Hyderabad: Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy chaired a high-level review meeting with several ministers to assess key state programs ahead of the upcoming cabinet meeting scheduled for June 5. The meeting was held at the Command Control Center in Banjara Hills, with Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, Seethakka, Damodar Rajanarsimha, and the Chief Secretary participating in the discussions.

CM Revanth Reddy conducted an in-depth review of the ongoing Telangana State Formation Day celebrations, progress on the Indiramma housing scheme, revenue conference preparations, and readiness for the upcoming crop cultivation season. The leadership emphasized ensuring smooth implementation and greater public satisfaction across these sectors.

One of the key decisions taken was to hold a full cabinet meeting on June 5 to deliberate on important policy matters, including the Rajiv Yuva Vikasam scheme. It was confirmed that the announcement of eligible beneficiaries under the scheme will only be made after a thorough and meticulous scrutiny of all applications. The CM stressed that "not a single ineligible person should



benefit" from the scheme, highlighting the government's commitment to transparency and fair-

Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka also presented a detailed report on the grievances and issues faced by state employees. These concerns will be thoroughly discussed in the upcoming cabinet meeting to explore possible solutions. The CM and other ministers lauded Uttam Kumar Reddy for his effective management of the recent grain procurement drive, which has been crucial for stabilizing agricultural markets and supporting farmers.

The meeting underlined the government's focus on accountability, efficient governance, and timely delivery of welfare schemes. With the cabinet session on June 5, several major announcements and decisions impacting the state's development trajectory are expected to be finalized.



Cybercrime Complaints Drop by 11% in Telangana in 2025

Telangana has recorded a notable decline in cybercrime during the first four months of 2025, with an 11% drop in complaints and a 19% decrease in financial losses compared to the same period in 2024. The Telangana Cyber Security Bureau (TGCSB) attributed this achievement to heightened public awareness, data-driven investigations, and stronger coordination among enforcement agencies.

According to TGSCB Director Shikha Goel, the state's integrated and proactive cybercrime response has shown significant results. While cybercrime complaints across India surged by 28% from January to April 2025, Telangana went in the opposite direction with a consistent downward trend. A further 5.5% decline in complaints was also observed when compared to the last quarter of 2024 (September-December).

Goel stated that the total monetary losses due to cybercrime saw a 19% drop in Telangana during the first four months of 2025. Com-

pared to the previous quarter (Sep-Dec 2024), the reduction was over 30%. Meanwhile, India witnessed a 12% increase in financial cybercrime losses during the same timeframe. The Bureau also reported a steady improvement in redressal and recovery. The percentage of recovered stolen money rose from 13% in 2024 to 16% in 2025. This progress is attributed to swift complaint resolution and enhanced coordination with financial institutions and digital platforms.

In terms of law enforcement actions, Telangana improved its FIR conversion rate from 18% in 2024 to 19% in 2025, registering 7,575 FIRs compared to 6,763 the previous year. Arrests saw a sharp rise, tripling from 230 in early 2024 to 626 in the same period of 2025. The number of PT (Prisoner Transit) warrants executed also increased from 53 to 89, reflecting improved cross-jurisdictional cooperation.

The World Health Organization levels of transmission. (WHO) has once again raised alerts amid a fresh rise in Covid-19 cases worldwide, including in India. In a statement released on May 23, WHO announced that two newly emerging coronavirus sub-variants—LF.7 and NB.1.8.1—have been classified as "variants under surveillance."

Among these, NB.1.8.1 is reportedly spreading rapidly and has been linked to a rise in infections and hospitalizations across several countries. However, WHO clarified that there is no current evidence to suggest that this sub-variant leads to more severe disease. The organization further stated that approved Covid vaccines are expected to remain effective in reducing the severity and impact of these new vari-

ICMR urges vigilance, not panic

In India, the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) confirmed that these variants are subtypes of the Omicron strain, as per genome sequencing data from western and southern regions. ICMR Director General Rajiv Bahl noted that while LF.1, XFG, JN.1, and NB.1.8.1 have been identified in India, only the first

three are currently showing notable

Experts from ICMR have emphasized the importance of maintaining alertness and preparedness rather than succumbing to panic. They highlighted that there is no indication of increased severity or risk of mortality from these subtypes at this stage.

India's Covid situation: Case count and state-wise data

As of 8 a.m. on June 1, India has recorded 3,758 active Covid cases, according to the Union Health Ministry. This marks a moderate but steady rise in infections in recent weeks.

Kerala tops the list with 1,400 active cases, followed by Maharashtra (485), Delhi (436), Gujarat (320), West Bengal (287), and Karnataka (238). Among the Telugu states, Andhra Pradesh has 23 active cases, while Telangana has reported only 3.

So far in 2025, the official death toll attributed to Covid stands at 28.

While the numbers remain relatively low compared to previous waves, health experts continue to stress the need for public caution, timely testing, and vaccination, especially among vulnerable groups.

NIA Investigates Sunny Yadav's Interview with Zakir Naik

- Key revelations emerge amid probe into alleged links and content

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) is currently probing the popular Haryana-based YouTuber Bhaiya Sunny Yadav following the emergence of his interview videos with controversial preacher Zakir Naik. Sunny Yadav was detained amid an ongoing crackdown on YouTubers suspected of having suspicious links with Pakistan, particularly after the arrest of fellow YouTuber Jyoti Malhotra for alleged spying activities. Zakir Naik, originally from India, is infamous for speeches that allegedly incite religious hatred and has been accused of providing financial assistance to terrorist groups. He became the subject of a money laundering investigation in 2016 and subsequently fled to Malaysia, where he currently resides. The Indian government has declared him among its most wanted individuals and is actively seeking his extradi-

The NIA's inquiry intensified after videos surfaced on Sunny Yadav's YouTube channel featuring interviews with Zakir Naik. Officials believe these interactions warrant close examination to understand any possible links or support between the two. Authorities are also expanding surveillance on prominent YouTubers, questioning those who have



traveled to Pakistan or exhibited suspicious behavior.

