A major aviation tragedy struck India on Thursday afternoon after Air India's Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner, operating as Flight AI171 from Ahmedabad to London Gatwick, crashed minutes after takeoff, killing multiple people and injuring dozens. The aircraft was carrying 232 passengers and 10 crew members when it lost altitude and crashed in a residential area Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed deep close to the Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International Airport around 1:38 pm. The crash site was chaotic, with dense smoke, flames, and debris spread across buildings and streets. Emergency services—including fire brigade teams, local police, the Indian Army medical corps, and more than two dozen ambulances-rushed to the scene for rescue and relief. Officials confirmed the aircraft struck a hostel building housing medical college students, tragically killing five students and injuring others. Harrowing visuals from the dining hall showed untouched food on tables moments before disaster struck. Flight data and evewitness accounts suggest that the aircraft struggled to gain height after takeoff from runway 23. According to initial

assessments, the plane reached just 625 feet before losing altitude. A 59-second video circulating online shows the aircraft airborne for merely 32 seconds before it violently crashed, resulting in a massive fireball.

A miracle amid the tragedy came in the form of a passenger seated on 11A who was seen walking away from the wreckage, surviving the crash with minor injuries.

It Was Lunchtime at Ahmedabad Doctors' Hostel, Then A Plane Came Crashing

AI-171, which was flying to London, crashed minutes after taking off from Ahmedabad. Horrifying visuals from the hostel of Ahmedabad's BJ Medical College, into which an Air India flight with 242 people onboard crashed this afternoon, show plates of food left uneaten, suggesting that the aircraft hit the building when the young doctors were having their lunch.

Viswashkumar Ramesh, a 40-year-old from the U.K. is reported to be the only survivor from this morning's crash of Air India 171 in Ahmedabad. He was sitting in seat 11A at the time of the crash, amazingly suffering only minor injuries and waking up to search-and-rescuers. His brother, who was seated next to him is still missing, presumed dead by authorities in India.

The Civil Aviation Ministry, under Minister Ram Mohan Naidu, is on high alert. "Shocked and devastated... Rescue teams have been mobilised and all efforts are being made to ensure medical aid and relief," he said. The Ministry is also working closely with Air India and the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), which has initiated a detailed investigation.



Air India Flight AI171 Crashes After Takeoff in Ahmedabad

The flight carried nationals from unimaginable loss." various countries—169 Indians, 53 British, 1 Canadian, and 7 Portuguese citizens. Among the passengers was former Gujarat Chief a London-bound plane crashing in Minister Vijay Rupani.

Air India confirmed the crash in an official statement and activated a dedicated emergency helpline (1800 5691 444) for concerned family members. Chairman N Chandrasekaran said, "With profound sorrow, I confirm that Air India Flight 171 was involved in a tragic accident today. Our thoughts and deepest condolences are with the families of all those affected."

Gautam Adani, head of the Adani Group that manages the Ahmedabad Airport, also released a statement: "We are shocked and deeply saddened by the tragedy of Air India Flight 171. Our hearts go out to the families who have suffered an progress.

From the UK, Prime Minister Keir Starmer responded to the crash, stating, "The scenes emerging of Ahmedabad are devastating. My thoughts are with the passengers and their families."

London's Gatwick Airport, the intended destination of the flight, confirmed it was expecting the aircraft to land at 18:25 UK time and said it was monitoring the developments.

Authorities have sealed off surrounding areas to facilitate uninterrupted emergency operations. Traffic diversions are in place, and a crisis centre has been activated to manage the aftermath. Further updates from Air India, DGCA, and international aviation safety bodies are expected as investigations

The Telangana High Court on Thursday issued interim orders halting construction work of the Hyderabad Metro Rail Phase 2 near Charminar and Falaknuma Palace, citing potential risks to historic and heritage structures. The orders were passed during the hearing of a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by the Act Public Welfare Foundation. The PIL raised serious concerns about the Metro's proposed Corridor-6, alleg-

Kaleshwaram Project Engineer's Crores in Assets Shock Officials

In a sensational development, the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) unearthed massive illegal assets belonging to Noonee Sridhar, an Executive Engineer who once supervised key works in the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project. The ACB carried out simultaneous raids on Wednesday at Sridhar's residence and those of his relatives, exposing properties and wealth allegedly running into hundreds of crores.

According to ACB sources, the searches revealed an opulent villa in Tellapur, a flat in Sheikhpet, and a commercial building in Ameerpet, along with three open plots in Karimnagar. Sridhar also reportedly owns three independent houses, 16 acres of agricultural land, and 19 plots across Hyderabad, Karimnagar, and Warangal.

In addition to real estate, officials seized two cars, large quantities of gold jewellery, and substantial bank balances, all of which are believed to be dispro-

portionate to his known sources of income. ACB's prelimiin the hundreds of crores.

Sridhar is currently serving as Executive Engineer (EE) in the SRSP Division-8, and earlier supervised work on packages 6, 7, and 8 of the prestigious Kaleshwaram Project. He also holds the position of President of the Irrigation Engineers Association.

Hyderabad: Internal tensions within the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) seem to be deepening as reports emerge of a strained encounter—or lack thereof between party chief K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and his daughter, MLC Kalvakuntla Kavitha. In a politically charged development, Kavitha visited her father's farmhouse in Erravalli on Monday, but KCR reportedly did not speak to her, fueling speculation within party circles.

Sources reveal that Kavitha, accompanied by her husband Anil Kumar, arrived at KCR's Erravalli residence intending to meet him. However, her visit coincided with KCR's preparations to BRK Bhavan. This cold response has

This Credit Goes to the Modi

In a significant political development, the All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) has decided not to contest the upcoming Jubilee Hills Assembly by-election, choosing instead to extend its support to the ruling Congress party. This move reflects the growing informal alliance between the two parties, particularly after recent political shifts in Telangana.

The by-election was necessitated following the sudden demise of BRS MLA Maganti Gopinath, who passed away from cardiac arrest. Gopinath had won the seat during the December 2023 Telangana Assembly elections with 80,549 votes, defeating Congress candidate and former Indian cricket captain Mohd Azharuddin, who secured 64,212 votes. The BJP's Lanka Deepak Reddy received over 25,000 votes, while AIMIM's Rasheed Farazuddin came fourth with 7,848 votes.

