# PROMISE IN WORDS, NOT IN NUMBERS

who virtually participated in the inauguration ceremony of Amaravati's reconstruction, began his address in Telugu, paying homage to the divine and historic spirit of the land. He said he was honoured to stand on the holy soil of Amaravati, which he described as not just a city, but a dream poised to become reality.

"Now I am standing on the sacred land of Amaravati. I see not just a city... I feel a dream about to come true. Amaravati will give rise to a new Andhra Pradesh," Modi declared. He said projects worth ₹60,000 crore had either been launched or had their foundation stone laid as part of this new development phase.

Calling Amaravati the "capital of Indraloka and now the capital of Andhra Pradesh," Modi said the city embodies the power to transform AP into a modern and progressive state. He envisioned Amaravati as a hub for IT, AI, green energy, clean industries, medical care, and education, and assured that the central government would provide full support in building its infrastructure.

Recalling his association with the state's development, Modi said, "I laid the foundation stone for Amaravati as the people's capital in 2015. In the past ten years, the Centre has supported Amaravati's growth and will continue to support it in every way."

The Prime Minister praised Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu's vision and execution capacity, recalling how Gujarat officials were once sent to Hyderabad to study its IT progress under Naidu's leadership. "Whether it is undertaking huge

projects or completing them quickly, there's no better leader in the country than Chandrababu," he affirmed.

Modi acknowledged the significant role of Jana Sena Chief and Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan, referring to him as a strong pillar in the government. He said the time had come for all forces to unite and realise the dreams of legendary leader N.T. Rama Rao.

The Prime Minister also emphasized that connectivity will be a key driver in Andhra Pradesh's growth, citing the Naidupeta–Renigunta highway as an example of fastpaced infrastructure development. "Devotees going for darshan to Tirupati Venkateswara Swamy can now travel faster, thanks to the new highway. Rail and road projects worth thousands of crores are underway," Modi added. Despite the grandeur of the occasion and Modi's powerful oratory, many observers note that Andhra Pradesh still needs much more than promises and foundation stones. The ₹60,000 crore figure includes several pre-existing or previously stalled projects, and there is little clarity on timelines, specific allocations to Amaravati, or a dedicated financial package that Andhra Pradesh has long awaited since bifurcation. While Prime Minister Modi's words struck an emotional chord and the visible show of unity between the Centre and the state government offers hope, Andhra Pradesh continues to seek concrete commitments beyond symbolic announcements. A state struggling with a financial deficit, stalled capital plans, and infrastructure gaps will need not just encouragement, but actionable and measurable support to truly realise its development vision.

#### **MODI AND AMARAVATI** REMEMBERED IN THE **HISTORY**



Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, while addressing the inauguration ceremony of Amaravati reconstruction works, expressed confidence that Amaravati will soon stand as a world-class capital with the full support of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He stated that this day will be written in golden letters in Andhra Pradesh's

Naidu emphasized that Amaravati is not just a city, but an emotional bond for five crore Andhras. Andhra Pradesh Minister Nara Lokesh, speaking at the resumption ceremony of Amaravati capital works, delivered a fiery speech, linking national security, rapid development, and the strong leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. ## India's Largest Quantum Computer to be Set Up in Amaravati

In a landmark announcement, IBM, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS) and the Government of Andhra Pradesh have unveiled plans to deploy India's largest quantum computer at the soonto-be-completed Quantum Valley Tech Park in Amaravati, making Andhra technology revolution.

The tech park will be anchored by IBM's most advanced quantum system to date — the IBM Quantum System Two, featuring a 156-qubit Heron processor. This deployment marks the first such installation in India and is expected to significantly accelerate the country's Mission.

Speaking on the occasion, Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu said, "Our National Quantum Mission is to make India a global hub in the quantum industry... The Quantum Valley Tech Park represents how industry and academia will together

# **AP Liquor Scam: Raj Kasireddy in SIT Custody**

- · ACB court allows one-week custody for in-depth investigation
- Medical tests done before interrogation begins at SIT office
- SIT probing role of ex CMO official's links

In a significant development in the Andhra Pradesh liquor scam case, the ACB court has granted the Special Investigation Team (SIT) custody of prime accused Raj Kasireddy for a week. Following the court's permission, SIT officials took Kasireddy into custody from the Vijayawada district jail on Friday morning.

Before commencing interrogation, SIT officials took Kasireddy to a government hospital for mandatory medical tests. He was then shifted to the SIT office, where the investigation is now underway. As per court directions, he will be questioned daily from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. for seven days and returned to jail each evening.

SIT officials suspect that Kasireddy played a central role in the massive liquor policy



scam that allegedly took place during the previous YSRCP government. He is believed to have overseen key elements of the policy-from issuing distillery permits to overseeing the monthly financial dealings tied to liquor contracts. Investigators allege that thousands of crores changed hands during this process under his supervision.

