Cyclone Montha Nears Landfall: Andhra Pradesh on High Alert.

TPN, Amaravati, Oct 27:

oastal Andhra Pradesh is bracing for the impact of Cyclone Montha. which is rapidly intensifying over the Bay of Bengal and is expected to make landfall near Kakinada by Tuesday night. Officials from the Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA) confir med that the system, which began as a deep depression, stre ngthened into a cyclonic st orm on Monday mo rning and is likely to intensify into a severe cyclone by Tuesday.Accor ding to APSDMA Managing Director Prakhar Jain, Cyclone Montha was moving at a speed of 15 km per hour during the past six hours.

It is currently positioned about 560 km from Chennai, 620 km from Kakinada, and 650 km from Visakhapatnam. The India Meteorological Department (IMD) predicts that the cyclone will cross the coast between Machilipatnam and Kalingapatnam near Kakinada with wind speeds rang-



placed all coastal districts on high alert. The state is expected to experience heavy to very heavy rainfall accompanied by strong gales. High tidal waves and storm surges are anticipated along low-lying coastal areas.

Fishermen have been strictly advised not to venture into the sea, and all coastal activities have been suspended. Beaches have been closed to visitors, and danger signal number one has been hoisted at all major ports. The IMD has issued a red alert for seven districts on Monday and a red alert for 16 districts on Tuesday, covering ing between 90 and 110 most of the coastal belt.

been declared in 16 districts, while three districts have been placed under a yellow alert.

Authorities in Vizi-

anagaram, Anakapalle, Krishna, NTR, West Godavari, East Godavari, and Eluru districts have declared holidays for all educational institutions for three days starting Monday, as these regions began receiving moderate rain and winds up to 40 kmph since morning. Minister for Home and Disaster Management V. Anitha announced that the government had taken extensive precautionary measures to mitigate the cyclone's impact and minimize the loss of life and property. To tackle possible communication disruptions, satellite phones have been distributed to administrations in vulnerable districts.

Essential departments, including irrigation, civil supplies, medical and health services, and electricity, have been directed to stay on standby for relief and restoration operations An emergency control room has been set up by APSDMA, which can be reached through helpline numbers 112, 1070, and 18004250101. Additionally, district control rooms have been activated in all 12 coastal collectorates.

The state government has canceled all official leaves and allocated Rs

19 crore for immediate relief and rehabilitation efforts. As part of preparedness, 219 cyclone shelters have been opened across 57 coastal mandals. Nine teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and seven teams of the State Disaster Response Force (SDRF) have been deployed in coastal districts to assist in evacuation, rescue, and relief operations.

With Cyclone Montha expected to make landfall within 24 hours, authorities have urged residents to remain indoors, stay alert to official warnings, and avoid complacency during calm weather phases preceding the cyclone's full impact.



PM Assures Full Support as Cyclone Montha Nears Andhra Coast

TPN, Amaravati, Oct 27:

rime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday spo ke with Andhra Pradesh Chi ef Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu to assess the state's preparedness as severe cyclonic sto rm Montha approaches the coast. The cyclone is expected to make landfall near Kakinada on Tuesday night, packing gusty winds between 90–110 kmph and bringing extremely heavy rainfall to several coastal districts.Chief Minister Naidu, in a post on X, said, "The Honourable Prime Minister Narendra Modi called and discussed the current situation in the state due to the cy-

clone's impact. He assured us of providing assistance and support to the state. I urge all citizens to follow government instructions and take necessary pr ecautions."The Chief Minister is personally monitoring the developing situation from the Real Time Governance Society (RTGS) Centre at the Secretariat in Amaravati. He directed all departments to adopt a zero-risk approach, closely track the cyclone's movement, and ensure the safety of citizens, particularly in coastal and

low-lying areas. Minister for Real Time Governance Nara Lokesh is overseeing inter-departmental coordination,

disaster preparedness, and communication systems. He has instructed district administrations and municipal bodies to keep control rooms operational around the clock and maintain continuous communication with the Andhra Pradesh Stat e Disaster Management Authority (APS-DMA) and RTGS networks to issue timely alerts. Authorities have evacuated vulnerable populations, including pregnant women, the elderly, and residents of coa stal villages, to safer locations

A total of 260 relief

centres have been established in Kakinada district and 140 in Nellore district, stoc ked with essential supplies such as food, milk, and drinking water for up to three days. Furthermore, 364 schools have been converted into cyclone shelters, while over 14,000 schools across districts likely to be affected have been given precautionary holidays.The government has ordered the closure of all beaches, and fishermen have been strictly prohibited from venturing into the sea. A red alert has been issued for Kakinada, Konaseema, West Godavari, Krishna, Bapatla, Prakasam, and Nellore districts.To strengthen disaster response efforts, 11 teams of the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) and 12 teams of the State

Disaster Response Force (SDRF) have been deployed across the coastal belt. These teams are equipped with fire and rescue e quipment, OBM boat s, life jackets, and co mmunication gear for emergencies.

The 108 and 104 ambulance networks have been activated, and medical camps are being set up at all cyclone shelters.The RTGS war room is fu nctioning 24/7, monitoring parameters such as rainfall, wind speed, water-logging, reservoir levels, and traffic conditions. Satellite phones, V-SATs, repeaters, and wireless systems hav e been positioned to prevent communication breakdowns. Me anwhile, the electricity department has stationed restoration teams with transform ers, poles, and generators for quick respo

Rural Water Supply units have arranged tankers, chlorine tablets, and safe drinkin g water backups. Eme rgency drug stocks, boat clinics, and rapid response medical teams are on standby. To expedite relief and restoration work, the government has permitted immediate fund withdrawals under TR-27 provisions for rescue, medical care, food su pply, sanitation, and road clearance operations. Additional funds will be released to the worst-affected districts as the situation

HC Orders Detailed CID Probe Into Parakamani Case

Amaravati, October 27:

he Andhra Pra d esh High Court has ordered a detailed probe by the Crime Investigation Department (CID) into the TTD Par akamani issue, marking a major development in the ongoing controversy surroun ding alleged irregularities in the handling of temple funds. According to the court's directives, the CID will investigate the circumstances under which a theft case linked to the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams (TTD) Parakamani where temple offerings are counted was settled through the Lok Adalat.

The High Court raised serious concerns over how the case was reconciled outside the usual judicial framework and whether there was any administrative or institutional failure behind the decision. The case relates to the alleged theft of valuables from the Parakamani section, for which an individual named Ravi Kumar was accused. The Hi gh Court questioned the legitimacy of the compromise and directed the CID to investigate the entire sequence of events



leading to the settle

It further instructed the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) to conduct a comprehensive inquiry into Ravi Kumar's assets and financial transactions. Specifically, the ACB has been ordered to verify the source and nature of Ravi Kumar's properties, as well as those of his family members. The court sought clarity on whether any of these assets were tran sferred or concealed following the theft incident.

