SPARKS POLITICAL CIRCLES WITH FRESH STORM

yderabad, Sept 20: Telangana politics once again witnessed fireworks as Member of Legislative Council (MLC) and Jagruthi president K. Kavitha came before the media on Friday. Known for her sharp words and controversial statements, Kavitha has often left leaders unsettled irrespective of whether they belong to her own party or to the opposition. True to her reputation, her latest press interaction triggered another round of intense debate in the state's political circles.

Addressing reporters, Kavitha alleged that she has become the primary target of coordinated attacks from different factions within the political spectrum. She specifically named the Bharat Rashtra Samithi's (BRS)



social media teams, MLA Harish Rao's supporters online, and what she described as Santosh Rao's "secret media" as orchestrating a smear campaign against her. "Everyone is targeting me," she declared, accusing her critics of deliberately trying to malign her image. Kavitha's most strik-

ing remark, however, came in the form of a warning to the Congress government in Telangana. Referring to the demand for 42 percent reservations for Backward Classes (BCs), she cautioned that if the state government failed to take a decision on the issue soon, she and her supporters would launch protests outside the residences of the Chief Minister and his ministers. "The government cannot afford to delay on such a crucial matter. If they ig-

nore BC rights, we will lay siege to their homes," she said firmly.

The MLC also shed light on her own political journey, revealing that she had already tendered her resignation to the Chairman of the Legislative Council in the Speaker's prescribed format. "I have formally resigned from my position. I do not understand why the acceptance of my resignation is being de-layed," she remarked. She added that she had no attachment to the post, reminding that she had earlier declined positions offered through the BRS and was now once again stepping away on principle.

Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka's Address on Women's Empowerment

yderabad, Sept 20: Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu, speaking at an interest-free loan distribution event in Yousufguda, affirmed the government's commitment to women's financial independence. He declared that the government is prepared to invest any amount necessary to empower women and eliminate their need to rely on high-interest moneylenders. He noted that for the past decade, women's self-help groups had been neglected, but the new administration is actively reviving sup-

The leaders also addressed the lack of funds for gram panchayats, which they said is causing darkness in villages.5 Ramana Reddy accused Chief Minister Revanth Reddy of being afraid to hold local elections, claiming the CM has avoided the topic in Delhi.6 They demanded that funds—₹5 lakh for large gram panchayats and ₹3 lakh for smaller ones-be allocated im-

mediately to improve fa-

cilities, especially for the upcoming Bathukamma and Dasara festivals.7 They called on Minister Seethakka to respond promptly and criticized the CM for speaking like an opposition leader, not focusing on village development.

Both leaders also raised concerns about the Singareni workers' share of profits, questioning why the government has not yet made an announcement, something that never happened during the previous BRS government's tenure.8 They ridiculed the CM's recent statements on political defections, calling them laughable and against the constitution.

Gellu Srinivas Yadav specifically accused Re-

vanth Reddy of hypocri sy, noting that Rahul Gandhi advocates for the constitution while Revanth Reddy violates it by welcoming defecting MLAs with party scarves and even giving them Congress tickets to contest as MPs.9 He pointed out the case of Danam Nagender as an example of a defection. Yadav also criticized the government's decision to go to the High Court Division Bench on the Group-1 exam issue, saying it is a bad move and accusing the CM of following "Trump's policies."10 Both leaders asserted that the Congress will lose in any upcoming elections and demanded that the CM apologize for his re-

Seizure of Illicit Liquor in Hyderabad and Ranga Reddy

he Excise Enforce-ment teams of Hyderabad and Ranga Reddy have seized a large quantity of non-duty paid liquor (NDPL) in a major crackdown. These coordinated operations led to the confiscation of 585 bottles of illicit liquor, with an estimated value of 21.80 lakhs.

The Ranga Reddy team, led by AES Jeevan Kiran, seized 449 bottles of liquor, valued at 15 lakhs, during vehicle inspections at Pahad Sharif. The seized bottles were from Goa, Delhi, and Haryana, and were being transported in small quantities by different individuals.

In a separate operation, teams in Hyderabad and Secunderabad confiscated 136 bottles of NDPL, with an estimated value of ₹6.80 lakhs. Raids were conducted in Dhulpet,



near Secunderabad Railway Station, and in the Pista House area.

