

TGRTC IS READY FOR FESTIVAL TRAVELS: MINISTER ASSURED

yderabad, Sept 28: Telangana Transport Minister Ponnam Prabhakar convened a comprehensive teleconference with senior officials of the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TGRTC) to review and strengthen passenger transport arrangements ahead of the Bathukamma and Dussehra festivities. The minister underscored the need to ensure that festival travelers heading to their native towns and villages experience no inconvenience due to overcrowding, delays,

or logistical issues. Minister Prabhakar instructed TGRTC authorities to focus on major congestion points across Hyderabad, including Uppal, LB Nagar, and Arangur, ensuring smooth passenger flow and efficient deployment of buses. Each bus station, he stressed, should have a dedicated officer responsible for managing operations, monitoring crowding, and making additional buses available as required.

"RMLs, Deputy RMLs, and senior officials must be deployed on the ground at all depots and bus stations. Coordination across all 97 depots and 340 bus stations is critical to ensure that passengers reach their destinations safely, on time, and without unnecessary stress," the minis-

ter directed.

During the teleconference, TGRTC officials informed the minister that a total of 7,754 special buses have been arranged statewide to meet the surge in passenger traffic anticipated during the festival period. Bathukamma is scheduled for September 30. while Dussehra falls on October 2. Officials highlighted that the highest passenger movement is expected to begin this Saturday. and the deployment of special buses has been strategically planned to manage peak demand.

Officials assured the minister that all depots and bus stations are fully prepared to handle the high volume of travelers. Measures include efficient coordination between depots, bus stations, and traffic authorities to minimize congestion and delays. Special buses will operate on high-demand routes to and from Hyderabad, facilitating a seamless journey for passengers traveling to different districts of Telangana.

Minister Prabhakar also emphasized passenger safety, advising TGRTC staff to provide timely updates on bus schedules, routes, and availability of services. He urged officials to remain vigilant and proactive in addressing any unexpected issues that might arise during the festival travel period. The minister further highlighted that on-ground supervision by senior officials would ensure adherence to safety protocols and smooth function-

ing at all stations. In addition, TGRTC was directed to maintain constant communication with travelers, particularly at major bus stations and junctions, to inform them about waiting times and alternative travel options. The minister reiterated that citizen convenience is a top priority and that festival travelers should experience stress-free transportation without facing overcrowding or

long delays. The TGRTC, under the guidance of Minister Prabhakar, is taking a multi-pronged approach to manage the festival travel rush. With the deployment of additional buses, dedicated on-site supervision, and close coordination between depots and stations, the corporation aims to provide efficient and safe transport services throughout the festive

Political Reservation Controversy Intensifies

The Telangana Congress government's recent push for 42% reservation for Backward Classes (BCs) in local body elections has sparked heated debates over the legitimacy and timing of the move. The political row comes on the heels of the government issuing government orders (GOs) to implement the higher BC quota in panchayati raj institutions, municipal councils, and other local bodies.

Congress, in its election manifesto, had promised education and employment benefits through political reservations for BCs. However, critics argue that the current push is less about fulfilling constitutional mandates and

vantage. Constitutional experts and political analysts have flagged the move as potentially manipulative, cautioning that elections cannot be postponed under the guise of implementing new reservation policies.

Legal precedents are

clear. The Supreme Court has repeatedly emphasized transparent implementation of reservation policies and adherence to constitutional provisions. Critics argue that issuing GOs without a detailed, comprehensive report on beneficiaries undermines the rule of law. "The system is not a drama company," remarked one political observer, noting that courts will examine the legality of

plementing 42% BC reservation. While the intent may be to provide equitable representation in elected bodies, the process requires a meticulous survey of eligible candidates across all categories, including sarpanches, MPTCs, ZPTCs, MPPs, and ZP chairpersons. Observers suggest that a piecemeal approach or rushed notifications could lead to legal setbacks.

Opposition leaders have criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's handling of the situation. Questions have been raised on why the government, if genuinely committed to BC reservations, failed to implement similar measures earlier through ministerial ac-

There, 69% reservation in various sectors was implemented after a comprehensive study conducted by a panel of 25 retired IAS officers, covering education, employment, and social sectors. The ongoing debate underscores a broader concern: ensuring social justice while maintaining electoral fairness. Experts emphasize the importance of detailed data, transparent procedures, and constitutional compliance before issu-

Heavy Rains Cause Manjeera River to Overflow in Medak

Edupayala Temple Doomed In Flood

jeera River has overflowed at the Yellapur bridge in Medak district, creating significant disruptions on the Hyderabad-Medak road near the famous Edupayala temple. Authorities have temporarily closed traffic on the bridge as a precautionary measure, following continuous heavy rainfall in the region and large water releases from the Singur reservoir.

