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AP to Be Global Energy Hub


Says CM at Hydrogen Summit

Amaravati witnessed a significant step toward a sustainable future as Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu participated in the Green Hydrogen Summit - 2025 held at SRM University. Addressing the gathering, which included CEOs and MDs of major energy and tech firms, the CM emphasized Andhra Pradesh's ambition to become a national hub for green hydrogen innovation and production.

Chandrababu stated that the summit is not just a platform for discussion, but a place for learning, sharing innovations, and building collaborative solutions. "I am here to listen to your ideas and understand the innovations driving green hydrogen. This technology holds the key to clean and affordable energy," he said.

Reflecting on his past reforms, Naidu remarked, "I was the first to initiate power sector reforms in India. Though I lost power at the time, those reforms have now become a national model." He stressed the importance of producing and storing green energy at lower costs, especially in the context of global warming and climate change. "Green hydrogen is no longer an option; it is a necessity. We must act swiftly and



smartly," the CM said.

Calling on electricity generation companies and research institutions, Naidu urged them to explore green hydrogen technologies. He highlighted that even the Central Government and NITI Aayog are prioritizing green hydrogen, with Prime Minister Narendra Modi aiming for 500 GW of green energy capacity.

"As Andhra Pradesh, we are determined to transform into a green hydrogen valley. The state will provide the best platform and ecosystem for this transformation," he declared, in-

viting global and national stakeholders to collaborate.

The Chief Minister also acknowledged that this transformation requires state-of-the-art technology. "We invite all of you to bring the best of your technologies and innovations to AP. The state is your best place to invest and innovate."

He concluded by encouraging participants to use the two-day summit to share, explore, and shape the future of energy. "Together, we can create a clean, green future for the next generation," he said.



Pawan's Push Brings Central Nod for Uppada Project

In a major step towards coastal protection, Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan has announced a ₹323 crore project aimed at providing a permanent solution to the long-standing sea erosion problem in Uppada, Pithapuram constituency.

Speaking to the media on Thursday, Pawan Kalyan said the NDA government is actively working on a detailed project proposal submitted through the National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA). The plan involves constructing a strong sea wall in Uppada, where the coastline has been receding at an alarming rate of 1.23 meters annually for the past five years, resulting in a total erosion of nearly 12 meters.

This continuous erosion has caused serious damage to local fishing communities, washing away homes and endangering livelihoods. "The people of Uppada have suffered for too long. This project is our commitment to them," Pawan stated.

The proposal, prepared under the leadership of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, has already been forwarded to the Union Ministry of Home Affairs. Pawan Kalyan expressed confidence that Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah will extend full support to the project, considering its urgency and importance for coastal Andhra.

"This is not just a project. It's a promise we made and one we intend to keep," he emphasized. During the 2024 elections, Pawan had assured Uppada residents of immediate action against sea erosion if elected. Staying true to his word, he pushed for the preparation and submission of the ₹323 crore proposal soon after the formation of the coalition government.

He also noted that Andhra Pradesh continues to enjoy strong support from the Central government, especially in disaster management and infrastructure development. Once the final approvals come through, the construction of the sea wall will begin without delay.

The proposed sea wall is expected to act as a long-term barrier against storms, tidal surges, and further erosion, finally offering a sense of security to the vulnerable population in Uppada. Local residents have welcomed the move, calling it a long-overdue lifeline for their villages and livelihoods.

The announcement marks a significant political and infrastructural milestone for the coastal belt, demonstrating the government's resolve to act on promises and protect communities facing environmental threats.

Mithun Reddy to **Face SIT Tomorrow...**

In a major development in the Andhra Pradesh liquor scam, former YSRCP MP Mithun Reddy faces imminent arrest after the Supreme Court dismissed his anticipatory bail petition. The court questioned the basis for pre-arrest protection, especially in a case involving serious allegations of corruption and criminal conspiracy. This decision follows a similar rejection by the Andhra Pradesh High Court.

With the legal route closed, the Special Investigation Team (SIT) has stepped up efforts to apprehend Mithun, who has reportedly gone into hiding. The SIT had already issued a lookout circular. Teams are actively searching for him as he is now officially listed among the key accused.

SIT: Mithun Orchestrated Bribe Network

The SIT has identified Mithun Reddy as a prime conspirator in the liquor scam, describing him as the

second-most powerful figure during the previous YSRCP regime next only to the chief beneficiary. As the son of senior YSRCP leader Peddireddy Ramachandra Reddy and a close associate of former CM Jagan Mohan Reddy, Mithun wielded extraordinary behind-thescenes influence.

Investigators

Mithun handled party funds, managed election finances, and facilitated high-level operations in Delhi on Jagan's behalf. He allegedly partnered with Raj Kesireddy to set up a bribe collection and distribution network involving distilleries and liquor distribution firms.

Strategic Appointments Enabled Scam Flow

Mithun is accused of engineering the appointment of key officers like IRS officer Vasudeva Reddy as Beverages Corporation MD and Distilleries Commissioner. Another official, Assistant Commissioner Satyaprasad, was reportedly promised IAS promotion for his cooper-

SIT found that Mithun ordered the transition to manual liquor orders to manipulate the system, set bribe rates per consignment, and ensured the money reached designated political leaders. His instructions were central to every major financial transaction in the scam. With court protection denied, the SIT is preparing to

bring the former MP into custody soon.

Talli Ki Vandanam' Turns Boon for Pvt Schools

Despite the well-meaning goals behind schemes like Ammavodi and Talli ki Vandanam, a concerning trend is unfolding in Andhra Pradesh—more parents are choosing private schools over government-run institutions. The new coalition government's expansion of Talli ki Vandanam, offering ₹13,000 per child regardless of the number of children, has led to an unintended consequence: a silent migration towards private and corporate

While official claims suggest a rise in enrolment, ground-level data paints a different picture. The student strength in government schools has declined from 32.50 lakh to 29.65 lakh in the current academic year—a dip of nearly 3 lakh. Among the 43,922 government schools in the state, many primary classes now have just 10–15 students. This sharp drop is attributed to class mergers, especially for grades 3 to 5, forcing students to travel several kilometers. Parents are understandably hesitant to send their young children such distances when private schools offer convenient door-to-door transport.

