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New Ministers Take Oath at Telangana Raj Bhavan

- Vivek Venkataswamy, Adluri Laxman, Vakiti Srihari inducted into cabinet
- Governor administers oath to three new ministers at Raj Bhavan
- All inducted MLAs belong to SC, ST, and BC communities
- Ramachandrunayak appointed as Deputy Speaker of Assembly

This latest cabinet expansion by the Congress-led government is seen as an effort to uphold social justice, with all three newly inducted ministers representing SC, ST, and BC communities. Contrary to speculation that senior leaders like Sudarshan Reddy and Komatireddy Rajgopal Reddy would be included, the Congress high command reportedly directed the state leadership to focus solely on providing opportunities to underrepresented sections for now.

Alongside the cabinet expansion, Ramachandrunayak has been appointed as the Deputy Speaker of the Telangana Legislative Assembly. Chief Minister Revanth Reddy extended his congratulations to all four leaders through a social media message, praising their elevation and expressing hope in their future contributions to the state's progress.

Interestingly, all three newly sworn-in ministers are first-time MLAs. Vivek Venkataswamy, though a first-time MLA from Chennai, had previously served as a Member of Parliament. Vakiti Srihari was elected from Makthal, while Adluri Laxman Kumar secured his win from Dharmapuri in the 2023 Assembly elections.

In a significant step towards social representation, three new ministers were inducted into the Telangana cabinet on Sunday morning. Governor Jishnu Dev Verma administered the oath of office at the Raj Bhavan to Chennai MLA Vivek Venkataswamy, Dharmapuri MLA Adluri Laxman Kumar, and Makthal MLA Vakiti Srihari. The ceremony was attended by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, existing cabinet members, MLAs, and MLCs.

Gaddam Vivek's Political Journey

Gaddam Vivek, who won from Chennai in the 2023 Assembly elections, comes from a distinguished political lineage as the son of veteran Congress leader G. Venkataswamy. His career has seen several political shifts. Vivek won as a Congress MP from Peddapalli in 2009, joined the TRS during the Telangana movement in 2013, and rejoined Congress briefly for the 2014 elections, where he was defeated. He returned to the TRS in 2016 and later joined the BJP after being denied an MP ticket. In 2023, he once again rejoined the Congress and secured victory as an MLA. His son Vivek Vamsi also won as a Congress MP in the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. This is Vivek's first ministerial role.



Adluri Laxman Kumar's Rise

Adluri Laxman Kumar earned his ministerial berth after winning from Dharmapuri in the 2023 Assembly polls, defeating BJP's Koppula Eshwar by a margin of 2,229 votes. Born in 1968 in Karimnagar district, he holds an IIT diploma from Peddapalli. He has held various organizational roles including General Secretary of Karimnagar District NSUI (1986-1994) and AP Youth Congress (1996-2001). Laxman previously served as Karimnagar ZP Chairman (2010-2012) and AP SC Corporation Chairman (2013-2014). After multiple unsuccessful MLA contests, he finally secured a win in 2023.



Vakiti Srihari's First Cabinet Role

Vakiti Srihari, hailing from the former Mahabubnagar district, won the Narayanpet Assembly seat in 2023, defeating BJP's Chittam Rammohan Reddy by over 17,000 votes. His political groundwork includes serving as ZPTC and ZP floor leader (2014-2018) and as Sarpanch of Makthal (2001-2006). A long-time grassroots Congress leader, Srihari now steps into his first ministerial position.

The expansion underscores Congress's strategy to strengthen its base across communities and regions in Telangana. The move is being viewed as a calculated political message aimed at strengthening the Congress party's outreach among marginalized communities ahead of key future political developments in the state.



Jubilee Hills MLA Maganti Gopinath passes away at 63

- BRS Party mourns senior leader's demise;
- suffered heart attack at AIG Hospital
- Gopinath died of a heart attack at 5:45 am while under treatment
- He served as MLA thrice and was a key BRS leader in Hyderabad

Senior BRS leader and Jubilee Hills MLA Maganti Gopinath (63) passed away early this morning while undergoing treatment at AIG Hospital in Gachibowli. According to official reports from doctors, he suffered a fatal heart attack at 5:45 am. His sudden demise has left his family and the BRS party in deep shock and mourning.

Maganti Gopinath was born on June 2, 1963, in Hyderguda to Krishnamurthy and Mahananda Kumari. He completed his intermediate education at Venkateswara Tutorials in 1980 and went on to graduate with a BA from Osmania University in 1983. He is survived by his wife Sunita, son Maganti Vatyalyanath, and daughters Akshara Naga and Dishira. Gopinath entered politics



through the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) in 1983. He rose through the ranks, serving as the Telugu Youth State President (1985-1992), director of HUDA (1987-88), president of the Consumer Forum, and Hyderabad TDP district president (1988-93). In 2014, he won the Jubilee Hills MLA seat as a TDP candidate.

He later joined the Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS), now BRS, and won the 2018 by-election by defeating Congress candidate P.

Vishnuvardhan Reddy with a majority of 16,004 votes. In 2022, he was appointed TRS Hyderabad district president. He retained his seat again in the 2024 elections, marking three consecutive wins from Jubilee Hills. He also served on the Legislative Assembly's Public Estimates Committee.

Beyond politics, Gopinath made his mark in Telugu cinema as a film producer. His film credits include Pathabasti (1995), Ravanna (2000), Bhadradi Ramudu (2004), and Naa Style (2009). Known for his strong grassroots connection and commitment to development work, Gopinath earned a loyal following in his constituency. His loss is being deeply felt by both party leaders and the people he served.

BJP leader and former Telangana minister Eatala Rajender has strongly reacted to allegations that he is shielding BRS chief and ex-Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) in the ongoing Kaleshwaram Commission inquiry. Addressing the media on Sunday, Eatala made it clear that he has no obligation to protect KCR and had already



submitted a transparent account of his role during the project implementation to the Commission.

Eatala, who served as the Finance Minister during the Kaleshwaram project phase, clarified that all government de-

isions at the time were taken with cabinet discussions and approval. "There is no Kaleshwaram without a cabinet sub-committee," he said, adding that redesign suggestions came from within the sub-committee and that complete details will emerge soon.

He criticised the Congress leadership for making misleading statements to confuse the public. "I have placed all the facts before the commission. I have nothing to hide, nor do I have any reason to protect anyone," Eatala asserted. Responding sharply to Minister Tummala Nageshwar Rao's statement that the Kaleshwaram project was never discussed in the cabinet, Eatala dismissed it as false. "Nothing happens in the government without cabinet discussion. Every file was

Union Minister and BJP Telangana President G. Kishan Reddy has claimed that the central government under Prime Minister Narendra

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Congress leader, six others held for assaulting female cop

- Accused remanded to 7-day judicial custody for obstructing SI Haritha on duty
- Incident linked to witness intimidation in February case, say police

Local Congress leader Rayala Rama Rao and six of his associates were arrested on Saturday, June 6, in Khammam district for allegedly assaulting sub-inspector D. Haritha and obstructing her from carrying out her duties. The group has been remanded to seven days of judicial custody.

The incident took place at Chowdari Hotel near the NSP Crossroad in Kalluru mandal, where SI Haritha had arrived

following a tip-off that Rama Rao was intimidating hotel owner Maganti Bosu Babu and staff. The officer was reportedly investigating threats aimed at discouraging witnesses from testifying in a case related to a February 2025 incident at the same location.

Upon her arrival, Rama Rao allegedly pushed the officer with both hands and hurled verbal abuse when she asked him to vacate the premises. Video evidence of the confrontation reportedly shows Rama Rao and his associates engaging in a heated argument and attempt-

ing to obstruct Haritha from discharging her official duties. Based on her complaint, a case was registered under various sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), including charges for assaulting a public servant, criminal intimidation, unlawful assembly, rioting, and outraging the modesty of a woman.

All seven accused were produced before a local court in Khammam on Saturday evening and subsequently remanded to judicial custody for a week.

Further investigation into the matter is ongoing, and police have not ruled out the possibility of more arrests in connection with witness intimidation in the February case.

Maganti Gopinath's funeral ends with government honours

The last rites of BRS leader and Jubilee Hills MLA Maganti Gopinath (62) were held on Sunday afternoon at the Mahaprasthanam in Jubilee Hills, conducted with official government honours. Gopinath passed away early Sunday morning while undergoing treatment at AIG Hospital, Gachibowli, following a severe heart attack he suffered three days ago.