According to officials, the river has been receiving over 1.5 lakh cusecs of water, with irrigation authorities releasing 90,000 cusecs from the Singur reservoir by lifting 10 crest gates. The steady inflow, combined with incessant rains in Sangareddy and Medak districts, has caused the river to swell beyond its banks, threatening nearby bridges and low-lying

areas. The Yellapur bridge, which serves as a vital link between the Hyderabad-Medak road and Edupayala temple, has seen water levels rise dangerously. In addition to Yellapur, three other nearby bridges have also been submerged, causing further disruption to vehicular and pedestrian movement in the area.

The rising waters have swept away prasadam counters and temporary sheds set up for devotees at Edupayala temple, affecting the local religious activities. Authorities have urged residents and visitors to stay away from the riverbanks and

avoid traveling through affected areas until the water recedes.

Apart from the Manjeera, several streams, lakes, and minor water bodies across the district are overflowing due to continuous rainfall over the past few days. Local administration has activated disaster response teams to monitor water levels and assist affected residents in low-lying

villages The irrigation and flood control departments are keeping a close watch on the Singur reservoir and other key water bodies in the region to manage further releases safely. Officials have also set up warning signals and barricades at vulnerable points along the river to prevent accidents and ensure public safety.

District authorities have appealed to devotees planning to visit the Edupayala temple to postpone their trips until the river subsides. Temporary shelters and relief measures are being readied for residents in floodprone areas, ensuring immediate assistance in case of emergencies.

Meteorologists have predicted that heavy

rainfall is likely to continue over the coming days in Medak and Sangareddy districts, raising concerns over the water levels in rivers, streams, and reservoirs. Residents have been advised to remain vigilant, avoid venturing near overflowing water bodies, and follow official advisories issued by the district administration.

With the Manjeera River in spate and the heavy inflows from Singur reservoir, authorities continue to closely monitor the situation to prevent any casualties and minimize damage to property.

Speaker to Hear Disqualification Petitions Against Turncoat MLAs

yderabad, Sept 28: Telangana Assem-Speaker Gaddam Prasad Kumar is set to commence hearings on the disqualification petitions filed against MLAs who defected from the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS). The proceedings, scheduled for Monday and Wednesday, mark a significant step in addressing the political turmoil triggered by the recent wave of

defections. The Supreme Court had earlier directed the Speaker to take action on the defection petitions, prompting the initiation of hearings. In compliance with this directive, both the petitioners and the MLAs who switched loyalties have been summoned to present their

The hearings on Monday are expected to be conducted in four sessions, running from 11 am to 4 pm. As part of the process, the Speaker will oversee the crossexamination of both the petitioners and the respondents. This comprehensive approach aims to ensure that all sides are heard before any decision is taken regarding the disqualification of the turncoat MLAs. Among those slated to

appear for the hearing are T. Prakash Goud (Rajendranagar), Kale Yadaiah (Chevella), Gudem Mahipal Reddy (Patancheru), and Bandla Krishnamohan Reddy (Jogulamba Gadwal). These MLAs have drawn

attention due to their defection from the ruling BRS, which has raised questions about party loyalty and legislative

stability in the state. The disqualification petitions were filed amid political upheaval following the shift of several MLAs from the BRS to other parties. The move has intensified political debate in Telangana, as both supporters and opponents of the turncoat legislators await the Speaker's decision.

The Speaker's hearings are expected to involve detailed scrutiny of the circumstances surrounding the defections. MGBSResumes Services After Unprecedented Flood Disruption

ber 28: The Mahatma Gandhi Bus Station (MGBS), one of the largest bus stations in Asia and a crucial hub for passenger transport in Telangana, has resumed its operations this afternoon after being forced to shut down due to unprecedented floods. The resumption of services marks the end of a tense period for both staff and passengers, who had witnessed scenes never before experienced at the iconic bus station.

In the aftermath of the heavy downpour that lashed Hyderabad earlier this week, the premises of MGBS were inundated with floodwaters. What shocked many was not just the accumulation of water, but the volume of mud and debris that swept into the station. Three major plat-

forms, essential for inter-district and interstate bus services, were completely buried under layers of thick mud.