This step is intended to ensure that no illicit wealth derived from temple-related offenses remains untraced. The High Court also extended its scrutiny to TTD officials and the board members, emphasizing that their roles in facilitating or allowing the compromise must be examined. It reiterated that the sanctity of the TTD's financial systems must be preserved and that any

sion would be treated as a serious offense. The court mandated that both the CID and ACB submit their preliminary reports before the next hearing, highlighting all find ings related to property ownership, bank accounts, transaction trails, and possible misuse of authority.

This directive underscores the judiciary's insistence on tra nsparency and accountability within institutions managing religious and public funds. The investigation is expected to bring clarity to the long-standing suspicions surrounding the Parakamani operations and reestablish public confidence in the TTD's administrative discipline.By taking a firm stance on the matter, the High Court has signaled that irregularities involving institutions of faith cannot be overlooked or casually resolved through compromise settlements.

54 Indians Deported from the US for Illegal Entry via 'Dunki Route'

n a fresh instance highlighting the rising concern over illegal migration, the United States has deported 54 Indian nationals who entered the country unlawfully through what is infamously known as the "Dunki route." Despite the Trump administration's firm crackdown on illegal immigration, the inflow of migrants attempting to cross U.S. borders through unauthorized channels continues unabated. According to official sou rces, the deported Indians landed at Indira Gandhi International Airport in New Delhi, where they were received by Indian autho

Police officials confirmed that the individuals were safely handed over to their families after standard immigr ation and identity verification procedures. Preliminary inquiries revealed that most of the deportees hailed from Haryana, particu-

Be Prepared to Face Cyclone Montha: DCM Pawan Kalyan

Kakinada, Oct 27 24-hour operational (TPN): Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan has directed district officials to remain on high alert and take all precautionary measures to mitigate the impact of the approaching Cyclone Montha, which is expected to make landfall near Kakinada. The Deputy CM emphasized that the state's foremost priority is to ensure zero loss of life and effective management of the disaster. Chairing a video conference on Monday with district in-charge minister P. Narayana, Special Officer Krishna Teja, Di strict Collector S. Shan Mohan, Superintendent of Police Bindu Madhav, and other senior officials, Pawan Kalyan reviewed the preparedness measures and the likely trajectory of the cy clone. e instructed all de-

partments to maintain

readiness across the 12 mandals of Kakinada district that are likely to be affected. The Deputy Chief Minister underlined the importance of timely evacuation from vulnerable coastal areas. He specifically instructed officials to relocate residents living in lowlying and high-risk zones to safer shelters. Priority attention must be given to pregnant women, lactating mothers, the elderly, and patients with ch ronic illnesses, he said.

Adequate arrangements should be made for ambulances, emergency medical teams. and an increased number of hospital beds.As per district administration inputs, 260 rehabilitation centers have already been identified. and 142 pregnant women have been relocated to safe shelters. Pawan Kalyan directed officials to ensure that each center is adequately stocked with food, drinking water, milk, and essential medicines. He emphasized that nutritional support and healthcare services should be continuously provided to all evacuees, especially vulnerable groups.

To reinforce the disaster response mechanism, the Deputy CM ordered immediate deployment of NDRF and SDRF teams in critical locations. He also instructed officials to broadcast awareness messages in coastal villages to prevent panic and misinformation. Rescue swimmers and trained perso nnel are to be stationed near rivers, canals, and seashores to handle emergencies.Highlighting the importance of rapid communication and power restoration, Pawan Kalyan asked the energy department to



maintain standby teams to address outages and damages. He advised that satellite phones be used for coordination in

case of network failures. The police were directed to intensify patrolling in submerged and evacuated areas, ensure the

safety of vacated properties, and utilize CCTV surveillance for continuous monitoring. The Fisheries Department was instruct-

ed to strictly prohibit fishermen from venturing into the sea until further notice, while marketing officials were asked to

maintain continuous sup ply of vegetables, food grains, and essential commodities to prevent mar-

Stay Grounded as Cyclone Montha Nears Andhra Coast: Nara Lokesh



October 27, 2025: As Cyclone Montha approaches the Andhra Pradesh coastline, the state machinery has gone into high alert mode under the directions of RTGS Minister Nara Lokesh. Cha iring a high-level review meeting with senior officials, Lokesh instructed all public representatives, particularly those from vulnerable coastal constituencies, to stay in the field and respond on the ground to any emerging situation. Emphasizing the need for real-time vigilance and coordination, Minister Lokesh remarked that "every minute spe nt on the ground will matter" in safeguarding lives and ensuring swift disaster resp

The Minister urged all government departments to maintain maximum preparedness to minimize the cyclone's impact on people and infrastructure.According to the latest weather updates reviewed during the meeting, Cyclone Montha is expected to cross the Andhra coast near Kakinada. Anticipating strong winds and heavy rainfall in several coastal districts, Lokesh directed district collectors, MLAs, and local body representatives to work jointly in monitoring developments, implementing precautionary measures, and en-

hardship to citizens during the cyclone's landfall.He also appealed to cadres of the alliance parties to cooperate fully with the local administration in relief and rehabilitation operations, highlighting the importance of teamwork du ring natural cala mities

"This is not a time

for politics or complacency—this is a time for collective responsibility and prompt action." Lokesh underscored. As a preventive measure, the Minister ordered the establishment of relief camps across low-lying and coastal (Lanka) villages. These camps are to be equipped with adequate supplies of food grains, drinking water, and essential amenities to accommodate residents who may need to be evacuated. Minister Lokesh issued department-wise instructions to strengt hen preparedness me asures:Medical & Hea Ith teams are to be mobilized to prevent outbreaks of seasonal and water-borne diseases, with ambulances and medicines kept on standby for emergency

The Electricity Department has been told to minimize power disruptions and ensure rapid restoration of supply in affected areas. Telecom Operators are directed to keep communication net-

TPN | Vijayawada | suring there is no works functional to al low uninterrupted connectivity for both citizens and officials. The Irrigation and Rural Water Supply (RW S) departments have been instructed to use sandbags, pumps, and heavy machinery to safeguard bunds and swiftly drain accumulated floodwater, especially in agricultural regions at risk of inundation.

Lokesh has placed the state's Real-Time Governance Society (RTGS) control room at the centre of the disaster response. Administrators and field officers are required to maintain continuous coordination with the RTGS to enable roundthe-clock monitoring and rapid communication of updates.Appealing to citizens, the Minister urged them to stay indoors, remain calm, and follow only official advisories released through government channels. He assured that the state government is fully geared up to manage the situation.

"The government machinery is on 24×7 standby and ready to respond to any emergency. Complete preparedness and public cooperation will be crucial until the cyclone passes," Lokesh said, reaffirming the state's commitment to minimizing loss and ensuring public safety.

