Speaking after inaugurating the Malabar Gems and Jewellery manufacturing unit at the newly built Maheswaram Industrial Park, CM Revanth Reddy said that 'Vision-2047' has been drafted to guide the state's development for the next 100

"This is not just about Telangana or India—we're creating a future city that can stand the world. National and international consultants are helping us shape the state's development strategy," the CM said, emphasizing that his government guarantees safety and



profits for investors coming into Telangana.

He stated that the Congress government is serious about attracting investments and is providing a transparent, safe, and proactive governance alongside the greatest cities of model. "We will offer all kinds of support to those setting up industries here. Our aim is to make Telangana the most attractive destination for global capital," Revanth added. Joining him at the event, In-

Babu pointed out that Telangana's manufacturing sector recorded a growth of over 9% in 2023-24, outpacing the national average. He highlighted that the government recently rolled out the Green Industrial Policy and New MSME Policy 2025, further strengthening the industrial climate in the state.

Protest Intensifies at Sigachi Factory in Pashamailaram


- Family members cry for justice and demand bodies
- Father of missing worker injures himself in anguish

Sangareddy: Tensions flared on Thursday at the Sigachi Industries unit in Pashamailaram, Sangareddy district, as grieving families of missing workers continued their sit-in protest for the fourth

consecutive day, demanding that authorities hand over the bodies of their loved ones who went missing in the recent industrial mishap. The factory premises, where a deadly explosion occurred earlier this week, remain sealed off, and relatives say no clear information has been provided to them regarding the fate of the missing workers. Though DNA samples have been collected, there is no progress on identifying or recovering the bodies, leaving families in despair.

One tragic incident occurred today when Ramdas, the father of Justin, a young man who had joined work at the company just two days before the explosion, struck his own head with a stone in front of the police and factory gate, shouting, "Give me my son's body!" Eyewitnesses say Ramdas bled profusely, but



"We've been standing outside this factory for four days. You took DNA samples. But you still won't tell us anything. At least let us see where our sons died," cried one of the protesting relatives.

Police have deployed heavy security around the factory to control the crowd, but their presence has done little to ease tensions. Families allege that authorities and factory management are stonewalling, refusing to allow them access or even communicate the current status of search

TPCC Chief lashes out at MLC Kavitha over BC, reservation claims

TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad The Congress Party is gearing up to hold a massive "Social Justice Samara Bheri" rally at Lal Bahadur Stadium in Hyderabad today, with AICC President Mallikarjun Kharge set to participate as the chief guest. TPCC President and MLC Mahesh Kumar Goud announced that nearly 40,000 village, mandal, district presidents, as well as Congress ministers,

MPs, MLAs and corporation chairpersons will be attending the commemorative program for village-level leadership.

Speaking to the media, Mahesh Goud said, "The Congress Party is committed to real social justice. Our rally today will reflect our dedication to the welfare of SC, ST, and BC communities." He emphasized that Kharge will directly address all grassroots leaders and issue directions for future political action.

Taking strong objection to a recent letter reportedly sent by MLC Kavitha to Mallikarjun Kharge, Goud ridiculed it, saying, "It's unclear whether she wrote the letter on behalf of BRS or her Bharat Jagruti organization. Either way, the content is absurd and shameful."

He further questioned Kavitha's political credibility, stating, "What did Kavitha or her party do



for BCs in their 10 years of rule? Can she show a single clipping where she spoke for BCs when in power? And now, chanting BC slogans to escape a political vacuum is laughable. The Congress Party is the one that provided 42% reservation for BCs in local bodies, education, and health sectors—not the BRS."

Mahesh Goud also remarked that Kavitha is currently under investigation in the liquor scam, while the Congress is issuing declarations for BC upliftment. He accused BRS of reducing local body reservations and reminded the public of how KCR compromised on Telangana's water share, alleging that BRS leaders once dined with Andhra leaders and struck secret deals, referring to Harish Rao's meeting at

Roja's house.



Telangana Eyes Trillion-Dollar Goal by 2035: Sridhar Babu

Telangana State Minister for Industries and IT, Sridhar Babu, said the state is on track to becoming a trillion-dollar economy by 2035, driven by its rapidly growing manufacturing sector. He was speaking at the inauguration of the Malabar Gems and Jewellery Manufacturing Unit in Maheshwaram on Thursday.

Citing economic data, the Minister said Telangana's secondary sector grew at 9.6% in 2023-24, outperform-

ing the national average of 8.3%. The Gross Value Added (GVA) in manufacturing rose from ₹1.34 lakh crore in 2022–23 to ₹1.46 lakh crore in 2023–24, marking 9% annual growth. The manufacturing share in GSDP stood at 19.5%, ahead of the national average of 17.7%.

"These aren't just statistics. CM Revanth Reddy is scripting a success story for Telangana, turning it into a model for other states," Sridhar Babu said, adding that the government is building a com-



setting up industries.

He also revealed that Telangana's manufacturing exports have crossed ₹1.2 lakh crore in 2023–24. Strategic initiatives include the establishment of an electronics cluster on the outskirts of Hyderabad, a jewellery manufacturing zone in Maheshwaram, and an EV and Defense hub in Zaheerabad.

The Minister highlighted the efficiency of the TG-iPASS single-window clear-

ance system, through which 4,200 units were granted approvals, with 98% completed within 15 days. He announced that the system will soon be AI-integrated to further improve speed and transparency. As part of its forward-looking industrial development plan, the government is working on a New Industrial Policy 2025, which will focus on Green incentives for clean manufacturing, Sector-specific industrial zones, Special incentives for women entrepreneurs and AIbased digital governance.

"This government is pro-industry. We invite national and international investors to be part of Telangana's growth. CM Revanth Reddy leads a government that supports,

Govt Raises Age Limit for **Anganwadi Promotions**


In a significant move that brings cheer to thousands of Anganwadi helpers across Telangana, the state government has raised the maximum age limit for their promotion to Anganwadi teachers. The limit, which was previously set at 45 years, has now been extended to 50 years, opening new doors for career advancement.

