Illegal Construction In Musi Under HYDRAA Lens

Agency (HYDRAA) officials have finally taken notice of the massive illegal construction by Aditya Constructions along the Musi River, following reports by True Point News. Special teams of HYDRAA visited the site on Tuesday to inspect the construction

Recent heavy rains in Hyderabad caused water levels to rise dangerously in the twin reservoirs feed-

ing the Musi River. With Gandipet and Himayat Sagar reservoirs at full capacity, authorities opened all gates to release water downstream, flooding lowlying areas.

The controversial project by Aditya Constructions, located near Outer Ring Road in Narsingi Municipality (Survey No. 476), spans 16 acres and 25 guntas of land and violates irrigation department regulations. Despite this, reports from the revenue and irrigation departments reportedly cleared the way for HMDA permis-

TPCC Files Supreme Court Appeal on BC Quota

TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud expressed disappointment over the High Court's decision to follow the old reservation system for upcoming elections, calling it "distressing." He announced that the Congress has filed a Special Leave Petition (SLP) in the Supreme Court challenging the ruling on BC reservations.

The SLP is expected to be heard on Thursday. Goud expressed optimism that the Supreme Court will allow the government to implement the enhanced 42% quota for BCs in local body polls. He noted that all parties had supported the bill in the Assembly, but some are now opposing it, undermining the government's initiative. This move seeks to uphold the enhanced reservation quota and avoid political fallout, asserting Congress's commitment to backward classes. Goud's statement also targets opposition parties, particularly BRS and BJP, accusing them of double standards. The Supreme Court verdict will be decisive for Telangana's local body elections and political dynamics.

Telangana Slips Back Into Deflation, Retail Prices Fall 0.15% in September

Hyderabad, Oct 14 In a worrying sign of demand stagnation and economic cooling, Telangana has once again slipped back into the deflation zone. The state reported a 0.15 per cent fall in retail prices for the month of September, according to the latest data released by the Union Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI). This deflationary trend marks the third such in-

months, a phenomenon unprecedented since the formation of Telangana state. Economists are issuing serious warnings, stating that this sustained trajectory reflects weak consumption patterns and significantly sluggish rural demand. Such a trend, if it continues, is projected to have detrimental effects on the state's economy, potentially negatively impacting business investment, job creation, and the overall state revenue. The retail price trajectory since June clearly shows this economic deterioration. Telangana initially entered the deflation zone in June with a reading of -0.93 per cent, followed by -0.44 per cent in July. Although a brief recovery was observed in August with a positive inflation rate of 0.94 per cent, the state quickly reverted to deflation at -0.15% in September. This makes Telangana the only state in India to have entered the deflation territory three times in such a short span, signaling a deepseated economic issue. The MoSPI data strongly suggests that current government policies are failing to stimulate economic activity and are causing a widespread reduction in consumer spending power. This erodes the tax base and adds to the state's fiscal challenges, requiring immediate and effective economic inter-

ventions. The report underscores the urgent need for the new administration to introduce stimulus measures, particularly targeting rural communities and increasing liquidity in local markets to reverse the damaging deflationary cycle. The falling prices, while seemingly beneficial, are a symptom of a much larger problem of demand stagnation that threatens the state's growth projections.w



Telangana Economy Heading for Collapse: Harish Rao Slams Congress Over Deflation

TPN Bureau, Hyderabad, Oct 14 Former minister and BRS leader T. Harish Rao has expressed deep concern that Telangana's economy is heading towards collapse under the Congress government led by Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. Harish Rao pinpointed the alarming trend of negative inflation (deflation) in the state, which he argues is clear evidence of the government's failure in fiscal management and policy planning. He warned that the state is currently moving towards a dangerous state of deflation. Harish Rao drew a sharp contrast with the national economic scenario, noting that while India's overall retail inflation is recorded at a positive 1.54%, Telangana has been witnessing negative inflation, signaling a major slowdown and economic decline. He cited the specific de-

flation figures: June growth. This sustained (-0.93%), July (-0.44%), deflation, he warned, and September (-0.15%). He stressed that this is the first time since the formation of Telangana that the state has recorded negative inflation on three occasions in four consecutive months, which he attributes directly to "policy paralysis, financial mismanagement, and vendetta-driven

governance." The former minister noted that the negative inflation in September is particularly critical because festive periods like Bathukamma and Dasara typically trigger a surge in consumer spending, leading to positive inflation. The fact that deflation was recorded even during this period, he asserted, serves as definitive proof of the government's economic mismanagement, which he believes has crippled lo-

underscores the policy failures that have pushed Telangana's economy into a dangerous downward spiral.

