

Stop Targeting Muslims Over BC Reservation

Revanth Reddy Slams BJP

TPN Correspondent | NewDelhi Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy strongly criticised the BJP for linking the 42% Backward Classes (BC) reservation bill with demands to remove Muslim reservations. Speaking to the media in New Delhi, he questioned the BJP's attitude, asking, "Why does the BJP hate Muslims?"

Revanth specifically targeted Union Ministers Kishan Reddy and Bandi Sanjay for insisting that Muslim reservations be withdrawn in exchange for their support for the BC quota bill. He called such statements "ignorant" and likened them to "street-level politics."

The Chief Minister explained that Muslim communities like Noor

Bash and Dudekula have received reservations since 1971 become Chief Minister?" The Chief Minister also remindreligion. He noted that even Prime Minister Narendra Modi supported reservations for backward Muslims during his equality and back the reservation bill.

Calling the BJP's stand hypocritical, Revanth urged the party to support the 42% BC reservation bill without targeting Muslims. He accused Kishan Reddy of fearing that Muslims might rise to the post of Chief Minister, questioning, "Why can't a Muslim

KCR Govt in Phone Tapping Scandal

Bandi Sanjay Demands CBI Probe

revealed shocking details following the SIT investigation into the phone tapping scandal in Telangana. He alleged that the KCR government illegally tapped the phones of more than 6,500 people, including himself, senior ministers, BRS MLAs, judges, businessmen, and even members of KCR's own family.

Sanjay said his phone was tapped constantly, with conversations monitored under the pretext of Maoist threats. "They tapped phones of ministers, MLAs, judges investigating sensitive cases, and even the phones of KCR's own daughter Kavitha," he claimed. He accused the ruling government of using the Special Intelligence Bureau (SIB) as a tool for blackmail and political control, targeting opposition leaders,

He condemned the seizure of hundreds of crores of rupees from Congress leaders during elections and

questioned the whereabouts of this money, alleging misuse by officials. Sanjay slammed the state government and Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for their failure to act decisively against those involved. He accused Revanth Reddy of shielding KCR and stalling the investigation despite clear evidence.

Sanjay also questioned the SIT's authority to summon judges and political leaders for statements, demanding the case be handed over to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) for an impartial probe. He asserted that if the CBI had direct powers, KCR and his son would have been arrested by now.

Highlighting political collusion, Sanjay said the Congress and BRS governments were wasting time with the probe and called for urgent legal action. He urged Revanth Redcontractors, businessmen, and film dy to cooperate with the SIT and formally request the CBI investigation from the central government to restore public faith.

AP Speeds Up Polavaram Project **Telangana Sounds Warning**

Andhra Pradesh has fasttracked the Polavaram–Banakacherla Link Project, designed to divert surplus Godavari floodwaters, even as the project awaits critical environmental and legal approvals. Estimated to cost around Rs 80,112 crore, the ambitious project aims to provide relief to drought-prone Rayalaseema, but immediate benefits are likely to be enjoyed by the Krishna delta region.

As part of the fast-tracking efforts, the Andhra Pradesh government is expanding the Polavaram Right Main Canal's capacity from 17,500 cusecs to 38,000 cusecs. This expansion will facilitate the diversion of floodwaters to the Krishna River and is being executed rapidly to meet internal timelines. However, critics note that this work primarily serves the ir-

rigation needs of Krishna and Guntur districts, while Rayalaseema continues to await promised water benefits.

The project includes constructing a 25-kilometre tunnel through the ecologically sensitive Nallamala forests and connecting water through the Bollapalli reservoir to the Banakacherla regulator near Nandyal. Experts caution that acquiring mandatory clearances from the Krishna River Management Board (KRMB), Godavari River Management Board (GRMB), and Central Water Commission (CWC) will take at least three years, with construction expected to span over a decade.

Revanth Reddy Reviews Hyderabad Flood Issues

Singur Reservoir Breach Risk Over 517m

A Telangana government-appointed Dam Safety Review Panel (DSRP) has warned that storing water beyond 517 metres in the Singur reservoir could endanger the structure and lead to a possible breach. The expert team recommended urgent repairs and strict adherence to the limit to prevent a downstream di-

The panel Comprising former Central Water Commission members Ashok Kumar Ganju and Yogendar Kumar Sharma, hydrologist and former Engineer-in-Chief (Irrigation) P. Ramaraju, retired GSI deputy general manager M. Raju, and irrigation expert Kannaiah Naidu — inspected the project on March

They found that prolonged storage at 522 metres had damaged the revetment of the earth dam. According to the report, the water level was capped at 517.8 metres until

2017, when the government permitted storage up to 520.50 metres to meet Mission Bhagiratha needs. This limit was later pushed to 522 metres, worsening structural dam-

The panel also called for immediate repairs to the spillway, earth dam, gallery, and other components, and urged the government to release funds without delay.

A breach, the experts warned, could devastate towns like Sangareddy and Medak, submerge several villages along the Manjeera river, and threaten downstream structures including the Manjeera dam, Ghanpur anicut, Nizam Sagar, and multiple check dams.

