CM Bats for Continued **Congress-Communist Unity**

Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy emphasized the importance of continued cooperation between the Congress and Communist parties, stating that such unity has always benefited the people. He made these remarks while speaking at the 10th anniversary celebrations of the Nava Telangana daily newspaper, which he lauded for consistently standing by the public regardless of who is in power.

"There are only a few media organizations today that consistently stand on the side of the people, and Nava Telangana is one of them," the Chief Minister said, reflecting on the newspaper's legacy and role in upholding democratic values.

Revanth Reddy recalled how press organizations played a vital role during India's freedom struggle and also during the armed peasant movements led by Communist forces. He said the Communist-run newspapers of the past were instrumental in raising awareness against social evils and injustice, and Nava Telangana continues that tradition.

Taking a critical view of the current state of journalism, he expressed concern over the growing crisis of credibility among press organizations. "Today, some political party newspapers are more concerned with protecting their incomes and hiding their mistakes than informing the public," he remarked. "This is eroding the meaning of the word 'journalist'."

The Chief Minister warned that social Likewise, without the red flag in public



media has further blurred the lines, with people who have no knowledge of journalism parading as journalists. He urged genuine journalists to take responsibility and protect the profession's integrity by drawing a clear line between real and fake journalism.

"In the past, journalists who attended press meets would come prepared with facts. Today, strange trends have emerged, and unfortunately, some political parties are encouraging these trends to weaken the system," he said, calling the situation a threat to national security if not corrected.

Revanth Reddy also used a powerful analogy, saying, "Communists are like salt—without salt, food has no taste.

He reiterated that the Congress party has always received significant support from Communist allies in both past and present political victories. "We will give equal priority to Nava Telangana in government announcements. The cooperation between Congress and Communists should continue like this in the future. If both work together, the people will benefit more."

His remarks come at a time when ideological media and partisan journalism are under increasing scrutiny. The CM's speech struck a balance between celebrating the progressive legacy of Communist media and warning against the dangers of partisan reporting.



With this directive, the spotlight has firmly shifted to the Speaker, who is now compelled to act swiftly and judi-

This judicial intervention has come as a political blow to the Congress. The ruling has not only questioned the ethical foundation of the Congress party's handling of the issue but also created political uncertainty. The very identity of the MLAs - whether they still belong to BRS or have lawfully shifted allegiance to Congress — is now under legal and political scrutiny. If disqualification proceeds, it could impact the numbers in the Legislative Assembly and potentially trigger by-elections in the concerned constituen-

The Congress leadership, particularly Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, has so far remained silent on the matter. While the party has claimed to uphold democratic values, doubts are emerging over whether it will

allow the Speaker to act independently or intervene to protect the defected MLAs. With legal clarity favoring disqualification, Congress may soon be faced with the question — will it give these MLAs a hand by supporting their re-election or sideline them and field fresh candidates?

BRS, on the other hand, has welcomed the court's order as a legal and moral victory. Leaders see it as vindication of their consistent struggle over the past 18 months. Now, with the momentum swinging back in its favor, BRS is preparing to reorganize its cadre. The party is likely to expose the defectors and convert public anger into electoral strength if by-elections are held.

The political drama has its roots in the defection of ten BRS MLAs — Danam Nagender, Tellam Venkat Rao, Kadiyam Srihari, Pocharam Srinivas Reddy, Bandla Krishnamohan Reddy, Kale Yadayya, Prakash Goud, Arikepudi Gandhi, Gudem Mahipal Reddy, and Sanjay Kumar — all of whom joined the Congress after winning on the BRS symbol in the 2023 elections. In response, BRS leaders K.T. Rama Rao, Padi Kaushik Reddy, Jeevan Reddy, and Vivekananda filed disqualification petitions with the Speaker. With no action forthcoming, they took the battle to the High Court, and ultimately, the Supreme Court.



Speaking at a press conference at Telangana Bhavan, Harish Rao questioned Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's silence on the issue, claiming it has encouraged Andhra Pradesh leaders like Nara Lokesh to speak boldly about completing the project. "Revanth's silence is seen as support. He is more interested in gaining praise from Chandrababu and Delhi than protecting Telangana,"

He called the Banakacharla project illegal and pointed out that several central agencies, including the CWC and environmental boards, have already rejected its DPR. "If surplus water truly exists, sation Act and the Sri Krishna Commit-

Rao accused the Congress and BJP of enabling Andhra Pradesh's "bulldozing politics" by remaining mute spectators. He said Revanth Reddy's government made a "lacuna agreement" and is now refusing to raise its voice. "Lokesh is emboldened because Telangana is silent," he said.

Referring to Telangana's rightful allocation of 968 TMC under the AP Reorgani-

tee recommendations, Rao demanded AP withdraw its objections to Telangana's Godavari projects. "If they divert Godavari to Krishna, we must be compensated. Our share must be honored," he asserted.

Harish Rao warned that the BRS would

go to the Supreme Court if necessary. "If they know how to get clearances, we know how to block them," he said, adding that the party would not tolerate any move that hurts Telangana's interests.

He also demanded answers from Telangana MPs of both Congress and BJP, asking why none of them have raised the issue in Parliament. "Are they here to protect Telangana or to destroy it?" he questioned.

Rao concluded by reaffirming that BRS will fight legally and politically to protect Telangana's water rights and block any unilateral move on the Banakacharla project.



