ENGINEERING COLLEGES TORTURING PARENTS IN THE NAME OF ADMISSIONS

Amaravati: Usually, admission for Engineering colleges is held after EAMCET. After getting the results, counselling begins, and students opt for convenor quota and management quota based on the rank obtained in EAMCET. Generally, students who got average marks in Intermediate and who predict a lower performance in EAMCET try to reserve their seat under the management quota in their desired college. Merit students and those who are hopeful of better ranks can get seats in the majority of the colleges.

Not only EAMCET, but many deemedto-be universities are also conducting their own exams. Based on the performance in those exams, admissions are finalized. Regular colleges and universities alike are indulging in manipulation in the name of admissions and are collecting deposits.

On the ground, the marketing teams of many Engineering Colleges are contacting the parents of merit students and asking them to deposit money to reserve a seat. They promise that if the student gets a better rank, they will refund or adjust the deposit accordingly. Practically, the refund is done only if the student doesn't want to join that particular college, and we all know the drama created by the management by that time. This means that in the name of pre-booking seats, colleges are collecting crores of rupees, which will be settled only after two months. During these two months, that amount will Here, the problem lies in the combe utilized by these college managements, which is against the rules.

Mrs. Aruna, a parent, said, "My kid got 988 marks. We hope for a better rank in EAMCET as well. Our kid is also going to write the exams conducted by a few universities. We are getting so many calls from different colleges seeking deposits towards pre-booking of the seat. They are warning that if we don't deposit, we may lose the seat



afterwards. But they are promising a refund. But why should we deposit if we are going to get a better rank? If the rank is not good, then we will have to opt for the management quota. Then why are they pressurising us for a deposit?"

Mr. Kiran Kumar, a parent, said, "Colleges with a good reputation are demanding high fees, and a few are at moderate levels. We are unable to make a decision at this time, as we don't know the rank yet. If we don't get give us a seat, and then we have to opt

for another college. If we do not pay the deposit to that college, at the time of admission they may also say that the seats are not available. Then what are we supposed to do? Exactly on this point, they are blackmailing us."

Jogi Ramesh's U-turn on Amaravati

Former Andhra Pradesh minister and senior YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) leader Jogi Ramesh has stirred a major political debate with his sensational remarks supporting Amaravati as the sole capital of Andhra Pradesh. Known for his fierce loyalty to YCP Chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy and for aggressively countering TDP in the past, Jogi Ramesh's sudden shift in tone has surprised both party leaders and the public.

In an interview with Big TV, Jogi Ramesh said, "From now on, Amaravati will be the single capital. We faced a serious loss due to the three-capital plan. After the people have given such a verdict, we will not go for three capitals again. When Jagan becomes CM again, Amaravati will be developed as the capital."

His comments have set off a storm, raising questions about whether this is a new party line or a personal stance taken out of political compulsion. He admitted that the attacks on Amaravati farmers during their padayatra were a mistake and that the government should not have targeted them. "It was



wrong to attack the Amaravati farmers. We have realized that mistake," he said. Jogi Ramesh also accepted that the remarks made against Chandrababu Naidu's wife, Nara Bhuvaneshwari, during a session in the Assembly severely damaged the YCP's image. "Even my wife questioned me. Is that what we go to the Assembly for? To say such useless things about a leader's wife?" he stated, expressing regret over the episode.

The sudden change in his tone has raised eyebrows. Many on social media are speculating about whether Jogi Ramesh has distanced himself from Jagan or is trying to shield himself from legal trouble. Observers recall the jail time faced by former YCP leaders like Vallabhaneni Vamsi and wonder if fear

of similar consequences pushed Jogi to change his stand.

Some political analysts are even suggesting that Jogi Ramesh may have been deliberately used by the YSRCP leadership to test waters before officially shifting from the unpopular three-capital proposal. Others argue he may be trying to appease his local constituency in the Amaravati region, where sentiment against the three-capital idea has always been strong.

Meanwhile, the farmers of Amaravati expressed strong resentment toward the vulgar comments allegedly made by some pro-government voices. Women from the region protested with slippers and filed a formal police complaint at Tullur police station against the Sakshi group's editor KSR and journalist Krishnam Raju for derogatory remarks. Jogi Ramesh's remarks have now triggered a larger debate: Has the YSRCP taken a U-turn on the three-capital issue, or is this just the former minister's individual damage control effort? The coming days are likely to shed more light on whether this is the beginning of a policy shift or an isolated political survival tactic.

State IT and Human Resources Minister Nara Lokesh has strongly condemned YSRCP chief Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy for what he described as disrespectful remarks against women and the sacred capital, Amaravati. Lokesh accused Jagan of insulting women publicly through his media and demanded an unconditional apology. In a scathing social media post, Lokesh said, "Jagan garu! Is it right to insult women so badly through your media? The false propaganda you are spreading by hating the self-respect of mothers and Amaravati marks the pinnacle of your downfall. If you try to spit on the sky, it will fall on your face. If you try to spit poison on Amaravati, it will return to your Tadepalli Palace."

Lokesh emphasized that Amaravati is the "capital of the gods" and a place deeply respected by the people who sacrificed their lands for its development. "This is the Amaravati of mothers who made sacrifices. While conspiracies are



being made under the guise of three capitals, our capital remains the holy place where the deities of all religions who chased away the demon Jagan are worshipped," he said. Lokesh also questioned how someone who allegedly sent his own mother and sister away could understand the greatness of women.

The Minister also highlighted Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu's firm stance on women's safety and respect. "CM Chandrababu Naidu has repeatedly warned that any harassment or atrocity against women will be met with strict punishment. We educate respect for women from the student stage and strictly punish those who damage women's self-confidence," Lokesh stated.

He warned Jagan and his team that the coalition government would not tolerate derogatory remarks targeting women, such as "We will wear sarees and bangles," or "Don't cry like a girl." Lokesh demanded that Jagan immediately apologize to the women of the state.







