder." Seminars were held. Petitions were signed. Sympathies were extended—not to the families of the security personnel who died—but to the man convicted of planning the attack.

Even in the case of Yakub Memon, convicted for financing and planning the 1993 Mumbai blasts, candlelight vigils were organized and narratives of injustice were spun. Courts had upheld the convictions after lengthy due process. Yet the intellectual class chose symbolism over truth, sentiment over justice.

Bengaluru flooded but Congress celebrates: BJP slams anniversary event timing

Kannada actress Ranya Rao, who was arrested in March for allegedly smuggling gold bars worth ₹14.56 crore, was granted bail on Tuesday by the Special Court for Economic Offences. However, the actor will continue to remain in Bengaluru Central Prison, as she has also been detained under the stringent Conservation of Foreign Exchange and Prevention of Smuggling Activities Act (COFEPOSA), 1974. This law allows preventive detention without bail for up to a year.

Ranya Rao, the stepdaughter of senior IPS officer Ramachandra Rao, was arrested after being caught with 14.2 kg of gold at Bengaluru's Kempegowda International Airport on March 3 upon her arrival from Dubai. Officials grew suspicious due to her frequent travels — 27 trips to Dubai in the past year, including four within 15 days and her methods of concealment, reportedly wearing some gold and hiding the rest in her clothes.

Along with co-accused Tarun Kondaru Raju, Rao was granted statutory bail after

Investigators also recovered over ₹2 crore worth of gold jewellery and ₹2.67 crore in cash from Rao's residence during raids. In a leaked statement, Rao admitted to carrying 17 gold bars and disclosed travel details involving the Middle East and Western countries. Her stepfather, Ramachandra Rao, has publicly distanced himself from her activities, claiming he had not been in contact with her since her marriage and expressing shock over the allegations. He maintained that his career remains untainted and denied any involvement in her affairs.

As torrential rains wreaked havoc in Bengaluru, flooding key areas and claiming three lives, the Karnataka Congress government faced sharp criticism from the BJP for going ahead with a grand celebration to mark its two years in power. The event, titled Samarpana Sankalpa Samavesha, was held in Hosapete on Tuesday, even as large parts of the state capital struggled with severe waterlogging and infrastructure failures.

While Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and Deputy Chief Minister DK Shivakumar welcomed Congress national leaders Mallikarjun Kharge and Rahul Gandhi at Jindal Vijayanagara Airport, several Bengaluru neighbourhoods such as Sai Layout, Manyata Tech Park, and Silk Board Junction were submerged due to continuous rainfall over the past 48 hours. Roads became unmotorable, emergency responses were delayed, and complaints over poor drainage infrastructure flooded social media.

Despite briefly visiting the BBMP War Room for updates, both Siddaramaiah and Shivakumar were physically absent from the worst-hit areas. BJP leaders seized the opportunity to attack the Congress government, accusing it of being "tone-deaf" and "irresponsible."

State BJP President BY Vijayendra said, "Three people have lost their lives, and instead of managing the crisis, the Congress is busy celebrating. The government has shown complete disregard for the suffering of Bengalureans." He also criticized Home Minister G Parameshwara for blaming citizens for the flooding, calling the comment "arrogant and unacceptable."

Former Deputy Chief Minister Ashwath Narayan echoed the sentiment, calling the event "utterly insensitive." He accused the Congress government of failing to deliver on infrastructure and governance over the past two years, and labelled it a "government of scams and slogans."

Meanwhile, the Congress defended its decision to proceed with the event, pointing to its welfare-focused policies and asserting that senior officials were actively monitoring the situation. Party insiders claimed that necessary relief operations were being carried out on the ground and that the CM and DyCM were overseeing efforts remotely.

The situation has spotlighted the growing tension between governance and optics in Karnataka, with opposition leaders demanding more direct accountability from the ruling party during times of crisis.

Indian Travelers Shun Turkey and Azerbaijan Amid Geopolitical Tensions, Visa Drop Hits 42%

TPN Correspondent | Delhi Amid recent geopolitical developments that have stirred national sentiment, Indian travelers are increasingly turning away from Turkey and Azerbaijan. According to data released by visa processing platform Atlys on Tuesday, visa applications to both countries have plunged by a sharp 42%, following public expressions of support for Pakistan by Ankara and Baku.

