Australia Lifts Ban on Unpeeled Indian Prawns: Lokesh Hails Breakthrough for Seafood Exporters.

ijayawada, Oct 21: SvdnevIn a landmark decision for India's seafood sector, Australia has lifted its longstanding ban on the import of unpeeled Indian prawns, reopening a crucial market that was closed for years due to biosecurity concerns. Announced during Andhra Pradesh Minister for IT, HRD and RTGS Nara Lokesh's visit to Australia, the move is being hailed as a major breakthrough that promises to boost India's aquaculture exports and revitalise the livelihoods of coastal



farmers across Andhra Pradesh. Australia had im-

posed the restriction years ago following the detection of the white spot virus in earlier shipments of unpeeled

prawns from India. The ban hampered the growth of India's seafood export industry, already under pressure from increased tariffs and market access barriers in the United

States. Andhra Pradesh, which contributes nearly 60-80 per cent of India's seafood exports worth over ₹66,000 crore annually,

Following the complaints, Pawan Kalyan is said to have contacted the West Godavari District Superintendent of Police (SP) directly. He enquired about the DSP's alleged misconduct and instructed the SP to submit a detailed report explaining Jayasurya's actions and past conduct.

The Deputy CM em-

phasized that the government will not tolerate any misuse of power or behaviour that damages the credibility of the police force.Further, Pawan Kalyan directed his office officials to inform both the State Home Minister and the Director General of Police (DGP) about the allegations raised against the Bhimavaram DSP. He reportedly made it clear that immediate internal inquiry procedures should be initiated to verify the truth behind the accusations.

Officials have been advised to ensure transparency and fairness during the investigation Political circles in West Godavari have reacted strongly to the development. Local NDA leaders have welcomed Pawan Kalyan's swift action, saying it reflects his commitment to good governance and accountability within the police administration. They noted that illegal gambling has been a recurring issue in several coastal towns, often operating under political or administrative protection.

Sources at the Home Department said that the Deputy CM's directives demonstrate the government's renewed emphasis on maintaining discipline within law enforcement agencies. A preliminary report from the district SP is expected within the next few days. Appropriate action against the DSP will depend on the findings of that report.

Announcing the development on X (formerly Twitter), Minister Lokesh said, "A long-standing hurdle for Indian seafood exporters has been Australia's restrictions on unpeeled prawns due to white spot virus detection. Today, the first import approval for Indian prawns has been granted." He expressed deep gratitude to both the Indian and Australian governments for their coordinated efforts to reopen the trade channel. The decision is expected to create substantial opportunities for Indian exporters and aquaculture workers, especially in coastal districts such as Godavari, Nellore, and Krishna.

With this lifting, a conditional approval has been granted initially for two years, valid until October 2027, subject to strict sanitary compliance and inspection protocols set by Australia's Department of Agriculture. Fisheries and ForLokesh held extensive deliberations with Seafood Industry Australia (SIA) leadership, including CEO Veronica Papacosta and Engagement Manager Jasmin Kelleher.

The discussions focused on strengthening trade ties, improving sustainability in aquaculture practices, and exploring collaborative ventures in seafood marketing and value addition. He noted that Australia had developed a strong seafood brand identity "Great Australian Seafood" and suggested that India and Andhra Pradesh could adopt similar branding efforts to enhance market reach.

Welcoming Australia's decision, Lokesh emphasized the importance of diversifying India's seafood export markets to reduce dependency on a single country. "We should continue to open new markets to de-risk ourselves from too much dependence on one market," he remarked, referhave adversely affected Andhra's aqua industry. Industry experts believe this policy reversal will not only reinvigorate exports but also encourage new investments in India's seafood processing, packaging, and logistics infrastructure.

It could restore confidence among shrimp and prawn farmers, creating thousands of new employment opportunities along the coastal belt. As part of his Australian tour, Lokesh has also been promoting the upcoming CII Partnership Summit in Visakhapatnam, highlighting Andhra's potential as a global aquaculture hub. "This is a victory for India's seafood exporters and Andhra's farmers who have been waiting for this opportunity," Lokesh said. The agreement, he added, marks the start of a new chapter in Indo-Australian trade cooperation one rooted in trust, biosecurity, and mutual prosperity.

tion reportedly escalated into a serious feud culminating in the fatal incident. Rejecting any insinuations of castebased violence, the victim's family and pun-

Home Minister stressed that justice will be delivered irrespective of social background. "To ensure justice for the ishment for the guilty, caste or community will never be considered a factor," she asserted. warning that the government would not tolerate any attempt to incite caste tensions.

She commended the police for their prompt action, stating that officers responded immediately after the incident and apprehended the accused within hours. The Home Minister said Chief Minister Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy had held a detailed discussion with top offi-

cials soon after being informed of the case and directed them to take decisive measures to ensure speedy justice. Anitha announced that the government would prosecute the accused through a Fast-Track Court to deliver punishment at the earli-

est possible time. She added that mechanisms are being strengthened to prevent the recurrence of such violent incidents across the state, emphasizing continuous monitoring and better coordination between law enforcement agencies. Advanced Infrastructure and Technology

Each new center will operate with state-of-theart equipment, including five advanced dialysis machines and dedicated reverse osmosis (RO) water plants to ensure pure water supply for treatments. The facilities are designed to conduct

three sessions daily, accommodating approximately 15 patients per day at each location. The centers will be established under the Pradhan Mantri National Dialysis Programme (PMNDP), with each facility receiving an investment of approximately ₹75 lakh for equipment and infrastructure. This substantial investment demonstrates the government's dedication to providing quality healthcare services to rural and semiurban populations.