In the 2023 polls, AIMIM had supported BRS by fielding a candidate to draw Muslim votes away from the Congress. However, with the Congress having helped AIMIM win the MLC elections, AIMIM leaders say it's the Congress helped the AIMIM in winning the MLC elections, we will reciprocate this time. The friendly relations with the ruling government will not change," said a senior AIMIM functionary.

Despite this support, the by-election is far from a smooth ride for Congress. The BRS is expected to benefit from sympathy votes following Gopinath's death. Additionally, controversy surrounding former BRS leader Baba Fasiuddin, now with the Congress, might hinder the party's chances. Fasiuddin is reportedly linked to the suicide of a local BRS leader, which could be exploited by rivals during the campaign.

In the 2023 Assembly elections, the Congress emerged victorious with 64 seats out of 119, while BRS managed 39, the BJP 8, AIMIM 7, and the CPI 1. Since then, AIMIM has moved away from its previous alliance with the BRS, siding with Congress during the 2024 Lok Sabha elections as well. As the political landscape shifts, all eyes will be on Jubilee Hills, where sympathy, strategic alliances, and controversies may all shape the final outcome.

TPN Correspondent | Telangana Malkajgiri MP and senior BJP leader Etala Rajender strongly defended the Narendra Modi-led central government, crediting it for India's dramatic transformation over the past 11 years. Addressing the media at his residence in Shamirpet, Etala said that the country has progressed significantly under Prime Minister Modi's leadership, bringing the Indian economy to the fourth position globally.

"Before 2014, India's economic condition was miserable. But people trusted the BJP with their vote, and we've honored that trust," Etala stated. 10 Sweet Shops Shut in Hyderabad for Food Safety Violations

- Shops found operating without valid FSSAI licence
- GHMC issues closure orders after surprise inspections

· Violators told to comply with hygiene norms to reopen

In a major crackdown on food safety violations, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) on Wednesday ordered the immediate suspension of operations at ten sweet shops and food establishments found functioning without a valid Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) licence or registration.

The action followed a series of surprise inspections carried out by GHMC's food safety wing across 69 sweet shops in various parts of the city. So far, officials have inspected 60 establishments under strict orders from the GHMC commissioner, with the inspection drive still ongoing.

Each food safety officer in the GHMC

limits was directed to inspect a minimum of five sweet shops in their respective circles. During the inspections, officials uncovered numerous violations of the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, and the Food Safety and Standards Rules and Regulations, 2011. TGANB Hosts First Inter-State Convergence Meeting to Strengthen Drug Law Enforcement

In a historic step toward coordinated drug law enforcement, the Telangana Anti-Narcotics Bureau (TGANB) hosted the First Convergence Meeting of Drug Law Enforcement Agencies on June 12, 2025, at the Mini Conference Hall, TGiCCC, Banjara Hills, Hyderabad. Delegates from Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka, Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and central agencies including NCB, ED, DRI, FRRO, and Customs participated in the strategic summit. The event, inaugurated by Telangana DGP Sri Jitender, IPS, focused on fostering operational unity to combat the growing complexity of narcotics trafficking. "Telangana has a zero-tolerance policy towards drugs," the DGP asserted, urging states to strengthen cooperation and intelligence-sharing mechanisms. Key objectives included improving inter-agency coordination, mapping trafficking routes, sharing data on major offenders, and building joint enforcement capacity. The meet also emphasized technology partnerships, legal SOPs for inter-state operations, and tracking financial networks behind drug syndicates.

Sri Sandeep Shandilya, Director, TGANB, highlighted the need for joint intelligence handling and rehabilitation efforts under Section 64(A) of the NDPS Act. DIG Sri Abhishek Mohanty and SP Sri Ch. Rupesh provided insights into Telangana's current challenges in synthetic and cross-border drug movement.

Delegates unanimously agreed on forming nodal coordination points, drafting joint SOPs, and initiating regular review meetings. They stressed arresting key traffickers and simultaneously launching awareness drives to reduce demand. This convergence marks a pivotal shift toward united action against narcotics, laying the foundation for a robust inter-state enforcement network across India's southern zone.

Rowdy Sheeter Jaber and Gang Nabbed in Murder Plot Conspiracy

In a major breakthrough, the Commissioner's Task Force South Zone Team, in coordination with Bandlaguda Police, apprehended six members of a criminal gang allegedly involved in a conspiracy to commit murder. Among the arrested is notorious rowdy sheeter Mohd Jaber, who has a long criminal history across Hyderabad.

According to police, the gang was planning to eliminate Jaber's long-time rival, Mohd Murtuza Ali, a former rowdy sheeter of Rajendra Nagar PS. Jaber, a real estate businessman from Pahadi Shareef, has been involved in at least 12 serious cases including murder, extortion, and illegal arms possession.

Acting on credible intelligence, the police seized 12 coconut shell cutting knives, five mobile phones, and a Maruti Ciaz car used by the gang. The gang had planned to use these weapons to carry out the attack. The accused arrested are:

Despite being arrested, he continued his vendetta and procured weapons for another attempt. The arrested individuals and seized property were handed over to Bandlaguda Police. A case has been registered under Cr. No. 182/2025 under Sections 25(1)(B)(3) of the Arms Act and 61(2) BNS. Investigation is ongoing.

PD Act Will Be Imposed on Encroachers of Temple Lands: Konda Surekha

Minister conducts surprise inspection in Chengicherla over land encroachment Orders fencing and protection of 30 acres of endowment land Blames previous government for negligence of temple lands

Telangana Endowments Minister Konda Surekha has issued a stern warning that the Preventive Detention (PD) Act will be invoked against anyone attempting to encroach upon lands belonging to temples and the Endowments Department in the state. "We will not tolerate any attempt to seize God's lands. Strict action will be taken, including invoking the PD Act if necessary," she said during a surprise inspection at Chengicherla, under Medipalli Mandal of Medchal district, on Thursday.

