

### **GST REDUCTION BOOSTED REVENUE**

The introduction of the revised Goods and Services Tax (GST 2.0) slabs has defied initial concerns that both central and state governments would face a revenue dip. Contrary to expectations, the reduction in tax rates on essential commodities, along with several other products, has driven up sales, thereby boosting tax collections across the country in

the second half of September.

ijayawada, Oct 01: According to official data, India's GST revenues for September 2025 stood at ₹1.89 lakh crore, registering a 9.1 percent increase compared to ₹1.73 lakh crore in September 2024. This rise also marked a 1.5 percent improvement over August 2025, when collections reached ₹1.86 lakh crore. These numbers indicate a positive trend, demonstrating that the new tax regime has fueled consumption rather than slowing it down.

### Rs. 1000 Cr BENEFIT TO HEALTH SECTOR BY GST REFORSM: MINISTER

ijayawada, Oct 01: The recent GST 2.0 reforms are set to bring substantial relief to the state's health sector, with the government estimating annual savings of nearly ₹1,000 crore. Health Minister Satyakumar announced on Wednesday that the reduction in

drugs, surgical equipment, and medical purchases will significantly ease the financial burden on both the public and government institutions.

According to him, the state expects to save around ₹716 crore on medicines and surgical items directly purchased by the public, while government pro-GST on life-saving curement will see an ad-

ditional saving of about ₹250 crore. These estimates are based on 2024-25 purchase records. The minister emphasized that this reduction will directly benefit patients, ensuring more affordable healthcare access

Until September 21, most medicines were taxed at 12 percent, with nearly 99 percent of drugs falling under that needed relief to

slab. With GST 2.0, the central government has reduced the rate to 5 percent. "This effectively amounts to a 7 percent cut in tax burden," Satyakumar said. He further added that taxes on 33 categories of critical drugs, including those used for cancer and rare diseases, have been completely removed, providing much-

The state has nearly 35,000 pharmacies and around 5,000 wholesale distributors. In 2024–25, these outlets sold medicines and surgical supplies worth ₹11,250 crore. The tax burden borne by the people during this period was estimated at ₹1,350 crore. With the revised GST

September 22, slashed tax rates on 375 essential goods, including food items, daily-use products, automobiles, and household appliances. The immediate fall in prices has led to a surge in demand and accelerated sales across multiple sectors. Market experts have observed that consumer spending patterns shifted significantly, providing a boost to trade volumes and, in turn, tax collections.

Further strengthening the revenue stream, gross national income rose by 6.8 percent last month, reaching ₹1.36 lakh crore. Import-related tax revenues also surged by 15.6 percent, totaling ₹52,492 crore. In addition, GST refunds climbed steeply by 40.1 percent, amounting to ₹28,657 crore. After accounting for refunds, the net GST collections for

lakh crore, about 5 percent higher than the same month last year.

Commenting on the de-

velopment, Deloitte partner M.S. Mani stated that the increase in collections clearly proves that the GST 2.0 slab changes have not slowed down economic activity. "These numbers are evidence that consumer demand has held firm and even improved despite the structural changes,' he remarked. He also noted that, with the latest figures, the country's average monthly GST collections for this financial year are approaching the ₹ 2 lakh crore mark, indicating strong-

er fiscal stability. A closer look at statelevel data, however, reveals mixed results. Andhra Pradesh reported a 4 percent increase in GST revenues, with collections rising from ber 2024 to ₹3,653 crore this year. In contrast, Telangana registered a decline of 5 percent, with collections slipping from ₹5,267 crore last year to ₹4,998 crore this September. Experts attribute this shortfall to localized

specific slowdowns and

the state.

Economists believe that while some states may temporarily experience reduced revenues, the overall national trend points towards higher consumer confidence and wider participation in the formal economy. They emphasize that the drop in prices has not only stimulated demand but also improved compliance, as more businesses are integrating into the GST framework to capitalize on growing market

The GST 2.0 reforms are being closely monitored by policymakers to assess their long-term impact on fiscal sustainability. For now, the early data suggests that the reforms have successfully balanced consumer relief with government revenue needs. With festive season demand expected to peak in the coming months, many analysts predict that collections may well surpass the ₹2 lakh crore benchmark sooner than expected.