Minister for Women and Child Welfare Seethakka approved the key file related to this decision on Thursday, marking a crucial reform aimed at supporting long-serving Anganwadi staff. Officials from the department confirmed that this change will ben-

efit 4,322 Anganwadi helpers currently working across various districts in the

Until now, many helpers who crossed the 45-year threshold were denied the opportunity to move up the ranks, despite years of dedicated service. With the revised age limit, thousands who were previously ineligible will now be considered for promotion, significantly boosting morale and job satisfaction among grassroots workers.

Sources revealed that official government orders will be issued soon, following the minister's approval. The decision is being seen as a proactive step towards recognizing and reward-



ing the contributions of Anganwadi helpers who have played a crucial role in child nutrition, health, and early education across rural Telangana.

The move also aligns with the state government's broader objective of empowering women workers and enhancing the effectiveness of the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) scheme through experience-backed promotions.

Three-Day Rain Alert in Telangana...

The Hyderabad Meteorological Centre has issued a yellow alert for multiple districts in Telangana as moderate to heavy rains are expected to lash the state over the next three days, under the influence of a monsoon trough. The alert comes amid changing weather patterns and increasing cloud activity across several regions.

On Thursday, the districts of Komaram Bheem Asifabad, Mancherial, Jayashankar Bhupalpally, and Bhupalpally are expected to witness heavy rainfall. The meteorological department has urged residents in these areas to remain cautious and take necessary precautions.



Moving into Friday, the weather office has predicted light to moderate rain in several parts of the state, including the combined Adilabad, Karimnagar, Khammam, Rangareddy, and Hyderabad districts, as well as Nizamabad, Bhupalpally, Mulugu, and Sangareddy. The forecast also warns of thunderstorms and lightning, along with gusty winds reaching speeds of 30 to 40 kilometers per hour.

Authorities have advised people, especially farmers and travelers, to stay updated with local weather bulletins and avoid venturing into open areas during lightning or strong wind conditions. Emergency teams have been kept on alert in sensitive zones.

The rains are attributed to the active monsoon trough currently affecting the region, which is expected to keep weather conditions unstable for the next few days. The government may also consider response measures depending on the intensity and spread of the rainfall.

If KCR Speaks, I Will Speak: Komatireddy Venkat Reddy

Says KTR and Harish Rao have no significance in current politics

State Roads and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkat Reddy has launched a sharp attack on BRS leader and former Chief Minister KCR, stating that he will only respond if KCR himself speaks, not to comments made by KTR or Harish Rao. Speaking to the media after a review meeting with top officials on road development, Komatireddy said the Congress government is prepared to debate every issue in the Assembly — but only if KCR attends in person.

"We won't respond to Harish Rao or KTR. They are just former ministers and current MLAs, not floor leaders. If KCR speaks, I will speak. Otherwise, there's no value in debating with them," said Komatireddy, making it clear that the Congress party does not consider them politically significant anymore.

He emphasized that the Congress party was the one that granted Telangana and reminded that many senior Congress leaders had played a pivotal role in the statehood movement. Komatireddy urged KCR, now the leader of the opposition, to come to the Assembly and confront the government directly over the issues being raised by the BRS.

"The opposition has the right to question, and we are ready to answer — but KCR must come forward himself, not send proxies," he asserted.

His remarks underline the Congress government's stance of not engaging with second-tier BRS leaders while calling for a direct political face-off with KCR on the floor of the Assembly.



Kusumanchi to See Khammam-Level **Development: Ponguleti**

Revenue Minister vows full implementation of poll promises ₹1,500 crore spent in Paleru in 18 months

Telangana Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy asserted that the government is committed to comprehensive development in Kusumanchi, stating that the headquarters will be developed on par with Khammam city. Addressing a public meeting in Kusumanchi, the Minister highlighted the progress achieved under the Indiramma government and reassured the people that all election promises will be fulfilled.

"We are executing numerous development and welfare programs across the Paleru constituency, with an investment of ₹1,500 crore in just 18 months," he stated. The Minister said that since the formation of the new government, they have prioritized both infrastructure and social securi-

TPCC Chief Warns Jadcherla **MLA Over Covert Remarks**

Mahesh Kumar Goud says no place for baseless claims or indiscipline

TPCC president B Mahesh Kumar Goud has come down strongly on Jadcherla MLA J Anirudh Reddy for alleging that covert operatives linked to Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu were functioning in Telangana. Speaking to reporters at Gandhi Bhavan on Thursday, Goud said the remarks were baseless and that party discipline would be strictly enforced.

"We are seriously looking into Anirudh Reddy's comments. No one should cross the party's disciplinary line,"

Hyderabad Tops Salaries, Chennai Leads for Freshers

Survey reveals shifting job trends in Indian cities

Southern cities outperform metros in pay satisfaction and opportunities

A recent 'Paymap Survey' by job portal Indeed has revealed a major shift in the salary landscape across Indian cities, placing Hyderabad at the top for experienced professionals and Chennai as the most favorable destination for freshers. This trend challenges the long-standing dominance of metro cities like Delhi, Mumbai, and Bengaluru in offering high-paying jobs. The survey compiled insights from 1,311 employers and 2,531 employees nationwide to assess post-pandemic salary trends, sector performance, and cost-ofliving comparisons.

According to the findings, freshers (0-2 years of experience) in Chennai earn an average of ₹30,100 per month, making it the top city for entry-level jobs. On the other hand, Hyderabad emerged as the most lucrative destination for mid and senior-level professionals (5-8 years of experience), with average monthly salaries reaching up to ₹69,700.

Indeed India's Head of Sales, Shashi Kumar, explained, "The



salary equation is changing rapidly. Our data shows that employees are increasingly drawn to cities offering a balance between salary and cost of living. Southern cities and emerging job hubs are leading this change." However, the report also revealed dissatisfaction in expensive metros, with 96% of employees in Delhi, 95% in Mumbai, 94% in Pune, and 93% in Bengaluru stating that their salaries do not match their living expenses. In contrast, cities like Hyderabad, Chennai, Ahmedabad, and Kolkata are seen as more financially

sustainable for working profes-

With the rising demand for digital and AI-related skills, especially in the IT sector, employees are increasingly prioritizing growth opportunities, quality of life, and financial flexibility when choosing cities for employment.

