Two Hyderabad **Students Die in the US Within 48 Hours**

yderabad, Oct 05: In two separate tragedies within 48 hours, two students from Hyderabad lost their lives in the United States, sparking grief among families and concern over the safety of Indian students abroad.

On Sunday, 25-year-old Mehtab Mohammed from Chanchalguda, Hyderabad, died in a road accident in Chicago. He had recently moved to the US to pursue higher studies and was reportedly settling into his new

environment when the accident occurred. MBT spokesperson Amjed Ullah Khan confirmed the news on social media, offering condolences to Mehtab's family and urging the Indian government to assist in repatriating his body.

Just a day earlier, 28-year-old Chandrashekhar Pole from BN Nagar, Hyderabad, was shot dead during an armed robbery at a gas station in Dallas, Texas. Chandrashekhar, who was pursuing a Master's degree in Data

ALL SET FOR A NEW PARTY AFTER LOCAL BODY POLLS, BY KAVITHA?

Speculation surrounding Kavitha's next political move has gained momentum, with strong indications that she is preparing to launch her own political party. The outfit is expected to be named Telangana Jagruti Samiti and could be announced soon after the upcoming local body elections. Political observers believe that Kavitha has been carefully studying the state's evolving political landscape and is now convinced that the timing is right to step into the arena independently.

yderabad, Oct 05: For months, Kavitha had maintained that she was in an observation mode and would take a decision at an appropriate time. She repeatedly stated that her focus was on assessing the performance of the major partiesthe Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS), Congress, and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)—before charting her own course. Given the lack of preparation time, she strategically avoided launching her party ahead of the local elections, preferring instead to gauge voter sentiment in those contests.

One of the main reasons her decision is attracting significant attention is the ongoing rift within her family. Kavitha, daughter of former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekhar Rao (KCR), has in recent months openly expressed discontent

with her position inside the BRS. While she initially hinted at differences with her brother K.T. Rama Rao (KTR), the blame has gradually shifted towards Finance Minister T. Harish Rao. In her statements and interactions, she has targeted Harish Rao and BRS MP Santosh Rao, while at the same time defending her father and brother, cautioning them about the alleged influence of those leaders.

Analysts say that while Kavitha's new party may not immediately have the strength to secure a sweeping victory, it can certainly disrupt the existing balance of power. A section of the BRS's support base, especially those loyal to Kavitha, might shift their allegiance to her new platform. Even a minor division in votes could significantly impact the BRS's performance, particularly in close contests. This



Political observers point out that Kavitha's party could emerge as a 'spoiler" in Telangana politics. Even without winning a large number of seats, her presence has the potential to influence outcomes by cutting into the vote share of established parties. For the BRS, already facfrom the Congress and the BJP, this development could be particularly damaging.

As the state waits for the outcome of the local body elections, attention will be firmly fixed on Kavitha's next move. Whether her new political outfit can transform into a serious force or remain a disruptive player is yet to be determined, but one thing is certain—her entry will add another twist to the dynamic and fast-changing political narrative of Telangana.

Case Filed Against MLA Raja **Singh Over Alleged Remarks** on Prophet Mohammed

yderabad, Oct 05: A case has been registered against Goshamahal MLA T. Raja Singh for allegedly making derogatory remarks about Prophet Mohammed during a recent public rally in Hyderabad. The controversy erupted after a video clip of his speech went viral on social media, sparking outrage and formal complaints from residents.

Police said the case was filed at Shahalibanda Police Station following a complaint from community members who alleged that Raja Singh's comments hurt the sentiments of the

could disturb communal harmony.

Acting on the complaint, the police booked the MLA under relevant sections of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and the Information Technology (IT) Act. Investigators are verifying the authenticity of the viral video, its circulation online, and identifying the organisers of the rally where the alleged remarks were made.

Senior police officials said legal procedures are being followed. "We have taken cognisance of the complaint and initiated an investigation. Action will be taken based on evidence," a senior of-

portedly shows the MLA making provocative statements, prompted police to heighten patrolling in sensitive areas to maintain peace. Additional security was deployed in the Old City to prevent disturbances

This is not the first time Raja Singh has courted controversy. Known for his hardline views, he has faced multiple cases in the past for alleged hate speeches.

