Rubio Calls Jaishankar

Amid escalating tensions between India and Pakistan, United States Secretary of State Marco Rubio on Thursday urged India to pursue immediate de-escalation, following a sharp spike in cross-border hostility. Rubio spoke to External Af-

in the day and expressed support for direct dialogue between India and Pakistan, reaffirming Washington's commitment to work closely with India in combating terrorism. The conversation took place just hours before Pakistan launched missiles and drones targeting multiple Indian cities, marking a significant military provocation.

In a late-night briefing, US State Department Spokesperson Tammy Bruce stated, "Secretary Marco Rubio spoke today with Indian External Affairs Minister Subrahmanyam Jaishankar. The Secretary emphasised the need for immedi-

IPL 2025 At Risk Of **Being Called Off**

ramsala The IPL 2025 is facing growing uncertainty, with con-

cerns that the entire season could be called off amid the escalating India-Pakistan border tensions. The IPL match between Punjab Kings and Delhi Capitals in Dharamsala was cancelled midway on Thursday, following air raid alerts in the neighbouring cities of Jam-

mu and Pathankot. The match was in progress with Punjab at 122 for 1 in 10.1 overs when floodlights failed, initially leading to speculation of a technical issue. However, the situation escalated when the lights went out, and authorities decided to evacuate the stadium for the safety of both the teams and the spectators. The ground, which holds a capacity of around 23,000, was filled to about 80% of its capacity when the evacuation took place.



"There was no panic from the spectators. They (spectators and players) were moved out of the stadium very carefully and safely," an HPCA source informed

Set Up Water War Rooms Across All Districts: Pawan Kalyan

State Deputy Chief Minister and Minister for Rural Drinking Water Supply, Shri Pawan Kalyan, has directed officials to establish Water War Rooms at both state and district levels to proactively tackle drinking water shortages during the summer. In a high-level review with engineering officials of the Rural Water Supply (RWS) Department, he emphasized the need for real-time coordination, swift response to complaints, and media monitoring to address public grievances effectively.

He announced that the government has allocated ₹28 crore for emergency summer measures and instructed officials to identify vulnerable areas in advance including drought-prone mandals, forest regions, and suburbs lacking regular supply. The RWS Department was asked to remain fully alert and mobilize resources without delay.

"Water War Rooms should function daily under the leadership of the Chief Engineer at the ENC office. Teleconferences with officers at all levels should be held to ensure rapid decision-making," Pawan Kalyan said.

The deputy Chief minister emphasized the need for multi-pronged strategies to address the water crisis effectively. These include supplying water through tankers, renting private water sources, setting up temporary water supply systems, regularly filling summer storage tanks, and repairing defunct water pipelines and hand pumps to ensure uninterrupted access to water.

He ordered officials to make use of the RWS One App for continuous surveillance of tanker supply operations to avoid any lapses. So far, 33,232 water trips have been made through 180 tankers, based on need assessments.

Officials were also advised to keep track of complaints through media, social media, and direct submissions to the CM camp office. Mapping and monitoring of water sources was also made mandato-

Pawan Kalyan reiterated the coalition government's commitment to addressing the drinking water crisis in the state. He urged full coordination between officers, staff, and Panchayat Raj employees to resolve water-related issues swiftly and efficiently.

Reorganization of Civil **Supplies System**

CM Chandrababu's New Directives

Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu has directed the Civil Supplies Department to completely reorganize the distribution system to ensure smooth delivery of ration goods, proper implementation of the Deepam-2 scheme, and the procurement of grains. His primary focus is to meet people's satisfaction and ensure transparency in the entire process.

The CM emphasized that there should be no irregularities in ration rice distribution and instructed that 79,173 names on the rice cards but missing from the GSWS database be immediately corrected. Additionally, he announced

Mitra will begin on May 15 to process rice card-related services, providing ease of access for citizens.

KYC Updates and New Applications

As of now, there are 1,46,21,223 rice cards in the state, covering 4,24,59,028 individuals. Of these, 3.94 crore people have completed the mandatory KYC process, while 23 lakh people are yet to complete it. Notably, children aged 0-5 and those above 80 are exempted from the KYC requirement. The central government has set a deadline for all KYC processes to be completed by June 30.



PSR Remanded Till 22nd in **APPSC Scam** Case

- Accused of Rs 66 lakh corruption in Group-1 evaluation

The Vijayawada court has extended the judicial remand of former Andhra Pradesh Intelligence Chief PSR Anjaneyulu till May 22 in connection with the APPSC Group-1 exam evaluation scam. He is expected to be shifted to Vijayawada jail soon following the court's order.

PSR Anjaneyulu is already under arrest in a separate case involving the alleged harassment of film actress Kadambari Jethwani. In the APPSC case, CID officials secured a PT (Prisoner Transit) warrant and produced him before the court today (May 8), where the remand was officially extended.

