



US Stealth Strike Rocks Iran Nuke Sites

Biggest B-2 bomber op in US history leaves 3 Iranian nuclear sites in ruins

In a bold and highly secretive overnight operation named 'Midnight Hammer', the United States military launched its largestever B-2 stealth bomber strike targeting Iranian nuclear facilities, causing severe destruction across three key sites — Fordow, Natanz, and Isfahan. The mission involved 125+ aircraft and 75 precisionguided munitions, marking the first operational use of the GBU-57 Massive Ordnance Penetrator (MOP), a weapon specifically designed to destroy fortified underground facilities.

At a press briefing, General Dan Caine, Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, described the strike as a "complex and high-risk mission carried out with exceptional skill and discipline." Remarkably, only a handful of top officials in Washington were aware of the timing and scale of the operation.

The operation began at midnight, Friday into Saturday, as seven B-2 Spirit bombers launched from the US. To preserve tactical surprise, a portion of the bomber fleet flew west toward the Pacific as a decoy — a deception tactic known only to a select group of planners. Meanwhile, the main strike package quietly headed east toward Iranian airspace, undergoing multiple in-flight refuelings over the 18-hour journey. As the B-2s neared Iranian territory,

they coordinated with escort fighters and support aircraft in a complex aerial maneuver conducted with minimal radio communication. To protect the incoming bombers, US submarines launched over two dozen Tomahawk cruise missiles at surface infrastructure targets, while advanced fighter jets swept ahead to neutralize potential threats from enemy aircraft or missile batteries. At exactly 2:10 am local time in Iran (6:40 pm EST), the lead B-2 dropped two GBU-57 bunker busters on Fordow, followed by 12 more MOPs across two other nuclear locations. Between 6:40 pm and 7:05 pm EST, all three targeted nuclear facilities were hit.

General Caine confirmed there were no shots fired at the incoming or outgoing US aircraft and stated, "Iran's surface-to-air systems did not even detect us." The final stage saw Tomahawk missiles striking Isfahan to ensure continued surprise.

Initial battle damage assessments indicate all three sites suffered extensive destruction. The mission not only demonstrated US airpower precision but also its ability to carry out long-range, coordinated stealth operations with complete surprise. The B-2s have now returned home safely, concluding the secondlongest B-2 mission ever flown. This strike is expected to have far-

reaching geopolitical and security implications as the world waits for Iran's official response.

In fact, they claim the local MLA himself is guarding the place. This isn't your usual poker club, town hall, or building. The den is reportedly set up in a serene forest area, where nature offers a beautiful backdrop and no disturbances.

Once you enter, it's a complete feast. No doubt — not even a fly

can sneak in without notice. The MLA is said to have secured the area entirely. With such a setup, naturally, the stakes are high. Payment? Proportionate to the luxury. It doesn't matter whether you're from Telangana, Andhra, Chhattisgarh, or even Bengaluru — if distance isn't an issue, this poker den

welcomes all. This is what locals living

in the region are saying.

Whether it is true or not needs verification. The location in question is Barrinkalapadu, under Jeelugumilli Mandal in West Godavari district of Andhra Pradesh. It falls under the Polavaram constituency. The MLA's name is Balaraju.

Locals further claim that MLA Balaraju has a close aide, Kumarababu, who is allegedly managing the operations. Balaraju is said to be the "Director", while

Kumarababu plays the role of "Executive Director" of the entire setup.

Clerk-Turned-Superintendent Sparks **Controversy at Draksharamam Temple**





East Godavari: "He won't move... he won't leave..." — a phrase echoing through the corridors of the historic Draksharamam temple, as a small-time temple worker finds himself at the center of a controversy. Even though his deputation has ended, he refuses to leave. Even if it defies all logic, locals say, "he is beautiful to those in power." A clerk from the Ainavilli temple was posted to the Draksharamam temple on deputation. But even after the approved period ended, he did not return to his original post. More recently, he created chaos by declaring himself the new superintendent,

even though he originally came as a sanitation worker. Unable to bear his behavior, devotees submitted complaints to the Endowments Department's senior officials and Chief Minister N. Chandrababu

Acting on these complaints, officials from the Dwaraka Tirumala temple in West Godavari were deputed to investigate both the temple's Executive Officer and the employee in question. However, allegations suggest the employee managed to influence the inquiry officials too — making it a common perception that no one can move him, no matter what.

Locals claim that the said employee, Venkanna Babu, enjoys the support of a minister from the Konaseema district — Dr. B.R. Ambedkar — and that his influence is deeply rooted. The temple in question, Draksharamam Bhimeshwara Swamy Temple, is famously known as Dakshina Kashi and houses the 12th Shakti Peetha, Manikyamba Devi. Built by the Chalukyas in the 7th century, it is revered as both a Shaiva and Shakti Kshetra, making these allegations even more serious.

Devotees are raising strong objections to mismanagement and administrative apathy. They allege that the daily 20 liters of daddi (curd made from cow's milk), once offered to the deity as per Kanchi Peetha guidelines, has stopped. Akula Siva, a local devotee, demanded an inquiry into the cow milk's disappearance. Other complaints include the non-performance of sacred offerings such as Pulihora, Perugannam, Gudannam, and Pancha Bhaksha Paramannam during Sri Chakra Archana. The man at the center of the controversy, Surapureddy Venkanna Babu, reportedly began his career as a daily-wage NMR worker earning ₹50 per day on the recommendation of then-MP Pilli Subhash Chandra Bose. Between 2006 and 2008, he worked as a sanitary mason. His salary increased gradually from ₹2,000 to ₹7,000 over a few years.

