Sakshi anchor Kommineni Srinivasa Rao, who was arrested in a case involving inappropriate comments on women, will remain in jail until at least Monday due to a series of consecutive court holidays. Though the Supreme Court granted him bail, procedur-

al delays caused by the vacation period have prevented his immediate release. According to his legal team, the bail orders from the Supreme Court did not reach the relevant trial court by Friday evening. With Saturday and Sunday being court holidays,



Land Scam Clouds IPS Officer Uday Bhaskar's Record in Andhra Pradesh

Fresh controversy has erupted around Jammu & Kashmir cadre IPS officer Uday Bhaskar Billa, currently on deputation to the CRPF, with serious allegations linking him to a major land scam in Kunchanapalli, Andhra Pradesh. Locals allege that under the guise of authority, Bhaskar unlawfully acquired land belonging to poor residents in the village, which lies virtually adjacent to the Andhra Pradesh DGP office.

This is not the first time Bhaskar has found himself in the eye of a political storm. During the previous YS-RCP-led government, Bhaskar was reportedly stopped and sent back from Visakhapatnam Airport by then CM Chandrababu Naidu — a move seen as a symbolic protest against his alleged proximity to CM Y.S. Jagan Mohan

Further, serious allegations of harassment have emerged from a female officer who worked under Bhaskar. Internal sources within the police department claim that not only did Bhaskar harass her, but he also systematically oppressed several lower-level staff during his tenure, creating a climate of fear and resentment. Locals in Kunchanapalli, including Vijayender Rao and Pamula Reddy, have now approached the High Court, alleging that their land was illegally seized under pressure. The court has since issued notices in the case, bringing Bhaskar's alleged misuse of power back into public focus.

It is also alleged that Bhaskar made large-scale investments in Hyderabad real estate, with funds and proxies traced back to controversial Vizagbased auditor G.V., who is reportedly acting as an alias or financial front for the IPS officer.

Adding to the political dimension, Bhaskar — while on central deputation to the CRPF — is accused of covertly supporting the YSRCP during the recent elections, working against TDPaligned officers and influencing local administrative decisions, even though his formal duties required strict neutrality.

there was no scope for proceedings over the weekend. In an attempt to expedite the process, Kommineni's lawyers reportedly met the magistrate at his residence, but those efforts were unsuccessful. His legal team is now planning to secure the bail orders in the trial court on Monday. If the process goes smoothly, Kommineni is expected to be released by Monday evening. Kommineni was arrested for making inappropriate remarks against women and is currently in remand in the Andhra Pradesh capital region. Meanwhile, Krishnam Raju, identified as the main accused in the same case, continues to be lodged in Guntur district jail. While the YSRCP's legal cell lawyers have worked on securing bail for Kommineni, Krishnam Raju is said to have appointed a separate legal counsel to handle his case. The delay in Kommineni's release has once again highlighted how court holidays can impact the execution of judicial orders, especially in high-profile or time-sensitive cases.

RWAs Key to Power Savings: BEE Pushes for Energy Efficiency in Homes

- · BEE calls on states to empower RWAs and promote behaviourbased energy saving
- BEE urges SDAs to adopt 2BESP model for long-term impact
- Residential sector accounts for 35-40% of India's energy use
- · Up to 22.5 billion kWh of energy can be saved annually with simple behavioural shifts

In a major initiative to curb residential energy consumption, the Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) under the Ministry of Power, Government of India, has urged all State Designated Agencies (SDAs) to actively engage Residential Welfare Associations (RWAs) and Group Housing Societies to promote Behaviour-Based Energy Saving Practices (2BESP) across the country.

Highlighting that the residential sector consumes 35–40% of India's total energy, the BEE emphasized that RWAs—due to their strong community influence—can play a vital role in spreading awareness and accelerating the adoption of energy-efficient habits and appliances.

At a recent stakeholder meeting on the impact of 5-Star Rated Appliances, BEE Secretary Milind Deore stressed the need for households to shift to high-efficiency air conditioners, ceiling fans, and refrigerators. He also reiterated the government's campaign to set air conditioners at 24°C or higher as a simple yet effective energy-saving measure.



"A shift in daily habits, coupled with the adoption of energy-efficient appliances, can lead to massive savings—for both consumers and the nation," said Deore.

BEE estimates that successful implementation of 2BESP initiatives could lead to annual savings of 22.5 billion kWh, offering both economic and environmental benefits. For example:

A 75W ceiling fan running for 16 hours daily incurs an annual electricity bill of ₹2,857.

A 32W BLDC fan, under the same usage, consumes less than half the power, bringing the yearly bill down to ₹1,208.

BEE applauded the proactive involvement of southern states—particularly TSREDCO (Telangana)—in the World Environment Day campaigns. SDAs from Tamil Nadu (TANGEDCO), Kerala (EMC), Andhra Pradesh (APSECM), and Karnataka (KREDL) were also commended for their efforts in promoting energy efficiency.