The Paymap Survey clearly signals a new direction in India's employment geography, with Southern cities emerging as ideal choices for both freshers and experienced professionals seeking better pay and balanced lifestyles.

Fridge Blast Triggers Fire in Sanathnagar Home

No casualties as family was away during the incident

A major fire accident was narrowly averted in Sanathnagar on Thursday morning after a refrigerator exploded inside a house in Rajarajeshwari Nagar. Fortunately, no one was at home when the explosion occurred, preventing any loss of life.

The incident took place in the residence of Satyanarayana, a local resident, when the refrigerator suddenly exploded with a loud noise. The resulting fire rapidly spread throughout the house, engulfing all the furniture and personal belongings in flames. As the family members had gone out during the time of the incident, a major tragedy was avoided.

Upon receiving an alert, the fire brigade and Hydra teams rushed to the spot and managed to control the fire before it could spread to neighboring houses. Local MLA Talasani Srinivas Yadav visited the site soon after the incident, consoled the affected family, and as-



sured them of necessary support.

Police officials have registered a case and initiated an investigation to determine the exact cause behind the refrigerator explosion. Preliminary reports suggest an electrical malfunction could be the reason, but a detailed inquiry is underway.

Residents in the area have been urged to take precautions with electrical appliances, especially during peak summer months when overload-related accidents are more likely.

Residents Demand Reopening of Key Road in Borabanda

A formal complaint has been lodged with the Hydra Commissioner demanding the reopening of a crucial internal road from Navabharat Nagar to Madhapur, which has been blocked by a local builder. The complaint was submitted on Thursday by Kotha Venkatesh, a resident of Site H3, Borabanda, highlighting the hardships faced by residents due to the sudden road closure.

The road in question, located in Survey No. 17/2 of Guttala Begumpet, has reportedly been in use for over 30 years. However, it has now been completely shut off by the builder, forcing commuters—especially pedestrians and two-wheeler users—to take a detour of over three kilometers to reach their destinations.

In the complaint, Venkatesh stated that BJP leaders had twice approached the landowner and requested the reopening of the blocked route. Despite those efforts, the landowner has not taken any action, prompting local residents to seek intervention from the authorities.

The closure has affected people across 26 bastis, including Ambedkar Nagar, HF Nagar, Devaiah Basti, Bhavani Shankar Nagar, Sewalal Basti, Peddamma Nagar, Sunil Nagar, Jyoti Nagar, Sairam Nagar, SPR Hills, and several Weaker Section colonies. Residents, many of whom rely on this road for daily commuting, have raised concerns about the lack of accessibility and urged the municipal authorities to act immediately.

Locals are demanding that the municipal and civic bodies step in to resolve the issue at the earliest. The blocked road is seen as a vital lifeline for thousands of residents in the densely populated Borabanda and Madhapur stretch.



Kwid Car Catches Fire **Near Mailardevpally Petrol Pump**

A shocking incident took place near Mailardevpally Police Station in Hyderabad on Thursday, where a Kwid car caught fire just moments after refueling at a Bharat petrol pump. The driver, identified as Sudarshan, was on his way from Shadnagar to Dilsukhnagar when the incident occurred.

According to eyewitnesses, the fire broke out soon after the vehicle was filled with fuel, raising suspicion about the circumstances. Initial reports suggest that the petrol pump staff were allegedly involved, with claims emerging that they deliberately set the car on fire using petrol cylinders. The exact motive is yet to be verified. The Mailardevpally police have registered a case and launched an investigation into the incident, including reviewing CCTV footage and questioning the staff present at the time. The role of the petrol pump workers and the cause of the fire are under serious scrutiny.

Piracy Kingpin Busted

Man Arrested for Leaking 65 Movies to MovieRulez, Tamil MV

In a major breakthrough in the fight against film piracy, a man named Kiran Kumar from East Godavari has been arrested for illegally recording and selling Telugu and Tamil movies to piracy websites like MovieRulez and Tamil MV, causing massive financial damage to the South Indian film industry.

According to police, Kiran Kumar, who worked as an AC technician in an NGO colony in Vanasthalipuram, is accused of pirating over 65 films in 2024 alone. He allegedly recorded the movies directly from theaters using his mobile phone and then sold each copy to piracy sites for amounts ranging from ₹40,000 to ₹80,000.

Authorities estimate that his actions have led to a staggering loss of ₹3,700 crore to both Tollywood and Kollywood during the current year.

Police sources confirmed that they are still tracking the entire piracy network and that more arrests are likely. The investigation revealed that Kiran operated discreetly, often attending early shows of newly released films to record them.

Officials are now working with cybercrime teams to shut down mirror links and trace the handlers of piracy platforms that have long plagued the film industries. The arrest of Kiran is being seen as a significant step forward in curbing illegal movie distribution in South India.

Producers and film bodies have welcomed the police action, urging for stricter punishment and a fast-track trial in piracy cases to deter future offenses.

Bihar: Is Nitish Kumar King, Kingmaker, Or Just Clinging On?

The 'Ajatashatru' Who Still Holds Bihar's Political Pulse in 2025

As Bihar heads towards another crucial assembly election, Chief Minister Nitish Kumar, often dubbed the "Ajatashatru" — one who has no enemies — remains the defining figure of state politics. Once described as such by former Bihar Governor Rajendra Arlekar, Nitish's political journey reflects resilience, adaptability, and a deep understanding of Bihar's fragmented electorate.

Having ruled Bihar for nearly two decades, with only a brief interruption, Nitish Kumar continues to be the National Democratic Alliance's (NDA) face in the state, even at 74. His party, the Janata Dal (United), suffered a major blow in 2020, managing just 43 seats in the 243-member assembly. Yet, through alliances — first with BJP, then RJD, and back with BJP — he held onto power.

Today, JD(U)'s 12 Lok Sabha MPs are crucial to the BJP-led NDA's narrow majority at the Centre, giving Nitish significant leverage. His current But the Grand Alliance (Mahagathtenure could extend beyond the 2025 elections, unless the opposition IN-DIA bloc, led by RJD's Tejashwi Yadav, pulls off a surprise.

