### **REVANTH REDDY VOWS TO ELEVATE** FILM INDUSTRY TO GLOBAL STANDARDS

derabad, Sept 17: Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy held a crucial meeting with prominent figures from the film industry on Wednesday, assuring them of the government's commitment to strengthen the sector and address longpending issues of film workers. The meeting, attended by senior producers, technicians, and industry representatives, aimed at building a collaborative roadmap to transform Hyderabad

into a world-class film

rable to.

Speaking at the meeting, the Chief Minister said the government is making determined efforts to elevate Hyderabad's standing in the global entertainment map. He invited film industry representatives to submit a comprehensive list of their requirements, particularly for the welfare of film workers who are often overlooked in policy decisions. Revanth Reddy stated that he had already urged producers not to neglect film workport for enhancing their

Highlighting the need to build human resources, the Chief Minister announced that the government would offer specialised training for film workers through the . He emphasised that film workers must also focus on improving their own skills to stay relevant in an evolving industry. Revanth Reddy said the government would facilitate permissions and infrastructure so that films from all languages could be shot in Telangana, turning the state into a prefilming ferred

destination. He also called on producers to encourage small-budget filmmakers and ensure that they receive the necessary logistical support to sustain their projects. Stressing on maintaining a healthy workplace environment, he cautioned all stakeholders not to disrupt the ecosystem of the industry through conflicts or internal disputes. "If strikes occur, losses will be faced by both sides,'

Clarifying his approach, the Chief Minister said he would treat any issue as a professional problem rather than through personal relationships. He assured that the government would mediate discussions between producers and film workers to resolve disputes in an amicable manner. "This government belongs to you. Solving your problems is my responsibility. I stand by the workers, while also safeguarding the interests of the

Revanth Reddy said that the government cannot remain a mere spectator during strikes as they impact both livelihoods and the state's economy. To ensure social security, he promised to work towards providing health insurance coverage for film workers. He added that the government had recently introduced the to recognise and honour the contributions of film artistes, pointing out that no state awards were given to the industry in the last ten years.



students receive quality education and acquire skills that enhance their employability. Speaking during an interaction with retired bureaucrats, academics, and educationists in Hyderabad, Reddy said the state urgently needs a new education policy that could serve as a model for the entire country.

Expressing concern over the current state of higher education, Reddy lamented that while lakhs of engineering graduates pass out of colleges across Telangana every year, fewer than 10 percent secure meaningful employment. He attributed this alarming trend to a lack of requisite industry-ready skills among graduates. Reddy said the education system needs a fundamental shift and that the state is producing graduates without preparing them for the demands of the real world. This has to change, he emphasised, if Telangana wants to remain competitive and if the youth are to lead In

#### **ONE BIG DAY-THREE** NARRATIVES AT CELEBRATION



PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept 17: Telangana witnessed a striking display of political divergence on September 17, as three major political parties marked the day of in 1948 with their own distinct narratives and symbolism. The day, which carries historical and emotional weight in the region, was observed in parallel ceremonies — the ruling (Congress) celebrated it as Praja Palana Dinotsavam (People's Governance Day), the (BRS) termed it National Integration Day, and the (BJP) commemorated it as Liberation Day.

The Congress-led state government sought to present the occasion as a tribute to democratic values and people-centric governance. Chief Minister hoisted the national flag at the in . underscoring that the merger of Hyderabad State with the Indian Union marked the foundation of a governance system rooted in people's aspirations. He described Praja Palana Dinotsavam as a celebration of the democratic ethos and citizen empowerment that emerged from the merger, pledging that his government would continue to strengthen grassroots

governance in the state. However, within the Congress itself, there remained a noticeable duality in terminology. While the state government officially framed the day as Praja Palana Dinotsavam, the party organisation continued to refer to it as Telangana Integration Day. At the party headquarters, , the (TPCC) president, unfurled the national flag and referred to the occasion as Integration Day. Several district Congress units also adhered to this nomenclature, highlighting a subtle yet clear distinction be

#### $HYDERABAD\ WITNESSED\ HEAVY\ RAIN\ ONCE\ AGAIN$

■PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept 17: Hyderabad experienced intense rainfall on the night of Wednesday, September 17, 2025, leading to widespread flooding across the city. Areas such as Mettuguda recorded approximately 10 cm of rain, with several other localities reporting over 9 cm. The heavy down-

pour resulted in water-

logging in low-lying areas, including around metro stations, causing significant disruptions to daily life.

