Polluters Out, Reforms In: **Bhatti Leads Cabinet Charge**

The Telangana government is taking firm steps toward environmental safety and urban planning by initiating the relocation of polluting industries situated within the Outer Ring Road (ORR). Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka chaired a Cabinet sub-committee meeting on Saturday at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Secretariat, where he directed officials to expedite the process of shifting such industries beyond the ORR limits.

The meeting saw participation from key ministers including Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy, IT and Industries Minister D. Sridhar Babu, and Excise Minister Jupally Krishna Rao. The sub-committee reviewed current industrial zoning issues and emphasized that relocating polluting units is vital to protect the environment and improve urban living standards.

hensive framework and a time-bound relocation calendar. The ministers insisted that the relocation process be handled with urgency and strict adherence to deadlines to avoid further environmental damage.

The meeting also reviewed revenue performance from various departments. Officials reported that there was a 1.8% increase in income from the Commercial Taxes Department, 3.6% growth in Stamps and Registration, and a notable 7% increase in revenue from the Mines Department. The ministers commended the departments for improved performance and advised them to maintain consistency in revenue mobilisation. In addition, the Cabinet sub-committee examined the progress of property auctions under the Rajiv Swagruha housing scheme and vacant plots managed by the Housing Board. Officials were instructed to ensure full transparency in the auction process

Officials were asked to prepare a compreto avoid irregularities. The committee also stressed that the sale of Housing Board houses must be structured in a way that makes them accessible to the common man and middle-income groups.

Deputy CM Bhatti reiterated the government's commitment to inclusive development and urged departments to align with the state's broader goals of revenue generation, environmental protection, and social equity.

Senior officials including Chief Secretary A. Santhi Kumari, Finance Principal Secretary Pradeep Kumar Sultania, Industries Special Chief Secretary Jayesh Ranjan, Mines Principal Secretary Sridhar, MA&UD Secretary Ilambarthi, HMDA Commissioner M. Will Sentiment **Politics Bring BRS Back?**

Power has always been the ultimate goal in politics, and history shows that leaders and parties often rely on either personal charisma or emotional sentiment to attain it. In the case of the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), sentiment was the winning formula once a driving force during the separate Telangana move-

ment that propelled the party, then known as TRS, to power in 2014 and again in 2018. However, in the 2023 elections, that same formula failed to connect with voters, resulting in the party's ousting and the rise of the Congress government under Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy.

Now, 18 months into the Congress regime, BRS appears to be reaching back into its old playbook sharpening the sentiment strategy it once wielded successfully. Lacking a new

narrative or a strong political campaign to take on the current government, the

party is leaning on emotion and regional pride in an effort to revive public support. Sources in political circles observe that the BRS is struggling to shake off the shadow of alleged corruption and dynastic politics that marred its previous term. Accusations of centralized power within the KCR family and unaddressed issues such as

These acts, often ignored or considered harmless, now fall under the purview of ragging, according to the new

Kazipet Coach Factory Set to Power India's Rail Future by 2026

The much-anticipated Rail Coach Factory in Kazipet is set to commence production by 2026, Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw announced during an inspection visit on

Saturday. Accompanied by Union Coal Minister G. Kishan Reddy, the ministers reviewed the ongoing construction of the coach factory and railway manufacturing unit and expressed satisfaction with the progress.

Speaking to the media, Vaishnaw said the mega infrastructure project is moving swiftly and is a significant milestone for the region. "Production of railway coaches from Kazipet will begin in 2026. We are working with full speed and efficiency. Initially, 150 locomotives will be exported from this facility, and in the future, metro coaches will also be manufactured here," he said.

The railway minister added that the facility would not only serve domestic needs but will also be positioned as an export hub, boosting industrial activity and employment in Telangana.

Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy, who hails from the state, described the Kazipet project as the result of a "40-yearold aspiration" of the people of Warangal. "The demand for a coach factory has existed for decades. Prime Minister Narendra Modi fulfilled this aspiration by sanctioning the wagon, coach, and



engine manufacturing unit here. This will transform Warangal's economic landscape," he said.

Reddy also emphasized the Centre's focus on improving railway infrastructure in Telangana. "As many as 40 railway stations across the state are being modernised. These upgrades will improve passenger amenities and ensure better connectivity," he said.

In addition to rail infrastructure, Kishan Reddy also brought up the long-pending issue of establishing an airport in Warangal. "The region should have had an airport by now. We had asked the previous KCR government repeatedly for land allocation, but there was no response. Now, we are requesting the current state government to expedite land acquisition. Warangal deserves an airport," he said.

The visit by the two Union ministers highlights the Centre's emphasis on development in Telangana and its push to deliver long-pending infrastructure promises. The Kazipet Rail Coach Factory, once operational, is expected to become a major employment generator and industrial hub in the region.



Online Betting Scam: ED Summons Google, Meta

In a major development in the ongoing crackdown on online betting, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has issued summons to tech giants Google and Meta. The ED has called on representatives from both companies to appear for questioning on July 21, as part of its probe into the alleged promotion of illegal online betting apps on

their platforms. The ED suspects that Google and Meta gave prominent advertisement space and visibility to betting apps, allowing them to reach millions of users across India. Officials believe that the two digital platforms failed to conduct proper checks, thereby enabling the growth of these illegal apps. The agency further believes that many lives could have social media, thereby encourbeen saved if such apps were not promoted so widely.