CID officials have levelled serious charges against PSR, who served as APPSC Secretary between 2018-2019. According to investigators, large-scale irregularities were committed during the evaluation of Group-1 Mains answer sheets. Although the evaluation was reportedly done digitally, false records were created to suggest manual evaluation, enabling the misuse of government funds. The CID claims that crores of rupees were siphoned off using this method.

Based on their investigation, CID registered a case on April 29 under IPC Sections 409 (criminal breach of trust by a public servant) and 420 (cheating). As part of the same case, Pamidi Kalva Madhusudan, Director of Com Sign Media Private Limited, was arrested and remanded till May 21. His company had been entrusted with the task of evaluating Group-1

CID alleges that Rs 1.14 crore was paid to Com Sign Media, of which Rs 66 lakh was misappropriated. Madhusudan is accused of simply reproducing the scores from the earlier digital evaluation and then fabricating records to show manual marking, without actually assessing the papers again.

In this case, PSR Anjanevulu is named as Accused No. 1 (A1), while Madhusudan is Accused No. 2 (A2). The investigation is ongoing, and CID officials are expected to question more individuals linked to the irregularities

No Relief from SC in AP Liquor Scam Case

In a major setback to the accused in the Andhra Pradesh liquor scam case, the Supreme Court on Thursday dismissed the anticipatory bail petitions filed by Dhanunjaya Reddy, Krishnamohan Reddy, and Govindappa. The apex court made it clear that no exemption from arrest could be granted to the accused at this stage. During the hearing, the bench observed that anticipatory

bail was not warranted and dismissed the petition accordingly. The Supreme Court had earlier taken up the bail hearing on May 5, but deferred its decision, citing the High Court's pending proceedings on the same matter scheduled for May 7. On Thursday morning, however, it concluded that anticipatory bail could not be considered in the current circumstances. The next hearing in the case has been adjourned to May 13. The AP liquor scam continues



to attract widespread attention, with the investigation expected to tighten further following this top court directive.

Disciplinary Action Dropped Against Bindu Madhav And Amit Bardar

The Andhra Pradesh government has halted further disciplinary action against senior IPS officers Bindu Madhav and Amit Bardar. Orders to this effect were issued on Wednesday by State Chief Secretary KS Jawahar Reddy to the Director General of Police (DGP).

Both officers were subject to disciplinary action by the Election Commission (EC) following violent incidents reported during the 2024 general elections. Bindu Madhav was serving as the Superintendent of Police (SP) in Palnadu district at the time, while Amit Bardar held the same post in Anantapur district.

The Election Commission had taken action citing their alleged failure to contain poll-related violence in their respective jurisdictions. However, the state government, after seeking detailed explanations from both officers, has decided not to pursue further action.

According to official sources, the government reviewed the responses submitted by the officers and expressed satisfaction with their



explanations. Consequently, Chief Secretary KS Jawahar Reddy communicated the government's decision to the DGP, instructing the police department to treat the matter as

This move effectively puts an end to the disciplinary proceedings initiated during the election period, signaling the government's acceptance of the IPS officers' justification over their handling of the election law and order

ED Steps Into AP Liquor Scam Probe

ED seeks case files, remand reports from SIT and police

A major development has emerged in the Andhra Pradesh liquor scam case, with the Enforcement Directorate (ED) officially entering the investigation. The ED has taken the first step toward probing the case under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002, signaling a deeper financial probe into the alleged irregularities and money trail behind the scam.

In a formal communication, the ED has written to both the Special Investigation Team (SIT) chief and the Vijayawada Commissioner of Police, requesting detailed information regarding the case. The letter specifically asks for a copy of FIR No. 21/2024, bank account details seized so far, and full profiles of the accused arrested to date, including their remand reports.

The ED has also asked for any chargesheets filed against the accused to be handed over for review. The agency's involvement suggests a fresh focus on the alleged laundering of illicit money in the scam and the movement of funds possibly linked to shell companies or benami transactions.

So far, the SIT has made significant progress in the case, having arrested Kasireddy Rajasekhar Reddy, believed to be the main accused, along with his personal assistant Paila Dilip. During interrogation, both are said to have revealed crucial information that helped the investigators track the financial and operational network of the scam.

Other individuals, including Dhananjaya Reddy, Krishnamohan Reddy, and Govindappa Balaji, have also been named as accused. Despite seeking interim protection from arrest in the AP High Court and Supreme Court, their pleas were dismissed, strengthening the hands of the investigation team.

As the ED begins its probe, the focus now shifts to tracing the proceeds of the scam and uncovering how government licenses and permissions may have been manipulated for personal gain. More arrests and asset seizures could follow as the financial trail unfolds under central scrutiny.

