## Senior Maoist Leader Mallojula Venu Gopal Expelled, Declared 'Traitor' by Central Committee

-In a dramatic turn of events that has exposed growing fissures within the Maoist movement, the outlawed CPI (Maoist) has expelled senior leader Mallojula Venu Gopal, alias Bhupati, branding him a "traitor" for unilaterally offering to surrender arms and seek peace with the government.

According to a statement issued by the Maoist Central Committee, Venu Gopal had recently written to the Union Government, declaring that the Maoists were willing to give up their weapons and join the mainstream. The committee, however, strongly denied that the letter represented the collective will of the organization. It stressed that the move was his personal decision and not approved by the party leadership.

The statement went further, expelling Venu Gopal from the organization and directing him to immediately hand over all arms in his possession to the Maoist leadership. The committee warned that failure to do so would lead to action through the so-called "people's court", where punishment would be handed down under their internal rules.

This rare public announcement of internal discord has surprised observers and security officials alike. The Maowho have traditionally projected an image of strict unity

and discipline, appear to be grappling with internal weaknesses, particularly in the wake of Operation Kagar—a massive security offen-

Operation Kagar has been described as one of the most aggressive counter-insurgency drives in recent years. Venu Gopal's open call for surrender, they argue, is symptomatic of this trend.

# Supreme Court Stays Local Elections in 23 Villages of Mulugu District

In a significant development, the Supreme **Court has** stayed local body elections in 23 villages of Mangapet mandal in Mulugu district, following a dispute over whether these villages fall under the

yderabad, Sept 23: The controversy stems from conflicting judicial and administrative interpretations regarding the status of these villages. While the Telangana High Court had earlier ruled that these villages should be treated as tribal villages, non-tribal residents challenged this verdict in the Supreme Court, arguing that such classification was inconsistent with historical records and presidential orders.

The non-tribal petitioners cited Presidential Orders issued in 1950, which, according to them, excluded these 23 villages from being categorized as tribal areas. Based on this, they contended that the High Court's recognition of the villages as tribal settlements was erroneous.

On the other hand. tribal associations had the High Court, insisting that as per Nizam-era regulations, these villages were indeed tribal villages. The High Court, after examining the matter, accepted their plea and directed that the villages be recognized as tribal habitations.

This ruling prompted non-tribal groups to approach the Supreme Court, arguing that the High Court had erred in relying on outdated records and ignoring the constitutional authority of the Presidential Orders.

Acting on the petitions filed by non-tribal residents, the Supreme Court ordered a stay on the conduct of local elections in these villages. The apex court observed that until the legal status of the villages is conclusively determined, it would not be appropriate to proceed with elections, as the classifica-

tion directly affects elec-

quotas, and the rights of both tribal and non-tribal communities.

The stay order has temporarily halted the election process in these villages, creating uncertainty among local residents. Tribal organizations, which had welcomed the High Court's earlier decision, expressed disappointment at the Supreme Court's intervention, stating that it undermines their long-standing struggle for recognition and political representation.

Non-tribal groups, however, have welcomed the stay, arguing that it restores fairness and prevents what they consider to be a misinterpretation of law. They maintain that recognizing these villages as tribal habitations would unjustly exclude them from contesting or participat-

According to Vinod Kumar, the BRS government, led by KCR, had already completed the construction of the bar-

rage, which was built to strengthen the Devadula project.3 He pointed out that the previous Congress government in Chhattisgarh had obstructed the project by withholding permissions from the Central Water Commission (CWC). The current agreement with Chhattisgarh regarding the submergence of 50 acres, which is now being celebrated by Minister Uttam, is an achievement that KCR was prevented from securing due to political pressure from Congress leaders during the 2023 elections.