Big relief for CM Revanth

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy received a major relief as the Court for People's Representatives in Nampally dismissed two cases filed against him, one from 2018 and another from 2023. The court, after examining the evidence and hearing both sides, found no grounds to proceed with the charges.

The first case, filed in 2018 at the Kowdipalle Police Station in Medak district, pertained to a pro-

test organized by Revanth Reddy when he was the President of the Pradesh Congress Committee (PCC). The protest reportedly led to traffic disruption, prompting the police to register a case for public obstruction.

The second case was filed in 2023 by Nalgonda Two Town Police. It stemmed from comments made by Revanth Reddy during a political event, where he alleged that the then BRS government was misusing the police force for political gain. The statements were viewed as derogatory and led to legal proceedings.

Following investigations, charge sheets were filed in both cases, and the court had sought the Chief Minister's appearance. Revanth Reddy appeared in court and submitted that the cases were politically motivated, aimed at silencing opposition voices.

The court dismissed both cases, citing lack of substantial evidence and highlighting the political nature of the complaints. The judgment has come as a significant legal and political boost for the Chief Minister.

Kadiyam Srihari Reacts to **SC Verdict on Defections**

Congress MLA from Station Ghanpur, Kadiyam Srihari, has responded to the Supreme Court's verdict in the party defection case with a firm stand, stating that he will respect and abide by the decision taken by the Assembly Speaker. Speaking to the media, Srihari launched a scathing attack on BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), criticizing his recent statements about by-elections.

Reacting to KTR's call asking BRS workers to prepare for by-elections in the next three months, Srihari reminded that it is the Election Commission, not KTR, who decides when elections are held. He questioned the moral ground of both KTR and former CM KCR on the issue of defections, stating that they have no right to speak on the matter.

Srihari accused the BRS of consistently violating the anti-defection law during its decade in power. He alleged that BRS indulged in largescale mergers of opposition parties and poaching of MLAs throughout their rule. "The BRS government built its strength by encouraging defections. Now, they want to preach about democracy and fairness," he said.

Expressing full faith in his popularity and public support, Srihari stated that even if by-elections are held, he is confident of winning again. He reiterated that he and other affected MLAs are waiting for the Speaker's decision and will act accordingly once it is announced.

Dasoju Shravan clashes with Ponnam Prabhakar

Tensions flared at a ration card distribution program in Hyderabad's Banjara Hills on Friday when BRS MLC Dasoju Shravan interrupted Minister Ponnam Prabhakar's speech, leading to a chaotic scene at Banjara Bhavan under the Khairatabad constituency.

State Minister and Hyderabad in-charge Ponnam Prabhakar distributed 1,150 new ration cards to beneficiaries of the Cantonment constituency at a program held at Lee Palace. Cantonment MLA Sri Ganesh, Corporator Kontham Deepika, Collector Dasari Harichandana, Nominated Member Narmada, and other local leaders were present.

Addressing the gathering, Minister Ponnam said the Congress-led government is committed to ensuring ration cards reach all eligible families. He reminded that in the previous government's tenure, even newly married couples and newborns struggled to get included.

He assured that ration card distribution is a continuous process and urged eligible citizens to apply. "We are correcting the past injustice. Our goal is to ensure food security for every deserving family," he said.

The minister revealed that Hyderabad city has received 55,378 new ration cards, increasing the total from 6.39 lakh to 6.94 lakh. In Cantonment, cards have gone up from 33,971 to 35,121, covering 1,19,080 beneficiaries. An additional 4,664 applications are under verification.

Highlighting the distribution of 6 kg of fine rice per person, he said quality rice is now being supplied to the poor, not just to select groups. "Earlier, people couldn't eat the rice given to them. Now we're ensuring dignity and nutrition,"

R. Krishnaiah Slams **Congress Over BC Reservation Promises**

He asserted that the BJP supports the 42% BC reservation bill and accused the Congress of spreading falsehoods. "Reservations should be for genuine BC communities like artisans, shepherds, and laborers, not based on religion," he said, referring to previous Congress at-

tempts to include Muslim groups under BC quotas. Krishnaiah reminded that the Modi government gave constitutional status to the National BC Commission, launched the PM Vishwakarma Yojana to support caste-based professions, and initiated a national caste census for the first time since 1931.

He questioned the sincerity of Congress, asking why no BC was made Chief Minister or included in key cabinet positions. "If Congress truly cares, let them replace CM Revanth Reddy with a BC leader," he demanded.

Krishnaiah announced a massive Mahadharna at Indira Park on August 2, calling on BC communities to protest Congress's failure to honor its promises.

BC Students Scholarships to Be Released: MLC Sravan



TPN Correspondent | Hyderabad Thousands of BC students are reeling under financial stress due to long-pending scholarships and fee reimbursement arrears. Demanding urgent action from the state government, the BC Students' Union, led by its State President Vemula Ramakrishna, staged a large protest at Indira Park's Dharna Chowk on Thursday.

Extending support to the students' cause, BRS MLC Dr. Dasoju Sravan, former BC Commission Chairman Vakalabaranam Krishnamohan, and other prominent figures participated in the protest and condemned the government's inac-

Addressing the gathering, MLC Sravan said, "The government's negligence toward the education of BC students is unacceptable. Delaying scholarships and

fee reimbursements for months not only causes distress but also deepens social inequality. Education is a right, not a privilege."