Public-Private Partnership Model

Two centers in S Kota

and Seethampeta are already operational, with their management transferred to private organizations under the Public-Private Partnership (PPP) model. The Andhra Pradesh Medical Services and Infrastructure Development Corporation (APMSIDC) has been instructed to invite tenders for operating the remaining five centers through similar partnerships.Currently, 173 of the existing 232 dialysis centers operate under the PPP model through the Dr NTR Vaidya Seva Trust, including 153 located in private hospitals. This collaborative approach ensures efficient service delivery while maintaining government oversight of quality standards.

Significant Impact on Patient Care

Minister Satya Kumar highlighted that these new centers would eliminate the need for patients to travel long distances for dialysis treatment. ensuring timely medical intervention and reducing health complications. The strategic placement of centers across different districts will provide better geographic coverage and accessibility.During the 2024-25 financial year, the state conducted an impressive 10.62 lakh di-

alysis sessions through

the NTR Trust, while an additional 4.95 lakh sessions were performed in 59 centers under PMN-DP. These statistics reflect the high demand for dialysis services and justify the expansion initiative.

Financial Commitment

The coalition government allocated ₹164 crore for free dialysis services in the previous fiscal year, with ₹110 crore channeled through the NTR Trust and ₹54 crore under PMNDP. This substantial financial commitment has benefited thousands of economically disadvantaged kidney patients across Andhra Pradesh. The establishment of these sevrepresents a significant step toward achieving universal healthcare access in Andhra Pradesh. By combining advanced technology, strategic location planning, and the proven PPP model, the government aims to provide comprehensive kidney care services to citizens while reducing the financial burden on patients and their families. This healthcare infrastructure expansion aligns with the state's broader vision of ensuring quality medical services reach every corner of Andhra Pradesh, particularly benefiting rural populations who previously faced challenges accessing specialized treatments.

CYBER CRIMINAL FOOLED

Cyber **Fraudsters Foiled: Trader Outsmarts Scammers in Bapatla**

TPN BUREAU, Bapa tla, Oct 21: A cunning cyber fraud attempt was smartly foiled by a smalltime trader who kept his composure and saw through a sophisticated scam in Bapatla district. The incident, which recently came to light, stands as a strong rem inder to the public about the growing menace of cybercrime and the importance of alertness in dealing with unknown phone calls. According to sources, Srinivas Rao, a small businessman from a nearby village, received a shocking phone call one evening. The caller introduced himself as an

officer from a police station in Bengaluru. In a stern tone, the caller informed Srinivas that his daughter who indeed works as a software engineer in Bengaluru was currently under police custody.

The voice on the other end claimed that she was involved in a criminal case and could be relea sed only if a payment of 5 lakh was made imme diately via an online tra nsfer.The scam was carefully designed, as the fraudsters had alrea dy collected enough back ground information abo ut Srinivas and his daug hter to make the call sound authentic. They even mentioned her workplace details and other personal informa tion to make the situat ion appear legitimate.

However, unknowingly to them, Srinivas daughter had returned home for the Deepavali



holidays and was safe right there in front of him.As soon as Srinivas demand, he realized it was a fraudulent call. The impostors tried to create panic and urgency

common tactics in cyber extortion cases. Pretend ing to play along, Sriniva s firmly replied that he

knew their game and threatened to file a police case against them. Emba rrassed and caught off

guard, the scammer immediately disconnect ed the call.

Had his daughter truly been in Bengaluru at that moment, the panic and confusion could have been disastrous for the family. But her presence at home preven ted the con from succeedi ng and possibly saved Srinivas from losing a large amount of money. The incident quickly spr ead across the neigh borhood, prompting awareness about similar cyber traps.Responding to inquiries, Bapatla Sub-Inspector Bhargav confirmed the report and praised Srinivas for his presence of mind.

He warned residents to remain extremely cautious while dealing with calls from unknown numbers, especially those claiming to repres ent authorities. "Cyber criminals are becoming more creative by impers onating police officers,

government officials, or even bank executives,' the SI said. "Never share personal or bank details over the phone. If you receive any suspicious or threatening call, inform your nearest police station immediately.

Bhargav further ad ded that police departm ents across Andhra Pra desh and Karnataka have been coordinating to track such cybercri minal networks. Most of these scams originate from call centers operat ing illegally across differ ent states and target unsuspecting citizens using fake caller IDs and forged credentials.The Bapatla incident thus serves as both a warning and a lesson in digital caution. In an era where online fraud is spreading rapidly, vigilance, awa reness, and immediate reporting remain the strongest shields against

YSRCP SLAMS TDP FOR **RESTRAINING AROGYASRI**

YSRCP Accuses TDP Govt of Deliberately Destroying Aarogyasri Scheme

TPN / Vijayawada Oct 21: The YSR Congress Pa rty (YSRCP) has launch ed a fierce attack on the TDP-led coalition govern ment, alleging that it is deliberately dismantling the Aarogyasri health scheme one of Andhra Pradesh's most vital lifelines for the poor. YSRCP State Medical Wing Vice President and State Executive Comm ittee Member Dr. Mehab oob Shaik accused the government of neglectin g the healthcare needs of millions of underprivil eged citizens and pushin g network hospitals towa rds financial breakdown. Addressing the media in

Vijayawada on Tuesday, Dr. Mehaboob expressed deep concern over what he termed as the "worst crisis" in the 19-year hist ory of Aarogyasri.

