UNENDING HONEYMOON FOR AP EMPLOYEES, WHO ARE RESIDENTS OF HYDERABAD

The Persistent Burden of Employee Incentives

Amaravati: The Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act of 2014 bifurcated the erstwhile state into Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, designating Hyderabad as the joint capital for both states for 10 years, until June 2, 2024. During this period, Andhra Pradesh was permitted to use Hyderabad's Secretariat and government offices while developing its new capital in Amaravati. However, with the transition to a temporary Secretariat in Amaravati, over 8,200 Secretariat and Heads of Departments (HoD) employees were required to relocate from Hyderabad. To ease this shift, the state introduced special benefits, which, despite the completion of new office buildings in Amaravati and the expiration of the 10-year agreement, continue to burden the state's finances, raising questions about their necessity.



implemented a range of benefits to support relocating employees, including a five-day workweek, a 24% House Rent Allowance (HRA) as per the latest Pay Revision Commission (PRC),

The Andhra Pradesh government subsidized train travel for weekend commutes to Hyderabad, and 146 hostel rooms in premium locations like Raintree Park in Gollapudi and Ibrahimpatnam. These measures were designed to address the challenges of

moving to Amaravati, which initially hostel rooms, while helpful, indicate lacked urban infrastructure. However, with modern office buildings now operational in Amaravati, the continued provision of these benefits—costing the state an estimated hundreds of crores annually-has sparked debate. Many employees, having established lives in Hyderabad, resist permanent relocation, citing inadequate housing, schools, and healthcare facilities in Amaravati as reasons for retaining these incentives.

The persistence of these benefits, even after the 10-year agreement's end and the establishment of new office infrastructure, highlights a disconnect. The government's investment in Amaravati's administrative facilities was expected to encourage employees to settle in the new capital, yet many prefer to commute, relying on the fiveday workweek and train subsidies to maintain ties with Hyderabad. a temporary mindset rather than a commitment to making Amaravati home. Financial analysts argue that the state's budget, already stretched by capital development and welfare programs, cannot sustain these benefits indefinitely, especially when office infrastructure is no longer a barrier.

The government's decision to continue these costly incentives suggests a reluctance to enforce full relocation, possibly to maintain employee morale or avoid administrative disruptions. However, this approach raises concerns about fiscal responsibility, as Andhra Pradesh grapples with the challenge of developing Amaravati into a fully functional capital. With modern office buildings in place and the Hyderabad agreement expired, why is the government still footing the bill for these extra benefits?

CBI Submits Report in

A year into the coalition government in Andhra Pradesh, frustration is mounting within the Kapu community as the Kapu Corporation remains unfunded, with not even a single rupee released so far. Despite the massive support extended by the community — largely influenced by Janasena chief and current Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan — the lack of progress has left many feeling disappointed and ignored. While Pawan Kalyan's efforts in forming the TDP-Janasena-BJP alliance played a pivotal role in defeating the YSRCP and

ensuring the coalition's victory, those who stood by him now feel shortchanged. From sacrificing seats to ensuring consolidated votes in favour of coalition candidates, Janasena workers and the Kapu community supported the alliance without hesitation

— even when it hurt their own political aspirations.

A Silent Corporation, A Waiting Chairman

Despite the Kapu Corporation claimed having a chairman, Subbarayudu, and an MD, the situation on the ground remains stagnant. "There's

a file showing budget allocations on paper, but no funds have arrived, so there's nothing we can do," say sources within the Corporation. The office lies deserted, and countless applications for loans, overseas scholarships, and education continue to pile up with no sign of processing or assistance. Even though the government



Ayesha Meera Murder Case

- 7-year-long probe concludes
- AP High Court adjourns hearing to next week

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has formally concluded its investigation into the sensational Ayesha Meera murder case and submitted its full report in a sealed cover to the Andhra Pradesh High Court. This marks the end of a seven-year-long inquiry that was initially launched in 2018 following a re-investigation order from the court.

The case, which drew statewide attention, saw multiple twists and legal proceedings. The Andhra Pradesh High Court had first entrusted the case to a Special Investigation Team (SIT). However, citing a lack of progress and dissatisfaction with the SIT's probe, the court later transferred the investigation to the CBI. On Friday, the CBI presented its comprehensive findings to the High Court. The court has now directed the central agency to also submit a copy of this report to the CBI special court. The High Court has adjourned further hearing on the matter to next week.

The submission of the CBI report is seen as a significant development in a case that has long remained unresolved and has seen repeated calls for justice by the victim's family and rights activists.

the buzz on the ground refuses to die down. Locals claim that these camps — often referred to as "boards" — have mushroomed at an unprecedented rate since the MLA came to power, and the timing has only added fuel to the fire.

The gambling boards allegedly operate across Bhimavaram in lodges, open fields, and function halls, with some even claiming that two boards are being run from the Town Hall itself — under the MLA team's direct control. Sources say each board handles a minimum of ₹10 lakh, with daily earnings running into crores. The financial backbone of the town — its aqua business — is reportedly enabling a strong money flow into this shadow network.

Who's Behind the Operation?

Initially, the spotlight was on Prashanth, the MLA's son, who was allegedly seen overseeing the camps. Later, as the scale expanded, Prashanth reportedly took a back seat at the ground level, directing operations through trusted aides. Bapiraju, a close associate, and Madhu, the MLA's personal assistant, are now said to be running the show on his behalf.