Before resuming operations, staff undertook a massive cleanup drive to restore the station. Workers rolled up their sleeves, manually clearing the sludge that had rendered bus bays unusable. Their swift action ensured that services could be restarted within days, minimizing disruption to thousands of commuters who depend on the facility

For many employees, the incident was unlike anything they had seen in their careers. Sharing his reaction, Mr. Srinivasa Rao, a senior staff member at MGBS, said, "Really, we are shocked with the flood. We have only seen rainwater being stocked in

but nothing like this has ever happened. This was a completely new experience for us. However, all our staff participated actively in the rescue and restoration work. The management too was with us every step of the way. They did not limit themselves to giving instructions, but personally came down to the ground and worked shoulder to shoulder with us. This experience has truly shown our collective commitment to this institution."

His words reflect the sense of unity and resilience displayed by the MGBS team during the crisis. Employees, many of whom had themselves been affected by the rains in their neighborhoods, still reported for duty and worked long hours to bring the bus station

ack to normalcy.

The management of the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TSRTC), which oversees MGBS, also acknowledged the extraordinary efforts of the staff. Senior officials made frequent visits to the premises during the cleanup operation and coordinated with ground staff to expedite the restoration process. According to insiders, their presence not only boosted morale but also ensured that critical decisions were implemented without delay.

Commuters expressed relief at the reopening of the bus station. Many passengers who rely on MGBS for travel to districts across Telangana and neighboring states had been forced to reschedule or cancel their journeys due to the disruption. With buses resuming

service from Saturday afternoon, passenger flow is gradually re-

turning to normal. The incident has sparked conversations around the need for improved flood preparedness and infrastructure upgrades at major public transport hubs in the city. While Hyderabad has faced instances of heavy rains and waterlogging in the past, the scale of flooding inside MGBS has highlighted new vulnerabilities.

For now, however, staff and management take pride in having overcome the crisis together. As operations return to routine, the resilience shown during the disaster stands as a reminder of the dedication of those who keep one of India's busiest bus stations running, even in the face of unprecedent

Authorities Shut Down Musarambagh Road After Flood Damage

yderabad, September 28: Heavy rains that lashed the city in recent days have left the Musarambagh stretch severely damaged, forcing authorities to completely halt vehicular movement in the area. The service road built temporarily alongside the Musarambagh bridge, which was already under construction, has been battered by floodwaters, leaving it unsafe for travel.

According to officials, the rains brought heavy floodwater that swept through the service road, peeling off the road surface, creating deep potholes, and leaving behind piles of debris. With the condition of the road worsening and accidents becoming imminent, authorities had no option but to shut it down completely.

The Musarambagh bridge has been under construction for several months, with one side already closed for flyover works. To ease traffic congestion, officials had permitted movement of vehicles on a temporary service road adjacent to the bridge. However, after the recent rains, that road too has become impassable.

Speaking on the situation, Amberpet Circle DMC Maruthi Divakar and Traffic Inspector Veera Kaushik appealed to citizens not to use the route until the bridge construction is completed. "The road has become extremely dangerous after the floods. For the safety of the public, we have closed the route entirely. We request everyone to cooperate and avoid using this stretch," they said.

Police have set up barricades on both sides of the bridge to completely restrict the movement of vehicles. Security personnel have also been deployed to ensure that commuters do not attempt to bypass the closure.

The shutdown has caused inconvenience to regular commuters who use the Musarambagh route daily, but officials

stress that safety is the top priority. Locals too echoed that while the closure may cause delays, preventing mishaps is far more important.

Traffic police have begun diverting vehicles to alternative routes and are closely monitoring congestion in surrounding areas. They have also advised motorists to plan their journeys in advance to avoid getting stranded near the closed stretch.

The incident has once again highlighted the vulnerability of Hyderabad's infrastructure during heavy monsoon rains. Experts point out that temporary arrangements, such as service roads, often cannot withstand the impact of floodwaters and call for stronger planning in future projects.

For now, authorities are urging patience from the public. Until the completion of the Musarambagh bridge construction, citizens will have to depend on alternate routes to commute safely.

Hyderabad Sees 17% Decline in Crime

Police have reported a notable 17 percent reduction in crime since August 2024, marking what officials describe as a significant improvement in the city's law and order situation. The figures were released on Sunday during a review meeting chaired by Police Commissioner C.V. Anand, who praised the collective efforts of the police force in achieving these results.

Overall Decline in Ma-

jor Crimes According to the report, murder cases saw a sharp fall. Between September 2023 and August 2024, the city registered 85 cases of murder, whereas during the same period this year, only 73 cases were recorded—a decline of 14 percent. Attempt-tomurder cases showed an even more encouraging trend, dropping from 259 last year to 185 this year, a fall of 29 percent.

Cases involving intentional harm also declined, with 2,049 cases reported last year compared to 2,037 this year. Kidnapping cases, another major concern for the city police, fell by 12 percent, from 698 in the previous year to 616 in the current reporting period.

reporting period.