Community leaders have urged the public to remain calm and allow the law to take its course while police have cautioned citizens against sharing inflammatory content online.

Harish Rao Targets Congress Failures in Jubilee Hills Bypoll Campaign



Hyderabad police intensi-fy drunk driving crack-down with surprise checks

yderabad, Oct 05: In a determined effort to improve road safety and curb the growing menace of drunk driving, the Hyderabad Traffic Police launched a large-scale enforcement drive across 23 major city locations on the night of October 4, 2025. The operation aimed to tackle a worrying trend — an increase in daytime drunk driving, which has become a major contributor to road accidents in the

Traditionally, drunk driving was considered a nighttime offence, but recent observations by the

in cases during the day. Many offenders include drivers of two-wheelers, four-wheelers, and transport vehicles, putting themselves and others at serious risk.

During the latest surprise checks, police apprehended 312 drivers under the influence of alcohol. Of all the offenders, 259 were two-wheelers, 17 three-wheelers and 36 four-wheelers.

All violators have been booked under relevant sections of the Motor Vehicles Act and will be produced before the courts. They face penalties ranging from hefty fines and imprisonment to temporary or permanent suspension of their ing on the severity of the

The Hyderabad Traffic Police reiterated that drunk driving is a serious and punishable crime that endangers both the driver and the public. Officials said such enforcement drives will continue regularly, both during the day and at night, to ensure safer

Downpour brings Hyderabad to a halt, yellow alert issued across Telangana

yderabad, Oct 05: Heavy rains pounded Hyderabad and several districts across Telangana on Sunday, bringing traffic to a crawl and flooding many roads. Areas such as Ameerpet, Panjagutta, Filmnagar, Khairatabad, Jubilee Hills, Yousufguda, Koti, Sultan Bazaar, Abids, Nampally, Basheerbagh,

gar, Narayanguda, Necklace Road, Kukatpally, Malkajgiri, and Secunderabad witnessed severe waterlogging and traffic disruptions.

According to the Telangana State Disaster Management Department, Eturunagaram in Mulugu district received the highest rainfall of 11 cm. Other areas recorded significant downpours: Lingala (KhamMogdampally (Sangareddy) 9.8 cm, Pallegudem (Khammam) 8.98 cm, Medaram (Mulugu) 8.43 cm, and Pulkal (Sangareddy) 7.45 cm. Several locations, including Gudur (Jangaon) and Basheerabad (Vikarabad), also saw over 7 cm of rainfall.

The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) attributed the

Bihar to Tamil Nadu, affecting weather patterns across central and southern India. As a result, widespread rainfall has been reported in Jharkhand, Chhattisgarh, Telangana, and Andhra Pradesh. A Yellow Alert remains in effect across both Telugu states, warning of moderate to heavy rainfall, with isolated heavy

Meanwhile, a severe cyclonic storm over the Arabian Sea continues to persist, centred about 530 km east of Dwarka, and is expected to make landfall near Oman's coast by Monday.

Authorities have urged residents to remain indoors, avoid lowlying areas, and adhere to safety advisories until weather conditions



Heavy rush on Vijayawada-Hyderabad highway as holiday travellers return

ith the Dussehra holidays coming to an end, thousands of travellers returning to Hyderabad led to heavy congestion on the Vijayawada-Hyderabad National Highway over the weekend. Vehicles moved at a snail's pace across several key points, including Narketpalli Kamineni Junction, Chityal, Peddakaparthi, Pantangi Toll Plaza, and Choutuppal, where traffic bottlenecks caused long delays.

Anticipating the rush, authorities deployed additional staff to manage traffic. At the Korlapahad Toll Plaza in Kethapalli Mandal which usually handles around 25,000 vehicles daily — the number surged to 34,000 on Saturday. By Sunday evening, nearly 27,000 vehicles had passed through. At the Pantangi Toll Plaza, which typically processes 40,000 vehicles a day, the figure jumped to 51,000 on Saturday and 49,000 by Sunday evening.