The problem deepens as Talli ki Vandanam applies equally to students in private schools. This undermines the attractiveness of government institutions. Field data indicates that 4,750 government schools recorded zero enrolment this year. As of now, 29.65 lakh students attend government schools, while private backlash.



school enrolment has surged to 38.90 lakh—a complete reversal from 2021–22, when government schools had 45.60 lakh students.

Youth leader and Education Minister Nara Lokesh has begun focusing on education reforms. With a mega DSC recruitment drive to fill teacher vacancies, the government is also under pressure to address the infrastructure gap. Experts and activists are suggesting that schemes like Talli ki Vandanam should be reserved exclusively for students enrolled in government schools to stem the outflow. However, such a move could trigger political

Long-term reform requires more than monetary schemes. To bring students back, government schools must match private institutions in quality. Facilities like robotics, English language labs, craft design, music, sports, and self-defense training for girls should become standard. When parents believe that government schools offer everything private ones do—free of cost—they may reconsider their choices.

Ultimately, reversing the trend depends on restoring public confidence. For that, real transformation—not just financial incentives—is the need of the hour.

Tensions Flare Again in Tadipatri

Tadipatri witnessed dramatic scenes and heightened political tension on Friday as police blocked senior YSRCP leader and former MLA Ketireddy Peddareddy from attending the party's "Chandrababu Recalling" pro-

gram. Organized by the YSRCP, the event was the police for what he called undemocratic aimed at exposing what the party claims are broken promises by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu in the Tadipatri constituency. Peddareddy, who began his journey from his native village Timmampalli, was intercepted by police mid-route. Citing law and order concerns, officials informed him that his entry into Tadipatri could incite unrest and denied him permission to proceed. Interestingly, while other YSRCP leaders were allowed to participate in the program, the restriction applied solely to Peddareddy, sparking accusations of selective targeting.

In a show of defiance, the former MLA staged a protest on the roadside, declaring that no matter how many hurdles were placed in his way, he would reach Tadipatri. He slammed and biased behavior, especially when the High Court had cleared his participation. "Why am I being singled out when others are allowed? This is political suppression," Peddareddy alleged.

As tension escalated, police deployed heavy forces in both Tadipatri and Timmampalli to prevent any outbreak of violence. Peddareddy's supporters gathered in significant numbers, raising slogans and demanding the restoration of their leader's democratic rights. The protest created a tense atmosphere, turning both locations into security hotspots.





GoM Proposes Cut in Paddy Fee, Boosts Food Safety Measures

A crucial meeting of the Group of Ministers (GoM) on market regulation was held at the Andhra Pradesh Secretariat on Thursday. The meeting, chaired by Civil Supplies Minister Nara Nadendla Manohar, brought together Finance Minister Payyavula Keshav, Agriculture Minister K. Achchennaidu, Health Minister Satya Kumar Yadav, and top departmental officials to discuss strategies for market price control and food safety improvement.

The GoM reviewed daily fluctuations in prices of essential commodities and explored new policy tools to address inflation. Minister Nadendla Manohar reiterated the coalition government's focus on delivering quality food at affordable prices. He emphasized that systematic price reviews and timely in-

terventions are crucial for market stability. One of the key proposals put forward was the reduction of market fee on paddy from 2% to 1%. This initiative is expected to benefit both farmers and consumers by easing procurement costs and encouraging fine variety paddy cultivation. The ministers recommended immediate implementation of procurement mechanisms, especially for vegetables like tomatoes, which are prone to price volatility.

In a significant move toward food safety, the GoM directed officials to strengthen the Food Safety Wing by recruiting qualified staff from other government departments. These recruits will undergo proper training to conduct inspections and monitor food quality standards. Joint awareness drives and food inspections will be carried out by the Food Safety and Weights and Measures depart-


ments in key cities including Vijayawada, Visakhapatnam, and Tirupati.

To enhance farming practices, the GoM instructed the Agriculture Department to educate farmers about fine paddy varieties to improve both productivity and profitability. Awareness sessions will be conducted at the village level with technical support.

Minister Manohar concluded the meeting by stressing the importance of close coordination among departments and timely ground-level monitoring. He also called for weekly reviews on essential commodity prices and the effectiveness of regulatory measures.

Senior officials from Civil Supplies, Agriculture, and Marketing departments presented their progress reports and field strategies, reinforcing the state's commitment to market discipline and food safety enhancement.

Ashok Gajapathi Raju Quits TDP Ahead of Goa Role

In a key political shift, senior Telugu Desam Party (TDP) leader and former Union Minister Ashok Gajapathi Raju has officially stepped down from the party. His resignation follows his appointment as the Governor of Goa. Raju tendered his resignation from both the TDP's primary membership and his position in the party's Politburo through a formal letter addressed to TDP Andhra Pradesh President Palla Srinivasa Rao.

In an emotionally worded letter, Raju expressed his gratitude for the decades-long association with the party. He termed his journey with the TDP a matter of pride and privilege and thanked the Central Government for entrusting him with the constitutional responsibility of a gubernatorial role.

TDP Loyalist Since 1982

Ashok Gajapathi Raju has been part of the TDP since its inception in 1982. Hailing from the royal Pusapati family of Vizianagaram, he served seven terms as a Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) in Andhra Pradesh and once as a Member of Parliament (MP). Over the years, he held key ministerial roles in both the state and central governments.

In 2014, he was elected to the Lok Sabha and appointed as the Union Minister for Civil Aviation in the Narendra Modi-led NDA government. Though he stayed away from the 2019 electoral race, Raju remained a respected senior within the TDP, even fielding his daughter as a candidate during that election.

Honoured With Gubernatorial Role

Despite maintaining a low public profile in recent years, Raju's integrity and long service earned him continued admiration within political circles. Recognizing his contributions, the TDP proposed his name for the Governor's post, which was swiftly approved by the NDA government at the Centre, underlining the party's strategic importance.

With this transition, Ashok Gajapathi Raju moves from active party politics to a constitutional role. His vast experience in governance is expected to add value to his new responsibilities as the Governor of Goa. His departure marks the end of an era for the TDP but also signals a dignified new chapter in public service.

Peddareddy demanded a clear explanation from the authorities about why he alone was barred. He warned that these tactics would not deter him from reaching the public or engaging in political activities. "This is my democratic right. Denying me entry while allowing others shows clear political motive," he said.