The GST 2.0 rollout has silenced critics who predicted falling revenues, instead delivering a broadbased boost to India's tax ecosystem. While a few states like Telangana are grappling with short-term revenue dips, the larger national picture is one of rising collections, buoyant consumption, and a resil-

The CM arrived at Visakhapatnam Airport on Wednesday as part of his Vizianagaram district tour. During the visit, former minister and Bheemili MLA Ganta Srinivasa Rao met him and presented details about the ongoing land-related issues. Ganta informed the

Chief Minister that some vested interests were misleading and instigating farmers to file court cases against the acquisition. He revealed that petitions were filed even without the farmers' knowledge, and in one shocking instance, a deceased person's name was used in legal documents. This revelation angered the Chief Minister, who instructed the district administration

to act swiftly. Addressing District Collector Harendhira Prasad, he ordered strict action against those misusing legal systems to create unnecessary hurdles.

Ganta further requested the Chief Minister to extend rehabilitation measures for the affected farmers. He appealed for the provision of employment opportunities for those who had surrendered their lands, besides livelihood-supporting facilities such as a shopping complex. Additionally, he suggested that each displaced family should be allotted three cents of land for house construction.

Responding to these appeals, Chandrababu Naidu explained the government's stance on compensation. He noted that, in general, once compensation is announced for land acquisition, it is not revised under any circumstances. However, in this par-

ticular case, the government had considered the repeated requests of farmers and enhanced the compensation package as a special measure. This, he said, reflected the government's commitment to balancing developmental needs with the welfare of local communities.

The Chief Minister stressed the importance of completing the land acquisition process quickly. He told officials that delays in projects of this scale could affect

xactly two years after the sinking of piers at the Medigadda barrage, part of the prestigious Kaleshwaram Lift Irrigation Project (KLIP), the Telangana government has taken its first concrete step towards rehabilitation by inviting Expressions of Interest (EOI) for design proposals. This marks a significant development, as the Congress government is keen to project itself as working on a credible roadmap to restore functionality to all three barrages Medigadda, Annaram, and

The decision comes against the backdrop of detailed investigations conducted by the National Dam Safety Authority (NDSA), which

had flagged severe structural concerns in the Medigadda barrage, particularly Block 7. According to the NDSA's findings, Block 7 posed a high safety risk due to problems with its raft foundation and damage to two of its piers. The authority recommended that the block should either be decommissioned or stabilized using appropriate engineering interventions, while ensuring that adjacent blocks remain unaffected.

A key recommendation involved filling subsurface cavities under the raft foundation by adopting soil-structure interaction techniques. This measure is intended to address the root cause of the instability, which led to the sinking

of piers in the first place. The NDSA also called for the incorporation of upstream and downstream cut-off walls, along with hydro-mechanical elements, to counter risks such as sand piping — a condition where seepage through soil can compromise the structural integrity of the barrage.

For Annaram and Sundilla, the other two barrages under the KLIP, the NDSA prescribed immediate strengthening measures. These, it stressed, must form part of a broader rehabilitation plan that not only restores the barrages to working condition but also ensures their longterm sustainability.

"Boss, there needs to be better ways to arrive at decisions," Hariharan said, reflecting on the experience.
That moment led him to start IDfy, a digital identity
verification startup aimed at replacing hunches with data and trust.

From that small apartment, Hariharan and a handful of colleagues laid the foundation for what would become one of India's biggest players in the Know Your Customer (KYC) revolution - a booming industry now valued in the hundreds of millions of dollars.

### The KYC Surge: Fueling India's **Digital Economy**

Today, KYC is no longer a backend compliance process - it's the backbone of India's digital economy.

The country has over 227 startups dedicated to KYC technology, more than any other nation, including the U.S. and the U.K.

On average, 17 new KYC startups emerge each year in India. Among them, 83 have received external funding, and 31 have progressed to Series A or later rounds, signifying deep investor confidence.