To ease congestion, 12 toll booths were opened on the Hyderabad-bound side of Pantangi Toll Plaza, while only four booths operated for Vijayawada-bound traffic to prioritise returning commuters. Toll officials coordinated closely with Rachakonda Traffic Police to streamline vehicle flow and reduce waiting times.

Bhuvanagiri Traffic ACP Prabhakar Reddy and Choutuppal Traffic Inspector Vijay Mohan supervised operations along key stretches, di-

recting traffic and ensuring real-time coordination between police and toll staff.

Despite the surge, the joint efforts of police and toll authorities helped manage the flow and prevent gridlock. Commuters were advised to remain patient and cautious, with officials stressing that better planning and coordination during festive periods are crucial to maintaining safety and avoiding prolonged delavs on major highways.

INCREASING CYBER FRAUDS: MAN LOST Rs.2 LAKH

derabad fell victim to cyber fraud and lost nearly ₹2 lakh while trying to rent a car online. The incident, reported by the Cyber Crime Police, highlights once again how fraudsters are exploiting online platforms to trap unsuspecting individuals.

According to officials, the victim, a resident of Lalaguda, wanted to rent a car in Coimbatore. He searched on Google and came across a service named Shiva Shakthi Car Rentals. Believing it to be genuine, he contacted the number listed on the website. The fraudsters informed him that a registration fee of ₹149 was required and sent him a link to download an APK file to complete the process.

Trusting the instructions, the man down-loaded the APK file and paid the ₹149 registration fee. However, the APK contained malware designed to gain access to his phone. Through this malicious

software, the cybercriminals intercepted and auto-forwarded the one-time passwords (OTPs) received on his device. Using these OTPs, the fraudsters gained access to his bank account and siphoned off ₹1.98 lakh.

By the time the victim realized he had been duped, the money was already withdrawn. He immediately lodged a complaint with the Hyderabad Cyber Crime Police, who have begun investigating the case. Authorities have

once again urged the public to remain cautious while using online services, especially those discovered through random internet searches. Officials warned that downloading unknown APK files or clicking on suspicious links can allow cybercriminals to install malware on devices, giving them access to sensitive data including bank details and OTPs.

Police have also advised citizens never to share OTPs, banking credentials, or passwords with anyone and to rely only on verified platforms for services such as rentals, bookings, or online transactions.

This case adds to the growing list of cyber fraud incidents being reported in the city, as criminals continue to devise new methods to cheat people. The Hyderabad Cyber Crime Police have appealed to

the public to report such scams immediately through their helpline or online portal to prevent further losses.

The incident serves as yet another reminder of the need for vigilance in the digital space. With online fraud becoming increasingly sophisticated, experts stress that awareness and caution are the only effective tools to safeguard oneself against such financial crimes.

Only Eight Applications Received for 294 Liquor Shops in Warangal

arangal: The from Mulugu and Excise Department has received just eight applications for 294 liquor shops across the erstwhile Warangal district, even as the October 18 deadline approaches. The lottery to allot licences will be held on October 23.

The tender notification for the liquor shops was issued on September 25, and applications have been accepted since September 26. So far, three applications have been received from Warangal district for 57 shops, one from Hanamkonda for 67 shops, two from Jangaon for 50 shops, and two from Mahbubabad for 61 shops. No applications have been filed

Jayashankar Bhupalpally districts, which together have 59 shops.

The Congress government has retained the existing reservation system for liquor shop allotments—15% for the Goud community, 10% for Scheduled Castes, and 5% for Scheduled Tribes.

The department also released the tax structure, to be paid in six instalments over two years. The licence fee varies with the population served: ₹50 lakh for up to 5,000 people, ₹55 lakh for up to 50,000, ₹60 lakh for up to one lakh, ₹65 lakh for up to five lakh, ₹85 lakh for up to 20 lakh, and ₹1.10 crore for a population exceeding 20

MISINFORMATION IN SOCIAL MEDIA CAUSING TROUBLES

have intensified their crackdown on misinformation and misuse of social media, particularly in the run-up to the local body elections. Officials revealed that several incidents over the past months highlight how fake messages and posts are being used to spread panic, target political rivals, or trigger communal tensions.

