PM Applauds Vijayawada's Water **Management**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi commended Vijayawada's efficient water management during his latest 'Mann Ki Baat' broadcast, calling it an exemplary model for urban water supply. He highlighted that the city's effective distribution system stands as proof of good governance and sustainable planning.

Urban Development Minister Dr. Narayana expressed pride over the Prime Minister's acknowledgment, stating that it reflects the development-oriented approach of the coalition government. "The Chief Minister's constant monitoring has ensured that Vijayawada not only meets its residents' needs but has also earned recognition at the national level by securing the Swachh Survekshan Award recently," he said.

According to official data, the Vijayawada Municipal Corporation (VMC) currently supplies safe drinking water to over 1.6 million residents daily without major disruptions. Dr. Narayana emphasized that even hilly regions within the corporation limits are now receiving uninterrupted water supply, a significant improvement since the new government assumed office. He also credited the AMRUT scheme for strengthening the State's water infrastructure. "Under the guidance of Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, Andhra Pradesh has received substantial central funds through the AMRUT program. Over the next three years, we aim to ensure that every household in all municipalities across the State receives safe drinking water," he added.

The Minister extended congratulations to VMC Commissioner Dhyanachandra, other officials, and staff for their dedicated efforts in achieving this recognition.

Singapore Tour Day Two

Ports, Cities, Sports Top Naidu's Agenda

Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu highlighted Andhra Pradesh's ambitious plans in green energy, port development, housing, and sports infrastructure, calling for extensive cooperation from Singapore during his ongoing visit. He emphasized that the state is undertaking large-scale renewable projects and expects significant support from Singapore, particularly in green hydrogen, transmission corridors, data centers, and logistics.

Singapore's Trade and Industry Minister Tan See Leng expressed willingness to partner in housing construction and subsea cable projects. He assured that Singapore, along with the World Bank, is already collaborating globally in sectors like green energy and urban housing, and would extend its expertise to Andhra Pradesh. Naidu noted that earlier difficulties faced by Singaporean firms in Andhra Pradesh would not be repeated, stressing his commitment to restoring trust and ensuring smooth cooperation.

Two-Hour Walk in **Bidadari Estate**

During the visit, Naidu toured Bidadari Estate, a 250-acre eco-friendly housing project accommodating 10,000 families, designed by Singapore's Housing Development Board (HDB). The project's environmental planning—preserving natural water sources, minimizing tree removal, and converting old cremation grounds into parks—was highlighted as a model for Andhra Pradesh's upcoming urban housing initiatives. Naidu invited Singaporean agencies to participate in Amaravati's housing development and acknowledged their earlier contributions to the capital city's master plan.

Port Development and **Logistics Hub Vision**

Later, Naidu inspected Tuas Port, one of Asia's largest container terminals under construction at a cost of ₹1.7 lakh crore. He reviewed its automation systems, AI-based cargo handling, and real-time tracking technologies. Andhra Pradesh plans to develop ports every 50 km along its coastline, aiming to create a logistics hub integrating ports, airports, and industrial corridors. Discussions focused on technology transfer, joint ventures, and international standards for port operations.

Sports Infrastructure and Global Training

Naidu also visited the Singapore Sports School with badminton coach Pullela Gopichand and ministers. He said Andhra Pradesh's sports policy aims to produce international athletes while positioning sports schools as hubs for tourism and commercial activity. The state has raised sports reservations in government jobs to 3% and enhanced rewards—₹7 crore for Olympic gold medalists, ₹5 crore for





YS Jagan Meets Governor Abdul Nazeer

Just a day earlier, Special Investigation Team (SIT) officials conducted searches at Bharathi Cements' Hyderabad office, raising speculation about the next course of action in the ongoing Andhra Pradesh liquor case. While YSRCP leaders maintain that

the meeting carried no political significance, some believe discussions could have touched upon the latest political developments.



Congress vs BJP In Lok Sabha on Op Sindoor

The Lok Sabha on Monday witnessed heated exchanges between the BJP and Congress during the debate on the Pahalgam terror attack and India's subsequent military response, Operation Sindoor. The Congress party questioned the government's claim of success. Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi questioned the government's narrative by pointing to their own statements. "They said we attacked them inside their homes. But they also admitted that Operation Sindoor is incomplete because Pakistan can still strike in the future. They said it themselves. Then how was the operation a

success?" he asked. Continuing his criticism, Gogoi challenged the Centre's position on Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK). "They say our intention was not war. Was it not so? They say it was not to take territory. Why was it not? When will we take back PoK, if not today, then when?" he asked, accusing the government of lacking clarity in its objectives.

Shashi Tharoor Snubs Party Line

Amid the debate, senior Congress leader Shashi Tharoor reportedly distanced himself from the party's aggressive stance.

Telangana HC Allows Permanent Residents in MBBS Seats

The Telangana High Court has delivered relief to MBBS aspirants by directing Kaloji Narayana Rao University of Health Sciences (KNRUHS) to provisionally count permanent residents of the state as "local candidates" for counselling, even if they lack the required four-year residency or study history. The interim order addresses petitions challenging Rule 3(a) of the KNRUHS admission prospectus released on July 15, which reinstated a stringent fouryear requirement for Telangana locality eligibility. Advocates B. Mayur Reddy and Diwakar Reddy argued in court that the rule unfairly penalized permanent residents and violated fundamental rights under Articles 14, 19, and 21 of the Constitution. The High Court agreed that domicile should be accepted as valid proof of local status.

With the registration deadline for MBBS counselling closing on July 30, the court ruled that around 100 affected candidates may participate under the Telangana local quota until a final decision is reached. The bench directed KNRUHS and state authorities to follow its earlier rulings from 2023 and 2024 in managing the ongoing admissions process.

The interim order offers much-needed respite to hopeful candidates while the court continues its deliberations on the legality of the four-year norm.



Mega PTM Enters Guinness World Records

Andhra Pradesh has secured a prestigious Guinness World Record for organizing the world's largest Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM), marking a historic achievement in public education. Over 5.34 million parents and teachers participated in the Mega PTM 2.0 event, with a total footfall exceeding 15.2 million, including students, alumni, School Management, School Management Committee (SMC) members, and philanthropists.

The event, held just a day before the fifth anniversary of the National Education Policy on tuesday, reflects the State's commitment to transforming its public education system. Andhra Pradesh aims to establish itself as a "Quantum Valley," a hub for knowledge and innovation, by focusing on global educational standards and empowering its youth.