Cybercrime, which has been a growing challenge across Indian cities, also showed improvement in Hyderabad. A total of 3,745 cases were registered this year, compared to 4,348 in the previous year—a 14 percent drop. The detection rate also improved, rising from 40 percent to 42 percent.



which the commissioner described as a "commendable performance" by specialized cybercrime teams.

Property Offences and Detection Rates

Property-related offences showed a significant decline. In the previous year, 5,484 such cases were reported. This year, the number dropped to 4,082, representing a 26 percent reduction. The recovery rate of stolen property improved slightly from 54 percent to 55 percent.

Murder-for-gain cases also decreased by 40 percent, with only three incidents reported this year, compared to five last year. Notably, two of the three were detected, raising the recovery rate dramatically from 2 percent to 83 percent.

Robbery cases fell sharply, from 251 in the previous year to 135 this year—a reduction of 46 percent. Out of these, 128 cases were detected. Burglary cases showed only a marginal decline, from 450 to 443, but the recovery rate improved significantly, rising from 61 percent to 80 percent. Theft cases dropped by 27 percent, from 4,778 to 3,501, with the detection rate inching up from 50 per-

cent to 51 percent. Crimes Against Women

improved, rising from 40 The report also shed percent to 42 percent, light on crimes against

women. Rape cases recorded a sharp decline of 23 percent, from 632 last year to 485 this year. Kidnapping of women fell by 10 percent, while harassment cases dropped slightly from 1,358 to 1,351. Cases of outraging the modesty of women saw a steep decline of 20

percent, from 1,004 last year to 803 this year. However, there was an increase in dowry death cases—from 11 last year to 13 this year, representing an 18 percent rise. Police officials acknowledged this as an area

requiring greater focus. Commissioner's Statement

Police Commissioner C.V. Anand, appreciating the dedication of officers and staff, said the results reflected the teamwork and commitment of the Hyderabad police. ecunderabad, Sept 28: The Jubilee Bus Station (JBS) in Secunderabad experienced a surge of passengers ahead of the Dasara festival, as students and families traveled in large numbers to their hometowns. The festive season, coupled with school and college vacations, contributed to the heavy rush at the station.

TSRTC officials said that special Dasara services were arranged from JBS to various districts to accommodate the high demand. Bond Yields Defy RBI Rate Cuts Amid Fiscal, Global Concerns

espite India's inflation hitting an eight-year low and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) cutting interest rates since February government bond yields are moving in the opposite directionrising sharply when they would typically

India's 10-year benchmark bond yield has climbed over 20 basis points since the RBI's last rate cut in June, closing at 6.47% on Wednesday. This unusual rise is driven by concerns over weak tax collections, a

potential fiscal deficit overshoot, and geopolitical risks—especially the impact of U.S. tariffs on Indian exports.

Traditionally, lower interest rates and inflation lead to higher bond prices and lower yields. But recent market behavior has defied this logic. Experts point to the RBI's shift in policy stance-from 'accommodative' to 'neutral'as a key trigger. While the reporate was cut by a cumulative 100 basis points this year, markets interpreted the

policy shift as a signal

that further rate cuts may not follow.

Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman has acknowledged the rise in vields is "not affordable," though she maintained it doesn't currently affect the government's fiscal calculations.

Independent analyst Ajay Bodke noted that fiscal slippage fears especially with underperforming direct and indirect tax collections—are keeping bond investors wary. A recent report by Axis Bank estimates a possible ₹1.4 trillion shortfall in direct taxes for FY26, adding pressure to government borrowing.

The new GST rate rationalisation announced in early September—cutting slabs to 5% and 18% aims to boost demand but may reduce revenue by ₹48,000 crore. Bond yields briefly softened following the GST announcement, but broader worries

continue. Adding to market jitters is the potential fallout from U.S. trade policy. Trump's new 100% tariffs on branded pharmaceuticals and the proposed HIRE

outsourcing bill have raised red flags for Indian exporters. Experts warn that substitution to other markets won't match U.S. profit margins and could lead to reduced earnings across labour-intensive

sectors Until there is clarity on fiscal trends and external pressures. experts suggest bond yields may remain elevated—even as inflation and interest rates stay low. For now, market sentiment is clearly being driven more by future risks than present data.

