

ACB questions KTR for 8 hours in second round

Officials instruct him to remain available, hint at another summons

Ordered to submit all cell phones by June 18

Hyderabad: Eight hours of interrogation. Sixty questions. Only partial answers. Entire session recorded on video. A half-hour lunch break. Six officers. A tense grilling. Authorities ordered KTR to hand over his cell phones. In the end, they said: "You'll be called again, and you must appear without fail." This was the second round of questioning that former minister K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) underwent at the ACB office. As soon as he arrived, sources say KTR attempted to divert officials' attention with speculative questions like "Will I be arrested?" and "Should I be ready?" However, the officers pressed on with their questions.

Reportedly, KTR tried to evade several questions as they came in succession, but the investigators remained persistent. The ACB interrogation in the Formula E race case wrapped up after an 8-hour session. KTR, accompanied by his lawyer, reached the ACB office at Banjara Hills at 10 AM.

Top officials including DGP Vijay Kumar, Director Tarun Joshi, DSP Majid Khan, and Ritiraj were present for questioning. In this case, KTR is A1, former Municipal Administration Principal Secretary Arvind Kumar is A2, and HMDA Executive Engineer B.L.N. Reddy is also accused.

All three were previously questioned. This time, KTR was called again. The questioning was reportedly based on statements by Arvind Kumar and evidence collected by the ACB. Cross-questioning was done using documentary evidence obtained during the investigation.

Sources reveal that KTR was asked under what capacity he issued fund release orders when the Model Code of Conduct was in effect. The ACB officers used the statements of Arvind Kumar and B.L.N. Reddy to question him, as well as the testimony of Dan Kishore.

They probed into MoUs signed with contractors, and suspicious cash transfers. Why was ₹44 crore transferred without cabinet approval or Finance Department clearance? Why did Greenko withdraw from the Formula E race? The ACB also reportedly asked about the BRS party's use of electoral bonds. Out of 60 questions asked, officials say KTR answered only a few and dodged many. The entire session was video recorded, and if needed, the footage may be presented in the High Court. Since the responses didn't satisfy the officials, another round of questioning is expected.

KTR reportedly did not bring his phone along. Officials ordered him to submit the phone he is currently using, as well as those used during the Formula E event, by June 18.

Call me 30 times, I'll come 30 times

Before heading to the ACB office, KTR reached the BRS party office, met with leaders, and then proceeded for questioning. While addressing the media, he remarked, "Not three times—call me thirty times, and I'll still appear." He claimed this was all due to political vendetta by Revanth Reddy, and asserted he is not afraid of in-

After the interrogation, he returned to the BRS office and reiterated he wasn't afraid of going to jail—he'd treat it as a rest. He alleged that since Revanth Reddy had been to jail, he now wants KTR jailed as well. KTR said no new questions were asked—just a repeat of earlier ones—and claimed that the government seems determined to trap him and send him to prison under the pretense of investigation.

Party Office Locked, Leaders Arrested

Following KTR's summons, a large number of party leaders gathered at the party office, raising slogans and attempting to go to the ACB office in solidarity. Police took several leaders into custody and, unable to control the crowd, locked the party office to



prevent anyone from entering. Tight Security at ACB Office

At the ACB office, strict restrictions were enforced. Barricades were erected, and a 50-meter restriction zone was declared. Even media personnel were not allowed into the vicinity. Only vehicles belonging to KTR and his lawyer were permitted entry. Harish Rao Meets Legal Team

While KTR was being questioned, Harish Rao met with legal experts including R.S. Praveen, to prepare for the possibility of further summons or arrest.

Hyderabad: MLC K. Kavitha's sudden political silence has triggered intense discussion across the Telangana political landscape. Once a prominent voice of dissent within the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), her retreat has raised serious questions about her future in the party and the direction of the BRS itself.

Kavitha, daughter of BRS supremo K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), had recently taken a strong stance by openly criticizing the leaders surrounding her father. She went on record saying "KCR is God, but there are demons around him," expressing deep dissatisfaction with the current state of affairs within the party. Her strong words positioned her as a symbol of rebellion within the party. However, her abrupt and prolonged silence since then is being viewed as both surprising and strategic.

This unexpected silence—especially at a time when several senior leaders are refraining from public statements—is fueling speculation. Political observers are asking: is Kavitha's silence a deliberate strategy? Or has she bowed under internal pressure? Did her determination crumble before her father's stubborn leadership?

Her decision to step back from criticism has also led to questions about whether she is doing so out of fear of legal complications or due to calculated political planning. There is also speculation that party insiders may have acted to erode her confidence and isolate her within the BRS structure.

Previously seen as a strong and independent force within the party, Kavitha's retreat has left a visible void. Her silence, after having loudly questioned the direction of the party, has transformed her from a vocal rebel into a guiet observer. Some believe she is maintaining silence out of respect for her father, while others suspect that the investigations and legal scrutiny she is facing may be weighing heavily on her

Whatever the reasons may be, Kavitha's current silence has become a subject of widespread debate, leaving many wondering: what lies ahead for her within the BRS—and what will be her next political move?