Education and IT Minister Shri Nara Lokesh expressed immense pride upon receiving the confirmation from Guinness World Records. He dedicated this global recognition to teachers who contributed tirelessly to the success of Mega PTM 2.0. The Guinness certification followed a thorough audit involving three photographs, one video, verified participant counts, and independent witness statements from each participating school.

Centre Key Statement on Polavaram-**Banakacharla Project**

The Central government has stated that the Andhra Pradesh government has not yet started work on the proposed Polavaram-Banakacharla project. This was clarified in a written reply by the Union Jal Shakti Ministry in the Rajya Sabha, responding to a question raised by Congress MP Anil Kumar Yadav.

According to the reply, the AP government informed the Centre that only a free feasibility report has been submitted to the Central Water Commission for technical and financial evaluation. No physical work on the project has been initiated so far.


Meanwhile, the Telangana government has raised objections to the project. It has communicated its concerns through a formal letter and stated that it is in ongoing consultation with the concerned authorities and other river basin states. The Centre's disclosure highlights the project's early stage and the inter-state complexities involved. The Polavaram-Banakacharla project has long been discussed as a significant water linkage initiative aimed at improving irrigation and water distribution in Andhra Pradesh. However, the latest update suggests that critical clearances and inter-state agreements are yet to be finalized.

Achchennaidu Orders Full Water to Vamsadhara Ayacut

In view of the prevailing drought-like conditions, Agriculture Minister Kinjarapu Achchennaidu has instructed irrigation authorities to ensure full-scale water supply to the Vamsadhara ayacut. Chairing an emergency review meeting with irrigation officials at his Nimmada camp office on Monday, the Minister emphasized immediate measures to safeguard crop cultivation in the region. He directed that water release from lift irrigation schemes be temporarily halted so that maximum allocation can be diverted to the left canal ayacut. Special focus must be placed on providing water to tail-end areas, particularly in Palasa, Meghavaram, Tekkali, and Nandigam mandals. The Minister instructed officials to increase the current discharge from Gotta Barrage from 1,600 cusecs to 1,800 cusecs to meet growing irrigation needs.

Achchennaidu stressed that water distribution should prioritize lower ayacut areas be-



fore supplying upper regions, ensuring farmers preparing for transplantation have adequate access. He also directed field-level inspections to monitor real-time water flow and identify any bottlenecks.

To maintain uninterrupted supply, the Minister ordered the deployment of temporary staff to oversee canal operations and prevent breaches. He asked officials to take precautions to avoid damage to canal structures and to ensure that water reaches all targeted villages without leakage or wastThe Minister assured that the coalition government stands firmly with farmers and is committed to resolving their concerns. He also instructed agriculture department officials to make fertilizers readily available to cultivators, enabling them to proceed with agricultural activities without delays.

Lokesh Urges Airbus to Set Up MRO Hub

Currently, over 850 Airbus air-

craft operate in India, and forecasts indicate that approximately 1,750 new aircraft will be required over the next 20 years. Airbus maintains a 65-70% market share in the commercial aviation space, largely through the A320 narrow-body fleet.

Lokesh stated that Andhra Pradesh's geographical advantage, combined with its readiness to develop robust infrastructure, positions the state to become South Asia's leading gaged in a strategic discussion MRO destination. He assured with Airbus Asia Pacific Presi- that the proposed hub would dent Anand Stanley during his meet global standards similar to those maintained by Singapore, aiming to reduce operational costs, minimize ferry times, and improve aircraft turnaround for Indian carriers. "Our objective is to establish an MRO hub that not only caters to domestic requirements but also services regional airlines, strengthening India's aviation ecosystem," Minister Lokesh said.

Water is being released downnataka and Maharashtra have stream to manage the rising levels. Through two spillway gates, 53,764 cusecs are being discharged towards Nagarjuna Sagar. Additionally, 20,000 cusecs are being released via the Pothireddypadu head regulator, while the left-bank power station is discharging 35,315 cusecs,

and the right-bank power station is releasing 30,930 cusecs. The reservoir's full reservoir level (FRL) is 885 feet, while the current level stands at 882.40 feet. Its full storage capacity is 215.80 TMC, and the present storage is 201.12 TMC. Authorities are closely monitoring the situation and have taken measures to regulate water levels to prevent downstream flooding.

Police arrested two individuals from a forested area in Salem for hunting bats using country-made rifles. During interrogation, the suspects admitted to killing bats and selling their meat under the guise of chicken to local eateries.

Their confession prompted immediate alerts to the Food Safety Department, which is now coordinating with law enforcement to prevent the illegal sale of bat meat.

Authorities are preparing to conduct surprise raids on restaurants and fast-food centers in Salem city following the leads provided by the arrested individuals. Food safety officials have warned that such acts pose severe health risks, including the potential spread of zoonotic dis-

Sources indicated that Tharoor declined a request from Rahul Gandhi's office to lead the opposition's charge in the nearly 16-hour discussion on Operation Sindoor and the conflict with Pakistan.

Tharoor is said to have made it clear that he would not speak against the government for the sake of political messaging, reportedly telling party leaders that he would not contradict his earlier statements. His refusal comes at a time when his relationship with the Congress appears to be at a crossroads.

The debate over Operation Sindoor is expected to continue in both Houses, with opposition parties pressing for clarity on its objectives and long-term impact.

"Opposition Should Ask If Terror Bases Destroyed": Rajnath Singh

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh delivered a fiery response in Parliament on Monday, taking strong exception to the opposition's focus on Indian losses during Operation Sindoor and the Pahalgam terror attack, and asserting that their questions do not align with the country's collective sentiment.

"A few members of the opposition have been asking, 'how many of our aircraft were shot down?' I feel their question does not adequately represent our national sentiments," Singh said. "They have not asked how many enemy aircraft we shot down."

Singh argued that the real questions should have been: Did India destroy terrorist bases? Was Operation Sindoor a success? Were terrorist leaders killed? "And the answer to all these questions is — yes," he thundered, drawing loud thumps of approval from the treasury benches.

Amid opposition queries over alleged damage to Indian military infrastructure — and Pakistan's claim of downing six Indian jets — Singh clarified that none of India's brave soldiers were harmed. "Pakistan could not hit our targets. There was no damage to any of our important assets," he said.