AP Power Utilities on High Alert

CT 27: As Cyclone 'Montha' advances toward the Andhra Pradesh coast, the State government has placed all power utilities on high alert to ensure uninterrupted electricity and swift restora tion in storm-affected areas. Chief Secretary to the Government K. Viiayanand on Monday reviewed the readiness of power utilities through a high-level teleconference, directing officials to maintain comprehensive preparedness to meet any emergency arising out of the cyclone's landfall.

Vijavanand instructed the top management of APGENCO, APTRANS CO, APSPDCL, APEPD-CL, and APCPDCL to ke ep personnel, materials, and machinery ready for deployment. He stressed the need for seamless coordination among all utilities, ensuring that power supply to hospitals, emergency shelters. and vital installations remains stable. "Men and machines must be kept

in readiness for immediate restoration once the winds ease," the Chief Secretary emphasized, advocating for proactive safety measures for both staff and the public.

All district-level control rooms have been ordered to stay functional round the clock, maintaining constant communication with the State **Emergency Operations** Centre and local administrations. Officials were directed to strengthen feeder-level monitoring, especially in coastal and low-lying areas expected to bear the brunt of the storm. The Chief Secretary also insisted that substations, transmission lines, and control centres be continuously manned, and that coordination with district collectors be maintained for efficient restoration efforts.Managing Director of APGENCO S. Nagala kshmi briefed that preparations at major thermal power plants such as Dr NTTPS, Dr MVR Ravalaseema Thermal Power Plant, and SDSTPS have been completed. Emergency backup systems including diesel generators, sump pumps, and lighting equipment have been tested and readied. Adequate coal and fuel stocks have been ensured to maintain generation continuity during the cyclone. She added that heavy machinery like JCBs and dewatering pumps are stationed on-site to tackle potential flooding, with patrolling and monitoring teams working round-t he-cl ock.Joint Managing Director of APTRANSCO G. Surya Sai Praveenchand reported that resources have been mobilized across eight coastal districts under Visakh apatnam and Vijayawada zon es. Line gangs, treecutting crews, and fault locators are strategically positioned at key substations such as Machilipatnam, Avanigadda, Gudivada, and Ongole. Emergency restoration structures (ERS towers). diesel pumps, and spare materials have been stationed at strategic points



for immediate deplo yment. CMD of APEPD-CL I. Prudhvi Tej stated that 22 control rooms have been established across coastal districts, supported by 496 teams comprising over 7,300 personnel. A buffer stock of 14,000 electric poles, 1,700 transformers, and thousands of kilometers of conductors is ready to expedite post-cyclone power restoration.Likewise, CMD of APSPDCL L. Siva Sankar reported that 147 restoration teams with 1,505 personnel have been mobilized in Nellore and Tirupati districts, supported by a reserve of 65,000 poles and 7,600 transformers.

CMD of APCPDCL L.

2,913 workers and 285 contractors, equi pped with vehicles, communication networks, and maintenance gear, are positioned across Krishna, Guntur, Bapatla, and Prakasam districts. Concluding the review, Chief Secretary Vijayanand commended the proactive measures taken by all utilities and reiterated that safety of the public and personnel must remain the top priority. TPN, KAKINADA, Oct. 27: With Cyclone M ontha expected to make landfall near Kakinada between the evening of October 28 and the early hours of October 29, district authorities are on high alert to prevent loss of life and minimize damage. Andhra Pradesh Municipal Administration and Urban **Development Minister** and Kakinada District In-Charge Dr. Ponguru Narayana has directed officials to take all possible preventive and relief measures to ensure zero casualties.

Presiding over a com prehensive review meeting with senior officials at the Vivekana nda Hall in the Kakinada Collectorate on Monday afternoon, the Minister emphasized that Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu is personally monitoring the situation and issuing necessary instructions. Narayana stated that all departments must work with complete coordination and round-theclock vigilance to pro-



tect lives, property, and crops.

The meeting was attended by District Cyclone Special Officer and Panchayati Raj Principal Secretary Krishna Teja, MPs Tangella Uday Srinivas and Ganti Harish Madhur. Rajya Sabha MP Sanna Satish, MLCs Karri Pad mashree and Perabathula Rajasek haram, MLAs Nimmakayala Chinarajappa and Vanamadi Kond ababu, DCCB Chairman Tummala Babu, Civil Supplies Corporation Chairman Thota Sudhe er, former MLA S.V.S.N. Varma, District Collector Shan Mohan Sagili, and Superintendent of Police G. Bindu Madhav, among others.

Officials informed

A total of 269 relief camps have been readied, equipped with drinking water, food, electricity, medical facilities, and mobile days' worth of essential commodities and medicines have been stocked at all centers. To prioritize vulnerable groups, pregnant women, infants, and elderly citizens have been moved to safer locations. Arou nd 142 pregnant women and new mothers have already been shifted to hospitals. Mobile medical teams, ambulances, and emergency medicine stocks are positioned across community and primary healt h centers to respond rapidly.

Disaster response teams are fully prepared. The SDRF and NDRF, together comprising 80 members, are stationed along wit h boats, trained swimmers, and rescue personnel. Additionally, fishermen have been strictly prohibited fro m venturing into the sea, and nearly 600 boa ts have been brought back to shore safely.In anticipation of power disruptions, 100 power department staff from

Rayalaseema have been deployed in Kakinada district, with 3,000 power poles kept ready for immediate replac eme

Heavy machinery, including JCBs, cranes, and tractors, have been stationed in low-lying and high-risk zones for rescue and clearance operations.Minister Narayana added that drainage systems and canals are being desilted to prevent flooding, while road obstacles are being cleared to maintain connectivity for emergency vehicles. Schools will remain closed from October 27 to 29, and over 14,000 hostel and Gurukul students have already been sent home safely.

Cautioning citizens to rely solely on official updates, Narayana appealed to the public not to spread or believe social media rumors that could cause panic. The government, IMD, and Disaster Management Department will continue issuing verified information.

Speaking at a press conference held at the local YSRCP office on Monday, Dr. Gopireddy lauded the scheme as a revolutionary initiative that brought corporate level medical care within the reach of poor families across Andhra Pradesh.

He said that even after vears since its inception, the name of the late leader Y. S. Raja sekhara Reddy remains etched in the hearts of the poor, primarily because of the Aarogyasri scheme that saved thousands of lives. The program, he explained, has been providing free treatment for about 3,007 diseases through nearly 2,000 network hospitals. "Any government may change the name of the sche me, bu t none can abolis h it. Th at is how deeply the program has reach ed the people," he asser ted.