TPCC Chief Mahesh Goud to Depose in Phone Tapping Case

- TPCC chief summoned to Jubilee Hills ACP office
- Allegedly victim of phone tapping during 2023 elections
- Police term his testimony as crucial to the investigation

The investigation into the high-profile phone tapping case has reached a key turning point, with Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC)

president and MLC Mahesh Kumar Goud set to record his statement before the police. He is expected to appear at the Jubilee Hills ACP office at 11 a.m. tomorrow in compliance with a police

Mahesh Goud, who served as TPCC working president during the 2023 Telangana

Assembly elections, is said to be among the political figures whose phone was allegedly tapped by the previous government. The tapping reportedly occurred at the peak of the election campaign, raising serious concerns about abuse of power and violation of privacy.

As the current PCC president, Mahesh Goud's statement is seen as a crucial piece in the puzzle. According to sources, he has assured full cooperation to the police and is prepared to provide all relevant details concerning the alleged surveillance.

The phone tapping allegations have rocked Telangana politics in recent months, with several suspects already questioned by the authorities. Police have also recorded statements from multiple alleged victims, and Mahesh Goud's testimony is expected to further strengthen the ongoing probe.

Political observers believe this development could open up new

leads in the case, especially if Goud confirms any direct or circumstantial evidence of illegal surveillance during the 2023 elections. The incident has already triggered heated debates in the state's political circles, with the Congress targeting the previous regime over alleged misuse of state machinery.

Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu announced that within the next nine days, the complete Rythu Bharosa assistance will be credited directly into the accounts of farmers cultivating land across Telangana. Addressing the Rythu Nestham Sabha held at the Agriculture University in Rajendranagar on Monday, Bhatti hailed this as a historic moment for the state's farming community.

He stated that every acre under cultivation—totalling 1.49 crore acres—would re-

ceive Rs. 12,000, irrespective of the number of acres a farmer owns. "This is being done on the sole command of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. No previous government has taken such a bold and pro-farmer step," Bhatti said.

He further added that even the landless poor engaged in agriculture will receive Rs. 12,000 annually per family under the Indiramma Aatmiya Bharosa Scheme.

Despite tight financial conditions, Bhatti said the Congress government is determined to stand by farmers and is mobilizing Rs. 70,000 crore every year—totaling Rs. 3.5 lakh crore over five years for agriculture and farmer welfare. "This government is the true savior of farmers," he declared.

Criticizing the previous TRS regime, Bhatti said they failed to compensate farmers for crop losses and neglected crop insurance altogether. "They roamed the state seeking votes with fake promises. Today they're making noise like evil spirits. Don't allow them into



your villages—chase them away," he told the crowd.

He noted that the current government has already waived Rs. 21,000 crore in farm loans, a feat unmatched by any other state in India. "Without stopping any previous scheme, we are adding new ones. In just a few months, we've deposited Rs. 13,088 crore under Rythu Bharosa and Rs. 1,199 crore as paddy bonus," he said.

To ensure uninterrupted farming operations, the Finance Department has also released Rs. 16,691 crore to supply free electricity to 29 lakh agricultural pump sets. Additionally, Rs. 11,000 crore has been spent on speeding up irrigation projects.

Bhatti emphasized that the Congress party's legacy is deeply rooted in agriculture. "Congress means farmers, and farmers mean Congress. This government will always stay committed to the welfare of the farming community," he concluded.

Telangana Signs MoUs With Top NGOs To Upgrade Govt Schools

Kishan Reddy inspects Gandhi Hospital amid rising COVID cases

Union Minister and BJP Telangana State President G. Kishan Reddy held a media conference at the BJP state office, sharply criticizing the Congress government in Telangana for delaying local body elections. He also outlined key national initiatives, including the digital caste census and BJP's strategy for empowering rural

Kishan Reddy stated that the Central Government has officially notified the caste census to be held alongside the such exercise since independence. The census, scheduled for completion by March 1, 2027, will be fully digital, involving 34 lakh enumerators and 1.34 lakh supervisory staff. He added that a secure app is under development to ensure the safety of personal data. The BJP leader highlighted that this comprehensive census will be the first to include a detailed BC enumeration, which is expected to lay the foundation for new welfare and development policies.

TPCC chief Slams Ponguleti Over **Reservation Remarks**

TPCC President and Minister Mahesh Kumar Goud has expressed serious displeasure over fellow minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy's remarks regarding reservations in local body elections. Mahesh strongly objected to Ponguleti's public statement, stating that such sensitive issues should be discussed internally within the party or the cabinet before being disclosed to the media. Mahesh Kumar Goud, who also holds a cabinet position in the Telangana government, questioned the propriety of one minister commenting on matters pertaining to another minister's department. He emphasized that it was improper for Ponguleti to speak on reservations without collective discussion. "It is not right to go directly to the media on such issues without even consulting the cabinet," Mahesh said.