The Mettuguda metro station, along with other stations in the city, was surrounded by rainwater, affecting the movement of commuters. Waterlogging on major roads led to traffic snarls, with vehicles moving at a crawl during peak hours. Residents reported difficulties in commuting, and several areas experienced power outages due to water entering electrical substations.

The heavy rainfall was not confined to Hvderabad alone. Nearby districts, including Medak, also experienced significant downpours. In Medak district, areas like Sardhana village re-



corded unprecedented tions receiving over 300 rainfall, with some loca- mm in 24 hours. This led

to overflowing streams and rising water levels in dams, prompting officials to evacuate residents from vulnerable areas.

In response to the flooding, the Telangana State Disaster Response and Fire Services (TSDR&FS) deployed teams to affected areas to assist with rescue operations and provide relief to stranded residents. The Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) initiated water drainage operations to alleviate waterlogging and clear blocked roads. Authorities have advised residents to stay indoors and avoid unnecessary travel, especially in lowlying areas prone to flooding.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a Yellow alert

for Hyderabad and surrounding districts, forecasting continued rainfall over the next 24 hours. Residents are urged to remain cautious and stay updated with weather advisories. The IMD has also warned of possible thunderstorms and gusty winds in certain regions.

Mallanna's move comes months after his suspension from the Congress on March 1 this year for what the party termed as "anti-party activities." The disciplinary action was taken after he publicly criticised and symbolically burned the caste survey report released by the in February, calling it "flawed" and "politically motivated." The act sparked controversy within the Congress, with senior party lead-

ers condemning his behaviour as indiscipline. Despite his suspension. Mallanna continues to hold his seat in the Telangana Legislative Council, as the Congress has not filed any formal petition to disqualify him from his post.

Mallanna is widely known in Telangana as a prominent Telugu iournalist who rose to fame in the early 2000s for his satirical takes on socio-political issues. His sharp commentary and unique presentation style earned him a strong following, particularly among the youth and rural audiences. He joined the Congress in November 2023, just ahead of the, in a move that was seen as part of the party's strategy to tap into his popularity and expand its outreach.

Political analysts believe the formation of the TRP could potentially alter the political dynamics in Telangana, especially if Mallanna succeeds in consolidating the support of the BC communities, who constitute a significant vote bank. However, they also caution that building a new party from the ground up will require extensive organisational efforts, grassroots mobilisation, and resources to compete with established political forces like the (BRS), the (BJP), and the

Mallanna, however, struck an optimistic tone, declaring that the TRP would focus on people-centric politics and be a voice for the voiceless. He urged people, especially the youth and marginalised groups, to ioin hands with him in building a new Telangana that truly represents all sections of society. With the official

launch of the TRP, Telangana's political arena now has another player seeking to challenge the existing status quo. It remains to be seen how much traction Mallanna's new party will gain in the coming months, but his entry into the political fray with a platform centred on social justice and empowerment has already stirred discussions across the state's politi-

underscored the importance of reorienting curricula and pedagogy to make students not just degree holders, but also job creators and innovators. The state has also established the to impart in-



dustry-aligned skill development progra mmes.

"These initiatives are aimed at creating a workforce that is ready for tomorrow's challenges," Reddy explained. "We want our students to be able to walk out of educational institutions and walk straight into good jobs, or even better, start their own enterprises."

Reddy drew a contrast between traditional poverty alleviation measures and the present economic realities. He noted that earlier, governand funds to uplift economically weaker sections, but such resources are now scarce. "Today, the only real weapon we have to eradicate poverty is education," he said. "It is education that can give our children the power to break the cycle of poverty, empower their families, and transform our society."

He called for a collective approach in reshaping the sector, urging the retired bureaucrats, academics, and education experts present at the meeting to actively contribute their expertise. Looking ahead, the Chief Minister revealed that education will form a core pillar of the state government's forthcoming long-term vision document titled. This strategic blueprint aims to map out Telangana's developmental trajectory for the next two decades, with education and skillbuilding as critical

cornerstones. Reddy appealed to educationists to form specialised sub-committees based on their areas of dations for inclusion in the vision document. "We want the best minds to come together and shape a bold, forwardlooking education policy for Telangana," he said.

The Chief Minister's

remarks mark the beginning of what could be one of the most farreaching education reforms in the state's history. By aligning academic curricula with industry needs, investing in teacher quality, modernising vocational training infrastructure, and positioning education as the central tool of social mobility, the government hopes to create a generation of skilled, confident, and employable youth.