He stated that never before have empaneled hospitals faced such severe distress and alle ged that Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu's administration has shown "complete indiffe rence" towards the state 's healthcare obligations. "For the first time since the scheme's inception, hospitals that treat the poor are staging protests for their pending dues. It is shameful that a government which has borrowed over 2 lakh crore in just 16 months has failed to release even 3,000 crore for Aarogy asri," Dr. Mehaboob said. He emphasized that this apathy has crippled netw ork hospitals, disrupted services, and placed immense hards hip on

poor patients who depen

d on the scheme for free

treatment. Dr. Mehaboob further questioned the governm ent's priorities, pointing out that despite spending nearly 5,000 crore, it has failed to complete constr uction of ten promised government medical colleges. He alleged that the coalition is delibera tely weakening public health institutions while plotting to replace the Aarogyasri model with a private insurance-based alternative a move that he said would steer heal thcare away from the needy.

Recalling a similar attempt by the previous TDP government betwe en 2014 and 2019 to subst itute Aarogyasri with an insurance scheme, he warned that repeating such a mistake would have disastrous consequ ences for the state's medical sector. "The government's selfish and anti-poor policies have



already left millions without proper medical care. Hospitals and medical staff are on the verge of collapse," he stated. Dr. Mehaboob demanded immediate clearance of the 2–5 cro re in dues owed to each network hospital and urged the government to

hold consultations with hospital managements to restore Aarogyasri in its original, people-oriented form. He warned that continued neglect of the scheme would not only expose the government's failures but also carry serious political repercu ssions for the coalition.

He urged the state government to ensure that officers posted in sensitive areas like Tadipatri possess both administrative discipl ine and cultural sensitivi ty toward local commun ities. Munir, a deeply ideological army chief and a Hafiz-e-Qura n, is seen now not just as the power behind the th rone, but effectively sha ring it. His presence alon gside the elected PM in multiple foreign visits— Tianjin, Riyadh, Doha, and now this high-visi bility moment in the U. S.—shows how far civ ilian authority has been

sidelined in Islamabad. For India, this photog raph is not cause for desp air but a reality check. Trump's engagement wi th Munir does not sugge st the U.S. is abandoning India, but that it still sees strategic utility in Pakis tan as a pliable military client. Since 1954, when Pakistan joined SEATO, it has served that role. De spite being out of favor post-Osama bin Laden, it was never dropped from the list of Major Non-NATO allies—a status India never held nor

sought. The U.S. values India's

rising power but knows New Delhi will never be a client state. That limits the transactional, contr ol-based engagem ent Washington often prefe rs. Meanwhile, Pakist an's military remains its most reliable interloc

Munir's presence also represents a renewed extremism in Pakistan's military leadership. He is not just another gene ral—he believes in the eventual disintegration of India and views the

India Tops Innovation Efficiency, But Job Growth Lags Behind



India has emerged as the global leader in the Innovation Efficien cy Index, as per the latest report from the World Intellectual **Property Organisation** (WIPO). This index highlights how effec tively a country conve rts innovation inputs such as funding, infrastructure, and talent — into tangible outcomes like patents, startups, and research breakthroughs.

However, despite th is remarkable efficie ncy, India ranks only 38th in WIPO's Global Innovation Index (GII). The top five countries

 Switzerland, Swe den, the United States. South Korea, and Sin gapore — dominate the GII largely due to their heavy investments in R&D and high per capita resource inputs. China stands at 10th

position. This contrast raises important questions about how innovation is measured and what it means for real

economic progress, especially in a country like India where empl ovment remains a criti cal concern.

While innovation is vital, job creation must remain central to deve lopment. High GDP growth rates often mask the reality that millions remain unem ployed or underem plo yed. India's innovation model — efficient, fru gal, and outcome-orie nted — should ideally lead to widespread economic participat ion. But that isn't alwa vs the case.

Many of the global indices reward resour ce-intensive innovat ion models, favoring countries that pour billions into research labs, defense tech, or biotech. India's approa ch, born out of necessit y, is more inclusive and grassroots-driven, ofte n leveraging local kno wledge and cost-effecti ve technologies. Howe ver, such efforts don't always translate into high global rankings, even when they have meaningful domestic impact.

What matters more. however, is whether innovation leads to bet ter lives — especially through livelihood generation. Startups, MSMEs, and rural entrepreneurs must become the focus of policy if India wants innovation to translate into employment and equitable growth.

To truly reflect prog ress, we need to rethi nk global innovation benchmarks. The real measure of growth is not just GDP or patent s, but how many good jobs are created, how many lives are impro ved, and how inclusive the economic outcom

India's innovation story is promising. Now, it must be aligned with its most pressing need — jobs for its vast young population. The next frontier of inno vation policy must focus not only on effici ency, but also on emplo yment impact.

