# **HYDRA Saves Government Land Worth ₹50,000 Crore, Aims for** Flood-Free Hyderabad

The Hyderabad Integrated Drainage and River Authority (HYDRA) has announced a series of strong measures to safeguard government lands, restore water bodies, and ensure effective flood management across the city. **HYDRA Commissioner A.V. Ranganath revealed that the** authority has so far reclaimed 923.14 acres of government land, valued at nearly ₹50,000 crore, from illegal encroachments.

yderabad, Sept 22: Addressing a press conference on Monday, Ranganath said HYDRA's mission was not just about land recovery, but about preserving natural ecosystems and creating a safe, sustainable urban environment for future generations. The stringent actions being taken now may seem harsh, but they are an invaluable gift to the next generation," he

#### **Land Recovery and Anti-Encroachment Drives**

According to the Commissioner, HYDRA has conducted 581 major eviction drives, many of them targeting largescale encroachments by

influential individuals. The recent operations in Gajularamaram and Pragathinagar reclaimed 317 acres of land belonging to the State Finance Corporation, which had been under threat of private occupation. In Gandipet, resorts and recreational areas owned by political leaders were demolished. Similarly, large-scale structures affecting the flow of the Musi river were removed.

Of the total 923.14 acres recovered, 424 acres were prime government land, while the rest included water channels, roads, parks, and lakes. "If we fail to protect lakes, drains, and public spaces, the city's environment will collapse, and citizens will face repeated floods. Our priority is to ensure Hyderabad remains a flood-free city,' Ranganath empha sized

#### **Disaster Preparedness During Rains**

Ranganath explained that HYDRA's work is not limited to demolition drives. With unpredictable climate changes causing intense cloudbursts and urban flooding, the authority has strengthened its disaster preparedness.

At present, 51 Disaster Response Force (DRF) teams with 825 personnel and 150 Monsoon Emergency Teams (MET) with 2,250 staff are on 24/7 duty. In addition, 736 static staff are stationed at 240 floodthe city. A toll-free helpline (1070) has also been set up for public complaints.

#### Public Participation and Grievance Redressal

Citizen complaints have been central to HY-DRA's operations. Through its weekly 'Praja Vani' grievance redressal programme, HYDRA has received over 5,000 complaints so far, of which 75% have already been resolved. Apart from public meetings, complaints through media reports, WhatsApp, and social media platforms like X are also taken up for action.

Ranganath pointed out that flood-prone areas like Ameerpet Metro station, which previously submerged with just 5 cm of rainfall, did not witness waterlogging this year even after 10 cm of heavy showers, thanks to extensive desilting works.

yderabad, Sept 22: Chairing a high-level review meeting at the Secretariat on the development of national highways, the Chief Minister emphasized that road infrastructure is critical for economic growth and must not be stalled by minor procedural issues. The meeting was attended by senior officials of the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI), Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRT&H), Roads and Buildings (R&B) Department, Forest Department, and senior state government functionaries.

Revanth Reddy instructed district Collectors to approach land acquisition from a humane perspective, explaining the benefits of road development to farmers while ensuring timely

The CM expressed displeasure over delays in the Regional Ring Road (RRR) project and asked NHAI to issue simultaneous approvals for the northern and southern alignments. Responding, NHAI officials assured the immediate approval of RRR South. The CM also pressed for quick clearance of the 12-lane Bharat Future City-Amaravati-Machilipatnam Greenfield Highway,

Revanth Reddy reminded officials that the Greenfield project was assured under the AP Reorganization Act and urged its clearance under PM Gati Shakti or other schemes. He also called for the parallel sanction of a railway line linking Bengaluru– Shamshabad Airport-Amaravati, which he said could support highspeed trains, including Vande Bharat

On pending proposals, the CM sought immediate approval for the elevated corridor between Raviryal and Mannanur along the Hyderabad-Srisailam route, frequently used by pilgrims and tourists. He ordered Chief Secretary K. Ramakrishna Rao to resolve cases pending with the National Green Tribunal regarding banyan tree removal on the Hy-derabad-Manneguda road. The state also requested NHAI to approve the proposed Hyderabad-Mancherial-Nagpur highway, expected to attract new industrial parks.

parked on the footpath. It was impossible to ride through knee-deep water," said Ramesh Kumar, a private employee stranded near Tolichowki.

At Amberpet Polytechnic, heavy flow of rainwater turned the road into a virtual stream, making it extremely difficult for motorists to navigate. Several small vehicles broke down in the middle of waterlogged stretches, adding to the chaos.

Hyderabad Traffic Police personnel were deployed in large numbers to manage the situation, but the intensity of the rain and widespread waterlogging made regulation a daunting task. Traffic officials said that even sub-roads and alternative lanes, usually opened to ease congestion during emergencies.

were themselves clogged due to the heavy flow of vehicles. "We tried diverting traffic to parallel routes, but those stretches were also jam-packed. Our teams were on the ground throughout, but the sheer volume of vehicles slowed down clearance," a traffic inspector at Punjagutta said. Commuters expressed

frustration over the recurring problem of waterlogging during rains, which has become an annual ordeal for Hyderabad. "Every time it rains heavily, the same roads get flooded, and traffic collapses. It seems no permanent solution has been found to improve drainage or road conditions," said Shalini, a software professional who was stuck for nearly 90 minutes on her way from Mehdipatnam to Gachibowli.

