# EX MP MVV WILL ARRESTED SOON...?

Andhra Pradesh: Another YSRC leader is going to be a remand prisoner very soon. Ex-MP Mr. MVV Satyanarayana, who is basically a realtor, is getting into a big scoop. The ex-MP visited the office of the Director, Town Planning, a week back, which is located at Mangalagiri. He argued with the Director, Town Planning, Vidyullata, for not giving permission for his 24-floor building at Visakhapatnam. As per the complaint of the Town Planning Director, he threatened her severely. The Director has given a complaint to the police and a case was registered accordingly.

In 2019, he became an MP on behalf of YSRC from Visakhapatnam. But later onwards, many allegations have come against him and his business. Encroaching roads and including them into his real estate ventures, subsequently selling them, has been



noted. Many politicians have raised their voices against his encroachments. Janasena Corporator Murthy Yadav has agitated against his encroachments several times.

In 2023, a kidnap issue exposed many financial irregularities of the ex-MP. A clash with a partner led to this kidnap. This incident became a headline in the media and everybody turned their eyes to his business. He started a film production house and produced

four to five films also. But even when he was MP, Mr. Jaganmohan Reddy removed him from the in-charge post, deputing another. It means Mr. Jagan had declared that he would not be an MP candidate again. He was thrown into a position to contest as MLA from Vizag East constituency against his will.

The problem is that, keeping all these issues with him, he busted out on the Town Planning Director and gave himself into the hands of the police. Now, there is a buzz that he will be arrested very soon. Moreover, all his encroachments on government places and all other issues will become grounds to register more cases against him. Like that, one more YSRC leader will roam between prison and court for months together, it seems. Already the police are busy listing all his irregularities and allegations mounted on him. The details will be revealed very soon.



### Jagan Slams Babu's 'Red **Book' Rule**

Former Chief Minister and YSRCP chief YS Jagan Mohan Reddy accused the Chandrababu Naidu government of imposing an "emergency-like situation" through a "Red Book Constitution," stifling dissent in Andhra Pradesh. Visiting Nellore, Jagan met jailed former minister Kakani Govardhan Reddy and consoled former MLA Nallapareddi Prasanna Kumar Reddy, whose house was attacked. Addressing the media, he condemned the government's tactics.

Jagan questioned restrictions on his movements, asking if meeting party members was a crime. He described unprecedented police deployment, barricades, and road excavations to block his supporters, alleging Naidu's fear of public backlash against his governance. Jagan claimed Naidu's administration, riddled with unfulfilled promises like Super Six and Seven, has led to public discontent, prompting efforts to silence opposition voices. Highlighting injustices, Jagan cited 14 cases against Kakani, with new charges filed as bail is granted, and the violent attack on Prasanna's home by 80 armed men, damaging property and threatening his 83-year-old mother. He warned that such actions sow "poisonous seeds" that will harm democracy, urging Naidu to

Jagan accused the government of targeting YSRCP leaders with false cases, citing examples like Pinnelli Ramakrishna Reddy, Nandigam Suresh, and others.

### June 2026 Set as **Deadline for Plastic Ban**

Andhra Pradesh is set to become a single-use plastic-free state by June 5, 2026, with the State Secretariat leading the way by achieving this goal by August 15, 2025, announced Principal Secretary (Municipal Administration & Urban Development) S. Suresh Kumar. Speaking at an awareness and training program held at the Secretariat on Friday, Kumar outlined Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu's vision to eliminate single-use plastics, aligning with the Swarna Andhra, Swachha Andhra campaign.

Kumar highlighted the environmental and health hazards of single-use plastics, including microplastics that harm humans, animals, and ecosystems, contributing to pollution and even cancer risks. He detailed a robust action plan to ban items like plastic bottles, cups, plates, and carry bags in the Secretariat, replacing them with reusable and biodegradable alternatives. RO plants will ensure drinking water availability, and stainless steel bottles will be provided to employees. Three-colored dustbins for waste segregation will also be installed.

Swachha Andhra Corporation MD B. Anil Kumar Reddy revealed the formation of a Secretariat Plastic-Free



Taskforce, chaired by the GAD Principal Secretary, to enforce the ban. Awareness programs for MLOs and vendors began on Friday, with promotional materials launching on August 5, a trial ban on August 11, and full implementation by August 15. Environmentally friendly alternatives will be promoted to ensure compli-

The initiative follows Naidu's directive to ban single-use plastics in 17 municipal corporations by October 2, 2025, and establish circular economy parks and recycling centers. The state aims to boost its GSDP by ₹15,000 crore annually through sustainable waste management, creating jobs for 1 lakh people. Employees and vendors were urged to cooperate in making the Secretariat a model for a plastic-free Andhra Pradesh.

## What Should've Been **Stopped Was Fueled: CM Fires at YSRCP**

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu lashed out at the previous YSRCP regime, accusing it of dismantling central schemes and promoting a culture of provocation and destruction. Speaking at a Prajavedika Sabha in Gudem Cheruvu of Jammalamadugu constituency in Kadapa district, Chandrababu expressed sharp disapproval of the opposition's behavior and stressed the importance of responsible leadership.

"What should have been reprimanded was let go... Will you provoke instead?" he questioned, in reference to YSRCP's silence on derogatory remarks made against Kovur MLA Prashanthi Reddy. "If a leader himself encourages such actions, what example are you setting for the party? When a person talks wildly, the leader should condemn it. But here, the leader is the one provoking," he said, clearly targeting former CM Jagan Mohan Reddy.

Drawing a sharp contrast, Chandrababu emphasized that while destruction is easy, maintaining and nurturing progress is the real challenge. "During YSRCP's fiveyear rule, they destroyed good initiatives. They even stopped central government schemes. Now we have to pick up the pieces," he remarked.

Chandrababu also warned miscreants, stating that drones are being used for surveillance and those who create trouble for the people will not be spared. "If you believe a newspaper witness and jump into Godavari holding a dog's tail, what will happen?" he said sarcastical-

### Minister Reviews Singapore's Waste & Policing Systems

Andhra Pradesh Municipal Administration and Urban Development Minister P. Narayana is currently on an official visit to Singapore, studying global urban planning and management models to shape Amaravati into a world-class capital city. Over the past six days, the Minister has been reviewing various infrastructure projects and holding discussions with key experts and officials in Singapore.

