yderabad, Sept 19: Mr. Revanth Reddy, the Chief Minister of , has announced ambitious plans to significantly expand the network and its daily ridership over the coming years. Speaking to the media on Friday, Revanth Reddy said that currently around five lakh passengers are using the metro every day, and the government is formulating strategies to increase that number to 15 lakh within the next five years.

The Chief Minister explained that the state government is preparing a comprehensive roadmap to strengthen the city's public transport infrastructure. This includes proposals for new metro lines, improved feeder services, and enhanced last-mile connectivity. Revanth emphasized that the metro system plays a crucial role in reducing traffic congestion, pollution, and travel time for urban commuters. He added that a large portion of the state's urban development budget would be allocated to expanding the metro network and integrating it with other modes of transport like city buses and suburban

KTR Slams Revanth Over Silence on Karnataka's Almatti Plan

yderabad, Sept 19: Escalating the political confrontation in , (BRS) working president (KTR) on Saturday launched a blistering attack on Chief Minister for what he described as "deafening silence" over 's recent decision to raise the height of the from 519 feet to 524 feet.

KTR warned that the proposed increase in the dam's height posed a "direct and grave threat" to Telangana's irrigation projects and farmers, especially in the erstwhile , and districts, which depend heavily on water inflows from the . He described Karnataka's move as "nothing short of a death warrant for Telangana's farmers" and demanded that the State government immediately pursue both legal remedies and public protests to safeguard Telangana's riparian rights.

'While the Karnataka Congress government is openly jeopardising our water security, our Chief Minister is busy touring Delhi and staying silent. This negligence could leave vast stretches of our state barren," KTR said, addressing media representatives. He accused Revanth Reddy of

putting political camaraderie with the in Karnataka ahead of the interests of Telangana's people.

The BRS leader pointed out that it had been three days since the Cabinet cleared the proposal to raise the dam height, yet the Telangana government had not issued even a formal statement or lodged an objection with the.

"This silence is unacceptable. If the government continues to remain a mute spectator, BRS will not hesitate to launch a massive people's agitation to protect ers," KTR warned. He also called for an all-party meeting to formulate a joint strategy and urged the Telangana government to immediately seek a stay on the project through legal channels, citing the interstate water-sharing agreements and the jurisdiction of

KTR's remarks come amid growing concerns among Telangana's farming community that the proposed elevation of the Almatti dam could further reduce water availability downstream, potentially crippling irrigation projects such as the and jeopardising crop cycles in the southern districts.

While the Telangana government has yet to respond officially, political observers say KTR's aggressive stance signals the BRS's intent to position itself as the defender of Telangana's water and agrarian interests, especially as it seeks to regain lost ground ahead of upcoming elections.

The issue is expected to spark a major political flashpoint between the ruling Congress and the opposition BRS in Telangana, with water-sharing disputes once again returning to the centre stage of state politics.



Officials' Apathy Stalls Repossession of Encroached Tribal Lands in

administrative apathy, revenue officials in are reportedly dragging their feet in reclaiming tribal (agency) lands that have been encroached upon in of . Despite explicit directives from , the Project Officer (PO) of ITDA, to immediately take the lands into government custody, local revenue authorities have alleged-

ly failed to act. The issue came to light over seven months ago when re-

businessmen had illegally occupied tribal lands in survey numbers 17 and 18 of Muthyampet village. According to local sources, the encroachers seized about 1.12 acres of land — including 34 guntas previously earmarked for distribution as house sites to landless tribal families — and even set up an unauthorised mini rice mill without obtaining any permissions or a trade license

influential non-tribal chayat. The village is categorised as an agency area where protective laws such as and are in force, which prohibit land transfers to non-tribals.

Following media reports and multiple complaints from villagers, the Utnoor ITDA PO ordered a detailed probe and directed the to survey the disputed lands. Even, the District Collector of Mancherial, instructed the additional collector to ensure a


full inquiry into the illegal rice mill. Under mounting pressure, the Mandal Revenue Inspector Bhuman and surveyor Vinod conducted a field inspection on January 2 and confirmed that the 1.12 acres were indeed encroached. They submitted their report to the Tahsildar, who forwarded it to the ITDA

Acting on this, the ITDA PO issued written orders on February 6, instructing the Tahsildar to take possesagency land and ensure police security during the eviction to maintain law and order. Minister Directs Coordinated Rain Response for Hyderabad

tent heavy rains, Hyderabad In-charge Minister Ponnam ■Prabhakar held a crucial teleconference with officials from multiple departments to ensure a coordinated and effective response.1 The meeting included top brass from the GHMC, Police, Hyderabad Metro Water Works, Traffic, District Revenue, Electricity, and Health departments. Citing the severe difficulties faced by residents over the past three days and a weather forecast warning of more heavy rainfall ahead, the Minister issued a series of urgent directives aimed at public safety and swift relief operations.

