No World Leader Asked Us to Stop Op Sindoor: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday firmly asserted in the Lok Sabha that no world leader had asked India to halt Operation Sindoor, countering the Opposition's claims and defending the government's response to the recent Pahalgam terror attack. He clarified that the decision to pause the military action came only after Pakistan pleaded for a ceasefire.

Responding to the debate on the operation and the terror strike in Kashmir, PM Modi directly addressed concerns raised by the Opposition, especially Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi, who questioned the government's silence on US President Donald Trump's earlier remarks suggesting his role in brokering peace between India and Pa-

"For the first time, I am sharing these details. From the beginning, we said our action was non-escalatory. No global leader asked us to stop Operation Sindoor," said the Prime Minister. "On the night of May 9, US Vice President JD Vance tried to contact me for over an hour. I was in a meeting with



our forces. When I returned his call, he informed me that Pakistan was preparing a major assault. I told him clearly — if Pakistan attacks, it will pay a heavy price. Ham goli ka jawab gole se denge (We will answer a bullet with a cannonball)."

PM Modi stated, "On May 10, we destroyed Pakistan's military infrastructure. Even Pakistan now realises that India's responses only get bigger and stronger. Operation Sindoor is still

ongoing. Let there be no doubt about that."

"On May 9 and 10, Indian missiles reached every corner of Pakistan. This brought them to their knees. After relentless strikes, Pakistan's DGMO called our side pleading: 'Bas karo, bahut maara, zyada maar jhelne ki taakat nahin hai. Please hamla rok do' (Stop this. You've hit us hard. We can't bear more. Please stop the attack). We made it clear on May 7 that our targets were terrorists and their handlers. The decision to pause was made in consultation with our armed forces after these objectives were achieved."

In a scathing attack on the Opposition, PM Modi mocked, "Terrorists are crying, their bosses and backers are crying, and seeing them cry, some people here are mourning too." He accused the Congress of trying to malign India globally in the past by propagating the narrative of "saffron terror".

PM Modi concluded, "Let me reiterate in this temple of democracy — Operation Sindoor is still on. India will respond in full force to any provocation, and the world knows now that we act, and we mean it."

SIT Intensifies Probe into Dharmasthala Mass-**Burial Allegations**

A Special Investigation Team (SIT), formed by the Karnataka government on July 19, has intensified its inquiry into disturbing allegations of mass burials and possible murders near the Hindu pilgrimage site in Dharmasthala. The probe was triggered when a former sanitation worker, now a court-protected whistle-blower, came forward in early July claiming he was forced, over nearly two decades (1995–2014), to bury bodies of women and girls who showed signs of assault and strangulation.

He filed a complaint on July 3 and deposited skeletal remains before a magistrate on July 11, stating that he had acted under threats from supervisors that his family would be harmed if he disobeyed. The allegations mentioned victims including schoolgirls and acid attack survivors. The complaint also cited cases of destitute men murdered nearby in gruesome ways.

A week after the FIR was registered on July 4, the SIT leadership initiated the first face-to-face questioning of the whistle-blower, who was examined for two consecutive days under tight security. During this time, he identified 15 specific locations, largely along the banks of the Nethravathi River and nearby forested areas, where bodies were reportedly buried or cremated. Multiple departments including the Anti-Naxal Force (ANF), Forensic Science Labs, and Forest and Revenue authorities are now involved in securing and monitoring these sites under regulated access.

On July 28, SIT investigators began exhumation operations at the first of these marked spots,

accompanied by forensic teams and video documentation. Additional dig sites are planned as evidence emerges. SIT chief DGP Pronab Mohanty, along with senior officers, personally visited Mangaluru, reviewed progress, visited the SIT office in Belthangady, and coordinated field logistics. The whistle-blower's identity remains concealed for safety.

With mounting public pressure and legal scrutiny, organizations like AIDWA have demanded full autonomy for the SIT and broader re-investigation into unresolved disappearance and rape cases, including the 2003 case of Ananya Bhat. The complainant in that case, the mother of a missing medical student, joined calls for justice and suggested her daughter may have been among the victims. A local lawyer also urged authorities to arrest a panchayat vice president who had previously claimed all burials were officially sanctioned, a claim contradicted by the eyewitness-led site identifications.

Meanwhile, a civil court issued an ex-parte gag order requiring removal of nearly 9,000 online articles, posts, and videos covering the allegations, citing reputational harm to the temple trust and its managing family. Affected media outlets are challenging the order, and the Supreme Court has declined to intervene directly, deferring to the Karnataka High Court. As the SIT's forensic work proceeds, broader questions remain about past complaints over decades, including unsolved rape and disappearance cases going back to the 1980s, and alleged institutional cover-ups. The probe now spans multiple dimensions, legal integrity, media freedom, and community trust, and has become one of the most high-stakes investigations in recent Indian history.

Centre Grants Equity to 227 FPOs

The Union Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare has granted equity support to 227 Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) in Andhra Pradesh as part of the central scheme to promote 10,000 FPOs across India. Union Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan gave a detailed written reply in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday in response to questions posed by Vijayawada MP Kesineni Sivanath and MP Kalisetti Appalanaidu during the Question Hour.

The minister said the scheme aims to boost farmers' income, expand market opportunities, and strengthen women's participation in agriculture. So far, 10,000 FPOs have been registered nationwide, of which 5,694 have received equity grants. Andhra Pradesh has 714 FPOs under the scheme.

The MPs had asked for details on FPOs in Andhra Pradesh including district-wise distribution, year-wise benefits, major crops and commodities, and involvement of women-led FPOs. Responding to this, Minister Chouhan said that as per the government's mapping, major crops and sectors like



rice, pulses, turmeric, tomato, mango, chilli, coconut, cashew, livestock, and fisheries fall under the scheme's scope

Significantly, the minister highlighted the push for gender inclusion. Across India, 1,663 FPOs are fully women-led, and another 949 have over 50% women members. In Andhra Pradesh, 228 FPOs are entirely women-run and 45 others have majority women membership.

To enhance the capabilities of FPOs, Cluster-Based Business Organizations (CBBOs) were established. These CBBOs have conducted 3,111 training programs and 809 exposure visits in Andhra Pradesh alone. Nationally, 49,553 training sessions and 14,564 exposure visits have been carried out.