Authorities had initially requested ten days of custody but were granted seven by the court. SIT aims to unravel the full extent of the scam during this time, especially focusing on the involvement of higher-ups in the former government.

With allegations pointing towards Jagan's Tadepalli Palace as the nerve center of the liquor scam, SIT officials are closely examining the role and instructions of senior government figures from that time. The outcome of Kasireddy's interrogation is expected to shed further light on how deep the scam ran and who else might be im-

## **SC** Declines Interim Relief in Ramanaidu Studios Land Case

In a key development in the Ramanaidu Studio land issue in Visakhapatnam, the Supreme Court on Friday refused to grant interim relief to Suresh Productions, which had challenged a show cause notice issued by the Andhra Pradesh coalition government. The notice questioned the previous YSRCP government's decision to allow the studio to use land allotted for Film City for other purposes.

A bench led by Justice Abhay S Oka took up the hearing and made it clear that the court would not intervene in the matter at this stage. The bench stated that if the government deems it necessary, it may approach the appropriate court to proceed further regarding the show cause notice. With its strategic coastline, infrastructure, and strong governance under CM Naidu, Andhra is emerging as a center for advanced technologies, AI, green energy, and nextgeneration manufacturing.

#### **YouTuber Dies Under Suspicious...**

A 22-year-old YouTuber named Madhumati was found dead under suspicious circumstances in Vissannapeta mandal of NTR district, sending shockwaves across her village and followers. Hailing from A. Konduru village, Madhumati was reportedly involved in an extramarital relationship with a man named Pratap

The young woman's family has accused Pratap of killing her. They allege that he took her away and later hanged her

to death. Madhumati's parents have made a public appeal demanding justice and strict punishment for Pratap. According to initial reports, the body was discovered under unclear circumstances, and police officials have begun a preliminary investigation into the incident. The family's allegations have intensified the seriousness of the case, though authorities have stated that full details are yet to emerge. As of now, the police have not released an official statement on the cause of death or confirmed any arrests. The community remains tense as locals await clarity and legal action. #### **Super-Fast Connectivity** to Amaravati

- New 3.11 km six-lane bridge eases access to AP capital
- 3.11 km six-lane bridge inaugurated over Krishna River
- Bypasses Vijayawada traffic, connects directly to Amaravati

Good news for those traveling to the capital city of Amaravati. A 3.11-kilometre-long, six-lane bridge built over the Krishna River has been inaugurated, providing super-fast connectivity to the capital. With this development, commuters no longer need to enter Vijayawada city and endure heavy traffic. The new bridge, constructed as part of the Western Bypass, offers a direct and time-saving route

Authorities opened the bridge to the public ahead of the Prime Minister's visit and the expected resumption of Amaravati construction works. Those arriving from Hyderabad can now cross the Krishna River at Gollapudi and reach Venkatapalem in Amaravati in just five minutes. Similarly, commuters from both Godavari districts and Uttarandhra can enter the capital in less than 30 minutes by taking the bypass at Chinna Awatapalli near Gannavaram.

The bridge is expected to significantly reduce travel time and support the transport of heavy vehicles and construction equipment necessary for Amaravati's development. Equipped with separate lanes, clear indicators, dividers, and a modern lighting system, the bridge ensures safe and fast travel without disruptions.

Locals and commuters have welcomed the new infrastructure with enthusiasm, stating that it will boost development and ease daily travel to important destinations such as the Secretariat, the High Court, and other government offices in Amaravati.

#### Convert and lose SC status, rules AP High Court

In a landmark ruling, the Andhra Pradesh High Court has clarified that individuals belonging to Scheduled Castes (SC) will lose their SC status if they convert to another religion. This verdict comes amid increasing concerns over the misuse of SC protections even after conversion.

The case originated from Bapatla district, where a pastor named Anand, who had converted to Christianity, filed a police complaint under the SC and ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act in 2021. He alleged that certain individuals were interfering in the affairs of the church he was running. However, he concealed his religious conversion while invoking the protections available to Scheduled Castes.

Following his complaint, the police registered a case under the Atrocities Act and later filed a charge sheet. The accused, however, approached the High Court, arguing that since Anand had converted from his original religion, he was no longer entitled to SC protections under the law.

After examining the matter, the High Court ruled that the SC status of a person is revoked the moment they convert to another religion. It observed that the police should not have registered a case under the Atrocities Act in this instance and dismissed the case accordingly. The court's decision also means that the case pending in the Guntur SC and ST Court must now be closed.

This verdict is expected to have far-reaching consequences. It not only sends a strong message against the misuse of caste-based legal protections post-conversion but is also likely to deter religious conversions that seek to retain SC benefits unlawfully.

Legal experts believe the ruling could trigger a wave of scrutiny into similar cases, with law enforcement agencies now being more cautious in registering Atrocities Act complaints from individuals who have converted from Scheduled Castes.