Despite denials, there is mounting speculation that the entire setup is tightly linked to the MLA's office, with some suggesting that people from TDP, Janasena, and even YSRCP have quietly aligned to keep the poker camps running — united not by ideology, but by profit.

Rising Corruption in Town Planning In addition to the poker camps, allegations of widespread corruption in the municipal town planning office are surfacing. Sources claim that municipal staff themselves are commenting on the spike in bribe demands and irregularities, pointing fingers at the MLA's growing influence in the administration.

The developments have especially shocked residents who once held former MLA Anjibabu in high regard. Many are now drawing unfavorable comparisons, saying that such gambling activity was never seen during his tenure. "It's Prashanth who's spoiling everything, and the MLA is allowing it to happen," locals claim, disappointed at what they see as the rapid erosion of a once-respected leader's image.

AP Clears ₹28,546 Cr Investment **Proposals in SIPB Meet**

• Additional incentives for backward areas, 30,270 new jobs approved

• 19 industrial projects cleared in 7th SIPB meeting

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu on Thursday announced that the Andhra Pradesh government will provide special incentives to industries investing in the state's backward regions, highlighting the coalition government's vision for balanced and decentralised development.

At the 7th State-Level Investment Promotion Board (SIPB) meeting held at the Secretariat, the board approved 19 new industrial projects worth ₹28,546 crore, expected to generate 30,270 jobs across the state. The Chief Minister said that this step will significantly contribute to regional equity, local employment, and youth empowerment.

He stressed that local youth must receive a majority of jobs created through these projects and urged officials to ensure skill development is a core objective across departments. "Skill upgradation will bridge the gap between opportunity and access, especially in underdeveloped regions," Naidu said.

The SIPB has so far cleared investments worth ₹5.34 lakh crore, providing employment potential for 4.73 lakh individuals over seven meetings.

Focus on Timely Implementation & Transparency

The Chief Minister issued strict instructions to ensure that land-allotted companies start operations within deadlines. He also directed that details of industries, projects, investments, and employment data be made accessible to the public Calling tourism, IT, and food prothrough a dedicated online portal, with projects cluster-mapped for better monitoring.

Naidu also underlined the necessity of regular SIPB meetings, declaring that two meetings per month would now be held, with a target of 25 meetings annually to maintain consistent momentum in industri-

He urged companies that had signed MoUs to accelerate construction work, especially in the hospitality sector. He also emphasized the need

for MSME parks in every Assembly constituency, encouraging local entrepreneurship under the 'One Family – One Entrepreneur' initiative. Additional proposals from BPCL, KSSL, LT Electronics, and Krishnapatnam Power Corporation regarding modifications and expanded investments were also discussed. CM Naidu concluded by reiterating that Andhra Pradesh is open for business and is moving towards becoming India's most investment-friendly state, with equitable growth and youth development at its core.

Kapu welfare would be covered under BC welfare allocations, no clarity has been given. Subbarayudu, who initially resisted accepting the Chairman post knowing the political situation, eventually took charge but has reportedly remained quiet, possibly due to lack of real backing.

History Repeating?

In 2014, Chandrababu Naidu had promised reservations for Kapus. After losing power, Jagan Mohan Reddy used Mudragada Padmanabham's movement to build momentum for Kapu reservation, even as the Tuni incident involving a train burning shocked the state. Jagan later backtracked, saying reservations weren't feasible, and simply counted Kapus under existing welfare schemes to claim inclusivity without exclusive allocation.

During his tenure, he promised ₹1,000 crore for Kapu Corporation but never released it — a move that drew strong criticism.

With Pawan Kalyan as Deputy CM and Janasena part of the ruling coalition, expectations were naturally high. The Kapu community believed that their long-standing issues would finally be addressed. However, the reality has been disappointing so far, and many are now asking when Chandrababu and Pawan will respond.

Is this another chapter of unfulfilled promises, or will the leaders who won with the support of this community finally break their silence and act?

Cognizant to Set Up IT Campus in Vizag

In a major boost to Andhra Pradesh's IT sector, tech giant Cognizant Technology Solutions is all set to establish a state-of-the-art IT campus in Visakhapatnam. With an estimated investment of ₹1,582 crore, the project is expected to generate employment for nearly 8,000 people in and around the region.

As part of its expansion strategy, Cognizant representatives recently met with Andhra Pradesh IT and Industries Minister Nara Lokesh and presented their proposal. The company requested the allocation of 21.31 acres in the Kapuluppada IT layout for the project. In a move to encourage large-scale investment and employment generation, the state government has agreed in principle to allocate the land at a nominal rate of just 99 paise per acre.

According to officials, Cognizant plans to construct a world-class IT campus in Visakhapatnam to facilitate its future operations in the region. The proposal aligns with the state government's vision to transform Visakhapatnam into a major IT destination in South In-



dia.

Minister Lokesh assured Cognizant that all necessary clearances will be provided promptly and pledged full support from the government to ensure timely execution of the project. He emphasized that the arrival of a global player like Cognizant would not only strengthen Vizag's position in the tech map of India but also bring transformative opportunities for the local youth.

The announcement marks another significant milestone in Andhra Pradesh's industrial development efforts, with Visakhapatnam emerging as a preferred destination for global technology and innovation investments.