The real turning point for the industry came in 2016 with the introduction of video KYC. Instead of paperwork and in-person meetings, users could now verify their identity via a short video call.

A decade after world leaders adopted the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and the Paris Agreement, global development appears to be on life support.

Last week, at the UN General Assembly, President Donald Trump's mocking dismissal of climate change and multilateralism underscored what many feared: the era of global cooperation is crumbling. The SDGs,

once hailed as a universal blueprint to improve human well-being, have failed to take off.

Trillions of dollars in annual funding were promised but never materialised. Private investment meant to be leveraged through public aid didn't arrive.

According to McKinsey, global aid is projected to drop by up to 22% leaving the SDG vision largely unrealised.

In India, some welcome this demise, labelling the SDGs as "Western" or "anti-national."

But that's a flawed view. India has historically shaped and benefitted from global development dialogues. Our own economic reforms in 1991 were deeply informed by global debates and knowledge flows.

### Centre Hikes DA/DR by 3%, Benefits Over 1.18 Crore Employees and Pensioners

he Union Cabinet on Wednesday, approved a 3% hike in Dearness Allowance (DA) for central government employees and Dearness Relief (DR) for pensioners. The revised rate takes the DA/DR from 55% to 58% of basic pay or pension, effective retrospectively from July

The decision is set to benefit approximately 49.19 lakh central government employees and 68.72 lakh pensioners, offering relief amid ongoing inflation concerns.

Information and **Broadcasting Minister** Ashwini Vaishnaw said the increase aims to compensate for the rising cost of living. "The combined impact on the exchequer on account of



this increase in DA and DR will be 10,083.96 crore per annum," he said during a media briefing on the Cabinet decisions.

Dearness Allowance and Dearness Relief are revised twice a year—in January and July—based on the All India Consumer Price Index (AICPI) to mitigate the impact of inflation on government employees and pensioners. This latest hike follows the government's standard formula and was widely anticipated ahead of the festive

The retrospective implementation from July 1 means employees and pensioners will receive arrears for July, August, and September in their upcoming pay cycles, providing a festive financial boost.

Experts have noted that while the 3% hike aligns with historical trends, rising inflation and cost pressures could warrant a sharper increase in the next review if the economic situation persists.

This DA/DR increase comes at a time when the government is also managing broader financial challenges and electionyear spending demands. However, the move is likely to bolster morale among government staff and retirees, especially with general elections on the horizon in 2026.

### "I Love Tariffs": Trump Defends His Trade Policy, Says It's "Making US Rich"

S. President Donald Trump has once again defended his aggressive trade policy, calling tariffs his "favourite word" and crediting them with making America "rich again." Speaking at the Marine Corps Base in Quantico, Trump said his administration's tariff strategy has helped the U.S. regain control over its trade relationships after decades of exploitation by other nations

"I love tariffs. Most beautiful word. We're becoming rich as hell," Trump declared, boasting that the U.S. has taken in "trillions of dollars" through tariffs — enough, he said, "to

buy a lot of battleships." Trump's comments come ahead of a major Supreme Court hearing in early November, where justices will review lawsuits filed by American businesses challenging the president's use of emergency powers under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act (IEEPA) to impose sweeping tariffs.

had earlier upheld a ruling that Trump's use of the IEEPA to levy global tariffs was unlawful, raising questions about the legal future of his trade agenda.

Despite legal setbacks. the Trump administration remains firm. U.S. Trade Representative Jamieson Greer has warned that tariffs will remain a key policy tool regardless of the court's verdict. "Win or lose at the Supreme Court, tariffs are here to stay," Greer told the Financial Times, adding that reciprocal tariffs represent "how it's going to be." The administration in-

sists that the courts should defer to the president's judgment in declaring economic emergencies that justify such trade actions. Critics, however, argue the policy has hurt American consumers and businesses by raising import costs and straining global trade ties.

### **US Government Shuts Down,** Lst Since 2018

he U.S. federal government officially shut down at midnight after Democrats blocked a Republican-led stopgap funding bill that failed to meet their key demands, marking the first shutdown in over six years.