The response from Indian travelers was swift and pronounced. Within just 36 hours of the statements, Atlys reported a 60% surge in users abandoning their visa applications mid-process. "The reaction wasn't scattered; it was sharp and behavioral," said Mohak Nahta, Founder and CEO of Atlys. "People didn't need to be told to avoid certain destinations. They simply moved



on, guided by instinct, information, and access to alternatives. That's what modern travel looks like."

Nahta added that Atlys responded to the trend by pausing all marketing efforts for Turkey and Azerbaijan "in solidarity with national sentiment."

Travel data showed varying levels of decline based on geography. Metro cities like Delhi and Mumbai saw Turkey-bound applications fall by 53%, while tier-2 cities such as Indore and Jaipur showed a comparatively modest 20% decline. Group travelers—typically families and tour groups—seemed the most sensitive to political cues, with group visa requests dropping by nearly 49%. In contrast, solo and couple applications showed a smaller dip of 27%. The data suggests that group travelers, who often plan well in advance, were more decisive in altering travel plans. Demographically, travelers

aged 25 to 34 were the most responsive to the developments, making up over 70% of the application drop-offs for Turkey. Women travelers were notably more likely to change course altogether, with a 2.3 times higher likelihood of restarting visa applications for destinations in Southeast Asia, such as Vietnam and Thailand.

As Turkey and Azerbaijan lost appeal, alternate destinations like Vietnam, Indonesia, and Egypt witnessed a rise in visa applications, spiking by as much as 31%, reflecting a quick shift in travel interest shaped by current affairs.





Trump's Immigration Crackdown Sparks Fear and Labor Shortages

Crackdown On Undocumented Immigrants Hits Washington Restaurants

President Donald Trump's renewed crackdown on undocumented immigrants is sending shockwaves through Washington, D.C.'s restaurant industry, as surprise visits by immigration enforcement agents have prompted fear, staff departures, and concerns over long-term labor shortages.

Earlier this month, armed Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agents made an unannounced visit to Pupatella, a popular pizzeria in Dupont Circle. Although no arrests were made, the agents demanded to inspect I-9 employment eligibility forms. Lacking a warrant or documentation, they were turned away. However, they later returned to another Pupatella location with a formal "notice of inspection."

"We've never experienced anything like this," said Natasha Neely, vice president of Pupatella. "These notices are usually sent via email. Showing up like that was clearly intended to intimidate."

ICE reported arresting 189 undocumented individuals in the D.C. area from May 6 to May 9 after issuing 187 inspection notices. The agency described the operation as targeting "criminal alien offenders," although businesses affected say the approach has caused broader disruption.

Restaurants, long reliant on immigrant labor, are feeling the impact. "Undocumented migrants are the backbone of our



industry," said Shawn Townsend, president of the Restaurant Association Metropolitan Washington (RAMW). "From dishwashers to chefs, they are vital."

Trump's second-term focus on immigration enforcement echoes his first-term policies, with thousands already deported and legal challenges mounting over alleged violations of due process.

The fear among workers is palpable. One restaurant owner, who spoke anonymously, said that following ICE's visit, many staff with uncertain work status simply stopped showing up. "They were told by advocates to lay low. We're not

sure who will return," he said.

A recent survey by employment law firm Littler Mendelson found that 58% of business executives fear Trump's policies will worsen labor shortages, especially in hospitality and manufacturing.

Neely said Pupatella is now educating its staff about their legal rights. "We've briefed our team on how to respond, but the sight of armed agents in federal uniforms is always unnerving," she said. As enforcement intensifies, Washington's restaurants brace for further disruption—both operational and emotional.

"Want To End War But Not Sure If Russia Is Ready": Zelensky

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has reiterated his country's willingness to pursue a full ceasefire to end the ongoing war with Russia, but expressed skepticism over Moscow's commitment to peace. His remarks came after holding talks with U.S. President Donald Trump and other European leaders regarding potential ceasefire negotiations.



