Satavahana's Fall

Is Alapati Raja the Mastermind of ₹200 Crore Land Scheme?

Vijayawada: The midnight demolition of Satavahana College, a 55-yearold institution in Vijayawada that had served thousands of underprivileged students, has triggered widespread outrage and accusations of a land-grab scheme. The destruction of the college, situated on prime land valued at ₹150–200 crore, has left students and faculty in distress, with their academic records destroyed and their futures uncertain. Opposition leaders from CPI and YSRCP have pointed fingers at MLC Alapati Raja, alleging his involvement in the controversial demolition.

The college, managed by the Sri Durga Malleswara Educational Society, was razed in early June despite an ongoing Supreme Court case over the disputed 5.16-acre property. The incident, carried out without prior notification to authorities, has fueled speculation of a calculated move to seize the valuable land. The dispute's origins date back 30 years, when a sale agreement was struck between the landowners and the college management. The management paid an advance but failed to register the land for reasons that remain a mystery due to a lack of evidence. This unresolved issue led both parties to court, igniting a legal battle that continues to this day.

Women Protest Against Jagan in Podili, Attacked by YCP Activists

- · YSRCP activists threw stones and sandals at protesting women
- Three police constables also injured in the clash
- · Women demanded Jagan's apology for derogatory remarks aired on Sakshi

Tensions erupted in Podili town of Prakasam district during former Chief Minister Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy's visit, as a group of women staging a peaceful protest were reportedly attacked by YSRCP activists. The women were protesting near PSR Colony on Ratham Road, raising slogans and displaying placards demanding an apology from Jagan for his silence over derogatory remarks made against Amaravati women on Sakshi TV, a channel affiliated with the YSRCP.

As Jagan arrived to visit the tobacco auction centre in Podili, the women demonstrators released black balloons and held signs saying "Shame Shame Jagan" and "Bharathi Reddy should break her silence." They expressed anger that no condemnation had come from Jagan or his family

over the offensive comments. Eyewitnesses reported that soon after the protest began, YSRCP supporters arrived and started pelting stones and sandals at the women. In the ensuing chaos, several women were injured, along with three police constables who were trying to maintain order. Police forces eventually intervened and dispersed the YSRCP activists from the area.

The incident has drawn widespread condemnation from opposition parties and women's groups, who accused the ruling party of encouraging political violence and failing to uphold democratic rights. Calls have intensified for Jagan to issue an apology and take action against those responsible for the attack.

Further tensions are expected as opposition leaders plan to visit the injured protestors and raise the issue in the state assembly.

All Developers/Promoters/Builders and Real Estate Agents are hereby advised to refrain from engaging in any financial transactions or promotional activities with buyers in the name of "Pre-launch" for unregistered real estate projects. Any violation will attract strict legal action by APRERA under the provisions of the Act.

Allottees/Customers/Buyers are also advised not to purchase any plot/ apartment/building in projects that are not registered with APRERA. For information on specific projects or to seek redressal for issues such as delay in possession, poor construction quality, or other grievances, buyers may contact the APRERA Helpdesk.







NALA Act to Be Repealed: Minister Narayana Ministerial sub-committee reviews land administration reforms

Urban Development and Municipal Administration Minister P. Narayana revealed that the Andhra Pradesh government is moving ahead with the repeal of the NALA Act (Non-Agricultural Lands Assessment Act), following widespread concerns and grievances. Speaking after attending a ministerial sub-committee meeting on land administration reforms held at the Secretariat, Minister Narayana explained that the decision was taken after thorough discussions and reports from officials.

He stated that the Chief Minister had already addressed the issue at the recent Collectors' Conference, expressing concern over the difficulties caused by the NALA Act. "Following the CM's clear stance, the cabinet has taken a decision to repeal NALA. This decision comes after officials studied the Act's impact and submitted a detailed report," Narayana said.

The minister also noted that a significant number of people had submitted complaints about fee-related issues associated with land conversions under NALA. These complaints were also taken into account during the sub-committee's deliberations. Minister Narayana added that several other revenue-related matters were discussed during the meeting, aiming to simplify land administration and make it more accessible and transparent to the public. The government is expected to announce a detailed framework soon on how the repeal will be implemented and what mechanisms will replace NALA provisions.

The Andhra Pradesh State Government has taken a significant step toward fostering entrepreneurship and innovation among youth by signing a tripartite Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Cyient Foundation and the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE). The MoU was signed in the presence of Education and IT Minister Nara Lokesh at his residence in Undavalli.