According to ED sources, these

TPN: Special Desk | V. Krishna apps are often disguised as skill-based games but function as betting platforms, leading to financial losses, addiction, and even suicides. Investigators have also uncovered that crores of rupees have allegedly been routed through hawala channels linked to these betting operations, raising serious concerns about money laundering.

In recent weeks, the ED registered cases against 29 individuals, including several celebrities, for endorsing and promoting these apps. Actors such as Prakash Raj, Rana Daggubati, and Vijay Deverakonda have been named in the case, along with popular TV hosts and influencers. These celebrities are alleged to have received large sums of money to promote betting platforms on aging the

The Congress has repeatedly denied these accusations, labeling them as political theatrics. However, the BRS continues to double down on the strategy, appearing convinced that stirring sentiment around Telangana identity and injustice will resonate with the public once again.

But political analysts are divided. While some see emotional politics as a proven and potentially effective strategy, others believe that the political climate and voter expectations have evolved. "The Telangana sentiment that was once organic and deeply rooted during the statehood struggle cannot be easily recreated," one analyst observed. "Today's electorate is more focused on governance, delivery, and transparency."

As the BRS positions itself for a will the emotional appeal that brought them power a decade ago still strike a chord with voters in 2025? Or has the political landscape shifted too far for old formulas to work?

For now, the BRS appears to be betting that sentiment more than policy may once again open the door to power.

Uttam Orders Water Plan for Kharif

Irrigation Minister Capt N Uttam Kumar Reddy held a high-level review at the Dr BR Ambedkar Telangana Secretariat on Saturday, assessing the water availability across major reservoirs for the ongoing Kharif (Vana Kalam) season. He directed irrigation officials to formulate a practical and scientific plan based on current water levels,

expected monsoon inflows, and total ayacut coverage.

The Minister stressed coordinated efforts between the Irrigation and Agriculture Departments, citing last year's record paddy production of 281 lakh metric tonnes. He urged officials to maintain the same coordination with Collectors and field staff this season to ensure farmers receive timely water supply.

Reviewing the Krishna and Godavari basins, Uttam Kumar Reddy called for a data-driven water release strategy aligned with crop patterns and geography. "No farmer should suffer due to lack of water," he asserted.

Uttam Kumar Reddy also reviewed desilting work in both river basins and directed urgent efforts to restore reservoir capacity. He expressed concern over sedimentation and ordered

immediate desilting of vulnerable reservoirs before peak rainfall.

Addressing land encroachments on irrigation properties, he instructed officials to identify and remove illegal occupants, including on the premises of WALAMTARI and ERL. A statewide eviction drive will be launched, and officials were told to coordinate with municipal and police departments.

On administrative matters, the Minister instructed the completion of pending promotions in the Irrigation Department within two months.

Reaffirming the government's commitment to farmers, Uttam said: "We are focused on optimal water use, safety of structures, and revival of key projects. This Kharif must bring prosperity to every farmer."

AK Singh Takes Charge as Chief Justice

Justice Aparesh Kumar Singh was sworn in as the Chief Justice of the Telangana High Court at a ceremony held at Raj Bhavan. Governor Jishnu Dev Verma administered the oath of office.

The swearing-in ceremony was attended by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, Legislative Council Chairman Gutta Sukhender Reddy, Assembly Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar, Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, ministers, High Court judges, MLAs, MLCs, and other dignitaries.

Justice AK Singh, who was transferred from the Tripura High Court, is the seventh Chief Justice of the Telangana High Court. Since the formation of the state, six judges have served in the role before him. With his appointment and the recent changes in judicial positions, the High Court now has 25 serving judges out of a total sanctioned strength of 42.

Born on July 7, 1965, Justice Singh hails from a family of legal luminaries. He is a third-generation lawyer and the son of Dr. Ram Gopal Singh and Dr. Shraddha Singh. His maternal grandfather, Justice B.P. Sinha, served as the sixth Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of India. His paternal grandfather, Justice Shambhu Prasad Singh, served as the Acting Chief Justice of the



Patna High Court.

Justice Singh completed his B.A. (Hons.) and law degree from Delhi University and enrolled as an advocate in the Patna High Court in 1990. He practiced there until 2000 and later in the Jharkhand High Court from 2001 to 2012. He was appointed as an Additional Judge of the Jharkhand High Court in 2012 and became a Permanent Judge in 2014. He also served as Acting Chief Justice of the Jharkhand High Court in 2022 before being elevated as Chief Justice of the Tripura High Court in 2023.

His transfer to the Telangana High Court marks another milestone in his distinguished judicial career.

Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) Commissioner RV Karnan has called for war-like measures to prevent the spread of dengue in the city. At a review meeting held on Saturday with health officials, the Commissioner stressed the importance of intensified anti-larvae operations across slums, houses, apartments, schools, colleges, and government hostels.

He instructed medical officers to personally visit these areas to identify and eliminate mosquito breeding sites, especially in places with stagnant water. Fogging operations are to be conducted regularly, particularly in government hostels, to minimize the risk of dengue transmission. Special initiatives are also to be launched to prevent mosquito breeding in closed and stagnant water bodies.

