

# II Eyes on Delhi

**High-Level Meetings Spark Speculation**

**Hyderabad:** A series of high-level political and strategic meetings in Delhi has triggered widespread speculation across political and media circles. The NDA Parliamentary Party is scheduled to meet at 9:30 AM in Parliament today, but the buzz has already intensified following a string of closed-door discussions on Monday night involving key figures in the Modi government.

External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, while Defence Minister Rajnath Singh chaired a crucial meeting with BJP President JP Nadda, Union Minister Piyush Goyal, and Law Minister Kiren Rijiju. At the same time, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, Home Secretary, and Intelligence Bureau Chief met with Union Home Minister Amit Shah in what is being described as a "high-level" strategic meeting.

Adding fuel to the fire, both Prime Minister Modi and Home Minister Shah held consecutive meetings with President Droupadi Murmu on Sunday. Although there has been no official word from the Centre regarding the outcomes of these meetings, the timing and urgency have sparked intense political chatter.

Sources suggest that the meetings may be linked to ongoing national initiatives, possibly related to the Election Commission's SIR drive. There is speculation that some important announcements regarding internal political processes or electoral reforms may be on the cards.

While a section of observers connects the flurry of activity to the issue of Jammu and Kashmir—especially since Au-

gust 5 marks the anniversary of the abrogation of Article 370 those close to the developments hint that this round of meetings may not be directly related to any immediate change in the status of the region. Ongoing tensions with Pakistan have made any decision on that front unlikely for now.

Instead, the back-to-back meetings with the President and involvement of BJP leaders from different states suggest that the leadership may be aligning for bigger political and adminis-



trative moves. Notably, Home Minister Shah is also expected to meet West Bengal BJP President Samik Bhattacharya later today, where the Bengal SIR process could come up for detailed discussion.

Since taking office in 2014, the Modi government has chosen August 5 to unveil some of its most impactful decisions. With no official announcement yet, all eyes remain on Delhi to see what the day holds this time.



### Kaleswaram Report points finger at KCR

A scathing 650-page report by the Commission of Inquiry into the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project has severely indicted former Telangana Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and two of his former ministers — T. Harish Rao and Eatala Rajender — for "brazen procedural and financial irregularities." The project, once projected as the 'lifeline of Telangana,' has now been described as a colossal waste of public funds, stemming from a

complete failure of leadership, oversight, and governance.

The report points a direct finger at KCR, accusing him of making unilateral decisions, including the construction of Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla barrages without proper cabinet approval. It states that the former CM took "sole and individual" decisions by bypassing government protocol and expert advice.

Eatala Rajender, who served as the finance minister during the period, was accused of showing a "lack of commitment and integrity in safeguarding the financial and economic health" of the newly formed Telangana state. The report noted his failure to corruption.

While Harish Rao remains with KCR's Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), Eatala Rajender defected to the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) in 2021, two years before the Congress ousted the BRS from power in the 2023 Telangana Assembly elections.

The commission also named senior IAS officers including S.K. Joshi, the then Principal Secretary of Irrigation and Command Area Development, for his role in allegedly suppressing the Medigadda report. Smita Sabharwal, who served as Additional Secretary/Secretary to the Chief Minister, was criticized for her lack of due diligence in handling the matter.

The findings set the stage for potential legal action, with the report calling for the recovery of public funds and a full-fledged probe into what it described as "collusion between project authorities and contractors."

## Kaleshwaram Sinks Under BRS Misrule: CM Revanth

Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy came down heavily on the previous BRS regime, holding it responsible for the structural failures in the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project. He said that the Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla barrages—constructed after redesigning the original Chevella project—have either sunk or developed major damages within three years of completion. Addressing the media, the Chief Minister recalled that expert committees had earlier submitted reports highlighting flaws in the planning, construction, and maintenance of the project. "Despite warnings, the BRS government proceeded with a redesign that ultimately endangered public resources and lives," Revanth said.

Fulfilling an electoral promise, the Congress government appointed a Judicial Inquiry Commission on March 14, 2023, headed by retired judge Justice P.C. Ghosh. The commission submitted a comprehensive 665-page report on July 31 this year. "This report confirms that Kaleshwaram was built on a foundation of illegalities," he added. The Cabinet has reviewed and approved the report. A three-member committee prepared a summary that will be presented in the upcoming Assembly session. Revanth clarified that the inquiry was conducted independently and without political interference.

Anticipating criticism from the BRS,

he remarked, "They praise reports that suit them and dismiss the rest. But we will not act out of political vengeance." He assured that the government will act on the report based on consensus and public interest.

"The Kaleshwaram report will be placed before the Assembly. We will move forward transparently, taking everyone's views into account," the Chief Minister concluded.

AI assistant for ASHA workers. GHMC Commissioner RV Karnan not-

ed that this collaboration with Google marks a turning point in the city's digital transformation. He emphasized that the project is not just a tech experiment but a serious move toward making Hyderabad a smarter, cleaner, and more efficient city. If the pilot proves successful, these AI solutions will be expanded across the city and may set a national benchmark for urban innovation.

### **CM Issues Alert as Heavy Rains Hit Telangana**

## Telangana Wildlife Board Holds Key Meet

abad The Telangana State Board for Wildlife (SBWL) held its 9th meeting at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Secretariat, chaired by Forest, Environment and Endowments Minister Konda Surekha. The meeting focused on reviewing key development proposals in forest areas and strengthening wildlife conservation efforts.

