Telangana: Who will get the Telangana BJP chair? That's the question that has taken over political discussions within the BJP and beyond. With the BJP's organizational reshuffle gaining momentum across the country, Telangana remains one of the few key states where the party is yet to name a new state president. The BJP is rolling ahead with structural revamps in various states, but the decision on Telangana's leadership has been hanging for months. With local body elections just three months away, the high command is now reportedly focusing its attention on the leadership issue here. Sources say the party is preparing to hand over the reins to a new leader, replacing the current state president, Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy.

The national-level organizational elecmay offer a clue tions are being held in phases. Recently,

like Maharashtra, Uttarakhand, and West Bengal, and notifications have been released for Andhra Pradesh and Tripura. So far, new presidents have been appointed in 14 states. This momentum has led to intense speculation that Telangana's turn is next.

Within the state unit, several leaders are said to be in the race — MPs Etala Rajender, Dharmapuri Arvind, DK Aruna, Raghunandan Rao, and Bandi Sanjay Kumar among the frontrunners. Even though some of them maintain that they are not actively vying for the post, their internal lobbying tells a different story.

Among all names, Etala Rajender seems election officers were appointed for states to be leading the race. His strong BC (OBC)

background fits neatly into the BJP's national strategy of empowering backward communities. With the party keen on expanding its influence in Telangana — a state it believes is within reach — Etala's grassroots appeal and political experience are seen as major assets.

Dharmapuri Arvind, the Nizamabad MP, is also a strong contender. He's a firebrand with a good media presence, deep connections in Delhi, and popularity among youth for his direct, no-nonsense political style. If the leadership wants to energize the base with a more aggressive approach, Arvind could emerge as the preferred choice.

Meanwhile, if the party opts for continu-

ity, there's always the option of Kishan Reddy staying on. However, insiders suggest he's not too keen on continuing in the role. The name of Bandi Sanjay, who previously served as the party chief, is also doing rounds. His hardline Hindutva stance and sharp oratory helped boost the party's profile in the past, but internal tensions during his term may work against his reappointment.

Others like former MLC Ram Chandra Rao, who has a long association with the party and RSS roots, are also being considered. And if the high command wants to project

a woman leader, then DK Aruna becomes a strong candidate.

Telangana: The Telangana government's ambitious promise to implement 42% reservation for Backward Classes (BCs) in local body elections has hit a major roadblock, pushing the administration into a legal and constitutional crisis. Despite passing two bills in the Legislative Assembly and Council, the government is unable to move forward as the President has not yet approved the legislation.

The situation has become more critical after the High Court ordered that the reservation process for panchayat elections be completed within 30 days.

This deadline has forced the Congress government to explore all possible legal and administrative options to implement the increased quota.

The reservation proposal, which is based on the findings of a caste census conducted soon after the Congress assumed power, faces a major hurdle due to the constitutional cap of 50% total reservation. As the 42% BC quota would take the total beyond this limit, the Governor forwarded the bills to the President, recommending their inclusion in the Ninth Schedule of the Constitution.

However, the silence from Rashtrapati Bhavan since April has left the state in a bind. In response, the government is reportedly planning to send an official delegation to Delhi to urge the Centre for speedy approval. Legal experts are also being consulted on whether to directly approach the Supreme Court, citing its earlier observation that the President or Governor must act on bills within three months.

Hyderabad: The headquarters of Maha News Channel in Hyderabad was attacked on Saturday, triggering widespread outrage across political and media circles. The incident, allegedly carried out by BRS party activists, is linked to the channel's coverage of the phone tapping issue involving BRS leader K.T. Rama Rao (KTR). Protesters stormed the office, damaging studio equipment, shattering glass windows, destroying furniture, and vandalizing vehicles parked outside. Reports also indicate that staff who attempted to intervene were assaulted.

The violent attack was met with strong condemnation from top political leaders across party lines. Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy immediately responded and ordered action, while Deputy CM Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka visited the site to assess the damage firsthand and express solidarity with the media personnel.