Commissioner Karnan emphasized that the ELISA test should be made mandatory for dengue diagnosis, pointing out that rapid diagnostic tests used by pathology labs are insufficient. He directed doctors to conduct ELISA tests for all suspected dengue patients and to visit

colonies with reported cases to monitor health conditions. In areas with multiple cases, a fever survey must be carried out to contain the spread.

Deputy commissioners and assistant medical officers have been ordered to regularly inspect Urban Public Health (UPH) hospitals to review preparedness


and patient care related to dengue. In addition to health measures, the Commissioner reviewed the progress of the ongoing road safety and infrastructure improvement programs. Engineering officials reported that of the 8,000 potholes identified citywide, 4,500 have been repaired so far, with plans to complete all repairs by next week. Work on storm water drains, catch pits, and other floodprone areas is also being expedited.

The Commissioner highlighted the vital role of GHMC in flood prevention and urged close coordination with the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (Hydra) to minimize disruptions during the monsoon season.

The meeting was attended by CEO Sahadev Ratnazar, Additional Commissioner Raghu Prasad, Zonal Commissioners, medical officials, and other senior staff members.







Jagga Reddy Slams KCR,

As Revanth Reddy completes 18 months as Chief Minister, political tensions in Telangana continue to escalate, with senior Congress leader Jagga Reddy sharply criticizing the ruling KCR family and their close aides.

Jagga Reddy highlighted widespread public dissatisfaction, stating that unfulfilled promises over the past decade have led to strong resentment against the KCR family. He referred to failed commitments such as the incomplete loan waiver scheme, lack of minority reservations, and unfulfilled promises of jobs and housing. "We have every right to criticize," he said, addressing the public grievances.

Focusing his remarks on the KCR family, Jagga Reddy condemned what he called the "wretched" rule that allegedly oppressed farmers and common people. He criticized incidents like the Mallanna Sagar farmer beatings and accused the regime of cruelty and misgovernance.

On the political front, Jagga Reddy praised Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's leadership under Rahul Gandhi's guidance, highlighting achievements such as free bus travel for women, enhanced health schemes like Aarogya Sri increased to ₹10 lakh coverage, and proposed initiatives including integrated schools with significant investment. He urged people to witness the progress in areas like Siddipet and Sircilla firsthand.

He also launched a scathing attack on KTR, the working president of the ruling party, questioning his conduct and criticizing his approach. Jagga Reddy accused KTR of undermining governance and ridiculed his overseas education and leadership style. "KTR is laughing when you look at him," he said, implying disconnect from the public.

Responding to criticisms, Jagga Reddy described Revanth Reddy as a strong leader but acknowledged internal political challenges. He warned against provoking Revanth unnecessarily, highlighting tensions within the political camp and warning of potential electoral challenges.

The political exchange reflects growing friction between the Telangana Rashtra Samithi (TRS) leadership and the Congress government, signaling a turbulent political climate as elections approach.

Etala Stands by Huzurabad, Slams BRS

Etala said that the strength of a party comes from its leaders and workers. "I understand the problems of the workers. I will try to fulfill their political needs. I work with full dedication in any party I am in. I don't chase power or positions," he said.

He also commented on the current political situation and leadership. "Sometimes BJP speaks, sometimes it remains silent. I speak openly and don't believe in backstabbing. I will fight my political enemies directly," he said.

Etala said he would stay connected with the people of Huzurabad. "I will visit Huzurabad every 10 days. We will open party offices in every mandal. Workers should not lose hope," he said. He encouraged party members to stay united and ignore political opportunists.

Former MLA Mynampally Hanmantha Rao launched a scathing attack on BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) during a press meet at Gandhi Bhavan. Accusing KTR of acting as a "shadow Chief Minister" during the previous government, Mynampally said the BRS leader made hollow promises and led the state into political and administrative chaos.

Rao said KTR spoke arrogantly and failed to deliver on assurances like providing jobs to every household, appointing a Dalit as Chief Minister, and allotting lands to Dalits. Online Licence Must for Hyderabad Pubs

In a move to improve public safety at night establishments, the Hyderabad Police

has made it mandatory for bars, pubs, restaurants, and hotels to apply for entertainment and amusement licences through its official licence will be issued only after obtaining an entertainment licence.

The police issued strict safety guidelines, requiring all establishments to install door frame metal detectors (DFMDs) and hand-held metal detectors (HHMDs) at entry and exit points. CCTV cameras with a minimum 30-day backup must be installed, covering both interiors and surrounding roads.

Strict action will be taken against establishments allowing minors to consume alcohol or smoke. Emergency exits and signage must be in

web portal. An amusement place to avoid stampede-like situations, and noise levels must be within the prescribed limits — 65 dB during the day and 55 dB at night. Managements must prevent

drunk driving by encouraging cab services. All bouncers and security staff must be trained in fire safety and emergency response, with mock drills conducted regularly. Events or special programmes require prior police permission. Police also urged timely reporting of any suspicious activity or incidents. All outlets must strictly adhere to closing hours and public safety

The word economic forum in its gender gap report 2025 ranks INDIA 131 out of 148. Countries with particularly low scores in economic participation and health and survival — the pillars essential for meaningful gender parity. These are not just social indicators. They are signs of a structural failure holding back national progress.

According to the latest Mc.Kinsey and LeanIn.org Women in the Workplace report, only about half of women feel confident that their employer would handle harassment claims effectively-a percentage virtually unchanged from 2018. This lack of trust in workplace processes not only discourages women from reporting incidents but also contributes to perpetuation of toxic work environment.

