AP Govt, YSRCP Clash Over PPP Model for 10 New Medical CollegesThe ambitious plan to expand Andhra Pradesh's medical education landscape has sparked an intense political battle, with the NDA-led state government and the opposition YSR Congress Party (YS-RCP) trading charges over the decision to build 10 new medical colleges under the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model. The initiative traces back to the YSRCP government under former Chief Minister Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, that laid the foundation for 17 new government medical colleges aimed at providing advanced healthcare in every district.

Of these, five colleges, Vizianagaram, Rajah-mundry, Eluru, Machilipatnam and Nandyal were completed and became functional before the 2024 elections, with classes for 750 MBBS seats starting in the 2023–24 academic year. However, by the time YS-

He argued that the original plan could have added 4,910 medical seats, 2,360 of them free for disadvantaged students and accused the NDA government of falsely citing lack of funds. "Chandrababu can spend 2 lakh crore on Amaravati but not 500 crore on a medical college," Jagan said, calling it a matter of misplaced priorities. The dispute has moved

into the judicial arena, with a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) challenging the PPP model now before the Andhra Pradesh High Court. While the court has declined to stay the tender process, it has directed the state to file a detailed counter-affidavit explaining its decision. Meanwhile, YSRCP has mobilized mass protests under the banner of "Praja Udyamam" (People's Movement). Through September and October, the party has conducted rallies, district-wide demonstra-



tions, and launched a one-crore signature campaign demanding a reversal of the policy.

Chief Minister Naidu has sought to reassure the public that "the PPP model is not privatization," stressing that ownership remains with the government and projects revert to it after an agreed period. He promised that all healthcare services, including medicines and NTR Vaidya Seva treatments, will remain free for the people. As the political confrontation intensifies, the fu-

ture of Andhra Pradesh's medical education expansion hinges on both the court's verdict and the public's response to these competing visions for healthcare infrastr ucture.

'AP EXCISE SURAKSHA' APP INSPECTED

TPN BUREAU /VI-JAYAWADAOct 14: Excise Minister Ravindra Reviews 'AP Excise Suraksha' App Functioning in Vijayawada

In a major step toward promoting transparency and strengthening enforcement in the liquor trade, Andhra Pradesh Excise Minister Kollu Ravindra on Monday inspected the functioning of the state's new mobile application "AP Excise Suraksha" at M/s Liquor Home located on Sambamurthy Road, Sitaramapuram, Vijayawada. The visit marked a hands-on evaluation of how the innovative digital platform is transforming the way liquor authenticity is verified at the retail level.

Accompanied by Excise Commissioner Chamakuri Sridhar and other senior officials from the department, the Minister personally reviewed the operational features of the app. During the demonstration, he cross-checked the app's efficiency, user interface, and real-time functionality. Using the application, the Minister verified the genuineness of several liquor bottles firsthand, ensuring that the system was accurately identifying authentic products. The exercise also included a live demonstration conducted for members of the media, showcasing how the app empowers consumers and retailers to verify a bottle's authenticity through simple barcode scanning.

Speaking to reporters after the inspection, Minister Ravindra expressed satisfaction with the app's performance and its potential benefits to the public. He highlighted that the "AP Excise Suraksha" application represents an important milestone in the state government's efforts to curb the circulation of spurious liquor and promote ethical trade practices. "This initiative will not only eliminate illegal liquor movement but also foster transparency and build confidence among consumers," the Minister stated.

He urged every consumer in Andhra Pradesh to download and actively use the app to verify key details about liquor products, including brand authenticity, manufacturing origin, and source of supply. According to the Minister, widespread adoption of the app would act as a powerful deterrent against counterfeit liquor distribution and ensure that buyers receive only certified and safe products. During the interaction, Ravindra also directed Excise Commissioner Sridhar and the Chief Project Engineer to make the system more inclusive and userfriendly by addressing the needs of illiterate consumers. He suggested that

within the next 45 days, the team should develop a visual indicator feature at liquor shops. Under this proposed enhancement, when a salesperson scans a bottle, the display system at the counter should automatically flash a green light for genuine liquor and a red light for fake or non-genuine liquor. This method, he emphasized, would simplify the verification process and make alcohol safety easily understandable for

all sections of society. Commissioner Sridhar briefed the Minister on the technical architecture of the new app, explaining its integration with the excise department's centralized monitoring and product tracking systems. He assured that continuous improvements and updates would be implemented to enhance efficiency and consumer experience. AP GOVT TO RETURN ZEZ LANDS TO FARMERS

THREE JUDGES TO AP HIGH COURT

Three Judges Transferred to Andhra Pradesh High Court Following Collegium Approval

TPN BUREAU, AM-ARAVATHI OCT 14: In a significant development for the judiciary in Andhra Pradesh three sitting High Court judges from different states have officially been transferred to the Andhra Pradesh High Court. The move comes after the Supreme Court Collegium's earlier recommendation, which has now received the formal approval of President Draupadi Murmu. Orders to this effect have already been issued by the Central Government.

Justice Manavendranath, previously serving in the Gujarat High Court, Justice Dundi Ramesh from the Allahabad High Court, and Justice Subendu Samantha, who was a sitting judge in the Calcutta High Court, will soon take up their new assignments in Amaravati, where the Andhra Pradesh High Court is located. These transfers are part of the regular administrative reshuffle aimed at strengthening the judicial bench in various states and ensuring equitable distribution of experienced judges across the country. According to legal experts, such transfers are essential to ensure uniformity in judicial functioning and to enhance the efficiency of courts in states facing rising caseloads. Andhra Pradesh's High Court has been witnessing a steady increase in



along with an uptick in public interest litigations addressing governance, infrastructure, and social welfare issues.