Meanwhile, NDA's fortunes have a Lok Sabha presence. The Hindustan Awam Morcha (HAM) led by Jitan Ram Manjhi adds further complexity but also strengthens the NDA on paper.

> Despite repeated political obituaries, Nitish Kumar remains Bihar's great survivor. His ability to read the pulse of Bihar's fragmented social fabric — from EBCs and Mahadalits to Pasmanda Muslims — has kept him relevant. He isn't grooming a successor either, with his son Nishant showing no interest in politics.

> Prashant Kishor, once Nitish's political aide, is attempting to replicate that long-game strategy. Backed by RCP Singh, a former JD(U) insider, Kishor's Jan Suraaj could tap into the vacuum that might emerge post-Nitish. Karnataka Crisis: A Defining Test for Mallikarjun Kharge's Leadership



As political rumblings in Karnataka intensify, Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge finds himself at the center of an unexpected leadership test—one that may define his tenure and legacy within the party. Open discussions among Congress MLAs about a possible change of Chief Minister have escalated into a full-blown intra-party crisis, yet Kharge has remained noticeably noncommittal. His recent statement that the matter is for the "party leadership" to decide and that "no one can say what is going on in the high command"—has only deepened the confusion.

What makes this all the more curious is that Kharge hails from Karnataka and should ideally be best positioned to take charge of the situation. His reluctance to assert authority has puzzled many Congress leaders. Some even wonder whether the BJP's repeated jibes about Kharge being "remote-controlled" by the Gandhis are beginning to stick. An opposition MP sarcastically compared the Congress leadership to a ghost: "unseen but heard and felt"—a comment that's starting to feel uncomfortably accurate.

Within the Congress ranks, there's genuine disappointment. Many had hoped Kharge's election as party president—over Shashi Tharoor in a rare internal contest—would revive the idea of an empowered, independent Congress chief. A senior Dalit leader noted, "From Indira Gandhi's time to now, we've always treated the Congress president as the final authority. Kharge's apparent detachment is hard to understand."

Kharge's age (now 82) and possible disinterest in day-to-day political maneuvering are likely factors. Party insiders acknowledge that it's usually Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra who handle campaign trail responsibilities and strategic decisions. Despite being president, Kharge is perceived more as a ceremonial head than a driving force. In fact, Rahul Gandhi has gradually assumed a de facto leadership role—

making key calls on policy, ticket distribution, and organizational reshuffles. Even Priyanka's undefined role as AICC general secretary is said to stem from this top-heavy decision-making

The Congress's broader organizational efforts have also revealed this imbalance. Declaring 2025 as the "year of the organisation," Rahul Gandhi initiated a bottom-up revamp of district committees. However, in practice, it's been a top-down effort, with external teams being parachuted into states—a move that's alienated local leaders and grassroots workers.

Kharge's current predicament has historical echoes. After the Congress was defeated in 1996, then-party president P.V. Narasimha Rao was pressured to step down when legal troubles loomed. He eventually resigned, only to be abandoned by his party during his court battles. Though later acquitted, the isolation he faced left a lasting impression on Congress history. Some now fear that Kharge could suffer a similar fate—being gradually sidelined, especially if Karnataka becomes a flashpoint that weakens his credibility.

Complicating matters is the internal dynamic around the "one person, one post" principle. After Kharge was elected Congress president, he defied party convention by retaining his Rajya Sabha role as Leader of the Opposition. While that decision was constitutionally justified, it raised questions about whether Kharge truly intended to fully embrace the presidency's responsibilities.

Now, as Karnataka teeters and factions jostle for influence, Kharge has a decision to make: step up and lead decisively, or risk being remembered as a placeholder president at a time when the party needed a commanding voice. Either way, the crisis could be his moment of reckon-



Trump vs Musk vs Mamdani: A **Three-Way Tug-of-War Reflecting America's Deeper Divide**

The brewing conflict between Donald Trump dominated by old-guard power players. Unlike and Elon Musk is not just a clash of egos or economic ideologies. To fully understand its deeper implications, one must look beyond these two headline-grabbing figures—and focus on an emerging political wildcard: Zohran Mamdani, a democratic socialist and immigrant-turned-politician who could soon become the next mayor of New York City.

Trump and Musk, both billionaire disruptors in their own right, find themselves at odds over the future of U.S. government spending. Trump's 940-page "One Big, Beautiful Bill" recently passed the Senate, aiming to slash expenditures on healthcare, food assistance, and—crucially—subsidies for electric vehicles and space programs. This hits Elon Musk's ventures directly, with Tesla and SpaceX heavily benefiting from federal support. Musk didn't hold back, calling the bill a betrayal and even hinting at forming his own political party, the "America Party," if things spiral further.

Trump, meanwhile, has ramped up his attacks on electric vehicles and space projects, suggesting that scrapping them would save the country "a fortune." The war of words escalated further when Trump invoked the Department of Government Efficiency, or DOGE—a fictional-sounding agency Musk had once headed—saying it may have to "eat Elon." It's political theater, yes, but it reflects real tensions about America's fiscal priorities.

Enter Zohran Mamdani, a rising star in the Democratic Party and a democratic socialist from Queens, New York. The son of filmmaker Mira Nair, Mamdani brings immigrant grit and progressive fire to a political scene long

Trump or Musk, Mamdani focuses not on billion-dollar space ambitions or tax cuts, but on the struggles of everyday Americans. His platform targets economic inequality, skyrocketing living costs, and stagnant wages—issues that resonate far more deeply with average voters than any rocket launch.

Trump has branded Mamdani a "communist lunatic," but Mamdani insists he is fighting for the same working-class Americans Trump once claimed to champion. His appeal lies in channeling the frustrations of voters left behind by both corporate-driven capitalism and anti-immigrant populism. In essence, Mamdani challenges the assumption that America must choose between Trump-style nationalism and Musk's techno-utopianism.