On Friday morning, Minister Narayana, accompanied by CRDA Commissioner Kannababu, visited the ALBA Waste Management Plant. The plant specializes in handling solid waste

collected from households and industries, transforming it through advanced technologies. The Minister examined methods used for plastic and electronic waste recycling, along with the production of energy from other residual waste materials. Singapore officials briefed the Minister on the collection, transportation, and processing systems, which ensure minimal environmental impact.

Narayana expressed keen interest in adopting similar models in Andhra Pradesh. The state government is already focusing on efficient solid waste management, including plans to develop waste-to-energy plants and electronic waste recycling facilities. Discussions were held on how some of



these internationally proven strategies could be customized and implemented in select areas of Andhra Pradesh to enhance urban living standards.

Later in the day, the Minister visited the Singapore Police Force Headquarters. He was given a detailed presentation by senior police officials about Singapore's law enforcement strategies, public safety systems, and the advanced technologies employed to prevent and tackle crime. Minister Narayana appreciated the integration of smart surveillance, data analytics, and public engagement in maintaining law and order.

Following his engagements in Singapore, the Minister left for Malaysia on Friday night. In Malaysia, he will continue his study tour focusing on urban development models including iconic structures like the Petronas Twin Towers, convention centers, and road infrastructure. The visit aims to gather inputs that can be adapted to accelerate the progress of Amaravati and other urban centers in Andhra Pradesh.

### **SC Relief for Mohan** Babu, Vishnu

The Supreme Court has granted relief to veteran actor Mohan Babu and his son Manchu Vishnu by quashing the criminal case filed against them in connection with a protest held in 2019 over pending fee reimbursement dues. The apex court bench comprising Justice BV Nagarathna and Justice KV Viswanathan ruled that the charges filed by police did not warrant


The case stemmed from a protest conducted by Mohan Babu, Vishnu, and staff of the Sri Vidyanikethan educational institutions in Tirupati on March 22, 2019. They staged a rally demanding the release of long-pending fee reimbursement funds for students, also raising slogans critical of the then state government. As the protest caused traffic disruptions, police registered an FIR under multiple sections for violating the model code of conduct during election season. Despite challenging the FIR in the Andhra Pradesh High Court, Mohan Babu's plea was dismissed. Subsequently, he approached the Supreme Court on March 3 this year. After reviewing the FIR and charge sheet filed by Chandragiri police on March 23, 2019, the Supreme Court observed that the charges were not applicable. The bench remarked that after reading the FIR and charge sheet together, it was unclear how the cited sections of law could be applied to the protest. The court set aside both the FIR and the charge sheet, offering relief to both father and son.

## Nominated Posts Soon, Says CM

### **Atchannaidu Slams Jagan** for Provoking Violence

## **Three Cases Filed During Jagan's Visit**

Three police cases have been registered in connection with the recent visit of YSR Congress Party chief and former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy to Nellore. The cases stem from violations committed by YSRCP leaders and supporters during the event.

According to police reports, a tense situation unfolded near the residence of former Minister P. Prasannakumar Reddy, where party leaders and workers allegedly dismantled barricades set up by police. The commotion led to Special Branch Head Constable Malakondaiah of Kavali falling under a barricade and suffering a fractured arm. Following the incident, police filed a case against Prasannakumar Reddy, Bobbala Srinivas Yadav, Patapati Prabhakar, and others involved in the confrontation.

In a separate incident, a protest

held on the road during Jagan's visit created traffic disruptions. For obstructing the public and violating traffic regulations, the Dargamitta police booked another case against Prasannakumar Reddy and several party members.

Additionally, police registered a third case for conducting a motorcycle rally without obtaining prior permission, which is a violation of public gathering norms. This case was also filed by the Dargamitta police station.

Police sources stated that all three cases were registered based on video evidence and reports from officers on duty. Authorities are expected to issue notices to the accused for further inquiry.

The incidents have raised questions about crowd control and law enforcement preparedness during political visits. Police have assured that they will handle all such incidents strictly in accordance with the law.



## Free Power for 65,000 Weaving **Families: Min Savitha**

In a major boost to the handloom sector, Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has announced the launch of a free electricity scheme for weavers, which will come into effect from August 7, coinciding with National Handloom Day. Under the scheme, weavers using traditional looms will be provided 200 units of free electricity, while those operating upgraded looms will receive 500 units free of cost.

The scheme is expected to benefit around 65,000 weaving families across the state, with an annual financial burden of Rs.125 crore on the government. This marks the fulfilment of another key election promise made by the coalition government, aiming to support the traditional handloom sector that suffered losses during the previous re-

Textile and Handlooms Minister Savitha expressed gratitude to CM Chandrababu for initiating the scheme and said the move would offer significant financial relief to weaver families. The scheme was finalized after consultations between the CM and the minister during Chandrababu's recent visit to Kadapa for pension distribution programs.

Over the years, the TDP-led coalition has implemented several measures to strengthen the handloom sector. These include



a new textiles policy with an outlay of Rs.10,000 crore aimed at creating employment for 1.51 lakh individuals, enhanced NTR Bharosa pensions from Rs.3,000 to Rs.4,000 for 92,724 weavers, and financial support through thrift schemes and cooperative bank loans.

Skill development programs


have also been initiated across five districts to train weavers in contemporary textile designs. Exhibitions were organized in seven major cities to market handloom products, while AP State Handloom Weavers Cooperative Society (APCO) facilitated direct-to-home deliveries through e-commerce platforms. Plans are also in place to develop textile parks in Rayadurgam, Hindupur, Brandix, and Emmiganur, along with constructing a Rs.172 crore Unity Mall in Visakhapatnam. The state government has also partnered with private textile firms like Tata Taneira and Aditya Birla Group to ensure better marketing and employment opportunities for weavers.