AP Cabinet Confirms Amaravati as Capital

The Andhra Pradesh Cabinet, chaired by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, convened and passed several key resolutions shaping the administrative, developmental, and welfare priorities of the state. Among the major outcomes, the cabinet formally confirmed Amaravati as the capital of Andhra Pradesh.

A resolution was passed to include Amaravati as the state capital in the Andhra Pradesh Reorganization Act, with the cabinet agreeing to forward the resolution to the central government. The move reaffirms the government's commitment to

develop Amaravati as the administrative and legislative heart of the state. The cabinet also ratified decisions taken in the 47th meeting of the CRDA and approved land allotments to several institutions within the capital region.

The cabinet expressed its appreciation for the successful execution of 'Operation Sindoor' and extended its congratulations to the Indian Army, Navy, and Air Force. It also thanked Prime Minister Narendra Modi for initiating reconstruction activities in Amaravati.

Another key decision involved the implementation of welfare schemes like Thalliki Vandanam and Annadata Sukhibhava, with ministers holding wide-ranging discussions Further, the cabinet approved the on their rollout. The cabinet also reviewed issues related to coastal security and defense industrial protocols.

A noteworthy administrative directive emerged concerning recent protocol mismanagement during PM Modi's visit. According to cabinet sources, CM Chandrababu Naidu instructed officials to ensure that such mistakes are not repeated. He directed that Union ministers and state ministers be seated appropriately and emphasized that Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan must always be positioned beside him during key public events, in line with his constitutional status.

Coalition Govt Signals Return of Emergency Era: MLC Chandrasekhar Reddy

YSR Congress MLC Parvatha Reddy Chandrasekhar Reddy has come down heavily on the Andhra Pradesh coalition government, alleging rampant corruption, media suppression, and political vendetta, warning that the present regime is beginning to resemble the dark days of the Emer-

Speaking to the press at the YSRCP city office in Nellore, Chandrasekhar Reddy accused the TDP-led coalition govt of resorting to a string of scams since assuming power and said the ruling party is targeting media houses that report the truth. "Arresting editors just because they published factual reports is a brutal misuse of power. If the press doesn't speak up against corruption, who else will?" he asked. He drew parallels between the current situation and the Emergency era, stating, "During the Emergency, opposition leaders were jailed and tortured. Now, the coalition government is raiding homes of YSRCP leaders and their supporters, forcing them to give false statements and booking them under fabricated charges."

He also criticized the Centre's celebration of Operation Sindhur while the state administration continues to collapse under corruption and poor governance. "In Andhra, scams have become the norm under this coalition rule," he stated.

"Jagan is trying to create religious divisions with the Tirumala laddu controversy. He never met me, and because he went to Chinnajiyar, he lost the election," Paul claimed.

Jagan Ruined Power Sector with ₹1.25 Lakh Cr Debt: **Minister Gottipati**

Minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar launched a scathing attack on former Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, accusing him of causing irreparable damage to the state's power sector. Speaking to the media on Thursday, Gottipati alleged that Jagan burdened the electricity department with a massive debt of ₹1.25 lakh crore during his tenure.

"At a time when the entire nation is united for national security, Jagan remains indifferent to the welfare of Andhra Pradesh," the minister said. He further accused the former Chief Minister of misguiding the public through false narratives spread by his media out-

Gottipati countered the YSRCP's claims on electricity procurement, stating that while Jagan's government purchased power at ₹9.38 per unit during peak hours, the current administration is buying it at ₹4.60. He clarified that the YSRCP's claims



of procuring electricity at ₹2.49 per unit from SECI are untrue, and that the actual agreement during their regime was at ₹5.12 per unit.

He also highlighted the benefits of the Axin Renewable Energy-Brookfield agreement signed under the present government. "This agreement will lease 1,700 acres from farmers at ₹31,000 per acre, with a 5% lease hike every two years. It's a win-win for both the state and farmers,"

he said. Gottipati claimed that the power tariff hikes enforced by the YS-RCP regime are still being borne by the public.

High Court Clears AB Venkateswara Rao In ACB Case

Judge rules allegations baseless Says no evidence of irregularities in tender process


Retired IPS officer AB Venkateswara Rao received major legal relief on Wednesday as the Andhra Pradesh High Court quashed the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) case filed against him during the previous YSRCP government.

The case pertained to alleged irregularities in the tender process for the purchase of security equipment when Rao was heading the Intelligence Department. The ACB had registered a case in March 2021, claiming misuse of official position and favoritism, and subsequently filed a chargesheet in the Vijayawada ACB court. However, Justice N. Harinath of the High Court ruled that there was no credible evidence to support the allegations made by the ACB. The judge stated that the accusations were vague, baseless, and could not stand legal scrutiny. He further emphasized that there was no need for the re-

tired officer to face trial in a lower court. Senior advocate B. Adinarayana Rao, arguing on behalf of the petitioner, highlighted that the procurement process was initiated by the then DGP, who also constituted the procurement and technical committees. The petitioner merely recommended the names of senior officers for these panels, without interfering in their functioning.