## **Modi's Amaravati Visit** Leaves AP Disappointed, **No Major Announcements**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Amaravati to restart the capital's development works has sparked disappointment across Andhra Pradesh, as expectations for financial assistance and substantial support were left unmet. Modi addressed a gathering of over one lakh people during the meeting, reiterating the Centre's support for the state. However, opposition parties and several media outlets were quick to criticize the Prime Minister for offering little more than words, with no tangible financial aid or new announcements for the capital.

The Prime Minister highlighted increased railway allocations for Andhra Pradesh, emphasizing investments in farmers, seeds, and fertilizers. He also mentioned the development of key infrastructure projects like the Polavaram and the linking of rivers. However, his speech largely focused on the Center's commitment to infrastructure projects rather than offering the much-awaited financial assistance to Amaravati's development.

Opposition leaders, particularly from the Congress, expressed their displeasure with the Prime Minister's address. Kolanukonda Shivaji, a core committee member of the Amaravati Capital Congress and Vice President of the APCC, criticized the Centre's stance. "The Prime Minister's speech failed to address the crucial pending projects like Polavaram and Banakacharla, and he didn't even commit to making Amaravati the permanent capital," Shivaji said. He further called the meeting a "self-goal" and mocked the claim of the state being led by a "double engine government."

Shivaji added that despite the promises, nothing significant materialized for the state, and people were left deeply disappointed. He likened the event to "digging a mountain and catching a mouse" in terms of its outcome.



# No relief for Jagan's aides in High Court...

**HC** declines to grant anticipatory bail to key ex-CMO officials

The Andhra Pradesh High Court on Friday delivered a setback to key aides of former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy in connection with the ongoing liquor scam investigation. The court refused to grant anticipatory bail to three individuals closely associated with the former CM's office, citing the need to first obtain the government's opinion.

Krishnamohan Reddy (ex-OST to Jagan), Dhanunjay Reddy (former CMO secretary), and Balaji Govindappa (linked to the liquor scam) had all filed separate petitions seeking anticipatory bail amid fears of imminent arrest. Their names reportedly surfaced during the interrogation of other accused, including Raj Kasireddy, who has already been arrested by the CID.

The High Court, which took up the petitions, questioned the prosecution and directed the Public Prosecutor to present the government's stance. In the absence of any interim relief, the court postponed the hearing to May 7, leaving the petitioners exposed to possible arrest in the interim. Notably, the court did not issue any order preventing the CID from arresting the petitioners before the next hearing.

The CID has been tightening its investigation based on the revelations made by Raj Kasireddy and others. Even MP Mithun Reddy has been questioned in connection with the case. Sources suggest that the CID is gearing up to make more arrests soon, especially those linked to the former Chief Minister's Office.

With the High Court refusing immediate relief and the CID intensifying its probe, the case is entering a crucial phase. The government's stance on the bail petitions, expected on or before May 7, will be key to the next developments.

More updates are expected as the investigation unfolds.

# **Jagan Skips Amaravati Event, Flies to Bengaluru**



Former Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister and YSRCP president Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy has stirred political debate by skipping the grand Amaravati reopening event, despite a formal invitation extended by the new coalition government. Instead, he reportedly left for Bengaluru on Thursday evening and is currently resting, according to party sources.

Jagan's absence from the event, which saw Prime Minister Narendra Modi kickstart development works in Amaravati, has triggered criticism from within his own party and the public. Many believe the occasion was a missed opportunity for the YSRCP to reconnect with the people after years of capital-related contro-

The Chandrababu Naidu-led coalition government, which has been working over the past ten months to revive Amaravati, organized the event on a grand scale. A three-member ministerial committee was assigned the task, and a formal invitation was sent to Jagan on Wednesday. However, he chose not to respond or attend, with his PA receiving the invitation on his behalf.

Party insiders and political observers view this as a continuation of Jagan's old stance. He had also boycotted the Amaravati foundation ceremony in 2017. At that time, it was perceived as a strategic political move. But with the return of Amaravati to the development map, even some YSRCP leaders are now questioning the decision to stick to the three-capital poli-



cy and skip a politically significant event. TDP supporters and Amaravati farmers were quick to lash out, accusing Jagan of only showing up in times of distress and ignoring the people's celebrations. "Jagan only goes to the people who cry, not those who are happy," remarked a TDP activist, pointing to the CM's silence during the Amaravati farmers' five-year-long strug-

Meanwhile, the YSRCP has countered criticism by reiterating its stance that Amaravati does not represent the entire state, emphasizing that development should not be limited to just 12 villages. However, this message has failed to cut through the backlash within party ranks and among

As the Prime Minister personally launched the capital works, many saw Jagan's absence as a symbolic snub to not only the central leadership but also to the farmers and citizens who hoped for a show of unity. With Amaravati once again in the spotlight, Jagan's political strategy is under scrutiny — both from allies and adversaries.