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu condemned the attack in



the harshest terms. "Such attacks have no place in a democracy. Trying to silence the media with force is a heinous act," he said, offering full support to the Maha News management, journalists, and staff. He warned that undermining media freedom is a direct blow to democratic values.

Andhra Pradesh Deputy CM Pawan Kalyan also reacted strongly. "If anyone has objections to media reports, there are legal and democratic means to address them. Physical attacks are not only condemnable but also anti-democratic," he said. He demanded that the Telangana government take swift and strict action against the culprits and ensure such attacks are never repeated.

With widespread condemnation pouring in, there is growing pressure on the Telangana administration to identify and punish those responsible for the attack. Media organizations, press unions, and civil society groups have described the incident as an alarming threat to press freedom and have urged immediate steps to safeguard journalists from political violence.

The attack has added further tension in the ongoing political friction surrounding the phone tapping controversy, and all eyes are now on the Telangana government's response.

New Twist in Anchor Swetcha Suicide Case

Father alleges mental harassment, names live-in partner Purnachandra Rao

TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad A shocking new has development emerged in the suicide case of Telugu TV anchor Swetcha Votarkar, who was found hanging at her residence in

Jawahar Nagar, Hyderabad on Friday night. Her father has made serious allegations against her live-in partner Purnachandra Rao, accusing him of cheating and mentally harassing her under the guise of marriage.

According to the complaint filed by Sukhadu's father at the Chikkadapalli Police Station, she had been in a relationship with Purnachandra Rao after divorcing her husband five years ago. The couple had been living together along with Swetcha's daughter.

The father claimed that Purnachandra Rao had promised to marry Swetcha, but repeatedly postponed the commitment, leading to frequent fights between them. He said

that this prolonged emotional stress led his daughter to take the extreme step.

said she was upset and couldn't continue living with him. She said the arguments were unbearable. My daughter was cheated in the name of marriage. He must be punished," the grieving father told the police. Following the complaint, the po-

lice registered a case against Purnachandra Rao and have begun an investigation. The body was shifted to Gandhi Hospital for post-mortem, and officials are now gathering further evidence, including call records and witness statements.

As the investigation unfolds, this tragic incident has sparked serious conversations around emotional abuse, live-in relationships, and the mental well-being of those in the media industry.

BRS Spreading Lies on Jurala, Manjeera Projects: Uttam Kumar Reddy

Uttam Kumar Reddy launched a scathing attack on the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) for spreading false propaganda about the safety of irrigation projects such as Jurala and Manjeera, calling it a diversionary tactic to cover up their own decade-long failure to maintain them.

Speaking to the media on Saturday after inspecting the Jurala dam along with a team of ministers and MLAS, Uttam Kumar Reddy said, "CM Revanth Reddy has personally sanctioned ₹100 crore for the construction of an alternative bridge to ease vehicular pressure on the Jurala structure and to ensure long-term safety." He stressed that there is no threat to the la's capacity dropped by 20–25% due

dam, and technical teams have confirmed that all 62 gates are operational, with maintenance underway.

He dismissed the allegations over damaged gates and ropes as baseless, clarifying that four gates have already had rope replacements and another four are in the process, with the dam to be fully flood-ready by mid-July.

Uttam Kumar Reddy accused the previous BRS government of ignoring older projects like Jurala, Kalwakurthy, Manjeera, and Koilsagar in favor of massive, commission-driven ventures like Kaleshwaram. "They spent thousands of crores for new projects and let old projects decay. There was no desiltation or maintenance. Jurato silt accumulation alone," he said. He further announced that ₹300 crore was approved for a second gantry crane at Jurala, Desiltation and vegetation removal will be carried out to restore full storage, Work has begun to store 4 TMC water at Rayalampadu reservoir and Mallammakunta reservoir will be completed soon

He reminded that under the Congress government, over 1,100 engineers and 1,800 laskars have been recruited to strengthen the irrigation workforce and bring scientific, transparent governance to the sector.