Minister Surekha reiterated the government's commitment to tribal welfare and environmental protection. "We will not hurt the sentiments of Adivasis nor allow violations of forest rules," she said, underlining that all development projects would be evaluated with both



ecological and social consider- wildlife safety measures. Of ations.

The board examined proposals for road construction, optic fiber cable (OFC) lines, power infrastructure, irrigation, and

the six forest road projects considered, only one was approved by the National Board for Wildlife (NBWL). The other five were rejected as they were intended to connect unauthorized tribal habitations, potentially violating forest norms.

The board reviewed eight OFC proposals. Five projects falling under the Right of Way (RoW)

were cleared by the state gov- rected to revise animal underernment. The remaining three, which pass through forest areas, were approved by the NBWL in its June 2025 meeting. The NBWL rejected the Mulugu 11KV power line and approach road proposal, citing ecological concerns. However, the Peddagattu Lift Irrigation Scheme in Nalgonda received NBWL approval after detailed evaluation.

To ensure safe wildlife movement, the board proposed redesigned animal passages in 22 rural road projects. A central team from MoEF&CC, NTCA, WII, and the Forest Department will conduct field inspections this month. Divisional Forest Officers (DFOs) have been di-

pass plans considering terrain, wildlife density, and traffic flow.

The board also cleared 13 mobile towers proposed by BSNL and Airtel. Revenue collected at check posts will be used for anti-poaching, fire response, and plastic control.

A Tiger Cell will be set up at Aranya Bhavan to monitor big cat movement in conflict zones. The newly constituted SBWL Standing Committee will advise the state on forest, wildlife, and development issues.

### Five Ex-BRS MLAS Set to Join BJP

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) appears to be executing a strategic political move to strengthen its base in Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's home district of Mahabubnagar, with efforts underway to induct five former BRS legislators into the party.

Leading the effort is local MP and BJP leader D.K. Aruna, who is reportedly coordinating with senior leaders in Delhi. Former Achampet MLA Guvvala Balaraju, who recently resigned from the BRS, is said to be the first among the group, with former MLAs Marni Janardhan Reddy (Nagarkurnool), Abraham (Alampur), Jaipal Yadav (Kalwakurthy), and Beeram Harshavardhan Reddy (Kolhapur) also reportedly in talks to join the BJP. Balaraju and Abraham are believed to have met BJP National General Secretary (Organisation) B.L. Santosh recently in Delhi.

The BJP's move is being seen as a bid to weaken the BRS further in the Palamuru region and consolidate its own position ahead of the next Assembly elections. The party gained ground in the region with D.K. Aruna's surprise victory in the Mahabubnagar Lok Sabha seat, defeating the Congress candidate despite a focused campaign by CM Revanth.

However, former MLA Marni Janardhan Reddy has denied speculation about his defection, terming it a baseless campaign and affirming loyalty to the BRS leader-

Meanwhile, D.K. Aruna is said to be on a Delhi tour to brief the BJP high command about the developments and ongoing efforts to bolster the party's presence in southern Telangana.



## BJP Slams Revanth as 'Tourist CM'

Addressing a press conference at the BJP state office, he said the tenure of sarpanchs, ZPTCs, MPTCs, and municipalities has ended, yet no elections have been held, resulting in an administrative vacuum.

### Jeevan Reddy Demands **Indiramma Homes**

Senior Congress leader and former MLC T Jeevan Reddy has appealed to the district administration to re-sanction Indiramma houses for original beneficiaries whose homes were razed during the implementation of the double-bedroom housing scheme in Nukapalli.

Reddy, along with affected residents, submitted a representation to District Collector Shaik Satya Prasad at the



Prajavani public grievance programme. Beneficiaries also submitted house site pattas, urging the government to restore the Indiramma housing benefit instead of shifting them to other schemes.

Addressing the media later, Reddy said that in 2008, the Congress government sanctioned 4,000 Indiramma houses in Jagtial. Many families began construction, but hundreds were left incomplete due

to financial hardship. Some of these were recently demolished during double-bedroom house works, leaving families stranded.

Following his representation to Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy, a ₹52 crore proposal was submitted to complete 1,611 unfinished homes. However, Reddy noted that several of these homes were already demolished before the funds could be released.

He urged the government to re-approve houses under the Indiramma scheme specifically for the affected families. "They built these homes with hope. We must not let that be destroyed," he said.

## **Political Plot Behind** SIT, Alleges BRS

The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) accused the Congress government of using the Justice PC Ghose Commission report as political weapon to target the previous BRS regime. The party alleged that the formation of a Special Investigation Team (SIT) and the selective leak of the commission's findings were aimed at influencing public opinion ahead of local body elections.

Senior BRS leader and former Minister S. Niranjan Reddy questioned the sanctity of the Commission's findings, saying only a summary was made public while the complete report remains hidden. "The selective disclosure raises serious doubts about the government's intentions. If there is nothing to hide, why not release the full report for public scrutiny?" he asked.

He said the Congress government was attempting to project the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project (KLIP) as a failure despite it being one of the largest and most ambitious infrastructure initiatives in the country. "This is a deliberate attempt to malign the legacy of the previous government," he added.



