

The Telangana state government has taken a crucial step toward conducting local body elections that have been delayed for months. As per official sources, it has been decided to hold the Sarpanch elections in July, and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy is said to have issued key instructions to the concerned departments to begin preparations.

The Telangana State Election Commission (TSEC) had already made all arrangements for the polls two months ago. However, elections were postponed following demands from various Backward Classes (BC) organisations that elections be held only after the caste sur-

vey was completed and the promised BC reservation was increased to 42%.

Adding to the complexity, the recent decision by the NDA-led central government to include caste enumeration in the national census has triggered fresh debates. The move is being seen as a potential challenge for the Congress government, as it puts the promised 42% BC reservation under scrutiny.

Though the Telangana Assembly had already passed two bills on the caste census and approved the 42% reservation in local bodies, education, and employment, they are still pending central approval. A senior official commented, "A full caste census and approval may take

nearly two years. The state cannot afford to wait that long without conducting elections. The terms of the gram panchayats and zilla parishads have already expired."

The term of the gram panchayats ended on January 31, 2024, while the zilla parishads completed their term back in July 2023. With constitutional and administrative urgency mounting, the Revanth-led government appears inclined to move forward with the elections, despite the legal and political challenges surrounding BC reservation.

A formal announcement with exact polling dates is expected soon.

Review Committee Under Lens in Phone Tapping Case

The Telangana phone tapping case appears to be entering a critical phase, with significant developments pointing to the involvement of senior bureaucrats. Former Officer on Special Duty (OSD) Prabhakar Rao, who is currently in the United States, is reportedly trying to distance himself from the controversy by shifting the responsibility onto the then review committee.

In a recent affidavit submitted to the court, Prabhakar Rao claimed that all phone tapping activities were conducted with the full knowledge and permission of the review committee constituted during the previous government's tenure. He also claimed that the sensitive phone tapping data was destroyed in December 2023 with the same committee's approval.

With this revelation, the focus of the investigation has now shifted toward the top officials who were part of that committee. Sources indicate that officials including the Chief Secretary, Principal Secretary of the Home Department, Secretary of the Law Department, and officials from the General Administration Department (GAD) may soon be sum-

Police say video defames top Telangana officials

Cyberabad cops register case suo moto under cybercrime laws

The Cyberabad Cyber Crime Police has registered a suo moto case against popular YouTuber Anvesh for allegedly making defamatory and baseless allegations against senior government officials in a video shared on his YouTube channel.

According to police, Anvesh accused Telangana DGP Jitender, Hyderabad Metro Rail MD NVS Reddy, senior IAS officers Shanthikumari, Dana Kishore, Vi-

kas Raj, and others of being involved in a ₹300 crore scam under the pretext of promoting betting apps within the Hyderabad Metro. The video, police claim, not only spread misinformation but also intended to damage the credibility of government institutions.

The FIR was filed based on a the Cyber Crime Police Station. The complaint stated that the video was crafted to create public confusion, incite hatred

against state officials, and destroy the public trust in law enforcement and administrative services. The police found the allegations unsubstantiated and described the video as part of a false propaganda campaign.

Anvesh, known for his travel-based content exploring culcomplaint by a constable from tures and traditions worldwide, had recently posted a video that targeted top officials with serious accusations. This has now drawn sharp backlash from law

enforcement. Netizens have reacted strongly, with some even demanding that other content creators expose Anvesh's actions in the same way he targeted others.

With this case now in progress, many are closely watching whether Anvesh will face arrest, especially as comparisons are being drawn with other controversial YouTubers like Harsha Sai and Imran, who are reportedly avoiding legal ac-

Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy strongly criticised the previous BRS government for sidelining key irrigation projects in South Telangana. Holding a review meeting in Miryalaguda with officials from the joint Nalgonda district, the minister asserted that the Congress govern-

ment is committed to completing all pending projects that were ignored under the earlier

Uttam Kumar Reddy said the Srisailam Left Bank Canal (SSLBC) tunnel project will be completed at any cost and assured that works on the stalled Kandamalla project will also resume soon. He alleged that the former BRS government paid attention only to the Kaleshwaram project, leaving out crucial initiatives like SSELBC, Devadula, Palamuru-Ranga Reddy, Kalwakurthy, Nettempadu, and Bhima

Fire Erupts in SBI Admission **Building at Patni Center**

A massive fire broke out on Sunday at the SBI Admission Building located in Patni Center, Secunderabad, triggering panic in the area. The blaze, which reportedly started on the fourth floor, quickly spread upward, completely en-

gulfing the fifth floor of the building in flames. Three fire engines were rushed to the spot immediately and are currently engaged in firefighting operations. However, officials on the scene revealed that the fire has intensified, making it increasingly difficult to control.

Preliminary reports suggest that the fire may have been caused by a short circuit, although a full investigation will be needed to confirm the cause. Sources indicate that several valuable

With temperatures soaring and power demand rising, Hyderabad has been identified as a key city in India's nationwide energy conservation campaign. The Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE), under the Union Ministry of Power, has called on households, offices, hotels, malls, and public buildings in Hyderabad to maintain air conditioners at a default setting of 24°C.