Acting on a complaint of illegal encroachment, the minister visited the location along with Medchal Congress in-charge Thotakura Vajresh Yadav, local officials, and Endowment Department staff. She reviewed the status of nearly 30.28 acres of temple land in Survey Nos. 33/8, 33/9, and 33/10,

which were originally donated by private landowners to the TLP Charitable Trust in 1968 and subsequently transferred to the Endowments Department in 1976 under the Ceiling Act.

Minister Surekha stated that successive Congress governments have protected these lands, but alleged that some individuals—with the help of fake surveys and local revenue officials during the BRS regime-attempted to encroach on and develop these lands, even planning to build villas. She directed immediate protection measures, including fencing, barcoding, and marking boundaries. She also coordinated with the Hyderabad District Collector and ordered a joint investigation involving the Revenue, Endowment, and Police Departments

to ensure the lands are safeguarded.

Endowment officials on-site in-

formed the minister that fresh com-

plaints were received about private encroachments and that an Assistant Director-level survey confirmed the land still falls under Endowment Department jurisdiction. The minister assured that no effort would be spared in reclaiming and protecting temple properties.Konda Surekha also slammed the previous BRS government for its "continued neglect" of temple lands. "Our government is working from day one to identify and protect temple assets. We have started a comprehensive survey and have so far identified 91,827 acres of endowment lands, out of which 25,000 acres have been encroached upon, and **6,000 acres lie within other state boundaries," she added.The minister's swift response was prompted by reports brought to her notice by Congress leaders Vajresh Yadav and Jangaiah Yadav, and she emphasized that

Reddy alleged that Revanth's Delhi visit was more about political maneuvering than governance.

He described Revanth Reddy's recent trip to Delhi as humiliating for the people of Telangana, stating, "He is roaming around Delhi streets like a helpless trader, begging for ministerial portfolios and appointments from the Congress high command." He further alleged that the Chief Minister could not secure an appointment with Rahul Gandhi, even after 45 visits to Delhi.

Calling Revanth Reddy's remarks about KCR and Union Minister Kishan Reddy false, Prashanth stated, "It is Revanth Reddy who has been helping the BJP, not KCR. He fielded weak Congress candidates in the Lok Sabha elections deliberately to ensure BJP victories." He cited the statements of BJP MP Konda Vishweshwar Reddy and others, pointing out how Sunitha Mahender Reddy was fielded from a different constituency to help Etala Rajender, and Danam Nagender was sent to Secunderabad to ease the path for Kishan Reddy.

He continued, "In Karimnagar, Congress ignored senior leader Jeevan Reddy and fielded a politically unknown Velichala Rajender against Bandi Sanjay. Revanth ensured weak contests in Nizamabad, Medak, and Adilabad too. BJP won 7 out of 8 seats with Revanth's help."

Questioning the silence of investigation agencies, he said, "When Prime Minister Modi himself accused Revanth Reddy of corruption during the campaign, why is there no action from ED or CBI? What happened to the cash-for-vote case?"

Prashanth also questioned how Revanth could meet the Prime Minister within 15 minutes in Delhi but is denied meetings with his own party leadership. "Bandi Sanjay openly says Congress and BJP should join forces against BRS. Isn't it clear they are working together?"

He warned Congress cadres that Revanth may eventually join the BJP, adding, "Even BJP MP Arvind said he would welcome Revanth. Revanth himself declared in Delhi that he studied in the BJP school."

Declaring KCR as the true soul of Telangana, Prashanth accused Revanth of betraying the state. "He remained silent when Chandrababu Naidu diverted Krishna water to Andhra Pradesh. He keeps defaming Telangana, claiming the state is drowning in debt, and blames KCR's governance despite Telangana once ranking No.1 in per capita income and GDP," he said.

Highlighting the failure of both BJP and Congress MPs in Telangana, he said, "8 BJP + 8 Congress MPs = Zero contribution to Telangana. Meanwhile, Andhra Pradesh MPs brought in thousands of crores under TDP's leadership. CM Chandrababu secured huge funds for Polavaram, Amaravati, and Visakhapatnam Steel Plant. Telangana MPs brought nothing." He criticised the Congress government for failing to deliver on 6 guarantees even after 600 days, citing that loan waivers, farmer bonuses, and Indiramma houses are being implemented half-heartedly. "You promised ₹2 lakh loan waivers to all farmers, but even half of them didn't benefit. What about those who repaid more than ₹2 lakh?" he asked.

Concluding his address, Prashanth said, "Revanth Reddy is obsessed with filing cases against BRS leaders, activists, and social media supporters instead of focusing on governance. It's time he introspects and stops playing political games."

Farmers Commission Chairman criticizes KCR's crowded appearance

Chairman of the Telangana Farmers Commission Kodanda Reddy strongly criticized the manner in which former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) appeared before the commission at BRK Bhavan on Thursday. Addressing the media, Kodanda Reddy questioned the motive behind KCR's arrival along with thousands of supporters, suggesting that the move could be perceived as an attempt to intimidate or pressure the commission.The commission was constituted by the central government to investigate alleged corruption and irregularities in irrigation projects undertaken by the previous BRS government. Kodanda Reddy emphasized that such inquiries are essential for transparency and accountability in a democracy. "Whether one is in power or not, if a commission calls for an explanation, they must appear and cooperate," he stated. Referring to the commotion at BRK Bhavan, the chairman noted that even he, despite holding the position of commission chairman, walked a distance to reach the building, underlining the decorum and simplicity expected in such proceedings. Kodanda Reddy called the gathering led by KCR "unnecessary and excessive."

He expressed concern that bringing thousands of people to a commission hearing could be seen as a form of coercion or threat, which undermines the dignity of democratic institutions. "Democracy gives importance to institutions like commissions. Just as T.N. Ses han, former Election Commis sion chief, upheld the dignity and independence of his role, every commission must be accorded the same respect," he remarked. He also responded to recent comments made by MLC Kavitha, who had questioned whether the commission would serve notices to KCR and threatened to hold a protest at Indira Park. Kodanda Reddy clarified that no individual is above inquiry and that commissions are empowered to investigate when required The chairman reiterated that the Farmers Commission of fice is located within BRK Bhavan, and any attempts to mobilize large crowds at such locations are neither appropriate nor helpful to the cause of justice. "This kind of display does not uphold democratic values; it threatens them," he warned. Kodanda Reddy concluded by affirming that the commission would continue its work independently, with out being influenced or intimidated by any individual or po litical party.