These collective efforts have already resulted in:

- 81.64 billion units of electricity saved in 2022–23
- ₹54,323 crore in energy cost savings
- 58 million tonnes of CO₂ emissions avoided annually

BEE concluded by reaffirming its commitment to sustainable development, urging SDAs to collaborate with RWAs, schools, and local bodies to accelerate grassroots energy awareness.

"The road to a cleaner, more energy-secure future begins at home," Deore added. "RWAs can be the torchbearers of this movement."

MP Putta Mahesh Warns Against Baseless Allegations

Member of Parliament Putta Mahesh has strongly condemned what he described as baseless and defamatory reports circulating in sections of the media, accusing him of being involved in the transfer of a government official. Speaking out firmly, Mahesh clarified that neither he nor his office staff, nor even the District Collector, were approached for clarification before such reports were published.

"It is not right to write false articles in newspapers, alleging that I was involved in transfers, without consulting me or my office or even the District Collector," Mahesh said. "If any allegations are received, they should first be verified. Writing baselessly will not be tolerated," he warned.

The MP emphasized that such unfounded accusations damage reputations and create misconceptions among the public. "From now on, I urge all media houses to contact me or my office before making any such allegations," he said, making it clear that he will not hesitate to pursue legal action if such acts continue.

Mahesh also reminded that elected representatives are accountable to the people and that transparency and proper process must be followed in all matters. He called for responsible journalism and warned against defamation through false news.

He concluded by stating, "I respect the role of the media, but misinformation is dangerous. I will take legal steps if such unverified claims are made against me again."

Surface Depression Triggers Rain Across Andhra

Heavy rains likely in coastal areas; fishermen warned to stay ashore

A surface depression formed in the west-central Bay of Bengal, adjacent to North Andhra, is bringing widespread rains to various parts of the state. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued alerts for rain in several areas across Coastal Andhra and Rayalaseema, along with warnings of potential heavy downpours in specific coastal locations.

The Visakhapatnam Meteorological Center reported that the depression, coupled with multiple surface troughs—one stretching from Bangladesh through the North Bay of Bengal to South Odisha, and another extending from Marathwada via Telangana to Coastal Andhra—is influencing weather patterns in the region. These developments led to rainfall Saturday.

Corruption Will Not Be Tolerated in Any Department: CM

Chief Minister Nara Chandrababu Naidu has taken a firm stand against corruption in the state administration. In a review meeting held at his camp office in Undavalli, the Chief Minister made it clear that corruption will not be tolerated in any department, anywhere, or by anyone. He directed officials to take swift and strict action wherever corruption is proven and to focus on establishing a transparent and accountable governance system across the state.

The review meeting centered around the public feedback collected through IVRS and CSDS surveys regarding various government schemes and services. Officials informed the Chief Minister that the coalition government has received a high level of public satisfaction over the past year. In response, Chandrababu instructed a technical audit of the survey data to identify areas of concern and improve satisfaction levels where needed.

The Chief Minister emphasized the importance of addressing ten major public issues with urgency, including welfare distribution, job creation, road development, and infrastructure. He asked officials to prepare data on job creation through work-from-home programs, investment inflows, and skill training. He also anthrough the "Mana Mitra" WhatsApp Governance initiative.

The IVRS survey revealed that 85 percent of respondents believe there is no corruption in pension distribution, 87.8 percent confirmed that pensions are delivered to homes, and 83.9 percent were satisfied with the behavior of government employees. Meanwhile, the CSDS field survey showed even higher satisfaction, with 93.9 percent stating there was no corruption, 93.3 percent acknowledging home delivery, and 73.3 percent expressing satisfaction with staff conduct.

In the areas of public health and municipal services, 80.5 percent of people rated canteens as clean, 79.3 percent were satisfied with the food, and 80.8 percent appreciated the quality checks in hospitals. However, only 55 percent were satisfied with free medicine distribution. About 68.1 percent were satisfied with daily garbage collection, and 57 percent said garbage removal was done within 24 hours.

Religious and transport services also received public feedback. In temples, 68 percent of devotees said darshan facilities were good, 63.6 percent appreciated temple amenities, and 77.7 percent approved of the quality of prasadam. "I Will Register Any Land"

Allegations Surface Against Patamata Sub-Registrar Nalmala Revanth Sub-Registrar Revanth allegedly defies High Court stay on Church lands Claims protection from ACB DG and backing of Minister Satya Prasad Documents point to illegal registrations worth hundreds of crores

A major controversy has erupted in Andhra Pradesh following explosive allegations against Patamata Sub-Registrar Nalmala Revanth, who is accused of openly defying a High Court order and facilitating illegal land registrations across the state. In a brazen assertion, Revanth reportedly declared, "I will register any land, anywhere, any land in the West! Who can stop me?" — igniting widespread condemnation.