The students presented a list of demands, including immediate release of pending fee reimbursements, full coverage of college fees by the government, proper enforcement of the Fee Control Act, and urgent appointment of an Education Minister. They also demanded own buildings with better facilities for BC hostels, seats for all eligible students in Gurukuls, and the sanction of 119 new BC Gurukul schools.

BC leaders warned that if their demands were not met, the student movement would grow into a state-wide agitation. "Education cannot be postponed. We will not tolerate any delay in delivering what is rightfully ours," they de-

Hydra Commissioner **Inspects flood**prone areas

Hyderabad Municipal Commissioner AV Ranganath conducted a comprehensive inspection across various flood-prone and developing areas of the city on Friday. He began by visiting Borabanda and Sunnam Cheruvu, where he reviewed sewage canal diversion and nala construction works. The Commissioner emphasized that floodwater should enter Sunnam Cheruvu, while sewage must be properly channeled elsewhere. He also directed the widening of drains connecting Allapur and Borabanda and took note of encroachments at Padmavati Nagar.

Residents showed the Commissioner sheds and structures encroaching on storm drains and high-tension lines. He assured that steps would be taken to remove such encroachments and widen the Borabanda high-tension road accordingly. Both local Corporators, Baba Fasiuddin and Sabiha Begum, requested quick completion of drain expansion. They also proposed developing road access from the 100-foot road near Ayyappa Society to Sunnam Cheruvu, which the Commissioner said would be considered.

In Gachibowli's NGO Colony, the Commissioner inspected Musaikunta and Gosaikunta ponds, suggesting their full development. At Chintalakunta in Vanasthalipuram, he checked the ongoing underground drainage works under the National Highway to prevent flood stagnation. GHMC officials informed him that 70% of the work was complete.

He later inspected road encroachments in Vivekananda Nagar and Mansurabad, where constructions were reportedly violating Gram Panchayat layouts. A full inquiry has been ordered.

In Mirpet, the Commissioner visited the Nala passing through Badangipet main road and ordered that the expansion be done properly with a 4-meter-wide canal and 2-meter buffer on each side. The administrators of the previously encroached Mallareddy Function Hall have now been tasked with completing the expansion.

Finally, he inspected Peddacheruvu and Hunda Sagar tanks near Bandlaguda and Jalapalli, directing officials to ensure no further encroachments occur. He ordered drone surveys and emphasized determining Full Tank Level (FTL) using village records, NRSC, and Survey of India maps.

Hyderabad: In a move sure to bring cheer to beer lovers, the Telangana government has decided to pour new life into its excise policy by allowing the establishment of micro cording to the latest cabinet deci-

breweries across cities and towns. No longer confined to Hyderabad, these craft beer cafés will soon pop up every 5 kilometers in cities and every 30 kilometers in towns, ac-

sion.The state cabinet, headed by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, approved the amendment of the Telangana Micro Brewery Rules, 2015, effectively lifting the restriction that limited breweries to the GHMC area. Currently, 18 licensed micro-breweries operate in Hyderabad. But now, the frothy expansion is going statewide.

This strategic buzz is more than just about brewing culture—it's about brewing revenue. The move is seen as a measure to increase state earnings by tapping into the fast-growing demand for freshly brewed craft beer, especially during summer when thirst is at its peak.

Back in 2015, it was the previous BRS government that brewed the

original micro-brewery policy, aiming to place Hyderabad on par with metro hubs like Bengaluru, Mumbai, Pune, and Gurugram. The excise department received about 60 applications in the first year, but steep investments—nearly ₹2 crore per unit—meant only 18 licenses were issued. Now, the government has sweetened the pitch: a fixed license fee of ₹3 lakh and a security deposit of ₹1 lakh. Each unit can produce up to 1,000 liters of beer per day. The catch? No takeaways—beer must be consumed on-site, keeping the café vibe alive. With this reform, Telangana is not just chasing spirits—it's chasing a spirited economy. Expect to see your next beer brewed just around the corner. Cheers to that.


ED Files Case in Rs. 7.5 Cr Loan Scam

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has filed a prosecution complaint against Hyderabad-based Saisree Engineers Private Limited (SEPL) and others under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), in connection with a ₹7.5 crore bank fraud case. The complaint was filed before the Special Court

for CBI Cases in Hyderabad and was taken cognisance of on July 28.

The ED launched its probe based on an FIR registered by the CBI's Economic Offences Wing (EOW) in Chennai. The FIR named SEPL, its Managing Director Sagiraju Suryanarayana Raju, unknown bank officials, and others. A chargesheet was later filed by the CBI in the Nampally court.



The ED also found that SEPL received ₹13.53 crore from Bharat Coking Coal Ltd., which it deposited in a current account with Andhra Bank instead of repaying the outstanding SBI loans. The amount was further diverted through various channels including cash withdrawals, transfers to Raju's personal and employee accounts, and repayment of unrelated loans.

So far, the ED has attached three immovable properties worth ₹3.11 crore belonging to Raju. Further investigation is ongoing.