One such case occurred on May 2, when a man from Hyderabad dialed 100 and falsely claimed that a bomb had been planted at the Nizamabad railway station. Police rushed to the scene and conducted thorough checks, only to find it was a hoax. The caller was later traced, arrested, and remanded to judicial custody.

In another case, a vouth created false propaganda against a politi-

in an attempt to defame it. Police promptly removed the posts and registered a case against him. Similarly, a group of youngsters who flaunted swords and posted videos online were detained, counseled, and booked

Police officials expressed concern that, during election season, some individuals and groups are attempting to manipulate public opinion by circulating misleading content. This includes creating photos and videos designed to incite communal disharmony or to glorify one group while vilifying another. Often, such material is reshared across groups without verification, raising the risk of disputes and unrest.

Authorities have warned that strict action will be taken against anyone spreading false in-

cial media monitoring cell has been established to detect and act against fake posts. Not only the creators but also group administrators will be held accountable if such content circulates in their groups. So far this year, police have registered 45 cases related to fake social media posts in Nizamabad district

ACP Raja Venkat Reddy of Nizamabad urged the public not to believe or share unverified messages. "Do not trust every piece of information that circulates on social media. Verify at least once or twice before sharing. Group admins must identify and remove those spreading misinformation. Anyone found circulating fake content, no matter who they are, will face legal action," he

MULTIPLE VEHICLES DAMAGED IN A CHAIN COLLISION ON ORR

dent, a major pile-up occurred on the Outer Ring Road (ORR) in Hyderabad on Sunday, October 5. The accident took place near ORR Exit Number 17, under the jurisdiction of the Rajendranagar Traffic Police Station.

According to officials, multiple vehicles were involved in a chain collision while travelling towards the Telangana State Police Academy from the Rajendranagar Toll Gate. Fortunately, all passengers escaped without major injuries as airbags deployed upon impact. The vehicles, however, sustained minor damage.

The accident caused heavy traffic congestion along the busy stretch of the ORR. Police immediately rushed to the scene, worked to clear the pilemal traffic flow after some time.

The Cyberabad Traffic Police also issued an advisory on X (formerly Twitter), alerting commuters about traffic congestion between the Rajendranagar Toll Gate and the Telangana State Police Academy. They urged motorists to remain cautious, maintain safe distances, and stay alert while travelling on high-speed

stretches of the ORR. The incident has once again drawn attention to road safety concerns on the ORR. which has witnessed a string of serious accidents in recent weeks. Just last week, three youngsters lost their lives when two bikes collided under the Pahadishareef Police Sta-

tion limits. On September 28, an IT professional died at Thondapalli in about road safety.

travelling with his family from Prakasam district in Andhra Pradesh to Manikonda. Earlier, on September 14, another IT employee lost his life in a car crash near Pedda Amberpet in Abdullapurmet.

Authorities have repeatedly warned that overspeeding, reckless driving, and lack of lane discipline are the major contributors to accidents on the ORR. Police have urged commuters to follow traffic rules strictly and exercise caution, particularly on accident-prone stretches.

While Sunday's pile-up did not result in casualties, it has added to the growing list of mishaps on Hyderabad's Outer Ring Road, underlining the urgent need for stricter enforcement of traffic regulations and increased public awareness

India's Clean Energy Boom Faces Climate Finance Roadblock

ndia is rapidly emerging as a global clean energy leader, but its ambitious transition risks stalling without significant expansion in climate finance. According to the 2025 Climate Report by the United Nations Secretary-General, India, along with China and Brazil, is at the forefront of scaling solar and wind energy among developing nations. In 2024 alone, India added 24.5 gigawatts (GW) of solar capacity, placing it third globally. after China and the United States.

India's strides are not just about energy; they are reshaping the economy. The renewable energy sector contributed to 5% of

the country's GDP growth in 2023 and employed over a million people. Off-grid solar solutions alone accounted for more than 80,000 jobs in 2021. India's international leadership, including its key role in establishing the International Solar Alliance (ISA). underscores its commitment to a sustainable energy future.