He further noted that matters currently under judicial consideration should be handled with extreme caution. "Ministers should refrain from making statements on topics that fall under the jurisdiction of the courts. Public comments on such issues can mislead people and weaken the government's stance," he cautioned.

Mahesh Kumar Goud stressed the importance of discipline among ministers and suggested that ministers should stick to matters within their respective departments. "Making statements without full knowledge or without discussion can spark unnecessary controversies and embarrass the government," he said, urging ministers to avoid overstepping boundaries in public

He concluded by reminding his cabinet colleagues that collective responsibility and cabinet discipline are fundamental to governance, and that all sensitive matters must be discussed internally before being made public.

High Court Rejects Kaushik Reddy's Plea in Threat Case

BRS MLA accused of demanding ₹50 lakh from granite trader

BRS MLA Padi Kaushik Reddy faced a legal setback as the Telangana High Court dismissed his petition seeking to quash a criminal case filed against him. The court ruled that the case, which involves serious allegations, must proceed as per legal procedures. The case stems from a complaint lodged by Umadevi, wife of a granite trader named Manoj, who operates a quarry in Vangapalli village of Kamalapuram mandal. In her complaint to the Subedari police, she alleged that MLA Kaushik Reddy had demanded ₹50 lakhs from her husband and issued threats in connection with the quarry operations.

Following the complaint, police registered a case and began an investigation. In response, Kaushik Reddy approached the High Court seeking dismissal of the case, calling the allegations baseless and politically motivated. However, the court, after hearing the arguments, refused to entertain the plea and made it clear that the case would not be dismissed at this stage. This ruling comes as a blow to the MLA, who was hoping for immediate relief from the legal proceedings. The High Court's decision effectively allows the investigation to continue, keeping the case against Kaushik Reddy active. Political observers note that the incident could have broader implications for the BRS leader, particularly at a time when legal accountability is under increased public

MLAs File PIL on ₹10,000 Cr Land Encroachment in Khajaguda

High Court issues notices to officials, next hearing in two weeks

Four MLAs—Yennam Srinivas Reddy, Rajesh Reddy, Anirudh Reddy, and Murali Nayak—have filed a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) in the Telangana High Court alleging large-scale encroachment of valuable government land in Khajaguda, Serilingampalli mandal. A hearing on the matter was conducted on Monday, where senior advocate Rikudu Prabhakar presented detailed arguments on behalf of the petitioners.

The petition claims that 27.18 acres of government land under survey numbers 119 and 122 were illegally encroached upon by altering the survey classification to "Poramboku" (wasteland). Advocate Prabhakar argued that this land is valued at approximately ₹10,000 crore and alleged that permissions for building construction were granted despite its disputed nature.

He stated that the Rangareddy District Collector issued a No Objection Certificate (NOC) in 2023, following which the GHMC gave clearance for massive construction activity. Currently, eight high-rise towers with 47 floors each are under construction at the site. The petitioners claim these buildings are situated within the Full Tank Level (FTL) limits involved in the construction. of Khajaguda Cheruvu, a violation of environmen- The matter has been adjourned for further hearing tal and land norms.



Additionally, the PIL raises concerns over a ready mix concrete plant operating within 150 meters of a private school, which the advocate claimed is severely polluting the environment and affecting the health and safety of students in the vicinity.

Advocate Prabhakar urged the court to instruct the government to reclaim the encroached land and stop the ongoing construction activities. After hearing the arguments, the Telangana High Court issued notices to the State Government, the Revenue Chief Secretary, Rangareddy Collector, GHMC, HMDA, and private firm Hydra, which is allegedly

42 Medical Shops Booked for Violations in Veterinary Drug Sales

The Drugs Control Administration (DCA) of Telangana has detected serious violations in 42 medical shops during a special drive conducted on June 16, 2025, targeting veterinary and pet clinics and attached medical shops across the GHMC area and neighboring districts. The raids were carried out in Hyderabad, Ranga Reddy, Medchal-Malkajgiri, and Sangareddy districts with a specific focus on verifying the sale and storage of veterinary drugs. The inspections uncovered numerous discrepancies, prompting the department to issue Show Cause Notices to the violators and initiate strict departmental action. According to DCA officials, several medical shops were found violating key norms under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940.