GHMC Hits 7,258 in Pothole Repair Drive

Jurala Project Sees 2 Lakh Cusecs Inflow

Heavy inflows were recorded at the Jurala reservoir on Friday as floodwaters surged into the project due to upstream rainfall. By evening, the reservoir had received an inflow of 2.01 lakh cusecs. Officials from the Irrigation Department immediately swung into action to regulate water levels and avoid overflow risks.

To manage the situation, authorities lifted 18 crest gates of the reservoir. A discharge of 1,79,316 cusecs of water was released downstream to the Krishna River, while 25,205 cusecs were diverted to hydropower generation units. In addition to flood management, the department ensured supply to various irrigation schemes critical to the region's agriculture.

Water was released to the following: 650 cusecs to the Main Right Canal, 1,250 cusecs to the Left Canal, 750 cusecs to the Nettempadu Lift Irrigation Scheme, 315 cusecs to the Koilsagar project, 800 cusecs to the Parallel Canal, and 750 cusecs to the Bhima Phase-I Lift Irrigation Scheme.

Officials stated that while the maximum water storage level of the Jurala reservoir is 318.516 meters, the water level stood at 317.640 meters at the time of reporting. They added that all safety measures are in place and inflows are being closely monitored. Authorities have advised people in downstream areas to stay alert and cooperate with officials if precautionary measures become necessary.

Wangara Health Centre in Ruins, Locals **Demand Action**

The Primary Health Center (PHC) in Wangara village, Bhimadevarapalli mandal, is teetering on the edge of collapse, endangering both staff and patients. The dilapidated building has developed wide cracks in the walls and slabs, while rainwater regularly floods the wards, making medical operations nearly impossible. The staff, forced to work amid fear and uncertainty, report that vital medicines are getting damaged due to constant leaks, and thorny overgrowth around the premises has turned it into a jungle. The presence of snakes has made even stepping into the PHC grounds risky. Despite the presence of two government-appointed doctors, the facility lacks basic infrastructure like clean water, proper storage, and sanitation.

Locals say the building is so dangerous that most villagers avoid seeking treatment there. They have made repeated appeals to authorities to intervene, but no action has been taken so far. With the structure worsening during the monsoon, residents warn that a tragedy is imminent if urgent repairs are not carried out.



Collector Calls for Trust in Govt Hospitals

Neglect of Individual Care Plans Harm Children in Child Care Institutions

ny person below the age of 18 is considered a child under the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). The UNCRC, a global framework to safeguard children's rights, came into force on 2nd September 1990. India ratified this convention on 11th December 1992 and has since implemented its provisions. Today, 196 countries across the world follow the principles laid out in the UNCRC.

The fundamental rights guaranteed to every child under the UNCRC include:

- Right to Survival
- Right to Development
- Right to Protection
- Right to Participation These rights are to be ensured without any discrimination.

To uphold these principles, the Government of India enacted the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2000, which has been amended over time. The latest version, Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Amendment

Act, 2021, came into effect from 1st September 2022. Under Section 27 of this Act, Child Welfare Committees (CWCs) have been constituted in every district. These Committees function as a bench of Judicial Magistrate of First Class, empowered by the Criminal Procedure Code, 1973. CWCs are responsible for interacting with and assessing children brought before them, often from highly vulnerable backgrounds, including:

- Orphans and semi-orphans Children from broken or abusive families
- Street children and child laborers
- Victims of trafficking, child marriage, or abuse
- Drug-addicted or mentally/ physically challenged children
- Children affected by HIV/AIDS Abandoned or surrendered children
- Missing and begging children These children are temporarily placed in licensed Child Care Institutions (CCIs) for care, counseling, and rehabilitation. The goal is to reunite them with their families where possible, or otherwise, prepare them for an independent and dignified life.

However, a major gap exists in the implementation of Individual Care Plans (ICPs) — a crucial component mandated by the law.

What is an Individual Care Plan?

An Individual Care Plan is a personalized and dynamic roadmap

designed for each child, tailored to address their unique needs, challenges, and aspirations. It is developed in collaboration with caregivers, counselors, and wherever possible, the child and their family.

A well-prepared **ICP should include:**

- Personal Medical History
- Family and Social Background
- **Developmental Milestones Emotional and Behavioral**
- Needs Interests, Preferences, and
- **Talents Educational and Vocational**
- Goals

Specific timelines, strategies, and interventions

Regular reviews and updates must be conducted to adjust the plan as the child grows and their circumstances evolve.

The Consequences of **Neglecting ICPs:**

Many CCIs, due to lack of awareness, resources, or oversight, fail to prepare or implement ICPs for the children under their care. This shortfall severely affects the child's ability to reintegrate into society once they turn 18 — the legal age at which they must exit the institution.

Although some support may be extended through After-Care Programs, these are limited and require that the child is adequately prepared for independent living. Without proper education, skill development, or emotional support, many of these young adults are left directionless and vulnerable, often slipping back into cycles of poverty, exploitation, or crime.

The Way Forward:

China Grows Wary as Pakistan Becomes Security Liability Amid CPEC Threats

China's strategic patience with Pakistan is wearing thin as persistent security threats endanger its flagship Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) project — the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC). During a recent meeting with Pakistan Army Chief General Asim Munir, China's Central Military Commission Vice-Chairman Zhang Youxia explicitly urged stronger security for Chinese nationals and investments in Pakistan.