CM Unveils AP's Global Vision in Singapore

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. BP Pandey Takes Charge as GRMB Chief

BP Pandey has been appointed as the new Chairman of the Godavari River Management Board (GRMB) by the Ministry of Jal Shakti. He replaces AK Pradhan, whose tenure concludes on July 31. Pandey's appointment comes at a critical time when the Polavaram-Banakacherla Link Project (PBLP) proposed by the Andhra Pradesh government faces multiple regulatory hurdles and growing opposition.

The PBLP, aimed at diverting 200 TMC of floodwaters from the Godavari to the Krishna basin, has run into trouble with the Central Environmental Expert Appraisal Committee (EAC) for River Valley and Hydroelectric Projects. The committee recently refused to grant clearance, citing legal and environmental objections.

Despite this setback, the Andhra Pradesh government continues to lobby for the project's approval. However, Telangana's BRS leadership has firmly opposed the plan, pointing out that it has neither received consent from the GRMB nor obtained mandatory clearance from the Central Water Commission (CWC).

The project remains a major flashpoint between the two states, with Telangana accusing Andhra Pradesh of unilaterally moving forward without institutional approvals or addressing environmental concerns. As Pandey steps into his new role, resolving the inter-state water sharing dispute is expected to be among his top challenges.

Minister Gottipati Promises Better Facilities in Government Schools

Energy Minister Gottipati Ravikumar emphasized the state government's commitment to providing high-quality education in governinstitutions. Jagan Slams **Alliance Govt** for Broken **Promises**

Former Chief Minister and YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) president YS Jagan Mohan Reddy lambasted the TDP-led coalition government for its failure to fulfill election promises and resorting to oppressive tactics to silence opposition voices. Speaking at a Political Advisory Committee (PAC) meeting at the YSRCP headquarters, Jagan accused the government of rampant corruption, unchecked exploitation, and a complete lack of governance, leaving the public disillusioned.

Jagan highlighted the TDP's "Babu Surety, Cheating Guarantee" campaign, urging party leaders to intensify efforts to expose Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu's unfulfilled promises across every village. He criticized the government for failing to deliver on schemes like financial aid for women, crop insurance, and educational support, while amassing a staggering ₹1.75 lakh crore in debt in just 14 months—52% of the state's total borrowing over five years.

The YSRCP chief condemned the government's tactics of filing false cases and arresting opposition leaders, citing examples like the arrests of Midhun Reddy, Chevireddy Bhaskar Reddy, and Nandigam Suresh. He announced the upcoming launch of a dedicated app for party workers and citizens to report harassment and injustices, with evidence to be stored in a digital library for future legal action against perpetrators.

Jagan directed senior leaders to strengthen the party at the grassroots level by forming village and booth-level committees, alongside wings for youth, women, students, and farmers.



Warn Villages via WhatsApp **Groups: Dy CM**

In response to rising incidents of elephant movements in Chittoor and Tirupati districts, Deputy Chief Minister and Forest Minister Pawan Kalyan has directed forest department officials to intensify surveillance in affected villages and take preventive measures.

During a teleconference held on Tuesday morning with senior forest department officials, the Deputy CM reviewed reports of elephant herds damaging crops and properties. He specifically inquired about the recent incident in Chandragiri constituency, where a herd of 11 elephants, including four calves, trampled agricultural fields and orchards near the Satya Sai ST Colony close to Kalyani Dam.

Forest officials briefed that drones are being used to monitor elephant movement. The minister instructed the department to adopt a proactive communication strategy using modern tools like WhatsApp groups at the village level to alert locals in advance.

"Identify the likely movement paths of elephants using drone footage and issue early warnings to residents through dedicated WhatsApp groups," Pawan Kalyan told officials. He stressed that timely alerts can prevent human-elephant conflict and reduce damage to crops and property.

The Deputy CM also ordered round-the-clock surveillance by forest personnel in villages prone to elephant movement. He directed District Forest Officers (DFOs) and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) offices to take full responsibility for monitoring the alerts and ensuring villagers receive timely updates.

He emphasized the need for coordinated efforts to prevent elephants from entering farmlands by guiding them safely back into forest zones. "Our approach must be systematic and people-focused. Prevention and alert systems must go hand in hand," he

A fresh controversy has erupted in Kadapa after a video surfaced showing local MLA Madhavi Reddy's gunman carrying her handbag. Although the video is not recent, it has gone viral on social media platforms, especially after the recent suspension of a gunman linked to former minister Peddireddy Ramachandra Reddy.

The incident that triggered this chain reaction occurred when the gunman of former minister Peddireddy was seen carrying a bag and bedding during a visit to MP Mithun Reddy in Rajahmundry Central Jail. Following this, Chittoor SP suspended the gunman, stating that security personnel are not to be used for personal errands. Home Minister Anitha also supported the move, stating that such misuse of gunmen cannot be tolerated.

Now, the focus has shifted to Kadapa MLA Madhavi Reddy, who was caught on camera walking out of the Assembly premises while her gunman carried her handbag. Though the video is old, it has reignited debate and is being widely circulated on social media with captions like "Rule is Rule... Rule for All."

YCP cadres, opposition members, and common citizens are sharing the clip extensively, demanding that the same disciplinary action taken against Peddireddy's gunman



be applied here as well. Many social media users have raised the question of whether the Kadapa SP will take similar action and how the Home Minister will respond this time

The viral posts are not only coming from political circles but also from the general public, who are closely watching the developments and calling out double standards in enforcement. With public sentiment gaining traction, all eyes are now on the Kadapa police and the Home Department for a consistent and impartial response.

Massive land scam in Vizag land allotments

Speaking to the media at the YSRCP city office in Visakhapatnam, KK Raju stated that a massive land scam involving Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, allotting highly valuable lands to his associates at throwaway prices. He demanded the immediate cancellation of these allotments, claiming companies like Lulu, Satva, Kapil Group, Ursa, and ANSR are involved in shady deals with Naidu. Raju criticized the government for neglecting North Andhra's development and exploiting its valuable public lands, warning of potential unrest.

Raju highlighted that lands worth thousands of crores are being handed over to Naidu's allies, with Visakhapatnam's development sidelined to favor Amaravati's real estate growth. Specifically, he pointed out the allocation of 13.83 acres worth Rs. 3,000 crore near RK Beach to Lulu Mall for just Rs. 1.50 per square foot for 99 years, questioning the minimal job creation and a quid pro quo. Similarly, lands in Yendada, valued at Rs. 100 crore per acre, were allotted to real estate firms like BVM Energy at Rs. 1.5 crore per acre, while an IT company was charged Rs. 4.5 crore per acre, indicating favoritism. Raju also questioned excessive subsidies to Satva Developers, a real estate firm, under IT policies, despite no direct job creation. In contrast, he praised the YSRCP's transparent handling of the Inorbit Mall project, which secured Rs. 133 crore in advance lease payments and is nearing completion. The project, involving 17 acres of port land, includes a mall and IT development, adhering to international standards and creating jobs.

