SC Orders Speaker to Act on Defector **MLAs in 3 Months**

In a major development related to party defections in Telangana, the Supreme Court on Wednesday directed the Speaker of the Telangana Legislative Assembly to take a decision within three months on the disqualification petitions filed against ten MLAs who won on BRS tickets but later joined the Congress. The verdict came from a bench headed by Chief Justice of India D.Y. Chandrachud (not BR Gavai as initially mentioned), which firmly stated that prolonged inaction on defection petitions undermines the spirit of democracy. While refusing to disqualify the MLAs directly, the Supreme Court made it clear that it is the Speaker's constitutional responsibility to dispose of such petitions in a timely manner.

Rejecting the BRS party's plea seeking direct disqualification through the judiciary, the bench said, "We cannot assume the role of the Speaker." However, the court warned that if MLAs attempt to delay the proceedings beyond three months, the Speaker is entitled to take an adverse view.



Local Polls in Limbo Amid **Reservation Row**

Telangana: There are increasing indications that local body elections in Telangana may face further delay. With the state government maintaining a silence instead of providing clarity, opposition parties are alleging that the polls are being postponed under the pretext of implementing reservations. Critics question how long the government can continue without public representatives, warning that democratic rights are being undermined at the panchayat and municipal levels.Despite a clear directive from the High Court, the government has yet to announce a timeline. With the deadline approaching, the opposition continues to target the Revanth Reddy government over its indecisiveness. Allegations are mounting that this delay is politically motivated, with accusations of "diversionary politics" being played through padayatras instead of addressing the polls directly.

Political analysts argue that while the intention to provide 42% reservation for BCs is commendable, it must be backed by legally robust action and political clarity. Right now, the Congress government appears stuck—caught between the



High Court's deadline and growing public dissatisfaction.

Its inability to initiate the election process is increasingly seen as both a defiance of court orders and a breach of public trust.

Congress leaders claim the reservation ordinance has been sent to the Centre, but the process remains stalled due to lack of clarity from Delhi. Meanwhile, the BJP and BRS have intensified their criticism, accusing the Congress of misleading BCs and orchestrating political

drama without a concrete legal roadmap. BJP leaders are questioning whether Congress even understands that any such law placed under the Ninth Schedule would still be subject to Supreme Court review. BRS, on the other hand, mocks the Congress for scaring people with "Char Sau Bis" tactics.

Adding to the speculation, Congress leader Meenakshi Natarajan's padayatra and meetings with BC organisations have sparked political debate. Opposition leaders argue these

events are designed to divert attention from the government's failure to hold elections and to cover up the lack of legal preparation on the reservation issue. Now, the Revanth Sarkar is left with two clear choices—comply with the High Court and conduct elections, or continue delaying them under the guise of reservation implementation. Will the government act decisively to uphold democratic norms, or will it continue to postpone the inevitable? That remains the burning question.

Probe Report Submitted to Govt

The much-anticipated report on the alleged irregularities in the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project is now in the hands of the Telangana government. The inquiry commission led by Justice PC Ghosh, constituted to investigate discrepancies in the construction of key barrages, has officially submitted its final report.

The Justice Ghosh Commission, set up on March 14, 2024, by the state government, focused its investigation on the construction of the Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla barrages. Over the course of 15 months, the commission interrogated 115 individuals and meticulously gathered evidence to assess the structural, financial, and procedural aspects of the project works.

According to official sources, the final report was recently submitted to Irrigation Department Principal Secretary Rahul Bojja in a sealed cover. The details of the findings remain confidential at this stage, but the submission marks a crucial step in addressing long-standing questions about the integrity and execution of one of Telangana's most ambitious irrigation initiatives.

The commission's inquiry followed widespread concerns and political criticism regarding the quality and safety of the barrages, particularly after reports of structural damage emerged. With the report now in government hands, the next course of action—whether legal, administrative, or political—is expected to unfold in the coming weeks. The state government is yet to announce when or whether the report will be made public.

CM Revanth Plans New DISCOM for Telangana

In a significant move aimed at reforming the power sector, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has directed officials to prepare plans for establishing a new power distribution company (DISCOM) in Telangana. Currently, the state has two DISCOMs—Southern Power Distribution Company Limited (SPDCL) and Northern Power Distribution Company Limited (NPDCL).

During a high-level review meeting held at his residence, the Chief Minister said the new DISCOM should oversee the implementation of 200 units of free electricity provided under schemes like Griha Jyoti, agricultural subsidies, and for government educational institutions.

Revanth Reddy stressed the need for comprehensive reforms to clean up the power sector and emphasized that the creation of another DISCOM would not only improve service delivery but also help increase national ratings for the existing companies.

He highlighted the financial strain on current DIS-COMs, stating that they have defaulted on loans while paying interest rates of up to 10%. To address this, he instructed officials to restructure existing loans at lower interest rates and work toward reducing the overall debt burden.

In a push for renewable energy, the Chief Minister also asked officials to take immediate steps to install solar power systems in government offices and buildings. He assigned district collectors the task of identifying suitable sites for these solar units.

Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka and senior power department officials were present at the review meeting.

Uttam Orders Action on Land Encroachments

Irrigation Minister Capt. N. Uttam Kumar Reddy has ordered a state-wide crackdown on encroachments of Irrigation Department lands, directing officials to reclaim the properties on a war footing and take strict legal and administrative action against illegal occupa-

Chairing a high-level review meeting at Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Telangana Secretariat,

the Minister emphasized zero tolerance towards encroachments, especially of lands worth hundreds of crores. He instructed departments to immediately fence off vulnerable properties and reclaim illegally occupied lands without delay.

The Minister called for

Government Pleader for the Irrigation Department to handle legal hurdles, particularly in ongoing court disputes.

