"LAND POOLING A FLAWED PRIORITY" JD

You chose to become a politician instead of continuing as an IPS officer. Many have made this transition—what sets you apart?

Published from : Vijayawada - Hyderabad - Delhi - Bengaluru

My perspective on politics is unique. My bureaucratic experience has given me a deep understanding of people's challenges, which I aim to address through meaningful public service. After engaging with communities and witnessing their struggles, I decided to enter politics to make a broader impact.

Which role do you find more fulfilling—IPS officer or politician?

To me, politics is the ultimate form of public service. Bureaucracy is valuable but often confined to specific areas of operation. Politics, however, has no limits in its potential to drive change. While I excelled as a bureaucrat, I believe politics offers a larger platform to serve and benefit the people.

Your political career includes associations with Lok Satta, Jana Sena, and now leading the Jaya Bharat National Party. Does this suggest confusion in your political journey?

I am not confused—my mission has always been clear, whether in bureaucracy or politics. I never formally joined Lok Satta; there was

a discussion with Dr. Jayaprakash Narayan about continuing their platform, but Lok Satta's focus on avoiding electoral politics didn't align with my belief that elections are vital in a democracy. So, I moved on.

I joined Jana Sena because I was drawn to their "zero-budget politics" policy. However, I left when Pawan Kalyan chose to continue his film career alongside politics. I felt this dual commitment would undermine the party's consistency and grassroots strength.

In 2023, I took over the Jaya Bharat National Party, originally founded by Mr. Chinnaya Dhor in 2014. We revitalized it with a new ideology centered on empowering youth to become self-reliant, not dependent on freebies. Contesting elections allowed us to connect with people and present a manifesto focused on creating opportunities for young people.

There's speculation that ideological differences with Mr. Nadendla Manohar led to your departure from Jana Sena. Is this true?

No. The sole reason I left Jana Sena was Pawan Kalyan's decision to pursue his film career while leading a political party. I believed this would compromise the party's focus. After leaving, I realized joining another

party would mean adopting their ideology. Instead, I chose to lead Jaya Bharat National Party to pursue my own vision.

What is your opinion on Pawan Kalyan and Jana Sena's shift from alliances with Left parties and BSP to joining BJP and TDP?

In politics, gaining power is critical, and alliances are often strategic. Pawan Kalyan's alliance with BJP and TDP was likely aimed at preventing Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy from retaining power. Importantly, Jana Sena has maintained its individuality without merging with other parties, reflecting a pragmatic approach while preserving its identity.

Do you think the BJP influenced Pawan Kalyan to expand his influence in southern states?

It's possible. As a prominent figure with a large fan base, Pawan Kalyan has significant influence. The BJP, already in alliance with him, likely saw an opportunity to leverage his popularity to strengthen their presence in southern states.



Direct Criticism of Land Pooling and Amaravati Focus

He criticizes the state's plan for more land pooling in Amaravati, arguing that sufficient land already exists and balanced regional development (like in Uttarandhra and Rayalaseema) is being ignored.

What is your view on the coalition government's performance after one and a half years?

The media is polarized—some outlets praise the government, while others highlight its failures, often obscuring the truth due to declining journalistic standards. The coalition has prioritized projects like Amaravati and Polavaram, which is positive. However, they have not fulfilled key election promises, such as the "Super Six" schemes or continuing the previous government's

In an exclusive interview, former bureaucrat-turned-politician and leader of the Jaya Bharat National Party, JD Lakshmi Narayana, shared his journey, vision, and perspectives on Andhra Pradesh's political landscape. welfare programs, like direct benefit transfers. The shift toward more freebies, like Talliki Vandanam and free bus services, contradicts our party's ideology at Jaya Bharat National Party, which opposes freebies and focuses on creating employment opportunities for self-reliance. What is your opinion on the government's plan for additional land pooling for the capital?

pooling for the capital? Andhra Pradesh already has sufficient land to develop the capital city. The focus should be on completing the current phase of Amaravati before considering further land pooling. Compared to capitals like Delhi or Mumbai, we have ample space. The state is burdened with debt, and the ruling party has acknowledged the need to develop other regions, like Uttarandhra and Rayalaseema, as mandated by the Reorganisation Act. Prioritizing balanced regional development over concentrating solely on one city is crucial. The TDP government claims the previous administration left the state in debt and promises to reverse the damage and make Andhra Pradesh prosperous. Do you see progress in this regard? The current government has taken loans worth ₹1.86 lakh crore from central institutions, the World Bank, and others. If this continues,

Andhra Pradesh risks falling into

a debt trap. Creating wealth and employment is essential to enable people to stand on their own without relying on freebies. The government has failed to deliver on promises like ₹3,000 for eligible unemployed youth and has neglected other regions by focusing heavily on Amaravati. While I agree Polavaram is critical, its completion depends on the dam's height—otherwise, it risks becoming just another reservair

Do you believe the TDP can complete Polavaram and the capital?

They've made a commitment, so they must follow through. Let's see what they achieve—I hope they succeed.

What is your opinion on the YSRCP, Jagan Mohan Reddy, and his current political approach post-elections?

When in power, YSRCP rarely engaged with the public. Now, Jagan Mohan Reddy is addressing people's issues, such as those of tobacco and mango farmers, and encouraging them to approach him. While this is positive, I urge YSRCP to raise these concerns in the assembly rather than boycotting it, as legislative engagement is more effective for addressing public issues.

Will you form alliances with other parties?

Alliances are considered closer to elections. For now, my focus is on strengthening Jaya Bharat National Party at the grassroots level, understanding the state's needs, connecting with people, and promoting our ideology of development and self-reliance.

What is the Jaya Bharat National Party's stance on Andhra Pradesh? Our party is committed to creating employment opportunities for the



CM Sets Vision for Governance

Targets ₹5.42 Lakh Per Capita Income by 2029

Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu emphasized a governance model prioritizing People, Vision, Nature, and Technology during a review with the Planning Department on Monday. He urged departments to align plans with short, medium, and long-term goals to achieve a per capita income of ₹3,47,871 by 2025–26 and ₹5.42 lakh by 2029, aiming to elevate Andhra Pradesh as the state with the highest per capita income.

Naidu stressed designing schemes with families as units, ensuring basic needs and income growth while preserving natural resources. He advocated for a circular economy, where waste from one industry becomes raw material for another, and integrating advanced technology in sectors like healthcare and agriculture to enhance services. "Governance must coordinate these elements for optimal outcomes," he said.

Highlighting the importance of value addition, Naidu noted that horticultural crops contributed ₹1,26,098 crore and aqua-related industries ₹1.12 lakh crore to the state's Gross Value Added (GVA). He emphasized that increasing Gross State Domestic Product (GSDP) is key to delivering welfare and development.