Rejecting what he termed "comparatively small issues that divert attention from national security," the Defence Minister praised India's precision strikes, which destroyed nine terror camps across Pakistan and Pak-occupied Kashmir, eliminating over 100 terrorists — all within nine minutes and without civilian casualties.

Singh's remarks come days after former US President Donald Trump controversially claimed that five Indian jets were shot down a claim India has not confirmed.

In defending Operation Sindoor, Singh reaffirmed India's military strength and dismissed opposition doubts: "If they truly stand with the nation, they should be asking the right questions."

HRC Seeks Report on Surrogacy **Scandal**

The Telangana Human Rights Commission (HRC) has expressed strong displeasure over reports of alleged child sales by a fertility center in Secunderabad. Acting on media reports, the HRC has taken up the case suo motu, emphasizing that incidents involving the sale of infants born through surrogacy must be treated with utmost seriousness.

The commission directed the state's Medical and Health Department to conduct a thorough investigation and submit a detailed report by August 28. It warned that any negligence in such sensitive cases would attract strict action.

The controversy began after police registered a case against Srushti Fertility Center, which allegedly assured childless couples of assistance through IVF and surrogacy but was found to be engaged in illegal child trade, according to initial reports. Several individuals have already been arrested in connection with the case, and further investigations are underway to identify the full network behind the operation.

Authorities are examining records of surrogate births facilitated by the center and verifying adoption-related documentation to trace how many infants may have been illegally sold. The HRC's intervention has intensified pressure on law enforcement and health officials to ensure accountability and prevent further exploitation of vulnerable families.







SIT Must Reveal Liquor Scam Details: Chinta Mohan

Former Union Minister Chinta Mohan has alleged large-scale corruption in Andhra Pradesh's liquor sector and demanded immediate release of the SIT report. He stated that he served as the Chairman of the Alcohol Board for one and a half years and fully understands liquor production. "With four kilograms of molasses, one liter of alcohol can be produced. Thousands of crores of rupees are involved in this liquor scam. The government must reveal the facts to the public," he said.

Mohan also raised concerns over mining activities in his constituency, particularly in Saidapuram, which he claimed holds resources worth lakhs of crores. "Who exploited these mines earlier, and who is doing it now? Similarly, sand resources in Gudur, Satyavedu, and Sullurupeta must be accounted for," he demanded. He criticized the state for halting the Duggarajupatnam port project, which had been approved during the UPA government. "I persuaded 32 Union Ministers and got Parliament's approval. If completed, the port could have attracted massive investments and industries. Instead, Chandrababu Naidu stopped it to benefit Adani," he alleged.

Mohan accused the ruling coalition of abandoning Rayalaseema's administrative capital, diverting resources to Amaravati, and distributing CRDA lands without transparency. He also slammed the BJP-led central government, citing ₹14.5 lakh crore in bank loan write-offs and alleged corruption.

Highlighting failures in healthcare, education, and employment, he said rural hospitals lack basic facilities, MGNREGA funds are misused, and three lakh students have dropped out of primary schools. He further expressed concern over rising attacks on SCs, STs, and OBCs, stating that Andhra Pradesh's governance has deteriorated over the last decade.



MLA Reviews Welfare Scheme Reach

MLA Yarlagadda Venkata Rao of Gannavaram constituency actively participated in the 'Good Governance – First Step' initiative conducted in Bapulapadu mandal. The program was organized in Kodurupadu and Sobanadripuram villages, where the MLA, along with local leaders, workers, and government officials, visited households to interact directly with residents. During these visits, Yarlagadda Venkata Rao inquired about the implementation of various government schemes and explained their benefits to the people. He encouraged villagers to make full use of the welfare programs designed to improve living standards. Local representatives from coalition parties, village volunteers, and administrative officials joined the initiative. The MLA emphasized that such door-to-door campaigns help bridge the gap between the government and citizens, ensuring that welfare measures reach all eligible beneficiaries.

Minister Gottipati Urges **Smart Meter Awareness**

Energy Minister Gottipati Ravi Kumar emphasized the importance of increasing public awareness regarding smart electricity meters. He clarified that no smart meters have been installed for agricultural connections in Andhra Pradesh and that their deployment is limited to industrial and commercial consumers. He directed DISCOMs to actively educate people, explain the smart meter policy, and dispel any misinformation or concerns circulating in the public domain.

During a review meeting held on Monday, attended by APEPDCL CMD I. Prudhvi Tej and senior officials, the Minister assessed the power supply situation in APEPDCL's jurisdiction. Officials confirmed that supply is meeting demand and reported that nine hours of uninterrupted electricity is being provided to agricultural consumers in nine out of eleven farming districts.

The Minister instructed officers to counter misleading claims on social media by conducting structured outreach programs. He urged direct engagement with consumers to explain where and why smart meters are



being installed, ensuring doubts are resolved before implementation.

Addressing infrastructure challenges, Ravi Kumar highlighted the need to prevent supply disruptions and tackle low voltage problems proactively. He also reviewed the progress of the RDSS (Revamped Distribution Sector Scheme) works and directed that local contractors be utilized to speed up execution. He reminded officials that central funding for Phase II of RDSS will only be released after the successful completion of Phase I.

Reiterating his earlier statement, the Minister said smart meters are not being deployed

in agriculture, and installations are confined to industrial and commercial users. He acknowledged the spread of false information about smart meters and instructed DISCOMs to launch extensive awareness campaigns before any installations.

Officials also updated the Minister on the PM Surva Ghar scheme. Eluru is leading its implementation, followed by Visakhapatnam, West Godavari, and East Godavari districts. The Minister directed that, as per Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu's instructions, at least 10,000 solar connections be provided per constituency under the scheme.



TDP Leaders Criticized for Targeting YSRCP

YSRCP State Joint Secretary Kishore Boosipati has strongly condemned what he described as politically motivated attacks by TDP leaders B.Tech Ravi and MLC Rangopal Reddy against YSRCP State General Secretary Satish Reddy. Addressing the media at the district party office, Kishore alleged that these leaders are criticizing Satish Reddy to gain favor—B.Tech Ravi with Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu and Rangopal Reddy with Minister Nara Lokesh.

He stated that after coming to power, the coalition government ignored many pre-election promises and focused primarily on Amaravati and Polavaram, leaving several welfare schemes unimplemented. Farmers, students, women, and parents, who benefited from numerous schemes during the previous YSRCP government, are now facing hardships, Kishore said.