Rain Alert for Andhra Pradesh Today and

The Amaravati Meteorological Department has issued a rain forecast for Andhra Pradesh, predicting light to moderate rainfall today and tomorrow across several parts of the state. The weather office also warned of strong surface winds blowing at speeds of 40 to 50 kilometers per hour. According to officials, thundershowers are likely in parts of north coastal Andhra and the Yanam region over the next 48 hours. Meanwhile, areas in south coastal Andhra and Rayalaseema are expected to re-

ceive light rainfall. In the last 24 hours, Srisailam received the highest recorded rainfall at 40 mm, followed by Rajahmundry with 30 mm. Other rainfall totals include Chittoor (19 mm), Amalapuram (18 mm), Kambham and Kakinada (13 mm each), Yanam and Nellore (6.6 mm), Tanuku (4.8 mm), Bapatla (4.3 mm), and Kavali (4 mm). The Meteorological Department has advised the public to remain alert, particularly in regions prone to heavy winds, and take necessary precautions. Fishermen and coastal residents are also urged to stay updated with official warnings.

Incidentally, Barrinkalapadu is also Balaraju's native village. A new office and residence have reportedly come up there recently. Earlier, the gambling operations were said to

be happening near Garapati Makam. But after a warning from the SP, a new and "creative" plan was made. According to the locals, all vehicles now park near the MLA's newly built office. From there, participants move to the nearby old house of the MLA — where all the poker arrangements have been made.

Poker games are said to be running day and night. Locals say ₹10 crore games are happening in a single day — indicating the massive scale. They claim the setup has been functioning like this for the past 15 days. Cars from Chhattisgarh are also reportedly arriving. The entire affair is said to be managed by Kumarababu. The MLA is alleged to be visiting the spot every morning and evening for attendance, and spending the rest of his time outside attending to other duties. Whether the local police know about this, or whether they are unable or unwilling to stop it — or if the MLA has "purchased" their silence — is unclear. However, the people of the region are now demanding an investigation. If the MLA is innocent, then the real culprits should be brought to light to protect his image, they say.

Yesterday, Bhimavaram witnessed a similar incident. Today, it's Polavaram. Poker dens seem to be thriving in multiple places. Is this what the government means by creating a "Healthy, Wealthy, and Happy" state? Are investments flowing in this form? What are the administrative and police systems doing? It's time for experienced leaders like Chandrababu Naidu to comment on such developments. Jana Sena chief Pawan Kalyan too is expected to examine what's going on especially since several of his party MLAs are now part of the Assembly.

Sharmila Slams Jagan Over Singhaiah's Death

Sharmila calls the convoy incident a "horrifying tragedy"

Andhra Pradesh Congress President Y S Sharmila has launched a scathing attack on YSR Congress chief Jagan Mohan Reddy, holding him responsible for the tragic death of Singhaiah, who was crushed under a convoy vehicle during a recent political event. Taking to social media, Sharmila called the incident "horrifying" and demanded answers from both Jagan and the ruling coalition government.

"Who gave you the right to take people's lives?" she asked, referring to the disturbing visuals of Singhaiah falling under Jagan's vehicle. Sharmila questioned how the convoy could continue moving despite the fatal accident and accused Jagan of showing a complete lack of responsibility as a leader. Sharmila also pointed out the

Coalition Govt Violating Constitution Again: Jagan

Former Chief Minister and YSR Congress Party chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy has accused the TDP-led NDA coalition government in Andhra Pradesh of once again violating the Constitution by attempting to raise funds through non-convertible debentures (NCDs) issued by the Andhra Pradesh Mineral Development Corporation (APMDC).

In a scathing attack, Jagan said that the government is preparing to issue these bonds on June 24. despite the matter being sub judice in the Andhra Pradesh High Court, which has already issued notices in the case. He described this move as a blatant abuse of power and a direct threat to the state's future and financial au-

Jagan alleged that the state's Consolidated Fund is being accessed by private entities without the approval of the legislature, violating Articles 203 and 204 of the Constitution of India. He also asserted that using the Consolidated Fund as collateral to raise loans through APMDC contravenes Article 293(1).

Furthermore, the YSRCP chief raised serious concerns that the bondholders have been granted exclusive rights over the entire future revenues of APMDC, and that the state's mineral wealth—



being pledged as security. "This is nothing short of mortgaging the future of Andhra Pradesh," Jagan

He emphasized that no government has ever allowed such direct access to state funds by private players, bypassing legislative procedures. "This is not just administrative recklessness; it is constitutional impropriety of the highest order," he said.

Jagan questioned the timing of the bond issuance, pointing out that since the case is currently being heard by the High Court, proceeding with the NCDs before the court's verdict amounts to disrespecting judicial authority.

In his statement, Jagan remarked: "It is extremely regrettable that the government is acting in complete disregard of the Constitution and the state's future.