Health Minister showcases major progress in first year

- 100 Cr NHM incentive, 3,318 Ayushman Mandirs sanctioned
- · Digital health, diagnostics, cancer care see major push

On the occasion of one year of the NDA coalition government in Andhra Pradesh, Health, Family Welfare and Medical Education Minister Satya Kumar Yadav presented a detailed report of the department's achievements, highlighting key reforms and infrastructure developments that marked a shift in the state's public health de-

At a press meet held in Vijayawada on Saturday, the Minister said that democratic governance is not just about votes but about accountability, in an indirect swipe at the previous government. "We don't brand people who voted against us as backstabbers. We believe in serving all," he remarked.

The Minister revealed that Andhra Pradesh received a ₹100 crore performance incentive under the National Health Mission for outstanding implementation of health schemes—an accomplishment the previous government failed to achieve due to non-release of state funds. The coalition government, he said, constructed 3,318 Ayushman Arogya Mandir buildings within a year with ₹1,065 crore support from the Centre, compared to just 6,000 over five years earlier.

A significant expansion of diagnostic infrastructure was also noted. Thirteen new Integrated Public Health Labs were sanctioned—equal to the total set up by the previous regime in five years. City Diagnostic Centres in Vijayawada, Visakhapatnam, and Tirupati are being prepared for launch. Additionally, 3,200 advanced diagnostic machines were procured and doorstep diagnostics through 104 mobile vehicles will begin with a pilot rollout in Kuppam.

Critical care infrastructure also saw a boost, with 10 new Critical Care Blocks sanctioned in a year. The current government spent ₹62 crore in one year, compared to just ₹28 crore spent over the previous government's full term.

Other key updates include the operationalization of the Kurnool Cancer Hospital with four Linac machines, Cath labs at Ongole and Kadapa, new CT scan machines, and expansion of the STEMI heart attack care programme which saved 2,650 lives. On the digital front, the state will partner with the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation to establish a Digital Health Command Centre, and a Digital Nerve Centre pilot is underway in Kuppam with Tata Trusts, covering 3.3 lakh people. Minister Yadav also emphasized the success of the NCD 3.0 campaign, which screened 2.71 crore adults for non-communicable diseases and cancer. School health screenings under RBSK reached 58 lakh of 69 lakh students. Overall, hospital staff attendance improved to 14.2%, outpatient cases rose to 7.48 crore, and over 7.2 crore diagnostic tests were conducted.

The state will celebrate International Yoga Day on June 21 with a mass event on the Vizag-Bhimili beach stretch. The Minister outlined a ninepoint health vision aligned with Swarnandhra Vision 2047, covering digital health, AI, recruitment, and medical tourism development.

72% ration distribution in Just 7 days

Over 11 lakh elderly and disabled receive goods at home

State Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Minister Nadendla Manohar has hailed the successful distribution of ration goods to over one crore people in just seven days as a significant milestone in the history of Andhra Pradesh's public distribution system. He said the achievement reflects the government's commitment to efficient and people-centric service. Under the new civil supply policy introduced by the coalition government, ration goods are being distributed to 1,46,21,232 ration card holders through 29,796 low-price shops across the state. Starting from June 1, the government has already provided ration to 1,05,27,767 card holders — accounting for 72 percent of the total beneficiaries. In the same period, sugar has been distributed to



67.56 percent coverage rate.

The Minister highlighted the government's inclusive approach aged over 65 years. As of now,

98,77,670 cardholders, achieving a through the introduction of home delivery services for senior citizens and the differently-abled

11,05,439 individuals have received ration through this doorstep service, ensuring that no one is left out due to physical limitations.

Nadendla Manohar emphasized that the government is working toward a comprehensive "door-todoor service" model. Beneficiaries now have the flexibility to collect their rations from the 1st to the 15th of every month, at a time of their convenience, from morning to evening. He also pointed out that the earlier, consumer-friendly features of the ration distribution system have been reinstated to enhance accessibility.

The Minister advised all ration dealers to maintain a service-oriented attitude and ensure accuracy in distribution. He reiterated that the government is committed to transparency, responsibility, and delivering convenience to the public through a robust and accountable ration supply system.

Gang arrested for ₹53 lakh job fraud in AP Secretariat

A gang that extorted ₹53 lakh from unemployed youths by promising government jobs through outsourcing in the Andhra Pradesh Secretariat has been busted by the Vizianagaram police. Acting on a complaint, the 1st Town Police arrested four individuals involved in the scam and seized ₹6 lakh in cash. The key accused, K. Sai Venkat Sujith from Pradeep Nagar in Vizianagaram, is currently under treatment and will be arrested soon, police said.

According to DSP M. Srinivasa Rao, Sujith posted on Facebook offering jobs in various government departments through outsourcing in the AP Secretariat at Vijayawada. Attracted by the offer, seven unem-



ployed youths from Vizianagaram, Manyam, and Anakapalle contacted him. The accused collected a total of ₹53 lakh from them and issued fake appointment orders. To make the scheme appear au-

thentic, Sujith even brought the victims to Vijayawada and accom-

ly claiming that their joining pro-Visakhapatnam, Parvathipuram cess was underway. When there was no communication thereafter, one of the victims, S. Vinod of S. Kota, lodged a complaint with the 1st Town Police Station.

During the investigation led by CI S. Srinivas, it was found that five of the accused are residents of modated them for a month, false- Andhra Pradesh and four others

are from Hyderabad. When the accused learned about the FIR, they went into hiding.

However, acting on a tip-off that the other accused—CH Mahesh, Rubin Kumar, John, and Yakub were heading to Vizianagaram to check on Sujith's health, police laid a trap around the railway station area. The suspects were arrested and confessed to their involvement. The investigation revealed that they had created fake ID cards and appointment letters using equipment in Hyderabad.

Trapped by Greed...

Bengaluru man cheated of ₹7.5 lakh by betting app Growbet777

In a disturbing case of online fraud, a man from Bengaluru was cheated of ₹7.5 lakh by a shady betting app operating under the name Growbet777 (www.growbet777.com). The app, allegedly run by a group based in Andhra Pradesh, lured users with false promises of quick profits, easy withdrawals, and flashy advertising on social media.