He added that Satish Reddy has been questioning the government on public issues, not for personal gain. "Instead of answering those questions, TDP leaders are resorting to mudslinging," he alleged. According to Kishore, attempts to create political tension in Pulivendula, a region known for its calm, by launching personal attacks on Satish Reddy are unacceptable.

Kishore demanded that instead of targeting individuals, TDP leaders should focus on resuming stalled development works in Pulivendula, including medical college projects and infrastructure initiatives. He questioned why the leaders remained silent when 50 medical seats sanctioned for Pulivendula were withdrawn and when local projects came to a halt. He urged TDP leaders to shift their attention from personal criticism to addressing public welfare and ensuring the implementation of promised schemes.

Minister Slams Jagan Rule for Fiscal Mess

Andhra Pradesh Finance Minister Pajjavula Keshavulu stated that the state will need additional time to recover from the financial damage caused by the previous government. Jagan Mohan Reddy for pushing the state into a severe debt trap.

Keshavulu pointed out that the previous Chief Minister himself recently acknowledged the state's poor financial condition in a social media post. "The financial crisis Andhra Pradesh is experiencing today is a direct result of Jagan Mohan Reddy's governance. He left the state burdened with debts amounting to nearly ₹10 lakh crore and pending dues of around ₹1.14 lakh crore," he said. The Minister assured that the current government is making phased efforts to repay these debts.

He further alleged that the earlier government misused employee provident funds, police dues, and diverted resources from welfare schemes such as Srinidhi funds. "All systems were mismanaged, leaving the state in financial chaos. Our government, under Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, is committed to restoring fiscal discipline and placing Andhra Pradesh back on the right track," Keshavulu added.

He also accused the previous regime of halting 95 central government schemes, which affected development and welfare initiatives. "We are now clearing contractors' pending bills step by step—bills that the Jagan administration left unpaid," he said, holding the former Chief Minister responsible for the state's economic setbacks.

Vijayawada Metro **Tenders Out for** Phase-1

The Andhra Pradesh Metro Rail Corporation Limited (APM-RCL) has invited tenders for the construction of the Vijayawada Metro Rail Phase-1 project. The plan includes building metro lines along two major corridors, covering a total distance of 38.4 kilometers.

Corridor-1 will connect Pandit Nehru Bus Stand to Gannavaram Bus Stand, while Corridor-2 will extend from the bus station to Penamaluru. Notably, Corridor-1 features a 4.7-kilometer double-decker flyover, adding a significant engineering highlight to the project.

The tender also includes the construction of 32 elevated metro stations and one underground metro station. APMRCL has chosen to execute the project under the Engineering, Procurement, and Construction (EPC) model to ensure streamlined implementation.

For technical designs, supervision, and specialized engineering assistance, TYPSA Consultancy has been selected to provide expert support throughout the construction process.

Kondapur Rave Party Kingpin from Mangalagiri

The Task Force and Excise Police have identified Appikatla Ashok Kumar from Kaja village under the Mangalagiri-Tadepalli Municipal Corporation limits as the prime accused behind the sensational Kondapur rave party case that has shaken both Telugu states. Authorities revealed that Ashok Kumar allegedly organized illegal parties in Hyderabad, bringing youth—particularly from Andhra Pradesh—on weekends, supplying them with drugs, and forcing them into obscene activities.

During a raid on an SV Service apartment in Kondapur, police arrested nine individuals and seized nine vehicles. From Ashok Kumar's possession, officials recovered drugs, ganja, and condoms. Investigators believe he specifically targeted young women already addicted to narcotics, exploiting their drug-induced state to commit sexual assaults. Preliminary inquiries also point to the involvement of another individual, Nagalla Manikantha Sai, also a native of Kaja village, who is suspected of assisting Ashok Kumar in organizing these events. Notably, the accused was reportedly moving around in a black Fortuner SUV (registration number AP 39 SR0001) displaying a Lok Sabha MP sticker, raising further questions about possible misuse of influence. Local residents expressed shock upon learning that Ashok Kumar, the only son of his parents, who had been raised with affection and care, became deeply involved in criminal activities over the years. Authorities continue to investigate the broader network behind the rave parties, which have sparked serious concerns about drug abuse and organized exploitation in Hyderabad.



Guntur Police Bust Ganja Gang

Guntur district police dismantled a marijuana smuggling network, arresting 13 individuals and seizing 21 kilograms of marijuana worth approximately ₹3.15 lakh. District SP Satish Kumar stated that strict action is being taken to curb the organized sale and distribution of marijuana, particularly its growing impact on youth.

According to SP Satish Kumar, the gang had been smuggling marijuana from Odisha into Andhra Pradesh. They repackaged it into smaller packets and sold it at higher prices across Tenali and nearby areas. The accused allegedly targeted minors, first introducing



them to consumption and later using them as small-scale vendors, turning the illegal trade into a primary source of income. Among the arrested are two individuals

from Vijayawada, one from Guntur, and ten from areas around Tenali. Four of them are minors. Police revealed that several of the main accused are listed rowdy-sheeters in Tenali with multiple criminal cases, including previous drug-related offenses.

The operation was conducted by Tenali DSP Janardhana Rao and his team, who focused on high-risk zones such as railway stations,

bus stands, and neighborhoods known for criminal activity.





Kadapa Civic Body in Garbage Tax Row

Kadapa: Despite the state government's clear orders to abolish garbage tax collection from June 9, 2024, unauthorized levies are still being imposed in Kadapa Municipal Corporation. Certain sanitation officials have ignored directives and are allegedly extracting lakhs of rupees every month from residents and businesses under the guise of "user charges." Residents, fearing penalties and harassment, are reportedly paying

whatever amount is demanded. Shockingly, receipts issued in the name of the municipal corporation have become a point of contention, raising questions about their authenticity. Earlier, households were charged ₹90 per month, while commercial establishments—tea stalls, hotels, liquor shops, clinics, lodges, theaters, function halls, meat stalls, and grocery stores—were categorized and billed between ₹200 and ₹2,000. Official procedures mandated online payment notices and legitimate receipts, but many officers allegedly created their own receipt books and diverted up to 70% of collected funds, depositing only a fraction into the municipal treasury. After the government's ban, officials reportedly shifted focus to businesses, openly demanding payments from small tea vendors to large restaurants. Traders claim they are threatened with accusations—littering nearby, using

plastic covers, or blocking public spaces—if they resist.