While the investigation is ongoing, officials remain tight-lipped about further details. However, the developments have raised concerns over the role of social media influencers in propagating sensitive and potentially harmful content.

The NIA continues to investigate the full extent of Sunny Yadav's connection with Zakir Naik and possible implications on national security.

Corruption Decentralized in Congress Govt, Says Union Minister Kishan Reddy

Union Minister and BJP State President Kishan Reddy issued a sharp challenge to the Congress party, expressing his readiness for a debate on the country's development. Speaking at a workshop held at the BJP state office, which

included state office bearers, MPs, MLAs, MLCs, and district presidents, Kishan Reddy drew a vivid contrast between the Congress and BJP governments. Centre Must Repeal Waqf Amendment Act: Akbaruddin Owaisi

AIMIM legislator and Chandrayangutta MLA Akbaruddin Owaisi on Sunday declared that the Central government will have to repeal the Waqf Amendment Act 2025. Speaking at a protest rally held at Dharna Chowk in Hyderabad, jointly organized by the All India

Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) and the All India Muslim Personal Law Board (AIMPLB), Owaisi said the Muslim community remains united and resolute in its opposition to the Act.

"The Waqf Amendment Act has been created not to protect Waqf properties, but to destroy them," Owaisi asserted. He accused the Union government of attempting to weaken the community through such legal changes and called on the people to remain firm in their faith and struggle.

"Allah tests those whom He loves. Muslims in India are being tested today, and we must consider ourselves fortunate to be chosen for this trial," he told the gathering, urging the community to view these challenges as opportunities for unity and resistance.

He reiterated AIMIM's unconditional support to the AIMPLB in its ongoing movement and stated, "We will participate in every protest organized by the Muslim Personal Law Board." Emphasizing a peaceful and constitutional path, he added, "We will continue our fight within the framework of the Constitution and the law."

Targeting the Centre, the MLA said, "Those who think they can break us should understand that Muslims will never compromise on Sharia, Namaz, hijab or Waqf. We will not step back."

Owaisi concluded his address by expressing confidence that the community would emerge victorious. "We have complete faith that Allah will grant us success in this struggle," he said.

HC Quashes Life Sentence, Slams Police Probe in Rape Case

In a significant judgment, the Telangana High Court has quashed the life sentence imposed on Colonel Rishi Sharma, an administrative officer at DRDO Shamirpet, declaring him innocent in a rape case filed in 2017. The bench comprising Justices P Shyamkoshi and N Tukaramji severely criticized the police investigation and called for systemic reforms in the criminal justice process.

The case, dating back to April 25, 2017, involved allegations from a woman who claimed that Sharma, a close friend of her mother, raped her while she was alone with him. She further stated that she became pregnant and was threatened by Sharma to undergo an abortion. Based on her complaint, the Rangareddy District Court had sentenced Sharma to life imprisonment in September 2024.

However, upon appeal, the High Court found several critical flaws in the police investigation and the need for reform in how criminal judicial process. Justice Shyamkoshi pointed out that there was no rape, are investigated and prosecutcredible explanation for the delay in filing the complaint. Additional-

ly, there was no solid medical evidence regarding the abortion—only a certificate from one doctor, who was not summoned to testify.

A key factor in the case was Sharma's prior vasectomy in 2005, which made it biologically improbable for him to father a child. The court also criticized the police and prosecution for not conducting a DNA test on the fetus, which could have provided crucial evidence.

Justice N Tukaramji emphasized the right of every citizen to a transparent and thorough investigation, warning that flawed procedures can lead to gross miscarriages of justice. He advocated for the establishment of an independent oversight mechanism to monitor criminal investigations, stressing that only with such reforms can investigative standards improve and public trust be restored.

The ruling has stirred debate in legal and civil society circles, reigniting discussions about the urgent cases, especially sensitive ones like

Slot Booking in All Sub-Registrar Offices From Today

AI-powered WhatsApp chatbot to streamline registration services

State Revenue, Housing and Information Public Relations Minister Sri Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy announced that the slot booking system and AI-powered services will be introduced in all sub-registrar offices across Andhra Pradesh from June 2. So far, the slot booking system has been implemented in 47 out of 144 sub-registrar offices in two phases. The remaining 97 offices will now adopt this system, aiming to provide faster, transparent, and corruption-free registration services, the min-

The slot booking system, designed to save time for property buyers and sellers, has received a 94% satisfaction rate from users. Since its launch, over 45,000 documents have been registered through this system, with 3,000 more registrations attributed to the slot booking facility.

addition to slot booking, an AI-integrated WhatsApp chatbot named Medha (number: 82476 23578) is now available to assist applicants by answering queries related to registration office locations, slot availability, charges for gift deeds, sale deeds, market prices, and more.

To curb illegal activities, a developer registration module will soon be launched. This system will flag double registrations in layouts by displaying registered plot details in red, accessible to both registration offices and developers.

Due to high workloads, additional sub-registrars and staff have been appointed at nine busy locations, including Pathancheruvu, Yadagiri Gutta, Gandipet, Ibrahimpatnam, and others. Slots can be booked daily from 10:30 am to 5 pm, excluding lunch breaks, with 48 slots per office each day. Five walk-in registrations will be allowed

between 5 pm and 5:30 pm for emer-

The minister urged users to take precautions to avoid technical issues during slot bookings. Aadhaar e-signature is also being piloted in Armur (Nizamabad) and Kusumanchi (Khammam) sub-registrar offices to accelerate registrations and will be expanded statewide soon.