This move is part of a national effort to reduce electricity consumption and carbon emissions while ensuring thermal comfort. Given its dense population of over 90 lakh and a high concentration of

residential and commercial consumers, Hyderabad's ener- agency is launching a state-wide campaign, starting with gy usage patterns are now under close national scrutiny. BEE Secretary Milind Deore, along with Directors Abhishek Sharma and Kamran Sheikh, has emphasized the importance of Telangana's State Designated Agency (SDA), TSRED-CO, in implementing the campaign. Speaking with key SDA officials, he stated, "Hyderabad's energy consumption pattern also directly impacts national power stability and climate targets. A collective shift to 24°C AC settings could be a game-changer."

According to BEE estimates:

- A 1°C increase in AC settings can reduce power
- use by up to 6%. If ACs nationwide are set at 24°C, the country could save up to 20 billion units
- of electricity annually.
- This would result in ₹10,000 crore worth of savings and an 8.2 million-tonne drop in carbon emissions.

Other cities in the campaign include Bengaluru, Chennai, Vizag, Thiruvananthapuram, Delhi, Mumbai, and others, but Hyderabad stands at the forefront in South India's energy-saving efforts.

Heavy Rains Lash Telugu States, Orange Alert in Multiple Districts

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has forecast heavy rains in several parts of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana over the next two days. Orange alerts have been issued for multiple districts in both states as rainfall continues to intensify.

In Telangana, the Hyderabad Meteorological Centre has issued orange alerts for Sircilla, Karimnagar, Mulugu, and several other districts. The affected regions include Peddapalli, Bhupalapalli, Kothagudem, Khammam, Nalgonda, Suryapet, Mahabubabad, Warangal, Hanmakonda, Jangaon, and Siddipet. These areas are expected to receive heavy to very heavy rainfall, accompanied by thunderstorms in

Meanwhile, in Andhra Pradesh, the IMD has predicted significant rainfall in West Godavari, Eluru, and nearby districts. Thunderstorms are also likely in certain regions on Tuesday. Already, rain has begun in several locations across the state. Light to moderate showers are expected



in Srikakulam, Vizianagaram, Manyam, Alluri, Visakhapatnam, Anakapalle, Kakinada, Konaseema, East Godavari, Krishna, NTR, Guntur, Palnadu, Prakasam, Nellore, Chittoor, and Tirupati.

Residents in the affected areas have been advised to take necessary precautions, especially those living in low-lying regions. Authorities are monitoring the situation closely and may issue further warnings if rainfall intensifies.





Harish Slams Govt Over Fee Reimbursement Delay

Harish Rao criticizes Congress for neglecting students ₹800 crore dues pending, exams not conducted on time Degree, PG, and entrance test futures at stake

Former Minister and senior BRS leader T Harish Rao came down heavily on the Congress-led Telangana government for its failure to clear fee reimbursement dues, leaving the future of lakhs of students hanging in the balance. He lashed out at the government for paying crores to big contractors while ignoring students' welfare.

Harish Rao said nearly ₹800 crore in fee reimbursement dues to degree colleges have not been released, putting the academic future of six lakh students in jeopardy. He pointed out that the government's negligence has have even declared holidays and sus-

gree exams across major universities, including Kakatiya, Satavahana, Telangana, Mahatma Gandhi, and Pala-

He strongly condemned the delay, saying, "Third-year students are losing eligibility to appear for PGSET, LawSET, and other entrance exams due to the non-conduct of degree exams. This failure is a result of the government's utter disregard for education."

Highlighting the dire state of private colleges, Harish said managements are struggling to pay staff salaries due to non-payment of dues, some already led to the suspension of depended admissions. "While students

are pleading with the government to conduct exams, officials and ministers are acting as if nothing has happened," he said.

Harish Rao also contrasted the current situation with the BRS regime, stating that the KCR government had implemented the fee reimbursement scheme started by late CM YSR with utmost commitment. "Even during COVID, not a single rupee was delayed. Over ₹19,000 crore was released in 9.5 years, averaging ₹2,000 crore annually," he said.

He criticized the Congress government for failing to release even a single rupee in the past 17 months, despite promising in its manifesto to improve the scheme and introduce a ₹5 lakh education assurance card under 'Yuva Vikasam.'

He also called out Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Finance Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, stating that their words in the Assembly and to college managements about clearing dues immediately have proved empty. "Not a single promise has been fulfilled. From CM to ministers, all are walking the same path of neglect," Harish said.

He ended with a scathing remark: "During your 17-month rule, welfare hostels, degree colleges, and even medical colleges have been locked. Now even Gurukuls are suffering.



This is the dark mark Congress has left on the state's education system." On behalf of BRS, Harish demanded that the Congress government immediately release the pending fee reimbursement funds and conduct the degree exams without further delay to protect the future of Telangana's students.


Appoint Telangana President Quickly: Raja Singh

Chief Secretary Reviews Metro Demolition Works in Old City

Chief Secretary K Ramakrishna Rao on Sunday inspected the ongoing demolition works along the Hyderabad Metro Rail Corridor in the Old City, particularly between Darul Shifa and Shalibanda Junction, where several impacted buildings are being removed to make way for the project. Accompanied by top officials, the Chief Secretary assessed the progress of the works amid congested lanes and emphasised the importance of public convenience. Metro Rail MD NVS Reddy briefed him on the measures being taken to ensure that essential services such as electricity, telephone, and cable TV lines are safely relocated without disruption to residents.