The crux of the issue lies in the illegal registration of prime lands belonging to the Andhra Evangelical Lutheran Church Society. The High Court, in its ruling under Writ Appeal No. 1033/2023, had clearly directed that the Church Society lands across

Andhra Pradesh not be sold or trans- to have claimed, silencing objections ferred.

Despite this, Nalmala Revanth allegedly carried out registrations of Church lands in Rajahmundry from his Vijayawada-based Patamata Sub-Registrar Office by exploiting the Anywhere Eni system. The registered document numbers — 27901/2024 to 27908/2024 — are now at the center of an emerging storm.

Sources allege that when the Rajahmundry Sub-Registrar raised objections, citing the HC stay, Revanth reportedly boasted of his political protection. "Behind me is ACB DG Atul Singh. Nara Lokesh is my relative. Minister Angani Satya Prasad is backing me. I send ₹6 lakh every month for his office expenses," Revanth is said

There are serious accusations that Revanth received bribes to execute these illegal registrations. It is further alleged that similar high-value land transactions — estimated to be worth over ₹100 crore — were facilitated in Guntur, West Godavari, East Godavari, and Visakhapatnam districts in violation of established legal procedures. What's raising further concerns is the inaction by vigilance authorities. Though a vigilance inquiry was reportedly conducted against Revanth earlier, insiders claim it was diluted due to political pressure, particular-

Officials within the registration department and legal experts are now demanding immediate intervention. "This is not just a violation of court orders but a breakdown of the system. If a sub-registrar claims immunity from ACB and ministers, what justice can citizens expect?" said a senior legal officer who chose to remain anonymous. The silence of the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) is also drawing criticism. Activists question why the ACB has not yet initiated action in such a high-profile case despite mounting mitment to transparency, accountevidence. "Is ACB functioning at all ability, and rule of law.

The Andhra Pradesh NGVOS (Non-Gazetted Officers' Sangham) has urged the state government to take immediate steps to resolve pending issues affecting government employees. Speaking after the election of D.V. Ramana from Vizianagaram district as the new State General Secretary, Sangha State President Alaparthi Vidyasagar stated that while the employees welcome the welfare and development programs introduced by the new government, employee welfare cannot be ignored.

and administrative rotation, the implementation of G.O.Rt. No.344, issued on May 31, 2025, is being flagged for procedural ambiguity and potential injustice. This department-specific G.O. mandates the rotation of ministerial staff who have completed 3 to 5 years of service at a given station — a deviation from the broader G.O.Ms. No.23, which applies compulso-

Uneven implementation of G.O.s sparks unrest among ministerial staff

ry transfers only to employees with over five years of continuous service at the same location. The new clause, applicable solely to ministerial staff in sensitive units like DM&HOs and RDMHS offices, has led to confusion and alleged misuse. Intent vs. Misuse

Officials say the objective behind G.O.Rt.No.344 was to break influence networks and prevent prolonged postings in sensitive units, thereby curbing administrative misuse. However, ground reports suggest the clause is now being used selectively, allowing certain staff members with only 3–5 years of tenure to secure transfers to other districts of their choice often through lobbying and bypassing standard procedures.

Demands for Policy Revisit

This has led to rising appeals from department insiders and employees' unions, urging the Health Minister and Principal Secretary of HM&FW to revisit and rationalize the implementation. Their key demands include:

• Ensuring employees with over 5 years of service are given top priority in transfers

• Making transfers for 3-5 year employees optional or need-

- vacancy" clauses for cross-district postings
- Enforcing transfers based on vacancy, seniority, and transparent criteria
- · Issuing a uniform clarification to all District Collectors and HoDs on correct interpretation

Conclusion

While the state's effort to overhaul stagnant administrative setups is well-intended, misapplication of guidelines in the HM&FW Department may cause demoralization, mistrust, and potential legal challenges. Health staff urge swift action to correct inconsistencies and preserve the spirit of fair governance that these reforms aim to establish.

According to reports, the group of 18 devotees had traveled to Basar for darshan. Despite not knowing how to swim, five of them ventured into the deeper section of the river, leading to the fatal accident. Locals nearby noticed the youths struggling

Tragically, all five were declared dead. The deceased have been identified as Rakesh (17), Vinod (18), Madan (18), Ruthvik, and Bharath, all residents of Chintalbazar in Dilsukhnagar, Hyderabad. Their bodies were later retrieved and sent for post-mortem examination.

