

Robbery at Former Minister Jawahar's Residence

A robbery took place at the residence of former Minister and senior Telugu Desam Party leader K.S. Jawahar in Kovvur town. The crime occurred while Jawahar, who had been appointed as in-charge for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's assembly, was away in Gudivada. His son and children had also left for their hometown, Tiruvur, three days pri-

On Saturday, Jawahar's follower, V.V. Raju, who regularly visited the house to water the plants, noticed the back door was open. Upon entering, he found items scattered across the house, arousing suspicion. Raju immediately alerted the local police and Jawahar about the

The police, including DSP G. Devakumar and Town CI P. Vishwam, reached the spot to investigate. Jawahar's family, including his son, Kothapalli Ashish Lal, soon arrived in Kovvur after being informed of the incident. The burglars reportedly stole two cell phones, expensive watches, a television, silver items, and Rs. 45,000 in cash.

The authorities have launched a full investigation, bringing in a clue team and a dog squad from Rajahmundry to assist with gathering evidence, including fingerprints found at the scene. A case has been registered based on Jawahar's complaint, and efforts are underway to identify the culprits.

Massive Long March in Kadapa Against Waqf Bill

- Muslim Personal Law Board leads protest with support from YCP, Congress, Left
- · TDP leaders face backlash, asked to leave rally
- Call for withdrawal of the Waqf Amendment Bill

A massive protest rally titled the Long March against the Waqf Amendment Bill was held in Kadapa, drawing participation from the All India Muslim Personal Law Board and leaders from the Congress, YSR Congress Party (YSRCP), and the Left. The rally voiced strong opposition to the Waqf Amendment Act, calling it an unconstitutional and anti-secular move by the central government.

Speaking after the march, Kadapa MP Y.S. Avinash Reddy alleged that the Modi government is acting with ill intentions and insisted that opposition to the bill is not limited to one community. "People of all castes and religions are opposing this amendment. YSRCP has also opposed it in the Rajya Sabha under the direction of our leader Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy and filed a writ petition in the Supreme Court," he stated.

Reddy argued that the bill is undemocratic, as it reduces the number of board committees and permits the appointment of non-Muslims to the Waqf Board — a move he said violates the spirit of religious autonomy. He said the central government must recognize that crores of people are against the bill and warned that the movement will intensify unless the bill is withdrawn.

Former Deputy CM Amjad Basha and YSRCP district president Ravin-



dranath Reddy strongly condemned the bill, saying, "When only Hindus are allowed on temple committees, Sikhs in Gurudwaras, and Christians in their trusts, how can non-Muslims be included in the Waqf Board?" They accused the central government of trying to seize Waqf and minority properties to benefit corporates. They added that the bill isn't just an attack on Muslims but on all communities. Congress leader Abdul Khan, CPM district secretary Chandrashekhar, and other prominent minority leaders also participated in the protest, with large-scale public support from the local Muslim community. TDP leaders face protest backlash

TDP leaders, including Amir Babu, faced a bitter experience when they attempted to join the rally. As they arrived at the venue, the organizers and participants objected to their presence, citing TDP's support for the Waqf Amendment Bill in Parliament. Slogans were raised demanding that the TDP stop its "dramas" and that their MPs resign if they truly opposed the bill. The leaders were forced to leave amid the protests.

The incident highlighted the political tensions surrounding the controversial bill and reflected the growing resistance from minority communities in Andhra Pradesh and across the country.

The Chief Minister instructed that the party's organizational committees — barring the state-level ones — must be completed by May 18. He announced that the TDP's flagship event, Mahanadu, will be held this year in Kadapa on May 27, 28, and 29, and that the state committee will be finalized there-

He called upon leaders to actively counter criticism from the opposition YSRCP. "The opposition is attacking every positive step we take. Our leaders must stay grounded, communicate the facts, and reflect the aspirations of the activists and people," he directed. Chandrababu also urged the party to adopt the Gujarat model of governance, praising its development pace under a stable regime. "We have brought visible changes in governance within a year. Now, our focus is to deliver on both governance and party strengthening," he added.

statements politically motivated and lacking credibility.

The minister highlighted that while the previous YSRCP regime owed ₹1,674 crore to farmers for grain procurement, the coalition government cleared the entire pending amount soon after assuming power. "We've gone beyond that and purchased 48.43 lakh metric tons of grain in the past 10 months — 11 lakh metric tons more than YSRCP did last year," he pointed out. He added that about ₹11,000 crore has already been deposited into farmers' accounts, often within 24 hours of procurement.

Moisture issue addressed with new measures

In response to recent unseasonal rains affecting grain moisture levels, the minister said the government has given clear instructions to millers to accept grain with up to 24% moisture. "We are setting up identical moisture testing machines at farmer assistance centers and with millers to ensure farmers aren't cheated," he assured. Manohar added that from next Kharif season, testing will be done using equipment from the same manufacturer on both ends to maintain fairness.