Kavitha emphasized that these changes will disadvantage Telangana-based contractors, who will incur losses due to the new tender conditions.

She urged Chief Minister Revanth Reddy to intervene and cancel the tenders to protect the interests of local contractors and maintain fairness in the procurement process. The letter calls for a transparent review of the tender process and reinstating rules that favor local businesses.

The issue has sparked concerns among contractor groups and is expected to gain further political attention in the coming days.



Two Narcotic Drug Peddlers Apprehended in Hyderabad

Two men caught with 1.6 kg ganja in separate police operations

Based on credible information, the Commissioner's Task Force North Zone Team, along with Marredpally and Gandhinagar Police Stations, apprehended two ganja peddlers — Bandhal Ganapathi Lakhan @ Chinna and Jerripothula Teja @ Nikhil. Authorities seized a total of 1.6 kilograms of ganja during the operations under Cr.No: 107/2025 and Cr.No:147/2025, registered under various sections of the NDPS Act.

Bandhal Ganapathi Lakhan, a 28-year-old electrical worker from Risala Bazar, Airforce Gate, Alwal, resorted to selling ganja to support his lavish expenses. He conspired with his friend Jerripothula Teja, a 25-year-old electrical shop worker from Chachanagar, Bansilalpet, Secunderabad, who financed the initial purchase of ganja with Rs. 20,000. Lakhan traveled to Nagpur and bought the ganja from two main suppliers—Sk. Shabbir and Guddu—who are currently absconding.

On 30th May 2025, Teja was caught with 0.5 kg of ganja, and the next day Lakhan was apprehended near Jubilee Bus Station, Secunderabad, with 1.1 kg of ganja. Both suspects were handed over to their respective police stations for further legal action. Two mobile phones worth Rs. 65,000 were also seized from the accused.

The operation was led by Inspector P. Raghavender of the Task Force, along with Inspector N. Venkatesh of Marredpally PS, Inspector N. Bose Kiran of Gandhinagar PS, and their respective teams.

Y.V.S. Sudheendra, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Task Force Hyderabad City, confirmed the arrests and ongoing investigations.



Massive ATM Heist In Suryapet: ₹20 Lakh Stolen, ATM Set Ablaze

Robbers use gas cutters to break into SBI ATM in Huzurnagar



TPN Correspondent | Suryapet In a dramatic and brazen theft, unidentified robbers looted approximately ₹20 lakh from an SBI ATM located on Lingagiri Road in

Huzurnagar, Suryapet district, late on the night of May 31. The incident has sent shockwaves across the region and raised serious concerns about ATM security.

According to local police, the gang targeted the ATM after midnight, using gas cutters to forcibly access the cash dispenser. After securing the money, the suspects allegedly set the ATM on fire, completely destroying the kiosk. The deliberate arson is believed to have been an attempt to erase fingerprints and CCTV footage. The crime came to light when lo-

cals noticed the burning ATM and alerted authorities. Police teams responded swiftly, cordoned off the area, and conducted a detailed inspection of the site. Forensic teams were also deployed to gather potential evidence from the remnants of the crime scene. A formal case has been registered, and police officials stated that preliminary evidence suggests the involvement of a professional and well-organized gang. The use of sophisticated tools like gas cutters, along with the planned arson, points toward a coordinated effort. Efforts are now underway to retrieve nearby surveillance footage and question residents in the area. Authorities are also coordinating with SBI officials to assess the exact amount stolen and review internal ATM security protocols.

The daring robbery has triggered demands for better surveillance and round-the-clock security around isolated ATM kiosks, especially in semi-urban and rural areas. Police assured the public that they are actively pursuing leads and will bring the culprits

305 Arrested for **Drunk Driving in** Cyberabad; Miyapur **Leads with 52 Cases**

Over the weekend, Cyberabad police arrested a total of 305 individuals for drunk driving offenses, with Miyapur traffic police registering the highest number of arrests at 52. Balanagar and Chevella police stations followed with 30 arrests each, while Shamshabad accounted for 27 cases. No women were among those apprehended.

The age distribution showed that most offenders were young to middle-aged adults: 116 were between 31 and 40 years, 92 aged 21 to 30, 74 between 41 and 50, and 20 offenders were in the 51 to 60 age bracket. Only two senior citizens were booked.

Regarding vehicles involved, 242 two-wheelers topped the list, followed by 16 three-wheelers and 47 four-wheelers. No heavy vehicles were involved in the arrests.

Drunk driving is an offense punishable under Section 185 of the Motor Vehicles Act, which includes penalties such as a fine up to Rs. 10,000 and/or imprisonment for up to six months. Repeat offenders face stricter consequences, including suspension or permanent cancellation of their driving licenses.

The Cyberabad traffic police reiterated the dangers associated with driving under the influence, warning that alcohol impairs vision, reduces alertness, and encourages risky behaviorfactors that significantly increase the likelihood of accidents, some of which can be fatal. Authorities urged motorists to avoid drinking and driving to ensure road safety for all.

Buses bound for Dilshuknagar, LB Nagar, Saibabad, and Ibrahimpatnam will be diverted at Chaderghat X Roads, passing through Nimboliadda, 6 No Junction, New Golnaka bridge, Musarambagh RTA, and Musarambagh X Roads. Vehicles from the left will divert towards Dilshuknagar, while those from the right will turn towards Nalgonda X Roads, Chanchalguda, Saidabad, and IS Sadan.

Plane Flies Over Tirumala Temple Again

TPN Correspondent | Tirupati An airplane flying at a low altitude over the Tirumala Srivari Temple on Sunday morning caused widespread concern

and anger among devotees. The aircraft was seen flying alarmingly close to the temple premises, with several devotees capturing the incident on their mobile phones. The video quickly went viral, intensifying public outcry.