However, behind this

progress lies a significant challenge — the widening climate finance gap. Experts argue that without adequate and sustained financial support from both domestic and international sources. India may struggle to

targets. Climate finance is critical not just for building infrastructure, but for supporting innovation, capacity building, and enabling a just transition that includes vulnerable communities

Despite various

government schemes and increased private sector interest, funding remains inadequate to meet India's Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement. The need for transparent, predictable, and accessible finance is urgent. International financial institutions and developed countries have a crucial role to play, especially in delivering on their climate finance commitments.

The stakes are high. As artificial intelligence, green hydrogen, and battery storage technologies evolve, India's potential to lead the next phase of the clean energy revolution depends on its ability to mobilize climate finance effectively.

If India's green momentum is to be sustained, policy reforms, global cooperation, and targeted investment must go hand in hand. Without closing the climate finance gap, the country's clean energy promise may remain just that — a promise.







India Sees 29% Drop in Violent Crimes Over Decade: NCRB Data

|ndia has witnessed a sharp decline in violent crimes over the last decade, according to data from the Na tional Crime Records Bureau (NCRB). From 1.45 lakh cases in 2014, violent crime incidents dropped to 1.02 lakh in 2023—a 29% decrease, signaling significant progress in law enforce-

ment and public safety. The data, covering key

categories such as rape, dowry deaths, riots, and murders, also shows 2023 figures falling below the 2004 level of 1.18 lakh cases, suggesting consistent long-term improvement.

Crimes Against Women Decline

One of the most notable reductions has been in crimes against women. Rape cases, which had surged from 2004 to 2014, declined 19%, from 36,735 in 2014 to 29,670 in 2023. Dowry deaths also dropped significantly, from 8,455 to 6,156 cases, marking a 27% fall, the sharpest among all

Murder and Riots Cases Also Down

Violent crimes like murders and riots also showed steady decline. Murder cases fell by 18%—from 33,981 in 2014 to 27,721 in 2023. Riots, which were a major concern during incidents

Delhi violence, saw a 40% reduction, from 66,042 to 39,260 cases.

Reforms and **Technology Behind** the Drop

Officials attribute this positive trend to focused reforms in policing and internal security. The Crime and Criminal Tracking Network and Systems (CCTNS) now links 17,712 police stations and gives access to over 35 crore crime records nationwide.

Under the Police Modernisation Scheme, the government allocated Rs 4,846 crore since 2021 to enhance communication tools, surveillance systems, and weapons infrastructure, helping police forces respond more efficiently.

This data marks a major turnaround in India's fight against violent crime and reflects the impact of sustained reform in the criminal justice

"Will Bring Out Full Truth": MK Stalin On Vijay's Karur Rally Stampede

amil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin on Saturday expressed deep sorrow and resolve following the tragic stampede in Karur that claimed 41 lives during a public rally organised by actor-politician Vijay's Tamizhaga Vettri Kazhagam

In a statement on social media, Stalin said the government is treating the High Court's observations with utmost seriousness, adding, "We are all deeply shaken. I feel great anguish for every family suffering the loss of a loved one and share in their tears

and pain." Stalin confirmed that a Special Investigation Team (SIT), ordered by the Madras High Court and led by Inspector-General of Police Asra Garg, will begin a comprehensive inquiry. 'This investigation will bring out the full truth. Accountability will be ensured at every level," Stalin affirmed.

The stampede on Sep-

tember 27 occurred in the Velusamy area of Karur, allegedly due to poor crowd management at a TVK rally. The tragedy has drawn criticism over the party's handling of the event. The High Court has since banned political rallies and roadshows along highways in the state until Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) are put in place.

Stalin said Tamil Nadu will lead the way in drafting SOPs to prevent future stampedes, involving input from experts, political parties, activists, and the general

Meanwhile, anticipatory bail pleas by top TVK leaders—including General Secretary Anand, Joint Secretary CTR Nirmal Kumar, and District Secretary N Sathish Kumar — have been dismissed by the Madurai Bench of the High Court, citing unruly crowd behaviour and damage to public property.