The Ukrainian leader also stressed that a ceasefire must be followed by additional steps, including a humanitarian exchange of prisoners and broader diplomatic engagement. "These are our principles: ceasefire first, and then other steps like prisoner exchanges," Zelenskyy explained. Covid-19 Cases Surge Across Asia Amid Rise of JN.1 Variant: Key Affected Countries and Trends

A fresh wave of Covid-19 is sweeping across parts of Asia, with several countries reporting sharp increases in infections, hospitalisations, and viral activity. The spike, driven by the emerging JN.1 variant and post-holiday gatherings, has prompted public health authorities to issue fresh advisories and call for booster vaccinations, particularly for vulnerable groups.

In Hong Kong, health officials have sounded the alarm over the "quite high" virus activity in the city. The percentage of respiratory samples testing positive for Covid-19 recently hit a 12-month high. In the week ending May 3, Hong Kong recorded 31 severe cases—its highest in a year—along with rising Covid-related medical consultations and sewage surveillance data pointing to active transmission.

Singapore has also experienced a notable jump in Covid-19 cases, with infections rising 28% to 14,200 in the week ending May 3. Daily hospitalisations surged by about 30%, marking the first time in nearly a year that Singapore's health ministry has issued a detailed update. Authorities attributed the spike to waning immunity but clarified that current variants, including JN.1, do not appear to cause more severe illness than before.

In Thailand, the situation is more acute. Weekly Covid-19 cases doubled from 16,000 to over 33,000 in the week ending May 17. Bangkok alone recorded 6,290 cases, followed by Chon Buri, Rayong, and Nonthaburi. Most infections occurred in individuals aged 30 to 39. Health officials believe the spike is linked to gatherings during April's Songkran festival and are urging high-risk individuals to get booster shots immediately.

China is also seeing an upward trend. Between March 31 and May 4, the national Covid-19 positivity rate among outpatient and emergency flu-like illnesses surged from 7.5% to 16.2%. Hospitalised case positivity also nearly doubled, signaling a possible early stage of a summer wave similar to last year's.

Speaking on Monday, Zelenskyy said Ukraine remains ready to accept a ceasefire without preconditions, a proposal initially introduced by Trump. However, he emphasized that Ukraine needs to see "concrete actions" from Russia before it can fully trust any peace initiative. "Too many lives have been lost. We really want to finish this war. But I'm not sure that Russia is ready, and we don't trust them," Zelenskyy stated.

According to Zelenskyy, Russia has indicated a willingness to outline its own "principles" for a ceasefire, including additional terms beyond just halting hostilities. "From our dialogue with U.S. President Trump, it seems the Russian side wants to send a memo on how they see the principles of ending the war—not just a ceasefire, but more," he noted.

Zelenskyy expressed appreciation for Trump's initiative, calling the proposed unconditional ceasefire a positive step. "I was very happy when President Trump proposed a full ceasefire without any conditions or preconditions. We've been ready for this," he said, reaffirming Ukraine's position.

Zelenskyy has maintained consistent communication with international partners, including the United States and European Union members. He confirmed Ukraine's openness to direct negotiations with Russia, contingent on a verifiable commitment from Moscow.

This diplomatic momentum comes amid Trump's recent announcement that both Russia and Ukraine are expected to begin immediate negotiations, with the Vatican offering to facilitate peace efforts.

While hopes for a breakthrough remain cautious, Zelenskyy's message was clear: Ukraine is ready for peace—if Russia truly is.

UK Professor Nitasha Kaul Says India Revoked OCI Over 'Anti-India Activities'

British-Kashmiri academic Nitasha Kaul, a Professor of Politics and International Relations at the University of Westminster in London, has claimed that the Government of India has cancelled her Overseas Citizenship of India (OCI) over alleged "anti-India activities."

Taking to social media on Sunday, Kaul revealed that she received an official communication from Indian authorities accusing her of "malice and complete disregard for facts or history" in her writings and speeches. The academic said the cancellation follows her earlier public statements in February, when she was denied entry into India to attend a conference in Bengaluru.



"Know that arresting academics in India for speaking against hate is closely tied to removing access to country and family for academics outside India," Kaul wrote on X (formerly Twitter). "The idea is to send a signal — don't dare challenge us within and don't dare analyse what's going on to convey to audiences outside," she added.

According to India's rules governing OCI holders, the government has the authority to revoke OCI status if it determines that the individual has shown "disaffection towards the Constitution of India as established by law."