BJP Stands with Call Money Victims

The BJP has strongly condemned the growing menace of the call money mafia in Dharmavaram, claiming it is pushing poor and middle-class families into severe financial distress. NDA constituency in-charge Harish Babu addressed the media at the NDA office in Dharmavaram on Monday, flanked by several victims of illegal lending operations. Harish Babu directly accused former MLA Kethireddy Venkata Ramireddy of patronizing the mafia and turning Dharmavaram into a hub of illegal activities during his tenure. From land, sand, and liquor smuggling to illegal gambling, cannabis trade, and factionalism—Harish Babu alleged that all these were actively supported by Kethireddy and his associates.



He cited a key individual, Erragunta Raja, allegedly a close associate of Kethireddy, as one of the main enforcers of the call money racket, even resorting to physical assaults and property seizures from borrowers. Harish Babu promised strict action, including invoking the PD Act against anyone involved in such harassment.

Highlighting a "dark system" created by Kethireddy, Harish Babu said BJP aims to bring transparency and justice under the leadership of Minister Satyakumar Yadav. He accused Kethireddy of running a gambling den from his own residence and misusing handloom workers and officials for his gain. He added that illegal liquor from Goa was transported with official protection under Kethireddy's influence, further damaging Dharmavaram's reputation.

Calling for a clean break from the past, Harish Babu assured that BJP would stand firmly with victims and restore rule of law in Dharmavaram. He emphasized that under Satyakumar's leadership, the constituency is already witnessing transparent governance and inclusive development.

Power Sector Reforms Must Be Fast-Tracked: CS

Andhra Pradesh Chief Secretary K. Vijayanand directed officials to expedite the completion of electricity feeder segregation and ongoing power sector reforms in Bapatla district. Chairing a review meeting with electricity department officials at the district Collectorate on Tuesday, he emphasized the government's commitment to providing quality electricity to people. Out of 62 approved works in the dis-

trict, surveys have been completed for 59. While 16 projects are already completed and 20 are in progress, the Chief Secretary questioned why 15 projects haven't started yet. He insisted on continuous monitoring of feeder expansion and modernization works and instructed that quality standards must be strictly followed.

Regarding overloaded 33 kV substations, Vijayanand noted that 9 of the 12 feeder extension works were done, but asked for an explanation on the

delay in the remaining three. Contractors were questioned for the lag. He also instructed replacement of aged power poles and those damaged in coastal regions.

On smart metering, he ordered faster implementation. Of the 71,025 targeted meters, only 50,108 have been installed so far. He stressed the need for prompt resolution of power interruptions and directed officials to monitor feeder-wise complaints.

Addressing power issues in areas like

Inkollu, Nizampatnam, and Bapatla, he warned against recurring complaints and stressed accountability. He said low and high voltage issues, tripping, and other problems must be resolved immediately.

Highlighting renewable energy, Vijayanand called for public awareness on the benefits of solar power. Under the PM-KUSUM scheme, 8,844 solar pump sets will be provided to farmers in the district.



Nearly 9.87 lakh new beneficiaries were added, bringing the total number of beneficiaries to 4.29 crore—2.68 crore under the central scheme and 1.61 crore under the state scheme.

The old ration cards have been digitized into smart cards, designed like debit or credit cards with QR codes for security, transparency, and accountability. These cards do not feature political leaders but

Cruel Conditions at Yerrabalem Goshala Raise Alarm

Shocking reports of animal cruelty have emerged from the Srikrishna Ananda Ashram Goshala in Yerrabalem village, Mangalagiri mandal, prompting urgent action from district officials. The issue surfaced after Tejovanth Anupoju, a concerned citizen, submitted a formal complaint to the Animal Husbandry Department and the Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI), accompanied by visuals allegedly depicting the animals in distressing conditions.

'No Bribe, No Business': Industrialist's Exit Slams System

Tobacco Farmers Protest Over Price Crash

Middlemen exploit situation as companies fail to honour agreements

Tobacco farmers in the undivided Kurnool district have taken to agitation after facing a massive price shock, as several companies that promised to purchase tobacco at fair rates have now backed out. The situation has pushed farmers into deep distress, with many blaming the unchecked intervention of middlemen for worsening their plight.

The problem began when companies lured farmers with promises of good returns, encouraging them to cultivate tobacco extensively. Motivated by these claims, farmers not only used their own land but even leased land to grow the crop. Fortunately, the yield turned out well, and the farmers an-

ticipated decent profits. But their hopes were dashed when companies, except ITC, refused to buy tobacco at the agreed

Now, over 6,000 quintals of tobacco remain stored in villages across the district. Middlemen have seized this opportunity, approaching farmers directly and making purchases at rates ranging between ₹800 and ₹5,000 per quintal. These agents are demanding ₹3,200 per quintal from farmers, exploiting the lack of an official procurement mechanism.

So far, only ITC has purchased tobacco as per its earlier agreement. However, companies like Alliance, Deccan, and GPI have allegedly failed to fulfil their promises. Farmers are urging



the state government to intervene immediately and begin direct procurement.

Tobacco remains the primary livelihood for thousands in this region. However, cultivation this season proved costly, especially after cyclone-related damage. Last year, the price was as high as ₹15,000 per being assured of favourable

quintal. This year, prices have plummeted to between ₹5,000 and ₹6,000, with many farmers not even recovering their investments.

Farmers in mandals such as Nandikotkur, Orvakallu, Kallur, and Panyam cultivated the crop on a large scale after

vielded 14 to 15 quintals. The region, suitable for rainfed farming, yielded around 2,150 kg per hectare. But instead of seeing profits, farmers feel cheated. "We cultivated the crop at great expense. We have two lorries full of tobacco. But we are being offered only ₹2,000 per quintal now. We spent at least ₹50,000 per acre. The government must respond," said Venkatasubbayya from Lakshmipuram, voicing the frustration shared by many. The Andhra Pradesh Rythu Sangam has also expressed serious concern. Its district general secretary, G Ramakrishna, pointed out, "Tobacco remains unsold in many mandals like Emmiganur,

30 King Cobra Hatchlings Freed in Eastern Ghats

In a landmark conservation initiative, the Andhra Pradesh Forest Department (Visakhapatnam Circle), in collaboration with the Eastern Ghats Wildlife Society (EGWS) and local communities, successfully released 30 King Cobra hatchlings into their natural habitat in the Eastern Ghats. This is Andhra Pradesh's first community-based King Cobra nest conservation effort.