The appeal is not new — but it is increasingly urgent. A 2024 report by Pakistan's National Counter Terrorism Authority (NACTA) revealed that 20 Chinese citizens have been killed and 34 injured in attacks since 2021. The threat is twofold, stemming from both Baloch insurgents and Islamist militants like the Tehreek-e-Taliban



Pakistan (TTP).

While the TTP targets Chinese personnel as a symbolic attack against Islamabad's foreign alliances, Baloch insurgents see Beijing's presence as exploitation of their resource-rich region. Their tactics — hijackings, suicide bombings (including by women), and road blockades — aim to cripple CPEC-linked logistics and damage Pakistan's trade routes.

Despite deploying Special Security Divisions and surveillance systems, Pakistan's response has been largely reactive. Strategic vulnerabilities persist, and Beijing's dissatisfaction is now surfacing publicly. The upcoming B2B-focused second phase of CPEC requires a secure environment — something Pakistan is struggling to

guarantee.

Internally, Pakistan's fragile security apparatus, ethnic grievances, and economic constraints further complicate the situation. Delays, insurance hikes, and operational risks are eroding China's investment appetite, pushing it to reassess engagement terms.

The CPEC's viability, deeply tied to western China's stability and Xinjiang's economic agenda, now hangs in the balance. A continued failure to secure Chinese interests could convert Pakistan from a "strategic ally" into a costly liability — forcing China to reconsider the depth of its relationship.

The road ahead may be defined less by partnership and more by growing frustration in Beijing.

'Make in India' Falls Short as **Manufacturing Shrinks, Not Surges**



launch, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's flagship Make At its core, critics say, Make in in India campaign is faltering. Promised as a revival of India's manufacturing might, the initiative now stands as a cautionary tale of optics overshadowing execution.

Launched in 2014, Make in India aimed to increase the manufacturing sector's GDP share from 16% to 25% by 2022. Instead, it dipped below 13% by 2024. Jobs in the sector fell drastically from 5.1 crore in 2016-17 to 2.7 crore in 2020-21,

A decade after its grand raising deep concerns.

India was more about branding than building. Flashy summits and a logo designed by a U.S. firm masked the absence of a coherent policy roadmap. Key components — infrastructure, skilling, and sectoral focus — were either underfunded or ignored.

Gross Fixed Capital Formation, a key indicator of infrastructure investment, declined from 36% of GDP in 2007 to 30% by 2024. Foreign Direct Invest-

ment also plummeted, falling from 8.8% of total capital formation in 2020 to 2.3% in 2024.

While Production-Linked Incentive (PLI) schemes provided a minor boost in areas like smartphone manufacturing, they couldn't offset structural gaps. Meanwhile, policy shocks like demonetisation and a flawed GST rollout devastated small and medium enterprises — the backbone of India's manufacturing sector.

With over 1,400 regulatory requirements draining resources and credit access limited to just 20% of MSMEs, growth remains elusive. Reports on job losses and unemployment were buried, and key economic data was withheld, raising accountability concerns.


The decade-long effort, instead of revitalising industry, has left it adrift. As global peers advance domestic manufacturing, Make in India has become a case study in missed opportunity — proving that strategy, not slogans, drives real economic transformation.

"Our ties with any country stand on their merit and should not be seen through the prism of a third country," Jaiswal stated. "As far as India-Russia relations are concerned, we have a steady and time-tested partnership."

Trump had criticized India and Russia in a post on his social platform Truth Social, saying, "They can take their dead economies down together." He also claimed that India's tariffs are among the highest in the world and dismissed bilateral trade

Jaiswal highlighted the "comprehensive global strategic partnership" between India and the US, grounded in democratic values and strong people-to-people ties. Tharoor Differs With Rahul Gandhi Over Trump Remarks

Congress MP Shashi Tharoor on Friday publicly distanced himself from party colleague Rahul Gandhi's endorsement of US President Donald Trump's controversial remarks calling India a "dead economy". Responding to Trump's statement on social media, Mr Tharoor said, "This is not the case, and we all know it," defending India's economic strength amid recent trade tensions with Washington.

Trump, while justifying a 25% tariff on Indian exports, claimed he was unconcerned about India's ties with Russia and dismissed both nations' economies as "dead." "They can take their dead economies down together," he wrote on Truth Social, also accusing India of maintaining "strenuous and obnoxious" trade barriers. Surprisingly, Rahul Gandhi, the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, agreed with Trump's assessment. "He is right. Everybody knows this except the Prime Minister and the Finance Minister," he told reporters in Parliament.

However, other Congress leaders voiced strong disagreement. Karti Chidambaram, Congress MP, called Trump "an unconventional politician" and downplayed the comment. "India and America are large economies that need each other. Flipping comments won't derail this relationship," he said in an interview.

Rajya Sabha MP Rajiv Shukla also rejected Trump's characterization of India's economy. "Our economic condition is not at all weak. Trump is living in a delusion," he told ANI.

Trump releases revised tariffs for 70 countries

U.S. President Donald Trump has issued a revised executive order formalizing new reciprocal tariffs for nearly 70 countries, retaining a 25% tariff on Indian exports while slashing Pakistan's rate from 29% to 19%. The revised duties, outlined in an executive order titled "Further Modifying The Reciprocal Tariff Rates," will come into effect from August 7, 2025.