Civic officials from the

Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC) said that emergency monsoon teams were deployed at critical junctions to pump out stagnant water. However, the sudden intensity of rainfall overwhelmed the city's drainage system. "We are identifying choke points and ensuring that water recedes quickly. Additional teams have been moved to Tolichowki, Mehdipatnam, and Khairatabad,' a GHMC official said.

Monday's disruption once again highlighted Hyderabad's vulnerability to urban flooding, particularly during sudden spells of heavy rain. With the monsoon still active, officials cautioned commuters to plan their travel with care and avoid floodprone stretches during downpours.

#### **CM Revanth Reddy Demands GST Compensation and Announces Bonuses**

vderabad, Sept 22: Chief Minister Shri A Revanth Reddy demanded that the central government compensate Telangana for a projected annual revenue loss of Rs 7000 crore due to the new GST rate rationalization structure.1 Speaking during the announcement of profit share bonuses for Singareni employees, the Chief Minister said that the new GST system would negatively impact the state's finances and that the Centre should support states facing such shortfalls.

Announcing a "Dasara bonus" for Singareni employees, CM Revanth Reddy assured that the state government would address their concerns regarding increasing private partnership in Singareni Collieries Company Limited. He stated that the workers had requested the government to take over the coal mines currently run by private agencies, as this private involvement threatens the company's

The Chief Minister committed the Telanga-

na government to the welfare of Singareni employees and pledged to continue developing the company as a profitable entity. He acknowledged the crucial role of Singareni workers in the Telangana statehood movement, noting that the new government recognizes their services.2

Regarding the company's performance, he announced that out of a total income of Rs 6394 crore, Rs 4,034 crore would be used for investments. An amount of Rs 819 crore, which constitutes 34% of the profits, was distributed as a bonus to the employees.3 The bonus for contract employees was also increased from Rs 5,000 to Rs 5,500.4

Revanth Reddy praised the workers for their efforts in making Singareni a consistently profitable company and stated that the government's decision to share profits with them every year is a recognition of their hard work.5 He also reiterated his government's commitment to making Singareni a competitive entity on par with corporate



# Telangana Excise Department Cracks Down on Illicit Liquor

yderabad, Sept 22: The Telangana Excise Department has launched a special drive to combat the illegal transportation and sale of non-duty paid liquor (NDPL) and "Natusarah" (illicitly distilled liquor), particularly in anticipation of the upcoming Dussehra festival.1 This initiative, under the direction of Prohibition and Excise Enforcement Director Shaan Vaz Qasim, runs from September 15th to 30th.

In just one week, the specialized teams—including the STF (State Task Force), DTF (District Task Force), and other enforcement teams—have seized a record-breaking 1704 liq-

uor bottles. The estimatconfiscated alcohol is Rs. 68.16 lakh. This amount is particularly significant as it surpasses the total NDPL seizures over the last three years combined. Previously, the state had registered 4516 cases over ten years. leading to the arrest of 3238 people and the seizure of 1,22,222 liters of liquor.3 In 2024 alone, up to August, 381 cases were filed, and 8201 liters were seized.4 The recent week's seizure of 1704 bottles is considered a significant achievement in a short period.

The drive is also targeting Natusarah production and sales in districts like Mahabubabad, Bhupalpally, Mahabubnagar, Nagarkurnool, Khammam. According to the department, illegal traders are exploiting the festive season by purchasing cheaper liquor from other states and smuggling it into Telangana via air, rail, and bus, causing substantial revenue losses to the state.

Director Shaan Vaz Qasim commended the teams for their diligent work and urged them to continue their efforts to prevent the influx of illicit liquor from other states. The department's focus remains on curbing these illegal activities to protect both state revenue and public health.6 The raids will continue for another week as part of the ongoing special

# **Telangana CM Revanth Reddy Pushes for Infrastructure Development**

yderabad, Sept 22: Chief Minister Revanth Reddy recently held a review meeting with officials, issuing a series of directives to expedite several major infrastructure projects across Telangana.1 His primaryfocus was on completing pending land acquisition to ensure the timely execution of these projects.2

The CM ordered the acceleration of land acquisition for both the northern and southern parts of the Regional Ring Road (RRR) and its connecting radial roads.3 He set a firm deadline for District



Collectors to complete this process by the end of October, with a strict order to provide immediate compensation to farmers who have lost their lands.4 He also instructed officials to submit details of landrelated cases pending in courts to higher authorities for swift resolution.

In addition to the RRR, Chief Minister Reddy reviewed plans for a new greenfield highway that would

connect Hyderabad to Bandaru Port.6 He urged officials to finalize the route map and secure permission from the central government as quickly as nossible

Furthermore, he addressed the proposed elevated corridor on the Hyderabad-Srisailam Highway, directing officials to seek timely approval from the central government.8 The CM also held a video conference with District Collectors to discuss the progress of other national highway projects, reiterating his demand for the speedy completion of all outstanding land acquisition processes.