Highlighting major encroachments in Hyderabad, Uttam Kumar Reddy said 131.31 acres out of 426.30 acres under WALAMTARI and TGERL near Gandipet and Rajendranagar were encroached. Of this, 81.26 acres fall under the ITIR zone and are under litigation, while 50.13 acres are directly encroached. Twenty cases are pending in district courts, with two more in the High

The Minister instructed the Irrigation, HYDRAA, Revenue, and R&R departments to work in close coordination and prepare a full inventory of all Irrigation Department lands, quarters, and buildings across the state. He also directed the repossession of illegally occupied government quarters and sought a detailed report.

KTR asserted that no further investigation is needed in the case of the ten MLAs, as their party-switching is public and ongoing. He demanded their immediate disqualification, noting that they continue to participate in Congress government programs without any legal standing.

BJP Blames Congress for Urea Shortages

BJP Telangana State General Secretary Gujjula Premender Reddy, addressing a press conference at the party's state office, accused the Congress-led Telangana government of spreading false propaganda about urea shortages.

He said that under the UPA regime, farmers faced fertilizer scarcity, but the Modi government resolved the issue by reviving shut-down fertilizer factories, including the ₹6,300 crore Ramagundam plant in Telangana. He highlighted that ₹3.80 lakh crore has been deposited into farmers' accounts through PM-Kisan, and ₹1.40 lakh crore is provided annually as fertilizer subsidy. Refuting the state's claim of shortages, he explained that of the 6.14 lakh metric tonnes required this Kharif season, 6.12 lakh tonnes have already been dispatched, 4.36 lakh tonnes sold, and 1.76 lakh tonnes remain in stock, with more

Despite global supply issues due to geopolitical tensions and reduced exports from China, the Centre is ensuring sufficient supply. He alleged that any perceived shortage is due to mismanagement, black marketing, and diversion for non-agricultural use at the state level.

Reddy challenged Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao to provide evidence of the alleged shortage and said the BJP is ready for a discussion. He further criticized the Congress government for failing to implement its poll guarantees and for not providing MSP or bonuses to farmers as promised. He demanded that the state government act responsibly, apologize to farmers, and correct the lapses in fertilizer distribution.

Kavitha Seeks ₹35L for Displaced Farmers

Kavitha has demanded that the State government pay a compensation of at least ₹35 lakh per acre to farmers displaced by the Kodangal-Narayanpet Lift Irrigation Scheme. She alleged that the authorities were currently offering only ₹14 lakh per acre, falling short of the ₹20 lakh per acre earlier promised by Chief Minister

meeting with affected farmers in Kanukurthy village of Kodangal constituency, Kavitha also criticised the government for shelving the Karivena package under the Palamuru-Rangareddy Lift Irrigation Scheme. She said that the package, with 95% of head works completed by the previous BRS government, was planned to irrigate 1.8 lakh acres in the region. In contrast, the new scheme under the present government reduces the irrigation potential to just 1 lakh acres. She raised concerns over the change in the water source, stating that instead of drawing water from the Jurala project, the

government now plans to use the Bhoothpur link of the Bhima Lift Irrigation Scheme, limiting water supply to the Makthal area.

Kavitha also questioned the sharp escalation in the project cost from ₹2,900 crore to ₹4,500 crore without any groundwork. She alleged the increase could be intended for kickbacks. Furthermore, she criticised the release of ₹600 crore each to two contractors as mobilisation advance before the commencement of any work.

She urged the government to provide employment to one member of each displaced family and construct a housing colony to rehabilitate them.

BJP to Hold Protest for BC Rights

BJP State General Secretary Dr. Kasam Venkateswarlu announced that the party's OBC Morcha will hold a major protest (Mahadharna) at Dharna Chowk, Indira Park, on August 2, demanding justice for BCs (Backward Classes) and criticizing the Congress-led state government for its alleged betrayal.

Speaking at a press conference at the BJP Telangana state office, he said that key BJP OBC Morcha leaders from Hyderabad, Ranga Reddy, and nearby districts met earlier in the day. BJP State President N. Ramchandra Rao also attended. A meeting of BJP Yuva Morcha office bearers was held later.Dr. Venkateswarlu accused Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of betraying the BC community by not fulfilling promises made in the Kamareddy Declaration. He alleged that the CM walked away from responsibility by saying the 42% BC reservation issue was not in his control and left for Delhi after a cabinet meeting. He called this an insult to the people and questioned



why such basic constitutional knowledge was lacking in the state leadership.

He said the BJP demands immediate implementation of all BC-related promises made by the Congress during the elections. He claimed that neither the CM nor the Congress government has taken meaningful action for BC welfare

despite being in power. Dr. Venkateswarlu also criticized BRS leader Kavitha, accusing her of suddenly showing interest in BC issues for political survival. "After enjoying power for ten years, she is now talking about BC rights and planning a 72-hour hunger strike. This is nothing but an attempt to whitewash her political record," he remarked. He alleged that the Congress

and BRS are both using BC reservations as a political tool and that the BJP will expose their true intentions. SC Supported Speaker, Not BRS: Dayakar

Congress MLC Addanki Dayakar clarified that the Supreme Court did not question the constitutional powers of the Assembly Speaker in deciding disqualification petitions but only offered procedural suggestions. Addressing the media at the CLP media point on Thursday, he said the apex court reaffirmed that it is solely the Speaker's responsibility to safeguard the rights and dignity of the legislature.

Taking a swipe at the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), Dayakar criticised its leaders for misinterpreting the verdict. "BRS leaders are misleading the public by claiming the judgment is in their favour. They should first read and understand what the court actually said," he remarked.

He accused BRS chief K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) of subverting democratic norms during his tenure. "KCR has a track record of engineering defections and merging other parties into his own. His government violated constitutional values for a decade," he alleged.

Dayakar said that KCR's intolerance toward a Dalit leader heading the Congress Legislature Party was the reason behind the controversial merger of the CLP with the BRS. "KCR couldn't stand a Dalit leading the opposition and orchestrated the merger. He even tried to destroy the communist parties. But our alliance with them helped save democracy," he added. 
HC Reserves Verdict on Deverakonda's Plea

On the other hand, the respondent's counsel opposed the plea, stating that the actor's apology should not have any bearing on the legal process and urged the court to allow the case to proceed. Following detailed submissions, the court reserved its verdict.

