AP Liquor Scam ED Raids Five States

yderabad, Sept 18: The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has launched a multi-state operation, conducting searches in five states as part of an ongoing investigation into the Andhra Pradesh (AP) Liquor Scam. This case, which involves an alleged fraud of Rs. 3,500 crore, saw coordinated raids in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, and Delhi. The searches were carried out at 20 locations, targeting the offices and companies of individuals and entities accused in the case.

The raids represent a significant escalation in the investigation, bringing a central agency like the ED into the fold. The AP government has been grappling with the fallout of this scam, and the ED's involvement signals that the case has



now taken on a wider, more serious dimension, likely involving money laundering and financial irregularities across state lines

Meanwhile, the Special Investigation Team (SIT) continues its parallel investigation. The SIT has officially named 29 individuals and 19 companies as accused in the scam. So far, the SIT has made 12 arrests in connection with the case. Of those arrested, four individuals—Dhanunjaya Reddy (A - 31),Krishnamohan Reddy (A-32), Balaji Govindappa (A-33), and Paila Dilip (A-30)—have been granted bail. However, eight others, including Chevireddy Bhaskara Reddy and Venkatesh Naidu, remain in

custody. The ED's action follows the SIT's groundwork, and the coordinated raids across multiple states suggest that the

scam extends far beyond Andhra Pradesh. The involvement of companies and individuals in other states indicates a sophisticated network that allegedly facilitated the illegal liquor trade and associated financial transactions. The recent develop-

ments, particularly the ED's widespread searches, are expected to provide new evidence and insights into the money trail, which could lead to further arrests and a deeper understanding of the scam's magnitude. The authorities are focused on uncovering how the illicit profits were generated and where they were funneled, aiming to hold all those responsible accountable for their roles in the scam. The public awaits further details from the ongoing investigation, as the case continues to unravel.

The Government of Telangana has taken a serious view of the actions of, the District Collector of Rajanna Sircilla, for allegedly violating official protocol during the celebrations held on Wednesday. According to officials, the Collector failed to attend the flag-hoisting ceremony on time and also did not formally receive the chief guest of the event, Government

Whip. Government sources said that Aadi Srinivas submitted a formal complaint to the Chief Secretary and the (CMO) about the incident. The complaint alleged that the Collector's conduct reflected negligence and a lack of respect for established protocol at an official government programme. In response, the State government has issued notices to Collector Jha, directing him to provide a written explanation for his actions.

The government is said to be displeased not



only with this incident but also with what it perceives as Jha's increasingly controversial conduct in recent times. Officials noted that during an official event, adherence to protocol is mandatory and any breach will be viewed seriously. The government has reportedly taken strong exception to Jha's behaviour, particularly as it undermines the decorum expected from a senior administrative officer. In addition to the pro-

tocol issue, legal troubles have also surfaced for Jha. On Wednesday, a court issued a warrant against him in connection with a case involving a displaced landowner. This has further fuelled the government's dissatisfaction with the Collector's conduct. Senior officials are said to be closely watching the developments surrounding him.

Meanwhile, on Thursday, several leaders from BC community organisations across Rajanna Sircilla district held protests in support of Aadi Srinivas, condemning the Collector's actions. They demanded accountability from the district administration and called for appropriate

disciplinary measures. Following these devel-

formal notices to Collector Sandeep Kumar Jha. He has been asked to submit a detailed written explanation by 3 p.m. on Monday. The government has indicated that it will review his response and decide on further action based on the explanation provided.

PATIENTS SUFFERING DUE TO STALLING AAROGYASRI SERVICES

yderabad, Sept 18: Aarogyasri services across remained suspended for the second consecutive day as private hospitals continued their protest over pending dues amounting to nearly 1,500 crore. Despite repeated appeals from Aarogyasri officials, the has not yet opened dialogue with the (TANHA), which is spearheading

The suspension of services has left thousands of patients in the lurch, particularly those from economically weaker sections who rely heavily on the Aarogyasri health insurance scheme for critical treatments. According to TANHA representatives, most small and medium-sized reportedly urged the govprivate hospitals have completely stopped offering medical care to beneficiaries of Aarogyasri, as well as to government employees covered under the (EHS) and journalists under the (JHS).

Hospital managements have said that the strike was forced upon them due to the government's prolonged delay in clearing the arrears, which has severely affected their operational sustainability. They pointed out that the dues have been pending for months, creating a financial crunch and leaving many hospitals struggling to pay staff salaries

and procure medicines. Despite the disruption to patient care, the state



government and the health department have so far made no move to initiate negotiations with the striking hospitals. Aarogyasri officials ernment to intervene and prevent further damage to public health services, but these requests have gone unanswered.

Patients, meanwhile, are bearing the brunt of the standoff, as they are being turned away from hospitals or asked to pay out of pocket for treatments that would otherwise be covered under the scheme. Several patient advocacy groups have raised concerns about the denial of lifesaving treatments, urging both the government and TANHA to resolve the deadlock at the

TANHA has stated that they are willing to resume services immediately if the government releases at least a substantial portion of the pending dues and gives a concrete timeline for clearing the remaining payments. However, without any response from the government side, they said the protest would continue indefinitely.

