

Now Notices to the BRS Boss?

Prabhakar Rao attends third day of hearing

SIT reportedly preparing to issue notices to KCR



TPN | V. Krishna Kumar **Hyderabad:** The Kaleshwaram Commission hearings may have concluded, but former Chief Minister KCR is likely to face trouble again—this time in the phone tapping case. All attention is now on the statements made by Prabhakar Rao. Beneath the surface of this already serious investigation, fresh tremors seem to be brewing. Once Prabhakar Rao's questioning is complete, the SIT is expected to interrogate KCR, who is currently undergoing treatment in the hospital.

Within the police department, speculation is rife that claimed that a team was the Special Investigation formed during Prabhakar Team is planning to move Rao's tenure as SIB Chief and aggressively. Former Task Force DCP Radhakishan Rao has already stated in both court and police interrogations that the phone tapping was done on the orders of "the boss"—a statement that Media personality Shracould prove damning for

Sources say the answers given by Prabhakar Rao, who recently returned from abroad, have left SIT officials on the defensive. The SIT has even informed the High Court that Prabhakar Rao is uncooperative, frequently claiming he doesn't remember key details. Because of this, Praneeth Rao has been called in again for a fresh round of questioning—this time face-to-face with Prabhakar Rao. Along with his written explanation, the entire investigation is being video recorded.

### **Allegations Against** Prabhakar Rao

In his earlier statement, Praneeth Rao alleged that when Prabhakar Rao was the SIB Chief, a team was formed under his instructions. He claimed that after the change in government, evidence—including hard disks—was destroyed and burned in the Anantagiri forests of Vikarabad on the orders of "boss" Prabhakar Rao. Based on this, the SIT has been interrogating Prabhakar Rao for the past three

What Radhakishan Rao Revealed

There were reports that former Task Force DCP Radhakishan Rao, who was arrested in the case, had turned approver. He claimed that around 1,200 phones were tapped—those of BJP leaders during the Dubbaka and Huzurabad elections, as well as Congress leaders, bureaucrats, and media personalities. He said all of this was done under direct orders from the then Chief Minister KCR. With this, the phone tapping case became even more entangled for KCR.

Statements by Bhujanga Rao and Tirupatanna also reportedly echo the same. They that all actions were taken under instructions from the then CM.

### The Key Role of Shravan Rao

van Rao allegedly played a key role alongside Prabhakar Rao. It is claimed that he procured equipment for phone tapping from abroad and discreetly set it up in his media company to avoid suspicion. Allegations also suggest he used the recordings to threaten rivals and extort money running into lakhs of rupees.

### Case Background

Current Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who was then a Congress leader, had accused the previous regime of tapping his phone. After taking office, he ordered a formal investigation. A case was registered at Panjagutta police station in 2024. The first arrest was of Praneeth Rao, followed by Bhujanga Rao, Tirupatanna, and Radhakishan Rao. All are currently out on bail.

As the case progressed and Prabhakar Rao was named as A1 in the FIR, both he and Shravan fled the country. After 15 months, they returned to India following a Supreme Court directive to surrender their passports and appear before the SIT. On June 9, they presented themselves for questioning. **Hyderabad:** Is the ACB ready to arrest the BRS China boss? Is that why it has issued fresh notices for investigation again? Or is it Revanth's ploy to trouble KTR? Are the leaders claiming there was no corruption being stubborn? They say yes. They allege that all this is a politically motivated act. They claim it's part of a conspiracy, pointing out that Revanth was once arrested under similar circumstances.

While Kaleshwaram is hanging around KCR's neck, this Formula Car case is choking KTR. The Congress government alleges that crores of rupees were misused in the event. The ACB stepped in after orders were issued for a comprehensive investigation. As part of this, the ACB served fresh notices to KTR to appear for questioning again on June 16.

Many allegations were made against this prestigious Formula Car race during the BRS government. Immediately after the change in government, the ACB—Anti-Corruption Bureau—registered a case on December 23, 2023. The main allegation was that unauthorized payments of ed a commotion within the BRS. Discus-Rs. 45 to 55 crore were made. Accordingly, Arvind Kumar, A3 BLN Reddy, and A4 FEO officials in the FIR. A case was registered under the PC Act Sections 13(1)(A), 13(2), IPC Sections 409 and 120(b). Alongside the ACB, the ED—Enforcement Directorate—

also stepped in, registering a case under money laundering and FEMA violation. Summons were issued to KTR, Arvind Kumar, and BLN Reddy.

KTR approached the High Court seeking protection from arrest in the cases filed by the ACB. He obtained court orders in his favour. Meanwhile, the ACB interrogated the FEO officials, Arvind Kumar, and BLN Reddy and reportedly collected substantial evidence. Finally, on May 26, 2025, the ACB issued summons to KTR. He appeared for questioning at the Banjara Hills ACB office on May 28. Just when everyone thought the case had gone dormant, the ACB gave him another shock by issuing fresh notices, asking him to appear for questioning again. This creatsions began suggesting that these notices Arrest Fix? the ACB named A1 KTR, A2 then-IAS officer might be a prelude to arresting KTR. KTR, Kavitha, and Harish Rao reacted strongly, expressing deep anger. It is reported that KTR, troubled by the new notices, consulted his legal teams.

### Another case registered against KTR

When the ACB called him for questioning again, KTR expressed strong displeasure. He argued that the Formula Car race had brought investments to the state and that there was nothing wrong with events like beauty pageants. Until then, things were relatively calm. But KTR reportedly lost his temper and used vulgar language to insult CM Revanth Reddy and tarnished his reputation. In response, Congress MLC Balmuri Venkat filed a complaint with the Hyderabad Cyberabad Crime Police. He submitted video clippings and statements alleging defamatory remarks. After reviewing the evidence, the Cyber Crime Police registered a new case against KTR.