Man dies after being run over by Jagan's convoy

Criminal Case Against YCP Leader Sajjala

Complaint by SC Corporation Director over remarks on Amaravati women

Following the receipt of the complaint, the Tadepalli police conducted a preliminary inquiry and booked a criminal case against Sajjala Ramakrishna Reddy under relevant sections of the IPC. Police sources confirmed that a detailed investigation is underway, and further action will depend on the outcome of the probe. The issue has sparked political tension, especially given Sajjala's key position within the YSR Congress Party. More reactions are expected from various women's groups and political parties in the coming days.



YSRCP leader faces charges for violating prohibitory orders

YSR Congress Party senior leader and former minister Ambati Rambabu is facing fresh legal trouble with multiple cases registered against him for violations during party chief Jagan Mohan Reddy's recent visit to Rentapalla in Palnadu district.

According to police sources, FIRs were lodged against Ambati and several other YSRCP leaders at Nallapadu and Old Guntur police stations for violating prohibitory orders issued in the area during Jagan's visit. The leaders allegedly disregarded Section 144 restrictions and gathered at the location in defiance of police instructions. In a more serious development, the Sattenapalli Rural Police registered an addi-



tional FIR against Ambati following an incident at Korrapadu. Ambati, accompanied by his brother Murali, reportedly removed police barricades, argued with officers on duty, and pushed personnel who attempted to prevent their movement. The situation escalated, leading to charges of obstruction and assault.

Based on the complaint filed by the police, the Sattenapalli Rural Police invoked IPC Sections 188 (disobedience to an order duly promulgated by a public servant), 332 (voluntarily causing hurt to deter public servant from duty), 353 (assault or criminal force to deter public servant from discharge of duty), and 427 (mischief causing damage).

These developments have further intensified the legal challenges faced by the YS-RCP leader in the wake of the party's recent activities in Palnadu.





Corruption Allegations Mount Against Patamata Sub-Registrar Nalmala Revanth

Vijayawada: Serious allegations of corruption have surfaced against Patamata Sub-Registrar Nalmala Revanth, with multiple reports indicating his deep involvement in illegal registrations, bribery, and abuse of power. Revanth, who is already under scrutiny for several questionable land registrations, is now being accused of turning the Patamata Sub-Registrar office into a hub of corruption.

In one of the most glaring instances, the land of Katthi Sirisha (W/o B.V.V. Prasad Reddy), a 55-year-old woman from Tirupati, was fraudulently registered using a fake identity under the same name (K. Sirisha) istration was completed under document number 23998/2024. Following the discovery of the fraud, a complaint was filed at Tiruchanur Police Station in Tirupati, leading to FIR No. 63/2024 being registered. Ten people have been named in the case, and so far, five—including a man named Nagaraju from Vijayawada—have been arrested.

According to sources, Revanth is allegedly involved in converting land value from yards to acres and reducing the government valuation to evade proper stamp duty, directly impacting state revenue. For every registration, he is said to be collecting a 1% bribe openly, with the vanth allegedly told him, high-

at the Patamata office. The reg-help of two private aides—Sunny and Tammareddy Kiran who reportedly manage the bribe collection process at the registration office.

It is also alleged that if any dis-

crepancies or "loopholes" exist

in documents, Revanth demands between 2% to 5% as a bribe. Failure to comply reportedly results in denial of registration or delayed processing. In a shocking instance of disrespect, an 85-year-old retired IAS officer, who had previously served as Commissioner in the Vijayawada Municipal Corporation, was not even offered a chair while waiting at the office. "See the color of your hair before you question me," Relighting a pattern of arrogance and high-handedness.

Further allegations claim that the registered documents are kept in a private locker under Revanth's control and only released after payment is made to Sunny. Even after government challans are paid, documents reportedly remain locked until the bribe is received.

Even for basic services, such as obtaining market value certificates, which officially cost ₹10, Revanth's office allegedly charges ₹300. Similarly, exorbitant amounts are being extracted for marriage certificates, encumbrance certificates (ECs), and stamp papers. Revanth, who formerly worked in the IG office, is now accused



of misusing his access to statewide registrar data, including lands under Section 22A and church properties. In an audacious remark reportedly made to staff, he claimed:

"I have details of corrupt registrars and IGs across the state. I only registered Christian lands—others did worse. If ACB touches me, I'll expose the bribes I've paid them monthly." These revelations have sent shockwaves across the registration and law enforcement communities. With references to bribe payments to ACB officials, the situation is not only a matter of departmental misconduct but possibly a larger systemic failure.

Calls are now growing louder for an independent inquiry, possibly by the CBI or Vigilance and Enforcement, to investigate the full extent of corruption and hold all complicit officials accountable.



Guntur's Sankar Vilas Flyover: A Dream Takes Shape

Guntur: The long-awaited Sankar Vilas Road Over Bridge (ROB) is set to transform Guntur's traffic landscape as construction begins on June 23 from the AC College side. This four-lane flyover, a vital link to the Vijayawada highway, addresses years of congestion at Sankar Vilas Centre. The ₹98 crore project, funded by the Central Road and Infrastructure Fund (CRIF), owes its progress to Union Minister of State for Rural Development and Guntur MP Dr. Pemmasani Chandra Sekhar. Dr. Pemmasani secured the funds eight months ago and has driven progress through relentless coordination. On June 13, he chaired a review

meeting to streamline efforts among Traffic, Electricity, and Guntur Municipal Corporation (GMC) officials. Despite early delays from land acquisition disputes and incomplete designs, the project is now advancing swiftly.