The arrival of these three judges is expected to bolster the court's capacity and possibly expedite hearings in pending matters.The Supreme Court Collegium, comprising the Chief Justice of India and senior-most judges of the apex court, had recommended the transfers earlier this year after reviewing the overall requirements of different High Courts and the experience of the judges concerned. Justice Manavendranath is known for his expertise in constitutional matters and

commercial law. Justice Dundi Ramesh has built a strong profile in criminal jurisprudence and has presided over several high-profile cases in Uttar Pradesh. Justice Subendu Samantha is widely respected for his judgments in civil and taxation domains, and his tenure in the Calcutta High Court has been marked by several landmark orders.President Draupadi Murmu's approval marks the final stage in the transfer process, following which the Ministry of Law and Justice is-

ent with constitutional provisions under Article 222, which deals with the transfer of High Court judges after consultation with the Chief Justice of India.Judicial sources in Andhra Pradesh expressed optimism that the addition of these judges would help reduce case backlogs that have been a persistent challenge. Lawyers practicing at the High Court also welcomed the move, noting that the diverse backgrounds and legal specializations of the incoming judges would contribute to more comprehensive judicial perspectives.

As the three judges prepare to assume their new responsibilities, the focus will be on how their collective experience can enhance the credibility, speed, and quality of iudicial outcomes in Andhra Pradesh, The transfers underscore the judiciary's commitment to maintaining a balanced and effective system, capable of delivering justice efficiently across different regions. With the Collegium's vision and the President's endorsement now implemented, the Andhra Pradesh High Court is poised for a strengthened bench and renewed judicial momentum.

TRANSPORT MINISTER TO REVIEW RTC ARRANGEMENTS



TPN BUREAU Amaravati Oct 14: Transport Minister Reviews RTC Arrangements for PM Modi's Visit.

Andhra Pradesh Transport Minister Mandipalli Ramprasad Doddi on Tuesday held a highlevel review meeting with transport department and Andhra Pradesh State Road **Transport Corporation** (APSRTC) officials to finalise arrangements for Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to Kurnool and Nandyal districts on October 16.During the meeting, the Minister extended his congratulations to Prime Minister Modi for the recent Goods and Services Tax (GST) reduction, describing the decision as historic and undertaken with public welfare in mind.

He emphasised that the GST relief would benefit common citizens and improve affordability in various sectors. thereby bolstering economic activity. The Chief Minister's office has already coordinated with district administrations to ensure smooth con-

duct of Modi's programmes, and the Transport Department is playing a major role in enabling large-scale public participation. Minister Ramprasad Doddi personally reviewed RTC's operational plans for the visit, which is expected to draw significant crowds to political meetings and public gatherings.

As part of the arrangements, APSRTC will make available a total of 3,500 buses to meet transport demands during the Prime Minister's tour.

Out of these, 3,070 buses have been earmarked to carry attendees to the major public meeting scheduled in Nannur, Kurnool district. Officials stated that efforts are being made to mobilise fleets from adjoining depots and districts to ensure timely transportation without affecting regular passenger services.In addition to the Nannur meeting, 150 buses will be prepared for the Prime Minister's visit to Srisailam. These buses will facili-

tate easy travel for people heading to religious and cultural events scheduled alongside the PM's programme. Special attention is being given to ensuring that all vehicles deployed for the tour are in optimal condition, with teams assigned to carry out maintenance checks, fuel arrangements, and logistical readiness. Furthermore, Transport Minister Ramprasad Doddi directed that 80 buses be reserved exclusively for police and security personnel movement. This measure aims to strengthen coordination among various security agencies, including state police, SPG (Special Protection Group), and other central forces assigned to the visit.

By ensuring smooth transit for security staff, the government is seek-

ing to enhance crowd management and ensure strict adherence to safety protocols. The Minister instructed that designated parking zones, pickup points, and route diversions be planned well in advance. He also sought detailed briefings from RTC officials on real-time monitoring systems that will track bus movements on the day of the visit. Control rooms will be set up in district headquarters to coordinate with drivers, conductors, and field staff, ensuring seamless transport operations for thousands of attendees.

Speaking to media after the meeting, Ramprasad Doddi reiterated that Prime Minister Modi's visit is of great significance to the people of Andhra Pradesh. "The GST decision is people-centric and reflects commitment towards economic growth. We will ensure flawless transport arrangements so that citizens can participate comfortably in the Prime Minister's programmes," he said. Officials confirmed that all logistical plans will be ready by October 15, with trial runs scheduled in key locations on the eve of the visit. With preparations in full swing, Kurnool and Nandyal districts are gearing up for a historic and well-attended tour.

SIT RAIDS ON MITHUN REDDY'S RESIDENCES



SIT Raids YSRCP MP Mithun Reddy's Residences in Connection with Liquor Scam Probe

TPN BUREAU, RAJAMPET, OCT 14: Andhra Pradesh's Special Investigation Team (SIT) on Tuesday intensified its investigation into the alleged liquor scam that took place during the YSR Congress Party's regime by conducting searches at multiple properties linked to YSRCP Rajampet MP P.V. Mithun Reddy. The coordinated raids were carried out simultaneously in Hyderabad and Bengaluru, targeting residences and offices belonging to the MP. According to official sources, SIT officials began searches early in the morning at Mithun Reddy's high-profile residences located in Film Nagar, Prashasan Nagar, and Gayathri Hills in Hyderabad's upscale Yusufguda area.