International labour organisation in a press release published -India's POSH Act (2013) is a critical step in addressing workplace sexual harassment, but weak enforcement, employer non-compliance, and lack of independent oversight limit its impact.

A safe workplace for women is a work environment where they feel secure, respected, and free from harassment, discrimination, and physical harm. Employers are responsible for creating a safe and healthy working environment for women, free from the fear of violence or discrimination. This includes:

- Freedom from Harassment & Discrimination
- Physical Safety
- Equal Pay & Opportunity
- Safe Working Hours
- ConfidentialityAccess to Support
- Employers play a crucial role in fostering a safe and respectful workplace. The Prevention of Sexual Harassment (PoSH) Act is a key legal framework that mandates employers to prevent and address sexual harassment at work. Understanding the PoSH

Act is essential for employers to

comply with the law, create a safe environment, and protect both employees and the organization. By implementing section 19 of PoSH Act effectively, employers can enhance employee well-being, reduce risks, and ensure smooth operations.

- Employers must ensure a safe workplace environment. This includes safety from individuals who may come into contact with employees.
- Employers must display the penal consequences of sexual harassment. They should also display the order that constitutes the Internal Committee under section 4(1).
- Employers must regularly organize workshops and awareness programs. These programs should inform employees about the POSH Act and train Internal Committee members as required.
- Employers must provide necessary facilities for the Internal or Local Committees. This helps them deal with complaints and conduct inquiries effectively.



- Employers must assist in securing the attendance of the respondent and witnesses. They must also provide necessary information to the Internal or Local Committee as needed.
- Employers must assist a woman in filing a complaint related to sexual harassment under the Indian Penal Code or any relevant law. Sexual harassment should be treated as misconduct under the service rules. Employers must take appropriate action for such misconduct.
- Employers must ensure timely submission of reports by the Internal Committee.

Even after a decade after the enactment of POSH Act 2013 there are major drawbacks by the employers in the implementation

In November 2024, the Orissa High Court issued a significant directive concerning Section 19(b) of the PoSH Act. The case, initiated through a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) by social activist Biyat Pragya Tripathy, addressed the non-compliance of both central and state authorities with the provisions of the PoSH Act.

The court emphasized the mandatory requirement for employers to:

- 1. Display Penal Consequences: Clearly exhibit the legal repercussions of sexual harassment in a conspicuous location within the workplace.
- 2. Constitute Internal Committee:
 Ensure the establishment of an
 Internal Complaints Committee
 (ICC) as mandated under Section
 4(1) of the PoSH Act.

If women continue to exit or be excluded from the workforce, the dependency ratio will rise even faster, placing greater strain on fewer workers and undermining fiscal stability. Reversing this trend demands integrated policies that connect health, labour and social protection.

Strict employer liability, independent investigations, financial penalties, and survivor-centric policies—best practices India must adopt. To ensure safe and inclusive workplaces, India must ratify ILO C190, expand protections to gig and informal workers, strengthen penalties, and mandate employer accountability. A survivor focused, globally aligned approach will transform policies into real workplace safety.

Trumplomacy and India: Navigating the Chaos with Strategy, Not Emotion



Donald Trump's unconventional diplomacy—dubbed Trumplomacy—is shaking up the global order. His approach, driven by blunt statements, social media theatrics, and transactional politics, has unsettled allies and adversaries alike. For India, his recent remarks—lumping Prime Minister Modi and Pakistan's Field Marshal Asim Munir in the same breath—have reignited concerns about the long-rejected "hyphenation" with Pakistan.

But rather than respond with indignation or anxiety, India must step back and assess the situation with realism and strategic calm. Trump isn't reviving old diplomatic frameworks—he's tearing them apart. His praise of Munir isn't a departure from U.S. policy, but a clearer endorsement of what India has long claimed: the Pakistani military, not its elected government, holds real power. In Trump's world, diplomacy bypasses formalities. He deals directly with the power centers, and for him, that means engaging with generals, not figurehead prime ministers.

India has traditionally opposed external mediation in its disputes with Pakistan. But Trump's style isn't classic mediation—it's improvisational facilitation, as seen during "Operation Sindoor."

Even then, it was India's Foreign Minister S. Jaishankar, not Prime Minister Modi, who was treated as the key counterpart. Pakistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif was largely ignored, highlighting where Trump sees real authority.

This brand of diplomacy unsettles many global leaders, as Trump has insulted NATO allies, made outrageous offers to Canada, and undermined Ukraine while praising Putin. His actions are driven by spectacle and an obsession with American dominance, not consistency. Friends and foes alike are adapting—Europeans with flattery, China with leverage, and smaller nations by playing smart. India must do the same. Trump may visit for the Quad Summit, and a stop in Pakistan is not unthinkable. Should that happen, India's response must be pragmatic, not reactionary. Trump's style may be chaotic, but the underlying strategic currents—security cooperation, economic interests, Indo-Pacific balance—remain constant.

In a world reshaped by Trumplomacy, India cannot afford to get caught up in symbolic slights. It needs a cool-headed strategy rooted in national interest. Trump may bring noise, but India must respond with signal.

