# **NEW DISCOM AND UNDERGROUND** CABLE IN HYDERABAD

■PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept 16: Revanth Reddy, the Chief Minister of, conducted a comprehensive review meeting with senior officials of the State Energy Department to discuss key proposals and reforms aimed at strengthening the power infrastructure across the state, particularly in the region. The meeting was attended by Deputy Chief Minister, Principal Secretary of Energy, CM's Special Secretary, (GENCO) CMD, CMD, (SPDCL) CMD, (NPDCL) CMD, (RED-CO) Chairman and other top officials. During the review,

officials briefed the Chief Minister on several proposals regarding the implementation of underground power cabling in Greater Hyderabad. They explained the key aspects to be included in the Detailed Project Report (DPR) for the underground cabling system. Emphasizing the need for a reliable power supply system, the Chief Minister directed that, along with underground cabling, priority should be given to upgrading existing power substations in the Core Urban Region. He stressed that load replacement measures must be undertaken to prevent overloading



and instructed officials to ensure that no power connection should exceed the designed capacity of a substation. He also advised enhancing the capacity of substations wherever necessary to meet the growing demand.

The Chief Minister further ordered officials to identify areas in the Core Urban Region where new power substations are required and to incorporate advanced technologies in urban substations to improve efficiency and safety. He also suggested that the underground cabling system should be designed in a way that it can accommodate not just electricity cables but also other utility cables, enabling better infrastructure coordination. To ensure the state adopts the best practices, he directed the Energy Department to study

similar underground cabling projects implemented in and other states. He instructed that a comprehensive plan for the underground cabling project should be prepared by December and that the entire project in the Core Urban Region should be completed within the next two

and a half years. In addition to underground cabling, the meeting also discussed the proposal to establish a new power distribution company (DIS-COM) in the state, apart from the existing SPDCL and NPDCL. Officials informed the Chief Minister that the Energy Department had prepared a preliminary plan for this new DISCOM. They explained that electricity consumption related to agriculture, major and minor lift irrigation projects, rural drinking water supply, and

drinking water supply within the (GHMC) limits could be brought under the purview of the new DISCOM.

The Chief Minister suggested reorganizing the existing two DIS-COMs into three by creating this new one and gave key directions on the allocation of Power **Purchase Agreements** (PPAs), division of staff, sharing of assets, settlement of dues, and other related issues. He stated that the government would proceed with the formation of the new DISCOM only after obtaining Cabinet approval. Revanth Reddy directed officials to prepare a comprehensive and time-bound plan for setting up the new DISCOM at the earliest, marking a maior step towards strengthening the state's power sector and ensuring reliable electricity supply to all



# **ACB FOUND Rs.2 Cr** CASH IN ADE's HOME

ccording to an official press release issued by the ACB, searches were conducted at ten different locations linked to Erugu, including properties owned by his relatives and suspected benamis. The searches led to the discovery of several high-value properties and assets. These include a flat in, a groundplus-five-storey commercial building in, and a private company named Amthar Chemicals spread over 10 acres of land. Additionally, six residential plots in, agricultural farmland, two cars, significant quantities of gold ornaments, and multiple bank deposits were also identified as part of the seized

properties. During the searches, officials also discovered unaccounted cash amounting to 2.18 crore at the residence of a suspected benami associated with the engineer. Investigators suspect that these assets were acquired by Erugu by misusing his official position and engaging in

#### **ARRESTED IN DA CASE**

In a major crackdown on corruption, the (ACB) has arrested, Assistant Divisional Engineer (Operations) with the (TGSPDCL) at Ibrahimbagh. on charges of possessing assets disproportionate to his known sources of income. Following extensive searches, ACB officials uncovered a staggering amount of wealth allegedly amassed through cor-

corrupt practices during his tenure at TGSPDCL. ACB officials noted that while the official values of the properties are listed at certain amounts, their actual market value is believed to be substantially higher, indicating the scale of alleged illicit gains.

"The searches have clearly revealed that the officer amassed these movable and immovable properties disproportionate to his known sources of income by abusing his official position. The searches are still continuing to trace further assets," an ACB official stated.

Following his arrest, Ambedkar Erugu was produced before a local court and has since been

remanded to judicial custody. The ACB is continuing its investigation to identify other potential benamis and to ascertain the full extent of the wealth accumulated by the accused. Officials said they are also examining the flow of funds related to the company and properties discovered during the raids.

The arrest has sent shockwaves through the power utility sector, highlighting the persistent issue of corruption within certain sections of the bureaucracy. The ACB has reiterated its commitment to rooting out corruption and stated that strict action would continue against officials found to be

heated debate has erupted within the (BRS) over the possible impact of former party leader on the upcoming by-election in the constituency. Kavitha, who was recently suspended from the party, has been openly acting against BRS and distancing herself from its leadership, creating ripples in the party's internal circles. The by-poll was necessitated by the sudden demise of sitting BRS MLA, and BRS has fielded his wife as its candidate, hoping to gain public sympathy. However, the political atmosphere appears far from one-sided.

Unlike earlier elections where BRS enioved a clear edge, the party is now facing a tough contest as both (Congress) and (BJP) are making aggressive moves to wrest control of the seat. Political observers believe that the sympathy factor surrounding Gopinath's death is not resonating as strongly with the public as BRS had anticipated. This has raised concerns among BRS strategists about potential cracks in their traditional vote base.

In this tense backdrop, Kavitha's role has become a focal point of discussion. Several political analysts are suggesting that Kavitha still holds influence in certain pockets of Jubilee Hills, and her actions could sway the outcome. While she has not announced support for any specific candidate, there is growing speculation that if she indirectly or openly backs a rival candidate, it could lead to a split in the BRS vote bank. Such a scenario could tip the balance in favor of either Congress or BJP, both of whom are eyeing an upset victory in the

The BRS leadership is trying to project unity and rally behind Gopinath's wife, but the shadow of Kavitha's possible interference looms large. According to sources familiar with the discussions, Mr. Nageswara Rao made a strong pitch highlighting the strategic importance of Kothagudem, which is well known for its extensive coal mines and a cluster of power generation units and heavy industries. He underscored that the region has seen significant industrial growth, but lacks direct

## WELFARE OF JOURNALISTS WILL **BETAKEN CARE: MINISTER**

onguleti Srinivasa Reddy, Minister for Information and Public Relations (I&PR), has reaffirmed the state government's commitment to safeguarding the welfare and rights of journalists under the leadership of Chief Minister.