Krishnamraju Shifted from Guntur jail to Tullur police station

Journalist VVR Krishnamraju, who was arrested for making derogatory comments about women in the Amaravati capital region, has been taken into custody by the Tullur police for further investigation. He was earlier lodged in Guntur district jail as a remand prisoner and

was moved today to the Tullur police station after receiving court permission. The Mangalagiri court on Thursday approved the police's request for a three-day custody of Krishnamraju, allowing them to interrogate him from today until June 22. Prior to taking him into custody, the police took him to Guntur Government General Hospital (GGH) for a mandatory medi-



cal check-up before shifting him to Tullur. The police are expected to focus their questioning on the context and motive behind Krishnamraju's controversial statements. They are also probing whether anyone else was involved or instigated him to make the comments targeting women from the Amaravati region. Sources indicate that the investigation will explore the background, intent, and possible political influences behind the remarks. The case has drawn significant public and political attention due to the sensitive nature of the comments and the larger backdrop of the Amaravati capital movement. Police are reportedly treating the matter seriously and plan to complete a detailed inquiry within the three-day window granted by the court.



AP EdSET 2025 Results Out, 99.42% Pass

The results of the Andhra Pradesh Education Common Entrance Test (AP EdSET) 2025 were officially released on Friday, recording an impressive pass percentage of 99.42%. Speaking for Anti-Social Elements Is a Crime Too, Warns Pawan Kalyan

Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan has issued a stern warning that speaking in favor of anti-social forces is itself a criminal act and will not be tolerated. In a strong reaction to the comments made by former Chief Minister and YSRCP chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, Pawan Kalyan cautioned the public against individuals who undermine democratic values and incite unrest through provocative rhetoric. Pawan Kalyan, addressing the media on Thursday, said, "People must be vigilant about those who act and speak undemocratically. Backing illegal activities or those who incite public disorder is not only wrong but punishable under law."

Taking a direct jab at Jagan's use of movie-style rhetoric in political discourse, Pawan advised that "dialogues are only good in cinema halls, not in real life where rules and responsibilities govern our conduct." He said that such comments have no place in a constitutional democracy and that leaders must set a responsible example. The Deputy CM asserted that the current coalition government is firmly committed to maintaining law and order in the state. He revealed that the police have been given full authority to suppress anti-social elements and ensure public safety.

"We will open rowdy sheets if necessary and take stringent action against those disrupting peace. There will be zero tolerance for anyone creating fear or chaos," he warned.

If Chandrababu Wants, Jagan Will Be in Jail in Two Minutes: Lokesh

No vendetta, but law will take its course

Andhra Pradesh IT and Education Minister Nara Lokesh has made sharp allegations against former Chief Minister YS Jagan Mohan Reddy. Speaking to the media in Delhi on Thursday, Lokesh issued a direct public challenge to Jagan over the liquor scam, questioning if he would dare to swear on God that he hadn't taken a single rupee from the business. He also brought up the Viveka murder case and challenged Jagan again, reminding how he had earlier avoided taking a similar oath.

Lokesh also responded to speculations about vendetta politics by clarifying that the current TDP government, led by Chandrababu Naidu, has no intention of acting out of partisanship. "If Chandrababu really wanted to settle factional scores, it wouldn't take even two minutes to send Jagan to jail," Lokesh said. "But we were elected to govern responsibly, not to act out of revenge." Still, he issued a warning that strict legal action would be taken against those who had violated laws or looted public money.

No Political Vendetta, but Law Will Act

Lokesh stressed that their administration would remain focused on development and welfare, not revenge. However, he stated that there would be no leniency when it comes to accountability. "We won't overlook the misdeeds of the past government. If there's evidence, we'll act. Everyone is equal before the law," Lokesh asserted. He also mentioned that a charge sheet would soon be filed in the liquor case, and hinted that there were signs of money laundering as well.

'Swear on God, Jagan!' – Lokesh's Challenge

In a bold statement, Lokesh directly challenged Jagan on two major controversies. "Let him swear that he didn't take a single rupee from the liquor scam. I swear my family has no link to the Viveka murder. But when I challenged him, he fled," Lokesh said. He emphasized that their government would move forward with policy-based



decisions, not personal battles. **Reveals Details of First**

Meeting with Modi

For the first time, Lokesh spoke about his recent meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi. Calling it an 'unbelievable' experience, Lokesh said the PM shared personal insights from his 25-year political journey. "He advised me to step out of my father's shadow and encouraged me to work hard. He said the future belongs to the youth," Lokesh revealed.

Development and Super Six Implementation

Lokesh also highlighted key development programs underway in Andhra Pradesh. He said the 'Talliki Vandanam' scheme is nearly complete, with the remaining issues to be resolved by July 5. He announced that TCS operations will begin in Visakhapatnam by the end of July and the foundation stone for their permanent facility will be laid the same day. He added that Rs 2,000 crore worth of pending employment guarantee bills have been cleared. Lokesh also confirmed that steps are being taken to withdraw false cases filed against TDP workers during the previous regime.