Another team carried out searches at his office in Kondapur, where they reportedly examined several financial records, electronic devices, and property documents. Simultaneously, a separate SIT unit conducted raids at his residence in Bengaluru, ensuring the operation was comprehensive and synchronized. The searches come as part of the SIT's ongoing investigation into the alleged irregularities and financial mismanagement

tendering process that occurred during the previous YS-RCP government.

Sources close to the investigation revealed that the agency suspects a network of political figures, business associates. and government officials may have colluded to generate illegal commissions and kickbacks through liquor contracts. The SIT's operations on Tuesday were primarily aimed at collecting key evidence and tracing money trails linked to the scam. Officials remained tight-lipped about the findings of the searches, but sources suggested that significant digital data, including laptops, mobile phones, and financial papers, were seized for forensic examination.

The team reportedly questioned a few staff members and personal aides of the MP during the searches to verify details related to transactions and ownership of certain firms allegedly used for routing funds. This development has drawn substantial attention within political circles in the state. Opposition parties, including the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) and Jana Sena, have claimed that the raids validate their long-standing allegations of large-scale corruption during the YSRCP's rule. TDP leaders welcomed the SIT's action, in the liquor distribution and calling it a crucial move toward

uncovering the "truth behind the liquor cartel that looted public wealth.'

Meanwhile, YSRCP sources have downplayed the searches as politically motivated. Party leaders asserted that such actions are being carried out to tarnish the image of their representatives ahead of possible upcoming by-elections and to divert public attention from governance issues. They maintained that Mithun Reddy has fully cooperated with investigators and has nothing to hide. The liquor scam case has been one of the most high-profile investigations launched after the change in government. The SIT, constituted by the Andhra Pradesh government earlier this year, has been pursuing various leads involving alleged financial irregularities that amount to hundreds of crores.

With Tuesday's raids, officials have indicated that the probe is entering a critical phase, with several prominent figures likely to face questioning in the coming weeks. The SIT plans to submit an interim report to the state government after completing analysis of the seized materials. If further discrepancies or money laundering links are established, the Enforcement Directorate (ED) is expected to step in to trace interstate financial transactions.



Dharmana Prasada Rao Warns TDP **Coalition against Privatization of Medical Colleges**

TPN BUREAU/ Vijayawada Oct 14: Former minister and senior YS-RCP leader Dharmana Prasada Rao issued a stern warning to the TDP-led coalition government over its reported move to privatize government medical colleges in Andhra Pradesh. He termed the proposal "irresponsible and anti-people," alleging that it would seriously endanger the state's public healthcare system while prioritizing profit over people's welfare. Speaking at a press conference in Srikakulam on Monday, Dharmana condemned the coalition's decision as an assault on the very foundation of social justice and constitutional respons ibility.

"Public health is the government's duty, not a commodity for private business. Handing over the healthcare system to corporate interests is like sacrificing the poor at the altar of profit," he said.He cautioned that if

the government failed to withdraw its privatization plans, the YSR Congress Party and the people would launch a massive state-wide agitation to compel the administration to reverse its decision. Dharmana added that the growing public outrage reflected a deep sense of betrayal among citizens who had trusted successive governments to expand healthcare access, not re-

Dharmana contrasted the coalition's approach with the initiatives undertaken during the YS Jagan Mohan Reddy administration. He recalled that during the COV-ID-19 pandemic, Andhra Pradesh's network of government hospitals strengthened under Jagan's leadership provided free treatment to thousands of patients and played a vital role in saving lives. "The same system that protected people during a global health emergency is now being dismantled for pri-

vate gain," he rema rked.

Dharmana highlighted that the YSRCP government had sanctioned 17 new medical colleges to decentralize medical education and strengthen public healthcare. Of these, seven institutions were already completed, each built at a cost of around Rs 500 crore and spread over 50 acres. These colleges, he said, were envisioned to ensure that corporate-level medical facilities reached remote and economically weaker regions of the state. "Turning these government assets over to private management would defeat their original purpose," he added. Dharmana also accused the coalition of deliberately weakening the Aarogyasri health scheme, which provides free treatment for low-income families. He alleged that the government was delaying payments to empanelled hospitals, causing dis-

WOMEN'S COMMISSION SLAMS BOLLA'S REMARKS

Demands Public Apology

TPN BUREAU, Amaravati, October 14: The Andhra Pradesh State Women's Commission has expressed strong objection to the controversial remarks made by former Vinukonda MLA Bolla Brahmanaidu, who reportedly stated in a public interaction that "all women are drunkards." Calling the comments deeply derogatory and unacceptable, the Commission's Chairperson Dr. Rayapati Sailaja said such statements insult the dignity of women and tarnish democratic values. Addressing the media on Tuesday, Dr. Sailaja described Brahmanaidu's words as "an affront to the entire female community" and a reflection of his disrespectful attitude towards women.