High-Level Meetings Spark Speculation

Hyderabad: A series of high-level political and strategic meetings in Delhi has triggered widespread speculation across political and media circles. The NDA Parliamentary Party is scheduled to meet at 9:30 AM in Parliament today, but the buzz has already intensified following a string of closed-door discussions on Monday night involving key figures in the Modi government.

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while Defence Minister Rajnath Singh chaired a crucial meeting with BJP President JP Nadda, Union Minister Piyush Goyal, and Law Minister Kiren Rijiju. At the same time, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, Home Secretary, and Intelligence Bureau Chief met with Union Home Minister Amit Shah in what is being described as a "high-level" strategic meeting. Adding fuel to the fire, both Prime Minister Modi and Home Minister Shah held consecutive meetings

with President Droupadi Murmu on Sunday.

To achieve better living standards, Naidu called for monitoring indicators like forest cover, air quality, and per capita electricity consumption at the village and family levels. He directed departments to define sector-specific standards, similar to the 42 indicators under the 'AWARE' system, for sectors like electricity, transportation, and water resources. Starting August 15, 700 government services will be available online, enhancing accessibility.

Naidu cited Singapore's success with limited resources, urging Andhra Pradesh to leverage its potential. He emphasized using RTGS data and AI to enhance departmental efficiency, with quarterly progress reviews. Minister Payyavula Keshav and Chief Secretary K. Vijayanand attended the review, reinforcing the state's commitment to quality living standards.

Although there has been no official word from the Centre regarding the outcomes of these meetings, the timing and urgency have sparked intense political chatter.

Sources suggest that the meetings may be linked to ongoing national initiatives, possibly related to the Election Commission's SIR drive. There is speculation that some important announcements regarding internal political processes or electoral reforms may be on the cards.

While a section of observers connects the flurry of activity to the issue of Jammu and Kashmir—especially since August 5 marks the anniversary of the abrogation of Article 370 those close to the developments hint that this round of meetings may not be directly related to any immediate change in the status of the region. Ongoing tensions with Pakistan have made any decision on that front unlikely for

Instead, the back-to-back meetings with the President and involvement of BJP leaders from different states suggest that the leadership may be aligning for bigger political and administrative moves. Notably, Home Minister Shah is also expected to meet West Bengal BJP President Samik Bhattacharya later today, where the Bengal SIR process could come up for detailed discussion.

Five New Cities to Get Waste-to-**Energy Plants: Narayana**

Municipal Administration and Urban Development Minister Ponguru Narayana announced that Andhra Pradesh will be declared a "Legacy Waste-Free State" by the end of December 2025. Speaking at a media briefing after launching a state-level workshop on Information, Education, and Communication (IEC) and capacity building organized by Swachh Andhra Corporation, the Minister emphasized the importance of solid and liquid waste management across all municipalities in the state.

He directed all municipal commissioners to prioritize waste management and contribute to achieving Swachh Andhra goals. "The legacy waste left behind by the previous government amounts to 85 lakh tonnes, which will be cleared by October 2. Additionally, 20 lakh tonnes of newly accumulated waste will be removed by Decem-



ber," he said.

Narayana underlined the key role of municipal commissioners in transforming urban areas into clean and garbage-free spaces. He stated that Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu is personally participating in the monthly 'Swarna Andhra – Swachh Andhra' programme every third Saturday to

raise public awareness.

The Minister also informed that the waste-to-energy plants currently functioning in Visakhapatnam and Guntur will be supplemented by new units in Kadapa, Kurnool, Nellore, Rajahmundry, and Tirupati. Once operational, these will eliminate the need for dumping yards. He added that sewage treatment plants will

be established within two years to handle liquid waste, while AMRUT scheme funds will be used to complete drinking water pipeline works. On the international front, Minister Narayana highlighted efforts to rebuild ties with Singapore, which were strained under the previous government. "Between 2014 and 2019, agreements were made with companies holding major stakes in Singapore. But the past administration cancelled these MoUs and even sent CID officials for investigation, damaging bilateral ties," he said. To revive these relations, CM Chandrababu recently visited Singapore and held talks with officials, who responded positively. The Singapore government has expressed readiness to provide technical support for Amaravati's development in collaboration with the World Bank. The CRDA Commissioner will soon send a formal letter to Singapore authorities to initiate follow-up consultations.

Pawan Supports Orphaned Students

Govt Reserves PG Seats for PHC Doctors

The State government has finalised a reservation quota for government doctors in postgraduate (PG) medical admissions for the 2025–26 academic year. Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu approved the proposal submitted by the state Medical and Health Department.

The decision was made after assessing the projected need for clinical and non-clinical specialists in government hospitals by the 2028-29 academic year. Simultaneously, the aspirations of doctors serving in Primary Health Centres (PHCs) were also considered. Medical and Health Minister Satyakumar Yadav said the state decided to implement reservations in both clinical and

non-clinical streams. Under this policy, 15% reservation is being provided in seven clinical subjects—General Medicine, General Surgery, Pediatrics, Gynaecology, Anaesthesia, Emergency Medicine, and Radiology. These courses fall within the 17 total PG specialisations available.

Additionally, 30% reservation has been allotted in nine non-clinical courses including Hospital Administration, Biochemistry, Anatomy, Physiology, Forensic Medicine, Microbiology, Pathology, and Social & Preventive Medicine. Minister Satyakumar added that the reservation policy takes into account the expectations of 2,288 doctors currently working across 1,144 PHCs in the state. A committee comprising senior officials from the ministry evaluated the demand for specialists in the coming years and submitted a comprehensive report supporting the reservation plan. The minister said the government had also decided to offer more PG opportunities than the estimated demand to encourage higher education among government doctors.

As per the government order, 50% of the PG seats under the convenor quota in government and private medical colleges will be made available to PHC doctors as per the reservation policy.

Free Bus Travel for Women from August 15

In a significant step towards fulfilling the "Super Six" promises, the Andhra Pradesh government has announced that women and transgender individuals will be allowed to travel free of cost in state-run buses starting August 15. Transport, Youth and Sports Minister Mandipalli Ramprasad Reddy made the announcement at the Secretariat on Monday.

As part of this initiative, women and transgender persons can avail free travel in services including Pallevelu-

gu, Ultra Pallevelugu, City Ordinary, Express, and Metro Express buses. To access the benefit, valid ID proof such as Aadhaar, Voter ID, or Ration Card must be presented. The minister confirmed that 74% of APSRTC buses—amounting to approximately 6,700 vehicles—will be covered under this scheme.

The minister added that Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has instructed officials to implement the scheme in a transparent and foolproof manner. A team of three ministers was sent to Karnataka, Tamil

Nadu, and Telangana to study the implementation of similar schemes in those states and submit a comprehensive report. The scheme is set to be approved in the state cabinet meeting scheduled on Wednesday. The expected annual cost of this initiative is around ₹1,950 crore. Additionally, the government is planning

to purchase 3,000 electric buses this year, with 1,400 more expected over the next two years. Steps are also being taken to recruit additional drivers and mechanics to meet the rising demand.