As Telangana eyes 2047—the centenary year of India's independence—Reddy's message was clear: the future of the state will depend on how well it educates and empowers its young people today. "Education is not just another department for us," he concluded. "It is the foundation on which Telangana's

### **AAROGYASRI SERVICES** STALLED IN TELANGANA

PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept 17: (TANHA) has suspended health services in all its empanelled private hospitals from midnight of Tuesday, September 16, plunging healthcare access for lakhs of Below Poverty Line (BPL) families in into uncertainty. The decision came after repeated appeals to clear pending reimbursements amounting to nearly 1,400 crore reportedly went unanswered bу government.

The abrupt suspension is expected to severely affect rural areas, where a majority of the population depends on Aarogyasri health cards for tertiary healthcare. Members of 323 empanelled private hospitals under TAN-HA had convened on Sunday and unanimously resolved to halt services, citing failure of discussions with the to address their longstanding grievances regarding delayed payments.

TANHA president Dr. told the media that, according to the protocol, funds should be reim-



payments have been delayed by over 400 days in many cases, leaving hospitals struggling to sustain services. He said the uncertainty in reimbursements has disrupted cash flow. burdened hospitals with operational debts, and threatened their ability to continue treating patients under the scheme.

The association's primary demands include immediate clearance of all pending dues, establishment of a predictable and timely payment schedule, and revision of package rates to match the rising cost of medical services. According to this marks a substantial improvement compared to the earlier average of 57 crore released per month between 2014 and November 2023. He further revealed that, based on repeated representations from private hospitals, their monthly payments have recently been increased

to 100 crore. Despite these assurances, TANHA members maintain that without immediate disbursal of the 1,400 crore dues, continuing services is financially unsustainable. As the standoff continues, healthcare access for nearly one crore BPL families hangs in the balance, with both the government and private hospitals yet to arrive at a resolution.

The party's leaders sought to emphasise the peaceful assimilation of the erstwhile princely state into the Indian Union. Through local events and statements, they underscored the need to remember the sacrifices of those who advocated unity, while cautioning against what they termed attempts to sow divisiveness over history. Party leaders criticised the Congress and the BJP for politicising a day that, they argued, should symbolise unity and collective

progress. In contrast, the BJP marked the day as Liberation Day, a terminology rooted in its longstanding narrative that the integration of Hyderabad State into India was a liberation from the autocratic rule of the -led and the associated paramilitary resistance held commemorative events across the state, paying homage to the martyrs who fought against the Razakars during the operation. They asserted that the day must be remembered as a liberation from oppression, positioning their narrative as one that honours the sacrifices of those who fought for freedom from feudal rule.

This tripartite framing of the same historical event underlines the deep political contestation surrounding September 17 in Telangana. While for Congress it symbolises the beginning of democratic governance, for the BRS it represents national integration, and for the BJP it signifies liberation from tyranny. The contrasting interpretations have become an annual flashpoint in the state's political discourse, each party using the day to assert its ideological stance and mobilise its

Political observers note that these competing commemorations reflect not only different readings of history but also strategic positioning in contemporary politics. The Congress, which returned to power in the state after a decade, appears keen on projecting itself as the custodian of people's governance, while subtly accommodating the Integration Day sentiment that resonates with sections of its cadre. The BRS, seeking to reclaim its relevance after losing power, has attempted to frame itself as the unifying force above divisive narratives. The BJP. aiming to expand its footprint in the state, continues to emphasise its nationalist credentials by portraying the merger as a liberation struggle.

#### 1700 JOBS IN TSRTC; NOTIFICATION RELEASED

■PN Bureau, Hyderabad, Sept 17: The (TSLPRB) on Wednesday, September 17, issued a notification inviting applications to fill vacancies for the posts of drivers and shramiks in the (TG-SRTC). The announcement has created a buzz among job seekers across the state, as it opens up over 1.700 government job opportunities in the

public transport sector. According to the notification, a total of 1,743 posts are available. Of these, 1,000 vacancies have been earmarked for

rying a pay scale ranging from 20.960 to 60.080. Additionally, 743 vacancies are available for the post of shramiks, which come with a pay scale of 16,550 to 45,030. Officials said this recruitment drive is aimed at strengthening the TGSRTC workforce to improve service delivery and operational efficiencv across Telangana.