#### **OBC Morcha welcomes** caste census

#### Katru Vijay calls Centre's move historic and transparent

The OBC Morcha has extended strong support to the decision of the Narendra Modi-led Union Cabinet to include caste details in the upcoming national census. At a press conference held at the BJP office in Eluru on Friday, OBC Morcha District President Katru Vijay addressed the media and welcomed the move as a long-awaited and historic step.

Katru Vijay noted that the last comprehensive caste census in India was conducted during British rule in 1931. "Since then, except for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, no official caste-based data has been collected at the national level. # Liquor Shop Owned by Excise Officer, Operated in Driver's Name

In a bizarre turn of events, a liquor shop located at the Thotamula bend in Veerulapadu mandal has become a source of both safety concerns and public outrage, especially after it was revealed that the shop is owned by an excise officer, but is being run under the name of his driver. This unusual situation has raised questions about misuse of power and transparency within the local excise department.

The shop, situated at a dangerous road bend, has become notorious for frequent accidents, increasing traffic congestion, and safety hazards for motorists, especially women passengers traveling late at night. The shop's location near the bus stand has further aggravated the problem, leading to growing concerns from villagers who are now planning to stage a dharna to protest the shop's continued operation.

What adds to the irony of the

situation is the revelation that the liquor shop, although owned by the excise officer, is operating under the name of his driver, Kasani Naveen Kumar. This peculiar arrangement has raised suspicions about the motives behind it, as Naveen Kumar, a private individual, has allegedly been involved in managing the shop's operations and collecting money from other belt shops in the area. He has also reportedly been handling all liquor transaction records, a responsibility that typically falls to government officials.

Despite being a temporary employee, Naveen Kumar has been accused of overstepping his role, acting as though he were a government officer, and making decisions that affect local businesses. The public is now questioning how such a critical establishment could be operated in this manner, with many calling for an immediate investigation into the excise officer's involvement and the shop's op-



The combination of public safety concerns, the apparent conflict of interest, and the unconventional way the liquor shop is being managed has sparked widespread anger in the com-

## Post office account opening made easy with e-KYC

The Indian Postal Department has simplified the process of opening accounts for several key savings schemes by launching a paperless, Aadhaar-based e-KYC system. This new digital process is designed to save time and streamline the customer experience, marking another step in the department's broader digitization efforts.

Effective from April 24, customers can now use biometric authentication to open accounts in schemes such as the Monthly Income Scheme (MIS), Time Deposit (TD), Kisan Vikas Patra (KVP), and the National Savings Certificate (NSC). The e-KYC facility, which has already been in use for post office savings accounts since January, has now been extended to these four schemes, as confirmed in a recent circular from the Department of Posts.

Under the new system, customers visiting the post office simply provide their for all citizens.

biometric details (fingerprints) to the postal assistant. The assistant inputs the customer's details—scheme selection, deposit amount, and other necessary data. A second round of biometric verification confirms the transaction. This eliminates the need for physical deposit forms, significantly cutting down paperwork and processing time. # High Court allows Pedda Reddy to visit Tadipatri

Permission granted with restriction of only five vehicles No rallies or gatherings permitted during visit

TPN Correspondent | Anantapur The Andhra Pradesh High Court has granted conditional permission to former Tadipatri YSRCP MLA Kethireddy Pedda Reddy to visit Tadipatri, following a petition he filed challenging police restrictions. The decision comes in the backdrop of heightened political tensions and clashes reported in Tadipatri after the recent general elections.

Pedda Reddy had approached the court alleging that the police had unfairly prevented him from entering Tadipatri and had even placed him under house arrest at his residence in Thimmampalli, Yellanur mandal, He further claimed that his house was attacked by JC Prabhakar Reddy and activists of the Telugu Desam Party (TDP), and that the police were not allowing him to respond or move freely.

The High Court, after reviewing the matter, ruled in Pedda Reddy's favour but imposed strict conditions. It stated that he may



enter Tadipatri with no more limit his influence in the town to than five vehicles and explicitly prohibited any form of rally or public gathering during his visit. The court also directed the police to provide adequate security for his movement.

### Tribal Woman Gives Birth on the Way as Doli Remains Lifeline in Vizianagaram Hills

In a stark reminder of continued neglect in tribal areas, a woman in the Regapunayagiri hills of Shringavarapukota Mandal was forced to give birth on the way to the hospital due to the lack of proper road access. The incident occurred today in Girishikara village, where Fangi Seethamma, a pregnant tribal woman, went into labor with no way to reach a hospital except by doli (makeshift stretcher).

In the absence of any motorable road, her husband Narsingarao, along with relatives and villagers, tied a traditional doli and carried her across the rugged terrain for several kilometers. While en route to the S. Kota Government Hospital, Seethamma gave birth to a baby girl midway. The mother and newborn were then carried to Punyagiri College in the same manner before being shifted to the hospital by a 108 ambulance. Fortunately, both the mother and child



received timely medical care upon arrival.