The nesting site was located on community land in Gangavaram village and protected with the active cooperation of villagers. Forest officials and EGWS teams monitored the nest for over a month before releasing the hatchlings in the forests of the Paderu Division near Valabu village in Alluri Sitarama Raju (ASR) District. Deputy Chief Minister Sri Konidela Pawan Kalyan praised the effort, highlighting the power of inclusive conservation partnerships. "This is a transformative success that shows how local communities and government can work together to protect endangered species," he said.

Principal Chief Conservator of For-



ests Sri A.K. Naik, said the initiative is a model for combining community stewardship with scientific conservation. Chief Wildlife Warden Sri S.S. Sridhar, emphasized the ecological role of King Cobras and congratulated frontline staff and villagers for their commitment.

As a next step, the Forest Department has proposed a 2,400-hectare area in Sankaram Reserve Land of Paderu Division as a dedicated King Cobra Sanctuary—the world's first. If approved, it will provide long-term protection to the species and promote eco-awareness and research in the

Between Promise and Paralysis

Cracks in Andhra Pradesh's Battle Against Human Trafficking

As the world marks the 'World Day Against Trafficking in Persons' on July 30, the grim reality of human trafficking in Andhra Pradesh remains an indictment of our law enforcement and justice system. Despite a strong legal framework and the existence of Anti-Human Trafficking Units (AHTUs), the state continues to struggle with fragmented implementation, poor conviction rates, and inadequate survivor support.

According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), between 2016 and 2022, Andhra Pradesh registered 1,396 cases under IPC provisions, leading to the rescue of 2,119 victims. Under the Immoral Traffic Prevention Act (ITPA), another 594 cases were filed, rescuing 771 individuals. Yet justice rarely follows. Out of the total cases, 887 ended in acquittals, with only 109 convictions, leaving the conviction rate at a dismal 8%.

While India has mandated every state to establish AHTUs, only 13 of Andhra Pradesh's 26 districts have officially notified these specialized units. Even where they exist, AHTUs function under Women Police Stations without independent authority, dedicated personnel, or proper infrastructure. A field study across four districts paints a disturbing picture — understaffed teams, lack of vehicles, poor internet connectivity, and absence of basic office facilities severely limit their ability to act promptly.

Adding to the crisis is the stark fact that none of the state's AHTUs have registered a single FIR to date, despite having police station status. Guidelines from the Ministry of Home Affairs clearly state that all trafficking cases within an AHTU's jurisdiction must be transferred to it for investigation, charge-sheet filing, and court

follow-up. In practice, local police stations retain control, sidelining AHTUs and undermining their very purpose.

The systemic gaps extend further:

Jurisdictional ambiguity: AHTUs are often unaware of trafficking cases in their districts, missing critical rescue operations and folLack of structured training: Officers rarely receive specialized instruction on survivor-centred investigations or trauma-sensitive approaches. Most victims, young women aged 15–25 lured by false promises of jobs or marriage, face inadequate emotional, medical, and legal support.

Neglected victim compensation: Though the state offers up to ₹1 lakh under its compensation scheme, very few survivors access it due to poor awareness and procedural delays. Interim relief during investigations is almost never provided.

Poor coordination: No centralized database exists to track cases or share intelligence between districts and across state borders, leaving traffickers free to exploit jurisdictional loopholes.

Immediate steps must include:

- Granting AHTUs full authority to register and investigate trafficking cases
- Ensuring dedicated staff, vehicles, and digital infrastructure for all units.
- Providing specialized, survivor-focused training to officers.
- Streamlining victim compensation schemes for timely relief.
- Building a statewide digital platform for real-time case tracking and inter-district coordination.

While the Crime Investigation Department (CID) monitors AHTUs through a Management Information System (MIS) portal and periodic reviews, utilization of central funds (₹1.6 crore allocated in FY 2020-21 and 2021–22) for strengthening these units remains unclear, raising concerns about accountability and political will.

Human trafficking is not a routine crime; it is a gross violation of human rights, targeting the most vulnerable and destroying lives. If Andhra Pradesh is serious about combating this organized crime, half measures won't suffice.

Every rescued victim deserves more than a hollow promise of justice. Empowering AHTUs is not a procedural necessity, it is a moral imperative. If the state continues to falter, it risks not just failing survivors but eroding the very foundation of justice it claims to uphold.

India's Census Crisis | Draw Feels Like Victory

Identity, a Political Weapon



India, the world's most populous nation, doesn't actually know how many people it has. With the last census conducted in 2011 and no nationwide update since, the government lacks accurate data on its population's size, distribution, and even citizenship. This absence of demographic clarity has become a critical political issue, especially in Bihar—home to 130 million people and plagued by historical underdevelopment and poor record-keeping.

In June 2025, the Election Commission of India announced it would revise Bihar's voter rolls ahead of the state elections. This triggered immediate backlash from opposition parties, who warned that as many as 30 million voters—primarily from marginalized communities—could be disenfranchised. They argue the revision could tilt the electoral balance unfairly in favor of the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), which has maintained strong support in Bihar despite slipping in other key states like Uttar Pradesh. Bihar's weak administrative infrastructure exacerbates the issue. For decades, birth and death registrations remained minimal. For instance, only 3.7% of births in Bihar were officially record-

ed around the year 2000. Such gaps have made it

nearly impossible for many citizens—especially migrants and the rural poor—to access valid documents. During the COVID-19 lockdown, the government was caught off-guard by the number of internal migrants, many of whom returned home to Bihar on foot, highlighting the administration's demographic blindness.

Now, stringent documentation requirements such as needing birth certificates or proving parental Indian birth—pose further hurdles, particularly for those without formal paperwork. The concern is not just about voting rights but about existence itself. Without proof of identity, many Indians risk being excluded from welfare, employment, and recognition.

The BJP defends the voter verification as a way to remove "infiltrators." The opposition fears it's a targeted attempt to suppress Muslim and underprivileged voters. Comparisons are drawn to U.S. voter ID laws, which critics say disproportionately affect minority groups.

India's leaders must acknowledge the consequences of not conducting a census. Instead of exploiting the void, they must urgently work to fix it—starting by ensuring every citizen's right to vote is protected.