According to officials, these raids are part of an ongoing effort to prevent revenue loss to the state of Telangana. They have warned that bringing even a single bottle of liquor from other states is a violation of the Telangana Excise Act. The enforcement teams will continue their raids, especially leading up to the Dussehra festival.

In the twin cities, DTF teams raided Sridevi Lodge and confiscated 34 bottles from a specific room. An additional 34 bottles were seized from an individual in front of the Alpha Hotel. In the Ameerpet area, an excise team seized 22 bottles near the SR Nagar New Bus

actions highlight the prevalence of smallscale smuggling.

The crackdown extended to other parts of the state as well. In Kamareddy, a tip-off about a house containing illegal liquor led to a search operation, where excise personnel successfully found and seized 55 bottles. Furthermore, the Excise STFA team, under the leadership of Anji Reddy, intercepted four individuals in the Almasguda area. These individuals were found to be in possession of 51 bottles of defense-grade liquor that had been illegally sourced from

immediately registered against all four suspects.

The Prohibition and Excise Enforcement Director, Shanwaz Qasim, along with Deputy Commissioners Anil Kumar Reddy and others, praised the teams for their dedicated efforts. The department has reiterated its commitment to continuing these operations to enforce the law and prevent revenue loss. team from the Cvbercrimes unit of the Hyderabad City Police has arrested a man from Punjab in connection with a major trading fraud. The suspect, Gurdit Singh, 27, was apprehended for his role as an account holder and operator in a scam that defrauded a 64-year-old freelancer in Hyderabad of over ₹86 lakhs

The investigation began after the victim filed a complaint, detailing how he was lured into a fraudulent trading scheme through a WhatsApp message in April 2025. The scammer promised high returns on daily trading and used a fake app to display inflated profits. This convinced the victim to invest large sums of money. The victim eventually grew suspicious when the scammer pressured him for more investments and blocked him from withdrawing his



The police determined the scammers' method involved building trust through friendly conversations, presenting themselves as trading experts, and showing fake profits to encourage larger investments. They also used "tax" and "withdrawal fees" as excuses to demand more money from their victims.

The successful operation was led by Inspector of Police K. Satish Reddy under the supervision of ACP R.G. Siva Maruthi. Authorities



Survivors Call for Stronger Anti-Trafficking Framework in Andhra Pradesh and Across India

Lakshmi* and Parvathi*(names Changed) spent months, even years, confined in shelter homes after their rescue. "We didn't know our rights. No one asked if we wanted to stay there," they say. Their experience reflects a national failure — policies made about survivors, without consulting them.

drags on for years.

"Our time in shelter homes was deeply distressing. We spent months—sometimes years—there without knowing when we would be allowed to leave," recalls Anjali* (name changed), a 21-year-old survivor leader from Andhra Pradesh. Her experi

ence reflects the stark reality faced by many survivors of trafficking who are institutionalised after rescue.

"We were kept in the dark — unaware of our rights and unable to reach the decision-makers who determined our futures," adds Parvathi* (name changed), another survivor leader. "No one ever asked if we wanted to stay in a shelter home," she says, highlighting a critical gap: policies affecting survivors are often drafted without their participation or consideration of lived realities.

Lakshmi is clear about the way forward: "Survivors must be recognised as stakeholders and have a voice in policies that shape our lives." She spoke at the State-Level Consultation on "Paving Better Lives for Women and Girls" held on 4 August 2025 at Fortune Murali Park, Vijayawada, organised by VMM, Mahila Sanghala Ikya Vedika, and Dignity for Women.

A Collective Voice Emerges

state-level forum of trafficking survivors and victims of commercial sexual exploitation. now has over 500 members across eight districts of Andhra Pradesh. For years, survivors like Lakshmi and Parvathi fought for their rights in scattered efforts at the district level. "Our issues rarely reached the State or National stage. VIMUKTHI gives us the platform to make our voices heard at the highest level," says Bajamma, a survivor leader from Addanki.

The forum serves as a platform to share knowledge, build evidence from survivor experiences, and push for systemic reforms. Members argue that trafficking persists in India due to institutional gaps and systemic failures — gaps they believe survivor expertise can help close. "We want to use our experience to strengthen the antitrafficking ecosystem," says Ramani, another VIMUKTHI leader.