Six Farmers Killed in **Lightning Strikes in** Adilabad

Rains bring devastation across mandals; 13 others injured in multiple incidents

In a tragic turn of events, six farmers lost their lives and 13 others were injured due to lightning strikes in Adilabad district over the past two days. The sudden and severe rains accompanied by thunder and lightning have brought grief to many farming families who were busy with sowing activities in anticipation of the monsoon. The worst-hit incident occurred in Pippiri village of Gadiguda mandal, where 14 farmers were sowing maize seeds when heavy rain forced them to take shelter in a temporary hut nearby. Without warning, lightning struck the hut, killing four on the spot — Pendur Madarao (45), Sanjana (22), Mangam Bhimbai (40), and Sidam Rambai (45). Ten others sustained serious injuries and were rushed to Jhuri Primary Health Centre before being shifted to RIMS Hospital in Adilabad.In a separate incident in Bela mandal, two women farmers were struck by lightning in different villages. Nandini (30) of Sangidi village died instantly while working in the fields. In Sonkas village, Sunitha (35) also lost her life while sowing cotton seeds. These incidents have caused deep anguish among families who had sent their loved ones to the fields in the morning, only to be met with tragedy by nightfall.Meanwhile, lightning struck again in Kummarithanda of Utnoor mandal, injuring three members of the same family. Bokan Dhanraj (27), Nirmala (36), and Tokan Krishnabai (30) were injured after lightning struck a cattle shed where they had taken shelter along with 15 others. They are currently undergoing treatment at a local hospital.In another related incident, the Ram temple gopuram in Bandalanagapur, Tamsi mandal, sustained minor structural damage due to a lightning strike, adding to the widespread panic in the region. The incidents have raised concerns across Adilabad district, with farmers expressing fear and frustration over the untimely rains and the increasing frequency of deadly lightning strikes. Authorities are expected to respond with relief measures and possible compensation for the affected families.

Tesla Turmoil: Musk's Apology to Trump Fails to Reassure Investors Amid Ongoing Challenges



- In the early hours of Wednesday, Elon Musk offered a rare moment of *reflection*, *tweeting*:
- *"I regret some of my posts about"* President @realDonaldTrump last week. They went too far."

This came after a week of high-stakes online provocation, in which Musk claimed credit for Trump's 2016 win, amplified calls for his impeachment, and referenced ties to a deceased sex offender. The backlash not only triggered political waves but coincided with a slump in Tesla's stock, hinting at investor discomfort with Musk's volatile behavior. Since then, shares have recovered, aided in part by a short video of Tesla's self-driving Model Y maneuvering a turn in Austin—a PR distraction that couldn't have come at a better time.

Still, Musk's about-face does little to address deeper concerns. That he, as CEO of a company with a near-\$1 trillion market cap, would engage in such a feud with a former—and possibly future—U.S. president raises red flags. Tesla remains vul-

nerable to federal scrutiny, especially on regulatory issues critical to its self-driving ambitions and manufacturing operations. A vengeful administration could complicate matters considerably.

While the apology might ease immediate tensions, the broader issue is Musk's pattern of impulsive behavior, which has previously wiped billions from Tesla's market value. The board's continued silence only magnifies governance concerns.

Tesla is also grappling with more tangible problems. Sales in China dropped 30% yearover-year in May, challenging the company's narrative that Q1 weakness was due to factory retooling. Promised new affordable models remain absent, and with less than three weeks left in Q2, time is running out.

Musk has now "tentatively" set June 22 for the robotaxi reveal-delayed from earlier expectations. But without major progress on core EV sales and regulatory traction, no apology or autonomous demo will be enough to steer Tesla clear of turbulence.

The Urgent Need to **Address Bioterrorism as a Growing Global Threat**



Telangana: Rice Bowl Of India

Telangana has achieved a major success in agriculture by becoming the top rice-producing state in India. In the year 2024-25, the state produced 183.57 lakh tonnes of paddy, breaking its own previous record of 168.75 lakh tonnes in 2023–24. This remarkable growth has been made possible due to good weather, timely support from the Congress government, and uninterrupted free electricity to farmers.

State had aimed to produce 269.37 lakh tonnes of crops during the rainy and summer seasons, but it went beyond the target by producing 297.79 lakh tonnes. This means Telangana produced 28.42 lakh tonnes more than expected. Among the major crops, paddy production stood at 274.99 lakh tonnes, maize at 35.05 lakh tonnes, and sorghum at 3.32 lakh tonnes, all of which exceeded their targets.

Earlier, leaders from the BRS party claimed that farmers were struggling under the Congress government due to lack of electricity and water. They also said that agriculture had flourished only under BRS rule and that farmers had stopped farming after the Congress came to power. However, the record harvest this year clearly proves these claims wrong.

has now agreed to import 8 lakh metric tonnes of rice from Telangana every year.

The Congress government has also encouraged farmers by offering a bonus of ₹500 per quintal for fine paddy. Because of this, many farmers have chosen to grow more rice. In the last rainy season, the government paid ₹1206.44 crore as bonus to farmers. This gave them extra income of more than ₹20,000 per acre for two crop seasons. Along with this, the government provided fertilizers and seeds on time. By delivering seeds directly to farmers' homes at low prices, it helped them sow crops without delay.

The state also saw a big jump in paddy procurement. While the BRS government bought only 36.63 lakh tonnes of paddy during the 2022–23 rabi season, the Congress government purchased 60.61 lakh tonnes in the same season this year. That is nearly 20 lakh tonnes more. Despite this, BRS leaders are still spreading false claims that the government is not buying paddy.

For many years, Punjab held the top spot in rice production in India. But now Telangana has over-Pradesh, West Bengal, and Punjab. The Telangana government has also given the highest share of its budget to agriculture. This is helping not just the farming sector, but also the development of villages and rural communi-

Recent incidents involving the attempted smuggling of biological materials into the United States highlight a worrying gap in global biosecurity. In June 2025, a Chinese student was arrested for sending packages containing roundworm materials to the University of Michigan. Just days earlier, two other Chinese nationals were charged with



attempting to smuggle a crop-damaging fungus, Fusarium graminearum, to the same university. While roundworm itself is not a biological weapon, the fungus could potentially be used as an agricultural bioterrorism agent, underscoring the serious risks of insufficient oversight in international biological research collaborations.