Minister Prabhakar stressed the importance of readiness, instructing officials to be on continuous duty and to immediately address any complaints, particularly from people in low-lying areas.2 To facilitate public communication, he mandated that toll-free helpline numbers be widely publicized through television and social media. The Minister also called for re-



habilitation centers to be fully equipped with all necessary facilities displaced residents.

Emphasizing the need to prevent accidents, he ordered the deployment of police personnel at railway underbridges to guide motorists safely. GHMC staff were instructed to constantly monitor manholes to prevent accidents, while the public was advised to exercise extreme caution around electric poles and wires.3 The Minister also directed officials to use mobile messaging to send timely alerts to residents about potential heavy rainfall and to appeal to them to avoid leaving their homes unless absolutely necessary during peak intensity.

Has Britain gone too far with its digital controls?

Authorities say the tool boosts safety, but critics see a dangerous expansion of state surveillance.

The embrace of facial recognition is part of a wider push under Prime Minister Keir Starmer to deploy advanced technology in governance. Moves in-

clude expanding oversight of online speech, introducing stricter age and verification checks for digital platforms like Instagram and Reddit, pushing back against encrypted services, and experimenting with artificial intelligence to process asylum claims. Civil liberties groups warn ernment officials argue they are pragmatic measures to protect citizens in the digital era.

"There's a big question about what is freedom and what is safety," said Ryan Wain of the Tony Blair Institute for Global Change, which supports the policies. Britain's Department for Science, Innovation and Technology said citizens expected the state to use modern tools against crime, child exploitation, and border threats, while pledging that freedoms would be safeguarded.

The new online safe-

ty law has stirred controversy. Child safety advocates back it. but opponents, including Nigel Farage, call it decisions in sensitive censorship and "borderline dystopian." Ofcom CEO Melanie Dawes defended the law, stressing it aims to protect children, not stifle speech. The issue has also drawn criticism from the US, with Donald Trump's administration and lawmakers condemning Britain's policies as attacks on free speech and American tech

ry safeguards. Supporters see these measures as necessary modernization, while detractors warn of eroding liberties. As Britain becomes a test case for how democracies balance security, privacy, and technological change, the debate over surveillance and digital governance is only intensifying.

Cancer vaccine: From Russia with hope

tial vaccine for cancer have ignited global hope in the fight against a disease that has claimed millions of lives for centuries. Russian scientists have announced that a vaccine developed by their teams has demonstrated 100% efficacy in early-stage clinical trials, raising optimism about a breakthrough in cancer treatment.

The vaccine, developed jointly by Russia's National Medical Research Radiology Centre and the Engelhardt Institute of Molecular Biology, was tested on 48 patients diagnosed with colorectal cancer. Early results indicate that the vaccine not only shrank tumors but also slowed

their growth, with no severe side effects reported. The vaccine employs modern techniques, including mRNA (messenger RNA) technology, which has been widely used in the development of COVID-19 vaccines by companies such as Pfizer and Moderna. This technology works by instructing the immune system to recognize and destroy cancer cells through tumor-specific antigens

Preliminary work on vaccines targeting other types of cancer is already underway, and initial pre-clinical trials have reportedly shown positive outcomes. Experts caution, however, that these findings are still at an early stage. Extensive large-scale clinical trials across genetically diverse populations and different geographic regions are necessary before the vaccine can be declared fully effective and market-ready. The appearance of side effects over time also remains a possibility, making long-term evaluation crucial.

Nitish, Shah discuss seat-sharing strategy for poll-bound Bihar

he political chessboard in Bihar saw a key move as Chief Minister Nitish Kumar of Janata Dal (United) met Home Minister Amit Shah of the BJP on Friday to discuss poll strategy ahead of upcoming elections. The meeting, held at a highend Patna hotel, marked the first formal interaction between Nitish and Shah since JD(U) joined

the NDA to form the state government last year, drawing significant attention from political observers.

Sources indicated that the leaders discussed broad contours of seatsharing, with JD(U) reportedly demanding at least one more seat than the BJP to maintain its symbolic dominance within the alliance. As per the current Bihar Assembly composition, BJP is the single largest party in the ruling 131-member NDA bloc with 80 seats, followed by JD(U) with 45 seats and Hindustan Awam Morcha's four. Allies like LJP and Rashtriya Lok Morcha will divide the remaining seats.