The YSRCP has sharply criticized the police action, calling it an attempt by the ruling coalition to stifle opposition voices. Party leaders have vowed to escalate the matter through legal and political channels.

The incident once again highlights the deepening political divide in Andhra Pradesh, particularly in hotspots like Tadipatri. With police presence still high and tempers flaring, the coming days may see further confrontation as YSRCP leaders assert their political rights and question what they claim is misuse of state machinery.



Mystery Deepens in Gandikota Murder

Kadapa: The mysterious murder of 17-year-old Intermediate student Vaishnavi in Gandikota continues to confound police, even four days after the incident. Despite CCTV evidence confirming her boyfriend Lokesh dropped her off at the historic site, police ruled out his involvement. DIG Koya Praveen stated clearly that Lokesh had no role in the crime.

The investigation has since shifted focus to Vaishnavi's brother, Surendra, and other family members, who were questioned multiple times. Kadapa SP Ashok Kumar is personally overseeing the investigation, directing a team to explore all angles, including the possibility of an honor killing.

Vaishnavi's body was found in suspicious condition behind the Madhavaraya Swamy temple in the forested area of Gandikota. Her injuries, as per preliminary postmortem, included trauma to the liver, chest, eyes, and legs. However, the complete report is still awaited. The police believe the murder may have stemmed from personal conflicts, not sexual assault.

Surendra, who reportedly went searching for Vaishnavi on the day of the incident, has become a key figure in the probe. His call records and location data are under scrutiny. The police suspect that more individuals could be involved and are gathering



digital evidence.

Meanwhile, the case has sparked statewide debate and local outrage. The Students' Federation of India (SFI) organized a protest at Kamalapuram Girls' High School demanding strict punishment for the culprits. SFI leaders Raghavendra and Goutham condemned increasing violence against women in the name of love and honor. They urged the Home Minister, herself a woman, to act swiftly.

With tourism also being impacted due to the incident, pressure continues to mount on police to crack the case. As the investigation progresses, the public awaits answers and justice for Vaishnavi.

Tulasi Reddy Slams Chandrababu on **Handri-Neeva Claims**

Senior Congress leader and former Rajya Sabha member Dr. N. Tulasi Reddy has accused Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu of taking undue credit for the Handri-Neeva project. Speaking to media at Vempalle, Tulasi Reddy mocked that it appears to be a case of "someone else's money and someone else's pride."

He stated that while former CM N.T. Rama Rao laid the foundation stone in 1983, only ₹13.75 crore was spent on the project in the 21 years until 2004. It was under the Congress regime, he said, that the project gained momentum. In 2005, then CM Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy relaunched the project under "Jalayagnam," planning to lift 3,850 cusecs of water daily from the Srisailam reservoir to irrigate 6.02 lakh acres and supply drinking water to 33 lakh people.

Tulasi Reddy added that ₹6,948 crore was spent under the Congress to complete the first phase, and 80% of the second phase was also completed. He recalled that the project delivered water to Jeedipalli reservoir in 2012 and released 10.12 TMC by

He criticized the current coalition for merely completing minor lining works while making exaggerated claims. Calling Chandrababu's self-praise "laughable," he demanded an end to such misleading narratives.

On Polavaram-Banakacharla, Tulasi Reddy called the proposal unviable and a financial burden. He cautioned that accepting this could weaken Andhra Pradesh's stance against Telangana's illegal projects on the Krishna river, including the 90 TMC Palamuru-Rangareddy and 30 TMC Dindi lift schemes — all built without tribunal or central approvals.

He warned that if these continue, key Andhra projects like Telugu Ganga, Galeru-Nagari, Handri-Neeva, and Krishna delta will run dry, turning Rayalaseema into a desert. He urged the AP government not to trade water rights for political compromise with Telangana.



Sriram Urges TDP Leaders to Accelerate Governance Program

JAC Urges Govt to Regularise 1 Lakh Outsourced Staff

The Andhra Pradesh State Government Contract and Outsourcing Employees Federation has submitted a detailed representation to the government, urging immediate action on the long-pending demands of over one lakh contract and outsourcing workers. The memorandum was formally handed over on July 17, 2025, to Minister Nimmala Ramanaidu by JAC Chairman A.V. Nageswara Rao, Co-Chairman B. Kantha Rao (Mrs. Indivara), and Treasurer D. Dayamani. The federation emphasized that lakhs of workers, employed across departments like education, health, municipal administration, and electricity, have been serving the state diligently for years without proper recognition or regularisation.

The federation highlighted that many of these employees have completed more than ten years of service and are still working under insecure, temporary terms despite multiple assurances by previous governments. They called upon Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu to fulfil promises made during his earlier tenure, particularly the 2019 GO issued for minimum wages and job protection. They also demanded that Andhra Pradesh implement Supreme Court orders ensuring "Equal Pay for Equal Work" for all temporary employees working alongside permanent staff.

Further, the JAC stressed the urgent need for job security and the formulation of clear service rules for outsourcing employees. They pointed out that most departments—including hospitals, schools, and municipal bodies—depend on outsourced employees to manage critical services like sanitation, record-keeping, and maintenance. Despite this reliance, these employees continue to face wage disparities and lack basic employment benefits like EPF and ESI. The JAC requested the reactivation of proposals previously prepared by retired IAS officers and ministers regarding employee regularisation.

EO Orders Urgent Steps to Manage Indrakeeladri Rush

The ministers agreed that any future steps would aim to balance social justice with operational integrity in government service promotions.

Dhavaleswaram ITI Faces Neglect

East Godavari: The Government Industrial Training Institute (ITI) near East Godavari district collectorate in Dhavaleswaram is under scrutiny for administrative negligence and long-standing allegations of corruption. Despite its purpose to offer skill development and employment opportunities to unemployed youth, the institute reportedly lacks basic equipment for practical training and has failed to conduct proper exams.

One of the key issues is the absence of a functioning Institute Management Committee (IMC), which is mandated for every government ITI to oversee development and training. Though an IMC was constituted in 2006 with local industrialists and department officials, it became inactive after leadership changes and financial irregularities. During its initial phase, the committee had Rs 2.5 crore funds sanctioned for development. However, only Rs 1 crore was spent while the remaining was reportedly placed in fixed deposits. Serious allegations emerged during the tenure of former Regional Deputy Direc-



who acted as IMC Chairperson. He was accused of misappropriating funds, facing vigilance and departmental inquiries, along with forest violation cases. Attempts to cover up these irregularities led to hurried reappointments of new committee members and a fresh Chairperson, allegedly to divert attention from past misuse. However, no development projects were executed in the last five years, and the ITI remains functionally crippled.