The recruitment board has stated that the application process will be conducted entirely online. Eligible and interested candidates can ap-



ply through the official TGSRTC recruitment portal. The online application window will open at 8:00 am on October 8 and will close at 5:00 pm

on October 28. Applicants are advised to submit their forms well before the deadline to avoid last-minute technical

leased detailed information regarding the recruitment process on the official TGSRTC website. This includes eligibility criteria, educational qualifications, age limits, reservation guidelines, the procedure for submitting applications, the distribution of vacancies, and the selection process. Candidates have been urged to carefully go through the notification and ensure they meet all requirements before applying.

For the post of drivers, candidates are expected

to possess a valid driving licence and meet the prescribed physical standards. They will also have to undergo driving skill tests as part of the selection process. For shramik posts, the selection will be based on physical efficiency tests, traderelated assessments, and document verification. The recruitment board has assured that the selection will be conducted in a fair and transparent manner.

Applicants have been cautioned that incomplete applications or those submitted after the deadline will not be considered. They are also advised not to submit multiple applications for the same post, as this could lead to disqualification. Candidates should keep essential documents, such as educational certificates, proof of age, identity proof, and category certificates (if applicable), ready in advance for easy uploading during the online application process.

The TSLPRB has also warned applicants to rely only on the official website for all updates, application submissions, and

hall ticket downloads, and not to fall prey to fake recruitment agents or unofficial websites This large-scale recruitment is expected to

provide a significant employment boost, particularly in the state's transport sector, while also addressing staff shortages in the TGSRTC. The state government hopes the recruitment of new drivers and shramiks will help improve the efficiency and reliability of public transport services that cater to lakhs of passengers daily across Telangana.

The event, planned as a collaboration between the (PRC) and the, was scheduled to be held on Monday, September 15, to mark Martyrdom Day and Political Prisoners Day. However, the programme was called off after the administration allegedly labelled it "anti-governmental." described those featured in it as "rioters," and warned the organisers of possible disciplinary action if they went

ahead with it. "When we released the posters for the programme, the administration summoned us to the proctor's office, called it 'anti-governmental,' and asked us to route the request through the student union," one of the organisers from the Fraternity Movement told.

of the event, they were again called to the proctor's office, where senior university officials were present and clearly told them the event could not

Students said they pointed out that similar programmes had been organised at (JNU) and (HCU), but the EFLU administration refused to grant permission. They alleged that they were threatened with disciplinary action through a show-cause notice under the university's ordinance and were closely monitored to ensure the event did not take place.

The poster for the cancelled programme had featured several individuals currently imprisoned under the UAPA. including anti-CAA activists , , , and ; case accused and human rights activist; and activists and, among others.

According to an organiser from the PRC, democratic spaces in central universities are shrinking and are being "enforced by the administration under state guidance." He said any form of student dissent was being "systematically suppressed," particularly when it inor socially sensitive issues or expressing solidarity with oppressed communities. He stressed that it was time for students to "intensify the struggle" to safeguard these spaces.

The PRC, Fraternity Movement EFLU, (MSF) EFLU Hyderabad, and (NSUI) EFLU jointly issued a statement condemning the university's move, saying it exposed the "undemocratic nature" of the administration and raised concerns over the "rapidly shrinking space for democratic dialogue on political issues. "While we celebrate revolutionaries like Jatin Das and their fight against injustice, we consider it equally important to discuss today's activists who are imprisoned for daring to question or expose the workings of the state machinery," the statement said.

The groups argued that such discussions were crucial to "save the space for democratic engagement," especially when democratic dissent was increasingly being branded illegal. They urged fellow students to oppose what He added that on the day volved raising politically they described as "arbitrary and authoritarian actions" by the EFLU administration and to defend the university's role as a platform for critical debate and free expression.

Students also drew attention to a similar incident last year when the administration allegedly denied permission for an event titled "Sumud," which was planned to express solidarity with. They claimed they were threatened with disciplinary measures even then.

Further, some students alleged that only the (ABVP) is allowed to operate without restrictions on campus, while other student groups are subjected to constant intimidation and threats. One student alleged that this selective treatment was part of an ongoing attempt to "saffronise" campuses by discouraging dissent and imposing ideological conformity.

The controversy has reignited debates on academic freedom, the role of universities as spaces for political discourse, and the rising tensions between student organisations and university administrations across Indian campuses.