The Scope of the Problem:

Human trafficking remains one of the gravest human rights violations worldwide. In India, victims include men, women, and children exploited for sexual purposes, forced marriages, bonded labour, and even forced begging. According to the National Crime Records Bureau, three out of every five trafficking victims at the national level are children. In the state of Andhra Pradesh between 2017 and 2022, 1,972 women and girls were reported trafficked, including 155 girls below 18 years. In the same period, 2,106

were under 18. In Andhra Pradesh, districts such as Krishna, Guntur, Prakasam, and parts of Rayalaseema are trafficking hotspots, driven by poverty, migration, and deeprooted social vulnerabilities. Survivors and activists say weak laws, poor rehabilitation measures, and lack of accountability enable the crime to persist.

A Call for Stronger Legislation

VIMUKTHI leaders are pressing for a comprehensive anti-trafficking law that covers all forms of exploitation — including sex trafficking, bonded labour, forced labour, and servitude. They want the earlier Trafficking of Persons (Prevention, Protection and Rehabilitation) Bill, 2018 to be revived, strengthened, and passed with stronger deterrence measures and better conviction rates.

Equally important is community-based rehabilitation. Survivors stress that reintegration should prioritise education, livelihood opportunities, and social acceptance. "Recovery does not happen in isolation — it happens when survivors can live and work with dignity,' says Parvathi.

Implementing NHRC Directions

The National Human Rights Commission's (NHRC) 1st and 2nd advisories (5 October 2020 and 31 May 2021) recommend that sex

workers be recognised as informal workers entitled to all relevant welfare schemes and services. However, no department in Andhra Pradesh has acted on these directions.

Lakshmi, VIMUK-THI's treasurer, is calling for a state-level action plan to ensure better service delivery to sex workers, backed by effective monitoring

and accountability. Fast-Tracking Justice and Ensuring Compensation

Long legal battles are another major hurdle. "Many of us are still entangled in years of court proceedings," says Smt. Apurva, VIMUKTHI's president. Given the survivors' often precarious economic situations. these delays are devastating. The forum is demanding special fast-track courts for trafficking cases.

They also insist on reforms in victim compensation — ensuring it is not dependent solely on rescue status and that survivors are fully informed about available schemes. They demand penalties for officials or service providers who fail to do

A Growing Survivor-Led Movement

VIMUKTHI members are actively engaged in public awareness campaigns, policy advocacy, and capacitybuilding to equip survivor leaders to advocate directly. They are expanding their networks across Andhra Pradesh, building new survivor groups, and linking with grassroots

organisations. "We've only just begun and will not stop until a strong, effective system is in place to end trafficking — not just here, but across the country," says Apurva.

The message from these leaders is unambiguous: combating trafficking requires more than rescue operations. It demands an ecosystem that listens to survivor voices, delivers justice swiftly, and ensures rehabilitation with dignity. Only then can India dismantle the networks that prey on its most vulnerable




India, Pakistan & Cricket - A **Question of Sport or Strategy?**

modern Olympics began, the Subcontinent has only three individual gold medals. Yet when Neeraj Chopra faced Pakistan's Arshad Nadeem in Tokyo, there was no outrage, no trending debate. Contrast this with cricket, where the question of playing Pakistan sparks firestorms.

The irony is sharp. India, the world's fourth-largest economy with a powerful military, has punished terror outfits through operations like Sindoor. But many still argue cricket should serve as the new battlefield. Can cricket deliver justice that the armed forces couldn't?

If India boycotts Pakistan, it hands them walkovers. Pakistan, which has lost most cricket contests in the past 25 years, would gain automatic wins. Is justice for victims found in turning a near-perpetual loser into a permanent winner?



History proves otherwise. Social media outrage thrives because cricket

guarantees engagement. Other sports don't stir such frenzy, even though India now

dominates Pakistan in hockey too. Governments in the

past conceded games

against apartheid South Africa, or over Intifada killings. But those were multinational actions. A unilateral boycott today damages Indian cricket, gifts Pakistan victories, and undermines India's claim of being a strong, decisive power.

Realpolitik also matters. India leads world cricket, with enormous influence in ICC and Asian cricket bodies. Leaders like Jay Shah must work with Pakistan counterparts. Just as the Prime Minister couldn't walk out of an SCO group photo, sport can't be hostage to bilateral wounds.