YSRCP government, alleging rampant corruption, including a recent ₹11 crore scam and a ₹10,000 crore liquor scandal, which he claimed drained the state's treasury. Despite financial challenges inherited

from YSRCP, the current government is disbursing pensions to 64 lakh beneficiaries statewide this month, spending ₹2,750 crore. In the Narsipatnam constituency, 41,882 beneficiaries received ₹18 crore, while Nathavaram mandal's 11,093 got ₹4.62 crore. Gunupudi alone saw 716 beneficiaries receive ₹27.63 lakh. Additionally, 17 lakh widows statewide received ₹700 crore, and 1.08 lakh new beneficiaries, including 750 from Narsipatnam, got ₹43.40 crore.

The Speaker highlighted the Annadata Sukheebhava scheme, ensuring ₹20,000 per farmer annually—₹14,000 from the state and ₹6,000 from the Centre—disbursed in three instalments. Anakapalli district's 2.31 lakh farmers received ₹161 crore, with Nathavaram's 10,596 getting ₹7.42 crore. For village development, ₹49.55 lakh was sanctioned for Gunupudi's roads, and ₹8 crore for the Tandava project, with more funds promised. Ayyanna visited Gunupudi ZP High School, pledging a volleyball and kabaddi court, sports equipment, 16 toilet doors, school painting funds, and 10 study tables, with another 10 tables supported by Tandava Chairman Karak Satyanarayana. Urging leaders to promote government schemes, he was joined by TDP, Jana Sena leaders, and officials, reinforcing the coalition's commitment to welfare and development.

## MP Questions Low Pay for Anganwadi, MGNREGA

Machilipatnam MP Vallabhaneni Balashowry raised critical concerns about An-

ganwadi workers and MGN-REGA wages during the winter session of Parliament on Friday, pressing the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development for answers. In a pointed query, Balashowry asked about the performance of Anganwadi centres in Andhra Pradesh, the stagnation of Anganwadi workers' honorarium since 2018, and whether MGN-REGA wages could be linked to inflation.

Union Minister of State Savitri Thakur responded in writing, citing Poshan Tracker

data showing improved nutrition indicators for children across India, including Andhra Pradesh. She provided details of child mal-

> nutrition indices (0-5 years) and household visits by Anganwadi workers in the state for June 2024 and 2025. Thakur clarified that Anganwadi workers and helpers are "honorary workers" who volunteer for child care and development, receiving a fixed honorarium. Since October 2018, the Centre raised the honorarium for Anganwadi workers at regular centres from

₹3,000 to ₹4,500 monthly, for mini-centres from ₹2,250 to ₹3,500, and for helpers from ₹1,500 to ₹2,250, with cost-sharing between the Centre and states. Additional

On MGNREGA wages, Thakur stated no proposal exists to link them to inflation, without elaborating on reasons. ## **Sharmila Slams CM** on Farmer Neglect

Andhra Pradesh Congress Committee (APCC) chief Y.S. Sharmila Reddy launched a blistering attack on Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu, accusing his coalition government of deceiving farmers under the guise of the Annadata Sukheebhava scheme. Addressing the media, Sharmila alleged that Naidu's pre-election promise of ₹20,000 per farmer has been diluted by linking it to the Centre's ₹6,000 PM Kisan scheme, leaving the state contributing only ₹14,000.

"Naidu's Annadata Sukheebhava is not about farmers' prosperity but their misery," she charged, pointing to similar cuts in other promises like gas cylinders and the Talliki Vandanam scheme, which she claimed benefit only half the eligible population.

Questioning Naidu's integrity, Sharmila recalled his opposition days when he criticized linking state and central schemes. "Why didn't you clarify before elections that the ₹20,000 included the Centre's share? Why merge PM Kisan, a national scheme, with your promise?" she demanded. She accused Naidu of backtracking on his "big promises" and misleading farmers for votes.

The APCC chief emphasized that the Congress party stands firmly with farmers, demanding that the state government directly provide ₹20,000 per farmer under Annadata Sukheebhava, independent of central funds. "Chandrababu must answer for this betrayal," Sharmila asserted, urging the government to honor its election commitments without excuses.

She warned that the Congress would intensify its fight if farmers' grievances remain unaddressed, signaling a growing opposition challenge to the coalition's governance. The public, Sharmila added, is watching Naidu's actions closely as the state grapples with unfulfilled promises.

### Govt Bans Single-Use Plastic at Secretariat

Andhra Pradesh has taken a significant step toward becoming a single-use plastic-free state by June 5, 2026, following the call given by Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu. As part of the initiative, the state Secretariat will become free of single-use plastic items by August 15, 2025, announced Principal Secretary of the Municipal Administration and Urban Development Department S. Suresh Kumar.

He addressed an awareness and training session held at the Secretariat on Friday, attended by MLOs of various departments. Suresh Kumar emphasized the harmful effects of single-use plastics, including environmental pollution and health hazards caused by microplastics. He noted that several cancer cases have been linked to plastic exposure.

As part of this mission, the Secretariat will immediately ban the sale, distribution, and use of plastic bottles, cups, plates, stickers, sachets, and carry bags. The government will promote alternatives like reusable and biodegradable products. RO plants will be installed for drinking water in all blocks, and reusable stainless-steel water bottles will be provided to employees.

Further, three-color dustbins will be introduced for solid waste segregation. The comprehensive action plan is being implemented in collaboration with Swachh Andhra Corporation.

Swachh Andhra Corporation MD B. Anil Kumar Reddy announced the formation of a Secretariat Plastic-Free Task Force, chaired by the GAD Principal Secretary. Sensitization and training sessions for MLOs and vendors are underway, with publicity materials to be released on August 5. A trial implementation of the ban is scheduled for August 11, followed by full-scale enforcement from August 15.

## **Rs. 1.73 Crore Cyber Fraud Busted**

In a major breakthrough, the Anantapur police, under the supervision of SP P. Jagadeesh, have arrested a five-member cyber fraud gang involved in a fake investment scam operated from Cambodia and coordinated through Delhi. Authorities seized ₹41.20 lakh in cash, 8 mobile phones, a car, 20 ATM cards, 15 SIM cards, 5 bank passbooks, 10 cheque books, and 2 Wi-Fi routers.