The stalemate, centered around healthcare funding and partisan tensions, has halted nonessential government operations. As many as 750,000 federal employees face temporary furloughs, while essential personnel, including military, border agents. and air-traffic controllers, will work without pay until the shutdown ends.

Trump has escalated the conflict, threatening permanent job cuts and warning of mass layoffs if the standoff continues. "We'll be laying off a lot of people — they're going to be Democrats," he said, raising concerns of politicised purging in federal



agencies.

Essential services such as in-hospital care, law enforcement, and Social Security payments — will continue. though functions like food inspections, student loan processing, and national park operations may pause. Issuance of Medicare cards and benefit verifications could also be disrupted.

The shutdown could dent the U.S. economy if prolonged. Analysts estimate a weekly impact of 0.1 to 0.2 percentage points shaved off GDP growth. The situation is particularly volatile as over 150,000 federal workers are already exiting through buyouts the largest government workforce reduction in eight decades.

At the heart of the deadlock are Democrat demands to include permanent Affordable Care Act subsidies in the funding bill, which would prevent healthcare cost spikes for 24 million Americans. Republicans have pushed back, accusing Democrats of leveraging the shutdown for political gain ahead of the 2026 midterm elections.

With no clear path to resolution, the duration and fallout of this shutdown remain uncertain, heightening fears of economic disruption and deeper political divisions in Washington.

op Democratic leaders have slammed President Donald Trump and Republican lawmakers for triggering a federal government shutdown, blaming their refusal to address rising healthcare costs as the key reason behind the crisis.

The shutdown, which took effect at midnight, comes as Congress failed to pass a funding bill, largely due to disa-

greements over the inclusion of permanent Affordable Care Act (ACA) subsidies. Democrats insisted on including provisions to curb healthcare cost spikes expected to hit millions of Americans by yearend, while Republicans demanded a clean funding bill without additional conditions.

The official account of House Democrats echoed Harris's sentiments, stating, "Donald Trump and Republicans just shut down the federal government rather than address the health care crisis they created. Democrats will keep fighting to protect health care.'

California Governor Gavin Newsom mocked Trump's leadership style, writing in a dramatic Truth Social-style post: "THE TRUMP SHUTDOWN IS HERE! HEALTH CARE FOR BABIES, MOMS & GRANDMAS HELD HOSTAGE BY A VERY

Illinois Governor JB Pritzker accused Trump and "MAGA Republicans" of pushing an "extreme agenda" by threatening core social programs like Medicaid and SNAP.

### **Elon Musk Cancels Netflix Subscription**

After Director Hamish Steele Mocks Charlie Kirk

Tech billionaire Elon Musk has cancelled his Netflix subscription, joining growing backlash against British director Hamish Steele, the creator of Netflix's animated series Dead End: Paranormal Park, after Steele allegedly mocked the recent killing of conservative activist Charlie Kirk.

The controversy erupted after screenshots surfaced online, purportedly showing Steele using profane language and referring to Kirk as a "Nazi" in a post responding to UK Prime Minister Keir Starmer's condolence message. "Your sympathy for any of the families being slaughtered



by your own weapons but a random Nazi gets shot and it's a public statement," read Steele's alleged comment.

Though the viral screenshots remain unverified, they quickly ignited outrage online, particularly among conservative audiences and commentators. Steele had already been under scrutiny for incorporating transgender themes in a children's animated series, a point of contention

among critics who claim such content is inappropriate for young audiences.

An X (formerly Twitter) user announced they had cancelled their Netflix account, citing the streamer's support for "pro-trans content" aimed at children and for employing someone who "celebrated the murder of Charlie Kirk." Musk amplified the criticism by resharing the post, writing simply:

This latest move from Musk — a frequent critic of "woke" culture and corporate policies — comes amid heightened cultural tensions in the U.S. around free speech, LG-BTQ+ representation in media, and political violence. His decision adds to the mounting pressure on Netflix, which has not yet publicly commented on the

While Steele has not responded to the allegations directly, calls for accountability and content boycotts have gained traction online. The situation underscores how content creators' personal views, especially when shared online, continue to spark high-stakes fallmajor out for platforms.