Niranjan Reddy alleged that the SIT and the partial release of the report were tactics to distract the public from the ruling party's unfulfilled promises and lack of development. ## **Hydra to Protect Parks and Roads**

In a firm stance against encroachments, Hydra Commissioner A.V. Ranganatha stated that parks, roads, and public spaces will be protected as per approved layouts. He appealed to citizens not to block roads or encroach on open spaces, stressing the importance of these areas for community well-being.

The statement came during the weekly Hydra Prajavani program held on Monday, which received 58 complaints, the majority related to encroachments on parks, public roads, and community spaces. The Commissioner personally reviewed each complaint using Google Maps, NRSC data, Survey of India maps, and village records in the presence of complainants. Field-level inspections were ordered, with Asset Protection Officers assigned to act, and specific timelines set for resolution.

One major complaint involved a



2,000-square-yard area allocated for a Kuruma community burial ground in Boiguda, Secunderabad. Community leaders alleged the land was being encroached upon, disturbing ancestral graves.

Residents of Sri Sai Krishna Colony in Bachupalli, Malkajgiri district, reported encroachment on a 1,700-square-yard park space within a 4.8-acre layout. Although fencing was initiated by Nizampet munic-

ipal staff, encroachers reportedly obtained a stay order from court. Locals requested the park be restored for children and festivals like Bathukamma.

In Gandipet village, Rangareddy district, locals alleged a 25-foot road under Survey No. 69 had been illegally occupied, blocking access for hundreds of families. They pointed to the presence of electric poles and water pipelines as proof of its intended use. Another complaint came from Bhagat Singh Nagar in Qutbullapur mandal, where a 3,500-yard plot earmarked for public use and a proposed government hospital is allegedly under encroachment. Residents demanded immediate intervention to save the site.

Commissioner Ranganatha assured citizens that no violation will be overlooked and that genuine complaints will be addressed transparently with layout verification and public involvement.



## **Monsoon Cleanup Drive in Full Swing**

The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) is conducting a special monsoon sanitation drive across the city to maintain public hygiene and prevent seasonal diseases. The drive, which began on July 26, is being implemented in 150 wards and will continue till August 8.

Multiple departments including Sanitation, Entomology, Town Planning, Engineering, Veterinary, Urban Bio-Diversity (UBD), and Urban Community Development (UCD) are working together to keep the city clean and safe during the rainy

In sanitation efforts, 611 colonies were covered, with 679 metric tons of garbage and 1,195 metric tons of construction waste collected. In engineering works, 72.21 metric tons of waste was removed, 888 potholes filled, and 266 catch pits repaired or cleaned.

The Entomology Department reported 62 dengue cases. A total of 176,393 houses were inspected, with awareness programs conducted to prevent mosquito breeding.

Town Planning officials fined 140 violators through the CCMS app, collecting over ₹15.5 lakh in penalties. In the veterinary segment, 1,001 sterilizations and 4,661 anti-rabies vaccinations were performed.

UBD staff cleaned 469 parks in 328 trips. Meanwhile, UCD teams inspected 22,482 houses, with 1,276 staff participating in 162 rallies and 336 school awareness programs. Around 15,087 SHG members were involved in sanitation activities-Issued by CPRO, GHMC Office

## Yoga Protest Over **Potholes Goes Viral**

In a striking protest against the worsening condition of roads in Serilingampally, city-based activist Vinay Vangala performed a yoga pose over a large pothole, calling it 'Pothole Asana'. The unique demonstration was aimed at drawing attention to the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation's (GHMC) inaction despite repeated complaints from residents.Holding the pose for several minutes, Vinay sarcastically remarked, "Why spend on a chiropractor when our roads offer free spinal adjustments with every ride?" His protest quickly gained traction on social media under the hashtag #PotholeAsana, with several citizens echoing similar frustrations.

Vinay directly targeted GHMC's Serilingampally zone officials,

including Executive Engineer Indira and Deputy Engineer Sridevi, stating that it has been over two months since complaints were lodged, yet the potholes remain unattended.

He also criticised GHMC's claim of having filled 7,000 potholes across Hyderabad. "Many main roads in Serilingampally are still broken, and internal colony roads are completely ignored," he said, adding that the pace of repair is too slow to meet the city's needs."At this rate, it'll take years to fix everything," Vinay warned, pointing out that poor road conditions not only damage vehicles but also pose serious risks to public health. "This is about safety and dignity," he said. Following the viral protest and growing public support online, GHMC officials reportedly acted and fixed the highlighted issue.

## Cousin Kills Over Cash Clash

A heated argument over money ended in tragedy at Indiranagar, Borabanda, where a 21-year-old man was brutally murdered by his cousin.

The victim, Basavaraj, worked as a driver and lived with his cousin Prem Raj, 20, in a rented house. According to police, the two had frequent argu-

ments over money. On Sunday night, a heated quarrel broke out between them, which continued late into the night.

At around 4:30 am, while Basavaraj was asleep, Prem Raj allegedly picked up a granite stone and struck him on the head multiple times, causing severe injuries. Basavaraj was rushed to

a private hospital by neighbours but crime has been recovered, and further was declared dead on arrival by doc-

tors. Preliminary investigation suggests the motive was an ongoing monetary dispute between the two. Police have arrested Prem Raj and booked him under relevant sections of the IPC for murder. The weapon used in the

investigation is underway.