From Goldman Sachs to OnlyFans: What the Rise of the Creator Economy Really Tells Us

In an era where leaving a high-paying job at Goldman Sachs for a content creation career on OnlyFans barely raises eyebrows, the shift from traditional employment to the creator economy has never been more stark—or more complicated. Welcome to the creator economy, where algorithms are gatekeepers, attention is currency, and going viral can be more lucrative than an Ivy League degree. With platforms like Instagram, TikTok, and YouTube democratizing fame and monetization, charisma often trumps competence. Even in India, the "Jiofication" of internet access has turned small-town tea vendors into viral sensations and homemakers into beauty influencers.

But this brave new world isn't without con-

sequences. Traditional high-achievers—those who aced exams, collected degrees, and climbed corporate ladders—are now grappling with imposter syndrome and identity crises. Their disciplined skill sets are often overlooked in a system that rewards virality over value.

Content creation isn't easy either. Behind every 15-second reel lies hours of editing, emotional vulnerability, and endless hustle. Creators act as CEOs of their own one-person startups, juggling branding, content, marketing, legal compliance, and mental health.

The irony? Education hasn't caught up. Students still memorize facts in classrooms while AI writes essays and 13-year-olds rake in sponsorships. We're preparing kids for a world that no longer exists.

The solution isn't to dismiss influencers or idolize them. It's to reform education—teach emotional intelligence, financial literacy, digital ethics, and offline self-worth in an online-first world. Because when the dopamine fades and the next algorithm shift hits, we'll need citizens who can think, feel, and adapt—not just perform.

Not everyone will go viral. But everyone deserves a meaningful life—even when the WiFi goes down.









BJP MP Nishikant Dubey: Age 75 Rule Does Not Apply to PM Modi

BJP MP Nishikant Dubey has confidently stated that the Bharatiya Janata Party will struggle to win even 150 seats in the Lok Sabha if Prime Minister Narendra Modi stops leading the party. Currently, the BJP holds 240 seats, and Dubey believes Modi's leadership is crucial for the party's continued success.

Speaking to ANI, Dubey emphasized that Modi remains the undisputed leader of the country and the BJP for the next 15 to 20 years. Addressing concerns about Modi's age, Dubey cited former Prime Minister Morar-ji Desai, who became PM at 82, to argue that age should not be a barrier for leadership. He urged voters to support Modi until he is well, especially with the vision of a developed India by 2047 in mind.

Dubey's remarks come amid ongoing speculation about whether Modi will step down after turning 75 in September, in line with the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh's (RSS) suggestion that leaders should retire after 75 to allow new leadership. However, Dubey's firm stance reinforces Modi's continued centrality in BJP's future plans.

PM Modi lauds Delhi CM Rekha Gupta for her 'rise through ranks'

ED Issues Notices to Google and Meta Over Online Betting App Promotions

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has issued notices to global tech giants Google and Meta as part of its intensified crackdown on illegal online betting platforms in India. The move comes amid rising concerns over the growing number of suicides, debt traps, and broken families attributed to online gambling addiction. According to ED sources, the agencies have found that both Google and Meta allegedly promoted and provided advertising space for betting apps through their platforms. These promotions, ED claims, not only offered visibility to illegal gambling operations but also made direct website links available to users, aiding in their access to these platforms. The ED's investigation is part of a broader probe into the operations of illegal betting networks such as the Mahadev Betting App, which has already been linked to multiple scams. The agency has reportedly registered cases against 29 Tollywood actors, YouTubers, and social media influencers for their alleged involvement in promoting the Mahadev platform.

Officials have raised concerns that major digital platforms are failing to regulate paid advertisements for gambling apps, thereby contributing to a growing social crisis. The ED believes such negligence has enabled betting companies to exploit loopholes and target young, im-



pressionable users, particularly college students and working professionals.

The central agency emphasized the dangers of online betting and urged parents to monitor their children's digital activities. "Greed and peer pressure are leading our youth into a trap that's hard to escape," an official said. "It's not just about financial loss; lives are being ruined."

The Enforcement Directorate, while not a police force, is a powerful central agency tasked with investigating economic offenses, including money laundering and financial fraud.

You'll Be Slapped If You Don't Understand Marathi: Raj Thackeray

Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) chief Raj Thackeray sparked controversy once again with his fiery remarks targeting non-local residents of Maharashtra. Addressing a rally in Mira-Bhayandar, Thackeray warned that anyone who fails to understand Marathi will be slapped on the spot. "If someone speaks to you in Marathi and you still don't understand it—even when said in your ear—you will be slapped. People will not tolerate this ignorance anymore," Thackeray declared, drawing cheers from MNS supporters. The remarks come in the wake of a recent incident where MNS workers allegedly assaulted a shopkeeper for refusing to speak in Marathi. The incident triggered protests from traders and business owners, many of whom closed their shops in protest.

Thackeray defended the actions of his party workers, blaming the shopkeeper's attitude for provoking the confrontation. He criticized those who shut down their businesses in protest, questioning, "How long can you keep your shops closed? What will happen when locals stop buying from you?"

He went on to warn non-locals who live and work in Maharashtra, saying they must behave responsibly and not "sneak around." "Those who work here should work with honesty and without hiding anything," he added.



Warning to the State Government

Raj Thackeray also directed sharp criticism at Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis, opposing any move to make Hindi mandatory in schools from Classes 1 to 5.