She said the former MLA's comments have widespread criticism across social and political circles, adding that no responsible public representative should use such language that demeans women. "Bolla Brahmanaidu's contempt for women is evident from his irresponsible remarks. A person holding public office has the moral responsibility to respect women and behave in a manner that upholds social dignity," Dr. Sailaja said. She demanded that the former legislator issue a public apology for his comments, emphasizing that failure

to do so would invite serious action from the Commission.

The Chairperson warned that the State Women's Commission will treat the matter with utmost seriousness if Bolla Brahmanaidu continues to remain unapologetic. She stated that words of political leaders should serve as a social model for people, not as a cause for public outrage. "No civilized person would speak in such a manner. Leaders who insult women are unfit to hold any public post," she added .Dr. Sailaja reminded that before making any remark about women, one must remember that "their mother, sister, wife, and even the goddess they worship are also women."

She asserted that the Commission would continue to act firmly against any person or leader who makes statements that degrade the honor of women. The Women's Commission Chairperson also appealed to government officers and law enforcement agencies to stay vigilant and act against the toxic culture of sexist or derogatory political speech. She stressed that such comments not only hurt women but also weaken the values of respect and equality enshrined in Indian society. The Commission concluded that protecting women's dignity is a collective responsibility that every elected representative should uphold.

VIJAYAWADA METROLINE -DEADLINE EXTENDED FOR TENDERS



Amaravati, October 14: Deadline Extended for Vijayawada Metro Rail Project Tenders The Andhra Pradesh Metro Rail Corporation (APM-RC) has announced an extension of the deadline for submission of

tenders related to the highly anticipated Vijayawada Metro Rail project. The new deadline has been moved to October 24, providing an additional 10 days for interested companies to finalize their bids. The extension has generated considerable relief among infrastructure firms that were preparing their tender documents, as the earlier timeline posed challenges due to the complexity and scope of the project.

According to reliable sources, the APMRC decided to extend the deadline following requests from several contracting companies that sought additional time to prepare comprehensive, competitive proposals.

The Vijayawada Metro Rail project is expected to transform public transport in the city, offering a modern, efficient, and sustainable alternative to current commuting options. With Vijayawada's rapid urban growth and increasing traffic congestion, the project has been viewed as a crucial step toward reducing travel times, lowering pollution levels, and improving connectivity within the city and surrounding regions.

Major infrastructure companies across India are closely watching this development. Industry analysts note that metro rail tenders attract some of the largest players in construction, engineering, and transport solutions. These companies bring expertise in ad-

The Vijayawada Metro Rail project is expected to be planned in multiple phases, covering key routes that connect commercial hubs, residential areas, and vital transit points such as railway stations and bus terminals. Each phase will involve detailed engineeri n g works, environmental assessments, and integration with existing transport infrastructure.

As the October 24 deadline approaches, the focus will remain on which companies submit bids and how their proposals measure up to AP-MRC's criteria. The eventual awarding of contracts will mark a turning point in the project's progress. Given the level of industry interest and public anticipation, observers expect a competitive and high-stakes tender process that could set a benchmark for future infrastructure projects in Andhra Pradesh.











TREAT HOSTLERS AS OWN CHILDREN - DISTRICT COLLECTOR

SAJJALAACCUSES CBN FOR DIVERSION POLITICS

TPN BUREAU/ Vijayawada Oct 14: Sajjala Slams Chandrababu for 'Diversion Drama' Amid Fake Liquor Mafia Exposure

YSR Congress Party (YSRCP) State Coordinator Sajjala Ramakrishna Reddy has sharply criticised Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu, alleging that he is orchestrating a "diversion drama" to distract public attention from the exposure of an alleged fake liquor mafia operating in Andhra Pradesh under the Telugu Desam Party (TDP) government.Speaking at a meeting of YSRCP State Secretaries (Parliament) at the party's Central Office in Vijayawada on Monday, Sajjala charged that the Chief Minister was 'panic-stricken" and "behaving irresponsibly" as the spurious liquor network linked to his administration was gradually coming to light.Instead of ordering a fair and transparent probe, Sajjala claimed, Chandrababu was attempting to levy false charges against YSRCP leaders.

"The Chief Minister is resorting to cheap diversion tactics rather than confronting the truth about the liquor mafia flourishing under his watch," he al-



leged. The YSRCP leader ridiculed the TDP government's recently launched liquor verification app, describing it as a "self-goal". He questioned the rationale behind such an initiative, arguing that the very necessity of an app to check whether liquor is genuine or fake proves the extent of adulteration under the present regime.

"In the history of India, no Chief Minister has ever needed to launch an app for this purpose. If Chandrababu has done so, it is clear evidence that fake liquor is being produced and sold across the state," Sajjala remarked. He further alleged that belt shops and permit rooms were functioning round-the-clock under TDP supervision, many of them

delivering adulterated liquor straight to consumers' doorsteps. Sajjala contrasted this with measures implemented during YS-RCP's tenure under former CM Y.S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, where every liquor bottle carried a QR-code tracking system from distillery to retail, ensuring transparency and preventing black-market activities.Condemning what he called "cheap diversion politics", Sajiala pointed to a recent development where "a man was brought from Africa, given lavish treatment, and then used to exact political

revenge.

calling it a sign of Chandrababu's "desperation and fear."Sajjala also used the meeting to rally YS-RCP cadre, urging them to resist politically motivated propaganda and focus on strengthening the party's organisational structure from the grassroots level. He directed secretaries to form ward and village committees, coordinate with regional units, harness social media for outreach, and identify committed workers f o r k e y responsibilities.