The impasse has sparked widespread criticism of the government's handling of the crisis, with health experts warning that prolonged suspension of services under Aarogyasri could overwhelm public hospitals and push low-income families into financial

As the standoff enters its third day, pressure is mounting on the state government to break its silence and initiate talks with TANHA to restore health services and ensure that patients do not continue to suffer.

yderabad, Sept 18: In a significant step to enhance child protection, the government on Thursday, September 18, launched in collaboration with UNICEF and the the initiative aims to ensure that every child in the city grows up safe, healthy, and supported, while building a comprehensive framework for safeguarding children's rights and well-being.

The launch event was attended by , the state's Transport Minister, and, Minister for Women and Child Welfare, along with senior officials from multiple government departments. The ministers collectively vowed to make a national model for a "Child Safe City."

A key component of the CLAP for Children initiative is the strengthening of legal mechanisms and frontline services to provide timely protection for children. This will include coordinated efforts from various departments such as Women and Child Development, Police, Health, Education,

the (GHMC), and Disaster Management authorities. Officials stated that better inter-departmental coordination would enable swift responses to issues of child abuse, neglect, and exploitation. The plan also emphasises the importance of preventing everyday risks to children, such as bullying, unsafe transport, and drug abuse, through proactive community

The initiative proposes the establishment of Child Protection Cells and Vigilance Committees to oversee implementation, ensure accountability, and provide regular monitoring of child safety measures. These bodies will work closely with local communities to report violations, address grievances, and create safer environments in schools, neighbourhoods, and public spaces. Additionally, the plan includes training and deployment of experienced frontline workers who are equipped to deliver child-friendly care, legal assistance, counselling, and emergency response.

Addressing the gather-

ing, Minister Seethakka said that ensuring the safety of children was a shared responsibility that required active participation from families, schools, local communities, and government agencies. Transport Minister Poonam Prabhakar stressed that the city must adopt a zero-toler-ance approach to child exploitation and unsafe environments, calling for 'systematic, coordinated and compassionate" efforts to protect young lives

HIGH COURTASKED POLICE REPLY IN YADADRI ISSUE

yderabad, Sept 18: The on Thursday directed the to submit an explanation in connection with a case registered against , a senior (BRS) leader and MLA from, over an alleged violation of temple norms during a ritual at the . The Court has also issued notices to the temple's Executive Officer (EO) seeking a response on the matter.

The case pertains to a ritual conducted by Harish Rao in August last year within the temple premises. As part of the event, he performed a

(atonement ritual) with the assistance of private priests he had brought to the temple. The ritual drew criticism from certain quarters, who alleged that it violated the temple's established procedures and norms by bypassing the designated temple priests and protocols.

The controversy escalated when Harish Rao used the occasion to criticise, the Chief Minister of, accusing him of deceiving farmers by failing to deliver on his promise to waive agricultural loans by August

15. The remarks, made

further fuelled the debate about whether political activities were being mixed with religious practices.

Following complaints, the Yadagirigutta police registered a case and began preliminary inquiries. Petitioners argued that conducting religious rituals in violation of the temple's set norms undermines its sanctity and could set a problematic precedent. They sought accountability from both Harish Rao and the temple administration for permitting the ritual to take place in that manner.

tion, the High Court has now asked the police to submit a detailed explanation regarding the steps they have taken so far in the investigation and the legal provisions being invoked. The Court also sought a report from the temple EO clarifying under what circumstances permission was granted for the ritual and whether any internal rules or religious protocols were bypassed.

The Court's directives mark a significant development in the case, as they place both the local police and the tem-

judicial scrutiny. Legal experts note that the Court's observations could have wider implications on how religious rituals are regulated in state-managed temples and whether political figures can be held accountable for violating such protocols.

Officials from the

state agriculture department said they have been making continuous representations to the Centre, seeking additional urea allocations, especially during the peak agricultural season when demand is at its highest. They argued that delayed or insufficient dispatches from central warehouses have disrupted the supply chain and pushed farmers into distress.

However, leaders of the (BRS) have sharply criticised the state government, accusing it of mishandling the distribution and failing to anticipate the demand surge. They alleged that the government's poor planning and mismanagement have worsened the crisis, leaving farmers helpless in the middle of the agricultural season.

BRS leaders have also demanded that the government take immediate corrective measures, including transparent distribution of available stocks, stringent action against hoarding, and real-time monitoring of supply at mandal-level centers to ensure that small and marginal farmers get priority ac-

Meanwhile, farmers' unions have warned that if the shortage persists, it could lead to significant crop losses and threaten the livelihoods of lakhs of farmers across the state. They have urged both the state and central governments to set aside political blame games and act swiftly to restore normal supplies.

As the standoff continues, the acute shortage of urea has become a flashpoint between the state and central governments, with farmers caught in the crossfire. Observers note that if the crisis is not resolved soon, it could snowball into a major political issue in the agrarian

Objection Raised Against Daljeet Singh's Nomination

derabad Cricket Association (HCA) has formally raised objections regarding the nomination of Daljeet Singh as HCA's representative for the upcoming Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) elections. The objection, submitted in writing to A.K. Joti, the Electoral Officer for the **BCCI General Elections** 2025, cites a lack of proper authorisation and an alleged violation of judicial directives.

In the letter, the member expressed serious concerns over Singh's nomination as the association's representative. "We, the members, and also the commoners hereby lodge this formal objection under the provisions of the Election Schedule with respect to the Draft Electoral Roll (dated 13th September 2025). The said Roll has shown Sardar Daljeet Singh as the nominated representative of the Hyderabad Cricket Association (HCA)," the correspondence stated.