These included the sale of prescription sale of veterinary drugs pose a serious veterinary drugs without valid prescriptions, dispensing medicines without issuing bills, and stocking expired drugs along with saleable stock. In many cases, medical shops were operating without a registered pharmacist and failing to maintain proper sales and purchase records. Notable violations included:

· Sale of veterinary drugs without pre-

scription from a certified veterinarian. · Absence of billing and failure to main-

tain sales/purchase registers. · Dispensing prescription medicines with-

out a qualified pharmacist. · Storage of expired drugs with usable stock. Mixing veterinary and human

drugs in the same storage areas. The DCA stressed that improper use and

risk, especially with regard to the growing global threat of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR). Officials highlighted that the indiscriminate use of antibiotics in food-producing animals like cattle, poultry, and fish can accelerate AMR, which has critical public health implications. The department reiterated its appeal to

medical shops to strictly follow regulatory guidelines to ensure the quality, safety, and efficacy of veterinary medicines. They also urged the public to report any illegal drug-related activities or violations in veterinary medical shops and clinics. From 129 Million to 75 Million: **Understanding India's Poverty Recount**



India continues to hold the unenviable people within a year raises questions distinction of having the largest number of poor people in the world, even as it competes with nations like Japan and Germany to become the third-largest economy globally. The World Bank's latest poverty update has significantly revised India's poverty numbers, sparking widespread discussion on the accuracy and implications of these figures.

In its 2024 report, the World Bank estimated that India had 129 million people living in extreme poverty, defined as surviving on less than \$2.15 per day (2017 PPP). However, the recent 2025 update drastically lowered this figure to 75.2 million, based on a higher poverty line of \$3 per day (2021 PPP). This treme poverty benchmarks of \$2.15 and

about the methodology and assumptions behind these statistics.


The key reason for this revision is the World Bank's acceptance of India's new consumption survey conducted in 2022-2023, which replaced the previous 2016-2017 survey deemed unreliable. India's updated methodology, known as the Modified Mixed Recall Period (MMRP), significantly reduces reported poverty levels compared to the older Uniform Recall Period (URP) method.

While the government has touted this drop as a major success, the World Bank cautions that the traditional exsudden drop of nearly 54 million poor \$3 per day are not fully applicable to

middle-income countries like India. Instead, a more realistic poverty threshold for such nations is \$6.85 per day (2017 PPP), which accounts for modern essentials like electricity, healthcare, and digital access.

At this higher poverty line, India's poor population remains staggering—over 1.17 billion people or 82% of its population in 2022. This means India still has the highest absolute number of poor people globally, surpassing even Sub-Saharan Africa. In summary, while India's extreme poverty figures have been revised downward, broader poverty challenges remain immense, underscoring the complexity of measuring poverty in a rapidly developing nation.

A Decade Later, Telangana's Battle for Krishna River Water Continues



More than ten years after Telangana split from Andhra Pradesh, the state's struggle to secure its rightful share of Krishna river water remains unresolved, exposing deep political and administrative challenges.

The Krishna river, flowing through Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, and Karnataka, is central to this dispute. Telangana and Andhra The Centre established the Krishna Pradesh share two major dams on the river: the Srisailam and Nagarjunasagar projects. The Srisailam dam regulates about 811 thousand million cubic feet (TMC) of water, with Telangana allocated 299 TMC and Andhra Pradesh receiving the remainder. At Nagarjunasagar, which holds 285 TMC, Telangana's share is 90 TMC.

Despite clear allocations, Andhra Pradesh has frequently been accused Water issues are deeply intertwined of exceeding its water share, hurting Telangana's agricultural and de-

2023, tensions escalated when Andhra Pradesh authorities released over 2,000 cusecs of water from the Nagarjunasagar dam—beyond its entitlement—while Telangana was focused on elections. The incident sparked a police standoff, highlighting the fragile nature of water sharing between the two states.

River Management Board (KRMB) to oversee the equitable distribution of water between Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. The KRMB, comprising officials from both states and the central government, was expected to settle disputes and ensure compliance with the agreed 66:34 water-sharing ratio. Yet, a decade on, its effectiveness remains limited as disputes persist.

Is America Still Worth It? Indian **Students Begin Looking Elsewhere**

For decades, American universities have been the gold standard for Indian students seeking world-class education and global career opportunities. Names like Sundar Pichai, Raghuram Rajan, Indra Nooyi, and Amartya Sen owe a part of their global success to the academic grounding they received in the US. Indian students have not only studied at top American institutions, but also contributed to them through philanthropy and research.

However, that long-standing appeal is now under pressure. The Trump administration's crackdown on academic institutions—citing antisemitism, "anti-white racism," and political activism—has created a hostile environment for both universities and international students. Elite campuses like Harvard and Columbia are facing political heat, while US embassies have halted student visa interviews, citing enhanced social media scrutiny. Indian applicants must now disclose years of online activity, leaving many uncertain about what could jeopardize their future.

For Indian families, where sending a child to the US is often a longterm investment, this is more than a policy change — it's a dream deferred. The US had over 3.3 lakh Indian students in 2023, making them the largest international student group. They contribute significantly to STEM fields and university funding. But the political message is clear: global talent is no longer welcome without conditions.