Attack on Maha News Office: Bandi Sanjay Blames BRS Goons

Calls it an attack on press freedom Alleges BRS trying to divert attention from anchor suicide case Warns that "truth can't be stopped by breaking cameras"

Union Minister of State Bandi Sanjay Kumar has made sensational comments condemning the attack on the Telugu news channel Maha News office, describing it as a direct attack on press freedom and alleging that BRS party goons were behind it. He demanded that the Congress government take immediate and strict action against those responsible. Bandi Sanjay stated that the attack was not just physical damage to a building but a blow to the freedom of the press. "The BRS party, which often speaks about media values, has now resorted to destroying a media house - this exposes their dual standards," he criticized. He questioned why there were no retaliatory actions when BRS-affiliated social media supporters defamed others while in power. "Did we attack your homes then?" he asked. He alleged that this act of violence was aimed at diverting public attention from the recent suicide case of a TV anchor, where BRS leaders are facing accusations. He claimed that this was a conspiracy to silence media voices that were raising uncomfortable questions and to suppress the growing criticism against the BRS in the public domain. "You can break cameras, but not the truth. You can silence voices, but not stop questions. You can attack a channel, but you cannot kill journalism," Bandi Sanjay warned. He called the incident a criminal act under the law and stressed that people are observing everything. He urged the ruling Congress government to respond swiftly and bring the culprits to justice.

KTR Fires at Media Outlets, Warns of **Legal Action**

BRS leader accuses media of defamation, vows to confront orchestrated attacks

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has lashed out at sections of the media, accusing them of launching organized, malicious campaigns against him and his party. In a strongly worded statement on Saturday, KTR made it clear that he would pursue legal action against anyone involved in spreading defamatory content under the guise of journalism.

"Over the past few months, a few individuals posing as journalists have been deliberately spewing venom against me and the leadership of our party. These are not criticisms — they are calculated personal attacks," KTR alleged.

He said that the relentless defamation campaign has caused mental distress to his family, friends, and party workers. "We've endured enough. That's why I've decided to initiate legal proceedings against all those responsible. We know who is orchestrating these attacks — and we will face them in the appropriate forums," he asserted. KTR clarified that while he is prepared to deal with slander through the legal system, he does not endorse any form of violence. Commenting on the recent attack on the Maha News office allegedly by BRS workers, he firmly stated, "There is no room for physical attacks in a democracy." The statement comes amid growing criticism of BRS over the assault on journalists in Hyderabad. KTR's response appears to be aimed at distancing himself and the party from such incidents, even as he prepares for a legal battle over what he calls organized slander. KTR concluded by stating that freedom of the press should not be misused for personal vendetta, and added that the BRS believes in accountability — both from politicians and from the media.

BRS senior leader and former minister T. Harish Rao launched a blistering attack on the Congress government, accusing it of cheating the unemployed youth in Telangana by failing to deliver on its promise of two lakh government jobs. He sarcastically remarked that Kodandaram, Akunuri Murali, and Priyanka Gandhi got jobs, but the youth who voted with hope have been left in despair.

In a media address on Saturday, Harish Rao said the Congress, which made grand promises before the elections, is now running a "fraudulent calendar" instead of a genuine job calendar. He strongly backed the 'Chalo Sachivalayam' protest planned by unemployed groups and declared that BRS would fully support and stand by the youth.

"Before the elections, the Congress created huge expectations. The youth trusted their words, believing that job notifications would be issued on time. But not a single notification has come after coming to power. Worse, the Chief Minister is now blaming the protesting youth, saying they don't want notifications," Harish said, calling this "cruel misinformation."

He reminded that the BRS government had provided 1.62 lakh jobs during its term and said they would not rest until the Congress fulfilled its commitment of providing 2 lakh government jobs. "We will pursue the issue in the Assembly and outside until the youth get what they were promised," he affirmed.

Further, Harish Rao slammed the government for the delay in fee reimbursement arrears, raising questions about possible corruption motives behind the hold-up. "Are they delaying it to demand commissions?" he asked pointedly.

Harish Rao concluded by stating that BRS will remain at the forefront of the unemployed struggle, and expose the Congress's failures at every platform.