India's Grit Shines at Old Trafford



In Test cricket, not all draws are equal—and Team India's remarkable escape at Old Trafford against England proves just that. Despite technically ending in a draw, the fourth Test felt like a monumental win for India, and a stinging blow to England. With Brendon Mc-Cullum's aggressive 'Bazball' era yielding only two draws in 40 Tests—both at Old Trafford this match was a rare occasion when England failed to push through.

India were staring at a crushing defeat after conceding a 311-run lead in the first innings and slipping to 0/2 early in their second. But what followed was nothing short of a miracle. With England fielding a fierce attack led by Jofra Archer and Chris Woakes, India's resistance was led by KL Rahul, Shubman Gill, Ravindra Jadeja, and Washington Sundar. Batting through pressure, pace, and hostile conditions, they forced England to settle for the handshake.

KL Rahul, whose transformation as a Test opener has been one of the series' biggest sto-

ries, anchored India with poise and adaptability. With over 500 runs in the series so far—including two centuries—Rahul seems to have truly found his groove. Shubman Gill, the young captain, continues to shine with the bat and shows maturity beyond his years in juggling leadership and form.

Ravindra Jadeja, often underappreciated, was brilliant with the bat, scoring his second century of the tour and underlining his value as an all-rounder, even when his bowling returns were modest. Washington Sundar also proved his growing stature, playing with patience and composure to notch up his maiden Test ton.

This gritty fightback showed India's bench strength and mental resilience in the post-Kohli, Rohit, and Pujara era. With the series finale starting July 31, India now carries priceless momentum. While the scoreboard says "draw," the psychological win at Old Trafford might just be the turning point of the series. Ask Ben Stokes—it hurt more than a loss.



Sonia Gandhi slams PM Modi for 'shameful silence' over Gaza crisis

Congress parliamentary party chairperson Sonia Gandhi sharply condemned Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his government on July 29, 2025, for what she described as a "shameful silence" over the ongoing humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza. In a detailed article published in the Hindi daily Dainik Jagran, Gandhi accused the Modi government of being a "mute spectator" to what she called an "affront to humanity" and a "cowardly betrayal" of India's constitutional values.

Gandhi labeled Israel's military actions in Gaza as a "genocide" and denounced the devastating aerial bombardments that have destroyed most residential buildings, hospitals, and essential infrastructure, leading to immense civilian casualties including over 55,000 Palestinians killed, among them 17,000 children since October 2023. She also highlighted the Israeli military blockade that has cut off vital supplies of food, fuel, and medicine, calling the resultant starvation a "crime against humanity."

attacks on Israeli civilians and the ongoing hostage situation, she emphasized that these actions cannot justify Israel's disproportionate military response, which



she described as criminal and ethnically cleansing the Gaza Strip.

Pointing to international bodies, Gandhi lamented the failure of the United Nations Security Council and the International Court of Justice to enforce resolutions calling for a ceasefire and humanitarian aid. She praised countries like South Afri-While Gandhi condemned Hamas' brutal ca, Brazil, France, Britain, and Canada for their decisive actions against Israel's aggression and noted growing protests within Israel itself.

Sonia Gandhi urged PM Modi to break his

silence and uphold India's proud legacy as a global advocate for justice, peace, and anti-colonialism. She reminded that India historically recognized the Palestine Liberation Organisation in 1974 and the State of Palestine in 1988.

"The Global South is looking to India for leadership on this grave humanitarian issue," Gandhi asserted, calling on the government to speak "clearly, boldly and forthrightly" and live up to the nation's constitutional and moral obligations amid one of the worst crises of our time.

PRALAY Missile Tests Successful

India's defence capabilities received a boost as the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) successfully conducted two consecutive flight tests of the indigenously developed 'Pralay' missile from Dr APJ Abdul Kalam Island off the Odisha coast on July 28 and 29,

The trials were aimed at validating the missile's maximum and minimum range. Both tests achieved pinpoint accuracy and met all objectives, with sub-

systems performing as expected. Pralay is a solid-propellant, quasi-ballistic missile equipped with state-of-the-art navigation and capable of carrying multiple warheads against various targets. It was developed by DRDO's Research Centre Imarat along with other labs and industry partners like Bharat Dynamics Limited and Bharat Electronics Limited. Defence Minister Rajnath Singh congratulated the teams, calling it a technological boost for the Armed Forces. DRDO Chairman Dr Samir V Kamat said the tests pave the way for its induction.

Nimisha Priya's **Death Sentence Stands, MEA Denies Reprieve Reports**

The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on July 29, 2025, officially denied reports claiming that the death sentence of Indian nurse Nimisha Priya in Yemen had been revoked. These reports emerged after the office of the Indian Grand Mufti alleged that her death sentence, which had been temporarily suspended, was completely canceled following a high-level meeting in Sanaa.

Nimisha Priya, a 38-year-old nurse from Palakkad district in Kerala, moved to Yemen in 2008 seeking better opportunities. She entered into a business partnership with a Yemeni citizen, Talal Abdo Mahdi, with whom she jointly ran a clinic in the capital, Sanaa. However, the relationship deteriorated after Mahdi claimed to be her husband and subjected her to repeated abuse, confiscating her passport to prevent her from returning to India.

In a desperate attempt to escape, Nimisha Priya tried to sedate Mahdi in 2017. Unfortunately, Mahdi died of a suspected drug overdose. Nimisha was arrested in 2018 and later sentenced to death by a Yemeni court in 2020.

Her execution, initially scheduled for July 16, 2025, was postponed following intervention by the Indian Grand Mufti, Kanthapuram AP Aboobacker Musliyar. The Grand Mufti sought help from Sufi leader Sheikh Habib Umar bin Hafiz, who negotiated with Mahdi's family regarding the blood money and a possible pardon.

Despite these efforts, the MEA has clarified that no official reprieve has been granted, and Nimisha Priya's death sentence remains in place as the legal and diplomatic efforts continue.



Govt Clueless About What Deterrence Means: Rahul Gandhi

Leader of the Opposition Rahul Gandhi launched a scathing attack on the central government in the Lok Sabha on Tuesday, criticising its handling of Operation Sindoor—India's military response to the Pahalgam terror attack. He accused the Centre of lacking political will and compromising the armed forces' operational freedom.

Gandhi said the government had tied the hands of the military by instructing them not to target Pakistani military infrastructure, leading to operational setbacks. He cited Defence Minister Rajnath Singh's own statement that the government informed Pakistan at 1.35 am on May 7 that only non-military targets had been hit and that India did not want escalation.