Vinod Kumar also

criticized the Congress government's historical handling of the Devadula project.5 He recalled that while the project's foundation was laid by Chandrababu Naidu in 2001, it remained incomplete even after the Congress came to power.6 The Congress government, despite spending a significant amount, failed to properly pump water from the project. In contrast, he credited KCR with fixing the proiect's design flaws and constructing ten reservoirs to ensure water

In his address, Vinod Kumar urged the Congress government to

## **Enforcement Efforts Target Illicit Liquor and Jaggery**

he ongoing enforce ment campaign against illegal liquor and contraband has led to several significant seizures in Hyderabad. HMC Commissioner R.V. Karnan held meeting to exress his dissatisfaction with the slow progress of key infrastructure projects, including the Strategic Road Development Program (SRDP), Strategic Nala Development Program (SNDP), and H-City projects. He ordered engineering officials to accelerate their efforts, warning of disciplinary action for continued negligence.

During the review, Karnan expressed frus-tration that only 25 lake development projects have been initiated across six zones, with

many progressing slowly. He specifically criticized irrigation engineers for their performance and instructed Zonal Commissioners to submit a field report on lake development within a week. He emphasized the need to complete walking tracks, beautification efforts, and sewerage diversion around the lakes promptly.

The Commissioner directed officials to operate in a "mission mode" to quickly complete all projects aimed at alleviating Hyderabad's traffic problems. He assured them that a lack of funds was not an issue and pledged to help resolve any pending government clearances. Karnan also instructed engineers to collaborate with traffic police to manage traffic flow around construction sites and to prepare the Falaknuma ROB for its inauguration by September 25.

# Hyderabad Railway Police Apprehends Murder Suspect



he Hyderabad Railway Police have arrested Pathlavath Ravi, a 35-year-old man, in connection with a murder case (Cr. no: 148/2025) at the Hitech City Railway Station. The suspect was apprehended on September 23, 2025, at the Fathenagar Railway Station by a police team conducting routine checks for criminals. The arrest was made based on the accused's suspicious appearance, including injuries on his nose and eye.

During the police interrogation, the accused

confessed to the murder of a man identified as Neelam Rajesh. According to his statement, the incident occurred on September 18, 2025. Pathlayath Ravi and the deceased, Neelam Rajesh, initially met to discuss job prospects. After failing to find work, they consumed alcohol and toddy. The situation escalated when the deceased allegedly harassed a couple and extorted money from them.

The confrontation that led to the murder began after the two men consumed liquor and the ac-

cused decided to leave. The deceased followed him, verbally abused him, and physically assaulted him with a helmet and a brick. The accused claimed that the harassment was "unbearable" and he decided to kill the deceased. He then picked up a cement brick and hit Neelam Rajesh, causing him to fall. The accused then used a larger brick to strike the victim on the head, which was the fatal blow. He then fled the scene on an MMTS local train.

he Indian IT landscape is shifting acquisitions services sector faces a critical crossroads. Just days ago, US President Donald Trump signed a decree imposing a \$1,00,000 fee for each H-1B visa used for onshore work, raising costs and threatening the traditional labour arbitrage model that has long powered India's IT giants. Meanwhile, Infosys announced an unprecedented Rs 18,000 crore share buyback, signalling a preference for rewarding shareholders rather than investing in long-term innovation. Buybacks and high dividends can indicate a lack of profitable growth opportunities, undervaluation of shares, or a strategy to boost earnings per share. For promoterled companies like TCS, Wipro, and HCL Technologies, dividends largely benefit promoters rather than minority shareholders, underscoring the short-term

orientation.

The competitive

Global capability centres (GCCs) are expanding rapidly, growing at 40 percent in FY24, compared with just 5 percent growth among India's top five IT firms. These GCCs retain intellectual property rights in-house, compete for talent, and threaten margins of traditional IT services. TCS's recent announcement to cut 12,000 jobs illustrates the sector's need to manage costs while sustaining investor confidence.

vulnerable domains of public life today is free speech. As US Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis famously stated, public discussion is a political duty: the remedy to falsehood and harm is more speech, not enforced silence. Free speech is essential because it makes the Public, enabling citizens to participate in shaping ideas, policies, and societal norms. Yet, both totalitarian and democratic regimes increasingly curtail this freedom. revealing a worrying convergence in practice.