Harish Rao invoked the state's past, stating that under KCR's leadership, Telangana was a national model for development, but under Revanth Reddy's governance-which he termed "corrupt and chaotic"—the state is sliding into financial decline. He concluded by directly urging the Chief Minister to abandon his "bulldozer politics and vindictive attitude" and, instead, focus on the critical task of reviving Telangana's collapsing economy and ensuring immediate financial stability before the situation worsens. This strong critique highlights the BRS's focus on attacking the ruling party's governance cal markets and slowed record and economic

AICC Tightens Norms for DCC President Selection in Telangana

Hyderabad, Oct 14 was convened with the **District Congress Commit**tee (DCC) presidents, led by AICC in-charge Meenakshi Natarajan and TPCC president Mahesh Kumar Goud. Following directives from AICC president Mallikarjun Kharge and AICC organization incharge K.C. Venugopal, the DCC presidents were issued a strict set of instructions and mandates regarding the selection and operational conduct of party functionaries. The AICC has significantly tightened the eligibility criteria for candidates applying for the post of DCC president. A key instruction is that applicants must have at least five continuous years of disciplined service to the party. AICC observers have been authorized to immediately exclude candidates who do not meet this non-negotiable continuous service

requirement. Furthermore, in a major organizational reform, the central leadership has emphatically stated that no opportunity will be given for a second term to the currently serving DCC presidents, a measure intended to introduce new blood into the district-level party structure. The



new guidelines also include a measure to curb political nepotism: close relatives of current public representatives (elected members) belonging to the Congress party are explicitly barred from being considered for the DCC president post. Conversely, the party is prioritizing diversity and inclusion, with clear emphasis placed on giving preference to leaders from the SC, ST, BC, minority, and women categories during the selection process. To ensure transparency and prevent undue influence, all DCC leaders have been strictly instructed not to hold personal discussions or private meetings with AICC observers. Furthermore, all district-level

meetings must be conducted either at the official party office or at a location that is easily accessible to all members. Holding meetings at the personal residences or private offices of local leaders is now prohibited. Finally, DCC presidents were mandated to ensure the successful execution of the AICC's prestigious 'vote theft' program, requiring them to collect signatures from a minimum of one hundred people in every village to document alleged electoral malpractice. These stringent rules are designed to professionalize the party, dismantle local power centers, and strengthen the grassroots organization.

Minister Tummala Launches Groundnut Seed Distribution with 100% Subsidy

TPN Bureau, Hyderabad, Oct 14 Minister for Agriculture, Marketing, Cooperation, Handlooms & Textiles, Tummala Nageswara Rao, officially launched the distribution of groundnut seeds with a 100% subsidy to farmers across the state. The program is being implemented under the National Mission on Edible Oils -Oil Seeds (NMEO-OS) 2025-26 scheme, utilizing a network of value chain clusters. The minister inaugurated the distribution program via video conference from a Rythu Vedika (farmers platform).

The minister detailed the core objectives of this initiative: to distribute quality groundnut seeds for free across the state, thereby boosting oilseed production, increasing the cultivated area for oilseed crops, and consequently enhancing the income of the farmers. He stressed that this scheme is a significant step towards agricul-

tural diversification. Speaking on the occasion, Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao reiterated the state government's commitment to achieving selfsufficiency in oilseed production. ment order (GO) sanctioning 40.53 lakh to the Airports Authority of India (AAI). This sanctioned able for the construction amount is specifically allocated for the AAI to conduct a crucial pre-feasibility study of the newly identified site. This decisive step has successfully

rekindled the long-held aspirations among local residents and business communities for an airport in the region. The selection of the Anthargaon site marks a revival of the project, as an earlier proposal for a location near Basanthnagar was ultimately