Tirupati Tirumala Devasthanams (TTD) officials responded swiftly to the reports and have launched an inquiry to determine the origin and destination of the aircraft. According to Agama Shastra the sacred scriptures governing temple practices — flying over the temple is strictly prohibited. TTD reiterated that such incidents violate both spiritual

traditions and the sanctity of the shrine.

"This is not just a violation of rules, but a deep hurt to the sentiments of lakhs of devotees," said a TTD official. The organization has been requesting the Union Government for years to declare the Tirumala hill shrine a 'No Fly Zone', but the Ministry of Civil Aviation has reportedly deemed the request unfeasible.

Despite repeated appeals, similar incidents have been occurring for the past two to three years, leaving the TTD and devotees increasingly frustrated. The absence of concrete action has led to suspicions of negligence, prompting stronger demands this time around.

In light of the latest incident, devotees are now urging Union Civil Aviation Minister Ram-



Beneath America's polished surface lies a complex spiritual landscape unlike any other—a vast "faith bazaar" where religion merges with spectacle, politics, and social media. Here, belief is not just private but public performance, with megachurches boasting IMAX-like experiences and fiery pastors livestreaming apocalyptic prophecies to hundreds of thousands.

One striking example was the 2021 gathering in Dallas, where thousands awaited the miraculous return of JFK, guided by Michael Protzman, aka "Negative 48," a QAnon influencer and selfstyled prophet. When the prophecy failed, followers didn't abandon their faith; instead, they adapted—showing how flexible and performative belief has be-

America's spiritual scene ranges

from Pentecostal miracle healings at places like Bethel Church in California, where prayers for healing flood social media, to the rising interest in Russian Orthodoxy. Many young white American men, seeking order and tradition, are drawn to its incense-filled rituals and moral clarity, sometimes embracing political narratives tied to Vladimir Putin and his framing of the Ukraine war as a battle for Christian civilization.

Meanwhile, movements like the New Apostolic Reformation push a political-religious agenda, seeing Donald Trump as a divinely chosen figure. Charismatic leaders such as Pastor Greg Locke and prophetess Julie Green mix conspiracy theories with faith, influencing followers on YouTube and Christian TV, and fueling political unrest.

Social media has become a pulpit and stage, with TikTok prophets warning of doom, casting out demons, and speaking in tongues all attracting millions of viewers. This fusion of entertainment, politics, and religion reflects America's hunger for meaning amid cultural confusion.

The American faith bazaar isn't limited to Christianity—it includes psychedelic churches, UFO cults, and wellness gurus blending Eastern mysticism with Western trends. This pluralism allows people to mix and match beliefs in a constantly evolving spiritual marketplace.

Despite the spectacle, at its core lies a profound human longing for permanence, meaning, and hope in a fast-changing world—a quest that continues to shape the ever-shifting American spiritual landscape.



India Surpassing Japan in GDP: Reality, Misconceptions, and the **Importance of Data Integrity**



Recently, BVR Subrahmanyam, CEO of rates remain stable. NITI Aayog, claimed that India has overtaken Japan in current dollar GDP. However, a closer look at the data reveals a more nuanced reality. According to the IMF's World Economic Outlook (WEO) Japan's relative position, while a weaker database, for the fiscal year 2024-25, Ja- yen could hasten India's rise. pan's GDP stands at \$4.0 trillion, slightly ahead of India's \$3.9 trillion. The forecast for fiscal year 2025-26 shows India's GDP at \$4.187 trillion narrowly surpassing Japan's \$4.186 trillion, suggesting the crossover will occur around that period—not before.

This timing aligns roughly with the midpoint of the fiscal year (September), meaning the claim that India has already overtaken Japan was premature by about a year. Exchange rates also add complexity. For instance, India's GDP in Q1 2025, converted at the prevailing exchange rate, is around \$4.13 trillion, while Japan's GDP for the same quarter is about \$4.38 trillion—still significantly higher. Given India's nominal GDP growth rate of roughly 10% per year and Japan's more modest 3.4%, the crossover is expected near March 2026, assuming exchange

Fluctuations in currency values can delay or accelerate this milestone. A stronger yen against the dollar would push back

This episode underscores several lessons. First, hasty conclusions can mislead public understanding. Second, headline GDP figures matter less than what truly affects everyday life—such as per capita income, which still places India decades behind Japan. Third and most importantly, reliable and transparent data is crucial for sound policymaking. The continued delay in releasing crucial household expenditure data from 2017-18 has eroded confidence in official statistics, inviting skepticism both domestically and internationally.

As India aspires to global economic leadership, maintaining data integrity and patience in interpreting statistics remain vital. Premature claims may thrill headlines but do little for informed decision-making or national progress.

Musk-Durov AI Deal Sparks Tech Drama, Raises Concerns **Over Telegram's Future**

In a collision of ideology, ambition, and controversy, Elon Musk and Pavel Durov—two of tech's most libertarian-minded billionaires—have entered what appears to be a turbulent partnership. Durov recently announced a one-year deal with Musk's AI startup, xAI, worth \$300 million in cash and equity. The goal: integrate xAI's chatbot, Grok, into Telegram, a messaging platform with nearly 1 billion users.

But the deal quickly hit turbulence. Hours after Durov's announcement, Musk publicly disputed the claim, tersely stating, "No deal has been signed." The public contradic-

At the 100-day celebration event, CM Gupta praised her government for working with "honesty and dedication." She also highlighted the launch of Operation Sindoor, a counter-terror offensive launched in response to the clinics, women's pensions, bus mar-

um. However, the days following their However, the opposition, led by the AAP, accused the new government of failing to deliver on its promises. AAP leader Atishi dismissed the government's performance as visionless, citing increased power outages, higher electricity rates, and rising private school fees. AAP Delhi president Saurabh Bharadwaj further alleged that the BJP had stalled or shut down key welfare initiatives, including mohalla

shal recruitments, and the "Farishte" emergency response scheme.