On June 20, Guntur District Collector S. Nagalakshmi reviewed preparations at the Collector's chamber, directing officials to implement traffic diversions from June 23.

Attended by the Roads and Buildings Department, GMC, traffic police, and contractor engineers, the meeting focused on minimizing congestion. Collector Nagalakshmi instructed Traffic Circle Inspector Ashok Kumar to ensure smooth

execution of the diversion plan and urged GMC officials to level roads near the three existing bridges for seamless vehicle flow. She also emphasized public awareness, directing officials to publicize alternate routes via press releases and social media.

Traffic diversions will route heavy vehicles through Chillies Point, Inner Ring Road, and Autonagar, while light vehicles can use Arundelpet or Kankaragunta Flyover. Challenges persist, including incomplete diversion roads and a fourmonth closure of Three-Bridges Junction for railway work. Nonetheless, with Dr. Pemmasani's oversight and GMC's infrastructure upgrades, the flyover promises smoother commutes and economic growth for Guntur.

Iron Dome Under Fire: Can Israel's Air **Defences Withstand Prolonged Conflict?**

Israel's renowned Iron Dome air defence system is facing its toughest test yet amid an unprecedented barrage of Iranian missile and drone attacks. As the conflict stretches into its eighth day, questions are mounting about whether the system can hold the line in a prolonged confrontation.

On June 19, Iran confirmed a new wave of coordinated strikes targeting military sites in Haifa and Tel Aviv, escalating tensions sharply. Among the sites hit was Soroka Hospital in southern Israel, prompting a forceful Israeli counter-attack. Reports suggest Israel struck Iranian-linked nuclear sites in response, with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu warning he would not rule out targeting Iran's Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei. Defence Minister Israel Katz directly blamed Khamenei for the hospital attack. While videos have surfaced showing some missiles slipping past Israel's air defences, retired Brigadier General Amir Avivi, chairman of the Israel Defense and Security Forum,

While under intense strain, Israel's layered air defence strategy—spearheaded by Iron Dome, David's Sling, and Arrow systems—appears to be holding. For now, Avivi insists the Iron Dome remains dependable. But as attacks continue and footage reveals occasional breaches, the longterm resilience of Israel's defences is increasingly under the spotlight.

Carlos Alcaraz and the Dawn of a New Tennis Era

Carlos Alcaraz's rise is no longer just a promise—it's history in the making. On June 8, 2025, at just 22, the Spaniard pulled off one of the greatest comebacks in Grand Slam history, cementing his place among tennis royalty. In the French Open final, he clawed back from two sets down and saved three Championship points against Jannik Sinner to defend his Roland Garros crown. Only two men in the Open Era had ever done that in a Slam final—Gaston Gaudio in 2004 and Novak Djokovic in 2019. Alcaraz became the third.

His fifth Grand Slam title makes him the third youngest man to achieve that milestone, after Bjorn Borg and Rafael Nadal. But what truly sets Alcaraz apart is not just his age or number of trophies—it's how well-rounded and versatile his game already is. He's won majors on hard courts (US Open), grass (Wimbledon), and now twice on clay (French Open), a feat that even some of the sport's greats took years to accomplish.

Alcaraz's game is a rare hybrid. He brings the defensive grit and speed of Djokovic, the creativity and touch of Federer, and the explosive topspin of Nadal. Former champions like Andre Agassi have already begun comparing him to all three. And it's not just talk—statistically and stylistically, Alcaraz is showing traits that resemble the Big 3, all rolled into one. Much of this success is rooted in his early start and sol-



id team. Born into a tennis family, Alcaraz was handed a racquet at four by his father, a coach in Murcia. His raw talent was soon discovered by Albert Molina, who later brought him under the wing of former world No. 1 Juan Carlos Ferrero. Since 2019, Ferrero has been instrumental in shaping Alcaraz's mental and tactical development, guiding him through each breakthrough with the discipline of a seasoned pro.

Alcaraz's comeback at Roland Garros this year wasn't just about tennis. It was a mental battle. Down love-40 at 3-5 in the fourth set against Sinner, with three Championship points against him, most would've crumbled. But Alcaraz held firm, turned the match around, and outlasted Sinner in a fifth-set tie-break to win the longest final ever played at the venue—5 hours and 29 minutes.

The rivalry with Jannik Sinner is now shaping up as the defining battle of this generation.

The Long Undoing: Why the Muslim World Is in Crisis

From the rubble of Aleppo to the ravaged neighborhoods of Gaza and the scarred plains of Iraq, a grim portrait of the modern Muslim world emerges—one marked by endless conflict, external manipulation, and internal decay. The devastation is not due to fate or faith but the result of a complex interplay of colonial legacies, geopolitical opportunism, and authoritarian governance.

Critics often reduce the Muslim world's plight to cultural backwardness or religious extremism. Others blame the West for its relentless interventions and double standards. Both narratives contain truths, yet neither fully captures the depth of the crisis. The truth lies in the long arc of history, where Western imperial ambitions, Cold War alignments, and modern proxy wars have repeatedly undermined sovereign governance, leaving fractured states and broken societies in their wake.