"You told Pakistan you had no political will to fight. It's like saying: 'We slapped you once, but won't do it again," Gandhi remarked, adding that this undermined India's deterrence. He claimed India's own defence attaché in Indonesia confirmed that aircraft losses occurred because pilots were restricted from neutralising Pakistan's air defences.

Gandhi also took issue with Singh's comparison of Operation Sindoor to the 1971 war, stressing that the political leadership during Indira Gandhi's era showed far more resolve. He questioned why PM Modi had not publicly countered US President Donald Trump's repeated claims of brokering a ceasefire.

Highlighting diplomatic concerns, Gandhi said no country condemned Pakistan after the Pahalgam attack and criticised the government for empowering terrorists by declaring every terror act as an act of war. "This government is clueless about what deterrence means," he concluded.



US Team to Visit India On August 25 for Trade Talks

A high-level delegation from the United States is set to visit India on August 25 for the sixth round of negotiations on the proposed bilateral trade agreement, a senior official confirmed on Tuesday. The visit comes as both sides race against time to secure an interim trade deal before the critical August 1 deadline. Last week, the fifth round of talks concluded in Washington, with deliberations led by India's chief negotiator and Special Secretary in the Department of Commerce Rajesh Agrawal and Assistant US Trade Representative for South and Central Asia Brendan Lynch. The discussions are viewed as crucial, given that August 1 marks the end of the temporary suspension of tariffs imposed by former US President Donald Trump.

These tariffs — including a 26% levy on several Indian products — were initially suspended for 90 days starting April 2, and later extended until August 1 to allow room for trade negotiations with multiple countries, including India.

The US delegation's upcoming visit aims to iron out outstanding issues, particularly those related to tariffs and market access. India is pressing for the removal of the 26% additional tariff and wants relaxation of duties on key sectors like steel, aluminium (50%), and automobiles (25%). In return, India is pushing for concessions for its labour-intensive sectors such as textiles, gems and jewellery, leather goods, plastics, chemicals, and agricultural exports like shrimp, oil seeds, grapes, and bananas.

However, contentious issues remain. The US has been demanding duty cuts on certain industrial goods, electric vehicles, wines, petrochemicals, and agricultural products including apples, tree nuts, dairy, and genetically modified crops. India has strongly resisted any duty concessions in the dairy sector, which would be a first if granted, citing domestic sensitivities and opposition from farmer associations.

Meanwhile, trade between the two nations continues to grow. India's merchandise exports to the US surged 22.8% to USD 25.51 billion in the April–June quarter of the current financial year, while imports from the US rose 11.68% to USD 12.86 billion — underscoring the importance of a stable and mutually beneficial trade pact.





Trump Not Seeking Summit With Xi but May Visit China on Invitation

U.S. President Donald Trump announced on July 29, 2025, that he is not actively seeking a summit with Chinese President Xi Jinping but is open to visiting China if formally invited by Xi. Speaking on Truth Social, Trump said, "I may go to China, but it would only be at the invitation of President Xi, which has been extended. Otherwise, no interest!"

According to sources previously speaking to Reuters, aides to both leaders have discussed a possible meeting during Trump's planned trip to Asia later this year. Such a visit would mark the first in-person encounter between Trump and Xi since Trump's second term as U.S. president. The meeting would occur amid ongoing trade



and security tensions between the two global powers.

Although no final decision has been made, discussions include the possibility of Trump stopping in China around the time

of the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit, scheduled to be held in South Korea, or engaging in talks on the sidelines of the summit from October 30 to November 1.

Meanwhile, the third round of U.S.-China trade negotiations taking place this week in Stockholm is viewed by analysts as a potential stepping stone toward a future leaders' summit in the autumn. These talks come at a critical time when both sides are weighing the economic and geopolitical costs of escalating tariffs and export controls.

Experts warn that any renewed trade hostilities could further destabilize the already fragile relationship between the U.S. and China, with wide-ranging implications for global markets and international diplomacy.

While Trump's openness to a visit signals a possible thaw, the details remain uncertain as both administrations continue to navigate complex issues surrounding trade, security, and diplomatic engagement.

Netherlands Bans Israeli Ministers Over Gaza War as EU Considers Sanctions

The Netherlands has become the first European country to ban two far-right Israeli ministers from entering its territory, citing their support for the ongoing Gaza conflict. The ban targets National Security Minister Itamar Ben-Gvir and Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich, both key members of Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's coalition, known for their backing of Jewish settlements and hardline policies towards Gaza.

Dutch Foreign Minister Caspar Veldkamp informed lawmakers of the decision in a letter on Monday, emphasizing the urgency of halting the war in Gaza. This move comes amid rising international concern over the worsening humanitarian crisis in the region.

While the Netherlands leads with an entry ban, other countries have already imposed financial sanctions on Ben-Gvir and Smotrich. The UK, Australia, Canada, New Zealand, and Norway took similar measures last month, targeting the ministers for their controversial roles and statements, including support for the so-called "voluntary emigration" of Palestinians from Gaza.

In response, Israel's Foreign Ministry summoned the Dutch ambassador to protest the ban, labeling it "unacceptable." The diplomatic tension underscores growing friction between Israel and parts of the international community over Gaza.

Meanwhile, the European Union is contemplating additional punitive measures. The European Commission has proposed partially suspending Israel's participation in a €900 million science and technology program, especially limiting access to its €200 million annual investment arm, which supports projects in cybersecurity, drones, and artificial intelligence.

Officials stressed that the suspension would be "targeted and reversible," sparing projects with purely civilian applications. The Commission justified the move by stating Israel's military actions in Gaza breached the terms of a bilateral agreement with the EU.

As international pressure mounts, these developments signal increasing European willingness to hold Israeli officials accountable over the Gaza war.

Russia's Aeroflot cancels over 100 flights after cyberattack cripples IT systems

Russia's national airline Aeroflot was forced to cancel more than 100 flights and delay several others after a major cyberattack crippled its IT infrastructure on Monday, the country's Prosecutor's Office confirmed. The incident caused chaos at Moscow's Sheremetyevo Airport, Aeroflot's primary hub, leaving hundreds of passengers stranded. The cyberattack also affected Aeroflot's subsidiaries Rossiya and Pobeda, with disruptions extending to both domestic and limited international flights, including services to Belarus, Armenia, and Uzbekistan.