At a review meeting held at the on Monday, the Minister instructed officials to ensure that all eligible journalists are issued accreditation cards through a transparent and fair process. He emphasised that the government values the role of the media in democracy and will extend full support to their professional and personal welfare.

The meeting was attended by senior officials including, Special Chief Secretary (Home), Chairman of the,, I&PR Special Commissioner, and, CPRO. Several critical issues were discussed during the review, including accreditation policy reforms, the provision of health benefits for journalists, the revival of journalism awards, and the functioning of the high-power committee responsible for addressing attacks on journalists.

According to Gadkari, the projects are expected to significantly enhance connectivity within Telangana, improving transportation networks between urban centres, industrial hubs, and rural areas. "These initiatives are aimed at significantly enhancing connectivity and strengthening the State's transport network. The Central Government remains resolute in its commitment to advancing road infrastructure in Telangana, thereby fostering inclusive growth and balanced regional development," the minister noted in his post.

Officials from the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) said that the sanctioned proiects include both road widening and construc-

tion of new bridges, addressing critical bottlenecks in the state's transport corridors. Many of the roads slated for development are vital links connecting districts, industrial zones, and agricultural markets, ensuring smoother flow of goods and people. The bridge projects will not only reduce travel time but also strengthen resil-

The CRIF, under which these projects are being funded, is part of the Union Government's broader plan to enhance road and infrastructure networks across India. # KTR says By-Elections are inevitable

PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept 16: The political heat in intensified on Tuesday as (KTR), working president of the (BRS), launched a scathing attack on the ruling, predicting inevitable byelections in the state and asserting that the Congress government's "honeymoon period" was over.

Speaking at a meeting of constituency leaders and activists at, KTR accused the Congress of surviving on lies, defections, and fear of elections, while asserting that BRS would soon witness a political resurgence under the leadership of (KCR).

In a direct challenge, KTR asked the Congress to openly admit the defected BRS MLAs into its in by-elections.

"If the Congress truly believes in democracy, let them say these MLAs are theirs and go for byelections. Their defeat is certain,

he said, adding that the Congress's hesitation to acknowledge the defectors publicly exposed its lack of confidence and moral weakness.

KTR remarked that defections from BRS to Congress had weakened the ruling party rather than strengthening it, as it had failed to own them up and seek public mandate.

Calling the Congress a party "built on lies," the BRS leader said that the ruling party had come to power on false promises and misinformation, and



warned that people's patience was wearing thin. He alleged that the

Congress was scared of facing elections at any level, whether they were

panchayat polls or bypolls, and was trying to cling to power through backdoor tactics and vious (ED) raids on his blame games.

KTR admitted that BRS failed to effectively counter the Congress narrative during the last Assembly elections.

"Our focus was solely on development and welfare. That was our mistake. We did not expose the Congress's lies effectively,"

#### he acknowledged.

However, he stressed that the honeymoon period for the government was over, and said that the public no longer trusts a government surviving only by blaming the previous administration instead of delivering on its promises.

In a pointed attack on, a state minister, KTR questioned his political integrity in light of preresidence.

He demanded clarity on the outcome of the raids, asking why both the ED and the Minister remained silent.

"Has he colluded with the (BJP)? Or is he working at the behest of Revanth Reddy, who himself is working in tandem with the BJP?"

KTR questioned, adding that he doubted Srinivas Reddy's chances of being re-elected from in the next polls.

Despite what he described as conspiracies by both the Congress and the BJP, KTR exuded confidence that BRS would make a strong comeback. He hailed KCR as the architect of Telangana and one of the longest-serving regional leaders after the

potential return to power to the coronation of Lord Rama after exile.

"Like Lord Rama's crowning after returning from exile, BRS will return to power under KCR's leadership," KTR declared, drawing applause from party cadres.

KTR's remarks come

at a time when political battlelines are sharpening in Telangana, with defections, party infighting, and leadership challenges dominating the headlines. His statements indicate that BRS is preparing to take an aggressive stance against the Congress, aiming to reclaim lost ground and position itself as the primary challenger in the state's po-

# TELANGANA LOST Rs.5000 Cr **DUE TO GST REVISION**

PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept 16: Mr. Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, the Deputy Chief Minister of Telangana Government, has said that the state government is prepared to forgo revenue of nearly 5,000 crore annually following the recent revision of (GST) rates. Speaking at an interaction with the business community at the on Tuesday, September 16, Bhatti said the decision to rationalise GST was taken by Chief Minister and the state cabinet as part of a broader policy aimed at benefiting poor, middle-class, and farming families.

Bhatti explained that although the state would incur a significant revenue loss, the government had actively supported the policy changes to promote economic growth among common and middle-class people. ture would benefit crores of people as many essential and widely used goods would become cheaper, thereby easing the financial burden on households.

"The revised GST rates will ensure that a large number of goods are available at lower prices. It is the responsibility of both the government and the trading community to make sure these benefits actually reach the public," Bhatti said, as per a press release from his office. He emphasised that the success of this reform depended on honest and transparent implementation by traders, urging

Until an official statement is issued either by the government or by the Maoist leadership confirming or denying the authenticity

of the letter, authorities are treating it with caution. If verified, it could open the door to a possible cessation of hostilities and dialogue, but if it proves false, it would underscore the Maoists' desperation and continued use of psychological tactics to ease the pressure of security operations.