The objection points to procedural and legal irregularities, questioning whether Singh's nomination adheres to the association's constitution and the judicial guidelines governing HCA. While Daljeet Singh is currently serving as the in-charge president of HCA, the member argues that his nomination does not reflect proper authorisation from the governing body and may be inconsistent with directives issued by courts overseeing HCA matters.



The BCCI Electoral Officer, A.K. This development comes at a critical time for HCA, which is gearing up for the BCCI elections later this year. The association has been under judicial supervision in recent years due to governance and administrative disputes, making the adherence to procedural guidelines crucial for all electoral processes.

Stakeholders in Hyderabad's cricketing community have closely monitored these proceedings, emphasizing the need for fair representation and strict compliance with both the HCA constitution and court-mandated reforms. Any decision regarding the objection could have wider implications on the association's participation in the BCCI electoral process and may influence future nominations

As the BCCI elections approach, all concerned parties, including HCA members, legal authorities, and electoral officers, are expected to closely observe the resolution of this objection. The final decision on Daljeet Singh's nomination will likely set a precedent for ensuring transparency, accountability, and adherence to legal and procedural norms in cricket administration at both the state and national

Ponguleti Hits Back at KTR, Predicts BRS Defeat



onguleti Srinivasa Reddy, Minister in the government, strongly criticised (KTR) for his recent remarks against the state government and Chief Minister . Addressing the media, Ponguleti said that KTR would be forced to go abroad after the upcoming General Elections once he witnesses the humiliating defeat of the (BRS)

Ponguleti reminded that KTR had earlier challenged him by claiming that BRS would defeat him in his own

constituency, . Responding sharply, Ponguleti said that before talking about defeating him, KTR should first focus on saving his party's position in the upcoming bypolls for the constituency, where BRS is already facing an uphill battle.

"Let them first win Ju-

"Let them first win Jubilee Hills before boasting about defeating me in Paleru. People are rejecting BRS everywhere, and they are clearly staring at a major defeat. After the next elections, KTR will be nowhere to be seen here—he might

prefer to leave the country," Ponguleti said in a scathing attack.

He also defended the policies and governance of the current -led state government, stating that under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, the government has been working sincerely to fulfil its promises and address people's issues. He alleged that BRS leaders. especially KTR, are trying to mislead people with false propaganda because they are frustrated by their declining popularity.

Ponguleti asserted that people have already given their verdict in the recent elections and that the Congress government will continue to win their trust through development and welfare initiatives. He added that BRS is fast losing its ground and even its own cadre are reportedly unhappy with its leadership.

The war of words between leaders of the ruling Congress and the opposition BRS has intensified in recent days, with both parties preparing for upcoming electoral battles. Ponguleti's remarks are seen as a strong rebuttal to KTR's attempts to target the government and the Chief Minister personally.

Political analysts say this exchange reflects the high-stakes political atmosphere in Telangana, where BRS is trying to regain lost ground, while Congress is determined to consolidate its hold on power. With the Jubilee Hills bypolls approaching, the political rivalry between these two leaders has added more heat to the campaign narrative.

Urea Distribution Underway to Support Farmers in Padtanpalli and Naspur

CBI STARTED PROBE IN VAMANARAO COUPLE'S MURDER CASE





he long-awaited probe into the sensational murder of lawyer couple and has finally commenced, with the (CBI) officially beginning its investigation in of . The development comes nearly four years after the double murder shocked the state and drew widespread outrage from legal circles and civil society.

The CBI launched the probe following directions from the, which had last month ordered a CBI investigation into the case. This order was issued in response to a petition filed by Vaman Rao's father, who alleged that justice had not been served in the case so far and that several influential individuals may have been involved in the conspiracy behind the

killing. On Thursday, a three-member CBI team led by arrived in Peddapalli district and began its first round of on-ground investigation. The team initially visited the Police Commissionerate, where they held discussions with senior officers and examined the records related to the murder. They reportedly reviewed the case files, witness statements, forensic reports, and other evidence that had been collected during the initial investigation by

local authorities.

Later in the day, the CBI officials proceeded to, where they were joined by , the Assistant Commissioner of Police. From there, they visited the native village of the slain couple — in — and went to their family residence. At the house, the of-

ficers questioned the couple's family members, including Vaman Rao's parents, Kishan Rao and , and his brother. The interaction lasted for about ten minutes, during which the CBI is understood to have sought information on the couple's movements and activities on the day of the incident, as well as any possible threats they had been

The team then took

the family members along to the premises, where the lawyer couple had reportedly attended proceedings shortly before their murder. The officials sought to reconstruct the sequence of events, enquiring about where the couple had stood, whom they had spoken to, where their car was parked, and whether anyone had been conducting surveillance on them. This reconstruction is expected to help the investigators identify possible lapses or overlooked leads in

the earlier probe. Following this, the CBI officers visited the actual crime scene

ple were brutally hacked to death in February 2021. They inspected the area carefully and gathered more details from Kishan Rao, who was present during the visit. The officers reportedly sought to understand the positioning of the vehicles, the escape route of the assailants, and the presence of any CCTV cameras in the vicinity.

The CBI team later returned to Ramagundam and is expected to continue its investigation from there. Sources said the officers are likely to stay in the district for the next four to five days to carry out a detailed probe. They have requested the Ramagundam Police Commissionerate to allocate a separate room to function as their temporary office during the inquiry, and arrangements are report-

edly underway. The initiation of the CBI probe into the Gattu Vaman Rao-Nagamani murder case has become a major talking point in the region. Locals, legal professionals, and activists have expressed hope that the central agency's involvement will bring to light the full conspiracy behind the killings and ensure that all those involved are brought to justice, ending the long wait for accountability in this high-profile case.