The agreement, led by the Andhra Pradesh State Skill Development Corporation (APSS DC), aims to support the development of business skills, encourage startup culture, and promote intellectual property creation among students and faculty. As part of the initiative, innovation clusters will



be developed starting with the Visakhapatnam region.

Under this partnership, special centers named i-CARE (Innovation Creation and Research for Entrepreneurship) and i-CAFE (Idea Creation and Auxiliary Facilities for Entrepreneurship) will be established in engineering institutions. Tobacco Farmers Won't Be Left Behind: Minister Gottipati

Fuel Minister Gottipati Ravikumar assured tobacco farmers that the state government will not remain passive in the face of marketing challenges and losses. During an inspection at the Throvagunta Tobacco Purchase Centre in Ongole mandal on Wednesday, the minister called upon traders to purchase low-grade tobacco alongside high and medium grades.

He was accompanied by Associate Minister Dola and local officials, whom he instructed to streamline procurement operations. "For the past two years, traders and company representatives have made significant profits. It is now their responsibility to support farmers during this surplus year," Ravikumar stated.

He emphasized that marketing issues due to high production should not result in losses to farmers. "Buyers must come forward to support the farming community by ensuring full-scale purchases. The coalition government will not tolerate farmer distress," he said, adding that the Tobacco Board must step in if required. The minister also addressed issues surrounding the Black Burley tobacco variety, noting that earlier procurement problems have been resolved and traders must now resume pur-



chases without delay.

Highlighting the government's commitment, he said, "Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu is a true supporter of farmers. Whether it was issues with mango farmers or with oil palm and cocoa, the CM personally intervened to resolve them. We will ensure the same support for Black Burley tobacco farmers too."

To reinforce this support, the government has arranged for the Andhra Pradesh State Co-operative Marketing Federation (Markfed) to begin purchasing Black Burley tobacco on June 15 and 16. Minister Ravikumar affirmed that any new issues will be resolved swiftly and that the government is fully prepared to protect the interests of the agricultural commu-

Reports suggest that college principal Vankayalapati Srinivas faced coercion, claiming he was forcibly taken to a private residence in Guntur on May 31, 2025, and pressured to sign documents related to the land. Although Srinivas initially threatened to file a police complaint, his subsequent silence has sparked speculation of external pressure. His son reported surveillance by unidentified men to Satyanarayanapuram police, but no arrests have been made, intensifying concerns about law enforcement's response.

Police have registered a case against Boayapati Srinivas Apparao and nine others for illegal demolition, criminal trespass, and mischief, based on a complaint claiming unauthorized actions. Authorities confirmed that college correspondent Rama Satyanarayana and Principal Srinivas provided written permission for the demolition, raising suspicions of

internal complicity. Student unions have protested the act, highlighting the loss of critical academic records, including software course certificates, which has left thousands of students in limbo.

CPM leader Baburao called for urgent government action to protect the college's remaining assets, while TDP MLA Bonda Uma urged intervention to address the crisis. The lack of arrests 48 hours after the incident has fueled public anger, with student unions pressing Education Minister Nara Lokesh to safeguard students' rights and restore the institution's legacy.

As Vijayawada reels from the loss of Satavahana College, the allegations against Alapati Raja have cast a shadow over the city's political landscape. With opposition leaders demanding a thorough investigation and students' futures at stake, the state government faces mounting pressure to uncover the truth and deliver justice.

Jagan, Bharathi behind conspiracy to defame capital, says BJP MLA

BJP MLA Adinarayana Reddy has strongly condemned the recent derogatory remarks made by Sakshi channel anchors Kommineni Srinivasa Rao and Krishnam Raju against the women of Amaravati. Speaking to media in Kadapa on Wednesday, the MLA alleged that there is a deliberate conspiracy behind these remarks, orchestrated by former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy and his wife Bharathi Reddy to malign the image of Amaravati and stir unrest in the region.

"The comments made by Sakshi anchors are extremely wicked and unacceptable. Jagan and Bharathi are conspiring to create chaos and disrespect the dignity of the capital region," he said. Reddy accused the couple of leading the state into economic ruin and said their actions have only served to destabilize progress in Andhra Pradesh.

He further lashed out at Jagan, predicting that the former CM is "certain to go to jail" in connection with the liquor scam, and added that several other YSRCP leaders who were involved in irregularities during their tenure will also face legal consequences.

