#### Customs Fraud Case and Political Connections

yderabad, Sept 24: Hyderabad-based businessman Basharath Khan Patan, owner of 'Car Lounge,' is at the center of a Rs 100 crore customs fraud investigation by the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI)-Ahmedabad.1 He was arrested in May 2025 for allegedly importing high-end luxury cars by deliberately under-invoicing and misdeclaring their value at Indian ports.2 The fraud is estimated to be around Rs 100 crore in evaded customs duties.

The investigation began after a tip-off led to the discovery that Basharath's showroom, S K Car Lounge, had imported eight luxury cars, including a Rolls-Royce, two Lexus, and five Toyota Land Cruisers, with significant undervalua-

tion. In his confession statement. Basharath admitted to undervaluing vehicles by large amounts, for example, a Rolls-Royce Cullinan by over Rs 1.24 crore and a Lexus LX-500D by over Rs 50 lakh. The vehicles were imported through various ports, including ICD Tughlakabad in Del-

Chennai. The probe has expanded to include the buyers of these cars. One such transaction involved a Lexus LX-500D sold to the Ayaan Educational

Society for Rs 3.25 crore, which was nearly double its declared landed value of Rs 1.75 crore.

Basharath, who has been in the car business for over a decade, is known for his connections with high-profile individuals, including politicians.4 The report reveals that a former BRS minister and a sitting Congress minister in Telangana have purchased imported luxury cars from him.5 Sources indicate that many customers paid for the cars in cash to avoid taxes.

and Basharath allegedly used these transactions to convert black money to white.6 His business partner, Dr. Ahmed, is also under scrutiny for reportedly storing several of the illegally imported vehicles at his farmhouse.7 The investigation has a pan-India footprint, with links to importers in cities like Mumbai, Pune, Bengaluru, Ahmedabad, and Delhi.8 Basharath has been remanded to judicial custody as the DRI's investigation continues.

#### Tenders to be Floated for **Kaleshwaram Barrage Restoration**

yderabad, Sept 24: The Telangana government is preparing to issue a tender notification within the next two days for the restoration of the Medigadda, Annaram, and Sundilla barrages of the Kaleshwaram Project. This process is being expedited to invite expressions of interest (EoI) from international design consultants. The goal is to select a highly qualified and reputable firm to create the necessary designs for the repair and rehabilitation of the damaged barrages.

The move follows a recent directive from Irrigation Department Principal Secretary Rahul Bojja on September 19, who ordered that steps be taken to call for an EoI for the restoration. Subsequently, Irrigation



Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy instructed officials to finalize the design consultant within two weeks. In response, the Irrigation Department is currently working to establish the criteria for selecting a firm with the required expertise for this critical project. The department is keen on engaging a firm with a strong international reputation to ensure the barrages are re-

stored to a high standard, preventing future failures.

This initiative is a significant step towards addressing the structural issues that have plagued parts of the Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project. The project, a flagship scheme of the previous government, has faced criticism and controversy following reports of subsidence and damage to the barrages.

The selection of an international consultant is aimed at bringing in global expertise to assess the damage, redesign the structures, and supervise the restoration work. This approach is expected to ensure the long-term stability and functionality of the barrages, which are crucial for irrigation and drinking water supply across several districts in Telangana.

Harish Rao pointed out what he saw as a significant contradiction between the statements of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and Minister for Irrigation Uttam Kumar Reddy.1 He noted that while Uttam Kumar Reddy claimed to have demanded a 763 TMC share of Krishna waters. Chief Minister Revanth Reddy had previously mentioned 500 TMC on June 18, 2025, and later 904 TMC on September 13. Harish Rao questioned who was correct. arguing that their lack of a unified position and basic understanding of the issue would harm the state's rightful share.2 He claimed that the Congress leaders' words were counted every hour, every minute, highlighting their alleged ignoa n d rance irresponsibility.

The former minister specifically addressed the historical 299:512 Krishna water sharing ratio between Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. He vehemently denied that

the BRS government had ever agreed to this ratio, stating that it was the Congress party that had accepted this "death warrant for the rights of the Telangana region" in 2013, based on the Justice Sri Krishna Committee's report. He challenged Uttam Kumar Reddy to resign if Harish Rao could prove that the BRS had signed any permanent agreement for 299 TMC.