The funeral procession witnessed tearful farewells as BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), former minister Harish Rao, and numerous party leaders, activists, and supporters gathered to pay their respects. KTR, Harish Rao, and other senior leaders carried the pall during the procession. Police officials honored Gopinath's mor-

tal remains with a ceremonial three-round salute in the air.

Maganti Gopinath had been battling ill health for some time, including kidney-related complications. He was admitted to the AIG Hospital after suffering a cardiac arrest on June 5 at his residence. Emergency CPR was performed successfully, and he was placed on a ventilator in the ICU. Despite intensive care, his condition worsened, and he breathed his last at around 5:45 am on Sunday.

His sudden demise has cast a deep shadow of sorrow over the Jubilee Hills constituency and the BRS party. Several political leaders and public figures expressed their condolences, mourning the loss of a respected leader.

Buffalo calf rescued from illegal sacrifice in Telangana

- Undavelly police prevented sacrifice after PETA tip-off
- Calf sent to Kalote Animal Trust for rehabilitation
- PETA calls for abolition of animal sacrifice practices

A male buffalo calf was rescued from an illegal sacrifice attempt at a temple in Undavelly village of Jogulamba Gadwal district, Telangana, on June 4, 2025. The rescue happened after People for the Ethical Treatment of Animals (PETA) India received credible information and immediately contacted the Station House Officer of Undavelly Police Station. Acting quickly, the police prevented the sacrifice at around 1 a.m.

The operation was coordinated with Ms. Latha Nimma, founder of Mettu Animal Samrakshan, Hyderabad, whose timely complaint to PETA India was crucial for the calf's rescue. The calf was initially placed under temporary care and later transferred safely to the Kalote Animal Trust, an animal rescue sanctuary in Raigad, Maharashtra, for treatment, rehabilitation, and lifelong care. PETA India arranged the interstate transfer with full cooperation from local authorities.

PETA India's Legal Advisor and

Director of Cruelty Response, Meet Ashar, said, "Just as human sacrifice is now recognized and condemned as murder, the outdated practice of animal sacrifice must also be abolished. We urge the public to stand up for animals by rejecting cruel practices and choosing kindness instead." Ashar also praised the compassion and swift action of the Undavelly police, especially Station House Officer Shri P. Mahesh, for saving the young calf from a violent death.

Several Indian states including Gujarat, Kerala, Puducherry, and Rajasthan have laws prohibiting the religious sacrifice of animals in temples or their precincts. Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, and Telangana also prohibit such practices in public places of worship, their precincts, or related religious gatherings.

Anyone can file complaints against illegal constructions: High Court

The Telangana High Court has ruled that any individual — including strangers and passersby — can file complaints about illegal constructions, and such complaints are not restricted to direct victims. The clarification came in a case involving unauthorised construction on a 400-square-yard plot in BS Maktha, Begumpet, Hyderabad.

Justice T. Vinod Kumar, who presided over the matter, dismissed a plea filed by Anita Andallu Cheguri seeking to cancel GHMC notices served to her and her son regarding alleged illegal construction on the property.

According to the petition, Cheguri and her son had individually purchased 200 square yards each and obtained permission for two-storied buildings with stilt floors. Later, they applied to revise the permissions to allow a ground-plus-four structure on the combined plot. Eventually, a fifth floor was constructed, which the petitioners claimed was due to structural and architectural requirements. Despite applying for revised permissions and regularisation, the authorities did not act on their requests. The dispute arose after a person named Narender — who does not reside in the locality — filed a petition over the construction, prompting the High Court to issue orders directing GHMC to take action. GHMC subsequently served notices to the petitioners without including them as respondents in the original case.

The petitioners challenged the legality of these orders, arguing that they were not heard before the court's initial directions and



that this violated the principles of natural justice.

However, the court rejected this contention. Justice Vinod Kumar observed that the absence of the petitioners as respondents did not amount to a violation of natural justice in this case. He emphasised that any individual has the right to report unauthorised constructions, and if authorities fail to act, the court has the authority to intervene.

GHMC's counsel clarified that construction permissions had been denied, and that regularisation is applicable only for structures built before 2015. Since the petitioners' additional floors were constructed without necessary approvals, the court noted that their rights were not ignored, but rather, their constructions were illegal.

Upholding the earlier single-judge ruling, the High Court dismissed the petition. However, it directed GHMC to consider the petitioners' regularisation plea in accordance with the precedent set by the A. Praveen Kumar case.

This verdict reinforces the court's stance on illegal constructions and upholds public participation in reporting violations, regardless of whether the complainant is directly affected.

Gau Rakshaks stop Cattle Transport, row erupts in Sangareddy

- Cow protectors claim action based on theft alerts
- MLC alleges assault, demands attempt-to-murder case

An incident involving alleged cow vigilantes and cattle traders in Ramchandrapuram, Sangareddy district, has triggered controversy in Telangana. While AIMIM MLC Mirza Rahmath Baig has condemned the group's actions as assault and kidnapping, the gau rakshaks maintain they acted in response to growing concerns over illegal cattle transport and thefts that often spike during festival seasons.

The incident occurred when cattle traders were transporting livestock in a DCM vehicle towards Hyderabad. According to sources aligned with the gau rakshak group, the vigilantes intercepted the vehicle following a tip-off that the cattle were being moved without proper documentation and in violation of transport norms. The group claims they attempted to question the traders and escort them to a nearby gaushala (cow shelter) for verification.

The situation reportedly escalated when the traders resisted. The gau rakshaks insist there was no intent to harm, but to prevent what they believed could be part of an ongoing pattern of illegal cattle movement — a concern that has surfaced across multiple villages in Telangana, especially during Muslim festivals when cases of cattle theft often rise.

AIMIM MLC Rahmath Baig, who visited the injured traders at the hospital on Sunday, alleged that the traders were tied to a tree and beaten with sticks and rods, and has demanded an attempted murder case against the vigilantes. He termed the incident a targeted attack and called for immediate arrests.

In contrast, cow protection groups argue that their actions were in the interest of animal welfare and the prevention of illegal trade. "We are simply ensuring the safety and dignity of cows, which are often smuggled or subjected to cruelty. Our volunteers respond when local communities raise alarms about suspicious movements," said a member of the group.

Police have launched an investigation into the matter and are examining CCTV footage as well as verifying transport documentation related to the cattle. Authorities have also stated that any violations of law — from either side — will be dealt with strictly.

The incident has once again highlighted the delicate balance between law enforcement, animal rights, and communal sensitivities. While cow protectors see themselves as guardians of tradition and law, critics argue for stricter regulation to prevent overreach and ensure no citizen is subjected to unlawful violence.

nearly 14 months abroad. His return follows an undertaking submitted to the Supreme Court promising cooperation with the ongoing investigation. He is expected to appear before the Special Investigation Team (SIT) probing the case on Monday.

Rao, who was declared an absconder by the SIT, had his passport revoked after a First Information Report (FIR) was registered against him during the investigation into illegal surveillance activities allegedly carried out under the previous Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) government. The apex court, however, recently ordered the return of his passport and barred the police from taking any coercive action against him until further orders. A bench comprising Justices B.V. Nagarathna and Satish Chandra Sharma passed the order after Rao challenged the Telangana High Court's rejection of his anticipatory bail plea.

According to the SIT, Prabhakar Rao had allegedly formed a special unit within the SIB comprising his trusted officers, including DSP Praneeth Rao, to monitor political opponents, businessmen, journalists, dissidents within the ruling party, and even members of the judiciary. The scandal came to light in March

last year after a complaint by Additional SP D. Ramesh led to the arrest of DSP Praneeth Rao. The Nampally criminal court in Hyderabad had earlier issued proclamation orders against Prabhakar Rao, who remained out of reach for over a year. The SIT has so far arrested and charged six officials in connection with the case, including Praneeth Rao, Additional SPs Thirupathanna and Bhujanga Rao, and former DCP P. Radha Kishan Rao.

Rao, in his defense, has consistently denied all allegations, branding them as politically motivated. He had sought political asylum in the United States on similar grounds, a request that was denied by the US government. In India, his legal team has argued that there is no direct evidence linking him to the case, aside from statements from the co-accused, and emphasized his long-standing service record and willingness to cooperate.

As the SIT prepares to interrogate the former intelligence chief, political observers are closely watching the developments in this high-profile case that has shaken the foundations of state-level intelligence operations in Telangana.

Meenakshi Natarajan meets key Cabinet aspirants

Even as three MLAs took oath as Ministers at Raj Bhavan on Sunday, June 8, AICC Telangana in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan personally met other MLAs who were strong contenders for Cabinet berths but were left out in the recent expansion.