After the Ottoman Empire's fall, colonial powers carved up the Middle East to suit their interests, not the aspirations of its people. The Sykes-Picot



Agreement divided lands arbitrarily, birthing states like Iraq, Syria, and Lebanon, not through organic nation-building but through strategic calculus. These fault lines, inherited

without reconciliation, have since fueled coups, civil wars, and sectarian strife.

The U.S.-led invasions of Iraq and Afghanistan, NATO's toppling of

Gaddafi in Libya, and decades of regime-change policies have brought more harm than hope. Iraq's collapse post-2003 invited ISIS. Syria became a global battleground. Afghanistan remains under Taliban control despite two decades of foreign intervention. Iran now faces a similar threat—isolated, sanctioned, and painted as the next domino.

Meanwhile, U.S. allies like Saudi Arabia and the UAE, despite autocratic rule and rights abuses, face little scrutiny, revealing Western hypocrisy. This selective morality breeds resentment and radicalism, turning grievance into ideology.

The Muslim world doesn't need more warplanes or foreign blueprints. It needs space to rebuild—economically, socially, and politically. The global order must abandon the myth that democracy can be delivered through drones. Instead, it must invest in civil societies, education, and local leadership.

Until the world acknowledges the shared responsibility for this ruin and chooses justice over expedience the cycle will continue. And the ruins will not remain contained to West Asia; they will echo far beyond. The time for principled action is now.





PM Modi speaks to Iranian President, reiterates call for de-escalation

Prime Minister Narendra Modi conveyed India's "deep concern" over the escalating conflict between Iran and Israel, urging immediate de-escalation through "dialogue and diplomacy." Modi's phone call to Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian came just hours after the US launched airstrikes on three major Iranian nuclear facilities—Fordow, Natanz, and Isfahan—marking America's direct entry into the Israel-Iran confrontation.

In a social media post, Modi expressed worry over the recent escalation and emphasized that peaceful dialogue remains the only path to restoring regional peace, security, and stability. "We discussed in detail about the current situation. Expressed deep concern at the recent escalations," Modi said. He reiterated India's call for immediate de-escalation and diplomatic engagement to prevent further deterioration.

The US strikes, carried out by B-2 bombers, effectively destroyed key Iranian nuclear sites, with President Donald Trump declaring the facilities "completely and totally obliterated." This aggressive move has raised fears of a broader regional conflict, prompting calls for restraint from global powers.



Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi condemned the US action as a "grave violation" of the UN Charter, international law, and the nuclear non-proliferation treaty. He described the attack on Iran's "peaceful nuclear installations" as "outrageous" and warned that Iran reserves all options to defend its sovereignty.

The European Union, representing 27 nations, urged all parties to step back and return to ne-

gotiations. EU High Representative Kaja Kallas called for calm and announced that EU foreign ministers would discuss the crisis further on Monday.

The UK and many other countries also appealed for restraint, while China and Russia have yet to issue official statements regarding the unfolding situation triggered by the US bombing campaign.

As US Bombs Iran, Asaduddin Owaisi Questions **Pakistan's Nobel Prize Nomination for Trump**

As the US joined Israel in bombing Iranian nuclear facilities, AIMIM chief and Hyderabad MP Asaduddin Owaisi took a sharp dig at Pakistan, questioning their move to recommend US President Donald Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize.

Pakistan announced it would nominate Trump for the Nobel Prize, praising his intervention during the recent India-Pakistan conflict triggered by the Pahalgam terror attack. Islamabad described Trump's role as that of a "genuine peacemaker." However, just after the US airstrikes on Iran's Fordow, Natanz, and Esfahan nuclear sites, Pakistan expressed "grave East. It condemned the strikes as violations of to Pakistan's complex ties with the US. international law and affirmed Iran's right to self-defense under the UN Charter.



Reacting to these developments, Owaisi challenged Pakistan, sarcastically asking if they really want Trump to receive the Nobel Prize for his military actions. "Did their General (Pakistan Field Marshal Asim Munir) have dinner concern" over the escalation in the Middle with Trump for this?" he questioned, pointing

Owaisi also criticized the narrative around of wider conflict.

Iran's alleged nuclear weapons program, calling it a repeated "bogey" used to justify attacks. He referenced similar claims used against Iraq and Libya that ultimately proved unfounded.

The US President called Iran the "bully of the Middle East" and warned that if Iran did not seek peace, future attacks would be even more devastating. Meanwhile, Iran condemned the US strikes as "brutal military aggression" and a serious breach of the UN Charter. The Iranian Foreign Ministry accused the US of acting in collusion with Israel and expressed outrage over what it described as American hostility toward Iran's sovereignty and peace efforts.

Jaishankar on Neighbourhood Ties: "No Smooth Sailing, But Collective Stability Is Key"

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar has acknowledged that India should not expect "smooth sailing" all the time in its relationships with neighbouring countries. Speaking during an interactive session, he stressed that New Delhi has focused on building a "collective interest" to ensure inherent stability in the region, regardless of which regime is in power.

Jaishankar pointed out that while most neighbours eventually see the benefits of cooperating with India, Pakistan remains an exception due to its "in-built hostility" shaped by its military. "If you put Pakistan aside, the logic will apply everywhere else," he said.