The gang lured Veparalla-based software engineer Narasimhappa through fake Facebook investment ads and tricked him into joining a WhatsApp group linked to fraudulent apps like VIP66 Bajaj Investment and K26 Zerodha. Initially, he invested ₹12 lakh and was shown fake profits, increasing his trust. Over a month, from April 15 to May 14, he invested a total of ₹1.73 crore. When he attempted to withdraw ₹3.4 crore (investment + fake profits), he was told to pay 40% in taxes, raising suspicion and prompting him to file a police complaint.

Following a probe based on Cr.No.112/2025 under relevant sections of the IT Act, the police identified that the defrauded money was routed through 13 fake bank accounts created across India. The accused used internet banking and planned to transfer the funds abroad via cryptocurrency. A private bank manager suspected of aiding the scam is under investigation.

SP Jagadeesh praised the efforts of DSP Ravibabu and CIs Jayanaik, Venkataramana, Shaik Zakir, and SIs Nagamadhu and Gurnath Reddy. He urged the public to be alert against fake financial apps and investment scams, and to report suspicious activities to police or cybercrime helplines.





## **Neglect of Individual Care Plans Harm Children** in Child Care Institutions

ny person below the age of 18 is considered a child under the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). The UNCRC, a global framework to safeguard children's rights, came into force on 2nd September 1990. India ratified this convention on 11th December 1992 and has since implemented its provisions. Today, 196 countries across the world follow the principles laid out in the UNCRC.

#### The fundamental rights guaranteed to every child under the UNCRC include:

- Right to Survival
- Right to Development
- Right to Protection
- Right to Participation These rights are to be ensured without any discrimination.

To uphold these principles, the Government of India enacted the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000, which has been amended over time. The latest version, Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Amendment

Act, 2021, came into effect from 1st September 2022. Under Section 27 of this Act, Child Welfare Committees (CWCs) have been constituted in every district. These Committees function as a bench of Judicial Magistrate of First Class, empowered by the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973. CWCs are responsible for interacting with and assessing children brought before them, often from highly vulnerable backgrounds, including:

- Orphans and semi-orphans Children from broken or abusive families
- Street children and child laborers
- Victims of trafficking, child marriage, or abuse
- Drug-addicted or mentally/ physically challenged children
- Children affected by HIV/AIDS Abandoned or surrendered children
- Missing and begging children These children are temporarily placed in licensed Child Care Institutions (CCIs) for care, counseling, and rehabilitation. The goal is to reunite them with their families where possible, or otherwise, prepare them for an independent and dignified life.

However, a major gap exists in the implementation of Individual Care Plans (ICPs) — a crucial component mandated by the law.

#### What is an Individual Care Plan?

An Individual Care Plan is a personalized and dynamic roadmap

designed for each child, tailored to address their unique needs, challenges, and aspirations. It is developed in collaboration with caregivers, counselors, and wherever possible, the child and their family.

#### A well-prepared **ICP should include:**

- Personal Medical History
- Family and Social Background
- **Developmental Milestones Emotional and Behavioral**
- Needs Interests, Preferences, and
- **Talents Educational and Vocational**
- Goals

Specific timelines, strategies, and interventions

Regular reviews and updates must be conducted to adjust the plan as the child grows and their circumstances evolve.

#### The Consequences of **Neglecting ICPs:**

Many CCIs, due to lack of awareness, resources, or oversight, fail to prepare or implement ICPs for the children under their care. This shortfall severely affects the child's ability to reintegrate into society once they turn 18 — the legal age at which they must exit the institution.

Although some support may be extended through After-Care Programs, these are limited and require that the child is adequately prepared for independent living. Without proper education, skill development, or emotional support, many of these young adults are left directionless and vulnerable, often slipping back into cycles of poverty, exploitation, or crime.

#### The Way Forward:

The Women and Child Welfare Department, along with the District Child Protection Units (DCPUs) and Child Welfare Committees (CWCs), must ensure that each and every child in a CCI is cared for according to an Individual Care Plan. Strict monitoring, regular audits, and capacity-building of CCI staff are essential to achieving this.

Every child deserves the chance to live a safe, fulfilling, and independent life. A well-designed and implemented Individual Care Plan is not a formality — it is a fundamental right and a lifeline for the vulnerable children of our society.

## **China Grows Wary as Pakistan Becomes Security Liability Amid CPEC Threats**

China's strategic patience with Pakistan is wearing thin as persistent security threats endanger its flagship Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) project — the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). During a recent meeting with Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir, China's Central Military Commission Vice-Chairman Zhang Youxia explicitly urged stronger security for Chinese nationals and investments in Pakistan.

The appeal is not new — but it is increasingly urgent. A 2024 report by Pakistan's National Counter Terrorism Authority (NACTA) revealed that 20 Chinese citizens have been killed and 34 injured in attacks since 2021. The threat is twofold, stemming from both Baloch insurgents and Islamist militants like the Tehreek-e-Taliban



Pakistan (TTP).

While the TTP targets Chinese personnel as a symbolic attack against Islamabad's foreign alliances, Baloch insurgents see Beijing's presence as exploitation of their resource-rich region. Their tactics — hijackings, suicide bombings (including by women), and road blockades — aim to cripple CPEC-linked logistics and damage Pakistan's trade routes.

Despite deploying Special Security Divisions and surveillance systems, Pakistan's response has been largely reactive. Strategic vulnerabilities persist, and Beijing's dissatisfaction is now surfacing publicly. The upcoming B2B-focused second phase of CPEC requires a secure environment — something Pakistan is struggling to

guarantee.

Internally, Pakistan's fragile security apparatus, ethnic grievances, and economic constraints further complicate the situation. Delays, insurance hikes, and operational risks are eroding China's investment appetite, pushing it to reassess engagement terms.

The CPEC's viability, deeply tied to western China's stability and Xinjiang's economic agenda, now hangs in the balance. A continued failure to secure Chinese interests could convert Pakistan from a "strategic ally" into a costly liability — forcing China to reconsider the depth of its relationship.

The road ahead may be defined less by partnership and more by growing frustration in Beijing.

### 'Make in India' Falls Short as **Manufacturing Shrinks, Not Surges**



launch, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's flagship Make At its core, critics say, Make in in India campaign is faltering. Promised as a revival of India's manufacturing might, the initiative now stands as a cautionary tale of optics overshadowing execution.