Biological weapons—bacteria, viruses, toxins, or other biological agents—can cause widespread harm to humans, animals, or crops. State use is termed biowarfare, whereas non-state actors such as terrorist groups engage in bioterrorism. Smuggling of hazardous biological materials represents only one facet of biosecurity concerns.

Three years ago, the discovery of an illegal biotech lab in California, owned by a Chinese company, revealed genetically engineered mice and viruses hidden under the guise of COVID-19 testing. This raises questions about how many other clandestine labs and undetected smuggling incidents exist worldwide. Bioweapons are often called "the poor man's nuclear weapon" because they are far easier and cheaper to develop, making the threat accessible to rogue states and terrorists alike.

Technological advances have outpaced regulation. Gene synthesis costs have plummeted over the past decade, enabling the recreation or enhancement of deadly viruses. For example, scientists recreated a virus closely related to smallpox in 2017, revealing how easily extinct pathogens could be revived or engineered in rogue labs. The rise of DIY biology and readily available lab equipment online means terrorist groups might soon produce biological weapons with minimal oversight.

The insider threat further complicates biosecurity-highly skilled individuals within labs might collude with hostile actors. However, current legislation and monitoring systems, including the Biological Weapons Convention and international health regulations, are insufficient. India's Economic Growth: A Story of Wealth Concentration, Not Inclusivity

India proudly stands as the world's fourth-largest economy with a nominal GDP nearing \$3.9 trillion. Prime Minister Modi and his government tout this as a historic economic miracle, amplified by national and international media. However, beneath this celebratory narrative lies a stark and unsettling reality: the benefits of growth are concentrated among a tiny elite, while the vast majority of Indians grapple with hunger, unemployment, and poverty.

Official GDP figures paint an incomplete picture. India's per capita income is approximately \$2,800 (Rs 2.33 lakh), far behind countries like Vietnam (\$4,300) and China (\$12,500). Yet, even this figure is misleading. The richest 1% of Indians control over 40% of the nation's wealth, dominated by powerful business families like the Adanis and Ambanis. Excluding this elite's wealth, the remaining 1.4 billion people share far less — reducing actual per capita income to around Rs 85,000 annually, or Rs 7,000 monthly. Narrowing it down further to exclude the top 5% leaves the majority with just Rs 67,000 per year,

In a nation where nearly 80 crore people rely on free ration schemes to survive, celebrating GDP growth rings hollow. How can a country be "shining" when millions line up daily for food aid? Such contradictions are often dismissed with accusations of being anti-national, but they reveal a painful truth.

India, EU Focus on Addressing Non-Tariff Barriers for Free Trade Agreement

Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal highlighted the importance of addressing non-tariff barriers (NTBs) in the ongoing negotiations for the proposed Free Trade Agreement (FTA) between India and the European Union (EU). Speaking from Stockholm on June 12, 2025, Goyal emphasized that both sides are "pretty" close to finalizing the deal, with over half of the chapters already completed.

"Significant progress has been made. More than half the chapters are ready, and we are almost 90% ready in terms of market access. The key issue to tackle now is non-tariff barriers and finding ways to ease business exchanges between India and the EU," Goyal stated.

Non-tariff barriers, such as excessive regulations, arbitrary standards, and technical measures, often create obstacles for trade. For example, Indian exports like chillies, tea, Basmati rice, and milk face stringent EU regulations that impede smoother trade. Goyal stressed that both India and the EU are actively discussing ways to reduce these regulatory hurdles to facilitate a freer flow of goods and services.

Goyal also criticized the EU's proposed Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM), a carbon tax aimed at products imported into the EU. He argued that such measures would unfairly target Indian industries and could be seen as another form of a non-tariff barrier. However, he expressed hope that both parties would find a solution to this issue in the ongoing FTA talks.

India's bilateral trade with the EU reached \$136.4 billion in 2024-25, making the EU India's largest trading partner. With the FTA negotiations progressing, both sides are optimistic about enhancing trade relations and reducing trade barriers. EU Commissioner for Trade, Maros Sefcovic, is scheduled to visit New Delhi later this month to further discuss the pact.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed deep sorrow over the tragic Air India plane crash in Ahmedabad on Thursday, calling it "heartbreaking beyond words." In a post on social media platform X (formerly Twitter), he said he is closely monitoring the situation and remains in constant touch with ministers and authorities involved in the rescue and relief operations.

"The tragedy in Ahmedabad has stunned and saddened us. It is heartbreaking beyond words. In this sad hour, my thoughts are with everyone affected by it. Have been in touch with Ministers and authorities who are working to assist those affected," PM Modi wrote.

The Air India Flight AI171, a Boeing 787-8 Dreamliner, crashed just moments after taking off from Sardar Vallabhbhai



Patel International Airport at 1:38 PM IST. The aircraft, bound for London's Gatwick Airport, was carrying 242 people — including 230 passengers (169 Indians, 53 British nationals, one Canadian, and seven Portuguese) and 12 crew members, including the two pilots. Aviation expert Sanjay Lazar told NDTV that the aircraft appeared to experience a failure to gain sufficient lift, stalling at an altitude of just 825 feet. Pilot Captain Sumeet Sabharwal had issued a "Mayday" distress call to Air Traffic Control shortly before the aircraft lost contact and crashed in a residential area near the airport.

Air India confirmed the crash in a public statement and announced the activation of a dedicated passenger helpline — 1800 5691 444 — for families and concerned individuals. Injured passengers and local residents have been taken to nearby hospitals, with emergency responders continuing rescue efforts on-site.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has launched an investigation into the incident to determine the cause of the crash.

Wilson were among six candidates elected unopposed to the Rajya Sabha from Tamil Nadu in the biennial elections held on Thursday (June 12, 2025). These six MPs will serve until July 2031, with their term beginning in July 2025.