The cybercriminals allegedly extorted 6.6 lakh from the elderly woman by falsely implicating her in a fabricated human trafficking case and subjecting ing the school, but her to relentless intimidation through forged nothing materialized. According to the complaint lodged by the victim's family, the ordeal began on September 6 when the doctor received a video call displaying the logo of the . The caller accused her of being involved in a fabricated " and presented forged documents showing her details. The fraudsters claimed that her identity had been misused for criminal activities. threatening her with arrest and imprisonment unless she cooperated fully with their so-called

As the psychological

she was under surveillance and subject to legal action. Under intense fear and coercion, she was forced to transfer 6.6 lakh from her pension account to a shell account based in .

The victim was reportedly kept isolated through continuous video calls, instructed not to contact her family or anyone else, and warned that her phone was being tracked by investigating agencies. Even after she transferred the money. the harassment continued, with the fraudsters sending fake court notices and threatening further action.

The sustained intimidation left the elderly woman deeply traumatised. On September 7, she complained of chest pain and collapsed. She was rushed to a hospital but succumbed to cardiac arrest the next day. September 8.

In a disturbing revelation, the family stated that the fraudsters continued to send threatening messages and fake legal notices even after her death, apparently unaware that their victim had passed away.

Cybercrime experts have described the incident as an alarming example of "digital arrest" scams — a new modus operandi where fraudsters impersonate law enforcement or regulatory authorities, fabricate legal cases, and mentally trap victims through sustained intimidation. These scams often target vulnerable individuals, especially senior citizens, using official-looking forged documents and symbols to instill fear and extract money.

Authorities have urged the public to remain vigilant and report any suspicious calls or messages impersonating law enforcement or judiciary immediately to the at 1930 or the (cybercrime.gov.in). They have stressed that no genuine police or court official ever conducts investigations over video calls or demands money transfers to settle cases.

The death of the retired doctor has sparked widespread concern and outrage, highlighting the urgent need for stronger awareness drives on cyber safety and stricter action against organised digital fraud networks targeting vulnerable

One protesting DRF staff member said he had always been supportive of 's government and did not want to create trouble, but the salary cut had left him with no choice. He explained that his house rent alone costs 7,500 and he has two children to raise, apart from having to pay EMIs. "We are suffering due to the cut in our salaries. How will we manage?" he asked, adding that he had broken down in tears while

This synergy has fueled the BJP's remarkable growth. In 2014, the party was seen as geographically limited, yet under Modi's

leadership and Amit Shah's organizational push, it expanded nationally. By 2019, the BJP had made inroads into the Northeast, strengthened its presence in Odisha and West Bengal, and established footholds across southern India.

As Modi turns 75, the BJP celebrates not just his leadership but the successful blend of Modi's mass appeal and the Hindutva-driven party apparatus, a combination that has transformed the BJP into the world's largest political party.

### Europe's Oval Office Moment: Lessons for India in a Trumpian World



n image now etched into history captures European leaders and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy seated before Donald Trump in the Oval Office, like obedient schoolchildren before a stern headmaster. For many, the picture evoked amusement, pity, or schadenfreude—but for Russian President Vladimir Putin, it symbolized victory. To him, the world's richest and most powerful nations had reduced themselves to jesters before the only leader who mattered in the

For Putin, this scene validated his war strat-

Western alliance.

egy. Despite heavy losses, Russia holds about 20 percent of Ukraine, including Crimea and Donbas, with NATO's eastward expansion seemingly halted. Trump's repeated assertions that he won't back Europe's maximalist demands have only strengthened Moscow's hand. With peace, sanctions may lift, enabling Putin to rebuild his economy and claim victory, however defined.

Ukraine's resilience remains extraordinary. With drone warfare innovations, covert operations, and sheer grit, it has denied Putin his maximalist goals of regime change. Yet Europe's un-

willingness to bear economic or military pain and Trump's return—has left Kyiv short of its desired outcome.

The Oval Office tableau also reflects Europe's deeper crisis: decades of outsourcing its security to the US. Post-World War II pacifism and complacency after the Cold War created overdependence on Washington. Trump has now leveraged this weakness, extracting one-sided deals, including control over hundreds of billions in European investm ents—protection money under the guise of alliance.

Compounding this vulnerability is Europe's economic reliance on Chinese manufacturing and Russian energy. The jolt has forced realism: accept the least worst bargain, preserve the alliance, and wait for a post-Trump America. This pragmatism, not defiance, now defines Europe's approach.