Commissioned in 1999 at Singur village in Sangareddy district, the reservoir has a capacity of 29.91 TMCft, irrigating about 40,000 acres. It currently holds around 21 TMCft, with an inflow of 2,000 cusecs from up-

Uttam Orders SLBC Tunnel Restart

Irrigation Minister Capt. N Uttam Kumar Reddy has initiated steps to resume the stalled Srisailam Left Bank Canal (SLBC) tunnel work, calling it a "very high priority" for the government. The incomplete 9-km tunnel currently prevents the State from drawing water by gravity from the Srisailam reservoir's bottom, forcing an annual expenditure of nearly ₹750 crore on electricity for water lifting. This affects tribal and fluoride-affected areas especially.

A high-level meeting at the Secretariat discussed restarting the project. A meeting with Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy and Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka will seek clearances from Finance, Energy, and related departments.

The National Geophysical Research Institute (NGRI) will conduct aerial electromagnetic surveys using helicopters to map geological faults and challenges. The Geological Survey of India (GSI) will perform an aerial LIDAR survey to ensure precise planning. The remaining tunnelling of nearly 10 km will resume immediately, adhering to approved costs and quality standards. The Minister also announced promo-



HC Seeks Phased Plan for Telugu in Schools

The Telangana High Court has directed the state government to prepare and submit a detailed action plan for the phased implementation of Telugu as the second language for students from classes 2 to 9 in government, unaided, and private schools. This came during a hearing on a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by Pramila Pathak of Hyderabad, challenging government orders issued in December 2024 that made Telugu mandatory as a second language in CBSE, ICSE, IB, Cambridge, and other national board schools.

The division bench, comprising Chief Justice Aperesha Kumar Singh and Justice GM Mohiuddin, heard the case on August 7. The petitioner's counsel argued that Telugu should be introduced gradually, starting from Class 6 and extending one class each year. The lawyer contended that a sudden mandatory implementation could severely affect students who have studied in oth-

er languages and disrupt their learning. After considering the arguments from both sides, the court refused to stay the government's orders. Instead, it asked the government to submit a clear and feasible phased implementation plan to ensure a smooth transition for students and schools. The court adjourned the hearing for two weeks to allow the government time to prepare and present the plan. This directive highlights the court's effort to balance language policy with students' academic interests.





KTR demands apology from Bandi Sanjay

BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has issued a strong warning to Union Minister of State for Home Affairs, Bandi Sanjay Kumar, challenging him to substantiate his phone-tapping allegations against the previous BRS government. KTR demanded that Sanjay issue a public apology within 48 hours, failing which he vowed to initiate legal proceedings.

The confrontation follows Sanjay's recent statements made before the Special Investigation Team (SIT) probing the alleged phone-tapping during the BRS regime. Responding sharply, KTR condemned Sanjay's claims as "cheap political drama" and accused him of crossing all limits with baseless and derogatory accusations.



"I will serve a formal legal notice. If you fail to retract your statements and apologize publicly within 48 hours, I will drag you to court," KTR declared firmly.

He also criticized Sanjay for lacking basic understanding of intelligence operations, despite holding the position of Union Minister of State for Home. KTR mocked Sanjay's desperate political tactics, saying, "If only being a responsible minister was as easy as carrying the chappals of Delhi bosses." This exchange adds fuel to the ongoing political firestorm over the contentious phone-tapping allegations, reflecting the deepening rivalry between the BRS and BJP in Telangana's volatile political landscape.

The SIT inquiry continues to draw attention from all sides, with the phone-tapping scandal remaining a highly sensitive and contested issue.

BRS Complains Against BJP MP Over Merger Rumors

The Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) filed police complaint against BJP MP CM Ramesh, accusing him of spreading false rumors about a possible merger between BRS and BJP. The complaint was submitted by BRS leader Manne Govardhan Reddy at Banjara Hills Police Station, demanding a formal FIR against Ramesh and warning of strict legal

action if such statements continue. Addressing the media after filing the complaint, Govardhan Reddy accused CM Ramesh of involvement in serious financial crimes, including a massive Rs. 450 crore bank fraud and illicit gains from the liquor trade. He alleged that Ramesh switched from the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) to BJP to escape

enforcement actions by the Directorate of Enforcement (ED).

Govardhan Reddy further claimed that CM Ramesh acted as a key mediator for the Revanth Reddy-led Telangana government in mortgaging the Kancha Gachibowli forest land. In return, Ramesh was rewarded with a lucrative Rs. 1,600 crore road development proj-

ect in the controversial Fourth City area.

Highlighting the corruption allegations, he cited revelations made by senior Congress MLA Komatireddy Rajgopal Reddy, who exposed how contractors from Andhra Pradesh were looting Telangana under the Revanth Reddy government. Govardhan Reddy accused CM Ramesh of benefiting from these corrupt deals, painting him as a key player in

the ongoing exploitation of Telangana's resources.

The BRS warned that it would take strong action against any further attempts by CM Ramesh to spread misinformation and undermine the party. The complaint signals rising political tensions between BRS and BJP ahead of upcoming elections.

KTR Blasts Congress for Scrapping **Driver Insurance**

BRS working president K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) launched a fierce attack on the Congress government for scrapping the Rs 5 lakh accident insurance scheme meant for gig workers, private drivers, and unorganised sector labourers. He accused the government of betraying these vulnerable groups by abruptly withdrawing the scheme and demanded its immediate revival along with clearing all pending claims.