The other four candidates elected unopposed include S. R. Sivalingam, Rajathi alias Salma (a Tamil poet), I.S. Inbadurai, and M.Dhanapal from the AIADMK, the principal Opposition party. The election results were confirmed after 13 nominations were received, with only six being found eligible following the scrutiny process.

B. Subramaniyam, Returning Officer and Additional Secretary of the Tamil Nadu Assembly, confirmed that the six elected candidates—three from the DMK, one from MNM, and two from AIADMK—would fill the vacancies of six retiring Rajya Sabha members.

Kamal Haasan's election marks a significant milestone in his political journey. After a history of vocal criticism against the DMK, he joined forces with the party ahead of the 2024 Lok Sabha elections and was promised a Rajya Sabha seat as part of a broader alliance deal. Despite electoral setbacks, Kamal's political stature has been revived through his alliance with M.K. Stalin's DMK. Kamal, 70, has played a crucial role in campaigning for the DMK in the state and will likely play a pivotal role in the upcoming Assembly elections as well.

P. Wilson, another notable figure, is recognized for his legal acumen, especially in the case against Governor R.N. Ravi over his delay in signing bills into law. Wilson's efforts were instrumental in securing a favorable verdict for the Tamil Nadu government, strengthening his position in the political sphere. The DMK's Rajya Sabha strength will remain unchanged at 10 seats, while the AIADMK will now have five members, up from four.

Consulate Closely Monitoring Situation: India On US Immigration Crackdown

In response to an ongoing immigration crackdown in California's Los Angeles region by the Trump administration, India has expressed concern over the situation, emphasizing the safety and welfare of its nationals. On Thursday, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) stated that the Indian Consulate in San Francisco is closely monitoring the developments, as the U.S. government has deployed National Guard troops and Marines in the area.

The LA region, and California in general, is home to a large community of Indians," Jaiswal said, responding to questions about India's position on the situation. He urged Indian nationals in the area to take appropriate safety precautions, given the heightened tension and security presence on the ground.

Reports have indicated that the U.S. administration's intensified immigration enforcement has caused concern among immigrant communities in California, particularly in Los Angeles, which is home to one of the largest Indian diaspora populations in the United States. Trump Launches Website for \$5 Million U.S. Residency Visa Amid Immigration Crackdown

U.S. President Donald Trump announced the launch of a new website, TrumpCard. gov, on Wednesday for his proposed \$5 million U.S. residency visa, sparking interest as the country faces intensified immigration enforcement and protests.

This "golden visa" program, first revealed by Trump aboard Air Force One in April, is designed as a premium version of the traditional green card, targeting wealthy investors and job creators. Trump promised that the visa would be available "in less than two weeks" at the time, but it has yet to be officially launched. The newly unveiled website allows potential applicants to register their name, desired visa type, and email address under the tagline "The Trump Card is Coming."

In a social media post, Trump highlighted the growing demand for the visa, stating, "Thousands have been calling and asking how they can sign up to ride a beautiful road in gaining access to the Greatest Country and Market anywhere in the World."

The president has emphasized that this visa program is aimed at attracting highnet-worth individuals who can contribute



to the U.S. economy, potentially helping reduce the national deficit. Earlier statements suggested that the administration hoped to sell as many as a million of these cards, and Trump did not exclude the possibility of Russian oligarchs qualifying for the program.

The announcement comes at a time when the U.S. government has intensified deportation raids nationwide, leading to widespread protests and criticism. Trump's administration continues to face lawsuits and

allegations of rights violations related to its aggressive anti-immigration policies.

Trump has framed the \$5 million visa as a fast-track route to coveted U.S. citizenship, promising a new avenue for wealthy immigrants seeking to live and work in the United States. However, details regarding the visa's implementation and legal framework remain scarce, and questions persist about its impact amid the ongoing immigration controversies.

Urges India to Curb Exiled Sheikh Hasina's Online Speeches

Food Aid Remains Vital Lifeline for Millions in Crisis-Hit Afghanistan: WFP

The World Food Programme (WFP) has highlighted that food assistance continues to be the only lifeline for millions of Afghans struggling with severe hunger amid ongoing crises, according to a report by Khaama Press. In a statement posted on June 10 on social media platform X, WFP emphasized the urgent need for sustained support to vulnerable communities across Afghanistan.

Despite challenging conditions, including difficult terrain and remote mountainous regions, WFP teams persist in delivering life-saving food supplies to those most in need. "For many Afghans facing hunger, this food is their only hope of survival," the agency stressed.

However, a significant drop in funding has drastically impacted WFP's operations in the country. The organization, which has played a crucial role in preventing famine over recent years, has been forced to scale back its services substantially, raising fears over the worsening humanitarian situation.

Currently, more than 23 million people in Afghanistan face acute food insecurity due to prolonged conflict, economic collapse, and climate-related disasters. The country continues to grapple with economic hardships under the Taliban regime, including high unemployment, soaring food prices, and reduced international aid.

Millions of families, especially in rural and hard-to-reach areas, remain heavily reliant on humanitarian assistance to survive. WFP and other aid organizations have consistently called on the international community to increase financial contributions to sustain relief efforts.

WFP has issued a stark warning that without immediate and increased funding, the lives of many more Afghans could be at risk in the coming months. Humanitarian groups urge global donors not to abandon Afghanistan's most vulnerable populations, stressing that even a single truckload of food can be a matter of life and death for many families.

Baloch Activist Mahrang Baloch Exposes Pakistani State Repression from Prison

Baloch rights activist Mahrang Baloch has revealed severe state repression against peaceful dissenters in Pakistan, writing from her prison cell in Quetta's Hudda Jail, according to The Balochistan Post. Arrested over two and a half months ago, Mahrang draws attention to the systematic targeting of activists, journalists, and ordinary citizens in Balochistan.

In her article, Mahrang recounts how Pakistan's security agencies have tried various tactics to silence her, including offering deals to stay quiet in exchange for freedom. She firmly refused these offers, emphasizing that no evidence has been presented linking her to any violence or crime. The only "proof" cited by the authorities was a press conference she held before her March 22 arrest, where she clarified her stance against violence, distinguishing peaceful activists from armed militants in Balochistan.