Officials said the accused will be produced before a magistrate soon. The incident has shocked the local community, as both men were known to be close and had been living together for several months.

The officer was performing his duty by preventing unauthorized entry through a restricted gate. The staff member reportedly slapped the CISF officer, leading to a public backlash. Despite this, the airline defended the crew member's actions at the time.

As the current incident gains traction, many are urging aviation authorities to probe SpiceJet's internal protocols and examine repeated allegations of unprofessionalism by its ground staff.

## **Tibal Torchbearer Shibu Shoren**

The passing of Shibu Soren, fondly known as 'Dishom Guru', marks not just the end of an extraordinary political journey but the closing chapter of an era that saw tribal aspirations rise from the margins to the mainstream of Indian politics. As the founder of the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) and a relentless voice for tribal rights, Soren's life was a testament to resistance, resilience, and reform.

Born on January 11, 1944, in the small village of Nemra in the Ramgarh district of erstwhile Bihar, Shibu Soren's life was shaped early by personal tragedy. At the age of 15, his father, Shobaran Soren, was allegedly killed by moneylenders. That harrowing incident in 1957 lit a fire in the young boy—one that never extinguished. That same pain would later drive a lifelong commitment to Through mass mobilisations, grassfight feudal exploitation and social injustice in tribal lands.

In 1973, Soren co-founded the JMM alongside AK Roy and Binod Bihari Mahto. From that point, the JMM would become the principal vehicle for demanding a separate tribal state, resonating across the Chotanagpur and Santhal Pargana belts.



roots movements, and unwavering activism, Soren emerged as the face of Jharkhand's statehood movement. After decades of agitation, their vision materialised with the formation of Jharkhand on November 15, 2000 — a landmark that remains Soren's most defining achievement. But Soren's political influence didn't

stop with Jharkhand's creation. He played an active role at the national level, having been elected multiple times as MP from Dumka, including his eighth term from 2014 to 2019. He also served in the Union Cabinet as Coal Minister in the UPA government. However, his time in national politics was marred by legal entanglements. From the 1975 Chirudih

massacre case to the sensational tron, Soren remained a lodestar for 1994 murder of his secretary Shashinath Jha, Soren faced trials and tribulations that nearly derailed his political career. Though acquitted in both cases—most notably by the Supreme Court in 2018—the episodes left a lasting impact on his public

Still, controversy couldn't eclipse his connection with the people. In Jharkhand, he remained a revered figure. His three short-lived stints as Chief Minister may have lacked administrative longevity, but symbolically, they underscored the complexities of coalition politics and the struggles of regional leadership in a fractured polity. A failed assassination attempt in 2007 while being escorted to jail only highlighted the danger and volatility that surrounded his career.

What truly set Soren apart was not just his survival in such a turbulent political landscape, but how he managed to retain the trust of his people. For 38 years, he led the JMM before handing over the reins in April 2025 to his son, Hemant Soren, currently the Chief Minister. Even in semi-retirement, as the party's founding patribal politics in India.

His personal life, like his political one, was rooted in struggle and legacy. He is survived by his wife Roopi Soren, daughter Anjani, and two sons, Hemant and Basant. His eldest son, Durga, passed away in 2009, but the family's political lineage continues with Hemant at the helm of Jharkhand's government and Basant serving as a legislator.

For the people of Jharkhand, Shibu Soren will forever be remembered as the embodiment of their long and difficult fight for identity, autonomy, and dignity. He was not without flaws, but his contribution to the tribal movement is indelible. His name is etched in the political and emotional fabric of a state that exists today largely because of his vision.

As India moves forward, Shibu Soren's life reminds us that real change often comes not from corridors of power, but from the pain of personal loss, the grit of grassroots struggle, and the courage to challenge systemic injustice. His voice may be silenced, but his message will echo for generations.







### **Shibu Soren passes away at 81**

Veteran tribal leader and former Jharkhand Chief Minister Shibu Soren passed away at the age of 81 on Monday after battling a kidney-related illness. He had been on life support at Delhi's Sir Ganga Ram Hospital for nearly a month. The nation is in mourning as tributes poured in from top political leaders, recognising his pivotal role in the upliftment of tribal communities and the creation of Jharkhand.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi led the tributes, calling Soren a "grassroots leader" who dedicated his life to the cause of tribal welfare. "He empowered tribal communities and worked tirelessly for the poor. His demise is a great loss to Indian politics," PM Modi said. President Droupadi Murmu, in an emotional post on X, said, "The demise of Shri Shibu Soren Ji is a big loss in the space of social justice. He championed the cause of tribal identity and the formation of the state of Jharkhand. His emphasis on the welfare of the people, especially the tribal communities, will always be remembered."

Union Home Minister Amit Shah remembered the late leader for his lifelong struggle for tribal rights. "He fought for decades for the rights and empowerment of the tribal society in Jharkhand. He connected with people with his simple personality and easy nature," he posted on X.

Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren, son of Shibu Soren, expressed deep grief over the loss of his father. "I am left with nothing," he said in a moving statement.

Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra also offered condolences, stating, "This is a very saddening news for all of us. My condolences and prayers are with the family members in this difficult time. I have also texted Kalpana Soren ji." Shibu Soren, also known as "Guruji," was born in 1944 in the Ramgarh district (then Bihar) and belonged to the Santhal community. Over decades, he became a symbol of the tribal movement, serving multiple terms as Chief Minister of Jharkhand, Union Minister, and Member of Parliament. His legacy includes not just political leadership but an unwavering commitment to tribal rights and social justice.

### **Himachal Floods Toll Rises to** 184, Over 300 Roads Blocked

The 2025 monsoon has wreaked havoc across Himachal Pradesh, with 184 people dead and key infrastructure crippled by relentless rain, landslides, and flash floods. The State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) reported that 103 of these deaths were directly rain-related, while 81 resulted from road accidents caused by dangerous terrain and damaged roads.

As of Tuesday, 309 roads, including National Highway 305 (NH-305), remain blocked due to landslides and debris flows. Water supply and electricity have also been severely disrupted, with 236 water supply schemes and 113 distribution transformers non-functional. Mandi district has emerged as the most severely affected, accounting for 23 rain-related deaths and 14 road fatalities. It also leads in infrastructure collapse with 167 roads blocked, 74 water schemes disrupted, and 91 transformers out of service. Kangra follows with 24 weather-related deaths and six accident fatalities, while Kullu reported 10 monsoon deaths and eight road accident deaths. Chamba and Shimla districts have also sustained multiple casualties and significant Shimla, Sirmaur, Solan, and Una.

In Lahaul-Spiti, a bridge collapse at Dared Nallah has severed the connection between Madgran and Kurched, isolating local populations. Meanwhile, a major landslide in Kullu near Jhed (Khanag) has rendered NH-305 impassable. However, a detour via Kandugad is currently open for light vehicles. NH-505 in Lahaul-Spiti also remains closed due to landslides. The SDMA has warned that continued rain in the coming days could trigger further landslides, flash floods, and service failures. On Sunday alone, 296 roads were blocked, 134 transformers went offline, and 266 water supply schemes were disrupted, highlighting the widespread infrastructure breakdown.

The cumulative damage to public property—including roads, electricity, water infrastructure, health centres, and schools—has crossed ₹1,71,495 lakh. Additionally, over 88,800 hectares of agricultural and horticultural crops have been impacted.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has predicted light to moderate rainfall across the state in the next 12 hours, with heavy rain expected at isolated places in Bilaspur, Hamirpur, Kangra, Kullu, Mandi,

## "True Indian Won't Say This": SC Raps Rahul Gandhi

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi faced stern words from the Supreme Court on Monday over his remarks about the Indian Army and China during the 2022 Bharat Jodo Yatra, even as the apex court stayed ongoing criminal defamation proceedings

A bench comprising Justice Dipankar Datta and Justice AG Masih questioned the veracity of Gandhi's statement that "Chinese troops are thrashing Indian soldiers in Arunachal Pradesh" and that China had taken over 2,000 sq km of Indian territory. The remarks, made in December 2022, referred to the border clash in Arunachal's Tawang

"How do you know China grabbed 2,000 sq km of land? Were you there? Do you have any credible material?" Justice Datta asked, adding pointedly, "If you are a true Indian, you won't say all of this." Senior advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi, appearing for Gandhi, defended his client by arguing, "If he can't say these things, how can he be the Leader of the Opposition?" But the court responded, "Then why don't you say such things in Parliament?"

Despite staying the proceedings for now, the court issued notice on Gandhi's plea to quash the defamation case, which originated from a complaint by Udai Shanker Srivastava. The complainant alleged that Gandhi's remarks defamed the Indian Army and lowered its morale.

The Supreme Court's comments come after the Allahabad High Court, in May, rejected Gandhi's challenge to a summons issued by a special court in Lucknow. That court had taken cognisance of



Srivastava's complaint and summoned Gandhi as an accused.

The High Court had also dismissed Gandhi's claim that he was not given a hearing and said, "Freedom of speech does not include the right to make

defamatory remarks about the armed forces." Gandhi's legal team argued that the case was politically motivated and violated procedural norms, but the courts have so far maintained that the content and tone of the statements warranted serious legal scrutiny. The Supreme Court will now hear the matter further following its notice, but its strong words have already reignited political tensions over the role and responsibility of leaders when speaking on sensitive national security issues.



### Rahul Gandhi Always **Speaks Against India:** Kangana Ranaut

Actor and BJP MP Kangana Ranaut lashed out at Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Monday, accusing him of repeatedly making statements that "undermine India's honour and support enemy nations," following the Supreme Court's sharp remarks over his controversial comments on the Indian Army.

The Supreme Court earlier in the day granted an interim stay on defamation proceedings against Gandhi in connection with his comments made during the Bharat Jodo Yatra in 2022. During the event, Gandhi had alleged that the Chinese Army "killed 20 Indian soldiers" and "thrashed Indian jawans" in Arunachal Pradesh.

Reacting strongly to these remarks, Kangana Ranaut said, "Rahul Gandhi always speaks against India, whether it's about the economy or our Defence forces. He speaks in support of enemy nations. He has an anti-India mindset. So, it is a welcome move by the Supreme Court that they pulled him up."