GHMC Steps Up Mosquito Control Drive

The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) has intensified anti-larva operations across the city to curb mosquito-borne diseases during the monsoon season. Acting on the instructions of Commissioner R.V. Karnan, the civic body has launched a comprehensive mosquito eradication campaign across more than 15,500 colonies in July alone.

As part of this initiative, thousands of personnel are conducting door-to-door inspections and awareness drives. So far, officials have inspected over 34.45 lakh houses two to three times and found larval presence in approximately 1.5 percent of them. Additionally, 1.10 crore water containers were checked, with 0.5 percent found to be affected. To educate the public, awareness programs have been conducted in more than 1,700 schools and 320 colleges about Indoor Residual Spray (IRS) and mosquito prevention.

Commissioner Karnan is closely monitoring the program, reviewing daily updates, and addressing gaps in implementation. He has directed staff to carry out operations more efficiently to prevent the spread of seasonal diseases such as dengue, malaria, and chikungunya. GHMC officials said these consistent efforts have led to a noticeable reduction in mosquito-related illnesses compared to previous years. (CPRO – GHMC)

GHMC Sweep on **Food Safety Violations**



TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad Responding to public complaints about unhygienic food handling and poor quality, the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation's (GHMC) food safety wing conducted surprise inspections across 27 commercial establishments, including retail storage units and delivery points, on Thursday.

During the inspections, officials collected 36 food samples and identified several violations. Common issues included the absence of mandatory medical fitness certificates for food handlers, unsanitary storage conditions, and lack of proper documentation. Several establishments were found operating in violation of basic hygiene protocols, raising concerns about consumer safety.

The crackdown was ordered by GHMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan, who directed the food safety team

to intensify checks across outlets operating under major e-commerce and quick-commerce platforms. These include Zepto, Amazon Fresh, InstaMart, Blinkit, Big Basket, Swiggy, Zomato, and oth-

The inspection teams were tasked with examining food quality, expiry dates, storage standards, employee hygiene, and compliance with licensing requirements. Establishments found in violation were issued notices and instructed to take corrective measures immediately.

Officials have confirmed that this is part of a larger, ongoing drive aimed at tightening food safety enforcement in Hyderabad. More inspections are expected in the coming days to ensure that food supplied to consumers—especially through online platforms—meets regulatory standards.

SLBC Tunnel Work to Resume with Safer Method

Work on the Srisailam Left Bank Canal (SLBC) tunnel is set to resume with a revised excavation strategy, months after a tragic collapse in February halted progress. Authorities have decided to bypass the collapse zone by shifting the tunnel alignment by 100 metres to avoid the geologically unstable sec-

Abandoning the earlier Tunnel Boring Machine (TBM) method, officials will now adopt the drilland-controlled-blast technique for the remaining 9 km stretch. This method allows for better assessment of rock conditions ahead of excavation and is considered both safer and more cost-effective.

The 44-km-long SLBC tunnel is a crucial infrastructure project aimed at transferring Krishna River water from the Srisailam reservoir to drought-affected regions of Nalgonda and Nagarkurnool dis-



tricts. On February 22, a portion of the tunnel collapsed in Nagarkurnool, trapping eight workers — including two engineers. Only two bodies have been recovered so far; six remain untraced.

Officials estimate the cost of completing the remaining stretch using the new method at ₹900 crore — approximately ₹100 crore per kilometre. This is significantly lower than the ₹2,000 crore projected for the TBM-based approach.

The decision to revise the method and route is intended to enhance worker safety and ensure timely completion of the long-pending project.

More Solar Plants Coming Soon: Singareni CMD

Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) Chairman and Managing Director N. Balaram has directed officials to complete the construction of 122 MW of solar power plants currently underway by October. He also instructed them to begin work immediately on an additional 137 MW of solar capacity, for which tendering has already been completed, aiming to reach a total capacity of 504 MW.Balaram issued these directives during a comprehensive review meeting held at Singareni Bhavan to assess the progress of solar projects and other business expansion strategies.

Emphasising timely execution, he warned implementing agencies and supervising officers that delays would not be tolerated, and strict action would be taken in case of any negligence.

Referring to a recent feasibility report on setting up a green hydrogen plant in Ramagundam, he directed officials to expedite the groundwork for the project. Once operational, the plant is expected to produce five tonnes of green hydrogen per day, providing a significant financial boost to the company.

In addition, Balaram highlighted the potential for a large-scale geothermal power project in the Manuguru area,

in collaboration with ONGC. He ordered immediate preparatory steps for setting up the joint venture plant.

He also instructed officials to fast-track feasibility studies on establishing wind power plants on overburden dumps of open cast mines, and to explore the viability of pumped storage hydro power projects in Medipalli and other locations. Liquor Seized Inside Shiva Temple

A controversy erupted in Manuguru village after liquor bottles were found inside a prominent Shiva temple, prompting swift action from the Telangana Endowments Department. Acting on complaints from locals, officials conducted an inspection and discovered the bottles stored within the temple premises.

The head priest, reportedly battling health issues, is alleged to have developed a dependency on alcohol. Officials reprimanded him and issued a formal warning, stressing that such behavior would not be tolerated in sacred spaces.

The incident has triggered wider



conversations around regional traditions. In many tribal and rural parts of Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, and Chhattisgarh, it is customary to offer Mahua liquor—locally known as Ippah Sara—to deities like Lord Shiva during festivals. Due to seasonal unavailability and regulatory restrictions on Mahua, commercial

liquor is sometimes used as a substitute. Alcohol and toddy are also traditionally offered to folk goddesses such as Yellamma, Maisamma, and Pochamma.

While such offerings are part of longstanding local customs, officials clarified that storing or consuming alcohol inside the temple's inner sanctum is strictly prohibited. The Endowments Department emphasized that religious tradition must not be misused to justify personal misconduct.