Adding to the pressure, AAP workers protested outside the stadium, demanding the BJP fulfill its campaign promise of ₹2,500 monthly support for one woman per family. Several demonstrators were detained by police.

Public opinion remains divided. Some citizens, like auto driver Sandeep, expressed optimism about the government's direction. Others, however, cited no visible improvements, highlighting issues like increased traffic challans and vendor harassment.

The Congress also joined the criticism, with Delhi unit chief Devendra Yadav accusing the BJP of spreading false promises, misusing public funds, and offering Z-plus security to its leaders while neglecting public welfare. He listed what he called the "10 major sins" of the new administration, including presenting a fictitious ₹1 lakh crore budget. In response to slum demolition concerns, CM Gupta assured residents that demolitions were court-mandated, not government-led, and that no slum would be razed under her administration.

'PM Should Step Back From Campaigning, Focus On Enemy': Mallikarjun Kharge

Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge has urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to temporarily step away from election campaigning and focus solely on national security in light of the recent Operation Sindoor military offensive. Addressing reporters in Bengaluru on Saturday, Kharge said this is a time for leadership, unity, and focus—not political grandstanding.

"I don't like reacting to all his (PM Modi's) statements," Kharge began, but added pointedly, "The Prime Minister should recuse himself from electioneering for now and concentrate fully on the country's security. He should reflect on recent events and speak responsibly."

Operation Sindoor, launched following a deadly terror attack in Pahalgam, has heightened tensions across the region. In this sensitive context, Kharge emphasized that political leaders must display restraint and solidarity with the armed forces. "He (PM Modi) should focus on the enemy instead of indulging in self-praise. No one else would have used this moment to score political points. Our full support is with the Indian Armed Forces," Kharge

He further criticized what he described as unnecessary public speeches by the Prime Minister during a critical time for national defense. "Let the Congress delegations and diplomats abroad return before we engage in political discourse again," Kharge said, alluding to ongoing international briefings being conducted by the party.

Kharge also responded to PM Modi's past remarks about giving the armed forces a "free hand" during military operations. "If he has already empowered the military, why continue boasting about it? Self-praise does not suit a Prime Minister," he remarked.

The Congress president underlined that national security must supersede electoral politics, especially when the country is engaged in a military operation. "The situation is not normal. This is not the time for political tours and campaign speeches," Kharge warned.

Reaffirming the Congress party's full support for India's armed forces, Kharge concluded, "As long as the army stands, the nation is safe. We support them unconditionally and urge the government to maintain focus where it's most needed—on defending the country."



Union Home Minister Amit Shah launched a scathing attack on West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee during a rally in Kolkata on Sunday, accusing her of opposing national security measures like Operation Sindoor and the Waqf Amendment Act to appease her political vote bank.

Speaking to BJP leaders and party workers, Shah alleged that Banerjee's resistance to Operation Sindoor—India's military response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack—was politically motivated. "To appease the Muslim vote bank, Mamata didi opposed Operation Sindoor. In doing so, she has insulted the mothers and sisters of our nation," Shah said, vowing that women in Bengal would respond to this at the 2026 state elections.

He also criticized Banerjee's stance against the Waqf Amendment Act, calling it an example of appeasement politics. "Mamata Banerjee is against the Waqf law only to cater to her minority vote bank," Shah claimed, asserting that the BJP stands for legal



reform and equal rights for all.

Referring to the recent communal violence in Murshidabad, Shah alleged that the riots were "state-sponsored" and had the backing of senior Trinamool Congress (TMC) leaders. At least three people died and several were injured during protests related to the

Waqf law in April.

"The Ministry of Home Affairs had requested the deployment of the BSF during the Murshidabad riots, but the TMC government blocked it to let the violence continue," Shah said.

Accusing the TMC government of facilitating illegal infiltration from Bangladesh, Shah alleged that Banerjee had "opened Bengal's borders" to illegal migrants. "Only the BJP can stop infiltration. Mamata Banerjee has denied land to the BSF, making their work more difficult," he claimed.

He added that the refusal to allot land to the Border Security Force (BSF) was a deliberate strategy by the TMC to ensure the continuation of illegal immigration, which, he said, served their political interests.

Shah's fiery remarks come as BJP intensifies its campaign in West Bengal ahead of the 2026 Assembly elections, with security, law enforcement, and religious polarization at the forefront of its narrative.









Indian YouTuber Malik Swashbuckler Detained in Turkey for Derogatory Remarks Against Women

An Indian YouTuber identified as Malik SD Khan, known online as "Malik Swashbuckler," has reportedly been detained by Turkish authorities after a series of disturbing videos sparked widespread outrage on social media. The videos, allegedly showing Malik making sexually explicit and derogatory remarks about Turkish women, have led to public backlash and legal consequences.

According to reports from Turkiye Today, Malik was taken into custody after multiple complaints were filed by Turkish citizens who understood the offensive content, much of which was spoken in Hindi. Malik, apparently assuming the language barrier would shield him from scrutiny, made rape threats and lewd comments while interacting with locals during his visit.

In one viral clip, he referred to a Turkish woman as "maal" (a slang term often used derogatorily for women). In another, he asked viewers if he should assault his female guide later that night. A separate video showed Malik aggressively confronting a store owner, demanding to know why there wasn't an Indian flag displayed, while hurling profanities.

Though Malik has since deleted his YouTube and Instagram accounts, many of the video clips continue to circulate across platforms, prompting global criticism. Turkish social media users played a key role in bringing the videos to light, ensuring that the issue reached local authorities.