Attack On Maha News **Is Attack On Democracy: Minister** Ponnam

Speaking to reporters after inspecting the damaged premises, the Minister termed the attack "a direct assault on democracy" and assured that those responsible would face strict punishment.

TPN | Srikanth Gurram Hyderabad: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy on Saturday inaugurated the PJR flyover connecting Kondapur to the Outer Ring Road (ORR), promising a major relief to motorists struggling with traf-

fic snarls in Hyderabad's rapidly growing IT corridor.

Built with modern infrastructure standards, the 1.2 km-long and 24-meter-wide six-lane flyover will provide uninterrupted travel from Kondapur to ORR, bypassing

the congested Gachibowli Junction — one of the busiest intersections in the city. The flyover, now open to public use, is expected to significantly reduce travel time for vehicles heading toward Hi-Tech City, Financial District, and the Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (Shamshabad). Palm Oil Cultivation a Priority in Telangana

Call to farmers to grow high-profit crops with govt support Telangana suitable for palm oil in all 31 districts: Tummala Government offers ₹50,900 per acre subsidy for palm oil cultivation Intercropping with cocoa, sorghum, and groundnut yields higher income

Telangana Agriculture and Handloom Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao emphasized that the state government is giving top priority to palm oil cultivation across the state. He appealed to farmers to adopt profitable crops like palm oil along with suitable intercropping practices to increase income.

Speaking at Devuni Erravalli village in Chevella, Rangareddy district, on Saturday, Minister Tummala planted 1,050 palm

land belonging to Pollution Control Board member Chimpula Satyanarayana Reddy. He noted that all 31 districts of Telangana are agro-climatically ideal for palm oil, and stressed the need for more farmers to adopt the crop.

Minister Tummala shared insights from a recent study tour to Malaysia, where he and his team travelled 900 kilometers daily for three days to understand modern palm oil cultivation techniques. "We studied seed gardens, oil refineries,

oil saplings in a 20-acre farm- and interacted with Malaysian experts who expressed interest in setting up palm oil processing infrastructure in Telangana," he revealed.

He encouraged intercropping with cocoa, sorghum, and myrtle, along with palm oil cultivation, stating that such combinations offer higher returns than traditional crops like maize or cotton. With market demand high for groundnut, he suggested that farmers also grow groundnut alongside palm oil.

"Even in our neighboring states

like Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh, especially in Anantapur, such models are being successfully implemented," he said. Drawing comparisons with Australia, where similar crops fetch ₹4,000 for 10 kg, he stressed the income potential for Telangana farmers.

Highlighting the irregular rainfall in Telangana and the shortage of clean water even in urban areas like Gachibowli and Madhapur, the Minister said the government is providing ₹50,900 per acre in subsidy for palm oil plantations. This



covers planting and maintenance, ensuring minimal risk to farmers. "We do not lack natural resources—we only need to choose the right crops," he added. He urged farmers to take full advantage of government support and adopt palm

oil cultivation to make Telangana a green and prosperous state. Telangana State Geddang Chairman Rayala Nageswara Rao, officials from the Telangana Farmers' Conference, and local Congress leaders were also present at the event.

Such cooperation is crucial on Earth, where the threat of war, especially nuclear conflict, endangers the future of humanity. Instead of division, we must build friendships and unity, values that the ISS embodies.

seven days aboard the Salyut T-7 space station. Soviet cosmonaut Yuri Malyshev piloted the mission. Similarly, Commander Shubanshu Shukla, during his mission in 2025, expressed heartfelt gratitude to his family, friends, and especially his wife, just as Yuri Gagarin, the first man in space, did decades ago. These gestures of gratitude highlight the emotional depth of space explorers and their awareness of the support they receive from loved ones.

Headingley Test: A Loss on Paper, **But a Step Forward for Team India**

Despite the scoreboard reflecting a convincing defeat, India's performance in the Headingley Test against England offered encouraging glimpses of a team in transition with growing self-belief. Shubman Gill, leading the side in his first major assignment as captain, had plenty to prove. Having been dropped in the previous series, his promotion was seen as bold. While his captaincy remains a work in progress—his game reading and field placements under scrutiny—Gill the batsman made a strong statement by embracing the crucial No. 4 position with confidence. His public declaration of aiming to be the highest scorer in the series reflects ambition, not arrogance.