Launched in 2014, Make in India aimed to increase the manufacturing sector's GDP share from 16% to 25% by 2022. Instead, it dipped below 13% by 2024. Jobs in the sector fell drastically from 5.1 crore in 2016-17 to 2.7 crore in 2020-21,

A decade after its grand raising deep concerns.

India was more about branding than building. Flashy summits and a logo designed by a U.S. firm masked the absence of a coherent policy roadmap. Key components — infrastructure, skilling, and sectoral focus — were either underfunded or ignored.

Gross Fixed Capital Formation, a key indicator of infrastructure investment, declined from 36% of GDP in 2007 to 30% by 2024. Foreign Direct Invest-

ment also plummeted, falling from 8.8% of total capital formation in 2020 to 2.3% in 2024.

While Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes provided a minor boost in areas like smartphone manufacturing, they couldn't offset structural gaps. Meanwhile, policy shocks like demonetisation and a flawed GST rollout devastated small and medium enterprises — the backbone of India's manufacturing sector.

With over 1,400 regulatory requirements draining resources and credit access limited to just 20% of MSMEs, growth remains elusive. Reports on job losses and unemployment were buried, and key economic data was withheld, raising accountability concerns.


The decade-long effort, instead of revitalising industry, has left it adrift. As global peers advance domestic manufacturing, Make in India has become a case study in missed opportunity — proving that strategy, not slogans, drives real economic transformation.

### BJP's Changing Stance on Divorce, **Inheritance, and Social Policies**

The BJP's shifting positions on key social issues such as divorce, inheritance laws, and caste policies reflect a broader pattern of ideological evolution—or retreat—since its origins as the Jan Sangh in the 1950s.

Originally, the Jan Sangh opposed divorce and supported the joint family system as central to Hindu society. Its 1957 manifesto promised to repeal laws like the Hindu Marriage and Hindu Succession Acts, which challenged these traditional structures. Women's rights, particularly around inheritance, were not championed but opposed, reflecting conservative social values. Yet, as Indian society urbanized and nuclear families became common—especially among the BJP's core urban, upper-caste supporters—these stances softened or were abandoned altogether without clear explanation.

Similarly, the party's earlier hardline approach on caste sought to eliminate untouchability but dismissed affirma-



tive action policies like reservations for Scheduled Castes and Tribes. This has now evolved into a more complex, sometimes contradictory approach that struggles to address ongoing social inequali-

### We have steady & time tested partnership with **Russia: MEA**

## **Tharoor Differs With Rahul Gandhi Over Trump Remarks**

Congress MP Shashi Tharoor on Friday publicly distanced himself from party colleague Rahul Gandhi's endorsement of US President Donald Trump's controversial remarks calling India a "dead economy". Responding to Trump's statement on social media, Mr Tharoor said, "This is not the case, and we all know it," defending India's economic strength amid recent trade tensions with Washington.

Trump, while justifying a 25% tariff on Indian exports, claimed he was unconcerned about India's ties with Russia and dismissed both nations' economies as "dead." "They can take their dead economies down together," he wrote on Truth Social, also accusing India of maintaining "strenuous and obnoxious" trade barriers. Surprisingly, Rahul Gandhi, the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, agreed with Trump's assessment. "He is right. Everybody knows this except the Prime Minister and the Finance Minister," he told reporters in Parliament.

However, other Congress leaders voiced strong disagreement. Karti Chidambaram, Congress MP, called Trump "an unconventional politician" and downplayed the comment. "India and America are large economies that need each other. Flipping comments won't derail this relationship," he said in an interview.

Rajya Sabha MP Rajiv Shukla also rejected Trump's characterization of India's economy. "Our economic condition is not at all weak. Trump is living in a delusion," he told ANI.

## Trump releases revised tariffs for 70 countries

U.S. President Donald Trump has issued a revised executive order formalizing new reciprocal tariffs for nearly 70 countries, retaining a 25% tariff on Indian exports while slashing Pakistan's rate from 29% to 19%. The revised duties, outlined in an executive order titled "Further Modifying The Reciprocal Tariff Rates," will come into effect from August 7, 2025.

India's tariff rate remains unchanged despite earlier threats of an added penalty over its continued military and energy ties with Russia. However, the finalized order makes no mention of this penalty. Trump had earlier accused India of using high tariffs and non-monetary

trade barriers and being a major buyer of Russian energy and defense equipment—factors he claimed warranted the tariff

The move comes amid tense U.S.-India relations following Trump's criticism of India's BRICS membership and trade surplus with the U.S., which he described as "massive." The White House also questioned India's alignment with American economic and security pri-

"all necessary steps to safeguard national interests." Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal indicated that exemptions will apply to goods shipped before August 7 and cleared in the U.S. Pakistan, in contrast, received by October 5—offering exporters temporary relief.

> Trade analysts warn the tariff policy could complicate bilateral trade talks, with former U.S. official Wendy Cutler noting that India was once considered a promising candidate for a quick agreement. Meanwhile, U.S. businesses and customs officials are bracing for logistical challenges stemming from the uneven global tariff landscape.

> Tariff rates across the board now range between 10% and 40%, with Laos and Myanmar facing the highest levies.



## No F-35 Jets From US? **India Weighs Options**

India is exploring ways to ease tensions with the US following President Donald Trump's surprise announcement of a 25% tariff on Indian exports, sources familiar with the matter told Bloomberg. Despite the tariff threat, New Delhi has ruled out immediate retaliation and is considering increasing imports from the US, including natural gas, communication equipment, and gold, to help narrow its trade surplus over the next few years.

Officials expressed disappointment over Trump's move but remain committed to continuing bilateral trade talks. Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal confirmed that the government is consulting exporters to assess the tariffs' impact and vowed to protect national interests.

Notably, India has decided against boosting defense purchases from the US, a key demand from Trump. The Modi government is not interested in acquiring the expensive F-35 stealth fighter jets, which Trump had offered during Modi's visit to Washington in February. Instead, India prefers focusing on domestic defense manufacturing partnerships rather than buying ready-made US equipment.