deemed unsuitable by aviation authorities. That location was rejected due to challenging terrain and restrictions imposed by the Indian Air Force (IAF) on flight training operations. The new initiative, backed by the financial commitment for an AAI

study, signals the state government's strong resolve to enhance regional connectivity and infrastructure development across the Peddapalli district. The successful completion of the pre-feasibility study is the critical next step that will pave the way for the

detailed planning and eventual construction of the long-awaited airport. This major infrastructure project is expected to create significant economic opportunities, particularly promoting industrial growth and tourism, benefiting the entire northern Telangana region by providing direct air access and reducing the reliance on the far-off Hyderabad airport. The Additional Commissioner of Police, Crimes, Hyderabad City, M. Srinivas, IPS, held his inaugural crime review meeting on Monday, October 13, 2025, with the heads of the three specialized wings: the Central Crime Station (CCS), Cyber Crimes, and the Women Safety Wing (WSW). The meeting focused on reviewing the functioning and progress of all associated teams, including the CCS teams (I to X), the Special Investigation Team (SIT), She Teams, Women Police Stations, and the Clues/Finger Prints units. Addl. CP Srinivas emphasized that these specialized wings must concentrate on un-

terns to prevent offenses at their root. He stressed the paramount importance of staying updated with criminal technologies, tackling emerging challenges in white-collar and cyber crimes, enhancing women's safety, and significantly improving investigation standards. He called for fair and firm investigations, meticulous documentation of evidence, and the effective use of forensic and digital tools to strengthen prosecutions. The overarching goal is not just to enhance public safety but also to foster greater trust between the police and the community by adopting technologydriven, citizen-centric policing strategies. A key foCrimes Wing, which was instructed to intensify public awareness campaigns. The police will caution the public, especially senior citizens, against sophisticated scams like fake online investment and trading platforms.

These fraudsters lure victims with false profits and then block withdrawals under pretexts like 'tax payments' or 'compliance charges.' 

What began as a tariff skirmish has now escalated into a full-blown global supply chain siege, with the United States and China weaponising their respective technological and material strengths. And in this escalating economic battle, India finds itself deeply exposed.

Ahead of a Trump-Xi summit slated for late October in South Korea, Beijing announced sweeping export controls on rare-earth elements, magnets, and battery materials. These moves, framed as national security measures, are seen as a direct response to

U.S. export curbs on Chinese chipmakers and higher port duties on Chinese-built ships.

Washington retaliated with threats of 100% tariffs and restrictions on software exports. But this is no longer a trade war—it is now a strategic siege, where semiconductors and minerals are new-age weapons.

India's Growing Vulnerability

India imports nearly 90% of its rare-earth magnets from China, totalling 53,700 tonnes in 2024–2025. These critical materials power electric vehicles, wind turbines. electronics, and defence

tightening licensing rules—even for products made abroad using Chinese inputs—India's production lines from Pune to Coimbatore are at risk of disruption.

The export curbs are a stark reminder of India's dependency. Despite having the fifth-largest rareearth reserves globally, India lacks the refining and magnet-making infrastructure to fully utilise them.



On Friday morning, the S&P 500 was on track for yet another record close when Trump abruptly declared a 100% tariff on Chinese goods. The news sent shockwaves through Wall Street, with the techheavy Nasdaq dropping 3.6% and the CBOE Volatility Index, Wall Street's so-called "fear gauge." surging over 30%.

By Sunday, Trump's administration had already started walking back the threat, suggest-

ping ahead of their planned meeting in South Korea later this month.

ment and the reversal both occurred while Asian markets were closed for the weekend, allowing U.S. investors to bear the brunt of the immediate fallout. By Monday, when Chinese markets reopened, traders had already priced in the likelihood that Trump's tariff hike wouldn't materialize. The Hang Seng Index dropped just 1.7%, a relatively modest slide compared to the 13.1% plunge it experienced during Trump's earlier

If Political Parties Fear POSH, The Real Problem Runs Deeper

India has six national parties, 67 state parties, and nearly 3,000 registered unrecognised political parties. Yet none are legally mandated to protect women against harassment. This legal vacuum starkly con-

sedes dignity. Political parties must adopt independent, transparent complaint mechanisms and comply with the POSH Act as a bare minimum

standard. The government and judiciary need to close the legal loophole that leaves political organizations outside the reach of laws protecting women at work.