Mahbubnagar Man Dies in America

bubnagar, identified as Ameruddin, has tragically lost his life in an accident in America. The incident occurred after a dispute between two of his friends escalated. According to the details provided, Ameruddin, who moved to the U.S. in 2016, had completed his MS from the University of Florida and was working for a company. His job contract had ended six months ago, and he was staying with friends in a room without an extension.

The accident happened during a heated argument between two of Ameruddin's friends. When the fight did not subside, one of the friends called the police. Upon their arrival, the confrontation continued, prompting the police to open fire. A bullet, fired by the police, accidentally struck Ameruddin, causing his

Following the incident, his friends immediately informed his parents in Mahbubnagar. His uncle, who resides in Chicago, rushed to the scene. It is reported that Ameruddin had spoken to his family just eight days prior to the tragedy. The exact time of the incident has not been officially confirmed.

Gold Worth 3.36 Crore Seized at Shamshabad Airport

Customs officials at Rajiv Gandhi International Airport (RGIA) in Hyderabad have seized gold worth approximately 3.36 crore in a major anti-smuggling operation. The Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI), acting on specific

intelligence, foiled two separate smuggling attempts involving passengers arriving from Kuwait. In the first incident,

officers found a suspicious piece of unclaimed baggage. Upon examining CCTV footage, they confirmed it was deliberately abandoned by a passenger. The bag contained 1.26 kg of gold. Investigators traced the person to the Annamayya district of Andhra Pradesh and ar-

rested him. He confessed

that a handler in Kuwait

had given him the bag

leave it at the airport. The handler was also traced and arrested.

In the second case, officers found 2.11 kg of gold concealed inside an iron box within a passenger's luggage. The individual involved was traced and arrested from the YSR Kadapa

A total of three individuals were arrested and remanded to judicial custody under the Customs Act. The investigation is ongoing to uncover any wider smuggling networks.

ADULTRATED ICE CREAM UNIT SEIZED BY THE POLICE

Thursday busted an illegal ice-cream manufacturing unit manufacturing unit operating in a residential area of and arrested its owner for allegedly using harmful substances in production, posing a serious threat to public health.

According to officials, the raid was carried out by the Special Operations Team (SOT) of Rachakonda Police at Sharada Nagar in Ramanthapur. The accused, identified as had been running the unit without proper authorisation and producing icecreams of various flavours using adulterated ingredients and unsafe chemicals.

Police said the use these substances posed a grave risk, especially to children, who are the primary consumers of such products. The unit was operating in complete violation of safety and hygiene



During the raid, the police seized adulterated icecream stock, artificial colours, flavours, and other raw materials worth nearly 8 lakh from the premises. Samples of the seized items have been sent for laboratory analysis to confirm the nature of the substances used. Authorities are also

probing whether the accused possessed any valid licences or clearances from the food safety department to operate the unit. Preliminary checks have revealed that the unit was functioning without mandatory permissions, further indicating deliberate violations of food safe-

the consumption of icecreams produced under such unhygienic conditions with harmful chemicals could lead to severe health issues, including food poisoning and longterm complications.

The police have registered a case against the accused under relevant sections of the law related to food adulteration and endangering public health. They said further legal action would be initiated once the lab reports are received and the investigation is completed.

The Rachakonda Police urged the public to remain vigilant and report any suspicious food manufacturing or storage units operating in their localities. They said strict enforcement drives would continue to curb the production and sale of adulterated food items to ensure the safety of consumers, espe-

Gang Arrested for Misappropriating CMRF Funds in Kodad

scam has been unearthed in Kodad, where a gang allegedly manipulated records of victims who had applied to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF) for health-related assistance, diverting the money to different accounts. The Kodad Circle Crime Squad (CCS) police successfully busted the operation, leading to the arrest of six individuals at the center of the

fraudulent scheme. Superintendent of Police K. Narasimha stated that the gang altered the details of beneficiaries suffering from health issues and illegally transferred the CMRF funds to accounts under their control. "Over the past few months, we noticed that the gang was systematically misappropriating funds meant for genuine applicants," he said, emphasizing that the scam involved both manipulation of records and financial misappropriation.

The investigation revealed that the gang had targeted a total of 44 CMRF cheques. Out of these, 38 cheques had already been withdrawn illegally, while plans were underway to withdraw an additional six before police intervention. Authorities have seized 9.3 lakh in cash and six mobile phones from the accused, which are now under examination as part of ongoing investigations.

The SP further explained that political figures from the Kodad constituency were allegedly involved in the formation of this gang. Multiple leaders reportedly collaborated, creating a network to exploit the CMRF, which is intended to provide financial relief to individuals facing medical emergencies. Police believe that the scam represents a coordinated effort to defraud genuine beneficiaries while siphoning public funds for personal gain.