This three-way political rift reflects broader tensions in American society. On one hand, there are the ultra-rich who despise taxes and exploit loopholes to accumulate generational wealth. Wealthy Americans often pay capital gains taxes only when selling assets, and federal estate taxes apply to a tiny fraction of inheritances. Meanwhile, millions of low- and middle-income Americans live paycheck to paycheck, facing rising costs with little institutional support.

Trump capitalizes on cultural fears, especially among less-educated white voters who feel displaced by more competent immigrants and alienated by rapid social change. Musk blames an inefficient government for stifling innovation. Mamdani, however, offers a third path—demanding that America's prosperity benefit all, not just the elite.





India Will Soon Be World's Third Largest Economy: PM Modi In Ghana

In a landmark address to Ghana's Parliament on Thursday, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said India is undergoing a profound transformation and is poised to become the world's third-largest economy, built on the foundations of political stability and good governance.

"Today, India is the fastest-growing emerging economy, contributing nearly 16% to global growth," PM Modi told Ghana's lawmakers. He highlighted that India's demographic strength is paying dividends, noting that the country now hosts the world's third-largest start-up ecosystem and is a global hub for innovation and technology.

PM Modi also emphasized India's rising stature in science, space, and industry. "India landed on the Moon. Today, an Indian is in orbit as part of our human spaceflight mission. Indian women are leading in science, aviation, space, and sports," he said, adding that India is globally recognised as the 'Pharmacy of the World.'

Looking ahead, PM Modi reaffirmed India's national resolve to become a developed country by 2047, marking a century of independence. He extended India's solidarity with Ghana, saying, "As Ghana continues its journey of



progress, India shall walk with you—shoulder to shoulder."

PM Modi underscored India's growing engagement with Africa. Since hosting the 2015 India-Africa Summit and the 2017 African Development Bank annual meeting, India has expanded its diplomatic presence to 46 African nations. Over 200 infrastructure and development projects are underway across the continent.

In Ghana, India recently inaugurated

the Tema-Mpakadan rail line, the region's largest infrastructure project. PM Modi also welcomed Ghana's leadership in promoting economic integration under the African Continental Free Trade Area and noted its potential as a regional IT and innovation hub.

Earlier in the day, President John Mahama conferred Ghana's highest civilian honour—the Officer of the Order of the Star of Ghana—on PM Modi, who called it a "matter of immense pride."

India to Monitor US Proposal for 500% Tariff on Russian Oil Imports: Jaishankar

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar on Thursday responded to a US Senate bill proposing a 500 percent tariff on oil imports from countries trading with Russia, stating that India will closely watch developments that may affect its energy security.

Addressing the issue at a press confer-

ence, Jaishankar said, "Regarding Senator Lindsey Graham's bill, any development happening in the US Congress is of interest to us if it impacts our interest. We have been in touch with Senator Graham. Our embassy and ambassador have communicated India's concerns and interests regarding energy security to him. We will have to cross that bridge when we come to it, if we come to it." The bill, introduced by Senator Lindsey

Graham and backed by over 80 co-sponsors in the Senate, seeks to impose a 500 percent tariff on products imported from any country that continues trading oil, gas, uranium, or other products with Russia. Graham described the bill as a strong measure against countries like India and China, which account for around 70 percent of Russia's oil imports, saying it aims to cut off funding to Russia's war efforts.

Despite Western sanctions following the Ukraine conflict, India has maintained its long-standing relationship with Russia by continuing oil imports, citing its energy needs. While some Republican lawmakers are cautious, the bill reportedly has the backing of former US President Donald Trump, who encouraged Graham to advance the legislation. A possible exemption may be included for countries that are assisting Ukraine's defense efforts.

For India, a major export partner of the US, the proposed tariffs could have significant economic and diplomatic repercussions. New Delhi remains watchful as discussions continue in Washington.

AAP to Contest Bihar Assembly Elections Independently, Says Arvind Kejriwal

Aam Aadmi Party's (AAP) national convener Arvind Kejriwal announced on Thursday that the party will contest the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections without forming any alliance with the Congress or the I.N.D.I.A. bloc allies. Speaking at a press conference in Ahmedabad, Kejriwal clarified that the I.N.D.I.A. coalition was formed solely for the Lok Sabha elections and does not extend to state polls like Bihar.

Kejriwal emphasized, "We are going to contest Bihar polls solo. There is no alliance with the Congress from our side." He pointed out the contradiction in Congress's approach, referencing the recent Visavadar bypoll where Congress contested against AAP candidates, effectively working to defeat them. "If there was truly an alliance with Congress, then why did they contest the Visavadar bypoll? They came to defeat us. BJP sent Congress to cut our votes," he stated, responding to questions from reporters.

The AAP leader was in Gujarat on a



three-day visit to kickstart the party's membership drive ahead of the 2027 Assembly elections in the state. This comes on the back of AAP's significant victory in the Visavadar by-election, which Kejriwal hailed as a turning point for the party's growth in Gujarat. At the membership drive launch in Ahmedabad, Kejriwal took a dig at Congress, accusing the party of being "hand-in-glove with the BJP" and claimed that AAP is emerg-

ing as a strong alternative to both the BJP and Congress. With this strategy, AAP aims to strengthen its foothold in Bihar and Gujarat, positioning itself as a key player in Indian politics outside the established alliances.

As the Bihar polls approach, AAP's decision to contest independently signals a new political equation and a challenge to the traditional players in the state.



Air India Cancels Delhi-Washington Flight Due to Extended Maintenance at Vienna Stopover

Air India cancelled its New Delhi to Washington, DC flight on July 2, 2025, following a technical snag detected during a routine stopover in Vienna, leading to extended maintenance work, the airline confirmed. This disruption also resulted in the cancellation of the return flight AII04 from Washington, DC to Delhi via Vienna.

The flight AII03 made a planned fuel stop in Vienna where the aircraft underwent routine checks. During these checks, an extended maintenance issue was identified that required immediate repair before the next flight. As a result, the Vienna to Washington segment was cancelled, and passengers were disembarked in Vienna.

Passengers with valid Schengen visas or eligible for visa-free entry were provided hotel accommodation in Vienna until the next available flight. Those without entry permission were also being accommodated pending immigration and security clearance by Austrian authorities.