Telugu NRIs in Riyadh Hold Candlelight Vigil for Ahmedabad Plane Tragedy

Imran Khan vs Pakistan Military: How Democracy Became a Bedtime Story

Pakistan's political theatre has long been dominated by the invisible yet omnipresent hand of its military establishment. The narrative of democracy—while periodically enacted through elections and parliamentary proceedings—has largely served as a facade, masking the real levers of power wielded by the men in uniform. The ongoing incarceration of former Prime Minister Imran Khan since 2023 is merely the most visible symbol of a deeper malaise: a civilian governance system permitted to exist only at the pleasure of the military elite.

Imran Khan's rise to power in 2018 was not an act of defiance against the establishment but rather a carefully orchestrated endorsement. His cricketing fame and populist promises made him an ideal proxy. Yet, his eventual attempts to assert civilian authority particularly over foreign policy and intelligence matters—were met with swift and unforgiving retribution from the very institution that once backed

Khan's ousting in 2022 marked the beginning of a targeted campaign to dismantle his influence. What followed was a relentless barrage of legal cases—ranging from corruption allegations in the Toshakhana case to violations of Islamic marriage laws intended less for accountability and more for political eradication. Even his wife, Bushra Bibi, was drawn into this

The 9 May 2023 protests following Khan's arrest triggered an unprecedented backlash. For the first time in Pakistan's history, military installations in Lahore and Peshawar were attacked by demonstrators. The state's response was draconian: mass arrests, forced resignations of PTI leaders on

> At the helm of this crackdown is Army Chief Field Marshal Asim Munir, whose approach has left little room for political pluralism. symbol and crippled ahead of the 2024 general elections. Despite being billed as a democratic exercise, the elections were marred by internet shutdowns, vote-count discrepancies, and allegations of ballot tampering—turning the process into a staged performance with a pre-determined outcome.

Beyond the political sphere, the military's control extends to the media and civil society. Journalists have been ab-

ducted or driven into exile, platforms like X (formerly Twitter) were banned for over a year, and enforced disappearances now plague not just the restive provinces but major cities like Karachi and Lahore. Under the guise of national security, dissent is silenced, surveillance intensified, and freedom curbed.

This environment has hollowed out Pakistan's democratic institutions. The judiciary is largely submissive, parliament functions as a rubber stamp, and political survival depends not on public support but allegiance to the military establishment in Rawalpindi. Pakistan today isn't suffering from a civil-military imbalance—it operates under military dominance with civilian rule as a carefully managed illusion.

Imran Khan joins a long list of leaders—Zulfigar Ali Bhutto, Benazir Bhutto, Nawaz Sharif—who were brought down once they outlived their usefulness. What makes this moment particularly perilous is the normalization of authoritarianism under a democratic veneer. The cost is steep: a faltering economy, dwindling foreign investment, growing diplomatic isolation, and deepening societal fractures.

Until Pakistan's generals loosen their grip on power, democracy will remain, as it has for decades, little more than a bedtime story told to comfort, not to convince.

A Decade Later, Telangana's **Battle for Krishna River Water Continues**

More than ten years after Telangana split from Andhra Pradesh, the state's struggle to secure its rightful share of Krishna river water remains unresolved, exposing deep political and administrative challenges.

The Krishna river, flowing through Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Karnataka, is central to this dispute. Telangana and Andhra Pradesh share two major dams on the river: the Sr-

isailam and Nagarjunasagar projects. The Srisailam dam regulates about 811 thousand million cubic feet (TMC) of water, with Telangana allocated 299 TMC and Andhra Pradesh receiving the remainder. At Nagarjunasagar, which holds 285 TMC, Telangana's share is 90 TMC.

Despite clear allocations, Andhra Pradesh has frequently been accused of exceeding its water share, hurting Telangana's agricultural and developmental prospects. In November 2023, tensions escalated when Andhra Pradesh authorities released over 2,000 cusecs of water from the Nagarjunasagar dam—beyond its entitlement while Telangana was focused on elections. The incident sparked a police standoff, highlighting the fragile nature of water sharing between the two states.

The Centre established the Krishna River Management Board (KRMB) to oversee the equitable distribution of water between Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. The KRMB, comprising officials from both states and the central government, was expected to settle disputes and ensure compliance with the agreed 66:34 water-sharing ratio. Yet, a decade on, its effectiveness remains limited as disputes persist.

Water issues are deeply intertwined with politics. At Telangana's formation, the rivalry between Telangana's first Chief Minister K Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and Andhra Pradesh's then-leader N Chandrababu Naidu added fuel to the dispute. Naidu's party had to share Hyderabad, the joint




capital, with Telangana for ten years after bifurcation, complicating relations.

The political landscape shifted in 2019 with the rise of YSR Congress Party's Jagan Mohan Reddy in Andhra Pradesh, briefly raising hopes for improved cooperation. However, the honeymoon ended quickly when Andhra Pradesh unilaterally used 3 TMC of water from the Srisailam dam without informing Telangana or the KRMB, reigniting mistrust.