The preliminary understanding reportedly suggests BJP contesting 100 seats, JD(U) 101, while smaller allies get the rest. The LJP, led by Chirag Paswan, has demanded 45 seats, but BJP sources indicated they could get only 20-25. In 2020, LJP contested separately, which impacted JD(U)'s prospects in multiple constituencies.

Meanwhile, the Opposition Mahagathbandhan, comprising RJD, Congress, and left par-ties, is focusing on the Election Commission's ongoing special revision of electoral rolls in Bihar as a key poll plank. Congress leader Rahul Gandhi has raised allegations of voter roll manipulation, which the EC has rejected, setting the stage for an intense political battle.

Mann also responded to opposition BJP and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's claims that Punjab had Rs 12,000 crore sitting unused in its State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF). He clarified that the actual balance in the SDRF is under Rs 2,000 crore, detailing annual receipts and expenditures since 2010-11. "The BJP simply added a zero to the actual amount," Mann

The Chief Minister further claimed that the Centre has withheld Rs 8,000 crore from Punjab's Rural Development Fund (RDF), which collects a three percent cess on agricultural produce to maintain roads and mandis, and has not released Rs 50,000 crore due as the state's share of Goods and Services Tax revenue. He said the state could manage flood relief operations using these funds without requiring a special package.

Punjab has faced its worst floods in decades due to overflowing Sutlej, Beas, and Ravi rivers, heavy rainfall in Himachal Pradesh, Jammu and Kashmir, and within the state. The floods have affected nearly four lakh people across more than 2,000 villages, caused 55 deaths, and damaged crops on 1.93 lakh hectares.

Relief operations con-

tinue with 14 Army columns, eight NDRF teams, two SDRF teams, and two Engineer Task Force teams deployed. Mann's remarks came after the Centre announced Rs 1,600 crore in aid, which he deemed insufficient compared to the scale of the disaster.

The Chief Minister urged immediate release of pending funds and stressed that state authorities are prepared to use all available resources for relief and rehabilitation.

Assam Rifles Jawan Killed, Three Injured in Manipur Ambush

iolence erupted once again in Manipur's Bishnupur district on Friday evening when armed men ambushed a vehicle carrying Assam Rifles personnel, leaving one jawan dead and at least three others injured. Officials confirmed that the attack took place around 6 pm in the Nambol Sabal Leikai area as the security personnel were moving towards Bishnupur from Imphal.

According to initial reports, a group of unidentified gunmen opened heavy fire on the vehicle, catching the jawans off guard. One soldier died on the spot while three sustained injuries during the sudden burst of gunfire. The injured were immediately rushed to a nearby hospital by police and local residents, who assisted in the rescue operations amid the chaos. Their condition is being monitored closely by doctors.

Security forces quickly cordoned off the area and launched a massive search operation to track down the attackers. Additional reinforcements have been rushed to the spot to secure the region and prevent further escalation. The identity of the armed assailants is vet to be confirmed, but

intelligence agencies are investigating possible links to militant groups active in the state

This ambush underscores the continuing instability in Manipur, which has been grappling with months of ethnic tension, armed clashes, and insurgent activities. Officials fear that such targeted attacks could further heighten insecurity in the troubled state.

Pakistan ATC Rejects PTI Plea Against Imran Khan's Video Link Appearance

n anti-terrorism court (ATC) in Rawalpindi on Friday dismissed a petition filed by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) challenging the arrangement for party founder Imran Khan to appear via video link in the General Headquarters (GHQ) attack case. Imran, imprisoned in Adiala Jail since August 2023, was expected to attend the hearing remotely. His counsel argued that a fair trial required his physical presence, but the court upheld the video arrangement.

Prosecutor Zaheer Shah opposed the plea, citing the Punjab gov-



der transferring trial proceedings to the ATC. He stressed that amendments to the Code of Criminal Procedure and the Anti-Terrorism Act allow courts to decide trial procedures, including appearances via video link. Shah added that challenging the arrangement would delay the trial, though the defence could approach a higher court against the transfer

notification. During the hearing, testimonies of two prosecution witnesses, Sub-Inspectors Saleem Qureshi and Manzoor Shahzad, were recorded. They presented 13 USB drives containing 40 video clips of Imran related to the May 9, 2023 protests, as well as clips of other PTI leadincluded CCTV footage from key locations in Rawalpindi, such as Benazir Bhutto Road, Mall Road, and Liaquat

The ATC also summoned 10 additional witnesses from the Pakistan Electronic Media Regulatory Authority, the Federal Investigation Agency, the PTI, the Press Information Department, and interior ministry for the next hearing.