Kaul, who also serves as Director of the Centre for the Study of Democracy at Westminster, shared a portion of the cancellation document she received. The notice reportedly cites her "numerous inimical writings, speeches and journalistic activities at various international forums and on social media platforms," which Indian authorities allege target "India and its institutions on the matters of India's sovereignty." In India, while the situation remains under control with only 257 active cases reported, health authorities are on alert and closely monitoring trends across Asia.

The JN.1 variant has not been flagged as more severe, but its rapid spread reinforces the need for vigilance, vaccinations, and readiness to manage potential outbreaks.

14,000 Babies In Gaza Could Die In Next 48 Hours, Warns UN

The United Nations has issued a dire warning, stating that up to 14,000 babies in Gaza could die within the next 48 hours unless critical humanitarian aid is allowed to enter the war-torn enclave. The warning comes as Israeli authorities continue to allow only a limited amount of aid to cross into Gaza, following over 11 weeks of a near-total blockade. International pressure, particularly from the United States, Canada, France, and the United Kingdom, has led to this slight shift in Israeli policy.

On Monday, only five trucks carrying aid, including baby food, entered Gaza—far from what is needed to address the overwhelming crisis. UN humanitarian chief Tom Fletcher described this as a "drop in the ocean" given the severity of the situation. He emphasized that aid had yet to reach the areas where it is most urgently needed, particularly for the countless families unable to feed their malnourished children.

Fletcher spoke to BBC's Radio 4, warning that unless more aid is allowed in immediately, thousands of babies could die. "There are 14,000 babies that will die in the next 48 hours unless we can reach them," he said. "We run all sorts of risks trying to get that baby food through to those mothers who cannot feed their children right now." The UN's statement followed a joint condemnation from the leaders of the UK, France, and Canada, who criticized Israel's continued blockade and the rhetoric from members of Prime Minister Netanyahu's government, who have threatened to displace large numbers of Palestinians. In their joint statement, British Prime Minister Keir Starmer, French President Emmanuel Macron, and Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney warned of potential international action if the restrictions on humanitarian aid were not lifted.

Regulatory Delays and Lack of Transparency **Can Undermine FTA Progress: Nirmala** Sitharaman

Union Finance Minister Nirma-Finance la Sitharaman has warned that delays in regulatory approvals and lack of transparency in the clearance process can severely impact the timely conclusion of free trade agreements (FTAs) and diminish the value of global business transactions. Supreme Court Rejects AGR **Relief Pleas by Vodafone**, Airtel, and Tata Teleservices

Tn a significant development for the Indian telecom sector, the Supreme Court on Monday, May 19, 2025, dismissed petitions filed by Bharti Airtel, Vodafone Idea, and Tata Teleservices seeking relief in the payment of their adjusted gross revenue (AGR) dues. The apex court categorically termed the petitions as "misconceived," effectively closing the door on any legal recourse regarding the financial liabilities stemming from the long-standing AGR case.

A Bench comprising Justices J.B. Pardiwala The Supreme Court had previously ruled in and R. Mahadevan delivered the verdict, rejecting the telcos' request to reconsider the components of their dues, specifically the interest on the principal amount, penalties, and interest on the penalty. The companies had argued for waivers or adjustments, citing financial stress and the disproportionate burden these components imposed.

The Supreme Court, however, reiterated its earlier rulings on the matter and emphasized the finality of its judgments. The Bench noted that any reconsideration of the dues at this stage would set a precedent that undermines judicial sanctity and accountability in the regulatory framework.

The AGR dispute has been a long-running issue in the telecom industry, dating back over a decade. The case centers around the definition of AGR, which includes not just core telecom revenues but also non-core income such as interest, dividend, and rent.



favor of the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), ordering telecom operators to pay outstanding dues as per the expanded definition.

With this latest verdict, the financial burden on the telecom operators remains substantial, particularly for Vodafone Idea, which continues to struggle with mounting debt and losses. Bharti Airtel, while financially more stable, also faces significant payouts. The companies have already made partial payments, but large sums are still outstanding.

This ruling reaffirms the judiciary's stand on the AGR matter and signals limited judicial tolerance for re-litigation of settled issues. It also places the onus on the government and regulatory bodies to explore any policy-based solutions, should they choose to extend any form of relief to the sector moving forward.