Jagan Spreading Misinformation Before PM's Visit: Bhanuprakash Reddy

BJP leader Bhanuprakash Reddy came down heavily on YSR Congress Party chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, accusing him of deliberately spreading misinformation ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's scheduled visit to Andhra Pradesh. Speaking to the media in Nellore, Bhanuprakash Reddy alleged that Jagan was trying to create a false narrative of law and order issues in the state. He likened Jagan's behavior to "a man trying to turn an axe wound into a heart attack," adding that the former CM was now behaving irrationally after his defeat. "People now look at Jagan like a stranger," Bhanuprakash said, adding that the former CM had lost the moral authority to speak about governance or development.

He strongly criticized Jagan's recent visit to Delhi, questioning what he had achieved by "creating a ruckus" just 40 days after the NDA coalition came to power in the state. "Jagan is trying to spread rumors and create panic just before Modi's arrival, but the people of the state are not buying it," he said.

Bhanuprakash Reddy mocked Jagan's demand for opposition party status, saying it resembled "a child crying for chocolates." He added that Jagan's mental state was visibly unstable post-election defeat and that YSRCP had no future beyond court cases and consolation tours.

"Jagan alone is responsible for pushing the state into darkness," Bhanuprakash said, blaming the previous regime for the financial and administrative ruin of Andhra Pradesh. He claimed it would take at least a year for the NDA government to rebuild the state from the damage caused by the YSRCP administration.

Mayor, MLA in open clash as officials lock halls and skip meeting

A routine general body meeting of the Kadapa Municipal Corporation turned chaotic on Thursday, as a battle for control — both literal and symbolic — broke out between Mayor K. Suresh Babu and Kadapa MLA R. Madhavireddy, with the issue of a chair on the dais spiraling into a full-fledged political drama.

Locked Doors, Divided Camps

The scheduled general meeting, convened after a gap of six months, was expected to begin at 11 a.m. But it never officially began — because both the conference hall and the council meeting hall were locked. According to the Mayor, this was done without his knowledge, and was a deliberate move to block him and YSRCP corporators from holding the meeting as per High Court directives.

While MLA Madhavireddy, Commissioner Manoj Reddy, and other municipal officials sat inside the locked council hall, the Mayor, corporators, and supporters gathered outside the locked conference hall, where they conducted a parallel meeting, passed agenda items, and expressed dismay over the absence of officials. The root of the tension seems to lie in seating arrangements. Just as in the previous meeting, controversy erupted over allocating a chair for the MLA next to the Mayor on the stage. The Mayor objected to this, saying it was against protocol. "The MLA is only fighting for the chair, not for people's issues," Suresh Babu remarked, accusing the Commissioner of acting under political pressure.

"Officials acting as puppets" – Mayor

The Mayor slammed Commissioner Manoj Reddy, accusing him of acting unilaterally and violating court orders by holding the meeting in the council hall despite the agenda stating it would be in the corporation premises. "The officials are acting like pawns of the ruling party. We were ready with a quorum and had all the agenda ready — but not a single official attended. We will approach the court again," said Mayor Suresh Babu, visibly frustrated. **MLA Fires Back**

In contrast, MLA Madhavireddy blamed the Mayor for violating mu-

nicipal rules by holding a meeting outside the designated premises. Speaking to the media, he said, "It's unfortunate that the Mayor didn't attend the scheduled meeting to discuss public issues. We had given prior notice to all members."

He also refuted the Mayor's allegation regarding the chair arrangement and denied any misuse of authority, saying that the officials were simply following standard procedures.

Officials Caught in the Crossfire

Officials remained largely silent during the fiasco, but Additional Commissioner Rakesh Chandra defended the move to hold the meeting in the council hall, citing tradition and lack of facilities in the conference hall. He also clarified that seating arrangements were made after consulting higher officials, as per longstanding practice.

Despite the Mayor citing High Court orders that the meeting be held in the conference hall, the lack of consensus, presence of parallel power centres, and absence of key officials led to yet another unproductive session.

7,099 Medical Staff **Transferred in First Phase** of Health Department Reshuffle

In a major administrative move, the Medical and Health Department of Andhra Pradesh has successfully completed the first phase of staff transfers, affecting a total of 7,099 medical personnel. Of these, 5,200 employees were compulsorily transferred after completing five years at their current postings, while 1,899 were shifted based on their own requests. Additionally, 379 teaching staff were also transferred as part of this exercise.

The state government has announced that 9,650 Grade-3 ANMs, working at the village level, will be transferred by June 30, marking the completion of the second phase. These transfers will be coordinated with the Village and Ward Secretariat departments.

Health Minister Satya Kumar Yadav expressed satisfaction over the transparent and dispute-free execution of this large-scale reshuffle. "We ensured that the process followed rules and eliminated the irregularities that plagued past transfer practices," he said. The Minister commended the efforts of department heads and officers involved in the smooth conduct of the exercise.

In a bid to prevent administrative stagnation and irregularities, junior and senior assistants, account officers, and superintendents who had worked in the same position for over three years were mandatorily transferred. For the first time, senior officials holding key positions for prolonged periods were also moved.

The Ministry had also proactively released data on employee seniority, completed years of service, and vacancy lists to ensure transparency and allow time for objections to be resolved fairly.

Interestingly, 840 staff members continue in their existing positions even after five years due to valid exemptions—including health grounds, spousal postings, and union representation. However, the Minister has sought detailed justification for their continued postings and has asked for a complete report on them soon.