KL Rahul, the batting veteran, brought stability and technical mastery, hinting that he could emerge as the key guiding force in India's top order. His flexible role between No. 3 and 6 was executed with maturity, offering both resilience and intent. Yashasvi Jaiswal, though guilty of dropping crucial catches that cost the team 166 runs, continues to show signs of being a future batting stalwart.

Among the most promising developments was the debut of Sai Sudharsan. Despite a nervous first innings and tough introduction to England's conditions, his composed 30 in the second innings revealed glimpses of class and preparation. With his IPL dominance and disciplined approach off the field, Sudharsan is one to watch.

The return of Karun Nair was another highlight. Though his scores weren't substantial, his mental

strength—especially after six years in the wilderness—was evident. He deserves more time and a stable role, particularly after showing intent in the second innings.

India's real concern was their bowling unit. While Jasprit Bumrah and Mohammed Siraj showed patches of brilliance, third and fourth seamers like Prasidh Krishna leaked runs heavily, and Shardul Thakur failed in his dual role as a batting all-rounder. The side would benefit from blooding in sharper swing bowlers like Arshdeep Singh and a more attacking spinner like Kuldeep Yadav.

Yes, the team lost. But with five centuries, promising new faces, and growing leadership under Gill, India seems to be building a new core. The Headingley loss, while painful, might just be a vital stepping stone in shaping a more balanced, aggressive, and future-ready Test side.

The vast majority, who might have had an average or mildly positive experience, often remain silent. This creates a "participation bias" in the review ecosystem. Only a small fraction of customers leave reviews, and they tend to represent either end of the emotional spectrum. That's why you often see products with a mix of glowing five-star ratings and scathing one-star rants, with little in between. The result? A skewed perception that fails to reflect ly sophisticated. Some businesses pay for glowing testimonials to boost their rankings, while competitors might plant negative reviews to sabotage reputations. Even when reviews are genuine, they are subject to personal biases, unreasonable expectations, or one-off incidents that may not apply to most consumers.

The real-world implications are significant. A poor rating could unfairly doom a decent product, or an inflated score might lead you to waste money on something subpar. For consumers, this means approaching reviews with a healthy dose of skepticism. Be wary of patterns: if feedback is overly enthusiastic without details or extremely negative without context, dig deeper. Look for verified purchases, balanced reviews, and recent trends rather than isolated praise or complaints.

In the end, online reviews should be one of many tools in your decision-making toolbox-not the final word. By understanding the hidden biases in online feedback, you can make more informed, rational, and fair choices.

Looking At Strengthening Partnership With Canada: India

Days after Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Canada and his meeting with newly elected Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney, India signaled its intent to strengthen bilateral ties with Ottawa across key sectors such as trade, energy, mobility, and education.

Addressing the media on Thursday, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal stated, "We are looking forward to strengthening our partnership with Canada in several respects—on the economic side, trade side, energy side, mobility, and student exchange."

The remarks follow a recent high-level interaction between PM Modi and PM Carney Kananaskis, Canada. Jaiswal described the meeting as "very productive and positive,"



with both leaders agreeing to take "constructive and balanced" steps to restore normalcy in relations.

Tensions between India and Canada had reached a low point in 2023 after then-Prime Minister Justin Trudeau publicly alleged on the sidelines of the G7 summit held in Indian involvement in the killing of pro-Khalistan separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar. The fallout led to reciprocal expulsions of lations.

Congress MP Shashi Tharoor stated on Saturday that India clearly conveyed to foreign governments during post-Operation Sindoor diplomatic outreach that any future provocation would be met with a similar response. Speaking at the Ahmedabad Management Association, Tharoor emphasized that Indian delegations, including the one he led, explained India's restrained and targeted action against terrorist camps in Pakistan.