US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent criticized India for slowing trade negotiations, citing India's close ties with Russia as a concern. Trump's tariffs also come amid criticism of India's energy purchases from Russia, which the US sees as supporting Moscow's war efforts in Ukraine.

Despite the trade tensions, both countries had previously aimed to finalize a bilateral trade deal by fall 2025. Analysts remain cautious about Trump's tariff threats, viewing them possibly as negotiating tactics, similar to past US-EU trade disputes.

India's markets reacted mildly, with the rupee dipping slightly and stocks edging lower. Experts suggest India may need to be more flexible in ongoing talks but reaffirm the country's priority to protect farmers, entrepreneurs, and small businesses.

As the US-India relationship navigates these hurdles, New Delhi balances diplomatic pragmatism with safeguarding its strategic and economic interests.

### **Trump Deserves Nobel Peace Prize for Ending India-Pak Conflict: White House**

White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt on Thursday asserted that U.S. President Donald Trump should be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, citing his role in brokering multiple global ceasefires—including the recent de-escalation between India and Pakistan.

During a press briefing in Washington, Leavitt claimed that President Trump has successfully mediated peace in several conflict zones during his six months in office. "He has now ended conflicts between Thailand and Cambodia, Israel and Iran, Rwanda and the DRC, India and Pakistan, Serbia and Kosovo, and Egypt and Ethiopia," she stated. "It's well past time President Trump was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize."

Trump had earlier taken credit for ending hostilities between India and Pakistan, saying a ceasefire was achieved on May 10 after a "long night" of U.S.-led talks. He has since repeated that claim in public statements, saying he leveraged trade deals to push both nations toward peace, adding that

the U.S. promised increased trade if military action ceased.

However, Indian officials strongly deny any external mediation. Prime Minister Narendra Modi told Parliament that no foreign leader, including Trump, influenced India's military decisions during Operation Sindoor. External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar reiterated that there was no third-party role and confirmed that there were no phone calls between Modi and Trump during the time Trump claims he negotiated the ceasefire.

"India acted independently and firmly in its national interest," Jaishankar told the Rajya Sabha, directly contradicting Trump's assertions.

The White House push for Trump's Nobel recognition comes amid broader diplomatic tensions, including new U.S. tariffs on Indian exports and growing criticism of India's ties with Russia. While the Nobel Committee remains silent, Trump's self-promotion as a peacemaker continues to draw both support and skepticism at home and abroad.



#### "India An Ally, But Can't Align 100% Of Time": US **On Trump Tariffs**

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio acknowledged India as a strategic ally but expressed clear frustration over India's continued purchase of Russian oil, calling it "a point of irritation" in bilateral relations. Rubio's remarks came a day after former US President Donald Trump announced a 25 percent tariff on Indian goods starting August 1, alongside unspecified penalties targeting India's procurement of Russian military equipment and energy.

Speaking to Fox Radio, Rubio emphasized that while India is a key partner, alignment on every issue is unrealistic. "India has huge energy needs," he said, explaining that Russia's sanctioned and discounted oil is an economically attractive option for India. However, Rubio warned that these purchases indirectly sustain Russia's war efforts in Ukraine. Trump's tariff announcement criticized India for high tariffs and trade barriers, alongside its close military and energy ties with Russia and China. On his social media platform Truth Social, Trump stated, "India will therefore be paying a tariff of 25%, plus a penalty for the above, starting on August first."

India responded calmly, with the Ministry of Commerce and Industry stating that it is reviewing the US announcement while remaining committed to negotiating a fair and balanced bilateral trade agreement. The government reaffirmed its priority to protect farmers, entrepreneurs, and MSMEs, promising to safeguard national interests as done with other trade deals, such as the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement with the UK.

### **Zelensky Calls for Regime Change in Russia to Ensure Long-Term Peace**

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has called on Western nations to pursue regime change in Russia, warning that Moscow will remain a threat even after the current war ends unless its leadership is replaced.

Speaking via video at an international conference marking the 50th anniversary of the Helsinki Accords, Zelensky stated, "I believe Russia can be pushed to stop this war... But if the world doesn't aim to change the regime in Russia, that means even after the war ends, Moscow will still try to destabilize neighboring countries."

Zelensky also urged the West to go beyond sanctions by confiscating frozen Russian assets and using them

to support Ukraine's defense. "It's time to confiscate Russian assets, not just freeze them," he said, emphasizing that the funds should be redirected toward countering Russian aggression.

His comments come amid heightened tensions between Moscow and Western nations, with Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov accusing the West of betraying the Helsinki Accords' principles. In an article released to mark the anniversary, Lavrov claimed the European Union is evolving into a "Fourth Reich," citing rising Russophobia and militarization.

Russian President Vladimir Putin also weighed in, accusing Western governments of misleading



their citizens to justify soaring military expenditures and masking internal economic problems.

Despite these sharp exchanges, Moscow claims it remains open to negotiations with Kyiv. RT reported that several rounds of talks have taken place in recent months but that little progress has been made, with Russia accusing Ukraine and its allies of failing to address "territorial realities."

Russia has also questioned Zelensky's political legitimacy, arguing that his term expired in May 2024 and that martial law does not justify postponing elections indefinitely. Russian officials claim the Ukrainian parliament now holds governing authority.

## **Global Cues, Trump Tariffs Hit Sentiments**

Tndian stock markets **⊥**ended in losses for the fifth consecutive week. Sectoral indices including the benchmarks suffered a huge fall on Friday. Although they appeared to be stable at the beginning, they were in a rout when European markets opened. The reasons for this were Trump tariffs, negative news, and negative signals from Asian and international markets. Investors also cautiously sold. The Nifty's approach to the key 100 moving averages indicates weakness in the medium term. Technically, the indices are also bearish. In total, the Nifty lost 203 points and the Sensex lost 585 points.

The BSE Sensex, which closed at 81,185 in the previous session, opened at 81,074 on MURTHY NAIDU PAADAM Thursday. It touched an intraday low of 80,495.