In a statement released early Monday, Aeroflot acknowledged facing "technical difficulties" that had impacted their systems, urging passengers to expect delays and potential cancellations. Later in the day, the Prosecutor's Office officially confirmed a cyberattack had taken over a year. down the airline's systems and announced a criminal investigation into the incident.

Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov described the situation as "quite alarming," noting that cyber threats are a persistent concern



for large public service companies in Russia.

Ukrainian hacker group Silent Crow and Belarusian activist group Belarus Cyber-Partisans claimed responsibility for the attack. Both groups, known for targeting pro-government infrastructure, alleged they had maintained unauthorized access to Aeroflot's network for

Netanyahu and Putin Discuss Iran Amid Rising Tensions Over Nuclear Talks

Tel Aviv, July 29, 2025 (ANI): Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu held a crucial phone conversation with Russian President Vladimir Putin to discuss Iran, amid escalating regional tensions surrounding Iran's nuclear ambitions and violence in Syria, the Israeli Prime Minister's Office confirmed on Tuesday.

In a post on social media platform X, the Prime Minister's official handle stated, "Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu spoke with Russian President Vladimir Putin. The conversation between the two leaders was on the issue of Iran."

According to The Times of Israel, the call also addressed wider developments in West Asia, with particular focus on

Iran's nuclear program and the recent sectarian violence in Syria. The Kremlin later emphasized Putin's call for maintaining Syria's sovereignty and territorial integrity, referencing recent Israeli airstrikes in Sweida and Damascus. These attacks followed deadly unrest in the Druze-majority Sweida province, where clashes erupted between Druze fighters and Sunni Bedouin tribes on July 13.

The Syrian Observatory for Human Rights reported over 1,400 people—mostly Druze—were killed in the violence, and more than 250 civilians were summarily executed by Syrian government forces, which had intervened on the side of the Bedouin.



Putin urged political stability through the protection of all ethnic and religious groups and reiterated Russia's ongoing military involvement in Syria, despite its war in Ukraine. Russia continues to back Syria's Assad regime, which collapsed in December 2024, leading to Bashar al-Assad's relocation to Moscow.

The Russian President reportedly offered to mediate stalled talks on Iran's nuclear program. This follows a recent 12-day conflict sparked by Israeli strikes on Iranian military and nuclear sites. While aligned with Tehran, Moscow has maintained neutrality during Israeli and U.S. strikes, possibly to preserve its diplomatic ties with Israel.

Over 1.5 million Afghans returned from Iran, Pakistan in 2025: UN

More than 1.5 million Afghan migrants have returned to Afghanistan since the beginning of 2025, according to a report by the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA), as reported by Tolo News. The data shows a massive surge in returns from neighboring countries, particularly Iran and Pakistan.

As of July 19, OCHA reported that 1,541,000 Afghans had returned this year — with 1,201,000 coming from Iran and 340,000 from Pakistan. While the number of returnees from Iran remained high, the daily deportation rate appeared to be declining in mid-July, down to around 9,000 per day. OCHA attributed this decrease to ongoing diplomatic talks between Afghan authorities and the Iranian government.

Despite the drop, the scale of returns remains staggering. On July 22 alone, 11,605 individuals returned to Afghanistan, according to the Islamic Emirate's Ministry of Refugees and Repatriation. Of these, 1,811 were successfully relocated to their home provinces. Over the previous two days, 19,002 migrants had arrived from both Iran and Pakistan — through a mix of voluntary returns and forced deportations.

Ali Reza Karimi, a migrants' rights advocate, raised concerns about the humanitarian impact of mass deportations. "Between 10,000 to 20,000 Afghans are being forcibly deported from Iran daily. The Afghan gov-



ernment must establish reception centers, offer emergency aid, and create short-term jobs to support these returnees," he urged.

Many deportees shared stories of hardship. "We have no shelter in Afghanistan," said Abdul Wadood, recently deported from Iran. "We need support from the Islamic Emir-

A young returnee named Jalal appealed for help with education: "My wish is to go to school. I ask the government to help me study."

In response, the UN High Commissioner for Refugees has called for an end to forced deportations and proposed a trilateral meeting involving Iran, Afghanistan, and UNHCR to address the crisis.






Domestic Markets Rebound Strongly Despite US-India Trade Deal Uncertainty

The series of losses has come to an end. The domestic stock markets were buoyed on Tuesday by positive signals from Asian markets. Benchmark and sectoral indices gained heavily. 

New UPI Rules from Aug 1: Balance Check, Auto-Pay Limits



Starting August 1, 2025, the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) will enforce new guidelines for all UPI users to enhance security, reduce system load, and streamline digital payments.

One of the key updates is a cap on balance enquiries. UPI users will now be limited to 50 balance checks per day per app, within a rolling 24-hour period. However, this is per application, meaning users can still check balances on other UPI apps separately. These balance checks must be user-initiated—apps can no longer request them automatically. Additionally, banks must display the available balance after every successful UPI transaction.

Auto-pay transactions, which include recurring payments, will also see changes. To avoid congestion during high-traffic hours, NPCI has defined new processing windows: before 10 a.m., between 1 p.m. to 5 p.m., and after 9:30 p.m. Auto-pay will not be executed during peak UPI usage hours: 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 5 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

Other restrictions include:

Viewing linked bank accounts: Limited to 25 times per

Checking status of pending transactions: Only 3 times, with a 90-second gap between each.

Payment reversal requests: Capped at 10 per month, and only 5 allowed per sender.

To prevent fraud, UPI apps will now display the recipient's bank name before a transaction is completed, allowing users to confirm they are sending money to the correct person or business.


NPCI has warned that banks or apps that fail to comply with these rules may face penalties, suspension of new user onboarding, or even restricted API access for UPI services.

Centre Eyes ₹5.91 Lakh Cr from Cess, Surcharge in FY26, Up 9.4%

The Central Govern-I ment has projected a significant increase in its cess and surcharge collections for the financial year 2025–26 (FY26), budgeting ₹5.91 lakh crore—marking a 9.43% rise over FY25 figures. This includes ₹4.18 lakh crore from cess and ₹1.72 lakh crore from surcharge, according to data presented in Parliament on July 29, 2025.

In FY25, cess collections stood at ₹3.87 lakh crore, while surcharges brought in ₹1.53 lakh crore. The figures were shared in a written reply by Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary in the Rajya Sabha.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman also responded to a separate query, revealing that the Centre collected ₹83,071 crore in FY25 from health and education cess alone, while expenditures from the same fund totaled ₹87,199 crore. In previous years, collections were ₹69,891 crore (FY24) and ₹60,616 crore (FY23), with similar spending

Currently, the government levies eight different cesses, including those on agriculture infrastructure, crude oil, exports, GST compensation, health and education, national calamity, and infrastructure. Surcharges are imposed on corporate income tax, personal income tax, and via social welfare surcharges under Customs.