Second Phase Lottery Results for Free Admissions in Private **Schools Released**

8,583 Seats Allotted Under RTE 12(1)(C), Says Samagra Shiksha Director

The Government of Andhra Pradesh's School Education Department, under the Samagra Shiksha initiative, has released the second phase lottery results for free admissions in private schools under the Right to Free and Compulsory Education (RTE) Act, Section 12(1)(C). Samagra Shiksha State Scheme Director Sri B. Srinivasa Rao, IAS, announced on Friday that 8,583 students have been selected in this phase.

Parents of the selected students will receive SMS alerts and can also check the results online at https://cse. ap.gov.in. Admissions must be confirmed between June 21 and June 28, 2025, by submitting the necessary certificates at the respective schools. The School Education Department has made it clear that action will be taken against schools that deny admissions without valid reasons. Admissions will be processed through special logins provided to the Samagra Shiksha District Additional Project Coordinators (APCs). For queries, school managements can approach the respective MEO, DEO, or RJD, and parents can contact the toll-free number 18004258599 for assistance. In the first phase, out of 37,427 registered applications, 28,561 met the eligibility criteria, resulting in 23,118 seat allotments. Of these, 15,541 students were successfully admitted to private schools under the scheme.

TTD Refutes Allegations by Former Chairman Bhumana

Allegations baseless and misleading, says TTD in strong rebuttal

The Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) has categorically refuted the recent allegations made by former TTD Chairman Sri Bhumana Karunakar Reddy, terming them as baseless, misleading, and devoid of any factual backing. In a press release issued by the Chief Public Relations Officer of TTD, the organization condemned the attempt to tarnish its reputation and clarified on all points raised.

TTD clarified that contrary to claims, the duration and quality of Vedic recitation at Srivari Temple have not only been maintained but significantly improved in recent months. The sacred chant 'Om Namo Venkatesaya' now resonates throughout the temple premises, footpaths, annadanam centers, and queue lines.

TTD further stated that Vedic students are being supported with initiatives aimed at improving their physical and mental well-being in the Veda pathashalas.

Dismissing allegations that priests are being disrespected, TTD reaffirmed that due respect is always maintained, though several internal reforms were introduced to improve temple operations and transparency. The views of devotees are now being actively sought to enhance service delivery, which has drawn praise from the pilgrims. TTD strongly denied any targeted action against Mutts, stating that only those occupying land beyond allotted boundaries—such as Visakha Sharada Peetham-received notices in compliance with court directives. Many mutts,



it added, have themselves expressed support for recent reforms and even received approvals for renovations.

Refuting the charge that TTD is misleading pilgrims with AI-based promises, the statement clarified that AI technology is being deployed to streamline darshan, not to promise fixed timings. With the help of AI and scientific time management, the TTD has been able to provide comfortable darshan for record numbers of devotees during peak days. An additional 22 food counters were also set up, serving Annaprasadam and beverages in waiting areas. Feedback is now collected via IVRS, WhatsApp, and Srivari Sevaks, with over 90% satisfaction reported on services like accommodation, drinking water, and prasadam. Addressing concerns about Parakamani, TTD recalled the 2023 incident and noted that since then, a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) has been put in place. All personnel are subject to stringent security checks before entering the Parakamani area to restore public confidence.

The press release concluded by calling the former Chairman's allegations irresponsible and cautioned that public figures should verify facts before making damaging statements. "It is inappropriate to malign a revered Hindu institution like the TTD without substantiated evidence," it stated. "Every action taken in the past year has been aimed at strengthening tradition while ensuring better services to devotees. Allegations for political mileage hurt the sanctity and public trust in such institutions," TTD maintained.

Drunken Youths Create Chaos on Bhimavaram Highway

Attack student, chase college bus and go wild on the road

Vanamahotsavam: A Step To Greening Telangana!

Pakistan's Risky Reboot: **Playing America's 'Frontline** State' Once Again

The Long Undoing: Why the **Muslim World Is in Crisis**





Pakistan appears to be revisiting a familiar script — positioning itself as America's go-to "Frontline State" in return for strategic rewards, this time with Iran as the new theater. Field Marshal Asim Munir's June 18 White House lunch with President Donald Trump was not just symbolic; it likely signaled a quiet understanding between Washington and Rawalpindi to collaborate on destabilizing Iran's regime.

anniversary celebrations, Munir skipped the event. His real mission seems to involve shaping a renewed bilateral framework — one in which Pakistan would serve as the logistical base for American operations against Iran, much like it did during the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan or the post-9/11 war on terror. Trump's unpredictable transactionalism and the urgency around Iran's nuclear program have made this arrangement timely.

This engagement could bring Pakistan critical financial relief and strategic leverage, including

renewed military aid, debt support, and global legitimacy. But the price is steep. Aligning with the U.S. against Iran — a Shia-majority neighbor with historic and religious ties — could destabilize Pakistan internally. With around 15% of Pakistan's population being Shia and a restive border with Iran, such cooperation could ignite sectarian and geopolitical tensions.

Historically, Pakistan has capitalized on similar Though initially invited to the U.S. Army's 250th U.S. engagements — from Cold War-era pacts to aiding the Mujahideen in the 1980s, and later, supporting U.S. campaigns in Afghanistan. But each episode left internal blowback: terrorism, illegal arms, and deepening military control over civilian institutions.

> For India, the episode reinforces the wisdom of strategic autonomy and the perils of over-trusting Trump's administration, which has shown a willingness to sidestep Indian interests for tactical deals. It's time New Delhi adopts a more agile, less idealistic foreign policy in an increasingly transactional world.