It reached an intraday high of 81,317. It ended at 80,599, down 585 points. The NSE Nifty, which opened at 24,734, touched a low of 24,535 and a high of



24,784. It closed down 203 points at paise against the dollar and settled 24,565. The Nifty Bank fell 344 points to

In the Nifty50, 12 companies gained and 38 lost. Trent, Asian Paints, Hindustan Unilever, Nestle, Hero MotoCorp were the top gainers. Sun Pharma, Dr. Reddy's Labs, Cipla, Adani Enterprises, and Tata Steel were the biggest losers. All sectoral indices, except FMCG, were mixed today. Pharma, healthcare, telecom, defense, metal, IT, realty, manufacturing, oil, commodities, PSU bank and auto indices fell heavily.

Market breadth in NSE today is in favor of sellers. Out of a total of 3040 stocks traded, 785 gained. 2173 lost. 56 shares touched 52-week highs and 47 touched 52-week lows. Upper circuit was reached at 80 and lower circuit at 57.

## Starlink Gets Satellite Internet **Permit In India**

**T**n a major development Ifor India's digital infrastructure, Elon Musk-led Starlink has been granted a Unified License to launch satellite-based internet services in the country, Union Telecom Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia announced on Thursday.

The announcement coincided with the 30th anniversarv of India's first cellular call made in 1995, highlighting

the country's rapid telecommunications evolution over the decades.

Scindia said a comprehensive framework for spectrum allocation and gateway setup has already been prepared, ensuring a smooth and speedy rollout of satellite services. Alongside Starlink, Bharti-backed Eutelsat OneWeb and Jio SES are also awaiting spectrum allotment to begin their own satcom operations.

"This is a big step forward in bridging globally. the digital divide. From remote villag-

access to everyone," Scindia noted.

India's digital progress under the Modi government was also highlighted. The country now has 1.2 billion telephone connections, and internet subscriptions have grown by 286%, reaching 970 million. Broadband usage surged by over 1,450% since 2014, and mobile data costs have dropped by 96.6%, now averaging just ₹8.9 per GB—the lowest

The seasonally adjusted PMI stood at 59.1 in July, up from 58.4 in June, marking the strongest performance since March 2024. A PMI reading above 50 indicates

expansion, while below 50 signals constrong activity levels, business contraction.

## **Commercial LPG Cylinder Price Cut By** Rs 33.50



**T**n a move that brings much-need-**L**ed relief to the hospitality and commercial sectors, oil marketing companies have announced a reduction in the price of 19 kg commercial LPG cylinders by ₹33.50. The new rates came into effect starting Thursday, August 1.

As per the revised prices, the cost of a 19 kg commercial LPG cylinder in the national capital now stands at ₹1,631.50, down from ₹1,665. This price cut follows the standard monthly revision that oil companies undertake at the beginning of every month.

The reduction in commercial LPG rates is expected to ease the cost burden on hotels, restaurants, catering businesses, and small industries that rely heavily on commercial LPG for daily operations. However, prices of 14.2 kg domestic LPG cylinders remain unchanged, offering no direct relief to household consumers this month.

This is the fourth consecutive price cut on commercial LPG cylinders in the last five months, signaling a relatively stable international market for liquefied petroleum gas and possibly reflecting softening crude prices.

Oil marketing companies such as Indian Oil Corporation, Bharat Petroleum, and Hindustan Petroleum review LPG rates monthly based on global benchmark prices and the rupee-dollar exchange rate. While commercial LPG rates are deregulated and directly linked to international prices, domestic LPG prices are more tightly controlled by the government and subject to periodic subsidies or policy interventions.

Industry bodies have welcomed the move, with some restaurant associations saying it would provide "short-term breathing room" as input costs remain high across the food and beverage sector.

No announcement has yet been made regarding any revision in domestic LPG subsidies or further reductions.

## July GST Collections Rise by 7.5% to ₹1.96 Lakh Crore



collection data for July 2025, reporting a 7.5% year-on-year increase. The total collection stood at ₹1.96 lakh crore, driven by higher income from domestic transactions and imports.

However, the growth was slightly lower when compared to recent months. In the first quarter of this year, the average GST collection was ₹2.1 lakh crore—significantly higher than the July figure. April saw a peak of ₹2.37 lakh crore, followed by ₹2.01 lakh crore in May.

The GST revenue for the April–July period reached ₹8.18 lakh crore, marking a 10.7% increase over the ₹7.39 lakh crore collected during the same period last year.

In July, the total GST collection of ₹1.96 lakh crore comprised ₹35,470 crore from Central GST, ₹44,059 crore from State GST, ₹1,03,536 crore from Integrated GST, and ₹12,670 crore from cess.

The Centre on Thursday released After adjusting for refunds, the net GST revenue for July stood at ₹1,68,588 crore, a marginal 1.7% increase over last year. The subdued net growth is attributed to a rise in refunds, which reached ₹27,147

> Net GST revenue from April to July recorded an 8.4% growth at ₹7.11 lakh crore. Among the states, Tripura reported the highest growth at 41%, followed by Meghalaya at 26%, Madhya Pradesh at 18%, Bihar at 16%, and Andhra Pradesh at 14%. Maharashtra's GST revenue grew by 6% to ₹30,590 crore.

# Spanish Town Declares Dying Illegal Due to Cemetery Crisis

Tn the quaint Spanish town of Lanjarón, dying is technically illegal — a peculiar law born out of a serious space shortage in the town's only cemetery. The bizarre edict was issued in 1999 by then-mayor Jose Rubio, who, faced with no available burial plots, jokingly banned death until a new graveyard could be found.

"It is hereby forbidden to die in Lanjarón," the decree humorously stated. Mayor Rubio clarified at the time, "I'm just a mayor. Above me is God, who ultimately runs things," adding that the law was taken in good humor by residents.

Now, 26 years later, the rule still stands, and the cemetery crisis remains unresolved, with Lanjarón still operating

only one graveyard. Despite its macabre-sounding legislation, Lanjarón is a peaceful town of 4,000 people, known for its natural beauty and therapeutic mineral springs. Located in the Alpujarra region of Granada at the base of the Sierra Nevada mountains, it attracts wellness seekers and tourists alike.