Reports indicate an estimated ₹30 lakh is collected monthly through this illegal practice, suggesting a potential multi-crore scam if fully investigated. Yet, officials appear hesitant, "calculating their moves," delaying inquiries, and avoiding firm action. Questions remain unanswered: Who is collecting these taxes? Since when? Where is the money going?

TTD Gears Up for Varalakshmi Vratham

HC Suspends New Kabaddi Committee

The Andhra Pradesh High Court has suspended the newly formed Andhra Kabaddi Association committee, instructing that the body elected in 2023 will continue until further orders.

Goluguri Venkata Reddy, also known as Victory Venkata Reddy and serving as the association's president, stated that secretary Yalamanchili Srikanth organized a meeting on May 17 under

the guise of honoring medal-winning players but instead announced a new executive committee without his consent. Venkata Reddy alleged that this action violated sports regulations and ignored previous court directions.

He further accused Srikanth of manipulating player selections, bypassing mandatory inter-district tournaments, and selecting individuals of his choice. "Many athletes lost opportunities because nearly 69% of selected players submitted fake birth certificates to qualify for junior-level competitions," he said.

According to Venkata Reddy, Srikanth sidelined independent kabaddi coaching camps, reassigned players to districts of his preference, and intimidated those who questioned his decisions. He also claimed that officials submitted a false affidavit to the court stating

that the previous committee had been dissolved, with 26 people—including government employees—signing it. He criticized Srikanth for organizing unauthorized events under the title "Youth Andhra Pro Kabaddi," misleading players, and branding state teams as "SKY," referring to his initials, instead of Andhra Pradesh.

Venkata Reddy emphasized the need for a single, transparent state association to protect genuine athletes' opportunities and align with government initiatives to promote kabaddi.

The concept of a circular economy (CE), first introduced in the 1970s by pioneers like German chemist Michael Braungart and American architect William McDonough, offers a promising alternative focused on sustainability, resource efficiency, and waste minimization.

A circular economy promotes designing products for reuse, recycling, repair, remanufacturing, and refurbishment, aiming to keep materials and products in use for as long as possible. This "closing the loop" approach decouples economic growth from resource consumption, helping combat climate change and environmental degradation. Despite over 100 billion tonnes of resources entering the global economy annually, only 8.6% are recycled, signaling a huge opportunity for improvement.

Globally, several countries have embraced circular economy principles. The Netherlands aims for full circularity by 2050, with a 50% target by 2030, balancing socioeconomic growth with environmental sustainability. China enacted its Circular Economy Promotion Law in 2008, while Japan has led waste management innovation since the early 2000s, achieving high recycling rates through collaboration and technology. Chile, following COP-25, set a roadmap for circularity by 2040, targeting the creation of 100,000 green jobs. Germany's Adidas has innovated with a three-loop strategy—recycle, re-



use, regenerate—producing fully recyclable running shoes with zero waste.

In India, the circular economy is still emerging. The government, through NITI Aayog, has initiated a circular economy cell and introduced policies on plastic and e-waste management. However, waste management remains a challenge; India generates around 62 million tonnes of municipal waste yearly, but only 30% is processed. States like Andhra Pradesh and Telangana are pioneering efforts—Andhra Pradesh is advancing zero-waste initiatives, while Telangana's Hyderabad hosts one of the world's largest solid waste processing facilities, featuring waste-to-energy plants and plastic recycling units.

The circular economy closely links with biodiversity conservation by reducing pollution, preventing habitat destruction, minimizing resource extraction, and fostering ecosystem regeneration. It also supports multiple UN Sustainable Development Goals, including clean water and energy, economic growth, sustainable cities, climate action, and life on land and below water.

Adopting circular economy practices in India could save up to 11% of GDP by 2030 and 30% by 2050 while reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 44%. Embedding circular principles into global and national development agendas is vital for a sustainable future, where human well-being thrives in harmony with the planet's health.

The Politics of Identity and **Social Justice in Odisha: A Complex Reality**

Since the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) came to power in Odisha, the political landscape around identity has taken on a sectarian hue. The BJP's rise was fueled by "Odia asmita" (Odia pride), which has gradually merged with Hindutva nationalism. The traditional regional slogan "Jai Jagannath" is increasingly overshadowed by the Hindutva rallying cry "Jai Shri Ram," signaling the dominance of religious nationalism in Odisha's politics. This shift highlights the deep-rooted religiosity influencing the state's social and political dynamics.

While the BJP projects itself as a champion of marginalized identities, especially Other Backward Classes (OBCs) and Adivasis, its record on caste-based social justice in Odisha remains ambiguous. Prominent OBC and tribal leaders like Dharmendra Pradhan and Chief Minister Mohan Majhi have been elevated, and Droupadi Murmu, an Adivasi, was elected President of India. Yet, the BJP has been hesitant to fully implement the Mandal Commission's recommended 27% reservation for OBCs in Odisha, maintaining only 11.25% reservation in technical and professional education sectors. This modest extension of quotas contrasts with the state's large OBC population, which various estimates place between 40% and 54%.

Historically, Odisha missed the widespread Mandal movement that shaped caste politics in states like Bihar and Uttar Pradesh. The influential former leader Biju Patnaik opposed OBC reservations, and protests demanding such rights were violently suppressed. Moreover, OBC communities in Odisha are fragmented and socially stratified, with many identifying as middle castes or landowners, reducing the pressure for unified social justice demands.

Despite the presence of tribal and Dalit leaders in power, the real political power in Odisha remains concentrated among upper-caste groups like the Karana and Brahmins. Social hierarchies and caste-based inequalities persist largely unchallenged, with minimal critical caste consciousness or sustained anti-caste movements. Dalit activism and literary expression in Odisha are limited compared to other Indian states, and caste atrocities remain common, often perpetrated by other marginalized groups as well.



Deleting Tipu Sultan from Textbooks Distorts History and Harms Education

The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has recently removed the entire lesson on Hyder Ali, Tipu Sultan, and the Mysore Wars from the Class VIII Social Science textbook, citing "textbook rationalisation." This decision is deeply problematic, as it erases an essential chapter of India's anti-colonial struggle and distorts historical understanding for young learners.

NCERT is entrusted with framing syllabi and creating textbooks that provide comprehensive, unbiased education. History, among all subjects, requires an especially careful and balanced approach because it deals with complex social, cultural, and political narratives. The deletion of the Mysore Wars chapter undermines this responsibility by omitting crucial facts about the valiant resistance led by Hyder Ali and Tipu Sultan against British colonial expansion in the late 18th century.