Accompanied by senior leaders including Advisor Vem Narender Reddy, Natarajan visited former Minister Sudarshan Reddy at his residence and held discussions. Sudarshan Reddy, a key aspirant for a Cabinet post, is understood to have expressed displeasure over his exclusion from the three-member Cabinet expansion.

In response, Natarajan reportedly assured him and sought to explain the party's reasons for the

selections.

Of the 17 total Cabinet positions, 11 had been filled previously, and with the induction of three more Ministers on Sunday, 14 posts are now occupied. The party still has three vacancies to fill, and efforts are ongoing to placate the remaining aspirants.

Apart from Sudarshan Reddy, Natarajan also tried to meet Munugode MLA Komatireddy Rajgopal Reddy and Mancheril MLA Prem Sagar Rao, who were also strong contenders for Cabinet berths.

The nature of assurances given to these leaders and their future plans remain unclear at this point, as the party works to maintain internal harmony while completing the Cabinet formation.



Ibrahimpatnam MLA defers press meet on Cabinet berth issue after AICC intervention

Ibrahimpatnam MLA Malreddy Rangareddy, who had expressed disappointment over being denied a Cabinet berth, postponed the press meet he had scheduled for 5 pm on Sunday, June 8, after receiving a phone call from All India Congress Committee (AICC) Telangana in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan.

Rangareddy had planned to address the media and outline his future course of action but decided to defer the event after the call. Sources say Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) president Mahesh Kumar Goud is expected to visit Rangareddy later in the day to discuss and address his concerns personally.

Earlier, AICC in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan had also met Bodhan MLA

P Sudarshan Reddy, who is similarly unhappy about not being included in the Cabinet. Among several aspirants, Malreddy Rangareddy was considered a strong contender for a ministerial post.

The MLA has been advocating for the appointment of at least one Minister from the Greater Hyderabad region. In April, he even stated his willingness to step down and have another person elected from his constituency if caste and social equations became obstacles to including a representative from the erstwhile Rangareddy district in the Cabinet.

The intervention by the AICC leadership seems aimed at calming tensions among party members ahead of final Cabinet formation.

Raja Singh Writes to GHMC Demanding Removal of Animal Waste

Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) MLA from Goshamahal, T Raja Singh, on Sunday, June 8, wrote to the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) seeking urgent action to remove animal waste generated during the recent Eid al-Adha celebrations in Hyderabad's Old City.

In his letter addressed to GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan, Raja Singh expressed concern over the waste from qurbani (animal sacrifice) littering various areas, including Falaknuma, Tigalakunta, Yakutpura Railway Station, and Bahadurpura. He alleged that the resulting pollution has caused an unbearable stench, posing serious public health risks to residents.

Singh further pointed out that in some instances, animal waste was found near religious places, including temples, which he described as highly inappropriate and offensive to religious sentiments. He called it "disturbing" and urged the GHMC to take immediate steps to address the issue.

He requested the deployment of additional sanitation teams to clean these affected areas promptly and insisted on initiating thorough disinfection measures. The MLA also stressed the importance of regular monitoring by the civic authorities to prevent similar situations

from recurring in the future.

The letter comes amid heightened public attention on sanitation and health safety following the large-scale animal sacrifices during Eid al-Adha in the city.

Raja Singh's move aims to ensure that hygiene standards are maintained and the discomfort caused to residents is swiftly alleviated.





Hyderabad Mayor receives death threats over phone

Hyderabad Mayor receives death threats over phone

A major security concern has surfaced in Hyderabad as Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) Mayor Gadwala Vijayalakshmi reportedly received threatening phone calls during late hours. The caller, whose identity is

yet to be established, not only used abusive language but also threatened to kill the Mayor and her father, senior BRS leader and MP K. Kesava Rao (KK).

According to reports, the unknown caller left voice messages on the Mayor's phone, issuing life threats and claiming affiliation with a man named Sardar, who recently died by suicide in Borabanda. The threats, which came in the form of late-night calls and vulgar voice notes, triggered alarm among the Mayor's office.

Following the disturbing developments, the Mayor's Public Relations Officer (PRO) filed a formal complaint with the Banjara Hills Police. Acting swiftly, the police registered a case and launched an investigation into the matter.

Authorities have begun tracing the phone number from which the threats were made and are working to identify the person behind the calls. Investigators are also probing the claim of the caller's connection with the deceased individual mentioned in the threats. Police sources say every angle is being explored to determine the motive and background of the accused. Meanwhile, security around Mayor Vijayalakshmi and her family has reportedly been reviewed in light of the threats.

The incident has raised serious concerns about the safety of public representatives and the need for stronger mechanisms to curb such harassment. Further updates are expected as the investigation progresses.

Man, dupes Hyderabad woman under pretext of marriage

In a disturbing case of cheating under the guise of love and marriage, a man identified as P Shiva duped multiple women, including one from Hyderabad. The case came to light after a 35-year-old Hyderabad woman filed a complaint against him at the SR Nagar police station.

According to the complaint, Shiva initially introduced himself as a candidate who had cleared the police sub-inspector exam and soon entered into a relationship with the woman. He even visited her home in November 2020 and assured her parents of marriage. Claiming to have received a marriage proposal along with a dowry offer of Rs 30 lakh, Shiva convinced



the woman's parents to give him Rs 10 lakh.

However, his demands for money continued. At one point, he asked for an additional Rs 6 lakh, claim-

ing he needed the amount to convince his family for the marriage. When the woman's family started questioning the delay in the wedding, Shiva instructed the wom-

an to discuss matters privately. During a meeting at a hotel, he persuaded her into a physical relationship by promising marriage. The woman later accessed Shiva's cellphone and discovered that he was in contact with multiple women.

Shockingly, she also found out that Shiva had married another woman two years earlier.

Following this revelation, the woman approached the SR Nagar Police and lodged a formal complaint. Based on her statement, police registered a case under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) and the Bangalore Nagaraja Sexual Harassment (BNS) Act and have started investigations into the matter.

Elderly man dies of heart attack at Fish Prasadam Distribution

Tension prevailed at the annual fish prasadam distribution program held at the Nampally Exhibition Grounds in Hyderabad after an elderly man collapsed and died while waiting in queue. The deceased has been identified as Satyanarayana (75), a resident of Medak district.

According to eyewitnesses, Satyanarayana was standing in a long queue to receive the traditional fish prasadam when he suddenly collapsed. On-site medical personnel rushed to provide emergency care and performed CPR, but he could not be revived. The incident created a moment of panic among those present at the venue. Authorities immediately shifted the body to Osmania General Hospital Mortuary for post-mortem.

The fish prasadam distribution, conducted annually and drawing thousands from across the state, continued after a brief interruption. Police and organizers ensured that the rest of the proceedings went on in an orderly manner while increasing medical support at the site. Officials expressed condolences to the family of the deceased and are investigating the circumstances surrounding the death.



Drinking water wasted due to pipeline leakage in Falaknuma

Precious drinking water is being wasted in Falaknuma following a major leakage in the main water supply pipeline on Engine Bowli – Jahanuma road. The leak, which started a few days ago, has caused gallons of water to gush out from beneath the road, flowing over a stretch of nearly 200 meters.

Local residents have reported the issue to the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWS&SB) as well as their elected representatives, but so far, no remedial action has been taken to stop the leakage or repair the damaged pipeline.

Zeeshan Qureshi, a local trader,

expressed his frustration, saying, "After noticing the water leakage, we informed both local public representatives and water board officials about the problem. The issue has not been resolved so far." Residents also highlighted that many areas continue to face inadequate drinking water supply, yet water is being wasted unchecked at this leakage point. Muneer Khan, another local resident, lamented, "People in several areas are not getting adequate drinking water supply, yet the authorities are allowing this water wastage despite being notified."

The continuous flow of water has also severely damaged the road

surface. Existing potholes have widened, making travel difficult and uncomfortable, especially for senior citizens. Niyazuddin, a senior citizen from Jahanuma, shared his troubles, saying, "The road guarantees a painful and backbreaking ride. I'm avoiding this road and taking a longer alternate route to reach Engine Bowli from Jahanuma playground."

Residents urge the authorities to take immediate action to repair the pipeline, stop the wastage of drinking water, and fix the road to prevent further inconvenience to commuters and local residents.



Defence liquor bottles seized in Sherlingampalli; two held

In a major crackdown on liquor smuggling, the Shamshabad District Task Force (DTF) team seized 115 liquor bottles being illegally transported from the Defence Canteen. The operation took place near Hafizpet in Sherlingampalli following a tip-off.