The Modi government has been wise not to concede to populist outrage. Sport is not war. Indian cricket is no soldier in the fight against terror. To conflate the two is hypocrisy—and risks turning a position of strength into needless

Why Is Arvind Kejriwal **Attacking Congress's Gandhi Brand?**

AAP supremo and former Delhi chief minister, has sharpened his attack on the Congress party, particularly the Gandhi family. 

Addressing a massive rally at Puthur, Vijay said the government curtailed his free movement and even disrupted power during his speeches.

'CM sir, will you impose conditions during the Prime Minister or Home Minister's visit, or disrupt power as you do to the TVK? Numerous restrictions are imposed on me. I can't move my hands," he said, emphasizing that the contest in 2026 would be solely between the TVK and DMK. The crowd erupted with chants of "TVK, TVK", which Vijay highlighted in his address.

The actor alleged deliberate interference during his meetings: the speaker's wire was cut in Tiruchirappalli, and power was disrupted at Ariyalur, limiting him to just three minutes of speech. He warned the DMK against being "tyrannical" toward the TVK and stressed that his party is

supported by the people. Vijay also questioned Chief Minister M.K. Stalin's overseas trips, asking whether they were intended to secure investment for Tamil Nadu or for personal gain abroad. He criticized the DMK for neglecting development in Nagapattinam district, citing lack of a government marine college, poor tourism infrastructure, and insufficient industrial promotion.

On social issues, Vijav attacked the DMK for inaction on the fishermen and Sri Lankan Tamil problems, stating, "We are not DMK to write letters and remain silent. Our agenda is to ensure lasting solutions." He also criticized the BJP government for allegedly discriminating against Tamil Nadu fishermen.

Responding to critics of his weekend rally schedule, Vijay said the timings were designed to avoid public inconvenience and to allow certain political leaders rest, while ensuring maximum participation.

Birthday return gifts from your 'Abki baar, Trump sarkar' government!' Kharge warned that the fee hike could lead to estimated losses of 2.17



lakh crore across 10 sectors due to the HIRE Act and 50% tariffs targeting Indian outsourcing.

Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Rahul Gandhi, criticized Modi's diplomatic approach, tweeting, "I repeat, India has a weak PM." Deputy Leader Gaurav Gogoi highlighted that the hike threatens the future of India's brightest minds, while Manish Tewari said the U.S. was deliberately escalating pressure on India, citing recent defense and trade developments.

Tewari added that India's strategic silence, coupled with opticsheavy diplomacy, had left the nation vulnerable to these moves, unlike the bold handling seen during former PM

'Return To US Within 24 Hours: Meta, Microsoft To H-1B Visa Holders



ajor U.S. technology companies, including Meta and Microsoft, have issued urgent advisories to their H-1B visa holders following President Donald Trump's latest immigration crackdown, which includes raising the H-1B visa fee to USD 100,000 annually.

According to internal emails accessed by NDTV Profit, the companies urged employees currently in the U.S. to remain in the country for at least 14 days, while foreign workers residing outside the U.S. were advised to return within 24 hours to avoid potential re-entry issues. Employees were instructed to comply



with these directives for the foreseeable future, as firms seek clarity on the new regulations.

Meta specifically advised H-1B and H-4 visa holders to stay in the U.S. "till practical applications are understood", while Microsoft strongly recommended

employees to stay put and asked those abroad to make every effort to return.

The H-1B visa programme, designed for professionals in specialty occupations such as software engineers, program managers, and other IT roles, is valid for three

years with a three-year renewal option. Trump's new policy, aimed at protecting American workers, dramatically increases the cost of hiring foreign talent, with visa fees jumping from just USD 215 to USD 100,000

annually. Additionally, the adnounced a Gold Card visa programme, including the Trump Gold Card, Platinum Card, and Corporate Gold Card, designed to provide exclusive privileges for investors, businesses, and highly skilled professionals, potentially replacing traditional employment-based visa paths to U.S. residency.

India, the largest source of H-1B visa holders, is expected to feel a significant impact from these changes, particularly for tech professionals employed by multinational firms in the U.S. The move underscores the administration's focus on hiring "truly extraord inary people" while limiting routine worker foreign



Trump Imposes \$100,000 Fee On H-1B Visas

n a major move affecting Indian professionals and other foreign workers in the United States, President Donald Trump on Friday signed a proclamation raising the H1-B visa fee to USD 100,000 annually. The announcement forms part of the administration's broader efforts to curb immigration and prioritise highly skilled

foreign workers. White House staff secretary Will Scharf described the H1-B programme as "one of the most abused visa systems," intended to allow only specialized talent in sectors where American workers are unavailable. The new fee, he said, ensures companies bring in people" without replacing domestic workers.