India's tariff rate remains unchanged despite earlier threats of an added penalty over its continued military and energy ties with Russia. However, the finalized order makes no mention of this penalty. Trump had earlier accused India of using high tariffs and non-monetary

trade barriers and being a major buyer of Russian energy and defense equipment—factors he claimed warranted the tariff

a 10% tariff reduction, drawing attention to Washington's evolving trade strategy in South

The move comes amid tense U.S.-India relations following Trump's criticism of India's BRICS membership and trade surplus with the U.S., which he described as "massive." The White House also questioned India's alignment with American economic and security pri-

"all necessary steps to safeguard national interests." Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal indicated that exemptions will apply to goods shipped before August 7 and cleared in the U.S. Pakistan, in contrast, received by October 5—offering exporters temporary relief.

No F-35 Jets From US? **India Weighs Options**

India is exploring ways to ease tensions with the US following President Donald Trump's surprise announcement of a 25% tariff on Indian exports, sources familiar with the matter told Bloomberg. Despite the tariff threat, New Delhi has ruled out immediate retaliation and is considering increasing imports from the US, including natural gas, communication equipment, and gold, to help narrow its trade surplus over the next few years.

Officials expressed disappointment over Trump's move but remain committed to continuing bilateral trade talks. Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal confirmed that the government is consulting exporters to assess the tariffs' impact and vowed to protect national interests.

Notably, India has decided against boosting defense purchases from the US, a key demand from Trump. The Modi government is not interested in acquiring the expensive F-35 stealth fighter jets, which Trump had offered during Modi's visit to Washington in February. Instead, India prefers focusing on domestic defense manufacturing partnerships rather than buying ready-made US equipment.

US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent criticized India for slowing trade negotiations, citing India's close ties with Russia as a concern. Trump's tariffs also come amid criticism of India's energy purchases from Russia, which the US sees as supporting Moscow's war efforts in Ukraine.

Despite the trade tensions, both countries had previously aimed to finalize a bilateral trade deal by fall 2025. Analysts remain cautious about Trump's tariff threats, viewing them possibly as negotiating tactics, similar to past US-EU trade disputes.

India's markets reacted mildly, with the rupee dipping slightly and stocks edging lower. Experts suggest India may need to be more flexible in ongoing talks but reaffirm the country's priority to protect farmers, entrepreneurs, and small businesses.

As the US-India relationship navigates these hurdles, New Delhi balances diplomatic pragmatism with safeguarding its strategic and economic interests.

Trump Deserves Nobel Peace Prize for Ending India-Pak Conflict: White House

White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt on Thursday asserted that U.S. President Donald Trump should be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize, citing his role in brokering multiple global ceasefires—including the recent de-escalation between India and Pakistan.

During a press briefing in Washington, Leavitt claimed that President Trump has successfully mediated peace in several conflict zones during his six months in office. "He has now ended conflicts between Thailand and Cambodia, Israel and Iran, Rwanda and the DRC, India and Pakistan, Serbia and Kosovo, and Egypt and Ethiopia," she stated. "It's well past time President Trump was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize."

Trump had earlier taken credit for ending hostilities between India and Pakistan, saying a ceasefire was achieved on May 10 after a "long night" of U.S.-led talks. He has since repeated that claim in public statements, saying he leveraged trade deals to push both nations toward peace, adding that

the U.S. promised increased trade if military action ceased.

However, Indian officials strongly deny any external mediation. Prime Minister Narendra Modi told Parliament that no foreign leader, including Trump, influenced India's military decisions during Operation Sindoor. External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar reiterated that there was no third-party role and confirmed that there were no phone calls between Modi and Trump during the time Trump claims he negotiated the ceasefire.

"India acted independently and firmly in its national interest," Jaishankar told the Rajya Sabha, directly contradicting Trump's assertions.

The White House push for Trump's Nobel recognition comes amid broader diplomatic tensions, including new U.S. tariffs on Indian exports and growing criticism of India's ties with Russia. While the Nobel Committee remains silent, Trump's self-promotion as a peacemaker continues to draw both support and skepticism at home and abroad.



"India An Ally, But Can't Align 100% Of Time": US **On Trump Tariffs**

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio acknowledged India as a strategic ally but expressed clear frustration over India's continued purchase of Russian oil, calling it "a point of irritation" in bilateral relations. Rubio's remarks came a day after former US President Donald Trump announced a 25 percent tariff on Indian goods starting August 1, alongside unspecified penalties targeting India's procurement of Russian military equipment and energy.

Speaking to Fox Radio, Rubio emphasized that while India is a key partner, alignment on every issue is unrealistic. "India has huge energy needs," he said, explaining that Russia's sanctioned and discounted oil is an economically attractive option for India. However, Rubio warned that these purchases indirectly sustain Russia's war efforts in Ukraine. Trump's tariff announcement criticized India for high tariffs and trade barriers, alongside its close military and energy ties with Russia and China. On his social media platform Truth Social, Trump stated, "India will therefore be paying a tariff of 25%, plus a penalty for the above, starting on August first."

India responded calmly, with the Ministry of Commerce and Industry stating that it is reviewing the US announcement while remaining committed to negotiating a fair and balanced bilateral trade agreement. The government reaffirmed its priority to protect farmers, entrepreneurs, and MSMEs, promising to safeguard national interests as done with other trade deals, such as the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement with the UK.