The defense also pointed out that no government money was spent on the equipment, as the tender was eventually cancelled by the then DGP. Therefore, the question of any undue benefit did not

Refuting another key allegation, the defense clarified that the Israeli company which won the bid had no connection with 'Akasham Advanced System', a firm allegedly linked to Rao's son. The Israeli firm itself confirmed it had no affiliated



companies in Andhra Pradesh or Telangana.

With the High Court agreeing with the petitioner's arguments and noting the absence of any material loss to the government, the case was dismissed, bringing a clear vindication to AB Venkateswara Rao.



Focus on boosting canal capacity to 3,850 cusecs ₹3,873 crore allocated for Phase 1 & 2 works CM aims Phase-1 completion by June 2025

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu is set like Kia Motors benefiting from water supto visit Uravakonda constituency today (May 9) to inspect the ongoing works of the Handreeniva Sujala Sravanti (HNSS) project, a key lifeline for the Rayalaseema region. Maharashtra's dynamic political terrain has seen a transformative shift with the rise of two major alliances — the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA) and the Mahayuti. The Mahayuti coalition, comprising the BJP, Shiv Sena (led by Eknath Shinde), and the NCP (Ajit Pawar faction), came to power with a decisive mandate in the November 2024 Assembly elections. While their initial performance has been promising on paper, growing internal rifts threaten the long-term stability and governance of the alliance.

With limited resources and competing political interests, the scheme's implementation has suffered from rushed beneficiary lists, inadequate verification, and inconsistent branding — with some partners allegedly omitting the "Mukhyamantri" prefix to claim political credit. These issues reflect a broader problem: the coalition is operating more like a collection of rival factions than a unified government.

To maintain credibility and ensure effective governance, Mahayuti leaders must urgently adopt a more cooperative approach. Internal discipline, transparent decision-making, and mutual respect among allies are essential to prevent administrative paralysis. Maharashtra's people voted for stability and progress. If the Mahayuti fails to function as a cohesive unit, it risks not only losing public trust but also derailing the developmental momentum it has claimed to build. A genuine coalition mindset, rooted in shared vision rather than individual ambition, is now the need of the hour.

India's Caste Census Gap: Why Truthful Data Matters for Real Equity



The conversation around a caste census in India is no longer just about statistics—it's about visibility, fairness, and the realities we choose to acknowledge or ignore. Caste continues to shape access to opportunity, yet our understanding of its reach is built on outdated or incomplete data. The last comprehensive caste count was conducted in 1931—under colonial rule. Since then, efforts like the 2011 Socio-Economic and Caste Census have failed, marred by misclassification and duplication, leaving over 46 lakh caste names in disarray. As a result, the data was never officially released.

Today, our policies still depend on broad categories like Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), and Other Backward Classes (OBC). While useful at a high level, these groupings overlook deep inequalities within each category. Some sub-groups have gained significant political and economic power, while others remain invisible, their needs buried under generalised labels.

This blanket approach harms the vulnerable. Government benefits often reach more dominant sub-groups that can organise and demand attention, while the truly disadvantaged are left out. Take land ownership: SCs make up 16% of the population but hold only 7.2% of agricultural land, as per NSS data. Even that figure lacks granular insight into which SC communities are most deprived.

Moreover, caste discrimination isn't isolated. It intersects with class, gender, and geography. A Dalit woman in rural Bihar faces different challenges than an OBC man in urban Karnataka—but policy frameworks fail to reflect such nuances. Worse, reservations and welfare schemes still rely on colonial-era caste population estimates.

While states like Bihar have initiated their own caste surveys, national-level data remains missing. In its absence, political decisions often rely on guesswork, ignoring the needs of the most marginalised. What India urgently needs is a transparent, updated caste and economic survey—capturing education, land, occupation, and access to services.

Both Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi and UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer likely played a key role in pushing their teams to finalize this deal, especially as many obstacles still remained just days before its completion. The agreement demonstrates that, even in a world fraught with uncertainties, nations are willing to embrace economic cooperation—if their leaders are prepared to make necessary compromises. For instance, India had to abandon its longstanding demand for more visas for Indian workers and students, a critical point of contention in past negotiations. The UK's current political climate, influenced by rising anti-migrant sentiment, made this concession essential.