Pharma Tariffs: Trump Keeps Indian Drug-Makers on Edge

ongoing negotiations between India and the United States over a long-pending trade agreement, President Donald Trump has announced a sweeping new tariff policy targeting the pharmaceutical sector. The US administration has imposed a 100% tariff on branded and patented pharmaceutical products imported into the country unless the manufacturing companies establish production facilities on American soil. This policy shift has sent ripples through India's pharmaceutical industry, which is a major player in the global market

India, often hailed as the "pharmacy of the world," exports over \$30 billion worth of pharmaceutical products globally, with the US accounting for roughly \$10 billion of that figure. The country predominantly supplies low-cost generic drugs to the American market, which, importantly, remain exempt from the new tariff regime. This exemption provides some relief to Indian drug-makers, safeguarding a significant portion of their exports.



However, concerns persist over the status of active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs), the core components used in drug production. The tariff policy has not clearly addressed whether APIs will fall under the new tariffs, leaving Indian manufacturers uncertain about potential impacts on this crucial segment.

Additionally, the industry is witnessing a strategic shift as major Indian pharmaceutical firms increasingly focus on complex generics advanced formulations that are more difficult to develop than traditional generic drugs. These include inhalers. injectables, and ophthalmic solutions, which often fall within the branded or patented categories and thus might be subject to the new tariffs. Complex generics are commercially valuable as they enable companies to

enter higher-value markets and diversify beyond conventional generics.

This evolving landscape creates a delicate balance for Indian drug manufacturers. While the exemption of standard generics offers some protection, the new tariff rules pose challenges for growth in specialized drug segments. Setting up manufacturing bases in the US, as demanded by the policy, would require substantial investments and strategic decisions by Indian companies.

As trade talks between the two nations continue, clarity on tariff implications, especially concerning APIs and complex generics, remains crucial. The outcome will determine how India's pharmaceutical exporters navigate this new regime while sustaining their vital role in global healthcare.

Trump's \$100,000 H-1B Visa Fee May Boost India's \$65 Billion GCC Sector

Trump's latest move to impose a \$100,000 fee on all new H-1B visa petitions filed after September 21, 2025, has sent shockwaves through the global tech industry—particularly in India, which receives about 70% of all H-1B visas issued each year.

The steep visa petition fee, payable by the employer regardless of whether the petition is approved, is part of Trump's push to encourage domestic hiring in the U.S. The

outsourcing talent—and create more jobs for American citizens.

hurt Indian IT companies with U.S. operations in the short term,

it could accelerate the growth of Global Capability Centres (GCCs) in India. With on-site postings becoming significantly more expensive, many global firms are expected to ramp up their offshore operations, bringing more high-value work back to India.

India currently hosts approximately 1,700 GCCs, which collectively generated \$65 billion in revenue in FY2024. Industry experts believe this number

could rise sharply if companies shift hiring and project execution to India to avoid the H-1B cost burden.

'This move makes offshore delivery even more attractive. Instead of paying \$100,000 just to file a visa, companies can expand their Indian GCC teams and save costs while maintaining productivity," said a senior executive at a top Indian IT firm.

The Trump administration's stance stems from long-standing

criticisms that the H-1B program has been misused by outsourcing firms to place low-cost, low-skilled labor in the U.S., rather than attracting the highly skilled technologists the visa was originally designed for. This has fueled perceptions that Indian IT workers are "stealing American jobs," a view that has gained political traction.

For India, the move presents both a challenge and an opportunity. While it

restricts access to U.S.-based employment for Indian tech talent, it also strengthens India's position as a global tech and innovation hub. As companies rethink their global workforce strategies India's GCC ecosystem could see a significant boost in investment, hiring, and upskilling.

The coming months will reveal whether this visa fee acts more as a deterrent or a trigger for a new phase of growth in India's tech sector.







Rahul Gandhi Accuses BJP of Attacking Ladakh's Culture, **Seeks Sixth Schedule Status**

ongress leader Rahul Gandhi on Sunday (September 28, ■2025) alleged that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS) are endangering Ladakh's unique cultural identity, calling for the region's immediate inclusion under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution to safeguard its people, land, and traditions.

His remarks come days

Leh left four people dead and several others injured following firing by security forces. The unrest, sparked by growing resentment over land rights and cultural protection, has led to the arrest of over 50 individuals allegedly involved in the rioting.

Speaking to reporters during a visit to the region, Gandhi said, "The people of Ladakh, their culture and their traditions are under attack. The BJP and RSS are trying to erase what makes Ladakh special. We stand with the people and demand constitutional safeguards.'

The Sixth Schedule provides for autonomy and protection of tribal populations through elected councils with legislative and judicial powers over land, culture, and resource use. Currently, it applies to certain areas in the northeast but not to Ladakh.

Local leaders and civil society groups have long demanded the extension of the Sixth Schedule to Ladakh, especially after the revocation of Article 370 in 2019, which removed the region's previous special status.