Support extended to millers as well

Acknowledging the role of millers, Manohar said the government has released their pending dues and made provisions for 1:2 bank guarantee ratios. "We do not insult or humiliate millers. But if anyone causes trouble or creates hurdles in grain procurement, strict action will be taken," he warned. Plans are also in place to procure an additional 3 lakh metric tons in Godavari district, 97,400 tons in Konaseema, and 57,600 tons in Kakinada. Manohar concluded by reiterating the coalition government's firm commitment to farmers' welfare and said field-level teams are ready to act wherever necessary.

Chennai Steps Up In AC Energy Campaign

- · BEE pushes 24°C setting across Chennai
- TANGEDCO to launch citywide awareness drive · Initiative aims to cut emissions and bills

With the summer heat intensifying and electricity demand peaking, Chennai has been identified as a pivotal city in India's nationwide energy conservation mission. The Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE), under the Union Ministry of Power, has placed Tamil Nadu—and particularly its capital Chennai—at the forefront of its national push to encourage responsible air conditioner (AC) usage.

BEE is urging all households and commercial establishments in Chennai to maintain their ACs at a default temperature setting of 24°C. The twin goals behind this directive are to promote energy-efficient cooling and reduce overall power costs



With a population of over

1.35 crore and the largest consumer base in South India, Chennai's energy consumption patterns have a significant bearing on national power stability and climate goals. BEE Secretary Milind Deore, joined by Directors Kamran Sheikh and Abhishek Sharma, interacted with key State Designated Agencies (SDAs) and called for swift execution of the campaign in Chennai.

"Chennai's role is vital. A collective shift to 24°C AC settings could be a game-changer," said Secretary Deore. He stressed that Tamil Nadu's SDA—TANGED-CO—must lead a focused awareness campaign targeting homes, offices, malls, hotels, and public buildings.



According to BEE estimates:

- Raising the AC temperature setting by just 1°C reduces power use by up to 6%.
- If ACs across India are set at 24°C, it could save up to 20 billion units annually.
- This translates into ₹10,000 crore in financial savings and 8.2 million tonnes less carbon emissions.
- Benefits of Maintaining ACs at 24°C:
- Energy Efficiency: Up to 24% less power consumption vs. 20°C.
- Cost Savings: Significant reductions in electricity bills. Environmental Impact: Reduces household and commercial carbon
- System Longevity: Less wear on AC compressors improves lifespan.
- User Comfort: 24°C lies within the ideal thermal comfort zone.

Smt. Anandi, Chief Engineer and Head of Department of SDA (TANGED-CO), confirmed that the agency will roll out the initiative on a war footing across Chennai and Tamil Nadu.

BEE has also appealed to air conditioner manufacturers to standardize 24°C as the default factory setting for new models. Citizens are also advised to use fans along with ACs, ensure room insulation, and install programmable thermostats for optimal energy use.

While BEE's earlier reference mentioned Hyderabad, the officials reiterated that "if even 50% of Chennai's consumers adopt this practice, the city can significantly reduce power demand and emissions."

High-consumption zones such as IT parks, shopping malls, airports, hotels, and public offices will be the primary focus areas for implementation. Alongside Chennai, other major cities in the campaign include Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Vizag, Thiruvananthapuram, Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chandigarh, Jaipur, Bhopal, and Patna. BEE emphasized that informed energy behavior in metros will help India strengthen its climate resilience and energy security. This campaign is not just a power-saving effort but a collective movement toward environmental protection and sustainable public welfare—one that Chennai is now poised to lead.

Special police teams have been dispatched to Bengaluru, Vijayawada, and Hyderabad to trace the remaining suspects. Authorities also questioned the helicopter pilot and co-pilot on April 16 to understand why the chopper was considered unsafe for return travel. The helicopter in question reportedly belongs to a private aviation firm from Karnataka. There were initial doubts within the police regarding the nature and extent of the windshield damage. Meanwhile, the YSR Congress Party has launched a sharp attack on the state government. Party spokesperson Putta Sivashankar Reddy accused the ruling establishment of filing false cases against YSRCP workers to hide its own failure in providing proper Z-plus category security to Jagan.

He condemned the alleged targeting of former Raptadu MLA Topudurthi Prakash Reddy and his brother, stating, "The helicopter damage exposed the police's inefficiency. Instead of owning up, the government is registering false cases against Prakash Reddy's family and followers."

AP Rains: Home Minister Anitha Alerts Officials

Heavy rains lashed several parts of Andhra Pradesh today, bringing life to a standstill in many districts amid unseasonal summer downpours. With strong winds accompanying the showers, people in low-lying areas have been particularly affected, prompting the state government to go into high

State Home Minister Vangalapudi Anitha took charge of the situation by personally monitoring developments. She spoke over the phone with Disas-

ter Management Authority MD Ronanki Kurmanath to get real-time updates and assess the latest ground situation. Following this, the Home Minister issued urgent directives to district Collectors and Superintendents of Police (SPs) across the state. She emphasized the need for immediate precautionary steps, especially in vulnerable low-lying areas. Officers were instructed to ensure the safety of citizens and prevent any rain-related mishaps.

Minister Anitha also directed authorities to be ready with relief measures and to act swiftly wherever required.