This has already sparked a shift. A 28% drop in Indian student enrolments is forecast for 2025, with more turning to the UK, Canada, and Australia. These countries may not offer the same prestige, but they aren't undermining their universities or politicizing student mobility. India, in turn, finds an opportunity in this disruption. With institutions like IITs, IIMs, and emerging private universities like Ashoka, India can become an academic hub—if it invests in research, academic freedom, and global partnerships.

The world may see fewer Indian success stories shaped in America in the coming years. But if India seizes this moment, it could become the new destination for intellectual ambition — not just for Indians, but for global talent disillusioned with America's shifting values.

Is Airbus Safer Than Boeing? The Truth Behind the Debate



Last week's crash of a Boeing 787 Dreamliner in Ahmedabad shook the aviation world and reignited fears about Boeing's safety. For Air India, it was a devastating blow to their brand revival. For Boeing, it reopened painful wounds from the 737 MAX disasters, which severely damaged its reputation due to flawed software and safety shortcuts. But does this mean Airbus is safer?

Globally, Boeing and Airbus dominate the aircraft manufacturing industry, shaping air travel for decades. Between 2013 and 2022, Boeing had 60 accidents and Airbus 50, but Boeing operates more planes. When adjusted for flight numbers, their fatality rates are almost identical. Aviation expert Richard Aboulafia sums it up: statistically, flying on either is equally safe. The plane itself is rarely the problem.

Boeing's recent troubles are not just technical—they're moral. The 737 MAX crashes in Indonesia and Ethiopia, caused by faulty software, revealed a corporate culture prioritizing profits over safety. Airbus hasn't been perfect either, with incidents like the 2009 Air France A330 crash and a \$4 billion corruption settlement. As one insider put it, "Airbus sins in boardrooms; Boeing sins in cockpits."

Beyond safety, Boeing and Airbus are geopolitical rivals tied to the US and Europe respectively, fueling trade disputes and lobbying battles. Despite Boeing's rough decade, including the 737 MAX crisis and other incidents, its 2023 record was strong, with just 11 non-fatal accidents in over 31 million flights.

Flying remains incredibly safe: in 2023, there was one major accident for every 5.3 million flights. Most accidents stem from pilot error, not plane design. Modern aircraft, including Boeing's Dreamliner and Airbus's A320, are marvels built with multiple redundancies.

So while emotions flare after crashes, data shows commercial aviation is safer than ever. The choice between Boeing or Airbus is often less about safety and more about perception. In reality, flying any modern aircraft means trusting an industry that's a technological wonder, despite its flaws.







PM Modi Conferred Cyprus' Highest Civilian Honour: A Proud Moment for India

MK Stalin Renews Demand for Tamil as Official Language in Supreme Court and Madras HC

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin has reiterated the demand for Tamil to be recognized as an official language for conducting arguments in the Supreme Court and the Madras High Court. Speaking at a wedding in Thanjavur, Stalin emphasized the cultural and historical significance of Tamil and called for greater support from the judiciary to promote its use in court proceedings.

Recalling the legacy of the Dravidian movement and DMK founder CN Annadurai, Stalin highlighted the 1967 reforms that recognized self-respect marriages—secular unions without religious rituals—as a major milestone for social justice. He also praised the contributions of former Chief Minister Karunanidhi, who secured classical language ("Semmozhi") status for Tamil.

"We are proud to be Tamizhars," Stalin said. "It is time the judiciary recognizes Tamil as a court language. Kalaignar even passed a resolution for this demand during his tenure." He appealed to the judges present at the event to support the ongoing efforts to include Tamil in judicial proceedings.

Stalin cited recent instances of progress, such as Tamil speeches delivered by Supreme Court Justices R Mahadevan and MM Sundresh, as evidence of growing acceptance of the language in legal spaces. However, he noted that while thousands of court judgments have been translated into Tamil, the language is still not allowed for arguments in court.

According to data shared by Union Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal in the Rajya Sabha, over 2,500 Supreme Court and nearly 900 Madras High Court judgments had been translated into Tamil as of September 2024. In a broader cultural appeal, Stalin also encouraged young couples to have more children, expressing concern that Tamil Nadu might lose parliamentary representation due to declining population growth.



460 Sprinkler Machines With Smog Guns To Hit Delhi Streets Soon: Rekha Gupta

In a major initiative to curb air pollution, Delhi Chief Minister Rekha Gupta announced the deployment of 460 water sprinkler machines integrated with anti-smog guns across the city. This move is part of a comprehensive dust control and cleanliness plan approved by the Cabinet, aimed at improving air quality and reducing pollution-related health risks in the capital.

CM Gupta stated that over 1,000 water sprinklers will operate year-round—excluding the monsoon season—to consistently suppress dust and maintain cleaner streets. Each of Delhi's Assembly constituencies will soon receive advanced air pollution control equipment.