Rupee Weakens by 13 Paise to 85.55 Against U.S. Dollar Amid **Subdued Market Sentiment**

∎n early trade on Tuesday, May 20, 2025, the Indian rupee declined by 13 paise to settle at 85.55 against the U.S. dollar. This depreciation comes in the wake of a muted performance in domestic equity markets and continued outflows of foreign funds, reflecting a broader sense of caution among investors.

Forex market analysts attribute the rupee's weakness to a combination of global and domestic factors. A key contributor has

been the recent rise in the U.S. 10-year Treasury yield, which has sparked concerns over America's fiscal health and the direction of its monetary policy. The surge in bond yields has pushed up borrowing costs globally, although ironically, it has also led to a decline in the Dollar Index, which measures the strength of the U.S. dollar against a basket of major currencies.

Despite the fall in the Dollar Index, the rupee continues to face pressure due to a lack of strong domestic cues and an ongoing exodus of foreign capital. Equity markets in India opened on a subdued note, with investors awaiting fresh economic data and policy signals. This cautious approach is further compounded by global uncertainties and tightening financial conditions, which have increased the appeal of safe-haven assets.

Experts suggest that unless there is a significant



improvement in market sentiment or a reversal in capital flows, the rupee may remain under pressure in the short term. Additionally, geopolitical tensions and oil price fluctuations are also likely to influence the domestic currency's trajectory.

Market participants will closely monitor statements from the U.S. Federal Reserve and India's upcoming economic indicators for cues on future movement. For now, traders are bracing for continued volatility as macroeconomic headwinds persist.

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has so far refrained from major intervention, but its stance could shift if the rupee experiences sharper declines. Meanwhile, importers may face increased costs, while exporters could see short-term gains due to the weaker currency.





World Press Photo Suspends Credit for Iconic 'Napalm Girl' Image Amid Authorship Dispute

One of the most powerful and iconic imag-es from the Vietnam War — the Pulitzer Prize-winning photograph of a terrified, naked nine-year-old Phan Thi Kim Phuc running from a napalm attack — is now at the center of a growing controversy.

World Press Photo, which honored the image as its 1973 "Photo of the Year," has announced it is suspending attribution to long-credited photographer Nick Ut of the Associated Press (AP), following a fresh investigation into the image's authorship.

The decision stems from new claims brought to light by The Stringer, a documentary that premiered at the 2025 Sundance Film Festival. The film suggests that Vietnamese freelance photographer Nguyen Thanh Nghe, not Mr. Ut, may have actually taken the photograph on June 8, 1972, near the village of Trang Bang.

According to the documentary, Nghe was among several photographers present when South Vietnamese planes mistakenly dropped napalm on a group of civilians. The film alleges Nghe captured the image and later sold it to AP, which credited staff photographer Nick Ut.

World Press Photo cited both the documentary The Pulitzer Prize Board stated it has no plans and new visual analysis in its decision. "The level of doubt is too significant to maintain the existing attribution," said Joumana El Zein zations — in this case, the AP. Khoury, the foundation's executive director.

Nick Ut, who won a Pulitzer in 1973 for the photo, strongly denies the claims. His attorney, Jim Hornstein, criticized the move, calling it "de-



plorable and unprofessional."

The AP also weighed in, releasing a 96-page report that includes interviews, technical studies, and photo forensics. While the report found no definitive evidence to change the attribution, it acknowledged that gaps in information prevent a conclusive determination.

A third photographer, military photojournalist Huynh Cong Phuc, is also mentioned as a possible author.

For now, World Press Photo's suspension of credit remains in effect unless further evidence emerges to clearly confirm or refute the original attribution.

Is AI Overhyped? New Study Shows Little Impact on Jobs and Wages

Despite the global hype surround-ing artificial intelligence (AI), a new study suggests its real-world impact on jobs and wages may be far more modest than expected. As fears grow over AI replacing human workers and reshaping entire industries, early research now paints a different picture.

A working paper from the National Bureau of Economic Research in Denmark has found that AI's effect on the labour market is minimal so far. No Apps, No Notifications: US Startup's 'Fake' Phone Goes Viral as a Cure for Screen Addiction

Tn an age where digital Loverload is increasingly linked to anxiety and reduced attention spans, a US-based startup has taken an unconventional approach to tackle phone addiction — by creating a phone that doesn't actually do anything.