This heart-wrenching incident has once again spotlighted the inaccessibility and lack of basic infrastructure in tribal settlements. Despite multiple promises over the years and a sanctioned ₹4 crore allocation by the current coalition government for a BT road to Regapunayagiri, the work remains incomplete. Locals allege that the road construction has been moving at a snail's pace due to the negligence of the contractor and Panchayat Raj department engineers.

For generations, tribal communities in this region have been relying on dolis to handle medical emergencies, highlighting a painful disconnect from the modern facilities available elsewhere. While governments have changed over the years, the ground reality in these remote villages remains unchanged, with each emergency turning into a struggle for survival.

Villagers now express growing concern, fearing for the safety of their loved ones due to the delay in road completion. "We are not even getting enough dollies when needed," one tribal resident remarked, underscoring the severity of the situation. The incident has once again triggered a demand for the immediate completion of the promised road to ensure that such tragedies do not repeat.

## **Betting Racket Busted, 11** Arrested in Vizianagaram

Vizianagaram In a major crackdown on online

cricket betting, Vizianagaram District Superintendent of Police Vakul Jindal announced the arrest of 11 individuals involved in a well-organized IPL betting network. The arrests were made during a raid in a mango orchard on the outskirts of Shivarampuram village under the Bobbili Police Station limits.

SP Vakul Jindal, addressing a press conference at the district police office, revealed that the investigation began with the anat the orchard. Interrogation led to the unearthing of a larger betting racket that operated across Vizianagaram, Parvathipuram Manyam, and Visakhapatnam districts. The gang was reportedly being run by Musidipalli Diwakar from Parvathipuram Manyam district, who obtained admin rights to a betting app called Radhe Exchange from one Niranjan Reddy in Bangalore.

Diwakar expanded the operation by appointing area-wise agents in the three districts and incentivizing them with commissions. These agents promoted the betting app among local youth through WhatsApp and managed bets based on ongoing IPL matches. The accused also acquired admin access to another app, National Exchange, to widen the business network, the SP said.

So far, approximately 200 youth across Vizianagaram, Parvathipuram Manyam, and Visakhapatnam districts were found to be

using these betting apps. Among those arrested were two admins -Musidipalli Diwakar and Ambati Rammohan; five agents - Mahanti Ganesh, Samireddy Vasu, Kottangi Mohan Rao, Modadla Paidiraju, and Tati Shankara Rao; and three users - Gedela Srinivas, Seerapu Narayana Rao, and Terli Mohan Rao.

# Improved Facilities Needed at Children's Homes

In a review meeting held by Bathula Padmavati, member of the Andhra Pradesh State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, she emphasized the need for better facilities at Children's Care Institutions (CCI) in alignment with the Juvenile Justice (JJ) Act. The meeting focused on ongoing schemes and adoption processes under the Women and Child Welfare Department.

Padmavati stressed that every CCI should be equipped with the necessary facilities to cater to the well-be-

ing of children and should operate in conjunction with the JJ Act. She further reviewed adoption processes with various agencies, including the ICPS One Stop Center, Balika Sadan, and the Police Department.

During the review, she highlighted the importance of speeding up the adoption process, particularly for orphaned, abandoned, surrendered, and neglected children. Padmavati instructed all relevant departments to cooperate in identifying children eligible for adoption and completing the process in accordance with KARA



guidelines.

The review also addressed operational aspects such as registration and counseling at the OSC center, rehabilitation of women, and the status of or-

phan children in Children's Care Centers (CCS). Additionally, the need for timely action in issuing CWC orders for adoption and the completion of pending FIRs and untraceable certificates by the police was emphasized. District Women and Child Welfare Department Project Director Smt. S. Suvarna assured that the district would ensure the timely completion of adoption processes with full cooperation from the staff. # Can Mark Carney Reset Canada-India Relations?



The 2025 Canadian federal election, though somewhat overshadowed by U.S. President Donald Trump's escalating trade war, marked a significant political shift within Canada. The Liberal Party, now under the leadership of Mark Carney, returned to power with 168 seats just shy of a majority—securing a fourth consecutive mandate. This outcome signals both continuity and change: a new face at the helm and a political landscape reshaped by shifting public sentiment.

Carney's rise to leadership played a piv-

otal role in the Liberals' resurgence. A former central banker with international credibility, Carney brings economic expertise at a time when Canada's economy faces mounting challenges. His technocratic and pragmatic style stands in stark contrast to the more ideologically driven leadership of his predecessor, Justin Trudeau. With the New Democratic Party (NDP) weakened—having lost nearly 12% of its vote share and with leader Jagmeet Singh losing his seat—Carney has more freedom to craft his own foreign and economic agenda.