Opposition-led states have repeatedly demanded that cess and surcharge collections be included in the divisible pool of taxes, from which the Centre currently devolves 41% to states. However, these levies remain outside the revenue-sharing framework.

SEBI Bans Four for Two Years in TV Stock Tips Case

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has barred four entities from participating in the securities market for two years in connection with an insider trading case involving stock recommendations aired on a popular business television channel. The final order, released on July 28, 2025, reveals that the entities exploited non-public information to earn unlawful gains of ₹7.4 crore.

barred entities include Partha Sarathi Dhar, SAAR Commodities Private Limited, Manan Sharecom Private Limited, and Kanhya Trading Company.

SEBI's investigation uncovered a coordinated scheme in which guest experts on the TV show shared their stock tips and broadcast timings in advance with the noticees, namely Nirmal Kumar Soni and Partha Sarathi Dhar. These individuals would then take positions in the recommended stocks before the recommendations aired, and square them off immediately after the broadcast to profit from the anticipated price movements.

SEBI noted, "The noticees devised a scheme to take advantage of advance possession of non-public information about the recommendations given by guest experts."

The guest experts involved were identified as



Kiran Jadhav, Ashish Kelkar, Himanshu Gupta, Mudit Goyal, and Simi Bhaumik. While they were not banned, they played a role in the tip-sharing process.

Out of 15 individuals and entities named in the interim order dated February 8, 2024, ten settled with SEBI, leading to the disposal of charges against them. However, the remaining four failed to substantiate their denials and were debarred.

SEBI also imposed a joint penalty of ₹4 crore, with SAAR Commodities Private Limited facing the highest individual fine of ₹2 crore. All debarred parties are required to deposit the unlawful gains in an escrow account as directed.

Meta Smartwatch **Project Revived, May Launch with Cameras and AI in** September 2025



Meta Platforms appears to be reviving its longstalled smartwatch initiative, with a potential launch now eved for September 2025. According to a new report from DigiTimes, the company is working toward unveiling the wearable device during its annual Meta Connect event, scheduled for September 17–18. The upcoming smartwatch may feature built-in cameras and artificial intelligence (AI) capabilities, potentially pairing with Meta's AI-powered smart glasses to enhance user interaction.

This development marks Meta's second serious attempt to break into the competitive smartwatch market. The original project, codenamed "Milan," surfaced in 2021 with ambitious features, including a curved-edge display, a physical button, and a front-facing camera. A subsequent 2022 prototype included two cameras—a 5MP front sensor and a 10MP rear sensor—in a gold-colored frame. Kaziranga Ranks Third Globally in Tiger Density with 18.65 Tigers per 100 sq km

Assam's Kaziranga National Park and Tiger Reserve (KNPTR), globally renowned for its population of one-horned rhinoceroses, has now earned another distinction—it ranks third in the world for highest tiger density. According to a recent survey, Kaziranga has recorded a tiger density of 18.65 tigers per 100 square kilometers, reflecting a thriving and expanding big cat population.

The latest tiger census conducted in 2024 reported 148 individual adult tigers across Kaziranga, including 83 females, 55 males, and 10 of unknown gender. This figure includes 27 tigers from the newly incorporated Biswanath Wildlife Division, counted for the first time in this survey.

Dr. Sonali Ghosh, Director of KNPTR, highlighted that the core Eastern Assam Wildlife Division showed growth, with the number of tigers rising from 104 in 2022 to 115 in 2024. Meanwhile, the Nagaon Wildlife Division maintained a steady count of 6 tigers.

The tiger survey was a comprehensive exercise conducted under Phase IV monitoring protocols of the National Tiger Con-

servation Authority (NTCA). It involved deploying 293 camera traps over a 1,307 sq km area and spanned 103 days. The monitoring generated over 1.3 million images, of which 4,011 captured tigers, aiding in individual identification.



Japan's Toll System Crashes for 38 Hours, Yet 24,000 Drivers Still Pay **Voluntarily**

Tn a remarkable dis-**⊥**play of civic responsibility, 24,000 drivers in Japan voluntarily paid their toll fees after the country's electronic toll collection (ETC) system crashed approximately 38 hours earlier this year. The malfunction affected busy highways such as the Tomei and Chuo Expressways, forcing toll gates to remain open to keep traffic flowing smoothly.

The incident occurred on April 8 and continued into April 9, disrupting the automated system that normally reads drivers' ETC cards and raises gates to allow passage without stopping. With 106 toll booths across Tokyo and several prefectures unable to process payments, the expressway operator, Central Nippon Expressway Co (NEXCO Central), decided to open all gates temporarily to avoid traffic jams on some of Japan's busiest roads.

Despite the free passage, about 24,000 drivers later offered to pay the tolls online, reflecting the high level of trust and integrity typical of Japanese society. While an estimated 920,000 ETC-equipped vehicles were on the roads during the outage, it is unclear how many passed through the affected gates.

In May, NEXCO Central announced it would waive toll fees for all vehicles that traveled through the affected areas during the outage period. For those who had already paid, full refunds were issued through the ETC mileage program or similar means.

The incident and the public's response have been widely praised on social media, with many highlighting Japan's culture of respect and honesty. One user remarked, "Japan is a high trust society," while another said, "I'd pay too if I was getting services like in Japan." A third commented on the efficiency of the ETC system, noting that "You didn't even have to stop at the toll gates."

This episode underscores how strong social norms and collective responsibility can maintain order, even when technology fails.



Kotak later explained the sequence of events to the media, stating that while the request from the ground staff was unusual, the Indian team would not file any complaint. "One of the ground staff said to stand 2.5 metres from the wicket and view it from outside the rope. I



He added that Indian players were wearing joggers, not spikes, so there was no risk of damage to the pitch.

"We already had an idea that the curator wouldn't be easy to deal with. Being possessive is fine, but not to this extent," Kotak remarked. The situation escalated when Fortis warned he would "report" the matter. Gambhir snapped back: "You go and report whatever you want to report." Kotak then calmly intervened, pulling Fortis aside to assure him, "We won't damage anything."

Though the Oval groundstaff is reportedly considering lodging a formal complaint, the Indian camp has indicated it will let the matter rest — for now.