Speaking at the White House, Trump said, "We need great workers, and this ensures that's what's go-ing to happen." Commerce Secretary Howard Lutnick added that the programme would raise over USD 100 billion for the U.S. Treasury, funds that will be used to reduce taxes and pay down na-

tional debt. The USD 100,000 annual fee will apply to both first-time applicants and renewals. H1-B visas, typically valid for three years and renewable for another three, can now cost companies up to USD 600,000 over six years per employee. This move is expected to significantly impact

Indian tech profes-

sionals, many of whom face decadeslong waits for Green Cards.

Alongside this, Trump introduced the 'Gold Card' programme, offering a path to U.S. residency for individuals who can pay USD 1 million personally, or USD 2 million via corporate sponsorship, ensuring expedited visa treatment and Green Card

eligibility. Lutnick emphasized that companies must now evaluate whether foreign employees are valuable enough to justify the annual fee or hire American workers instead. Trump asserted that tech companies support the measure, saying it will allow the U.S. to retain highly productive talent while ensuring American workers are prioritised.

SEBI Clears Adani Group, Boosts Investor Confidence

ew Delhi: Markets regulator SEBI's clearance of the Adani Group has been hailed as a major boost not only for the conglomerate but also for India's investment climate, according to Manish Singh, Chief Investment Officer at Crossbridge Capital.

On September 18, SEBI dismissed allegations by US short seller Hindenburg Research, which had claimed that Adani Group firms, including Adani Enterprises, Adani Ports, and Adani Power, had routed funds through three companies – Adicorp

Enterprises, Milestone Tradelinks, and Rehvar Infrastructure – in an irregular manner. SE-BI's investigation found that all loans were repaid, funds were used for intended purposes, and there was no fraud or unfair trade practice, effectively giving a clean chit to both the group and Chairman Gautam Adani.

Speaking to NDTV Profit, Manish Singh welcomed the move, saying, "This is very good news for the group, and it is also very good news for India, given the importance of the Adani Group in the Indian development story.

India needs a lot of power, and in my opinion, the country needs a few more Adanis."

He further highlighted the broader economic implications, noting that investor confidence directly affects the cost of capital, a critical factor in any country's growth trajectory. "If investor confidence erodes, it leads to a higher cost of capital, which can slow development. This SEBI order is a significant confidence booster for In-

dia," Singh said.

However, Singh cautioned that the government should scrutinize any malicious intent

behind such allegations to prevent future attempts at tarnishing reputations. "The last thing you want is investor confidence to drop because people rely on headlines without knowing the full story. Any potential malicious intent should be investigated and exposed," he

GST cuts to boost economy, but revenue loss could hit banking sector

he government is facing a significant revenue shortfall due to the recent reduction in Goods and Services Tax (GST) rates on various essential products. While official estimates put the annual revenue loss at around Rs 480 billion, a recent report by Systematix Research suggests that the actual impact could be far greater, potentially reaching nearly Rs 1.2 trillion.

The GST rate cuts, aimed at easing the financial burden on consumers and boosting consumption, cover a range of items, including essential goods and daily-use products. According to economists, such reductions are expected to stimulate demand in the short term, providing relief to households grappling with inflation and increasing disposable income for middle-class

However, the Systematix Research report highlights that while the rate cuts may benefit consumers, they will exert substantial pressure on government finances. The higher-than-expected revenue loss could limit the fiscal space available for development projects, social welfare schemes, and infrastructure investments. Analysts caution that if



such revenue shortfalls persist, the government may need to explore alternative measures, such as improving tax compliance, broadening the GST base, or adjusting rates on non-essential items.

Financial experts also note that while the move may stimulate economic activity, it underscores the delicate balance policymakers must maintain between boosting consumption and safeguarding fiscal health. The government is expected to monitor revenue collections closely over the next few months to gauge the actual impact of these GST cuts and assess whether additional measures may be required to offset the shortfall.

With the potential revenue loss reaching Rs 1.2 trillion, the debate over the sustainability of GST reductions is likely to continue among policymakers, economists, and industry stakeholders.