Bringing political parties under POSH is not charity — it is a democratic imperative to ensure women serving the nation can do so free from harassment

Delhi Waives Late Fees on Water

Bills Till jan 31, Cuts Charges for

Illegal Connections

In a significant relief for Delhi residents, Chief Minister Rekha Gupta on Tuesday announced a complete waiver of late payment surcharge (LPSC) on domestic water bills till January 31, 2026. The move is aimed at easing the financial burden on consumers and encouraging the reg-ularisation of illegal water connections.

Addressing a press conference, Gupta revealed that the Delhi government will write off over ₹11,000 crore worth of surcharge on domestic water bills. After January 31, the waiver will be reduced to 70% and will remain in effect till March 31,

"The LPSC waiver will be 100% till January 31. After that, we are offering a 70% waiver till March 31, but there will be no extension beyond

In another major decision, the gov-structure in the capital.

ernment slashed the conversion charges for unauthorised water connections. For domestic connections. the fee has been reduced from ₹25,000 to just ₹1,000. For non-domestic connections, the charges have been cut from ₹61,000 to ₹5,000. These measures aim to bring more than 29 lakh illegal connections in the city under

the legal network. According to officials, the Delhi Jal Board (DJB) is owed a staggering ₹87,589 crore in unpaid water bills. Of this, only ₹7,125 crore is the principal amount, while ₹80,463 crore about 91% — is late payment surcharge.

The chief minister urged residents to take advantage of the waiver and regularisation drive, adding that the scheme will not be extended beyond March 31, 2026. The initiative is expected to boost DJB's revenue recovery and improve water supply infra-

'India Proved Doubters Wrong...': **IMF Chief's Praise In Global Economy Meet**

International Monetary Fund (IMF) Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva on Monday praised India's "bold economic and structural reforms" during the opening session of the IMF's semi-annual meeting of global finance ministers and central bank governors.

Georgieva highlighted key Indian reforms such as the recalibration of Goods and Services Tax (GST) brackets, overhaul of income tax laws, mass digital payments adoption, and the rollout of Aadhaar — the country's digital social identity program.

"Everyone told India that digital identity on a mass scale could not be done... but India proved them wrong," she said. She specifically applauded the recent GST restructuring, which included eliminating the 12% and 28% slabs and introducing a 40% 'sin tax', aimed at boosting consumption by making essentials like milk, coffee, and ghee more affordable.

She also reinforced earlier remarks made last week, calling India a "key growth engine" amid global slowdown concerns. The IMF projects India's GDP to grow at 6.5% in 2025 and 2026, while the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) projects 6.8%, citing structural reforms as the growth driver.

However, Georgieva also sounded alarms on global economic challenges. She warned that global public debt is set to exceed 100% of GDP by 2029, with over 150 developing countries nearing or already in debt distress. While she



appreciated G20 efforts, she pressed for greater focus on debt relief, especially as South Africa chairs the group. The next G20 chair, the United States under President Trump, has shown little interest in the issue.

Georgieva also flagged fresh risks from esca-

lating US-China trade tensions. Trump's threat of a 100% tariff on Chinese goods could derail recent progress and spark a renewed global trade war. "If Trump goes back to 100% tariffs... there's going to be a lot of pain," former IMF strategist Martin Muehleisen warned.

Congress to Boycott JPC on Bills for PM, CM **Removal Over Criminal Charges**

The Congress party has officially decided to boycott the Joint Parliamentary Committee (JPC) formed to examine three controversial bills related to the removal of the Prime Minister, Chief Ministers, and other Ministers arrested on serious criminal charges for a 30-day period.

The decision was communicated to Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju on Monday, October 13, party sources confirmed. The boycott marks a sharp political stance against what the Congress terms an attempt to "undermine democratic institutions through questionable legislative processes."

The bills in question were introduced in the Lok Sabha by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on August 20. Soon after the introduction, the House passed a resolution to refer the legislation to a joint committee for further scrutiny. The proposed bills aim to establish a legal framework for suspending top executive office-holders, including the PM and CMs, from their posts if they are arrested on charges deemed "serious" by the judiciary or investigative agencies.