Authorities have as-

major financial sured that strict action will be taken against all individuals involved, including political figures linked to the gang. "This incident undermines the very purpose of the Chief Minister's Relief Fund, which is to assist those in urgent need of medical aid," SP Narasimha said. He added that the police are committed to tracing every irregular transaction and ensuring the recovery of misappropri-

ated funds. The Kodad CMRF cheque scam highlights ongoing challenges in monitoring and safeguarding relief programs, particularly in areas where large sums are distributed for urgent health needs. Officials emphasized the importance of digital record-keeping, regular audits, and stringent verification procedures to prevent similar scams in the future

have expressed concern over the incident, calling for stricter oversight and transparency in the administration of public welfare funds. Authorities noted that timely detection of the fraud was possible due to vigilant monitoring by CCS personnel, who continue to scrutinize accounts and track any irregularities in fund distribution.

Police investigations are ongoing, with further interrogations planned to uncover any additional accomplices. Authorities have also appealed to the public to report any suspicious activities related to government relief funds. The successful bust of the gang serves as a warning to potential fraudsters that misappropriation of public welfare funds will not be tolerated.

With the arrests, Kodad authorities hope to restore trust in the CMRF system and ensure that financial assistance reaches the genuine beneficiaries who need it the most, reinforcing the government's commitment to social welfare and transparency.

Six Maoists from Chhattisgarh Surrender in $Bhadradri\,Kothagudem$

significant development, six Maoist operatives from Bijapur district in Chhattisgarh surrendered to police on Thursday, marking a notable step in ongoing efforts to integrate insurgents into mainstream society. The group, which included members of the Bastar South Area Committee, chose to lay down arms in response to government welfare initiatives aimed at improving tribal livelihoods.

According to the Bhadradri Kothagudem Superintendent of Police, Rohith Raju, the surrendering Maoists comprised well-known cadres, including Madakam Deva, alias Dinesh, who has been associated with the Bastar South Area Committee, party member Joga Madivi, and several militia members. The police official confirmed that the group voluntarily approached law enforcement authorities, signaling a desire to dis-



The irony could not be sharper. A party that once dreamt of ruling the nation now holds no representation in the Lok Sabha and only four seats in the Rajya Sabha. Worse, it has chosen to boycott pivotal elections, such as the Vice Presidential contest.

conversation. The leadership that once aspired to shape Delhi's corridors of power is now absent from even routine parliamentary processes.

BRS's boycott of the Vice Presidential election has sparked widespread criticism. Political analysts and observers across parties believe the move indirectly benefits the BJP, underscoring how far the party has fallen from its earlier relevance. In stark contrast, regional parties like the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP)despite being a direct rival to Congress in multiple states—chose to participate in the democratic process by backing the INDIA bloc candidate. This act of political maturity further highlights BRS's isolation and declining stature.

The seeds of this downfall were sown vears ago when BRS succumbed to arrogance. In the aftermath

formation in 2014, the party secured 11 out of 17 Lok Sabha seats, creating an illusion of invincibility. The 2019 elections were still tolerable with nine seats, but by 2024, BRS lost every seat it contested. Even its representation in the Rajya Sabha fell drastically from seven to four members. A once-powerful force is now barely visible in

national politics.

The turning point, however, came with the 2023 Telangana Assembly elections. After nearly a decade in power, the party's strength plummeted from 88 seats in 2018 to just 39. Congress, capitalizing on public frustration, surged ahead and formed the government. KCR's autocratic leadership style-marked by family favoritism, intolerance toward dissent, and allegations of corruption alienated the electorate. His son K.T. Rama Rao and nephew T. Harish Rao were elevated at the expense

of experienced party workers, reinforcing perceptions of nepotism.

Scandals such as the Kaleshwaram irrigation project and phone-tapping allegations compounded the party's troubles. Rather than addressing public concerns, KCR retreated into seclusion at his farmhouse in Gajwel. His silence on pressing issues, refusal to engage with commissions of inquiry, and reluctance to counter corruption charges painted him as evasive and weak. This absence of leadership further eroded trust in the party.

Internal discord has only added to the party's woes. KCR's authoritarian grip has demoralized his own cadre. His daughter Kavitha's open defiance of the leadership—and subsequent suspension—revealed the fragility of his control. Party workers and the public began questioning how a leader incapable of managing family disputes could govern a political organization.

Though KCR continues to hold the title of Leader of Opposition, his presence in legislative sessions is rare, and his contribution to debates negligible. Congress now openly mocks him as an "absent opposition leader," pointing to his irrelevance. Even after vowing to stage a comeback at the party's silver jubilee celebrations in Warangal earlier this year, KCR remains out of touch raising serious doubts about his political resilience.

The insult to Telangana's dignity reached a new low when BRS chose to boycott the Vice Presidential election instead of backing Justice Sudarshan Reddy—a respected son of the soil from a humble farmer's family. His nomination was a source of pride for Telangana, yet BRS chose indifference over solidarity. Critics argue that this move was orchestrated to deny a Telangana leader the recognition he deserved, further exposing KCR's narrow-mindedness and political opportunism.

While other opposition parties, including AAP, set aside rivalries to support the INDIA bloc candidate, BRS's refusal to engage in national politics reinforced its image as a party more interested in self-preservation than in serving the people. Congress leaders accused the party of clandestine coordination with the BJP to undermine Telangana's representation at the national level.

The rise of Justice Sudarshan Reddy was celebrated across parties, with leaders calling for unity to bolster Telugu pride on the national stage. BRS's absence from this historic moment only deepened the perception that it had long abandoned the aspirations of the

people it once claimed to represent.

The final truth is undeniable: BRS's reliance on family over merit, intolerance toward criticism, and reluctance to embrace democratic values have steadily driven it toward irrelevance. The party's collapse is a cautionary tale for political outfits everywhere-arrogance and nepotism may bring short-term gains, but they cannot sustain trust or

long-term leadership.