"We are not against any language," Thackeray said, "but if Hindi is made compulsory, we will shut down those schools."

His remarks have reignited debates around regional identity, linguistic nationalism, and freedom of language choice in one of India's most economically vital states.

"5 Jets Were Shot Down": Trump Makes Another Op Sindoor Claim

US President Donald Trump claimed during a private White House dinner that "five jets were shot down" in the recent India-Pakistan conflict sparked by the Pahalgam terror attack. He did not specify which country's aircraft were lost but highlighted the intensity of the brief military exchange between the two nuclear-armed neighbors.

The conflict began after a deadly terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam on April 22, which killed 26 people, including tourists. India responded with Operation Sindoor, launching air and missile strikes over several days targeting terrorist camps and military assets across Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

Pakistan has claimed that its air force shot down multiple Indian jets, including three Rafale fighters, and captured Indian pilots—claims strongly denied by India. Indian officials have acknowledged some aircraft losses but rejected Pakistan's assertions of losing several Rafales. Indian Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan emphasized India's ability to adapt tactics quickly and conduct precision strikes deep inside Pakistani territory.

The French manufacturer Dassault Aviation's CEO Eric Trappier also refuted Pakistan's claims, calling them "factually incorrect." India maintains that no Rafale jets were lost and no pilots were captured during the conflict. Trump further claimed that the ceasefire, an-

nounced on May 10, was achieved through US



diplomatic intervention, with threats to suspend trade talks if hostilities continued. However, India disputes this version, insisting that the resolution was reached bilaterally without any foreign mediation.

Operation Sindoor involved coordinated strikes by India's Air Force, Army, and Navy over several days, which India describes as targeting terrorist infrastructure and military installations. Both India and Pakistan continue to maintain conflicting narratives about the events and losses during the conflict.

President Donald Trump has filed a libel lawsuit against The Wall Street Journal, its parent company Dow Jones, and two of its reporters, Khadeeja Safdar and Joe Palazzolo, over a story that linked him to a letter and drawing allegedly sent to Jeffrey Epstein in 2003. The article claimed Trump gifted Epstein a note and a sketch of a naked woman for his 50th birthday an allegation Trump forcefully denies.

Filed in federal court in Miami, the 18-page complaint accuses the Journal of "glaring failures in journalistic ethics." Trump's legal team says no authentic letter or drawing exists and contends the story lacked both photographic evidence and verifica-

The lawsuit represents a significant escalation in Trump's legal battles against the press, seeking a massive \$20 billion in damages. Trump, writing on Truth Social, claimed that Rupert Mur-

doch, whose News Corp owns the Journal, was personally warned the letter was fake. "But obviously, did not have the power to stop it," Trump posted.

A spokesperson for Dow Jones

defended the reporting, stating: "We have full confidence in the rigor and accuracy of our reporting and will vigorously defend against any lawsuit."

Trump's ties to Epstein, who died in jail in 2019 while facing sex trafficking charges, have drawn renewed attention. During the 2024 campaign, Trump promised to release more information on the Epstein case, appealing to right-wing influencers calling for transparency.

This is not Trump's first lawsuit against the media. He previously sued ABC and CBS in 2024, settling both cases for \$16 million each — funds earmarked for his future presidential library.

Legal experts say this case could test the limits of presidential defamation suits. "No sitting president has ever done this,' said First Amendment attorney Ted Boutrous.

Japan's PM Shigeru Ishiba **Faces Election Test Amid Rising Prices and Political Instability**

Japan's Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba is heading into a critical upper house election on Sunday, July 20, 2025, as his leadership hangs in the balance amid political turbulence, rising prices, and public frustration. A poor performance could deepen instability and cast doubt on his government's ability to address urgent economic and social issues.

The ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP), along with coalition partner Komeito, needs to secure 50 of the 124 contested seats to maintain a majority in the 248-seat upper house. This would still be a significant drop from the coalition's pre-election total of 141 seats. Analysts warn that failure to secure a majority could spark calls within the LDP to oust Ishiba.

Even if the coalition manages to win, Ishiba's leadership is expected to remain weak. Since suffering a major defeat in last year's lower house election, his minority government has struggled to push legislation without opposition support, limiting its ability to curb inflation and boost wages.

A major flashpoint has been the soaring price of rice, which has doubled over the past year due to shortages and poor distribution. Ishiba's handling of the crisis has been criticized, especially as U.S. President Donald Trump pressures Japan with a 25% tariff on rice and

Meanwhile, populist parties like Sanseito have capitalized on public dissatisfaction by promoting anti-foreigner rhetoric, traditionalist values, and resistance to globalism. Critics warn this trend is fueling xenophobia, even as Japan faces a labor shortage due to its aging population.

The opposition, while gaining ground, remains fragmented, limiting its ability to pose a united challenge to the ruling coalition. However, if the LDP loses its majority, it could trigger a broader political reshuffle and shift in national policy priorities.

US Tech Company Launches Probe Into CEO, Head HR's Viral Coldplay Video

A U.S. tech CEO has been suspended following a viral video that allegedly shows him embracing his head of HR during a Coldplay concert. The incident, caught on the venue's "kiss cam" at Gillette Stadium in Massachusetts, led to widespread speculation online and has now triggered an internal investigation. The pair in question are believed to be Andy Byron, CEO of the AI firm Astronomer, and Kristin Cabot, the company's Chief People Officer. The footage shows the two swaying closely to the music before abruptly ducking when they appear on the big screen. Coldplay frontman Chris Martin quipped from the stage: "Either they're having an affair or they're just very shy."