Mr. Antony, a resident of Bengaluru and a regular private sector employee, was first introduced to Growbet777 via a social media ad. Tempted by the claims of doubling his money, he cautiously began with a ₹10,000 deposit through a UPI transaction to a number shared by the app's WhatsApp customer support: 8297931135. Seeing his balance increase in the

app after the first deposit, Antony



gained confidence and proceeded to invest larger amounts—₹50,000, then ₹1,00,000, and so on. Each time, he was given a new UPI ID and name for the transactions, including handles such as bkalmar0519@axl, chsri4625@axl, devanshyaaqua.ibz@icici, more. Names associated with these IDs include CH Sridhar, Mamidisetti Satyanarayana,

Mutyalapalli Tarun Prasad, and multiple wallets and banks—typentities like Mohan Traders.

But when Antony attempted to withdraw his supposed profits, the platform stopped responding. His requests were first marked "pending", then ignored altogether. The once-active WhatsApp number went silent. No replies, no support—only dead ends.

Realizing he had been scammed, Antony documented all his transactions and filed a formal complaint on the national cybercrime portal cybercrime.gov.in. He also visited his local police station and provided full transaction records, names, and UPI IDs linked to the fraudulent activities. Simultaneously, he requested his bank to take action to freeze the beneficiary accounts.

Bank officials acknowledged the complaint but admitted that recovery would be difficult, as the money had been dispersed across ical tactics of organized digital fraud operations.

Antony's case shines a spotlight on a growing trend of online betting scams, especially through apps that appear legitimate but are designed to defraud unsuspecting users. These platforms exploit regulatory loopholes, create temporary UPI handles, and use misleading ads to trap users. While gambling is banned or restricted in many states, these digital platforms manage to operate in grey zones.

Antony's message to others is clear: "If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is. Don't fall for quick-money traps."

Authorities are now investigating the network behind Growbet777. Meanwhile, Antony continues his fight—not just to get his money back, but to prevent others from falling into similar digital traps.

The initiative will help establish clear records such as area, ownership details, and usage patterns for each parcel of land and property. Crucially, unauthorized con-

structions, encroachments, and irregularities will be identified through database analysis.

As part of this digital transformation, every asset—be it a house, road, or piece of land—will be assigned a unique identification number. Digital door numbers will be issued for residential properties, improving governance, service delivery, and urban planning.







Setback For TDP in Annamaiya district...

- Senior leader shocks TDP
- Sugavasi Balasubramaniam announces resignation from party
- · Unexpected twist after Mahanadu

The Telugu Desam Party has suffered a setback in Annamayya district with senior leader Sugavasi Balasubramaniam announcing his resignation from the party. Balasubramaniam, who contested and lost the 2024 Assembly elections from Rajampet, sent his resignation letter to TDP chief and Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, citing respect for the sentiments and opinions of the people as the reason for his decision.

The move comes just ten days after the party's Mahanadu, indicating internal unrest in the Rajampet unit of the TDP. According to sources, Sugavasi's resignation is linked to the ongoing group rivalry within the constituency leadership, and also due to the party's failure to respond appropriately after the death of his father, former MP and senior leader Palakondrayudu.

Sugavasi, son of the late Palakondrayudu—a political stalwart who served as both MLA and MP from the Rayachoti and Rajampet constituencies over several decades—had contested the Rajampet Assembly seat in 2024 but faced defeat. Despite his loss, he remained active in party activities for a brief period before gradually distancing himself due to internal disputes.

Reports indicate that Rajampet TDP is currently split into three factions led by Chamarthi Jaganmohan Raju, former MLC Batyala Chengalrayudu, and Sugavasi Balasubramaniam himself. The growing infighting has left the local cadre confused and leaderless. Adding to the discontent, the Sugavasi family reportedly feels sidelined by Minister Mandapalli Ramprasad Reddy, who is accused of not giving space to the family in their own stronghold of Rayachoti.

Sources close to Balasubramaniam revealed that he had hoped for a Rajampet MP ticket before the elections, but instead received an Assembly ticket. Despite contesting in challenging circumstances marked by internal opposition, he stayed loyal to the party. However, the lack of acknowledgment or support from Chandrababu Naidu during the time of his father's death proved to be the final

In his resignation letter, Balasubramaniam wrote: "Respected Nara Chandrababu Naidu, I am resigning from the Telugu Desam Party, respecting the advice, suggestions, opinions and sentiments of the people."

It remains unclear whether he will continue in politics or join another party. Political observers believe that if he chooses to continue, the YSRCP could be a likely option, though no official confirmation has been made yet.

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has issued a stern warning to party leaders and legislators, stating that anyone who brings disrepute to the party or the government will be removed without hesitation. Speaking during a teleconference with TDP leaders, Chandrababu emphasized the need for accountability and performance in governance.

He noted that a clear shift in development and administration has been visible in the past year under the current government. "The state, which was pushed into darkness, depression and despair during the previous regime, is now seeing progress due to our decisive governance," he said.

The Chief Minister revealed that internal surveys are being conducted to assess the per-



formance of every party member and public representative. "Those who perform well will be encouraged. Those who bring a bad name to the party or government, regardless of their status, will be removed," he warned. Chandrababu particularly addressed first-time MLAs, urging them to work with greater responsibility and stay in close touch with the people and party workers. "I don't want them to be just one-time MLAs. People observe everything closely, so be cautious and sincere," he added. He announced that the state government would roll out the 'Thalliki Vandanam' scheme by June 12 or 14, providing financial support directly to mothers. He reaffirmed his commitment to the state's reconstruction efforts, declaring that no obstacles will be allowed to derail the development agenda.

To mark one year of the NDA government, victory rallies will be held in all constituencies on June 12. On the same day, an evening review meeting will take place involving NDA allies and senior officials. This meeting will focus on charting out the programs to be implemented over the next four years.