Netanyahu Slams West Over Palestinian Statehood at UN

Israeli Prime Mini ster Benjamin Netany ahu delivered a fiery speech at the Un ited Nations General Asse mbly on Friday, fiercely condemning Western nations that recently recognized Palestinian statehood. Calling out countries like France, Britain, Australia, Canada, and others, Netanyahu accused them of caving under pressure from activists, biased media, and anti-Israel sent iment.

"These leaders reco gnized a Palestinian state unconditionally, even after the horrors of October 7," Netan yahu said, referencing the Hamas-led attack that killed approxima tely 1,200 Israelis, acco rding to Israeli figures. "This is a reward to ter rorism," he added, acc using 90% of Palest inians of praising the

Despite facing an international arrest warrant from the Inter national Criminal Cou rt for alleged war crim es in Gaza—a charge Israel rejects—Netan yahu defiantly address ed the global assembly. As he began speaking, scores of delegates walked out, while othe rs in the balcony gave him a standing ovation. Netanyahu used the



platform to reject allegations of genocide in Gaza and reiterated that Israel would not accept a Palestinian state. "There will be no Palestinian state. Not now. Not after what happened. Never," he declared.

Over 65,000 people have reportedly died in Gaza since Israel launched its military response to the October 7 attack, leaving the region in ruins. As international criticism intensifies, so has pressure from within Israel—particularly fro m families of hostages still held by Hamas.

Speaking in Hebrew, Netanyahu addressed the hostages directly: "We've not forgotten you—not even for a

His speech followed a wave of support for Palestinian statehood from several Western and Arab nations, with Palestinian President Mahmoud Abbas than king them in a video address. Abbas called Israel's actions "a war of genocide" and pled ged the Palestinian Au thority's readiness to govern Gaza post-war.

Despite Netanyahu's hardline stance, U.S. President Donald Trump—who spoke with him by phone and is set to host him at the White House—warned against Israel annexing the West Bank. "It's not going to happen," Tru mp said. With deepening

divisions and a fragile Israeli coalition, Netan yahu's speech reaffirm ed his hard stance on Hamas and Palestinian statehood, setting the stage for a tense meet ing with Trump and a volatile geopolitical landscape ahead.



Trump's TikTok Deal Raises More Questions Than Answers

after President Donald Trump first called for a ban on TikTok over natio nal security concerns, the app remains at the center of geopolitical tensions between the U.S. and China. While Trump is celebrating a deal that keeps TikTok operating in the U.S., the details suggest that Beijing may have walked away with far more than Washington bargained

The deal, reportedly valued at \$14 billion, allo ws a U.S. investor conso rtium to acquire TikT ok's American operat ions. However, ByteDa nce will retain ownership of TikTok's powerful algorithm, licensing a

More than five years version of it to the U.S. buyers. This arrange ment raises concerns over whether the core issue — eliminat ing Chinese influence — has truly been addressed.

> Chinese officials, who once drew a hard line ag ainst giving up TikTok's "secret sauce," have changed tone publicly. State-backed media now call the deal a "win-win." But according to veteran observers, in China's lexicon, that often means 'China wins twice.'

While the U.S. claims a legal victory and avoids shutting down a platform with 170 million America n users, Beijing appears to have used TikTok as a bargaining chip to push broader trade and invest ment negotiations forw ard. Xinhua reports indicate the agreement also includes a framew ork to reduce investment barriers and improve U.S.-China economic coo peration — suggesting concessions were made elsewhere.

President Trump, who once campaigned on banning the app, now credits TikTok for help ing him reach younger voters. Despite four deadline extensions and a brief shutdown earlier this year, Trump ensured the app returned, calling it "saved" under his leadership.

Tamil Nadu is expected to bear the brunt of the system with widespread intense downpours along its coastal districts. The Regional Meteorological Centre (RMC), Chennai, has issued orange and yellow alerts for several regions through the week. Thangachimadam in Ramanathapuram district has already recorded the highest rainfall so far.

Delhi Sees Spike in Burn **Injuries After Diwali Celebrations**



TPN Correspondent | Delhi Hospitals across Delhi reported a significant rise in burn injuries following Diwali celebrations, with dozens of people injured due to firecracker-related accidents.

Data from the Department of Plastic, Reconstructive, and Burns Surgery at AIIMS revealed that 60 burn cases were recorded between October 19 and 21, including 33 cases on Diwali night alone. Most of the injured were between 10 and 40 years of

Among these, 29 patients required hospitalisation, with 10 admitted to the ICU.

Alarmingly, 11 patients suffered life- or limbthreatening injuries, while 13 cases involved partial or complete loss of fingers or limbs. Additionally, 16 patients reported eye injuries, including three with damage to both eyes.

No deaths were reported during the

At Dr Ram Manohar Lohia (RML) Hospital, 10 patients were admitted on Diwali for burn injuries, while 68 others visited the OPD with minor burn-related complaints. According to Dr Pulin Gupta, Director of Medicine at RML, one patient remains in critical condition and two celebrations.

The youngest patient treated was 1 year and 6 months old, while the oldest was 52, Dr Gupta added.

Napoleonic Jewels Stolen From Louvre In Paris In **Daring Sunday Heist**

In a brazen daylight robbery, priceless Napoleonic-era jewels were stolen from Paris's iconic Louvre Museum on Sunday. prompting an emergency closure and a fullscale investigation.