The principle of Public Reason asserts that laws harming communities, driven by prejudice, sectarianism, or ideological motives, are illegitimate. Restrictions are justified only when speech produces actual harm, such as hate speech inciting violence. What is unacceptable is viewpoint-based suppression—proscribing speech simply because it challenges the state's official stance. Legal

Stone emphasized: "The government may not restrict expression simply because it disagrees with the speaker's views.' Similarly, Justice Thurgood Marshall insisted that governments cannot limit speech based on its content or ideas, for doing so undermines democratic debate.

Yet, governments often justify curbs on speech citing "national interest" or "national good," ironically undermining the very public whose participation defines these concepts. Paternalistic regulation privileges certain majority interests over the broader public, skewing discourse and shaping citizens to conform to ideological lines. Historical examples are stark: Nazi Germany's propaganda machinery and Rwanda's radio-fueled ethnic mobilization show how viewpoint suppression and orchestrated hate speech paved the way for genocide.

Countering harmful speech is central to

Reason. As political scientist Katherine Gelber observes, citizens must respond to disagreeable or harmful speech, engaging in reasoned rebuttal to prevent the public from being manipulated. In Habermasian terms. the Public emerges not only through debate but through active counters to misinformation, bias. and hate speech. Silence, or non-engagement, enables manipulation and diminishes democratic life.

Nobel laureate Toni Morrison reminded us: "There is no time for despair, no place for self-pity, no need for silence, no room for fear. We speak, we write, we do language. That is how civilizations heal." Speaking back—continually, logically, and purposefully—is not just a civic duty; it is what sustains Public Reason and qualifies our life within a democracy. Free speech, therefore, is not merely a right it is the lifeblood of an informed, resilient, and participatory society.

## **'I Love Muhammad' Banner Sparks Protests Across India**

Cities such as Unnao, Bareilly, Kaushambi, Lucknow, Maharajganj, Kashipur, and Hyderabad have witnessed rallies and street demonstrations, some resulting in clashes with police.

September 4 during the Barawafat (Eid-e-Miladun-Nabi) procession in Rawatpur, Kanpur, when a group placed an "I Love Muhammad" banner along the route. Local Hindu groups objected, claiming a "new tradition" was being introduced in a space traditionally used for Barawafat celebrations. Police intervened, restoring the traditional tent and signage. DCP Dinesh Tripathi clarified

that no FIR was filed specifically for the banner. However, both communities accused each other of tearing posters, esca-

On September 9, Kanpur police registered cases against 24 people for allegedly introducing a new custom during the procession and disturbing communal harmony. The controversy gained national attention after AIMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi tweeted that expressing love for Prophet Muhammad was not a crime, criticizing police

## Rohit Godara Accuses Lawrence Bishnoi, Police Kill Two Accused in Bareilly Firing Case

n a dramatic turn in India's underworld scene, Rohit Godara has publicly accused Lawrence Bishnoi of being a traitor, claiming he colluded with an American agency to reveal sensitive information. In an unverified social media post, Godara alleged that Bishnoi joined forces with the agency to protect his brother Anmol and now provides them with intelligence, including plans to harm actor Salman Khan for personal fame. Godara also urged the media not to associate him or his associates with Bishnoi

wanted by the National **Investigation Agency** (NIA) and multiple state police units, with Brar reportedly in the U.S. and Godara in the U.K.

The accusations come shortly after a shocking incident on September 12, when gunshots were fired outside Bollywood actress Disha Patani's residence in Bareilly, Uttar Pradesh, around 3:45 am, allegedly by Godara and Brar. The attack caused widespread fear in the community.

Following the firing, law enforcement conducted a joint operation involving the Delhi Police and Uttar Pradesh Special Task Force (UP STF). On September 17, two acfiring, Ravinda alias Kullu and Arun, were injured during the encounter near Tronica City, Ghaziabad. Both later succumbed to their injuries.

The deceased, both residents of Rohtak, Haryana, were reportedly affiliated with Godara and Brar. The police confirmed their deaths and reiterated ongoing investigations into the larger gang network.