Japan Set to Elect First Female PM After Takaichi Wins LDP Leadership Race

anae Takaichi is on track to become Japan's first female prime minister after clinching victory in the ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) leadership race on Saturday

In a runoff between the top two candidates, Takaichi secured 185 votes against Shinjiro Koizumi's 156, signaling strong support within party ranks. Earlier rounds already showed her dominance among party members.

With the LDP holding significant influence in Japan's parliament, Takaichi is expected to win the formal parliamentary vote later this month and officially assume the role of prime minister.

Challenges Ahead

Takaichi inherits a deeply fragmented LDP. The party has lost its majority in both houses of parliament, making coalition-building essential to passing legislation and budgets.

She will also face the task of winning back public trust, especially among younger voters who have turned toward smaller populist parties amid rising cost-of-living pressures and demographic change.

Despite breaking gender barriers, it is unclear if her leadership will translate into progress on women's issues. Known for her conservative views, Takaichi may focus less on social reforms and more on economic revival.

Policy Outlook & **Diplomacy**

Analysts predict Takaichi's victory could swing Japan toward more stimulative fiscal policies. Bloomberg Economics notes her prostimulus leanings may slow the pace of rate hikes by the Bank of Japan and influence broader markets.

In foreign policy, she may quickly face tests. The United States-Japan tariff deal is nearing completion, and pressures over defense spending from allies will demand delicate diplomacy. Takaichi has also expressed interest in visiting the controversial Yasukuni Shrine, which could stir tensions with

Addressing lawmakers immediately after her win, she echoed the challenges ahead: "There is a mountain of things that we must accomplish together." As Japan gears up for this historic shift, many will watch not just whether she wins, but how she leads in turbu-

PM Modi Praises Trump as Hamas Signals Support for Gaza Peace Deal

rime Minister Narendra Modi has hailed the leadership of former US President Donald Trump after Hamas signaled acceptance of a US-brokered peace plan aimed at ending the ongoing Gaza conflict.

In a significant diplomatic development, Hamas has agreed in principle to release all Israeli hostages, contingent upon the fulfillment of "field conditions" for the exchange. The group expressed readiness to enter immediate negotiations with international mediators to finalise the

The announcement came just hours before the expiry of Trump's self-imposed deadline, which he described as a "last chance" for Hamas to agree to the peace framework

Welcoming the progress, Prime Minister Modi praised Trump's efforts, calling his role "instrumental in moving toward lasting peace in the region." In a statement issued by the Ministry of External Affairs, Modi said, "India supports all diplomatic efpeace and stability in West Asia. President Trump's initiative is a positive step.'

The proposed deal, which has not been fully disclosed publicly, reportedly involves phased hostage releases, a ceasefire, and guaranteed humanitarian access to Gaza. It also includes provisions for the reopening of borders and reconstruction under international oversight.

Trump, who has remained actively involved in Middle East diplomacy since leaving office, described Hamas' response as a "critical break-through", but warned that the implementation phase would be closely monitored by the US and its allies.

The Indian government has expressed hope that the deal could lead to long-term de-escalation in the region. Officials confirmed that India is in touch with key stakeholders and is prepared to support reconstruction and humanitarian aid efforts.

The international community has cautiously welcomed the development, though experts warn that trust deficits and security concerns could still derail the peace process

Peace Deal Signed to End Deadly Protests in Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir

fter nearly a week of violent unrest in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), the federal government and protest leaders have reached an agreement to end widespread demonstrations that have left at least 10 dead and hundreds

The breakthrough came late Saturday following intense negotiations between Islamabad officials and the Jammu Kashmir Joint Awami Action Committee (JKJAAC) — a coalition representing civil society, traders, and local rights activists. The agreement aims to restore calm in the region, where tensions have flared over governance failures, economic hardship, and long-standing grievances about neglect by the central government.