#### **BRS Leaders' Press Conference on MLA Defections** and Political Attacks

Former Minister G. Jagadish Reddy, along with MLAs Padi Kaushik Reddy and Dr. K. Sanjay, held a press conference at the Assembly Media Point to address the issue of MLA defections from the BRS to the Congress party.

During the conference, Jagadish Reddy accused the MLAs who switched parties of betraying the public and the BRS. He mentioned that the party had provided all necessary documentation to the Assembly Secretary and was confident that the Speaker would make an impartial decision. He also asserted that the actions of the defecting MLAs were apparent to the people and that byelections were bound to happen, leading to the loss of their seats.

Reddy broadened his

criticism to both the Congress and BJP, holding them responsible for encouraging political defections. He specifically targeted Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, calling him "brainless" and blaming the Congress for what he termed "misdeeds" that resulted in a 299% share of Krishna river water for them.

In response to comments made by Bandi Sanjay about KTR purchasing used cars, Reddy dismissed them as trivial, sarcastically questioning if Sanjay had discovered the concept of buying second-hand vehicles. He concluded his remarks by challenging Ministers Uttam Kumar Reddy and Revanth Reddy to a public debate, promising to present evidence to support all his

Reflecting on criticism over HYDRA's demolition drives, Ranganath said such reactions were not new in his career. He recalled

past high-profile investigations like the Ayesha Meera murder case (2007 in Vijayawada) and the Pranay honor killing case in Nalgonda, where initial backlash later turned into public appreciation after justice was delivered.

"In the same way, today's criticism of HY-DRA's strict actions will eventually be recognized as necessary steps for Hyderabad's future," he remarked confidently.

Ranganath concluded by stressing HYDRA's vision: a flood-free, environmentally resilient

sive land recovery, proactive flood management, and long-term lake restoration, HY-DRA aims to strike a balance between urban growth and ecological sustainability.

Taking to social media platform 'X', Bandi Sanjay raised questions about the alleged association of the BRS leadership with Basarath Ahmed Khan, a Hyderabad-based luxury car dealer who was arrested by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) in May 2025 for customs duty evasion linked to the import of high-end

"Is Car Party running on smuggled luxury cars?" Bandi Sanjay asked, in a veiled reference to the BRS, whose election symbol is a car.

He particularly targeted BRS working president K. T. Rama Rao (KTR), questioning his association with the accused dealer. "Why is Twitter Tillu seen in land cruisers imported by luxury car scam-accused Basarath Khan, arrested by DRI Ahmedabad?" he asked. The BJP leader often refers to KTR as 'Twitter Tillu', a nickname he uses to mock the former minister's frequent presence on social

# KTR Accuses Congress of Betraying Farmers over RRR Realignment

yderabad, Sept 22: president K.T. Rama Rao launched a scathing attack on the Congress government on Monday, accusing it of betraying farmers by altering the alignment of the proposed Regional Ring Road (RRR) to serve vested interests. He urged farmers in the affected villages to boycott the upcoming local body polls as a mark of protest, promising that the BRS would stand firmly by their side until the alignment was corrected in a scientific and fair manner.

Farmers from Nalgonda, Suryapet, Gajwel and Sangareddy constituencies, who claim to be severely impacted by the RRR realignment, met Rama Rao at Telangana Bhavan to voice their concerns. Former Minister G. Jagadish Reddy and other public representatives from the erstwhile Nalgonda district also participated in the meeting.

Speaking on the occasion, Rama Rao alleged that the Congress had blatantly gone back on its election promises. "Before the Assembly elections, Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi personally assured that farmers would not be made to suffer because of the RRR alignment in Nalgonda. Based on this promise, people trusted them and voted

once in office, the Congress has inflicted irreparable damage by changing the alignment to suit the inter-

ests of a few," he said. Rama Rao accused the ruling party of being more focused on commissions than on public welfare. "After securing seats, Congress leaders abandoned the people and are now busy collecting money bags to send to their Delhi bosses. This selfish realignment is destroying lives and livelihoods. Farmers should resist it with unity," he declared.

He called upon affected villages to pass resolutions, boycott the local body elections, and collectively protest against the move. "If farmers boycott the polls and intensify their struggle, both the State and Central governments will be forced to respond," he said, adding that Telangana Bhavan would serve as a "Janata Garage" where farmers could seek legal, political and organizational support.

Drawing comparisons with the BRS regime, Rama Rao highlighted how land acquisition disputes during projects like the Outer Ring Road were resolved. "When we were in power, we always ensured dialogue with farmers, provided fair rehabilitation and found permanent solutions. The Congress government, on the

them to power. But other hand, is bulldozing ahead without even consulting the affected families," he said.

The BRS leader also criticized the silence of the Union government on the matter. "Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy has written to the Centre about the State government's realignment of the RRR, but the Centre has not responded. BRS MPs will raise this issue in the Raiva Sabha and we will also corner the Congress in the Assembly. Unfortunately, this government does not even have the courage to convene an Assembly session on such a burning issue," he remarked

Rama Rao further accused the Congress of repeating past mistakes that once caused immense suffering in Nalgonda. "This district suffered for decades with the fluorosis problem. It was K. Chandrashekhar Rao who transformed Nalgonda through Mission Bhagiratha and irrigation projects, bringing water, prosperity and dignity to the people. But the Congress is undoing all that progress by betraying the very farmers who believed in them," he said.