For India, there are clear lessons. First, strengthen the military on a genuine war footing, prioritizing deterrence against Pakistan and preparing for longterm challenges. Second, deepen ties with Russia while resisting entanglement in rigid blocs. Third, maintain stability with China where possible, recog-

nizing its use of Pakistan as a proxy. Fourth, calm the periphery, avoiding needless hostilities with neighbors beyond Pakistan. Finally, manage US ties with patience and foresight—Trump's era will pass, but American power will remain

The Oval Office picture underscores that national interest demands cynicism over emotion. Europe's decision to bend without breaking illustrates pragmatism over pride. India must heed the same lesson: navigate turbulence wisely, safeguard core interests, and prepare for the day after Trump.

Jawaharlal Nehru, Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, and Dr. Rajendra Prasad.

# **FBI Director Kash Patel Clashes** With Senate Democrats

BI Director Kash Patel engaged in a heat-■ed confrontation with Senate Democrats during a Judiciary Committee hearing on Tuesday, amid questions over his handling of the Jeffrey Epstein files. The exchange grew tense when Senator Adam Schiff pressed Patel on the transfer of Epstein associate Ghislaine Maxwell to a lower-security prison.

Patel, in a forceful response, accused Schiff of attempting to weaponize intelligence for political gain. "My role is to protect the weaponization of intelligence from the likes of you," Patel said, adding, "You are the biggest fraud to ever sit in the United States Senate, a disgrace to this institution, and an utter



coward. The confrontation escalated as both sides shouted over each other. prompting Committee Chair Chuck Grassley to repeatedly bang the gavel and call for order.

Ranking member Dick Durbin also urged Grassley to regain control. Schiff later criticized Patel, stating on X that the FBI Director "came to the Senate today not to do his job, but to save his

job," emphasizing that Americans deserve leadership committed to justice rather than political performances.

Patel defended his stance by highlighting

### My Friend Narendra: **Decoding Trump's Midnight Birthday Wish For PM**

S President Donald Trump's latenight phone call to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on his 75th birthday has injected new momentum into strained India-US relations, which have been weighed down by tariff disputes, trade deadlock, and disagreements over Russian oil imports. The call is widely seen as an attempt by Mr. Trump to reset ties after months of tension, including his disputed claims over brokering the Op Sindoor ceasefire and his push for a Nobel Peace Prize endorsement from India.

Significantly, PM Modi was the first to post about the call on social media, beating Mr. Trump by 37 minutes. Observers say the timing unsettled the US President, who is known for capitalising on first-mover advantage online. In his post, Mr. Trump unusually addressed Mr. Modi by his first name, a practice he reserves for leaders like Vladimir Putin and Benjamin Netanyahu. Mr. Modi, in contrast, stuck to formal protocol, avoiding his earlier use of

the word "friend." On Ukraine, both sides exchanged carefully crafted words. Mr. Modi expressed "support" for Mr. Trump's efforts to end the war but stopped short of committing India to reduce oil imports from Russia, a point of contention

that had earlier triggered additional US

The phone call also offered a boost to longstalled trade talks. A sixth round of discussions in New Delhi this week was described as "positive," with Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal hinting that an initial deal could be finalised by November.

The outreach comes after months of frosty silence, during which Mr. Modi reportedly declined multiple calls from Mr. Trump and pivoted towards closer engagement with China and Russia. Tuesday night's exchange suggests a thaw, with both leaders signalling readiness to stabilise one of the most consequential partnerships in the Indo-Pacific.

### Pakistan FM Says India Rejects Mediation, Calls for Dialogue

akistan's Foreign Minister and Deputy Prime Minister Ishaq Dar has said that India has rejected any third-party mediation on bilateral issues, reiterating Islamabad's desire for friendly relations with all its neighbours, including India. 

Robinson made his first virtual court appearance on September 16 and will remain in custody until his next hearing on September 29, by which time he is expected to have legal representation. Prosecutors plan to seek the death penalty.

Robinson was arrested on September 11 after his father recognized him in

bushes. He expressed news photos. Discord messages from Robinson two hours before his arrest included an admission: "Hey guys, I have bad news for you all...It was me at UVU yesterday. I'm sorry for all of

FBI Director Kash Patel confirmed that the bureau is investigating all individuals connected to Robinson's Discord group chats, as authorities probe potential coconspirators. Robinson's political views, including support for LGBTQ+ rights, were noted by family members, but prosecutors have not clarified whether this influenced his motive.