Harish Rao detailed the BRS party's efforts under former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), including meeting central ministers, going to the Supreme Court, and successfully achieving Section 3 to secure Telangana's rightful share. He stated that the BRS had always insisted on 763 TMC and had worked relentlessly to establish a new tribunal based on the river basin, not on old agreements. He argued that the current Congress government's erratic statements could negatively affect the ongoing tribunal's final

Additionally, Harish Rao criticized the Congress for their silence on key issues, such as the Banakacharla project (due to fear of Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister Chandrababu Naidu) and the increase in the height of the dam in neighboring Karnataka, where the Congress party is in power. He also dismissed Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy's claims about obtaining approvals for the Sammakka Sagar project as a "Dabba campaign" or a false boast.





#### Telangana High Court Halts Pawan Kalyan's 'OG' Benefit Shows



The film "O G," starring actor and Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan, suffered a significant setback just before its release, as the Telangana High Court suspended a government memo allowing special benefit shows and a hike in ticket prices. The decision, handed down by Justice N.V. Shravan Kumar, came after a petition was filed challenging the Home Department's memo. The petitioner, Mahesh Yadav, argued through his lawyer that the Special Chief Secretary had no authority to issue such an order, as the

power to approve special shows and ticket price hikes lies with the Police Commissioner in the city and the Joint Collector in the districts. The lawyer further contended that the memo violated rules against selling tickets at inflated prices. The High Court's ruling which temporarily halts the price hike, has sent shockwaves through the film industry, with producers expressing concern that the loss of benefit shows will negatively impact the movie's opening day collections. Negotiations between **US Treasury Secretary** Scott Bessent and Chinese Vice Premier He Lifeng in Madrid have yielded a "framework" for TikTok's sale, though official details remain scarce. Reports suggest the new US company may hold an 80% American stake, leaving Chinese investors below the legal 20% limit.

Additionally, a board member nominated by the Trump administration could oversee operations, aligning with a strategy that treats economic security as integral to national security, similar to the government's approach in deals like Nippon Steel's \$14 billion US



Bessent emphasized that the agreement balances American national security interests with Beijing's economic expectations. Chinese officials describe the deal as a licensing arrangement for algorithms and intellectual property, framing it as a step to promote stable Sino-American economic relations.

# **Journalism Under** Siege: A Global Crisis of Truth and Safety

he global assault on journalists due to their journalism is reaching alarming levels, threatening the public's right to information and undermining the foundations of democracy. Violence, intimidation, and political interference against journalists are spreading across regions, affecting both unstable states and long-established democracies. The rise of authoritarian practices and populist rhetoric openly targeting the press has emboldened law enforcement, making physical attacks on journalists increasingly commonplace.

Traditionally, journalists have identified themselves at protests and public events, relying on this visibility for legitimacy and protection. Today. however, these identifiers often make them targets. In the past year alone, journalists have been violently attacked in countries as diverse as Turkey, Argentina, and the United States. All were clearly recognized as press members, highlighting the direct targeting of

work. In many parts of the

world, journalism is disappearing under relentless intimidation and threats. Journalists in West Africa's Sahel region and Central American countries like Nicaragua and El Salvador have been forced to flee. In Eastern and Central Europe, fact-checkers face regular death threats and organized campaigns designed to silence them. The threats often come from the highest levels of power; for example, Argentina's presidency posted on social media last year, "We Do Not Hate Journalists Enough," with the Argentine Journalism Forum recording 179 assaults on media workers in 2024 alone

The situation in conflict zones is even more dire. In Gaza, nearly 200 journalists have been killed over the past two years, with over 20 incidents believed to involve deliberate targeting. Some reporters working for AFP in Gaza refuse

to wear protective flak jackets, fearing they make them more visible targets. The pervasive fear even keeps ordinary citizens from being near journalists. Yet, despite this global crisis, few governments with a history of press freedom are willing to actively defend the profession, leaving journalists feeling isolated and vulnerable.

Adding to these challenges is the ra rise of generative artificial intelligence, which, while capable of incredible advancements, also threatens to pollute the information ecosystem with false or fabricated content. This is an inflection point for journalism. While the profession is imperfect. its pursuit of truth and accurate information is vital for the health of societies. In an era of widespread misinforma tion, standing up for facts and protecting iournalists has never been more critical. There is no alternative to defending the principles of truth, transparency, and press

banks are no longer moving in unison, creating a fragmented monetary landscape. The United States Federal Reserve recently cut its policy rate by 25 basis points, bringing it to a range of 4-4.25 per cent. In contrast, the European Central Bank (ECB) remains cautious, holding rates steady as it balances inflation concerns with sluggish growth. Japan continues its ultra-loose monetary policy with near-zero rates and extensive bond purchases, while China is aggressively easing policy rates to support its slowing

gence marks a clear departure from the post-pandemic trend when most central banks tightened policies collectively to combat inflation. Liquidity is now being injected in some regions while withdrawn in others, creating yield differentials that scatter capital flows rather than channeling them uniformly.