Telangana has also sought a revision of the water-sharing formula. The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) government, under KCR, pushed for a 50:50 split instead of the current 66:34, citing the state's growing water needs, especially for major projects like the Kaleshwaram lift irrigation scheme. This demand is currently under consideration by the Brijesh Kumar tribunal. Meanwhile, Andhra Pradesh continues to advance its own projects, such as the Polavaram irrigation project on the Godavari river, aimed at irrigating millions of acres and supplying drinking water to Visakhapatnam.

With the Congress now in power in Telangana—a party historically opposed to Andhra Pradesh's TDP—the political divide remains a significant barrier to resolving the water dispute. For a fair and lasting solution, the KRMB must be empowered and allowed to function effectively, ensuring both states receive their rightful share and protecting the interests of millions dependent on the Krishna river.

Backstory: Could Reporting on the AI171 Crash Have Prioritized **Substance Over Sensation?**



The morning after India's worst air disaster in three decades, headlines competing for attention told very different stories. The Times of India went with a sensational "Dreamliner Nightmare Kills 245," which was dramatic but factually flawed, overstating the death toll and creating confusion. Meanwhile, The Hindu's headline, "AI flight with 242 on board crashes in Ahmedabad," was straightforward and accurate, though less flashy. This contrast raises a vital question: could media coverage of the Air India AI171 crash have focused more on facts and less on sensationalism?

Air crashes are undeniably tragic and newsworthy, naturally triggering a buzz in newsrooms. Ideally, this should ignite thoughtful, responsible reporting—something akin to what former President A.P.J. Abdul Kalam once wished: that such "tingles" in the newsroom spark minds, not chaos. Unfortunately, watching hours of Indian television coverage revealed more noise than clarity, often drowning the public in speculation rather than facts.

An aviation expert commented that public speculation during ongoing investigations doesn't help families, investigators, or the process itself. This restraint was notably missing from much Indian coverage. In stark contrast, international outlets like the BBC and CNN treated the tragedy with measured sensitivity. They were careful to respect passengers' privacy and referred to the deceased with reverence, often using the term "souls" to acknowledge the human cost.

Indian media, however, often veered toward hysteria. Young reporters frequently

raised their voices, seemingly believing that louder delivery added weight. One reporter's near-accusatory tone toward Bhoomi Chauhan—a passenger who narrowly missed the flight—felt inappropriate and insensitive. What stood out amidst the gloom was footage of a survivor calmly walking to an ambulance. This prompted veteran journalist Rajdeep Sardesai to wax philosophical on "miracles" and divine plans, a framing that risks deflecting focus from crucial questions of accountability.

Indeed, accountability—or the lack thereof—was a sore point. Union Home Minister Amit Shah's remark that "this is an accident, and nobody can stop accidents" sparked criticism. Many saw it as a premature dismissal of responsibility, with calls growing louder for resignations from senior leaders, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi and key ministers. Over 240 lives lost demanded more than platitudes.

Political optics played a large role in the media narrative. Even before Modi's arrival at the crash site, coverage framed his response as swift and decisive, with channels like Times Now headlining "Team Modi rushes to Ahmedabad." Yet details of any concrete "quick action" remained vague. When the Prime Minister did visit the next day, the iconic image of him standing alone, staring up at the wreckage embedded in a hostel building, became a social media sensation. But while the disaster's physical toll was evident, many perceived Modi's visit as a carefully staged public relations moment amid the ongoing chaos.





PM Modi Begins Five-Day Tour to Cyprus, Canada, and Croatia Focused on Counter-Terror Diplomacy and Strengthening Ties

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has embarked on a significant five-day foreign tour, starting with a two-day visit to Cyprus, followed by stops in Canada and Croatia. This marks his first overseas trip since India launched Operation Sindoor, targeting terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK).

PM Modi was warmly welcomed at the airport by Cyprus President Nikos Christodoulides, highlighting the importance of this visit — the first by an Indian Prime Minister to Cyprus in over two decades. During his stay from June 15 to 16, Modi will discuss expanding cooperation with Cyprus in trade, investment, security, technology, and people-to-people exchanges. He described Cyprus as a close friend and key partner in the Mediterranean and the European Union.

Next, Modi will travel to Kananaskis, Canada, to attend the G7 Summit on June 16 and 17, at the invitation of Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney. The summit provides a platform for India to present its stance on pressing global issues such as energy security, technology cooperation, and innovation. The visit to Canada is notable as it is Modi's first since diplomatic ties between the two countries were strained over allegations relating to the killing of Khalistan separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar in Canada — claims India has

strongly denied. His attendance also quells speculation that he might skip the summit, a move that would have broken a six-year tradition.