This incident highlights the continuing tension between rival gangs, the cross-border dimension of criminal networks, and the law enforcement efforts to curb gang-related violence targeting civilians and celebrities

## **Trump rejects Palestinian** recognition, signals pressure on China

he White House on Monday (September 22, 2025) said U.S. President Donald Trump "disagrees" with Western nations that have formally recognised a Palestinian state. warning that such moves effectively reward Hamas. Speaking to reporters, Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt stressed that the president views recognition as counterproductive at a time when hostages remain captive in Gaza and the war shows no sign of ending. "He feels this does not do anything to release the hostages, which is the primary goal right now, does nothing to end this conflict and bring this war to a close, and frankly, he believes it's a reward to Hamas," Ms. Leavitt said, adding that Mr. Trump will expand on this stance in his upcoming address to the United Nations General Assembly. France and several European governments have recently recognised Palestinian statehood, framing it as part of renewed peace efforts. However, the Trump ad-



ministration argues that such recognition prioritises symbolism over concrete action.

The briefing also turned to domestic concerns, with reporters pressing the White House about falling crop prices and mounting anxiety among American farmers as trade negotiations with China remain unresolved. Ms. Leavitt acknowledged the unease, noting the issue has been central in talks with Beijing. "We very much understand the anxiety of farmers. The National Economic Council and Agriculture Secretary Brooke Rollins

have been deeply engaged on this," she said, while offering no new measures.

On foreign policy, Ms. Leavitt confirmed that Mr. Trump is reviewing Russian President Vladimir Putin's offer of a one-year extension to the nuclear arms treaty, describing it as sounding "pretty good," though she deferred further details to the president. She also dismissed a letter from Venezuelan leader Nicolás Maduro as "filled with lies," reiterating Washington's view that his regime is illegitimate and linked to drug


## China closes schools, cancels flights as it braces for Ragasa

outhern Chinese cities scaled back daily life on Tuesday, September 23, 2025, as Super Typhoon Ragasa approached, prompting school and business closures and flight cancellations. Ragasa, packing maximum sustained winds of around 230 kph, is expected to move westnorthwest across the northern South China Sea and edge closer to Guangdong province, China's economic hub. China's National Meteorological Centre forecasts landfall between Shenzhen city and Xuwen county on Wednesday, September 24, 2025.

Hong Kong's observatory, already hoisting strong wind signals, plans to issue storm warning No. 8, the third-highest alert, while monitoring the potential need to upgrade it by Wednesday morning. The city anticipates water levels to rise around 2 metres along coastal areas, with some spots possibly reaching 4 to 5 metres, comparable to the devastation from Ty-

phoon Hato in 2017 and Typhoon Mangkhut in 2018, which caused economic losses exceeding \$154 million and \$590 million, respectively. Residents in floodprone areas reinforced doors with sandbags and taped windows, while many stocked up on food and essential

in Hong Kong and Macao, while cities such as Shenzhen, Foshan, and Haikou suspended classes and gradually halted businesses and transport. Hundreds of flights were cancelled in Hong Kong, and Shenzhen airport will stop operations from Tuesday night. Macao activated its

The typhoon has already caused casualties and damage in other regions. In Taiwan, six people were injured, over 7,000 were evacuated, and 8,000 households faced power outages. ## "False Hindu God": Republican Leader's Remark On Hanuman Statue

A Texas Republican leader has drawn sharp criticism for his remarks targeting a 90-foot statue of Lord Hanuman, known as the 'Statue of Union,' located at the Shri Ashtalakshmi Temple in Sugar Land, Texas. Alexander Duncan, a Senate candidate from President Donald Trump's party, questioned the presence of the statue in the US, calling America a "Christian nation.'