Amid this global monetary complexity, the Indian rupee is under pressure. recently slipping past Rs 88 to the dollar, marking a historic low. Conventional wisdom would suggest that a


weakening currency deters foreign investors, yet paradoxically, inflows into India continue unabated. Foreign portfolio investments (FPIs) surged, crossing \$14.6 billion in equities and nearly \$9-10 billion in debt in FY25. Momentum is expected to accelerate with India's inclusion in JPMorgan's Emerging Market Bond Index, which began in June 2024 and will reach full weight by March 2025, potentially attracting \$20-25 billion in debt

Why do investors remain bullish despite the rupee

key factors stand out. First. India's relative growth advantage is unmatched, with projected GDP growth of 6.5 per cent in FY2025, compared with 0.7 per cent in the eurozone and 0.9 per cent in the United States. Second, macroeconomic credibility matters: August 2025 inflation moderated to 4.9 per cent, within the Reserve Bank of India's target range, reflecting steady and credible policy management. Third. index-driven and structural flows provide stability, as pension funds and sovereign wealth

resources to India due to benchmark mandates rather than speculative motives.

Combined, these factors explain the paradox: despite the rupee's weakness, India remains a magnet for capital. It offers relative safety compared with emerging peers like Turkey, South Africa, or Brazil and delivers higher returns than developed markets such as the US or Europe. In a world of fragmented global liquidity, India stands out as a preferred investment destination, underpinned by growth, stability, and structural inflows.



#### Trump vs India: Tariffs, Swadeshi, and the Modi-RSS Alignment

ndia ushered in the Goods and Services Tax (GST), a landmark reform in state revenue collection, compared by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to historic moments like Independence and the adoption of the Constitution. Eight years later, on September 22, 2025, Modi announced the next phase of GST reforms, introducing a rationalised structure with just three rate slabs. Branded as a "savings festival," the move encourages Indian consumers to buy swadeshi products, aiming to offset the potential impact of US-imposed

While the tax adjustment may temporarily

boost consumption and appease the middle class, its broader significance lies in domestic political and ideological alignment. The Trump administration's tariffs have created an opportunity for the Modi government to embrace a

stronger swadeshi narrative, aligning more closely with the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) ideology and potentially bridging the longstanding rift between the RSS and its political arm, the Bharatiya Janata Party

Historically, India's economic policies have followed a liberal trajectory from the Narasimha Rao-Manmohan Singh era through the Vajpayee government. The RSS, however, advocated for a more inward-looking, self-reliant approach,

which clashed with liberalisation, especially in sectors like insurance. When Modi assumed office in 2014, hopes for swadeshi economic policies were rekindled, but his pro-business track record and openness to foreign investment often

drew criticism from the Sangh Parivar. Initiatives like Atmanirbhar Bharat and Vocal for Local were seen by some RSS factions as symbolic rather than substantive.

Trump's Make America Great Again campaign mirrors the swadeshi vision for India—prioritising domestic industries while imposing protective tariffs. India, however, faces challenges in developing a high-purchasing-power domestic market, as it remains capital-intensive rather than innovation- or labour-driven. The dual circulation strategy, similar to China's approach during its tariff tensions with the US, emphasises strengthening internal markets alongside external exports. promoting domestic innovation and resilience.

In response, the RSS has begun assessing India's economic

position and domestic capabilities, working with affiliated organisations to map out a roadmap for India to emerge as a global economic model. At a recent Jodhpur meeting, the Sangh leadership emphasised pursuing its goals unwaveringly, signalling a firm ideological direction. While the Modi administration's alignment with the Parivar remains evolving, Trump's tariffs have inadvertently provided an impetus for India to embrace swadeshi policies more assertively, blending domestic economic growth with ideological consolidation.

hocking revelations have emerged against 'Swami Chaitanyananda Saraswati', the director of the Sri Sharada Institute of Indian Management in Delhi's Vasant Kunj, who allegedly sent sleazy messages and exploited dozens of women under his care over the past 16 years. WhatsApp messages recovered from the mobile phones of 50 women reveal disturbing details, including lewd texts, coercion, and forced physical contact.