The final leg of the tour takes PM Modi to Croatia on June 18, marking the first-ever visit by an Indian Prime Minister to the country. There, he will meet Croatian President Zoran Milanovic and Prime Minister Andrej Plenkovic to explore new opportunities for bilateral cooperation, building on centuries-old cultural connections.

The tour underscores India's commitment to deepening international partnerships and advancing counter-terrorism efforts globally.



Uttarakhand Suspends Char Dham Helicopter Services for Two Days After Fatal Crash

High-Level Probe Ordered

Dehradun, June 15, 2025: The Uttarakhand government has suspended all helicopter services on the Char Dham Yatra route for two days following a tragic crash near Guptkashi on Sunday morning. The accident involved a private chopper operated by Aryan Aviation Pvt Ltd and claimed the lives of all seven people on board, including the pilot.

The helicopter was returning from Kedarnath when it crashed under adverse weather conditions. In response to the incident, Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami convened an emergency meeting with top officials and announced immediate measures to enhance safety and accountability in heli services across the state.

"The safety of pilgrims is our top priority. Heli services will remain suspended for two days due to bad weather and to ensure a thorough review of safety protocols," the Chief Minister said. He ordered a high-level inquiry into the crash and emphasized that any negligence, regardless of position or authority, would be strictly punished.

CM Dhami also directed officials to formulate a stringent Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for helicopter operations in Uttarakhand. He stressed the urgent need for improved coordination and monitoring of aerial services, especially during the peak pilgrimage season.

To that end, the state will establish a Common Command and Coordination Centre in Dehradun. This centralized body will oversee helicopter operations and ensure real-time coordination among multiple stakeholders. The centre will include representatives from the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), Uttarakhand Civil Aviation Development Authority (UCADA), the State Disaster Management Department, and all private heli service providers.

"The lives of the people come first. There will be no compromise when it comes to safety," Dhami asserted, vowing comprehensive reforms to prevent such incidents in the future.

Asaduddin Owaisi urges urgent evacuation of 1700 Indians stranded in Iran, Iraq

Amid the rapidly deteriorating security situation in the Middle East following Israel's military strikes on Iran, All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) chief and Hyderabad MP Asaduddin Owaisi has called for the urgent evacuation of over 1,700 Indian nationals stranded in Iran and Iraq.

In a post on X (formerly Twitter) on Saturday, June 14, Owaisi highlighted the plight of 1,595 Indian students in Iran, including 140 medical students at Tehran University. He also said that 183 Indian pilgrims are currently stranded in Iraq due to escalating tensions and airspace closures.

"I request the Government of India to treat this as an emergency and coordinate an urgent evacuation," Owaisi appealed. He confirmed that he has already shared the details of those stranded with Anand Prakash, Joint Secretary (PAI) at the Ministry of External Affairs.

Owaisi also urged External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar and Telangana Chief Minister Anumula Revanth Reddy to act immediately to ensure the safety and safe return of these Indian citizens.

The call for evacuation follows Israel's launch of Operation Rising Lion on June 13, which targeted Iranian military and nuclear sites. The strikes reportedly resulted in the deaths of senior Iranian military officers, nuclear scientists, and civilians. In retaliation, Iran initiated Operation True Promise 3 in the early hours of June 14, firing over 100 missiles at Israeli targets, further escalating the conflict.

As a result of the hostilities, airspace over both Iran and Iraq has been restricted, significantly impacting commercial flight routes and complicating evacuation logistics. The tense situation has raised fears of wider regional instability, making the evacuation of Indian nationals an urgent humanitarian priority.

NIA Chargesheets Three in Punjab Police Post Grenade Attack Linked to Khalistani Terror Network

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has filed a chargesheet against three individuals in connection with the December 2024 grenade attack on a police post in Punjab's Shaheed Bhagat Singh (SBS) Nagar district. The attack has been linked to the banned Khalistan Zindabad Force (KZF), a designated terrorist organization with transnational networks.

The accused—Yugpreet Singh, Jaskaran Singh, and Harjot Singh, all residents of Rahon village in Punjab—have been charged under multiple sections of the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), the Explosive Substances Act, and other relevant laws. According to the NIA, the attack was part of a broader terror conspiracy to destabilize law enforcement and security structures in Punjab.

The agency's investigation revealed that Jagjit Singh Lahiri, also known as Jagga, a UKbased radical operative, played a key role in orchestrating the attack. Jagga allegedly radicalized Yugpreet Singh while he was in the United Kingdom and facilitated the transfer of over ₹4.36 lakh in terror funds through Canada-based sources.

With financial and logistical backing from foreign handlers, Yugpreet Singh recruited Jaskaran and Harjot. The trio received a grenade in November 2024 and carried out the attack during the night of December 1–2, 2024, targeting a Punjab Police post in an attempted arson and explosion.

The NIA has also expanded the scope of the investigation to include KZF chief Ranjit Singh, designated as an individual terrorist under Indian law, and other unidentified international operatives.