# **Uttam Demands Centre Block Banakacherla Project**

Uttam Kumar Reddy has urged the Union Government to immediately reject the Pre-Feasibility Report (PFR) of Andhra Pradesh's proposed Godavari-Banakacherla Link Project, prevent submission of the Detailed Project Report (DPR), and halt all plans to call or award tenders. In a strongly worded letter to Union Jal Shakti Minister C.R. Patil dated June 13, Uttam alleged that the project violates the Godavari Water

• Andhra's Godavari-Banak- Disputes Tribunal (GWDT) Award of 1980 and the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act (APRA), 2014, and threatens Telangana's legitimate share of river waters.

> Uttam expressed serious concern that Andhra Pradesh was reportedly asked to submit the DPR following a June 2 meeting chaired by the Additional Secretary of the Ministry of Finance and attended by Jal Shakti officials. "It is a matter of grave concern... the request to submit the DPR implies the PFR is deemed approved, which is both flawed and unacceptable," he stated, warning that such a move violates interstate water governance norms.

### **Legal Provisions Invoked**

Six accused in the phone tapping case have been booked under IPC Sections 120B (criminal conspiracy), 409 (criminal breach of trust), 420 (cheating), 201 (destruction of evidence), 468 and 471 (forgery). Additional charges were filed under the IT Act—Sections 66, 66B, and 77—for

phone lines; and Section 65B of the Evidence Act regarding the admissibility of digital evidence.

Due to the gravity of the case, it was transferred from Panjagutta Police Station to the SIT. Given the repeated references to the then CM in multiple testimonies—including that of Prabhakar Rao—it is now being reported that the SIT is preparing to issue formal notices to KCR as well.

### KCR Undergoes Medical Tests at **AIG** for Second Day TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad

Former Telangana Chief Minister and Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) president K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) visited the Asian Institute of Gastroenterology (AIG) Hospital in Gachibowli on Saturday for the second consecutive day. His visit was part of routine health checkups, according to hospital sources.

KCR arrived at AIG Hospital on Friday afternoon around 2:30 PM and remained there for approximately an hour. Continuing the same checkups, he returned on Saturday for additional medical evaluations. The health tests were conducted under the direct supervision of AIG chairman and leading gastroenterologist Dr. D. Nageswara Reddy.

Doctors overseeing the evaluations confirmed that KCR is not facing any health complications at present. However, they reportedly advised a few lifestyle-related precautions, which were communicated to the former Chief Minister.



The former CM's visits have drawn public attention, but close aides emphasized that these are part of his regular health monitoring and nothing alarming.



Government Whip Adi Srinivas has launched a sharp counterattack on BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) over the ongoing controversy surrounding alleged irregularities in the organization of the Formula-E car race. In a video statement released on Saturday, Adi Srinivas said KTR appears scared and is deliberately avoiding the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) investigation by throwing irrelevant challenges at Chief Minister Revanth Reddy.

This comes after KTR, who has received ACB notices in the case, challenged CM Revanth Reddy to undergo a lie detector test. Responding to this, Adi Srinivas said, "This kind of challenge and retreat attitude is typical of BRS leaders. When Revanth Reddy challenged KTR to take a drug test in the past, who ran away? Wasn't it KTR who backed out?"

Adi Srinivas accused KTR of making baseless and provocative remarks instead of cooperating with the ACB inquiry. He stated that the Chief Minister is focused on making Telangana a drug- and marijuana-free state, while the BRS leader is trying to derail the investigation through diversionary

Condemning KTR's recent comments, Adi Srinivas said, "The entire society of Telangana is watching the kind of foul language coming from KTR. The people have already given their verdict on the BRS through the ballot box. It's time KTR faces the law."

He further alleged that KTR will not be spared in the phone tapping case either. "The truth must come out in the Formula-E scam, and KTR should face trial without drama," Adi Srinivas asserted.

Madhya Pradesh Principal Secretary and senior IAS officer Narahari has given a clarion call for unity among the Other Backward Classes (OBCs) across India, asserting that true social justice will be possible only when OBCs seize political power. Speaking at the book launch event of 'OBCs' Struggle' held at the Suravaram Pratap Reddy Telugu University Auditorium in Nampally on Saturday, Narahari said that despite economic and social advancements, OBCs continue to lag in political representation.

The book, co-authored by Narahari and High Court Advocate Prithviraj Singh, was unveiled by a host of Telangana political leaders including Malkajgiri MP Etela Rajender, TPCC President and MLC Mahesh Kumar Goud, MLCs Addanki Dayakar and Dasoju Sravan, TSMDC Chairman Eeravatri Anil Kumar, former Water Resources Development Corporation Chairman V. Prakash, retired IAS Chiranjeevulu, retired IPS Poornachandra Rao and BC Welfare Association National President Jajula Srinivas Goud.

Narahari said he wrote 'OBCs' Struggle' to address the aspirations, concerns, and future roadmap for the 80 crore OBCs in India. "Although OBCs form a significant part of the population, political representation is far from proportional. In Telangana, for example, OBCs influence 50% of Assembly constituencies but hold only 15-20% of seats," he pointed out.



He welcomed the Centre's decision to consider caste in the census, stating that it is essential to measure how government funds and schemes are distributed. "Only a caste-based census can reveal the exact beneficiaries of policies. Social justice depends on accurate data," he said, adding that political reservations based on population share would bridge the current gap in power dynamics. TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud highlighted Congress' commitment to BC empowerment, recalling Rahul Gandhi's emphasis on BC rights during the Bharat Jodo Yatra. He said the Telangana government under CM Revanth Reddy had passed two significant bills providing 42% reservation for BCs in education, employment, and politics. He urged the Centre to include these bills in the Ninth Schedule of the Constitution to protect them from judicial review.

### Banakacharla may become another Pothireddypadu: Harish Rao

BRS senior leader and former minister T. Speaking at a press conference in Hyderabad, Harish Rao presented a detailed power-point presentation exposing what he called the "conspiracy" behind the Godavari-Banakacharla linkage project. > Andhra Pradesh is rushing ahead with tenders for the project, our government is sitting idle—watering lemon trees," he remarked sarcastically. He accused the Congress government of focusing more on political vendettas, like cases against KTR, rather than defending Telangana's water rights.