 $Congress\,lea\bar{d}ers\,argue\,that\,the\,legislation$ sets a dangerous precedent and could be misused for political vendetta. "These bills are vague, open to misuse, and politically motivated. We cannot be part of a process that



legitimizes such overreach," a senior party

leader told The Hindu. The party has also questioned the urgency

and timing of the bills, especially ahead of key state elections and rising political tensions across the country.

This move by the Congress could potentially lead to a wider opposition boycott, complicating the review process in the committee. The government, however, maintains that the bills are aimed at ensuring accountability in public office and upholding the rule of law.

The JPC is expected to begin its deliberations later this month, with or without Congress participation.

Andhra mountaineer becomes first Indian

To summit 9 of world's highest 8,000 metre peaks



Bharath Thammineni, a 36-year-old mountaineer from Kurnool, Andhra Pradesh, has become the first Indian to successfully summit nine of the world's 14 highest peaks over 8,000 metres. His latest feat was conquering Mt Cho Oyu (8,188m), the world's sixthhighest mountain, in China.

Thammineni reached the Cho Oyu base camp on September 30 but faced setbacks due to bad weather and heavy snowfall. After waiting for better conditions, he made a final summit push on October 12, reaching the peak at 6:55 am China time (8:55 am IST). Notably, he accomplished this climb without Sherpa support, highlighting his skill and resilience.

Before Cho Oyu, Thammineni had already scaled eight other 8,000+ metre peaks: Mt Everest (May 2017), Mt Manaslu (September 2018), Mt Lhotse (May 2019), Mt Annapurna (March 2022), Mt Kanchenjunga (April 2022), Mt Makalu (May 2023), Mt Shishapangma (October 2024), and Mt Dhaulagiri (April 2025). Five remaining highest

peaks—Mt K2, Nanga Parbat, Gasherbrum I and II, and Broad Peak—are located in Pakistan and currently offlimits to Indian climbers.

Thammineni is the founder of Boots & Crampons, a mountaineering company, and is widely regarded as one of India's most accomplished high-altitude climbers. Over the past decade, he has guided expeditions across six continents and inspired many aspiring climbers.

His leadership was instrumental in the Everest 2025 expedition, which included historic achievements such as Chhonzin Angmo becoming the world's first blind woman to summit Everest and Vishwanath Karthikey becoming the youngest Indian to complete the Seven Summits challenge.

From his summit camp, Thammineni dedicated his achievement to India's adventure sports community, saying, "This is not just a personal achievement but a testament to the potential of Indian adventure sports. I hope this inspires a new generation of climbers to aim for the highest peaks."

PM Modi Welcomes Release of All Hamas Hostages, Backs **Trump's Peace Efforts**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi warmly welcomed the release of all remaining Israeli hostages held by Hamas, praising the resilience of their families and the peace efforts led by US President Donald Trump and Israeli Prime Minister

Benjamin Netanyahu. On Monday, the Israeli Defence Forces (IDF) confirmed that all 20 surviving Israeli hostages, held captive for over two years in Gaza, were freed and returned to Israeli authorities. This announcement came on the eve of the Jewish festival Simchat Torah, marking a significant moment for Israel and supporters of peace

worldwide. "We welcome the release of all hostages after over two years of captivity. Their freedom stands as a tribute to the courage of their families, the unwavering peace efforts of President Trump and the strong resolve of Prime Minister Netanyahu. We support President Trump's sincere efforts to bring peace to the region," PM Modi said in a post on X.

IDF spokesperson Effie Defrin called the return of the hostages "a defining moment" that belongs to all those who believe in humanity, underscoring the emotional and political significance of the development.

India has consistently condemned the terror attacks on Israel on October 7, 2023, and the resulting civilian casualties in the ongoing Israel-Hamas conflict. The Ministry of External Affairs reiterated India's call for the release of all hostages, a ceasefire, and a peaceful resolution through dialogue diplomacy.

India has also stressed the urgent need for safe and sustained humanitarian aid to affected areas. This stance has been voiced in multiple international platforms, including the UN, BRICS, NAM, and the Voice of the Global South.