On X, Duncan wrote, "Why are we allowing a false statue of a false Hindu God to be here in Texas? We are a CHRIS-TIAN nation," while sharing a video of the statue. In another post, he quoted verses from the Bible's Book of Exodus, emphasizing prohibitions against worshipping idols or images, suggesting that the Hindu deity violated Chris-

tian doctrine. The remarks quickly



sparked backlash. The Hindu American Foundation (HAF) condemned Duncan's statement, calling it "anti-Hindu and inflammatory." The group formally reported the comments to the Texas Republican Party, urging disciplinary action. "Hello @TexasGOP. will you be disciplining your senate candidate who openly contravenes your own guidelines against discrimination—displaying anti-Hindu hate-not to mention disrespect for the 1st Amendment's Establishment Clause?" HAF posted

Social media users also criticized Duncan, reminding him that the US Constitution guarantees freedom of religion and prohibits the establishment of any one faith as dominant. Many called his remarks discriminatory and divisive. One X user, Jordan Crowder, pointed out that Hinduism predates Christianity by centuries and has deeply influenced global spiritual traditions, writ-

ing, "Just because you're not Hindu doesn't make it false. The Vedas were written almost 2000 years before Jesus and are extraordinary texts. It would be wise to honor and research the religion that predates and influences you."

The controversy has reignited discussions around religious freedom, diversity, and respect in the United States, highlighting ongoing challenges in balancing faith, politics, and inclusivity.

## Pakistan Airstrikes Kill 30 Civilians in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, Outrage Grows

t least 30 civilians, most of them women and children, Monday when Pakistan Air Force jets bombed the village of Matre Dara in the Tirah Valley of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, according to intelligence sources. The strikes, carried out around 2 am, reportedly involved JF-17 fighter jets dropping at least eight China-made precision-guided bombs on the remote settlement. Evewitnesses described horrific scenes, with families buried under rubble and survivors desperately searching for loved ones.

Entire families have been wiped out. Most victims had no chance to es-



cape," a source said. The Tirah Valley, close to the Afghanistan border, is a region where Pakistani forces often target Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) militants. However, human rights groups have repeatedly criticised such operations for heavy civilian



In its statement, S&P said, "We forecast India's GDP growth to hold steady at 6.5% this fiscal year, ending March 31, 2026. Domessoon conditions, income and GST cuts, and accelerating government investment." The agency emphasized that these factors will continue to underpin economic expansion despite external challenges.

S&P also revised India's inflation forecast down to 3.2% for the fiscal year, noting that a sharper-than-expected decline in food inflation will help keep overall price pressures low. This moderation in in-

the Multi-Commodity Exchange (MCX) declined on Tuesday, as traders trimmed positions amid weak demand in the spot market. October delivery crude fell Rs 16 or 0.29%. settling at Rs 5,506 per barrel across 12,933 lots.

Analysts noted that the drop in futures prices reflected profit-booking and cautious trading, as market participants responded to soft spot market activity. Weak physical demand for crude prompted sellers to offload their holdings, weighing on prices during the session.

On the global front, oil benchmarks also witnessed mild declines. West Texas Intermediate



(WTI) crude traded 0.33% lower at USD 61.95 per barrel, while Brent crude slipped 0.56% to USD 66.20 per barrel in New York, reflecting a broader cautious sentiment in the energy markets.

Analysts said that despite global concerns over supply disruptions in some regions, the current demand-supply dynamics remain subdued, limiting significant upside in crude prices. Traders are closely watching inventory data, geopolitical developments, and OPEC signals for indications of any supply tightening that could support price

recovery Market observers highlighted that the MCX crude futures trend mirrors global patterns, as both domestic and international markets face tepid demand and mixed trading signals. Investors are expected to monitor upcoming economic data releases and fuel consumption trends to gauge future price direction.

Overall, the oil futures market remains under pressure, reflecting weak spot demand and cautious investor sentiment. Market participants continue to adopt a wait-andwatch approach, balancing domestic demand trends with global price movements.

## Coca-Cola bottler SLMG beverages targets Rs 9,000 cr revenue

dia's largest Coca-Cola bottler, expects high single-digit sales pects growth in FY26 despite facing headwinds in the June quarter due to unseasonal rains and geopolitical concerns, said Joint Managing Director Paritosh Ladhani on Monday. The company anticipates its gross revenue to cross Rs 9,000 crore, aided by festivals and GST concessions on its non-aerated drinks portfolio, which contributes around 30% of total

"The June quarter was below expectations, with 35-40% higher rainfall affecting sales. However, we anticipate strong growth in the December quarter and may even achieve double-digit growth," Ladhani told PTI. He added that fizzbased drinks will also see a rise as consumers have discretionary spending power.