> He further demanded an immediate all-party meeting to counter Andhra Pradesh's aggressive execution of the project. "This is not a matter of one party. It is about our future. If Congress does not act, BRS will launch a massive

agitation," he declared.

Harish Rao also took aim at the Central government, accusing it of clear bias. "In the last two Union Budgets, Andhra Pradesh received generous funds. Telangana got zero," he said. He alleged that the BJP-led Centre was operating with a mindset of 'funds for Andhra, rivers for Andhra,' and questioned the silence of the state's 16 MPs, including two Union Ministers, for not raising this issue in Delhi.

Recalling how Chandrababu Naidu once fought for 2 TMC of Babli water in 2008, Harish Rao said Andhra Pradesh is now attempting to draw 200 TMC with this illegal project. "If this is not stopped now, Telangana will have to struggle for every drop in the future," he warned.

In a final appeal to the Revanth Reddy government, Harish Rao said, "Open your eyes. Act now. We will support any genuine fight for Telangana's interest. But if you continue to ignore this, BRS will take this fight to the people."

### **CPI Leader Slams** Kaleshwaram As Useless Project

"All the water being supplied to agricultural fields today is from the Yellampally project," he stated, adding that Kaleshwaram has turned out to be a project without purpose or outcome.

# Boora Narsayya Slams Congress for Delay in Local Body Polls

Former Bhuvanagiri MP and BJP senior leader Dr. Boora Narsayya Goud has sharply criticized the Congress government in Telangana for its prolonged delay in conducting local body elections. Speaking at a press meet held at the BJP state office on Saturday, Boora said the inaction is costing the state heavily, both financially and democratically.

"Despite being in power for nearly 18 months, the Congress government has not given any clarity on conducting local body elections," he said.

He detailed the status of expired terms: 12,769 sarpanches since January 2024, 5,717 MPTCs since May 2024, and 538 ZPTCs, MPPs, and ZP chairpersons whose terms ended a year ago. Similarly, elections for 128 out of 130 municipalities are overdue by over six months.

Boora alleged that due to these delays, Telangana has lost ₹1,514 crore from the Central Finance Commission, and an additional ₹800 crore from the 14th Finance Commission remains pending. "This is a direct result of the state government's failure.

The central government has no role in this," he clarified.

"Rahul Gandhi promised 42% reservation for BCs before elections, but till now there is no progress," Boora said. He called the Congress' failure to implement the 'triple test' — caste census, BC Commission, and a dedicated committee — as an excuse to delay BC reservations.

Boora added, "In Telangana's 14-member Congress cabinet, only three are from BC communities. The party that ruled the country for nearly 50 years has never made a BC Chief Minister."

He compared this with the BJP's re- na are being misled daily with false cord, highlighting that "for the first time, BJP made a BC the Prime Minister, and over 60% of ministers in the Union Cabinet are from SC, ST, or BC backgrounds."

He also accused the Congress of using the caste census as a "political weapon" and blamed its leadership for using rhetoric without action. "While Congress keeps talking about caste census and social justice, in Karnataka — where it is in power — the caste census report remains hidden for three years, "The people of Telangahopes and empty promises," he said.

# Hyderabad Hydra vs GHMC...

Cold war between GHMC and Hydra officials Coordination lapses hamper monsoon response GHMC officials ignore Hydra chief's request Lack of coordination causes public inconvenience

A crisis has emerged between two government organizations regarding responsibilities during monsoon emergency measures in Hyderabad. The Telangana government has sidelined the GHMC and handed over the responsibility of managing monsoon-related emergency measures to Hydra. Recently, Municipal Administration Secretary Ilambarthi issued orders bringing these responsibilities under Hydra's purview. In this context, a cold war appears to be brewing between GHMC and Hydra officials. Due to coordination failures and communication gaps, confusion is hampering joint efforts. A clear pow-

er struggle is visible between the two departments. It is believed that GHMC officials have been reluctant to accept the delegation of such critical responsibilities to Hydra. Allegations have also surfaced that vigilance officers are operating under the GHMC Commissioner, which is leading to further controversy. This internal power tussle is now threatening to impact public services. Reportedly, some engineering officials within GHMC (Baldia) are unable to accept the government's decision to entrust monsoon emergency team duties to Hydra. The government took this step after GHMC was accused of delays in forming monsoon teams and irregulari-

ties in tender notifications, allegedly favoring a single individual. Heavy rains hit the city while tenders were still being called for monsoon teams. Hydra's Disaster Response Force (DRF) teams were deployed for these relief operations. However, it appears that GHMC has not cooperated with them. Officials remained silent as the responsibilities shifted to Hydra. Even though the Hydra Commissioner formally requested GHMC engineers to coordinate with Hydra during the monsoon season, the request seems to have been ignored.

When GHMC engineering officials were asked for clarification, they responded: "Who should we inform if we are to work under Hydra? Who do we contact in case of any issues? We haven't even been given phone numbers of Hydra officials." This lack of coordination between Hydra and GHMC officials is causing problems for the public as heavy rains have continued for the last three days.

On Thursday, rainfall reached up to 14 centimeters, flooding roads, railway underpasses, and apartment cellars. Water stagnation occurred in areas like Chandanagar, Lingampally, Miyapur, Chatrinaka, Himayatnagar, and Langar Houz. GHMC officials failed to respond adequately, and it took a long time for Hydra's DRF teams to reach the affected areas-worsening the plight of residents.

Due to the shortcomings of the government machinery—which is supposed to protect citizens' lives and property during the rainy season—the people themselves are bearing the brunt. This situation underscores the critical importance of coordination. The administration must realize that public service is far more important than any power struggle among officials. Citizens of Greater Hyderabad are demanding that all officials set aside their differences and move forward together with a unified focus on public welfare.

Naming is one thing—honoring is another. To truly celebrate Gaddar, his philosophy must live through these awards. Whether or not the word "revolution" remains etched in public memory, Gaddar lives on in the hearts of the people. But do these awards reflect that spirit—or do they simply raise more questions than they answer?