In some messages, the 'Swami' lured women with promises of wealth and overseas trips, while in others, he threatened poor academic marks to force compliance. Police investigations suggest that the accused, born Parthasarathy in Odisha, preyed on women from Economically Weaker Sections (EWS). possibly believing they would be less likely to speak up. He reportedly received assistance from three female wardens who allegedly coerced victims via messages and calls.

Two prior molestation



cases filed against him in 2009 and 2016 appear to have been ignored, allowing him to continue his predatory behavior. The second case was even reported by a woman from the same Vasant Kunj ashram, yet no action was taken by authorities or the ashram.

Currently, the accused was in London when the latest scandal broke after 17 women filed complaints at Delhi's Defence Colony Police Station in early August. He was last seen in Agra. Besides molestation charges, he faces allegations of using a fake diplomatic number plate on

his Volvo sedan, fraud. and other criminal conduct. Multiple fake plates were recovered from the ashram.

The ashram, part of the Dakshinamnaya Sri Sharada Peetha in Sringeri, has expelled the 'godman' and described his actions as "inappropriate." Police are actively investigating the matter, recording statements from the victims and associates, while the hunt continues to locate the accused. The scandal has sparked outrage over the prolonged exploitation of women and failures in accountability within religious institutions.

# Karnataka HC Rejects Elon Musk's X Corp Petition on Information Blocking Orders

he Karnataka High Court on Wednesday dismissed a petition filed by Elon Musk's X Corp challenging the authority of government officials to issue information blocking orders in India. The court emphasized that social media companies cannot be allowed to operate unregulated within the country.

The petition, filed by X Corp, sought to ques-

government-issued orders that direct platforms to remove or restrict access to content deemed unlawful or harmful. The company argued that such orders were excessive and could impinge on free expression online.

However, the Karnataka High Court rejected the claims, asserting that regulation is necessary to ensure responsible functioning of social media platforms. The court highlighted the government's role in maintaining public or- authority under the Inder, preventing the formation Technology spread of misinformation, and safeguarding citizens' rights.

"Social media companies cannot be allowed to work unregulated in India," the court stated. It stressed that platforms like X must comply with legal obligations, including blocking or taking down content as directed by competent authorities under Indian

Legal experts noted that the judgment reaffirms the government's

Act and other relevant regulations to issue directives to social media intermediaries. The ruling underscores the importance of balancing free speech with accountability in the digital space.

This verdict comes amid growing scrutiny of global social media platforms operating in India, particularly concerning the spread of misinformation, hate speech, and other unlawful content. It signals that even high-profile tech companies, including those led by global figures like Elon Musk, must adhere to Indian regulations.

Industry analysts say the decision could set a precedent for future cases involving content regulation, compliance obligations, and the responsibilities of social media intermediaries in India. The ruling reinforces that legal oversight is central to maintaining a safe and accountable online ecosystem while protecting national interests and public welfare.

















## "Because His Audience Is Gone": Trump On ABC Reuniting With Jimmy Kimmel

S President Donald Trump has expressed disbelief and frustration over ABC's decision to reinstate late-night host Jimmy Kimmel, just days after his show was suspended. The controversy erupted following Kimmel's remarks on the killing of rightwing activist Charlie Kirk and his criticisms of President Trump's response and FBI Director Kash Patel's handling of the investigation.

Kimmel's comments on the September 16 epiLive mocked Trump's manner of grieving and questioned the political narratives surrounding the assassination. The backlash was immediate, with Nexstar Media Group, a major ABC affiliate owner, announcing it would not air the show "for the foreseeable future." Disney later confirmed the show's return on Tuesday.

President Trump took to Truth Social to voice his disapproval, writing, "I can't believe ABC Fake News gave Jimmy Kimmel his job back. The White House was told by ABC that his show was cancelled!" He questioned ABC's motives, claiming Kimmel's

audience had diminished and accused the host of spreading "99% positive Democrat GAR-BAGE," calling it a potential "Illegal Campaign Contribution." Trump added that the government would "test ABC out on this," recalling that ABC previously paid \$16 million in a legal settlement.

Despite the reinstatement, some affiliates are refusing to broadcast the show. Nexstar and Sinclair Broadcast Group, controlling about a quarter of ABC's affiliates, said they would continue to preempt Kimmel unless assurances of "respectful, constructive dialogue" are met.