She stressed that there should be no disruption in the supply of drinking water or electricity during this period. Officials in all rain-affected districts have begun mobilizing field staff and assessing the extent of the impact. Local administrations are coordinating with disaster response teams and alerting citizens about potential risks through public announcements. With rains continuing since early morning and forecasts predicting more showers, the state machinery is actively working to minimize damage and protect public welfare.



MP Vemireddy must answer illegal mining charges: Anil Kumar

Anil Kumar alleged that the case filed against Kakani was illegal and part of a larger smear campaign. "They are trying to falsely implicate our leaders. Kakani has nothing to do with illegal mining, and everyone knows it," he said. He firmly stated that they have not been involved in any such illegal activity and added, "We leave it to God." He further demanded answers from MP Vemireddy Prabhakar Reddy, stating, "The people of Nellore deserve to know what role the MP played or failed to play in controlling this rampant illegal mining. He cannot escape without answering.'

The former minister also criticised the current coalition government in Andhra Pradesh, alleging that the mining mafia has grown stronger under its rule. "After this government came to power, the anarchy of the mining mafia has reached new heights," he said. "Due to these unchecked illegal operations, hundreds of people are now unemployed and struggling for livelihood."

Gunasekhara Reddy, a native of Kalimbaka in Vijayapuram mandal, alleged that Roja, her husband Selvamani, a man named Meena Kumar, and the Nagari Municipal Chairman illegally occupied land owned by his family since 1982 in Jyothinagar near Nagarikonda. According to him, a rake shed was constructed on this land with-

Among other grievances, Ramanamma from Mulakalacheruvu in Annamaya district alleged illegal demolition of her house, while Koppula Narasimha Rao from Palnadu district requested the removal of his agricultural land from the prohibited list. Thirumalaya Yadav from Prakasam district highlighted the issue of unpaid bills for development works carried out during the TDP government's tenure between 2014 and 2019.

US Knew About the Pahalgam Terror Attack in Advance: KA Paul

Following the tragic terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, where 26 innocent people lost their lives, tensions between India and Pakistan have escalated, with fears of an imminent conflict. These meetings, along with discussions with the heads of India's three armed services, are seen as a move to finalize a response to Pakistan's role in fostering terrorism.

Ready to resign if charges are proven

Allagadda MLA and TDP leader Bhuma Akhilapriya has come out strongly against the YSR Congress Party (YSRCP), accusing its leaders of spreading baseless allegations and orchestrating a false campaign through certain media outlets. The MLA also lashed out at reports linking her to irregularities in the chicken business in Allagadda. "Even in the poultry business, they are trying to drag my name with false stories. This is nothing but a political smear campaign," she

Alleged false claims on Rs 300 crore betting app scam

Police say video defames top Telangana officials Cyberabad cops register case suo moto under cybercrime laws

The Cyberabad Cyber Crime Police has registered a suo moto case against popular YouTuber Anvesh for allegedly making defamatory and baseless allegations against senior government officials in a video shared on his YouTube channel.

According to police, Anvesh accused Telangana DGP Jitender, Hyderabad Metro Rail MD NVS Reddy, senior IAS officers Shanthikumari, Dana Kishore, Vikas Raj, and others of being involved in a ₹300 crore scam under the pretext of promoting betting apps within the Hyderabad Metro. The video, police claim, not only spread misinformation but also intended to damage the credibility of government institutions.

The FIR was filed based on a complaint by a constable from the Cyber Crime Police Station. The complaint stated that the video was crafted to create public confusion, incite hatred against state officials, and destroy the public trust in law enforcement and administrative services. The police found the allegations unsubstantiated and described the video as part of a false propaganda campaign.

Anvesh, known for his travel-based content exploring cultures and traditions worldwide, had recently posted a video that targeted top officials with serious accusations. This has now drawn sharp backlash from law enforcement. Netizens have reacted strongly, with some even demanding that other content creators expose Anvesh's actions in the same way he targeted others.

With this case now in progress, many are closely watching whether Anvesh will face arrest, especially as comparisons are being drawn with other controversial YouTubers like Harsha Sai and Imran, who are reportedly avoiding legal action

Kadapa Exhibition Tender Sparks Political Collusion Row

Officials, leaders blamed for revenue loss Tender given at ₹30.5 lakh instead of ₹1 crore Gambling, high pricing allegations surface

In a shocking revelation from the Kadapa Municipal Corporation, the ruling and opposition parties, usually seen sparring over political differences, are now facing allegations of working hand-in-glove to manipulate tenders related to the annual city exhibition. What should have been a transparent tendering process aimed at boosting municipal revenue has reportedly turned into a corrupt arrangement, costing the Corporation lakhs of rupees.

Every year, the exhibition held on municipal grounds generates over ₹1 crore in revenue for the Corporation. However, this year, instead of awarding the contract to the highest bidder through open tendering, officials and political leaders are accused of secretly handing over the contract to a favoured individual for a mere ₹30.5 lakhs. Whistleblowers allege that a bribe of over ₹25 lakhs changed hands to facilitate this under-the-table deal. To make matters worse, construction for the exhibition began without securing the mandatory approval of the Municipal Standing Committee. This clear violation of procedure has sparked outrage, especially since the same

der call on March 22 received no bids from the "preferred" parties, prompting officials to cancel and reissue it on April 1. This time, the contract was quietly handed to a close associate for a significantly lower price. The municipal land was reportedly given to the contractor even before the Standing Committee had signed off on the decision, a move deemed illegal and unethical.