Venezuela Closes Norway Embassy After Machado Wins Nobel Peace Prize

In a move seen as a direct response to Venezuelan opposition leader María Corina Machado receiving the Nobel Peace Prize, President Nicolás Maduro's government has ordered the closure of Venezuela's embassy in Norway. The decision came just days after Machado was honoured for her efforts promoting democracy and peaceful transition in Venezuela

The Venezuelan Foreign Ministry cited a "reorganisation" of its diplomatic network as the official reason for shutting down the Oslo embassy. Phone lines at the embassy were disconnected by Monday evening. At the same time, Caracas announced plans to close its mission in Australia while opening new diplomatic posts in Zimbabwe and Burkina Faso, signalling a strategic realignment aimed at strengthening ties with the Global South.

Norway's Foreign Ministry expressed regret over the closure, stating that Venezuela had not provided any official explanation. Spokesperson Cecilie Roang emphasised that despite differences, Norway wishes to maintain dialogue with Venezuela. Roang also

clarified that the Nobel Peace Prize is awarded independently of the Norwegian government. Machado, a leading

figure in the opposition Vente Venezuela party, has been a vocal critic of Maduro's administration, which she frequently describes as a dictatorship. She has led multiple anti-government protests and went into hiding last year amid threats to her safety. Following the controversial 2024 presidential election, which Maduro won amid opposition allegations of fraud, Machado claimed her party's candidate Edmundo González was the rightful winner.

Although Maduro has not publicly addressed Machado's Nobel Prize, he reportedly referred to her in derogatory terms during a recent speech. Speaking from hiding, Machado declared that "Maduro's time is over" but urged a peaceful transition, offering negotiations to ensure stability.

This latest diplomatic fallout underscores the deepening tensions between Maduro's regime and the opposition, complicating Venezuela's fragile political landscape.

Trump Praises Modi, Sees Hope for India-Pakistan Peace at Egypt Summit

US President Donald Trump praised India and its leader, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, without naming him directly, while expressing optimism about peace between India and Pakistan at a world leaders' summit in Egypt. The gathering followed a ceasefire agreement that ended the more than two-year-long Israel-Hamas war in Gaza.

Addressing the summit on Monday, Trump called India "a great country with a good friend of mine at the top" and lauded Modi's leadership. Turning his gaze toward Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif standing behind him, Trump said, "I think Pakistan and India are going to live very nicely together,' prompting Sharif to respond with a chuckle.

Earlier, Trump praised Sharif and Pakistan's army chief, General Asim Munir, whom he called his "favourite field marshal." He invited Sharif to speak, during which the Pakistani leader credited Trump's "untiring and relentless efforts" for achieving peace in the Middle East.

Sharif also announced Pakistan had nominated Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize for his role in stopping the war between India and Pakistan and brokering the Gaza ceasefire. He expressed interest in nomi $nating \, Trump \, again \, for \, saving \, millions \, of \, \, lives \, across \,$ South Asia and the Middle East.

Trump, who previously claimed credit for resolving seven conflicts including the India-Pakistan dispute, now asserts he has helped settle eight, adding the Israel-Gaza conflict to his tally.

Since May 10, when Trump announced a "full and immediate" ceasefire between India and Pakistan following US mediation, he has frequently asserted his role in ending the hostilities. However, India has maintained that the ceasefire understanding was



reached through direct talks between military

The ceasefire followed India's Operation Sindoor, launched on May 7 to target terror infrastructure in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir after a deadly attack in Pahalgam. The truce brought an end to four days of cross-border drone and missile strikes

Pakistan on High Alert After Fierce Border **Clashes with Afghanistan**

Pakistani troops remain on high alert along the 2,600km border with Afghanistan following intense fighting over the weekend that left dozens dead. The clashes between Afghan and Pakistani security forces have heightened tensions and disrupted cross-border trade, with Pakistan closing several border crossings.

The weekend violence saw heavy exchanges of fire, drawing the attention of US President Donald Trump, who expressed willingness to assist in ending the conflict. The fighting led to the closure of key trade routes, leaving scores of loaded goods vehicles stranded on both sides of the frontier.