Currently, the institute opertor (RDD) R.V. Venkata Ramana, ates without an IMC. Principal skill infrastructure.

Sunil confirmed there is no existing management committee and no record of recent IMC activities. Despite Minister Nara Lokesh's focus on skill development, officials appear to have ignored the worsening state of this government-run ITI.

Vizianagaram Gets ₹2.84 **Crore for Air Quality Projects**

Vizianagaram: Vizianagaram district officials have been directed to work towards transforming the city into a pollution-free zone, with a strong focus on green development. Bapatla Collector Frees 102 Acres After Decades

Bapatla: In a major relief to farmers in Muthupalli village, Bapatla District Collector J. Venkata Murali on Friday announced full ownership rights to 87 farmers over 102 acres of land that had been caught in administrative limbo for decades. The decision was made during a review meeting held at the Bapatla Collectorate with the affected farmers of Nizampatnam mandal.

The land in question, though under cultivation for decades, was mistakenly registered as poramboke (government wasteland) in revenue records by earlier officials. As a result, these farmers were denied rightful ownership, with their lands included in the prohibited category under Section 22-A for the past several years.

Following a petition submitted



20 days ago, the Collector ordered a detailed investigation. The review revealed that in 1987, the lands were wrongly categorized as government property, and no corrective measures were taken thereafter. Upon re-examination of revenue records and land documents, it was confirmed that the 102 acres rightfully belonged to the 87 farmers.

Speaking at the meeting, Collector Venkata Murali stated that the administration had decided to recognize these lands as legitimate patta (assigned) farmland. The farmers will now receive patta passbooks, granting them full legal ownership and rights over the land. This decision brings to an end decades of uncertainty and hardship for the farmers.

He assured that entries would be updated in the revenue records accordingly and pledged that the farmers would face no further obstacles regarding their land.

Also present at the meeting were Repalle RDO Ramalakshmi, Nizampatnam Tahsildar M. Srinivasa Rao, and several farmers from Muthupalli.

The move was hailed by the farming community as a long-awaited justice and a major step forward in correcting historical administrative errors that had left generations in dis-

Dr. Yugandhar, District Immunization Officer, instructed that Form-F must be mandatorily uploaded with full details and RCH ID before each scan. He

also stated that abortions can only be conducted under specific conditions by qualified doctors as per the amended MTP Act, 2021. Abortions performed due to gender bias are punishable by law. Officials warned that regular inspections of scanning centers will continue. All centers must maintain proper registers and documentation in compliance with the law. India's Global South Leadership Under Strain Amid Foreign Policy Contradictions



that India's leadership role in the Global South is steadily eroding, raising concerns about its strategic positioning and credibility in multilateral forums. From the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) to BRICS and even the long-dormant SAARC, India appears increasingly isolated as other nations in the region and beyond explore alternative alliances often with China's support.

India has long aspired to be the voice of the Global South, championing the concerns of developing nations. However, its selective advocacy and reluctance to take firm stances on contentious global issues have created a credibility gap.

Recent developments suggest India's abstentions on several United Nations resolutions calling for ceasefires in Gaza, its muted responses to US and Israeli attacks on Iran, and its silence on issues like the Dalai Lama's succession and Tibet's autonomy raise questions about the consistency of its moral compass. These choices point to a foreign policy driven more by realpolitik than by principle — a stance increasingly viewed with skepticism across the Global South.

In the SCO, India's influence appears to be waning. At the recent Council of Foreign Ministers meeting in Tianjin, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar pushed for a con-

terrorist attack, highlighting the SCO's foundational aim to combat terrorism. However, member states — led by China and backed by Pakistan offered only platitudes about regional cooperation. India's refusal to sign the joint statement after the attack was ignored reveals its diminished sway in the organisation.

Similarly, India's role in BRICS is under scrutiny despite its upcoming presidency in 2026. While there are bold ambitions to reshape BRICS around themes like resilience and sustainability, India's mixed signals are undermining trust. Its continued support for Israel, hesitancy on endorsing a demnation of the Pahalgam common BRICS currency, and

silence on US-led efforts that destabilize global trade have led to questions about its commitment to genuine multipolar cooperation.

Closer to home, in SAARC, India's longstanding strategy of isolating Pakistan has lost traction. Frustrated by the lack of regional progress, neighbouring countries are now leaning toward Chinese-backed platforms, leaving India further marginalized.

Unless India reassesses its diplomatic approach, especially its balancing act between strategic autonomy and bloc commitments, it risks further alienation within the very group of nations it once sought to lead.

Indian Sports Administration: Living in a Fool's Paradise, Urgent Reality Check Needed



India's sports administration up call highlighted three critical cording to the Athletics Integseems trapped in a dreamland where everything appears promising on the surface, but beneath lies a mess of conflicts, doping scandals, and declining performance. The government's ambitious plan to host the 2036 Olympic Games is touted as a symbol of India's sporting progress and organizational capabilities. However, a recent visit by Indian Olympic Association (IOA) officials to the International Olympic Committee (IOC) headquarters in Switzerland brutally exposed India's deep-rooted problems.

The IOC bluntly told the Indian credibility. delegation: "Get your house in order before you think of hosting the Olympics." This wake-

cal concerns.

First, the IOA is marred by internal power struggles. IOA President P.T. The doping crisis is widespread and entrenched, tarnishing India's image internationally. Despite this, the sports community often turns a blind eye to drug use as long as medals keep coming.

Third, India's overall Olympic performance is on a steady decline. The IOC's data reveals that India's rank in the last five Olympics has dropped from 50th in Beijing 2008 to a low of 71st in Paris 2024, with Second, doping is rampant only a slight improvement in Tokyo 2020 due to Neeraj

Chopra's gold medal. The scarcity of gold medals hurts India's global standing.

Compared to nations like Jamaica, which produces worldclass athletes despite limited infrastructure, India's progress is sluggish. If things don't change, India risks being ranked 100th by 2036—the year it plans to host the Olympics—making it the only host nation with such poor sporting credentials.