### Gold and Silver prices hit record high, driven by global uncertainty

prices surged to fresh record highs this week, supported by safe-haven demand amid rising global uncertainty, tariff concerns, and geopolitical tensions. Analysts expect the bullish momentum in bullion to continue in the near term as investors turn to precious metals for security during volatile times

According to the Indian Bullion and Jewellers Association (IBJA), 24-carat gold closed at 1,09,707 per 10 grams on Friday, registering a sharp gain of 1,670 compared to Monday's 1,08,037. Gold has remained above the 1 lakh mark throughout

1,04,075. Prices of 22-carat gold followed suit, ending the week at 1,00,492 per 10 grams, up from 98,962 earlier in the week

Silver prices also maintained a strong rally. The metal ended the week at 1,28,008 per kilogram, higher by 3,595 from Monday's 1,24,413. With silver holding firm above 1.20 lakh levels, investor appetite remains robust.

On the futures market, October gold contracts settled at 1,09,356 per 10 grams, up 0.34 per cent, reflecting sustained optimism. Globally, Comex gold traded at \$3,680.7 per ounce, extending gains as traders sought refuge September, having from economic and po-

Analysts believe the upward trend will re-

main intact, citing geopolitical risks, a fragile economic outlook, and ongoing tariff issues. Jateen Trivedi of LKP Securities noted that gold gained 0.35 per cent at 1,09,350, with Comex prices factoring in expectations of a possible U.S. Fed rate cut to support economic growth.

Despite being in overbought territory, bullion continues to attract premium buying. Market watchers see gold trading within a range of 1,07,000–1,12,000 in the coming weeks, reinforcing its role as a safe-haven asset during global uncertainty





# **US tariffs to hit 8% of India's** auto component output

component industry is facing significant headwinds as high US tariffs are expected to impact nearly 8% of the sector's total production, according to ratings agency Icra. Auto component exports contribute almost 30% to the industry's revenues, with the United States alone accounting for 27% of this share. However, the recent imposition of a 50% tariff on Indian goods has placed Indian exporters at a relative disadvantage compared to several Asian peers

While China, Japan, sia face tariffs in the 15–30% range, India's much higher tariff burden makes its products less competitive. Adding to the challenge, manufacturers in Mexico and Canada enjoy exemptions under the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA), further intensifying competition in the American market. This disparity underscores the growing need for India to accelerate trade talks with Washington to protect its export interests

Despite the hurdles,

Indian auto component exports to the US have witnessed steady growth in recent years. FY2023, and USD 6.8 billion in FY2024. For FY2025, exports are projected to touch USD 7.3 billion, reflecting the strong demand for Indian-made components. However, experts caution that the escalating tariff regime could slow this momentum in the near future

#### 20 Peacocks Found Dead Near Stream in Karnataka



n a shocking incident from Hanumanthapura village in Karnataka, twenty peacocks – India's national bird — were found dead under mysterious circumstances near a stream. According to reports, local farmers discovered the carcasses of 17 fe-

male and 3 male peacocks, prompting immediate concern and investigation by the Forest Department.

Forest officials who reached the spot collected evidence and dispatched the carcasses to the Forensic Science Laboratory. Officials stated that the cause of death would be confirmed after scientific examination, with poisoning being one of the suspected causes.


This mass death comes at a time when Karnataka is already grappling with a series of unexplained wildlife fatalities. Just a month earlier, 20 monkeys were found dead in the Chamaraianagar district, where forest and police officials suspected poisoning.

In another alarming case, five tigers — a tigress and her four cubs – died on June 27 in the Male Mahadeshwara Hills Wildlife Sanctuary. Initial investigation revealed that the tigress had preyed on a cow that was allegedly poisoned by villagers in retaliation. The meat was laced with poison, leading to the tragic deaths. Three individuals — Konappa, Madaraja, and Nagara — from Koppa village were arrested in that

Both the peacock and tiger incidents have raised serious questions about wildlife protection and human-animal conflict in Karnataka. While the forest department does offer compensation for livestock killed by wild animals, the benefit is not extended when such killings occur within the core areas of sanctuaries or national parks – where cattle grazing is

illegal. The recent peacock deaths are particularly disturbing given the state's commitment to preserving the species. Karnataka is home to two prominent peacock sanctuaries — Adi-chunchanagiri and Bankapura — both established to protect and conserve the national

life deaths being reported in short succession. activists and environmentalists are urging stricter enforcement of wildlife laws and better coordination between forest officials and local communities to prevent further incidents.