Enter the Methaphone, a

minimalist, screenless device designed to replicate the shape, weight, and feel of a smartphone, but with zero functionality. Priced at just \$20, this "fake" phone features a smooth, transparent acrylic surface, allowing users to mimic the scrolling motion so familiar in daily life—without accessing any content or notifications.

The Methaphone gained widespread attention after a TikTok video went viral, showing a woman scrolling on what appeared to be a futuristic transparent phone. Speculation erupted online, with some users calling it a new "Nokia glass phone." It was later revealed that the object was actually a Methaphone a psychological tool aimed at helping people break their compulsive phone habits.

Made from durable clear acrylic, the Methaphone is shaped like a modern smartphone and offers a tactile experience that mirrors



the feel of real devices. It's designed for people who often reach for their phones out of habit or boredom, rather than necessity.

"When the urge strikes to pick up your phone and scroll aimlessly, the Methaphone offers a similar physical sensation without the distraction," the com-

pany said in a statement. "It's a way to become conscious of your screen time without going cold turkey."

The idea is based on the principle of substitution therapy—redirecting habitual behavior to a non-disruptive alternative. By replacing real phones with Methaphones during moments of mindless scrolling, users can become more aware of their digital consumption and begin reducing it gradually.

The product has sparked a mix of curiosity, praise, and skepticism online. While some call it a clever mental health tool, others view it as a commentary on how deeply ingrained our tech habits have become.

Still, in a world where constant connectivity is the norm, the Methaphone offers a refreshingly low-tech response — no apps, no alerts, just mindful mimicry.

FaceAge: The AI Tool That Measures Your Health from a Selfie

Agroundbreaking AI tool called FaceAge is making waves in the medical community by promising to assess a person's health simply from a photograph. Developed by researchers at Mass General Brigham, a leading nonprofit healthcare system based in Boston, FaceAge uses deep learning algorithms to analyze facial features and predict a patient's "biological health age" rather than just their chronological age.

FaceAge is inspired by the traditional "eyeball test" used by physicians—an intuitive, quick judgment about a patient's health based on appearance. However, while human doctors might rely on subjective experience, FaceAge

uses large datasets and AI to deliver a more standardized, objective measurement. According to the research team, this system evaluates visible facial cues such as skin texture, muscle tone, and other subtle features to estimate how "aged" a person appears in terms of overall health.

The goal is not to tell you how many birthdays you've had, but rather how your body is aging biologically. This distinction matters: two people aged 50 chronologically might differ significantly in biological age depending on factors like lifestyle, disease, and genetics. A person with a biological age of 60 may be at higher health risk than someone whose biological age is closer to 40.

Published in The Lancet Digital Health on May



8, 2025, the study highlights how FaceAge could help doctors make faster, data-driven decisions, especially in emergency and critical care settings. Early results suggest that FaceAge's assessments correlate with health outcomes and mortality risk more accurately than some traditional methods.

That said, the researchers caution that FaceAge is still in the experimental phase and not ready for clinical deployment. More testing across diverse populations and environments is needed before it can become a trusted tool in hospitals or clinics.

Still, the potential is immense. In a future shaped by AI, FaceAge could help personalize treatments, monitor aging, and even catch health issues before symptoms appear—all from a single selfie.





Mumbai Indians Sign Three Replacements Ahead of IPL 2025 Playoffs

Mumbai Indians have announced the signing of three new players ahead of the IPL 2025 playoffs, replacing key overseas names who are returning for national duties. Among the incoming players is Sri Lankan captain Charith Asalanka, who has reportedly secured a hefty ₹5.25 crore deal — a significant amount for a mid-season replacement.

The franchise confirmed the arrivals of Asalanka, England pacer Richard Gleeson, and seasoned English batter Jonny Bairstow. This international duty overlaps with the IPL's playoff schedule, rendering him unavailable for the remainder of the tournament.

Meanwhile, Ryan Rickelton and Corbin Bosch have been called up by Cricket South Africa in preparation for the World Test Championship final. As per ESPNcricinfo, they are required to report back by May 27, which means their IPL campaign is effectively over.