# **Excise Dept Earns** Nearly ₹37 Cr, 24 New Pub Licenses Allotted in Hyderabad

Hyderabad is set to witness the addition of 24 new pubs, as the Telangana Prohibition and Excise Department concluded the latest bar license allotment process through a computerised draw held on Friday, June 14, at Narsingi.

In total, 28 new bar licenses were granted across the state, with 24 of them allotted within the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) limits. The department earned ₹36.68 crore from the allotment, reflecting the high demand and competition for bar licenses in urban areas.

The process, overseen by Prohibition and Excise Commissioner C Hari Kiran, received an overwhelming response—3,520 applications were filed for the 24 available licenses in Hyderabad alone.

Beyond Hyderabad, four additional bar licenses were allotted in districts like Ranga Reddy, Mahbubnagar, and Nizamabad, which received 148 applications in total. This brought the cumulative number of applications for all 28 locations to 3,668.

Ranga Reddy district recorded the most intense competition, with a single bar license in Saroornagar attracting 57 applications. In Mahbubnagar, 49 contenders competed for one bar slot, while in Nizamabad, two different locations received 27 and 15 applications respectively.

The excise department's move is expected to further boost state revenues while also catering to increasing demand in urban nightlife zones, especially within the GHMC boundaries.

### Another Case Filed Against Actress Kalpika Ganesh

Actress Kalpika Ganesh has landed in fresh legal trouble, with the Hyderabad Cyber Crime Police registering another case against her, marking the second such case in recent times. The complaint, filed by a woman named Keerthana, alleges that Kalpika used obscene and abusive language on social media, particularly on Instagram.

According to police sources, the case has been filed under Sections 67 of the IT Act (2000-2008), and Sections 79 and 356 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS). The complaint accuses Kalpika of harassment through vulgar messages, offensive posts, and repeated online abuse. The victim, Keerthana, provided screen-

shots of the alleged messages and Instagram statuses as evidence to support her claims. These reportedly include derogatory language and personal attacks, which she stated caused her severe mental distress.

This is not the first time Kalpika has faced legal action for her online behavior. The current case adds to a growing list of controversies surrounding the actress, raising serious concerns over cyber harassment and the responsibility of public figures on digital platforms.

Cyber Crime officials have confirmed that an investigation is underway, and further action will be taken based on digital forensic analysis of the submitted material.





# **Locals Flee With Mangoes After** Truck Overturns in Rangareddy

A truck carrying a large load of mangoes overturned near Thimmapur village on the highway in Kothur Mandal, Rangareddy district, early on Saturday morning, leading to a bizarre scene where locals rushed in to collect the spilled fruit. The vehicle, reportedly en route to Hyderabad city, lost control and overturned on a curve. While the driver escaped without injury and no casualties were reported, the accident quickly drew the attention of local residents who gathered with bags, baskets, and even bedsheets to take away as many mangoes as they could.

The situation turned chaotic as dozens of people scrambled to grab the fruit, disregarding

both traffic and the police. A video capturing the incident — showing people joyfully looting the mangos — is now circulating widely on social media.

Kothur inspector Narasimha Rao, speaking to reporters, confirmed that while the accident did not result in any major injuries, it led to a severe traffic jam in both directions of the highway. "We had to intervene to clear the road and disperse the crowd that was looting mangoes," he said.

Police have not filed any case so far but urged residents to behave responsibly during such incidents, especially on busy highways where safety is paramount.

Viewing South Asia solely through an India-Pakistan prism denies India the sphere of influence it believes it deserves — especially at a time when China is actively working to undercut that dominance, with Pakistan's eager collabora-

While clearly more about ego than diplomacy, such statements have given Islamabad fresh talking points. Pakistani politicians like Bilawal Bhutto now boast that Wash-

disregard for historical nuance unsettle traditional diplomacy. He undermines long-standing alliances, praises adversaries like Putin, and dismisses democratic leaders. His new term (if won) could reshape global alignments — and certainly India's diplomatic calculations.

The Modi government, so far, has been wise to remain calm and focused, especially as a critical India-US trade deal looms. No official outrage was expressed over statements from US nominees like Paul Kapur, who hinted at working with Pakistan "where American interests align." Similarly, CENTCOM's praise of Pakistan as a counterterrorism partner raised eyebrows but reflected longstanding military jurisdictional divides.

The challenge now is balancing public sentiment, often hyper-reactive on social media, with the strategic composure needed in diplomacy. Past crises — from Kargil to 26/11 — have shown that American involvement has often helped defuse tensions and even reinforced India's nar-The third concern is the return of the rative against terror. The fear is that under Trump, involvement may return, but without the discretion or balance.

# A Decade Later, Telangana's Battle for Krishna **River Water Continues**

More than ten years after Telangana split from Andhra Pradesh, the state's struggle to secure its rightful share of Krishna river water remains unresolved, exposing deep political and administrative challenges.

The Krishna river, flowing through Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Karnataka, is central to this dispute. Telangana and Andhra Pradesh share two major dams on the river: the Srisailam and Nagarjunasagar projects. The Srisailam dam regulates about 811 thousand million cubic feet (TMC) of water, with Telangana allocated 299 TMC and Andhra Pradesh receiving the remainder. At Nagarjunasagar, which

holds 285 TMC, Telangana's share is 90

Despite clear allocations, Andhra Pradesh has frequently been accused of exceeding its water share, hurting Telangana's agricultural and developmental prospects. In November 2023, tensions escalated when Andhra



Pradesh authorities released over 2,000 cusecs of water from the Nagarjunasagar dam—beyond its entitlement—while Telangana was focused on elections. The incident sparked a police standoff, highlighting the fragile nature of water sharing between the two states.

The Centre established the Krishna River Management Board (KRMB) to oversee the equitable distribution of water between Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. The KRMB, comprising officials from both states and the central government, was expected to settle disputes and ensure compliance with the agreed 66:34 water-sharing ratio.

Water issues are deeply intertwined with politics. At Telangana's formation, the rivalry between Telangana's first Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and Andhra Pradesh's then-leader N Chandrababu Naidu added fuel to the dispute. Naidu's party had to share Hyderabad, the joint capital, with Telangana for ten years after bifurcation, complicating relations.