Chandrababu concluded by saying that regular reviews of MPs and MLAs will continue every six months, and those who excel will be appreciated, while underperformers will be sidelined. "I will soon hold face-to-face meetings with each MLA," he said, underscoring his handson leadership approach.

Strict rules for new entries into TDP

Admit only after background checks, inform central office first, says State President

The Telugu Desam Party (TDP) has issued key instructions regarding the process of admitting new members, with State President Palla Srinivasa Rao making it clear that all future inductions must follow a well-defined protocol. State's financial woes exposed by CAG figures: Jagan

Government hiding truth behind GST numbers, says YCP chief

TPN Correspondent | Andhra Pradesh YCP chief and former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy has lashed out at the Andhra Pradesh government over what he described as a "disturbing and misleading" financial situation of the state. Reacting to the key financial indicators released by the Comptroller and Auditor General (CAG) for April 2025, Jagan said the government's claims on revenue growth are far from the actual picture.

Taking to social media, Jagan stated that the CAG's report exposes the reality behind the government's financial propaganda. "These figures make it clear that the financial condition of the state is in a serious crisis, and the narrative being pushed by the ruling party does not match the facts," he said.

On May 1, the government had claimed that the net GST collections in April 2025 stood at ₹3,354 crore the highest since the implementation of GST. However, the CAG data told a different story. It showed that GST revenues for April 2025 were down by 24.20% compared to April 2024. The sharp decline has raised questions about the reliability of government announcements.

Dy Speaker files complaint against Sakshi TV over Amaravati remarks

Assembly Deputy Speaker Raghurama Krishnam Raju has filed a complaint with the DGP demanding strict action against Sakshi TV and individuals responsible for airing derogatory comments about Amaravati.

In his complaint, he stated that remarks made by Krishnam Raju and Kommineni Srinivasa Rao on Sakshi TV equating Amaravati with prostitution were deeply insulting to the women of the region. He described the comments as a serious violation of human values and journalistic standards.

Raghurama Raju urged the police to register cases under IPC sections 294, 354A, 500, 504, 505(2), and 509. He demanded legal action against the channel, the anchor, and those who made the statements, based on the broadcast footage. He asserted that such language is unacceptable in civil society and hurts the dignity of the people of Amaravati, especially the families who gave up land for the capital project. The incident has sparked public outrage, with many demanding accountability.

Contract staffer faces serious misconduct allegations in Eluru

A contract employee working in that she demanded a 25% share the Women and Child Welfare Department in Eluru district is facing a barrage of serious allegations, ranging from corruption and misuse of government funds to harassment of fellow employees and misuse of authority.

Reports claim that she habitually files complaints against those who don't follow her directives, thereby creating a hostile work environment.

Officials also point out that her interference extends into the functioning of the Child Welfare Committee. Instead of supporting the adoption process and child welfare activities, she reportedly obstructs officials and refuses to send assigned staff, violating government orders.

In one instance, when a report wasn't favorable to her interests, she allegedly went directly to the District Collector and influenced action against committee members. Her consistent pattern of bypassing protocol and creating internal disruptions has raised concerns within the department. Multiple voices within the administration are now demanding a thorough probe into the employee's activities, questioning how a contract worker could exert such unchecked control over an entire department for more than a decade.

MLA Bonda Uma inspects controversial Satavahana College demolition

Vijayawada MLA and Central Government Whip Bonda Umamaheswara Rao visited the Satavahana College campus to inspect the damage caused by recent demolitions, which have sparked widespread controversy. The MLA examined the demolished structures and sought detailed information about the incident. The demolition work, carried out with a JCB lorry, was halted temporarily after TDP leaders deflated the tires of the vehicle. Speaking to the media, Bonda Umamaheswara Rao condemned the demolition, emphasizing the college's historical significance. "Satavahana College has been serving poor, marginalized, and weaker sections of society since 1969. It is an ancient institution with a rich legacy," he said.

The MLA noted that civil disputes over the college land have existed for decades, but the High Court had previously ruled clearly in favor of the college. The matter is currently under appeal in the Supreme Court. Bonda alleged that a false affidavit was submitted by a person undergoing medical treatment and accused one Dhulipala Srikanth and his associates of attacking a watchman and vandalizing the college. "They have defamed the DGP's name and created chaos in the area. The City Police Commissioner is closely monitoring the case," he added.

The MLA called for a thorough investigation into the demolition, which was carried out through a contract reportedly worth crores of rupees. He urged authorities to bring all those responsible, regardless of their status, to justice. "It is atrocious to destroy a college where lakhs of students have studied," Bonda said, pointing out that 1.66 cents of the disputed land belongs to the government.

College correspondent Rama Satyanarayana described the demolition, saying, "The demolition started at 2 a.m., with watchmen terrorized and the college smashed without warning." He added that the police seized the vehicles used in the destruction and that many conspirators were behind the attack. Satyanarayana also revealed that the college principal had been kidnapped 10 days ago amid the ongoing land dispute.

"Manchu Vishnu's film Kannappa has introduced the characters 'Pilaka' and 'Gilaka', which were publicly promoted in recent official releases. These names and portrayals are clearly intended to ridicule Brahmins. We strongly condemn this deliberate insult," Sridhar stated.

He accused the makers of using the film as a platform to target a specific community under the guise of creative freedom. The Vedika has already approached the High Court seeking legal intervention on the issue. Sridhar warned that if the characters are not removed, his organi-

zation will ensure that the film's release is legally blocked.

"We are not against cinema or artistic freedom, but targeting a community for laughs is unacceptable. At the pre-release event of the film, it should be officially declared that these two objectionable characters have been removed. Otherwise, we will take this battle to court and stop the film's release," Sridhar asserted. The controversy comes as Kannappa, a high-budget mythological drama starring Manchu Vishnu, continues to generate buzz for its scale and casting. However, this protest has now cast a shadow over its release plans.