Soon after, online sleuths identified the duo as Byron and Cabot, sparking controversy due to their high-ranking positions within the same company. Astronomer responded late Friday, confirmleave and that Co-founder Pete DeJoy will serve as interim CEO.



The company released a brief statement on X (formerly Twitter), reaffirming its commitment to "the values and culture that have guided us since our founding," and emphasizing accountability among leadership. ing Byron had been placed on Byron, who became CEO in July 2023, had praised Cabot's leadership when she joined the com-

pany in November. Neither party has made a public statement since the video emerged. Byron's wife has reportedly removed his surname from her social media profile and deleted her account amid the fallout.

The video's rapid spread online led to memes and even a fake statement quoting Coldplay lyrics. The woman who posted the clip said she had no idea who the couple was but hoped the situation allows those affected to heal.

As the investigation continues, the company has yet to announce further actions or confirm if Cabot remains in her po-





Textile Industry Urges Uniform 5% GST Across Value Chain to Boost Growth



The Indian textile industry has reiterated its ■ demand for a fibre-neutral Goods and Services Tax (GST) rate of 5% across the entire textile and apparel value chain. Industry leaders argue that rationalising the current tax structure will eliminate the inverted duty structure, boost investments, and promote growth in all segments of the sector.

Currently, the cotton-based textile sector largely attracts a 5% GST, except for garments priced above ₹1,000, which are taxed at 12%. However, the Man Made Fibre (MMF) sector faces a complex and higher tax structure — raw materials like Purified Terephthalic Acid (PTA) and Monoethylene Glycol (MEG) are taxed at 18%, MMF filament and spun yarn at 12%, fabrics and garments at 5%, and items priced above ₹1,000 at

R.K. Vij, Secretary General of the Polyester Textiles Apparel Industry Association, highlighted the impact of this disparity. "A uniform 5% GST is crucial to remove the inverted duty structure and make MMF sector globally competitive," he said. He added that to achieve the textile sector's ambitious target of \$100 billion in exports and \$250 billion in domestic sales by 2030, all segments — cotton, viscose, and synthetic fibres — must grow simultaneously. Currently, there are no major expansions in the viscose or cotton sectors, making MMF sector growth vital.

K. Selvaraju, Secretary General of the Southern India Mills Association, suggested that garments and fabrics priced above ₹2,000 be taxed at 12%, while all other products, irrespective of the fibre, should attract a uniform 5% GST. "Micro, small, and medium enterprises are struggling with input tax credit accumulation. MMFbased fabrics and garments are affordable to the masses and must be supported through lower taxation," he emphasized.

He also pointed out that the textile and apparel industry is one of the largest employment generators in the country. Rationalising the GST structure, he argued, would encourage new investments and job creation.

Industry bodies believe that implementing a fibre-neutral GST regime will bring parity, reduce compliance complexity, and position India more competitively in the global textile market.



India's agri-exports surge in Q1 FY26, rice exports lead

Tndia's agricultural and processed food exports India is now the world's second-largest export-**L**have shown strong momentum in the first quarter of FY26, recording a 7% year-on-year increase to reach \$5.96 billion between April and June. This growth reflects the sector's robust performance, driven by supportive policies and strong global demand.

Rice remains the cornerstone of India's agri-export success. Combined shipments of basmati and non-basmati rice rose by 3.5%, reaching \$2.9 billion in Q1 FY26. This comes on the heels of a record-breaking FY25, where rice exports hit \$12.47 billion — a 20% jump over the previous year. For over a decade, India has consistently maintained its status as the world's largest rice exporter, contributing 40% of the global trade. The recent surge in rice exports was supported by the government's decision in late 2024 to remove various export controls, including minimum export price restrictions, following a record harvest and strong domestic stock levels. Other key drivers of export growth include buffalo meat, dairy, and poultry products, which collectively grew by 17% to \$1.18 billion in Q1.

er of buffalo meat, with major markets in the UAE, Saudi Arabia, Malaysia, Vietnam, Iraq, and Egypt. These exports are managed under the APEDA framework, with integrated, certified meat plants regularly inspected by importing countries to ensure compliance with international standards.

Fruits and vegetables also posted impressive growth, with exports climbing 13% to \$0.95 billion in the quarter, reflecting rising global demand for Indian produce.

APEDA (Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Development Authority) continues to play a vital role, coordinating exports worth \$25.14 billion in FY25 — a 12% rise from FY24. APEDA products now account for over half of India's total agricultural exports.

Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal credited the sector's progress to favorable policies, fiscal incentives, low tariffs, and enhanced market access through free trade agreements (FTAs) with countries like Australia, the UAE, the UK, and EFTA nations.