Further controversy surrounds the nature of the exhibition itself. There are growing concerns that the contractor, now operating with political backing, is planning to permit gambling and charge inflated entry and stall prices, potentially turning the fair into a hub of unregulated activities.

Even more troubling is the reported involvement of some opposition members, who allegedly joined hands with ruling party leaders and corrupt officials in this deal, setting aside their political differences for personal gain. Locals now question how a contractor could afford to pay such high unofficial "commissions" unless he had plans to exploit the event for massive profits, possibly through gambling dens or other illicit activities.

With construction nearing completion, and the scandal gathering steam, the Kadapa Municipal Corporation hastily arranged a Standing Committee

meeting on Monday evening to retroactively approve the project. This last-minute effort, seen by many as a face-saving move, has only added to public anger. As the controversy unfolds, all eyes are on whether the Stand-

NEET 2025 Exam Concludes Successfully Across India

Over 20.8 lakh students appeared in 5,453 centres

The NEET UG 2025 examination,
a crucial gateway for students
aspiring to enter undergraduate
medical courses, was successfully conducted across the country and abroad on Sunday. Organized by the National Testing
Agency (NTA), the examination
saw participation from over 20.8
lakh candidates across 5,453
centres in 548 cities in India and
14 international locations.

To ensure fairness and transparency, the NTA operated a central control room under the supervision of the Union Ministry of Education. Key departments including Health, Defence, Home Affairs, and Electronics & IT coordinated efforts on the ground. Officials monitored all centres throughout the exam duration. In preparation, the NTA held mock drills on May 3 to verify arrangements at all centres. This included checking the



functioning of mobile signal jammers, biometric attendance systems, and staffing adequacy. Most exam centres were set up in government and aided institutions for better infrastructure and supervision.

Given the summer heat and afternoon exam schedule, authorities provided facilities like drinking water, electricity, first-

aid, mobile toilets, and even ambulance services at all centres to ensure student well-being.

To tackle misinformation and attempts at malpractice, the NTA launched a 'Suspicious Complaints Reporting Portal' on April 26. Through this, they received about 2,300 complaints and identified 106 Telegram and 16 Instagram channels spread-

ing fake question papers. The details have been passed to the Indian Cybercrime Coordination Centre (I4C) for further action. The Union Education Ministry

also held preparatory meetings with district magistrates and police superintendents across India, ensuring safe exam material transport, multi-layered security checks, and strict enforcement of the Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024.

Answer Key to be Released Soon The NTA will soon publish the provisional answer key for NEET UG 2025 on its official website: exams.nta.ac.in/NEET. Candidates can download it and cross-check their responses to get an estimate of their scores. Students are advised to keep an eye on the website for further updates on results and counselling dates.

India at a Global Crossroads: A New Inflexion Point in World Order

in global geopolitics, one that echoes the historic arrival of Vasco da Gama in Kozhikode in 1498. Just as the Zamorin of Calicut then failed to grasp the strategic implications of that moment, India today must act decisively in a fast-changing world order to safeguard its interests and assert its global leadership. With the global value chains now being reshaped not by trade but by geopolitical force, the stakes are higher than ever. India, poised to become the third-largest economy, cannot afford strategic complacency.

For over seven decades, the post-colonial international order—commonly referred to as globalisation—was built on multilateralism and a rules-based system aimed at the collective good. This framework, however, was anchored in a worldview that divided nations into "donors" and "recipients." That distinction has eroded as emerging powers, particularly China, have overtaken traditional Western powers like the United States in global trade, manufacturing output, and even in development financing.

As China rose to become the largest contributor to global infrastructure and aid, the legitimacy of existing institutions such as the United Nations, World Trade Organization (WTO), and various multilateral treaties began to wane. Their relevance diminished in the eyes of the very powers that had once championed

India stands at a critical inflexion point them. This erosion was symbolised by the United States withdrawing from key treaties and institutions, signaling a retreat from multilateral commitments.

> The COVID-19 pandemic accelerated this unraveling of the global order. The scramble by G-7 nations to hoard medical supplies revealed a stark disregard for international cooperation. It became evident that even the most developed nations would act in self-interest, leaving vulnerable countries to fend for themselves. As fractures deepened within the G-7, a vacuum in global leadership emerged.

> This vacuum is creating space for alternative global frameworks like BRICS to gain prominence. As the credibility of traditional institutions wanes, BRICS has begun attracting increasing interest from nations seeking a more equitable world order. Membership requests are expected to rise, potentially transforming BRICS from a bloc of emerging economies into a more dominant global institution.