The meeting at Telangana Bhavan ended with BRS leaders reaffirming their commitment to lead a prolonged political and legal fight until the RRR alignment was revisited and justice was delivered to farmers.

porator C.N. Reddy, Naveen Yadav, and Kanjarla Vijayalaxmi, have also put up large posters and organised programmes in different localities.

In a video clip widely circulated on social media, Anjan Kumar Yadav is seen declaring, "I am a senior in the Congress and the party has confirmed a ticket for me. That's the reason I am conducting all these programmes in the constituency." His remarks have not only raised evebrows within the party but also heightened the rivalry among competing aspirants.

Despite the proliferation of flexies and hoardings, neither the GHMC nor the Hyderabad Roads and Related Amenities Authority (HYDRAA) has acted against the leaders for defacement of public spaces.

The Telangana Congress, however, appears more concerned about the internal wrangling than civic violations. Party strategists fear that unchecked competition could weaken the Congress in a constituency that has already been politically sensitive. Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy has stressed on multiple occasions that the final decision rests with the All India Congress Committee (AICC). He instructed Ministers Ponnam Prabhakar. Yet, differences have continued to spill into the open. Khairatabad MLA Danam Nagender and corporator P. Vijaya Reddy have been at loggerheads, clashing on several occasions. This divide among senior leaders has only compounded the stiff competition at the grassroots, where aspirants are accused of splitting party cadre along caste lines.

"Apart from local versus non-local debates, aspirants are now dividing the cadre on caste basis. Beyond the Reddy versus Yadav rivalry, there are even tensions among Yaday aspirants themselves," a senior leader at Gandhi Bhavan admitted.

Further complicating matters, surveys predicting poor performance by Congress in the by-election have been circulated on social media, causing unrest among party workers. Taking strong exception, TPCC Media

#### Harish Rao Slams Revanth Govt Over Singareni Bonus Cut, Demands 34% Share on Net Profit

yderabad, Sept 22: Former minister and senior BRS leader T. Harish Rao has strongly criticized the Congress government led by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy for allegedly shortchanging workers of Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL). He accused the government of betraying labour by reducing the profit-share bonus payable to employees and demanded that a 34% bonus be declared on the entire net profit of ₹6,394

Speaking to reporters on Monday, Harish Rao charged that instead of bringing festive cheer, the Congress government delivered "bitter news" to workers during Dasara. "Singareni reg-

istered net profits of ₹6,394 crore this year. But instead of calculating the bonus on that figure, the government restricted the distributable base to just ₹2,360 crore and announced a payout on 34% of that amount. This is nothing short of cheating," he said.

According to him, the move has effectively cut the expected bonus by more than half, leaving thousands of miners and their families disappointed. "Congress has played with the hopes of workers who toiled day and night to make Singareni profitable. By manipulating numbers, they have robbed labour of its rightful share," he added.

Harish Rao contrasted this with the approach of the previous BRS government under K. Chandrashekar Rao. "During

the undivided Andhra Pradesh era, Singareni workers used to receive only about 16% of the company's profits. After Telangana was formed. KCR ensured that workers' share increased steadily. By 2022–23, their profit share had reached 32%, recognising their sacrifices for the statehood movement and their contribution to the growth of the company," he said.

The former minister alleged that the Congress government is reversing these hard-won gains. "Instead of honouring workers, the present government has diverted their rightful bonus share under the pretext of future plans and investments. It is unfair and unacceptable," he remarked.

Harish Rao also reminded that KCR's policies had helped transform Singareni from a loss-making entity into one of the most profitable public sector undertakings in Telangana. "It was only under BRS that Singareni marched ahead with rising profits, better welfare measures and dignity for workers. The Congress government, in contrast, is dragging the company back into an era of neglect and betrayal," he

charged. Warning of protests, the BRS leader said his party would stand shoulder to shoulder with the miners. "If the government does not correct this injustice, we will launch an agitation in support of workers. The bonus must be declared on the full net profit, not on a reduced figure." he said.

On its part, the state

government has defended the decision. Officials have argued that the announced payout is significant, covering both permanent and contract workers. They also pointed out that part of the profits were being channelled into expansion and infrastructure projects meant to secure the company's long-term

However, trade unions and worker representatives are not convinced. Many have demanded clarity on why the ₹6,394 crore net profit figure was not fully considered. Questions have been raised over whether statutory deductions and reserves were wrongly excluded, and whether the government's accounting method stands up to scrutiny.