What was once Telangana's voice has been reduced to whispers. BRS's journey from prominence to political obscurity stands as a stark reminder that leadership must be inclusive, accountable, and rooted in servicenot personal ambition or dynastic control. Without course correction, the party risks becoming a footnote in the state's political history rather than a force to reckon



Kerala CPM Bets on Ayyappa Sangamam to Counter BJP Outreach

hiruvananthapuram: The CPM-led Left **Democratic Front** (LDF) government's decision to organise the Global Ayyappa Sangamam on September 20 at Pamba, near the Sabarimala Ayyappa temple, has sparked heated debate across Kerala. Though the event is officially being held under the Travancore Devaswom Board as part of its platinum jubilee celebrations, political observers view it as a carefully calculated move by the CPM to counter BJP's growing influence among Hindu

The stated objective of the Sangamam is to discuss development plans for the hill shrine and attract more

a political agenda—an attempt to pre-empt Hindutva forces from monopolising the cultural and spiritual symbolism of Sabarimala. With Assembly and local body elections on the horizon, the timing has further fuelled speculation about the government's

pilgrims. Yet, critics see

For the CPM, the stakes are high. The Hindu-Ezhava community, forming nearly 23% of Kerala's population, has long been the backbone of Communist support. However, recent elections saw BJP making inroads into Ezhava-dominated regions, aided by a strong campaign against what they

termed "minority

appeasement" by both the LDF and the Congress-led United **Democratic Front** (UDF). After the 2024 Lok Sabha setback, the CPM leadership openly admitted concern over this shift, prompting new outreach efforts. Major Hindu organi-

sations such as the Sree Narayana Dharma Paripalana Yogam (SNDP) and the Nair Service Society (NSS) have extended support to the Sangamam. Neither Congress nor BJP wants to be seen opposing "development" at Sabarimala, especially when the event aligns with the interests of lakhs of devotees. Instead, they have invoked memories of the bitter 2018-2019 Sabarimala conflict, when the state govern-

Supreme Court's ruling permitting women of menstruating age to enter the shrine, sparking mass protests. Both parties now question the CPM's ideological shift and accuse it of political opportunism.

The LDF, meanwhile, has hinted at organising similar outreach events with other social groups, including minorities, to address grievances. Supporters argue that this reflects inclusive governance, while detractors call it vote-bank engineering. Whatever the framing, the Ayyappa Sangamam is set to be more than a spiritual congregation-it is fast becoming a political litmus test for Kerala's shifting electoral landscape.

MK Stalin Declares 'No Entry for BJP' in Tamil Nadu at **DMK Fest**

amil Nadu Chief Minister and DMK president MK Stalin took a strong political stance against the BJP during the DMK's annual Mupperum Vizha celebrations in Karur, marking the party's founding day and the birth anniversaries of Periyar and Anna. Addressing a large gathering, Stalin vowed that the BJP would have "no entry" in Tamil Nadu, warning that attempts at central overreach threatened the state's language, culture, and federal rights.

Stalin accused the Centre of imposing Hindi, withholding education funding, and undermining states' powers through interventions such as delimitation. "If we do not stop the BJP now, next it will move to a state-less country," he cautioned, urging a mass mobilisation across Tamil Nadu. He contrasted Tamil Nadu's political resilience with other states, insisting that protecting linguistic and cultural rights was a

generational duty. The DMK leader also highlighted his govern-

ment's achievements, including double-digit economic growth and successful welfare schemes. He outlined the party's organisational roadmap, describing the "Oraniyil Tamil Nadu" campaign aimed at reaching every village and household, claiming over one crore families had already joined the party's fold. "We have won every election since 2019, and with your work the victory journey will continue in 2026," he

Stalin targeted AIAD-MK leader Edappadi K. Palanisami, accusing him of compromising the party's independence to align with the BJP. He called the AIAD-MK's current posture a betrayal of Annadurai's principles, coining the term "Adimaiism" to describe its alleged

surrender. While projecting confidence, Stalin faces challenges as opposition parties criticise his government over rising crimes against women, drug abuse, and declining law and order. These issues could influence public perception ahead of the 2026 polls, even as the DMK consolidates its support through welfare and cultural messaging.

eader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi on Thursday (September 18, 2025) launched 🛮 a sharp attack on Chief Election Commis sioner Gyanesh Kumar, alleging that the CEC is shielding those "destroy ing" Indian democracy. Gandhi raised concerns over alleged large-scale voter deletions and manipulations in Karnataka and Maharashtra, claiming the irregularities are undermining electoral integrity

He cited the Aland constituency in Karnataka, where 6,018 votes were reportedly sought to be deleted using centralized software and phones outside the state. Similarly, in Rajura, Maharashtra, 6.850 applications were submitted online to add names to the electoral rolls, which Gandhi described as a "Vote Chori factory." The Karnataka



tigated the removal of 5,994 voters' names in Aland ahead of the 2023 Assembly election, allegedly through forged forms

Rahul Gandhi criticized the Election Commission for withholding crucial information from the Karnataka CID despite 18 letters sent over 18 months. He brought forward a voter whose vote was attempted to be deleted and another whose identity was misused in the process. Both denied any knowl-

ties. Gandhi asserted that the deletions were carried out using specialized software, and the ECI is aware of the perpetrators but is failing to act