Tharoor said the global community was largely understanding of India's position. Even countries like Colombia, which initial-Pakistan, later withdrew their statements. "Many leaders respected India's right to self-defence and appreciated the restraint shown. We made it clear that if such attacks happen again, India would not hesitate to respond similarly," he said.



Tharoor underlined that India never intendly expressed condolences for casualties in ed to escalate the situation into a full-scale war. "Our aim was retribution against terrorist bases only. We didn't target civilians or military installations," he explained, adding that India had always been willing to stop once Pakistan ceased hostilities.

He also noted that while India acted inde-

ternal persuasion to de-escalate. "If they stopped because of American influence, that's fine by us," he remarked.

Tharoor, who led one of seven Indian delegations to 33 global capitals, said his group's role was to reinforce the government's message on Pakistan's involvement in terrorism.

On the 50th anniversary of the Emergency, he urged all political leaders to recommit to the Constitution and democratic values rather than politicizing the moment. Acknowledging the Emergency as a difficult period, he said even Indira Gandhi accepted the people's verdict when elections were called.

Reflecting on his recent Russia visit, Tharoor called it a valuable opportunity to engage with Russian leaders, including his longtime friend, Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov.

India Imposes Land and Sea Port Restrictions on Jute Imports from Bangladesh

Tn a significant move, India has restricted Lthe entry of jute and related products from Bangladesh through its land and most seaports, effective immediately. The decision, announced by the Directorate General of Foreign Trade on June 27, 2025, allows imports of jute only through the Nhava Sheva seaport in Mumbai.

This latest restriction comes just weeks after India halted apparel imports from Bangladesh via land ports on May 17. The new measure is aimed at curbing the impact of what Indian authorities describe as "dumped and subsidised" jute imports from Bangladesh that have been harming the domestic jute industry for years.

"Jute from Bangladesh has enjoyed duty-free access to India under existing trade arrangements. However, persistent dumping and



heavy government subsidies from Bangladesh have undermined Indian producers," said an official familiar with the matter. The official added that although anti-dumping duties (ADD) were previously imposed on jute imports from Bangladesh, they failed to stem the influx of cheap jute goods due to continued financial support from the Bangladeshi government.

The restrictions apply to a wide range of jute and allied fibre products, including raw jute, yarn, and jute bags—items that form a large part of Bangladesh's export basket to India. Indian jute manufacturers have long voiced concerns about being unable to compete with low-cost, subsidised imports that have flooded the market.

The move is expected to have significant trade implications for Bangladesh, which relies heavily on India as a key market for its jute sector. At the same time, it signals a shift in India's approach to trade with its neighbour, focusing more on safeguarding domestic industries.

The situation may further strain bilateral trade relations, already under pressure from earlier import restrictions. Talks between the two nations may be required to resolve the growing friction over trade policies.





Trump Reflects on Assassination Threats Amid Court Victory and Rising Political Tensions

U.S. President Donald Trump, during an impromptu White House press conference on Friday, spoke wake of recent U.S. strikes on Iranian nuclear facandidly about threats to his life while celebrating a major Supreme Court victory that bolsters his administration's power. The Court's ruling significantly limits the ability of federal judges to impose nationwide injunctions, a move seen as a green light for Trump's ambitious policy agenda.

When asked about ongoing threats, Trump reflected on the July 13, 2024 incident in Pennsylvania where he was grazed by a bullet during a campaign rally. "I get that throbbing feeling every once in a while," Trump said. "But you know what? That's okay. This is a dangerous business."

The president described the role as riskier than many perilous professions. "Race car drivers, 1/10 of 1% die. Bull riders, same. But when you're president, it's about 5%. If someone had told me that, maybe I wouldn't have run," he remarked.

Trump has faced multiple threats during his presidency. On September 15, 2024, he survived another assassination attempt while golfing in West Palm

Beach, Florida. The suspect in that case is currently facing five federal charges and has pleaded not guilty.

The suspect behind the Pennsylvania rally shooting was killed by Secret Service agents. That incident left one attendee dead and two others injured. Additionally, U.S. officials have accused Iran's Islamic Revo-

lutionary Guard Corps of plotting to assassinate Trump—a charge Tehran denies, especially in the cilities.