Adinarayana Reddy questioned Jagan's moral standing, remarking, "Will anyone believe in Jagan's talk about democracy when he distanced his own mother and sister?" He accused the former CM of running a vindictive and destructive administration during his term.

Reddy also criticized the impatience shown by YSRCP leaders while the new coalition government is initiating steps toward the state's recovery. He reiterated that those responsible for wrongdoing in the past five years will not be spared.

Lokesh Slams YCP Over Podili Attack on Women and Police

Education and IT Minister Nara Lokesh has come down heavily on the YSR Congress Party (YCP) following a violent incident in Podili, where women and police officers were allegedly attacked by YCP supporters during a protest. In a strongly worded statement, Lokesh condemned the attack and promised that those involved would face strict punish-

Lokesh referred to the attackers as "YCP psychos" and expressed outrage over the stone-pelting targeting women and law enforcement personnel. "The miscreants who attacked women and police with stones will be punished severely," the minister warned.

Telangana High Court Suspends Gali Janardhan Reddy's 7-Year Jail Sentence Reddy ordered to surrender passport, furnish ₹10 lakh sureties

In a major relief to former Karnataka MLA and mining baron Gali Janardhan Reddy, the Telangana High Court has suspended the seven-year rigorous imprisonment sentence handed down by a CBI special court in the Obulapuram illegal mining case. The interim order came as a significant legal reprieve for the ex-legislator, who is one of the primary accused in the high-profile case.

On May 5, the CBI special court in Hyderabad convicted Reddy and three others, sentencing them to seven years in prison along with a monetary penalty. The case pertains to illegal mining operations conducted under the Obulapuram Mining Company (OMC) in Andhra Pradesh. Following the verdict, the Karnataka Assembly had disqualified Reddy from his MLA post. Challenging the lower court's verdict, Reddy approached the Telangana High Court seeking tions were set to ensure his



suspension of his sentence. His legal counsel argued that he had already served more than three years in jail and that a by-election triggered by his disqualification would cause unnecessary political and personal damage. The court was also informed that his appeal against conviction is pending and requires time for disposal. Taking these arguments into consideration, the High Court granted interim relief to Janardhan Reddy. The court instructed him to furnish two sureties of ₹10 lakh each and imposed strict conditions including surrendering his passport and refraining from leaving the country. These condi-

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), however, strongly objected to the plea, arguing that the nature of the offence and the existence of multiple pending cases against Reddy did not warrant suspension of the sentence. Despite their objections, the High Court decided in favour of Reddy, stating that further legal scrutiny is necessary before enforcing the conviction. With this decision, Gali Janardhan Reddy secures temporary legal relief, but the larger battle around the Obulapuram mining scam remains far from over as the appeal process continues.

Is America Still the Dream for Indian Students? A Shifting Reality

American institutions such as MIT, Stanford, and Harvard not only provided academic excellence but also symbolized intellectual freedom and opportunity.

But in 2025, that image is beginning to crack. Recent political developments especially under Donald Trump's administration—have placed American academia under pressure. Institutions like Harvard and Columbia are facing political backlash for their perceived liberal values and student protests, particularly over issues like Gaza and racial equity. Trump's aggressive stance, which includes freezing student visa interview appointments and scrutinizing applicants' social media history, is sending shockwaves through the international student community, including in India.

However, this disruption also presents an opportunity for India. With institutions like the IITs, IIMs, and emerging private universities, India can position itself as a new hub for global education. By focusing on research investment, policy reform, and academic freedom, India could not only retain its own talent but also attract students from around the world disillusioned with America's shifting priorities.

The tide is turning. The question now is: will India rise to meet it?

No, India Is Not Israel and **Pakistan Is Not Palestine: Why** the Analogy Fails

In recent years—and especially after the April In contrast, India, despite facing internal religious 2022 Pahalgam terror attack—many commentators have lazily drawn parallels between the India-Pakistan conflict and the Israel-Palestine issue. Social media and even academic circles have promoted the narrative that India is acting like Israel while Pakistan mirrors Palestine. However, this comparison is deeply flawed and distorts both regional and geopolitical realities.