India and the UK have seen their manufacturing sectors lose global competitiveness, while their services industries remain robust. The agreement shifts focus towards sectors where both countries excel, such as services, while offering more consumer-friendly deals. For example, Indian consumers can look forward to cheaper Scotch whisky and Jaguars, while British consumers may soon enjoy more affordable shrimp from India. These small, tangible benefits mark a shift in how trade agreements are being struc-

The India-UK deal is just one part of a broader trend. Countries like Canada are seeking new partnerships, and Japan, China, and South Korea are deepening their cooperation. The biggest prize, however, is a potential trade agreement between India and the European Union, a deal that has been in the works for years but may finally come to fruition by the end of this year.

As global trade continues to evolve, the India-UK deal signals that, despite challenges, the world remains committed to economic integration and consumer benefits.

Balancing AI Innovation and Inclusive Growth in Developing Nations

Jaishankar: India Doesn't **Seek Escalation but Will Respond Firmly to Any Military Attack**

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar stated on Thursday that while India has no intention to escalate tensions with Pakistan, any military aggression against the country will be met with a "very, very firm response." His comments came during a high-level meeting in New Delhi with Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi, who arrived late Wednesday night for a scheduled diplomatic visit amid heightened tensions in South Asia.

Addressing the recent flare-up, Jaishankar referred to the Pahalgam terror attack as a "barbaric" act that necessitated India's military response. The April 22 attack, which claimed the lives of 26 people in Jammu and Kashmir, was blamed on Pakistan-based terror groups. In response, India launched Operation Sindoor on May 7, targeting multiple terror camps across Pakistan-occupied Kashmir and parts of Pakistan's Punjab province.

"This attack compelled us to respond on May 7 by striking at the cross-border terrorist infrastructure," Jaishankar said. "Our response was targeted and measured." He emphasized that the Indian military's actions were precise, aimed at dismantling terror infrastructure, and not intended as a broader escalation.

However, Jaishankar made it clear that any direct military provocation by Pakistan would not be tolerated. "It is not our intention to escalate the situation. However, if there are military attacks on us, there should be no doubt that it will be met with a very, very firm response," he warned.

During the meeting, Jaishankar underlined the importance of India's partners, particularly Iran, understanding the gravity and context of the situation. He said that as a close neighbour and strategic partner, it was essential that Iran be fully informed of the challenges India faces with cross-border terrorism.

Iranian Foreign Minister Araghchi's visit takes place at a crucial moment, with both New Delhi and Tehran navigating regional complexities and shared interests in security and stability. The meeting underscored India's diplomatic push to inform key allies of its position, even as it reiterates its preference for restraint, provided its national security is not jeopardized.

The dialogue reflects India's broader strategy of measured deterrence and diplomatic transparency in the face of persistent security threats from across its western border.

Operation Sindoor: PM Modi chairs meeting with Ministries amid heightened security concerns

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday chaired a high-level meeting with Union Secretaries to assess the country's national security preparedness and inter-ministerial coordination in light of recent developments, particularly following the Pahalgam terror attack and India's subsequent military response under Operation Sindoor.

The meeting comes as India faces a heightened security situation after the April 22 terrorist attack in South Kashmir's Pahalgam, which claimed 26 civilian lives. In retaliation, Indian armed forces carried out precision strikes on May 7, targeting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK).

According to an official release, the Prime Minister stressed the need for constant vigilance, strong institutional synergy, and clear internal communication mechanisms. He reiterated the central government's unwavering commitment to protecting national



security, maintaining operational readiness, and ensuring the safety of citizens across the country.

"All ministries are fully prepared to respond to emerging situations," the government said, confirming that actionable steps have been identified across departments. Ministries have been instructed to reinforce institutional processes and maintain close coordination with state governments and local

authorities.

The review covered a wide range of topics, including enhancing civil defence protocols, countering the spread of misinformation, and protecting critical infrastructure such as power grids, communication networks, and transportation systems. Departments were directed to ensure continuity of essential services and improve emergency response frameworks.

The Prime Minister emphasized "whole-of-government" approach, urging seamless collaboration between ministries and departments to uphold national resilience and preparedness. Secretaries from key ministries — including Defence, Home, External Affairs, Power, Health, Telecommunications, and Information & Broadcasting — presented their preparedness strategies.

PM Modi directed all ministries to conduct internal audits of their preparedness levels and ensure proactive contingency planning. He also called for enhanced coordination with intelligence and security agencies to mitigate any further threats.

The meeting was attended by the Cabinet Secretary, senior officials from the Prime Minister's Office, and other top bureaucrats. The comprehensive review signals India's proactive stance amid an evolving security environment, with Operation Sindoor still ongoing and cross-border tensions high.

India thwarts missile attack on 15 cities, hits Pakistan defences

In a significant escalation of hostilities, Pakistan attempted coordinated attacks late Wednesday night and early Thursday morning on military installations in 15 Indian cities, including key targets in Jammu and Kashmir, Punjab, and Gujarat. The Indian government

confirmed that these provocations were effectively countered by Indian forces, which neutralised the threats using advanced air defence systems and precision strikes.