The announcement followed a demonstration at the Delhi Secretariat, showcasing high-tech machines including electric and CNG mechanical road sweeping machines, litter pickers, and water jetting units. The Chief Minister was joined by Environment Minister Manjinder Singh Sirsa and senior officials from the Environment Department.

CM Gupta emphasized that air pollution, particularly from road dust, remains a severe threat to public health. "To tackle this, the Delhi government has made special budgetary provisions for advanced street-cleaning machinery," she said.

The plan also includes the deployment of 70 mechanical road sweeping machines, 70 litter picker machines, along with water tankers and dust dump vehicles. All these machines will be outfitted with modern technologies such as GPS tracking, CCTV cameras, AQI (Air Quality Index) monitors, video analytics, mobile app integration, and IoT sensors for real-time monitoring and optimal performance.

A central control room will oversee and coordinate the operations of these machines to ensure they are deployed efficiently and effectively.

"This initiative is a step toward a cleaner, healthier Delhi," said Gupta, underlining the government's commitment to long-term environmental management and sustainable urban living.

India Begins Relocating Citizens in Iran, Considers Exit Routes from Israel Amid Escalating Conflict

As tensions escalate between Iran and Israel, the Indian government has begun relocating its citizens in both countries to safer areas, though full-scale evacuations have not yet been initiated. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) is closely monitoring the situation, with External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar in regular contact with regional counterparts.

In Iran, the Indian embassy in Tehran has coordinated with local authorities to shift citizens—especially students—from highrisk areas. Buses have begun transporting students from universities such as Tehran University of Medical Sciences, Islamic Azad University, and Iran University of Medical Sciences to safer cities. A similar effort is being prepared for students at Shahid Beheshti University and Urmia University, near Iran's border. Over 7,500 Indian students are currently studying in Iran, and the embassy has urged them to leave Tehran using the arranged transport.

Meanwhile, in Israel, where airspace has

been completely shut down due to daily aerial attacks, Indian citizens are being advised to move toward land border crossings with Jordan and Egypt. Embassy officials in Tel Aviv have conducted Zoom calls, issued advisories, and are guiding citizens—many of whom are recent migrant workers—on exit options. The Indian population in Israel has grown to around 25,000 following a surge in skilled labour recruitment.

India has also coordinated with Armenian authorities to facilitate border crossings from Iran, particularly at Agarak. While routes to Turkiye and Azerbaijan remain technically open, they are less favored due to strained relations following Operation Sindoor.

The Indian embassies in Tehran and Tel Aviv have launched registration drives via Google forms and are maintaining communication with citizens through hotlines and social media. The government continues to assess evacuation needs, emphasizing caution and limited movement.







"He's Enemy Number One": Israeli PM **Says Iran Wants To Kill Donald Trump**

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has alleged that Iran's Islamic regime actively sought to assassinate former U.S. President Donald Trump, labeling him "enemy number one" due to his aggressive stance against Tehran's nuclear ambitions.

Speaking to Fox News, Netanyahu said, "They want to kill him. He's enemy number one. He's a decisive leader who refused to appease Iran." Netanyahu praised Trump's decision to withdraw from the 2015 nuclear agreement and his role in eliminating top Iranian general Qasem Soleimani. "He made it clear — no nuclear weapons for Iran, no uranium enrichment. That kind of clarity is why they fear him," Netanyahu said.

Netanyahu also claimed he himself has been targeted, citing a missile strike that narrowly



missed his home and entered through a bedroom window. Referring to Trump as his "junior partner" in confronting Iran's nuclear capabilities, he underscored the personal risks leaders face when standing up to Tehran.

The Israeli Prime Minister described the threat from Iran as pecially not one the size of Isra-

ations in history." The offensive, he claimed, has significantly set back Iran's nuclear and missile development programs. Iran has retaliated with a wave of ballistic missile strikes targeting Israeli cities, though many were intercepted by air defenses. Netanyahu reiterated that Israel's

Iran's Supreme Leader **Hiding in Bunker as** Israeli Airstrikes Kill **Top IRGC Officials**

In a dramatic escalation of the regional conflict, Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and his family have reportedly taken shelter in an underground bunker in northeastern Tehran amid intense Israeli airstrikes, according to The Times of Israel. The strikes follow heightened tensions and retaliatory attacks between the two countries.

Iranian state media confirmed that the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) intelligence chief, Brigadier General Mohammad Kazemi, his deputy Hassan Mohaqiq, and a third intelligence officer, Mohsen Bagheri, were killed in the Israeli strike in Tehran.

The strikes mark a significant military operation by Israel, with the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) claiming it launched an "extensive" wave of airstrikes targeting Iran's weapons manufacturing infrastructure. The IDF said the offensive focused on facilities linked to the IRGC, its Quds Force, and other armed forces installations. "Numerous weapons production sites across Iran were targeted," the military said in a statement.