Mahrang's activism gained international attention after her visit to Norway in May 2024, where she spoke at events organized by PEN Norway. Her visit caused outrage



among Pakistani officials, and she was harassed even on Norwegian soil by individuals linked to Pakistan's embassy, prompting intervention from Norway's domestic security agency. Upon returning to Pakistan, she was immediately charged with sedition.

Additionally, warnings have been issued about potential threats to ships navigating nearby waters amid the growing strain.Busaidi shared the news on the social media platform X, stating, "I am pleased to confirm the 6th round of Iran US talks will be held in Muscat this Sunday the 15th." The U.S. has not issued an immediate response to this update.

These talks remain a critical diplomatic priority for U.S. President Donald Trump and his Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff. The goal is to reach an agreement that could lead to the lifting of some severe economic sanctions on Iran, in return for Tehran drastically curbing or halting uranium enrichment activities. Failure to secure a deal risks exacerbating tensions in a Middle East already strained by the Israel-Hamas conflict in Gaza. Iran's fragile economy could spiral further downward, fueling domestic unrest. There are also concerns that the U.S. or Israel might launch airstrikes against Iranian nuclear sites, while Iran could cease cooperation with the United Nations nuclear watchdog and accelerate its nuclear weapons ambitions.

Previous rounds of talks between Iran and the U.S. have been held in Muscat and Rome, with hopes that this latest session will advance toward a diplomatic resolution.





Stock Market Declines Amid Geopolitical Tensions, Trade Tariffs, and Rising Oil Prices

On Thursday, domestic stock markets experienced a sharp decline, with both benchmark and sectoral indices tumbling due to a combination of geopolitical developments and trade uncertainties. Tensions escalated in West Asia after Israel announced plans to attack Iran's nuclear facilities, a move that increased concerns over regional instability and its impact on global markets. Additionally, a rise in crude oil prices added to the market's woes, triggering sell-offs in energy

and oil stocks.

Further compounding the negative sentiment were U.S. President Donald Trump's recent tariff announcements, which raised fears of an impending trade war. Investors were left uneasy

by the lack of clarity surrounding potential tariffs on China and other trade partners, adding uncertainty to the already volatile market conditions. As a result, shares in sectors such as real estate, energy, oil, and automobiles faced heavy losses, dragging the broader market down.

Market Performance:

The BSE Sensex, which had closed at 82,515 points in the previous session, opened at 82,571 points on Thursday. The index then touched an intraday low of 82,523 points before reaching a high of 82,661 points. It eventually closed at 81,691 points, down 823 points, or a 1% drop. The NSE Nifty also saw a similar trend, opening at 25,164 points, touching a low of 24,825, and a high of 25,196 before closing at 24,888, down 253 points. The Nifty Bank index dropped 377 points, settling at 56,082.



Among the 50 stocks in the Nifty50 index, only seven managed to gain, while 43 ended in the red. Key gainers included Apollo Hospitals, Asian Paints, Bajaj Finserv, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories, and Tech Mahindra. On the other hand, Tata Motors, Titan, Trent, Shriram Finance, and Coal India were among the biggest losers, with their stocks facing significant declines.

Sector-wise Performance:

The market breadth on the NSE was overwhelmingly negative, with 2,112 stocks declining compared to just 783 that gained. The sectors that experienced the most significant declines were PSE (Public Sector Enterprises), realty, energy, oil, auto, commodities, metals, and infrastructure. The consumption and MNC indices also showed mixed performance, while the healthcare sector posted a slight gain.

Other Key Developments:


The Indian Rupee closed at 85.60 against the U.S. Dollar, further adding pressure on domestic equities. In specific stock news, shares of Air India experienced a 7% drop following the crash of an Air India Boeing 787 at Ahmedabad airport, resulting in casualties. 

Government Forms Task Force to Boost Textile Exports Amid FTA Negotiations



In a significant move to strengthen India's textile sector amid ongoing free trade agreement (FTA) negotiations, the government has formed a new inter-ministerial task force. The primary goal of this body is to create a unified platform that addresses the wide range of challenges faced by the textile industry — from skilling and labor issues to logistics and sustainability.

The first meeting of the task force took place on June 10, chaired by Commerce Secretary Sunil Barthwal. During the session, officials from multiple departments discussed strategies to enhance India's textile exports and increase its share in the global market, according to the Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

Commerce Secretary Barthwal emphasized that the task force aims to bring all relevant stakeholders together to tackle critical issues affecting the textile sector comprehensively. "The objective is to create a cohesive framework that resolves bottlenecks across the entire textile value chain," he said.

Rajesh Agrawal, Special Secretary of the Department of Commerce, highlighted the importance of innovation and alignment with global trends. "To secure a higher share of the export market, Indian textiles must evolve continuously, embracing new technologies and sustainable prac-

The new UPI addresses will carry a unique "@valid" handle, specially allocated by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). This handle will be reserved solely for SEBI-registered investor-facing intermediaries, ensuring that investors can confidently transfer funds directly to verified bank accounts.

Under this system, each intermediary's UPI ID will combine their name with the "@valid" tag and the syndicate bank's identifier. For instance, if a broker named ABC Ltd has an account with XYZ

bank, the UPI ID would be formatted as abc.brk@validXYZ. SEBI has made it mandatory for all intermediaries to obtain and provide this validated UPI ID to their investors, thereby streamlining and securing payment channels within the securities market.

SEBI Chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey emphasized the benefits of this initiative, stating, "This innovative mechanism will significantly boost the safety and accessibility of financial transactions by offering a verified and secure Together, the '@valid' UPI IDs and 'SEBI Check' mechanism are set to provide stronger safeguards against payment fraud, increase transparency, and restore investor confidence in the digital payment ecosystem associated with India's securities markets. tices," he noted.

The Confederation of Indian Textile Industry (CITI) welcomed the formation of the task force. Its Secretary General, Chandrima Chatterjee, remarked, "The inclusion of all relevant ministries acknowledges the multifaceted nature of the textile sector. Inter-ministerial collaboration is crucial because many procedural delays arise from fragmented responsibilities. This task force is a positive step toward identifying and resolving these issues effectively."