On evolving global dynamics, the minister highlighted the unpredictability of the U.S. but emphasized India's strategy of strengthening multiple linkages to stabilize relations. Regarding China, he noted that India had to "prepare capabilities" and improve border infrastructure—a previously neglected area—to defend national interests, especially after the 2020 Galwan clash. Jaishankar also underscored the progress made under Prime Minister Narendra Modi in deepening ties with the neighbourhood, Gulf countries, ASEAN, and the Indo-Pacific. He described Modi as a "leader of his times" who has provided clear goals and pathways for India's foreign policy.

Addressing regional volatility, Jaishankar cited examples from Sri Lanka, Maldives, and Nepal to illustrate how India manages changes in regimes without losing bilateral momentum. He emphasized creating systems and shared interests to maintain stability despite political shifts.

On counter-terrorism, Jaishankar called the 2008 Mumbai attacks a turning point that ended decades of a conciliatory approach towards Pakistan. The Modi government's military responses, including the Uri and Balakot strikes, established a "new normal" of proactive measures against terror threats. Jaishankar concluded that counter-terrorism and Jammu & Kashmir policy reforms reflect "holistic thinking," aiming for long-term national security and regional stability.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Cancels India Visit Again Amid Middle East Tensions

Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdelatty has postponed his planned visit to India for the second time, with no official reason provided. The trip, scheduled for this week, was set to include a meeting with India's External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar in New Delhi. However, officials confirmed that the previous advisory about the visit should now be disregarded.

Abdelatty's earlier visit, initially planned for February 2025, was also cancelled. While no formal explanation has been given, sources suggest the cancellation is linked to the rising tensions in the Middle East, especially following the United States' decision to join Israel's military offensive against Iran.

India and Egypt have strengthened ties in recent years, upgrading their relationship to a Strategic Partnership during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's 2023 visit to Cairo. That same year, Egyptian President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi was the chief guest at India's Republic Day celebrations, marking a high point in bilateral relations.

Amid the ongoing Israel-Iran conflict, triggered by Israel's "Operation Rising Lion" launched on June 13, Egypt has gained strategic importance as a potential evacuation corridor for Indian nationals stranded in Israel.

Defence cooperation between India and Egypt has also deepened since Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's visit to Cairo in 2022. Following



that, both countries signed a memorandum of understanding to boost military collaboration. They have since held ten meetings of the Joint Defence Committee (JDC), the key platform for coordinating defence efforts, with the latest session conducted in New Delhi last year.

As regional instability grows, Egypt's role in India's diplomatic and strategic plans in the Middle East remains critical, even as Abdelatty's visit faces postponement once again.

India's Power Sector Sees Rapid Growth, Renewable Energy Surges



India's power sector has witnessed remarkable expansion over the past decade, fueled by rising demand, infrastructure development, and strong government policies supporting both conventional and renewable energy. The country's total installed power capacity jumped over 56%, from 305 gigawatts (GW) in 2015–16 to 476 GW as of June 2025.

Electricity generation also rose significantly, from 1,168 billion units (BU) in 2015–16 to an estimated 1,824 BU in 2024–25. Meanwhile, power shortages have dramatically reduced, dropping from 4.2% in 2013-14 to just 0.1% in 2024-25. Over 28 million households were electrified during this period, with per capita electricity consumption increasing by nearly 46%.

Thermal power leads India's energy mix with 240 GW, but renewable energy is rapidly growing, with solar at 110.9 GW and wind power at 51.3 GW. India's transition toward cleaner energy is evident, as nearly half (49%) of the total installed capacity is now from non-fossil fuel sources—including 226.9 GW renewable and 8.8

GW nuclear power.

India is the world's fastest-growing major economy and is projected to double its share in global primary energy consumption by 2035. The country has set an ambitious goal of achieving 500 GW of installed electricity capacity from non-fossil fuel sources by 2030, aligning with its COP26 commitments.

Renewable energy capacity has nearly tripled since 2014, growing from 76.37 GW to 226.79 GW. Solar capacity skyrocketed more than 39 times—from 2.82 GW in 2014 to 110.9 GW in 2025—with 23.83 GW added in the last year alone. Manufacturing capacity has also surged, with solar PV module production increasing 38fold and solar cell capacity 21-fold.

India is also a global leader in wind energy, ranking 4th worldwide in installed capacity. The country is advancing in offshore wind development and strengthening its manufacturing ecosystem, further supporting its energy transition and sustainability goals.







Zelenskyy Accuses Russia of Returning Dead Soldiers in Prisoner Exchanges

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has publicly condemned Russia for sending back the bodies of at least 20 deceased Russian soldiers during recent exchanges involving prisoners of war and fallen troops. Speaking to The Guardian, Zelenskyy described the act as a grim and disrespectful gesture, stating, "They threw the corpses of their citizens at us."

According to Zelenskyy, the returned remains were part of the ongoing prisoner swaps and exchanges of war dead between the two countries amid the prolonged conflict. The Ukrainian leader highlighted the disturbing nature of these returns, emphasizing the toll the war is exacting on both sides. Among the bodies returned was reportedly an individual identified as an "Israeli mercenary" fighting alongside Russian forces, reflecting the complex and multinational composition of troops involved in the conflict. Zelenskyy did not provide further details on this mercenary but suggested that the identities of many of the deceased have been difficult to confirm.

The Ukrainian president also revealed that some of the returned bodies were found to still carry Russian passports, raising questions about the authenticity of Russia's military casualties and the circumstances surrounding the deaths. This detail hinted at possible irregularities or attempts by Moscow to obscure the full extent of its losses.