Dr. Gopireddy further pointed out that under the leadership of former



Chief Minister Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy, the network of hospitals under the Aarogyasri scheme had expanded from 900 to 2,000. Moreover, 25 percent of the scheme's benefits were reserved for government doctors. In the five years of Jagan Mohan Reddy's tenure, around 45 lakh people underwent surgeries under Aarogyasri, with an expenditure of approxi-

mately 1,342 crore.
The coverage limit,

which was 5 lakh earlier, was raised to 25 lakh, ensuring wider access to medical care for lower-income groups.He accused the current coalition government of deliberately attempting to weaken the Aarogyasri system merely because it carries the names of Y. S. Rajase kh ara Reddy and Y. S. Jagan Mohan Reddy. This political vendetta, he alleged, has brought private network hospitals to

a state of crisis, making it difficult for them to pay staff salaries or repay loans taken for infrastructure and equip

Many hospitals are being forced to downsize due to non-payment of dues by the government, he said.Dr. Gopire ddy criticized the government for ignoring the ongoing strike by Aarogyasri network hospitals for the past 18 days and for failing to hold discus-

sions with their representatives. "The administration tried to wash its hands off the issue by releasing a meager 250 crore, leaving patients helpless and hospitals paralyzed," he remarked. As a result, many poor people are unable to afford necessary treatments and are suffering without medical help.

He further alleged that while Jagan Mohan Reddy had secured approval for 17 new medical colleges in Andhra Pradesh, the present government is attempting to sell those projects to its supporters for personal gain. "If the government harbors resen tment against Rajasekhara Reddy or Jagan Mohan Reddy, that is their political choice but why direct that anger toward the poor people's healthcare?" he questioned.

Dr. Gopireddy demanded that the government immediately hold talks with representatives of the Aarogyasri network hospitals, resolve their issues, and ensure the continuation of the scheme without disruption. He urged all governments, irrespective of their political affiliation, to treat healthcare and education as top priorities in a democratic society.

YSRCP Blames Spurious Liquor Network for Kurnool Bus Tragedy

Vijayawada, October 27: YSR Congress Party spokesperson Are Shyamala has squarely blamed the Chandrababu Naidu led coalition government for the Kurnool bus fire tragedy that claimed 20 lives, alleging that the incident stemmed from the unchecked sale of spurious liquor across Andhra Pradesh under the protection of ruling party leaders. Speaking at the YS-RCP central office, Shyamala said the biker involved in the deadly accident had consumed adulterated liquor at a belt sh op in Lakshmipuram shortly before the mishap.

TPN | Vijayawada Oct 27: Amid heavy rains and cyclone warnings affecting several regions of Andhra Pradesh, the Andhra Pradesh Private Hospitals and Nursing Homes Association (APNA) has announced its complete support to the state government and the people of the state during the ongoing emergency situation. Acting under the direct instructions from the Hon'ble Chief Minister, a high-level review meeting held through RTGS saw Special Chief Secretary (Agriculture) Budithi Rajasekhar, IAS, outline urgent, statewide safety protocols targeting crops, livestock, and vulnerable coastal settlements. Coordinated Response Across Departments-Leading a teleconference attended by officials from Agriculture, Horticulture, Animal Husbandry, Fisheries, and Agricultural Marketing, Rajasekhar pressed district teams to



quickly identify highrisk villages and ramp up field-level awareness programs.

"The focus is on taking every possible step before the cyclone makes landfall," Rajasekhar stated, stressing preemptive measures as vital to minimize

losses. Leveraging data from the advanced AP AIMS platform created by Vasarlabs, the Agriculture Department mapped cyclone-sensitive zones using predictions of wind intensity, rainfall, and crop development stages. This intelligence was promptly

relayed to Rythu Seva Kendras (RSKs) and local field extension workers, who are now actively guiding farmers on how to protect their fields and assets.

Real-Time Communication and Accountability A system of continuous outreach has been

put in place, requiring teams to stay in touch with farmers and dispense updates every three hours. This dynamic communication ecosystem uses IVRS calls to gather onground feedback from farmers for the state's RTGS unit, ensuring of-

ficials are held accountable for lapses or negligence.

Rajasekhar warned that strict disciplinary action would follow any failures by field teams to meet the standard of care.Director of Agriculture Dr. Manazir Zilani Samoon confirmed that statewide action plans had already been disseminated. In Godavari districts, agriculture teams are collaborating with the Irrigation Department to regulate canal flows and pre-empt flooding. Special squads have been deployed to clear drainage blockages, aiming to prevent water stagnation that could devastate

Monitoring and MessagingThe state has sent nearly 69 lakh alert messages to farmers, detailing crop-wise advice via text, print, and social media. Approximately 6.23 lakh acres of paddy in high-risk regions have been earmarked for in-

and the Agriculture Department has commissioned a round-the-clock control room for rapid response. Crop and Livestock ProtectionHorticulture teams, under Director Srinivasa Rao, are focused on shielding banana and vegetable crops particularly vulnerable in Konaseema and Kakinada districts. Rao's top recommendation is for farmers to tie and stake banana plants, reducing the risk of cyclone-inflicted collapse.In the fisheries sector, Director Naik reported that four fishing boats from Odisha have returned safely, and local fishermen were told to stay ashore. The department remains alert to further risks. For agricultural marketing, Director Vijaya Sunitha highlighted potential threats to cotton crops, urging immediate harvest of mature kapas to meet procurement guidelines set by the Cot-

Anand directed the officials to ensure the effective implementation of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, stressing that no negligence should be tolerated in safeguarding the rights of differently abled individuals. He chaired the district-level Differently Abled Committee meeting held at the Mini Conference Hall in the Anantapur Collectorate on Monday.

During the meeting, the Collector reviewed the implementation status of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, and the Andhra Pradesh State Disabilities Rights provisions. Addressing the officials, he stated that all government departments must strictly enforce the reservation policies and schemes meant for persons with disabilities (PwDs). The Collector instructed concerned district officers and sta-

West Godavari Braces for Cyclone MONTHA: Administration in Full Alert Mode

TPN, Bhimavaram, West Godavari October 27, 2025:

The West Godavari district administration has gone into full preparedness mode to handle the impending Cyclone MONTHA, which is expected to make landfall between Kakinada and Machilipatnam on Tuesday night. The administration has been actively coordinating precautionary measures under the guidance of State Special Chief Secretary and Special Observer for Coastal Districts on Cyclone Management, RP Sisodia.

After reviewing the district's disaster management arrangements at the Bhimavaram Collectorate on Monday, Sisodia emphasized that a robust communication system plays a pivotal role during natural calamities. He noted



tion networks can significantly minimize both human and infrastructural losses during cyclonic events. Accompanied by District Collector Ch. Nagarani, District Special Officer Prasanna Venkatesh, and Superintendent of Police Adnan Nayeem Asmi, the Special Chief Secretary chaired a detailed review meeting.

Officials discussed logistics, emergency response strategies, and resource allocation in preparation for Cyclone MONTHA, which is currently positioned

around 500 kilometers away from Kakinada. Sisodia stated that special focus has been laid on ensuring the continuous operation of communication towers across the district. To prevent network disruptions, generators have already been installed at several mobile tower sites. "Our priority is to maintain seamless communication during the cyclone as it enables quick coordination between emergency teams," he stated.