Kimmel's initial monologue referenced Charlie Kirk's death and mocked Trump's remarks about ongoing White House construction, drawing sharp criticism from Nexstar. Andrew Alford, Nexstar's broadcasting president, called Kimmel's comments "offensive and insensitive," emphasizing that they did not reflect the values of local communities.

Trump praised the original cancellation, calling ABC courageous at the time, but now views the reinstatement as a misstep, reiterating his intention to scrutinize the network's decision.

# Ragasa Kills 14 in Taiwan, Over a Million Evacuated in China

uper Typhoon Ragasa has claimed at least 14 lives in Taiwan and left 18 injured, while over 1.04 million residents in China's Guangdong province have been evacuated as the powerful storm approaches landfall. Ragasa, the 18th typhoon of the season, is being described as the strongest storm to hit the Chinese coast this year, with state-run CGTN warning it could be the most destructive so far. In Taiwan, the storm

nas caused widespread devastation, with nearly 100 people still trapped in various areas awaiting rescue. The typhoon's outer circulation continues to lash the island, triggering torrential rains and flooding. On Tuesday, a dam at a barrier lake in Hualien County overflowed, worsening the disaster.

As Ragasa moved closer to Guangdong's Pearl River Delta, wind speeds of 212 km/h were recorded in Zhuhai city. China's State Flood Control and Drought Relief Headquarters has raised the emergency response to

Level III for Guangdong and neighbouring Hainan. Local authorities are reinforcing infrastructure and bracing for flooding, storm surges, and landslides.

The storm has already disrupted transportation across the region. Shenzhen airport has been shut, while the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macao Bridge remains closed. Guangzhou has cancelled all flights until Wednesday evening, and Zhuhai reported 21 cancellations on Tuesday. Public transport systems, including buses, taxis, and subways, have been suspended in key cities, while highways remain restricted.

Authorities have also implemented preventive measures, including tying down outdoor objects, taping windows, and trimming over 18,000 trees to reduce risks.

With its sheer intensity, Ragasa is testing disaster preparedness across East Asia, leaving Taiwan reeling and China's manufacturing hub bracing for impact. Rescue efforts are underway as both nations prepare for further damage in the coming



# India mostly with us, says Ukrainian President Zelenskyy

rainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy has expressed cautious optimism about India's role in the Russia-Ukraine war, saying that New Delhi is "mostly with us" despite continuing energy ties with Moscow. Speaking in an interview with Fox News, Zelenskyy suggested that U.S. President Donald Trump could play a crucial role in reshaping India's energy cooperation with Russia and building closer ties between Washington, Europe, and New Delhi

When asked whether India and China's purchases of Russian oil were indirectly funding

Moscow's war machine, Zelenskyy admitted that energy remained a difficult issue. "I think India mostly with us. Yes, we have these questions with energy, but I think that President Trump can manage it with Europeans, make more close and strong relations with India," he said. He stressed the need to ensure that India does not drift away, adding that he believed New Delhi could eventually adjust its stance on the Russian energy sector

Zelenskyy contrasted India's position with that of China and Iran, stating that Beijing's deep reliance on Moscow and Tehran's alignment with anti-U.S. positions made them unlikely partners in peace. "I'm sure with

China, it's more difficult... Without China, Putin's Russia is nothing. Yet too often, China stays silent and distant, instead of active for peace," he remarked, adding that if China truly wanted the war to end, it could force Moscow to stop the invasion

India, meanwhile, has maintained that its energy imports are driven purely by national interest and market realities. After Western sanctions cut Moscow off from much of its traditional market, New Delhi turned to discounted Russian crude to secure affordable supplies. India continues to stress that its decisions are not political but rooted in ensuring energy security for its 1.4 billion





# Google Admits To Censorship Under Joe Biden

Plans To Restore Banned YouTube Accounts

oogle has announced a significant policy shift that could see previously banned You-Tube accounts reinstated, particularly those removed for political speech linked to Covid-19 and election discussions. The move comes after the company admitted, in a letter to the House Judiciary Committee, that it had taken down content under pressure from the Biden administration during the pandemic.

The letter, written by a Google lawyer, outlined the company's updated approach, stating that permanently banned users may now have a pathway back to the platform. This includes both regular users and well-known figures such as Dan Bongino, former White House adviser Sebastian Gorka, and podcast host Steve Bannon, who were all previously de-platformed for content that violated YouTube policies at the time.