For now, the letter remains an intriguing development in the long-running conflict, and its implications will depend entirely on whether it represents a genuine shift in the Maoist approach or merely a strategic maneuver born out of

Chintapandu Naveen's rise has been any-thing but conventional. Starting as a small-time employee in a media house, he gained popularwhich earned him the nickname Teenmaar Mallanna. His witty and bold commentary on contemporary issues struck a chord with the public, particularly among youth and rural

Riding on his popularity, Mallanna made a determined entry into active politics, often facing setbacks and resistance, but gradually carving out a space for himself. His eventual election as Member of Legislative Council (MLC) is seen as the culmination of his persistent efforts in public life.

# Heavy Rainfall Likely in Hyderabad, Surrounding Districts on Wednesday

PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept. 16— Weather experts have issued a warning for heavy to very heavy rainfall in Hyderabad and adjoining districts starting Tuesday evening and continuing through the early hours of Wednesday. Both the India Meteorological Department (IMD) and independent weather analysts have cautioned residents to remain alert for potentially inweather tense conditions.

According to the IMD-Hyderabad's one-day forecast issued Tuesday morning, the city will experience a generally cloudy sky with light to moderate rain or thundershowers, accompanied by gusty winds. Misty or hazy conditions are also expected during the early morning and night hours. The IMD has predicted maximum and minimum temperatures of around 29°C and 22°C, respectively.

Independent weather

analyst T. Balaji, popu-

larly known on social

media for his accurate forecasts, echoed the IMD's warnings, predicting significant rainfall across Hyderabad and neighboring districts. Posting on X (formerly Twitter), Balaji stated, "Today (Tuesday), a massive trough line is expected to pass through the Hyderabad region. Therefore, Hyderabad and surrounding districts like Medak. Sangareddy, Kamareddy, Siddipet, Rangareddy, Vikarabad, Yadadri-Bhongir, Nizamabad, Jagtial, and Rajanna-Siricilla will receive



heavy to very heavy rainfall during the evening to overnight hours."

He added that while Hyderabad would experience dry conditions rainfall could bring

until Tuesday afternoon, widespread showers are likely to begin by evening and continue through the night. The

temporary flooding in low-lying areas and traffic disruptions across the city, similar to the spells seen in previous

The weather system responsible for the incoming rain is attributed to a trough line—a type of low-pressure area in the atmosphere—which is likely to intensify as it passes over the central parts of Telangana, including Hyderabad.

In light of these warnings, authorities have advised citizens to take precautions, especially during evening and night hours. Commuters are urged to plan their travel in advance and avoid routes prone to waterlogging. Motorists, in particular, are advised to drive cautiously as visibility may be reduced due to mist or heavy showers.

Urban flooding has been a recurring issue for Hyderabad during monsoon spells, and officials from the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) are reportedly on alert. Emergency teams and disaster response units have been kept on standrelated incidents.

While this bout of rain brings some relief from the recent hot and humid conditions, the IMD has not ruled out the possibility of further rainfall in the coming days, depending on the development of additional weather systems.

Residents are encouraged to monitor updates from official channels and stay indoors during periods of intense rainfall. The public can also follow real-time weather alerts from IMD and trusted meteorologists like Balaji for accurate a n d timely information.

As always, caution remains key as the city prepares for another wet night under the influence of changing monsoon dynamics.

#### **Telangana Cracks Down on Illegal Sale of Abortion Kits: 165 Medical Licences Suspended**

PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept. 16 — In a sweeping statewide operation, the Drugs Control Administration (DCA) of Telangana has intensified its efforts to combat the illegal sale of abortion kits. Between August 22 and September 15, DCA officials conducted raids on 809 medical shops across the state. The inspections uncovered violations at 234 locations, leading to the suspension of 165 medical store licences and the cancellation of seven others.

The crackdown focused on the unauthorized sale and distribution of Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP) kits, which contain drugs such as Mifepristone and Misoprostol. These medications are used to medically terminate pregnancies and are classified under Schedule H of the Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, 1945. As such, they cannot be sold over the counter and must only be dispensed with a valid prescription from a registered medical practitioner.

During the raids, DCA teams also identified quacks and unlicensed individuals who were found illegally stocking and selling these abortion kits without proper authorization. Officials reported a range of violations including dispensing medication without a doctor's prescription, absence or in-

completeness of bill records, selling drugs in the absence of a licensed pharmacist, and operating medical stores without valid documents.

Authorities empha-

sized that these violations pose a serious threat to public health. The misuse of MTP kits, especially without proper medical supervision, can lead to life-threatening complications. According to the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act, 2002, abortion kits should only be used under the supervision of a qualified gynaecologist. Inappropriate use of these drugs can cause severe adverse effects such as excessive uterine bleeding, incomplete abortion, and failure to detect ectopic pregnancies. Ectopic pregnancies, if not diagnosed and treated in time, can rupture and lead to internal bleeding or even

Speaking to the media, senior DCA officials reiterated the department's commitment to ensuring safe medical practices and upholding the law. They warned that strict legal action would be taken against violators, including cancellation of drug licences and prosecution under relevant provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics

The DCA has also appealed to the public not to purchase abortion pills from unauthorized sources or without consulting a registered medical practitioner. "Selfmedication with MTP kits is dangerous and can result in irreversible health complications. We urge people to approach licensed medical professionals for any reproductive health-related issues," an official stated.

This large-scale operation highlights the state's determination to tackle the rising concerns over the misuse of abortion drugs and ensure that such sensitive medical treatments are administered safely and legally. The DCA has indicated that more such inspections will continue in the coming months to monitor compliance and curb unlawful practices in the pharmaceutical retail

In addition to enforcement actions, the DCA also plans to increase awareness among pharmacists and the public about the legal and medical implications of handling and using Schedule H drugs, especially those related to abortion and reproductive health.

# Foundation Stone for 17.93-Crore **Storm water Drain Project**

#### **Project Details**

According to GHMC officials, the stormwater drain will be constructed using Reinforced Cement Concrete (RCC) box technology to ensure durability and longterm sustainability. The total length of the drain will be 2,720 metres, strategically designed to channel rainwater from several low-lying areas and prevent urban flooding.