She further added, "In the time to come, others should be mindful that they do not hurt the honour, integrity and morale of India."

While granting the stay on defamation proceedings, the Supreme Court also made key observations about the sensitivity of such public statements, particularly when they involve national security and the armed forces.



### 2 More Arrested in Odisha Student **Suicide Case**

Two more individuals have been arrested in connection with the death of a 20-year-old student from Fakir Mohan (Autonomous) College in Odisha's Balasore district, who died by self-immolation last month after alleging that no justice was served in her sexual harassment case.

The Odisha Crime Branch on Sunday night arrested Jyoti Prakash Biswal, a fellow student who had sustained burns while trying to save her, and Subhra Sambait Nayak, the state joint secretary of a student organisation. Both were produced before the Sub-Divisional Judicial Magistrate (SDJM) in Balasore and remanded to 14 days of judicial custody after their bail pleas were rejected.

According to police, the woman poured petrol on herself and set herself on fire on July 12 after her complaint against the Head of the Department (HoD) of Integrated BEd was reportedly dismissed by the college's internal enquiry committee. She suffered 95% burn injuries and succumbed at AIIMS Bhubaneswar on July 14.

Earlier, two others — assistant professor Samira Kumar Sahoo and former principal Dillip Ghose — had also been arrested for abetment to suicide. Police officials say the investigation is ongoing and more developments are expected as they probe institutional failures that allegedly led to the tragedy.

## Some Don't Agree to Share Power: DKS

### **Philippines President Embarks** on 5-Day State **Visit to India**

Philippines President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. landed in New Delhi on Monday to kick off his first official visit to India since assuming office in 2022, describing India as a "valued friend" and underlining the potential for expanded bilateral cooperation across sectors.

Speaking ahead of the five-day visit, President Marcos said, "Our bilateral relations have seen a measured and stable development that is both comprehensive in scope and multifaceted in nature." He emphasized the mutual benefit of deeper engagement in defence, pharmaceuticals, agriculture, health, tourism, and digital connectivity.

He also expressed hopes that the visit would "bring concrete benefits for the Filipino people, such as more affordable medicine, greater connectivity, and food security."

The state visit coincides with the 75th anniversary of diplomatic relations between India and the Philippines, highlighting a shared resolve to advance regional security and economic goals. Marcos noted that India's democratic values, maritime interests, and Indo-Pacific strategy align with the Philippines' vision for peace and cooperation in the region.

After his arrival in New Delhi, Marcos will meet with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and key Indian officials. The two leaders are expected to discuss expanding cooperation in strategic areas such as defence and security, political coordination, trade, investment, and people-to-people exchanges. They are also likely to exchange views on regional and international issues of common concern.

Following his engagements in the national capital, President Marcos will visit Bengaluru, where he is expected to meet Indian business leaders and technology stakeholders to further enhance economic and innovation partnerships.

India's Ministry of External Affairs also highlighted the importance of this visit, noting that ties between the two nations have strengthened over the decades, particularly since the launch of the Look East Policy in 1992 and its later evolution into the Act East Policy.

President Marcos and Prime Minister Modi previously interacted at the ASEAN-India Summit in Lao PDR in October 2024 and during the 20th ASEAN-India Summit in Jakarta in 2023, where both sides expressed a commitment to deepening regional cooperation.

## **"Be Very, Very Careful with Nuclear Rhetoric": Russia to US**

The Kremlin on Monday issued a cautious statement urging all nations to be "very, very careful" with nuclear rhetoric. This comes after former US President Donald Trump stated he had ordered two American nuclear submarines to reposition in response to comments from ex-Russian president Dmitry Medvedev. Kremlin spokesperson Dmitry Peskov addressed Trump's announcement, saying, "In this case, it is obvious that American submarines are already on combat duty. This is an ongoing process." He downplayed the incident, avoiding direct confrontation or escalation, but emphasized that nuclear-related statements must be handled re-

### Trump Aide Targets India Over Oil Delas with Russia

Donald Trump's deputy chief of staff, Stephen Miller, has sharply criticized India for continuing to buy Russian oil and allegedly "cheating" the U.S. on trade and immigration. Speaking to reporters on August 3, Miller accused India of indirectly "financing" the Ukraine war by importing large volumes of Russian crude, almost as much as China, according to a Bloomberg report.

"President Trump wants a tremendous relationship with India and its prime minister. But we need to get real about dealing with the financing of this war," Miller stated. He suggested that under Trump's leadership, "all options are on the table to deal diplomatically, financially and otherwise" with the Ukraine conflict.



Miller's remarks come amid persistent pressure on India to cut its oil trade with Russia. The Biden administration has also raised similar concerns in recent months, though India has not shown urgency to change its course. Sources quoted by Bloomberg say that no formal instructions have been given to Indian

oil refiners to halt Russian imports. Both public and private sector oil companies are free to buy from their preferred sources, with purchases based on commercial decisions.

In addition to oil trade, Miller lashed out at India for what he described as "massive tariffs" on American goods and manipulating the U.S. immi-

gration system. He didn't elaborate on the latter, but his comments signal growing frustration within Trump's camp toward India's economic stance. Despite tensions, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has reiterated India's commitment to self-reliance. At a rally on August 2, Modi said, "The world economy is going through many apprehensions — there is an atmosphere of instability. Now, whatever we buy, there should be only one scale: we will buy those things which have been made by the sweat of an Indian."