> In this shifting landscape, India has a unique opportunity—and responsibility—to help shape the new global order. Its economic rise, demographic strength, and strategic position make it a key player in building new alliances and reinforcing multipolarity. To do so effectively, India must avoid strategic drift and embrace a proactive global vi-



How golden ages really start—and end

Openness as the Engine of Golden Ages: Lessons from History

Contrary to the belief that greatness is achieved by building walls—both literal and metaphorical—to keep out foreign goods, people, and ideas, history consistently points in another direction. Johan Norberg, the Swedish historian and author, presents a compelling counter-narrative in his book Peak Human, where he explores the rise and fall of golden ages across civilisations over the past three thousand years. His findings suggest that societies that flourished did so not by isolating themselves, but by embracing openness—be it in trade, cultural exchange, or the free flow of ideas.

Norberg's historical survey spans a diverse range of civilisations, from ancient Athens to the Abbasid caliphate, and from Renaissance Italy to the modern Anglosphere. Each of these societies, in their peak, stood out because they were more inclusive, more connected, and more intellectually curious than their contemporaries. They welcomed merchants from foreign lands, gave refuge to persecuted scholars, and encouraged debate—even when it challenged the status quo.

Ancient Athens, for instance, is often hailed as the cradle of democracy and Western philosophy. But its true strength lay in its openness. It became



a hub of learning and commerce not just because of its own thinkers, but because it was a magnet for ideas and talent from across the Mediterranean. Likewise, during the Islamic Golden Age, the Abbasid caliphate in Baghdad became a global centre for science, philosophy, and medicine precisely

because it absorbed knowledge from Greek, Persian, Indian, and other traditions.

The same patterns were seen in the flourishing of the Italian Renaissance, where a revival of classical learning and a network of trade routes helped cities like Florence and Venice become cultural powerhouses. In more recent centuries, the openness of Britain and then America to immigrants and ideas helped fuel scientific discovery, industrial growth, and global influence.

But Norberg also warns of what hap-

pens when societies turn inward. Golden ages have never lasted forever, and one recurring cause of decline is self-imposed isolation. When empires or nations began to distrust outsiders, close borders, or suppress dissenting voices, their dynamism faded. The same Abbasid caliphate that once championed knowledge fell into decline when it grew more insular. China, too, after the early voyages of the Ming dynasty, shut its doors to the outside world—missing out on transformative global developments.

This historical perspective challenges today's populist rhetoric that promises national resurgence through protectionism and exclusion. It highlights a fundamental truth: the progress of humanity has been driven not by division, but by collaboration and exchange. Walls may offer temporary comfort or political gain, but they stifle the very openness that fosters innovation, prosperity, and cultural vitality.

In Peak Human, Norberg reminds us that societies reach their peak not by fearing the foreign, but by embracing the unfamiliar. Golden ages are built not on isolation, but on connection. The question facing the world today is whether we will heed history's lesson—or repeat its mistakes.

Although the specifics of the meeting between the Prime Minister and the Air Chief Marshal were not made public, it is understood that the discussions are part of ongoing deliberations on India's military and strategic response. In a high-level meeting earlier this week, Prime Minister Modi provided clear directives, emphasizing that the Indian armed forces have "complete operational freedom" to determine the targets, timing, and nature of any retaliation.

India's response to such terrorist provocations has historically involved military action. In 2016, India carried out surgical strikes

dia accuses of harboring terrorist on terrorist launchpads across the Line of Control in response to an attack on soldiers in Uri. The 2019 Balakot airstrikes, in retaliation for the Pulwama bombing, were another example of India's use of force against cross-border terrorism.

> The Indian Air Force played a pivotal role in the Balakot operation, utilizing Mirage-2000 jets to strike a major terrorist training facility in Pakistan.

> In addition to military considerations, India has already begun exerting diplomatic pressure on Pakistan, including taking steps to suspend certain provisions of the Indus Waters Treaty, a longstanding agreement regulating the shared rivers between the two countries. Despite these actions, there has been no official word on the specifics of India's retaliatory measures, leaving the situation highly charged and uncertain.



Congress will back any action by Centre on Pahalgam terror attack: Priyanka Gandhi

Speaking during her two-day visit to Wayanad, the AICC General Secretary emphasized the importance of swift action in the wake of the attack and highlighted that the Congress Working Committee (CWC) had already passed a resolution underscoring this stance.

"The Congress Party stands united with the government. The CWC met and passed a resolution stating that we fully support whatever action the government decides to take. We hope that action is taken soon," Privanka Gandhi said, responding to reporters' questions on the matter.

The deadly attack, allegedly carried out by operatives linked to the Lashkar-e-Taiba, has triggered widespread condemnation and calls for stringent countermeasures. Congress has demanded a firm response to penalize Pakistan for what it termed as its "continued export of terror." The party also called for a time-bound investigation into the glaring security and intelligence lapses in a region known to be one of India's most heavily guarded.

In its official resolution, adopted under the chairmanship of Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and attended by senior leaders including Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, Jairam Ramesh, K.C. Venugopal, and Priyanka Gandhi, the party expressed deep grief over the loss of innocent lives and extended solidarity with the families of the victims.