The heist occurred around 9:30 am, with thieves using a hydraulic ladder to gain access through the under-construction Seine-facing side of the building. Once inside, they targeted the Apollo Gallery — home to a selection of the French Crown Jewels — and executed the theft in just seven minutes, according to France's Interior Minister Laurent Nunez.

The robbers reportedly used a disc cutter to slice through the gallery's windowpanes, suggesting thorough prior planning and possible surveillance of the museum's layout and security systems. Nine pieces from the "Napoleon and the Empress" collection were stolen, though one jewel was later discovered abandoned just outside the museum.

The Louvre, the world's most visited museum and home to over 33,000 historical artefacts including the Mona Lisa, Venus de Milo, and Winged Victory of Samothrace. cited "exceptional reasons" for its sudden closure on Sunday. Crowds gathered outside were met with barricades and heavy police presence, while traffic in area was regulated.

France's Culture Minister Rachida Dati confirmed the robbery and said no injuries were reported. She visited the scene alongside museum officials and police. The Paris prosecutor's office has launched an investigation to assess the damage and identify the

The Louvre has a long history of thefts, most famously the 1911 theft of the Mona Lisa by Vincenzo Peruggia, a former worker, who smuggled it out under his coat. It was recovered two years later in Florence.

As authorities work to track down the missing jewels, the daring heist has once again raised questions about the security of the world's most treasured

Trump Eyes 'Fantastic Deal' with Xi Amid **China Tensions**



U.S. President Donald Trump on Monday expressed confidence in securing a "fantastic deal" with Chinese President Xi Jinping during their upcoming meeting later this month at the Asia-Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) summit. Trump's remarks signal a potential thaw in U.S.-China relations after months of growing tensions.

Speaking at a White House event alongside Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, Trump emphasized that the U.S. holds "great respect" from China and is in a strong position to negotiate. "We're going to make a fantastic deal. They respect us. They know we're serious," Trump said.

The comments come just days after Beijing escalated trade tensions by expanding export controls on rare earth materials — critical components used in everything from smartphones and electric vehicles to advanced military equipment. China's dominance in rare earth processing has long been a point of concern for the U.S.

In response, Trump highlighted the growing strategic partnership with Australia, particularly in securing alternative sources for critical minerals. The White House announced a new agreement with Australia aimed at reducing dependency on Chinese rare earths, positioning it as a key countermeasure.

The upcoming Trump-Xi meeting is expected to cover trade imbalances, intellectual property rights, and regional security issues, particularly in the Indo-Pacific. While previous negotiations have faltered under rising geopolitical friction, Trump expressed optimism that this meeting will be different.

"They want a deal. And so do we — but only a fair one," he

Analysts note that while both nations are under economic pressure, progress will depend on how far each side is willing to compromise.

The Trump-Xi meeting at APEC is shaping up to be a crucial moment in defining the future of U.S.-China relations.

Sanae Takaichi Becomes Japan's First Woman **Prime Minister**

Sanae Takaichi made history on Tuesday by becoming Japan's first female prime minister, following a surprise majority win in the first round of parliamentary voting. The 64-year-old conservative leader, known for her hawkish stance on China and admiration for Margaret Thatcher, will formally assume office after a ceremonial meeting with the emperor.

Takaichi, Japan's fifth premier in as many years, steps into the role amid political volatility. Her Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) recently lost its coalition partner Komeito, prompting a swift alliance with the right-leaning Japan Innovation Party (JIP). The new coalition remains in the minority, making legislative navigation a challenge.

A former cabinet minister and heavy metal drummer, Takaichi now leads a government with a full agenda. Her immediate tasks include preparing for a visit by U.S. President Donald Trump, finalizing a trade deal with Washington, and addressing U.S. pressure to end Russian energy imports and increase defence



Takaichi has pledged to strengthen Japan's economy and implement gender-inclusive governance, promising a cabinet with "Nordic" levels of female representation. Possible key appointments include right-wing politician Satsuki Katayama and Kimi Onoda, a half-American lawmaker.

While Takaichi aims to raise awareness of women's health issues, her stance on family laws and imperial succession remains conservative. Public reaction is mixed, with some hopeful she'll bring change for working women, while others remain cautious.

Known for past hardline remarks on China, she has recently softened her rhetoric, avoiding controversial moves like visiting the Yasukuni

Takaichi inherits a struggling economy, a shrinking population, and a fractured parliament. Her leadership will be tested immediately not just by international diplomacy but by her ability to unite a divided domestic front and revive the LDP's standing with voters.

Trump Admin Clarifies \$100K H-1B Fee Exemptions

In a much-awaited clarification, the Trump administration has specified who will be exempt from the controversial \$100,000 H-1B visa petition fee announced last month. The new guidelines, released by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) on October 20, offer significant relief to current visa holders and international students in the U.S.

The USCIS confirmed that the \$100,000 fee will not apply to individuals changing their visa status from within the U.S.—such as international students on F-1 visas transitioning to H-1B, or employees on L-1 visas seeking extensions. The rule also exempts petitions seeking extensions of stay inside the country.