The timing and framework for reinstatement have not yet been announced by Google's parent company, Alphabet. However, the disclosure forms part of a broader

Republican-led investigation into whether tech companies coordinated with the Biden administration to suppress speech online. The issue has also fueled legal challenges, with Republicans filing lawsuits alleging violations of free

expression.

In its statement, Alphabet acknowledged that government pressure to censor speech that did not break platform rules was both "unacceptable and wrong." The company emphasized that free debate should never be curtailed by political influence and vowed that it will never rely on third-party factcheckers to control speech.

speech.

The acknowledgment comes at a time when Europe's stricter online speech laws are already raising concerns in the U.S., especially about their implications for American users.

While critics see Google's reversal as a victory for free expression, supporters of stricter moderation argue it risks enabling misinformation. The reinstatement process, once clarified, could spark heated debates about the balance between open platforms and responsible content regulation.

# Recognition of Palestine Is 'Only a Matter of Time' at UN: PM Ishiba

Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba delivered a strong statement at the United Nations on Tuesday (September 24, 2025), declaring that Tokyo's recognition of the State of Palestine was inevitable and only a matter of time. Expressing sharp criticism of recent remarks by Israeli officials, Ishiba said he was "indignant" at statements that categorically rejected the very idea of Palestinian statehood

Currently, nearly 80% of UN member states recognize Palestine, with Britain, Canada, and France among the latest to add their names following almost two years of conflict in Gaza. "For

our country, the question is not whether to recognize a Palestinian state, but when. The continued unilateral actions by the Government of Israel can never be accepted," Ishiba emphasized. He further warned, "If further actions are taken that obstruct the realisation of a two-state solution, Japan will be compelled to take new measures in response"

The escalation of recognition efforts comes in the wake of Israel's offensive in Gaza, which began after Hamas's unprecedented October 7, 2023 attack inside Israel that killed 1,219 people, mostly civilians. Since then, nearly 65,382 Palestinians, the majority civilians, have died in Israeli military operations, according to Gaza's


health ministry, figures the UN has deemed credible

While the United States under President Donald Trump has argued that recognizing Palestine would reward Hamas, other Western allies have shifted toward supporting Palestinian statehood. Japan, a key G7 member and a close U.S. ally hosting around 54,000 American troops, has so far refrained but now signals a historic policy shift. Ishiba stressed that what matters most is ensuring a sustainable Palestinian state living peacefully alongside Israel. He also urged Palestinian leaders to establish governance systems that uphold accountability as they prepare for statehood.

# Sensex, Nifty end lower as profit booking continues; Tata Motors falls over 2%

Research at Geojit Investments, said profit booking has emerged post-GST reforms as investors recalibrate valuations and Q2 earnings expectations. He added that IT stocks underperformed amid H-1B fee hikes, while US trade rhetoric and weak global cues are prompting cautious investor sentiment.

Hariprasad K, SEBIregistered Research Analyst and Founder of Livelong Wealth, noted that the Nifty has declined over 3% in the past year despite intermittent rallies. He said this lack of meaningful enthusiasm among new-age investors, who are reluctant to deploy additional funds amid persistent volatility.

Adani Group stocks also came under pressure, reversing some recent gains. The surge in the group's shares following SEBI's clean chit last week appears to have triggered profit booking, with longstuck investors using the rally to pare positions

Globally, Asian equities rebounded on Wednesday, supported by optimism in the artificial intelligence and offered some relief to regional markets, although domestic investor sentiment remained cautious. Analysts expect that short-term volatility may continue as investors monitor global developments, currency fluctuations, and corporate earnings updates.

#### Gold Hits Record Rs 1,16,200; Silver Soars to All-Time High

by Rs 2,200 to touch a fresh peak of Rs 1,16,200 per 10 grams in the national capital on Monday, driven by strong global cues and anticipation of key commentary from US Federal Reserve officials on policy direction. According to the All India Sarafa Association, gold of 99.9% purity had closed at Rs 1,14,000 per 10 grams on Friday, while 99.5% purity gold rallied Rs 2,150 to hit a record Rs 1,15,650 per 10 grams, inclusive of all taxes.


Analysts noted that both gold and silver are

domestically, following bullish trends in international markets. Saumil Gandhi, Senior Analyst - Commodities at HDFC Securities, said a dovish signal from the US Fed suggests two additional rate cuts may occur by year-end, which could limit gains in the US dollar and Treasury yields while boosting precious metal prices. Strong inflows into exchange-traded funds and continued central bank demand have further supported bullion prices.