The IOC's advice is clear: India must first strengthen its sports ecosystem and improve athlete performance before dreaming of hosting the world's biggest sporting event. Otherwise, the nation risks humiliation on the global stage.



Palestine's Silent Tragedy: Daily Deaths Become the New Normal

What we are witnessing in Gaza today is not just a conflict—it is a relentless, daily decimation of a people. The killings have become so routine that they no longer shock the world. The silence is deafening, the inaction overwhelming. It seems the world, and perhaps humanity itself, has become numb to the tragedy unfolding in Palestine.

A recent report by the Palestinian Central Bureau of Statistics paints a grim picture. Since October 2023, Gaza's population has declined by nearly 10%. More than 57,000 Palestinians have been killed in Israeli attacks, including 18,000 children and 12,000 women. This staggering number represents 2.4% of Gaza's population—erased in less than two years.

The violence shows no signs of abating. On average, around 60 civilians are being killed daily, many of them women and children. The scale of human suffering is almost beyond comprehension, yet there is no visible effort to stop the carnage. The international community, often quick to condemn other crises, remains largely passive—reduced to a mute audience.

Even within the Islamic world, there is little more than rhetoric. The 57 Arab-Muslim nations, who often express solidarity with the people of Gaza, appear paralysed—neither raising their voice effectively nor taking any meaningful action. They call Gazans their brothers and sisters in faith, yet many remain silent out of fear—fear for their regimes, their personal safety, and the massive wealth they sit upon.

Children are dying not just from bombs but from hunger and thirst. Basic necessities are scarce. Human dignity is vanishing in plain sight.

Meanwhile, Israel, undeterred by the humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza, has also launched attacks on Iran, allegedly targeting its nuclear program. Backed by its long-time ally, the United States, Israel's military ambitions continue unabated, though they've failed to achieve key objectives.

In cities like Hyderabad, Urdu newspapers continue to document the daily toll of death and destruction in Gaza. But what impact do these grim updates have on their readers? Do they move people to demand action—or have even the most empathetic grown accustomed to the news?

How long will this massacre go on? Who will stop it? The world has no answers. The tragedy of Palestine continues—unfolding silently, tragically, and seemingly without end.



Retail Inflation Hits Six-Year Low: What the Numbers Reveal **Beyond the Headlines**

India's inflation rate continues its downward slide, with the latest data from the National Statistical Office (NSO) confirming a significant moderation. Retail inflation, measured by the Consumer Price Index (CPI), dropped to a six-year low of 2.1% in June, down from 2.82% in May. This marks the fifth consecutive month in which inflation has remained below the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) target of 4%.

The average inflation for the first quarter of the fiscal year now stands at 2.7%, lower than the RBI's own projection of 2.9%. The last time inflation was this low was in January 2019, when it reached 1.97%. Notably, rural inflation was even lower than the national average at 1.72%, while urban inflation was slightly higher at 2.56%.

The primary factor driving this downward trend is the sharp moderation in food prices. The food and beverages category, which constitutes around 46% of the CPI basket, recorded a deflation of 0.2%. Vegetables and pulses in particular saw substantial price declines. This drop was further aided by a favourable base effect. Given the positive outlook for agriculture—thanks to a strong southwest monsoon and increased kharif crop acreage—food prices are expected to stay low in the near future.

The monsoon, which had a slow start, has since picked up pace, delivering rainfall 9.5% above the long-period average. This has significantly improved agricultural prospects. Additionally, the resolution of the Israel-Iran conflict has eased concerns over a potential spike in global oil prices, further reinforcing optimism about inflation control. However, the picture isn't uniformly positive. While food inflation has declined, prices in other CPI categories—such as education, healthcare, and daily-use goods—have seen increases. This suggests that despite easing food costs, the overall cost of living may not have dropped significantly for the average household.



Justice Yashwant Varma Challenges Panel Report in Supreme Court Over **Alleged Cash Scandal**

Justice Yashwant Varma, a sitting judge of a High Court, has approached the Supreme Court challenging the findings of an in-house inquiry committee that linked him to unaccounted cash found in a gutted storeroom at his official residence following a fire on March 14-15.

The inquiry panel, formed by then Chief Justice of India Sanjiv Khanna, had submitted its report on May 3, concluding that large amounts of half-

currency notes were found in suspicious circumstances, and indicated that the money was likely removed from the storeroom by trusted staff of Justice Varma during



the early hours of March 15. Justice Varma has now moved the apex court to challenge both the report's findings and a subsequent communication sent by Justice Khanna to the President and Prime Minister, recommending his removal. He argued that the committee had no constitutional or statutory authority to recommend the ousting of a sitting judge and termed the report unconstitutional and procedurally flawed.

The judge contended that he was denied a fair hearing and not given an opportunity to cross-examine witnesses. He also raised objections over the absence of direct evidence, stating the panel based its conclusions on inference and speculation.

PM Modi Unveils ₹7,200 Crore Projects in Bihar, Promises Jobs, **Empowerment, and Growth**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday laid the foundation stone and inaugurated multiple development projects worth ₹7,200 crore during his visit to Motihari, Bihar. Aimed at accelerating the region's progress, these multi-sectoral initiatives cover infrastructure, education, transportation, housing, and women's empowerment.

During the event, PM Modi handed over keys to 12,000 beneficiaries under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, marking a significant push toward rural housing. He also flagged off four new Amrit Bharat trains, giving a major boost to the region's transport connectivity.

Bomb threats hit over 45 Schools In Delhi&Bengaluru, turns out to be hoax

New Delhi witnessed chaos and panic on Friday as more than 45 schools across the city received bomb threats via email, sending students, parents, and staff into a state of alarm. Authorities swiftly launched emergency protocols, with police, bomb disposal squads, fire services, and dog squads rushing to affected locations to carry out evacuations and security sweeps. The schools targeted include institutions in Rohini, Dwarka, Paschim Vihar, South Delhi, Janakpuri, Ashok Vihar, and other areas. Notable schools like Delhi Public School (DPS), The Heritage School, GD Goenka, and Amity International were among those threatened. This marks the fourth such incident in the national capital in just one week.

Delhi Police have confirmed that investigations are underway, and search operations at the affected schools are ongoing. So far, no explosives have been found, and authorities are working to trace the source of the hoax messages. Former Delhi minister Atishi criticized the BJPled central government over the repeated security lapses, calling it "shocking" that no safety assurance could be provided despite full control over Delhi's administration.