Imran was indicted

in the GHQ attack case on December 5, 2024, and was arrested in January 2024 under the May 9 protest case. The court proceedings continue while he remains in custody, with the trial expected to examine extensive digital evidence related to the unrest that followed his

GST 2.0 to Benefit Rural, Urban Households with Lower Rates

over 75% of items purchased by rural Indians and 66% of items bought by urban households will attract either a nil Goods and Services Tax (GST) or a 5% rate, according to a new analysis by the Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce & Industry (FICCI). The report, prepared by the Thought Arbitrage Research Institute (TARI) for FICCI's Committee Against Smuggling and Counterfeiting Activities Destroying the Economy (CASCADE), highlights a significant simplification and relief in the GST structure.

Currently, 56% of rural household expenditure and 50% of urban household expenditure is taxed at either nil or 5%. Under GST 2.0, the nil-rate slab will cover

29.9% of total items, accounting for 36.5% of rural expenditure and 32.9% of urban expenditure. The 5% slab will see a major expansion, comprising 40.5% of items and representing 38.8% of rural and 33.3% of urhousehold ban spending.

The 12% slab will be completely removed,

while the 18% rate will reduce slightly, covering 23.1% of items and accounting for 12.3% of rural and 14.1% of urban spending. High-tax items, including those in the 28% and 40% slabs under GST 2.0, will account for a minimal share—0.5% of items and just 0.2% of rural

penditure data, showing that the new structure benefits consumers by reducing the tax burden on frequently purchased essentials. Analysts suggest that the GST 2.0 reforms will likely boost consumption, particularly in rural areas, and support overall economic growth.

With more items moving into lower GST slabs and the elimination of the 12% rate, households across India can expect savings on daily essentials, while simplifying compliance for businesses. The new GST structure marks a step toward making taxation more equitable and consumer-friendly, with rural consumers gaining the maximum advantage.



Rupee Dips to 88.27 Amid Dollar Strength, Equity Decline

he Indian rupee slipped 7 paise to 88.27 against the US dollar in early Friday trade, reflecting broad dollar strength and a weak trend in domestic equities. The rupee opened at 88.22 in the interbank market before hitting the day's low of 88.27, continuing the modest decline seen on Thursday when it fell 35 paise to 88.20.

Forex traders attributed the depreciation to a recovery in the US dollar and concerns over potential US tariffs on Indian goods, which weighed on investor sentiment. CR Forex Advisors MD Amit Pabari noted that while the rupee has stumbled after recent gains, supportive trade developments and firm domestic confidence could provide

room for appreciation. Key support is placed at 87.70, with further levels at 87.50 and 87.20 if the downtrend continues, while resistance is seen around 88.40.

Globally, weekly US jobless claims fell sharply by 33,000, surpassing market estimates and boosting the dollar index toward the 97 mark after briefly dipping below 96. The dollar index, which measures the greenback against a basket of six currencies, stood at 97.34, down 0.01%. Brent crude futures edged lower by 0.09% to USD 67.38 per barrel.

Domestic equities mirrored the cautious sentiment, with the Sensex falling 264.36 points to 82,749.60 and the Nifty dropping 65 points to 25.358.60 in early trade. Foreign Institutional Investors bought equities worth Rs 366.69 crore on a net basis on Thursday.

Meanwhile, India-US trade talks are progressing, with Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal highlighting discussions with Assistant US Trade Representative Brendan Lynch in New Delhi on September 16. The talks are seen as crucial following the US decision to impose a 50% tariff on certain Indian goods, and positive outcomes could ease pressure on both trade and the currency.

The rupee's movement will remain sensitive to global dollar trends, oil prices, equity performance, and ongoing trade negotiations, with traders keeping a close watch on developments in these areas.

Supreme Court to Hear Vodafone Idea AGR Plea on September 26

he Supreme Court on Friday agreed to hear on September 26 a fresh plea filed by telecom major Vodafone Idea Ltd seeking to quash additional adjusted gross revenue (AGR) demands for the period up to 2016-17. A bench comprising Chief Justice B.R. Gavai and Justices K. Vinod Chandran and N.V. Anjaria scheduled the hearing after taking note of submissions by senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi for Vodafone Idea and Solicitor General Tushar Mehta representing the Centre.

Vodafone Idea has requested the Department of Telecommunications (DoT) to "comprehensively reassess and reconcile all AGR dues for the period up to FY 2016-17" in ac-



cordance with the Deduction Verification Guidelines issued in February 2020. The company argues that there were arithmetical errors and duplicate entries in the earlier calculation of AGR dues.

which, if corrected, could significantly reduce the liability.