"Despite the challenges posed by narrow roads, demolition is proceeding systematically to minimise inconvenience. Around 105 religious, historical, and sensitive structures lie along the corridor, and every possible effort is being made to ensure these structures remain untouched," Reddy said. He added that local stakeholders had been consulted in advance to ensure smooth cooperation on the ground.

The inspection also covered the ongoing work on the Detailed Project Reports (DPRs) for the second phase (Part B) of the Metro expansion.

The Chief Secretary confirmed that the DPRs are nearing finalisation and will soon be reviewed in a Hyderabad Airport Metro Limited (HAML) Board meeting before being sent for State Government approval and subsequently to the Central Government.

The Phase-2 DPRs include the corridors from JBS to Medchal (24.5 km), JBS to Shamirpet (22 km), and Shamshabad to Future City (40 km).

Officials accompanying the Chief Secretary included Municipal Secretary K Ilambarthi, GHMC Commissioner RV Karnan, HMDA Commissioner Sarfaraz Ahmed, and Water Board MD Ashok Reddy.

The Metro corridor in the Old City has long been a sensitive undertaking due to its proximity to many heritage and religious sites. Officials reiterated that extra caution is being exercised to balance development needs with heritage preservation.

Justice Maturi Girija Priyadarsini, a sitting judge of the Telangana High Court, passed away in Hyderabad on the morning of May 4, after a brief period of illness. The news of her death was officially confirmed by the Telangana High Court Registrar (Protocol).

Her mortal remains have been placed at her residence in Vasanth City, Hafeezpet, and her funeral will take place at Mahaprasthanam, Jubilee Hills, on Monday, May 5, at 12 noon.

Justice Privadarsini was an accomplished academic, holding three postgraduate degrees from Andhra University: an MA in Sociology, an MA in Public Administration, and an MA in Political Science. She was appointed as a judge to the Telangana High Court in 2022 and ranked 16th in seniority among the sitting judges. Her tenure was expected to conclude next year upon reaching the retirement age.

Her passing has left a void in the legal community, and condolences have been pouring in from various quarters.

Seize Illegal Constructions **Immediately: HC to GHMC**

The Telangana High Court has come down heavily on the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) for its failure to curb illegal constructions within its jurisdiction. Expressing strong dissatisfaction, the Court has directed the GHMC to immediately seal unauthorized buildings and floors that have already received show-cause notices.

The case pertains to a petition filed by G. Ramesh

tion in Sheikhpet's OU Colony, where a builder, despite obtaining permission for only G+2 floors, was allegedly raising additional floors, including penthouses. Justice B. Vijaysen Reddy, who presided over the case, sharply criticized GHMC's inaction and questioned the logic of issuing notices without taking follow-up enforcement action.

The judge observed that continuing construction even after the issuance of

disregard for the law and raised questions about potential collusion between builders, local politicians, and officials. "It is absurd to issue notices, then demolition orders, while allowing illegal constructions to continue unchecked," he remarked. Justice Reddy pointed out that as per Section 461A of the GHMC Act, the civic body has the power to issue show-cause notices and immediately seal any unauthorized structures. He stressed that the failure to act decisively was not only emboldening violators but also flooding the court with unnecessary litigation.

> In response to the High Court's directives issued on April 29, the GHMC has now acted by releasing a circular on May 1. This cir-

regarding illegal construc- notices reflected blatant cular mandates all Zonal Commissioners, Deputy Commissioners, Circle Offices, Ward Offices, and Town Planning personnel to ensure that unauthorized constructions are sealed without delay after issuing show-cause notic-

The circular marks a shift in GHMC's enforcement approach, compelling immediate action against violations of sanctioned building plans. The High Court's observations are expected to put significant pressure on municipal authorities to rein in the rampant illegal constructions across Hyderabad.

As the issue garners public attention, all eyes are now on GHMC to see whether it will strictly implement the sealing orders or continue its previous pattern of delayed responses.

Thanda Youth Demolish Illegal **Constructions on Play Ground**

In a dramatic show of public resistance, the youth of Dundigal Thanda 2 in Qutbullapur constituency took matters into their own hands by demolishing illegal constructions on a government-allot-

NEET 2025 Exam Concludes Successfully Across India

Over 20.8 lakh students appeared in 5,453 centres

Crucial Meeting on May 7 to Resolve Krishna Water Disputes

A crucial meeting of Irrigation Ministers from the Krishna river basin States will be held on May 7, convened by the Ministry of Jal Shakti, to seek consensus on a stable water-sharing framework that could last for the next two-and-a-half decades. The meeting is also aimed at paving the way for the gazette notification of the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal-II (KWDT-II) award.

The tribunal's award, delivered back in December 2010, has remained unimplemented due to legal battles particularly over Andhra Pradesh's objections to surplus water allocations and the controversial increase in the storage level of Karnataka's Almatti dam. Andhra Pradesh challenged the award in the Supreme Court in 2011, which led to a stay on its gazette notification.