The cancellation affected the return flight AI104 as well, and Air India has rebooked impacted passengers on alternate flights or offered full refunds based on individual preferences.

An airline spokesperson said the cancellations were part of Air India's "voluntary enhanced pre-flight safety checks" initiative, aimed at prioritising safety and minimising last-minute inconveniences. Despite efforts to maintain operational stability, challenges such as airspace closures, airport curfews in Europe and East Asia, and air traffic congestion occasionally cause delays or cancellations.

Air India operates over 1,100 daily flights and carries more than 150,000 passengers. The airline reiterated its commitment to safety and assured passengers of timely notifications to reduce inconvenience whenever possible.

The spokesperson expressed regret for the disruption and reaffirmed Air India's dedication to safe and reliable air travel despite unpredictable operational challenges.

"Had 30-45 Seconds To React": Pak PM's Aide On India's BrahMos Attack

A senior Pakistani politician has revealed that during the recent India-Pakistan military standoff, the Pakistan Armed Forces had only 30 to 45 seconds to determine whether an incoming Indian BrahMos missile carried a nuclear warhead—a window that could have triggered a catastrophic response.

Rana Sanaullah, adviser to Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, made the admission during an interview with a Pakistani news outlet. He referred to India's missile strike on the Nur Khan Airbase in Rawalpindi as part of 'Operation Sindoor,' a major Indian military campaign launched in response to a terrorist attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam that killed 26 tourists.

"When India fired the BrahMos missile at the Nur Khan airbase, our military had mere seconds to evaluate whether it was conventional or nuclear. That level of uncertainty could have led to an irreversible decision," Sanaullah said. He acknowledged the restraint shown by both sides but warned that a miscalculation could have escalated into global nuclear conflict.

India's operation targeted key Pakistani military facilities, including airbases at Sargodha, Chaklala (Nur Khan), Bholari, Jacobabad, Sukkur, and Rahim Yar Khan. Satellite imagery revealed significant damage to runways, aircraft hangars, and support infrastructure.

This was not the first Indian strike on Nur Khan; the base was previously hit during the 1971 war by the Indian Air Force's 20 Squadron flying Hawker Hunters.

Indian forces also destroyed multiple terrorist camps linked to Lashkar-e-Taiba, Jaish-e-Mohammad, and Hizbul Mujahideen, killing over 100 militants.

Following retaliatory drone and missile launches by Pakistan, which were intercepted by Indian defenses, India responded with precision strikes deep inside Pakistani territory. After four tense days, both nations agreed to a ceasefire.



Trump's "Big, Beautiful Bill" Awaits **Final Vote: How It Will Impact Indians**

US President Donald Trump's major tax-and-spending legislation, dubbed the "One Big, Beautiful Bill," is heading for a final vote in the House of Representatives after a turbulent passage through Congress. The bill, central to Trump's second-term agenda, has sparked controversy within his own Republican Party and among Democrats, mainly due to concerns over soaring national debt and cuts to social welfare programs.

Originally passed by the House in May, the bill returned for approval after narrowly clearing the Senate by a single vote, following several key revisions.

One significant update in the new version of the bill brings notable relief to non-resident Indians (NRIs) and Indian professionals working in the US who regularly send money home. The proposed tax on remittances to foreign countries, including India, has been substantially reduced. The earlier House version imposed a 3.5% tax, which was then lowered to 1% in the Senate's revised draft released on June



This tax applies to all US residents who are not US citizens—such as Green Card holders, temporary visa holders (including H-1B and H-2A), and foreign students. Nearly 4.5 million Indians living in the US, including around 3.2 million persons of Indian origin, are expected to benefit from this reduced tax on international money transfers.

According to the updated draft, "There is hereby imposed on any remittance transfer a tax equal to 1 per cent of the amount of such transfer... The tax imposed by this

section with respect to any remittance transfer shall be paid by the sender."

Moreover, the bill exempts transfers made from accounts held by financial institutions or funded using US-issued debit or credit cards, providing further relief for legitimate financial transactions.

This adjustment is seen as a significant win for the Indian diaspora in America, easing the financial burden on those supporting families back home through remittanc-

Thailand's New Cabinet Sworn In, Suspended PM Paetongtarn Takes Oath as Culture Minister

took their oaths of office on Thursday, July 3, 2025, including suspended Prime Minister Paetongtarn Shinawatra, who is currently under an ethics investigation.

Paetongtarn was suspended as Prime Minister on Tuesday by the Constitutional Court, which unanimously agreed to review allegations of ethical breaches linked to her handling of a border dis-

pute with Cambodia. Despite the suspension, the King approved a Thailand's new Cabinet members Cabinet lineup naming her as the new Minister of Culture. Smiling but silent, Paetongtarn arrived at Government House in Bangkok for the swearing-in ceremony alongside other Cabinet members but declined to answer questions from reporters.

> The ceremony was led by Acting Prime Minister Suriya Jungrungreangkit, who took the oath along with the rest of the Cabinet

before King Maha Vajiralongkorn and Queen Suthida. Suriya is expected to transfer his acting Prime Minister responsibilities to Deputy Prime Minister and Interior Minister Phumtham Wechayachai, who was also sworn in Thursday. Phumtham had previously served as Defence Minister under Paetongtarn's government.

Paetongtarn's suspension stems from a controversial phone call leaked with Cambodian Senate President Hun Sen, during which she sought to ease tensions following an armed border clash in May that resulted in the death of a Cambodian soldier. Critics accused her of overly conciliatory remarks that hurt Thailand's national image, sparking protests.

The Constitutional Court gave Paetongtarn 15 days to present evidence in her defense, but the timing of its final ruling remains uncertain. Meanwhile, Thailand moves forward with its new Cabinet amid political uncertainty, balancing governance and ongoing tensions at the border.

Drive-By Shooting in Chicago's River North Kills 4, Injures 14



A drive-by shooting in Chicago's River North neighborhood left four people dead and 14 others injured late Wednesday night, police reported on Thursday, July 3, 2025. Among the injured, at least three are in critical condition.