The Trump administration had earlier imposed a 25% tariff on Indian exports and threatened further actions. As the U.S. election season heats up, Trump's team appears to be tightening its foreign policy rhetoric, especially regarding strategic allies like India.

### Beijing On High Alert as New Rainstorm Looms

Beijing has placed much of its mountainous regions under top alert as the city braces for another round of torrential rains on Monday, just days after deadly flooding killed 44 people— China's worst rain-related disaster in the capital since 2012.

The Beijing Meteorological Bureau issued a red alert for six hilly districts— Mentougou, Fangshan, Fengtai, Shijingshan, Huairou, and Changping. Authorities have urged residents to avoid unnecessary travel as forecasters predict up to 200 mm of rainfall within a six-hour window beginning midday. This is nearly one-third of the capital's average annual rainfall.

The recent floods have prompted officials to reassess their emergency response plans. Many of the victims were reportedly trapped at a nursing home in Miyun district, located in the city's northeastern periphery. "The risk of flash floods and landslides is extremely high," officials said in a public notice, urging strict caution.

The city's geography contributes to the disaster risk. With mountains surrounding Beijing to the west and north, moist air tends to get trapped, intensifying rainfall. This "rain trap" effect has been blamed for past flood disasters, including the catastrophic 2012 event which killed 79 people many in the same western districts now under alert.

The current situation is raising alarm across other parts of China as well. In the southern province of Guangdong, five people were confirmed dead after being swept away during recent flash floods. More than 1,300 rescuers had been involved in the search operation, local media reported.

The capital's emergency services remain on standby, and residents in high-risk areas have been advised to relocate to safer ground. Schools and workplaces in affected districts have been instructed to follow emergency protocols and suspend non-essential operations. Authorities are expected to hold a press briefing later today on additional safety measures and evacuation plans.



## **GST Evasion Of ₹7.08 Lakh Crore Detected In 5 Years**

The Central GST (CGST) field officers have unearthed a staggering ₹7.08 lakh crore worth of tax evasion over the last five financial years from 2020–21 to 2024–25. The revelation, made in the Lok Sabha on Monday by Minister of State for Finance Pankaj Chaudhary, highlights the growing scale of fraud, especially in Input Tax Credit (ITC) claims.

According to government data, a total of 91,370 GST evasion cases were detected during this five-year span, of which 44,938 were related specifically to ITC fraud — totaling ₹1.79 lakh crore. These fake ITC claims allow businesses to illegitimately reduce their tax liability by claiming credit for taxes never actu-

In the current fiscal year 2024-25 alone, GST evasion of ₹2.23 lakh crore has been detected from 30,056 cases, with ₹58,772 crore linked to fake ITC claims from



15,283 cases. Similarly, during the 2023– 24 fiscal, ₹2.30 lakh crore worth of tax evasion was uncovered, with ITC fraud accounting for ₹36,374 crore.

In FY 2022–23, authorities found ₹1.32 lakh crore in evasion, including ₹24,140 crore of fake ITC. In the earlier years, the evasion stood at ₹73,238 crore (FY22) and ₹49,384 crore (FY21), with ITC-related frauds of ₹28,022 crore and ₹31,233 crore respectively.

Over the five-year period, the govern-

ment managed to recover more than ₹1.29 lakh crore in taxes through voluntary deposits.

Minister Pankaj Chaudhary said the government has implemented several digital reforms to tackle evasion and fraud, including e-invoicing, analytics-based GST return scrutiny, flagging system-based mismatches, and risk-based audits. These tools are intended to provide actionable intelligence to tax officials and ensure better compliance.

Responding to another query in the House, the Minister informed that the net Central GST collection for 2024–25 stood at ₹10.26 lakh crore — about 96.7% of the Revised Estimate (RE) of ₹10.62 lakh crore. This net figure includes CGST, Integrated GST, and compensation cess. In comparison, FY24 saw the government surpass its target slightly with collections reaching ₹9.57 lakh crore against the RE of ₹9.56 lakh crore.

## **ED Turns Heat on Anil Ambani** Over ₹3,000-Cr Loan Fraud

In fresh legal trouble for Reliance Group Chairman Anil Ambani, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) has written to over a dozen banks, seeking detailed information about loans extended to his companies, including Reliance Housing Finance, Reliance Communications, and Reliance Commercial Finance. The ED has approached both public and private sector banks, including SBI, ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Axis Bank, UCO Bank and Punjab & Sind Bank.

Sources familiar with the matter said the ED has requested documents related to the due diligence process for sanctioning the loans, the timeline of defaults, and the recovery steps taken since the loans turned into non-performing assets (NPAs).

The ED is also likely to summon officials from these banks for questioning as part of its investigation into what it believes 
The ED has already conducted raids at over 50 firms linked to is a major corporate loan fraud that runs into ₹3,000 crore. The probe agency has intensified its efforts after it arrested Partha Sarathi Biswal, Managing Director of Biswal Tradelink Pvt Ltd, last week under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. Biswal is accused of submitting fake guarantees worth ₹68.2 crore on behalf of Reliance Power.