Garbage Tax Scam Rocks Kadapa Corporation

Leaders of the YSR Trade Union Congress (YSR TUC) and the Communist Party of India (Marxist) staged a protest in Kadapa on Monday, demanding criminal cases against corrupt officials who allegedly embezzled collected garbage tax amounts without depositing them into the Kadapa Municipal Corporation accounts.

During the protest, leaders said those who pocketed the garbage tax must be booked under criminal charges and sent to jail. They demanded that the government recover the misappropriated amount and credit it back to the corporation. Accusing the administration of turning a blind eye, they said the city's civic system had become thoroughly corrupted and must be cleaned up immediately.

The protestors alleged that fake receipts were used to collect garbage tax from the public and the key culprits behind the scam were left untouched, while lower-level staff were being scapegoat-



ed. They called for a thorough investigation into the roles played by senior municipal officials and said that the exact whereabouts of the ₹8 crore collected must be traced by an honest officer. Allegations of deep-rooted corruption were also raised against the engineering and town planning sections of the corporation. Protestors accused officials of siphoning lakhs of rupees even under the pretext of conducting stray dog

sterilization operations. The protest saw the participation of YSRCP corporators Paka Suresh, Balaswami Reddy, Shamsheer, Sriranjan Reddy, and leaders including Basavaraju, Vinod, T.P. Subbamma, Narayanamma, Tyagaraju, Babu, CPM City Secretary Rammohan Reddy, B. Manohar, Kamanur Srinivasula Reddy, Dastagiri Reddy, Veeranala Shivakumar, Chandrar Reddy, and Venkatasubbayya.

Pulivendula, known as the political stronghold of the YSR family, is witnessing an intense campaign from both the YSRCP and the TDP-led alliance. The ruling YSRCP is going all out to retain its dominance, with MP Y.S. As part of the "Suparipalana Tholi Adugu" (First Step Towards Good Governance) initiative, Minister Kondapalli Srinivas visited Thullur mandal's Thallayapalem village in Amaravati region on Monday. Addressing the local residents, the minister praised the community for their unwavering belief in the capital city project and lauded their selfless sacrifices for the state's fu-

Recalling the contribution of 29,881 farmers who voluntarily gave away 34,000 acres for the construction of Amaravati, the minister described it as a monumental act of sacrifice. He emphasized that if former Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu had continued in power after 2019, the capital would have developed significantly.

Minister Srinivas criticized the previous government for halting the capital works and for announcing three capitals, which led to prolonged public protests. "From December 17, 2019, people - including women, children, and youth – took to the streets for 1,631 days demanding justice for Amaravati. Those scenes still haunt us," he said. He condemned the alleged police brutality faced by protesters during that period and stated that Amaravati was turned into a forest of incomplete projects. Former Union Minister Slams NDA

Centre Clears 9 Major NH Expansions:BC Janardhan

Roads, Buildings, Infrastructure & Investments Minister B.C. Janardhan Reddy has announced that national highway projects worth ₹1 lakh crore will be completed within the next two years in the state. Speaking to media personnel at the Secretariat, the minister said Union Minister Nitin Gadkari, during a meeting on August 2, approved a total of ₹1 lakh crore worth of highway projects for Andhra Pradesh, including ongoing ones.

Currently, ₹70,000 crore worth of works are already in progress, with nearly 80% of land acquisition and forest clearance



permissions granted through the task force committee. He listed nine national highway expansion projects sanctioned by the Centre, including the Hyderabad-Vijayawada Greenfield Highway, six-lane projects for Hyderabad-Vijay-

awada (₹6,700 crore), Vijayawada-Machilipatnam (₹2,600 crore), and four-lane roads like Vinukonda–Guntur (₹2,605 crore), Guntur–Nizampatnam (₹2,000 crore), Bugg–Kaipa–Giddalur (₹4,200 crore), Akiveedu-Digamarru (₹2,500 crore), Pedana-Lakshmipuram (₹4,200 crore), and Muddanur–Kadapa (₹1,182 crore). Detailed project reports (DPRs) for these will be submitted soon.

CPM Slams Govt Over Power Burden



The Communist Party of India (Marxist) has accused the coalition government of imposing a massive ₹12,717 crore burden on power consumers in the form of fresh "trueup" charges, continuing the exploitative practices allegedly initiated by the previous YSRCP regime.

CPM leader Ch. Babu Rao said the new burden comes on top of ₹15,485 crore already recovered under adjustment charges for FY 2022-23 and ₹2,787 crore through Fuel Price Adjustment Charges (FPPCA) this year. He warned that the total power burden in the first year of the coalition government has already touched ₹30,000

Addressing public gatherings during a doorto-door campaign in vijayawada Central Constituency's 61st Division, Babu Rao and other activists highlighted shocking billing data. One consumer, Lakshmamma, was charged ₹147 for power usage and ₹777 as

extra charges—525% more than her actual bill. Another user, Jammula Venkateswara Rao, paid ₹638 for a ₹277 bill due to 130% additional charges.

The CPM alleged that smart meter deals with Adani and solar power agreements signed during YSRCP rule are being continued by the coalition, despite previous legal challenges and corruption allegations. RTC Employees Gears Up for **Statewide Agitation**

The Andhra Pradesh State Public Transport Department (APPTD) Employees Union has strongly opposed the state government's decision to allocate prime RTC land in Vijayawada to the Lulu Mall project. In a press release issued on Monday, State President Palisetti Damodar Rao and General Secretary G.V. Narasayya announced that the union is preparing for a statewide agitation to resist this move.

The union leaders condemned the allocation of RTC-owned land—valued at ₹400 crore and covering the Governorpet Depot and the old bus stand—to the private retail giant. They declared their intent to organize district-level meetings and press conferences in six districts per day across four dates: August 5, 9, 13, and 17.

On Tuesday, meetings will be held in Anantapur, Kakinada, Tirupati, Visakhapatnam, Ongole, and Eluru districts. On August 9, similar events will be held in Kadapa, Rajahmundry, Nellore, Srikakulam, Guntur, and Krishna districts. The campaign will continue on August 13 in Kurnool, Vizianagaram, Palnadu, Parvathipuram, Bhimavaram, and Sri Sathya Sai districts. On August 17, the meetings will cover Nandyal, Anakapalli, Chittoor, Konaseema, Annamayya, Paderu, and Bapatla.

The union demanded that the state government revoke Government Order (G.O.) No. 137, which sanctioned the land transfer. The union also announced that a state-level meeting will be convened soon to decide on further action.