From the rubble of Aleppo to the ravaged neighborhoods of Gaza and the scarred plains of Iraq, a grim portrait of the modern Muslim world emerges-one marked by endless conflict, external manipulation, and internal decay. The devastation is not due to fate or faith but the result of a complex interplay of colonial legacies, geopolitical opportunism, and authoritarian governance.

Critics often reduce the Muslim world's plight to cultural backwardness or religious extremism. Others blame the West for its relentless interventions and double standards. Both narratives contain truths, yet neither fully captures the depth of the crisis. The truth lies in the long arc of history, where Western imperial ambitions, Cold War alignments, and modern proxy wars have repeatedly undermined sovereign governance, leaving fractured states and broken societies in their wake.

After the Ottoman Empire's fall, colonial powers carved up the Middle East to suit their interests, not the aspirations of its people. The Sykes-Picot Agreement divided lands arbitrarily, birthing states like Iraq, Syria, and Lebanon, not through organic nation-building but through strategic calculus. These fault lines, inherited without reconciliation, have since fueled coups, civil wars, and sectarian strife.

The U.S.-led invasions of Iraq and Afghanistan, NATO's toppling of Gaddafi in Libya, and decades of regime-change policies have brought more harm than hope. Iraq's collapse post-2003 invited ISIS. Syria became a global battleground. Afghanistan remains under Taliban control despite two decades of foreign intervention. Iran now faces a similar threat isolated, sanctioned, and painted as the next domino.

Meanwhile, U.S. allies like Saudi Arabia and the UAE, despite autocratic rule and rights abuses, face little scrutiny, revealing Western hypocrisy. This selective morality breeds resentment and radicalism, turning grievance into ideology.

The Muslim world doesn't need more warplanes or foreign blueprints. It needs space to rebuild—economically, socially, and politically. The global order must abandon the myth that democracy can be delivered through drones. Instead, it must invest in civil societies, education, and local leadership.

Until the world acknowledges the shared responsibility for this ruin—and chooses justice over expedience—the cycle will continue. And the ruins will not remain contained to West Asia; they will echo far beyond. The time for principled action is now.

The gunfight erupted on a forested hill under the jurisdiction of the Chhotebethiya police station, involving a joint operation by the District Reserve Guard (DRG) and Border Security Force (BSF).

Iran has temporarily opened its otherwise closed airspace exclusively for Indian evacuation flights amid escalating conflict in the region. As part of India's emergency evacuation operation named "Operation Sindhu," the first batch of around 1,000 Indian students stranded in conflict-hit Iranian cities is scheduled to land in Delhi tonight at 11:00 PM IST. Two more flights are planned for Saturday—one in the morning and another in the evening.

Iran's airspace has remained largely closed to international flights due to ongoing missile exchanges and drone attacks between Israeli and Iranian forces. However, India has been granted a special corridor to facilitate the safe evacuation of its nationals, especially students.

India launched Operation Sindhu in response to the escalating hostilities between Iran and Israel, which have endangered thousands of Indian nationals living in Iran. According to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), over 4,000 Indians reside in Iran, with half of them being students.

Earlier this week, 110 Indian students from Urmia Medical University in Iran's West Azerbaijan province—close to the Turkey border and a hotspot for recent missile activity—were evacuated by road to Yerevan, Armenia. From there, they boarded a special flight that landed in Delhi on June 19. The majority of these evacuees hail from Jammu and Kashmir.

The Indian government expressed gratitude to Iran and Armenia for facilitating safe passage and emphasized its highest priority on the safety and security of Indian nationals abroad.

The current conflict was triggered by Israel's "Operation Rising Lion" targeting Iran's nuclear infrastructure, provoking retaliatory missile and drone strikes by Tehran. Recent attacks have resulted in civilian casualties and significant military escalations, including Israeli airstrikes near Tehran and Iran's launch of hypersonic missiles against Israeli military targets.

India's swift evacuation efforts underscore its commitment to protecting its citizens amid growing tensions in the Persian Gulf region.





Maryland Governor Wes Moore Criticizes Trump's "Lack of Seriousness" on Iran Conflict

Wes Moore, the first Black governor of Maryland and a combat veteran who served with the Army's 82nd Airborne Division in Afghanistan, has publicly expressed his disappointment with US President Donald Trump's handling of the escalating Iran-Israel conflict. Moore condemned what he called Trump's "lack of seriousness" in addressing critical national security issues during a recent interview.

Moore, who led troops in dangerous combat zones, emphasized the gravity of the situation, stating, "As someone who has worn this uniform, and along with my fellow service members risked my life in defense of this country, to see such a free-wheeling conversation about issues of life and death is disappointing." He criticized the President's inconsistent messaging, especially after Trump issued an "ultimate ultimatum" warning Iran not to develop nuclear weapons but then ambiguously stated, "I may do it, I may not do it — nobody knows what I'm going to do," when asked if the US would join Israel in military action.