Legal notices have been issued to multiple firms doing business under the sacred name, which holds deep religious significance for millions of devotees. The Tirumala Srivari Laddu was granted patent rights by the Geographical Indicator Registry in Chennai in September 2009, after TTD first acquired rights under the Geographical Indications of Goods Act in 1999. Following orders from TTD Executive Officer Shyamala Rao, the legal department, through Sahadeva Law Chambers based in Delhi, issued notices on May 31 to companies including Push My Cart, Transact Foods Limited, and India Sweet House. Push My Cart responded promptly and agreed to remove the Srivari Laddu name from its products, with reports that others are taking similar action. TTD EO Shyamala Rao emphasized, "Tirumala Srivari Laddu Prasadam is not just a sweet; it symbolizes the faith of crores of devotees. We will not hesitate to take any action if this sacred name is misused." She reaffirmed that TTD remains committed to ensuring the quality and sanctity of the laddus offered to devotees, and will take all necessary legal steps to protect this heritage.

Scapegoating the Commissioner: Ignoring the Real Accountability in the Chinnaswamy Tragedy

The recent stampede at Bengaluru's Chinnaswamy Stadium was a tragedy of unimaginable proportions—one that left 11 young lives lost and over 40 injured. As someone who was present that day, I witnessed the euphoria turn into chaos. What began as a festive gathering of thousands of fans morphed into a nightmare of overcrowding, confusion, and eventual disaster.

The immediate aftermath saw swift action: suspension orders issued to the city's Police Commissioner, two IPS officers, and two lower-ranking personnel. But as the dust settles, a deeper question looms—was this a justified step or a convenient act of scapegoating to shield those truly responsible?

From early afternoon, the crowds swelled uncontrollably. Police presence was thin, and what little was there appeared overwhelmed. Stadium gates buckled under the surge, while some people climbed walls to gain entry. By late afternoon, it was clear the situation was spiraling out of control. Yet, this wasn't the doing of one individual or even one



department.

What transpired was a collective failure involving multiple stakeholders: the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA), the Royal Challengers dia spectacle driven by frenzy,

and crucially, the state government. The celebratory event itself was hastily organized following RCB's entry into the playoffs—a political and me-

Once allies of convenience, the tech tycoon and the ex-president forged their bond over mutual disdain for institutions and a shared love for deregulation, disruption, and attention. Musk briefly served on Trump's advisory councils during his presidency, only to exit after the U.S. withdrew from the Paris Climate Accord. But ties remained, with Trump lauding Musk as a "genius," and Musk later aligning with conservative narratives and rebranding Twitter into X, becoming a self-proclaimed champion of "free speech."

Their fragile alliance shattered with Trump's push for the "One Big Beautiful Bill Act," a sweeping \$2.5 trillion package that cuts taxes, slashes healthcare

and environmental programs, and most notably, eliminates subsidies for electric vehicles directly threatening Tesla's bottom line. Musk lashed out, calling the bill a "disgusting abomination." Trump retaliated with characteristic venom, branding Musk a hypocrite living off government contracts while publicly criticizing handouts.

This spiraled quickly into digital warfare. Musk endorsed tweets calling for Trump's impeachment and floated Vice President JD Vance as a replacement. He even hinted that the Trump administration suppressed Epstein-related files. Trump, from his social media platform Truth Social, portrayed Musk as an ungrateful billionaire sabotaging American interests for personal gain.

Tesla stock plummeted, wiping out over \$150 billion in market value in days. This feud, once confined to Twitter threads and cable news soundbites, now reverberates across markets and political structures. What began as an ego-driven

squabble is now destabilizing real institutions and investor confidence.

At the heart of this chaos is a broader issue: Musk and Trump aren't just individuals—they're avatars of power. Each represents a different strain of dominance. Trump weaponizes grievance and populist rhetoric. Musk, the tech visionary, leans into intellectual superiority and the allure of innovation. Yet, both depend on constant attention and narrative control.

In this clash, governance takes a backseat. Laws and institutions are no longer the bedrock democracy—personality and digital performance are. When governance becomes spectacle, policy becomes a prop, and democracy becomes dangerously fragile.

In ancient empires, power struggled between rulers and lawgivers. In today's America, power plays out between a tech baron and a reality TV politician. The question isn't just who wins—but what remains of democracy when they're done fighting.



Ukraine's 'Operation Spiderweb' and India's Strategic Echo

On June 1, Ukraine carried lives. out an extraordinary drone strike deep inside Russian territory, targeting two strategic air bases in an operation codenamed 'Spiderweb'. The audacity and precision of the attack stunned observers and exposed a crucial lesson in modern warfare: that emerging technologies and ingenuity can disrupt even the most formidable military powers. This marks a defining moment not just in the ongoing Ukraine-Russia conflict, but also in the evolving global doctrine of asymmetric warfare—one that carries striking parallels to India's own strategic playbook.

While Russian President Vladimir Putin has threatened retaliation and flagged the issue with U.S. President Donald Trump, Ukraine's strike was far from a reckless escalation. It was targeted, calculated, and timed ahead of ceasefire talks in Istanbul. By damaging Russia's Tu-95 and Tu-22 strategic bombers—aircraft capable of launching nuclear and cruise missile strikes— Kyiv sent a clear message without endangering civilian that dictates success.

This deliberate and focused action mirrors India's own approach to deterrence, particularly in the aftermath military superiority has been of terror attacks. Take for chipped away. This operation instance India's air strikes across the Line of Control following the Pahalgam terror attack. The emphasis was on "measured response"—targeting terror infrastructure, not civilian populations. Both nations, though facing very different theatres of conflict, demonstrate how strategic discipline and moral restraint can coexist with the capacity to strike decisively.

Ukraine's technological improvisation also disrupts conventional thinking about power. A country under siege, with limited resources, used affordable drones to pierce the myth of Russian invincibility. This mirrors India's belief in innovation and precision over brute force, especially in a region where asymmetric threats abound. The battlefield is changing: it's not the size of the arsenal, but the smartness of its use

Putin now faces a psychological dilemma. While his nuclear arsenal remains untouched, the aura of Russia's underscores a deeper truth that the weapon alone doesn't guarantee dominance; the will and mind behind it do.