#### The project has been divided into two major stretches:

 New Pragathi Press to Nampally Exhibition Grounds — covering Chirag Ali Lane to Bombay Bazaar via Nampally Station Road — covering 570

The drain will cater

metres

to a catchment area of approximately 175.13 hectares, covering several critical and floodprone localities including FTCCI Marg, Red Hills, Devaiah Bagh, Ek Minar Masjid Road, Netaji Nagar, and Nampally Station Road.

By creating a dedicated channel for stormwater, the project aims to reduce surface runoff, prevent water stagnation, and improve road safety during the rainy season.

Officials added that once completed, the RCC box drain will significantly reduce the burden on existing sewer and drainage networks, allowing rainwater to be quickly discharged into natural

outfalls. The project is also expected to improve sanitation and minimise damage to roads and public property caused by seasonal flooding.

#### **Part of Broader** Urban **Development**

The GHMC has been prioritising stormwater drain development in several parts of the city as part of its climate resilience and infrastructure strengthening plan. Similar projects are already underway in other vulnerable zones.

With this new project, the government hopes to address one of the long-standing civic challenges in central Hyderabad, bringing relief to thousands of residents commuters.

# **Hydra Continues Search** for Three Missing Persons

derabad, Sept16: The search operation for three individuals who went missing after falling into drains on Sunday is ongoing, with Hydra authorities conducting extensive surveys across multiple locations. Despite intensive efforts, the missing persons have not yet been located.

On Tuesday, Hydra officials carried out a detailed inspection of the drains and extended the search to the Musi River. The operation involved the use of drones to scan the entire river stretch, though no significant leads were found.

During the search, Hydra personnel recovered a two-wheeler belonging to Dinesh, also known as Sunny, which had fallen into a canal in Vinobha Colony, Musheerabad. The bike was found approximately 150 meters from the incident site and was retrieved by officials on Tuesday. Following this, Hydra teams opened every catch pit between the location where the vehicle was found and the site of the accident,



mained elusive.

The search operation also continues for Arjun and Ramulu, who went missing after falling into the Afzal Sagar drain in Asifnagar. Similar to Sunny's case, drones were deployed over the Musi River on Tuesday, but the operation did not yield any

Additional Hydra personnel, including Sri Varlapappayya, confirmed that the teams had also ventured into underground drainage channels to locate the missing individuals, despite the high risks involved. They noted that DRF personnel conducted searches in the subterranean drainage network with extreme caution, highlighting the challenges posed by such operations.

Hydra officials, including Jayaprakash, Sri Gautam, and Sri Yajnanarayana, are leading the

search operations, coordinating the teams and monitoring progress closely. The authorities have assured that efforts will continue relentlessly until the missing persons are traced.

The ongoing search underscores the dangers associated with urban drains and water bodies during the monsoon season. Authorities have advised residents to exercise caution near open drains and rivers, particularly during heavy rainfall, to prevent such incidents.

# From Degrees to Skills: Why Indian Education Needs Urgent Reinvention



or years now, I've watched thousands of students pass through the traditional education system - bright, capable, and full of potential, only to land in a job market that barely recognizes their degrees. As someone who works at the intersection of education, employability, and industry-readiness. I can say this with conviction: our current education model is outdated. And in today's fast paced world, outdated is dangerous. When Education Became a Checklist In many parts of India, education is no longer about learning — it's about checking boxes. Get a degree. Get a job. Get a salary. That's the loop. And in the process, we're producing graduates who are not job-

ready — just job-hoping. Over time, I've seen students enter colleges without clarity, study without curiosity, and graduate without confidence. They come to us, not because they failed their exams, but because their degrees failed to prepare them for the real world. The intent was noble. The result, however, is disheartening. The Problem Isn't the Students. It's the System. Students today are hungry, restless, and exposed to more global competition than any previous generation. And unfortunately, the answer — more often than not — is "no." This isn't limited to commerce or finance. It cuts across engineering, law, media, and even business schools. The symptoms are everywhere: underemploy-

ment, confusion, lack of confidence, and an obsession with "degree and certifications" that offer no practical value. The Illusion of a Guaranteed Future What concerns me even more is the debt trap. Inspired by flashy promises and global logos, parents are now willing to take massive loans to send their children to courses that offer little more than inflated hope. Zoho's founder, Sridhar Vembu, has rightly questioned this model. "I urge students and parents to be cautious in borrowing heavily to pursue degrees abroad. Borrowing

heavily to pursue degrees in India is unwise too. I strongly believe we should not trap young people in debt in the name of education. The only smart course is for prospective employers to fund training programs and for the industry to broadly accept such alternative credentials rather than ask for formal degrees. The best investment we make as a company is in training and skill development. I hope companies do this widely so we don't strand young people in debt." This is not just an opinion. They're signals from the world we are stepping into. What the Future Demands The truth is this: A degree is no longer a differentiator. A skill is. And the sooner we accept that, the faster we can build a generation that's futureready. The Shift Is Not Optional. It's Inevitable. Colleges and universities need to evolve. We need fewer lectures and more labs. Fewer PDFs and more projects. Fewer rigid degrees and more flexible pathways. The world no longer asks, "Where did you study?" It asks: • What can you do? · Can you learn fast? • Can you adapt when things change? The day our

education system starts answering those questions, we'll stop worrying about placements. In Conclusion As a founder, a mentor, and most importantly, a concerned citizen — I believe this change is not just necessary, it's non-negotiable. Because education should be about unlocking potential — not adding pressure. And because our students don't just deserve jobs they deserve futures. Let's build an education system that respects talent, nurtures skill, and prepares for the world we actually live in - not the one we left





# **India's Bond Yields Rise Despite Rate Cuts, Inflation at Record Low**

umbai: India's inflation is at an eight-year low, and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has cut policy rates three times since February. Yet, in a counter-intuitive trend, the 10-year government bond yields have climbed over 20 basis points since June, closing at 6.47 percent on Wednesday.