In 2025, gold has surged Rs 37,250 per 10 from Rs 78,950 at the end of 2024. Silver prices also skyrocketed by Rs 4,380 to an all-time high of Rs 1,36,380 per kilogram, up 52.04% from Rs 89,700 per kilogram on December 31, 2024.

Globally, spot gold rose over 1% to a record USD 3,728.43 per ounce, as investors awaited remarks from FOMC officials and Fed Chair Jerome Powell's upcoming speech. Spot silver traded higher at USD 43.61 per ounce, reaching an intra-day peak of USD 43.80. Kaynat Chainwala, AVP Commodity Research at Kotak Securiglobal markets are closely watching Fed guidance for policy direction, while Praveen Singh from Mirae Asset ShareKhan emphasized upcoming US PMIs data as crucial for market sentiment.

Jigar Trivedi, Senior Research Analyst at Reliance Securities, noted that strong fundamentals, tight supply, and robust industrial demand from the solar, electric vehicle, and electronics sectors are supporting silver's upward momentum, signaling continued strength for precious metals.



## SEBI Proposes Allowing FPIs to Trade in Gold, Silver, Base Metals



Exchange Board of India (SEBI) is considering a proposal to allow foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) to trade in noncash settled, non-agricultural commodity derivatives, potentially including gold, silver, zinc, and other base metals. Currently, FPIs are permitted to trade only in natural gas, crude oil, index futures, and index options.

SEBI Chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey recently confirmed that

he Securities and the proposal is under review as part of efforts to broaden India's domestic commodity market and attract a wider pool of investors. By opening the market to foreign participants, the regulator aims to increase liquidity, diversify investment flows, and enhance price discovery for non-agricultural commodities.

Market experts believe that allowing FPIs to trade in gold and silver derivatives could significantly boost participation in these segments, which have traditionally been dominated by domestic investors. Enhanced foreign involvement may lead to tighter spreads, more efficient pricing, and potentially higher trading volumes. Additionally, zinc and other base metals could see increased interest from global funds seeking exposure to India's growing industri-

al demand. The move aligns with broader policy goals of integrating India's financial markets with

global investment flows. By offering FPIs more avenues for investment, SEBI hopes to attract capital inflows while simultaneously strengthening the domestic derivatives

ecosystem. Analysts note while the proposal is likely to create new opportunities for foreign investors, it will also require careful monitoring to manage risks associated with volatility and speculative activity. The regulator may implement safeguards, in-

cluding position limits and risk management measures, to maintain market stability.

If approved, SEBI's proposal could mark a significant step in opening up India's commodity derivatives market to global investors, enhancing its depth, competitiveness, and alignment with international best practices. The final decision is awaited, and market participants are watching closely for potential implications on trading dynamics and investor strategies.

## GST 2.0: Centre Monitors Price Changes, Urges Consumer Feedback

he Centre has directed its field officers to closely monitor price changes across 54 product categories following the rollout of GST 2.0, government sources said on Tuesday. The sweeping tax rate cuts, which became effective from September 22, are aimed at simplifying the Goods and Services Tax and providing relief to consumers, but the government is cautious about ensuring that the benefits are actually passed

On September 9, the Revenue Department issued a letter to principal chief commissioners and chief commissioners of central GST zones, instructing them to submit detailed reports on price movements by the end of the month. The monitoring exercise is intended to avoid any sudden or knee-jerk in-



"Field officers are expected to track prices diligently and report any irregularities or insufficient benefit transfer to consumers," said a government official familiar with the matter. This is part of the broader effort under GST 2.0 to enhance transparency, ensure compliance, and maintain consumer confidence in the taxation

Consumers who feel

that the GST rate cuts are not being reflected in retail prices are being encouraged to lodge complaints through the National Consumer Helpline. The government has stressed that public feedback will complement the official monitoring and help authorities identify areas where addition-

al action may be needed. Officials have emphasized that the Centre does not plan to make hasty regulatory moves but will review the reports and consumer com-

plaints carefully before deciding on any interventions. The combined approach of field surveillance and consumer reporting is expected to provide a comprehensive picture of how the GST 2.0 benefits are being distributed in the market.

The ongoing monitoring will be crucial in ensuring that the intended price reductions are passed on effectively, maintaining trust in the new GST framework while balancing market dynamics.