Serving his second term, Trump has expanded presidential powers, often clashing with opponents and promising retribution. The U.S. continues to experience heightened political violence, with Reuters documenting over 300 politically motivated violent incidents since the Capitol riot on January 6, 2021.

'Everything is fine, as long as it is against Russia': **Putin accuses West of encouraging separatism**

Russian President Vladimir Putin has sharply criticized Western nations, accusing them of encouraging separatist movements and ignoring terrorist activities as long as they are directed against Russia. Speaking in Minsk, the capital of Belarus, on Friday, Putin alleged that the West has adopted a double standard when it comes to issues of security and terrorism, particularly concerning Russia.

"No one has wished to pay attention to the Islamic State, as long as it operates against Russia. Explosions in Moscow, and all that. This is still happening today. No one wants to pay attention to this. Everything is fine, as long as it is against Russia," Putin remarked, expressing frustration at what he sees as the West's selective outrage.

Putin also claimed that the so-called "collective West" had historically supported



separatist tendencies within Russia, weaponizing them as part of a broader strategy to destabilize the country. "The same happened when the collective West encouraged separatism in our country, and such an instrument of the fight against Russia as terrorism," he added.

The Russian leader's remarks come amid ongoing tensions between Moscow and Western powers, primarily stemming from the conflict in Ukraine, which began

with Russia's 2022 invasion. Since then, Russia has faced a wide range of international sanctions, diplomatic isolation from the West, and intensified NATO cooperation with Ukraine and other neighboring states.

Putin's comments are consistent with Russia's longstanding narrative that Western countries, particularly the United States and its European allies, use global conflicts and regional unrest as tools to weaken Russian influence and power. The accusation regarding Western indifference to terrorist threats inside Russia is also part of a broader strategy to rally domestic support and position Russia as a victim of international hypocrisy.

As global geopolitical alignments continue to shift, Putin's remarks signal a continued hardening of rhetoric and a deepening divide between Russia and the Western world.

BSE Shares Slip as SEBI Imposes ₹25 Lakh Fine for **Regulatory Violations**



Chares of the Bombay Stock Ex-Schange (BSE) declined over 1% on Thursday after the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) imposed a ₹25 lakh penalty for breaching regulatory norms related to data dissemination and trading compliance.

The stock fell 1.47% to ₹2,748 on the National Stock Exchange (NSE) following a weak opening, reacting to the regulatory action stemming from an inspection carried out between February 2021 and September 2022.

In a detailed 45-page order issued on Wednesday, SEBI highlighted serious lapses in BSE's system architecture. It found that certain corporate announcements were made accessible to BSE's paid clients and its internal Listing Compliance Monitoring (LCM) team before the information was published on the public website. This created an unfair advantage, violating the principle of equal access to market information.

The regulator concluded that BSE failed to comply with Regulation 39(3) of the SECC Regulations, 2018, which mandates fair and transparent access to all stakeholders. SEBI also criticized BSE for not having a proper real-time information feed like an RSS (Really Simple Syndication) system, which could have prevented the information disparity.

JSW Paints to Acquire Akzo Nobel India for ₹12,915 **Crore, Becomes 4th Largest Player in Paint Industry**

TSW Paints, part of Sajjan Jindal's J JSW Group, announced on Friday its acquisition of Dutch multinational Akzo Nobel's India unit in a landmark ₹12,915 crore deal. This acquisition will propel JSW Paints to the position of the fourth-largest player in the Indian paint industry.

As per the agreement, JSW Paints will acquire a 74.76% stake in Akzo Nobel India Ltd (ANIL) from its Dutch parent Akzo Nobel NV and affiliated entities for ₹8,986 crore. Following this, JSW, along with its group companies JTPM Metal Traders and JSW EduInfra, will make an open offer to acquire the remaining 25.24% stake from public shareholders for up to ₹3,929 crore.

The acquisition is based on an enter-



prise value of around €1.4 billion (approximately ₹12,915 crore), reflecting an EV/EBITDA multiple of 22x. The deal includes Akzo Nobel's liquid paints and coatings business in India, particularly the well-known Dulux brand.