Khamenei reportedly relocated to the Lavizan bunker shortly after the strikes began. He had also used the same shelter during Iranian offensives against Israel in April and October 2024. According to Israeli sources cited by The Times of Israel, Israel intentionally refrained from targeting Khamenei directly during the initial phase of its operation, in an apparent bid to give him a final chance to abandon Iran's uranium enrichment efforts.

Meanwhile, the conflict continues to have repercussions inside Israel. Magen David Adom, Israel's emergency medical service, reported eight injuries following the latest Iranian missile attack. In Haifa, one person was moderately injured and six others sustained light injuries. Another individual was lightly wounded in Kiryat Gat. Additionally, several people were treated for acute anxiety after missile impacts.

The IDF also revealed that Iran launched over 100 unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) toward Israel, all of which were successfully intercepted. Amid these developments, Iranian media, quoting IRGClinked Tasnim News Agency, reported that Iranian forces discovered a secret three-story Israeli drone manufacturing facility operating inside Iran, though the claim remains unverified.

Tensions remain at a boiling point as the region braces for further conflict.



Germany, France, and **UK Offer Immediate Nuclear Talks to Iran Amid Middle East Tensions**

Germany, France, and the United Kingdom have offered to hold immediate negotiations with Iran regarding its nuclear program in a bid to ease escalating tensions in the Middle East. German Foreign Minister Johann Wadephul, currently visiting the region, emphasized the urgency of de-escalating the conflict between Israel and Iran through diplomatic engagement.

Speaking to German broadcaster ARD on Saturday, Wadephul expressed hope that Iran would accept the offer for talks, despite Tehran's previous reluctance to engage constructively. He stressed that resolving concerns over Iran's nuclear ambitions is crucial for achieving lasting peace and ensuring the safety of Israel, the wider region, and Europe.

"The conflict will only end when pressure and influence are applied to both Iran and Israel from all sides," Wadephul said during his visit to Oman on Sunday. He added that there is a shared expectation that serious efforts must be made in the coming week to interrupt the ongoing spiral of violence.

When asked if he believed Iran's government might fall amid the crisis, Wadephul stated that he did not think Israel intended to bring down Tehran's administration.

Turning to the humanitarian crisis in Gaza, Wadephul described the situation as "unacceptable" and called on Israel to allow unrestricted access for aid organizations. He highlighted the severe hunger and suffering of civilians in the enclave and urged an end to their plight.

Wadephul also blamed Hamas for sparking the conflict and insisted that the Islamist group must release hostages it has held since militants launched attacks on Israel in October 2023. The offer by Germany, France, and the UK for renewed nuclear talks signals a push by European powers to bring diplomacy back to the forefront amid a volatile and dangerous regional conflict.

PM Modi Makes Historic First Visit To Cyprus, **Gets Warm Welcome**

India's Exports Rise 2.8% in **May; Trade Deficit Narrows** to \$6.6 Billion

Iperformance showed positive momentum in May with 2025, combined merchandise services exports reaching \$71.12 billion, a 2.77% year-on-year increase, according to data from the Union Commerce Ministry released on

June 16. In May 2024, the total exports stood at \$69.20 billion.

While merchandise exports dipped slightly from \$39.59 billion in May 2024 to \$38.73 billion in May 2025, services exports surged from \$29.61 billion to \$32.39 billion during the same period — an encouraging sign of India's growing strength in its services sector.

On the import side, India brought in goods and services worth \$77.75 billion, marginally lower than \$78.55 billion in May last year. This helped narrow the trade deficit for the month to \$6.62 billion, down from \$9.35 billion a year earlier — signaling a healthier trade balance.

For the fiscal year so far (April-May 2025), total exports stood at \$142.43 billion, marking a 5.75% increase year-on-year. Imports during the same period also grew, rising 6.52% from \$149.81 billion to \$157.57 billion. This brought the two-month trade deficit to \$17.14 billion, compared to \$15.12 billion during the same period in 2024.

India's exports for the full fiscal year 2024-25 had already hit an all-time high of \$824.9 billion, surpassing the government's target of \$800 billion. This reflected a 6.01% growth from \$778.1 billion in 2023–24. Of this, services exports contributed \$387.5 billion, a 13.6% jump, while merchandise exports rose marginally to \$437.42 billion.

Despite the record export numbers, India's total trade deficit widened to \$94.26 billion in 2024-25, up from \$78.1 billion the previous

Government initiatives, particularly the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes, appear to be supporting export growth across sectors like electronics, helping boost global competitiveness and attract foreign investment.

Interestingly, market sentiment is optimistic — prediction market platform Probo currently places a 45% probability on India reaching \$950 billion in exports in FY 2025-26, signaling strong expectations from the trade and investment community.