# Pakistan's top leadership will decide on deployment of troops in Gaza: FM Dar

akistan's Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister, Ishaq Dar, said on Tuesday that the decision to deploy Pakistani troops in Gaza under the proposed peacekeeping mission of Muslim nations will be taken by the country's top leadership.

Dar was responding to a question during a press conference regarding Pakistan's potential participation in the multinational peacekeeping force outlined in a new Middle East peace plan announced by U.S. President Donald Trump on Monday.

"The final decision will rest with the highest levels of our leadership," Dar stated. "Any deployment of Pakistani troops abroad is a matter of national security and will be decided with due consultation



a m o n g stakeholders."

The proposed peacekeeping initiative is part of a broader U.S.-backed deal aimed at ending months of deadly conflict in Gaza. President Trump's plan, which seeks to stabilise the region through a Muslimled security framework, includes the formation of a joint peacekeeping force involving countries such as Turkey, Egypt, Indonesia, and potentially Pakistan.

While Pakistan has a long history of contrib-

uting to United Nations peacekeeping missions, this deployment would be different, as it falls outside the UN framework and stems from a U.S.-brokered initiative.

Foreign Minister Dar noted that Pakistan supports all efforts aimed at restoring peace in Gaza and ensuring humanitarian access. "We have always stood for the rights of the Palestinian people and continue to support a two-state solution," he said.

There has been no official confirmation yet on whether Islamabad has received a formal request to contribute troops. Analysts say the decision could face domestic political scrutiny, given the geopolitical sensitivities surrounding any cooperation with U.S.-led initiatives

in the Muslim world. As consultations continue, the government is expected to issue a formal position in the coming days.

# RBI Holds Rates, Cuts Inflation Forecast, Ups Growth Outlook

he Reserve Bank to future economic Malhotra noted. of India (RBI) on developments. Wednesday kept the key policy rate - the repo rate unchanged at 5.5%, while lowering its inflation forecast and raising its growth outlook, reflecting confidence in the domestic economy despite global uncertainties.

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), in a unanimous decision, opted to maintain the current rate for the second consecutive meeting. Lending and deposit rates across the banking system are expected to remain steady, offering relief to borrowers and depositors alike. The RBI also retained its "neutral" policy stance, indicating it will remain flexible in responding

In a significant move, the central bank revised its inflation forecast downward to 2.6% from the earlier 3.1%, citing easing food and fuel prices. Simultaneously, the GDP growth projection for FY26 has been raised to 6.8%, up from the previous estimate of 6.5%.

RBI Governor Saniay Malhotra said that recent rationalisation of Goods and Services Tax (GST) rates is likely to cushion the impact of global trade tensions and ongoing uncertainty around U.S. H-1B visa policies. "The Indian economy remains resilient, supported by stable demand conditions, improving exports, and moderating inflation,"

The central bank's cautious optimism comes amid rising global risks, including escalating tariff wars and currency volatility. However, domestic indicators, including robust tax collections and strong service sector growth, have provided enough buffer for the RBI to hold

rates steady. Analysts expect the RBI to continue monitoring inflation trends and global developments closely before making any further policy shifts. For now, the pause signals policy stability and continued support for economic growth, while leaving room to respond to future shocks.

### **ATF Price Hiked** 3%, Commercial **LPG Up ₹15.50**



il companies on Wednesday revised fuel prices, increasing the cost of Aviation Turbine Fuel (ATF) by over 3% and commercial LPG rates by ₹15.50 per cylinder, reflecting changes in global market benchmarks.

The price of jet fuel (ATF) in the national capital, home to one of India's busiest airports, was raised by ₹3,052.50 per kilolitre - a 3.3% hike - bringing the new rate to ₹93,766.02 per kilolitre, according to state-owned fuel retailers.

Alongside this, commercial LPG used by hotels and restaurants also saw a price increase of ₹15.50 per 19-kg cylinder, pushing the cost to ₹1,595.50 in New Delhi. This adjustment follows a series of six reductions in LPG prices over the past six months, with the last cut being ₹51.50 on September 1. Since April, LPG prices have fallen by a total of ₹223 per cylinder.