Unlike the Israel-Palestine conflict—which involves a militarized state controlling a stateless people under occupation—the India-Pakistan conflict is between two sovereign nations with clearly defined, internationally recognized borders. Pakistan's framing of Kashmir as "Palestine" ignores decades of its own state-sponsored terrorism, from Punjab to Jammu & Kashmir and even India's Northeast. Unlike the occupied Palestinians, Pakistan is not stateless—it is a nation that has repeatedly used proxy groups to destabilize India.

This misleading analogy also dilutes the Palestinian struggle for dignity, freedom, and statehood. While Palestinians in Gaza and the West Bank live under military occupation with severe restrictions on basic rights, Pakistan continues to shelter militant groups and enforce religious discrimination through state institutions. This includes constitutional discrimination against Ahmadiyyas and systematic targeting of Shia communities—actions that reflect state complicity, not victimhood.

tensions, remains a functioning democracy where Muslims, though under social and political strain, maintain legal protections, cultural institutions, and political representation. Leaders like APJ Abdul Kalam and current opposition figures such as Asaduddin Owaisi and Salman Khurshid have held key roles in governance and international diplomacy—something nearly unimaginable for religious minorities in Pakistan.

The analogy also misrepresents India's counter-terror strategy. India has consistently differentiated between the people of Pakistan and its military-intelligence complex that supports terrorism. Its policies are driven by national security, not collective punishment. On the other hand, Israel's responses to Palestinian resistance—such as bombings and blockades—are often seen as disproportionate, drawing global criticism.

Furthermore, India has long supported the Palestinian cause at the UN, even while deepening strategic ties with Israel. Unlike Israel's occupation model, India does not suppress a stateless people—it defends its sovereignty against cross-border threats.

To equate India with Israel and Pakistan with Palestine is not only inaccurate but dangerously oversimplified. It undermines nuanced diplomacy, weakens India's global standing, and trivializes the real struggles of Palestinians.

The recent flooding of Mumbai's brand-new Acharya Atre station on Metro Line 3, caused by 90 mm of rain in just 90 minutes on May 27, highlighted a troubling reality: extreme weather events are growing more intense and unpredictable. Despite being a stateof-the-art facility, the station was overwhelmed when water surged in from storm drains combined with high tide, flooding concourses and tracks, and forcing a temporary shutdown. This event, described by Mumbai Metro chief Ashwini Bhide as "unprecedented" and "overwhelming," is a stark reminder that our infrastructure is struggling to cope with climate change-driven weather extremes.

Simultaneously, a glacier collapse in Switzerland triggered a mudslide causing a minor earthquake, showing that these powerful natural disasters are a global phenomenon. The usual forecasting models and data-driven predictions are proving inadequate in the face of increasingly erratic climate patterns. The monsoon in India arrived a full week early in 2025, leading to the third wettest May in 125 years. Such shifts have disrupted industries—cooling product sales slumped, and manufacturers had to adjust production, showing how climate unpredictability can ripple through economies.

Scientists have long warned about the limits of Earth's "planetary boundaries"—the critical processes needed to maintain a stable climate and ecosystem balance. A 2024 report by Johan Rockström and colleagues revealed that six of nine planetary boundaries, including freshwater availability, biodiversity, land use, and climate, have already been crossed, pushing the Earth dangerously close to irreversible damage.

With weather patterns becoming more chaotic and forecasting less reliable, developing countries like India face tough challenges. One promising solution is climate risk insurance. However, India's insurance penetration remains low, with just 3.7% of the population insured in 2023-24, partly due to cultural resistance and economic constraints. Climate insurance, if structured as a public good with government support and tied to sustainability commitments—such as communities adopting eco-friendly practices—could mitigate some risks.

Currently, India offers crop insurance through schemes like Fasal Bima Yojana and some parametric insurance for farmers, but broader coverage for businesses is limited. Kerala's government-backed insurance for MSMEs is a start, but lacks incentives for climate-conscious practices. A nationwide insurance program that rewards companies for ecological stewardship—such as protecting natural water bodies or innovating sustainable technologies—could encourage resilience while lowering costs.

Financial innovations like catastrophe bonds (CAT bonds) could also play a role. These bonds, which transfer disaster risks to investors, help insurers manage large payouts from extreme events without overburdening taxpayers. The global CAT bond market reached \$50 billion in 2024, offering attractive returns while spreading risk—making it a growing tool in climate finance.

Mumbai's floods are a warning: climate change is no longer a distant threat but a present reality demanding urgent, innovative solutions in urban planning, risk management, and public policy to protect lives and livelihoods in an unpredictable future.