The unrest began on September 29 when talks between JKJAAC leaders and local authorities broke down. What started as a peaceful strike soon spiraled into violent confrontations, with clashes between demonstrators and security forces reported in multiple towns including Muzaffarabad, Rawalakot, and Mirpur.

Protesters accused the government of ignoring the region's demands for affordable electricity, fair taxation, and greater autonomy in administrative matters. The strike turned violent after videos of alleged police brutality went viral, sparking further outrage.

Saturday's agreement

includes commitments from the government to review energy tariffs, suspend controversial taxes, and initiate a highlevel inquiry into police excesses during the protests. The JKJAAC has called off the strike and urged supporters to maintain peace.

Officials have begun withdrawing paramilitary forces from key protest sites, while local leaders have appealed for a return to normalcy. "This is a step toward justice and a voice for the people of PoK," said JKJAAC spokesperson.

While calm has temporarily returned, analysts caution that longterm stability in PoK will depend on whether the central government honors its promises and begins serious dialogue on the region's political and economic future.

"Savage": Zelensky Says Russian Drone Strike On Ukraine Train Station Kills 30

Russian drone strike on a railway station in northeastern Ukraine's Sumy region killed at least 30 people and injured dozens more, Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky confirmed on Saturday. calling the attack "sav-

age" and deliberate. The strike targeted the Shostka train station, located just 50 km from the Russian border. The victims included passengers and railway employees, according to Zelensky, who shared a harrowing video of a burning train carriage with shattered windows and twisted metal. "The Russians could not have been unaware that they were

striking civilians," he said, condemning the assault as another brutal blow to Ukraine's infrastructure. Since the beginning of the full-scale inva-

Flipkart, Amazon face Centre probe for charging ₹100 platform fee

'Alien' Diamond Created on Earth, **Harder Than Natural Diamonds**

nese scientists have successfully created a rare form of diamond-known as hexagonal diamond or lonsdaleite—in a laboratory setting, marking a major leap in material science. This ultra-hard crystal is naturally found only in meteorites and is believed to be significantly harder than conventional diamonds.

Published in Nature, the study was led by researchers from the Centre for High-Pressure Science & Technology Advanced Research. They achieved the feat by transforming highpurity graphite into hexagonal diamond under carefully controlled high-pressure, hightemperature, and quasi-hydrostatic conditions. The result: highly ordered, micrometre-sized diamond samples that could out-



perform traditional diamonds in industrial and electronic applications.

Unlike standard cubic diamonds, which can fracture along specific planes, hexagonal diamonds have a more robust atomic structure. Until now, attempts to synthesize them in labs had mostly produced ordinary diamonds due to structural instability during

Lead researcher Yang Liuxiang attributed the success to two key innovations. First, the use of ultra-pure natural graphite as the starting material ensured minimal defects. Second, real-time X-ray imaging allowed re-

The achievement not only advances diamond synthesis but also opens doors to engineering other rare materials found only in extreme cosmic environments.

NHAI to Install QR Code Signboards on Highways for Emergency and Utility Info



he National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has announced a new initiative to install QR code-enabled signboards across the national highway network, aimed at improving road safety, transparency, and commuter convenience. This move, revealed in a press release by the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, will allow travellers to instantly access critical information by scanning QR codes while on the move.

The vertical signboards will feature project-specific details such as the national highway number, chainage, proiect length, and timelines for construction and maintenance. More importantly, they will pro-

vide quick access to emergency helpline numbers, including 1033, as well as contact details of key officials like highway patrol officers, toll managers, project managers, resident engineers, and NHAI field

Additionally, the QR codes will offer digital access to nearby essential services such as hospitals, petrol pumps, toilets, police stations, restaurants, vehicle repair shops, truck laybyes, toll plazas, and electric vehicle charging stations. This will help travellers locate emergency and utility services quickly, making journeys safer and smoother.

To maximize impact, NHAI plans to place these QR code signboards at strategic locations such as toll plazas. rest areas, wayside amenities, truck laybyes, and at the start and end points of highway stretches.

The Ministry emphasized that beyond providing project information, these signboards will enhance road safety by improving access to emergency services and boost user experience by increasing awareness about the national highways.