"Only a strong organisational foundation can withstand TDP's conspiracies and safeguard the people from misrule," he said, adding that the current political climate starkly highlighted the difference between YSRCP's "integrity-driven governance" and what he termed TDP's "mafiapolitics."Sajjala concluded his remarks with an assertion that the people of Andhra Pradesh were aware of the contrast in governance styles between Y.S. What began as a tariff skirmish has now escalated into a full-blown global supply chain siege, with the United States and China weaponising their respective technological and material strengths. And in this escalating economic battle, India finds itself deeply exposed.

Ahead of a Trump-Xi summit slated for late October in South Korea, Beijing announced sweeping export controls on rare-earth elements, magnets, and battery materials. These moves, framed as national security measures, are seen as a direct response to

U.S. export curbs on Chinese chipmakers and higher port duties on Chinese-built ships.

Washington retaliated with threats of 100% tariffs and restrictions on software exports. But this is no longer a trade war—it is now a strategic siege, where semiconductors and minerals are new-age weapons.

India's Growing Vulnerability

India imports nearly 90% of its rare-earth magnets from China, totalling 53,700 tonnes in 2024–2025. These critical materials power electric vehicles, wind turbines. electronics, and defence

tightening licensing rules—even for products made abroad using Chinese inputs—India's production lines from Pune to Coimbatore are at risk of disruption.

The export curbs are a stark reminder of India's dependency. Despite having the fifth-largest rareearth reserves globally, India lacks the refining and magnet-making infrastructure to fully utilise them.

Early Moves, But a Long Road Ahead

In response, New Delhi is advancing plans for a National Critical Minerals Stockpile, aiming to



On Friday morning, the S&P 500 was on track for yet another record close when Trump abruptly declared a 100% tariff on Chinese goods. The news sent shockwaves through Wall Street, with the techheavy Nasdaq dropping 3.6% and the CBOE Volatility Index, Wall Street's so-called "fear gauge." surging over 30%.

Google to Invest \$15 Billion in Visakhapatnam Al Hub, **Pichai Briefs PM Modi**

Delhi Waives Late Fees on Water

Bills Till jan 31, Cuts Charges for

Illegal Connections

In a significant relief for Delhi residents, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Tuesday announced a complete waiver of late payment surcharge (LPSC) on domestic water bills till January 31, 2026. The move is aimed at easing the financial burden on consumers and encouraging the reg-ularisation of illegal water connections.

Addressing a press conference, Gupta revealed that the Delhi government will write off over ₹11,000 crore worth of surcharge on domestic water bills. After January 31, the waiver will be reduced to 70% and will remain in effect till March 31,

"The LPSC waiver will be 100% till January 31. After that, we are offering a 70% waiver till March 31, but there will be no extension beyond

In another major decision, the gov-structure in the capital.

ernment slashed the conversion charges for unauthorised water connections. For domestic connections. the fee has been reduced from ₹25,000 to just ₹1,000. For non-domestic connections, the charges have been cut from ₹61,000 to ₹5,000. These measures aim to bring more than 29 lakh illegal connections in the city under

the legal network. According to officials, the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) is owed a staggering ₹87,589 crore in unpaid water bills. Of this, only ₹7,125 crore is the principal amount, while ₹80,463 crore about 91% — is late payment surcharge.

The chief minister urged residents to take advantage of the waiver and regularisation drive, adding that the scheme will not be extended beyond March 31, 2026. The initiative is expected to boost DJB's revenue recovery and improve water supply infra-

'India Proved Doubters Wrong...': **IMF Chief's Praise In Global Economy Meet**

International Monetary Fund (IMF) Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva on Monday praised India's "bold economic and structural reforms" during the opening session of the IMF's semi-annual meeting of global finance ministers and central bank governors.

Georgieva highlighted key Indian reforms such as the recalibration of Goods and Services Tax (GST) brackets, overhaul of income tax laws, mass digital payments adoption, and the rollout of Aadhaar — the country's digital social identity program.

"Everyone told India that digital identity on a mass scale could not be done... but India proved them wrong," she said. She specifically applauded the recent GST restructuring, which included eliminating the 12% and 28% slabs and introducing a 40% 'sin tax', aimed at boosting consumption by making essentials like milk, coffee, and ghee more affordable.

She also reinforced earlier remarks made last week, calling India a "key growth engine" amid global slowdown concerns. The IMF projects India's GDP to grow at 6.5% in 2025 and 2026, while the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) projects 6.8%, citing structural reforms as the growth driver.

However, Georgieva also sounded alarms on global economic challenges. She warned that global public debt is set to exceed 100% of GDP by 2029, with over 150 developing countries nearing or already in debt distress. While she



appreciated G20 efforts, she pressed for greater focus on debt relief, especially as South Africa chairs the group. The next G20 chair, the United States under President Trump, has shown little interest in the issue.

Georgieva also flagged fresh risks from esca-

lating US-China trade tensions. Trump's threat of a 100% tariff on Chinese goods could derail recent progress and spark a renewed global trade war. "If Trump goes back to 100% tariffs... there's going to be a lot of pain," former IMF strategist Martin Muehleisen warned.

Congress to Boycott JPC on Bills for PM, CM **Removal Over Criminal Charges**

The Congress party has officially decided to boycott the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) formed to examine three controversial bills related to the removal of the Prime Minister, Chief Ministers, and other Ministers arrested on serious criminal charges for a 30-day period.