#### **Why Yields Are Rising**

Bond yields typically fall when interest rates perts cite several concerns driving the unexpected surge. Lower-than-expected tax collections, fiscal deficit worries, and global uncertainties, including US tariffs on Indian exports, have unnerved investors. RBI's shift in stance from 'accommodative' to 'neutral' has also signaled a pause in further cuts, contributing to the rise.

Independent analyst Ajay Bodke explained that while GDP growth in Q1 is encouraging, fears of fiscal slippage remain high. Investors are also worried about higher government borrowing if revenues fall short, which would push yields further upward. Former Federal Bank director Ashutosh Khajuria noted that the market read RBI's neutral stance as the end of rate cuts. The bond market, he said, "sees the future" and expects inflation to bottom out. He added that yields breached the normal 60-80 basis points spread with the reporate, influenced heavily by global movements and US trade policies.

Beijing controls critical resources like rare earths and has previously weaponized this advantage in trade disputes. Analysts warn that it could easily retaliate again if faced with a broader coalition.

#### India in the Crossfire

India's inclusion in the tariff plan has raised eyebrows. Unlike China, India is neither a strategic rival nor a manufacturing threat. On the contrary, it has been building deeper trade ties, recently signing a free-trade pact with the UK while negotiating one with the EU. Japanese companies such as Suzuki and Honda have invested heavily in India, and financial giants like Sumitomo Mitsui and Mizuho are expanding their footprint.

#### **Pressure on Modi** Government

President Donald Trump, while threatening tariffs beyond the current 50 per cent, has also expressed optimism about securing a bilateral trade deal with India. Yet Washington's demands go beyond energy, pressing New Delhi to end Russian oil purchases and open its agriculture market to genetically modified US corn and soybeans. For Prime Minister Narendra Modi, conceding on agriculture could spark fresh protests from farmers who have already resisted reforms in the past decade.

# "Against Federalism": Vijay's TVK Criticises Amit Shah's Hindi Day Remarks

ctor Vijay's Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) has strongly criticised Union Home Minister Amit Shah's remarks on Hindi, terming them an attempt to impose the language on non-Hindispeaking states. The party described the comments as discriminatory towards non-BJP-ruled states and a threat to India's federal structure.

"The Union government, even after failing to impose Hindi, is constantly trying to enforce it," said TVK propaganda and policy general

The TVK urged the Union government to embrace all states, languages, and religions, noting that such inclusivity would ensure holistic growth for the country. TVK chief Vijay, who has announced political opposition to both the ruling DMK and the BJP in Tamil Nadu, has previously criticised the

Hindi through the threelanguage policy.

The party also expressed concern over Shah's comments on the English language, calling them a "direct" assault on Tamil Nadu's two-language education policy. On September 14, Shah had addressed Hindi Diwas, stating that Hindi should not be seen as a rival to other Indian languages but as a companion. "I always say that Hindi is not a competition to Indian languages. Hindi is a friend of Indian languages. There are no conflicts between them," he had

## "Most Degenerate Newspaper": **Trump Sues New York Times For \$15 Billion**

Washington

S President Donald Trump announced on Monday that he is filing a \$15 billion defamation lawsuit against The New York Times, accusing the newspaper of waging a decades-long "campaign of lies" against him. Trump labelled the publication a "virtual mouthpiece for the Radical Left Democrat Party" and criticised its coverage of him, his family, his business, and the MAGA and First America movements.

Trump, in a post on X, claimed that the Times' endorsement of Vice President Kamala Harris during the presidential race, prominently placed on the newspaper's front page, amounted to "the single largest illegal campaign contribution, ever." He argued that the publication has long practised a pattern of abuse, comparing its coverage to other liberal media



outlets such as ABC

The lawsuit, which will be filed in Florida, accuses the Times of spreading falsehoods about Trump and engaging in illegal and unacceptable defamation. Trump also referenced past legal victories against other media organizations, citing settlements with ABC and CBS for alleged false reporting. He described the Times as a "once respected rag" that has been al-

lowed to smear him for too long. Trump has consist-

ently taken legal action against media outlets he claims have misrepresented him. Earlier lawsuits included ABC News, which settled for a \$15 million donation to the future Trump Library, and CBS' 60 Minutes, both of which involved claims of false reporting and defamation.

The president framed the new legal action as a continuation of his effort to hold media organizations accountable for what he described as malicious reporting. 'The New York Times has been allowed to freely lie, smear, and defame me for far too long, and that stops now," Trump said, reiterating his commitment to fight the media in court and protect his public and political image.

The case adds to Trump's ongoing highprofile media battles, highlighting the president's continued focus on litigation as a tool against perceived adversaries in the press.

# **Shehbaz Sharif To Meet Trump** Next Week, Asim Munir To Tag Along

Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and Chief of Army Staff, Field Marshal Asim Munir, are expected to meet US President Donald Trump on September 25 on the sidelines of the United Nations General Assembly, according to Khyber News, citing sources. The high-level meeting is likely to cover Pakistan's devastating floods, the fallout of the Israeli strike on Qatar, and the ongoing diplomatic tensions with India.

No official confirmation has come from Pakistan's Inter-Services Public Relations or its embassy in Washington. However, the report follows Munir's two recent visits to the US. In June, Trump hosted Munir at the White House, discussing trade, economic development, and cryptocurrency. This visit was followed in July by a US-Pakistan trade deal announcement and Washington's pledge to assist Pakistan in devel-



oping its oil reserves. The recent thaw in US-Pakistan relations comes after Islamabad credited Trump for mediating a truce during the May military conflict with India, a claim strongly rejected by New Delhi. Initially, Pakistan stated that its Director General of Military Operations had proposed the ceasefire to India, but later acknowledged Washington's role in the breakthrough.