Indian electronic exports hit \$40 billion: Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw

electronics **⊥**exports have surged dramatically, crossing the \$40 billion mark—a growth of eight times over the past 11 years— Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw announced on July 19, 2025. He also highlighted that domestic electronics production has increased sixfold during the same period, reflecting the country's rapid advancement in this sector. Speaking at the 14th Convocation of IIT Hyderabad, Vaishnaw un-

able progress India has made in electronics manufacturing and related technologies. He shared optimistic news about India's first bullet train project, expected to be operational by August or September 2027, showcasing the country's broader technological strides. Looking ahead, Vaishnaw revealed that India is set to produce its first commercially made semiconductor chip this year. He expressed confidence that the nation is on a clear trajectory to become one of the world's top five semiconductor manufacturing hubs, driven by increasing investments in capital equipment and materi-

production. "In just 11 years, we have increased our electronics production six times," Vaishnaw said, emphasizing the double-digit compound annual growth rate (CAGR) that few corporations can match. "Our exports have grown eightfold, surpassing

\$40 billion—a phenomenal pace of growth rarely seen in countries of our size."

Vaishnaw credited this impressive transformation to the vision and leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi. He pointed to a key achievement under this vision—the design of a complete 4G telecom stack within about three and a half years. This homegrown technology now powers nearly 90,000 telecom towers across India, outnumbering the networks of many countries worldwide.

The minister's remarks highlight India's expanding role in the global electronics and semiconductor industries, reflecting a strong push to develop indigenous manufacturing capabilities and reduce dependence on imports. As India strengthens its production and export capacity, it is set to become a critical player in the fast-evolving global electronics market.

Crypto Market Surges Past \$4 Trillion Amid New U.S. Regulatory Framework

The cryptocurrency sector reached a historic milestone on Friday, with its total market value surpassing \$4 trillion, signaling the maturation of digital assets from a speculative fringe to a mainstream component of global finance. According to CoinGecko, this surge comes amid renewed optimism, clearer regulatory policies, and increasing institutional investment.

A key catalyst behind this growth was the U.S. House of Representatives passing a bill on Thursday to establish a regulatory framework for U.S.-dollarpegged stablecoins—cryptocurrencies designed to maintain a 1:1 value with the dollar. The bill has been sent to President Donald Trump, who is expected to sign it into law. This legislative move marks a significant shift in the U.S. government's stance toward the crypto industry, balancing cautious oversight with support for innovation.



In addition to the stablecoin bill, the House approved two more crypto-related laws, including one outlining broader crypto regulations and another aiming to prohibit the issuance of a U.S. central bank digital currency. These measures now await Senate review.

"The Genius Act will go down in history as a foundational step in mainstreaming crypto as an asset class," said Chris Perkins, president of CoinFund.

Are Aliens Watching Us? Massive 20-Km Interstellar Object Sparks Global Buzz


 $\mathbf{A}_{\text{ject named 3I/ATLAS}}^{\text{massive interstellar object named 3I/ATLAS}$ captured the attention of scientists and the public alike. Spotted by NASA's ATLAS telescope, the object is nearly 20 kilometers long, making it the largest known interstellar visitor to our solar system. Its strange features, including unusual speed, trajectory, and structure, have raised more questions than answers.

Harvard astronomer Avi Loeb suggests that 3I/ATLAS may not be a natural object at all. Instead, he believes it could be an alien probe or space-

craft, possibly sent by an advanced extraterrestrial civilisation. The object's surrounding gas and dust cloud, along with its odd behavior, support his theory that this might be intelligent technology rather than a random rock from

Loeb has even linked the object to the "Dark Forest Hypothesis"—a theory that alien civilizations stay hidden to avoid detection and destruction. If 3I/ATLAS is a deliberate signal or device, it could mean that Earth has been noticed, possibly for the first time.

3I/ATLAS is expected to come closest to Earth in December 2025, passing at a distance of about 270 million kilometers. As that date approaches, astronomers around the globe are preparing to study it in greater detail.

Whether it turns out to be alien technology or just a strange space rock, one thing is certain: 3I/ATLAS has reignited humanity's curiosity— However, not all scientists agree. Many believe and concern—about what lies beyond our solar system.

Tn a creative fusion **L**of health awareness and tech in-French novation, researcher Marc Teyssier has developed a smartphone case that mimics human skin—and even shows signs of sunburn when exposed to strong UV rays. Named Skincase, this unusual invention was created in collaboration with Virgin Media O2 to highlight the dangers of sun exposure and encourage regular sunscreen use.

Made from silicone and UV-reactive materials, Skincase looks and feels like real skin. It features lifelike textures such as pores and wrinkles, crafted using 3D printing and hand-sculpting techniques. Available in three skin tones, the case changes colour under intense sunlight, simulating sunburn. The idea is simple: when users see their phone case turning red, it's a timely reminder to protect their own skin.

Teyssier explained, "My work aims to connect our digital habits with real-world health. Skincase is a tool to promote self-care through technology." His inspiration came from studies showing that while people frequently check their phones, they often forget to apply sunscreen, even in high UV conditions.

The Skincase acts as a behavioral nudge—each glance at the discolored phone cover reinforces the need for sun protection. As Chris Hindenach of Virgin Media O2 noted, phone usage spikes during holidays, a time when sunburn risk also rises. Skincase leverages that phone-checking habit to raise awareness.

Currently, Skincase remains a prototype and isn't available for commercial use, but it's already sparking conversations about wearable health tech and behavioral design. This isn't Teyssier's first venture into human-like devices—he previously created artificial skin for phones that responded to touch gestures.

Skincase proves that even quirky gadgets can carry a serious message—protect your skin, one phone check at a time.