## Goyal Highlights U.S. Role in **India's Energy Securit**

ndia plans to increase its energy trade with the United States in the coming years, Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Tuesday (September 23, 2025), stressing that U.S. involvement will play a significant role in India's energy security. Speaking at the U.S.-India Strategic Partnership Forum (USISPF) in New York, Goyal outlined key areas of cooperation, including energy, nuclear power, and critical minerals

"India is a big player in the energy trade," Goyal said. "We are big importers of energy from across the world, including from the U.S. We expect to increase our trade with the U.S. on energy products in the years to come." He added that being close friends and natural partners, both countries

would collaborate to en-

sure price stability, diver-



sify energy sources for India, and explore broader opportunities across

sectors Goyal also highlighted nuclear power as a priority area for bilateral cooperation. "It is an area we have been talking about for a long time. There were certain elements that needed to be set right, and we are working to support private efforts in nuclear power in India," he said

The Commerce Minister also criticised the European Union's planned Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM), warning it could isolate the EU and harm its economy. "Green protectionism can backfire, causing inflation and making infrastructure and cost of living unviable," Goyal said, urging that trade and climate goals not be conflated

Researchers hope that further understanding of biophoton emission could have cine and biology, potentially allowing scientists to monitor cell health non-invasively or study the biological processes of aging and disease progression.

This discovery underscores the extraordinary complexity of life, revealing that even in silence and stillness, our bodies are quietly radiating light, a hidden signal of life's intricate energy



#### Google's AI Turnaround: From Early Blunders to Consumer Powerhouse

Google has staged a remarkable comeback in the AI arena, transforming from a company mocked for early missteps to a major player in consumer-facing artificial intelligence. When ChatGPT first shook the world, Google hastily launched its AI chatbot, Bard, in March 2023. Bard's launch was marred by errors, including a botched response about the James Webb telescope, drawing ridicule and prompting analysts to question Google's AI dominance.

Despite investing heavily in AI for over a decade, including acquiring DeepMind in 2014, Google had primarily focused on enhancing its own platforms rather than delivering direct



consumer services. Analysts noted that the company's leadership had grown complacent, underestimating the disruption from ChatGPT.

The turnaround began in 2024 with a major internal reorganization. consolidating AI teams under DeepMind, led by Nobel laureate Demis Hassabis. CEO Sundar Pichai emphasized the need to deploy Google's proprietary AI chips, TPUs, to power next-generation applications. Early experiments like AI Overviews, though initially ridiculed, marked the first step toward broader consumer engagement.

By 2025, Google had launched NotebookLM, a tool synthesizing documents into readable summaries or podcasts, followed by Veo 3, a precise

Mode transformed Google Search into a conversational interface, while the new Pixel smartphone enabled advanced AI features like 100x zoom and real-time translation. YouTube also integrated AI video generation, and Google's Gemini-powered image editing app, Nano Banana, outperformed ChatGPT in iPhone downloads.

With partnerships reportedly brewing with Apple for Siri integration, Google is positioning AI as both a consumer service and a potential revenue stream. Analysts note that while monetization remains uncertain, Google is playing the long game building engagement today for substantial returns tomorrow

#### iPhone 17 Pro Series launch of the iPhone 17 series, Apple is facing mounting criticism from consumers and tech experts

over the durability of its flagship models. Users have reported that the iPhone 17 Pro and iPhone 17 Pro Max are highly prone to scratches, even under minimal daily use, sparking outrage online. The issue has quickly been dubbed "Scratchgate" and has become a trending topic across social media platforms.

Tech reviewers were among the first to highlight the problem. They conducted standard scratch tests and found that the new devices scratched more easily than their predecessors, despite Apple's claims of using "next-generation

ceramic shield" glass. Consumers, meanwhile, have posted photos and videos showing noticeable scratches after routine handling, including keeping the phones in pockets alongside keys.

Many users are expressing disappointment, noting that the premium pricing of the iPhone 17 Pro models warrants a higher standard of durability. Some have questioned Apple's testing process, suggesting that the company prioritized aesthetics and design over everyday practicality. Online forums and tech communi-

Apple has yet to release an official statement addressing the Scratchgate controversy. Industry analysts predict that the backlash could impact sales if the company does not offer clarifications, warranties, or solutions for affected users. Meanwhile, consumer advocacy groups are closely monitoring the situation, urging Apple to respond promptly to maintain customer trust.

With "Scratchgate" gaining momentum, the tech world is watching to see whether Apple can quickly manage the issue and reassure its loyal user base about the reliability of its high-end devices.