### Lost 'Ghost Ship' F.J. King Found After Nearly 140 Years in Lake Michigan

he long-lost schooner F.J. King, which vanished in a storm in 1886 while carrying iron ore, has finally been discovered off Wisconsin's coast, ending nearly 140 years of uncertainty. The discovery was confirmed by underwater archaeologists working with the Wisconsin Historical Society and the Wisconsin Underwater Archaeology Association, as reported by

Built in 1867 in Toledo, Ohio, the 144-foot, three-masted cargo schooner was transporting iron ore from Escanaba, Michigan, to Chicago when disaster struck on September 15, 1886. Fierce gales and waves as high as 10 feet battered the vessel, opening its seams. Despite hours of desperate pumping, the schooner sank around 2 am. Fortunately, Captain William Griffin and his

crew were rescued by a

passing ship, but the exact location of the wreck remained a mystery for generations. Researcher Brendon

Baillod spearheaded the latest effort to track down the wreck. Guided by an eyewitness account from a lighthouse keeper, his team scanned a two-squaremile area off Bailey's Harbour on Wisconsin's Door Peninsula. On June 28, 2025, side-scan sonar revealed the ship resting half a mile from the reported site. To their surprise, the hull was largely intact, though coated with invasive quagga mussels and marine growth.

"A few of us had to pinch each other," Baillod said. "After all the previous searches, we couldn't believe we had actually found it, and so quickly." The discovery is particularly remarkable given the heavy iron ore cargo that many believed would have shattered the vessel upon impact with the lakebed.

The find adds to a growing list of historic wrecks located by the Wisconsin Underwater Archaeology Association. Earlier this year, the group identified the steamer LW Crane in the Fox River at Oshkosh and the tugboat

John Evenson along with the schooner Margaret A. Muir off Algoma. Baillod also located the schooner Trinidad in 2023.

This rediscovery not only solves a maritime mystery but also deepens understanding of the Great Lakes' rich shipwreck history.

# Kipyegon Wins Historic Fourth World 1,500m Title

enya's Faith Kipyegon etched her name deeper into athletics history by clinching her fourth world title in the women's 1,500 metres at the World Athletics Championships in Tokyo on Tuesday (September 16). The 31-year-old clocked 3 minutes 52.15 seconds, finishing nearly three seconds ahead of compatriot Dorcus Ewoi, while Australia's Jessica Hull secured bronze.

Kipyegon, already regarded as the greatest female middle-distance runner, joined Moroccan legend Hicham El Guerrouj as only the second athlete to win four world titles at 1.500m. Her dominance was clear as she widened her lead in the final lap, flashing four fingers at the finish line to mark her triumphs. "This was my dream, just to defend my title in the 1.500 for the fourth



time — and keep making history," she said.

Her victory comes just months after narrowly missing the four-minute barrier in the mile, a feat she continues to pursue. Despite that disappointment, she broke her own 1,500m world record in June, clocking 3:48.68. In Tokvo, while a record was never in sight, her composure and strength were unmatched.

Beyond medals, Kipyegon's story of balancing

motherhood and elite athletics has inspired a generation of women. She revealed her daughter Alyn had called her before the race, asking, "When are you going to get a medal?" a prom-

ise she duly fulfilled. Elsewhere, American Cordell Tinch won gold in the men's 110m hurdles, giving the U.S. its sixth title of the championships. tournament remains undecided.

PCB chief Mohsin Naqvi is expected to make a formal announcement soon regarding Pakistan's continued participation. While he is likely to confirm that the team will remain in the competition, he is also expected to reiterate his board's grievances. Sources indicate Naqvi was angered by the sudden "no-handshake" decision, stressing he would have accepted the protocol had it been communicated

in advance. Adding to the controversy, India captain Suryakumar Yadav has reportedly expressed reservations of his own. He has conveyed to the ACC that he does not want Naqvi — who also serves as ACC chairman — to present the Asia Cup trophy to India should his side

win the final.

With both boards airing grievances and tournament organizers scrambling to manage tensions, the Asia Cup has entered uncharted territory. While temporary compromises have been reached, uncertainty looms large over how the remainder of the competition will unfold, making this one of the most politically fraught editions in recent memory.



would be seen together again. Since then, speculation about the project has been at fever pitch.