#### **India's New Maritime Laws Deliver Ease Of Business Only For A Few**

ndia recently witnessed the passage of three major maritime laws—the Indian Ports Act, 2025; the Merchant Shipping Act, 2025; and the Coastal Shipping Act, 2025-aimed at modernising the country's ports and shipping sector. While these reforms promise improved efficiency and ease of doing business, concerns have emerged about the concentration of authority, ambiguity in implementation, and the marginalisation of small operators and coastal states

POINT

The Indian Ports Act, 2025, replaces legislation that had been in place since 1908. On paper, it updates India's maritime framework, promising coherence, sustainability, and modern governance. However, the creation of the Maritime State Development Council, chaired by the Union Minister of Ports, centralises decisionmaking and allows binding guidelines for states. This structure risks subordinating regional priorities, such as Kerala's port strategies, to centrally dictated projects like Sagarmala and PM Gati

Shakti. Furthermore, Clause 17 bars civil courts from resolving port-related disputes, directing parties to internal committees, which raises questions about transparency and investor confidence

The Merchant Shipping Act, 2025, brings updates to vessel registration, safety, environmental obligations, and offshore operations. While the reforms signal India's intent to modernise its maritime sector, the approach—passed without parliamentary debate or consultation with coastal states and stakeholders—raises concerns about democratic accountability, regulatory clarity, and federal balance. Infrastructure like the Vizhinjam port, operated by Adani Ports, showcases India's ambitions, with local communities benefiting from technology-driven employment. Yet, the success of such initiatives depends on policies and laws that empower states and small operators rather than imposing top-down directives

True reform in India's maritime sector must balance national strategy with regional autonomy, encourage investment, and enhance competitiveness, all while being transparent, inclusive, and responsive to the communities that sustain the maritime economy



# The message beyond 'ending' Sri Lanka's elite impunity

n a development that has stirred political debate both domestically and internationally, Sri Lanka's immediate past-President Ranil Wickremesinghe was arrested in August 2025 over allegations of misusing public funds during a personal visit abroad. The incident traces back to September 2023, shortly after the G77+China Summit concluded in Havana, Cuba, when Wickremesinghe, then President of Sri Lanka, made a stopover in the United Kingdom while returning to Colombo

Reports indicate that the former President attended a university event in the UK where his wife, Professor Maithree Wickremesinghe, was being honoured. Undernutrition silently drives vulnerability to TB. A wellnourished body, supported by adequate proteins, vitamins, and minerals, has a stronger immune system capable of fending off TB infection and recovering more effectively. Conversely, malnourished individuals are far more susceptible—not only to contracting TB but also to experiencing severe outcomes, including higher mortality rates. Nutrition, therefore, is not just a supportive



element but a frontline defense in TB prevention and recovery

Integrating nutrition into TB programmes can significantly enhance outcomes. Strengthening community-based nutrition initiatives, expanding access to differentiated TB care, and providing locally tailored food support can empower at-risk populations to combat the disease. Simple measures, such as fortified meals, protein supplementation, and micronutrientrich diets, combined with standard medical

care, can improve

immunity and treatment efficacy. Ensuring that patients receive adequate nutrition throughout their treatment journey can also reduce relapse rates and accelerate recovery

Government policies and public health programmes must scale up what works. Beyond curative treatment, empowering communities with the tools and knowledge to prioritize nutrition can create a sustainable barrier against TB. Collaboration between health departments, nutrition programmes, and local stakeholders is essential

to ensure that vulnerable groups-especially children, pregnant women, and the undernourished-receive timely interventions

**Ending TB in India** requires a multi-pronged approach. While medicines and diagnostics remain vital, addressing nutritional deficiencies is equally critical. By placing food and nutrition at the heart of TB elimination strategies, India can move closer to a healthier future where immunity and prevention work hand in hand with medical interventions to eradicate this persistent

#### The Social Justice Myth: How Lalu's $Legacy\ Narrowed\ Bihar's\ Politics$



or decades, Bihar's political narrative has celebrated Lalu Prasad Yadav as the champion of backward classe Dalits, and minorities. His rise in the early 1990s, coinciding with the Mandal Commission's recommendations and the socio-political upheaval of the Ram Mandir movement, is often depicted as the defining moment when marginalised communities found representation. However, a closer examination of Bihar's political history reveals that empowerment of disadvantaged groups long predated Lalu

Leaders such as BP Mandal, Karpoori Thakur, Bhola Paswan Shastri, Ram Sundar Das, Daroga Prasad Rai, and Abdul Ghafoor had

already occupied key positions in the state, showcasing that Dalits, OBCs, and Muslims were active participants in governance. Nationally, figures like Jagjivan Ram further highlight that Bihar's marginalized communities were politically vocal and influential before Lalu's era. The 1960s and 1970s saw significant social justice movements, including reservation policies implemented by Karpoori Thakur and groundwork laid by BP Mandal, setting the stage for backward empowerment by the time Lalu became Chief Minister in 1990

What Lalu did differently was consolidate political power around one sub-group—the Yadavs.