However, the fee will apply to petitions filed for beneficiaries outside the U.S. or those needing consular processing, including re-entry after leaving the country prior to approval. The proclamation applies to new petitions filed on or after September 21, 2025, for applicants outside the U.S. without a valid H-1B

An official online portal has also been launched to collect the \$100,000 petition fee, as mandated by Trump's Septem-



ber 19 proclamation. While blanket waivers were ruled out, employers may request exemptions if the worker's presence serves the national interest and no U.S. worker is

available to fill the role. The policy aims to curb perceived misuse of the H-1B program, primarily used by the tech sector. Critics argue it could damage industries fac-




ing skilled labor shortages. The clarification is especially welcomed by Indian students and professionals already in the U.S., who feared being caught in bureaucratic

and financial uncertainty. This marks the administration's first direct response to growing confusion and criticism surrounding the H-1B fee announcement.









India's Power Tools Market Set to Cross \$3.8 Billion by 2035

This surge is being attributed to the mode rnisation of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), increasing industrialis ation, and strong after market demand. Moreo ging domestic manufa ver, with India's boomi

ng construction and home improvement sectors, the need for efficient and costeffective tools is only expected to grow.

Industry officials said that the DIY trend among urban consume rs, especially in metro cities, is also expandin g the market for porta ble and battery-operat ed tools. E-commerce platforms have further simplified access to such products, making them popular among younger, tech-savvy

Experts believe that sustained policy supp ort, coupled with infr astructure and indust rial growth, will trans form India into a manu facturing and export hub for power tools over the next decade.

SBI Bats for 25 bps Rate Cut **Ahead of RBI Policy Meet**

Ahead of the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) bi-monthly monetary policy announcement on October 1, a State Ba nk of India (SBI) rese arch report has reco mmended a 25 basis point (bps) rate cut, cal ling it the "best possible option" in the current economic climate.

The Monetary Policy Committee (MPC), chaired by RBI Gov ernor Sanjay Malhotra, will begin its three-day meeting on Monday, September 30, amid global economic uncert ainty, rising geopoliti cal tensions, and the rec ent 50% tariffs imposed by the US on Indian exports.

The SBI report arg ues that a modest rate cut would support dom estic growth without stoking inflation, espec



ially as headline CPI in flation remains within the RBI's comfort ran ge. "A 25 bps cut would signal proactive policy support to insulate the economy from external shocks," the report

However, several oth er economists and anal ysts expect the RBI to maintain status quo on the reporate, citing con cerns about volatile crude prices, geopoliti

cal risks, and the weak rupee. Many believe the central bank will prefer to wait and watch, espe cially as the US Federal Reserve remains hawk

India's reporate curr

ently stands at 6.50%, u nchanged since Februa ry 2023. The central ban k has maintained a "wit hdrawal of accomm odation" stance, balanc ing inflation control wit h the need to support growth.

A rate cut now, acco rding to SBI, would also help ease borrowing costs for businesses and consumers, just ahead of the festive season, potentially boosting consumption and credit demand.

The final decision will be announced by RBI on Wednesday, October 1, and will be closely watched by markets, banks, and industry stakeholders for its signal on the direction of monetary policy amid global uncertainty.

India Becomes Top Expansion Market for APAC 3PL Firms:

: India has emerged as the most-preferred expansion destination for third-party logistics (3PL) companies in the Asia-Pacific (APAC) reg ion, according to a new report released by CBRE on Sunday (September 28, 2025).

The study reveals that nearly 70% of APACbased 3PL occupiers are planning to expand their footprint in India over the next two years. This marks the highest intent for expansion among all markets surveyed in the region.

CBRE attributed this growing interest to India 's rapidly developing infrastructure, digital transformation in supply chains, and the booming e-commerce sector. Other contributing facto rs include favourable government policies under initiatives such as PM Gati Shakti and Nat ional Logistics Policy, aimed at enhancing logistics efficiency and reducing operational

"India's position as a key supply chain hub is strengthening, driven by robust demand from retail, e-commerce, man ufacturing, and FMCG sectors," said a senior CBRE analyst. "The country is now se en not only as a consump tion market but also as a strategic distribution and logistics hub."

The report also highlig hted a rise in Grade-A warehousing demand, especially in Tier-1 cities like Delhi-NCR, Mumbai, Bengaluru, and Chennai. Tier-2 cities such as Luck now, Coimbatore, and Indore are also gaining traction due to lower



costs and improving connectivity.

India's 3PL segment has seen double-digit annual growth in recent vears, supported by increasing outsourcing of logistics operations

by major industries. With rising investments in automation, cold chain facilities, and mult i-modal logistics parks, the sector is poised for sustained expansion.

CBRE expects the

Indian logistics real estate market to outperf orm its regional counter parts in the medium term, reinforcing the country's status as the logistics growth engine of APAC.

Govt to Borrow 6.77 Lakh Crore in H2, Holds Near FY26 Target



New Delhi: The central government plans to borrow 6.77 lakh crore through dated securities in the second half (H2) of fiscal year 2025–26, aiming to stay close to its full-year borrowing goal.

Having already borrow ed 7.95 lakh crore in H1, the Centre will revise the total gross market borr owing for FY26 to 14.72 lakh crore, narrowly lower than the original budgeted 14.82 lakh

The shift is designed to balance fiscal discipline with market stability. despite increasing defe nce spending pressures.