According to the government, Pakistan deployed drones and missiles aimed at military facilities in This attempted Pakistani assault cities such as Srinagar, Pathankot,

Amritsar, Ludhiana, and Chandigarh. However, these were intercepted and destroyed by India's air defence systems, including the Russian-made S-400. In response, India targeted and disabled multiple Pakistani air defence radars and systems in locations including Lahore.

Government sources revealed that India used HARPY drones to take down Pakistani radar installations and followed up with targeted strikes in retaliation. "The Indian response was in the same domain and with the same intensity," officials emphasised, underlining the measured nature of the operation.

Debris from downed Pakistani drones and missiles is being collected and analysed, which the government says will serve as further evidence of Pakistan's deep state support for cross-border terrorism, including funding and training of terrorist operatives.

came just one day after India

launched Operation Sindoor, a retaliatory strike on nine terrorist camps—four in Pakistan and five in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. The strikes began at 1:05 a.m. Wednesday and lasted 25 minutes, utilising a mix of 24 precision munitions, including HAMMER smart bombs and SCALP cruise missiles. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh confirmed that over 100 terrorists were killed in the operation.

Operation Sindoor was India's direct response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, where four Lashkar-e-Taiba-linked terrorists killed 26 people in Jammu and Kashmir.

India has reiterated its commitment to non-escalation, provided Pakistan refrains from further aggression. However, Defence Minister Singh warned that any further provocation will result in continued and forceful retaliation. So far, India has reported 16 civilian deaths and one soldier lost in ongoing cross-border shelling by Pakistan.

Punjab on alert: Orders Nighttime Blackout and Fireworks Ban Amid India-Pakistan Border Tensions

As tensions continue to escalate along the India-Pakistan border in the wake of Operation Sindoor, authorities in Punjab have implemented strict precautionary measures to ensure public safety. A district-wide nighttime blackout has been ordered in Gurdaspur, and bans on the use of fireworks have been imposed across six border districts in the state.

The order for the blackout was issued by the Deputy Commissioner of Gurdaspur on Thursday. According to the directive, all non-essential lighting must be switched off from 9 PM to 5 AM starting tonight and will remain in effect until further notice. However, the blackout will not apply to cantonment areas or other military zones, where security operations and essential services continue without restriction.

The decision comes amid heightened cross-border military activity between India and Pakistan. Following the Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 civilian lives, India launched precision strikes under Operation Sindoor targeting terror infrastructure across the Line of Control (LoC). Pakistan has responded with increased shelling and missile threats, prompting civilian safety protocols in vulnerable regions.



In addition to Gurdaspur, deputy commissioners in five other Punjab border districts including Amritsar, Pathankot, Tarn Taran, Ferozepur, and Fazilka — have announced an immediate ban on fireworks. The move is aimed at preventing confusion or panic among residents during a time of military alert, as well as avoiding any visual signals that could be misinterpreted during night operations.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has been in continuous consultation with defence and civil authorities to monitor the security situation. State officials have assured the public that all necessary measures are being taken to safeguard lives and maintain law and order along the sensitive international

Operation Sindoor Day 2: Pak will be entirely responsible for consequences: FS Vikram Misri

On the second day of Operation Sindoor, India reiterated its commitment to measured military action and warned Pakistan that any further provocation would be met with a firm response. In a detailed press conference on Thursday, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri firmly stated that no Pakistani civilians were harmed during India's precision strikes targeting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir.

Addressing media alongside Wing Commander Vyomika Singh and Colonel Sofiya Qureshi, Misri clarified that India's actions were a direct response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack, where 26 civilians, mostly tourists, were killed by terrorists in Baisaran valley, South Kashmir. Misri emphasized that this attack marked the original escalation, and India's military operations were designed to dismantle terror infrastructure—not to provoke.

"Any further action by Pakistan, some of which we are seeing today, is nothing but escalation by Pakistan once again and will be responded to, and is being responded to appropriately," Misri warned.

India denied Pakistan's claims of civilian casualties and the alleged targeting of civilian infra-



structure, including a dam. Misri called these allegations "absolute fabrication" and warned Pakistan against using such false narratives as justification for retaliatory strikes on Indian infrastructure.

Wing Commander Vyomika Singh added that Pakistan had intensified unprovoked shelling across the Line of Control (LoC), using mortars and heavy artillery in Kupwara, Baramulla, Uri, Poonch, Mendhar, and Rajouri sectors in Jammu and Kashmir. These actions, she said, point to deliberate provocation from Pakistan's side.

Misri underlined that India's airstrikes were carefully calibrated and targeted at nine terrorist facilities across the border under Operation Sindoor, conducted early Wednesday morning. These actions, he noted, were based on credible intelligence and carried out in a restrained and proportionate manner.