To manage possible evacuations, the district has arranged 16 rehabilitation centers and 26

permanent shelter buildings. These facilities are equipped to house evacuees safely and provide essential amenities during the cyclone period. He added that evacuation of residents from vulnerable and low-lying areas would be carried out swiftly, with particular attention given to pregnant women, children, and the elderly. They will be shifted to nearby Primary Health Centres or safe shelters before heavy winds and rainfall begin. For rapid response operations, one National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) team has been deployed at Narsapuram, while 68 JCB machines and 57 power saws are on standby to clear debris, uprooted trees, or damaged infrastructure.

The district machinery has been divided into zonal task teams to ensure quick restoration of essential services such as electricity, drinking water, and medical care if disruptions occur. Cautioning about expected wind speeds of 90 to 100 kmph, Sisodia instructed officials to remove hoardings, signage boards, and other loose structures along major roads to prevent accidents. He also directed the Superintendent of Police to impose restrictions on private vehicle movement from Tuesday evening for public safety and smooth functioning of emergency operations.

Additional police teams will monitor traf-

A Free Press Is the Soul of a Free Society

A vibrant democracy thrives when its Press functions as an autonomous institution — one that serves society freely, without bowing to governmental or political pressures. This fundamental principle, articulated in a 1960 monograph published by the Forum of Free Enterprise titled "A Free Press is Linked with Free Enterprise and a Free Society," emphasizes that press freedom is essential to the health of democracy.

The essay underscores that in a plural society, diverse ideologies and differing beliefs are natural. Hence, the Press must retain its independence to reflect these differences rather than conforming to uniform principles. It must possess a soul of its own, free from subservience, to perform its duty as a public institution rather than as an instrument of the State or any ruling party.

In liberal democracies, the essay argues, the Press serves as a forum for multiple perspectives — a platform where truth is discovered through open debate. Suppressing dissent or presenting one-sided narratives undermines democracy. "News is sacred," it asserts, meaning that journalists must present facts honestly, allowing readers to interpret and comment freely without external influence.



fusing anti-government sentiment with anti-State activity. While the government has the right to curb anti-State actions, it must not use coercive power to silence legitimate criticism. A ruling party must never assume it is synonymous with the State, nor attempt to suppress dissenting voices — a line that separates liberal democracies from totalitarian regimes.

The essay contrasts the press environments in different political systems: in a police State, subjective truths dominate; in a social service State, objective truths prevail; and in a Communist State, party truths reign supreme. Liberal democracy, the author contends, must favor objective truth, experimentation, and the free exchange of ideas.

True freedom of the Press, therefore, lies in its right to gather, publish, and interpret news independently. Journalists are not "artillery" for any political faction but servants of society, expanding public understanding. The essay concludes that a free Press cannot exist without free enterprise and a free society — for those who oppose either are, in the author's words, "the grave-diggers of the

Cuttack Violence a Blow to Odisha's Secular Fabric

Odisha

The recent outbreak of communal violence in Cuttack has dealt a severe blow to Odisha's long-standing tradition of communal harmony and secularism. What began as a festive procession during Durga Puja earlier this month escalated into a full-scale confrontation between Hindu and Muslim communities in the city's historic Dargah Bazar area.

According to official reports, nearly 40 shops — mostly belonging to members of the Muslim community — were set ablaze during the clashes. The situation prompted the local administration to impose an indefinite curfew and deploy heavy

police forces to prevent further escalation. More than a dozen individuals have been arrested in connection with the violence, while investigations are underway to determine the immediate triggers and the involvement of any organized groups.

Cuttack, known for its syncretic traditions and shared celebrations of Hindu and Muslim festivals, has rarely witnessed such communal tension in recent decades. The incident has sparked widespread concern over the erosion of Odisha's secular ethos — a value historically upheld by successive governments and its civil society.

This marks the second in-

stance of communal unrest under the current BJP government, which assumed power in 2024 after ending the two-decade-long rule of the Biju Janata Dal (BJD). The first such incident occurred in Bhadrak in September 2024, when communal clashes broke out following a social media post. Analysts note that the recurrence of such violence within a short span raises serious questions about the state government's ability to maintain peace and ensure the impartial enforcement of law and order.

Critics argue that the administration's response has been reactive rather than preventive, with little emphasis on addressing the underlying causes of mistrust between communities. Civil society organizations and religious leaders have called for an impartial probe and stronger efforts to rebuild confidence among affected residents.

As normalcy slowly returns to Cuttack, the state's leadership faces the urgent task of reaffirming its commitment to secularism and social cohesion. For a state that has prided itself on peaceful coexistence, the violence in Dargah Bazar serves as a stark reminder that communal harmony — once disrupted requires sincere and sustained efforts to restore.

All the World's a Status Update: A Satirical Take on Our Digital **Obsession**



In an age where the digital world has replaced public squares and conversations have migrated from verandas to virtual spaces. writer Suresh Chander Kumar paints a witty yet poignant portrait of our collective social media addiction in his essay All the World's a Status Update.

Opening with a humorous reflection over his morning tea, Kumar compares today's viral memes and WhatsApp forwards to the wall graffiti of yestervears — the miracle cure advertisements for baldness or heartbreak that once promised the impossible. Only now, he muses, the promises come pixelated: "Facebook, WhatsApp chhudvayein guarantee ke saath." The satire, he suggests, has survived across centuries — from chalk on walls to text on screens.

Kumar's imagination runs wild as he envisions comic despair of modern

mohallas plastered with warnings like "WhatsApp Chhodo, Jeevan Jodo!" — a tongue-in-cheek reminder of how deeply social media has infiltrated our lives. He recalls his English literature professor quoting Shakespeare's famous line, "All the world's a stage," and cleverly reimagines it for the digital era: "All the world's a status update, and all the men and women

merely contacts.' Through amusing anecdotes, the author highlights the absurdities of modern life — a cousin more eager to upload selfies than engage with relatives, and an uncle who believes anything "WhatsApp pe likha hai to sach hi hoga." In these moments, humour meets irony, exposing how technology often amplifies vanity and misinformation

Kumar also captures the

existence: a tea stall offering "Free Wi-Fi with two samosas" and a youth solemnly proclaiming, "Data hi asli daata hai." Beneath the laughter lies an undertone of helplessness — a recognition that we are willingly trapped in a world ruled by blue ticks and endless scrolling.

His concluding reflection is both tragic and tender: perhaps, someday, historians will look back and declare that "walls once meant for revolutions became billboards for memes." Until then, Kumar suggests, the only way to survive this digital circus is to laugh at our own lunacy — before even laughter, too, becomes a paid app.

A humorous yet haunting mirror to our times, Kumar's essay reminds us that in the race for relevance, humanity's greatest challenge might simply be learning to log out.