This is especially relevant for India, given the NDP's past support for Khalistani elements, which strained India-Canada

The fall of Singh and the NDP's reduced influence opens the door for a recalibrated approach to New Delhi. Carney, unburdened by Trudeau-era baggage, has the political space to rebuild bridges. While a dramatic reset in bilateral ties is unlikely in the near term, cautious re-engagement seems plausible. Strong economic ties, the influence of a vibrant Indian diaspora, and enduring cultural links provide a solid foundation.

Meanwhile, Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre's defeat—along with the rejection of his populist, Trump-inspired rhetoric—reflected voter fatigue with divisive politics. Ironically, Trump's inflammatory remarks about Canada only galvanized nationalist sentiment, indirectly benefiting Carney.

Going forward, Carney must navigate a tense US-Canada relationship and a need for greater trade diversification. With ties to China and India currently strained, India emerges as a key potential partner. Whether Carney can capitalize on this opening will depend on his willingness to depart from the Trudeau legacy and pursue a more balanced, interest-driven foreign policy.

#### The impact of suspending a water treaty

India's Hydro-Political Response To Pakistan's Proxy War Doctrine



In a dramatic move signaling a significant escalation in India-Pakistan tensions, India has announced the suspension of the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) of 1960. The decision follows the killing of 26 tourists in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, by terrorists from The Resistance Front—a group India links to Pakistani support. The Indian Cabinet Committee on Security declared that the treaty would be "held in abeyance with immediate effect," contingent on Pakistan "credibly and irrevocably abjuring" its support for cross-border terrorism.

The suspension effectively signals India's intent to walk away from the longstanding water-sharing pact, though the legal framework complicates any such action. The IWT, brokered by the World Bank, has no clause allowing unilateral termination. Article XII (4) of the treaty clearly states it shall remain in force unless "terminated by a duly ratified treaty concluded for that purpose between the two governments."

Some Indian legal experts suggest that provisions under Articles 60 and 62 of the Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties (VCLT) could potentially be used to argue for suspension or withdrawal. These articles pertain to fundamental breaches of a treaty or changes in circumstances. Surveillance State Rising: The Hidden Costs of Tech-Enabled Tax Policing



When George Orwell envisioned Big Brother, he likely didn't imagine Instagram stories and WhatsApp groups becoming tools of state surveillance. Yet today, digital platforms are being co-opted for just that. With over ₹250 crore in concealed assets already unearthed, Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman recently revealed that encrypted chats, social media activity, mobile data, and even Google Maps are now being used in tax enforcement. Technology, once a symbol of empowerment, is quietly evolving into a tool of state con-

At the heart of this transformation lies the Income Tax Bill 2025, which, if passed, would empower income tax officials to access digital communications-emails, financial accounts, social mediawithout prior notice. While positioned as a move against financial fraud, the Bill represents a deeper, more troubling shift in the relationship between state and citizen.

This isn't just about regulation. It's about power. The proposed law normalises surveillance under the guise of efficiency and the common good, all while sidestepping any meaningful discussion on individual privacy. In a country where agencies like the Income Tax Department and the Enforcement Directorate are frequently accused of political bias, granting them unchecked digital access is fraught with risk. Perhaps most concerning is the public's apathy. There is little discourse, little resistance. Citizens seem to have internalised a dangerous narrative: "If you've done nothing wrong, you have nothing to hide." This thinking not only erodes the presumption of innocence but reframes rights as conditional—granted only to those deemed harmless by the state.

In doing so, it also reduces citizens to passive data subjects rather than active digital participants with rights and agency. The rhetoric of the "common good" has become a convenient justification for sweeping changes, just as it was during demonetisation, the revocation of Article 370, and Aadhaar's rollout.

Digital sovereignty cannot be built on surveillance. It must be founded on public trust, transparency, and respect for autonomy. The real strength of a nation lies not in the data it controls, but in the freedom and dignity it affords its people.



# **Pro-Khalistani Leader Urges Sikh Soldiers to Reject War with Pakistan**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi's comments at the inauguration of the Vizhinjam International Seaport in Kerala today have reignited discussions around Congress MP Shashi Tharoor. 

## IAF Jets Land on Ganga Expressway for Emergency Trial Exercise

#### 3.5-km airstrip near Shahjahanpur tested for military emergency use

In a major step toward bolstering national defense infrastructure, the Indian Air Force (IAF) conducted special trials on the Ganga Expressway in Uttar Pradesh on Friday. The objective of the exercise was to test the expressway's readiness for emergency landings and take-offs of military aircraft.

A 3.5-kilometre-long stretch of the expressway near Shahjahanpur has been developed as a dedicated airstrip for such operations. The IAF has deployed its frontline

Hercules, AN-32 transporters, and Mi-17 V5 stalled around 250 CCTV cameras for rehelicopters—to validate the airstrip's operational capability.

The trials, which began early in the morning and continued until 10 pm, are part of the IAF's broader strategy to create backup runways that can be used in times of war, natural disasters, or other national emergencies. These airstrip trials help ensure uninterrupted air operations if primary air bases are ever compromised.