Following the formation of Telangana in 2014, the scope of the KWDT-II tribunal was expanded in 2023 to include adjudication of water-sharing issues between the new State and Andhra Pradesh. A major point of contention is the project-wise division of the erstwhile unified Andhra Pradesh's share of 811 TMC (as per KWDT-I) and additional allocations. The tribunal has now been given time until July 31, 2025, to resolve the issue.

Telangana has been demanding a 70 per cent share of the Krishna water



based on its basin area and historical grievances of neglect. Andhra Pradesh, on the other hand, continues to stand by the existing 512:299 TMC allocation ratio. Karnataka and Maharashtra, who are also parties to the tribunal, are expected to safeguard their respective shares, potentially complicating consensus efforts. The KWDT-II award, based on 47 years of flow data and a 65 per cent dependability threshold, allocated 1,001 TMC to Andhra Pradesh, 911 TMC to Karnataka, and 666 TMC to Maharashtra out of a dependable yield of 2,293 TMC. It also redistributed the 285 TMC of surplus water among all three States, unlike the earlier KWDT-I award, which allowed Andhra Pradesh to use surplus water without formal allocation.

One of the most contentious issues remains the Almatti dam. The tribunal had approved Karnataka's request to raise its storage level from 519.6 meters to 524.256 meters, which Andhra Pradesh argued would jeopardise water supply to its Krishna delta region. This led to widespread protests and legal challenges.

25-Year-Old Woman Dies by Suicide at Jeedimetla

A 25-year-old woman died by suicide after allegedly jumping from the terrace of an apartment building in Subashnagar, Jeedimetla, on Saturday night. The deceased, identified as Laxmi alias Pooja, was residing at the apartment along with her husband Hari Krishna and her brother. The couple hails from Srikakulam district in Andhra Pradesh and had been living in Hyderabad for some time.

According to preliminary reports, Laxmi went to the terrace of the building late in the evening and reportedly jumped from there. She sustained severe head injuries and died on the spot, police officials said.

On receiving information, the Jeedimetla police reached the location and shifted the body to Gandhi Hospital for postmortem. A case has been registered, and investigations are underway to determine the circumstances and reasons that may have led the woman to take the extreme step.

Police officials stated that they are speaking to the family members and examining all possible angles, including personal and psychological factors, to understand what may have prompted the suicide.

15 Held for Gambling at **Adilabad Function Hall**

Rs 89,160 cash, 13 mobiles, and 6 bikes seized during raid

Fifteen individuals were arrested for indulging in illegal gambling at a function hall on the outskirts of Adilabad town on Saturday afternoon.

Acting on a tip-off, the Adilabad Rural police raided Balaji Function Hall around 1 pm and caught the accused red-handed while they were engaged in gambling activities. The police seized a total of ₹89,160 in cash, 13 mobile phones, and six motorcycles from the spot.

Adilabad Rural Inspector K Phanidhar, in an official statement, identified

the arrested persons as Manda Adellu, Sriram Santosh, Barkunti Raju, Chittala Sanjeev, Bongari Ganganna, Ekondi Gangareddy, Kola Bhojanna, Mentapu Mahesh, Ineni Kiran, Bollu Naresh, Angineni Dinakar, Thingeni Pochanna, Akula Sai, Gunjela Pradyumn, and Routu Sateesh.

A case has been registered against all the accused under relevant sections of the law, and further investigation is underway. Police are also probing whether the group has any links to larger gambling networks operating in the region.

India at a Global Crossroads: A New Inflexion Point in World Order

in global geopolitics, one that echoes the historic arrival of Vasco da Gama in Kozhikode in 1498. Just as the Zamorin of Calicut then failed to grasp the strategic implications of that moment, India today must act decisively in a fast-changing world order to safeguard its interests and assert its global leadership. With the global value chains now being reshaped not by trade but by geopolitical force, the stakes are higher than ever. India, poised to become the third-largest economy, cannot afford strategic complacency.

For over seven decades, the post-colonial international order—commonly referred to as globalisation—was built on multilateralism and a rules-based system aimed at the collective good. This framework, however, was anchored in a worldview that divided nations into "donors" and "recipients." That distinction has eroded as emerging powers, particularly China, have overtaken traditional Western powers like the United States in global trade, manufacturing output, and even in development financing.

As China rose to become the largest contributor to global infrastructure and aid, the legitimacy of existing institutions such as the United Nations, World Trade Organization (WTO), and various multilateral treaties began to wane. Their relevance diminished in the eyes of the very powers that had once championed

India stands at a critical inflexion point them. This erosion was symbolised by the United States withdrawing from key treaties and institutions, signaling a retreat from multilateral commitments.

> The COVID-19 pandemic accelerated this unraveling of the global order. The scramble by G-7 nations to hoard medical supplies revealed a stark disregard for international cooperation. It became evident that even the most developed nations would act in self-interest, leaving vulnerable countries to fend for themselves. As fractures deepened within the G-7, a vacuum in global leadership emerged.

> This vacuum is creating space for alternative global frameworks like BRICS to gain prominence. As the credibility of traditional institutions wanes, BRICS has begun attracting increasing interest from nations seeking a more equitable world order. Membership requests are expected to rise, potentially transforming BRICS from a bloc of emerging economies into a more dominant global institution.