The attack is part of what the agency believes is a coordinated campaign by KZF to conduct terror strikes against law enforcement agencies and vital installations in Punjab. The NIA emphasized that further investigation is underway to dismantle the entire network and prevent future threats.







Pakistan Expresses Solidarity with Iran Amid Israel-Iran Conflict

PM Sharif's Message to Iranian **President**

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif conveyed Pakistan's strong support for Iran following recent Israeli attacks on Iranian nuclear and military sites. In a phone call on June 15, 2025, with Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian, Sharif condemned the Israeli strikes, describing them as "blatant provocations" that violate Iran's sovereignty and international law.

Israel's military offensive on Friday targeted several key Iranian nuclear and military facilities, resulting in the deaths of senior military commanders and nuclear scientists. Iran responded with retaliatory strikes, escalating tensions in the region.

During the conversation, Sharif emphasized Iran's right to self-defense under Article 51 of the UN Charter. He expressed Pakistan's unwavering solidarity with the "brotherly people of Iran" in the face of what he called unprovoked aggression by Israel.

Trump Denies U.S. Role in Iran Strike, Issues Strong Warning Amid Escalating Conflict

Amid intensifying hostilities between Israel and Iran, U.S. President Donald Trump has issued a firm statement distancing the United States from the latest Israeli airstrikes on Iran, while warning Tehran of devastating consequences if American forces are targeted.

Taking to his social media platform, Truth Social, President Trump clarified, "The U.S. had nothing to do with the attack on Iran tonight. If we are attacked in any way, shape or form by Iran, the full strength and might of the U.S. Armed Forces will come down on you at levels never seen before."

Trump's remarks come after Israel launched a largescale military operation, dubbed Operation Rising Lion, which targeted several Iranian military and nuclear sites. The Israeli Defense Forces (IDF) claimed the strikes were aimed at halting Iran's alleged nuclear weapons development. In retaliation, Iran launched multiple ballistic missiles at Israeli cities.

Germany, France, and UK Offer Immediate Nuclear Talks to Iran Amid Middle East Tensions

Germany, France, and the United Kingdom have offered to hold immediate negotiations with Iran regarding its nuclear program in a bid to ease escalating tensions in the Middle East. German Foreign Minister Johann Wadephul, currently visiting the region, emphasized the urgency of de-escalating the conflict between Israel and Iran through diplomatic engagement.

Speaking to German broadcaster ARD on Saturday, Wadephul expressed hope that Iran would accept the offer for talks, despite Tehran's previous reluctance to engage constructively. He stressed that resolving concerns over Iran's nuclear ambitions is crucial for achieving lasting peace and ensuring the safety of Israel, the wider region, and Europe. "The conflict will only end when pressure and influence are applied to both Iran and Israel from all sides," Wadephul said during his visit to Oman on Sunday. He added that there is a shared expectation that serious efforts must be made in the coming week to interrupt the ongoing spiral of violence.

When asked if he believed Iran's government might fall amid the crisis, Wadephul stated that he did not think Israel intended to bring down Tehran's administration. Turning to the humanitarian crisis in Gaza, Wadephul described the situation as "unacceptable" and called on Israel to allow unrestricted access for aid organizations.

Iran Accuses Israel of Sabotaging Nuclear **Talks Amid Rising Conflict**

Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi accused Israel of deliberately trying to derail ongoing nuclear negotiations with the United States as tensions between the two nations escalated sharply. The comments came after Israel launched deadly strikes on Iranian nuclear and military sites, killing several and sparking retaliatory missile attacks by Iran on Israeli territory.

Araghchi stated that Iran's missile barrages on Israel would cease only if Israel ended its military campaign against Iran. He emphasized that Iran's actions were purely in self-defense and that Tehran did not seek to expand the conflict to neighboring countries unless forced. However, he warned that Israeli strikes on the by attacking Iran's nuclear facili-



Iran and Qatar—were a dangerous provocation aimed at widening the war beyond Iranian borders.

The foreign minister condemned Israel for crossing a "new red line"

South Pars gas field—shared by ties, which he said was a blatant violation of international law. He further accused Israel of sabotaging the sixth round of Iran-US nuclear talks, which had been scheduled for Sunday but were postponed due to the recent escalations. Araghchi insisted that

Israel does not want a diplomatic resolution or an agreement on the nuclear issue.

Araghchi also accused the United States of backing Israel's military campaign, claiming Iran has solid evidence that American forces and bases supported Israel's attacks. He expressed skepticism over U.S. denials and called on Washington to condemn the Israeli strikes on Iran's nuclear sites to demonstrate true goodwill.

Finally, the Iranian minister criticized the United Nations Security Council for its perceived indifference toward Israel's attacks. He said Western nations have unfairly condemned Iran instead of Israel, despite Iran being the party whose sovereignty was violated.