US Declares The Resistance Front a Foreign Terrorist Organization

The US State Department on Friday officially designated The Resistance Front (TRF), a shadow group linked to Pakistan-based terror organization Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), as a Foreign Terrorist Organization (FTO) and Specially Designated Global Terrorist (SDGT). TRF had claimed responsibility for the deadly Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 civilians.

India warmly welcomed the US decision, with External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar calling it a "strong affirmation of India-US counter-terrorism cooperation." The designation highlights the deepening partnership between the two countries in tackling cross-border terrorism and shared security threats.

The move comes amid ongoing confrom across the border targeting Indian civilians and security forces. The operations and links to Lashkar-e-Taiba, has been active in Jammu and



The US action adds international pressure on Pakistan to curb terror groups operating within its territory and disrupt their networks. New Delhi views this step as a significant boost to India's efforts in combating terrorism and safeguarding regional peace.

Both nations continue to strengthen cerns about terror groups operating collaboration in intelligence sharing and counter-terror measures to prevent such attacks in the future. The Resistance Front, known for its covert designation of TRF is seen as a critical milestone in the global fight against terrorism.

AAP Bids Goodbye to INDIA Bloc, Declares Alliance Limited to Lok Sabha Polls

In a political twist that has sent ripples across opposition ranks, the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has officially distanced itself from the INDIA bloc, declaring that its alliance with the Congress and other parties was limited only to the 2024 Lok Sabha elections. AAP MP Sanjay Singh confirmed this stance while addressing the media on Wednesday.

"The INDIA bloc was a strategy for the Lok Sabha elections. After that, we fought the Delhi and Harvana assembly elections independently. Our position is clear," Singh said, indicating a formal end to the collaborative opposition platform that once aimed to challenge the BJP at the national level. He emphasized that AAP will continue to raise people-centric issues in Parliament, particularly the alleged misuse of bulldozers in demolitions in states like Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, and the Purvanchal region. "We are committed to exposing the anti-poor policies being implemented under the guise of development," he said.

Singh also accused the BJP-led Delhi administration of targeting slum dwellers. Referring to the ongoing demolition drives, he claimed that homes and shelters of the poor were being razed during extreme weather con-



ditions. "Slums are being demolished in 50-degree heat while the poor are left to suffer on the streets," he added.

Backing Singh's statements, AAP national convener Arvind Kejriwal had earlier voiced strong criticism of the BJP during a protest at Jantar Mantar, alleging that land-grabbing motives were behind the slum demolitions. He warned voters ahead of the Lok Sabha polls that such actions would increase if BJP remained in power—remarks that have resurfaced after large-scale demolitions within just five months. With this official declaration, AAP's exit from the INDIA bloc marks a significant shift in the opposition landscape ahead of future state and national elections.

Former CM Bhupesh Baghel's Son Chaitanya Arrested by ED in ₹2,100 Crore Liquor Scam

In a major development in the ongoing liquor scam investigation, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Friday arrested Chaitanya Baghel, son of former Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel, in connection with a massive ₹2,100 crore money laundering

According to sources, ED officials carried out early

morning searches at Chaitanya Baghel's residence in Bhilai, located in the Durg district. After concluding their inspection and verifying new evidence, they detained him for further questioning and subsequently placed him under arrest.

The arrest has sparked political tensions in Chhattisgarh. Former CM Bhupesh Baghel has strongly criticized the ED's actions, accusing the central agency of acting with political bias. Speaking on the final day of the state assembly session, Baghel claimed that such raids and arrests are part of a broader political vendetta orchestrated by the ruling party at the Centre.

"It's no coincidence that this action comes just as key political discussions are underway. The ED is being misused to target opposition leaders and their families," Bhupesh Baghel said.

It is worth noting that the ED had previously raided Chaitanya Baghel's premises on March 10 as part of its ongoing investigation into the alleged scam. Today's arrest adds to the growing list of high-profile figures under the ED scanner as it deepens its probe into financial irregularities in Chhattisgarh's liquor business.

Bengaluru Stampede: State Calls IPS Officer 'RCB's Servant' in Defense of Suspension



In the Bengaluru stampede case, the Karnataka State Government defended the suspension of IPS officer Vikash Kumar Vikash before the Karnataka High Court. Senior Counsel PS Rajagopal, representing the state, argued that the suspended officers acted like "servants" of the Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) cricket team, leading to embarrassment for the government. The state blamed the officers for failing to manage the situation properly during the incident, which resulted in chaos and tragedy. This defense came as the government justified its decision to suspend Vikash and others responsible for the law and order lapse. The case highlights concerns over the handling of security and crowd control during high-profile events in Bengaluru. The Karnataka High Court is currently hearing the matter to decide on the validity of the suspension and accountability for the stampede.

Donald Trump Demands Release of Epstein Grand Jury Transcripts, **Denies Writing Controversial Letter**

Former US President Donald Trump on Friday called for the release of grand jury transcripts related to Jeffrey Epstein's case, labeling the situation a "scam" allegedly driven by Democrats. Posting on his social media platform Truth Social, Trump urged Attorney General Pam Bondi to produce all relevant grand jury testimony, pending court approval, to "end this scam right now."

The demand followed a Wall Street Journal report revealing a note purportedly from Trump among a collection of letters given to Epstein on his 50th birthday in 2003. The letter reportedly included Trump's name alongside a crude outline of a naked woman. The documents cited by the report have reignited public scrutiny of Epstein's connections to powerful figures. Epstein died in jail in 2019 while awaiting trial on child sex trafficking charges.

Trump swiftly denied authoring the letter and accused the media of a coordinated smear



on Truth Social, he threatened to sue The Wall Street Journal, its parent company News Corp., and media mogul Rupert Murdoch over the story.

"The Wall Street Journal, and Rupert Murdoch, personally, were warned directly by President Donald J. Trump that the supposed letter they printed by President Trump to Epstein was a FAKE," Trump wrote. He accused the Journal's editor Emma Tucker of ignoring warnings

campaign. In a series of posts from both himself and White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt. Trump insisted the letter is "false, malicious, and defamatory," and confirmed legal action would be taken soon.