Newlywed Woman Dies by Suicide

A tragic incident has unfolded in Kalavapamula village of Krishna district's Uyyuru mandal, where

24-year-old Srividya ended her life unable to bear the alleged domestic abuse by her husband, Rambabu. Srividya, who worked as a lecturer in a private college, was married just six months ago to Rambabu, a village surveyor.

In her emotional suicide note, Srividya detailed the continuous physical and mental torture she faced since the first month of marriage. She wrote that Rambabu regularly returned home drunk and physically assaulted her, once hitting her head against a cot and punching her back. The letter also mentioned how Rambabu insulted her by claiming she was worthless in front of another woman.

Srividya's final words included a heart-wrenching message to her younger brother: "Dear brother, I may not be able to tie Rakhi for you this time." She demanded that strict action be taken against Rambabu and his family. Srividya was found hanging in her home, leaving her family and the community in shock.

Police have registered a case and are investigating the matter.

Who Backs These Excise Operators?

East Godavari: An unsettling reality is unfolding in East Godavari district, where outsourced computer operators in the state excise department appear to be exercising more control over liquor distribution than the officials themselves. In particular, the Rajahmundry excise depot has come under scrutiny for alleged manipulation of liquor stock allocation, leaving small-time wine shop owners at a severe disadvantage.

Operators Turn Power Brokers

Despite being hired on contract, several computer operators have retained their positions for over a decade—defying the standard 3–5 year rotation policy. These operators are reportedly deciding who gets what liquor brand, and when. Bars owned by politically influential individuals are given top preference, while small retailers are left out. Sources say these operators act as intermediaries between higher officials and liquor traders, with allegations of bribe-taking to manipulate indents and brand allocation. Official Silence and Long-Term Influence

Repeated complaints from traders have not led to any significant action. When questioned about the long-term stay of specific individuals, officials either offer vague responses or cite the contractual nature of appointments. One such individual, Prasad, is said to be the de facto authority in the Rajahmundry depot. His continued influence—despite a regime change from YSRCP to the TDP-led coalition—raises questions about political protection.

Impact on Liquor Trade Ecosystem
The alleged control exercised by operators has skewed
the liquor supply chain. Small wine shops complain
of delayed or denied access to popular brands, while
bars get an uninterrupted supply. This favoritism is
reportedly pushing some retailers to the brink, forcing them to either pay bribes or face market isolation. The depot's role as a neutral hub is thus being
compromised, causing commercial distortion across
East Godavari's liquor market.

As local traders demand a thorough investigation, the larger question remains: how can contractual staff hold such disproportionate power for so long—and who is enabling them? Unless addressed, this issue threatens to erode the integrity of the excise system itself.

Pulivendula ZPTC Poll Sparks Political Tension

Tensions are running high in Pulivendula ahead of the upcoming ZPTC by-election, with fresh allegations and political counterattacks intensifying the atmosphere. TDP leaders held a press meet alleging threats from YSRCP leaders to those who recently switched allegiance. Vishwanatha Reddy, the former vice-president of the mandal, who joined TDP from YSRCP, claimed that senior YSRCP leaders including Deva Reddy Shankar Reddy, MP's PA Raghava Reddy, YS Bhaskar Reddy, and Tummalapalli Gangadhar Reddy were intimidating him and pressuring him to come to Kurnool for talks. He alleged that he feared for his life and had voluntarily joined TDP due to injustice in YSRCP.

TDP Pulivendula in-charge B.Tech Ravi accused YSRCP leaders of violating bail

conditions and using intimidation tactics due to fear of electoral defeat. He said that those on bail, including Shankar Reddy and Bhaskar Reddy, were threatening former colleagues, which is against the law. He added that TDP would file a complaint with the CBI seeking cancellation of their bail.

Responding to the allegations, YSRCP State General Secretary SV Satish Reddy dismissed the claims as politically motivated. He said no such threats were made and challenged the TDP leaders to produce call recordings if their claims were genuine. He argued that asking why a senior leader defected was natural and did not amount to a threat. Satish Reddy warned against making baseless claims for political mileage and reiterated that YSRCP respects democratic values and supports free campaigning for all.



Collector Promises Swift Action on Complaints

Bapatla District Collector Venkata Murali on Monday received a flurry of petitions from distressed citizens across the district during the public grievance redressal programme held at the Bapatla Collectorate. The event saw individuals and community representatives presenting a range of issues spanning multiple sectors, seeking immediate intervention from the administration

Among the key issues brought to the collector's notice were the non-credit of welfare schemes into bank accounts, land encroachments, problems faced by the fishing community, incomplete school building infrastructure, and delayed issuance of disability pension certificates. Journalists also presented concerns related to accreditation and welfare, while others highlighted delays in graduate pass-



book updates and access to essential records.

Notably, political leaders from the region also used the platform to escalate farmers' demands. Bapatla and Santhanuthalapadu YSRCP constituency coordinators submitted a memorandum through former Deputy Speaker Kona Raghupathi and former minister Merugu Nagarjuna. They urged the collector to resolve the ongoing issues of input subsidies and facilitate immediate disbursal of pending farm

Collector Venkata Murali assured the attendees that their grievances would be addressed systematically and that appropriate directions had been issued to the respective departments for swift action. He emphasized that the welfare and benefit of farmers remained a priority.

Speaking to the media later, Kona Raghupathi and Merugu Nagarjuna criticized the previous government for failing to release input subsidies on time. They labeled Chandrababu Naidu's previous administration as negligent towards farmers' welfare, alleging that programs such as 'Annadata Sukhibhava' were merely symbolic and lacked actual benefit.

YSRCP leaders Narayana Reddy, Gade Srinivas Reddy, Madhu, and others were also present during the event, extending their support to the aggrieved parties.

AISF Protests Poor Conditions in Government Hostels

The All India Students Federation (AISF) staged a protest at the Anantapur Collectorate on Monday, demanding urgent resolution of issues faced by students in government hostels across the district. AISF district president Hanumantharayudu and general secretary Kullaiswamy led the protest, where students wore black shirts and submitted detailed representations highlighting the dire conditions. AISF leaders alleged that government negligence has led to inhumane conditions in hostels, comparing the budget allocation for hostel students (₹53 per day) to that of prisoners (over ₹100 per day). They pointed out that in the Gooty BC Women's Hostel, over 270 students are accommodated in just 11 rooms. Many hostels lack basic facilities such as adequate rooms, toilets, and bathrooms, forcing students to bathe in the open.

The protesters demanded that the long-closed SC hostel in central Anantapur be reopened and renovated, as it could house hundreds of students. They also urged the government to install mineral water plants, supply quality food, and ensure proper living conditions. The AISF criticized the absence of regular wardens and the misuse of hostel facilities by non-resident staff.