Officials say that the H2 borrowing will be conducted over 22 weekly tranches, each totaling 28,000-33,000 crore, and is scheduled to conclude by March 6, 2026. Of the total. 10,000 crore is plan ned via sovereign green

In terms of maturity

composition, the share of shorter-term papers (3–5 years) will be increa sed to 19.9% (from 15.9% while the share of longer-term papers (15-50 years) will fall from 51.8% to 43.7%. Mediumterm securities (7-10

years) will also see a rise to 36.5% from 32.4%. The Centre reaffirmed its commitment to keep ing the fiscal deficit at 4. 4% of GDP, compared to 4.8% in FY25. To manage

Plastic Pipes Industry Faces FY25 Challenges, Eyes 10-12% Growth Ahead

India's plastic pipes industry has faced significant turbulence in FY25, struggling with subdu ed infrastructure investments, tight liquidity, and volatile raw material prices, according to a report released by JM Financial. However, the industry remains optimistic about its mediumterm outlook, supported by stabilising input costs and sustained demand from key

Navigating a Tough Year

FY25 proved to be a challenging year for the sector. Plastic pipe manufacturers especially those reliant on PVC (polyvinyl chloride)—had to deal with erratic pricing patter ns. Global factors, such as slug gish construction activity in major markets like China and developed economies, combined with a supply glut from large exporters like China, South Korea, and Taiwan, led to aggres sive undercutting of prices in the Indian market. PVC, which constitutes a major input cost

for the indus try, dropped significantly over FY20-25, declining at a 4% CAG R, comp ared to its long-term growth trend of 2% CAGR over the last 25 years. After a prolon ged downtrend, prices began to recover, rising by 7/kg over the last 4-5 months to reach 79/kg in September 2025. While this remains below the FY22 peak, it marks a potential turning point for the sector.

MARKET EVOLUTION AND FUTURE DRIVERS

Traditionally fragmented and focused heavily on agriculture, India's plastic piping sector has evolved into a more organised ecosystem, addressing critical needs in water supply, plumbing, sanitation, and industrial applications. Despite current hurdles, long-term structural drivers remain intact. Government-backed pro grams like the Jal Jeevan Miss ion, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, and Housing for All are expected to

boost demand significantly, alongside growing agricultural

and replacement requirements. JM Financial estimates the Indian plastic piping market at 600–650 billion, and forecasts a 10-12% CAGR growth between FY25 and FY30.

POLICY AND REGULATORY TAILWINDS

Industry experts believe upcoming policy measures may offer additional support. The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) is expected to implement quality control norms for PVC imports by December 2025, which would restrict the influx of substandard foreign products and offer a competitive edge to domestic manufacturers. "Stabilising PVC prices should restore distributor confidence, reduce inventory risks, and aid margin recovery for organised players," the report concluded, projecting a more stable and profitable path ahead for the





NASA's Artemis 2 Moon Mission Set for 2026, Could Launch Earlier

NASA officials confirmed on September 23, 2025, that the agency's first crewed flight in its Artemis program, a mission circling the moon and returning to Earth, remains on track for April 2026, with a potential launch as early as February if conditions allow. Artemis 2 is a critical precursor to NASA's goal of landing astronauts on the moon for the first time since 1972, testing the Space Launch System (SLS) rocket and Orion capsule with a human crew aboard.

The Artemis program represents the United States' flagship lunar initiative, a multi-billion-dollar effort to return humans to the moon, coinciding with China's similar goal of a 2030 astronaut moon landing. Artemis 2 will be a 10day mission, with four astronauts flying around the moon and back, preparing for Artemis 3, the ambitious 2027 lunar landing using a Starship moon

Artemis 2 will utilize NASA's 322-foot-tall SLS rocket, developed by Boeing and Northrop Grumman, and the Orion capsule, built by Lockheed Martin. This mission marks the first time the SLS-Orion combination will carry humans. Acting senior NASA official Lakiesha Hawkins emphasized that while the mission could potentially launch earlier, astronaut safety will guide the final schedule.

The crew includes Commander Reid Wiseman, who previously flew to the International Space Station (ISS) on a Russian Soyuz in 2014; Pilot Victor Glover, a 2020 SpaceX ISS mission veteran; Mission Specialist Christina Koch, who flew to the ISS in 2019; and Canadian astronaut Jeremy Hansen, flying to space for the first time and becoming the first Canadian to travel near the moon.

Artemis 2 represents a major milestone in lunar exploration, testing systems, crew readiness, and deep-space operations ahead of the historic Artemis 3 landing. NASA continues to monitor spacecraft readiness, ensuring both safety and mission success as humanity prepares to return to the moon.

Climate Change Forces Fish to New Homes: DNA Tells the Story

Across the planet, species are on the move, with climate change forcing over 12,000 species to shift their homes across land, freshwater, and seas. In the ocean, tropical fish are moving into temperate reefs along Australia's east coast, one of the fastest-warming marine regions. New coral and fish species are arriving in Sydney's waters, and their numbers are expected to rise as the climate changes. Traditionally, researchers and citizen scientists monitor these shifts through visual surveys, but small, rare, nocturnal, or cavedwelling species are often missed, meaning the true rate of movement is likely underestimated.

Our new research, published in Diversity and Distributions, uses environmental DNA, or eDNA, to detect these hidden migrations. Fish shed mucus, scales, and waste that contain DNA. By collecting seawater and filtering it, we can extract these genetic fingerprints and identify the species present, much like forensic scientists solving a crime from hair or fingerprints. While eDNA has been used since the 1980s for microbes, its application to



larger animals and plants has transformed biodiversity

monitoring. We surveyed 2,000 kilometres of Australia's east coast, from tropical reefs to temperate kelp forests. Alongside traditional visual transects, we collected seawater for DNA analysis.