Leavitt also criticized the Journal on X (formerly Twitter), calling the article a "hatchet job" featuring a "FAKE 'birthday letter' supposedly from 2003." The controversy adds to ongoing debates surrounding Epstein's legacy and his ties to influential individuals.



Gaza Crisis Deepens: Over 90 Killed in Israeli Strikes, Child Malnutrition **Doubles Amid Blockade**

The humanitarian crisis in Gaza has worsened drastically, with more than 90 Palestinians killed in the past 24 hours due to intensified Israeli airstrikes, health officials reported. Many of the dead include women and children, while severe food shortages and growing malnutrition among children continue to plague the region.

According to the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNR-WA), child malnutrition in Gaza has doubled since March, when Israel resumed military operations and tightened its blockade, cutting off essential food and medical supplies. UNRWA's latest screenings show that over killed and 278 injured in the last

In one of the deadliest incidents, a strike in Gaza City's Tel al-Hawa district killed 19 members of a single family, including six children and eight women. The strikes also claimed the life of Mohammed Faraj al-Ghoul, a Hamas legislator, along with a family sheltering in the same building. Gaza's Health Ministry said a total of 93 people were

The UN and aid groups warn of an impending famine, with aid severely restricted. UNICEF reported nearly 6,000 malnutrition cases in June—triple the number recorded in February.

Israel maintains that it targets militants, blaming Hamas for civilian casualties due to its presence in populated areas. However, humanitarian agencies say the aid distribution is hampered by Israeli military restrictions and ongoing violence. To date, Israel's military campaign has killed over 58,400 Palestinians and injured more than 139,000, with more than half of the fatalities being women and



Delhi Says No RIC Meeting Planned as China Pushes for Troika with Russia

As tensions rise over the ongoing Ukraine conflict and increasing pressure from the US and NATO on Russia, China has expressed willingness to strengthen trilateral cooperation between Russia, India, and China—commonly referred to as the "RIC format." This proposal comes amid mounting US threats of secondary sanctions on India if it continues purchasing Russian oil.

However, government sources in New Delhi, speaking on condition of anonymity, clarified that no official meeting of the RIC format has been scheduled or agreed upon yet. China's Foreign Ministry spokesperson Lin Jiang had recently stated that China is ready to maintain communication with

trilateral cooperation, but New Delhi remains cautious.

Ministry of External Affairs spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal reiterated that the RIC format is a consultative platform where the three countries discuss global and regional issues of mutual interest. Jaiswal added that any revival of the format would be worked out by the countries at a mutually convenient time.

Russian Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei Rudenko had earlier indicated Russia's positive stance on restoring the RIC mechanism and confirmed ongoing negotiations with Beijing and New Delhi. Despite Russia's enthusiasm, India appears measured, mindful of its close ties with the United States and pend-

Russia and India to advance ing trade discussions with the Trump administration.

> When asked about Prime Minister Narendra Modi's potential visit to China for the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) summit, Jaiswal said the event is months away, and participation will be finalized based on mutual convenience.

Key investment drivers include the country's growing commitments to renewable energy, biofuels, decarbonisation technologies, and sustainable infrastructure. India's ambitious target of reaching 500 GW of renewable energy (RE) capacity by 2030 alone will require \$200–250 billion, Deloitte estimates. This will involve major spending on advanced manufacturing, grid

integration, and expansion of transmission systems.

Currently, India must add 300 GW of RE capacity to close the gap between its installed capacity and the 2030 goal. The report identifies critical focus areas for climate investments, including:

RBI Governor Hints at Possible Rate Cut Amid Cooling Inflation and Growth Concerns

Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Sanjay Malhotra has signaled that a cut in the repo rate could be considered in the coming months if inflation continues to moderate or if economic growth shows signs of weakening. His comments come just a day after India's Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation dropped to a 77-month low of 2.1% in June, down from 2.82% in May.

Speaking in Mumbai on Tuesday, Malhotra acknowledged the continued downtrend in inflation and said that the central bank's monetary policy committee (MPC) would evaluate the evolving macroeconomic conditions before taking any decision on the policy rate.

"There is an expectation that inflation may not remain at 3.7% as projected earlier—it could be even lower. That possibility is on the cards. If inflation remains subdued or if growth momentum weakens, we will assess the situation carefully," Malhotra said.

The sharp decline in inflation is being viewed as a positive development, especially as global commodity prices have stabilized and domestic food inflation has softened. Meanwhile, concerns around slower growth have also resurfaced, with some economists flagging weakening consumer demand and sluggish investment activity in certain sectors.

The RBI has kept the repo rate unchanged at 6.5% for the past few policy meetings, adopting a "wait and watch" approach amid global uncertainties and the need to ensure price stability. However, with inflation easing closer to the lower band of the RBI's 2-6% target range, pressure may mount to shift toward a more accommodative stance.

A potential rate cut could provide a boost to borrowing and investment activity, especially as the country gears up for the festive season and the second half of the financial year.

Adani Group Exits Agri Business, Sells Stake in AWL to Wilmar for RS.10,874 Crore

In a significant strategic shift, the Adani Group has decided to exit the agri-business space by selling its entire stake in AWL Agri Business (formerly Adani Wilmar Ltd) to its joint venture partner Wilmar International of Singapore for a consideration of ₹10,874 crore. This move ends one of India's longest-standing joint ventures, originally established in 1999, and signals Adani's intent to streamline its focus on core sectors.

Under the original joint venture agreement, both Adani and Wilmar held 44% each in the company. With this transaction, Wilmar's ownership will rise to 64%, giving it majority control over the company. The remaining stake is held by public shareholders, as the firm was listed on the stock exchange in 2022.



The decision to divest comes amid Adani Group's efforts to consolidate and realign its business portfolio toward infrastructure, energy, logistics, and digital services. Industry experts see this as a logical move in the group's broader deleveraging strategy following recent expansions in capital-intensive sectors.

AWL Agri Business is known for popular consumer brands like Fortune edible oil, rice, atta, and other staples. The company has a significant market presence and wide distribution network across India. With Wilmar now in the driver's seat, the company is expected to deepen its focus on food processing and FMCG segments, leveraging its global expertise.

In a statement, Adani Group said the exit will help them "focus on areas that align better with the group's long-term vision." Wilmar, on the other hand, expressed confidence in further scaling the business in India.