Authorities have urged temple staff to uphold sanctity and discipline, warning of stricter action if similar violations occur again.



The Hour of Reckoning: Reimagining Governance

us. There's nowhere left for the incapable to hide. Let's call all government employees what they truly are: the very machinery that runs our government. No longer can we simply tinker at the edges; the entire apparatus of governance teeters on a precipice. The choice is stark: undertake a monumental repair of its creaking gears, or boldly forge an entirely new engine capable of seizing the visionary future that beck-

No matter how visionary a national or state leader might be, the machinery meant to translate that vision into a mission often grinds its cogs, its momentum faltering, threatening to leave the State's dreams in the dust. But we refuse to vield to stagnation!

Eminent economist Lord Meghnad Desai, a prominent figure and former Labour politician who recently passed away at 85, once offered a poignant insight into India's developmental dilemmas. I had the privilege of discussing these issues with him when he was a Professor Emeritus of the London School of Economics (LSE), This scholar, who wrote extensively on Marxian economics, famously declared that India's curse lay in its very own labor laws, which "protect those who are irresponsible, corrupt, or incapable of the jobs they are designated for."

to hierarchy over merit. This embodies the Peter Principle, which posits that individuals rise to their level of incompetence. In government, promotions are too often based on tenure, not on genuine capability. The result: decision-making is led by those ill-equipped to innovate or take bold action. Overcoming this requires cultivating a merit-based culture, where tangible outcomes, not years served, determine responsibility and advancement.

Another significant flaw is the obsession with procedures rather than purpose. Max Weber's model of bureaucracy, though once revolutionary, now shackles modern governance with excessive paperwork, rigid rules, and agonizingly slow response times. While rules are intended to ensure accountability, overregulation frequently becomes a tool for evasion and delay. The solution lies in simplifying rules, decentralizing authority, and digitizing workflows to significantly increase speed and transparency.

Politics further aggravates the proboverstaffing, misplaced loyalties, and appointments based on connections rather than competence. This culture erodes accountability, as the "small wheels" become untouchable due to their political

The hour of reconciliation is upon One of the most glaring manage- backing. A clear firewall between ment failures is the blind adherence politics and administration is necessary. Civil servants must be empowered and protected to act in the public interest, not merely for political convenience. Failed government programs, such as India's earlier Five-Year Plans or Venezuela's centrally controlled economy, demonstrate that rigid, top-down planning without room for feedback or course correction is destined to collapse. Flexibility, adaptability, and responsiveness must replace these outdated central planning models.

Thoughts towards a leaner, smarter government for a quantum leap.

To repair this ailing machinery, governments must adopt agile, citizen-centric management practices. This includes flattening hierarchies, leveraging data for informed decision-making, implementing real-time monitoring systems, and eliminating overlapping departments. Public servants must receive comprehensive training in modern governance principles, digital tools, and practical problem. Political patronage leads to lem-solving, moving beyond mere rule-following. I am increasingly convinced that many departments within the Andhra government are driven by a strong determination to make Andhra a leader in digital governance, striving to rise above

become redundant. I propose establishing a new, crucial ministry: the 'Ministry for Simplicity'. Currently, most Indian governments have a minimum of 22 to 30 ministries. Andhra Pradesh, for instance, has 25 portfolios. Let us create a minister with one single, overarching portfolio, the Ministry of Simplicity. The primary mandate of this ministry would be to oversee all other ministries' projects and to systematically simplify them. This new ministry would implement a real-time check on every project, preventing the escalation of costs

due to extravagances and unwarranted dues that often plague initiatives that could otherwise be completed within 60% of their allocated budget.

My all-time favorite management guru, the pragmatic Edward de Bono, consistently advocated for the critical importance of simplifying our increasingly complex world. He argued that complexity often results not from the inherent nature of problems, but from poor design, outdated structures, and an inability to think creatively. De Bono, renowned for pioneering lateral thinking, emphasized that simplicity isn't about "dumbing things down," but about making systems more effective, efficient, and easier to use or understand.

In conclusion, repairing government machinery is not merely about replacing parts; it is about fundamentally reengineering the entire system. It demands the courage to remove dead weight, the political will to insulate administration from undue interference, and a mindset that values simplicity, speed, and genuine public service over entrenched tradition and the status quo.

Trump's 25% Tariff on **India Sparks Diplomatic Crisis and Global Concerns**



In a dramatic announcement posted on Truth Social, U.S. President Donald Trump declared a 25% tariff on all imports from India starting August 1, citing high Indian tariffs, trade imbalances, and continued purchases of Russian oil and weapons. The statement, heavy on rhetoric and light on diplomacy, has sent shockwaves across global markets and diplomatic circles.

While Trump began by calling India a "friend," he quickly pivoted to accusations, claiming India imposes "obnoxious" trade barriers and contributes to "unfair" trade deficits. He also hinted at further penalties, specifically targeting India's longstanding defence and energy partnerships with Russia — partnerships that have historically been a key part of India's strategic autonomy.

India's response was measured. The Commerce Ministry said the government is "studying the implications" and reaffirmed its commitment to a "fair and balanced" bilateral trade agreement with the U.S., which had been under negotiation for several months. But behind the calm exterior, policymakers are clearly on high alert. Indian exports to the U.S., which include textiles, pharmaceuticals, jewellery, and electronics, are now at risk of losing competitiveness in the American market. Countries like Vietnam and Bangladesh, which face lower or no such tariffs, are poised

to benefit.

Economists warn the tariff could drag India's GDP by 0.2 percentage points in the coming fiscal year, while businesses express concern about supply chain disruptions and lost contracts. The move also threatens key sectors like agriculture and dairy, which Trump has previously insisted be opened to U.S. firms—a demand India has resisted, citing its massive rural employment base.

Trump's tariff blitz, which also targeted Brazil on the same day, fits a now-familiar pattern of aggressive, one-sided trade actions cloaked in populist messaging. Experts say it reflects a shift from multilateral diplomacy to performance-driven geopolitics, where tweets often carry more weight than treaties.