In addition, they called for filling vacant posts of cooks, tutors, and watchmen, and demanded mosquito nets, bedding, trunks, and nutrition-rich food similar to what Minister Nara Lokesh claims is provided to his son Devansh. AISF leaders also urged the immediate filling of vacant teacher posts in KGBV and Gurukula model hostels and warned of statewide agitations if the government fails to act. The protest highlighted the poor state of hostel infrastructure despite over six lakh students residing in them across Andhra Pradesh.

Operation Kunkie Brings Relief

The Forest Department successfully completed its first "Operation Kunkie," aimed at driving away wild elephants damaging crops near forest-bordering villages. The operation was launched in Mogili area of Bangarupalem mandal, Chittoor district, where a herd of wild elephants had been destroying mango plantations.

Using trained Kunkie elephants—Krishna, Jayanth, and Vinayak—brought from Karnataka, forest officials managed to drive the wild herd back into the forest. Krishna, a particularly agile Kunkie, played a key role during the operation, which lasted from Saturday night to Sunday morning.

Forest officials said the elephants had been roaming in the area for over 15 days. After two months of training, this was the first deployment of the Kunkies, marking a significant milestone in Andhra Pradesh's efforts to manage human-wildlife conflict.

Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan praised the efforts of forest officials, mahouts, and support staff, and thanked Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah and Forest Minister Eshwar Khandre for providing the Kunkie elephants. He noted that the Chandrababu Naidu-led coalition government is working in a planned manner to protect both human lives and crops from wild elephant threats. Advanced Dialysis Now Free

Tibal Torchbearer Shibu Shoren

The passing of Shibu Soren, fondly known as 'Dishom Guru', marks not just the end of an extraordinary political journey but the closing chapter of an era that saw tribal aspirations rise from the margins to the mainstream of Indian politics. As the founder of the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) and a relentless voice for tribal rights, Soren's life was a testament to resistance, resilience, and reform.

Born on January 11, 1944, in the small village of Nemra in the Ramgarh district of erstwhile Bihar, Shibu Soren's life was shaped early by personal tragedy. At the age of 15, his father, Shobaran Soren, was allegedly killed by moneylenders. That harrowing incident in 1957 lit a fire in the young boy—one that never extinguished. That same pain would later drive a lifelong commitment to Through mass mobilisations, grassfight feudal exploitation and social injustice in tribal lands.

In 1973, Soren co-founded the JMM alongside AK Roy and Binod Bihari Mahto. From that point, the JMM would become the principal vehicle for demanding a separate tribal state, resonating across the Chotanagpur and Santhal Pargana belts.



roots movements, and unwavering activism, Soren emerged as the face of Jharkhand's statehood movement. After decades of agitation, their vision materialised with the formation of Jharkhand on November 15, 2000 — a landmark that remains Soren's most defining achievement. But Soren's political influence didn't

stop with Jharkhand's creation. He played an active role at the national level, having been elected multiple times as MP from Dumka, including his eighth term from 2014 to 2019. He also served in the Union Cabinet as Coal Minister in the UPA government. However, his time in national politics was marred by legal entanglements. From the 1975 Chirudih

massacre case to the sensational tron, Soren remained a lodestar for 1994 murder of his secretary Shashinath Jha, Soren faced trials and tribulations that nearly derailed his political career. Though acquitted in both cases—most notably by the Supreme Court in 2018—the episodes left a lasting impact on his public

Still, controversy couldn't eclipse his connection with the people. In Jharkhand, he remained a revered figure. His three short-lived stints as Chief Minister may have lacked administrative longevity, but symbolically, they underscored the complexities of coalition politics and the struggles of regional leadership in a fractured polity. A failed assassination attempt in 2007 while being escorted to jail only highlighted the danger and volatility that surrounded his career.

What truly set Soren apart was not just his survival in such a turbulent political landscape, but how he managed to retain the trust of his people. For 38 years, he led the JMM before handing over the reins in April 2025 to his son, Hemant Soren, currently the Chief Minister. Even in semi-retirement, as the party's founding patribal politics in India.

His personal life, like his political one, was rooted in struggle and legacy. He is survived by his wife Roopi Soren, daughter Anjani, and two sons, Hemant and Basant. His eldest son, Durga, passed away in 2009, but the family's political lineage continues with Hemant at the helm of Jharkhand's government and Basant serving as a legislator.

For the people of Jharkhand, Shibu Soren will forever be remembered as the embodiment of their long and difficult fight for identity, autonomy, and dignity. He was not without flaws, but his contribution to the tribal movement is indelible. His name is etched in the political and emotional fabric of a state that exists today largely because of his vision.

As India moves forward, Shibu Soren's life reminds us that real change often comes not from corridors of power, but from the pain of personal loss, the grit of grassroots struggle, and the courage to challenge systemic injustice. His voice may be silenced, but his message will echo for generations.







Shibu Soren passes away at 81

Veteran tribal leader and former Jharkhand Chief Minister Shibu Soren passed away at the age of 81 on Monday after battling a kidney-related illness. He had been on life support at Delhi's Sir Ganga Ram Hospital for nearly a month. The nation is in mourning as tributes poured in from top political leaders, recognising his pivotal role in the upliftment of tribal communities and the creation of Jharkhand.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi led the tributes, calling Soren a "grassroots leader" who dedicated his life to the cause of tribal welfare. "He empowered tribal communities and worked tirelessly for the poor. His demise is a great loss to Indian politics," PM Modi said. President Droupadi Murmu, in an emotional post on X, said, "The demise of Shri Shibu Soren Ji is a big loss in the space of social justice. He championed the cause of tribal identity and the formation of the state of Jharkhand. His emphasis on the welfare of the people, especially the tribal communities, will always be remembered."

Union Home Minister Amit Shah remembered the late leader for his lifelong struggle for tribal rights. "He fought for decades for the rights and empowerment of the tribal society in Jharkhand. He connected with people with his simple personality and easy nature," he posted on X.

Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren, son of Shibu Soren, expressed deep grief over the loss of his father. "I am left with nothing," he said in a moving statement.

Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra also offered condolences, stating, "This is a very saddening news for all of us. My condolences and prayers are with the family members in this difficult time. I have also texted Kalpana Soren ji." Shibu Soren, also known as "Guruji," was born in 1944 in the Ramgarh district (then Bihar) and belonged to the Santhal community. Over decades, he became a symbol of the tribal movement, serving multiple terms as Chief Minister of Jharkhand, Union Minister, and Member of Parliament. His legacy includes not just political leadership but an unwavering commitment to tribal rights and social justice.

Himachal Floods Toll Rises to 184, Over 300 Roads Blocked

The 2025 monsoon has wreaked havoc across Himachal Pradesh, with 184 people dead and key infrastructure crippled by relentless rain, landslides, and flash floods. The State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) reported that 103 of these deaths were directly rain-related, while 81 resulted from road accidents caused by dangerous terrain and damaged roads.