Violence last week marked the worst unrest in the region since its bifurcation from Jammu and Kashmir and declaration as a Union Territory.

Gandhi's statement adds pressure on the central government, which has so far resisted granting Sixth Schedule status, citing administrative complexities. Meanwhile, protests continue in Leh and Kargil, with local groups warning of a larger agitation if their demands are not met.

He eventually arrived at 7:40 pm,'

3 Maoists With 14 Lakh Bounty Killed in Chhattisgarh Encounter

hree Maoists carrying a combined reward of 14 lakh on their heads were killed in an encounter with security forces on Sunday (September 28, 2025) in Kanker district, police confirmed.

The gunfight occurred in a dense forested hill near Chhindkhadak village, along the border of Kanker and Gariaband districts, said Indira Kalyan Elesela, Superin-

The encounter broke out when a joint team of security personnelcomprising District Reserve Guards (DRG), Special Task Force (STF), and Border Security Force (BSF)—was conducting a search operation as part of an intensified anti-Maoist drive in the region. The team was acting on intelligence inputs about

Maoist movement in the "During the operation, Maoists opened fire on ty personnel. The forces retaliated, leading to a fierce exchange of fire,' SP Elesela told PTI. Once the guns fell silent, three bodies of Maoists were recovered along with weapons and Maoist literature.

Initial identification revealed that all three deceased Maoists were carrying bounties — one of 5 lakh and two others of 4.5 lakh each — announced by the state government for their alleged involvement in violent attacks and am-

bushes on security forc-

es and civilians. This is the latest in a series of successful anti-Naxal operations in Chhattisgarh this year, where security forces have intensified efforts in Maoist-affected regions. Over 30 Maoists have reportedly been gunned down in separate encounters across the state in 2025 so far.

Search operations in the region are continuing, as authorities believe more Maoists may be hiding in the surrounding forests.

AAP Launches 'Goa Doesn't **Want BJP's Gundaraj' Campaign**

he Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Sunday launched a sharp statewide campaign titled "Goa Doesn't Want BJP's Gundaraj", accusing the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) of fostering lawlessness, corruption, and a climate of fear in the

AAP leaders said the campaign aims to mobilise Goans against what they called the "steady erosion" of the state's

peace, safety, and cultural identity under BJP rule. "Goa, once a symbol of harmony, has been reduced to a place where crime thrives and public land is sold off behind closed doors," said AAP's Goa convenor Rahul Mhambre.

Citing official police records, AAP claimed that serious crimes in Goa have surged by 38% in the last six years from 2,900 reported cases in 2017 to over 4,050 in 2024. Crimes against women saw a 40% rise, including more than 120 cases of murder or attempted murder, 350 assaults, and 800 incidents of theft and robbery last year alone.

The party also accused the BJP government of enabling illegal land grabs. Over 3,200 acres of public and community land were allegedly transferred to private firms without public consent. "This is not just about land. It's about identity, culture, and the rights of Goans being sold off," AAP said.

Attacks on activists and political workers have also intensified, with over 250 such incidents reported in two years, further fuelling what AAP calls a "breakdown of law and order."

Infrastructure woes were another focus, 72% of Goa's roads are in urgent need of repair, and repeated flooding exposes poor planning. AAP claimed its earlier citizen-led road condition campaign drew over 50,000 signatures.

AAP framed the upcoming election as a choice between BJP's "Gundaraj" and an AAPled governance model based on law, peace, and accountability.

US Shares 21-Point Plan to End Gaza War, Pave Way for Palestinian State

he United States has proposed a detailed 21-point plan to end the ongoing war in Gaza and create a pathway toward a future Palestinian state. The proposal, shared with Arab and Muslim nations during the UN General Assembly, marks a significant shift in US policy compared to the Trump-era stance which opposed a two-state solution and once suggested relocating Gaza's

The new initiative in-

cludes provisions for an immediate ceasefire, return of all hostages, large-scale humanitarian aid, and the eventual withdrawal of Israeli forces. In return, Hamas must disarm and surrender military infrastructure, with peaceful members granted amnesty or safe passage.

Gaza would be governed by a technocratic Palestinian administration under international supervision, led by the US and regional partners. A temporary international stabilisation force would ensure security and train local police. The proposal rejects

occupation of Gaza and commits to a structured de-radicalisation effort, including interfaith initiatives.

Crucially, the plan proposes a future path to Palestinian statehood, pending reforms in the Palestinian Authority. While not setting a timeline, the document acknowledges statehood as the legitimate aspiration of the Palestinian

Despite opposition from Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, who compared the idea of a Palestinian state to giving "Al-Qaeda

New York," Trump's envoy Steve Witkoff described the discussions as "very productive," expressing optimism about a breakthrough.