> In this shifting landscape, India has a unique opportunity—and responsibility—to help shape the new global order. Its economic rise, demographic strength, and strategic position make it a key player in building new alliances and reinforcing multipolarity. To do so effectively, India must avoid strategic drift and embrace a proactive global vi-



How golden ages really start—and end

Openness as the Engine of Golden Ages: Lessons from History

Contrary to the belief that greatness is achieved by building walls—both literal and metaphorical—to keep out foreign goods, people, and ideas, history consistently points in another direction. Johan Norberg, the Swedish historian and author, presents a compelling counter-narrative in his book Peak Human, where he explores the rise and fall of golden ages across civilisations over the past three thousand years. His findings suggest that societies that flourished did so not by isolating themselves, but by embracing openness—be it in trade, cultural exchange, or the free flow of ideas.

Norberg's historical survey spans a diverse range of civilisations, from ancient Athens to the Abbasid caliphate, and from Renaissance Italy to the modern Anglosphere. Each of these societies, in their peak, stood out because they were more inclusive, more connected, and more intellectually curious than their contemporaries. They welcomed merchants from foreign lands, gave refuge to persecuted scholars, and encouraged debate—even when it challenged the status quo.

Ancient Athens, for instance, is often hailed as the cradle of democracy and Western philosophy. But its true strength lay in its openness. It became



a hub of learning and commerce not just because of its own thinkers, but because it was a magnet for ideas and talent from across the Mediterranean. Likewise, during the Islamic Golden Age, the Abbasid caliphate in Baghdad became a global centre for science, philosophy, and medicine precisely

because it absorbed knowledge from Greek, Persian, Indian, and other traditions.

The same patterns were seen in the flourishing of the Italian Renaissance, where a revival of classical learning and a network of trade routes helped cities like Florence and Venice become cultural powerhouses. In more recent centuries, the openness of Britain and then America to immigrants and ideas helped fuel scientific discovery, industrial growth, and global influence.

But Norberg also warns of what hap-

pens when societies turn inward. Golden ages have never lasted forever, and one recurring cause of decline is self-imposed isolation. When empires or nations began to distrust outsiders, close borders, or suppress dissenting voices, their dynamism faded. The same Abbasid caliphate that once championed knowledge fell into decline when it grew more insular. China, too, after the early voyages of the Ming dynasty, shut its doors to the outside world—missing out on transformative global developments.

This historical perspective challenges today's populist rhetoric that promises national resurgence through protectionism and exclusion. It highlights a fundamental truth: the progress of humanity has been driven not by division, but by collaboration and exchange. Walls may offer temporary comfort or political gain, but they stifle the very openness that fosters innovation, prosperity, and cultural vitality.

In Peak Human, Norberg reminds us that societies reach their peak not by fearing the foreign, but by embracing the unfamiliar. Golden ages are built not on isolation, but on connection. The question facing the world today is whether we will heed history's lesson—or repeat its mistakes.

In a high-level meeting earlier this week, Prime Minister Modi provided clear directives, emphasizing that the Indian armed forces have "complete operational freedom" to determine the targets, timing, and nature of any retaliation.

India's response to such terrorist provocations has historically involved military action. In 2016, India carried out surgical strikes

Congress will back any action by Centre on Pahalgam terror attack: Priyanka Gandhi

Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi on Sunday reaffirmed her party's unconditional support for any decisive action the central government chooses to take in response to the recent terror attack in Pahalgam, Jammu and Kashmir, which claimed 26 lives, including two foreigners. Speaking during her two-day visit to Wayanad, the AICC General Secretary emphasized the importance of swift action in the wake of the attack and highlighted that the Congress Working Committee (CWC) had already passed a resolution underscoring this stance.

"The Congress Party stands united with the government. The CWC met and passed a resolution stating that we fully support whatever action the government decides to take. We hope that action is taken soon," Privanka Gandhi said, responding to reporters' questions on the matter.

The deadly attack, allegedly carried out by operatives linked to the Lashkar-e-Taiba, has triggered widespread condemnation and calls for stringent countermeasures. Congress has demanded a firm response to penalize Pakistan for what it termed as its "continued export of terror." The party also called for a time-bound investigation into the glaring security and intelligence lapses in a region known to be one of India's most heavily guarded.

In its official resolution, adopted under the chairmanship of Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge and attended by senior leaders including Sonia Gandhi, Rahul Gandhi, Jairam Ramesh, K.C. Venugopal, and Priyanka Gandhi, the party expressed deep grief over the loss of innocent lives and extended solidarity with the families of the victims.

The Congress leadership's stance reflects a rare moment of political consensus on national security, as the nation mourns yet another tragic terror incident. The resolution also stressed the need for strategic recalibration in counterterrorism policy, enhanced intelligence coordination, and greater regional vigilance. This strong show of bipartisan support aims to send a clear message that national security transcends political divisions and demands unified resolve in the face

India looks for partners, not preachers: Jaishankar on expectations from Europe

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar, speaking at the Arctic Circle India Forum 2025, underscored the need for Europe to engage with India on the basis of mutual respect, understanding, and realism, especially in light of the ongoing Russia-Ukraine conflict. He criticized the Western approach of formulating solutions without involving key stakeholders like Russia, saying such methods "challenge the basics of realism."