Hyder Ali was the first Indian ruler to seriously challenge British dominance after their victory at Plassey in 1757. His military campaigns pushed British forces back and threatened their strongholds in South India. After his death in 1782, Tipu Sultan carried forward this resistance alone, fighting three more wars against the British despite a lack of support from other Indian rulers who allied with the colonial power. Tipu's courage and sacrifice are foundational to India's broader anti-colonial movement, inspiring nationalist sentiments that culminated in the country's eventual independence.

Omitting this chapter disrupts the continuity of history education. While some content trimming is necessary to suit students' levels, erasing an entire significant event creates confusion and gaps in the historical narrative. It prevents students from understanding the roots of Indian resistance and nationalism, leaving them with an incomplete and distorted picture of the past.





India agreed to ceasefire only after Pakistan's request, no US trade link

External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar on Monday clarified in Parliament that India agreed to the recent ceasefire with Pakistan solely after a formal request was received through diplomatic and military channels from the Pakistani side. He firmly rejected claims that the United States played any role in brokering the ceasefire or linked it to trade deals.

Speaking during the Monsoon session debate on the Pahalgam terror attack and Operation Sindoor, Jaishankar outlined key events leading to the ceasefire. He recounted how on May 9, US Vice President JD Vance warned Prime Minister Narendra Modi of an impending Pakistani attack. Modi responded that any such aggression would be met with a strong retaliatory strike. The attack occurred on the night of May 9-10 but was thwarted by India's armed forces. India retaliated decisively, with satellite images showing damage to Pakistani airfields, widely circulated to underscore India's response.

Rejecting US President Donald Trump's multiple claims that he brokered the ceasefire, Jaishankar stated there were no direct calls between Modi and Trump during April 22 to June 17, nor any linkage of the ceasefire to trade negotiations.

Jaishankar emphasized that India acted Jaishankar also addressed criticism about



only after diplomatic indications suggested Pakistan wanted to stop hostilities but insisted on a formal ceasefire request via the Director General of Military Operations route.

Following his remarks, Opposition MPs protested, prompting Union Home Minister Amit Shah to defend the government, questioning why more faith was placed in a foreign leader than India's own External Affairs Minister.

India not pushing beyond the ceasefire, recalling the 2009 joint statement where both countries agreed terrorism was their main threat. He accused Opposition leaders of politicizing India-Pakistan relations and highlighted India's strong retaliatory actions against terror infrastructure, contrasting them with previous government inaction.

This firm stance underlines India's sovereign decision-making in managing its sensitive relationship with Pakistan, dismissing external interference narratives.

Starlink Limited to 20 Lakh Connections in India **Due to High Costs and Capacity: Telecom Minister**

Elon Musk's satellite internet venture Starlink will be restricted to just 20 lakh (2 million) connections in India, primarily due to capacity limitations and the high cost of service, Union Minister of State for Telecom Pemmasani Chandra Sekhar said on Monday.

Meanwhile, BSNL's 4G rollout has been completed across the country. The minister noted that the state-run telecom giant is not planning any tariff hikes at the moment. "Our priority is market expansion first. No increase in rates is on the cards," he said.

BSNL has reported a revenue increase of 20-30% in the first quarter of the current fiscal year, attributed to its 4G expansion and improved network uptime. Power-related technical issues have largely been resolved, with over 30,000 power stations upgraded at a cost of ₹600–700 crore.

Sekhar also reiterated the government's commitment to using indigenous technology in BSNL, with a phased removal of legacy 2G and 3G systems, including equipment sourced from Chinese vendors like ZTE.

India Records 7% Above-Normal Monsoon Rainfall, But Regional Imbalance Persists: IMD

India has received 7% more rainfall than the long-period average since the start of the monsoon on June 1, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD). However, the seasonal rainfall has been highly uneven across the country, with some states experiencing severe surpluses and others facing alarming deficits.

Nationally, the country recorded 447.8 mm of rainfall against the normal 418.9 mm for the same period. While this suggests a healthy monsoon on paper, regional disparities are stark.

Regions With Excess and Large Excess Rain-

States such as Rajasthan, Ladakh, Nagaland, Manipur, and Sikkim have seen "large excess" rainfall. Rajasthan recorded a remarkable 384.7 mm, up 92% from its average of 200.4 mm. Ladakh, which typically sees minimal precipitation, witnessed a 181% surge, receiving 30 mm of rainfall against the norm of 10.7 mm. Sikkim also experienced a 78% increase, while Nagaland and Manipur received near-normal levels.

Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, Jharkhand, Assam, and the union territories of Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman & Diu recorded "excess" rainfall, ranging between 20% and 59% above normal. Madhya Pradesh led the category with 645.8 mm of rain — 54% above its seasonal average.



Normal Rainfall Across Most States Most of the country, including Uttar

Pradesh, Maharashtra, Kerala, and West Bengal, received "normal" rainfall — within 19% of their seasonal averages.

Areas Facing Rain Deficits

In contrast, several regions saw worrying shortfalls. Arunachal Pradesh suffered the most, receiving just 521.8 mm — a 45% defi-

cit from the usual 942.2 mm. Bihar also fell short by 43%, and rainfall was deficient in parts of Assam, Delhi, Maharashtra, and Lakshadweep.

The monsoon remains vital for India's agriculture, which supports 42% of the population and contributes over 18% to the GDP. The rainfall also replenishes reservoirs critical for drinking water and energy produc-



SC Quashes FIR Against Badminton Star Lakshya Sen in Birth Certificate Forgery Case

The Supreme Court on Monday quashed the FIR filed against badminton player Lakshya Sen, his family members, and coach in a birth certificate forgery case, calling the continuation of criminal proceedings "unwarranted" and an abuse of the court process.

The case originated from a private complaint lodged by M.G. Nagaraj, who alleged that the birth certificates of Lakshya Sen and his brother Chirag Sen were forged. The complaint also implicated Sen's parents, Dhirendra and Nirmala Sen, his brother, his coach U. Vimal Kumar, and an employee of the Karnataka Badminton Association, accusing them of falsifying birth records to manipulate age details.

Earlier, the Karnataka High Court had allowed the investigation to proceed after observing prima facie evidence that warranted further inquiry. It rejected petitions filed by Lakshya Sen and others seeking to quash the FIR, thus permitting the probe to continue.