KTR warned that if the Congress fails to reinstate the insurance cover and release due payments, the BRS will organise a massive agitation to expose the government's negligence and hold it accountable. He recalled



that under the previous BRS regime led by Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhar Rao, comprehensive welfare initiatives including insurance protection were extended to farmers, weavers,

He highlighted the stark contrast with the current administration headed by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, who had promised significant support to unorganised sector workers prior to the elections but is now withdrawing this critical scheme from October 2024. KTR slammed this move as heartless, leaving the families of accident victims without any financial aid, and accused the Congress of abandoning the very people it claims to protect.

Terming the withdrawal as a betrayal of poor drivers and gig workers, KTR urged the government to reconsider its decision immediately and emphasized the need for compassionate governance that safeguards the rights and welfare of all citizens.

Tehsildars from Amberpet and Himayatnagar, along with representatives from multiple government departments, participated in the inspection to coordinate efforts for flood management and ensure timely action to protect vulnerable communities in the Musi River catchment areas.

Poor Drainage Causes Flood at Malkam Lake

Excessive inflow of rainwater combined with inadequate outflow capacity has been identified as the primary cause of flooding around Malkam Lake and adjacent Gachibowli areas, Hyderabad Commissioner A.V. Ranganath stated following an on-site inspection.

The Commissioner observed that while large volumes of water from upstream entered ter Response Force (DRF), and the lake, outflow was restrict- traffic police worked overnight ed to a single drain, resulting in waterlogging of nearby roads and residential localities. He recommended the installation of sluice gates to regulate water levels effectively during the monsoon season and instructed officials to commence the necessary works once rains subside.

Additionally, a woman trapped in floodwaters near Banjara Hills was safely rescued.

STH Arrests Ganja Peddler

Musi River Rises as Himayat Sagar Gates Open

The water level in Hyderabad's Musi River is set to rise following the opening of floodgates at the Himayat Sagar reservoir. Officials from the Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) opened the fourth gate out of 17 to release excess

water, as the reservoir's level reached 1763.15 feet—just shy of its full tank level of 1763.5 feet.

Recent heavy rains have increased the inflow to the reservoir to 1,500 cusecs, while the outflow is at 1,391 cusecs. To manage this, authorities have raised the four gates to a height of one foot each. This controlled release aims to maintain safe water levels but will cause the Musi River to swell, potentially affecting low-lying neighborhoods along its banks.

The authorities are closely monitoring the situation to ensure timely action if water levels rise season.

Train Coach Catches Fire, Workers Safe

resh violence has erupted in Syria's southern Sweida province, home to the Druze minority, following Israeli airstrikes purportedly to protect the embattled community. On August 6, aid trucks reached the area after prolonged shortages, even as tensions rise under Syria's new president, Ahmed al-Sharaa.

The Druze, an ancient, secretive religious group spread across Syria, Lebanon, and Israel, are being targeted amid escalating sectarian violence. Their beliefs — including reincarnation, a non-proselytizing faith, and reverence for Jethro, Moses' father-in-law — echo similarities with Indic spiritual traditions. Some Druze even believe their lost scriptures may be hidden in India.

While Israel claims to protect Druze near its borders, it has expanded military operations in southern Syria, citing the need to build a "buffer zone" in the Golan Heights, which it seized from Syria in 1967. The region remains a strategic flashpoint.



Meanwhile, Turkey and Qatar have deepened involvement in Syria, backing Islamist factions and expanding military and economic influence. Ankara sees Syria as key to countering Kurdish threats and securing regional dominance. As Turkey strengthens ties with Damascus, Israel views Turkish expansion as a direct threat.

Analysts now warn that a new proxy war may be brewing — not just involving Israel and Iran, but Israel vs. Turkey, with shifting alliances and covert support, including from Iran itself, now edged out of Syria. The fate of the Druze — and the stability of the region — hangs in the balance.

With a population of over 1.46 billion, India's economic output in dollar terms appears impressive. Reports from institutions like Morgan Stanley project that India could reach \$10.6 trillion in GDP by 2035, making it the third-largest economy by 2028. But is Nominal GDP a true reflection of India's economic strength and citizens' well-being?

The Limits of Nominal GDP

While nominal GDP is essential for international rankings, investment inflows, and membership in global economic forums like the G20 or IMF, it has significant limitations:

Inflation Distortion: Nominal GDP can rise due to inflation, even if actual production remains stagnant, giving a misleading picture of growth.

Low Living Standards: A high total GDP does not translate to high GDP per capita. India's GDP may rival Japan's in size, but Japan's small- Nominal GDP is important for standard of living.

Income Inequality: Nominal GDP doesn't capture how wealth is distributed. India's economic gains remain concentrated, with large segments of the population still under poverty.

Lack of Purchasing Power Insight:

Without accounting for the Purchasing Power Parity (PPP), nominal GDP fails to reflect the real value of money for the average citizen.

Overlooks Informal Economy & Sustainability: India's vast informal sector, along with environmental and health concerns, are invisible in GDP numbers.