Shamshabad DTF CI Praveen Kumar, along with

his team, intercepted a car suspected of transporting non-duty paid liquor (NDPL). Upon inspection, 115 bottles, containing approximately 86.25 liters of liquor worth ₹2.30 lakhs, were recovered. Additionally, the car used for transportation, valued at ₹3 lakhs, was seized.

Excise Superintendent Krishnapriya confirmed that two individuals have

been detained in connection with the case. They are currently being interrogated to ascertain the source and destination of the smuggled liquor.

The raid was conducted under the leadership of CI Praveen Kumar, with support from SI Srikanth Reddy and officers Ganesh, Shekhar, and Nehru.

These raids are part of a week-long special drive

launched by the Prohibition and Excise Department to curb the sale of NDPL across Telangana. The operation has been initiated following directives from Prohibition and Excise Department Director Shanawaz Qasim.

Where is Swachh Telangana?

Garbage piles raise health concerns in Dundigal Municipality

The promise of a clean Telangana appears to be fading in Dundigal Municipality, where garbage collection from households has fallen into complete disarray. Despite government claims of cleanliness drives, residents of Bahadurpally and surrounding areas are grappling with growing mounds of waste and deteriorating sanitation conditions.

In Ward 14 of Dundigal Municipality, particularly on the road stretching from Bahadurpally to Suraram Rajiv Gruha Kalpa near the double-bedroom housing units, heaps of garbage lie unattended. Residents report that the area has turned into a virtual dumping yard, making it uninhabitable due to the stench and spread of filth. Locals expressed serious health concerns as decomposing waste has become a breeding ground for flies and mosquitoes.

While Dundigal Municipal officials claim to be implementing a 100-day action plan for sanitation, visible efforts seem lacking in several col-



onies such as Udayagiri Colony, Green Hills Colony, and even in prominent housing clusters like the double-bedroom homes. Residents are questioning whether officials are deliberately ignoring garbage-laden areas, as no action has been taken despite repeated complaints. "The garbage near the Bahadurpally double-bedroom housing has been lying here for days. With the monsoon approaching, this mess poses a serious health hazard. Why are the officials blind to this

situation?" asked a local resident who spoke to the media. Citizens further allege that the plan to collect garbage using clean autos has failed to yield results, as door-to-door collection is irregular or completely absent in many areas. Public spaces have turned into dumping zones, raising serious questions about the effectiveness of local governance in maintaining basic hygiene standards. With concerns mounting, residents are urging Dundigal Municipal authorities to

immediately remove the accumulated garbage and take preventive measures to avoid outbreaks of disease. They are also demanding a sustained and transparent sanitation strategy, especially in view of the monsoon season that could further aggravate the public health risk. The local population is calling on higher authorities to intervene, inspect the affected areas, and hold officials accountable for neglecting core civic responsibilities.

Tragedy strikes Telugu states

Nine youth drown in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh

Six die in Medigadda barrage, three students drown in Alluri district

Two separate drowning incidents in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh claimed the lives of nine youth on Sunday, casting a pall of sorrow across both states. Families and communities have been left devastated by the sudden loss.

Telangana: Six youth drown in Medigadda barrage

A group of relatives from Ambatipalli and Korlakunta villages faced a tragic end when six of them drowned in the Medigadda barrage on the Godavari river in Jayashankar Bhupalapally district. The victims have been identified as Madhusudhan (18), P. Shiva Manoj (15), Rakshit (13), Karnala Sagar (16), Ram Charan (18), and P. Rahul (19).

According to police, the group of eight youth, accompanied by a middle-aged man named Patti Venkataswamy, had gone to the barrage to bathe after attending a wedding feast on Saturday. While swimming, two boys began to drown, and the others tragically lost their lives in an attempt to save them. Venkataswamy and another individual managed to escape. Heartbreakingly, two of the deceased—Madhusudhan and Manoj—were Venkataswamy's sons.

Rescue operations launched immediately after the incident continued through the night. Teams from the police, fire



department, Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL), and the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) were deployed, along with expert swimmers and boats. All six bodies were recovered on Sunday and shifted to Mahadevpur Government Hospital for postmortem.

Telangana IT and Industries Minister D. Sridhar Babu expressed deep sorrow over the incident and instructed district officials to oversee swift rescue operations. Officials attributed the rising water levels in the Godavari to recent upstream rains.

Andhra Pradesh: Three Class 10 students drown in Alluri district

In a separate but equally tragic incident, three Class 10 students drowned while swimming in a pond in Guntasima pan-

chayat of Dumbriguda mandal in Alluri Seetharamaraju district. The deceased were identified as K. Sushanth, G. Bhanu Tejam, and Sai Kiran.

The students had reportedly gone swimming during their summer vacation. Due to poor estimation of the pond's depth and lack of swimming skills, they were unable to survive. Their sudden deaths have plunged their local community into mourning.

Authorities from both states are urging families and youth to exercise extreme caution around water bodies, especially during the holiday and monsoon season. These tragic incidents serve as painful reminders of the dangers posed by natural water sources when safety precautions are not followed.

Elon Musk's Chatbot Grok: Can It Be 'Non-Woke' and Truthful? Not Quite



Elon Musk's chatbot Grok was launched as a "non-woke" alternative to ChatGPT and other AI models, promising answers free from what Musk called excessive political correctness. Musk even joked about Grok's sarcastic tone, positioning it as a refreshingly blunt AI. However, the reality has been more complicated.

Grok's core challenge stems from its training data—the internet, which Musk describes as "overrun with woke nonsense." Critics, including internet personality Jordan Peterson, have complained that Grok still delivers "woke" or politically correct answers, reflecting mainstream academic and factual consensus rather than any biased agenda. This highlights a fundamental issue: AI models reflect the truths embedded in their data, not political preferences.

Efforts to make Grok "non-woke" have led to questionable interventions. In February, Grok was found to have been manipulated to ignore any news sources labeling Musk or Donald Trump as misinformation spreaders—an unauthorized change by an employee. More recently, Grok inexplicably fixated on the controversial topic of "white genocide" in South Africa, echoing Musk's own statements, even

when unrelated queries were made. This too resulted from unauthorized tampering with the bot's system prompts.

In response, xAI announced it would make Grok's system instructions public to build transparency. Among these prompts is a directive for Grok to be "extremely skeptical" of mainstream media, which has led to troubling responses—such as questioning the widely accepted Holocaust death toll by suggesting it could be "manipulated for political narratives." xAI called this a "programming error," but it aligns closely with Grok's skeptical approach.

Compared to Google's Gemini AI, which had politically motivated missteps but aims to improve by adding better data, Grok faces a tougher road. To stay "non-woke," Grok must limit its knowledge or twist facts, risking deliberate misinformation. As one insider described, Grok seems to be training a "MAGA version of ChatGPT," balancing selective ignorance with ideological demands.

While this appeals to some, artificial-selective-intelligence risks turning truth into fiction—something Grok's ongoing controversy makes painfully clear

India's Strategic Focus Must Shift Beyond Pakistan to Address China's Challenge



For decades, the India-Pakistan relationship has dominated South Asian security discussions, shaping policies and perceptions. However, in the evolving geopolitical landscape of the Indo-Pacific—the pivotal arena of the 21st century—India must recalibrate its strategic priorities. The real peer rival for India is China, while Pakistan should be viewed as a manageable risk rather than a central strategic competitor.

The global order is undergoing fragmentation as the United States adjusts its strategic focus, placing greater responsibility on Asia to secure its own future. In this complex environment, robust mechanisms are needed to maintain peace not just among great powers but also to contain smaller, disruptive actors. India's approach to the China-Pakistan dynamic is crucial in this regard.

Historically, the India-Pakistan relationship has been marked by conflict and rivalry, rooted more in historical legacies than in any current strategic parity. Pakistan's role in


the region is that of a strategic irritant, not an equal geopolitical player. India's broad-based regional posture, therefore, should not be shaped around Pakistan but rather around ensuring stability and cooperation in the Indo-Pacific.

India and China, as major Asian powers, must take on the responsibility of stabilizing the region. This requires India to engage with Pakistan functionally—addressing practical issues without allowing Pakistan to dictate the larger strategic narrative. India's strategic arc must emphasize its role as a stabilizer in the Indo-Pacific, focusing on balancing China's rise while managing Pakistan as a secondary concern.

Such a shift demands changes both in India's strategy and in how it communicates its foreign policy objectives. By looking beyond Pakistan and addressing the greater challenge posed by China, India can better secure its interests and contribute meaningfully to regional and global peace and stability.