However, the Supreme Court bench comprising Justices Sudhanshu Dhulia and Aravind Kumar reviewed the case and decided that continuing criminal proceedings against Lakshya Sen and his family was unnecessary. The top court held that the allegations did not justify the prosecution and that further legal action would be an abuse of the judicial process.

The Supreme Court had previously issued notices to the Karnataka government and the complainant, inviting responses to the petitions challenging the High Court's decision. After hearing arguments, the apex court intervened in favor of the badminton star. This ruling brings relief to Lakshya Sen, who has been under scrutiny due to the accusations of age fabrication. The quashing of the FIR effectively clears him and the accused from the ongoing legal challenge in connection with the birth certificate forgery allegations.



Pahalgam Mastermind Suleiman Shah Among 3 Terrorists Killed In Op Mahadev: Sources

In a major counterterrorism breakthrough, security forces on Monday gunned down three Pakistani terrorists, including Pahalgam terror mastermind Suleiman Shah, during a high-stakes encounter in Jammu and Kashmir's Lidwas region near Srinagar. The operation, code-named Operation Mahadev, was carried out jointly by the Indian Army, CRPF, and Jammu and Kashmir Police.

Suleiman Shah, also known by the alias Hashim Moosa, was a top Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) commander and served in the Pakistan Army before joining the terror outfit. He was the key orchestrator behind the brutal April 22 attack in Pahalgam's Baisaran Valley, which claimed the lives of 26 innocent civilians. A ₹20 lakh reward had been placed on his head by Jammu and Kashmir Police.

Two other high-value terrorists were also killed in the operation — Abu Hamza and Yasir — with the latter also suspected of involvement in the Pahalgam massacre. All three were heavily armed and believed to be plotting another major strike in the Valley.

According to security sources, the joint forces launched the operation in the Mulnar area of Harwan early Monday morning, acting on precise intelligence inputs. The terrorists were hiding deep in a forested area. An intense gun battle followed, during which all three militants were neutralized. The encounter site has since been secured, and a large cache of weapons was recovered.

Among the arms seized were AK-47 and carbine rifles, 17 rifle grenades, and other ammunition. Photos of the hideout, accessed by NDTV, show a well-stocked base likely intended for a future assault.



Trump Strikes "Biggest-Ever" Trade Deal With European Union

The United States and the European Union have struck what former President Donald Trump called the "biggest-ever" trade agreement, narrowly avoiding a looming transatlantic trade war. Announced after a high-stakes meeting between Trump and European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen at Trump's golf resort in Scotland, the deal imposes a baseline tariff of 15% on EU exports to the US, significantly lower than the threatened 30%.

The deal came just days ahead of the August 1 deadline, which would have triggered steep across-the-board US tariffs on European goods. Trump confirmed that the 15% tariff will apply to key sectors including automobiles, pharmaceuticals, and semiconductors.

In return, the EU agreed to purchase \$750 billion worth of American energy—liquefied natural gas, oil, and nuclear fuels over the next three years. Von der Leyen emphasized that these energy purchases are part of the EU's broader effort to diversify away from Russian energy dependence.

Additionally, the EU committed to \$600 billion in US investments and pledged to



increase military equipment purchases, aligning with NATO spending goals. Trump described the deal as "a win for everyone," while von der Leyen called it "a good deal that brings stability and predictability" for businesses on both sides of the Atlantic.

Despite the agreement, some concerns remain. European industrial groups criticized the 15% tariff as excessive, while von

Iran Urges Indian Media to Avoid 'Fake News'

The Embassy of the Islamic Republic of Iran in India has issued a strong advisory to Indian media outlets, urging them to avoid publishing "fake and fabricated news" about Iran and its leadership. The statement, posted on the embassy's official X (formerly Twitter) handle @Iran_in_India, emphasized the importance of journalistic responsibility and the deep-rooted historical ties between the two nations.

The Embassy expressed concern over what it termed as "baseless reports" carried by certain Indian media platforms, including prominent outlets, which it said portraved

"Such irresponsible reporting not only undermines public confidence but also tarnishes the professional credibility of these



media organizations among their audience," the statement said.

Iran and its leadership in a disrespectful of speech and the public's right to informapaganda, and help promote the deep-roottion, the Embassy urged Indian media to ensure accuracy by relying on "credible and impartial sources." It cautioned against the dangers of sensationalism, particularly in coverage relating to Iran's domestic or for-

The statement also made reference to Iran's recent military conflict with Israel, describing it as the "twelve-day imposed war." It highlighted the leadership of Iran's Supreme Leader during the confrontation and claimed the operation resulted in a "heavy defeat" for the Zionist regime through decisive acts of self-defence.

Calling for stronger bilateral understanding, the Iranian Embassy reiterated its respect for India and emphasized the need to preserve the longstanding friendship between the two civilizational states. "We expect the Indian media to act with integrity, While affirming its full respect for freedom refrain from participating in external proed relationship built on mutual respect and shared heritage," the statement added. The Embassy's remarks come amid heightened regional tensions and underline the sensitivity of international reporting.

Bangladesh Elections Likely in August

National elections in Bangladesh are expected to be announced in the first week of August, coinciding with the one-year anniversary of the student-led revolution that ousted former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina. Interim Chief Adviser Professor Muhammad Yunus is expected to formally announce the election date in a national address.

According to reports, the elections to install a government with a political mandate are likely to take place in February 2026, just before the start of Ramadan. The interim government, led by Nobel Laureate Yunus since the fall of the Hasina administration in Au-

gust 2024, has come under increasing pressure from political parties and civil society to hold timely elections.

The Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP), now the dominant political force following the ban on the Awami League, has been actively demanding a concrete election timeline. BNP Secretary General Mirza Fakhrul Islam Alamgir welcomed the likely announcement, stating, "If the Chief Adviser announces the election date within a couple of days, we will be happy—because that's exactly what we have been demanding." In contrast, Jamaat-e-Islami Bangladesh, which has backed Yunus and regained political legitimacy after the ban on the party was lifted, appears reluctant to en-

dorse an immediate election timeline. Critics allege Yunus's prolonged tenure has been made possible due to Jamaat's influence.

Despite mounting political pressure, Yunus has remained cautious. During a meeting with leaders of multiple parties on Saturday, he emphasized the importance of unity to ensure a peaceful and credible election. "If all the forces of the uprising cannot come together to conduct a fair election, this great opportunity will slip through our hands," he said. Yunus reaffirmed his commitment to democratic transition, stating that "no conspiracy can obstruct the democratic journey," and that the unity against authoritarianism remains strong.