The town's 18th-century spa, or balneario, continues to draw visitors looking for relief from ail-



ments through mineral-rich waters. Lanjarón is also famous for its annual Fiesta del Agua y del Jamón — a summer celebration featuring townwide water fights and traditional foods.

Lanjarón's quirky law has sparked renewed attention, especially among Gen Z travelers on Tik-Tok, searching for hidden gems beyond Spain's usual tourist hubs.

Interestingly, Lanjarón isn't alone in its ban on death. Longyearbyen, Norway, enacted a similar rule in 1950 when scientists found that bodies didn't decompose in the permafrost, raising public health concerns.

While symbolic, these laws reflect deeper issues — from climate impacts to infrastructure shortfalls — and continue to amuse and intrigue visitors from around the world.

### Could Earth Be Ejected From the Solar System? Arecent study published in the journal Mercury's orbit could become unstable with a 50–80% increased risk of chaotic settling questions about the long-term stability of Earth's orbit within the solar system. Astronomers Nathan Kaib and Sean Raymond used thousands of computer simulations to exam-

If a star with a mass similar to the Sun passes within about 10,000 astronomical units (roughly 1.5 trillion kilometers), it could disturb the Oort Cloud, a distant shell of icy bodies surrounding the solar system. This disturbance could trigger a cascade of orbital instabilities affecting the planets. The study finds that

shifts. Such changes could lead to gravitational chain reactions, potentially pushing Venus or Mars into collision courses with Earth. More alarmingly, Earth itself could be thrown toward Jupiter, whose immense gravity might then fling our planet out of the solar system entirely.

While the probability of such an event occurring in the next five billion years remains low—around 0.2%—the findings challenge the long-standing view that planetary orbits are fixed and unchanging. This research offers a sobering reminder that Earth, despite its seeming security, exists within a dynamic and sometimes unpredictable cosmic environment. The possibility that our planet could be displaced or even ejected underscores the need for continued study of celestial mechanics and the influences of passing stars. Ultimately, the study provides a humbling perspective on humanity's place in the vast and ever-changing universe.

### **Swiggy Re-Evaluates Rapido Stake Amid Rising Competition**



wiggy has officially confirmed it is reas-Sessing its stake in bike taxi and logistics startup Rapido, as competition in India's mobility and quick-commerce sectors heats up. The move comes during a crucial period for the food delivery giant, which is navigating rising marketing costs and a sharpened focus on achieving profitability in its primary business verticals.

Swiggy, which holds a significant minority stake in Rapido, is reportedly evaluating the strategic value of this investment as it reallocates resources toward its core operations—primarily food delivery and Instamart, its quick-commerce platform. According to insiders, the re-evaluation is part of a larger strategic review that may involve either increasing its involvement in Rapido or partially divesting its stake, depending on future market alignment.

The decision reflects broader market dynamics, with competition from rivals like Zomato and Zepto prompting Swiggy to optimize its capital deployment. Swiggy has been increasing marketing spend in highgrowth cities and investing in technology to enhance customer experience, while maintaining its push for profitability ahead of a potential IPO.

Rapido, meanwhile, continues to expand its bike taxi and logistics services across major Indian cities. It remains a strong player in last-mile connectivity, but its long-term synergy with Swiggy's food and grocery delivery ambitions is under review.

Swiggy's spokesperson stated, "We periodically assess all our investments to ensure they align with our long-term business objectives. Rapido has been a valued partner, and any decisions will be taken with strategic clarity and in mutual interest."

Analysts see this re-evaluation as a pragmatic step for Swiggy to sharpen its operational focus and maintain a competitive edge in a rapidly evolving market. Further announcements regarding the Rapido stake are expected in the coming months.

## Meta Smartwatch With Camera Likely to Launch in September Meta Platforms is reportedly gearing up to plaunch a new smartwatch with built-in

cameras as early as September 2025, according to sources familiar with the development. The long-rumored wearable is said to include two integrated cameras, making it one of the first smartwatches to feature such a design. Development on the Meta smartwatch reportedly began in 2021, as part of the company's broader ambition to expand its hardware ecosystem and deepen its footprint in the wearable tech space. Meta, the parent company of Facebook and Instagram, has been gradually pushing into augmented reality (AR), virtual reality (VR), and now possibly wearable computing, with this smartwatch being seen as a stepping stone to more advanced wearable platforms.

Leaked renders and prototypes suggest that the watch may come with a detachable face and dual-camera system—one front-facing and another on the side—intended to enable photo and video capture from the wrist. These features could also serve Meta's plans for future integration with its metaverse and AR/VR platforms.

## India Bowled Out for 224 in 5th Test Day 2

Tndia was bowled out for 224 in Itheir first innings on day two of the fifth and final Test against England at The Oval, succumbing to a brilliant bowling performance led by England pacer Gus Atkinson.

The Indian innings, which resumed at 204 for six after rain delayed day one, suffered an early blow as overnight batters Karun Nair (57) and Washington Sundar (26) were dismissed within the first 20 minutes of play. Atkinson was the standout bowler for England, claiming five wickets for 33 runs in 21.4 overs, including key breakthroughs that brought the Indian innings to an end. His

partner Josh Tongue also impressed with figures of 3 for 57, the duo sharing the bulk of the bowling workload on a pitch that offered movement and bounce.

Earlier in the innings, Sai Sudharsan topscored for India with 38 runs, but the rest of the batting lineup struggled to withstand the pressure from England's pace attack.



The dismissal of Nair and Sundar marked a crucial turning point, as the lower order failed to build any substantial partnerships. England's bowling attack was further boosted by the injury setback to Indian pacer Chris Woakes, who was ruled out of the remainder of the Test due to a shoulder injury. With India's first innings now complete,

England will look to capitalize on this advantage as the match progresses. The game remains finely poised with several sessions left to play.

Fifth seed Holger Rune advanced with a 6-2, 6-4 win over Alexandre Muller. Meanwhile, eighth seed Casper Ruud overcame a slow start to beat Nuno Borges 7-5, 6-4, earning his 20th win of the season. Ruud will next meet 11th seed Karen Khachanov, who edged past Emilio Nava 6-7 (6/8), 6-4, 6-1.

Ruud and Khachanov last met during the 2022 US Open semifinals, won by Ruud.