Munir returned to Washington in August to

attend the retirement ceremony of outgoing Centcom Commander General Michael E. Kurilla and the change of command for Admiral Brad Cooper. During the trip, he also met US Chairman of Joint Chiefs of Staff, General Dan Caine.

The upcoming dialogue with Trump is expected to further shape the US-Pakistan relationship, which had been strained in previous years. Analysts suggest that the talks could focus

on economic, strategic, and regional security issues, including developments in Afghanistan and South Asia.

The meeting will be closely watched as Pakistan seeks to strengthen ties with the US amid regional challenges and economic pressures. Observers note that the engagement could influence Islamabad's diplomatic stance on ongoing disputes with New Delhi and its broader foreign policy

eaders from across the Muslim world convened in Qatar for the highly anticipatled Arab and Islamic Summit amid rising outrage over Israel's war on Gaza. While the summit delivered strong rhetoric condemning Israeli actions, it fell short of imposing any significant punitive measures, leaving many Muslim capitals disappointed.

The final statement urged states to "take all possible legal and effective measures to prevent Israel from continuing its actions against the Palestinian people." The communique included formal condemnations and calls for international investi gations, but stopped short of sanctions, oil embargoes, or downgrading diplomatic ties, a notable omission given the scale of de-

struction in Gaza. Significantly, UAE, Bahrain, and Moroccokey signatories to the Abraham Accords—remained silent on Israel, raising eyebrows as Monday marked the fifth anniversary of their formal recognition of the country. Their muted stance highlighted the delicate balance these states maintain in their diplo-

matic engagements. Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman (MBS) attended the summit but did not address the gathering, surprising observers given Riyadh's regional influence and the growing calls for decisive action. Analysts suggest his silence signals caution, possibly influenced by geopolitical

conside rations. Dr. Rashad Mohammed Al-Alimi. Chairman of Yemen's Presidential

Leadership Council, called for a comprehensive Arab and Islamic approach to counter Israeli expansionist policies. He also criticised the Houthis, stating, "The geopolitical challenges we face today prove that the expansionist regional states and armed groups in the region are two sides of the same coin."

The summit's outcome reflects a familiar pattern in regional diplomacy, where fiery statements often fail to translate into tangible action. While leaders united in condemnation, concrete measures against Israel remained absent, underscoring the challenges of achieving consensus among diverse

member states with differing strategic priorities and alliances.

The summit demonstrated the limits of collective Arab and Islamic influence, as nations continue to weigh political pragmatism against moral and public pressure to support Palestinians in

# Zelenskyy calls for European air defence system

ussian forces struck the southern Ukrainian city of Zaporizhzhia overnight, wounding 13 people, including two children, officials said Tuesday. The bombardment damaged over 20 apartment buildings and sparked fires, compounding recovery efforts from previous attacks, regional head Ivan Fedorov noted.

In response, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy called on European leaders to create a robust, multilayered air defence system to protect the continent's skies. "All the technologies for this are available. We need investments and desire, we need strong actions and decisions from all our



The strike in Zaporizhzhia comes more than three and a half years after Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine, with no ceasefire or peace settlement in sight. Despite months of US-led diplomatic efforts, fighting continues along the roughly 1,000-kilometre front line.

Zelenskyy highlighted the scale of recent Russian attacks, noting that in just the past two weeks, Moscow launched over 3,500 drones, more than 2,500 glide bombs, and nearly 200 missiles across Ukraine. Glide bombs, typically deployed from jets at high altitudes be hind the front lines, create large craters and remain largely uncountera ble by Ukrainian defences.

The ongoing drone and glide bomb threat has also reached neighboring countries, with recent Russian drones landing in Poland. NATO

has responded by reinforcing European air defences, signaling growing concern over Moscow's long-range capabilities.

Fedorov described the human and logistical toll of the latest strike, saying municipal workers are once again repairing windows and buildings damaged in previous attacks, adding strain on local

Zelenskyy's appeal underscores Ukraine's continued reliance on international support to counter Russian military advances and protect civilian populations. The call for a coordinated European air defence system reflects broader fears over regional security as Russia continues its aerial assaults and drone campaigns across Ukrainian

# South Korea-U.S. Trade Talks Face Delays

outh Korea's tariff negotiations with the United States have hit a stall, with Seoul emphasizing the need to protect domestic companies from potential losses, officials said Tuesday. President Lee Jae Myung is determined not to rush a trade deal at the expense of national interests, even as both countries aim to finalise an agreement following the broad frame-

work announced in July. The two nations continue to work through details of the proposed deal, particularly surrounding a \$350 billion investment fund. "We cannot do everything the U.S. wants... Although President Lee aims to reach a deal as soon as possible, he is determined not to give up his role concerning the national interest in order to meet a deadline," a Presi-

dential official told



trade envoy, Yeo Hankoo, is in the United States for follow-up negotiations, engaging intensively with American officials to resolve outstanding issues. Yeo noted that while both sides are committed to finalising a deal, the "devil is in the details," highlighting the complexity of the remaining discussions.

The stalled talks come amid broader economic pressures, with South Korea seeking to balance commitments under the trade agreement with the need to safeguard its industries from potential disadvantages. Officials stressed that the country would not compromise on critical points merely

to meet a timeline Analysts note that the negotiations are crucial for both sides, as the deal could significantly enhance investment flows and strengthen economic cooperation. However, careful navigation is required to ensure that Korean companies do not bear disproportionate costs.

The discussions mark the latest round in ongoing efforts to enhance bilateral trade relations between South Korea and the U.S., which have faced hurdles due to differing economic priorities and regulatory concerns. Both nations remain committed to finalising the agreement, but sources indicate that achieving a mutually acceptable resolution may take additional time, reflecting the intricate balance between economic growth and domestic protection.

# India's Exports Rise 6.7% In August, Trade Deficit Narrows

ndia's exports grew by 6.7% to \$35.1 billion in August 2025, while imports fell sharply by 10.12% to \$61.59 billion, according to official trade data released on Monday. In the same month last year, exports had stood at \$32.89 billion, and imports were at \$68.53 billion, indicating a significant improvement in the trade

The trade deficit for August narrowed to \$26.49 billion, compared to \$35.64 billion recorded during the corresponding period in 2024.