Globally, the implications are profound. Western nations now face a critical moment. Ukraine's daring operation has created diplomatic leverage that Washington and its allies can use to push for a genuine ceasefire. Failing to do so would squander a moment of strategic clarity.

For India, the lesson is equally sharp. In our volatile neighbourhood, peace cannot rest on diplomacy alone. It must be underpinned by credible deterrence, technological adaptability, and strategic autonomy. Ukraine's 'Operation Spiderweb' is a bold reminder that even the embattled can rewrite the rules—provided they think clearly, act precisely, and strike only when it matters most.



PM Modi to Attend G7 Summit in Canada, Thanks Mark Carney for the Invitation

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has confirmed his participation in the upcoming G7 Summit in Canada, signaling a positive shift in India-Canada relations. Modi will attend the summit, set to take place from June 15 to 17, following an invitation from Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney.

The news puts an end to weeks of speculation about whether Modi would attend the summit, marking the first time since 2019 that India will be represented at the G7, despite not being a formal member. "Evasion Won't Protect...": Rahul Gandhi vs Poll Body **Over Maharashtra Polls**

The Election Commission of India (ECI) has strongly refuted Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's latest allegations of "match-fixing" in the 2024 Maharashtra Assembly elections, calling them "completely absurd." In response, Gandhi doubled down, accusing the poll body of evasion and demanded transparency, including the release of CCTV footage from polling booths.

The row began after Gandhi penned an op-ed in The Indian Express on Saturday, raising concerns about the conduct of the Maharashtra elections. Despite a stronger showing in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the Congress, along with allies NCP (Sharad Pawar faction) and Shiv Sena (Uddhav Thackeray faction), suffered a major defeat in the Assembly polls, winning just 46 out of 288 seats. The BJP-led coalition swept the polls with 230 seats.

Gandhi alleged irregularities such as fake voter additions, inflated turnout, targeted bogus voting, and rigging in the appointment of Election Commission officials. He also warned of similar issues in the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections.

The Election Commission coun-

Rahul Gandhi hit back on X, calling the EC's response "unsigned and evasive," and urged the Commission to release the digital voter rolls and CCTV footage from booths after 5 p.m. on election day. "Evasion won't protect your credibility," he posted, demanding direct answers from the constitutional body.

Confident in PM's wisdom on delimitation: Andhra **Pradesh CM Naidu**

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has expressed full confidence in Prime Minister Narendra Modi's handling of the upcoming delimitation exercise, asserting that the national interest will guide the process and that southern states' concerns will be addressed.

In an interview with The Hindu, Mr. Naidu, whose Telugu Desam Party (TDP) is a key ally in the BJP-led NDA government, revisited the 2001 Constitutional amendment—one he was instrumental in shaping—that delayed inter-state redistribution of parliamentary seats until after the 2026 Census. "I am 100% confident in the Prime Minister's wisdom. He will work with everybody," Naidu said, recalling how the Vajpayee government had accommodated the sentiments of southern states that had successfully implemented population control.

The Chief Minister acknowledged demographic shifts, noting that north India's growing population is now viewed as an asset. "Now, we have to keep our sentiment intact," he said, suggesting that a balanced policy would emerge when the time is right. He also indicated that he hasn't yet raised the issue directly with Mr. Modi but plans to do so "at an appropriate time." Naidu downplayed the current push by southern states for a fair delimitation process, saying it was premature. "Let the Centre announce a policy. If there's a problem, we can raise it then. Until then, making it a political slogan won't help," he said.

Highlighting demographic concerns in southern states, Naidu emphasized the need to reverse declining population trends. "We have to promote population growth in a big way. It's a difficult task," he noted, while admitting that incentives for childbirth have largely failed elsewhere. He urged a new approach to population management, recognizing the region's aging population and declining birth rates.



India Set to Become World's Third-Largest Economy: Consul General in Shanghai

India is on track to become the world's third-largest economy, potentially surpassing Germany, driven by its demographic strengths and ambitious economic reforms, according to Pratik Mathur, India's Consul General in Shanghai.

Speaking at the Consul Generals and CEOs Business Forum in Shanghai on Friday, Mathur emphasized India's readiness to capitalize on the next wave of industrial growth and technological advancements. "It's a great time to be in Asia, especially in India," he told an audience of business leaders and diplomats, highlighting the country's strong democratic foundation and a large, aspirational middle-class population.

Mathur projected that India's current GDP of around USD 4 trillion could rise to USD 30 trillion by 2047. He attributed this potential to structural reforms, a youthful workforce, and initiatives such as the 'Make in India' campaign. Launched in 2014, the program aims to transform India into a global manufacturing powerhouse through measures like tax incentives, concessional loans, and the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme.

He noted that India is already seeing tangible results. The country is now the second-largest mobile phone manufacturer in the world, trailing only China, with over two billion devices shipped between 2014 and 2022 at a CAGR of 23%.

India's manufacturing prowess is also expanding in sectors such as automotive, steel, pharmaceuticals, and food processing. These developments, Mathur said, are positioning the country as a reliable player in global supply chains.

Further highlighting India's improved business climate, Mathur pointed to the country's significant rise in the World Bank's Ease of Doing Business index, where it has moved up 80 ranks in recent years.

India Reiterates Zero-Tolerance on Terrorism During UK Foreign **Secretary's Visit**

India reaffirmed its uncompromising stance on terrorism during talks with visiting UK Foreign Secretary David Lammy in New Delhi on June 7, 2025. External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar emphasized that India expects its international partners to respect its "zero tolerance" policy and reject any attempts to equate terrorists with their victims.

"We will never countenance perpetrators of evil being put on par with their victims," Mr. Jaishankar told Mr. Lammy during their meeting. He appreciated the UK's condemnation of the recent terror attack in Pahalgam and its support for India's counterterrorism efforts. The talks, held during Lammy's one-day visit to India, followed his controversial remarks during a visit to Pakistan three weeks earlier.