A Pakistani industry representative confirmed that the border closures have halted vital trade between the two neighbours, impacting businesses and local economies dependent on cross-border commerce. The border stretches through remote mountainous terrain, making it difficult to manage security and trade effectively.

The border closure has also affected Afghan refugees, many of whom were seen waiting at camps near the closed crossings, unsure when they would be able to return home or continue their journeys.

This latest flare-up adds to the ongoing instability in the region, where disputes over border demarcations and security concerns have frequently sparked clashes. Both countries have accused each other of violating sovereignty and escalating tensions.

Authorities on both sides have called for calm and dialogue, but the situation remains fragile. The conflict threatens to worsen an already volatile relationship between Pakistan and Afghanistan, with potential regional

As of Monday, no immediate resolution has been reached, and the border remains sealed. The international community, including the United States, continues to monitor the situation closely, hoping to mediate peace and restore stability in the region.

Amazon Fires Employee Over Protest Against Israel Ties

Amazon has terminated Ahmed Shahrour, a 29-year-old Palestinian engineer working for its Whole Foods Market unit, following his protests against the company's business ties with Israel. Shahrour was fired on Monday for violating company policies, including making statements deemed to "threaten, intimidate, coerce or interfere with" senior leaders and colleagues, according to an internal email obtained by Bloomberg.

Last month, Shahrour was suspended after posting messages in corporate Slack chat rooms criticizing Amazon's involvement with the Israeli government. He further protested by distributing fliers at Amazon's Seattle headquarters. In one message to colleagues, Shahrour stated, "Amazon is not a neutral observer. We are active participants," highlighting his concerns about the company's role.

Amazon confirmed it does not tolerate discrimination, harassment, or threatening behavior in the workplace and takes necessary action when such conduct is reported. Spokesperson Brad Glasser said, "We investigate and take appropriate action based on our findings."

The controversy surrounds Amazon's participation in Project Nimbus, a contract through which it, along with Google's parent company Alphabet Inc., pro-

vides cloud computing services to Israeli government and military agencies. This involvement has sparked protests amid the recent conflict in Gaza, where thousands died before a ceasefire.

Shahrour has also been involved in protests targeting other tech giants. In August, he was one of seven current and former tech employees who staged a sit-in at Microsoft President Brad Smith's office, demanding the company halt its sales to Israel. The protesters were arrested but later released. Following public pressure, Microsoft restricted some of its software

usage by an Israeli military unit.

The firing of Shahrour underscores growing tensions within the tech industry over corporate contracts linked to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and the challenges companies face balancing business interests with employee activism.

GST Annual Return Filing for FY25 Begins: Key Rules, **Turnover Limits, and Compliance Tips**



The GST portal has officially opened the window for filing the GSTR-9 annual return and GSTR-9C reconciliation statement for the financial year 2024-25. These filings are mandatory for all taxpayers registered under GST and provide a comprehensive summary of the year's tax transactions, including outward and inward supplies, tax paid, and input tax credit claimed.

GSTR-9 must be filed annually, consolidating all monthly or quarterly GST returns filed during the year. GSTR-9C, applicable to taxpayers whose

prescribed limit, serves as a reconciliation statement and requires certification by a Chartered Accountant or Cost Accountant.

According to Prabhat Ranjan, Senior Director at Nexdigm, while most taxpayers are familiar with GSTR-9 and 9C filings, this year's filing comes with new disclosure requirements and stricter validations on the GST portal. He urged taxpayers to be meticulous while filing to avoid errors and potential penalties.

Important Points to

Deadline: The last date for filing GSTR-9 and GSTR-9C for FY25 is December 31, 2025. Taxpayers are advised not to wait for any extensions, as no grace period is expected this year, unlike previous years when extensions were sometimes granted due to technical glitches.

Turnover Limits: GSTR-9C filing is mandatory for taxpayers with a turnover exceeding the threshold specified by the government, usually above 5 crore.

Compliance Tips: Early preparation, accurate

reconciliation of data with annual financial statements, and crossverification of input tax credit claims are essential for smooth filing.

The GST portal now enforces stricter validations to minimize discrepancies and improve compliance. Taxpayers should ensure their returns for the entire financial year are correctly filed before attempting the annual return.