The recent hikes come as oil firms align domestic fuel prices with fluctuating global crude oil markets and foreign exchange rates. This adjustment impacts sectors relying heavily on ATF and commercial LPG, such as aviation and hospitality, which may see a rise in operational costs.

The aviation industry, already recovering from pandemic-related setbacks, will feel the effect of the ATF price increase, potentially influencing airfares and cargo charges. Similarly, restaurants and hotels might adjust prices to offset the higher fuel costs.

Fuel price revisions by state-owned oil companies are closely monitored, as they directly af $fect\ inflation\ and\ the\ cost$ of living. The government typically allows market-driven adjustments, but such hikes often draw public and industry attention.

Consumers and businesses alike will be watching for any further fuel price movements amid ongoing global energy market volatility.

### **Manufacturing Growth** Slows in September, Job **Creation Hits One-Year Low**

sector witnessed a slowdown in September, with growth in and input buying easing uncertainties. to four-month lows, according to the HSBC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) released on

Wednesday. The seasonally adjusted PMI dropped to 57.7 in September from 59.3 in August, marking the weakest expansion since May. While the index remains comfortably above the 50-mark that separates growth from contraction, it indicates a mild loss of momentum in the sector.

Pranjul Bhandari, Chief India Economist at HSBC, noted, "The September headline index softened, but it remained

well above the long-term average," highlighting the sector's resilience despite competitive presnew orders, output, sures and global

Job creation in sector also slowed, hitting a one-year low. Only 2% of surveyed companies reported an increase in staffing, making it the weakest hiring pace since September 2024.

Despite the slowdown, optimism remains strong. Business confidence rose to a sevenmonth high, boosted by recent tax relief measures and expectations of rising demand. Many firms cited changes in GST rates as a key factor behind their positive out-

look for the next 12

months.

Export demand offered some relief, with international orders increasing at a faster rate, particularly from Asia, Europe, the Americas, and the Middle East This offset some of the negative impact from recent U.S. tariffs on Indian goods.

On the pricing front, input and output costs rose at the fastest pace since May. Firms reported higher expenses for labour, raw materials, and transport, which led to the sharpest rise in output charges in nearly 12 years.

Overall, while manufacturing continues to expand, rising costs and sluggish hiring indicate emerging challenges that may affect the sector's growth trajectory in the months ahead.



## APPLE, GOOGLE, META MUST FACE LAWSUITS OVER Casino-Style Gambling Apps

federal judge has ruled that Apple, Google, and Meta Platforms must face lawsuits accusing them of promoting illegal gambling through casino-style apps on their platforms. The ruling came on Tuesday from U.S. District Judge Edward Davila in San Jose, California, who denied the tech giants' attempts to dismiss the claims.

The lawsuits allege that Apple's App Store, Google's Play Store, and Meta's Facebook enabled an "authentic Vegas-style experience" of slot machine gambling by hosting these apps and collecting commissions, often as high as 30 percent. Plaintiffs contend that these platforms knowingly profited from apps that are addictive and harmful, contributing to mental health issues like depression and suicidal thoughts among users. Apple, Google, and Meta argued that Section 230 of the Communications Decency Act shields them from liability because they are not



responsible for thirdparty content posted on their platforms. However, Judge Davila rejected this defense for most claims, stating that the companies could still be held accountable for their role in facilitating and profiting from these

gambling apps. While the judge dismissed some claims based on certain state laws, all consumer protection claims—except those in California were allowed to proceed. The decision means the companies will have to defend themselves in class-action lawsuits brought by dozens of plaintiffs accusing them of operating an illegal racketeering conspiracy.

This ruling signals increased scrutiny of how major tech platforms manage and profit from third-party apps, especially those with potential social harms. The case highlights ongoing concerns about the regulation of online gambling and the responsibilities of app stores in protecting users.

As these lawsuits move forward, Apple, Google, and Meta could face significant legal and financial challenges related to their casinostyle gambling app ecosystems.