Zelensky Calls for Regime Change in Russia to Ensure Long-Term Peace

Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky has called on Western nations to pursue regime change in Russia, warning that Moscow will remain a threat even after the current war ends unless its leadership is replaced.

Speaking via video at an international conference marking the 50th anniversary of the Helsinki Accords, Zelensky stated, "I believe Russia can be pushed to stop this war... But if the world doesn't aim to change the regime in Russia, that means even after the war ends, Moscow will still try to destabilize neighboring countries."

Zelensky also urged the West to go beyond sanctions by confiscating frozen Russian assets and using them

to support Ukraine's defense. "It's time to confiscate Russian assets, not just freeze them," he said, emphasizing that the funds should be redirected toward countering Russian aggression.

His comments come amid heightened tensions between Moscow and Western nations, with Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov accusing the West of betraying the Helsinki Accords' principles. In an article released to mark the anniversary, Lavrov claimed the European Union is evolving into a "Fourth Reich," citing rising Russophobia and militarization.

Russian President Vladimir Putin also weighed in, accusing Western governments of misleading



their citizens to justify soaring military expenditures and masking internal economic problems.

Despite these sharp exchanges, Moscow claims it remains open to negotiations with Kyiv. RT reported that several rounds of talks have taken place in recent months but that little progress has been made, with Russia accusing Ukraine and its allies of failing to address "territorial realities."

Russia has also questioned Zelensky's political legitimacy, arguing that his term expired in May 2024 and that martial law does not justify postponing elections indefinitely. Russian officials claim the Ukrainian parliament now holds governing authority.

Global Cues, Trump Tariffs Hit Sentiments

In total, the Nifty lost 203 points and the Sensex lost 585 points.

It reached an intraday high of 81,317. It ended at 80,599, down 585 points. The NSE Nifty, which opened at 24,734, touched a low of 24,535 and a high of

The seasonally adjusted PMI stood at 59.1 in July, up from 58.4 in June, marking the strongest performance since March 2024. A PMI reading above 50 indicates

expansion, while below 50 signals constrong activity levels, business contraction.

Commercial LPG Cylinder Price Cut By Rs 33.50



Tn a move that brings much-need-**L**ed relief to the hospitality and commercial sectors, oil marketing companies have announced a reduction in the price of 19 kg commercial LPG cylinders by ₹33.50. The new rates came into effect starting Thursday, August 1.

As per the revised prices, the cost of a 19 kg commercial LPG cylinder in the national capital now stands at ₹1,631.50, down from ₹1,665. This price cut follows the standard monthly revision that oil companies undertake at the beginning of every month.

The reduction in commercial LPG rates is expected to ease the cost burden on hotels, restaurants, catering businesses, and small industries that rely heavily on commercial LPG for daily operations. However, prices of 14.2 kg domestic LPG cylinders remain unchanged, offering no direct relief to household consumers this month.

This is the fourth consecutive price cut on commercial LPG cylinders in the last five months, signaling a relatively stable international market for liquefied petroleum gas and possibly reflecting softening crude prices.

Oil marketing companies such as Indian Oil Corporation, Bharat Petroleum, and Hindustan Petroleum review LPG rates monthly based on global benchmark prices and the rupee-dollar exchange rate. While commercial LPG rates are deregulated and directly linked to international prices, domestic LPG prices are more tightly controlled by the government and subject to periodic subsidies or policy interventions.

Industry bodies have welcomed the move, with some restaurant associations saying it would provide "short-term breathing room" as input costs remain high across the food and beverage sector.

No announcement has yet been made regarding any revision in domestic LPG subsidies or further reductions.

July GST Collections Rise by 7.5% to ₹1.96 Lakh Crore



collection data for July 2025, reporting a 7.5% year-on-year increase. The total collection stood at ₹1.96 lakh crore, driven by higher income from domestic transactions and imports.

However, the growth was slightly lower when compared to recent months. In the first quarter of this year, the average GST collection was ₹2.1 lakh crore—significantly higher than the July figure. April saw a peak of ₹2.37 lakh crore, followed by ₹2.01 lakh crore in May.

The GST revenue for the April–July period reached ₹8.18 lakh crore, marking a 10.7% increase over the ₹7.39 lakh crore collected during the same period last year.

In July, the total GST collection of ₹1.96 lakh crore comprised ₹35,470 crore from Central GST, ₹44,059 crore from State GST, ₹1,03,536 crore from Integrated GST, and ₹12,670 crore from cess.

The Centre on Thursday released After adjusting for refunds, the net GST revenue for July stood at ₹1,68,588 crore, a marginal 1.7% increase over last year. The subdued net growth is attributed to a rise in refunds, which reached ₹27,147

Spanish Town Declares Dying Illegal Due to Cemetery Crisis

Tn the quaint Spanish town of Lanjarón, dying is technically illegal — a peculiar law born out of a serious space shortage in the town's only cemetery. The bizarre edict was issued in 1999 by then-mayor Jose Rubio, who, faced with no available burial plots, jokingly banned death until a new graveyard could be found.

"It is hereby forbidden to die in Lanjarón," the decree humorously stated. Mayor Rubio clarified at the time, "I'm just a mayor. Above me is God, who ultimately runs things," adding that the law was taken in good humor by residents.