However, the India Powder Coatings division and the International Research Centre currently under ANIL will remain with Akzo Nobel NV. This move marks the Dutch firm's exit from the Indian decorative paints segment, a market that has seen intensified competition with new entrants like the Aditya Birla Group investing over ₹10,000 crore.

According to Akzo Nobel NV, the deal will yield net cash proceeds of approximately €900 million, with €500 million allocated to debt reduction. The company also plans a €400 million share buyback post-deal closure.

The acquisition is subject to regulatory clearances, including approval from the Competition Commission of India (CCI), and the successful completion of the mandatory open offer. Once finalized, this deal positions JSW Paints as a significant force in India's rapidly evolving paint and coatings sector.

Additionally, SEBI identified deficiencies in how BSE monitored client code modifications. The stock exchange did not take disciplinary action against brokers frequently altering trade codes and failed to properly oversee 'error accounts' raising concerns over potential misuse and insufficient due diligence, particularly in trades between unrelated institutional clients.

While BSE eventually introduced corrective measures, SEBI noted that these actions came only after the inspection exposed the shortcomings. The regulator's penalty underlines the need for tighter oversight and a more transparent framework to uphold market integrity.

India's Oil Imports from US Surge Over 270% in Early 2025 **Amid Trade Deal Talks**

Tndia's crude oil imports from the United States Lwitnessed a sharp spike of over 270% in the first four months of 2025, highlighting the country's strategic push to diversify energy sources while reinforcing economic ties with Washington. From January to April, India imported 6.31 million tonnes of US crude, compared to just 1.69 million tonnes during the same period in 2024, according to official trade data.

This dramatic rise aligns closely with ongoing negotiations between New Delhi and Washingsides aim to finalize by July 9. The talks, now in their final phase, are expected to address key

Tndia's star javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra has once again claimed the world number one ranking in men's javelin, according to the latest World Athletics rankings. With 1445 points, Neeraj has overtaken Grenadian athlete Anderson Peters, who is now second with 1431 points.

Neeraj had lost the top spot in September 2024, shortly after the Paris Olympics, where he secured a silver medal, adding to his historic gold from the Tokyo Games. At the time, he had been struggling with a persistent injury. However, 2025 has marked a strong comeback for the reigning world champion, who now appears fully fit and in top form.

He followed this with finished ahead of Peters. a remarkable performance at the Doha Diamond League in May, where he set a new national record of 90.23 meters—finally entering the prestigious 90m club. Although he finished second in that event behind Germany's Julian Weber, who threw 91.06m, Neeraj's consistency has helped him climb back to the top.

Later, at the Janusz Kusocinski Memorial in Poland, Neeraj secured another second-place finish. But he bounced back at the Paris Diamond League in June with a winning throw of 88.16m and then added another ti-

Germany's Julian Weber is ranked third globally, while Pakistan's Olympic champion Arshad Nadeem stands fourth with 1370 points. Czech thrower Jakub Vadlejch rounds out the top five.

Neeraj's resurgence comes just ahead of the inaugural NC Classic on July 5, a tournament he's spearheading to boost javelin's popularity in India. His much-anticipated clash with Arshad Nadeem could take place at the World Championships in September.

Australia Thrash West Indies by 159 Runs to Take 1-0 Lead in Barbados Test

Australia delivered a command-ing performance to crush West Indies by 159 runs in the opening Test at Kensington Oval, Bridgetown, Barbados, taking a 1-0 lead in the series. Head, who scored the only half-century so far in the match, was determined to keep Australia in the game. Battling both the icant. swing-friendly pitch and relentless West Indies pace attack, Head was 13 not out off 37 balls at stumps, supported by Beau Webster on 19 not out. Despite taking a blow to his left glove from Alzarri Joseph, Head's stubbornness is Australia's key to survival.

Day two saw 10 wickets fall on a pitch still offering seam movement. West Indies' bowlers continued to trouble Australia's top order, with Hazlewood claiming the crucial wicket of debutant Brandon King, who had