As of now, Turkish officials have not made an official statement regarding Malik's detention or the ongoing investigation. However, sources confirm that he remains in custody as authorities examine the contents of his videos and assess possible legal action.

The controversy comes amid already strained India-Turkey relations, with diplomatic tensions recently flaring after Turkey voiced support for Pakistan in the wake of the Pahalgam terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir. Following the incident, many Indian tourists began boycotting travel to Turkey, further complicating bilateral ties.

Malik's actions have drawn condemnation from viewers both in India and abroad, with many demanding strict action. Advocacy groups have emphasized the need for accountability in digital spaces, especially when content creators cross ethical and legal boundaries abroad.

Trump-Xi Call Expected Soon Amid Escalating Minerals Trade Dispute

Says US Treasury Secretary

Tensions are escalating between the United States and China over a brewing trade dispute concerning critical minerals, with US Treasury Secretary Bessent indicating that a high-level conversation between President Donald Trump and Chinese President Xi Jinping is likely to take place soon.

Speaking on CBS' "Face the Nation" on Sunday, Secretary Bessent addressed President Trump's recent accusation that China has violated a trade agreement designed to reduce tariffs and ease restrictions on essential mineral exports. Trump had earlier stated that China failed to uphold its end of the deal, particularly in ensuring a steady flow of minerals vital for global industrial supply chains.

"What China is doing is they are holding back products that are essential for the industrial supply



chains of India, of Europe. And that is not what a reliable partner does," Bessent said.

The agreement in question was aimed at stabilizing trade in rare earth elements and other minerals deemed critical for manufac-

turing, clean energy technology, and defense industries. China is the dominant global supplier of many of these minerals, making any disruption particularly impactful to the US and its allies.

pressed frustration over China's conduct, accusing Beijing of reneging on commitments. He also said he was confident that a conversation with President Xi would happen soon to address the matter. China, for its part, had said in April that the two leaders had not spoken recently, and it remains unclear whether the upcoming call will de-escalate tensions.

Secretary Bessent acknowledged uncertainty about the reasons behind China's actions. "Maybe it's a glitch in the Chinese system, maybe it's intentional. We'll see after the President speaks with the party chairman," he said. The outcome of the potential Trump-Xi dialogue could have far-reaching implications, not just for US-China relations, but also for global supply chains and international trade partnerships. Markets and policymakers alike are watching closely for any developments from the expected call.

Zelenskyy Confirms Ukraine-Russia Peace Talks in Istanbul Amid Escalating Attacks

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy announced that a Ukrainian delegation will head to Istanbul on Monday, June 2, 2025, for a fresh round of direct peace talks with Russia, even as the war continues to escalate with deadly missile and drone attacks.

In a statement shared on Telegram, Zelenskyy confirmed that Defense Minister Rustem Umerov will lead the delegation. "We are doing everything to protect our independence, our state, and our people," he said, underscoring Ukraine's continued pursuit of a diplomatic resolution.

Kyiv had earlier urged Moscow to provide a promised memorandum outlining its position before the meeting. The Kremlin has responded that the document will be presented during the discussions.

The announcement comes amid a surge in Russian attacks. Ukraine's air force reported that Russia launched 472 drones—the highest number since the start of the full-scale invasion in 2022—alongside seven missiles. One of these strikes targeted an army training unit, killing 12 Ukrainian soldiers and injuring over 60 others. The attack occurred away from the front line, raising questions about operational security.


An investigative commission has been formed to probe the incident.

"If it is established that the actions or inaction of officials led to the death or injury of servicemen, those responsible will be held strictly accountable," the Ukrainian Ground Forces stated.

Meanwhile, Ukraine has expanded evacuations in the Sumy region amid fears of a renewed Russian offensive. The Russian Ministry of Defense claimed it had captured the village of Oleksiivka, prompting further mandatory evacuations in 11 nearby settlements.

On the other side, Ukrainian drones reportedly struck deep into Russian territory, including the Siberian region of Irkutsk—marking the first Ukrainian drone presence in the area—as well as Ryazan and the Arctic Murmansk region. No casualties were reported in these incidents.

Ukraine's top commander, General Oleksandr Syrskyi, stated that Russia's main offensive efforts remain concentrated on Pokrovsk, Toretsk, and Lyman in Donetsk, as well as areas along the Sumy border. As diplomatic channels reopen, the conflict on the ground shows no sign of slowing.



Sheikh Hasina Faces Trial for Crimes Against Humanity Amid 2024 Crackdown Allegations

In a dramatic turn of events, former Bangladeshi Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina is now facing formal charges of crimes against humanity for her alleged role in the brutal crackdown during the 2024 student-led uprising. Prosecutors allege that Hasina directly ordered security forces and affiliated political groups to carry out deadly operations that resulted in mass civilian casualties.

Chief Prosecutor Tajul Islam, speaking at a televised hearing on Sunday, revealed that the prosecution team has substantial evidence—including video recordings and decrypted communications—that indicate the killings were premeditated and sanctioned from the highest levels of government. "These killings were planned," Islam asserted, underscoring Hasina's command responsibility in the violent suppression of dissent.

The investigation report concluded that Hasina had given explicit directives to use lethal force against protesters and political opponents, which led to the deaths of approximately 1,500 individuals and injuries to around 25,000 more. A total of 81 witnesses have been listed for the upcoming trial, which is expected to be one of the most high-profile legal proceedings in Bangladesh's history.