This exchange came shortly after Iran's Supreme Leader declared that Iran "will never surrender" in response to Trump's demand for "unconditional surrender" from Teh-

Indian, US, and **Chinese Deposits in Swiss Banks Decline Over Past Decade**

Deposits by Indian nationals in Swiss banks have decreased by nearly 18% over the last ten years, according to data released by the Swiss National Bank (SNB). Indian deposits fell from about 425 million Swiss francs in 2015 to 346 million Swiss francs in 2024. Although deposits peaked at a 10-year high of around 602 million Swiss francs during the COVID-19 pandemic, they began declining afterward. In 2023, deposits stood at 309 million Swiss francs before rising slightly to 346 million Swiss francs in 2024.

This downward trend is not unique to India. Many other major economies have also recorded significant reductions in Swiss bank deposits. For example, deposits by UK nationals declined from 44 billion Swiss francs in 2015 to 31 billion Swiss francs in 2024. Chinese deposits dropped from 5.01 billion to 4.3 billion Swiss francs during the same period.


Neighboring countries Pakistan and Bangladesh experienced even sharper declines. Pakistani nationals' deposits fell dramatically from 947 million Swiss francs in 2015 to 241 million Swiss francs in 2024 — a drop of nearly 75%. Bangladeshi deposits decreased by over 73%, from 48 million Swiss francs to just 12.6 million Swiss francs.

Saudi Arabian deposits nearly halved over the decade, falling from 8.3 billion to 4.8 billion Swiss francs. The steepest decline was seen among American nationals, whose deposits plunged from 64.2 billion Swiss francs in 2015 to 24.4 billion in 2024 — a 62% drop.

The data reflects a broader global trend of declining foreign deposits in Swiss banks, likely driven by tighter regulations, enhanced financial transparency, and changing international norms. The pandemic caused a temporary surge in deposits, but the overall movement points toward reduced reliance on Swiss banking for foreign nationals, including Indians.

Zelenskyy Calls for Increased Pressure on Russia After Deadly Kyiv Missile Strike

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has urged the international community to ramp up pressure on Russia following a devastating missile attack on a residential building in Kyiv. The strike, which occurred on June 17, 2025, was the deadliest assault on Ukraine's capital this year, killing 28 people and injuring 142 others, according to Kyiv Military Administration head Tymur Tkachenko.

Zelenskyy, accompanied by presidential chief of staff Andrii Yermak and Interior Minister Ihor Klymenko, visited the site in Kyiv's Solomianskyi district to pay tribute to the victims. "This attack is a reminder to the world that Russia rejects a ceasefire and chooses killing," Zelenskyy said on Telegram. He thanked Ukraine's partners willing to increase pressure on Moscow to "feel the real cost of the war."

The missile and drone attack was part of one of the largest bombardments since the conflict began in February 2022, with Russia launching over 440 drones and 32 missiles to overwhelm Ukrainian air defenses. Despite ongoing peace efforts led by the U.S., Russian President Vladimir Putin has rejected a proposed 30-day ceasefire, demanding Ukraine halt its military mobilization and



stop receiving Western arms.

Russia continues its summer offensive across a broad front, intensifying attacks on urban areas. Putin denied targeting residential zones, insisting strikes were aimed at military infrastructure. Meanwhile, a prisoner exchange between the two sides took place in Ukraine's Chernihiv region,

repatriating several severely ill Ukrainian POWs, many captured during the defense of Mariupol in 2022.

Zelenskyy reaffirmed Ukraine's commitment to peace but accused Russia of escalating terror instead of seeking resolution. As attacks persist, Kyiv calls for greater diplomatic and economic measures to end the conflict.

Pakistan Seeks Ceasefire After India's Strikes on Air Bases **Amid Operation Sindoor**

Pakistan's Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar revealed that Pakistan was compelled to request a ceasefire with India last month following Indian strikes on two strategic air bases in Rawalpindi and Punjab. The strikes were part of India's Operation Sindoor, launched in retaliation to a terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam region that claimed the lives of 26 tourists on April 22.

Dar, speaking on a television news program, confirmed that India targeted the Nur Khan air base in Rawalpindi and the Shorkot air base in Punjab during the operation. The Nur Khan base, located strategically between

Rawalpindi and Islamabad, is a critical military installation. According to Dar, the Indian missile strikes occurred at around 2:30 am, prompting Pakistan to seek diplomatic intervention from the United States and support from Saudi Arabia.



He detailed that shortly after the attacks, Saudi Prince Faisal con-

tacted him. The Prince had learned about Dar's conversation with US Secretary of State Marco Rubio and offered to communicate with India's External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar to negotiate a halt to the strikes. Dar agreed, and the Prince later confirmed that he had relayed Pakistan's readiness to de-escalate if India stopped its attacks.

Operation Sindoor, conducted by India on the night of May 7-8, targeted and destroyed nine terror bases across Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir (PoK). This military action was in direct response to the deadly terror attack in Pahalgam. The strikes significantly escalated tensions between the two countries, leading to a series of counterstrikes.

Following the intense exchange, India and Pakistan eventually agreed on a ceasefire to prevent further conflict and stabilize the situation along the border. The ceasefire has been maintained since, although underlying tensions remain high.

Rupee Strengthens by 14 Paise to Close at 86.59 **Against US Dollar**



The Indian Rupee appreciated by 14 L paise to close at 86.59 (provisional) against the US dollar on Friday, June 20, 2025, supported by a decline in global crude oil prices and a weakening greenback, forex traders said. The local currency's gain was further bolstered by robust performance in domestic equity markets and inflows from foreign institutional investors (FIIs).