Now, 26 years later, the rule still stands, and the cemetery crisis remains unresolved, with Lanjarón still operating

only one graveyard. Despite its macabre-sounding legislation, Lanjarón is a peaceful town of 4,000 people, known for its natural beauty and therapeutic mineral springs. Located in the Alpujarra region of Granada at the base of the Sierra Nevada mountains, it attracts wellness seekers and tourists alike.

The town's 18th-century spa, or balneario, continues to draw visitors looking for relief from ail-



ments through mineral-rich waters. Lanjarón is also famous for its annual Fiesta del Agua y del Jamón — a summer celebration featuring townwide water fights and traditional foods.

Lanjarón's quirky law has sparked renewed attention, especially among Gen Z travelers on Tik-Tok, searching for hidden gems beyond Spain's usual tourist hubs.

Interestingly, Lanjarón isn't alone in its ban on death. Longyearbyen, Norway, enacted a similar rule in 1950 when scientists found that bodies didn't decompose in the permafrost, raising public health concerns.

While symbolic, these laws reflect deeper issues — from climate impacts to infrastructure shortfalls — and continue to amuse and intrigue visitors from around the world.

Could Earth Be Ejected From the Solar System? Arecent study published in the journal Mercury's orbit could become unstable with a 50–80% increased risk of chaotic settling questions about the long-term stability of Earth's orbit within the solar system. While the probability of such an event occurring in the next five billion years remains low—around 0.2%—the findings challenge the long-standing view that planetary orbits are fixed and unchanging. This research offers a sobering reminder that Earth, despite its seeming security, exists within a dynamic and sometimes unpredictable cosmic environment. The possibility that our planet could be displaced or even ejected underscores the need for continued study of celestial mechanics and the influences of passing stars. Ultimately, the study provides a humbling perspective on humanity's place in the vast and ever-changing universe.

Swiggy Re-Evaluates Rapido Stake Amid Rising Competition



wiggy has officially confirmed it is reas-Sessing its stake in bike taxi and logistics startup Rapido, as competition in India's mobility and quick-commerce sectors heats up. The move comes during a crucial period for the food delivery giant, which is navigating rising marketing costs and a sharpened focus on achieving profitability in its primary business verticals.

Swiggy, which holds a significant minority stake in Rapido, is reportedly evaluating the strategic value of this investment as it reallocates resources toward its core operations—primarily food delivery and Instamart, its quick-commerce platform. According to insiders, the re-evaluation is part of a larger strategic review that may involve either increasing its involvement in Rapido or partially divesting its stake, depending on future market alignment.

The decision reflects broader market dynamics, with competition from rivals like Zomato and Zepto prompting Swiggy to optimize its capital deployment. Swiggy has been increasing marketing spend in highgrowth cities and investing in technology to enhance customer experience, while maintaining its push for profitability ahead of a potential IPO.

Rapido, meanwhile, continues to expand its bike taxi and logistics services across major Indian cities. It remains a strong player in last-mile connectivity, but its long-term synergy with Swiggy's food and grocery delivery ambitions is under review.

Swiggy's spokesperson stated, "We periodically assess all our investments to ensure they align with our long-term business objectives. Rapido has been a valued partner, and any decisions will be taken with strategic clarity and in mutual interest."

Analysts see this re-evaluation as a pragmatic step for Swiggy to sharpen its operational focus and maintain a competitive edge in a rapidly evolving market. Further announcements regarding the Rapido stake are expected in the coming months.

Meta Smartwatch With Camera Likely to Launch in September Meta Platforms is reportedly gearing up to plaunch a new smartwatch with built-in

cameras as early as September 2025, according to sources familiar with the development. The long-rumored wearable is said to include two integrated cameras, making it one of the first smartwatches to feature such a design. Development on the Meta smartwatch reportedly began in 2021, as part of the company's broader ambition to expand its hardware ecosystem and deepen its footprint in the wearable tech space. Meta, the parent company of Facebook and Instagram, has been gradually pushing into augmented reality (AR), virtual reality (VR), and now possibly wearable computing, with this smartwatch being seen as a stepping stone to more advanced wearable platforms.

India Bowled Out for 224 in 5th Test Day 2

Tndia was bowled out for 224 in Itheir first innings on day two of the fifth and final Test against England at The Oval, succumbing to a brilliant bowling performance led by England pacer Gus Atkinson.

The Indian innings, which resumed at 204 for six after rain delayed day one, suffered an early blow as overnight batters Karun Nair (57) and Washington Sundar (26) were dismissed within the first 20 minutes of play. Their quick wickets exposed a fragile Indian tail, which collapsed without much resistance, adding just 20 more runs.

Atkinson was the standout bowler for England, claiming five wickets for 33 runs in 21.4 overs, including key breakthroughs that brought the Indian innings to an end. His

partner Josh Tongue also impressed with figures of 3 for 57, the duo sharing the bulk of the bowling workload on a pitch that offered movement and bounce.

Earlier in the innings, Sai Sudharsan topscored for India with 38 runs, but the rest of the batting lineup struggled to withstand the pressure from England's pace attack.



The dismissal of Nair and Sundar marked a crucial turning point, as the lower order failed to build any substantial partnerships. England's bowling attack was further boosted by the injury setback to Indian pacer Chris Woakes, who was ruled out of the remainder of the Test due to a shoulder injury. With India's first innings now complete,

England will look to capitalize on this advantage as the match progresses. The game remains finely poised with several sessions left to play.