The political landscape shifted in 2019 with the rise of YSR Congress Party's Jagan Mohan Reddy in Andhra Pradesh, briefly raising hopes for improved cooperation. However, the honeymoon ended quickly when Andhra Pradesh unilaterally used 3 TMC of water from the Srisailam dam without informing Telangana or the KRMB, reigniting mistrust.

Telangana has also sought a revision of the water-sharing formula. The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) government, under KCR, pushed for a 50:50 split instead of the current 66:34, citing the state's growing water needs, especially for major projects like the Kaleshwaram lift irrigation scheme. This demand is currently under consideration by the Brijesh Kumar tribu-

Meanwhile, Andhra Pradesh continues to advance its own projects, such as the Polavaram irrigation project on the Godavari river, aimed at irrigating millions of acres and supplying drinking water to Visakhapatnam.

With the Congress now in power in Telangana—a party historically opposed to Andhra Pradesh's TDP—the political divide remains a significant barrier to resolving the water dispute. For a fair and lasting solution, the KRMB must be empowered and allowed to function effectively, ensuring both states receive their rightful share and protecting the interests of millions dependent on the Krishna





# **PM Modi Embarks on Three-Nation Tour to Cyprus, Canada, and Croatia**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to embark on a significant three-nation diplomatic tour covering Cyprus, Canada, and Croatia, beginning Sunday morning. The visit marks a key effort to strengthen India's global partnerships and expand strategic engagement across Europe and North America.

The tour will begin with a twoday visit to Cyprus from June 15-16, on the invitation of President Nikos Christodoulides. This marks the first visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Cyprus in over 20 years. During his stay in Nicosia, PM Modi will hold high-level talks with President Christodoulides aimed at deepening bilateral cooperation. He is also scheduled to address a gathering of business leaders in Limassol, highlighting economic opportunities and reaffirming India's commitment to stronger region and the European Union.

The final leg of the Prime Minister's tour will take him to Croatia on June 18. This visit will be historic, as it will mark the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to Croatia. In Zagreb, Modi will meet with Croatian Prime Minister Andrej Plenković and President Zoran Milanović to explore avenues for enhanced cooperation across sectors, including trade, tourism, and technology.

The tour is seen as a strategic move to deepen India's diplomatic outreach and global influence ahead of key international developments.

### **India abstaining** from UN motion on Gaza 'shameful': Priyanka Gandhi

Congress general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Saturday strongly criticized the Indian government for abstaining from a United Nations resolution aimed at protecting civilians and ensuring adherence to humanitarian law in Gaza. She called the move "shameful" and a "disappointing" departure from India's historical values.

In a post on social media platform 'X', Vadra expressed outrage over the government's silence amid the worsening humanitarian crisis in Gaza. "It is shameful and disappointing that our government has chosen to abstain on the UN motion for the protection of civilians and upholding legal and humanitarian obligations in Gaza," she wrote.

Citing reports that over 60,000 people — mostly women and children — have died and that the entire population of Gaza is being starved and confined, Vadra questioned India's moral compass and its failure to condemn the violence.

She also alleged that the Indian government was not only passive on the Gaza crisis but was effectively supporting Israel's aggressive actions against Iran, including what she described as the "assassination of its leadership in violation of international norms."

"This is a tragic reversal of our anti-colonial legacy," she said. "Not only are we standing silent as Mr. Netanyahu annihilates an entire nation, we are cheering on his government's attacks on Iran in complete contravention of international norms."

Vadra further questioned how India could abandon the principles enshrined in its Constitution and the values of its freedom movement, which were rooted in peace, justice, and non-violence. "There is no justification for this. True global leadership demands the courage to defend justice. India has shown this courage in the past," she said, urging the country to reclaim its moral voice in the international arena.


# **India's Active Covid-19 Tally Crosses 7,400;** Surge in Karnataka, Nine Deaths Reported

India's active Covid-19 cases rose to 7,400 on Saturday after a single-day addition of 269 new cases, according to the Union Health Ministry. The sharpest increase came from Karnataka, which reported 132 new infections, followed by Gujarat (79) and Kerala (54).

The country also reported nine Covid-related deaths in the last 24 hours. Maharashtra accounted for four of these. Kerala reported Nadu recorded one death each. The total number of Covid-related deaths since January 1, 2025, now stands at 87.

# **Axiom-4 Mission Rescheduled**

# **Indian Astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla Set for Historic Space Journey on June 19**

The highly anticipated Axiom-4 mission, which will carry Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla to the International Space Station (ISS), has been officially rescheduled for June 19, 2025, following a brief delay due to technical issues.

The launch will take place from NA-SA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida. Originally slated for June 11, the mission was postponed after engineers

detected two key issues — a fuel leak in SpaceX's Falcon-9 rocket and a pressure anomaly in the Russian Zvezda module on the ISS.

Union Minister of Science and Technology Dr. Jitendra Singh confirmed

the revised launch date on social media. "The launch date of the Axiom-4 mission carrying Indian astronaut Shubhanshu Shukla to the International Space Station is now set for June 19. The SpaceX team has addressed all technical concerns that led to the earlier delay," he wrote, adding that further updates would be provided as needed.

### Mission Overview & **International Crew**

The Axiom-4 (Ax-4) mission is Axiom Space's fourth private astronaut venture to the ISS, in collaboration with NASA and SpaceX. The mission underscores growing global cooperation in space exploration and the rise of private sector participation in human spaceflight.

India's Role in the Mission Shubhanshu Shukla's participation in this mission marks a historic milestone for India's space program, especially as ISRO gears up for future human spaceflight missions, including Gaganyaan.

During the 14-day stay aboard the ISS, the crew will conduct seven scientific experiments developed by ISRO, covering fields like microgravity research, life sciences, and fluid dynamics.

This mission not only signifies a proud moment for India on the global space stage but also strengthens international collaboration in space science and technology.