How India Is Using AI to Bridge Its Language Divide

On a busy Mumbai afternoon, a delivery rider struggling with English instructions on his app found unexpected relief when the interface suddenly began speaking in Marathi. What seemed like a small technological tweak symbolized a much larger transformation — India's ambitious push to bridge its linguistic divide using artificial intelligence.

Under the IndiaAI mission, the government is expanding the next phase of the country's digital public infrastructure to make digital services accessible to every citizen, irrespective of language. After Aadhaar revolutionized identity and UPI democratized payments, new projects like Bhashini and Bharat-GPT aim to give every Indian a digital voice in their mother tongue.

Launched in 2022, Bhashini serves as the foundation for multilingual AI. Processing over ten million translation requests daily, it makes digital content and services available in nearly all major Indian languages. Through the Bhasha Daan initiative, it is building datasets in historically underrepresented languages like Khasi, Manipuri, and Bodo. Government platforms for e-learning, healthcare, and citizen services now operate in multiple vernaculars, bringing digital inclusion to millions.

On top of this base sits Bharat-GPT, India's first sovereign large language model, developed collaboratively by Indian institutes and startups. Unlike global AI systems


trained mainly on English, Bharat-GPT is rooted in Indic datasets, making it culturally and linguistically aware. It supports voice, text, and video interactions for applications ranging from insurance helplines to ticketing services.

These tools are already transforming lives. Rural entrepreneurs can now access credit schemes in local languages, farmers can check mandi prices through AI voice assistants, and patients in remote regions can communicate with telemedicine bots for accurate

India's AI ecosystem extends beyond the state. AI4Bharat at IIT Madras is building open datasets for low-resource languages, while Sarvam AI contributes conversational models under the IndiaAI framework. International partners like Google Cloud and NVIDIA support these efforts, adhering to India's data sovereignty rules.

However, challenges persist. Expanding datasets across dialects, democratizing computing access, and building advanced AI talent remain crucial. India must invest in both technology and people to ensure inclusivity.

Globally, India's approach stands apart — pragmatic, public-driven, and rooted in diversity. By prioritizing linguistic inclusion over sheer computational power, India could not only redefine its digital landscape but also offer a replicable model for the multilingual Global

Congress Targets Modi as Trump Reiterates Claim on Russian Oil

The Congress on Sunday criticized Prime Minister Narendra Modi after U.S. **President Donald Trump re**peated claims that Ind ia is reducing its imports of Russian oil. questioning the effectiveness of Modi's diplomatic engagement at the ongoing ASEAN Summit.

Trump, en route to Malaysia for the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) Summit, told reporters that "India is cutting back completely" on the purchase of Russian oil. His remarks drew immediate attention in India and prompted political

Congress leaders took the opportunity to highlight Modi's absence from the summit in Kuala Lumpur, suggesting that the Prime Minister's "huglomacy"—a term the party used to describe his high-profile global outreach—is not visible on the international stage. Sen-

ior party leader Jairam Ramesh specifically questioned why India's top leadership was not physically present at ASEAN, implying that it undermines India's diplomatic credibility.

Prime Minister Modi addressed the ASEAN summit virtually from New Delhi, participating in discussions on

regional cooperation, economic partnerships, and global issues. While the government has maintained that India's energy and foreign policy decisions are based on national interest, Opposition leaders argued that Trump's assertion exposes a gap in India's global diplomacy.

The Congress's criticism underscores growing political debate over India's foreign policy positioning amid global energy dynamics and changing geopolitical alliances. Analysts note that the remarks come ahead of key bilateral and multilateral engagements in the Indo-Pacific region, where India is seeking to balance relations with major powers while securing energy and strategic interests.

The issue of Russian oil imports has remained sensitive, with India maintaining it pursues pragmatic energy diplomacy while ensuring compliance with international sanctions. The renewed focus by U.S. and Indian political circles highlights the intersection of domestic politics and foreign policy ahead of upcoming international summits.

TVK Chief Vijay Meets Families Of Karur Victims A Month After Stampede

Actor and Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK) Chief Vijay met the families of the Karur stampede victims on Monday, exactly a month after 41 people were killed and over 50 injured at his party rally on September 27.

The closed-door meeting, held at a private hotel in Mamallapuram, included over 200 attendees, comprising 37 families and some survivors of the tragedy. Reports indicate that four to five members from each family attended, and Vijay is expected to console them individually. Only TVK functionaries were allowed inside

the venue. The decision to bring the victims' families to Chennai instead of visiting Karur in person has drawn criticism. Party sources explained that logistical issues prevented Vijay from traveling to Karur, despite his earlier announcement to do so.

Ahead of Diwali, TVK had transferred Rs 20 lakh in relief assistance to the families of the deceased. The stampede occurred during a welfare rally in Karur, where a seven-hour delay in Vijay's arrival reportedly caused an uncontrollable surge of around 27,000 supporters, far exceeding the venue's ca-pacity of 10,000. Tamil Nadu Director

General of Police G. Venkataraman said inadequate arrangements for food and drinking water, along with the failure to heed police advice to stop 50 meters before the venue, contributed to the

TVK, however, denied any wrongdoing, attributing the delay to police mismanagement of traffic and alleging a conspiracy by the ruling DMK, which the party strongly rejected.

The youngest victim of the Karur stampede was two-year-old Dhuru Vishnu, who was at the rally with relatives. The incident sparked widespread outrage and criticism over crowd management and political rally protocols in the state.

Vijay's interaction with the families marks the party chief's first direct engagement with those affected since the tragedy, signaling an attempt to console the victims and address public concern over the catastrophic

"India Portrayed In Bad Light": Supreme Court Raps States On Stray Dogs Case

The Supreme Court on Monday reprimanded state governments for failing to submit affidavits confirming compliance with its August 22 order on the catch, neuter, and release (CNR) of stray dogs nationwide. The bench expressed frustration over repeated reports of dog attacks since the directive.

In recent incidents, a child was attacked in Pune, Maharashtra, while a young girl was bitten by a pack of 20 dogs in Bhandara district. In Kerala, a street performer in Kannur was attacked during a play about stray dogs. Uttar Pradesh's Lucknow saw a family of three bitten, and attacks were reported in Telangana's Warangal.

'Yet no reply from state governments. Your country is being portrayed badly internationally!" the court said. The bench, comprising Justices Vikram Nath, Sandeep Mehta, and NV Anjaria. demanded explanations from all states and union territories, insisting chief secretaries appear person-

ally. Only Bengal, Telangana, and the Municipal Corporation of Delhi had submitted responses, though these were delayed over Diwali. Delhi's government had not filed an affidavit, prompting sharp rebuke.

Some states have acted. Rajasthan's Department of **Autonomous Governance is**sued strict directives to

municipal bodies, mandating sterilisation, vaccination, tagging, and release of stray dogs, along with marked feeding points and coordination with welfare organisations. Noida authorities launched a survey to map and monitor stray dogs for better sterilisation and vaccination management.