Stock Markets Snap 3-Day Rally on Profit-Taking; Adani Group Stocks Surge

umbai: Benchmark indices on Friday witnessed a sharp correction, snapping a three-day winning streak, as profit-taking in major blue-chip ares weighed on investor sentiment. Tata Technologies said the deal will significantly enhance its engineering, research, and development capabilities, particularly in embedded systems and systems engineering. The acquisition is expected to be earnings-per-share accretive from the first full year of operations.

Warren Harris, MD & CEO of Tata Technologies, described the acqui-

sition as a "strategic leap" that strengthens Tata Technologies' ability to deliver **end-to-end product engineering solutions across the automotive value chain." He added that ES-Tec's technical depth, customer focus, and regional presence align with Tata Technologies' vision to become the first partner choice for global OEMs navigating intelligent, connected, and sustainable mobility.

Marc Wille, MD & CEO of ES-Tec, welcomed the partnership, saying it will allow the German firm to expand its international presence and address future automotive challenges.

The acquisition positions Tata Technologies more strongly in Europe's automotive hub, at a time when global OEMs are ramping up R&D investments in electrification, ADAS, and software-defined vehicle platforms. Charlie Kirk's Anti-India Visa Remark Resurfaces Amid H-1B Shakeup



onservative US leader and staunch Trump supporter Charlie Kirk, who was shot dead on September 10 in Utah, is back in the spotlight after his controversial post on Indians and immigration resurfaced. Just days before his death, the 31-year-old Turning Point USA founder declared that America does not need more visas for Indians.

On September 2, Kirk wrote on X that legal immigration from India had displaced American workers more than any other, insisting that America was "full" and should put "its own people first." His remarks were in response to Fox News host Laura Ingraham, who argued that any US trade deal with India would involve more visas. Kirk's post sparked backlash, with critics calling it xenophobic and damaging to innovation and bilateral ties, since most Indians in the US migrate as skilled professionals in

The controversy has resurfaced now because former President Donald Trump, back in the headlines, has announced sweeping changes to the H-1B visa programme. From September 21, 2025, applicants will face an annual \$100,000 fee, a move expected to drastically reduce Indian tech migration. The H-1B visa has long served as the backbone of Silicon Valley's

workforce, powering giants like Google, Microsoft and Amazon with Indian talent.

Kirk, known for his fiery podcasts and youth outreach, built a strong base in conservative circles, aligning with Trump's "America First" agenda. His critics, however, saw his stand as part of a broader push within the MAGA movement to curb legal immigration, even at the cost America's competitiveness.

With his death, Kirk leaves behind a polarising legacy. But his last words on visas highlight a growing fault line in US politics—whether America should remain open to Indian talent or shut the door in the name of nationalism.

Bengaluru Techie Calls Traffic the City's Hidden Tax

has reignited the debate on Bengaluru's traffic crisis, calling it a "hidden tax" that drains time and productivity from lakhs of commuters. Shared in the r/Bengaluru community on Friday, the post narrates the ordeal of an Oracle employee living in JP Nagar, who says the city's gridlock costs him nearly two and a half months of his life every year.

According to the post, the techie earns Rs 28 lakh annually, excluding stock options. Out of this, he pays Rs 6.5 lakh in income tax and another Rs 1.4 lakh through GST on daily expenses already surrendering over three months of work to the exchequer. But the bigger loss, he arjust 14 kilometers away, should be a 30-minute commute. Instead, it takes an exhausting 90 minutes each way. Over the course of the year, this adds up to 2.5 months lost—time he believes is equivalent to another hidden tax paid not to the government, but to the city's infrastructure.

The post has struck a chord with thousands of Bengaluru residents who face the same grind daily. Many echoed the frustration that India's "Silicon Valley" may be powering global innovation, but its broken roads, endless traffic jams, and inadequate public transport force professionals to pay with their most valuable resource—time.



Experts say such urban inefficiencies also take a toll on mental health, family life, and the city's economy. While civic authorities have announced metro expansions, road upgrades, and tech-driven traffic management systems, citizens argue change is too slow to match the city's exploding population and vehi-

cle density.

Supreme Court Mandates AIFF To Operate India's Top-Tier Football League



n a landmark decision for Indian football, the Supreme Court has approved the All India Football Federation's new Constitution, making the AIFF the sole owner and operator of the country's top-tier football league. Until now, the Indian Super League (ISL) was managed by Football Sports Development Limited, a subsidiary of Reliance Industries, since its inception in 2014.