The Rupee opened at 86.65 at the interbank foreign exchange and traded within a narrow band of 86.55 to 86.67 before settling at 86.59, marking a modest recovery after hitting a two-month low the previous day. On Thursday, the Rupee had dropped 30 paise, closing at 86.73, marking a combined loss of 69 paise over the past three sessions.

Maneesh Sharma, AVP-Commodities & Currencies at Anand Rathi Shares and Stock Brokers, noted that the Rupee's weakness this month largely stemmed from geopolitical tensions, particularly following Israeli strikes on Iranian targets on June 13, which pushed Brent crude oil futures to a five-month high near \$79 per barrel. "The local currency was comforted by a dip in oil prices after the White House indicated that President

Donald Trump will decide within two weeks whether the US will intervene in the Israel-Iran conflict," Sharma added.

Market optimism also stems from expectations that the upcoming HDB Financial IPO will attract significant investment inflows, which could provide further support to the Rupee. Analysts predict the Rupee may continue to trade in a range between 86.20 and 86.70 in the early part of next week.

Meanwhile, the US dollar index, which measures the greenback's strength against a basket of six major currencies, eased by 0.30% to 98.60.

Steel Sector Hit Hard by Abrupt Quality Compliance Deadline

Amazon to Invest \$233 Million in India to Boost **Infrastructure and Technology**

The steel industry is bracing for significant challenges following a sudden notification by the Ministry of Steel that exquality tends certification requirements to the inputs used in steel production, including imported raw materials. Released on June 13, 2025, the notification mandates compliance with the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) for all steel inputs, effective immedi-



ately for imports with a bill of lading dated June the absence of government support and the need 16 or later—leaving industry players less than one business day to adjust.

This extension of the Quality Control Order (QCO) means not only finished steel products but also the raw materials and semi-finished goods entering India must meet stringent quality standards. For example, steel slabs supplied by a Malaysian firm to a Vietnamese company, which processes them into sheets and exports to India, must now ensure BIS certification at every stage.



Tn the wake of the tragic Air India crash in Ahmedabad, which resulted in 241 fatalities, aviation safety has once again taken center stage. Among the many rigorous tests planes undergo, one particularly unusual yet vital procedure is the "chicken gun test." This test involves firing real birds at aircraft parts such as windshields, wings, and engines to evaluate their ability to withstand bird strikes.

Captain and Senior Commander Sam Thomas of the Airline Pilots Association of India explains the reasoning behind this unconventional test. While it may sound strange, bird strikes are a serious risk for airplanes cruising at high speeds, often around 350 km/h. Collisions with large birds can cause severe damage, from cracking the windshield to impairing engine function, posing life-threatening dangers.

During the chicken gun test, frozen chickens are shot from a specially designed cannon at various aircraft components to simulate real bird strikes. The test is typically performed on the first engine a manufacturer develops to ensure it can safely handle such impacts. After the impact, engineers carefully examine the damage. If it's minimal and within safety limits, the aircraft part passes the test and is cleared for use following necessary approvals.

This critical safety step helps prevent accidents caused by birds, which are more common than many realize. By pushing engines and windshields to their limits with these realistic tests, manufacturers can design aircraft that better withstand unexpected collisions during flight.

Though the idea of firing real birds at planes may seem bizarre, the chicken gun test is an essential part of aviation safety, helping to keep millions of passengers safe every year by preparing aircraft to survive the unpredictable hazards of the skies.





8 Vasantalu Review: Beautifully **Shot but Emotionally Distant**

OVasantalu, directed by Phanindra Nar-**O**setti, is a coming-of-age drama that follows the emotional journey of a young girl over eight transformative years. Starring Ananthika Sanilkumar of MAD fame, the film attempts to blend philosophy, poetry, and youthful introspection into a slow-burning narrative. However, despite its visual richness and sincere performances, the film struggles to keep viewers emotionally engaged.

The story centers on Suddhi Ayodhya (Ananthika Sanilkumar), a 17-year-old living in Ooty. A dojo champion and aspiring writer, Suddhi's world changes when she meets Karthik (Hanu Reddy). What follows is a journey filled with love, heartbreak, and self-discovery. Though the concept is thoughtful, the film's poetic and meandering style becomes a double-edged sword. Ananthika delivers a heartfelt performance with remarkable maturity. Her portrayal of Suddhi is nuanced and expressive, anchoring the film with emotional sincerity. Hanu Reddy supports her well, and their chemistry adds warmth to the narrative. Visually, 8 Vasantalu is stunning, with breathtaking cinematography that captures the beauty of Ooty, Varanasi, and Kashmir. Hesham Abdul Wahab's music elevates several key moments with



a soothing, melodic presence.

However, the film falters in its second half. The pacing drags, the narration becomes overly abstract, and the emotional connection thins out. Character arcsparticularly Suddhi's post-heartbreak choices—feel inconsistent. Supporting roles lack depth, and promising subplots are abandoned too quickly.

Technically, the film is solid. But despite its rich visuals and musical charm, the storytelling lacks the cohesion and emotional pull needed to leave a lasting impact.

Verdict:

8 Vasantalu has moments of beauty and depth, especially in its visuals and lead performance. But a slow pace, scattered narrative, and abstract storytelling make it a test of patience. Watch it only if you enjoy experimental, poetic cinema. **Rating: 2.5/5**