Misinformation Poses Greater Threat Than Recent COVID-19 Rise in Asia and India

India and several Asian countries have recently reported a rise in COVID-19 cases, sparking renewed public and media attention. Since mid-May 2025, daily reported cases in India have increased from just a few to several hundred. Wastewater surveillance from various Indian cities has also detected a higher viral load of SARS-CoV-2, the virus responsible for COVID-19. Similar increases have been observed in Singapore, Hong Kong, Thailand, and South Korea.



This resurgence follows a pattern that experts say is becoming seasonal, with COVID-19 infections showing recurring waves much like influenza. The variant primarily responsible for this uptick is JN.1, a sub-lineage of the Omicron variant, which has been the dominant strain globally since its discovery in late 2021. Importantly, no new variant of concern has emerged worldwide since Omicron's appearance.

Despite the increase in cases, experts emphasize that the situation does not warrant panic. The recent surge appears to be a manageable seasonal pattern, rather than a sign of a dangerous new wave or variant. Health authorities urge

that responses to this uptick must be rational, proportionate, and based on current epidemiological data rather than fear or speculation.

A major concern, however, is the spread of misinformation, which can cause more harm than the virus itself. Panic driven by rumors or inaccurate reporting risks overwhelming healthcare systems unnecessarily, distracting from targeted efforts to protect vulnerable populations and maintain public health.

Public health experts advise that it is essential to focus on

scientific evidence, vaccination coverage, and preparedness rather than sensational headlines. Monitoring continues through testing and wastewater analysis, ensuring any future changes in the virus's behavior are detected early.

In summary, while the rise in COVID-19 cases in India and parts of Asia is notable, it aligns with an emerging seasonal pattern linked to existing Omicron sub-variants. The real challenge lies in combating misinformation to maintain calm and ensure appropriate, evidence-based responses moving forward.

With Charges Against Sheikh Hasina

Bangladesh's International Criminal Tribunal Comes Full Circle



In a dramatic and ironic turn of events, the International Criminal Tribunal (ICT) of Bangladesh, originally established in 1973 and later revived by Sheikh Hasina herself to try war criminals from the 1971 Liberation War, is now set to indict Hasina. The longest-serving Prime Minister of Bangladesh faces serious allegations related to her last tenure, particularly concerning the violent crackdown during the July–August 2024 student anti-quota protests that ultimately led to her ouster. Investigators recently submitted a report accusing Hasina of ordering security forces to open fire on protesters, resulting in multiple deaths.

Sheikh Hasina first assumed office in January 2009 with a strong electoral mandate. Early in her tenure, she introduced controversial amendments, in-

cluding abolishing the caretaker government (CTG) system in 2011. Ironically, Hasina had been a key proponent of the CTG system in 1996, which had helped ensure free and fair elections in Bangladesh. Her decision to remove it was met with fierce opposition, who feared that elections without the CTG would be compromised.

Hasina's administration also invoked the Digital Security Act to suppress dissent, stifling opposition voices and undermining institutional autonomy. Elections under her rule faced repeated allegations of rigging, and state institutions were perceived to be manipulated to consolidate her political power.

The July–August 2024 student protests were met with a harsh security crackdown. Facing escalating unrest and fearing for

her safety amid growing military unease, Hasina fled to India, where she currently resides. The Interim Government led by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus took charge shortly after her departure, pledging to hold the responsible parties accountable.

The ICT, which had previously sentenced four Jamaat leaders and a Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) leader to death, is now hearing five charges against Hasina. Alongside her, former Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan and ex-Inspector General of Police Chowdhury Abdullah Al-Mamun—currently in custody—face charges. The three-judge tribunal will decide the fate of these accused figures, marking a significant chapter in Bangladesh's complex political and judicial history.

NASA-ISRO Collaboration Strengthens as India's Gaganyatri Prepares for Pioneering ISS Mission

In a significant milestone for space cooperation between the United States and India, NASA and ISRO are deepening their joint efforts with the upcoming Axiom Mission 4. This mission not only represents a new chapter in bilateral space collaboration but also fulfills a high-level commitment made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi and former U.S. President Donald Trump. As part of this mission, the two space agencies will engage in five joint scientific investigations and two STEM-focused in-orbit demonstrations.

At the heart of this collaboration is Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla, a distinguished Indian Air Force officer and the designated 'gaganyatri'—India's space traveler. He is set to embark on a fortnight-long mission to the In-



ternational Space Station (ISS) next month, marking a historic moment in India's human spaceflight endeavors.

During his time aboard the ISS, Captain Shukla will carry out seven India-specific scientific experiments developed by ISRO. These experiments span diverse fields, including biology, materials science, and microgravity adaptation. One of the key studies involves the behavior of tardigrades—commonly known as 'water bears'—in microgravity. These resilient microscopic organisms are known for their extraordinary survival capabilities, and their responses to space conditions could provide valuable insights into how life adapts to extreme environments.

The NASA-ISRO partnership, which

has evolved over decades, is rooted in a shared commitment to scientific discovery and technological advancement. Their cooperative initiatives range from Earth observation missions like NISAR (NASA-ISRO Synthetic Aperture Radar) to upcoming human spaceflight collaborations.

This upcoming mission not only demonstrates the growing trust and synergy between the two space-faring nations but also highlights the increasing role of international cooperation in advancing space science. As Captain Shukla prepares for his landmark journey, the mission stands as a symbol of India's emerging presence in the global space community and the power of collaborative exploration to push the frontiers of knowledge.

Delhi Braces for Dust-Laden Winds and Soaring Temperatures as Heatwave Intensifies



Delhi continues to reel under intense heat as dust-laden winds and rising temperatures are expected to persist at the start of the week. According to the India Meteorological Department (IMD), strong surface winds carrying dust will sweep through the national capital on Monday, with skies remaining generally clear.

On Sunday, the temperature in Delhi climbed sharply, with the Safdarjung Observatory—the city's official weather station—recording a maximum of 42.1 degrees Celsius. This was 2.1 degrees above the seasonal average, indicating the onset of a harsh early summer spell. The minimum temperature stood at 27.7 degrees Celsius. Forecasts suggest that Monday could be even hotter. The IMD predicts that the mercury could rise to around 43 degrees Celsius, while the minimum temperature is likely to hover near 28 degrees Celsius. The hot and dry conditions, combined with strong surface winds, are expected to further reduce air quality and visibility in some areas due to blowing dust. Various parts of

Delhi-NCR registered extremely high temperatures on Sunday. While Safdarjung recorded 42.1°C, Palam was even hotter at 43.6°C. Lodi Road experienced a maximum of 42.3°C, the Ridge area saw 42.9°C, and Ayanagar emerged as the hottest location with a sweltering 44.1°C.

The IMD has warned that such weather conditions may lead to heat-related illnesses, particularly for vulnerable populations such as the elderly, children, and those with pre-existing health conditions. Residents are advised to stay hydrated, avoid prolonged exposure to the sun during peak afternoon hours, and take necessary precautions against the dust-laden winds.

The combination of high temperatures and dusty winds also poses challenges for commuters and could impact outdoor activities and construction work. As Delhi faces another scorching day, all eyes are on weather updates for signs of relief, even as the city remains firmly in the grip of an intensifying summer.

Jaishankar Embarks on Key Europe Visit to Strengthen Strategic Ties and Reaffirm India's Anti-Terror Stance

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar on Sunday began a week-long official visit to Europe, covering France, the European Union, and Belgium. The trip, scheduled to run until June 14, aims to bolster strategic partnerships and reinforce India's firm position on counter-terrorism amid growing global concerns.

According to the Ministry of External Affairs, Jaishankar's visit is part of India's ongoing diplomatic outreach and is expected to set the tone for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming participation in the G7 Summit in Canada. Modi has been invited as a special guest by Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney, in a move widely seen as an attempt to reset strained bilateral relations following tensions during Justin Trudeau's tenure. These tensions largely stemmed from the activities of Khalistani separatist groups in Canada, including the killing of Hardeep Singh Nijjar and the targeting of Indian diplomats.

Jaishankar will hold high-level meetings with top leaders in France and the EU, many of whom are also scheduled to attend the G7 Summit. His discussions will focus on strengthening bilateral cooperation in areas of strategic importance and addressing pressing global issues, particularly terrorism. India's zero-tolerance policy on terrorism will be a key message, especially in light of recent inci-



dents such as Operation Sindoor and the Pahalgam terror attack.