As of Tuesday, 309 roads, including National Highway 305 (NH-305), remain blocked due to landslides and debris flows. Water supply and electricity have also been severely disrupted, with 236 water supply schemes and 113 distribution transformers non-functional. Mandi district has emerged as the most severely affected, accounting for 23 rain-related deaths and 14 road fatalities. It also leads in infrastructure collapse with 167 roads blocked, 74 water schemes disrupted, and 91 transformers out of service. Kangra follows with 24 weather-related deaths and six accident fatalities, while Kullu reported 10 monsoon deaths and eight road accident deaths. Chamba and Shimla districts have also sustained multiple casualties and significant Shimla, Sirmaur, Solan, and Una.

In Lahaul-Spiti, a bridge collapse at Dared Nallah has severed the connection between Madgran and Kurched, isolating local populations. Meanwhile, a major landslide in Kullu near Jhed (Khanag) has rendered NH-305 impassable. However, a detour via Kandugad is currently open for light vehicles. NH-505 in Lahaul-Spiti also remains closed due to landslides. The SDMA has warned that continued rain in the coming days could trigger further landslides, flash floods, and service failures. On Sunday alone, 296 roads were blocked, 134 transformers went offline, and 266 water supply schemes were disrupted, highlighting the widespread infrastructure breakdown.

The cumulative damage to public property—including roads, electricity, water infrastructure, health centres, and schools—has crossed ₹1,71,495 lakh. Additionally, over 88,800 hectares of agricultural and horticultural crops have been impacted.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted light to moderate rainfall across the state in the next 12 hours, with heavy rain expected at isolated places in Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kangra, Kullu, Mandi,

"True Indian Won't Say This": SC Raps Rahul Gandhi

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi faced stern words from the Supreme Court on Monday over his remarks about the Indian Army and China during the 2022 Bharat Jodo Yatra, even as the apex court stayed ongoing criminal defamation proceedings

A bench comprising Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice AG Masih questioned the veracity of Gandhi's statement that "Chinese troops are thrashing Indian soldiers in Arunachal Pradesh" and that China had taken over 2,000 sq km of Indian territory. The remarks, made in December 2022, referred to the border clash in Arunachal's Tawang

"How do you know China grabbed 2,000 sq km of land? Were you there? Do you have any credible material?" Justice Datta asked, adding pointedly, "If you are a true Indian, you won't say all of this." Senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, appearing for Gandhi, defended his client by arguing, "If he can't say these things, how can he be the Leader of the Opposition?" But the court responded, "Then why don't you say such things in Parliament?"

Despite staying the proceedings for now, the court issued notice on Gandhi's plea to quash the defamation case, which originated from a complaint by Udai Shanker Srivastava. The complainant alleged that Gandhi's remarks defamed the Indian Army and lowered its morale.

The Supreme Court's comments come after the Allahabad High Court, in May, rejected Gandhi's challenge to a summons issued by a special court in Lucknow. That court had taken cognisance of



Srivastava's complaint and summoned Gandhi as an accused.

The High Court had also dismissed Gandhi's claim that he was not given a hearing and said, "Freedom of speech does not include the right to make

defamatory remarks about the armed forces." Gandhi's legal team argued that the case was politically motivated and violated procedural norms, but the courts have so far maintained that the content and tone of the statements warranted serious legal scrutiny. The Supreme Court will now hear the matter further following its notice, but its strong words have already reignited political tensions over the role and responsibility of leaders when speaking on sensitive national security issues.



Rahul Gandhi Always **Speaks Against India:** Kangana Ranaut

Actor and BJP MP Kangana Ranaut lashed out at Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Monday, accusing him of repeatedly making statements that "undermine India's honour and support enemy nations," following the Supreme Court's sharp remarks over his controversial comments on the Indian Army.

The Supreme Court earlier in the day granted an interim stay on defamation proceedings against Gandhi in connection with his comments made during the Bharat Jodo Yatra in 2022. During the event, Gandhi had alleged that the Chinese Army "killed 20 Indian soldiers" and "thrashed Indian jawans" in Arunachal Pradesh.

Reacting strongly to these remarks, Kangana Ranaut said, "Rahul Gandhi always speaks against India, whether it's about the economy or our Defence forces. He speaks in support of enemy nations. He has an anti-India mindset. So, it is a welcome move by the Supreme Court that they pulled him up."

She further added, "In the time to come, others should be mindful that they do not hurt the honour, integrity and morale of India."

While granting the stay on defamation proceedings, the Supreme Court also made key observations about the sensitivity of such public statements, particularly when they involve national security and the armed forces.



2 More Arrested in Odisha Student **Suicide Case**

Two more individuals have been arrested in connection with the death of a 20-year-old student from Fakir Mohan (Autonomous) College in Odisha's Balasore district, who died by self-immolation last month after alleging that no justice was served in her sexual harassment case.

The Odisha Crime Branch on Sunday night arrested Jyoti Prakash Biswal, a fellow student who had sustained burns while trying to save her, and Subhra Sambait Nayak, the state joint secretary of a student organisation. Both were produced before the Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate (SDJM) in Balasore and remanded to 14 days of judicial custody after their bail pleas were rejected.

According to police, the woman poured petrol on herself and set herself on fire on July 12 after her complaint against the Head of the Department (HoD) of Integrated BEd was reportedly dismissed by the college's internal enquiry committee. She suffered 95% burn injuries and succumbed at AIIMS Bhubaneswar on July 14.

Earlier, two others — assistant professor Samira Kumar Sahoo and former principal Dillip Ghose — had also been arrested for abetment to suicide. Police officials say the investigation is ongoing and more developments are expected as they probe institutional failures that allegedly led to the tragedy.

Some Don't Agree to Share Power: DKS

Philippines President Embarks on 5-Day State **Visit to India**

Philippines President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. landed in New Delhi on Monday to kick off his first official visit to India since assuming office in 2022, describing India as a "valued friend" and underlining the potential for expanded bilateral cooperation across sectors.

Speaking ahead of the five-day visit, President Marcos said, "Our bilateral relations have seen a measured and stable development that is both comprehensive in scope and multifaceted in nature." He emphasized the mutual benefit of deeper engagement in defence, pharmaceuticals, agriculture, health, tourism, and digital connectivity.

He also expressed hopes that the visit would "bring concrete benefits for the Filipino people, such as more affordable medicine, greater connectivity, and food security."

The state visit coincides with the 75th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and the Philippines, highlighting a shared resolve to advance regional security and economic goals. Marcos noted that India's democratic values, maritime interests, and Indo-Pacific strategy align with the Philippines' vision for peace and cooperation in the region.

After his arrival in New Delhi, Marcos will meet with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and key Indian officials. The two leaders are expected to discuss expanding cooperation in strategic areas such as defence and security, political coordination, trade, investment, and people-to-people exchanges. They are also likely to exchange views on regional and international issues of common concern.