Sources say the ED believes fake guarantees were used to secure loans which were later misused. It is also probing possible quid pro quo arrangements between Reliance Group firms and YES Bank promoters, as payments were allegedly made to the latter just before loan disbursements.



the case and is now expanding the probe to cover lending institutions. A lookout circular has also been issued against Anil Ambani to prevent him from leaving the country during the ongoing investigation.

The ₹3,000-crore case primarily involves loans disbursed by YES Bank between 2017 and 2019 to various Reliance Group entities, which eventually turned into bad loans. With the first arrest already made and the agency zeroing in on bank officials, the case could mark a major escalation in legal troubles for the embattled industrialist.

## **20 Peacocks Found Dead** Near Stream in Karnataka

**T**n a shocking incident **I**from Hanumanthapura village in Karnataka, twenty peacocks — India's national bird — were found dead under myscircumstances near a stream. According to reports, local farmers discovered the carcasses of 17 female and 3 male peacocks, prompting immediate concern and investigation by the Forest Department.

Forest officials reached the spot collected evidence and dispatched the carcasses to the Forensic Science Laboratory. Officials stated that the cause of death would be confirmed after scientific

examination, with poisoning being one of the suspected caus-

This mass death comes at a time when Karnataka is already grappling with a series of unexplained wildlife fatalities. Just a month earlier, 20 monkeys were found dead in the Chamarajanagar district, where forest and police officials also suspected poisoning.

In another alarming case, five tigers — a tigress and her four cubs — died on June 27 in the Male Mahadeshwara Hills Wildlife Sanctuary. Initial investigation revealed that the tigress had preyed on a cow that was allegedly poisoned by villagers in retaliation. The meat was laced with poison, leading to the tragic deaths. Three individuals — Konappa, Madaraja, and Nagaraj — from Koppa village were arrested in that case. Both the peacock and tiger incidents have raised serious ques-

tions about wildlife protection and human-animal conflict in Karnataka. While the forest department does offer compensation for livestock killed by wild animals, the benefit is not extended when such killings occur within the core areas of sanctuaries or national parks — where cattle grazing is illegal. The recent peacock deaths are particularly disturbing given the state's commitment to preserving the species. Karnataka is home to two prominent peacock sanctuaries — Adichunchanagiri and Bankapura — both established to protect and conserve the national bird.

With multiple wildlife deaths being reported in short succession, activists and environmentalists are urging stricter enforcement of wildlife laws and better coordination between forest officials and local communities to prevent further incidents.





## **114-Year-Old Shigeko Becomes Japan's Oldest Living Person**

Kagawa, an obstetrician and gynaecologist by profession, served as a wartime physician at a hospital in Osaka during the Second World War. After a long career in medicine, she retired at the age of 86

Despite her age, Kagawa remains a symbol of Japan's famed longevity. She drew global attention in 2021 when, at 109, she took part in the Tokyo Olympics torch relay—becoming one of the oldest Olympic torchbearers in history.

Speaking to local media in 2023, Kagawa credited her long life to a carefree and active lifestyle. "I don't have any [secret]... I just play every day. My energy is my greatest asset. I go where I want, eat what I want and do what I want. I'm free and

independent," she told TOS News. Before her, the title was held by Miyoko Hiroyasu, born in 1911, who passed away in a nursing home in Oita Prefecture. A former art student, Hiroyasu spent her final days reading, sketching, and play-

ing card games. She raised three children and remained mentally and physically active until her passing. Both women are celebrated as reflections of Japan's aging yet resilient population,

## **India Clinches Thriller in Oval Nail-Biter**

Siraj and Krishna's heroics seal 2-run win in historic Test finish

India pulled off one **L**of the most dramatic Test wins in its cricketing history by defeating England by just 2 runs at The Oval on Day 5 of the final Test, levelling the series 2-2. It is India's narrowest-ever victory in terms of runs in Test cricket. The match reached a fever pitch with England needing just 35 runs on the final day and having two wickets in hand, but an inspired bowling effort led by Mohammed Siraj and Prasidh Krishna turned the tide.



England, resuming at 339/8 and chasing a target of 374, had an entire day to reach their goal but lasted just 53 tense deliveries. Jamie Overton gave the hosts early hope with two boundaries off the day's first two balls, but the next over changed everything. Jamie Smith, England's last recognized batter, edged one behind off Siraj, triggering a collapse. Overton soon fell LBW to a sharp inswinger by Siraj, and though Josh Tongue resisted briefly — even overturning a close call on review — he was eventually castled by Krishna with 17 runs still required. Drama peaked when Chris Woakes, nursing a dislocated left shoulder, bravely walked in to bat one-handed. With Woakes in obvious pain, Gus Atkinson shielded him by farming strike. At one point, Atkinson hit a six off a spilled catch by Akash than an hour on a rainy London morning. Deep and edged the equation down to 11 runs.

However, with immense pressure mounting, Atkinson was bowled attempting a sweep to a full toss from Siraj. England were dismissed for 367, falling short by just two runs. Siraj finished with figures of 5 wickets in the innings, while Krishna's timely strike proved decisive.

Woakes was lauded by Indian players for his courageous stand despite injury. The crowd, too, gave him a rousing ovation for his fighting spirit. Though India won the match and squared the series, they remain third in the World Test Championship standings.