UK Parliament Debates India-Pakistan Conflict, Calls for De-escalation Efforts

Bill Gates to Donate 99% of Wealth. Gates **Foundation to Close** by 2045

In a landmark philanthropic decision, Bill Gates announced on Thursday that the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation will shut down in 2045 after donating 99% of his remaining wealth—estimated at \$107 billion. The tech magnate and Microsoft co-founder plans to channel the remainder of his fortune into the foundation, enabling it to distribute an additional \$200 billion over the next two decades, according to the Associated Press.

"It's kind of thrilling to have that much to be able to put into these causes," Gates said in an interview, explaining that a 20-year window balances the urgency of global challenges with the need for structured, impactful giving.

Established in 2000 with Melinda French Gates, the Gates Foundation has been a transformative force in global health, poverty reduction, and education. To date, it has spent more than \$100 billion supporting scientific innovation, sanitation initiatives, vaccine distribution, and other critical services in lowand middle-income countries.

Gates emphasized that the decision to sunset the foundation by 2045 reflects a strategic shift to concentrate resources in a finite period for maximum impact. "I think 20 years is the right balance between giving as much as we can to make progress on these things and giving people a lot of notice that now this money will be gone," he noted. About 41% of the foundation's total funds have come from Gates' longtime friend and fellow billionaire Warren Buffett, with the rest contributed by Gates himself. Their joint effort helped establish global health programs such as Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, and the Global Fund, which combats HIV, tuberculosis, and malaria. Gates said this philanthropic journey has become his "second and final career," driven by the stark disparity he discovered in global health funding.

No New Pope Yet: Black Smoke Signals Inconclusive Voting on Day Two of Vatican Conclave

The Catholic Church continues to wait for a new leader, as black smoke once again billowed from the Sistine Chapel chimney on Thursday morning, signaling that the cardinals have yet to agree (0950 GMT), following the second and third ballots of the papal conclave.

With none of the 133 voting cardinals securing the required two-thirds majority—at least 89 votes—the process to elect the 267th pope remains unresolved. The cardinals returned to their Vatican residences for a midday break and lunch before reconvening for an afternoon voting session, during which two more ballots are expected.

On Wednesday, the opening day of the conclave, the first round of voting ended with a similar result. Black smoke poured from the chimney just after 9 p.m., prompting speculation about the unusually long delay. Observers questioned whether the cardinals had needed to repeat the vote, address a health emergency, or accommodate translation needs. Others mused whether the papal preacher's meditation had simply run long.

Despite early predictions of a short conclave, the process has now entered its second day with no clear frontrunner. Historically, conclaves have required anywhere from three to 14 ballots to elect a new pope. Pope John Paul I was on a successor to Pope Francis. The chosen on the fourth ballot in 1978, John smoke appeared at 11:50 a.m. local time Paul II on the eighth, and Pope Francis on the fifth in 2013.

Trump Set to Announce U.S.-U.K. **Trade Deal Amid Tariff Tensions**

Former U.S. President Donald Trump is poised to announce a trade agreement with the United Kingdom on Thursday, May 8, 2025, according to reports from The New York Times and Politico. The announcement is expected during a scheduled news conference at 10:00 a.m. (1400 GMT) in the Oval Office, where Trump will unveil what he described as a "major" trade deal with a "big, and highly respected country."


Though official details remain sparse, sources familiar with the matter suggest the deal will mark the beginning of renewed trade ties between Washington and London, potentially outlining a broader framework that may still be subject to further negotiations. It is unclear whether the agreement has been fully finalized or is still a preliminary outline.

Trump has spent recent weeks promoting the possibility of new trade agreements, following his administration's decision last month to impose sweeping tariffs on multiple global trading partners. Most of these tariffs were temporarily suspended to allow time for negotiations, and Trump has repeatedly stated that several countries are eager to reach agreements with the United States.

This U.S.-U.K. deal comes shortly after Britain finalized a significant free trade agreement with India—its largest since Brexit. That agreement was concluded after renewed discussions resumed in February, spurred in part by concerns over potential U.S. tariff escalations. The India deal reflects Britain's wider strategy to diversify trade relationships following its departure from the European Union, a move that necessitated new bilateral arrangements to sustain economic growth.

For the United Kingdom, strengthening economic ties with major partners such as the U.S. has become increasingly urgent in the post-Brexit era. The British government has actively pursued agreements across Asia and the Americas to offset disruptions caused by the EU exit and avoid the potential fallout from U.S. trade restrictions.

As Trump prepares to present what he called the "first of many" deals, attention now turns to whether the proposed agreement will usher in a new phase of transatlantic trade cooperation—or simply lay the groundwork for future negotiations.