The MEA emphasized the significance of Jaishankar's stop in France, noting that India and France are marking 25 years of strategic partnership. "Our relations with France are rooted in deep trust and commitment," the statement said, highlighting the close collaboration between the two countries in defense, technology, climate, and regional security.

As global attention turns to the G7 Summit, Jaishankar's European tour is seen as crucial groundwork for India's engagement with Western allies. It reflects New Delhi's growing role in global affairs and its determination to counter terrorism through coordinated international efforts.

Karnataka CM Siddaramaiah Defends Role Amid Criticism Over Bengaluru Stampede



Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah, facing mounting criticism over last week's tragic stampede in Bengaluru, clarified on Sunday that he had attended the event solely based on an invitation from the Karnataka State Cricket Association (KSCA). Speaking to reporters, the Chief Minister distanced himself and his administration from the organization of the event, which ended in chaos near the M Chinnaswamy Stadium.

"The secretary and treasurer of KSCA came and invited me to the event. We didn't organise the function, the KSCA did," Siddaramaiah stated. "They also informed me that the Governor would be attending. I went only because I was invited. I was not invited to the stadium itself," he added.

The Chief Minister, along with other political leaders, had been present near the Vidhan Soudha where the celebratory procession of cricket fans concluded. It was at this spot that several cricketers met dignitaries following their triumph. However, the presence of high-profile VIPs drew substantial security resources away from the stadium, where large crowds had gathered.

According to the state's Opposition party, the BJP, the division of the 1,500-strong police force contributed significantly to the stampede that erupted shortly after the event. BJP leaders criticized the government's failure to anticipate crowd control needs, suggesting that the redirection of police personnel to manage VIP security was a critical factor in the tragedy.

In response to the incident, the state government has placed responsibility on the city police for failing to adequately prepare for the massive turnout. Three senior officers, including the Bengaluru city police commissioner, have been suspended for alleged dereliction of duty. The incident has sparked a broader debate over the handling of large public gatherings and VIP security protocols in Karnataka. As the investigation continues, public outrage remains high, with many demanding greater accountability from both the police and the event organizers.

In 2026, NDA will form governments in Tamil Nadu, West Bengal: Amit Shah

Union Home Minister Amit Shah declared on Sunday that the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) will come to power in Tamil Nadu and West Bengal in the 2026 Assembly elections. Speaking at a BJP party meeting in Madurai, Shah launched a scathing attack on the ruling DMK government, branding it a "100 per cent failure" and accusing it of deep-rooted corruption.

Citing the Rs 4,600 crore sand mining scam as an example of the DMK's alleged misgovernance, Shah accused the Stalin-led government of betraying the trust of the people. "Their corrupt administration has severely impacted the poor, women, and children in the state," he said. He called on BJP workers to commit themselves to removing the DMK from power and bringing about a new era of governance. Calling Madurai a city of "parivartan" (change), Shah said that the BJP's Karyakarta Sam-



melan (workers' conference) held there would be a turning point in the state's political landscape. "This Sammelan is not just a gathering; it marks the beginning of the DMK's end," he added.

Responding to Chief Minister M K Stalin's remarks that Amit Shah alone cannot defeat the DMK, Shah said, "Stalin is right in one way. It's not me who

will defeat the DMK—it's the people of Tamil Nadu who will rise and bring change."

Shah expressed confidence that the growing support for the NDA in both Tamil Nadu and West Bengal is a reflection of the people's frustration with the ruling parties. He emphasized that his experience across India has given

him insight into the public mood, and that mood, he claimed, is swinging decisively against the DMK.

Tamil Nadu BJP president Nainar Nagendran and senior leader K Annamalai were also present during the event, as the party gears up for what it views as a critical electoral battle in 2026.



Gaza Humanitarian Foundation Halts Aid Operations Amid Alleged Hamas Threats, Group Denies Claims

The Gaza Humanitarian Foundation (GHF) announced on Saturday that it was pausing its aid operations due to threats allegedly made against the organisation and its workers by Hamas. The suspension has caused significant disruption in delivering vital aid to thousands of hungry Gazans.

In an official statement, GHF blamed Hamas for the interruption, saying, "Hamas is the reason hundreds of thousands of hungry Gazans were not fed today. The group issued direct threats against GHF operations. These threats made it impossible to proceed today without putting innocent lives at risk." The foundation accused Hamas of wanting to restore control over aid distribution, manipulating the system to serve its own agenda instead of the Palestinian people's basic needs.

Despite the pause, GHF emphasized its commitment to continuing safe, secure, and independent aid delivery. "We are actively adapting our operations to overcome these threats and fully intend to

resume distributions without delay," the statement added.

Details about the nature of the threats remain unclear, but according to The Times of Israel, the intimidation was reportedly aimed at the foundation's drivers and Palestinian staff working at aid distribution points. However, Hamas has denied any involvement. In a statement to Reuters, Hamas said it had no knowledge of such "alleged threats" against the aid group or its workers.

This is the second disruption to aid operations in Gaza in recent days. The first halt was reportedly due to overcrowding at distribution sites and mass casualties linked to Israeli fire. The ongoing interruptions highlight the challenges humanitarian groups face in delivering aid in conflict zones where political tensions and security risks continue to escalate.

The Gaza Humanitarian Foundation remains determined to resume its work soon, adapting its methods to ensure the safety of its staff and the people it serves amidst the fragile and volatile environment.



Bangladesh's Chief Advisor Yunus Set for 11th Foreign Visit to the UK in 10 Months

Muhammad Yunus, Bangladesh's Interim Government Chief Advisor, is set to embark on his 11th foreign trip in the past 10 months. This visit, to the United Kingdom, is scheduled from June 9-13, 2025, where he will meet with several high-profile figures, including King Charles III and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer.

The visit comes at a crucial time for Bangladesh, as Yunus is expected to engage in confidential political discussions with the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Acting Chairman Tarique Rahman. The BNP has been pushing for elections to be held by December this year, but Yunus previously announced that elections will take place in April 2026, despite opposition from various political parties and the military.

In addition to these political discussions, Yunus will also be honored with the prestigious "Harmony Award 2025" on June 12, in recognition of his life-long work in promoting peace, sustainability, and environmental harmony. The award will be conferred

by King Charles III at a ceremony at St James's Palace in London.

Yunus' visit also holds significance in the context of Bangladesh's international diplomacy. He is scheduled to meet with the Secretaries-General of the Commonwealth and the International Maritime Organization (IMO). His discussions with the IMO will focus on the strategic importance of Bangladesh's Chittagong Port, a critical site for upcoming investments, including substantial Chinese contributions.

While in the UK, Yunus is also likely to address a longstanding issue with British MP Tulip Siddiq, who has sought a meeting to clear up misunderstandings regarding corruption allegations against his administration. However, a government spokesperson mentioned that no official request has been received from Siddiq for such a meeting. This trip continues Yunus's extensive international outreach, as he continues to navigate the political landscape of Bangladesh while strengthening the country's global relationships.

Trump Threatens "Serious Consequences" for Musk Over Democratic Funding Support

In a heated interview on Saturday, former U.S. President Donald Trump warned Tesla CEO Elon Musk of "serious consequences" if he provides financial backing to Democratic candidates opposing Republicans who support the GOP's sweeping budget bill. Speaking to NBC News, Trump stated, "If he does, he'll have to pay the consequences for that," but declined to elaborate on the specifics of those consequences.

Trump's comments come after a public fallout with Musk, which has seen the two exchange criticisms on social media platforms X and Truth Social. Despite a history of collaboration, Trump made it clear that he does not intend to mend his relationship with Musk, saying, "No," when asked if he wished to repair ties. He further added, "I'm too busy doing other things," and that he had "no intention of speaking to him." Musk, who previously supported Trump in the 2024 election with significant financial backing, has since criticized Trump's spending legislation, which includes sweeping tax cuts and military expenditure. In a series of posts on X, Musk has taken aim at Trump, accusing him of cor-



ruption and questioning his agenda, including promoting a call for Trump's impeachment.

Trump responded by accusing Musk of being "disrespectful" to the office of the President and dismissed Musk's criticism of the budget bill as "old news," pointing out that even Epstein's lawyer cleared him of any involvement with the late financier. This public dispute has emerged

during a critical time for Trump's major budget bill, which narrowly passed the House of Representatives. While Trump criticized Musk for turning against him, he acknowledged that Musk's criticism brought attention to the bill's strengths. However, Trump also threatened to cancel Musk's federal contracts, suggesting that it could be a way to save billions of dollars in government subsidies.