Under the plan, no resident will be forced to leave Gaza, and returning Palestinians will have full rights. Aid will be managed by neutral international bodies like the UN and Red Crescent. without interference.

The plan also calls on all regional actors to provide security guarantees and urges Hamas to accept or risk isolation in terror-free zones

"Terror Hubs Operate On **Industrial Scale": Jaishankar Shreds Pakistan At UN**

n a blistering address at the 80th United Nations General Assembly, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar launched a scathing attack on Pakistan, calling it the "epicentre of global terrorism" and urging the global community to unequivocally condemn states that use terrorism as a policy tool.

Citing the recent Pahalgam terror attack that claimed the lives of 26 tourists, Jaishankar

openly declare terrorism a state policy, when terror hubs operate on an industrial scale. when terrorists are publicly glorified, then such actions must be unequivocally condemned."

While not naming Pakistan directly at first, his remarks left little ambiguity. He accused Pakistan of being the origin of major international terror attacks for decades and reminded world leaders that many individuals on the UN's terror sanction list are Pakistani nationals.

"India has confronted

this challenge since its independence. For decades, major international terrorist attacks have been traced back to one country," Jaishankar said.

Referencing Operation Sindoor, India's recent counter-terror operation, he asserted India's right to defend its people and vowed to bring the perpetrators of terrorism to justice. He called for cutting off terror financing and applying relentless pressure on the "terrorism ecosystem."

He warned that nations which "condone"

or support terror-sponsoring states will ultimately pay the price. "The financing of terrorism must be choked... Those who condone nations that sponsor terror will find it comes back to bite them," he said.

His remarks came shortly after India's UN representative, Petal Gahlot, rebuked Pakistani PM Shehbaz Sharif for "glorifying ter-rorism." She countered Sharif's claims of military success by stating, "It was their military which pleaded with us for a cessation to the fighting.'





Vietnam Evacuates Thousands as Typhoon Bualoi Nears Landfall

ietnam has evacuated thousands of central and northern provinces as Typhoon Bualoi, the 10th storm to impact the country this year, approaches with increasing speed and intensity. The storm is expected to make landfall around 7:00 p.m. local time (1200 GMT) on Sunday, according to Vietnam's meteorology

Bualoi, currently over the South China Sea, is packing winds of up to 130 km per drownings and falling and urged residents to hour. Imran Khan's GHQ Protest Trial Continues Amid Legal Dispute Over Video Link

n Anti-Terrorism Court (ATC) in Rawalpindi on Saturday recorded testimonies from three more prosecution witnesses in the May 9 GHQ protest case against former Prime Minister Imran Khan, despite obiections from his legal team. The case stems from violent protests outside Pakistan's army headquarters following Khan's arrest in May

Khan, who has been incarcerated in Adiala Jail since August 2023, is attending the trial via video link — a format his defence team is fiercely contesting. Defence lawyers again submitted an application requesting Khan's personal appearance in court, arguing the video link system is



flawed and unjust. However, ATC Judge Amjad Ali Shah rejected the request, stating he could not halt proceedings without directions from an appellate court.

UN Sanctions Snap Back on Iran After Nuclear Talks Collapse

idespread UN sanctions against Iran officially came back into force late Saturday, marking the first time in a decade that Tehran faces such global restrictions. The move follows the collapse of last-ditch nuclear talks between Iran and Western powers and

ter Israeli and US strikes on Iranian nuclear facilities.

The renewed sanctions — frozen since the 2015 nuclear deal — target Iran's nuclear and ballistic missile programs and are expected to further damage its already fragile economy. They also prohibit armsrelated transactions and restrict Iran's access to

financial markets. The "snapback" mechanism was triggered by Germany, France, and the UK, citing Iran's non-compliance with its nuclear commitments. German Foreign Minister Johann Wadephul told the UN General Assembly, "Iran must never acquire a nuclear weapon... but we remain open to diplomacy."

US Secretary of State Marco Rubio urged Iran to accept "direct talks held in good faith" and called on UN members to "immediately" enforce the sanctions. Meanwhile, a last-minute push by Russia and China to delay the sanctions until April failed at the UN Security Council.

India's Power Tools Market Set to Cross \$3.8 Billion by 2035

ndia's power tools segment is projected to more than double, reaching \$3.8 billion by 2035, growing at a compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 7.8%, according to industry experts and a recent study by IMARC Group.

The growth is being driven by massive government capital expenditure in infrastructure sectors such as roads, railways, airports, and housing, alongside increasing demand from furniture manufacturing, the automotive aftermarket, and a rising

Do-It-Yourself (DIY) culture.