SBI Slashes Lending and Deposit Rates After RBI's 50-Basis Point Rate Cut

m ollowing}$ the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) surprise 50-basis point policy rate cut on June 6, the State Bank of India (SBI) — the country's largest lender — has reduced its lending and deposit rates, bringing welcome relief to borrowers.

With effect from June 15, 2025, SBI's Repo Linked Lending Rate (RLLR) has been slashed by 50 basis points to 7.75%, while its External Benchmark Based Lending Rate (EBLR) has also been reduced by the same margin — from 8.65% to 8.15%. This move will result in cheaper loans for both new and existing customers across segments like housing, auto, and personal finance.

The reduction comes as a direct response to the RBI's recent monetary policy decision, where the benchmark repo rate was lowered from 6% to 5.5%. The decision, supported by five out of six members of the RBI's Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), aims to revive eco-

Additionally, the RBI cut the Cash Reserve Ratio (CRR) by 100 basis points to 3%, injecting an estimated ₹2.5 lakh crore into the banking system, increasing liquidity ahead of the year-end.

In tandem with lending rate cuts, SBI also revised its fixed deposit (FD) rates

downward by 25 basis points across various maturities for deposits up to ₹3 crore. For example:

Vehicle Sales Mixed in May: Passenger Vehicle Wholesales Dip Slightly, Two-Wheelers Up

Tndia's automobile sector witnessed **■** mixed performance in May 2025, with passenger vehicle wholesales registering a slight dip, while two-wheeler dispatches saw modest growth, according to data released by the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM).

Domestic passenger vehicle (PV) wholesales — which include cars, utility vehicles, and vans — stood at 3,44,656 units, marginally down by 0.8% compared to 3,47,492 units in May 2024. The dip, though not sharp, reflects sluggish consumer sentiment, supply-side constraints, and a possible delay in purchase decisions amid expectations of upcoming new model launches and discounts.

In contrast, two-wheeler sales in the domestic market showed signs of recovery. Dispatches from manufacturers to dealerships rose 2.2%, reaching 16,55,927 units in May 2025, compared to



16,20,084 units in the same month last year. The increase is attributed to strong rural demand, easing input costs, and higher mobility needs driven by schools and offices reopening at full scale.

However, three-wheeler sales — a critical segment for last-mile transport declined 3.3%, dropping to 53,942 units from 55,763 units a year earlier. Indus-

try analysts point to elevated fuel prices, tighter financing conditions, and increased competition from electric three-wheelers as contributing factors behind the slowdown.

Despite the mixed trend across vehicle categories, overall vehicle wholesales across all segments rose by 1.8%, reaching 20,12,969 units in May 2025, compared to 19,76,674 units in May 2024. This slight uptick suggests a gradual recovery in the broader automotive sector, though growth remains uneven.

SIAM officials noted that while the domestic auto industry continues to navigate challenges such as fluctuating raw material prices, inflationary pressures, and global supply chain disruptions, the medium-term outlook remains cautiously optimistic — especially with expectations of policy support, better monsoon prospects, and festive season demand in the coming quarters.







Air India Crash: Netizens Spot Possible **RAT** Deployment as Investigation **Probes What Went Wrong**

The tragic crash of Air India Flight AI171. l en route from Ahmedabad to London, has left the world in mourning after all 241 passengers on board were confirmed dead. The Boeing 787 Dreamliner went down shortly after takeoff, marking the first fatal accident involving this aircraft model and triggering an urgent investigation into what caused the disaster.

While authorities continue to examine the aircraft's black box, theories are swirling online as netizens and experts alike analyze video footage of the crash. A prominent theory gaining traction involves the suspected deployment of the RAT (Ram Air Turbine) — a small emergency turbine that activates automatically in case of critical system failures.

A YouTube analysis by Captain Steve Scheibner, a former US Navy pilot and aviation analyst, has fueled the RAT theory. Initially skeptical of an engine failure due to the absence of smoke, fire, or sparks, Scheibner revised his stance affrom crash footage.

On the Boeing 787, the RAT deploys in three extreme situations: electrical system failure, hydraulic system failure, or dual



engine failure. Scheibner now strongly leans toward the dual engine failure theory, stating, "The RAT's presence points to a catastrophic systems breakdown most likely both engines failed."

She added, "It means a lot to me. I'm a good example that even at my age, you can still win big trophies. I'm super proud of myself."

Maria's journey to the title was nothing short of remarkable. En route to the final, she defeated four top-20 players, including Karolina Muchova, Elena Rybakina, and Madison Keys, showcasing her grit and grass-court expertise.

This marks Maria's fourth WTA title overall, having previously claimed titles on grass in Mallorca (2018) and back-to-back victories on clay in Bogota (2022 and 2023). A former Wimbledon semifinalist, Maria is known for her unique playing style and tenacity, making her a fan favorite, especially on grass courts.

With this victory, Tatjana Maria will soar to World No. 43 in the updated rankings on Monday, just in time for another potential deep run at Wimbledon 2025.