India now faces a crucial choice: retaliate and risk escalation, or diversify trade relations and bolster domestic industries. Strengthening regional ties, expanding trade with Southeast Asia, Africa, and Latin America, and investing in initiatives like Make in India may be key strategies.

Trump's tariff theatrics may dominate headlines, but the long-term path forward, for India and others, lies in building resilient, multipolar trade partnerships grounded in dialogue—not disruption.

Rahul Backs Trump's 'Dead Economy' Jibe

However, senior Congress leaders distanced themselves from Gandhi's remarks. Congress MP Shashi Tharoor said Trump's comments were "unreasonable" and emphasized that India should not give in to Washington's pressure. "We have ongoing negotiations with the EU, we already concluded a deal with the UK, and we are talking with other countries also. If we can't compete in America, we may have to diversify our markets. We are not out of options," he said. Congress Rajva Sabha MP Rajiv Shukla also rejected Trump's remarks as "completely

wrong." Speaking to ANI, he stated, "Our economic condition is not at all weak. If someone claims they can finish us economically, it's likely due to a misunderstanding. Trump is living in a delusion." He later told NDTV that "India's trade policies are sovereign. No country can dictate who we can or cannot do business with."

Electoral College Finalised for VP Polls

The Election Commission of India has finalised the Electoral College for the upcoming Vice Presidential election following the resignation of Jagdeep Dhankhar, who stepped down citing health concerns. The Commission is expected to announce the election schedule next week.

As per Article 66(1) of the Constitution, the Electoral College for the Vice President's election comprises elected and nominated members of the Rajya Sabha as well as the elected members of the Lok Sabha. With the list now frozen, no new additions to the Electoral College will be per-

Earlier this week, the Commission released a public booklet detailing the entire process and legal provisions of the Vice Presidential election. This includes the eligibility criteria, filing of nominations, schedule formulation, appointment of election officials, voting system, counting process, and dispute resolution mechanisms.

The EC is constitutionally bound to fill the vacancy "as soon as possible", generally within six months. However, the new Vice President, once elected, will serve a full five-year term and not just the remaining period of Dhankhar's tenure.

In the interim, the Deputy Chairman of the Rajya Sabha will assume the Vice President's parliamentary responsibilities, including presiding over Rajya Sabha sessions.

Will Act in National Interest: Piyush Goyal on US Tariffs

A day after US President Donald Trump announced a 25% tariff and an additional unspecified penalty on Indian exports due to India's continued oil and defence purchases from Russia, Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal assured Parliament that the Centre will take all necessary steps to safeguard the country's national interest.

Speaking in the Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha on Thursday, Goyal said, "The implications of these recent developments are being carefully studied. We are in constant touch with stakeholders, including exporters and industry representatives. The government is fully committed to protecting the interests of our farmers, MSMEs, workers, exporters and industrial sector. We will act decisively in India's national interest."

Goyal confirmed that the US had issued a reciprocal tariff order on April 2, with a baseline duty of 10%, which rose to 26% including the country-specific penalty for India. Though initially suspended, the additional duties came into effect from August 1.

He also responded to Trump's description of India as a "dead econ-such partnerships.



omy", saying, "India has moved from being one of the 'fragile five' to the fastest growing major economy. We are among the world's top five economies now, and are on track to becoming the third-largest in a few years."

Highlighting India's progress, Goyal said the country had contributed 16% of global growth and had become a manufacturing and export hub. He also noted that India had successfully signed free trade agreements with the UAE, UK, and of a comprehensive, balanced Australia, and would pursue more trade deal by October–November

US Tariff Move 'Unreasonable' Says Shahi **Tharoor**

Congress MP Shashi Tharoor has slammed US President Donald Trump's decision to impose a 25% tariff and additional penalties on Indian imports, calling it "completely unreasonable" and warning that India must not give in to American pressure.

Speaking to reporters outside Parliament on Thursday, Tharoor said, "This move comes even as trade negotiations between the two nations are still ongoing. It may just be a bargaining tactic, but if implemented, it will seriously hurt India's trade and economy."

The tariff and penalty are reportedly in response to India's ongoing defence and energy deals with Russia, including crude oil and military hardware purchases. The penalty, Tharoor said, could be "35% or 45%, even 100%" depending on how far the US administration push-

"America is a very big market for us, with our exports worth nearly 90 billion dollars. If there's a sharp drop in trade, we could lose up to half a percent of our GDP," Tharoor warned.

The Lok Sabha MP, known for his critical yet nuanced stance on foreign policy, said India could show "limited flexibility" during trade talks but should not compromise its core interests. "We have 700 million Indians dependent on agriculture. We cannot risk their livelihood to please America. Their demands are unreasonable, and our negotiators must resist," he added.

Tharoor has been broadly supportive of the Modi government's handling of foreign affairs in recent months, but said this situation calls for "firm resistance" from all sides. His remarks come as the Indian rupee dipped and markets reeled ahead of the tariff's effective date.

Pragya Thakur, Col Purohit Acquitted in Malegaon Blast Case

In a landmark judgment after 17 years, a Special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court in Mumbai on Wednesday acquitted all seven accused in the 2008 Malegaon blast case, including former BJP MP Sadhvi Pragya Singh Thakur and former Army officer Lt Col Prasad Shrikant Puro-

The verdict was pronounced by Special Judge A K Lahoti, who observed that the prosecution failed to establish the charges under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA), Arms Act and other sections. "The accused deserve the benefit of doubt," the judge stated in the courtroom.