Following his engagements in the national capital, President Marcos will visit Bengaluru, where he is expected to meet Indian business leaders and technology stakeholders to further enhance economic and innovation partnerships.

India's Ministry of External Affairs also highlighted the importance of this visit, noting that ties between the two nations have strengthened over the decades, particularly since the launch of the Look East Policy in 1992 and its later evolution into the Act East Policy.

President Marcos and Prime Minister Modi previously interacted at the ASEAN-India Summit in Lao PDR in October 2024 and during the 20th ASEAN-India Summit in Jakarta in 2023, where both sides expressed a commitment to deepening regional cooperation.

"Be Very, Very Careful with Nuclear Rhetoric": Russia to US

The Kremlin on Monday issued a cautious statement urging all nations to be "very, very careful" with nuclear rhetoric. This comes after former US President Donald Trump stated he had ordered two American nuclear submarines to reposition in response to comments from ex-Russian president Dmitry Medvedev. Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov addressed Trump's announcement, saying, "In this case, it is obvious that American submarines are already on combat duty. This is an ongoing process." He downplayed the incident, avoiding direct confrontation or escalation, but emphasized that nuclear-related statements must be handled re-

Trump Aide Targets India Over Oil Delas with Russia

Donald Trump's deputy chief of staff, Stephen Miller, has sharply criticized India for continuing to buy Russian oil and allegedly "cheating" the U.S. on trade and immigration. Speaking to reporters on August 3, Miller accused India of indirectly "financing" the Ukraine war by importing large volumes of Russian crude, almost as much as China, according to a Bloomberg report.

"President Trump wants a tremendous relationship with India and its prime minister. But we need to get real about dealing with the financing of this war," Miller stated. He suggested that under Trump's leadership, "all options are on the table to deal diplomatically, financially and otherwise" with the Ukraine conflict.



Miller's remarks come amid persistent pressure on India to cut its oil trade with Russia. The Biden administration has also raised similar concerns in recent months, though India has not shown urgency to change its course. Sources quoted by Bloomberg say that no formal instructions have been given to Indian

oil refiners to halt Russian imports. Both public and private sector oil companies are free to buy from their preferred sources, with purchases based on commercial decisions.

In addition to oil trade, Miller lashed out at India for what he described as "massive tariffs" on American goods and manipulating the U.S. immi-

gration system. He didn't elaborate on the latter, but his comments signal growing frustration within Trump's camp toward India's economic stance. Despite tensions, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has reiterated India's commitment to self-reliance. At a rally on August 2, Modi said, "The world economy is going through many apprehensions — there is an atmosphere of instability. Now, whatever we buy, there should be only one scale: we will buy those things which have been made by the sweat of an Indian."

The Trump administration had earlier imposed a 25% tariff on Indian exports and threatened further actions. As the U.S. election season heats up, Trump's team appears to be tightening its foreign policy rhetoric, especially regarding strategic allies like India.

To improve accessibility, the newly launched centres will remain open on Saturdays and include return courier services as part of the standard fees. Additional support such as photographs, photocopies, and form-filling assistance will also be available at no extra charge.

Beijing On High Alert as New Rainstorm Looms

Beijing has placed much of its mountainous regions under top alert as the city braces for another round of torrential rains on Monday, just days after deadly flooding killed 44 people— China's worst rain-related disaster in the capital since 2012.

The Beijing Meteorological Bureau issued a red alert for six hilly districts— Mentougou, Fangshan, Fengtai, Shijingshan, Huairou, and Changping. Authorities have urged residents to avoid unnecessary travel as forecasters predict up to 200 mm of rainfall within a six-hour window beginning midday. This is nearly one-third of the capital's average annual rainfall.

The recent floods have prompted officials to reassess their emergency response plans. Many of the victims were reportedly trapped at a nursing home in Miyun district, located in the city's northeastern periphery. "The risk of flash floods and landslides is extremely high," officials said in a public notice, urging strict caution.

The city's geography contributes to the disaster risk. With mountains surrounding Beijing to the west and north, moist air tends to get trapped, intensifying rainfall. This "rain trap" effect has been blamed for past flood disasters, including the catastrophic 2012 event which killed 79 people many in the same western districts now under alert.

The current situation is raising alarm across other parts of China as well. In the southern province of Guangdong, five people were confirmed dead after being swept away during recent flash floods. More than 1,300 rescuers had been involved in the search operation, local media reported.

The capital's emergency services remain on standby, and residents in high-risk areas have been advised to relocate to safer ground. Schools and workplaces in affected districts have been instructed to follow emergency protocols and suspend non-essential operations. Authorities are expected to hold a press briefing later today on additional safety measures and evacuation plans.



GST Evasion Of ₹7.08 Lakh Crore Detected In 5 Years

The Central GST (CGST) field officers have unearthed a staggering ₹7.08 lakh crore worth of tax evasion over the last five financial years from 2020–21 to 2024–25. The revelation, made in the Lok Sabha on Monday by Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary, highlights the growing scale of fraud, especially in Input Tax Credit (ITC) claims.

According to government data, a total of 91,370 GST evasion cases were detected during this five-year span, of which 44,938 were related specifically to ITC fraud — totaling ₹1.79 lakh crore. These fake ITC claims allow businesses to illegitimately reduce their tax liability by claiming credit for taxes never actu-

In the current fiscal year 2024-25 alone, GST evasion of ₹2.23 lakh crore has been detected from 30,056 cases, with ₹58,772 crore linked to fake ITC claims from



15,283 cases. Similarly, during the 2023– 24 fiscal, ₹2.30 lakh crore worth of tax evasion was uncovered, with ITC fraud accounting for ₹36,374 crore.

In FY 2022–23, authorities found ₹1.32 lakh crore in evasion, including ₹24,140 crore of fake ITC. In the earlier years, the evasion stood at ₹73,238 crore (FY22) and ₹49,384 crore (FY21), with ITC-related frauds of ₹28,022 crore and ₹31,233 crore respectively.

Over the five-year period, the govern-

ment managed to recover more than ₹1.29 lakh crore in taxes through voluntary deposits.

Minister Pankaj Chaudhary said the government has implemented several digital reforms to tackle evasion and fraud, including e-invoicing, analytics-based GST return scrutiny, flagging system-based mismatches, and risk-based audits. These tools are intended to provide actionable intelligence to tax officials and ensure better compliance.

Responding to another query in the House, the Minister informed that the net Central GST collection for 2024–25 stood at ₹10.26 lakh crore — about 96.7% of the Revised Estimate (RE) of ₹10.62 lakh crore. This net figure includes CGST, Integrated GST, and compensation cess. In comparison, FY24 saw the government surpass its target slightly with collections reaching ₹9.57 lakh crore against the RE of ₹9.56 lakh crore.