Raja, who was on his honeymoon with Sonam, was found dead in a gorge near Sohra, close to Cherrapunji, on June 2. His wife Sonam, who later went missing, was located in Uttar Pradesh and taken into custody by the Meghalaya police. She is currently under interrogation. Speaking to reporters, Govind made a strong statement: "If Sonam is guilty, she should be hanged." He emphasized that his family has completely disowned Sonam and expressed their commitment to fight for justice on behalf of Raja.

Govind also revealed that their parents, after learning the details of the case, have chosen to sever ties with Sonam. "My parents didn't know anything before, but now they have accepted the truth. We all stand with Raja's family," he said. He further claimed to be fully convinced of his sister's guilt based on the evidence presented so far. "I am 100 per cent sure she committed this crime. All those accused are linked to Raj Kushwaha, who is allegedly Sonam's boyfriend," Govind alleged.

Vowing to pursue legal action, he stated, "We will appoint a lawyer and ensure Sonam faces the consequences of her actions." This case has shocked many, with Raja's death turning what was meant to be a romantic getaway into a national tragedy. As investigations continue, Govind has taken a public stand for justice, distancing his family from the accused and aligning himself with the bereaved family of Raja Raghuvanshi.

Telangana: Rice Bowl Of India

Telangana has achieved a major success in agriculture by becoming the top rice-producing state in India. In the year 2024-25, the state produced 183.57 lakh tonnes of paddy, breaking its own previous record of 168.75 lakh tonnes in 2023–24. This remarkable growth has been made possible due to good weather, timely support from the Congress government, and uninterrupted free electricity to farmers.

State had aimed to produce 269.37 lakh tonnes of crops during the rainy and summer seasons, but it went beyond the target by producing 297.79 lakh tonnes. This means Telangana produced 28.42 lakh tonnes more than expected. Among the major crops, paddy production stood at 274.99 lakh tonnes, maize at 35.05 lakh tonnes, and sorghum at 3.32 lakh tonnes, all of which exceeded their targets.

Earlier, leaders from the BRS party claimed that farmers were struggling under the Congress government due to lack of electricity and water. They also said that agriculture had flourished only under BRS rule and that farmers had stopped farming after the Congress came to power. However, the record harvest this year clearly proves these claims wrong.



Currently, farmers in Telangana are cultivating around 29 lakh acres using borewells. The government has been supplying free and continuous electricity to these borewells, which has played a big role in increasing crop production. On March 20, 2025, Telangana recorded its highest-ever electricity demand of 17,162 megawatts, which the government managed without any power cuts. This shows that farmers had the support they needed for farming.

Back in 2014, the number of agricultural borewells in the state was only 18 lakh, but that number has now grown to 29 lakh. Along with this, good rainfall helped fill the irrigation projects. While the BRS party earlier credited the Kaleshwaram project for farming success, the recent results show that even without its full use, the state has achieved record yields. This proves that the project was not the only reason behind agricultural growth.

With such a large rice production, Telangana has started exporting rice to other countries. In the first phase, 12,500 metric tonnes of rice were exported to the Philippines. The Philippines has now agreed to import 8 lakh metric tonnes of rice from Telangana every year.

The Congress government has

also encouraged farmers by offering a bonus of ₹500 per quintal for fine paddy. Because of this, many farmers have chosen to grow more rice. In the last rainy season, the government paid ₹1206.44 crore as bonus to farmers. This gave them extra income of more than ₹20,000 per acre for two crop seasons. Along with this, the government provided fertilizers and seeds on time. By delivering seeds directly to farmers' homes at low prices, it helped them sow crops without delay.

The state also saw a big jump in

paddy procurement. While the BRS government bought only 36.63 lakh tonnes of paddy during the 2022–23 rabi season, the Congress government purchased lakh tonnes more. Despite this, BRS leaders are still spreading false claims that the government is not buying paddy.

For many years, Punjab held the top spot in rice production in India. But now Telangana has overtaken Punjab and has become the new leader in paddy output. Following Telangana are Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, and Punjab. The Telangana government has also given the highest share of its budget to agriculture. This is helping not just the farming sector, but also the development of villages and rural communities.

Around 470 villages and 1.3 million people will benefit from improved connectivity.

Expected freight capacity increase: 18.9 million tonnes per year. Environmental benefits include a reduction of 1.01 billion kg of CO₂ emissions and a saving of 200 million litres of diesel, equivalent to planting 40 million trees.