Hasina stepped down from her position as prime minister in August 2024 after a 15-year rule, amid intensifying public unrest and global pressure. She fled to New Delhi along with close family members,

UK Defence Review: Russia an 'Immediate Danger', China a 'Sophisticated Challenge' in New 10-Year Military Plan

UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer's government is preparing to unveil a sweeping strategic defence review on Monday, laying out a comprehensive 10-year roadmap for the country's military preparedness. The 130-page report, led by former NATO Secretary General George Robertson, alongside security experts Fiona Hill and Richard Barrons, outlines the increasing threats posed by Russia and China and the strategic investments needed to counter them.

The review identifies Russia as an "immediate and pressing danger" following its prolonged war in Ukraine and growing military cooperation with adversaries such as China, Iran, and North Korea. It highlights that Moscow's aggression and its deepening

ties with like-minded regimes demand urgent attention and military readiness from the West.

China, while not seen as an immediate military threat, is described as a "sophisticated and persistent challenge." The report underscores Beijing's complex approach to global influence—economically dominant, technologically advanced, and at times aligned with Pussian of

at times aligned with Russian strategic goals. These dynamics, the review warns, could result in coordinated efforts to reshape the global security order, especially when combined with the disruptive ambitions of regional actors like Iran and North Korea.

Alongside its geopolitical analysis, the review calls for critical investments in



defence infrastructure. The UK Ministry of Defence has announced the construction of at least six new weapons and explosives factories across the country. The Starmer government is also committing over £1 billion to the development of a "Digital Targeting Web" designed to modernize battlefield communication and coordination, drawing lessons from Ukraine's military resilience against Russia.

Healey emphasized the need for innovation and rapid response capabilities: "Future conflicts will be won by forces that are more connected, better equipped, and able to strike faster than their adversaries. India's Q4 GDP **Growth Hits Four-Quarter High at 7.4%**

But FY25 Growth Slows to Four-Year Low



Tndia's economy showed a se-**L**quential improvement in the January-March quarter of 2025, with GDP growth accelerating to 7.4%, marking the strongest quarterly performance in a year. This uptick was driven largely by robust industrial activity, particularly in manufacturing, construction, and mining sectors. However, despite the healthy end to the fiscal year, the overall growth for FY25 slowed significantly to 6.5%, the lowest in four years, according to data released by the National Statistics Office (NSO).

The Q4 figure reflects a rebound from the previous quarter, which was revised slightly upward to 6.4% from an earlier estimate of 6.2%. While industrial sectors showed strength, consumption demand—the engine of India's growth—appeared to lose momentum, indicating some softness in consumer spending as the fiscal year closed.

Comparing these numbers with the previous fiscal year underscores the moderation in economic momentum. FY24 saw a strong 9.2% growth, with the last quarter of that year registering 8.4%. The slowdown to 6.5% in

FY25 signals a significant easing, highlighting challenges that the economy faces as it seeks to sustain its expansion amid global uncertainties and domestic constraints.

This slowdown comes amid other notable economic developments, including recent claims by NITI Aayog CEO BVR Subrahmanyam that India has overtaken Japan as the world's fourth-largest economy. While such milestones reflect India's growing economic stature, the slowing growth rate reminds policymakers of the importance of addressing underlying structural issues to maintain momentum.

The latest GDP data suggests a mixed picture for India's economic outlook. The strong industrial performance in Q4 is encouraging and may provide a foundation for future growth. However, the dip in overall yearly growth calls for cautious optimism and highlights the need for sustained efforts to boost consumption and investment.

As India navigates this complex phase, maintaining balanced growth will be key to ensuring long-term economic resilience and prosperity.

India's Forex Reserves Surge by Nearly \$7 Billion to \$692.7 Billion

India's foreign exchange reserves witnessed a significant jump of \$6.992 billion, reaching \$692.721 billion during the week ending May 23, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) reported on Friday. This rebound comes after the previous week ended May 16, when the reserves had declined by \$4.888 billion to \$685.729 billion. India's forex reserves had previously hit an all-time high of

2024.

Breaking down the components, foreign currency assets (FCA)—which form the largest portion of the reserves—increased by \$4.516 billion to \$586.167 billion during the week. These assets reflect the value of India's holdings in major global currencies such as the US dollar, euro, British pound, and Japanese yen. The dollar value of these assets fluctuates with changes in exchange rates, as

\$704.885 billion at the end of September ate or depreciate against the dollar.

Gold reserves also contributed substantially to the overall increase, rising by \$2.366 billion to reach \$83.582 billion. Gold has traditionally been a key part of India's reserve portfolio, providing stability and serving as a hedge against currency risks.

Additionally, India's Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) rose modestly by \$81 million to \$18.571 billion. SDRs are the IMF to supplement member countries' official reserves. The country's reserve position with the IMF also saw an increase during the same period, adding to the overall strength of India's external buffer. The surge in forex reserves underscores India's strong external position amid ongoing global economic uncertainties. A robust forex buffer provides the country with greater flexibility to manage

currency volatility, support imports, and maintain investor confidence. It also strengthens India's ability to deal with external shocks and stabilize the economy in turbulent times.

Despite recent fluctuations, India's forex reserves remain among the highest globally, reflecting continued foreign investment inflows and steady export performance. The RBI's management of reserves will be closely watched as the global economic environment evolves.

Tndia's gross Goods and **■**Services Tax (GST) collections surged to over ₹2.01 lakh crore in May 2025, marking a 16.4% increase compared to the same month last year. The growth comes on the heels of April's all-time high collection of ₹2.37 lakh crore.

According to official data released on June 1, domestic transactions in May contributed around ₹1.50 lakh crore, growing by 13.7% year-on-year. Meanwhile, GST from imports rose by a sharp 25.2%, totaling ₹51,266

Breaking down the collections: Central GST stood at ₹35,434 crore,

State GST at ₹43,902 crore, and Integrated GST contributed approximately ₹1.09 lakh crore. The Cess component was ₹12,879 crore.