ED Turns Heat on Anil Ambani Over ₹3,000-Cr Loan Fraud

In fresh legal trouble for Reliance Group Chairman Anil Ambani, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has written to over a dozen banks, seeking detailed information about loans extended to his companies, including Reliance Housing Finance, Reliance Communications, and Reliance Commercial Finance. The ED has approached both public and private sector banks, including SBI, ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Axis Bank, UCO Bank and Punjab & Sind Bank.

Sources familiar with the matter said the ED has requested documents related to the due diligence process for sanctioning the loans, the timeline of defaults, and the recovery steps taken since the loans turned into non-performing assets (NPAs).

The ED is also likely to summon officials from these banks for questioning as part of its investigation into what it believes
The ED has already conducted raids at over 50 firms linked to is a major corporate loan fraud that runs into ₹3,000 crore. The probe agency has intensified its efforts after it arrested Partha Sarathi Biswal, Managing Director of Biswal Tradelink Pvt Ltd, last week under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. Biswal is accused of submitting fake guarantees worth ₹68.2 crore on behalf of Reliance Power.

Sources say the ED believes fake guarantees were used to secure loans which were later misused. It is also probing possible quid pro quo arrangements between Reliance Group firms and YES Bank promoters, as payments were allegedly made to the latter just before loan disbursements.

The ₹3,000-crore case primarily involves loans disbursed by YES Bank between 2017 and 2019 to various Reliance Group entities, which eventually turned into bad loans. With the first arrest already made and the agency zeroing in on bank officials, the case could mark a major escalation in legal troubles for the embattled industrialist.

20 Peacocks Found Dead Near Stream in Karnataka

Tn a shocking incident **I**from Hanumanthapura village in Karnataka, twenty peacocks — India's national bird — were found dead under myscircumstances near a stream. According to reports, local farmers discovered the carcasses of 17 female and 3 male peacocks, prompting immediate concern and investigation by the Forest Department.

Forest officials reached the spot collected evidence and dispatched the carcasses to the Forensic Science Laboratory. Officials stated that the cause of death would be confirmed after scientific

examination, with poisoning being one of the suspected caus-

This mass death comes at a time when Karnataka is already grappling with a series of unexplained wildlife fatalities. Just a month earlier, 20 monkeys were found dead in the Chamarajanagar district, where forest and police officials also suspected poisoning.

In another alarming case, five tigers — a tigress and her four cubs — died on June 27 in the Male Mahadeshwara Hills Wildlife Sanctuary. Initial investigation revealed that the tigress had preyed on a cow that was allegedly poisoned by villagers in retaliation. The meat was laced with poison, leading to the tragic deaths. Three individuals — Konappa, Madaraja, and Nagaraj — from Koppa village were arrested in that case. Both the peacock and tiger incidents have raised serious ques-

tions about wildlife protection and human-animal conflict in Karnataka. While the forest department does offer compensation for livestock killed by wild animals, the benefit is not extended when such killings occur within the core areas of sanctuaries or national parks — where cattle grazing is illegal. The recent peacock deaths are particularly disturbing given the state's commitment to preserving the species. Karnataka is home to two prominent peacock sanctuaries — Adichunchanagiri and Bankapura — both established to protect and conserve the national bird.

With multiple wildlife deaths being reported in short succession, activists and environmentalists are urging stricter enforcement of wildlife laws and better coordination between forest officials and local communities to prevent further incidents.





114-Year-Old Shigeko Becomes Japan's Oldest Living Person

Kagawa, an obstetrician and gynaecologist by profession, served as a wartime physician at a hospital in Osaka during the Second World War. After a long career in medicine, she retired at the age of 86

Despite her age, Kagawa remains a symbol of Japan's famed longevity. She drew global attention in 2021 when, at 109, she took part in the Tokyo Olympics torch relay—becoming one of the oldest Olympic torchbearers in history.

Speaking to local media in 2023, Kagawa credited her long life to a carefree and active lifestyle. "I don't have any [secret]... I just play every day. My energy is my greatest asset. I go where I want, eat what I want and do what I want. I'm free and

independent," she told TOS News. Before her, the title was held by Miyoko Hiroyasu, born in 1911, who passed away in a nursing home in Oita Prefecture. A former art student, Hiroyasu spent her final days reading, sketching, and play-

ing card games. She raised three children and remained mentally and physically active until her passing. Both women are celebrated as reflections of Japan's aging yet resilient population,

India Clinches Thriller in Oval Nail-Biter

Siraj and Krishna's heroics seal 2-run win in historic Test finish

India pulled off one **L**of the most dramatic Test wins in its cricketing history by defeating England by just 2 runs at The Oval on Day 5 of the final Test, levelling the series 2-2. It is India's narrowest-ever victory in terms of runs in Test cricket. The match reached a fever pitch with England needing just 35 runs on the final day and having two wickets in hand, but an inspired bowling effort led by Mohammed Siraj and Prasidh Krishna turned the tide.



England, resuming at 339/8 and chasing a target of 374, had an entire day to reach their goal but lasted just 53 tense deliveries. Jamie Overton gave the hosts early hope with two boundaries off the day's first two balls, but the next over changed everything. Jamie Smith, England's last recognized batter, edged one behind off Siraj, triggering a collapse. Overton soon fell LBW to a sharp inswinger by Siraj, and though Josh Tongue resisted briefly — even overturning a close call on review — he was eventually castled by Krishna with 17 runs still required. Drama peaked when Chris Woakes, nursing a dislocated left shoulder, bravely walked in to bat one-handed. With Woakes in obvious pain, Gus Atkinson shielded him by farming strike. At one point, Atkinson hit a six off a spilled catch by Akash than an hour on a rainy London morning. Deep and edged the equation down to 11 runs.

However, with immense pressure mounting, Atkinson was bowled attempting a sweep to a full toss from Siraj. England were dismissed for 367, falling short by just two runs. Siraj finished with figures of 5 wickets in the innings, while Krishna's timely strike proved decisive.

Woakes was lauded by Indian players for his courageous stand despite injury. The crowd, too, gave him a rousing ovation for his fighting spirit. Though India won the match and squared the series, they remain third in the World Test Championship standings.

With top-ranked players Jannik Sinner and Carlos Alcaraz skipping the tournament, Zverev was the highest seed in the draw. Other major players like Novak Djokovic and Jack Draper have also opted out of this year's event, opening



the field for new contenders.

Earlier in the day, American Alex Michelsen defeated compatriot Learner Tien 6-3, 6-3 to enter the quarterfinals. He will face 11th seed Karen Khachanov of Russia, who beat eighth-seeded Casper Ruud 6-4, 7-5.

The hard-court tournament is set to conclude on Thursday.