"Went Too Far": Elon Musk Says He "Regrets" His Posts About Donald Trump

Billionaire Elon Musk has expressed regret over some of his recent social media posts targeting former US President Donald Trump, just days after a public fallout between the two. Musk acknowledged on Twitter, "I regret some of my posts about President @realDonaldTrump last week. They went too far."

The dispute began when Musk harshly criticized a key spending bill championed by the Trump administration, describing it as a "disgusting abomination." He also urged political action against Republican lawmakers who supported the legislation, a move that drew sharp attention from the White House.

Trump responded sternly during an interview with NBC News, warning Musk of "very serious consequences" if he tried to back primary challengers against incumbent Republicans. The former president made it clear he had no interest in reconciling, stating, "I have no intention of speaking to him."

Just a week prior, Trump had praised Musk's work as head of the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE), an advisory body created to streamline federal spend-

Los Angeles Mayor Imposes Curfew on **Downtown Amid Rising Nighttime Violence**

Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass imposed a curfew on downtown Los Angeles on Tuesday, June 10, 2025, in response to a surge in nighttime violence, vandalism, and looting. The curfew, aimed at protecting lives and property, runs nightly from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. and covers a one-square-mile area where protests and unrest have occurred since Friday.

Mayor Bass declared a local emergency, citing that the city had "reached a tipping point" after 23 businesses were looted in recent days. The curfew exempts residents living in the affected zone, homeless individuals, accredited media, and emergency personnel, according to Los Angeles Police Chief Jim McDonnell.

Chief McDonnell emphasized that the escalating "unlawful and dangerous behavior" since Saturday necessitated the curfew to safeguard the community amid growing unrest throughout the city. The situation intensified as National Guard troops expanded their role beyond protecting federal property to supporting immigration enforcement operations in Los Angeles.

Photos released by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) showed National Guard members providing security during arrests, signaling a closer involve-



ment in law enforcement activities such as deportations. Although the Guard has limited arrest authority, it assists with transportation and can temporarily detain individuals attacking officers.

California Governor Gavin Newsom has strongly opposed the deployment of nearly 4,000 National Guard troops and 700 Marines ordered by President Donald Trump, arguing it would escalate tensions and fuel civil unrest. Newsom filed an emergency court request seeking to block their involvement in immigration raids.

Meanwhile, Marine Corps officials clarified that Marines are currently tasked only with protecting federal officials and property, without direct involvement in protests or arrests. Despite the heavy military presence, the Marines have yet to be deployed on the streets, and the National Guard's engagement with protesters remains limited.

The curfew and increased military presence highlight ongoing tensions in Los Angeles amid clashes over immigration enforcement and public order.



Food Aid Remains Vital Lifeline for Millions in Crisis-**Hit Afghanistan: WFP**

The World Food Programme (WFP) has highlighted that food assistance continues to be the only lifeline for millions of Afghans struggling with severe hunger amid ongoing crises, according to a report by Khaama Press. In a statement posted on June 10 on social media platform X, WFP emphasized the urgent need for sustained support to vulnerable communities across Afghanistan. Despite challenging conditions, including difficult terrain and remote mountainous regions, WFP teams persist in delivering life-saving food supplies to those most in need. "For many Afghans facing hunger, this food is their only hope of survival," the agency stressed.

However, a significant drop in funding has drastically impacted WFP's operations in the country. The organization, which has played a crucial role in preventing famine over recent years, has been forced to scale back its services substantially, raising fears over the worsening humanitarian situation. Currently, more than 23 million people in Afghanistan face acute food insecurity due to prolonged conflict, economic collapse, and climate-related disasters. The country continues to grapple with economic hardships under the Taliban regime, including high unemployment, soaring food prices, and reduced international aid.

Millions of families, especially in rural and hard-to-reach areas, remain heavily reliant on humanitarian assistance to survive. WFP and other aid organizations have consistently called on the international community to increase financial contributions to sustain relief efforts. WFP has issued a stark warning that without immediate and increased funding, the lives of many more Afghans could be at risk in the coming months. Humanitarian groups urge global donors not to abandon Afghanistan's most vulnerable populations, stressing that even a single truckload of food can be a matter of life and death for many families.