With Indian textile exports being a key demand in the ongoing FTA talks, this task force represents the government's commitment to strengthening the sector's global competitiveness. By addressing challenges holistically, it hopes to boost export growth, create jobs, and reinforce India's position in international textile markets. The coming months will reveal how these coordinated efforts translate into tangible gains for the industry.

Government Cuts Duty on Crude Edible Oils to 10% to Boost Domestic Refining and Ease Prices

In a significant move to address rising edible oil prices, the Government of India has slashed the Basic Customs Duty (BCD) on crude edible oils—including crude sunflower, soybean, and palm oils—from 20% to 10%. This reduction increases the import duty differential between crude and refined edible oils from 8.75% to 19.25%, a strategic adjustment aimed at encouraging domestic refining and stabilizing market prices.

The duty cut comes in response to the surge in edible oil prices following a duty hike in September 2024 combined with rising international market rates. Officials say this step will help reduce the landed cost of edible oils, translating into lower retail prices and easing inflationary pressure on consumers.



"A 19.25% duty differential between crude and refined oils incentivizes domestic refining capacity utilization and reduces reliance on imports of refined oils," the government said in a statement. This differential is expected to discourage imports of refined palmolein and shift demand towards crude edible oils, particularly crude palm oil, thus bolstering the domestic refining sector.

The government held a meeting with leading edible oil industry associations under the leadership of the Secretary of the Department of Food and Public Distribution. Industry stakeholders were advised to pass on the full benefits of the duty reduction to consumers, ensuring relief reaches retail markets promptly. This policy adjustment not only supports domestic refiners by leveling the playing field against imports but also helps maintain fair compensation for farmers involved in oilseed production. By promoting domestic refining, the government aims to strengthen the sector's competitiveness and stabilize edible oil prices in India.

The decision follows a comprehensive review of the sharp price rise that impacted food inflation last year, with soaring edible oil prices burdening consumers. This proactive intervention signals the government's commitment to balancing consumer interests, supporting domestic industry, and controlling inflation in essential commodities.





Smaller Eggs, Higher Prices: Reddit Post Criticizes Swiggy Over Egg Quality and Cost



A Reddit post recently went viral after a user high-lighted the stark difference in egg size and pricing between Swiggy Instamart and local kirana stores. The post, which quickly gained over 2,500 upvotes, featured a side-by-side comparison of two eggs: one bought locally and the other via Swiggy.

According to the user, the local egg, purchased for Rs 6.1 from a neighborhood store, weighed 60 grams. In contrast, the Swiggy-bought egg cost Rs 10 and weighed only 40 grams despite its fancy packaging and tiered pricing scheme. "What a man must do to eat 6 eggs a day in today's world," the caption read, sparking a lively debate in the comments.

While many criticized Swiggy for inflated prices and misleading product weights, others came to its defense, citing better hygiene, taste, and consistency. Some users noted that branded eggs from Swiggy often had richer yolks and better flavor, possibly due to improved diets or sourcing standards. Others claimed local eggs, though cheaper, were sometimes unclean or less palatable.

This isn't the first time Swiggy Instamart has faced scrutiny. In another viral post, a user discovered vegetables that were significantly underweight compared to the listed measurements on the app—prompting further questions about transparency and value.

The debate ultimately highlights a broader issue with convenience-driven shopping: Are consumers truly getting what they pay for? While online platforms offer unmatched ease, the trade-off in price and quality remains a growing concern for many.

Winged Terror: Lone Buzzard **Sparks Panic in Essex Village**

🕇 n a bizarre turn Lof events, residents of Havering-at-Bower, a quiet village in Essex, are under siege — not by burglars or vandals, but by a rogue buzzard. Dubbed the "Dive-Bombing Buzzard", the bird has become a daily threat to locals, reportedly attacking both people and property with increasing aggression.



Since late March, the buzzard's erratic and violent behaviour has left villagers anxious and afraid to step outdoors. Unlike the usual flockbased avian aggression seen in nature, this case involves a lone bird of prey, likely a buzzard-eagle hybrid, launching unprovoked attacks from the sky. It swoops down with startling speed and force, diving at unsuspecting passersby, including children.

The situation has grown so serious that local primary school students are being kept indoors for extended periods to avoid injury. Teachers and parents remain on high alert, as the bird has shown no signs of backing down. In one alarming incident, captured on May 20 by local resident Nick Woodgate, the buzzard is seen repeatedly smashing into a closed window, apparently trying to break through. The footage, now viral, underscores the bird's relentless nature and has left viewers stunned.

 $E^{\rm uropean}_{\rm bust}$ financial growth in the 2023-24 season, with total market revenues rising by 8% to €38 billion, according to Deloitte's Annual Review of Football Finance. The top five leagues—England's Premier League, Germany's Bundesliga, Spain's LaLiga, Italy's Serie A, and France's Ligue 1—generated €20.4 billion of that total, a 4% year-on-year increase.



The overall operating profit across Europe's top leagues stood at €0.6 billion for the second consecutive year, and the wage-to-revenue ratio improved slightly, dropping from 66% to 64%.

However, he also cautioned that the industry faces challenges such as rising costs, tighter regulations, and shifting fan engagement patterns. "The pressure is on clubs to boost revenues while staying financially sustainable," he added.

Meanwhile, England's Women's Super League (WSL) achieved record-breaking financial milestones, generating £65 million in revenue—a 34% increase from the previous season. Every WSL club report-

ed revenues exceeding £1 million, with an average of £5.4 million per club. "Strong fan engagement, strategic commercial partnerships, and centralized funding have propelled WSL into a new era of growth," noted Deloitte's Jennifer Haskel.

The findings underscore football's resilience and evolving commercial potential, even amid economic and regulatory headwinds.

England Completes 3-0 T20I Sweep Over West Indies with Duckett's Stellar 84

Rovman Powell topscored for the visitors with a resilient 79 not out from 45 balls, while captain Shai Hope contributed a brisk 45 off 27 deliveries.

England's comprehensive white-ball dominance reflects their well-rounded performance under Brook's captaincy, who now shifts focus to an upcoming five-match Test series against India starting June 20. With both the ODI and T20I series wins, England has sent a strong message ahead of the Test battles, showcasing depth in batting and bowling across formats.