Gandhi framed these revelations as a warning to India's youth about the systematic rigging of elections. While he said these were not yet the "hydrogen bomb" disclosures he had promised, he suggested more significant revelations are forthcoming. He reiter-

Sheikh Hasina, Family Barred From Voting In Bangladesh Elections

angladesh's Election Commission has confirmed that former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina and several of her family members will not be eligible to vote in the upcoming national elections scheduled for February 2026. According to local reports, the commission blocked their National Identity (NID) cards earlier this year, making online registration impossible

Akhtar Ahmed, Senior Secretary of the Election Commission, said both in-country and out-ofcountry Bangladeshis will be allowed to vote, provided they register online using their NID numbers. "Those with a blocked NID will be unable to complete online registration. Only those who can register with their NID will have the opportunity to vote," he clarified. He added that Sheikh Hasina's NID, along with those of 10 close relatives, was suspended on February 16.

The list includes her son Sajib Wazed Joy, daughter Saima Wazed Putul, sister Sheikh Rehana. nieces Tulip Rezwana Siddique and Azmina Siddique, and nephew Radwan Mujib Siddique Hasina fled Bangla-

desh on August 5, 2024, during a student-led uprising and has since taken refuge in India. Following her departure, an interim government led by Nobel laureate Muhammad Yunus was formed. Yunus has announced that parliamentary elections will take place before Ramadan in February 2026. Preparations are underway after the Office of the Chief Adviser formally requested the Election Commission to ensure the elections are free, fair, peaceful, and

The disqualification of Hasina and her family from voting underscores the dramatic political shift in Bangladesh since the uprising. With her absence and blocked participation, the February elections are set to mark a new chapter in the country's leadership

We Did More Good For Humanity Than: To Submit One-Pa Trump At UK State Dinner Work Summaries

S President Donald Trump began his second UK state visit on Wednesday with royal pag-eantry at Windsor Castle, hosted by King Charles III. The elaborate welcome featured the largest guard of honour in living memory with 120 horses and 1,300 troops, carriage rides, an air show, and a formal state dinner. During the banquet. Trump raised a toast praising the historic alliance, declaring, "Together we've done more good for humanity than any two countries in all of history." He urged both nations to continue standing for the values of the English-speaking world

Trump is the only US president to receive a second UK state visit, a fact he noted with humour during the dinner, calling it "the first and maybe the last time." The event came against the backdrop of trade tensions linked to Trump's America First policies, but also highlighted major investment announcements. Britain revealed that US companies had pledged



£150 billion (\$204 billion) for projects in the UK, with £90 billion (\$122 billion) coming from investment giant Blackstone over the next decade. In return, firms like GSK will invest nearly \$30 billion in

the United States The visit also set the stage for the signing of a "tech prosperity deal" between Trump and UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer at Chequers. Officials say the agreement will bring thousands of jobs and boost cooperation in artificial intelligence, quantum computing, and nuclear energy. Starmer and his wife Victoria formally welcomed Trump upon his arrival

Despite the grand ceremony, the visit was met with opposition. Thousands marched through London, carrying banners rejecting Trump's leadership, while in Windsor, protesters projected images linking him to Jeffrey Epstein on a castle tower. Police confirmed four arrests during the demonstrations. The mix of royal celebration, diplomatic deals, and public protests underscored the high-profile nature of Trump's unprecedented

Musk Orders xAl Staff **To Submit One-Page**

lon Musk, CEO of xAI, has once again directed his employees to provide detailed updates on their recent work and future plans. In an internal email sent on Tuesday afternoon, Musk asked all staff to submit a onepage summary of what they had accomplished in the past four weeks and what they intended to achieve in the next four weeks. The deadline for submission is noon on Thursday, according to a copy of the email obtained by CNN

The move comes as xAI undergoes a major reorganisation. Last

than 500 data annotators, most of whom were part of its generalist AI tutor team, as the firm pivots toward specialised AI instructors in fields such as STEM, finance, medicine, and safety. In a follow-up email, xAI explained that it aimed to scale down generalist roles while expanding specialised AI tutor positions by "10X." Musk also confirmed through a post on X that the company is actively hiring across domains

This is not the first time Musk has implemented such measures. In August 2024, The Verge reported that employees at X (formerly Twitter) were also instructed to submit onepage briefs of their contributions, which were tied to stock option allocations based on performance and projected impact. At that time, Musk warned that failure to respond would be considered a resignation

Musk has long been known for his unconventional management style. When he acquired Twitter in 2022, he once asked engineers to print out recent lines of code they had written, only to later instruct them to shred the printouts. His latest directive at xAI reflects a continued push for accountability and performance-based evaluation as the company navigates its strategic shift toward specialised AI development

ndian equity markets extended their positive run on Thursday following global cues after the US Federal Reserve cut interest rates by 25 basis points, bringing the benchmark rate to 4-4.25%. The S&P BSE Sensex surged over 350 points to trade above 83,000, while the NSE Nifty50 crossed 25,400 in early trade. Broader market indices also recorded gains, with volatility remaining stable.

Dr. VK Vijayakumar, Chief Investment Strat-

ments, described the Fed's 25 bp rate cut as a "risk management cut," highlighting uncertainties around economic activity, unemployment, and inflation. He added that with the US labor market cooling and GDP growth projected at 1.6% for 2025, further rate cuts are possible, creating a favourable environment for global and domestic markets. Despite this, Indian stocks are largely driven by expectations of corporate earnings revival and positive devel-

opments in India-US trade negotiations.