'No Kings' Protest Sees Millions March Across U.S. Against **Trump Amid Tensions**

Massive crowds flooded streets, parks, and plazas across the United States on June 14, 2025, joining the widespread "No Kings" protests against President Donald Trump's policies. Demonstrators marched through downtown areas and small towns alike, blending chants against authoritarianism with calls to protect democracy and immigrant rights.

Organizers claimed that millions participated in hundreds of events nationwide. Governors urged calm, condemned violence, and some even deployed the National Guard ahead of the demonstrations. While most protests remained peaceful, isolated clashes occurred. In Los Angeles, police used tear gas and crowd-control munitions



to disperse protesters after the official event concluded. The city has been tense following federal immigration raids a

week earlier that ignited nationwide demonstrations. Portland officers also fired tear gas and projectiles to break

up a crowd protesting in front of a U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement building late into the evening.

Salt Lake City experienced a more serious incident when a shooting during a downtown march critically injured one person. Police detained three individuals, including a man believed to be the shooter, who was also wounded. Authorities said it was unclear if the attack was politically motivated, and that the shooter had been walking with the crowd.

Huge crowds marched, danced, and chanted in cities including New York, Denver, Chicago, Austin, and Los Angeles. Seattle hosted over 70,000 participants, marking its largest downtown rally in recent memory. Atlanta's event quickly reached venue capacity with thousands more listening outside. In Washington, D.C., about 200 protesters gathered near Logan Circle, chanting "Trump must go now." A giant puppet caricature of Trump wearing a crown and sitting on a golden toilet was wheeled through the crowd. Many carried American flags—some flying upside down as a distress signal—and Mexican flags were also seen, especially in Los Angeles.

The protests follow intense unrest after immigration enforcement raids and President Trump's order deploying the National Guard and Marines to Los Angeles, where protesters blocked freeways and set cars on fire. Despite the tension, the No Kings Coalition declared, "Across red states and blue, rural towns and cities, Americans stood in peaceful unity and made it clear: we don't do kings."

Oil Prices Surge Amid Middle East Tensions, **Global Stocks Slip**

Oil prices soared sharply on Friday as fears grew that Israel's recent attacks on Iranian nuclear and military sites could escalate, potentially disrupting the global crude supply and impacting the world economy. The surge in oil prices coincided with weakening stock markets worldwide, reflecting heightened investor caution.

In India, equity markets also fell sharply amid the global sell-off. The BSE Sensex declined 573.38 points, or 0.70%, closing at 81,118.60 after falling for the second consecutive day. On the NSE, the Nifty dropped 169.60 points, or 0.68%, to settle at 24,718.60. Weekly losses for the Sensex and Nifty stood at 1.30% and 1.13%, respectively.

Investors remain cautious as they await further developments in the Middle East, closely watching the delicate geopolitical situation and its potential impact on global energy markets and economic stability.

Rupee Slips 55 Paise to Close at 86.07 Against **US Dollar Amid Rising Oil Prices** and Global **Tensions**



The Indian rupee dropped sharply by 55 paise to f L close at 86.07 against the US dollar on June 13, 2025, pressured by surging global oil prices, escalating Middle East tensions, foreign fund outflows, and weak domestic equity markets.

Brent crude, the global oil benchmark, saw a steep rise of 7.27% to \$74.40 per barrel in futures trading, intensifying concerns over India's trade deficit and inflation. The spike came amid heightened geopolitical tensions after Israel's military strike on Iran's nuclear sites, which has rattled global markets.

At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 86.25, moved between 85.92 and 86.25 during the day, before settling at 86.07, down from 85.52 on the previous day. Forex traders noted that weak domestic stock markets and sustained foreign institutional investor (FII) selling further weighed on the rupee's performance.

Anil Kumar Bhansali, Head of Treasury and Executive Director at Finrex Treasury Advisors LLP, highlighted the fragility of the markets following the military conflict, saying, "It has taken one country's military strike on another to bring home the fragility of markets." He also pointed out that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) intervened to support the rupee but rising oil prices remain a significant challenge, as every \$10 increase in crude prices could widen the trade deficit by \$12 billion and push inflation higher by 50 basis points.

Meanwhile, domestic equity markets mirrored the negative sentiment. The BSE Sensex tumbled 573.38 points to 81,118.60, while the Nifty index fell 169.60 points to 24,718.60. Foreign institutional investors sold equities worth ₹3,831.42 crore on June 12, showing continued caution.

The dollar index, measuring the greenback's strength against six major currencies, rose 0.33% to 98.24, adding pressure on the rupee.

With ongoing geopolitical uncertainty and volatile oil prices, analysts expect the rupee to trade in a range between 85.75 and 86.50 in the coming days as markets await India's trade deficit data, scheduled for release soon.