To gauge a country's real economic strength and its impact on people, economists recommend a combination of indicators:

Real GDP: Adjusted for inflation, it reflects actual growth in produc-

On August 7, Gandhi alleged the presence of over 1.02 lakh fake votes in the Mahadevapura Assembly segment under the Bengaluru Central Lok Sabha seat—far exceeding the 32,707-vote victory margin of BJP MP P.C. Mohan. Gandhi accused the Election Commission (EC) of complicity, saying the fraud was deliberate and designed to benefit the ruling party.

The Congress candidate from the seat, Mansoor Ali Khan, reportedly spearheaded a detailed audit that helping "steal" the 2024 elections. led to the discovery of alleged irregularities. Gandhi also claimed similar discrepancies occurred in other constituencies and accused the EC of



While the BJP has dismissed the charges as politically motivated, electoral officials have asked Gand-

hi to submit his claims under oath. However, with media reports validating some of the claims—including one house allegedly hosting 80 non-existent voters—the matter has moved beyond mere partisan rhet-

questions:

1. Why did these allegations emerge over a year after the elections?

2. What impact could they have on the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, especially in Bihar?

Critics argue that had the Congress acted earlier—perhaps by filing a legal challenge—the issue could have been addressed within established democratic mechanisms. Instead, Gandhi's public accusations ahead of legal action are seen as an attempt to corner the EC and the government politically.

Still, experts insist that such grave charges from a national leader cannot be ignored. A proposed solution is an inquiry led by former Election Commissioners, possibly under Supreme Court oversight, to investigate and present findings transparently.

The issue now poses two serious Rahul's claims come even as the Congress secured major electoral wins in recent years—Karnataka in 2023 and alliances with DMK and TMC in 2024. This complicates its full-throated criticism of the EC, suggesting selective trust in outcomes.

> The controversy also casts a shadow over the EC's ongoing efforts to clean up electoral rolls through the SIR process. Ironically, Gandhi's claims may strengthen the case for such roll revisions—if done transparently.

At stake is not just political mileage but public faith in the democratic process. The need of the hour is not partisan point-scoring, but a factbased inquiry that holds either the accuser or the institution accountable—restoring the trust that India's democracy depends on.



Priyanka Slams EC

Priyanka Gandhi's Dig At Poll Body

Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra launched a scathing attack on the Election Commission (EC) on Friday, questioning its neutrality after it demanded that Rahul Gandhi submit an affidavit to support his poll rigging allegations.

Priyanka questioned the EC's intent behind asking for a sworn declaration under a rule that only applies within 30 days of polling. "If they believe their responsibility is only to the BJP, they need to rethink. This is about Indian democracy, not a political party," she said, asserting that the EC should investigate the allegations instead of dismissing them. Her remarks came after Chief Electoral Officers from at least three states asked Rahul Gandhi to share specific names of voters allegedly added or removed from electoral rolls wrongly, along with a signed statement.

Rahul Gandhi had earlier alleged "vote chori" involving over 1 lakh fake or duplicate entries in a Karnataka assembly constituency. He presented data on voters with invalid addresses, photos, and bulk registrations, calling it a coordinated electoral fraud. Priyanka defended her brother, saying the allegations are based on evidence. "How can the EC call it baseless without probing it?" she asked. "If such a big scam is happening, the least they can do is check."

She warned that those enabling electoral malpractice would be held accountable when the Opposition returns to power. "They are attacking the foundation of democracy. This cannot be ignored," she added. The Congress said the INDIA bloc will collectively decide the next steps. Meanwhile, the EC insists Rahul Gandhi must either formalise his claims or stop misleading voters. Rahul Gandhi stood by his allegations, saying he had already made the claims publicly and that the EC should "take it as an oath."

Tharoor Backs Rahul on Vote Chori

Senior Congress leader Shashi Tharoor has come out in support of Rahul Gandhi over allegations of electoral irregularities, endorsing the Congress leader's recent criticism of the Election Commission and concerns of "vote chori" (vote theft). Tharoor's endorsement is significant amid ongoing tensions between him and the party's central leadership.

Sharing Rahul Gandhi's presentation on alleged voter fraud in the Mahadevapura Assembly segment of the Central Bangalore Lok Sabha seat, Tharoor posted on X (formerly Twitter): "These are serious questions which must be seriously addressed in the interests of all parties & all voters. Our democracy is too precious to allow its credibility to be destroyed by incompetence, carelessness or worse, deliberate tampering. @ECISVEEP must urgently act & @SpokespersonECI should keep the nation informed." Rahul Gandhi had accused the Election Commission of acting in collusion with the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) to undermine the Constitution and manipulate the electoral process.

Tharoor's support is seen as a notable shift, as he has been at odds with the Congress high command in recent months. He drew criticism from within the party after being selected by the central government to lead an all-party delegation on Operation Sindoor, following the Pahalgam terror attack. His views on India-Pakistan relations and diplomacy also diverged from the party line.

Adding to the strain, Tharoor recently praised Prime Minister Narendra Modi's diplomatic efforts in an op-ed for The Hindu, lauding the PM's "energy" and "dynamism" on the global stage — remarks that didn't sit well with Congress leadership. With his latest remarks, Tharoor appears to realign with the party on the issue of electoral integrity, underscoring the need for transparency and immediate corrective action by the Election Commission.