The new Constitution also introduces a promotion and relegation for men and two for tive committee, headed system for the top league, aligning Indian football with global governance standards. According to the draft, the "seniormost top division league" will now be recognized, owned, and operated solely by the AIFF, implementing promotion and relegation principles.

The Supreme Court has modified several provisions, including reducing the criteria for eminent players to five international matches women. The executive committee will consist of 14 members: one president, two vice presidents (one man, one woman), a treasurer, and 10 other members, including five eminent players, of which two will be women. The Constitution also allows for the removal of office bearers through a noconfidence motion—a provision not present

earlier. The court recognized the current AIFF execu-

Additionally, the AIFF can now conduct open tenders to find a new commercial partner for the top league and prepare for the 2025-26 season, ensuring compliance with FIFA regulations before the October 30 deadline.

The Supreme Court highlighted that continuous third-party monitoring of the sports body is unnecessary, stating that the adoption of the Constitution marks a new beginning for Indian football, aiming to make the sport thrilling, competitive, and globally respected. The federation has been directed to adopt the new Constitution within four weeks at a special general body meeting, paving the way for structural reforms and the long-term growth of football in India.

Beth Mooney Powers Australia to Record Total Against India

eth Mooney delivered a masterclass in hitting under pressure as she powered Australia to a record-breaking 412 all out against India in the series-deciding third women's ODI in New Delhi on September 20, 2025. Mooney's blistering 138 off just 79 balls propelled Australia to their joint highest-ever innings total, matching the 412/3 scored against Denmark in 1997, while also setting a new record for the highest total against India, surpassing their previous mark of 371/8.

Opener Georgia Voll (81) and all-rounder Ellyse Perry (68) provided early fireworks, putting on a 107-run partnership to punish India's inconsistent lengths. Skipper Alyssa Healy added 30 in



an aggressive start before falling to Kranti Goud, who dismissed her for the third time in as many games.

India's bowling attack struggled on the flat Kotla track, conceding 270 runs in boundaries alone

– 60 fours and five sixes — while the fielding unit faltered with dropped chances and misfields. Mooney, however, ensured Australia maintained dominance, sweeping, cutting, and lofting with authority. She hit 23 fours and a six, completely dismantling the Indian bowling attack and keeping the scoreboard ticking at a furious pace.

Deepti Sharma produced a standout 45th over, triggering a minicollapse with three wickets, including Mooney's dismissal via a run out. Despite late breakthroughs from India, the damage was done, and Australia posted a commanding total that put them firmly in control of the match.

This historic innings by Mooney and her teammates not only lit up the series finale but also sent a strong message to India ahead of the chase, highlighting the dominance of Australia's batting lineup in this ODI

Arshdeep Singh Creates History, Hardik Pandya Levels with Chahal

n a landmark moment for Indian cricket, Arshdeep Singh became the first Indian to take 100 T20I wickets, achieving the feat during India's final group stage clash against Oman in the ongoing Asia Cup in Abu Dhabi. The 26-year-old leftarm pacer reached the milestone in just 64 matches, making him the fastest Indian fast bowler to the mark and the third-fastest overall, behind Afghanistan's Rashid Khan and Sri Lanka's Wanindu Hasaranga.

The historic wicket came in the final over, when Arshdeep bowled a short delivery to Vinayak Shukla, who at-

tempted a big pull shot but was caught by substitute fielder Rinku Singh, sealing Arshdeep's place in history. His tally now stands at 100 wickets at an average of 18.49, highlighting his consistency and impact in the shortest

On the same night, India's stylish allrounder Hardik Pandya matched Yuzvendra Chahal to become the joint second-highest wicket-taker for India in T20Is. Pandya picked up a key wicket. dismissing Hammad Mirza with a clever short-ball ploy, bringing his tally to 96 wickets in 117 matches at an average of 26.61.

Oman's chase of a

189-run target saw veteran Aamir Kaleem keep hopes alive with a composed 64 off 46 balls, becoming the oldest player to score a 50-plus in T20 Asia Cup history, surpassing Mohammad Nabi. However, India's disciplined bowling and sharp fielding ensured a 21-run victory, maintaining their unbeaten streak i n tournament.