During his May 17 visit to Islamabad, Mr. Lammy had stated that the U.S. and U.K. were working with both India and Pakistan to "ensure an enduring ceasefire, dialogue, and Confidence-Building Measures." His comments, referencing the brief conflict that followed the Pahalgam attack, were not well-received in New Delhi, which has consistently opposed third-party involvement in bilateral matters with Pakistan.

India maintains that peace with Pakistan can only be built through bilateral dialogue, provided there is a complete cessation of cross-border terrorism. Mr. Jaishankar's statement was a direct response to any suggestion of parity being drawn between India and Pakistan or international mediation in regional tensions.

Ahead of the visit, the UK High Commission in India had said that Lammy's agenda would include discussions on how to support long-term peace and stability in South Asia in light of recent tensions.

The firm tone from India underscores its resolve to ensure that terrorism remains a red line in all diplomatic engagements, especially when dealing with sensitive issues involving Pakistan.

"People Have Spoken": Elon Musk Floats **New Political Party Amid Feud With Trump**

Tech billionaire Elon Musk has stirred fresh political debate by proposing the formation of a new political party in the United States. Amid his escalating feud with President Donald Trump, Musk launched a poll on his social media platform, X (formerly Twitter), asking users if it was time to create a party that better represents the political center.

The poll, which asked, "Is it time to create a new political party in America that actually represents the 80% in the middle?" received overwhelming support, with 80.4% of respondents voting "Yes." Responding to the results, Musk posted, "The people have spoken. A new political party is needed in America to represent the 80% in the middle! And exactly 80% of people agree. This is fate." He later proposed the



name "The America Party" for the potential new movement.

Musk's move comes amid a growing rift with President Trump, whom he once advised informally. Tensions flared when Musk claimed personal credit for Trump's victory in the 2024 presidential election, asserting, "Without me, Trump would have lost the election." The bold claim drew a sharp response from Trump, who fired back on Truth Social, saying the government should cut all financial ties with Musk's companies, including Tesla and SpaceX.

"The easiest way to save money

in our Budget, Billions and Billions of Dollars, is to terminate Elon's Governmental Subsidies and Contracts," Trump posted.

The clash intensified following Musk's criticism of a government spending proposal dubbed the "Big, Beautiful Bill," which continued to support fossil fuel companies while reducing benefits for clean energy initiatives — a direct blow to Musk's ventures in electric vehicles and renewable energy.

With his massive online following and growing political influence, Musk's suggestion of launching a centrist party could significantly alter the American political landscape. Whether "The America Party" becomes a formal reality remains to be seen, but the billionaire's latest move signals a deeper involvement in U.S. politics beyond business and technology.

Japan's Ispace Loses Contact With Moon Lander 'Resilience' **After Touchdown Attempt**

Japanese space startup Ispace has announced it was unable to re-establish communication with its uncrewed lunar lander Resilience following a touchdown attempt on the Moon early Friday morning. The mission, dubbed Hakuto-R Mission 2, was Ispace's second bid to achieve a successful lunar landing after a failed attempt in 2023.

Resilience was aiming to make Ispace the first private company outside the United States to land a spacecraft on the Moon. The planned touchdown was scheduled for 4:17 a.m. JST (1917 GMT, Thursday), following a meticulously planned hour-long descent from lunar orbit.

According to a live data feed provided by Ispace, the lander's altitude abruptly dropped to zero just before the expected landing time. However, no confirmation of a successful landing or subsequent data transmission was received. The company stated that it is currently analyzing telemetry data to determine what went wrong during the critical final moments of the descent. "We have not been able to establish communication with the lander after the expected touchdown time," Ispace said in a statement. "We are continuing to investigate the situation and will provide updates as soon as we have more information."

This marks the second unsuccessful attempt by Ispace to land on the Moon. Its first mission in April 2023 ended in failure when the lander crashed during the final descent phase due to a navigation error. Despite the setback, Ispace remains one of the leading contenders in the private lunar exploration sector, aiming to provide commercial transport services to the Moon in partnership with international space agencies and commercial partners. Industry analysts say while the mission may not have ended in success, it reflects the growing ambition and capabilities of private aerospace firms in ad-



Thailand and Cambodia Reinforce Troops Along Disputed Border After Fatal Skirmish

Tensions between Thailand and Cambodia have escalated following a deadly border clash in late May, prompting both countries to reinforce military presence along their disputed frontier. Thailand's Deputy Prime Minister and Defence Minister, Phumtham Wechayachai, confirmed on Saturday that additional Thai troops had been deployed in response to increased Cambodian military activity in the contested

The move follows a skirmish on May 28 in an undemarcated border zone, which resulted in the death of a Cambodian soldier. Although both governments have issued statements supporting dialogue, their military actions suggest otherwise. During bilateral talks held last Thursday, Cambodia reportedly rejected Thai proposals aimed at de-escalating the situation. "In light of continued military reinforcements by Cambodia, which have intensified tensions, the Royal Thai Government has found it necessary to strengthen our military posture," Mr. Phumtham said in an official statement, though without specifying the scale of troop deployments.

The Thai Army also issued a separate statement accusing Cambodian troops and civilians of repeatedly encroaching on Thai territory. "These provocations, and the build-up of military forces, indicate a clear intent to use force," it said, adding that Thailand would assume full control of all checkpoints along the Cambodian border.

Despite mediation efforts by Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim—who chairs ASEAN—and diplomatic engagement from China, the border standoff remains unresolved. Thailand and Cambodia share an 817-kilometre (508-mile) border that was first mapped by colonial France in 1907. The two nations have a long history of territorial disputes, most notably around the 11th-century Preah Vihear Hindu temple. A flare-up in 2008 led to artillery exchanges and multiple casualties over the following years.

US Army Develops 3D-Printed Skin to Heal Soldiers' Battle Wounds

The US Army is advancing cutting-edge bioprinting technology to produce 3D-printed skin and tissues that could revolutionize battlefield medicine. In collaboration with the University of Hawaii, the US Army Combat Capabilities Development Command Chemical Biological Center (DEVCOM CBC) has launched a research initiative aimed at treating soldiers' injuries more effectively particularly severe burns and wounds.