While the exchange of prisoners and bodies is a grim but necessary aspect of warfare, Zelenskyy's remarks underscored the strained relations and deep mistrust between Kyiv and Moscow. The handling of war dead remains a sensitive and poignant issue as the conflict continues to devastate lives and escalate tensions. Zelenskyy's accusation sheds light on the harsh realities of the Ukraine-Russia war, emphasizing the human cost and the ongoing challenges in managing the aftermath of battlefield casualties.

"Devastated Iran's Nuclear **Programme**": Pentagon Chief **On Op Midnight Hammer**

US Defence Secretary Pete Hegseth confirmed that American military strikes have "devastated the Iranian nuclear programme" following a coordinated attack on Iran's key nuclear facilities. Speaking at a Pentagon briefing, Hegseth revealed the operation, named Operation Midnight Hammer, was executed under direct orders from President Donald Trump after months of secret planning and strategic deception.

The campaign targeted Iran's primary enrichment sites at Natanz, Isfahan, and Fordow, involving over 125 aircraft, including stealthy B-2 bombers, 14 GBU-57 bunker-buster bombs, and more than 30 Tomahawk missiles launched from submarines in the Persian Gulf and Arabian Sea. The attacks, carried out between 2:00 and 3:30 AM local time, were designed for maximum surprise, disabling Iran's air defenses through simultaneous air and sea strikes.

General Dan Caine, who oversaw the operation, stated the strikes caused severe structural damage to all three sites, though assessments of Iran's remaining nuclear capacity continue. He emphasized the precision and speed of the attack, noting no civilian areas or troop formations were targeted. President Trump called the mission a "spectacular military success" in a late-night White House address, warning Iran of peace or "tragedy." The strikes followed a failed round of nuclear talks in Rome and came after Iran rejected a US ultimatum demanding new disarmament conditions.

US Bears "Full Responsibility" For Consequences Of Strikes On N-Facilities: Iran

Iran's Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi declared that diplomacy is no longer enough following US airstrikes targeting three Iranian nuclear installations in Fordow, Natanz, and Esfahan. Speaking hours after the missile strikes, Araghchi emphasized that Iran now prioritizes self-defense over diplomatic efforts.

"The situation has fundamentally changed. My country has come under direct attack," Araghchi stated. "The most dangerous escalation occurred last night. A red line was crossed with the attack on our nuclear facilities. This was not merely provocation but a direct assault on our national sovereignty and a violation of global norms."

He criticized the international



community, particularly the United Nations, for failing to uphold respect for Iran's sovereignty and the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT). "Despite being a non-nuclear state, Iran has honored the NPT, us. Why should Iran continue to trust a framework that offers no real security guarantees?" he questioned, highlighting what he called "double standards" and "aggression cloaked in diplomacy."

but the treaty has failed to protect Iran's Foreign Ministry also condemned the US as "aggressive and lawless," holding it "fully responsible" for the "extremely dangerous consequences" of the airstrikes. The statement accused the US of betraying diplomatic processes and supporting the "genocidal Israeli regime," thereby initiating a "dangerous war against Iran."

In response, US President Donald Trump justified the strikes, calling Iran "the bully of the Middle East" and warning that "future attacks will be far greater and a lot easier" if Iran does not pursue peace. Trump cited Iran's history of hostility toward the US and Israel, referencing attacks on American personnel over the past decades.

The escalating tensions mark a critical turning point in US-Iran relations, casting doubt on any near-term prospects for diplomatic resolution.

China's New Military Weapon: Tiny Mosquito Drone Could Change Warfare Forever

China has introduced a groundbreaking military innovation—a tiny drone the size of a mosquito that could revolutionize covert operations and battlefield reconnaissance. Developed by a robotics lab at the National University of Defence Technology (NUDT) in Hunan province, this micro drone is designed for stealthy information gathering in hostile environments, according to a report by the South China Morning Post.

Micro drones like this mosquito-sized robot represent the future of surveillance technology due to their extremely small size and agility. These drones are not only valuable for military use but also hold potential to transform various industries with their unique



capabilities.

US Bombs 3 Nuclear Sites In Iran, Tehran And Israel Trade New Strikes

The United States launched a major military strike on Sunday, targeting three key Iranian nuclear facilities at Fordow, Natanz, and Esfahan. The air and submarine assault marked the first US attack inside Iran since the 1979 revolution, signaling a dramatic escalation in the ongoing conflict involving Israel and Iran.

Speaking from the Oval Office, US President Donald Trump declared the mission a "spectacular military success," announcing that Iran's nuclear enrichment sites were

"completely and totally obliterated." He warned Tehran that further strikes would be swift and more devastating if they refused to seek peace. "Iran, the bully of the Middle East, must now make peace. If they do not, future attacks will be far greater and a lot easier," Trump

Shortly after the US strikes, Iran retaliated with a missile barrage targeting Israeli cities including Haifa and Tel Aviv, injuring at least 11 civilians and reportedly hitting Ben Gurion Airport near Tel Aviv. The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps

(IRGC) claimed responsibility for firing over 20 missiles in this counterattack.