With approximately 14% of Bihar's population, Yadavs became the backbone of the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD), leaving non-Yadav OBCs, Dalits, and Muslims largely excluded from top leadership roles. While the RJD projected itself as a voice for the marginalized, nearly 84% of Bihar's society had limited access to chief ministerial or deputy roles under its structure. Even loyal Muslim communities were largely kept out of executive leadership

In contrast, the NDA alliance, despite its own caste considerations, has experimented with broader representation. Notably, Jitan Ram Manjhi, a Mahadalit, was elevated as Chief Minister in 2014. Nitish Kumar's coalition-

building across Kurmis, EBCs, Mahadalits, and women illustrates a more pluralistic approach to

governance and leadership As Bihar approaches the 2025 assembly elections, the real question is which model the state will embrace. Will it remain tied to the myth of Lalu as the sole champion of marginalized communities, perpetuating Yadav-centric dominance? Or will it move toward genuinely inclusive leadership that reflects Bihar's diverse society? Beyond welfare and development promises, this election is a referendum on whether Bihar's politics will broaden representation or remain constrained within a narrow bloc




# **PM Modi slams Congress** for neglecting northeast, hails GST reforms

rime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday inaugurated and laid the foundation for development projects worth ₹5,100 crore in Arunachal Pradesh, including two hydropower units with a combined capacity of 426 MW. Speaking in Itanagar, he hailed the recent Goods and Services Tax (GST) reforms as "propeople" and criticized the Congress party for neglecting the northeastern region during its tenure.

"The new GST rates effective from the first day of Navaratri will ease household budgets," Mr. Modi said, highlighting reductions in taxes on essential items such as kitchen supplies, children's educational materials, clothing, and footwear. He added that simplification to two GST slabs — 5% and 18% – and reduced Income Tax rates would make housing, travel, dining, and vehicle purchases more affordable, terming the initiative a "GST savings festival."

The Prime Minister slammed the Congress for ignoring the challenging terrain of the northeast, saying it had dismissed border habitations as "last villages," leading to migration



from tribal and border areas. In contrast, he claimed, the BJP-led government prioritized the region through the "Vibrant Villages Programme" and rebranded these areas as "first villages" and "aspirational" districts, significantimproving infrastructure, connectivity, and quality of life.

Mr. Modi emphasized the State's growing tourism sector, noting that tourist footfall had doubled over the past decade and would be further enhanced by a modern convention centre in

Arunachal Pradesh's hydropower potential, the Prime Minister inaugurated two major projects by North Eastern Electric Power Corporation Limited. The 240 MW Heo Hydro Electric Project, with three 80 MW units, will generate 1,000 million units annually, while the 186 MW Tato-I Hydro Electric Project, with three 62 MW units, will produce 803 million units per year. The estimated cost for these projects is ₹3,700 crore, promising a significant boost to the State's energy capacity

General Assembly. The meeting at Lotte New York Palace marked their first in-person interaction since President Donald Trump imposed an additional 25% tariff on India's purchases of Russian oil, raising total levies to 50%

Jaishankar and Rubio's discussion comes ahead of critical trade negotiations between India and the United States, aimed at achieving an early conclusion of a mutually beneficial



Bilateral Trade Agreement. A delegation led by Union Commerce and Industries Minister Piyush Goyal is scheduled to meet the U.S. side on Monday to advance these discussions. Officials noted that during the recent visit of representatives from the U.S. Trade Representative's office to India on September 16. positive talks were held on various aspects of the trade deal, and both sides agreed to intensify efforts toward its finalization.

This bilateral meeting follows Jaishankar and Rubio's previous encounter in July in Washington DC during the Quad Foreign Ministers' Meeting. The discussions are expected to focus not only on trade but also on broader bilateral and strategic cooperation between the two

Jaishankar, who arrived in New York on Sunday, will participate in a series of bilateral and multilateral meetings on the sidelines of the UNGA session. He is also scheduled to deliver India's national statement at the General Debate on September 27, 2025, from the iconic green podium at the UNGA, highlighting India's priorities on global issues, trade, climate action, and multilateral cooperation.

The meeting underscores India's efforts to maintain strong diplomatic engagement with the United States while navigating challenges posed by new tariffs, and signals both sides' commitment to enhancing economic and strategic partnership in the midst of evolving global trade

#### "Crowds Don't Mean Votes": AIADMK's Warning, Outreach To Actor Vijay

he AIADMK is actively seeking to bring actor-turnedpolitician Vijay and nis Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) into its fold ahead of next year's Tamil Nadu Assembly elections. Former Milk and Dairy Development Minister Rajenthra Bhalaji urged Vijay to join the AIADMK-led alliance to defeat the ruling DMK-Congress coalition, emphasizing that a divided opposition would strengthen the DMK's

Bhalaji acknowledged Vijay's immense popularity, citing massive crowds at his rallies in Madurai and other cities, but warned that fan support does not automatically translate into



examples of actor-politicians like Vijayakanth, who succeeded due to a strong party cadre, and stressed that Vijay must accept AIADMK chief Edappadi Palaniswami's leadership to effectively challenge the DMK.

"If Vijay wants to defeat DMK, he should accept leadership of EPS and join the alliance. Otherwise, DMK will de-

ney," Bhalaji said. Since announcing his electoral debut, Vijay has maintained independence, refusing to align with either the DMK-Congress or AIAD-MK-BJP blocs. At a rally in Madurai, he declared, "I am a lion. I'm marking my territory. The TVK is an unstoppable force which is here to dominate." He has also reject'ideological enemy.