# **Gatherings Banned After Hindu Activist Killed**

Suhas Shetty was killed by five assailants

Mangaluru has been placed on high alert after the brutal murder of Suhas Shetty, a prominent Hindu activist and prime accused in the 2022 murder of a 23-year-old man, Mohammed Fazil. Shetty, in his early thirties, was killed by at least five assailants armed with machetes and swords in broad daylight on a busy road. The chilling attack was captured on CCTV footage.

In response to the killing, police in Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, banning public gatherings, meetings, and processions until May 6. The orders also prohibit the carrying of items that could

be used as weapons. Suhas Shetty had several cases registered against him, including charges related to assault and unlawful assembly. He was a key figure linked to local Hindutva groups and was reportedly involved in the murder of Mohammed Fazil, which had been widely regarded as a retaliatory act following the assassination of BJP youth worker Praveen Nettaru.

Following Shetty's murder, Karnataka Home Minister G Parameshwara condemned the incident as a "gruesome" act. He assured that four separate police teams had been assigned

> The attack on Shetty is the second murder within a week in Mangaluru. On April 27, Ashraf, a resident of Wayanad in Kerala, was allegedly beaten to death over a dispute during a cricket match on the outskirts of the city. Preliminary investigations suggested that the victim was assaulted after shouting "Pakistan Zindabad," leading to a violent confrontation. The police had detained 25 individuals for questioning, and 20 of them have been arrested following further investigations into the assault.

#### "Not A Time For Politics": Congress **Working Committee on Pahalgam Attack**

The Congress party, in a resolution passed by its Working Committee (CWC) on Friday, emphasized that the Pahalgam terror attack, which killed 26 people on April 22, is a moment for national unity and strength rather than political division. Chaired by party president Mallikarjun Kharge, the CWC meeting was attended by senior leaders including Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, Jairam Ramesh, K C Venugopal, and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra.

called for a time-bound investigation into the lapses in security and intelligence in one of the country's most heavily-guarded regions. "The entire country awaits accountability, answers and justice," the resolution stat-

It called on the government to act decisively in isolating and penalizing Pakistan for its role in perpetuating terrorism. "We must rise above partisan divides and send out an unambiguous message that India stands together," Congress emphasized.

The Congress Working Committee also expressed its unwavering support for the families of the victims of the attack, stressing that compensation alone is insufficient. The party demanded long-term rehabilitation, mental health support, and national recognition to honor the victims.

# **Ukraine's air force says** Russia launched 150 drones in overnight attack



#### Pahalgam attack: Indian response to Kashmir attack should avoid regional war: J.D. Vance

U.S. Vice President J.D. Vance has urged India to exercise restraint in response to the recent Pahalgam terror attack, emphasizing the importance of avoiding a wider regional conflict. Speaking to Fox News on May 1, 2025, Vance also called on Pakistan to cooperate with India in identifying and neutralizing militants that may be operating from its territory.

Vance's comments came while he was visiting India with his family on a fourday trip, coinciding with the April 22 terror attack in Pahalgam — the deadliest since the 2019 Pulwama incident. The attack, which claimed 26 lives, has significantly escalated tensions between India and Pakistan.

"Our hope is that India responds to this terrorist attack in a way that doesn't lead to a broader regional conflict," said Vance during Fox News' "Special Report." When asked if the situation between the two nuclear-armed nations was concerning, Vance acknowledged, "Anytime you see a hotspot flaring up, especially between two nuclear powers, it's a cause for concern."

The Vice President reiterated the U.S. commitment to remaining in close contact with both India and Pakistan. He expressed hope that Pakistan, "to the extent that they're responsible," will take accountability and work with India to ensure that terrorists allegedly operating from within their borders are tracked down and held responsible.

Vance's remarks come at a time of heightened diplomatic strain. In the immediate aftermath of the Pahalgam attack, India took several measures, including suspending the 1960 Indus Water Treaty and closing the Attari land-transit point with Pakistan. The attack also drew widespread international condemnation, with many global leaders expressing solidarity with India.

Vice President Vance had earlier taken to social media to condemn the Pahalgam attack and extend condolences to the victims and their families.

With cross-border tensions on the rise, Vance's appeal highlights Washington's concern about stability in South Asia and its support for counterterrorism cooperation without triggering further escalation.

#### **Pro-Khalistani Leader Urges Sikh Soldiers to Reject War** with Pakistan

**Amid Pahalgam Attack Fallout**

In a provocative video message, pro-Khalistani activist Gurpatwant Singh Pannun has called on Sikh soldiers in the Indian Army to refuse participation in any military conflict between India and Pakistan. Pannun, leader of the banned group Sikhs For Justice, claimed that Pakistan is a "friendly" nation for Sikhs and Khalistan supporters, and urged Sikh personnel to "serve langar" to the Pakistani army in the event of war.