On the domestic front, Niftv50 closed Wednesday at 25,330, marking gains in 11 of the last 13 sessions and recovering over 900 points from its recent low of 24,404 on August 29. Analysts noted that the Nifty remains in an uptrend, with support near 25,150 and resistance levels at 25,550 and 25,670.

IT stocks led the gains, with Infosys and Wipro seeing notable increases, while investor activity included major

GST Inversion Eases, But Input-Output Rate Gaps Worry Industry



he recent GST rate rationalisation in India has eased the inverted duty structure (IDS) across many sectors, but wide gaps between input and output tax rates continue to raise concerns for industry, particularly regarding working capital and refund processes. The removal of the 12 per cent slab and consolidation into two main rates of 5 per cent and 18 per cent has addressed most anomalies, yet items such as bicycles, tractors, fertilisers, and certain textiles still face inversion. For example, steel inputs attract 18 per cent GST, while final products like bicycles and e-bicycles are taxed at 5 per cent, creating potential

capital blockage. In the textile sector, GST cuts on manmade fibres and yarn have largely corrected inversion, with about 80 per cent of the value chain now aligned. However, minor inversions remain in polyester fibre raw materials and textile machinery, where input tax at 18 per cent exceeds the final product's 5 per cent rate. A textile industry executive noted that the wide rate difference, though smaller than before, continues to pose working capital challenges and highlighted the importance of a smooth refund mechanism.

Similarly, in the fertiliser sector, GST on key inputs such as sulphuric acid, nitric acid, and ammonia has been reduced from 18 per cent to 5 per cent. Yet packaging costs and government subsidies can still result in inversion, as final product prices may fall below input costs. Officials involved in GST rationalisation acknowledged these transitional issues but emphasized that majority of IDS cases have

been corrected, with expected savings for the fertiliser sector reaching Rs 5,000 crore annually due to lower refund outgo.

Industry experts caution that while progress has been made, residual inversions could incentivize evasion if refunds are delayed or capital remains blocked, underscoring the need for efficient implementation and monitoring. The government continues to refine rates and streamline processes to minimise such bottlenecks and support industrial



Premium hatchbacks and sedans are also included, with Swift down by Rs 84,600, Baleno by Rs 86,100, Dzire by Rs 87,700, Fronx and Brezza by over Rs 1.1 lakh, Grand Vitara by Rs 1.07 lakh, Jimny by



46,400, and XL6 by Rs 52,000. Commercial vehicles like Invicto, Eeco, and Super Carry LCV will see reductions of up to Rs 68,000.

Partho Banerjee, Senior Executive Officer (Marketing & Sales) at Maruti Suzuki India, said the company is reducing prices of small cars over and above the 8.5% GST cut to boost motorisation in India, noting the low car penetration of 34 vehicles per 1,000 people. Exchange Board of India (SEBI) is reviewing a proposal to allow foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) to trade in noncash settled, non-agricultural commodity derivative contracts, SEBI Chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey said on Wednesday. The move is aimed at strengthening India's domestic commodity markets and attracting greater foreign participation.

Speaking at the MCX Metals and Energy Summit 2025 in Mumbai, Pandey highlighted that SEBI has already set up a committee to suggest measures for

tural commodities segment. "We are actively looking at ways to develop the non-agricultural commodity space, including metals, and a dedicated working group will be constituted for this purpose," he

The proposed change would enable FPIs to participate in derivative contracts beyond cash-settled agricultural commodities, potentially enhancing market liquidity and offering international investors broader avenues in India's commodities market. Currently, FPI participation in commodity deriva-

ed, limiting foreign inflows and investment opportunities.

Pandey emphasized that expanding FPI access to non-agri commodity derivatives aligns with SEBI's broader goal of deepening financial markets while maintaining robust regulatory oversight. The regulator is also exploring other measures to improve transparency, risk management, and market participation across commodity segments.



Fibre plays multiple roles in the body. It feeds beneficial gut bacteria, regulates digestion, supports healthy cholesterol and blood sugar levels, and prevents constipation.

These combined effects may explain why people who consume fibrerich diets tend to live longer and healthier lives. However, experts caution that most findings come from observational studies, meaning they show definitive proof.

The 24-year-old narrowly missed out on the bronze medal, but his effort drew praise as he outshone Olympic champion and India's star javelin thrower Neeraj Chopra, who endured a rare off day

Chopra, who has won medals at every major event since the Tokyo Olympics in 2021, could only manage a best

throw of 84.03m—below his qualification mark of 84.85m—and finished outside the medal bracket. The result marks the first time in four years that the ace thrower returned empty-handed from an international competition. Meanwhile, Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem, the reigning Olympic gold medallist, also struggled on the big stage and ended in 10th place

The javelin final saw fierce competition at the top, with Trinidad and Tobago's Keshorn Walcott clinching the gold medal with a season-best throw of 88.16m. Grena-

da's Anderson Peters. the two-time world champion, secured silver with 87.38m, while USA's Curtis Thompson grabbed bronze with 86.67m—just 40 centimetres ahead of Yadav Though Yadav missed the podium by a whisker, his break through performance has put him in the spotlight as India's next big javelin hope. Athletics experts hailed his consistency and compo

sure under pressure, noting that his 86.27m throw would have been good enough for a medal in many past championships. As for Chopra, fans and analysts expect the Olympic champion to bounce back stron gly ahead of next season's competitions. including