# **Not Concerned About War, Gave Iran 60** Days, Today's 61st: Trump Backs Israel

US President Donald Trump stated on Friday that he is "not concerned" about a regional war erupting following Israel's recent strike on Iran's military and nuclear facilities, which also killed key Iranian nuclear scientists and commanders.

In an interview with Reuters, Trump revealed that he had initially tried to delay the Israeli attack to allow more time for diplomacy and dialogue with Tehran. "I gave them a 60-day ultimatum, and today was the 61st day," Trump said, referring to Iran. Despite the offensive, the President expressed continued hope for nuclear negotiations, noting that planned talks in Oman on Sunday will proceed, although he doubts Iran will participate following the Israeli strike. Trump emphasized that it's still not too late for Iran to negotiate. Earlier in the day, he urged Tehran to "make cial envoy Steve Witkoff is a deal before it is too late," scheduled to meet an Iranian while also warning on his Truth Social account that

Iranian hardliners were "all DEAD now," adding ominously that "it will only get worse."

The President acknowledged that the US was aware in advance of Israel's plans. He convened his top national

security team at Camp David on June 8 to discuss Iran and spoke with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu the following day. "We knew everything, and I tried to save Iran from humiliation and death. I would have loved to see a deal worked out. They can still work out a deal; it's not too late," Trump said.

Reaffirming strong support for Israel, Trump called the US its "number one ally by far." When asked about Iran's counterattack, Trump responded, "We'll see what happens."

In retaliation for Israel's strike, Iran launched 100 drones toward Tel Aviv. The Israeli military said its air defenses intercepted the drones outside Israeli territory. Iran's Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, warned Israel of a "bitter and painful" fate in response to the attacks, signaling escalating tensions in the region.

### **Bangladesh's Interim Chief Adviser Yunus Meets BNP Leader Tarique Rahman in London Ahead of 2026 Elections**

Bangladesh's interim Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus met with Tarique Rahman, acting chairman of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), in London on June 13, 2025, in a significant political development as the country prepares for elections next year. Photographs released by the government press team showed the two leaders smiling and shaking hands, signaling a moment of cordiality amid a historically rocky relationship between Yunus's caretaker government and the BNP.

Tarique Rahman, son of former Prime Minister Khaleda Zia, leads the BNP, which is widely considered the frontrunner in the upcoming elections, expected to take place in April 2026. These will be the first elections since a student-led uprising forced former Premier Sheikh Hasina from power in August 2024, ending her 15-year rule marked by allegations of human rights abuses and politicization of the judiciary and civil services.

The exact election date remains a contentious issue. While Yunus has suggested an April 2026 timeline, the BNP has been pushing for earlier polls—preferably before the Islamic holy month of Ramadan begins around February 17, 2026. Senior members of Yunus's cabinet, including Khalilur Rahman, have hinted that elections could be held sooner if sufficient progress is made in democratic reforms and judicial trials. BNP leader Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury expressed hope for consensus on these reforms soon.

Yunus, an 84-year-old Nobel Peace Prize laureate, assumed the caretaker role after the student protests that ousted Hasina, who fled the country by helicopter amid growing unrest. The caretaker government has emphasized the need to strengthen democratic institutions before elections, warning that ongoing political power struggles could threaten recent gains. The meeting in London between Yunus and Rahman is viewed as a critical step toward easing political tensions and ensuring a fair electoral process in Bangladesh's politically volatile environment. Both sides appear to be cautiously moving toward dialogue and consensus as the nation prepares for a pivotal election.


### "Unite for freedom from evil and oppressive regime": Israel PM Netanyahu tells Iranians

## Israel Strikes Iran's Nuclear Sites; Iran **Retaliates with Missile Attacks**

Israel launched a powerful airstrike on June 13, 2025, targeting Iran's key nuclear and military facilities, using warplanes and drones to destroy critical sites and kill top Iranian generals and nuclear scientists. The Israeli government said the operation was necessary to prevent Iran from advancing closer to developing an atomic weapon, although international experts had already assessed Iran's active nuclear program prior to the attack.

Israeli authorities urged civilians to take shelter as some missiles damaged homes, resulting in two fatalities and several injuries. Hospitals in Tel Aviv treated multiple casualties, mostly with minor injuries, while one Iranian missile strike in Rishon Lezion killed two people and injured 19, damaging several homes.

In response, Iran fired multiple ballistic rabad International Airport. Iran's Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, vowed harsh retaliation, condemning Israel's attack as a "great crime" and promising the perpetrators would not escape unpunished. Iran's UN ambassador reported 78 fatalities and over 320 wounded from the Israeli strikes.

> The Israeli military said about 200 aircraft targeted nearly 100 locations, including the Natanz nuclear enrichment site, where significant damage was visible, and the Isfahan nuclear research facility. Israeli officials confirmed destruction of numerous radar and mis-

sile defense systems. The UN nuclear chief reported that the above-ground Natanz facility was destroyed, though underground centrifuge operations might have been spared.

The strikes killed three of Iran's highest-ranking military lead-

ers, including Generals Mohammad Bagheri, Hossein Salami, and Amir Ali Hajizadeh, delivering a severe blow to Iran's military command.

The U.S. provided air defense support, helping Israel intercept Iranian missiles. The conflict has escalated fears of a broader regional war, with countries worldwide calling for immediate de-escalation. Israel's Prime Minister Netanyahu revealed the attack had been planned months in advance but was delayed due to evolving geopolitical factors, including the October 2023 Hamas attacks and U.S. political developments.

### **Trump's HIV/AIDS Aid Cuts Push 2030 Goal Further Out of Reach, Warns UNAIDS Chief**



Efforts to end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030 have suffered a major blow following U.S. President Donald Trump's decision to slash billions in HIV/AIDS foreign aid, according to UNAIDS Executive Director Winnie Byanyima. Speaking to journalists in Johannesburg on June 13, 2025, Byanyima expressed concern that the funding cuts are already having visible impacts across Africa, particularly in South Africa, which has the world's highest population living with HIV — an estimated 8 million people.