The decision was communicated to Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Monday, October 13, party sources confirmed. The boycott marks a sharp political stance against what the Congress terms an attempt to "undermine democratic institutions through questionable legislative processes."

The bills in question were introduced in the Lok Sabha by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on August 20. Soon after the introduction, the House passed a resolution to refer the legislation to a joint committee for further scrutiny. The proposed bills aim to establish a legal framework for suspending top executive office-holders, including the PM and CMs, from their posts if they are arrested on charges deemed "serious" by the judiciary or investigative agencies.

 $Congress\,lea\bar{d}ers\,argue\,that\,the\,legislation$ sets a dangerous precedent and could be misused for political vendetta. "These bills are vague, open to misuse, and politically motivated. We cannot be part of a process that



legitimizes such overreach," a senior party

leader told The Hindu. The party has also questioned the urgency

and timing of the bills, especially ahead of key state elections and rising political tensions across the country.

This move by the Congress could potentially lead to a wider opposition boycott, complicating the review process in the committee. The government, however, maintains that the bills are aimed at ensuring accountability in public office and upholding the rule of law.

The JPC is expected to begin its deliberations later this month, with or without Congress participation.

Andhra mountaineer becomes first Indian

To summit 9 of world's highest 8,000 metre peaks



Bharath Thammineni, a 36-year-old mountaineer from Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh, has become the first Indian to successfully summit nine of the world's 14 highest peaks over 8,000 metres. His latest feat was conquering Mt Cho Oyu (8,188m), the world's sixthhighest mountain, in China.

Thammineni reached the Cho Oyu base camp on September 30 but faced setbacks due to bad weather and heavy snowfall. After waiting for better conditions, he made a final summit push on October 12, reaching the peak at 6:55 am China time (8:55 am IST). Notably, he accomplished this climb without Sherpa support, highlighting his skill and resilience.

Before Cho Oyu, Thammineni had already scaled eight other 8,000+ metre peaks: Mt Everest (May 2017), Mt Manaslu (September 2018), Mt Lhotse (May 2019), Mt Annapurna (March 2022), Mt Kanchenjunga (April 2022), Mt Makalu (May 2023), Mt Shishapangma (October 2024), and Mt Dhaulagiri (April 2025). Five remaining highest

peaks—Mt K2, Nanga Parbat, Gasherbrum I and II, and Broad Peak—are located in Pakistan and currently offlimits to Indian climbers.

Thammineni is the founder of Boots & Crampons, a mountaineering company, and is widely regarded as one of India's most accomplished high-altitude climbers. Over the past decade, he has guided expeditions across six continents and inspired many aspiring climbers.

His leadership was instrumental in the Everest 2025 expedition, which included historic achievements such as Chhonzin Angmo becoming the world's first blind woman to summit Everest and Vishwanath Karthikey becoming the youngest Indian to complete the Seven Summits challenge.

From his summit camp, Thammineni dedicated his achievement to India's adventure sports community, saying, "This is not just a personal achievement but a testament to the potential of Indian adventure sports. I hope this inspires a new generation of climbers to aim for the highest peaks."







PM Modi Welcomes Release of All Hamas Hostages, Backs **Trump's Peace Efforts**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi warmly welcomed the release of all remaining Israeli hostages held by Hamas, praising the resilience of their families and the peace efforts led by US President Donald Trump and Israeli Prime Minister

Benjamin Netanyahu. On Monday, the Israeli Defence Forces (IDF) confirmed that all 20 surviving Israeli hostages, held captive for over two years in Gaza, were freed and returned to Israeli authorities. This announcement came on the eve of the Jewish festival Simchat Torah, marking a significant moment for Israel and supporters of peace

worldwide. "We welcome the release of all hostages after over two years of captivity. Their freedom stands as a tribute to the courage of their families, the unwavering peace efforts of President Trump and the strong resolve of Prime Minister Netanyahu. We support President Trump's sincere efforts to bring peace to the region," PM Modi said in a post on X.

IDF spokesperson Effie Defrin called the return of the hostages "a defining moment" that belongs to all those who believe in humanity, underscoring the emotional and political significance of the development.

India has consistently condemned the terror attacks on Israel on October 7, 2023, and the resulting civilian casualties in the ongoing Israel-Hamas conflict. The Ministry of External Affairs reiterated India's call for the release of all hostages, a ceasefire, and a peaceful resolution through dialogue diplomacy.

India has also stressed the urgent need for safe and sustained humanitarian aid to affected areas. This stance has been voiced in multiple international platforms, including the UN, BRICS, NAM, and the Voice of the Global South.

Venezuela Closes Norway Embassy After Machado Wins Nobel Peace Prize

In a move seen as a direct response to Venezuelan opposition leader María Corina Machado receiving the Nobel Peace Prize, President Nicolás Maduro's government has ordered the closure of Venezuela's embassy in Norway. The decision came just days after Machado was honoured for her efforts promoting democracy and peaceful transition in Venezuela

The Venezuelan Foreign Ministry cited a "reorganisation" of its diplomatic network as the official reason for shutting down the Oslo embassy. Phone lines at the embassy were disconnected by Monday evening. At the same time, Caracas announced plans to close its mission in Australia while opening new diplomatic posts in Zimbabwe and Burkina Faso, signalling a strategic realignment aimed at strengthening ties with the Global South.