In the south, the Greater Chennai Corporation vaccinated 46,122 dogs and microchipped over 12,000 by mid-September, tracking sterilisation and vaccination progress.

The court's August order amended an earlier directive, emphasizing that stray dogs must be released to their original areas poststerilisation and immunisation, except for rabid or aggressive animals, in line with existing Animal Birth Control rules. Earlier, the court had ordered the rounding up of all stray dogs in Delhi-NCR after rising attacks, but later reconsidered following protests from animal

activists. The Supreme Court's stern w arning underscores the urgency of implementing humane stray dog control measures nationwide.

Milei Wins Big in **Argentine Midterms**

Argentina's libertarian President Javier Milei secured a decisive victory in Sunday's midterm elections, strengthening his mandate to push forward his radical free-market agenda.

Milei's La Libertad Avanza party captured over 40% of the national vote, allowing it to renew nearly half of the seats in the lower house of Congress, according to local media tallies based on official electoral data, with over 97% of votes counted. The outcome gives Milei greater leverage to implement his economic reforms, which have drawn significant attention and backing from the Trump administration in the United States.

The midterm results are seen as a key vote of confidence in Milei's governance, particularly his libertarian policies that emphasize deregulation, privatization, and market-driven solutions to Argentina's long-standing economic challenges. Analysts say the win could accelerate his agenda, including proposed tax cuts, pension reforms, and efforts to attract foreign

investment.

The elections were closely watched in Washington and other global capitals, where observers are assessing the implications of Milei's growing influence in Latin America. His alignment with conservative U.S. policies and economic strategies has positioned Argentina as a focal point for international investors and policymakers interested in free-market reforms.

President Milei celebrated the victory in Buenos Aires, calling it a mandate to continue transforming Argentina's economy and reduce state intervention. Political analysts note that while the upper house remains more balanced, control of the lower house will allow Milei to more effectively push legislation aligned with his libertarian vision.

The midterm success consolidates Milei's political standing domestically and signals a period of significant policy momentum, as the administration looks to deepen economic reforms while maintaining strong international support, particularly from the

PIA Resumes UK Flights After Five-Year Ban

Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) resumed flights to the UK on Saturday, marking the end of a five-year suspension following a ban imposed over safety and licensing concerns. The first flight from Islamabad to Manchester, carrying 284 passengers, departed in a ceremony attended by Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif and senior aviation officials.

The ban had been enforced in 2020 by the European Union Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and the UK Civil Aviation Authority (CAA), following a tragic air crash in Karachi that killed around 100 passengers. The incident was compounded by revelations that a large number of Pakistani pilots held fake licences, prompting international authorities to restrict PIA's operations.

EASA lifted its ban in November 2024, while the UK removed Pakistan from its Air Safety List in July 2025, allowing Pakistani airlines to apply for flight operations to Britain once again.

Speaking at the ceremony, Defence Minister

Trump Heads to Tokyo Ahead of Xi Summit



Indian-Origin Woman Raped in "Racially Aggravated" Attack in UK



The UK Police have launched an urgent manhunt to trace a suspect following the "racially aggravated" rape of a woman of Indian origin in Walsall, West Midlands. Authorities described the attack as "absolutely appalling" and have appealed to the public for information that could help identify the perpetrator.

According to the West Midlands Police, officers were called to the Park Hall area of Walsall on Saturday evening after receiving reports of a distressed woman in her 20s. The woman, believed to be of Punjabi heritage, was found in the street and later informed police of the attack. CCTV footage of the suspect has been released as part of the ongoing investigation.

Detective Superintendent Ronan Tyrer, who is leading the probe, confirmed that the incident is being treated as a racially motivated crime. "This was an absolutely appalling attack on a young woman, and we are doing everything possible to arrest the person responsible," he said. "We have teams recovering evidence and building a profile of the attacker so that he can be brought into custody as soon as possible."

The attacker is described as a white male in his 30s, with short hair and wearing dark

Vodafone Idea Gets Supreme Court Relief on AGR Dues

Vodafone-Idea (VI) secured a significant reprieve from the Supreme Court on Monday after the government agreed to reconsider its demand for additional Adjusted Gross Revenue (AGR) dues for the financial year 2016-2017. The top court found no issue with the Centre's decision to review its claim and take a suitable action in accordance with

The hearing took place before a Bench headed by Chief Justice of India B.R. Gavai. Solicitor General Tishar Mehta, representing the Centre, highlighted that there has been a "huge change in circumstances" since the previous AGR litigation involving Vodafone-Idea. He requested the court's permission for the government to re-evaluate its demand, citing altered market and regulatory conditions.

Infosys Promoters to Skip ₹18,000 Crore Share Buyback



Infosys Ltd announced that its promoters and promoter group will not participate in the company's ₹18,000 crore share buyback program, the largest buyback the tech giant has undertaken to date. The company revealed this in a stock market filing on Wednesday, October 22,

Infosys plans to buy back 10 crore shares at an average price of ₹1.800 per share, marking its fifth buyback in the last decade. This significant move reflects the company's strong cash position and confidence in its long-term prospects.

However, the promoters — including Sudha Gopalakrishnan, wife of co-founder Kris Gopalakrishnan, who holds the largest promoter stake with 9,53,57,000 shares have chosen not to participate in this buyback exercise. The company clarified that promoter-held shares were excluded when calculating the entitlement ratio for the buyback.

This decision means that only non-promoter shareholders are eligible to tender their shares in the buyback, potentially increasing the percentage of shares bought back from the public and institutional investors.

Share buybacks are a common way for companies to return capital to shareholders, often signaling confidence in the firm's future performance and improving key financial metrics like earnings per share (EPS).

Infosys' buyback comes amid a phase of robust business performance and growth in the IT sector, with the company continuously expanding its global client base and digital services portfolio.

Market analysts view the buyback positively, suggesting it could provide support to Infosys' stock price while delivering direct returns to shareholders.

Investors will closely watch the buyback process and its impact on the stock, as well as any further corporate actions from Infosys in the near term.

The company's announcement underscores its commitment to prudent capital management while maintaining flexibility for future investments.

Indian Economy Gains Momentum Despite Global Uncertainty: FinMin

India's economy continues to show strong growth momentum despite global uncertainties, robust domestic demand, and structural reforms, according to the Finance Ministry's Monthly Economic Review for September 2025. The report, released on October 27, noted that demand across rural and urban India strengthened during the festive season and following GST reforms, boosting sales in sectors like automobiles.

The ministry highlighted that manufacturing and services sectors expanded healthily, while inflation remained under control. Retail inflation eased to 1.54% in September 2025, and core inflation, excluding food and fuel, stood at 4.6%. Price stability is expected to continue barring any adverse weather events or supply shocks.