"The world was already off track," Byanyima said, citing 1.3 million new infections in 2023. "Less funding means we will get more and more off-track." The U.S. has historically been one of the largest funders of global HIV programmes through initiatives like PEPFAR. But the Trump administration's February decision to significantly cut foreign aid, including HIV-related funding, has disrupted treatment and prevention services in many low-income countries.

Byanyima noted that the effects are already visible, with some countries seeing a decline in clinic visits and HIV testing. Community prevention programmes — instrumental in curbing new infections — are shutting down due to lack of resources. "We don't know yet what that impact will be, but impact there will be," she warned. In South Africa, where about 20% of the national HIV budget came from U.S. funding, monitoring and testing systems are faltering.

UNAIDS estimates that as many as six million people could die if global funding shortfalls continue. Byanyima emphasized that while prevention efforts were starting to show success, they were "not coming down fast enough" — and progress is now at serious risk.

She urged other wealthy nations to step in and help fill the funding gap. "Even poor, indebted countries are trying to plug the holes," she said. "We're saying to donors: this is one of the diseases without a cure, without a vaccine — yet we're seeing progress. If you've got a good success story, why drop it before you end it?" Her call comes amid growing concern from global health organizations, including the World Health Organization, about the wider implications of U.S. aid cuts on international health programmes.



### **India's Goods and Services Exports Poised to Cross** \$900 Billion in 2025-26, Says Piyush Goyal

Tndia's goods **L**and services exports are set to exceed \$900 during billion the fiscal year 2025-26, despite ongoing global economic uncertainties, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal has announced.

Addressing an Indian business delegation Stockholm on

June 11, 2025, Goyal expressed confidence that the country would achieve this milestone amid challenges such as the Russia-Ukraine conflict, the Israel-Hamas war, and the ongoing crisis in the Red Sea region. He highlighted that India's overall exports had already reached an all-time high of \$825 billion in 2024-25, up from \$778 billion the previous year.

"We have crossed \$825 billion exports last year, we are surely to cross \$900 billion this year in all this global turmoil," Goyal said during his official visit to Sweden, where he met with his Swedish counterpart and engaged with companies to promote bilateral trade and investments.

The United States continues to be India's largest trading partner, maintaining this position for the fourth consecutive year in 2024-25, according to government data.

Adding to this optimism, the Federation of Indian Export Organisations (FIEO), the apex exporters' body, has projected a robust growth of over 21% year-

on-year in India's overall goods and services exports for 2025-26. FIEO's forecast anticipates exports will reach the \$1 trillion mark during the same period, signaling a significant leap in India's global trade footprint.

This growth trajectory is particularly notable given the volatile geopolitical landscape and global economic disruptions. India's expanding export base, diversification of trade partners, and focus on boosting manufacturing and services sectors have been key drivers behind these encouraging export numbers.

The surge in oil prices coincided with weakening stock markets worldwide, reflecting heightened investor caution.

The price of US benchmark crude jumped 7.1% to \$72.88 per barrel, while Brent crude, the international benchmark, rose 7.2% to \$74.32 per barrel. ## **Dinosaur Fossil With Signs** of Cancer May Help Advance **Human Disease Research**

In a groundbreaking study, researchers from the UK and Romania have uncovered a 70-million-year-old dinosaur fossil showing signs of cancer, along with exceptionally preserved soft tissue. The fossil belongs to Telmatosaurus transsylvanicus, a plant-eating, cow-sized dinosaur that once roamed what is now Romania.

The discovery is notable not just for the tumour found in the dinosaur's jaw, but for the preservation of soft tissue containing structures resembling red blood cells near the tumour site. Using advanced microscopy techniques, scientists were able to examine these tissues in unprecedented detail. This rare find opens new doors for understanding how diseases like cancer developed in ancient organisms and how that knowledge might translate to modern medical

Professor Justin Stebbing, a senior author of the study from Anglia Ruskin University, emphasized the significance of proteins found in fossilized soft tissue. "Unlike DNA, which is highly fragile, proteins—especially those in calcified tissue—are more stable and resistant to degradation," Stebbing explained. "This makes them excellent targets for studying the molecular history of diseases, including cancer."

The researchers argue that this discovery strengthens the case for prioritizing the collection and preservation of soft tissues in fossils. Traditionally, paleontologists have focused more on bones and skeletal remains. However, with improvements in molecular analysis techniques, preserved soft tissues could provide critical insights into disease evolution.



The study also supports previous findings that suggested cancer existed in Telmatosaurus, underlining its ancient origins. The team believes that understanding how large, long-lived animals like dinosaurs dealt with cancer could shed light on human vulnerability and resistance to the disease.

Long-term fossil conservation strategies, the researchers note, are essential to enable future breakthroughs in molecular paleopathology potentially offering clues that benefit human health.

# Swiggy's 'Dilli Se Hu BLCK' Ad Sparks Backlash Over **Slang Reference**

wiggy's latest ad campaign to pro-**I**mote its premium membership service, One BLCK, in Delhi has stirred controversy rather than celebration. The food delivery platform recently ran a full-page newspaper ad featuring the bold tagline "Dilli Se Hu BLCK" — a play on a well-known Hindi slang phrase. While intended to grab attention, the phrase drew sharp criticism online for its perceived insensitivity and suggestive language.

The phrase appeared on the front page of a provocative marketing. prominent newspaper, prompting outrage among many Delhi residents and social media users who found the ad inappropriate and offensive. Journalist Sanket Upadhyay voiced his disapproval on X (formerly Twitter), describing the advertisement as "notorious" and accusing it of normalizing abusive language in mainstream media. He questioned how such messaging was deemed acceptable in a reputable

His post quickly gained traction, with many plimentary add-ons during dine-outs, and agreeing that Swiggy had crossed a line. One commenter stressed the need for clear advertising guidelines to prevent such messaging, while another argued that the primary responsibility lies with advertisers, not just publishers. "Normalising bad is the new good," one user remarked, referencing a growing trend of



However, not everyone saw the issue the same way. A few users defended the campaign, suggesting the outrage was exaggerated. "This is the most non-issue issue," one user commented, criticizing the backlash as misplaced.