The Congress leadership's stance reflects a rare moment of political consensus on national security, as the nation mourns yet another tragic terror incident. The resolution also stressed the need for strategic recalibration in counterterrorism policy, enhanced intelligence coordination, and greater regional vigilance. This strong show of bipartisan support aims to send a clear message that national security transcends political divisions and demands unified resolve in the face

India looks for partners, not preachers: Jaishankar on expectations from Europe

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, speaking at the Arctic Circle India Forum 2025, underscored the need for Europe to engage with India on the basis of mutual respect, understanding, and realism, especially in light of the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict. He criticized the Western approach of formulating solutions without involving key stakeholders like Russia, saying such methods "challenge the basics of realism."

Jaishankar expressed India's preference for global partners who prioritize cooperation over moral lecturing. "We look for partners, not preachers—especially not those who fail to practice at home what they preach abroad," he said, adding that while some parts of Europe are evolving, others still struggle with this outdated mindset.

He pointed out that India's expectations from Europe include sensitivity and an acknowledgment of shared interests, which are crucial for fostering meaningful and sustainable partnerships. "If



we are to develop a partnership, there has to be some understanding, mutuality of interest, and a realization of how the world actually works," he said.

On India's stance in the Russia-Ukraine war, Jaishankar reiterated that India has not prescribed solutions or dictated terms to either side. Instead, India has emphasized the importance of dialogue and engagement. "We have always been

careful not to prescribe a solution, which is a courtesy often not extended to us," he noted.

Highlighting the long-standing India-Russia relationship, Jaishankar emphasized the "important fit" between Russia as a resource provider and India as a resource consumer. He also defended India's increased purchase of Russian crude post-2022, framing it as a decision driven by national

interest, despite Western criticism. Jaishankar concluded by warning against unrealistic diplomatic expectations. He stated that attempts to solve the Russia-Ukraine issue without Russia's participation are not grounded in reality. "Nobody wants war, especially in an interdependent world. These are lose-lose scenarios," he said. India's approach, he maintained, is rooted in pragmatic engagement and global responsibility.



India Successfully Conducts Maiden Flight-Trials of Stratospheric Airship Platform

India has successfully conducted the maiden flight trials of a stratospheric airship platform, a significant milestone in enhancing the country's military surveillance capabilities. The trial, carried out on May 3, 2025, was conducted by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) at Sheopur in Madhya Pradesh, marking a key achievement in the development of this sophisticated high-altitude system.

The airship platform, designed to operate at stratospheric heights, was launched with an instrumental payload and reached an altitude of approximately 17 kilometers. This groundbreaking system has the potential to remain airborne for extended periods, providing an edge in intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance (ISR) operations. Few nations in the world have developed such a complex airship platform, placing India among the select few with such advanced capabilities.

DRDO Chairman Samir V. Kamat hailed the flight as a "milestone" in the development of lighter-than-air high-altitude platform systems. The flight trial lasted approximately 62 minutes, during which onboard sensors collected crucial data, which will be used for refining high-quality simulation models for future flights. The airship's envelop pressure control and emergency deflation systems were also tested during the trial to assess their performance.

"Not One And Done": Netanyahu's Multiple **Strike Warning After Houthi Attack**

Warns of Ongoing Strikes After Houthi Missile Attack Near Tel Aviv

Israel's Prime Minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, vowed to carry out multiple retaliatory strikes against Yemen's Houthi rebels following a missile attack near Ben Gurion Airport, Israel's primary international airport, on Sunday. The missile, launched by the Iran-backed Houthi group, marked a significant escalation in their ongoing conflict with Israel.

In a video shared on his personal social media account, Netanyahu made it clear that Israel's response would not be limited to a single strike. "We are acting against them in coordination with the US. We've acted against them before, and we will act against them in the future. It's not a one-and-done, but there will be strikes," Netanyahu said, signaling that Israel's military operations



would continue until the threat was neutralized.

The Houthi rebels, who have increasingly targeted Israeli interests, claimed responsibility for the missile strike. They stated that their actions were carried out in solidarity with

Palestinians in Gaza, amid ongoing tensions and violence in the region. The Houthis, who have aligned themselves with Iran, have ramped up their missile launches toward Israel in recent months, adding to the growing instability in the Middle East.

Israel's response to the missile strike near Ben Gurion Airport is part of a broader effort to defend its territory from external threats, including missile attacks from groups such as the Houthis. Netanyahu's warning of multiple strikes suggests that Israel plans a sustained military campaign to deter future attacks and protect its air-

The strike near Ben Gurion Airport raises concerns over the safety of one of Israel's busiest transportation hubs, which serves as a vital gateway for international travelers. As tensions escalate, the situation remains fluid, with both sides poised for further military actions. Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu Holds Record 15-Hour Press Conference

Sets New Record

Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu made headlines on Sunday after his office announced that he had broken the world record for the longest press conference by a sitting head of state. The 46-year-old leader held a nearly 15-hour session, surpassing the previous record set by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky, who held a 14hour press conference in 2019.

Muizzu began his marathon press conference at 10:00 am (0500 GMT) on Saturday, with the event running uninterrupted for 14 hours and 54 minutes, only pausing briefly for prayers. His office confirmed that the session continued past midnight, setting a new world record for presidential press engagements.