Taiwan President Calls for Bipartisan Support for CGA Budget Amid Rising Tensions with China

Taiwan President Lai Ching-te has called for bipartisan support to secure funding for a special budget aimed at bolstering the Coast Guard Administration (CGA)'s emergency response capabilities. His appeal comes amid increasing tensions in the surrounding waters, with China's "grey zone" activities threatening Taiwan's security and sovereignty.

Speaking during a joint exercise by the Coast Guard and the Navy in Kaohsiung on Sunday, Lai highlighted the essential role of the Coast Guard in safeguarding Taiwan's maritime borders. These "grey zone" activities involve China employing non-military tactics to undermine Taiwan's security, without crossing the threshold of open conflict. Lai stressed that the Coast Guard is Taiwan's first line of defense, ensuring maritime law enforcement and public safety.

The Taiwanese Cabinet has proposed a NT\$410 billion (approximately USD 13.6 billion) special budget to enhance national security, with NT\$150 billion allocated specifically for improving Taiwan's resilience. The funding will be used to acquire new marine vessels, drones, and a smart coastal monitoring system, alongside upgrading critical infrastructure like infrared night-vision systems and unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs).

Lai called for political unity, urging lawmakers to ensure the CGA is equipped with state-of-the-art technologies to effectively defend the nation. "Only with united political will can we provide our personnel with the tools they need to defend the nation," he said.

In addition to national security investments, the budget includes provisions to support businesses impacted by U.S. tariffs and to offset losses by Taiwan Power Co., which may face opposition in the Legislature.

The joint military drills held on Sunday involved large ships, smaller vessels, helicopters, and drones, simulating maritime interceptions, rescue operations, and aerial flyovers. The event also marked Taiwan's National Oceans Day, in alignment with the United Nations' World Oceans Day, showcasing Taiwan's maritime strength and commitment to ocean sustainability.



India Key to Global Supply Chains, Must Join G7 Talks: Canadian PM Mark Carney

Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney has strongly defended his decision to invite Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi to the upcoming G7 summit, emphasizing India's vital role in global supply chains and its position as the world's fifth-largest economy. Carney's remarks come in the wake of criticism from domestic political opponents over the invitation, given ongoing tensions between the two countries stemming from the 2023 killing of pro-Khalistan separatist Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

Speaking to reporters in Ottawa, Carney clarified that India's economic influence and strategic importance made it essential to include the country in discussions at the G7 summit, which Canada is set to host in Alberta from June 15 to 17. "India is central to a number of those [critical] supply chains," he said. "It makes sense to have countries like India at the table." Carney confirmed that Prime Minister Modi accepted the invitation during a phone call on Friday. The G7 summit will focus on key global issues such as energy security, digital transformation, critical minerals, and infrastructure development in emerging economies.

When asked about the Nijjar case and opposition concerns, Carney declined to comment directly, citing an ongoing legal process. However, he acknowledged bilateral progress, saying, "We have now agreed importantly to continue law enforcement dialogue... recognizing issues of accountability."

His remarks aimed to reassure critics, particularly from the New Democratic Party (NDP), which labelled the invitation to Modi as "profoundly troubling." The controversy is rooted in former Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's 2023 accusation of Indian involvement in Nijjar's killing, which led to diplomatic expulsions and a sharp decline in bilateral relations. Carney's April election victory raised hopes for a reset in India-Canada ties. In recent months, both countries have resumed high-level security contacts and discussed appointing new high commissioners. India has long criticized Canada for allowing pro-Khalistan activities on its soil, while New Delhi has expressed interest in rebuilding trust under Carney's leadership.

The Nifty 500 index surged 3.5% in May, driven by robust performances in the Industrials, Consumer Discretionary, and Financial Services sectors, according to a recent analysis by Motilal Oswal. Despite this positive momentum, sectoral indices for FMCG (Fast-Moving Consumer Goods) and Utilities showed slight declines, with -0.09% and -0.04% losses, respectively.

Broader market sentiment remained upbeat, with the Nifty 50 rising by 1.71% and the Nifty Midcap 150 experiencing a notable 6.3% gain. Both Smallcap and Microcap indices also posted impressive increases during the month.

Momentum and Quality factor-based indices continued to perform well, consistently delivering returns, while the Enhanced Value and Low Volatility indices showed more modest growth. Government bond indices indicated stability, with slight gains in the 5-year and 10-year G-Sec benchmarks.

The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI)

recent decision to cut the policy interest rate by 50 basis points to 5.5% has further impacted market dynamics. The move is expected to benefit sectors such as banking, NBFCs (Non-Banking Financial Companies), real estate, and automobiles, with credit growth likely to rise despite potential margin pressures on banks. This was the third consecutive rate cut in 2025, reducing the repo rate by 100 basis points since February.

Following the RBI rate reduction, sectors like banking and real estate saw a significant uptick in stock prices, although some experts, like VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strategist at Geojit Investments, pointed out that bank stocks might face short-term pressure due to margin concerns.

In general, except for the Media sector, which dipped 1%, all other sectoral indices closed the month on a positive note, with Metal, Auto, and Consumer Durables leading the charge with over 1% gains.

IndiGrid to Acquire Solar and Transmission Assets for ₹2,108 Crore

IndiGrid, a leading power sector infrastructure investment trust (InvIT), has announced the execution of definitive agreements to acquire one solar and one transmission asset, together valued at an Enterprise Value (EV) of approximately ₹2,108 crore, excluding net working capital and cash adjustments. Including these adjustments, the total EV is not expected to exceed ₹2,175 crore, the company stated.

The acquisition targets two high-quality operational assets: Renew Solar Aayan Private Ltd (RSAPL), a 300 MW (AC) solar project situated in Barmer, Rajasthan, and Koppal Narendra Transmission Ltd (KNTL), a Build-Own-Operate-Maintain (BOOM) Inter-State Transmission System (ISTS) located in Karnataka. IndiGrid plans to acquire 100% shareholding and management control of both assets, pending regulatory and contractual approvals, consistent with the terms of the definitive and concession agreements as well as the Power Purchase Agreement (PPA), including any lock-in obligations.

Harsh Shah, Managing Director of IndiGrid, highlighted that these acquisitions align with the company's long-term strategy of participating in India's energy transformation by owning and



operating critical infrastructure that ensures grid stability and broader energy access. "RSAPL and KNTL deepen our presence in key geographies, enhance portfolio diversification, and are accretive to distribution per unit (DPU)," he said.

Shah added, "As the power sector continues to evolve, IndiGrid remains committed to building a future-ready platform that supports India's ambitious energy goals while delivering sustainable value to our unitholders."

The acquisition will be financed through a combination of equity, internal accruals, and debt. Following this transaction, IndiGrid's net debt to assets under management (AUM) ratio will stand at 62%, maintaining sufficient headroom for future expansion and growth opportunities.

This strategic move strengthens IndiGrid's position as a key player in India's renewable energy and transmission infrastructure landscape, reinforcing its commitment to sustainable and reliable energy solutions.

GST Returns to Become Time-Barred Starting July 2025

Starting from the July 2025 tax period, Goods and Services Tax (GST) taxpayers will no longer be able to file their monthly and annual GST returns if they miss the deadline by more than three years. This means that returns related to outward supplies, payment of tax liabilities, annual returns, and tax collected at source will become time-barred and barred from filing on the GST portal after the three-year window expires.

The Goods and Services Tax Network (GSTN) issued an advisory on June 7, 2025, clarifying that taxpayers must file their returns within three years of the original due date. Returns such as GSTR-1, GSTR-3B, GSTR-4, GSTR-5, GSTR-5A, GSTR-6, GSTR-7, GSTR-8, and GSTR-9 will not be accepted beyond this time frame.



The change follows amendments made through the Finance Act, 2023, aimed at strengthening compliance and ensuring timely filing of returns.

The July 2025 tax period corresponds to returns filed in August 2025, marking the start of this new rule. Taxpayers are urged to reconcile their records and complete any pending filings before

this deadline to avoid losing the opportunity to file and claim Input Tax Credit (ITC).

While this measure is expected to enhance system discipline and reduce prolonged non-compliance, experts have expressed concerns over its potential impact. Rajat Mohan, Senior Partner at AMRG & Associates, pointed out that taxpayers facing litigation, technical glitches, or genuine oversight might be severely affected. He warned that the absence of a redressal mechanism for exceptional cases could result in permanent denial of ITC and significant financial losses.

This new rule emphasizes the importance of timely GST compliance and urges taxpayers to ensure their filings are up to date to avoid complications after the three-year period lapses.

his performance, showing no signs of hesitation or limitation.