Jaishankar expressed India's preference for global partners who prioritize cooperation over moral lecturing. "We look for partners, not preachers—especially not those who fail to practice at home what they preach abroad," he said, adding that while some parts of Europe are evolving, others still struggle with this outdated mindset.

He pointed out that India's expectations from Europe include sensitivity and an acknowledgment of shared interests, which are crucial for fostering meaningful and sustainable partnerships. "If



we are to develop a partnership, there has to be some understanding, mutuality of interest, and a realization of how the world actually works," he said.

On India's stance in the Russia-Ukraine war, Jaishankar reiterated that India has not prescribed solutions or dictated terms to either side. Instead, India has emphasized the importance of dialogue and engagement. "We have always been

careful not to prescribe a solution, which is a courtesy often not extended to us," he noted.

Highlighting the long-standing India-Russia relationship, Jaishankar emphasized the "important fit" between Russia as a resource provider and India as a resource consumer. He also defended India's increased purchase of Russian crude post-2022, framing it as a decision driven by national

interest, despite Western criticism. Jaishankar concluded by warning against unrealistic diplomatic expectations. He stated that attempts to solve the Russia-Ukraine issue without Russia's participation are not grounded in reality. "Nobody wants war, especially in an interdependent world. These are lose-lose scenarios," he said. India's approach, he maintained, is rooted in pragmatic engagement and global responsibility.



India Successfully Conducts Maiden Flight-Trials of Stratospheric Airship Platform

India has successfully conducted the maiden flight trials of a stratospheric airship platform, a significant milestone in enhancing the country's military surveillance capabilities. The trial, carried out on May 3, 2025, was conducted by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) at Sheopur in Madhya Pradesh, marking a key achievement in the development of this sophisticated high-altitude system.

The airship platform, designed to operate at stratospheric heights, was launched with an instrumental payload and reached an altitude of approximately 17 kilometers. This groundbreaking system has the potential to remain airborne for extended periods, providing an edge in intelligence, surveillance, and reconnaissance (ISR) operations. Few nations in the world have developed such a complex airship platform, placing India among the select few with such advanced capabilities.

DRDO Chairman Samir V. Kamat hailed the flight as a "milestone" in the development of lighter-than-air high-altitude platform systems. The flight trial lasted approximately 62 minutes, during which onboard sensors collected crucial data, which will be used for refining high-quality simulation models for future flights. The airship's envelop pressure control and emergency deflation systems were also tested during the trial to assess their performance.

"Not One And Done": Netanyahu's Multiple **Strike Warning After Houthi Attack**

Warns of Ongoing Strikes After Houthi Missile Attack Near Tel Aviv

Israel's Prime Minister, Benjamin Netanyahu, vowed to carry out multiple retaliatory strikes against Yemen's Houthi rebels following a missile attack near Ben Gurion Airport, Israel's primary international airport, on Sunday. The missile, launched by the Iran-backed Houthi group, marked a significant escalation in their ongoing conflict with Israel.

In a video shared on his personal social media account, Netanyahu made it clear that Israel's response would not be limited to a single strike. "We are acting against them in coordination with the US. We've acted against them before, and we will act against them in the future. It's not a one-and-done, but there will be strikes," Netanyahu said, signaling that Israel's military operations



would continue until the threat was neutralized.

The Houthi rebels, who have increasingly targeted Israeli interests, claimed responsibility for the missile strike. They stated that their actions were carried out in solidarity with

Palestinians in Gaza, amid ongoing tensions and violence in the region. The Houthis, who have aligned themselves with Iran, have ramped up their missile launches toward Israel in recent months, adding to the growing instability in the Middle East.

Israel's response to the missile strike near Ben Gurion Airport is part of a broader effort to defend its territory from external threats, including missile attacks from groups such as the Houthis. Netanyahu's warning of multiple strikes suggests that Israel plans a sustained military campaign to deter future attacks and protect its air-

The strike near Ben Gurion Airport raises concerns over the safety of one of Israel's busiest transportation hubs, which serves as a vital gateway for international travelers. As tensions escalate, the situation remains fluid, with both sides poised for further military actions. Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu Holds Record 15-Hour Press Conference

Sets New Record

Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu made headlines on Sunday after his office announced that he had broken the world record for the longest press conference by a sitting head of state. The 46-year-old leader held a nearly 15-hour session, surpassing the previous record set by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky, who held a 14hour press conference in 2019.

Muizzu began his marathon press conference at 10:00 am (0500 GMT) on Saturday, with the event running uninterrupted for 14 hours and 54 minutes, only pausing briefly for prayers. His office confirmed that the session continued past midnight, setting a new world record for presidential press engagements.

The extensive conference was held to coincide with World Press Freedom Day on Saturday, highlighting Muizzu's commitment to fostering a free press in the island nation. During the press conference, Muizzu emphasized the importance of factual, balanced, and impartial reporting, acknowledging the critical role the press plays in society.

In addition to answering questions from journalists, the Maldives president also responded to inquiries submitted by the public. This interaction underlined Muizzu's focus on engaging with citizens, a priority since he assumed office in 2023. As part of the session, the Maldives government also celebrated the country's rise in the 2025 World Press Freedom Index, where the nation moved up two places to 104th out of 180 countries, according to Reporters Without Borders.