In response, the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) launched a series of precision strikes on military targets in western Iran, including missile launchers used against Israeli territory. The intensifying exchange began last Friday when Israel initiated "Operation Rising Lion," aiming to halt Iran's nuclear ambitions by targeting scientists and military infrastructure. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu praised Trump's decision, saying, "Your bold decision to target Iran's nuclear facilities with the awesome and righteous might of the United States will change history." He reiterated the mantra "Peace through strength," emphasizing that military power precedes diplomatic resolution.

The conflict has already caused significant casualties, with over 600 deaths reported in Iran and dozens in Israel, as missile and drone attacks escalate across the region. The situation remains volatile as both nations prepare for potential further confrontations.



World's Largest **Banks Boost Fossil** Fuel Financing by **\$162 Billion in 2024**

SBI Among Top Increasers



Tn a worrying development Ifor global climate efforts, the world's 65 biggest banks increased their financing for fossil fuel companies by \$162 billion in 2024, reaching a total of \$869 billion compared to \$707 billion in 2023. This marks a significant reversal from the previous trend of declining investments in fossil fuels, according to the Fossil Fuel Finance Report 2025 published by the Banking on Climate Chaos Coalition—a group of eight environmental organizations.

Among nearly 50 major banks that ramped up their fossil fuel funding last year is India's State Bank of India (SBI), which increased its financing by \$65 million. This rise in fossil fuel support is particularly troubling at a time when global climate goals require urgent cuts in emissions and a shift toward renewable energy.

The report highlights the critical concern that expanding fossil fuel infrastructure now will "lock in" decades of dependence on oil, gas, and coal. The International Energy Agency's 2024 Energy Investment Outlook underlines that to achieve net zero emissions globally by 2050, investments in

fossil fuels must be reduced by more than half by 2030. However, the surge in bank financing runs counter to this necessary reduction, potentially jeopardizing global climate targets.

"This growth in fossil fuel finance is troubling," the report states, stressing that continued bank lending to fossil fuel companies undermines efforts to combat climate change. The increased capital flow into oil, gas, and coal sectors delays the energy transition and encourages further exploration and extraction activities.

Environmental advocates urge banks worldwide to redirect their investments toward sustainable and renewable energy projects to align financial flows with the goals of the Paris Agreement and the broader fight against climate

India Increases Oil Imports from Russia and the U.S. Amid Middle East Turmoil

Tndia has significantly boost-**L**ed its crude oil imports from Russia and the United States in June, surpassing combined supplies from traditional Middle Eastern suppliers like Saudi Arabia and Iraq. This shift comes amid heightened market volatility following Israel's recent military strikes on Iranian nuclear sites and the U.S. military's subsequent attack on Iran's nuclear facilities early Sunday.

Traditionally dependent on Middle Eastern supfrom global trade analytics to 439,000 bpd in June from pliers, India began increasing its Russian oil imports significantly after Russia's invasion of Ukraine in early 2022. Russian crude has been attractive due to its steep discounts caused by Western sanctions and reduced European demand. As a result, Russia's share in India's oil imports surged from less than 1% to roughly 40-44% in a short span.

Despite the ongoing conflict in the Middle East, oil supply chains remain intact for now. However, experts warn that tanker activity suggests a future decline in crude loadings from the Gulf region. Shipowners are reportedly reluctant to send empty tankers back to the Gulf amid instability, with the number of such vessels dropping drastically. This could tighten supplies from the Middle East, potentially forcing India to further adjust its sourcing

The Strait of Hormuz remains a critical chokepoint for oil exports from Saudi Arabia, Iran, Iraq, Kuwait, and the UAE, as well as for liquefied natural gas shipments from Qatar. Any disruption here could have wide-reaching effects on global energy mar-

Net Direct Tax Collection Declines 1.39% to ₹4.59 Lakh Crore in April-June

Net direct tax collections for the April-June period of the current fiscal stood at ₹4.59 lakh crore, marking a 1.39% decline compared to the same period last year, government data released on June 21, 2025, revealed. The slowdown is mainly attributed to sluggish advance tax collections and a dip in corporate tax revenues.

Advance tax collection for April 1 to June 19, 2025, grew marginally by 3.87% to ₹1.56 lakh crore, a significant slowdown from the robust 27% growth recorded in the same period last year. Corporate tax

collections fell over 5% year-on-year, amounting to about ₹1.73 lakh crore during this period.

On the other hand, non-corporate tax collections, primarily comprising personal income tax, showed a slight increase of 0.7%, reaching ₹2.73 lakh crore. Securities Transaction Tax (STT) also saw a healthy 12% rise, totaling ₹13,013 crore.



The overall gross direct tax collection for the fiscal so far stood at ₹5.45 lakh crore, reflecting a growth of 4.86% compared to last year. However, the increase in refund issuances, which surged 58% to ₹86,385 crore, affected the net collections.

Breaking down advance tax figures further, corporate tax advance collections

grew by 5.86% to ₹1.22 lakh crore, while non-corporate advance tax dropped 2.68% to ₹33,928 crore. The total advance tax collected across sectors stood at ₹1.55 lakh crore during April to June 19.

This mixed performance highlights challenges in maintaining steady growth in direct tax revenues, amid evolving economic conditions and taxpayer behavior.

Poor catching let India down—Jadeja dropped Duckett early, and Jaiswal shelled a crucial catch off Pope, who went on to score a fluent unbeaten 100.

Flamengo Stun Chelsea 3-1 at Club World Cup as Bayern **Prepare for Boca Clash**