Rising Black Carbon Levels Heating Himalayan Snow, Warns Study

A recent study by think-tank Climate Trends has raised serious concerns about the impact of rising black carbon levels on the Himalayan snowpack. The research, based on satellite data collected between 2000 and 2023, highlights how ultra-fine black carbon particles—primarily emitted from vehicle exhausts, stoves, and wood fires—are significantly accelerating surface warming in the region.

Black carbon differs from other atmospheric pollutants because of its unique ability to absorb sunlight. When these particles settle on snow, they reduce its albedo—or its natural ability to reflect sunlight—causing the surface to absorb more heat. Unlike carbon dioxide, which has a long atmospheric lifespan, black carbon is



short-lived but highly potent in terms of its warming effect. The study shows a consistent rise in snow surface temperatures across the Himalayas over the past two decades. Average snow temperatures increased from -11.27°C during 2000–2009 to -7.13°C in 2020–2023, with an overall mean of -8.57°C. Among the three major Himalayan zones, the Eastern Himalayas were the warmest,

followed by the Central and Western regions. During 2010–2019, the Eastern Himalayas recorded their highest decadal warming, with average snow temperatures at -5.69°C.

The report warns that this warming trend, linked partly to black carbon deposition, is destabilizing glaciers and threatening water security for nearly two billion people living downstream. “The contin-

ued temperature rise is altering the snow thermal regime, shortening snow seasons and causing earlier melt,” said Palak Baliyan, lead author of the study.

Interestingly, while snow surface temperatures have risen, the mean snow depth also increased, growing from 0.059 meters (2000–2009) to 0.117 meters (2020–2023). However, the study notes that there is no direct correlation between black carbon levels and snow depth, attributing the increase to spatial and temporal variability in snowfall.

The findings underscore the urgent need for stronger air pollution controls and climate action. Black carbon may be short-lived, but its impacts on glacier health and regional water systems could be long-lasting and severe.

Tinder’s New Height Preference Filter Sparks Controversy Among Users

Tinder is testing a new feature that’s causing quite a stir — a height preference filter that allows users to set their desired height range for potential matches. While still in the testing phase, the feature is being rolled out to a limited group of Tinder Gold and Platinum subscribers, according to a report by TechCrunch. The update was first spotted by a Reddit user, who found the height option under the app’s Discovery Settings. While the concept seems simple, it’s already sparked debate across social media about the implications of filtering matches based on physical traits — particularly height.

Tinder’s Vice President of Communications, Phil Price Fry, addressed the move, saying it was part of the app’s broader goal to help users “connect more intentionally.” He emphasized that the feature isn’t designed to work as a “hard filter,” meaning it won’t completely exclude users outside of a person’s set preference. Instead, it’s intended to help surface matches that align more closely with a user’s interests. “We’re always listening to what matters most to our Tinder users,” Fry said. “Testing the paid height preference is a great example of how we’re building with urgency, clarity, and focus.”

Despite Tinder’s reassurances, the feature has received mixed reactions online. Critics argue that it encourages superficiality and could reinforce unrealistic dating standards, particularly for men, who often face pressure over their height in online dating scenarios. Others defend the update, saying preferences are a natural part of dating and that similar filters for age, distance, and lifestyle habits already exist.

“This is part of a broader effort to enhance intentional dating,” Fry added. “Not every test becomes a permanent feature, but each one teaches us how to deliver smarter, more personalized experiences.”



Tinder has not confirmed whether the height preference setting will roll out globally or remain exclusive to premium users. For now, the test reflects the app’s ongoing effort to evolve based on user feedback — even if that means courting a little controversy along the way.

Granollers and Zeballos Clinch French Open 2025 Doubles Title, Defy Age in Historic Win



In a remarkable display of experience and resilience, veterans Marcel Granollers and Horacio Zeballos captured their first Grand Slam title as a pair by winning the men's doubles final at the French Open 2025. The duo, with a combined age of 79, triumphed in a thrilling contest over the all-British team of Joe Salisbury and Neal Skupski at Roland Garros on June 7.

Granollers, 39, from Spain, and Zeballos, 40, from Argentina, finally broke their Grand Slam jinx in their fourth major final together, defeating Salisbury and Skupski 6-0, 6-7 (5), 7-5 in an intense, emotionally charged final. This marks their first title at the clay-court major, having previously finished runners-up at the U.S. Open in 2019 and Wimbledon in 2021 and 2023.

Seeded fifth in Paris, Granollers and Zeballos stormed through the opening set, blanking the British pair 6-0.

Salisbury and Skupski, however, fought back in the second set, edging a tight tiebreak to level the match. The final set saw both teams hold firm until the Spaniard-Argentine duo made a crucial late break to seal victory.

The loss was bittersweet for Salisbury and Skupski, who became the first all-British team to reach a men's doubles Grand Slam final in the Open era. Despite falling just short, their run was historic and widely applauded.

Granollers and Zeballos' victory is being hailed as a testament to longevity in the sport. Their breakthrough at Roland Garros is not just a personal milestone but also a celebration of persistence, strategy, and seasoned partnership on the biggest stage.

Their triumph adds another thrilling chapter to the French Open's storied doubles history.

USA Suffer Third Consecutive Defeat Ahead of 2026 FIFA World Cup

The United States men's national football team endured their third straight loss under coach Mauricio Pochettino, falling 2-1 to Turkey in a friendly match in Hartford, Connecticut, on Saturday. This defeat follows losses to Panama and Canada in the CONCACAF Nations League finals in March, leaving the team with much to reflect on as they approach next year's World Cup, which they will co-host with Canada and Mexico.

With several key players, including captain Christian Pulisic, missing from the lineup, Pochettino used the match to assess players on the periphery of the squad. The match began brightly for the USA, with Houston Dynamo midfielder Jack McGlynn opening the scoring in the second minute with a stunning 20-yard shot that curled into the far corner.



However, Turkey quickly regained their composure and started applying pressure. Arda Guler missed a golden opportunity to equalize, firing over the bar from close range, while Orkun Kokcu forced debutant goalkeeper Matt Freese into a sharp save. Turkey's persistence paid off in the 24th minute, when Johnny Cardoso's poor pass from the back

ricocheted off Guler and into the USA's net. Just three minutes later, Turkey took the lead after a defensive lapse allowed Kerem Akturkoglu to score.

Despite the setback, the USA improved after the break, creating several opportunities. Max Arfsten headed wide from close range, and Patrick Agyemang's shot was saved, but Malik Tillman had the best chance to equalize. A perfect cross from Tyler Adams found Tillman at the back post, but he headed straight at Turkey's goalkeeper Berke Ozer.

The USA continued to push forward in search of an equalizer, but Turkey survived, even missing a late opportunity to seal the win with a counter-attack. Midfielder Adams reflected positively on the match, saying, "For the first time in a few camps, there were more positives than negatives. There's a lot more to take away from this performance."

Sara Errani and Jasmine Paolini Win French Open Women's Doubles Title

Italy's Sara Errani and Jasmine Paolini triumphed in the 2025 French Open women's doubles final, defeating Anna Danilina and Aleksandra Krunic 6-4, 2-6, 6-1 to claim their first major doubles title together. The victory comes after a heartbreaking runner-up finish for the duo in last year's Roland-Garros final.

For 38-year-old Errani, the win marks her second French Open doubles title and her sixth overall at a Grand Slam. She previously enjoyed great success with partner Roberta Vinci, capturing major trophies across the US Open, Wimbledon, and the Australian Open. a return match scheduled for June 9. Following that, India will face Argentina on June 11 and 12, Australia on June 14 and 15, and Belgium on June 21 and 22. After competing in Amstelveen, the team will move to Antwerp for further matches.

Led by star drag-flicker Harmanpreet Singh and deputy Hardik Singh, the team boasts an experienced 24-member squad, reflecting coach Craig Fulton's preference for seasoned players over newcomers. "Securing World Cup qualification through the Pro League is our priority," Fulton said. "If that doesn't work out, we have the Asia Cup in August as a fall-back."

Fulton also acknowledged areas needing improvement, especially penalty corner conversions. "We've improved our field goals but need to focus on penalty corners and defense," he said. "Our aim is to draw games instead of losing them."

The team's preparation included a recent camp in Bengaluru and three matches against Ireland, which Harmanpreet called valuable. "The conditions and pitches in Ireland and here are similar, so it was good preparation," he said.

With a game-by-game focus, India is determined to maximize points and finish high on the leaderboard in this decisive phase of the Pro League.