The Malegaon blast took place on September 29, 2008, in the communally sensitive town of Malegaon in Maharashtra, killing six people and injuring over 100. The explosion occurred during



Ramzan and just ahead of the Navratri festival. The seven accused in the case were Sadhvi Pragya Singh Thakur, Lt Col Prasad Purohit, Major (Retd) Ramesh Upadhyay, Ajay Rahirkar, Sudhakar Dwivedi, Sudhakar Chaturvedi, and Sameer

Sadhvi Pragya was arrested in October 2008 af-

ter investigators found that the motorcycle used in the explosion was registered in her name. The Maharashtra Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) alleged that she was part of a conspiracy targeting Muslim-majority areas in retaliation for previous at-

Reacting to the verdict, Col Purohit said, "I am

extremely grateful to the country and those who stood by us. The judiciary has delivered justice. During this fight, the armed forces stood with me. I have no words to express my gratitude." Sadhvi Pragya, who was present in court during the verdict, told the judge, "I said from the beginning that there has to be a basis to call someone for investigation. I was arrested and tortured. My life was ruined. I lived like a sage, yet I was accused. No one stood with us. Today, the truth has prevailed. Bhagwa has won. Hindutva has won.

God will punish the guilty."

India Begins Work on Chenab Hydro Project





Medvedev Hits Back at Trump's 'Dead **Economies' Remark**

A fresh wave of diplomatic tension has erupted after US President Donald Trump described India and Russia as "dead economies" and criticised their continued defence cooperation, prompting a sharp and ominous response from top Russian official Dmitry Medvedev. Posting on Truth Social, Trump lashed out at both countries saying, "India and Russia can take their dead economies down together." He also announced 25% tariffs on Indian imports and criticised New Delhi's military and energy ties with Moscow. "They have always bought the vast majority of their military equipment from Russia... and are Russia's largest buyer of energy, along with China," Trump said, adding that the world is seeking to isolate Russia over its actions in Ukraine.

This marks the second online clash between Trump and Medvedev this summer. In his latest post, Trump ridiculed the former Russian president, saying, "Tell Medvedev, the failed former President of Russia, who thinks he's still President, to watch his words. He's entering very dangerous territory."

In response, Medvedev, currently Deputy Chairman of Russia's Security Council, issued a blistering reply on Telegram. "As for the talk about the 'dead economies' of India and Russia, and 'entering dangerous territory' — maybe he should recall his favorite movies about 'the walking dead,' and also remember how dangerous the so-called 'Dead Hand,' which doesn't even exist, could be," he warned.

The "Dead Hand", or Perimeter, is a Cold War-era nuclear retaliation system designed to automatically launch a counterstrike even if Russia's leadership is

Taking a final dig, Medvedev added, "If a few words from the former president of Russia can provoke such a jittery reaction from the mighty president of the United States, then Russia must be completely in the right. We'll keep moving forward on our own path." Medvedev served as Russia's president from 2008 to 2012, and has grown increasingly hawkish in recent years amid rising tensions with the West.

India, Russia are 'Dead Economies' says Trump

In a sharp escalation of rhetoric, US President Donald Trump has stirred fresh controversy with a scathing attack on India and Russia, just a day after announcing a 25 per cent tariff on Indian imports. In a provocative post on Truth Social, Trump said, "I don't care what India does with Russia. They can take their dead economies down together, for all I care." He justified the tariffs by calling India's duties "among the highest in the world" and blamed non-monetary trade barriers for the historically limited trade between the two nations. "We have done very little business with India. Their tariffs are too high... obnoxious trade barriers," he said, further alleging a "massive" trade deficit with India.

The US President also disapproved of India's long-standing defence ties with Moscow. "India has always bought a vast majority of



Russia. They are Russia's largest buyer of energy, along with China, at a time when everyone wants Russia to stop the killing in Ukraine," Trump remarked.

Taking aim at former Russian their military equipment from President Dmitry Medvedev,

who had recently warned the US against "ultimatums" to Russia, Trump added, "Tell Medvedev, the failed former President of Russia, who thinks he's still President, to watch his words. He's entering

very dangerous territory."

India's government has responded cautiously to the escalating statements, saying it has "taken note" of the tariff decision and is "studying its implications."

Adding fuel to the geopolitical fire, Trump also announced a new US partnership with Pakistan. "We have just concluded a deal with the country of Pakistan, whereby Pakistan and the United States will work together on developing their massive oil reserves," he wrote. The announcement has raised evebrows in New Delhi, especially in the wake of the recent Pahalgam terror attack and severely strained India-Pakistan relations.

Trump's remarks and decisions are likely to spark diplomatic pushback, especially with India being a long-time strategic partner of the US. The timing and tone of his message signal a potential shift in priorities and relationships as the American President gears up for a more aggressive foreign policy stance.

Canada Joins UK, France in Recognising Palestine

Canada has announced its decision to recognise the State of Palestine at the upcoming 80th United Nations General Assembly session in September 2025, joining the United Kingdom and France in a growing Western push to support Palestinian statehood.

Prime Minister Mark Carney declared the decision on Wednesday, emphasising the urgency of preserving a two-state solution amid the worsening humanitarian crisis State of Palestine at the 80th Sesin Gaza. Carney added that the recognition is conditional upon the Palestinian Authority's implementation of key reforms. The Authority, led by President Mahmoud Abbas, has



pledged to conduct general elections in 2026—excluding Hamas and to ensure the demilitarisation of a future Palestinian state.

"Canada intends to recognise the policy goal that is "being eroded before our eyes."

This move follows recent declarations by France and the United Kingdom in support of recognising Palestine, marking a significant

shift in Western diplomatic engagement on the Israeli-Palestinian issue.

Israel Condemns Move

Israel reacted sharply, condemning Canada's announcement as dangerous and misplaced. The Israeli Embassy

in Ottawa issued a statement saying, "Recognising a Palestinian state in the absence of accountable government, functioning institutions, or benevolent leadership, rewards and legitimises the monstrous barbarity of Hamas on October 7, 2023."

Currently, 147 of the 193 United Nations member states, primarily from Africa, Asia, and South America, recognise Palestine as a sovereign state. Canada's move, alongside France and the UK, could give new momentum to broader international recognition efforts.