Xi Jinping Urges Respect and Stability in First Call with South Korea's New **President Lee Jae-myung**

In their first official conversation since Lee Jae-myung's inauguration as South Korea's president, Chinese President Xi Jinping emphasized the need for mutual respect and stronger cooperation between the two nations. Xi called for the two countries to respect each other's core interests and major concerns, ensuring that the relationship remains on what he described as the "right track." He emphasized that a healthy, stable, and deepening China-South Korea relationship is vital for promoting peace and stability in both the region and the world.

During the phone call, Xi highlighted the importance of strengthening exchanges and maintaining the spirit of "friendly neighbours." He also urged collaboration in protecting regional and global industrial and supply chains, amid

ongoing geopolitical tensions and economic disruptions.

China remains Korea's South trading largest partner, and diplomatic relations between the two have shown



signs of improvement following tensions that arose in 2017 over Seoul's deployment of a U.S. missile defence system, which Beijing strongly opposed.

Xi expressed that deepening the strategic cooperative partnership would not only benefit both countries but also "inject more certainty into the chaotic regional and international situation."

President Lee's recent election victory has ushered in a new political era for Asia's fourth-largest economy, but he faces significant challenges. Among them are rebuilding national unity following political turmoil under his predecessor, and navigating the complex dynamics between two major powers—the U.S. and China—both critical to South Korea's economy and security. The call marks an important step in reaffirming diplomatic ties as both nations seek greater regional stability and economic resilience.

Globally, gold futures also showed positive trends. In New York, the precious metal's futures prices rose by 0.49%, reaching \$3,359.90 per ounce. This increase in international prices contributed to the bullish sentiment in the domestic market.

India's Coal Imports Decline 4.4% to 24.95 Million Tonnes in April Amid Rising **Domestic Output**

Tndia's coal imports fell by **1**4.4 percent in April 2025, totaling 24.95 million tonnes (MT), compared to 26.10 MT in the same month last year. This decline is attributed mainly to a drop in non-coking coal imports, while coking coal imports saw a modest rise. According to data from mjunction services ltd, coal imports in April were actually up 9.48 percent compared to 22.79 MT in March 2025, indicating some month-onmonth recovery.

Non-coking coal imports stood at 15.90 MT in April 2025, down from 17.40 MT in April 2024. On the other hand, coking coal imports increased to 5.42 MT from 4.97 MT in the same period last year. The subdued demand for imported coal has been driven by



surplus stock availability in the system, despite relatively soft seaborne prices. "Availability of surplus stock in the system has reduced buyers' appetite for imported materials, even as the seaborne prices have remained soft," said Vinaya Varma, MD & CEO of mjunction services. He added

that this trend may continue until demand picks up ahead of the festive season.

Meanwhile, India's domestic coal production showed encouraging growth, rising by 3.6 percent to 81.57 MT in April 2025 compared to 78.71 MT in the corresponding period last year. Coal India Limited (CIL),

the country's largest coal producer accounting for over 80% of domestic output, produced 62.1 MT in April, slightly higher than the 61.8 MT produced in April 2024.

Despite this growth, CIL fell short of its production target for the 2024-25 financial year, producing 781.1 MT against a target of 838 MT, missing the mark by nearly 7 percent. The company is targeting increased production in the current fiscal year to meet India's growing energy demands.

Overall, the dip in coal imports combined with rising domestic output reflects a balancing act in India's coal supply chain, driven by stock availability, price dynamics, and production capabilities.

World Bank Lowers India's FY26 Growth Forecast to 6.3% Amid Export and Investment Slowdown

The World Bank has reduced its growth forecast for India's financial year 2025-26 to 6.3%, down from the 6.7% projected earlier in January. This revision reflects weaker export performance and slower investment growth, aligning with a similar downward adjustment in the global growth forecast to 2.3%.

India continues to lead among the world's largest economies in terms of growth rate, despite the downward revision. The updated forecast was part of the World Bank's June 2025 Global Economic Prospects report released on June 10 in Washington. The revised 6.3% forecast is slightly below the 6.5% growth predicted by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in its latest monetary policy announcement on June 6.

The report highlights that exports have been subdued due to reduced demand from key trading partners and rising



global trade barriers. Additionally, investment growth is expected to slow, primarily driven by heightened global policy uncertainty affecting business confidence.

Despite the slowdown, the World Bank projects India's growth to rebound in the following two years, with an average annual growth rate of 6.6% during FY27 and FY28. This recovery is expected to be supported by strong performance in the services sector and a potential revival in export growth.