The deal is subject to regulatory approvals and is expected to close by the end of the current fiscal year.

Plants Talk, Insects Listen: Israeli Study Reveals **Groundbreaking Communication**



A groundbreaking study from Tel Aviv University has revealed that plants may be communicating through sound — and insects are listening. Published in the journal eLife, the research provides compelling evidence that female moths can detect ultrasonic distress signals emitted by dehydrated tomato plants and use these cues when choosing where to lay their eggs.

Led by researchers Rya Seltzer and Guy Zer Eshel, under the guidance of professors Yossi Yovel and Lilach Hadany, the study shows that this form of acoustic interaction could be a crucial survival strategy for both plants and insects.

Moths typically lay eggs on tomato plants, providing a food source for their larvae. However, when presented with two identical healthy tomato plants — one paired with a speaker playing ultrasonic sounds previously recorded from stressed (drying) plants, and the other silent — female moths consistently avoided the sound-emitting plant. This suggests they inter-

pret the plant's distress signals as a sign of poor conditions for their offspring.

"We revealed the first evidence for acoustic interaction between a plant and an insect," the researchers said in a joint statement.

This discovery builds on earlier findings from the same team, which showed that plants emit high-frequency sounds when under stress sounds that are inaudible to humans but detectable by various insects and mammals such as

The implications of this research extend beyond basic science. Understanding how insects respond to plant-generated sounds could transform agricultural practices, offering new, eco-friendly methods to influence pest behavior and monitor crop health.

"We've seen that animals are capable of making sense of these sounds," said Hadany. "We believe this opens an entirely new channel of plant-animal communication to explore."



AI Could Soon Help You Talk to Your Pet, Says Groundbreaking **Research Initiative**

In a major step toward bridging the communi- AI-generated "translations" of animal emotions. cation gap between humans and animals, the London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE) is launching the world's first dedicated research centre for animal consciousness the Jeremy Coller Centre for Animal Sentience. Set to open on September 30, the £4 million centre will explore how technologies like artificial intelligence could help humans better understand and even "talk" to their pets.

According to The Guardian, one of the centre's core aims is to use AI to decode the behavioural cues of animals, potentially allowing pet owners to interpret what their pets are feeling or trying to express. This would mark a significant advancement in human-animal interaction, especially for domestic pets like dogs and cats. However, researchers are also placing a strong emphasis on the ethical challenges such innovations could bring.

Professor Jonathan Birch, the centre's inaugural director, warned of the risks associated with

"We like our pets to display human characteristics," Birch explained, "and with AI, the ways in which your pet will be able to 'speak' to you could be taken to a whole new level." However, he cautioned that AI systems often produce outputs designed to please users, rather than reflect reality — a concern that could have serious implications for animal welfare.

For instance, pet owners worried about separation anxiety might rely on AI tools for reassurance that their dog is fine — even if that's not true. "That could be a disaster," Birch said.

The centre plans to involve experts across neuroscience, philosophy, veterinary science, AI, and ethics to explore not only the potential but also the limitations of AI-animal communication. Birch emphasized the urgent need for global ethical standards, stating, "There's currently a total lack of regulation. We need responsible frameworks to guide AI use in relation to animals."


Virtual Companions for Psychedelic Trips: The Rise of AI Chatbots as Trip-Sitters

In a surprising new trend, people are beginning to use AI chatbots as digital "trip-sitters" while under the influence of psychedelic substances—sparking concern among mental health experts and technologists alike.

Traditionally, a trip-sitter refers to a sober, trusted individual who supports and monitors someone during a psychedelic experience. Now, some are turning to artificial intelligence for that role instead. According to a recent report from MIT Technology Review, users are increasingly seeking out AI chatbots—ranging from well-known tools like ChatGPT to niche platforms like "TripSitAI" and "The Shaman"—to provide virtual companionship and guidance while tripping on substances like psilocybin mushrooms or



This unconventional use of AI appears to be an extension of a broader trend: people turning to chatbots for emotional support and therapeutic conversations, often citing the high cost and limited availability of mental health services. However, using AI in such a vulnerable and altered state of consciousness is largely uncharted territory, raising ques-



psychological stability. The report highlights a strik-

ing case from 2023, involving a man named Peter, who consumed an extremely high dose-eight grams-of psilocybin mushrooms. During his trip, Peter turned to ChatGPT for support. The chatbot responded by suggesting a

soothing music playlist and

offering words of reassurance, mimicking the role of a human trip-sitter. Peter later described the experience as emotionally transformative.

Still, experts caution against using al as a substitute for a real, present, and sober individual during psychedelic use. The combination of hallucinogenic drugs and machine-generated dialogue could create unpredictable and potentially harmful outcomes.

One researcher called it a dangerous "psychological cocktail," emphasizing that AI cannot replace trained professionals or human intuition during altered states of consciousness.

As the trend grows, it's raising urgent discussions about responsible AI use in deeply personal and risky settings.

Netflix Confirms Use of Generative Al in **Argentine Series**

Netflix has revealed that it employed generative artificial intelligence (GenAI) to create visual effects in one of its original Argentine TV series—marking a first for the streaming platform. The announcement, made on Thursday, highlights Netflix's growing interest in leveraging AI technologies to support content production and improve user experience.

The company did not disclose the name of the specific series but confirmed that GenAI was used to develop on-screen visuals, demonstrating how artificial intelligence is gradually being integrated into mainstream entertainment. The move comes amid ongoing debates in Hollywood about the role of AI in creative industries, with concerns ranging from job displacement to ethical boundaries in storytelling.

Netflix Co-CEO Ted Sarandos emphasized that AI presents a "tremendous opportunity" for the entertainment world. "It's not just about making production cheaper, but about helping creators bring their visions to life more effectively," Sarandos said. He framed GenAI as a tool that could enhance the quality and creativity of content, rather than replace human

Fellow Co-CEO Greg Peters added that the company is exploring additional ways to incorporate generative AI to improve the viewer experience. One possibility, he noted, is allowing users to find content using spoken commands—such as asking Netflix directly what to watch based on mood, preferences, or voice queries.

The adoption of GenAI in content creation signals a shift in how the entertainment industry may evolve. While the use of AI has sparked debates across creative fields, Netflix's move suggests that major players are beginning to embrace the technology not only for cost efficiency, but also for expanding the boundaries of storytelling and interactivity.