Norway's Foreign Ministry expressed regret over the closure, stating that Venezuela had not provided any official explanation. Spokesperson Cecilie Roang emphasised that despite differences, Norway wishes to maintain dialogue with Venezuela. Roang also

clarified that the Nobel Peace Prize is awarded independently of the Norwegian government. Machado, a leading

figure in the opposition Vente Venezuela party, has been a vocal critic of Maduro's administration, which she frequently describes as a dictatorship. She has led multiple anti-government protests and went into hiding last year amid threats to her safety. Following the controversial 2024 presidential election, which Maduro won amid opposition allegations of fraud, Machado claimed her party's candidate Edmundo González was the rightful winner.

Although Maduro has not publicly addressed Machado's Nobel Prize, he reportedly referred to her in derogatory terms during a recent speech. Speaking from hiding, Machado declared that "Maduro's time is over" but urged a peaceful transition, offering negotiations to ensure stability.

This latest diplomatic fallout underscores the deepening tensions between Maduro's regime and the opposition, complicating Venezuela's fragile political landscape.

Trump Praises Modi, Sees Hope for India-Pakistan Peace at Egypt Summit

US President Donald Trump praised India and its leader, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, without naming him directly, while expressing optimism about peace between India and Pakistan at a world leaders' summit in Egypt. The gathering followed a ceasefire agreement that ended the more than two-year-long Israel-Hamas war in Gaza.

Addressing the summit on Monday, Trump called India "a great country with a good friend of mine at the top" and lauded Modi's leadership. Turning his gaze toward Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif standing behind him, Trump said, "I think Pakistan and India are going to live very nicely together,' prompting Sharif to respond with a chuckle.

Earlier, Trump praised Sharif and Pakistan's army chief, General Asim Munir, whom he called his "favourite field marshal." He invited Sharif to speak, during which the Pakistani leader credited Trump's "untiring and relentless efforts" for achieving peace in the Middle East.

Sharif also announced Pakistan had nominated Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize for his role in stopping the war between India and Pakistan and brokering the Gaza ceasefire. He expressed interest in nomi $nating \, Trump \, again \, for \, saving \, millions \, of \, \, lives \, across$ South Asia and the Middle East.

Trump, who previously claimed credit for resolving seven conflicts including the India-Pakistan dispute, now asserts he has helped settle eight, adding the Israel-Gaza conflict to his tally.

Since May 10, when Trump announced a "full and immediate" ceasefire between India and Pakistan following US mediation, he has frequently asserted his role in ending the hostilities. However, India has maintained that the ceasefire understanding was



reached through direct talks between military

The ceasefire followed India's Operation Sindoor, launched on May 7 to target terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir after a deadly attack in Pahalgam. The truce brought an end to four days of cross-border drone and missile strikes

Pakistan on High Alert After Fierce Border **Clashes with Afghanistan**

Pakistani troops remain on high alert along the 2,600km border with Afghanistan following intense fighting over the weekend that left dozens dead. The clashes between Afghan and Pakistani security forces have heightened tensions and disrupted cross-border trade, with Pakistan closing several border crossings.

The weekend violence saw heavy exchanges of fire, drawing the attention of US President Donald Trump, who expressed willingness to assist in ending the conflict. The fighting led to the closure of key trade routes, leaving scores of loaded goods vehicles stranded on both sides of the frontier.

A Pakistani industry representative confirmed that the border closures have halted vital trade between the two neighbours, impacting businesses and local economies dependent on cross-border commerce. The border stretches through remote mountainous terrain, making it difficult to manage security and trade effectively.

The border closure has also affected Afghan refugees, many of whom were seen waiting at camps near the closed crossings, unsure when they would be able to return home or continue their journeys.

This latest flare-up adds to the ongoing instability in the region, where disputes over border demarcations and security concerns have frequently sparked clashes. Both countries have accused each other of violating sovereignty and escalating tensions.

Authorities on both sides have called for calm and dialogue, but the situation remains fragile. The conflict threatens to worsen an already volatile relationship between Pakistan and Afghanistan, with potential regional

As of Monday, no immediate resolution has been reached, and the border remains sealed. The international community, including the United States, continues to monitor the situation closely, hoping to mediate peace and restore stability in the region.

Amazon Fires Employee Over Protest Against Israel Ties

Amazon has terminated Ahmed Shahrour, a 29-year-old Palestinian engineer working for its Whole Foods Market unit, following his protests against the company's business ties with Israel. Shahrour was fired on Monday for violating company policies, including making statements deemed to "threaten, intimidate, coerce or interfere with" senior leaders and colleagues, according to an internal email obtained by Bloomberg.

Last month, Shahrour was suspended after posting messages in corporate Slack chat rooms criticizing Amazon's involvement with the Israeli government. He further protested by distributing fliers at Amazon's Seattle headquarters. In one message to colleagues, Shahrour stated, "Amazon is not a neutral observer. We are active participants," highlighting his concerns about the company's role.

Amazon confirmed it does not tolerate discrimination, harassment, or threatening behavior in the workplace and takes necessary action when such conduct is reported. Spokesperson Brad Glasser said, "We investigate and take appropriate action based on our findings."

The controversy surrounds Amazon's participation in Project Nimbus, a contract through which it, along with Google's parent company Alphabet Inc., pro-

vides cloud computing services to Israeli government and military agencies. This involvement has sparked protests amid the recent conflict in Gaza, where thousands died before a ceasefire.