The extensive conference was held to coincide with World Press Freedom Day on Saturday, highlighting Muizzu's commitment to fostering a free press in the island nation. During the press conference, Muizzu emphasized the importance of factual, balanced, and impartial reporting, acknowledging the critical role the press plays in society.

In addition to answering questions from journalists, the Maldives president also responded to inquiries submitted by the public. This interaction underlined Muizzu's focus on engaging with citizens, a priority since he assumed office in 2023. As part of the session, the Maldives government also celebrated the country's rise in the 2025 World Press Freedom Index, where the nation moved up two places to 104th out of 180 countries, according to Reporters Without Borders.

"Will Use Full Spectrum Of Power": Pakistan's "Nuclear" Warning To India

Pakistan's Ambassador to Russia, Muhammad Khalid Jamali, has issued a stark warning, suggesting that Islamabad could resort to its full military capabilities, including nuclear weapons, if India attacks Pakistan or disrupts its water supply. Speaking to Russian broadcaster RT on Saturday, Jamali claimed that Pakistan had credible intelligence indicating that India is planning military strikes on Pakistani territory. "There are some other leaked documents whereby it has been decided to strike certain areas of Pakistan," he said, adding that this heightened the belief that an attack is imminent.

Jamali's comments represent one of the most direct threats of nuclear retaliation from a senior Pakistani official against India in recent years. He emphasized that Pakistan would use "the full spectrum of power, both conventional and nuclear," if provoked.

The remarks come in the af-



termath of the deadly Pahalgam terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir on April 22, which killed 26 people, mostly tourists. India has blamed Pakistan for harboring and supporting terror groups responsible for dus Waters Treaty (IWT), a key as of yet. 1960 agreement that governs water distribution between the two countries. This treaty has survived multiple conflicts between the nations and is seen as a stabilizing factor in their tense relationship.

Jamali condemned India's sus-"act of war" against Pakistan. He warned that any attempt by India to divert or stop the flow of water from the Indus River would lead to a full-scale military response. Pakistan's Defence Minister, Khawaja Asif, echoed this sentiment on Friday, stating that Islamabad would target any Indian infrastructure built on the Indus River in violation of the treaty.

The growing tensions have also led to military showdowns, with Pakistan conducting a test launch of its Abdali missile, which has a range of 450 kilometers and can carry both conventional and nuclear payloads. "Suicidal Concept": **Bangladeshi Islamists Protest Women's Rights Reforms**

Thousands of Bangladeshis took to the streets of Dhaka on Saturday to protest against the government's proposed reforms aimed at ensuring equal rights for women, particularly regarding property ownership. The protest, organized by the influential Islamist group Hefazat-e-Islam, centered around the claim that the proposed recommendations undermined "the sentiments of the majority" in the country.

Hefazat-e-Islam leaders argued that the draft proposals from the Women's Affairs Reform Commission, created by the interim government of Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus, were in direct contradiction to Sharia law. They specifically criticized recommendations that would provide Muslim women with more property rights, stating that such reforms would violate religious traditions. The group has threatened a nationwide protest on May 23 unless their demands are met.

The protest, which saw over 20,000 participants, took place near Dhaka University, with demonstrators, including many teachers and students from non-government madrassas, carrying banners with slogans such as "Say no to Western laws on our women, rise up Bangladesh." This event marked one of the largest public displays of strength by Hefazat-e-Islam in years, coinciding with a surge in religious activism following the ousting of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League government.

The Demands

At the rally, Maulana Mahfuzul Huq, a senior leader of the platform, presented a 12-point charter of demands. These included the abolition of the current Women's Affairs Reform Commission and the punishment of its members for the proposed changes. The group called for a new commission made up of Islamic scholars and women representatives. Hefazat-e-Islam leaders argued that the commission's proposals misrepresented the role of religious inheritance laws and were an attack on traditional Muslim values.

Additionally, the group called for the banning of the Awami League party and the reinstatement of "complete faith and trust in almighty Allah" in the country's constitution. They also voiced strong opposition to terms like "gender identity," "gender diversity," and "gender equality," viewing them as part of a broader agenda to promote LGBT and transgender rights, which they considered incompatible with their reli-

The ongoing protests reflect the growing influence of Islamist groups in Bangladesh following the political upheaval of 2024, with many fearing the erosion of Islamic practices and values in the country's legal system.

Xi Jinping to Visit Russia Amid Tensions and **Growing China-Russia Ties**

Chinese President Xi Jinping is set to visit Russia from May 7–10, the Kremlin confirmed on Sunday, in a move that underscores the strengthening of ties between the two nations. Xi's visit coincides with the Victory Day Parade on May 9 in Moscow, where he is among the prominent world leaders expected to attend.

The Kremlin stated that the visit is at the invitation of Russian President Vladimir Putin. In addition to participating in the Victory Day celebrations, the two leaders will engage in discussions about furthering their "comprehensive partnership and strategic interaction." They will also address key issues on both the international and regional fronts, and are expected to sign a series of bilateral agreements during the visit.

have increasingly relied on each other amid Western sanctions. These sanctions have restricted Russia's access to much of the global trading system, prompting Moscow to redirect its energy exports to China and seek Chinese companies' help in circumventing technology restrictions.