Philippines President to Visit **India from** Aug 4 to 8

Philippines President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr is set to embark on his first state visit to India from August 4 to 8, accompanied by First Lady Louise Araneta Marcos and a high-level delegation that includes several cabinet ministers, senior officials, and busi-

ness representatives. The Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) confirmed that the visit aims to further deepen diplomatic, strategic, and economic relations between the two countries. India and the Philippines have maintained diplomatic relations since November 1949, and currently cooperate at both bilateral and regional levels, especially through India's Comprehensive Strategic Partnership with ASEAN.

During the visit, President Marcos is scheduled to meet with President Droupadi Murmu and hold bilateral discussions with Prime Minister Narendra Modi on August 5. External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar will also call on President Marcos during his stay.

As part of the visit, President Marcos will also travel to Bengaluru before concluding his trip and returning to the Philippines on August 8. The visit is expected to result in strengthened cooperation across sectors including trade, defense, and regional security.

Myanmar Junta Lifts Emergency Rule

Myanmar's ruling military junta on Thursday officially ended the state of emergency imposed after its 2021 coup, signaling plans to hold national elections in December — a move widely condemned as a strategy to legitimize its hold on power.

The state of emergency, declared in February 2021 when the military ousted the democratically elected government of Aung San Suu Kyi, granted junta chief Min Aung Hlaing sweeping control over the legislature, judiciary, and executive. The military claimed, without evidence, that Suu Kyi's National League for Democracy (NLD) had rigged the 2020 elections, which it had won in a landslide. Three years later, Suu Kyi remains in

detention, and opposition groups — including lawmakers deposed in the coup — have vowed to boycott the upcoming poll. A UN expert has already branded the planned election a "fraud" aimed at cementing military dominance.

Min Aung Hlaing, who also serves as acting president, signed an order revoking the emergency rule. In a speech in Naypyidaw reported by state media, he framed the decision as a transition: "We have already passed the first chapter. Now, we are starting the second chapter."

While an exact date is yet to be announced, he confirmed the elections will be held in December, stating that poll-



ing would occur in phases depending on security conditions. Many regions of Myanmar remain unstable amid ongoing clashes between the junta and various ethnic armed groups.

In preparation, the junta announced the formation of a new "Union Government" and a "National Security and Peace Commission," both filled with members handpicked by Min Aung Hlaing to oversee national defence and the electoral

Critics argue these measures are part of a broader effort to consolidate military power rather than restore democracy. International observers and rights groups have repeatedly called for the release of political prisoners and genuine democratic reforms before any credible election can take place.

F-35 Fighter Jet **Crashes in California**

An F-35 fighter jet crashed near Naval Air Station (NAS) Lemoore in California on Tuesday evening, but the pilot ejected safely, according to a statement issued by the base. The crash occurred around 6:30 pm local time, and no injuries apart from the pilot were reported.

"The pilot successfully ejected and is safe. There are no additional affected personnel," NAS Lemoore said in a brief statement. The identity of the pilot has not been released.

Videos from the scene showed thick black smoke rising from the crash site, where emergency crews, in-

cluding Cal Fire and local EMS teams, responded quickly. The Fresno County Sheriff's Office confirmed that medical personnel assisted the pilot at the location.

CNN reported that the downed aircraft belonged to Strike Fighter Squadron VF-125, also known as the "Rough Raiders." The squadron operates as a Fleet Replacement Squadron tasked with training Navy pilots and aircrew on the F-35 platform.

The cause of the crash remains unknown, and a formal investigation is underway. Defense contractor Lockheed Martin, the manufacturer of the F-35, has not issued a public statement regarding the incident.

Al to Disrupt 1.8 Crore Jobs in India by 2030

Artificial intelligence is set to cause a massive transformation in India's workforce, with over 1.8 crore jobs expected to be impacted across manufacturing, retail, and education sectors by 2030, according to a new report by digital workflow firm Service-Now.

The report describes the change as "seismic," driven by the rise of agentic AI — a new generation of intelligent systems capable of performing tasks independently. Among the sectors, manufacturing will bear the biggest brunt, with 80 lakh jobs affected, followed by retail at 76 lakh and education at 25 lakh.

Jobs at the highest risk are those involving high levels of automation, such as payroll clerks, change managers, and data entry operators. These roles are being redefined or phased out as AI agents increasingly take over repetitive coordination tasks. On the other hand, positions requiring human-AI collaboration such as implementation consultants and system administrators — will see job scopes evolve but not disappear.

Despite the disruption, the report also points to opportunities. Agentic AI is projected to create over 30 lakh new jobs in emerging tech roles by 2030. "India has a generational opportunity to lead globally by developing AI-ready talent and redesigning workflows," said Sumeet Mathur, Managing Director, ServiceNow India Technology and Business Centre.

The findings come amid rising concerns about AI's impact on employment. Earlier this month, India's largest IT services firm, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), announced the layoff of 12,000 employees, attributing part of the reduction to automation and AI advancements.

Industry experts say the shift signals a broader need for upskilling and reimagining workforce models. While some roles are becoming obsolete, others are being transformed to work alongside AI systems rather than compete with them.

The report emphasizes that for India to stay competitive in the global digital economy, it must urgently invest in workforce reskilling and align education systems with future job needs.

With both risk and opportunity on the horizon, India's response to AI-driven disruption will shape the future of its labor market for years to come.



Can Gut Microbes Help Eliminate Forever Chemicals?

Scientists are investigating whether gut mi- She added that controlled human studies crobes could help flush out per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) — often called forever chemicals — from the human body. PFAS are synthetic chemicals found in many everyday items, including non-stick cookware, food packaging, and water-repellent fabrics. They are known to persist in the environment and the human body for years, and have been linked to cancer, liver damage, and hormone disruption.

Recent animal and laboratory studies have suggested that certain gut bacteria may bind to or break down PFAS, potentially helping reduce their accumulation in the body. However, experts caution that while these early findings are promising, there is not enough evidence yet to apply them as medical treat-

"There's intriguing research on how the gut microbiome might interact with PFAS, but we're far from proven therapies," said Dr. Aarti Shah, an environmental toxicologist.

are essential to fully understand the role gut microbes may play in metabolising or expelling these chemicals.