"Will Use Full Spectrum Of Power": Pakistan's "Nuclear" Warning To India

Pakistan's Ambassador to Russia, Muhammad Khalid Jamali, has issued a stark warning, suggesting that Islamabad could resort to its full military capabilities, including nuclear weapons, if India attacks Pakistan or disrupts its water supply. Speaking to Russian broadcaster RT on Saturday, Jamali claimed that Pakistan had credible intelligence indicating that India is planning military strikes on Pakistani territory. "There are some other leaked documents whereby it has been decided to strike certain areas of Pakistan," he said, adding that this heightened the belief that an attack is imminent.

Jamali's comments represent one of the most direct threats of nuclear retaliation from a senior Pakistani official against India in recent years. He emphasized that Pakistan would use "the full spectrum of power, both conventional and nuclear," if provoked.

The remarks come in the af-



termath of the deadly Pahalgam terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir on April 22, which killed 26 people, mostly tourists. India has blamed Pakistan for harboring and supporting terror groups responsible for dus Waters Treaty (IWT), a key as of yet. 1960 agreement that governs water distribution between the two countries. This treaty has survived multiple conflicts between the nations and is seen as a stabilizing factor in their tense relationship.

Jamali condemned India's sus-"act of war" against Pakistan. He warned that any attempt by India to divert or stop the flow of water from the Indus River would lead to a full-scale military response. Pakistan's Defence Minister, Khawaja Asif, echoed this sentiment on Friday, stating that Islamabad would target any Indian infrastructure built on the Indus River in violation of the treaty.

The growing tensions have also led to military showdowns, with Pakistan conducting a test launch of its Abdali missile, which has a range of 450 kilometers and can carry both conventional and nuclear payloads. "Suicidal Concept": **Bangladeshi Islamists Protest Women's Rights Reforms**

Thousands of Bangladeshis took to the streets of Dhaka on Saturday to protest against the government's proposed reforms aimed at ensuring equal rights for women, particularly regarding property ownership. The protest, organized by the influential Islamist group Hefazat-e-Islam, centered around the claim that the proposed recommendations undermined "the sentiments of the majority" in the country.

Hefazat-e-Islam leaders argued that the draft proposals from the Women's Affairs Reform Commission, created by the interim government of Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus, were in direct contradiction to Sharia law. They specifically criticized recommendations that would provide Muslim women with more property rights, stating that such reforms would violate religious traditions. The group has threatened a nationwide protest on May 23 unless their demands are met.

The protest, which saw over 20,000 participants, took place near Dhaka University, with demonstrators, including many teachers and students from non-government madrassas, carrying banners with slogans such as "Say no to Western laws on our women, rise up Bangladesh." This event marked one of the largest public displays of strength by Hefazat-e-Islam in years, coinciding with a surge in religious activism following the ousting of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League government.

The Demands

At the rally, Maulana Mahfuzul Huq, a senior leader of the platform, presented a 12-point charter of demands. These included the abolition of the current Women's Affairs Reform Commission and the punishment of its members for the proposed changes. The group called for a new commission made up of Islamic scholars and women representatives. Hefazat-e-Islam leaders argued that the commission's proposals misrepresented the role of religious inheritance laws and were an attack on traditional Muslim values.

Additionally, the group called for the banning of the Awami League party and the reinstatement of "complete faith and trust in almighty Allah" in the country's constitution. They also voiced strong opposition to terms like "gender identity," "gender diversity," and "gender equality," viewing them as part of a broader agenda to promote LGBT and transgender rights, which they considered incompatible with their reli-

The ongoing protests reflect the growing influence of Islamist groups in Bangladesh following the political upheaval of 2024, with many fearing the erosion of Islamic practices and values in the country's legal system.

Xi Jinping to Visit Russia Amid Tensions and **Growing China-Russia Ties**

Chinese President Xi Jinping is set to visit Russia from May 7–10, the Kremlin confirmed on Sunday, in a move that underscores the strengthening of ties between the two nations. Xi's visit coincides with the Victory Day Parade on May 9 in Moscow, where he is among the prominent world leaders expected to attend.

The Kremlin stated that the visit is at the invitation of Russian President Vladimir Putin. In addition to participating in the Victory Day celebrations, the two leaders will engage in discussions about furthering their "comprehensive partnership and strategic interaction." They will also address key issues on both the international and regional fronts, and are expected to sign a series of bilateral agreements during the visit.

have increasingly relied on each other amid Western sanctions. These sanctions have restricted Russia's access to much of the global trading system, prompting Moscow to redirect its energy exports to China and seek Chinese companies' help in circumventing technology restrictions.

Although the personal ties between Putin and Xi have strengthened the partnership, there is a growing asymmetry in power between the two nations. As Russia faces increasing isolation due to its actions in Ukraine, China's economic influence over Russia continues to grow.

Meanwhile, Moscow has accused Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy of jeopardizing the safety of dignitaries attending the Victory Day celebrations by dismissing Russia's unilateral ceasefire. Zelenskyy claimed Ukraine could not provide security guarantees for foreign officials visiting Russia, cautioning that Moscow could stage provocations and blame Ukraine for them.