China Welcomes PM Modi's Visit to SCO Summit

China has warmly welcomed Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to Tianjin for the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) Summit, scheduled from August 31 to September 1. This will mark PM Modi's first trip to China since 2019.

Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson Guo Jiakun highlighted that the summit will be the largest in SCO's history, with leaders from over 20 countries attending, including all nine member states—China, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Iran, and Uzbekistan—and heads of 10 international organizations. Guo described the event as a "gathering of solidarity, friendship, and fruitful results," emphasizing China's optimism for the summit's outcomes.

PM Modi's visit to Tianjin follows his stop in Japan for the annual India-Japan Summit with Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba on August 30. His attendance is part of a broader series of SCO-related diplomatic engagements in China, which have involved Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, and External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar in recent months.



The summit comes amid growing geopolitical tensions, including criticism from former US President Donald Trump targeting BRICS nations—many of which are SCO members—for their purchase of Russian oil. Russia plans to send representatives to the summit, but it remains unclear if President Vladimir Putin will attend.

Relations within the SCO have faced challenges, such as India's refusal in June to en-

dorse a defence ministers' document that omitted mention of the Pahalgam terror attack, which killed 26 people, while referencing unrest in Pakistan's Balochistan region. China, however, condemned the Pahalgam attack in July and called for enhanced regional counterterrorism cooperation.

With India's active participation, the upcoming SCO summit is expected to reinforce ties and address regional security and economic cooperation among member states.

India will not bow to anybody: Piyush

Amid rising global trade tensions, Union Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal declared that India "will not bow down to anybody," asserting the country's economic resilience and growing influence in the global trade order.

Speaking at the Business Today India@100 Summit, Goyal addressed concerns over the US imposing an additional 25% tariff on Indian goods over its continued purchase of Russian oil. He stressed India's self-confidence and growth trajectory, saying, "India is growing at 6.5% and will likely export more this year than last. We have put in place systems to respond to trade challenges effectively."

Rejecting claims of global "deglobalisation," Goyal said the world is merely recalibrating its partnerships, and India is emerging stronger in this reconfiguration.



Highlighting future prospects, he announced that the India-EFTA (European Free Trade Association) trade pact would come into effect on October 1. The agreement will bring in \$100 billion in investments and is expected to generate over 10 lakh direct jobs and 50 lakh total employ-

ment opportunities.

In a sharp rebuttal to US President Donald Trump's recent remark calling India a "dead economy" and Congress leader Rahul Gandhi's alleged endorsement of the view, Goyal said, "It's a shame when opposition leaders parrot foreign criticism. The nation will not forgive such negativity."

He reiterated India's economic strength—stable currency, healthy forex reserves, robust stock markets, and low inflation—and credited the IT sector and pandemic-era reforms for India's resilience. "India turned the Covid crisis into opportunity," he said, adding, "We will always emerge victorious during challenging times."

Looking ahead, Goyal confirmed that India is finalising or negotiating FTAs with over 10 countries, including the UK, EU, US, Chile, and Australia, positioning itself as a central player in the evolving global trade landscape.

India Pauses Plans To Buy US Weapons

India has paused plans to procure advanced U.S. weapons and aircraft following President Donald Trump's steep tariff hike on Indian exports, in a sign of growing diplomatic strain between the two countries, according to Reuters.

Three senior Indian officials confirmed that the government had shelved upcoming defence deals, including the planned visit of Defence Minister Rajnath Singh to Washington. During the now-cancelled trip, Singh was expected to announce major military purchases, including six Boeing P8I reconnaissance aircraft in a \$3.6 billion deal, Stryker combat vehicles from General Dynamics, and Javelin anti-tank missiles developed by Lockheed Martin and Raytheon.

The decision follows Trump's August 6 order imposing an additional 25% tariff on Indian goods, raising total duties to 50%. The move was justified by Washington as a response to India's continued purchases of discounted Russian oil, which the U.S. claims supports Moscow's war effort in Ukraine.

While formal instructions to cancel the arms deals have not been issued, officials said that all progress has been frozen "for now," with possible resumption depending on how the tariff dispute evolves.



India, the world's second-largest arms importer, has increasingly shifted defence procurement toward Western countries. However, the freeze in U.S. deals comes amid renewed Russian interest in supplying Delhi with new systems, including the advanced S-500 air defence system.

Despite the tensions, intelligence sharing and joint military exercises between India and the U.S. continue unaffected. Indian officials also indicated that New Delhi remains open to reducing Russian oil imports—if equivalent pricing from other sources, including the U.S., is available.

The fallout marks one of the most serious setbacks in U.S.-India ties in recent years and has added complexity to India's balancing act between long-standing Russian ties and its growing strategic alignment with Washington.







Trump Helped Ease India-Pak Tensions: US Secretary Rubio

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio has claimed that former President Donald Trump played a key role in defusing tensions between India and Pakistan, calling him a "president of peace." Speaking in an interview with EWTN's The World Over, Rubio asserted that the US "got involved directly" when the two nuclear-armed neighbours approached the brink of

"When India and Pakistan went to war, we got involved directly, and the president was able to deliver on that peace," Rubio said, praising Trump's diplomatic approach to global conflicts. Since May 10, Trump has repeatedly claimed that he helped ease hostilities between India and Pakistan by offering economic incentives. "We told them we'll do a lot of trade with them if they stopped fighting," Trump has said at public events.