The report also notes that economic activity in India has moderated, with a slowdown in industrial production balancing steady services sector activity and a recovery in agricultural output. India, South Asia's largest economy, continues to show resilience but faces headwinds from both domestic and global factors.

Globally, the World Bank warns that ongoing trade tensions and policy uncertainties are dragging down economic growth, resulting in the slowest global growth pace since 2008 outside of recessions. Chief Economist Indermit Gill pointed out that global GDP growth in 2025 is expected to fall to 2.3%, nearly half a percentage point below early-year expectations, and average just 2.5% annually through 2027—the slowest decade since the 1960s.

Experts Refute Claims of Hidden Underground City Beneath Egypt's Pyramids

 \mathbf{A} recent viral report suggesting the existence of a hidden underground city beneath Egypt's Giza Plateau has been firmly debunked by leading archaeologists. While initial findings by a group of scientists appeared to unveil groundbreaking evidence of a massive subterranean network beneath the iconic pyramids, experts now warn that the claims are scientifically flawed and lack credible verification.

The initial report, which quickly gained traction online, stated that researchers using Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) tomography had uncovered what seemed to be an expansive complex of underground chambers and passageways. This alleged network reportedly connected the Khafre, Khufu, and Menkaure pyramids, including the Great Sphinx. Some even claimed to have found vertical shafts extending up to 2,000 feet below the Khafre pyramid, with speculation that they dated back as far as 38,000 years, well



before the widely accepted timeline of ancient Egyptian civiliza-

Filippo Biondi, a radar imaging expert at the University of Strathclyde, had earlier stated there was a "90 per cent likelihood" that these ancient structures were interconnected underground. He suggested the pyramids might only represent the visible part of a massive, hidden infrastructure. "We firmly believe that the Giza structures are interconnected, reinforcing our view that the pyramids are merely the tip of the iceberg," Biondi was quoted as saying in international media.

However, Egyptologists and archaeological experts have since dismissed the findings as speculative and misleading. They criticized the study's methodology, pointing out that SAR tomography, while useful in surface im-

aging, is not precise enough at such depths to make definitive claims about buried architecture. Additionally, no peer-reviewed publication has supported the claim, and there is no archaeological evidence corroborating the supposed 38,000-year-old shafts or structures.

Experts argue that the current understanding of the Giza Plateau, based on decades of scientific excavation and analysis, does not support the notion of a second underground city. The narrative, while intriguing, seems to feed into the growing trend of pseudoarchaeological theories that rely more on speculation than substantiated science.

For now, the mystery of the pyramids remains intact, with researchers continuing to explore their origins through more grounded and evidence-based approaches.

Winged Terror: Lone Buzzard Sparks **Panic in Essex Village**

Tn a bizarre turn of events, **⊥**residents of ing-at-Bower, a quiet village in Essex, are under siege — not by burglars or vandals, but by a rogue buzzard. Dubbed the "Dive-Bombing Buzzard", the bird has become a daily threat to locals, reportedly attacking both people and property with increasing aggression.

Since late March, the buzzard's erratic and violent behaviour has left villagers anxious and afraid to step outdoors. Unlike the usual flock-based avian aggression seen in nature, this case in-

volves a lone bird of prey, likely a buzzard-eagle hybrid, launching unprovoked attacks from the sky. It swoops down with startling speed and force, diving at unsuspecting passersby, including children.

The situation has grown so serious that local primary school students are being kept indoors for extended periods to avoid injury. Teachers and parents remain on high alert,

as the bird has shown no signs of backing down. In one alarming incident, captured on May 20 by local resident Nick Woodgate, the buzzard is seen repeatedly smashing into a closed window, apparently trying to break through. The footage, now viral, underscores the bird's relentless nature and has left viewers stunned.

Reports suggest that the buzzard has even at-

tempted to claw at residents, targeting their heads or shoulders during low-flying ambushes. Some villagers have resorted to using umbrellas or hats as makeshift protection when venturing outside.

Local wildlife experts speculate that the bird may be defending a nest nearby, mistaking human activity as a threat. Buzzards are known for their territorial nature, especially during the breeding season, but such persistent and widespread attacks from a single bird remain highly unusual.

Despite calls for action, wildlife authorities are treading carefully, as buzzards are protected under UK law. A humane solution is being sought, but until then, villagers are left to navigate daily life under the looming shadow of the buzzard's wings.