The BJP and AIADMK have nevertheless extended overtures, emphasizing a shared goal of removing the DMK from power. BJP state chief Nainar Nagenthiran suggested a strategic alliance, while AIADMK leader EPS welcomed all parties seeking to oust the DMK.

Political analysts note that while Vijay is unlikely to secure a majority in the 234-seat assembly alone, his TVK could play a kingmaker role, influencing the formation of the next government by determining which party gains enough support to lead the state. His mass appeal makes him a pivotal factor in Tamil Nadu's upcoming political

## India Plans 'Bodyguard' Satellites After Risky Orbital Near-Miss

ndia is developing plans to deploy 'bodyguard" sateľlites to protect its orbiting spacecraft after a close encounter in space highlighted potential national security risks. Sources familiar with the matter said a satellite from a neighboring country came dangerously close to one of India's ISRO satellites in mid-2024, passing within iust one kilometre of an orbiting spacecraft tasked with mapping and monitoring. Although no collision occurred, the near miss underscored the need

for stronger satellite security.

The Modi-led government aims to identify and counter threats in orbit, part of a broader effort to enhance India's spacebased defense capabilities. This initiative complements a ₹27,000 crore (\$3 billion) plan to deploy around 50 surveillance satellites, the first of which is expected to launch next year. Indian satellites have played a key role during conflicts with Pakistan, including the May 2025 standoff. highlighting the stra-

cure space assets. The proposed bodyguard satellites could employ Light Detec-


tegic importance of se-

tion and Ranging (Li-DAR) technology to detect threats quickly, giving ground-based teams time to reposition satellites. These satellites would operate as part of a larger integrated system, including ground-based radars and telescopes, providing 24x7 monitoring of potential hazards in orbit.

While Pakistan operates just eight satellites, India has more than 100, and China operates over 930, raising concerns about space security amid longstanding territorial disputes. Officials have warned of growing threats from China's increasingly sophisticated military

space program.

The government is also collaborating with startups to develop these advanced monitoring solutions. Sudheer Kumar N, former ISRO Capacity Building Program director, noted that India currently lacks continuous in-orbit tracking but is exploring new technologies. ISRO's role in national security was highlighted during the May 2025 conflict, when over 400 scientists worked round the clock to support Earth observation and communication satellites, demonstrating the strategic value of Inspace capabilities.

# Trump Hails Charlie Kirk as "Martyr" for Freedom at Memorial

S President Donald Trump on Sunday paid tribute to right-wing activist Charlie Kirk, calling him "a giant of his generation" and asserting that he was "violently killed because he spoke for freedom and justice" during a packed memorial service. Speaking before tens of thousands at a 63,000-seat stadium, Trump highlighted Kirk's role as a devoted husband, father, Christian, and patriot, framing his death as an attack on shared American values.

Trump said, "The gun was pointed at him, but the bullet was aimed at all of us... Charlie was killed for expressing the very ideas that virtually evervone in this arena

and most other places throughout our country deeply believed in." He accused the media and political opponents of attempting to silence Kirk, arguing that they feared his influence on young

The memorial, organized by Turning Point USA—the youth political group founded by Kirk featured speeches from Vice President JD Vance, Secretary of State Marco Rubio, Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth, and rightwing personalities including Tucker Carlson. Kirk's widow, Erika Kirk, also addressed the crowd, stating she forgave her husband's alleged killer, 22-year-old Tyler Robinson, who faces murder charges with the death penalty being pursued.

Thousands attended, with many describing Kirk as a "Christ martyr" and crediting him with giving them the courage to express their political and social beliefs. Kirk, 31, was fatally shot on September 10 while speaking at a Utah university during his public debate series. Authorities said the suspect cited "hatred" stoked by Kirk's criticism of transgender people, Muslims, and others.

Trump vowed a crackdown on what his administration labels "domestic terrorism" by left-wing groups, designating "Antifa" as a major terrorist organization and promising action against networks responsible for left-wing violence. The event underscored the intense political polarization in the United States following Kirk's death and spotlighted his influence among young conserva-



#### Nepal PM Sushila Karki Expands Interim Cabinet with Four New Ministers

Nepal's newly-appointed Prime Minister Sushila Karki on Monday, September 22, 2025, inducted four new Ministers into her interim Cabinet, raising its strength to eight. President Ramchandra Paudel administered the oath of office at the presidential office, Sheetal Niwas, to former Justice Anil Kumar Sinha, National Innovation Centre founder Mahabir Pun, journalist Jagdish Madan Pariyar.

With the new appointments, Karki's Council of Ministers now totals eight members, though the Prime Minister has retained several key portfolios herself. Anil Kumar Sinha was assigned the Industry, Commerce, and Supplies portfolio, while Jagdish Kharel took charge of Communication and Information Technology. Madan Pariyar assumed responsibility for Agriculture and Livestock Development, and Mahabir Pun was appointed Minister for Education and Science and Technology. All four Ministers assumed office immediately after taking their oaths.