However, India has consistently maintained that the cessation of hostilities with Pakistan was achieved through direct communication between the Directors General of Military Operations (DGMO) of both countries, without any third-party mediation.

Rubio's remarks come as part of a broader narrative promoted by Trump's campaign about his global peacemaking efforts. Rubio also cited several other instances where Trump-led diplomacy allegedly resolved or de-escalated conflicts — including between Cambodia and Thailand, Armenia and Azerbaijan, and the Democratic Republic of Congo and Rwanda. He highlighted a peace agreement in the DRC-Rwanda conflict, noting the US facilitated a deal in a war that had claimed over seven million lives.

"We dedicate a significant amount of time to stopping and ending wars," Rubio said, adding that Trump's administration was proud of these diplomatic achievements and continues to work toward resolving major conflicts, especially the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

The comments are part of Trump's broader re-election messaging that paints him as a global peace broker.

Trump Halts Trade Talks With India

US President Donald Trump has ruled out any trade negotiations with India until the ongoing tariff dispute is resolved, following a sharp escalation in economic tensions between the two countries. The White House on Wednesday issued an Executive Order imposing an additional 25% tariff on Indian imports, doubling the total levy to 50%.

When asked by ANI in the Oval Office whether he expected trade talks to resume, Trump responded bluntly: "No, not until we get it resolved."

The order, which cites national security and foreign policy concerns, specifically targets Russian oil. The administration argues these imports — whether direct or routed through third countries pose an "unusual and extraordinary threat" to the United States, thereby justifying emergency economic action.

According to US officials, the initial 25% tariff took effect on August 7, and the additional

India's continued import of 25% will be implemented in 21 days. The new measures will apply to all Indian goods entering US ports, except items already in transit or those falling under certain exempt categories.

In response, Indian Prime Minister Narendra struck a defiant tone during a speech at the MS Swaminathan Centenary International Conference in New Delhi. "India will never compromise on The order allows the President the interests of farmers, fishermen, and dairy farmers," Modi declared. "We are ready to pay the price. India is ready for it."

India has repeatedly resisted US pressure to open sensitive sectors such as agriculture and dairy to foreign competition, arguing that doing so would jeopardize rural livelihoods. The move marks a significant downturn in bilateral trade relations, with both nations now entrenched in a broader economic and strategic standoff.



Germany Halts Arms Exports to Israel

In a significant policy shift, Germany has announced a suspension of military exports to Israel that could be used in Gaza, citing deep concern over Israel's plans to seize control of Gaza City.

Chancellor Friedrich Merz stated that it had become "increasingly unclear" how Israel's military actions aligned with the stated goals of disarming Hamas and freeing Israeli hostages. "Under these circumstances, the German government will not authorise any exports of military equipment that could be used in the Gaza Strip until further notice," Merz said. Germany, traditionally one of Israel's closest allies, had ap-

proved €485 million (\$565 million) in arms appointing" and urged Berlin to apply presexports to Israel between October 2023 and May 2025. These included firearms, ammunition, weapons parts, and armoured vehi-

While reiterating that "Israel has the right to defend itself against Hamas' terror," Merz stressed that the humanitarian suffering in Gaza had reached intolerable levels and warned Israel against moves toward West Bank annexation.

The decision has drawn mixed reactions within Germany. Vice Chancellor Lars Klingbeil of the Social Democrats called it a "just decision," citing the "unbearable" situation in Gaza. However, the Central Council of Jews in Germany labelled the move "dissure on Hamas instead.

A recent poll by ARD showed 66% of Germans support stronger government pressure on Israel to change its Gaza policy. Despite increasing international support for Palestinian statehood, Germany has declined to follow countries like France and Canada in formally recognising Palestine, citing the need for negotiations.

Germany continues to provide humanitarian aid to Gaza, including air force-led airdrops. Merz emphasized the need for comprehensive U.N. access to deliver aid and warned against further Israeli annexation efforts in the West Bank.

Israel Approves Gaza City Takeover Plan

Israel's Security Cabinet has approved a controversial plan to seize full control of Gaza City, signaling a major escalation in its nearly two-year-long military campaign against Hamas. The decision, taken early Friday, follows Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's announcement that Israel ultimately aims to control the entire Gaza Strip and transfer its administration to "friendly Arab forces."

Netanyahu stated on Thursday (August 7) that dismantling Hamas' infrastructure requires expanding Israel's territorial hold in Gaza. Israel already controls about three-quarters of the war-ravaged territory.

The plan has sparked domes-

Families of the approximately 20 Israeli hostages still held in Gaza protested outside the Cabinet meeting in Jerusalem, fearing the move could endanger their loved ones. Former Israeli security officials also voiced concerns, warning that full occupation of Gaza could lead to a long-term quagmire with minimal strategic gains. An Israeli official, speaking anonymously before the formal announcement, confirmed the Cabinet was weighing a gradual implementation strategy aimed at applying sustained pressure on Hamas-held areas.