Bioprinting uses bio-inks made from living cells, proteins, and nutrients to create three-dimensional, functional replicas of human tissues and organs. The technology holds immense potential for military medicine, enabling rapid tissue repair and even organ regeneration on the battlefield or in remote areas.

Under a Cooperative Research and Development Agreement (CRADA), DEVCOM CBC and the University of Hawaii are executing two joint work statements (JWS). One of these focuses on developing advanced organ models using bioprinting. Dr.



research professor at the John A. Burns School of Medicine (JABSOM), is partnering with DEVCOM CBC's bioengineering expert Priscilla Lee to create tools for evaluating chemical compounds and responses in human tissue.

Dean Sam Shomaker of JABSOM highlighted the global impact of the project, saying, "These Jason Barnhill, an associate efforts have the potential to

RBI Raises Loan-to-Value **Ratio for Gold** Loans, Effective **April 2026**



The Reserve Bank of In-**I** dia (RBI) has announced a hike in the loan-to-value (LTV) ratio for gold loans, revising the limits to provide greater borrowing power for individuals pledging gold. Under the updated guidelines, gold loans up to Rs 2.5 lakh will now have an LTV ratio of 85 percent, increased from the initially proposed 75 percent in the draft norms released in April 2025. This means borrowers can now avail loans amounting to 85 percent of the value of their pledged gold for loans under Rs 2.5 credit flow is enhanced, the lakh, enhancing access to safety and soundness of the credit for small-ticket bor- banking system are mainrowers.

For gold loans exceeding Rs 2.5 lakh and up to Rs 5 lakh, the LTV ratio has been fixed at 80 percent. Meanwhile, for loans above Rs 5 lakh, the RBI has set the LTV ratio at 75 percent. These tiered limits ensure that higher loan amounts correspond

with slightly lower LTV ratios, balancing borrower credit needs with prudent risk management.

The revision reflects the RBI's ongoing efforts to support financial inclusion and ease credit availability in a secure manner. By increasing the LTV on smaller gold loans, the central bank aims to make it easier for borrowers, especially those in rural and semi-urban areas, to access affordable financing using their gold assets.

What Degan as a rhike in the Krkonoše Mountains of northern Czech Republic turned into a real-life treasure hunt for two anonymous tourists. While walking through the lush forest, they stumbled upon a partially buried aluminium box among the stones. Curiosity led them to open it—and what they found inside has since captured global attention.

The box contained a breathtaking treasure trove: 598 gold coins 10 gold bracelets 17 sealed cigar boxes A vintage powder compact An ornate comb

Weighing about 3.7 kilograms (8 pounds), the gold coins alone are estimated to be worth over 80 lakh Czech Koruna (approximately ₹3 crore or USD 340,000). Even more intriguing are the 17 sealed cigar boxes, whose contents are yet to be examined, deepening the mystery surrounding the find.

Instead of keeping the treasure, the tourists acted responsibly and handed it over to the East Bohemia Museum in Hradec Králové. According to Miroslav Novák, the head of the museum's archae-

7hat began as a peaceful ological department, the pair arrived without notice and presented the discovery, prompting an immediate investigation by experts.

Historians believe the treasure might have been hidden during the interwar period or near the end of World War II, possibly as an act of protection during political unrest.

Is Al Overhyped? New Study Shows Little Impact on Jobs and Wages

Despite the global hype surrounding artificial intelligence (AI), a new study suggests its real-world impact on jobs and wages may be far more modest than expected. As fears grow over AI replacing human workers and reshaping entire industries, early research now paints a different picture.

A working paper from the National Bureau of Economic Research in Denmark has found that AI's effect on the labour market is minimal so far. The study analyzed data from 25,000 workers

across 7,000 workplaces—primari- The authors argue that while comly in occupations considered highly vulnerable to AI disruption, such as accountants, customer service representatives, financial advisors, HR professionals, software developers, and teachers.

The researchers, economists Anders Humlum and Emilie Vestergaard, reported that AI usage led to only a three percent reduction in work hours, with productivity gains translating into just a three to seven percent increase in pay. "AI chatbots have had no significant impact on earnings or recorded hours in any occupation," they wrote.

This evidence runs counter to the dominant narrative of AI driving massive workplace transformation or triggering job losses on a wide scale. "While adoption has been rapid, with firms heavily invested in unlocking technological potential, the economic impacts remain small," the paper notes.



panies may be eager to embrace AI for cost-cutting and efficiency, the actual benefits in terms of productivity and wage growth have been underwhelming. "Modest productivity gains, combined with weak wage pass-through, help explain the limited labor market effects," they added.

The findings challenge corporate strategies currently underway. For instance, cybersecurity firm Crowd-Strike recently laid off five percent of its staff, citing AI integration as the reason. Similarly, Duolingo announced it would phase out contractors in favor of AI tools, echoing a shift it made in 2012 when it transitioned fully to mobile.

As businesses bet big on AI, this study serves as a sobering reminder that the technology's economic impact—at least for now—might not be as revolutionary as many expected.

Airport Scanner Refused To Recognise This Make-Up Lover Forced to Remove Makeup

In War-Torn Goma, Parents Pay School Fees With Palm Oil as Cash Crisis Deepens

Tn the besieged city of **L**Goma, located in eastern Democratic Republic of Congo, survival has taken on new forms as a crippling cash shortage disrupts daily life. Seized by the Rwanda-backed M23 rebel group in January, the city is now grappling with a financial vacuum that has shuttered banks, emptied ATMs, and forced residents to turn to barter to meet essential needs.

Among the most telling examples of the crisis is how parents are now paying school fees—with cans of palm oil. At the Majengo school, teachers like Richard Mbueki accept oil and food items instead of cash. "The priority at the moment is to have something to eat," he says, lifting a donated can left by a parent. It's an informal, yet functional system: parents offer goods,



the school assesses their rates, then issues a receipt and credits the amount as school fees.