Tn a largely optimistic week for Indian equity **⊥**markets, several prominent industries emerged as the key gainers, with Reliance Industries, HDFC Bank, Bharti Airtel, and ICICI Bank leading the charge. These companies contributed to the BSE benchmark's impressive rise of 1,289.46 points, or 1.62%, marking a positive week for the stock market despite the holiday for 'Maharashtra Day' on Thursday.

Reliance Industries continued to be the top performer, with its market valuation soaring by Rs 1,64,959.62 crore, bringing its total market capitalization to Rs 19,24,235.76 crore. Bharti Airtel also witnessed a significant surge, as its market value jumped by Rs 20,755.67 crore, reaching Rs 10,56,029.91 crore. ICICI Bank added Rs 19,381.9 crore to its valuation, bringing its total market capitalization to Rs 10,20,200.69 crore.

HDFC Bank, another major player, saw its market capitalization rise by Rs 11,514.78 crore, bringing it to a total of Rs 14,73,356.95 crore. Infosys, too, experienced strong growth, with its valuation increasing by Rs 10,902.31 crore to Rs 6,25,668.37 crore. ITC and State Bank of India rounded off the gainers, with their market values climbing by Rs 2,502.82 crore and Rs 1,160.2 crore, respectively.



However, not all companies shared in the rally. The market capitalization of Bajaj Finance dropped by Rs 15,470.5 crore, taking its total valuation down to Rs 5,50,726.80 crore. Hindustan Unilever also faced a decline, with its market value slipping by Rs 1,985.41 crore to Rs 5,45,845.29 crore. Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), a leader in the IT sector, saw its valuation dip by Rs 1,284.42 crore, bringing its market capitalization to Rs 12,45,996.98 crore.

Reliance Industries remained the highest-valued company on the Indian stock market, followed by HDFC Bank, TCS, Bharti Airtel, ICICI Bank, and other notable firms. Despite some declines, the market as a whole experienced solid growth, signaling optimism in the Indian economy.


Google Joins Global Fans in Celebrating Star Wars Day with **Interactive Confetti Feature**

"I honestly didn't expect people to take it seriously. It was meant to be a fun social experiment," Sachdeva said in his video digital scams. documenting the campaign. "But to see the amount grow just shows how invested and spontaneous people can be, especially when it comes to cricket and RCB."

The video, posted on social media, quickly went viral—amassing over 24 million views and generating a flood of reactions ranging from laughter to concern. Many users found the idea hilarious, with comments calling it a "new business model" and praising Sachdeva's creativity. Apple Set to Launch Six iPhones in 2026, Including First Foldable Model and iPhone 18 Air

Tn a significant shift from its **⊥**traditional release cycle, Apple is reportedly preparing to launch a record six iPhone models in 2026, including its first-ever foldable device. According to a report from The Information, the tech giant is set to expand its iPhone lineup to accommodate new form factors and market segments.

Traditionally, Apple introduces four iPhone models each September. However, in 2026, the company could stagger releases across multiple events. The standard iPhone 18 and a successor to the iPhone 16e may be unveiled in Spring 2026, while the high-end iPhone 18 Pro models, a new iPhone 18 Air, and the much-anticipated foldable iPhone are expected to debut later in the year.

The foldable iPhone, likely called the iPhone Fold, is rumored to adopt a



book-style design with a 5.7-inch external display and a 7.8-inch internal screen when unfolded. Samsung Display has reportedly been selected as the exclusive supplier of OLED panels for the device, having met Apple's strict standards for crease reduction—something rival suppliers like LG Display and BOE failed to achieve.

Industry analyst Ming-Chi Kuo has suggested the iPhone Fold could be between 4.5mm to 4.8mm thick, potentially making it one of the thinnest

foldables on the market. The phone is expected to carry a hefty price tag around \$2,000 and feature Face ID, a punch-hole front camera, and a dual rear-camera setup.

Adding to the excitement, Bloomberg's Mark Gurman has hinted at a premium iPhone model set to commemorate the iPhone's 20th anniversary. This version may include ultra-premium materials like advanced glass, further pushing the boundaries of Apple's design and pricing.

These developments signal Apple's broader push to diversify its smartphone offerings and cater to emerging consumer demands for foldable devices, thinner designs, and innovative form factors. If confirmed, 2026 could mark one of the most significant years in the iPhone's evolution since its debut in 2007.

Abhishek Porel has shown intent but struggled to convert starts, while Vipraj Nigam's lower-order contributions offer DC depth. South African veteran Faf du Plessis's return to form is a boost, though his effectiveness on slower tracks remains to be seen.

Napoli Edge Closer to Serie A Title **After Intense Victory at Lecce**

Napoli took a crucial step toward clinching the Serie A title on Saturday with a narrow but vital 1-0 win over Lecce, maintaining their three-point lead over reigning champions Inter Milan. The match, played in a charged atmosphere at Lecce's Stadio Via del Mare, saw Giacomo Raspadori score the winner with a brilliant free-kick in the 24th minute.

The win marks Napoli's fourth consecutive victory without conceding, and puts them within touching distance of their fourth league crown. Antonio Conte's side now require just seven points from their est to equalizing for Lecce with a header that remaining three fixtures—against Genoa, Parma, and Cagliari—to secure the title, assuming Inter win all of their final matches.