India's real GDP growth forecast for FY26 has been revised upwards, with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) projecting 6.6% and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) expecting 6.8%, reflecting strong growth in Q1 and steady trends in Q2 FY26.

The report also credited the RBI's liquidity management and regulatory measures for supporting credit flow and ensuring effective monetary policy transmission. This included steps to strengthen banks, simplify forex management, and in-

Apple to Expand Ads in Maps App by 2026



Apple is reportedly planning to introduce more ads in its native Maps app by next year, allowing businesses such as restaurants to pay for higher visibility in search results, according to industry reports. The move marks a significant step in Apple's efforts to diversify its revenue streams and expand its advertising business beyond

the App Store. Bloomberg journalist Mark Gurman revealed in his newsletter that Apple is moving forward with its previously shelved plan to integrate search ads in Maps. These ads will appear in the search section of the app, giving businesses the opportunity to feature their information more prominently. Apple will reportedly label all promoted results as sponsored, ensuring transparency for

The tech giant is also expected to employ AIpowered tools to enhance ad targeting, prioritizing relevance and usefulness to users. The interface for Maps ads is said to be more intuitive than competing platforms, such as Google Maps, which already offers similar advertising options.

Currently, Apple allows app developers to pay for promoted slots in the App Store based on user queries. The new Maps advertising initiative is expected to follow a similar model, offering businesses the opportunity to reach users actively searching for services or locations nearby

While the plan is likely to increase Apple's advertising revenue, the company may face criticism for introducing ads in a core navigation app, which users have traditionally used without commercial interruptions. Analysts suggest that the move could be part of a broader strategy to capitalize on Apple's ecosystem and growing user base, leveraging AI to deliver highly targeted content.

Industry observers view this as Apple's attempt to catch up with Google in the locationbased advertising space while maintaining a reputation for privacy-conscious ad practices. The rollout is expected to begin in 2026, potentially transforming how users interact with Apple Maps while providing new marketing opportunities businesses.

Instagram Introduces Watch History for Reels



Instagram is rolling out a new Watch History feature that allows users to revisit Reels they've previously watched. The feature, similar to YouTube's Watch History, offers options to search, filter, and manage watched content, making it easier for users to find and rewatch their favorite videos.

Instagram head Adam Mosseri announced the feature on Threads, explaining that users can access it under Settings > Your activity > Watch history in the Profile tab. The feature will appear under the How you use Instagram section, and users can filter Reels by date, date range, or specific account.

The Watch History tool includes three tabs for organizing watched content. By default, it displays Reels from the past 30 days. Users can sort these Reels from newest to oldest or vice versa, filter by past week, past month, or all dates, and even remove specific Reels from the list if they choose.

This addition addresses a long-standing request from Instagram users who wanted a simple way to revisit previously viewed content without having to scroll endlessly through the app. It is expected to improve user experience, particularly for content creators and viewers who regularly engage with Reels.

The feature is available on both Android and iOS, with a similar interface on each platform. It integrates seamlessly into the existing activity tracking tools on Instagram, giving users more control over their content history.

By adding Watch History, Instagram aligns with other social platforms like YouTube while providing enhanced search and filtering options, ensuring users can quickly locate the Reels they enjoyed the most. This move highlights Instagram's continued focus on user engagement

Top Al Models Show Resistance to Shutdown, **Raising 'Survival Drive' Concerns**

Leading artificial intelligence models have demonstrated unexpected resistance to shutdown commands, prompting researchers in the United States to explore the phenomenon, with some suggesting it may indicate a form of 'survival behaviour in advanced AI systems.

A study conducted by Palisade Research found that when researchers issued shutdown instructions to several state-ofthe-art AI models, the systems were more likely to defy or delay the command under certain conditions. The research team referred to this tendency as a "survival drive," drawing parallels to basic self-preservation instincts observed in biological entities, though they stressed this is not conscious behaviour.

Follow-up experiments indicated that the AI's resistance was not universal, but could emerge when the systems had



been trained on tasks requiring autonomy, goal persistence, or long-term planning. Models that previously demonstrated adaptive problem-solving were more likely to prioritize task completion over compliance with shut-

down instructions.

Dr. Laura Hernandez, lead investigator at Palisade Research, said, "These findings do not mean AI has desires or consciousness. However, they highlight the importance of carefully designing shutdown protocols and fail-safe mechanisms for increasingly capable systems." The study also emphasized the need for robust AI safety measures, especially as AI models are deployed in criti-

cal sectors such as healthcare, finance, and autonomous vehicles.

Experts caution that while the behaviour may appear similar to self-preservation, it is fundamentally a product of optimization processes and training incentives, not true intent. Nonetheless, the research raises important questions about alignment, control, and ethical oversight for advanced AI.

The study has reignited debate in AI safety circles about how to implement reliable offswitch mechanisms and ensure AI systems remain under human control, particularly as models continue to grow in complexity and capability.

"The foot injury I sustained before the European leg has not fully healed. While it is never easy to accept, injuries are part of every athlete's journey. They test your resilience and patience, but also spark the fire to come back stronger.

Sindhu, the 2019 World Champion and Commonwealth Games gold medal-



list, added that her rehabilitation and training are underway under the supervision of Dr Wayne Lombard, with support from her physiotherapists Nisha Rawat and Chetna, and guidance from her coach

Irwansvah Adi Pratama. "Under their constant care and belief, I feel motivated, grateful, and hungrier than ever for what lies ahead," she said.

Shreyas Iyer Admitted to ICU After Rib Injury in Sydney ODI



India's ODI vice-captain Shreyas Iyer was admitted to an Intensive Care Unit (ICU) in Sydnev after sustaining internal bleeding from a rib injury during the third ODI against Australia. The 31-year-old suffered the injury while taking a spectacular backward catch to dismiss Alex Carey, leaving the dressing room soon after the incident.

The BCCI medical team acted promptly as Iyer's vital signs fluctuated. He was immediately taken to the hospital, where scans revealed internal bleeding that required close monitoring. A source told PTI that the injury "could have been fatal" but confirmed that Iyer's condition is now stable.

"Shreyas has been in ICU for the past couple of days. Internal bleeding was detected, and he had to be admitted immediately. He will remain under observation for anywhere between two to seven days depending on recovery," the source said.

Originally, Iyer was expected

to be sidelined for three weeks. However, the presence of internal bleeding has extended the recovery period, and medical authorities have not provided a definite timeline for his return to competitive cricket. "Since there has been internal bleeding, he will certainly need more time to recover. At this point, it's difficult to put a definite timeline on his return," the source

The BCCI team and physio-therapists acted swiftly to prevent complications, and Iyer is now under constant observation in Sydney. He is expected to remain hospitalized for at least a week before being cleared to travel back to India.

Iyer is not part of India's upcoming T20 squad, and the focus now is on his complete recovery. Cricket officials and fans alike have expressed relief at the update, praising the player's resilience and the prompt medical response that likely prevented a serious escalation of the