Shahrour has also been involved in protests targeting other tech giants. In August, he was one of seven current and former tech employees who staged a sit-in at Microsoft President Brad Smith's office, demanding the company halt its sales to Israel. The protesters were arrested but later released. Following public pressure, Microsoft restricted some of its software

usage by an Israeli military unit.

The firing of Shahrour underscores growing tensions within the tech industry over corporate contracts linked to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and the challenges companies face balancing business interests with employee activism.

GST Annual Return Filing for FY25 Begins: Key Rules, **Turnover Limits, and Compliance Tips**



The GST portal has officially opened the window for filing the GSTR-9 annual return and GSTR-9C reconciliation statement for the financial year 2024-25. These filings are mandatory for all taxpayers registered under GST and provide a comprehensive summary of the year's tax transactions, including outward and inward supplies, tax paid, and input tax credit claimed.

GSTR-9 must be filed annually, consolidating all monthly or quarterly GST returns filed during the year. GSTR-9C, applicable to taxpayers whose

prescribed limit, serves as a reconciliation statement and requires certification by a Chartered Accountant or Cost Accountant.

According to Prabhat Ranjan, Senior Director at Nexdigm, while most taxpayers are familiar with GSTR-9 and 9C filings, this year's filing comes with new disclosure requirements and stricter validations on the GST portal. He urged taxpayers to be meticulous while filing to avoid errors and potential penalties.

Important Points to

Deadline: The last date for filing GSTR-9 and GSTR-9C for FY25 is December 31, 2025. Taxpayers are advised not to wait for any extensions, as no grace period is expected this year, unlike previous years when extensions were sometimes granted due to technical glitches.

Turnover Limits: GSTR-9C filing is mandatory for taxpayers with a turnover exceeding the threshold specified by the government, usually above 5 crore.

Compliance Tips: Early preparation, accurate

reconciliation of data with annual financial statements, and crossverification of input tax credit claims are essential for smooth filing.

The GST portal now enforces stricter validations to minimize discrepancies and improve compliance. Taxpayers should ensure their returns for the entire financial year are correctly filed before attempting the annual return.

With the financial year-end approaching, businesses are urged to prioritize GST annual return filing to avoid lastminute rush and

Tata Motors Shares Fall 40% After Demerger



Shares of Tata Motors opened nearly 40% lower on Tuesday, triggering concern among investors. However, the company clarified that the sharp fall is a technical adjustment following the demerger of its commercial vehi-

The stock opened at 399, significantly down from Monday's close of 660.90, bringing the company's market capitalisation to around 1.45 lakh crore. Despite the steep fall, the move does not reflect any erosion in investor wealth, but rather a realignment due to the demerger.

As part of the restructuring, shareholders as of the record date (October 14) will receive one share

WPI Inflation Eases to 0.13% in September on Lower Food and Fuel Prices

India's Wholesale Price Index (WPI)-based inflation cooled to 0.13% in September 2025, marking a steady decline from 0.52% in August and a significant drop compared to 1.91% in September 2024, according to data released by the

government on Tuesday. The moderation in wholesale inflation was primarily driven by a decline in prices of food articles, fuel, and manufactured goods, offering some relief amid persistent concerns over inflationary pressures in the economy.

Analysts noted that softening prices in key segments — including vegetables, cereals, and cooking gas — played a major role in easing WPI inflation for the month. Crude petroleum prices also remained relatively stable, further contributing to the lower overall

index. The data suggests that supply-side pressures have started to ease, especially in the food and energy sectors, after months of volatility caused by global disruptions and erratic monsoon patterns.

"The decline in WPI inflation reflects improving supply chains and a drop in global commodity prices. This is a positive sign for producers and industries dependent on wholesale inputs," said an economist with a leading financial services firm. The continued moderation in WPI also bodes well for overall inflation management, as it may eventually translate into lower retail inflation (CPI) in the coming months. However, experts caution that external risks, including

global oil price fluctua-

tions and geopolitical tensions, remain poten-

tial challenges WPI inflation had been volatile over the past year, touching negative territory for several months before turning positive in recent readings. The September figure reinforces a trend of moderation, which may provide additional space for the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to maintain a balanced monetary policy approach.



In what appears to be an unexpected slip-up, actor-director Pradeep Ranganathan may have just confirmed the long-rumored title of Prabhas' upcoming film with Sita Ramam director Hanu Raghavapudi. While promoting his own film Dude at a Chennai event, Ranganathan casually mentioned the title Fauji, referring to the Prabhas-starrer being produced by Mythri Movie Makers.

Prabhas' film with Hanu Raghavapudi is a big-budget action drama set in the pre-Independence era. The film is currently under production, with popular social media star Imanvi playing the female lead. Despite ongoing speculation in media circles, the makers have not yet officially revealed the film's title.

However, during the Dude event, Pradeep Ranganathan said, "I don't know if I can say this or not, but my producers have shown me a few clippings of Prabhas sir's Fauji. Naveen sir and Ravi sir are among the most passionate producers I have ever seen. It will come out, and you will all witness it. What I have seen is extraordinary. Did I make a mistake by revealing? (laughs)."

The candid comment has since gone viral, with fans and media outlets treating it as an unofficial confirmation of the title. Though there has been no word yet from Mythri Movie Makers, this unintentional reveal has fueled fresh excitement around the film.