Xi Jinping and Lula Arrive in **Russia Amid Ukraine Conflict for Victory Day Celebrations**

Chinese President Xi Jinping and Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva arrived in Moscow on Wednesday to attend Russia's Victory Day celebrations, marking the 80th anniversary of the end of World War II. Their visit comes at a time when Russia is engaged in intense military conflict with Ukraine, with both sides trading fire just hours before the event.

The commemorations, typically seen as a showcase of Russian military strength, are overshadowed this year by continued hostilities in the Ukraine war. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky reported that Russia launched a wave of ballistic missile and drone strikes overnight, deploying over 140 attack drones across multiple Ukrainian cities, including Kyiv, Kharkiv, Sumy, and Kyi. Air raid sirens blared throughout the day, with numerous casualties and extensive damage

In response, Ukraine launched its own attacks, prompting Russian forces to shoot down nine drones approaching Moscow, according to Mayor Sergei Sobyanin. These retaliatory strikes occurred just before a Russian-proposed three-day ceasefire was set to begin. While Zelensky has not agreed to Russia's truce proposal, he reiterated Ukraine's earlier offer of a 30day ceasefire, calling it a genuine opportunity for diplomacy. "Russia gives no answer—only more strikes," Zelensky stated, emphasizing who he believes is responsible for prolonging the conflict. President Xi is expected to meet Russian President Vladimir Putin on Thursday for bilateral discussions. Topics on the agenda include the ongoing Ukraine war, strained Russia-U.S. relations, and broader global strategic concerns.

SEBI Takes Action Against STL and Merchant Banker FOCL for Misutilisation of IPO Funds



The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has issued an interim order restricting Mumbai-based Synoptics Technologies Ltd (STL) from trading in the securities market due to the diversion and misutilisation of funds raised through its initial public offering (IPO). In a separate move, SEBI has also barred First Overseas Capital Ltd (FOCL), the lead manager to the IPO, from accepting any new assignments related to merchant banking.

STL, a small and medium-sized information technology solutions provider, raised a total of Rs 54.04 crore through its IPO, which was listed on the SME Platform of the National Stock Exchange (NSE) on July 13, 2023. The IPO, priced at Rs 237 per share, included both a fresh issue of shares and an offer for sale. The company raised Rs 35.08 crore through the fresh issue, while Rs 18.96 crore was garnered through the offer for sale from two promoters, Jatin Shah, the company's managing director, and Jagmohan Manilal Shah.

According to the disclosures made in STL's red herring prospectus (RHP), the IPO-related expenses totaled Rs 80 lakh. Of these, Rs 50 lakh were to be paid from the proceeds of the fresh issue, while the remaining Rs 30 lakh was to be covered by the selling shareholders. After deducting these expenses, STL was expected to receive Rs 34.58 crore, which was meant for various purposes. These included repaying borrowings (Rs 5 crore), funding working capital (Rs 17.58 crore), making investments in strategic acquisitions or joint ventures (Rs 5.3 crore), and general corporate purposes (Rs 6.7 crore).

However, SEBI's interim order comes after the regulator discovered that STL had diverted and misused these funds, prompting the restrictions on the company and the barring of FOCL from taking up new IPO-related assignments. The action underscores SEBI's commitment to ensuring transparency and accountability in the capital markets.



Meta Reportedly Considered Bringing Facial Recognition Support to Its Smart Glasses

Meta is reportedly working on a controversial new feature for its Ray-Ban Meta AI smart glasses that could enable users to identify people nearby by scanning their faces. This feature, which would be optional for the wearer, has raised concerns due to its lack of opt-out options for those who are being scanned. The highly anticipated IPL 2025 match between Punjab Kings and Delhi Capitals at the Himachal Pradesh Cricket Association Stadium in Dharamsala was abandoned due to security concerns stemming from regional unrest. The decision to call off Match 58 came after a sudden power outage during the game, followed by the activation of air raid alerts in nearby areas, including a blackout in Jammu, approximately 200 kilometers away.

According to IPL Chairman Arun Dhumal, the match was called off as a "precautionary step" after reports emerged of missile activity and intercepts in Jammu. Initially attributed to floodlight malfunction, the stadium lost lighting tower by tower until only one remained function-

al. Fans were subsequently evacuated, and both teams were taken off the field for their safety.

At the time of abandonment, Punjab Kings were in a commanding position at 122/1 in 10.1 overs. Priyansh Arya had played a blistering knock of 70 off 34 balls before being dismissed by T Natarajan, while Prabhsimran Singh remained unbeaten at 50 from 28 deliveries. The top order's explosive start set a strong foundation before the match came to an abrupt halt.

Reports also noted sirens and blackouts in Dharamsala, possibly linked to national security protocols in response

to the Jammu incident, where Pakistani missiles were reportedly intercepted. This raised speculation about the continuation of the IPL 2025 season, with sources indicating that a final decision on the league's fate may be announced by Friday, May 9.