Back in the lab, filtering and sequencing the water revealed species often missed by divers. Tropical species like lined surgeonfish, striated surgeonfish, and black-blotched porcupinefish were detected in temperate ecosystems for the first time. Conversely, divers were often better at spotting temperate species, highlighting that eDNA complements rather than replaces visual surveys.

Combining eDNA with traditional methods provides the clearest view yet of how climate change is reshaping marine life. Globally, species are shifting ranges as oceans warm and currents change. Tracking these movements is essential to understand ecological transformations, anticipate which species may thrive or decline, and better manage our oceans in a rapidly changing climate.

Apple Responds to iPhone 17 'Scratchgate' Concerns



Apple has addressed growing concerns about the so-called 'scratchgate' affecting its new iPhone 17 series. Several users of the iPhone 17 Pro, iPhone 17 Pro Max, and iPhone Air have reported that their devices are

developing visible scratches, particularly around the camera island, just weeks after launch. The issue appears more pronounced in the Deep Blue, Cosmic Orange, and Space Black

Tech reviewers and users noticed that the scratches tend to form around the sharp edges of the camera bump. Popular You-Tuber JerryRigEverything suggested that the anodised aluminium layer on the iPhone 17 and iPhone 17 Pro Max "does not stick to corners very well,' potentially causing these marks. While the iPhone 17 series performed well in official durability and scratch tests, real-world usage has highlighted a vulnerability that some customers weren't expecting.

In response, Apple clarified that the scratches are not permanent and can generally be cleaned. The company emphasized that the devices remain highly durable and that normal handling might produce minor marks, which do not affect the performance or functionality of the phone. Apple reassured users that the iPhone 17's materials, including the camera housing and aluminium frame, were designed for long-term use and everyday wear, but recommended handling the devices with care to avoid scratches in vulnerable areas.

This incident highlights the challenges smartphone makers face when balancing sleek design with durability, particularly as devices increasingly feature sharp edges, large camera modules, and premium finishes Despite the 'scratchgate' reports, early reviews show that the iPhone 17 series continues to deliver strong performance, advanced features, and reliability, with Apple taking steps to address user concerns and provide guidance on keeping devices in top condition.

As the conversation around iPhone 17 scratches continues online, Apple encourages customers to report any concerns and follow care recommendations to maintain the phone's finish while enjoying its full

Quantum Entanglement Breakthrough Brings Nuclear Spin Computers Closer

Quantum entanglement famously called "spooky action at a distance" by Albert Einstein — is the key feature that makes quantum computers powerful. It allows particles to be connected in ways that enable computations impossible for classical computers, such as simulating molecules, pharmaceuticals, or catalysts. In new research published in Science, scientists have demonstrated entanglement between two atomic nuclei separated by about 20 nanometres, a breakthrough that could accelerate the development of quantum computers using nuclear spins. Quantum engineers face a

fundamental challenge: balancing the need to shield qubits from noise while allowing them to interact for computations. Many quantum hardware platforms either excel in shielding but are hard to control, or perform fast operations but are prone to errors. The team, led by Professor Andrea Morello, works with phosphorus atoms implanted in silicon

chips, using the spins of atomic nuclei to store quantum information reliably. Until now, entanglement between nuclei required them to share a single

electron, limiting scalability. The new approach uses electrons as "telephones" to enable communication between nuclei even when they are physically separated. Each electron interacts with a nucleus, and electrons interact with one another, creating entanglement between distant nuclei via a method called the "geometric gate." In the experiment, the phosphorus nuclei were 20 nanometres apart — a distance compatible with existing silicon transistor fabrication.

This breakthrough integrates long-lived nuclear spin qubits into standard silicon chips, opening the path for scalable, reliable quantum computing. The team envisions extending entanglement over even greater distances by manipulating electron shapes and positions, allowing more complex quantum circuits. This re-



search bridges electron-based quantum devices and nuclear spin qubits, bringing practical, high-fidelity quantum

computers closer to reality. By combining precision, stability, and scalability, this work marks a significant step to-

ward the next generation of quantum computing built on silicon, the backbone of today's electronics.

According to sources cited, the BCCI has demanded that Naqvi immediately return the Asia Cup trophy to the rightful hosts — India — warning that failure to comply may result in the issue being formally escalated to the International Cricket Council (ICC) during its meeting next month.

India emerged as the winner of the Asia Cup 2025, but the trophy reportedly remains in Naqvi's possession at his Dubai office, weeks after the tournament concluded. The BCCI maintains that the trophy, as per ACC protocol, should be handed over to the victorious team without delay.

"BCCI has reminded Mr. Naqvi that the trophy is not his personal possession. It belongs to the winning team and the ACC,' a senior BCCI official told NDTV on condition of anonymity. "If it is not returned promptly, we will escalate the matter to the ICC in November.'

The BCCI is reportedly preparing a formal protest to be lodged at the upcoming ICC board meeting. Officials say they view Naqvi's refusal to release the trophy as a breach of protocol and cricketing

The incident adds further strain to the already tense relations between the Indian and Pakistani cricket boards, with diplomatic challenges having impacted bilateral series and tournament hosting duties in re-

cent years. As of now, neither the PCB nor Naqvi has issued an official response to the BCCI's latest