This plea comes after the Supreme Court earlier this year refused to review its 2021 order, which had rejected similar requests from telecom majors including Bharti Airtel and Vodafone Idea. The top court had held that the DoT's demand regarding AGR dues was final and barred any re-assessment or dispute by telecom operators.

The AGR issue dates back to the Supreme Court's October 2019 verdict, which held telecom companies liable for 93,520 crore of dues. To ease the financial burden, the court allowed a staggered payment over ten years, starting with 10% of the total dues by March 31, 2021, and annual installments from April 2021 to March 2031.

Vodafone Idea's latest plea indicates that the company is seeking a recalculation based on perceived errors, reflecting ongoing challenges for the telco sector in clearing AGR dues. The Supreme Court will consider the arguments on September 26, potentially providing clarity on the contentious issue that has affected India's telecom industry for years.

US vs Russia

s US-Russia tensions intensify in a new Cold Warstyle standoff, the two powers are ramping up their undersea military posturing. In response to former Russian President Dmitry Medvedev's warning of Russia's "dead hand" nuclear retaliation system, US President Donald Trump has ordered the repositioning of two nuclear submarines to strategic waters.

This high-stakes move follows Moscow's dismissal of Trump's threats over tariffs and sanctions. Medvedev invoked "dead hand," a Cold War-era semi-automated nuclear strike system designed to launch a counterattack even if Russia's leadership is destroyed.

Russian lawmaker Viktor Vodolatsky responded to Trump's deployment, claiming that Russian nuclear submarine activity outmatches that of the US globally. "The submarines the US ordered to reposition are already tracked and surrounded," he said.

New Curiosity Discovery Points to Mars' Watery Past

discovery, NASA's Curiosity Rover has uncovered new evidence suggesting that liquid water once existed on Mars, potentially supporting life in the planet's distant past. The find was made using the rover's Mars Hand Lens Imager (MAHLI) — a camera located on the end of its robotic arm which captured a striking image of a coralshaped, wind-eroded rock in the Gale Crater.

NASA scientists believe the flower-like rock formation, roughly 1 inch (2.5 cm) wide, was created by minerals deposited by ancient water flows, later shaped by billions of

resembles ocean-bottom corals found on Earth, prompting further interest in Mars' ancient, possibly habitable environment.

The rover recently entered a region on Mount Sharp, the towering 5-kilometer-high mountain within Gale Crater, filled with boxwork formations hardened ridges formed by underground water activity billions of years ago. NASA says these formations may offer vital clues about whether microbial life once thrived below Mars' surface.

Curiosity, which landed on Mars on August 5, 2012, has spent over 13 years exploring answering the pivotal question: Could Mars have ever supported life? Despite the rover's age, engineers are continually enhancing its capabilities to ensure it continues to deliver valuable scientific

This latest discovery not only strengthens the hypothesis that Mars had liquid water, but also pushes the boundaries of how long the Red Planet might have remained habitable as it slowly lost its atmosphere. With each finding, Curiosity brings humanity closer to understanding the mysterious history of Mars — and whether it once had the right con-

OpenAI's GPT-5 Nears Release, Smarter Al But Smaller Leap

penAI is preparing to launch its nextgeneration AI model, GPT-5, the successor to the powerful GPT-4 that helped make ChatGPT a global phenomenon in 2022. The model's release is said to be imminent, raising anticipation across the tech world for what could be another step forward in genera-

tive AI capa bilities. OpenAI CEO Sam Altman has hinted throughout the year that GPT-5 will bring together the strengths of large-scale models and test-time compute, a technique where more computing resources are allocated during inference for improved results. This combination could make GPT-5 more adaptive and accurate across a broader

range of tasks. According to two early testers who spoke to Reuters on condition of anonymity due to non-disclosure agreements, GPT-5 has shown notable improvements in coding, mathematics, and scien-

tific problem-solving. However, they noted that while it is more capable and refined than GPT-4, the leap in performance and intelligence may not be as dramatic as the jump from GPT-3 to

GPT-4, launched in 2023, was praised for its multimodal abilities and more accurate reasoning. It powered the premium versions of ChatGPT and was later integrated into Microsoft products and numerous enterprise tools. GPT-5 is expected to expand on these capabilities, potentially with enhanced memory, better real-world grounding, and increased reliability.

While OpenAI has not announced an official release date, the testing phase suggests that a public launch could happen soon. With AI safety, alignment, and regulation becoming central concerns globally, GPT-5's release will also likely reignite debates about responsible AI development and the pace of innovation in the space.