China marks 60 years of cultural destruction in Tibet

As China prepares grand celebrations to mark the 60th anniversary of the establishment of the so-called Tibet Autonomous Region (TAR) on September 9, Tibetan advocacy groups have condemned the event as an attempt to whitewash six decades of repression, forced assimilation, and cultural destruction.

In a statement released on August 6, the International Campaign for Tibet (ICT), based in Washington, DC, said Tibetans have suffered "60 years of calamity" under Chinese rule. "Instead of forcing Tibetans to put on a performance of gratitude, China must change course and put the interests of the Tibetan people ahead of their own compulsive need for power and control," said ICT President Tencho Gyat-

The TAR, formed in 1965, covers less than half of Tibet's historical territory. ICT pointed out that this followed China's 1950 military invasion and the coercive 17-Point Agreement of 1951, which promised autonomy and cultural preservation—



pledges the group says were never honored.

ICT also highlighted that no Tibetan has ever held the top political post of Party Secretary in TAR. Instead, the role has always been filled by Han Chinese officials, including Chen Quanguo and Wu Yingjie, both facing serious allegations of human rights abuses.

Other ongoing issues include the banning of the Dalai Lama's image, disappearance of the 11th Panchen Lama, and forced assimilation policies like boarding schools and Mandarin instruction replacing Tibetan.

Environmental degradation has added to the crisis, with nomadic communities relocated and extensive mining operations disrupting traditional lifestyles without local consent.


With Freedom House consistently ranking Tibet among the least free regions globally, rights groups are calling on the international community not to be deceived by China's "celebrations" but to recognize the continued suppression of Tibetan identity and freedoms.

Rupee Slips to 87.63 Against **Dollar Amid Trade Tensions**

The Indian rupee declined declined by 5 paise to 87.63 against the U.S. dollar in early trade on Friday, pressured by persistent foreign fund outflows and escalating trade tensions with the United States.

Opening at 87.56 at the interbank foreign exchange market, the rupee moved within a narrow range and touched an intraday low of 87.63, down from the previous close of 87.58. Forex traders said the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) is actively managing volatility and

appears to be defending the rupee around the 87.95 level.

"Despite fresh headwinds from U.S. tariff hikes, the rupee remained largely stable due to RBI intervention," said Amit Pabari, MD at CR Forex Advisors. He added that while near-term resistance is seen at 87.70, a meaningful recovery would only follow a decisive drop below 87.20.

The dollar index, which tracks the greenback against six major currencies, slipped 0.27% to 98.13. Meanwhile, Brent crude fell 0.17% to \$66.32 per barrel, easing concerns about India's oil import bill.

On the domestic front, the BSE Sensex fell 242.24

points to 80,381.02, and the NSE Nifty declined by 54.85 points to 24,541.30 in early trading. Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) were net sellers, offloading equities worth ₹4,997.19 crore on Thursday.

Moody's Warns U.S. **Tariffs Could Weaken India's Manufacturing Growth**



Moody's Ratings has cautioned that the recent 50% tariffs imposed by the U.S. on Indian imports could significantly hamper India's manufacturing ambitions and slow its economic growth.

U.S. President Donald Trump's administration imposed an additional 25% tariff on Indian goods last Wednesday, citing India's continued imports of Russian oil. This brought total tariffs to 50%, considerably higher than those levied on other Asia-Pacific countries.

Moody's warned that India's real GDP growth could decline by about 0.3 percentage points from the current forecast of 6.3% for the fiscal year ending March 2026 due to these tariffs.

"The wider tariff gap compared to other regional countries could severely curtail India's push to develop its manufacturing sector, especially in high-value sectors like electronics," Moody's said. The agency also noted that the tariffs might reverse recent into manufacturing.

Furthermore, the pressure to rising investor anxiety.

reduce Russian oil imports to avoid tariffs might make it challenging for India to secure alternative crude supplies in sufficient quantities. This could lead to a larger import bill, widening India's current account deficit and dampening tariff competitiveness, which may deter investment inflows.

Moody's expects a negotiated resolution between India and the U.S. but highlighted that the degree of economic impact would influence India's fiscal policy choices. The government is likely to continue its focus on gradual fiscal and debt consolidation despite these challenges.

In recent developments, the Reserve Bank of India maintained its key interest rates and kept a neutral monetary stance after a surprise rate cut in June. Meanwhile, global trade uncertainties and tariff-related tensions have unsettled foreign investors, with \$900 million in equity outflows so far in August, following \$2 billion in July.

Tesla Leases 8,200 Sq. Ft. Space in Delhi's Aerocity Amid India Expansion

Silver Shines Bright While Gold Slips Slightly

 $\mathbf{P}^{\text{recious}}$ metals witnessed a mixed day in the markets on Tuesday, with silver recording strong gains and gold seeing a modest decline, both in domestic and international trading.

According to the India Bullion and Jewellers Association (IBJA), 24-carat gold dropped by ₹91, settling at ₹1,00,076 per 10 grams, down from ₹1,00,167 on Monday. Similarly, 22-carat gold saw a minor dip from ₹91,753 to ₹91,670 per 10 grams. 18-carat gold also slipped, priced at ₹75,057 per 10 grams compared to ₹75,125 the previous day.