Although the personal ties between Putin and Xi have strengthened the partnership, there is a growing asymmetry in power between the two nations. As Russia faces increasing isolation due to its actions in Ukraine, China's economic influence over Russia continues to grow.

Meanwhile, Moscow has accused Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy of jeopardizing the safety of dignitaries attending the Victory Day celebrations by dismissing Russia's unilateral ceasefire. Zelenskyy claimed Ukraine could not provide security guarantees for foreign officials visiting Russia, cautioning that Moscow could stage provocations and blame Ukraine for them.

Reliance Industries continued to be the top performer, with its market valuation soaring by Rs 1,64,959.62 crore, bringing its total market capitalization to Rs 19,24,235.76 crore. Bharti Airtel also witnessed a significant surge, as its market value jumped by Rs 20,755.67 crore, reaching Rs 10,56,029.91 crore. ICICI Bank added Rs 19,381.9 crore to its valuation, bringing its total market capitalization to Rs 10,20,200.69 crore.

HDFC Bank, another major player, saw its market capitalization rise by Rs 11,514.78 crore, bringing it to a total of Rs 14,73,356.95 crore. Infosys, too, experienced strong growth, with its valuation increasing by Rs 10,902.31 crore to Rs 6,25,668.37 crore. ITC and State Bank of India rounded off the gainers, with their market values climbing by Rs 2,502.82 crore and Rs 1,160.2 crore, respectively.



However, not all companies shared in the rally. The market capitalization of Bajaj Finance dropped by Rs 15,470.5 crore, taking its total valuation down to Rs 5,50,726.80 crore. 

By the end of the day, Sachdeva was surprised to see his digital wallet swell by Rs 1,200, all contributed by strangers.

"I honestly didn't expect people to take it seriously. It was meant to be a fun social experiment," Sachdeva said in his video digital scams. documenting the campaign. "But to see the amount grow just shows how invested and spontaneous people can be, especially when it comes to cricket and RCB."

The video, posted on social media, quickly went viral—amassing over 24 million views and generating a flood of reactions ranging from laughter to concern. Many users found the idea hilarious, with comments calling it a "new business model" and praising Sachdeva's creativity. Others, however, expressed concern about how casually people scanned an unknown QR code, pointing out the risks of fraud in an age of rampant chord.



One user joked, "Only in India can you raise money off superstition and fandom." Another added, "Imagine the impact if people used the same energy to feed the homeless."

While opinions remain divided, the incident highlights the deep emotional connection fans have with the IPL and RCB, as well as the ease with which viral trends can catch fire in India's digitally savvy population. Apple Set to Launch Six iPhones in 2026, Including First Foldable Model and iPhone 18 Air

Tn a significant shift from its **⊥**traditional release cycle, Apple is reportedly preparing to launch a record six iPhone models in 2026, including its first-ever foldable device. According to a report from The Information, the tech giant is set to expand its iPhone lineup to accommodate new form factors and market segments.

Traditionally, Apple introduces four iPhone models each September. However, in 2026, the company could stagger releases across multiple events. The standard iPhone 18 and a successor to the iPhone 16e may be unveiled in Spring 2026, while the high-end iPhone 18 Pro models, a new iPhone 18 Air, and the much-anticipated foldable iPhone are expected to debut later in the year.

The foldable iPhone, likely called the iPhone Fold, is rumored to adopt a



book-style design with a 5.7-inch external display and a 7.8-inch internal screen when unfolded. Samsung Display has reportedly been selected as the exclusive supplier of OLED panels for the device, having met Apple's strict standards for crease reduction—something rival suppliers like LG Display and BOE failed to achieve.

Industry analyst Ming-Chi Kuo has suggested the iPhone Fold could be between 4.5mm to 4.8mm thick, potentially making it one of the thinnest

foldables on the market. The phone is expected to carry a hefty price tag around \$2,000 and feature Face ID, a punch-hole front camera, and a dual rear-camera setup.

Adding to the excitement, Bloomberg's Mark Gurman has hinted at a premium iPhone model set to commemorate the iPhone's 20th anniversary. This version may include ultra-premium materials like advanced glass, further pushing the boundaries of Apple's design and pricing.

These developments signal Apple's broader push to diversify its smartphone offerings and cater to emerging consumer demands for foldable devices, thinner designs, and innovative form factors. If confirmed, 2026 could mark one of the most significant years in the iPhone's evolution since its debut in 2007.

Napoli Edge Closer to Serie A Title **After Intense Victory at Lecce**

Napoli took a crucial step toward clinching the Serie A title on Saturday with a narrow but vital 1-0 win over Lecce, maintaining their three-point lead over reigning champions Inter Milan. The match, played in a charged atmosphere at Lecce's Stadio Via del Mare, saw Giacomo Raspadori score the winner with a brilliant free-kick in the 24th minute.

The win marks Napoli's fourth consecutive victory without conceding, and puts them within touching distance of their fourth league crown.