Clinicians recommend focusing on a fibre-rich, diverse diet to support a healthy microbiome, which may indirectly assist in detoxification. Foods high in soluble fibre, prebiotics, and polyphenols — such as oats, legumes, fruits, and fermented foods — are known to promote microbial diversity and gut health.

Meanwhile, experts stress the importance of limiting PFAS exposure by using filtration systems for drinking water, avoiding nonstick pans, and checking product labels for PFAS-related ingredients.

Though gut microbes may offer a potential solution in the future, scientists agree that more research is needed to confirm how they can help the human body manage PFAS. Until then, prevention and healthy lifestyle choices remain kev.




Viral 'Dubai Chocolate Burger' **Leaves Internet Divided**



Android Phones Deliver Early Earthquake Alerts in 98 Countries

Android smartphones are proving to be life-saving tools by helping deliver early earthquake warnings to users in 98 countries, thanks to their built-in sensors and Google's Earthquake Alert

The Android Earthquake Alert (AEA) system, launched in 2020, uses the accelerometers already present in smartphones to detect the subtle seismic vibrations — known as P-waves and S-waves — that signal the onset of an earthquake.

These signals are then analyzed in real time by Google's servers to estimate the epicentre and intensity of the quake. If confirmed, the system pushes alerts to nearby users seconds before strong shaking begins.

In a new study published in Science, Google and the University of California Berkeley's Seismology Laboratory shared data from 2021 to 2024, showing that thousands of alerts have been successfully issued in countries including Indonesia, Mexico, Turkey, and the Philippines — regions often impacted by earthquakes.

This crowdsourced seismic network does not rely on traditional seismometers but instead harnesses the power of millions of Android phones to act as mini seismometers.

"It's the world's largest earthquake detection network," said Dr. Richard Allen, Director of the Berkeley Seismology Lab.

The alerts, delivered via Android no-

tifications or through Google Search, give users critical seconds to drop, cover, and hold on — or evacuate if possible — before major shaking begins.

While not a replacement for government-operated warning systems, the AEA system is especially valuable in regions that lack advanced seismic infrastructure. Google is also working to integrate the system into local emergency protocols to further improve response times.

The initiative represents a major step forward in low-cost, scalable disaster response using consumer technology, giving millions a chance to act before disaster strikes.



Manipur Clinch B.C. Roy Trophy

With the match seemingly heading for a draw, Messi delivered a clutch assist deep into stoppage time. Ayush Shetty, ranked World No. 31, cruised past Huang Yu Kai of Chinese Taipei 21-10, 21-11 to set up a second-round match against Malaysia's Justin Hoh. Tharun Mannepalli overcame fellow Indian Manraj Singh 21-19, 21-13 and will next face top seed Lee Cheuk Yiu of Hong Kong.

In the women's singles, Rakshitha Ramraj stood out as the only Indian to advance. She defeated Thailand's Pornpicha Choeikeewong 18-21, 21-17, 22-20 in a hard-fought 63-minute match.

Gambhir Under Fire as India Fight for Series Win

India head coach Gautam Gambhir is facing growing pressure as the team enters the deciding Test against England at The Oval. India trail 1-2 in the five-match series, and former England captain Michael Atherton warned that fans' patience may wear thin if India lose another Test series under Gambhir's leadership.

Atherton pointed to India's recent poor form, having lost back-to-back Test series at home against New Zealand (3-0) and away to Australia (3-1). "If they lose this series, then yeah, he's under pressure as a coach," Atherton said on Sky Sports. "India, with all their resources and population strength, are not a team that people are patient with. They're expected to win every time they walk onto the park. India made four changes to their playing XI after being put into bat by England. Dhruv Jurel, Karun Nair, Akash Deep, and Prasidh Krishna came in, replacing Rishabh Pant, Jasprit Bumrah, Shardul Thakur, and Anshul Kamboj.

Indian captain Shubman Gill emphasized the team's focus on winning. "Don't mind losing the toss as long as we win the game," he said. "The wicket looks good and should be a good pitch for bowlers. We look to win every game. We have come close in every game, and it is about the extra five or 10 per cent, so boys will be giving it their all."

As the series-decider unfolds, all eyes will be on Gambhir and the Indian squad to deliver a crucial victory.

Vijay Deverakonda's Kingdom Watchable action drama

Telugu star Vijay Deverakonda returns to the big screen with Kingdom, an action drama set in the early 1990s, directed by Gowtam Tinnanuri. Released amid moderate buzz, the film delivers a mixed experience—visually rich and performance-driven, but emotionally underwhelming.

The plot revolves around Soori (Vijay Deverakonda), a constable on a mission to locate his missing brother, Shiva (Satya Dev), who is now part of a smuggling cartel in Sri Lanka. Appointed as an undercover agent, Soori must infiltrate the gang, reach his brother, and navigate the emotional and moral dilemma that follows. Vijay Deverakonda gives a grounded performance, maintaining tonal consistency without overplaying emotions. Satya Dev, though impactful in parts, is underutilised by a script that doesn't allow his character's emotional journey to flourish. Venkitesh as Murugan shows promise but suffers from limited screen time, while Bhagyashri Borse's role remains marginal.

Kingdom struggles with a predictable narrative and lacks the emotional highs expected from a story centered on brotherhood and conflict. While the bridge fight and climax provide sparks of intensity, they aren't enough to carry the film through its slower second half.

Technically, the film is well-crafted. Cinematographers Girish Gangadharan and Jomon T. John capture striking visuals, especially during action sequences. Anirudh Ravichander's score is competent but not standout, and Naveen Nooli's editing could have benefited from more polish to improve pacing.

Despite its flaws, Kingdom is a visually pleasing, mildly engaging film that works if you go in with limited expectations. It sets the stage for a possible sequel but falls short of delivering a powerful standalone narrative.

Verdict: A watchable, stylised action drama anchored by Deverakonda's steady performance, but lacking emotional depth.