In contrast, silver prices surged, gaining ₹522 to reach ₹1,12,422 per kg from ₹1,11,900 — reflecting a bullish sentiment for the metal.

futures market. Gold futures for October 3 delivery on the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX) declined by 0.37% to ₹1,00,830 per 10 grams. Meanwhile, silver futures for September 5 delivery rose by 0.33%, hitting ₹1,12,160 per 10 grams.



Globally, the trend echoed these movements. Silver on Comex jumped 0.65% to \$37.58 per ounce, while gold slipped 0.31% to \$3,416.20 per ounce.

A similar pattern was observed in the Jateen Trivedi, Analyst at LKP Securities, attributed gold's decline to resistance near the \$3,370-\$3,375 zone on Comex, coupled with a firm rupee trading around 87.80, adding pressure to local gold prices.

Despite the dip, analysts suggest gold remains supported by ongoing global uncertainties, particularly around trade tariffs and dollar fluctuations. "Gold is expected to trade in a volatile range of ₹99,000–₹1,01,500," Trivedi noted.

Investors continue to watch key economic indicators, including Manufacturing PMI and developments in U.S. trade policy, which are likely to influence shortterm trends in bullion markets.



New Curiosity Discovery Points to Mars' Watery Past

In a ground-breaking disdis-NASA's Curiosity Rover uncovered evidence suggesting that liquid water once existed on Mars, potentially supporting life in the planet's distant past. The find was made using the rover's Mars Hand Lens Imager (MAHLI) — a camera lo-



cated on the end of its robotic arm — which captured a striking image of a coral-shaped, wind-eroded rock in the Gale Crater.

NASA scientists believe the flower-like rock formation, roughly 1 inch (2.5 cm) wide, was created by minerals deposited by ancient water flows, later shaped by billions of years of wind erosion. This unique structure resembles ocean-bottom corals found on Earth, prompting further interest in Mars' ancient, possibly habitable environment.

The rover recently entered a region on Mount Sharp, the towering 5-kilometer-high mountain within Gale Crater, filled with boxwork formations — hardened ridges formed by underground water activity billions of years ago. NASA says these formations may offer vital clues about whether microbial life once thrived below Mars' surface.

Curiosity, which landed on Mars on August 5, 2012, has spent over 13 years exploring the Martian landscape. Its mission centers on answering the pivotal question: Could Mars have ever supported life? Despite the rover's age, engineers are continually enhancing its capabilities to ensure it continues to deliver valuable scientific data.

This latest discovery not only strengthens the hypothesis that Mars had liquid water, but also pushes the boundaries of how long the Red Planet might have remained habitable as it slowly lost its atmosphere. With each finding, Curiosity brings humanity closer to understanding the mysterious history of Mars and whether it once had the right conditions to support life.

OpenAI's GPT-5 Nears Release, **Smarter AI But Smaller Leap**

OpenAI is preparing to launch its next-generation model, GPT-5, the successor to the powerful GPT-4 that helped make ChatGPT a global phenomenon in 2022. The model's release is said to be imminent, raising anticipation across the tech world for what could be another step forward in generative AI capabili-

OpenAI CEO Sam Altman has hinted throughout the year that GPT-5 will bring together the strengths

of large-scale models and test-time compute, a technique where more computing resources are allocated during inference for improved results. This combination could make GPT-5 more adaptive and accurate across a broader range of tasks.

According to two early testers who spoke to Reuters on condition of anonymity due to non-disclosure agreements, GPT-5 has shown notable improvements in coding, mathematics, and scientific problem-solving. However, they noted that while it is more capable and refined than GPT-4, the leap in performance and intelligence may not be as dramatic as the jump from GPT-3 to GPT-4.

GPT-4, launched in 2023, was praised for its multimodal abilities and more accurate reasoning. It powered the premium versions of ChatGPT and was later integrated into Microsoft products and numerous enterprise tools. GPT-5 is expected to expand on these capabilities, potentially with enhanced memory, better real-world grounding, and increased reliability.

With AI safety, alignment, and regulation becoming central concerns globally, GPT-5's release will also likely reignite debates about responsible AI development and the pace of innovation in the space.

According to a recent leak, the eye-catching shade could debut alongside standard options like black, white, and dark blue when Apple unveils its iPhone 17 series next month.

A short video shared by reliable leaker Majin Bu shows what appears to be a dummy unit

of the iPhone 17 Pro in a bright orange finish. Bu called the colour "so good," but reactions from fans online were sharply divided. Some praised the bold move, calling it a "refreshing change," while others dismissed it as "the worst colour in iPhone history" and "hideous."

Whether or not the orange version is real remains uncertain. Apple's colour leaks have often proven unreliable in the past. Still, the possibility of a bright new option has stirred excitement and debate ahead of the official announcement.

The iPhone 17 line-up is expected to be unveiled



in early September, with speculation pointing to a possible launch event on September 9. Apple typically announces its flagship devices in the second week of September, and multiple reports — including from Bloomberg's Mark Gurman — support this timeline.

In terms of hardware, the iPhone 17 and 17 Air are likely to feature the new A19 chip, while the Pro models may be powered by the A19 Pro. 