The appeal comes in the wake of the deadly Pahalgam terror attack on April 22, 2025, which resulted in the deaths of 26 people, including 25 tourists and one local. The attack, carried out by militants from The Resistance Front (TRF), a Pakistan-based offshoot of Lashkar-e-Taiba, has heightened tensions between India and Pakistan. The TRF initially claimed responsibility for the attack but later retracted its statement.

Pannun's comments have been met with criticism from Indian officials, who view them as an attempt to incite division among Sikh soldiers and undermine national unity. The Indian government has not responded directly to Pannun's remarks, but the Ministry of External Affairs has condemned the Pahalgam attack and called for international cooperation in combating terrorism.

The situation remains tense, with both India and Pakistan on high alert. The international community continues to monitor developments closely, urging restraint and dialogue to prevent further escalation in the region.



## **Canadian PM Mark Carney to Meet US President Donald Trump Amid Rising Tensions**

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney announced on Friday that he will meet with U.S. President Donald Trump at the White House on Tuesday. This high-stakes meeting comes amid escalating tensions between the two countries over trade disputes and sovereignty concerns.

Carney's Liberal Party secured a narrow victory in the recent federal elections, defeating Conservative leader Pierre Poilievre. The election result was seen as a response to Trump's aggressive trade policies and threats to Canadian sovereignty. In his victory speech, Carney emphasized that Canadians elected his government to stand up to President Trump and build a strong economy. He vowed to defend Canada's interests and negotiate future cooperation terms with the U.S. .

#### **Pakistan Reopens Wagah Border for Stranded Citizens Amid Visa Row**



Pakistan announced on Friday, May 2, 2025, that it would continue to allow the use of the Wagah border crossing for its citizens stranded in India, following New Delhi's decision to revoke visas in the aftermath of the Pahalgam terror incident.

The Attari-Wagah border, located near Amritsar in India and Lahore in Pakistan, was shut on Thursday, May 1, 2025, after being kept open until April 30. Reports indicated that as many as 70 Pakistani nationals were stranded at the border on Thursday, as the deadline for leaving India expired a day earlier.

In response to media queries, a spokesperson for Pakistan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA) acknowledged reports of Pakistani nationals, including children, stranded at the Attari border on the Indian side. The spokesperson stated, "We are aware of the media reports indicating that some Pakistani nationals are stranded at Attari. We are open to receiving our citizens in case the Indian authorities allow them to cross the border from their side." The MoFA also criticized India's decision to revoke visas of Pakistani citizens, stating that it was creating serious humanitarian challenges, including disruptions to medical treatments and family separations.

India had issued the 'Leave India' notice to Pakistani nationals after 26 people, mostly tourists, were killed by terrorists with Pakistan links in Kashmir's Pahalgam on April 22. The deadline for exiting India for those holding SAARC visas was April 26, for medical visas was April 29, and for other categories of visas was April 27. After the expiry of the deadline, no one from Pakistan or India could cross over to each other's country.

Mirroring India's steps, Islamabad had also closed the Wagah border post, canceled visas given to Indians under the SAARC Visa Exemption Scheme (SVES), and asked military advisers at the Indian High Commission to leave. Pakistan had stated, "All cross-border transit from India through this route shall be suspended, without exception.

## **Amazon Posts Strong Q1 Results Amid Trade** Uncertainty, Shares Dip **After-Hours**



A mazon reported strong Trump's trade policies, which infirst-quarter earnings on clude steep 145% tariffs on China. Thursday, with both profit and revenue surpassing analysts' expectations, reinforcing the company's dominance in e-commerce and cloud computing despite economic headwinds and mounting trade tensions.

For the quarter ending March 31, Amazon posted a net income of \$17.13 billion, or \$1.59 per share up from \$10.43 billion, or 98 cents per share, in the same period last year. Revenue climbed 9% yearover-year to \$155.7 billion, compared to \$143.3 billion in Q1 2024.

Amazon Web Services (AWS), the company's powerhouse cloud computing division, posted a 17% increase in sales, reaching \$29.3 billion for the quarter. The growth underscores AWS's continued strength in the tech landscape, particularly as Amazon ramps up investments in generative artificial intelligence and data infrastructure. The company is investing billions in AI development, including custom chips and expanded data centers.

Despite the strong quarterly performance, Amazon shares dipped more than 2% in afweighed the company's cautious outlook amid growing economic and geopolitical concerns.

These policies are expected to impact consumer prices and supply chains. Still, Jassy emphasized Amazon's ability to navigate turbulent markets.

"When there are uncertain environments, customers tend to choose the provider they trust most," said Jassy. "Given our broad selection, low pricing, and fast delivery, we've consistently emerged from these periods stronger."

To mitigate the impact of tariffs, Amazon and many of its third-party sellers accelerated imports ahead of policy changes. Amazon said it spent \$25.02 billion on property and equipment in Q1, up from \$14.92 billion a year ago. It also announced a \$4 billion rural delivery network expansion through 2026.