Charith Asalanka, currently leading Sri Lanka, brings leadership and all-round capabilities, making him a valuable addition during the crucial knockout stages. His signing fee



reflects Mumbai Indians' urgency to bolster their middle order with a reliable overseas performer.

Richard Gleeson, known for his sharp pace and death-over skills, adds depth to the bowling attack in the absence of Bosch. Jonny Bairstow's inclusion brings top-order experience and explosive batting prowess. Having played 50 IPL matches with stints at Punjab Kings (2022, 2024) and Sunrisers Hyderabad (2019–2021), Bairstow adds both experience and firepower to the Mumbai lineup.

With these timely reinforcements, Mumbai Indians are looking to strengthen their campaign as they gear up for the high-pressure playoff encounters, aiming to secure another IPL title in their storied history.

Thailand, Nepal Qualify for ICC Women's T20 World Cup 2026 Global Qualifier

Thailand and Nepal have officially booked their places in the Global Qualifier for the ICC Women's T20 World Cup 2026, following strong performances in the Asia Regional Qualifier's Super Three stage. Alongside the UAE, both teams competed in a round-robin format, with the top two sides earning spots in the next round of qualification.

Nepal sealed their progression on Monday with a nail-biting five-wicket win over the UAE in Bangkok. Chasing 115, Nepal paced their innings carefully, reaching the target in the final over. Key contributions came from skipper Indu Barma (30) and Rubina Chhetry (23), while Manisha Upadhyay impressed with the ball, claiming 4/20 to restrict the UAE to 114/7 in 20 overs.

Nepal's disciplined bowling at-

tack never allowed the UAE to build momentum, despite a steady 39 from opener Esha Oza. Tight fielding and consistent pressure meant the Emirati side fell short of a defendable total on a decent batting surface.

Thailand, on the other hand, had already confirmed their spot with a dominant victory over the UAE in an earlier Super Three clash. Led by Naruemol Chaiwai, Thailand posted 144/5 thanks to a dynamic 46* off just 20 balls by Natthakan Chantham and a steady 49 from Nattaya Boochatham. The UAE faltered in their chase after the early loss of Oza and finished at 90/5, never truly threatening the target.

With one Super Three fixture remaining—Thailand vs Nepal—both teams are now uncatchable at the top of the standings, confirming their advancement.



Thailand and Nepal will join Bangladesh, Scotland, and the USA at the Global Qualifier. Bangladesh and Scotland earned automatic entries due to their participation in the last ICC Women's T20 World Cup, while the USA secured their place through the Americas Qualifier held in Argentina in March.

Additional teams will qualify via the upcoming Europe and Africa regional tournaments, each offering two spots. One final team will qualify through the East Asia-Pacific region.

The Global Qualifier will determine the final four spots for the 2026 ICC Women's T20 World Cup in England and Wales, joining the already qualified Australia, India, New Zealand, South Africa, West Indies, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and host nation England.

Shivpal, who hails from Uttar Pradesh, was training at the National Centre of Excellence in Patiala under the guidance of India's javelin coach Sergey Makarov when the test was conducted. Following the test, he notably did not participate in the National Federation Senior Athletics Championships held in Kochi in April, raising early questions about his absence.

This is not Shivpal's first brush with anti-doping regulations. In October 2021, the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) suspended him for four years after methandienone was detected in his sample. However, in January 2023, the ban was reduced to one year following a successful appeal

by his legal representative, Parth Goswami. The appeal was based on Shivpal's claim that the positive result stemmed from a contaminated supplement, the name of which he had disclosed during the doping

offence carries a much harsher penalty-Shivpal could now face an eight-year ban if found guilty. That outcome could effectively end his professional athletics career. Shivpal's case is particularly disheartening given his position as one of India's few Olympic-level javelin throwers. At the Tokyo Games, he finished 27th in the qualifying round. Though he has never reached the heights of Neeraj Chopra, India's Olympic gold medallist, Shivpal was seen as a strong national contender in the sport. The recurrence of methandienone in his samples raises significant concerns about either negligence or intent, both of which will be closely examined by NADA during the ongoing investigation. As of now, Shivpal awaits a final ruling, and the future of his athletic career hangs in the balance.