The incident took place outside a restaurant and lounge that had recently hosted an album release party for a rapper. According to police, an unidentified individual opened fire into a crowd gathered outside the venue before fleeing the scene in a vehicle that sped away immediately.

The victims range in age from 21 to 32 and include 13 women and five men. The four fatalities include two men and two women. The injured were rushed to multiple hospitals across the city for treatment.

Chris King, spokesperson for Northwestern Medicine, confirmed that the hospital's emergency depart-



ment was actively evaluating several shooting victims but did not disclose the exact number of patients or their conditions.

Chicago police are currently investigating the shooting, but no arrests have been made yet. Authorities are appealing for witnesses or anyone with information about the incident to come forward to assist in the ongoing investigation.

This violent event adds to Chicago's

ongoing struggles with gun violence, prompting renewed calls for enhanced community safety measures. Law enforcement officials have vowed to increase patrols in the area and intensify efforts to prevent such tragic occurrences.

The police department continues to work diligently to identify suspects and ensure justice for the victims and their families while striving to improve public safety in the city.



PM Modi Honoured with Ghana's 'Officer of the Order of the Star

India-Ghana Sign Key Cooperation MoUs

"This award deepens the friendship between our nations and places a new responsibility on me to further enhance our bilateral ties," Modi remarked, highlighting his confidence that his "historic" visit would inject fresh momentum into

India-Ghana relations.

The Ministry of External Affairs described the award as a symbol of the growing and close ties between the two democracies. During extensive talks, PM Modi and President Mahama agreed to elevate bilateral relations to a comprehensive partnership.

As part of the visit, India and Ghana signed four Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) to strengthen cooperation across multiple sectors. These included a Cultural Exchange Programme to foster collaboration in art, music, dance, literature, and heritage, and an MoU between the Bureau of Indian Standards and the Ghana Standards Authority to boost coordination in standardisation and certification.

Notably, this visit marks the first by an Indian Prime Minister to Ghana in three decades. PM Modi's trip is part of a broader five-nation tour, with upcoming visits to Trinidad and Tobago, Argentina, and Namibia, where he will pay tribute to Namibian liberation icon Sam Nujoma.

Three Indians Abducted in Mali Amid Al-Qaeda-Linked **Terror Attacks**

India Seeks Their Safe Release

India has expressed deep concern following the abduction of three Indian nationals in Mali amid a surge of terror attacks in the West African nation. The three Indians, employed at the Diamond Cement Factory in Kayes, were forcibly taken hostage during a coordinated armed assault on July 1, according to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA).

Though no group has yet claimed responsibility for the kidnappings, the Al-Qaeda-linked Jama'at Nusrat al-Islam wal-Muslimin (JNIM) has claimed credit for coordinated attacks across Mali on the same day. The situation has heightened fears about escalating violence in the region.

In response, the Indian government has urgently called upon the Malian authorities to take all necessary steps to ensure the safe and speedy release of the abducted citizens. The Indian embassy in Bamako is maintaining close and continuous communication with local law

enforcement, government officials, and the management of the Diamond Cement Factory.

The MEA confirmed that senior officials are actively monitoring developments and engaging at multiple levels to facilitate the hostages' early and safe return. The families of the abducted individuals are also being kept informed and supported during this distressing time.

India strongly condemned the attack, describing it as a "deplorable act of violence," and reiterated its commitment to securing the well-being of its nationals abroad.

Meanwhile, the MEA has issued a cautionary advisory for all Indians residing in Mali, urging them to remain vigilant, exercise utmost care, and stay in regular contact with the Indian embassy in Bamako for updates and assistance. India remains determined to provide all possible support and to ensure the safe return of the abducted individuals at the earliest opportunity.







■June, reaching a ten-month high driven by a sharp increase in new business, both domestic and international, according to the latest HSBC India Services PMI report released on July 3, 2025.

The seasonally adjusted HSBC India Services PMI Business Activity Index climbed from 58.8 in May to 60.4 in June, signaling strong growth in the sector. In PMI terms, a reading above 50 indicates expansion, while below 50 denotes contraction.

The surge was largely fueled by a significant rise in new orders, with domestic demand leading the way and export orders also growing, albeit at a slower pace. According to Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC, "New orders expanded at the quickest rate since August 2024." The increased overseas demand mainly came from key markets in Asia, the Middle East, and the U.S.

The ongoing sector growth positively impacted employment, with job creation continuing for the 37th consecutive month in June. Although the rate of employment growth slowed compared to May's record, it economic sector.

India's services sector marked a robust expansion in still outpaced the long-term average, highlighting sustained hiring momentum.

> On the pricing front, cost pressures were most pronounced in consumer services, while output price increases were highest in the finance and insurance sectors. However, input cost rises remained below the increase in output charges, supporting margin improvements for service providers.

> Despite the strong performance, optimism among service companies about future growth softened slightly, with only 18% expecting output to increase over the next year— the lowest confidence level since mid-

> Meanwhile, the HSBC India Composite PMI, which combines manufacturing and services data, rose from 59.3 in May to 61 in June, marking the fastest expansion in 14 months.

> The survey reflects responses from about 400 service sector firms and offers a clear snapshot of ongoing growth and evolving business sentiment in India's key

Sugar Production Expected to Rise 15% to 35 Million **Tonnes in 2025-26**

India's sugar pro-Iduction is projected to increase by 15 percent to around 35 million tonnes in the 2025-26 sugar season, driven by a favourable monsoon that is expected to boost sugarcane acreage and yields, according to a Crisil Ratings report released on Friday.

The report highlights that above-average monsoon rains will particularly benefit

key sugar-producing states such as Maharashtra and Karnataka, helping improve cane output. This growth in sugar production is likely to ease domestic supply shortages that have plagued the industry in recent years.

The increased supply could also support higher ethanol diversion, as sugar mills ramp up production of ethanol for blending with gasoline. Additionally, improved output may revive sugar exports if backed by appropriate government policies.

The report also noted the challenges faced by sugar mills in the previous fiscal year, including high sugarcane costs, subdued ethanol prices, and weak exports, which compressed operating profitability by 200 basis points to around 8.7-9 percent in FY25.