Thailand and Cambodia agree to 'immediate and unconditional' ceasefire: Malaysian PM

Thailand and Cambodia have agreed to an "immediate and unconditional" ceasefire to end five days of deadly border clashes, Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim announced on Monday. The announcement came following urgent peace talks hosted at his official residence in Putrajaya. The agreement, reached between Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Manet and Thailand's Acting Prime Minister Phumtham Wechayachai, takes effect from midnight on July 28. Both leaders shook hands at the conclusion of the talks, signaling a shared commitment to halt further violence.

Anwar, who chaired the mediation as ASEAN's rotating chair, emphasized that the agreement marks a return to normalcy and peaceful dialogue. "This ceasefire is a vital step to stop the bloodshed and allow people to return home," he said.

Fighting erupted on July 24 after a landmine blast injured five Thai soldiers near the border, leading to escalating clashes that have killed at least 35 people and displaced over 260,000. Gunfire continued into Monday morning, especially near Samrong in Cambodia's Oddar Meanchey province. The conflict prompted both nations to recall their ambassadors and saw Thailand close its borders to Cambodia, with the exception of migrant workers returning home.

The emergency summit was convened following pressure from international actors, including U.S. President Donald Trump, who warned that continued hostilities could jeopardize trade deals. Representatives from the U.S. and China attended the talks as observers.

ASEAN foreign ministers issued a joint statement supporting peaceful negotiations and condemning the loss of life and destruction. Pope Leo XIV also expressed concern and prayed for those displaced. At evacuation camps in both countries, citizens expressed hope that the ceasefire would allow them to return home. "I just want peace," said Ron Mao, a displaced Cambodian mother. "I miss my home, my pets, my life," echoed Thai farmer Nakorn Jomkamsing.



Gaza Malnutrition Reaches Alarming Levels Amid Aid Blockades: WHO

Malnutrition in Gaza has reached "alarming levels," the World Health Organization (WHO) warned on Sunday, citing a surge in preventable deaths due to severe hunger and lack of humanitarian access. The UN health agency called the crisis "entirely man-made" and urged immediate, sustained

According to WHO, July has seen a deadly spike in malnutrition-related deaths, with 63 of the 74 deaths recorded this year occurring this month alone. Among the victims are 24 children under five, one child over five, and 38 adults. Most died on arrival at health facilities or shortly after, showing clear signs of severe wasting.

"This crisis is entirely preventable," WHO stated. "The deliberate blocking and delay of food, health, and humanitarian aid has cost many lives."

The agency also highlighted that the number of children under five treated for malnutrition reached 6,500 in June — the highest since the conflict began in October 2023. In July alone, over 5,000 children have received outpatient treatment for malnutrition, including 18 percent with severe acute malnutrition (SAM), the most life-threatening

Gaza City remains the worst-hit area, with nearly one in five children under five now acutely malnourished. Due to security constraints and damaged infrastructure, these numbers likely underestimate the real scale of the crisis. Only four specialised malnutrition treatment centres remain operational, now overwhelmed by the growing number of cases. WHO also reported that over 40 percent of pregnant and breastfeeding women are severely malnourished.




Sensex Crashes 572 pts, Nifty Slips Below 24,700



Cricket World Backs India'

Drama unfolded on the final day of the fourth Test between India and England when Indian batters Ravindra Jadeja (89*) and Washington Sundar (80*) declined England skipper Ben Stokes' handshake offer to end the match early. The reason? They were on the cusp of personal milestones, and the Indian team believed they had earned the right to complete their centuries.

Veteran spinner R. Ashwin strongly criticized England's reaction, accusing them of "double standards." On his YouTube channel, Ashwin remarked, "They played your bowlers all day and batted you out. Suddenly, when they're nearing hundreds, you want to walk off? Why should they?"

Stokes, visibly frustrated, said his intention was to protect his fatigued bowlers from injury. But his sarcastic jibe — "You're going to get a Test hundred against Harry Brook?" didn't sit well with many, including Ashwin. "You brought on Brook, not us. These are Test runs — centuries are earned, not gifted," he responded.

India declared the innings only after both Jadeja and Washington notched their centuries — the latter registering his maiden Test hundred. Former India captain Sunil Gavaskar and Ashwin agreed that India should've continued batting the remaining 15 overs as a matter of principle.



Support poured in from the cricketing world. Former Australian wicketkeeper Brad Haddin said India "earned the right to stay as long as they want" and called out England's poor sportsmanship. Former England skippers Alastair Cook and Nasser Hussain also backed India. Cook said the momentum would help India heading into the series-deciding fifth Test at The Oval, while Hussain labelled Stokes' decision to bowl Brook "silly" and added, "We make far too much of these things. All credit to India."

Ultimately, the incident underlined a deeper debate about sportsmanship, personal milestones, and fair play in Test cricket.

Spirit Shoot in Limbo? Prabhas' Packed Schedule Raises Doubts Over September Start

The long-awaited col-**■** laboration between Prabhas and Sandeep Reddy Vanga, Spirit, continues to face uncertainty, despite the director recently confirming that the film is set to begin shooting in September 2025. While fans were hopeful after Vanga's announcement, several scheduling issues have cast serious doubt on whether production will actually start on time.

After the massive success of Animal in December 2023, expectations were high that Spirit would go on floors by late 2024. However, as July 2025 draws to a close, not a single frame has been

shot. The primary hurdle? Prabhas' jam-packed schedule.

The star is currently juggling two major films. First, he is busy shooting a yet-untitled historical fiction film directed by Hanu Raghavapudi, which is still deep in production and unlikely to wrap by September. Second, he is also working on Maruthi's commercial entertainer The Raja Saab, which has

three songs and a major action sequence pending. That film is aiming for a December 5, 2025 release.

Complicating matters further, Sandeep Reddy Vanga is reportedly insisting that Prabhas commit bulk dates exclusively to Spirit, without working on any other films during the shoot. However, Prabhas is known for handling multiple projects simultaneously, making this demand a potential roadblock.

Unless Prabhas can realign his schedule and wrap up his ongoing projects quickly, the September launch of Spir-

it appears increasingly unlikely. Fans, who have been eagerly waiting to see this powerful actor-director duo team up for the first time, may have to wait a bit longer.

While the film remains one of the most anticipated Telugu releases, its timeline remains uncertain. All eyes are now on Prabhas' calendar—and whether Spirit can finally take flight this September.