Nepal's Constitution permits the Council of Ministers to include up to 25 members, including the Prime Minister. However, Karki has indicated that her interim Cabinet might consist of only 11 members. Initially, the President's Office had announced that five new Ministers would take the oath on Monday, but Sangita Kaushal Mishra was later excluded due to a ground. Sources revealed that the Commission Investigation of Abuse of Authority (CIAA), Nepal's anti-graft body, is investigating a corruption case involving Mishra.

At 73, Sushila Karki became Prime Minister on September 12, ending days of political uncertainty following the ouster of former Prime Minister K P Sharma Oli. Oli's removal came after youth-led Gen Z protests demanding action against corruption and opposing a social

her swearing-in, Karki had already appointed Kulma Ghising as Minister for Energy, Water Resources, and Physical Planning; Rameshwor Khanal as Finance Minister; and Om Prakash Aryal as Home Minister.

The interim government will continue to function until the next general elections scheduled for March 5, 2026, as Karki aims to maintain stability and oversee a smooth transition during this politically sensitive period.

# **Mass Protests in Italy** Demand Solidarity with Gaza

housands of protesters and striking workers took to the streets across Italy on Monday, demonstrating in solidarity with Palestinians in Gaza. Italy's grassroots unions, representing hundreds of thousands of workers from schoolteachers to metalworkers, called a 24-hour general strike affecting public and private sectors, including public transport, trains, schools, and ports. The nationwide action disrupted transport services, with long delays for national trains and limited public transport in major cities, including

In Milan, tensions escalated as dozens of masked protesters dressed in black tried to storm the central train station, hurling smoke bombs, bottles, and



stones at police, who responded with pepper spray. In Bologna, police used water cannons to disperse demonstrators blocking a highway. Workers' sit-ins and rallies in major ports like Genoa and Livorno partially slowed or blocked the transit of goods. Over 20,000 people gathered at Rome's central station to highlight the worsening humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

Union leaders and student organizations criticized the "inertia of the Italian and EU governments." Walter Montagnoli, national secretary of the CUB union, said "If we don't block what Israel is doing, if we don't block trade, the distribution of weapons, we will not achieve anything." Italian Foreign Minister Antonio Tajani condemned violent acts against security forces, emphasizing that such actions do not help the Palestinian civilian population.

The Italian government, led by conservative Premier Giorgia Meloni, has maintained a close alliance with Israel while facing domes-

tic pressure over the Gaza war. Italy, unlike some EU nations, will not formally recognize a Palestinian state at this week's U.N. General Assembly. The conflict, ongoing since Hamas' October 7, 2023, attack, has caused over 65,100 deaths in Gaza, displaced 90% of its population, and left Gaza City facing famine. The protests reflect widespread concern over the humanitarian crisis and calls for international intervention to support Palestinian

The New START agreement, signed in 2010 by then-U.S. President Barack Obama and

Russian President Dmitry Medvedev, restricts both countries to no more than 1,550 deployed nuclear warheads and 700 deployed missiles and bombers. It also allows for on-site inspections to verify compliance, though these inspections have been dormant since 2020. Arms control advocates

ndia's key infrastructure sectors recorded a robust growth of 6.3% in August 2025, marking a 13-month high, driven by strong expansion in coal, steel, and cement production, according to official data released on Monday. showed mixed performance. Coal output surged 11.4%, steel production rose 14.2%, and cement output grew 6.1%. Refinery products, fertilisers, and electricity recorded moderate increases of 3%, 4.6%, and 3.1%, respectively. #### **India's GDP Likely Near** 7% in FY26 on GST Reforms

ndia's economy is poised to grow closer to 7% in fiscal year 2026, driven by the latest indirect tax reforms under "GST 2.0." Chief Economic Adviser V. Anantha Nageswaran said on Monday, September 22, 2025. Speaking at a Network 18 event in New Delhi, Nageswaran noted that high-frequency indicators for July and August suggest that even the second quarter could see growth near 7%, pushing the economy toward the upper end of the government's projected 6.3-6.8% range.

India's real GDP had expanded by 6.5% in FY25, its slowest in four years, due to subdued consumption and manufacturing. However, the first quarter of FY26 recorded an impressive 7.8% growth, supported by services, manufacturing, construction, and agriculture. Nageswaran emphasized that the sweeping GST overhaul will deliver substantial gains to households and the broader economy.

"GST 2.0 has three components," he explained. "First, rate reductions, with many categories moving from 18% to 5%, and 12% be-



coming 5%. Second, the withdrawal of compensation, which is positive for households. Third, a few categories saw rates rise from 28% to 40%. He estimated that net household tax savings could exceed ₹1 lakh crore, with multiplier effects potentially boosting aggregate economic impact to over ₹2.5 lakh crore.

Nageswaran also reaffirmed the government's commitment to maintaining the fiscal deficit at 4.4% of GDP in FY26. The GST reforms mark the most significant rationalization since 2017,

collapsing the previous four-tier structure into two slabs—5% for essentials and priority goods, and 18% as the standard rate—while introducing a 40% levy on select luxury and sin items such as pan masala, aerated drinks, and high-end

While uncertainties remain, the combination of tax savings, consumption boosts, and strong sectoral growth is expected to underpin India's robust economic expansion in FY26, signaling renewed optimism for households and businesses alike.