Looking ahead to fiscal 2026, the report anticipates a recovery in sugar mills' operating margins to about 9-9.5 percent, supported by improved supplies and potentially greater ethanol blend-

Overall, the forecasted rise in sugar production marks a positive turn for the industry, offering some relief to producers and contributing to a more stable sugar supply in the domestic market. The potential boost in ethanol diversion aligns with India's broader energy blending goals and may help reduce dependence on fossil fuels.

As the sugar sector continues to recover, policy support will remain critical to sustain growth in exports and improve the financial health of sugar mills amid fluctuating global and domestic market conditions.

Stock Market Closes Lower Amid Profit Booking and Cautious Sentiment Ahead of Economic Data



Indian equity markets end-**L**ed lower on Thursday, reflecting profit booking in key sectors and cautious investor sentiment ahead of important upcoming economic data. The Sensex declined by 170.22 points (0.20%) to close at 83,239.47, while the Nifty slipped 48.10 points (0.19%) to settle around 25,405.30 after a volatile trading session.

Market breadth remained almost balanced with 1,947 stocks advancing, 1,912 declining, and 154 unchanged. On the Nifty, Apollo Hospitals, Hero MotoCorp, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories, ONGC, and Maruti Suzuki emerged as the top gainers. Conversely, SBI Life Insurance, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Bajaj Finance, JSW Steel, and Bajaj Finserv were among the major laggards.

Sector-wise, metal, realty, and PSU banks declined by about 0.5% each. In contrast, pharma, media, oil & gas, auto, and consumer durables posted gains ranging from 0.3% to 1%.

Institutional Equity, noted that the Nifty opened flat at 25,505 and touched an intraday low of 25,384 before rallying to a high of 25,587. However, renewed selling pressure in the second half pushed the index lower, ending the day on a subdued note. He pointed out sectoral strength in media, consumer durables, healthcare, and automobiles, while PSU banks, metals, and realty stocks faced pressure.

Investor caution stemmed largely from uncertainty over the ongoing US-India trade negotiations. Market participants remained on the sidelines, awaiting clarity on the trade deal and the approaching US tariff deadline set by President Donald Trump. Despite hopes for a breakthrough, this uncertainty weighed on overall market sentiment.

In the previous session on Wednesday, the Sensex had slipped over 300 points, and the Nifty dropped nearly 100 points, wiping out earlier gains fueled by positive macroeconomic and global trade cues.



India Set to Become Third-Largest Economy by 2030, Says Hardeep Puri

Leleventh to the fourth-largest economy globally and is on track India's ability to attract foreign to become the world's third-largest economy by 2030, Union Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri announced at the 77th Foundation Day of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) in New Delhi.

Puri highlighted India's impressive GDP growth, which more than doubled from \$2.1 trillion in 2014 to \$4.3 trillion in 2025. This remarkable progress is attributed to the nation's resilience amid global challenges, driven by bold policy reforms, extensive social welfare initiatives, and strong financial management.

The minister underscored the success of flagship programs, such as lifting over 27 crore citizens out of multidimensional poverty, sanctioning nearly four crore homes under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana, and providing piped water to 15.4 crore rural households through the Jal Jeevan Mission. Additionally, Ayushman Bharat has extended health coverage to more than 70 crore individuals, offering a Rs 5

Tndia has surged from being the lakh insurance benefit.

investment also saw significant growth, with \$748 billion in foreign direct investment between 2014 and 2025—a 143% increase from the previous decade. The number of source countries investing in India expanded from 89 to 112.

Key policy reforms such as the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, Production-Linked Incentive schemes, GST implementation, and the elimination of thousands of compliances have strengthened India's business environment. The tax administration has evolved, with annual income tax returns increasing from 3.6 crore in FY 2013-14 to 8.5 crore in FY 2024-25, 95% processed within 30 days.

Looking forward, Puri urged chartered accountants to adopt artificial intelligence and advanced analytics to enhance strategic decision-making and maintain competitiveness in the evolving financial landscape, stressing that embracing AI is now essential for innovation and growth.

India's Industrial Growth Slows to 9-Month Low of 1.2% in May 2025

Tndia's industrial output growth slipped to a nine-**⊥** month low of 1.2% in May 2025, reflecting a significant slowdown in key sectors such as electricity and mining. This marks the weakest growth since August 2024 and is a decline from 2.6% in April, according to official data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO) on Monday. The April figure was also revised downward from the earlier estimate of 2.7%.


The latest data from the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) — which tracks changes in the volume of production in factories, mines, and utilities — points to broad-based weakness, with particular stress in energy and resource-linked industries. Electricity output contracted sharply by 5.8%, while mining output saw a marginal decline of 0.1% year-on-year.

In contrast, manufacturing, which constitutes the bulk of the IIP, provided some support with 2.6% growth, driven by increased production in machinery, non-metallic minerals, and basic metals. However, this was still notably below the 5.1% growth recorded in the same month last year, indicating persistent softness in industrial momentum.

Sector-wise, consumer goods remained weak, reflecting subdued demand, while capital goods and infrastructure-related output offered modest positive contributions to overall industrial performance.

The IIP reading for May stood at 156.6, up slightly from 154.7 in May 2024, but the slow pace of expansion raises concerns about the resilience of India's industrial recovery amid global uncertainties and domestic demand challenges.

This deceleration in industrial activity may influence monetary policy discussions, especially as the Reserve Bank of India weighs the implications of softening growth against ongoing inflation risks.

According to the artist's press release, the sculpture is an "irreverent take on classical fountains" and is meant to challenge the norms of public art. But the reaction online has been mixed. Many social media users have slammed the installation, calling it "disturbing," "gross," and "inappropriate for public space." "I told the team at halftime — we have high standards, and we had to raise our game," Norway coach Gemma Grainger said post-match.

Swiss coach Pia Sundhage, who had earlier called managing Switzerland her "biggest challenge," looked dejected after the defeat. The team was aiming for only its second win in European Championship history.

The match followed a visually striking opening ceremony celebrating Swiss traditions, diversity, and unity, marking a grand start to the tournament in the nation's largest stadium, which will also host the final.