This comes as a relief for the government. which has been closely monitoring external trade pressures amid global economic uncertainties.

Cumulatively, during April-August of the 2025-26 fiscal year, exports touched \$184.13 billion, while imports reached \$306.52 billion. The data suggests a gradual strengthening of India's export momentum despite challenging international conditions.

Commerce secretary Sunil Barthwal, while briefing the media, said

Indian exporters have performed commendably despite uncertainties in global trade policies and volatile demand. He highlighted that services exports also played a crucial role in cutting India's trade deficit by 9.4% during the first quarter of the current fiscal

# Passenger Vehicle Dispatches Dip 9%, Two-Wheelers Rise

vehicle dispatches from companies to dealers fell 9% yearon-year in August to 3,21,840 units, com- units in August, up from pared to 3,52,921 units in 17,11,662 units in August the same month last year. According to the Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM), the decline was mainly due to manufacturers recalibrating supplies in response to low

market demand. SIAM Director General Rajesh Menon said sales were impacted as customers deferred purchases in anticipation of a GST rate cut and potential price reductions. The wait-and-watch approach by buyers weighed heavily on passenger vehicle sales during the month.

wheeler segment recorded growth, with dispatches rising 7% year-on-year to 18,33,921 2024. Scooter sales jumped 13% to 6.83,397 units, while motorcycle dispatches rose 4% to 11,06,638 units, showing resilience in the entrylevel and commuter segments.

The three-wheeler category posted its highestever dispatch figures for August, growing 8% to 75,759 units compared to 69,962 units in the previous year. This growth highlights sustained demand in urban and semiurban mobility markets, supported by rising adoption of shared mobility solutions.

try leaders expect the government's decision to reduce GST rates on vehicles to provide a much needed boost. From September 22, petrol and diesel cars with engine capacities up to 1,200 cc and 1.500 cc will attract 18% GST, while larger vehicles will continue to face the highest 40% slab. Electric vehicles will remain at the lowest 5% GST rate, ensuring continued policy support for clean mobility.

# Sensex, Nifty Rebound Ahead Of India-U.S. Trade Talks

mark equity indices Sensex and Nifty staged a rebound in early trade on Tuesday (September 16, 2025), buoyed by optimism over the India-U.S. bilateral trade talks and positive cues from global markets.

The 30-share BSE Sensex advanced 201.69 points to 81,987.43 in early trade, while the NSE Nifty rose 52.8 points to 25,122. Market sentiment was lifted ahead of the day-long India-U.S. bilateral trade discussions, with hopes of progress in securing a favorable deal.

Investor mood was further supported by gains in global peers ahead of the U.S. Federal Reserve policy meeting later this week. In

Asia, South Korea's Kospi, Japan's Nikkei 225 and Hong Kong's Hang Seng traded in positive territory, though Shanghai's SSE Composite index was marginally lower. On Wall Street, U.S. markets had closed higher on Monday.

Among Sensex constituents, Mahindra & Mahindra, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Axis Bank, Larsen & Toubro, UltraTech Cement and NTPC emerged as major gainers. On the downside, Titan, Asian Paints, HDFC Bank and State Bank of India were among the prominent laggards.

Meanwhile, global oil benchmark Brent crude edged up 0.19% to \$67.57 a barrel, offering some stability to commodity

Foreign institutional investors (FIIs), however, continued to show caution. They offloaded equities worth 1,268.59 crore on Monday (September 15, 2025), according to exchange data, highlighting the persistent volatility in foreign fund flows.

On Monday, the Sensex had snapped a five-day rally, shedding 118.96 points or 0.15% to settle at 81,785.74. The Nifty also ended its eight-day winning streak, closing 44.80 points lower or 0.18% at 25,069.20.

Market participants are now closely tracking both the India-U.S. talks and the outcome of the U.S. Federal Reserve meeting, which are expected to set the nearterm direction for equities.

#### 'Alien' Diamond Created on Earth, **Harder Than Natural Diamonds**



n a groundbreaking development, Chinese scientists have successfully created a rare form of diamond-known as hexagonal diamond or lonsdaleite—in a laboratory setting, marking a major leap in material science. This ultra-hard crystal is naturally found only in meteorites and is believed to be significantly harder than conven-

tional diamonds. Published in Nature, the study was led by researchers from the Centre for High-Pressure Science & Technology Advanced Research. They achieved the feat by transforming high-purity graphite into hexagonal diamond under carefully controlled high-pressure, high-temperature, and quasi-hydrostatic conditions. The result: highly ordered, micrometre-sized diamond samples that

could outperform traditional diamonds in industrial and electronic applications.

Unlike standard cubic diamonds, which can fracture along specific planes, hexagonal diamonds have a more robust atomic structure. Until now, attempts to synthesize them in labs had mostly produced ordinary diamonds due to structural instability during formation.

Lead researcher Yang Liuxiang attributed the success to two key innovations. First. the use of ultra-pure natural graphite as the starting material ensured minimal defects. Second, real-time Xray imaging allowed researchers to monitor and control the transformation process, avoiding common synthesis errors.

'This sets a new methodological foundation for future material breakthroughs," said Yang.

Ho-kwang Mao, a high-pressure science expert and foreign member of the Chinese Academy of Sciences, called the breakthrough a "new pathway" to next-generation superhard materials and advanced electronics.

With its exceptional hardness and thermal properties, the synthetic hexagonal diamond-produced at the hundred-micron scale—could revolutionize industries requiring ultra-durable materials, from cutting tools to high-performance semiconductors.

The achievement not only advances diamond synthesis but also opens doors to engineering other rare materials found only in extreme cosmic environments.