# iPhone 17 Pro Geekbench Scores Leak: A19 Pro Chip Outpaces Snapdragon 8 Elite SoC Apple's upcoming iPhone 17 Pro Aseries is generating major buzz

According to the leak, the A19 Pro SoC—expected to power the iPhone 17 Pro series—will retain the 3nm fabrication process seen in its predecessor but deliver significantly better per-

formance. The benchmark scores suggest a single-core score exceeding 4,000 and a multi-core score surpassing 10,000, representing a notable leap over the iPhone 16 Pro Max's Geekbench scores of 3,203 (single-core) and 7,846 (multi-core).

In comparison, the Samsung Galaxy S25 Ultra, equipped with the latest Snapdragon 8 Elite SoC, scored 3,054 (single-core) and 9,832 (multi-core). While Qualcomm's chip remains highly competitive, Apple's A19 Pro appears to take a slight lead in raw processing power, according to these early results.

Beyond performance, design leaks suggest the iPhone 17 Pro models may feature a thicker chassis—possibly to accommodate



a larger battery or a VC (vapor chamber) cooling system, which would be a first for Apple. Rumors also hint at a redesigned camera module and enhancements to display technology across the lineup, including the new iPhone 17 Air, a lightweight model poised to rival Samsung's Galaxy S25

These upgrades are expected to complement Apple's recently announced Liquid Glass UI, a visually immersive interface that increases processing demands with transparency effects and transitions.

If the leaks hold true, Apple's iPhone 17 Pro series is shaping up to deliver both style and substance in its next-generation flagship smartphones.



### **Stuttgart Open 2025: Zverev** and Fritz **Cruise Into Semifinals**



Top-seeded Alexander Zverev and American star Taylor Fritz have advanced to the semifinals of the Stuttgart Open 2025, keeping their title hopes alive on the grass courts of Germany.

Zverev, the hometown favorite, booked his place in the last four with a straightsets victory over Brandon Nakashima, winning 7-5, 6-4 in a tightly contested quarterfinal on Friday. According to the ATP Tour, Zverev maintained his unbeaten record against Nakashima, now leading 4-0 in their head-to-head meetings. The German saved two break points during the match and produced an impressive 31 winners, despite committing 20 unforced errors. The win came after a one-hour and 32-minute battle, marking Zverev as the first top-three ATP player to reach the Stuttgart semifinals since Roger Federer's 2018 title run.

Zverev, who recently captured the Munich Open title on clay, is chasing his first-ever grass court title. He will face the winner of the quarterfinal clash between Ben Shelton and Jiri Lehecka in

In another quarterfinal, Felix Auger-Aliassime advanced to a semifinal matchup with Taylor Fritz after dispatching Justin Engel in straight sets, 7-6(3), 6-3. The Canadian was in strong serving form, hitting 18 aces and winning 86% of his firstserve points. He is chasing his third title of the season and has now reached his sixth career semifinal on grass.

Meanwhile, Taylor Fritz continued his impressive grass court run by defeating Marton Fucsovics of Hungary 6-3, 6-4 in just 77 minutes. Fritz, a three-time winner of the ATP 250 event in Eastbourne (2019, 2022, 2024), looks poised to challenge for another grass title.

The Stuttgart semifinals are shaping up to be a thrilling showcase of power and finesse on grass.

# South Africa Clinch First ICC Title in 27 Years, Defeat Australia in WTC Final 2025

LONDON: South Africa have ended a 27-year-long wait for an ICC title, defeating Australia in a thrilling World Test Championship (WTC) Final 2025 on Day 4 at The Oval. Chasing a challenging target of 282, the Proteas held their nerve to script a historic victory, with Aiden Markram leading the charge with a brilliant century.

Markram's composed ton laid the foundation for the chase, while captain Temba Bavuma, despite battling a leg injury, added a crucial fifty to steer his team home in a high-pressure situation. The moment marked South Africa's first ICC trophy since the 1998 Champions Trophy and their first-ever WTC title, cementing their place in Test cricket's elite.

Earlier in the match, Kagiso Rabada was the standout performer with the ball, claiming nine wick-



ets across both innings. His relentless pace and precision dismantled the Australian batting line-up, setting the stage for South Africa's dramatic run chase.

Australia, despite holding the edge for much of the Test, failed to defend a solid total on the final day. Key wickets fell at the wrong time,

and their bowlers struggled to break the Bavuma-Markram stand that turned the match.

The victory triggered wild celebrations among South African players and fans, many of whom have long awaited the end of a trophy drought that spanned nearly three

This win is a significant milestone for South African cricket, not only ending years of near-misses in ICC tournaments but also highlighting the emergence of a new generation capable of succeeding on the global

With this triumph, South Africa now join India (2021 runners-up, 2023 winners) and New Zealand (2021 winners) as WTC title holders, reshaping the balance of power in modern Test cricket.

Tust five years after its Ma-**J** jor League Soccer (MLS) debut, Inter Miami is set to step onto football's biggest club stage — the 2025 FIFA Club World Cup. With global icon Lionel Messi leading the charge and co-owner David Beckham watching closely, the spotlight is squarely on the American side as it prepares to face the world's top

Kicking off the tournament at Miami's Hard Rock Stadium, Inter Miami's first challenge comes against Al Ahly, the most decorated club in African football history. The Egyptian giants boast 12 African Champions League titles, 45 national league championships, and 39 domestic cups — a resume that dwarfs Miami's brief history.

Despite the daunting competition, head coach Javier Mascherano sees this as an opportunity rather than a burden. "This competition will show us where we truly stand," Mascherano said in a press conference on June 13. "No one expects us to go far, and that might just be our advantage. In the MLS, there's pressure on us to win — here, we're the underdogs."

However, Miami's qualification for the Club World Cup has raised evebrows. Still, the Club World Cup offers Inter Miami and Messi a global platform. Whether they can spring a genuine surprise or simply make a respectable showing remains to be seen — but all eyes will be on Miami as football's newest contender takes its shot at global glory.