In comparison, the gross GST collected in May 2024 was ₹1,72,739 crore. After adjusting for refunds — which declined by 4% to ₹27,210 crore — the net GST mop-

up for May 2025 stood at about ₹1.74 lakh crore, reflecting a strong 20.4% year-on-year growth.

However, growth across states showed considerable variation. While Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and West Bengal posted healthy increases between 17% and 25%, other large states such as Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, and Telangana recorded more modest growth of up to 6%. States like Madhya Pradesh, Punjab, Haryana, and Rajasthan saw moderate gains of around 10%.

Deloitte India Partner M S Mani emphasized that this uneven growth

likely stems from sector-specific or seasonal factors, calling for a detailed, data-driven analysis at the state level.

'Skip India' Trend: Why AI Startups Are Turning Away from Local Clients Agrowing number of InAdian AI startup found-

ers are adopting a new approach — avoiding Indian enterprise clients altogether. This rising trend, now widely known as the "Skip India" movement, is driven by increasing frustration over how domestic businesses treat early-stage tech ventures.

While the issue may appear to be about money at first glance, it runs much deeper. According to several founders and industry voices, the problem lies in the approach and mindset of

many Indian enterprises. A viral LinkedIn post by finance professional Shubham Garg recently shed light on the issue, sparking fresh conversations in the startup ecosystem. Garg noted that companies often demand free proof of concepts (PoCs), expecting startups to invest significant time and resources into custom-built pilots without offering any commitment or payment in return.

These pilot projects can take weeks to complete, only for startups to be ghosted afterward or subjected to prolonged delays in decision-making. Founders also report vague communication, excessive negotiation over already modest pricing, and general reluctance to invest in innovative solutions unless they come from large, well-known players.

As a result, more founders are choosing to bypass Indian clients entirely and focus their energy on international markets where there's a greater willing-



ness to pay for innovation and a more professional procurement process. The "Skip India" trend is not about rejecting Indian roots — rather, it reflects a strategic decision to survive and scale in more supportive environments.

Industry insiders worry that this shift could hurt the domestic ecosystem in the long run. If Indian businesses continue to undervalue local innovation, they may miss out on cutting-edge technologies being developed right at home. Moreover, it could push more talent and intellectual property out of the country.

The message from startup founders is clear: unless attitudes shift toward valuing time, expertise, and fair compensation, India risks alienating its own innovators — and losing out on the AI revolution being built within its borders.

West Indies Fined for Slow Over-Rate in First ODI Against England

 $T^{\text{he International Crick-}}_{\text{et Council (ICC) has}}$ fined the West Indies team for maintaining a slow over-rate during the first One Day International (ODI) against England, held on May 29 at Edgbaston, Birmingham. According to the official ICC release, the team fell short by one over after time allowances were taken into account, triggering penalties under the ICC Code of Conduct.

Match referee Jeff Crowe of the Emirates ICC Elite Panel imposed a fine of five percent on each West

Indies player's match fee. The fine is in accordance with Article 2.22 of the ICC Code of Conduct, which deals with minimum overrate offences. Under this regulation, players are fined five percent of their match fee for every over their team fails to bowl within the allotted time.

West Indies captain Shai Hope accepted the sanction, meaning a formal hearing was not required. The charge was brought forward by on-field umpires Kumar Dharmasena and Martin Saggers, along with third umpire Adrian Holdstock and fourth umpire Graham Lloyd.

The first ODI ended in a resounding victory for England, who posted a massive total of 400/8, with significant contributions from Ben Duckett, Joe Root, Harry Brook, and Jacob Bethell—all scoring half-centuries. Bethell top-scored with 82 and was named Player of



the Match. In reply, the West Indies crumbled for just 162, handing England a dominant 238run win. Sagib Mahmood and Jamie Overton each claimed three wickets to lead the English bowling attack.

The series now moves to Cardiff for the second ODI, while the third and final match is scheduled to be held at The Oval on Tuesday.

voiced strong optimism about India's wrestling prospects in the coming years, especially at the 2036 Olympics. Speaking at the 25th edition of the Fit India Sundays on Cycle initiative—this time themed as the Tiranga Rally in tribute to the Indian Armed Forces—Dutt emphasized that wrestling would be India's top medal-winning sport if the Games are held in India.

Reflecting on recent challenges, Dutt acknowledged the troubled period wrestling has faced due to the controversy and legal proceedings involving former Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) president Brij Bhushan Singh. "The last two years were very bad for wrestling. There was a negative perception, and it affected our momentum. We could have easily won two or three medals at the Paris Olympics if not for the setbacks," he said.

However, he remains confident about the future. "We've won medals in wrestling in five consecutive Olympics from 2008 to 2024. Our wrestlers are resilient. Now that the ban on the WFI has been lifted, the sport is slowly getting back on track. The federation is resuming its work, and sponsors are returning," Dutt added.

He credited the Pro Wrestling League, launched in 2015, for giving aspiring wrestlers an international platform and financial support. "It helped junior wrestlers grow and compete with the best," he noted.

Yogeshwar also echoed Prime Minister Narendra



Modi's vision of hosting the 2036 Olympics in India. "We are preparing to become a global sporting power, and I truly believe that wrestling will be our biggest medal contributor," he affirmed.

Commenting on the Tiranga Rally, Dutt praised the initiative for honoring India's armed forces. "This is a message to every Indian: when we are fit and united, our nation is strong," he said.

The event also came in the wake of Operation Sindoor, India's strong military response to the April 22 Pahalgam terror attack. The operation eliminated over 100 terrorists, followed by a coordinated strike on Pakistan's key military infrastructure, leading to a mutual cessation of hostilities on May 10.

The result solidifies McLaren's recent resurgence, with Piastri emerging as a serious title contender and the team now firmly in the hunt for the Constructors' Championship.