# **Indian Engineer Sparks Debate Over** 100-Hour Work Weeks



engineer at AI startup Mercor has ignited online debate after revealing he works 72 to 100 hours a week. Pranav Mehta, a former Microsoft employee, described the intense schedule as a "worthwhile trade-off" for rapid personal and professional growth.

Mehta's comments followed a post by Mercor CEO Brendan Foody, who announced the company had

grown from a \$1 million to a \$500 million revenue run rate in just 17 months, calling it the "fastest growing company of all time." Mercor is now aiming for a \$10 billion valuation.

Acknowledging that such long hours may appear "daunting," Mehta highlighted the unmatched learning opportunities at the firm. "A comfy 40-hour week won't offer the same upside," he wrote on X (formerly Twitter), defending the demanding work schedule as part of the startup's highgrowth culture.

His remarks, howev-

er, quickly sparked backlash. Many social intense routines. media users criticised the glorification of extreme work hours, raising concerns about burnout, mental health, and toxic workplace culture.

One user questioned the mindset behind such schedules, asking, "Why do you guys try to flaunt toxic work cul-

ture as hustle culture?" Another sarcastically noted, "Dada, you don't have mental issues.' pointing to the potential mental toll of such

Some offered a optimistic perspective. A user suggested that the "working environment must be lit and hyped up all the time," implying that the energetic atmosphere might justify the high level of commitment.

The discussion reflects ongoing tensions

in India's tech sector, where startups often push employees to extreme limits for rapid growth, sparking debates over the balance between ambition and employee well-being.

# **Eritrea: The Only Country With** No Mobile Internet Access

the remotest regions are becoming digitally connected. the East African nation of Eritrea stands out as a rare exceptionone where mobile internet is virtually non -existent.

Located in the Horn of Africa and bordered by Djibouti, Sudan, and Ethiopia, Eritrea remains one of the most isolated and secretive countries on the planet. Despite technological advancements globally, the vast majority of Eritreans have never used mobile data, accessed social media, or made a digital transaction.

Asmara, the capital city, reflects the country's limited digital infrastructure. There are no functional ATMs, and only a few select locations—such as hotels and government build-

ingshave access fixed-line internet. Even that is heavily monitored and unreliable. For ordinary citizens, connecting to the internet on mobile phones is simply not an option.

Eritrea's extreme digital disconnect is closely tied to its political structure. Often referred to as the "North Korea of Africa," Eritrea has been under authoritarian rule since gaining independence

Ethiopia in 1993. The government tightly controls information, restricts freedom of expression, and mandates indefinite nation-

While the rest of Africa sees growing digital economies and somedia c i a l revolutions, Eritrea remains cut off—its citizens deprived of the connectivity that powers modern life. For many young Eritreans, the idea of streaming a video, checking messages, or browsing the web is not a daily habit—it's an

unimaginable luxury. In an age defined by digital transformation, Eritrea remains one of the few countries still living largely offline.

## 1,000-Year-Old Ceremonial Heads, Ancient Structures Found In Peru

ima, In a major archaeological breakthrough, researchers in Peru's Amazon region have unearthed 1,000-year-old ceremonial stone club heads, nearly 200 ancient structures. and a unique zigzag frieze at the Ollape site in La Jalca district. The area was once home to the Chachapoyas civilization, also known as the "Warriors of the Clouds," who thrived between 900 and 1450 AD.

According to lead archaeologist Pablo Solis, the intricately carved club heads are believed to have held ceremonial or symbolic importance, shedding light on the ritual practices of a civilization that remains largely understudied. "These artifacts offer a rare glimpse into the ceremonial life of the Chachapoyas people," Solis said.

The site also features a zigzag frieze, a decorative pattern never before found in the region. Archaeologists believe this discovery could repre-



sent a unique architectural style or symbolic motif used by the Chachapoyas. The sheer number of structures discovered at Ollape suggests that it may have served as a major ceremonial and residential

The Chachapoyas civilization, known for its distinct cliffside tombs and cloud-forest architecture, has long fascinated historians but remains relatively mysterious compared to other ancient Andean cultures like the Incas.

Peru continues to be a global hotspot for archaeological discoveries. With landmarks like Machu Picchu and the Nazca Lines, the country's vast and varied geography remains rich in his-

torical secrets. The latest discoveries in Ollape add to a growing body of evidence highlighting the complexity and cultural richness of pre-Columbian societies in the Amazon region.

Further excavations and studies are expected to reveal more about the Chachapoyas' social structure, religious beliefs, and daily life.

# Apollo Tyres Becomes Team India's New Jersey Sponsor

ew Delhi: Apollo Tyres has replaced Dream11 as the official jersey sponsor of the Indian cricket team, the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) confirmed on Tuesday. The development comes after Dream11 exited following the government's ban on real-money gaming platforms under new legislation.

#### **Deal Value And Duration**

According to sources, Apollo Tyres will pay approximately 4.5 crore per game as part of the sponsorship deal, a significant increase from the 4 crore per game that Dream11 was paying earlier. The contract, which runs until 2027, is expected to bring in nearly 600 crore for the BCCI.

#### **Bidding Battle**

The competition for India's jersey sponsorship reportedly involved Canwhom lost out to Apollo Tyres in the bidding process. Birla Optus Paints had also shown interest but opted not to enter the bidding race.

#### BCCI's **Eligibility Rules**

Following Dream11's exit, the BCCI tightened its sponsorship eligibility criteria. Companies from sectors such as gaming, betting, crypto, and tobacco were barred

also restricted brands in categories like athleisure, sportswear, financial services, insurance, soft drinks, home appliances, and safety locks, ensuring only select industries could compete.

The decision is part of broader amendments under the Karnataka Cinema (Control) Act, 1964. Draft rules were first issued in July, with the final notification declaring that the Rs 200 ticket price will take effect upon publication in the Official Gazette.

While the government maintains the move ensures affordable entertainment, filmmakers and multiplex associations insist that the cap undermines profitability, particularly for films requiring higher production and distribution costs. The High Court is expected to hear the matter soon. with industry stakeholders closely watching the outcome.