To reduce reliance on imports and tap into the growing demand, the Union Government is actively encouraging domestic manufacturing, which is beginning to show results. Local manufacturers are gradually scaling up production capacity in line with the 'Make in India" initiative.

The broader hand tools, power tools, and fasteners market in India is also on an upward trajectory. The domestic

rently valued at \$826 million (2024), is expected to reach \$1.22 billion by 2033, reflecting a CAGR of 4.1%, the IMARC study noted.

This surge is being attributed to the modernisation of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), increasing industrialisation, and strong aftermarket demand. Moreover, with India's booming construction and home improvement sectors, the need for efficient and cost-effective tools is only expected to grow.

Industry officials said

that the DIY trend among urban consumers, especially in metro cities, is also expanding the market for portable and battery-operated tools. Ecommerce platforms have further simplified access to such products, making them popular among younger, tech-

savvy users. Experts believe that sustained policy support, coupled with infrastructure and industrial growth, will transform India into a manufacturing and export hub for power tools over the next

Plastic Pipes Industry Faces FY25 Challenges, **Eyes 10–12% Growth Ahead**

ndia's plastic pipes industry has faced significant turbulence in FY25, struggling with subdued infrastructure investments, tight liquidity, and volatile raw material prices, according to a report released by JM Financial. However, the industry remains optimistic about its medium-term outlook, supported by stabilising input costs and sustained demand from key sectors.

Navigating a Tough

Year FY25 proved to be a challenging year for the sector. Plastic pipe manufacturers—especially those reliant on PVC (polyvinyl chloride) had to deal with erratic pricing patterns. Global factors, such as sluggish construction activity in major markets like China and developed economies, combined with a supply glut from large exporters like China, South Korea, and Taiwan, led to aggressive undercutting of prices in the Indian market.

tutes a major input cost for the industry, dropped significantly over FY20-25, declining at a 4% CAGR, compared to its long-term growth trend of 2% CAGR over the last 25 years. After a prolonged downtrend, prices began to recover, rising by 7/kg over the last 4-5 months to reach 79/kg in September 2025. While this remains below the FY22 peak, it marks a potential turning point for

the sector. Market Evolution and **Future Drivers**

Traditionally fragmented and focused heavily on agriculture, India's plastic piping sector has evolved into a more organised ecosystem, addressing critical needs in water supply, plumbing, sanitation, industrial applications.

Despite current hurdles, long-term structural drivers remain intact. Government-backed programs like the Jal Jeevan Mission, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, and Housing boost demand significantly, alongside growing agricultural and replacement requirements.

JM Financial estimates the Indian plastic piping market at 600–650 billion, and forecasts a 10-12% CAGR growth between FY25 and FY30.

Policy and Regulatory Tailwinds

Industry experts believe upcoming policy measures may offer additional support. The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) is expected to implement quality control norms for PVC imports by December 2025, which would restrict the influx of substandard foreign products and offer a competitive edge to domestic manufacturers.

"Stabilising PVC prices should restore distributor confidence, reduce inventory risks, and aid margin recovery for organised players," the report concluded, projecting a more stable and profitable path ahead for the sector.

SBI Bats for 25 bps Rate Cut Ahead of **RBI Policy Meet**

serve Bank of India's (RBI) bimonthly monetary policy announcement on October 1, a State Bank of India (SBI) research report has recommended a 25 basis point (bps) rate cut. calling it the "best possible option" in the current economic

climate. The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), chaired by RBI Governor Sanjay Malhotra, will begin its threeday meeting on Monday, September 30, amid global economic uncertainty, rising geopolitical tensions. and the recent 50% tariffs imposed by the US on Indian exports.

The SBI report argues that a modest rate cut would support domestic growth without stoking inflation, especially as headline CPI inflation remains within the RBI's comfort range. "A 25 bps cut would signal proactive policy support to insulate the economy from external shocks," the report said.

However, several other economists and analysts expect the RBI to maintain status quo on the repo rate, citing concerns about volatile crude prices, geopolitical risks, and the weak rupee. Many believe the central bank will prefer to wait and watch, especially as the US Federal Reserve remains hawkish.

India's repo rate currently stands at 6.50%, unchanged since February 2023. The central bank has maintained a "withdrawal of accommodation" stance, balancing inflation control with the need to support growth.

A rate cut now, according to SBI, would also help ease borrowing costs for businesses and consumers, just ahead of the festive season, potentially boosting consumption and credit demand.

The final decision will be announced by RBI on Wednesday, October 1, and will be closely watched by markets, banks, and industry stakeholders for its signal on the direction of monetary policy amid global uncertainty.