SLMG Beverages plans to invest around Rs 8,000 crore over the next six years for expansion, funded through internal accruals and debt, including greenfield plants in Buxer, Bihar and Gorakhpur, UP. The company's current bottling capacity of 22,000 BPM is expected to increase to 27,000 BPM by year-end. Ladhani highlighted that 65-70% of the investment will go into plant capacity, while the remainder will support market development, warehousing, fleet, and new product



On a mid-term outlook, Ladhani stated the company aims to cross Rs 20,000 crore in gross turnover over the next five to six years. Regarding an IPO, he emphasized the focus will remain on strengthening

operations before considering public listing.

SLMG Beverages is part of the Rs 10,000-crore Ladhani Group, which has interests in hospitality, real estate, and energy, with 70% of its revenue coming from the

bottling business. In hospitality, the group plans to invest around Rs 3,000 crore, expanding from 550 to 700 keys with the upcoming Taj Gateway project, aiming for 1,500 rooms in the next five to six years.

The move, part of the latest GST Council reforms, applies Section 9(5) of the Central GST Act to local e-commerce delivery services, making even small charges like the "rain fee"

The change has already started reflecting in bills, with users noticing higher costs for orders during adverse weather conditions. For instance, a delivery rain fee of Rs 25 now attracts an 18% GST, bringing the total to Rs 29.50, adding an unexpected extra burden on customers. Restaurant GST is also separately applied, as seen in typical bills showing charges such as Rs 14.75 for the meal itself.

## Novak Djokovic's Mentor Nikola Pilic Dies at 87, Leaves Lasting Legacy in Tennis

roatian tennis leg-end Nikola Pilic, famously known as Novak Djokovic's "tennis dad," passed away at the age of 87, the Croatian Tennis Association announced on Tuesday. Pilic died on Monday in the western Croatian town of Opatija, leaving behind a rich legacy as both a player and a coach.

Pilic began his tennis journey in Split in 1953, and by 1957, he was representing the Yugoslav youth national team. Over his career, he won the Yugoslav Championship five times in singles (1962, 1963, 1964, 1966, 1967), seven times in doubles, and once in mixed doubles. His greatest individual achievement came in 1973, reaching the French Open final, where he lost to Ilie Nastase. Three years earlier, he had won the US Open doubles title with Pierre Barthes.

After retiring



professional play, Pilic enjoyed a distinguished coaching career, mentoring tennis stars such as Goran Ivanisevic, Michael Stich, and Boris Becker. His profound influence extended to Novak Djokovic, who trained at Pilic's academy in Munich in 1999 under the guidance of Djokovic's first coach Jelena Gencic, helping shape the future 24-time Grand Slam champion.

Pilic made history as the only captain to lead three different nations to Davis Cup titles—Germany in 1988, 1989, and 1993; Croatia in 2005; and Serbia in 2010. His contributions were widely recognized: the Croatian Tennis Association honoured him with a Lifetime Achievement Award in 2019, and in 2020, Serbia awarded him the Gold Medal of Merit for his outstand

ing impact on sport. The Croatian Tennis Association lauded Pilic as "one of the greatest players and coaches Croatian tennis has ever had." Beyond titles and medals, Pilic will be remembered for his mentorship, dedication, and enduring influence on generations of tennis champions, leaving an indelible mark on the global tennis

es minimum over-rate offences, players are fined 5 per cent of their match fee for each over not completed within the allotted time. Consequently, the two-over shortfall resulted in the 10 per cent penalty for the Indian team.

India captain Harmanpreet Kaur accepted the charge and agreed to the proposed fine, thereby avoiding the need for a formal hearing. The slow over-rate was reported by on-field umpires Lauren Agenbag and Janani Narayanan, with assistance from third umpire Gayathri Venugopalan and fourth umpire Vrinda Rathi.

This penalty comes

amid growing scrutiny over over-rate compliance in international cricket, emphasizing the importance of maintaining the pace of play while balancing strategic decisions on the field. 