WPI Inflation Eases to 0.13% in September on Lower Food and Fuel Prices

India's Wholesale Price Index (WPI)-based inflation cooled to 0.13% in September 2025, marking a steady decline from 0.52% in August and a significant drop compared to 1.91% in September 2024, according to data released by the

government on Tuesday. The moderation in wholesale inflation was primarily driven by a decline in prices of food articles, fuel, and manufactured goods, offering some relief amid persistent concerns over inflationary pressures in the economy.

Analysts noted that softening prices in key segments — including vegetables, cereals, and cooking gas — played a major role in easing WPI inflation for the month. Crude petroleum prices also remained relatively stable, further contributing to the lower overall

index. The data suggests that supply-side pressures have started to ease, especially in the food and energy sectors, after months of volatility caused by global disruptions and erratic monsoon patterns.

"The decline in WPI inflation reflects improving supply chains and a drop in global commodity prices. This is a positive sign for producers and industries dependent on wholesale inputs," said an economist with a leading financial services firm. The continued moderation in WPI also bodes well for overall inflation management, as it may eventually translate into lower retail inflation (CPI) in the coming months. However, experts caution that external risks, including

global oil price fluctua-

tions and geopolitical tensions, remain poten-

tial challenges WPI inflation had been volatile over the past year, touching negative territory for several months before turning positive in recent readings. The September figure reinforces a trend of moderation, which may provide additional space for the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to maintain a balanced monetary policy approach.

India beat West Indies by 7 wickets to clinch Test series 2-0

Shubman Gill's first series win as Test skipper

history by matching the world record for the most consecutive series wins against a single opponent, with a 2-0 clean sweep over the West Indies in the recent home series. This marks India's 10th consecutive Test series win against the Caribbean side since their last defeat in 2002, equaling South Africa's record of 10 straight series victories against the West Indies from 1998 to

The series concluded with a commanding seven-wicket victory in the second Test at Delhi's Feroz Shah Kotla stadium. Needing just 58 runs to win, KL Rahul's unbeaten 58 guided India to a comfortable finish alongside Dhruv Jurel. The match stretched into the fifth day for the first time since 2011 in an India-West Indies Test series, largely due to strong batting performances from West Indies centurions John Campbell (115) and Shai Hope (103), and a resilient 10th-wicket partnership.

This was also a landmark series for Shubman Gill, who captained India at home for the first time and secured his maiden Test series win as captain. Earlier this year, Gill led



India to a 2-2 draw in the challenging England tour.

India's dominance was evident with their bowlers taking all 40 West Indies wickets across the two Tests. Despite unhelpful pitch con-

ditions for spinners, Indian pacers performed admirably, while spinners showed patience on slow tracks. The batting lineup flourished as well, with five centuries and a near-century scored by the top

six batsmen over the series.

This victory not only underlines India's continued home supremacy but also sets a strong tone for their future in Test cricket under Gill's

cricket India's Smriti Mandhana made history by be-

coming the first woman to score 1,000 ODI runs in a single calendar year, surpassing Belinda Clark's previous record of 970 runs set in 1997. Mandhana also became the fastest woman to reach 5,000 runs in Women's ODIs, achieving the milestone in just 112 innings, breaking Stafanie Taylor's record of 129 innings.

Mandhana's 46-ball half-century in the match helped her surpass Mithali Raj for the most 50+ scores by an Indian against Australia in women's ODIs. India posted a total of 330 runs, their highestever Women's World Cup total and the highest score against Australia in World Cup matches Australia's successful chase of 331 runs became the highest ever in women's ODI history, surpassing Sri Lanka's 302-run chase against South Africa in 2024.

The 22-year-old wrestler from Birohar, Haryana, explained that his failure to make weight was due to illness. "I joined the Croatia camp about 15 days before the competition but was taken ill with a stomach bug, which made it impossible to shed the required weight despite trying for two days," Sehrawat told The Tribune.

Though disappointed by the ban, Aman acknowledged the need to follow rules. "Nobody wants to be tagged as banned, but the rules are clear, so I have

accepted the situation," he said. Despite the setback, Sehrawat remains hopeful about his future in wrestling. He has already spoken to the federation multiple times and expects a decision soon, as the WFI plans to hold a meeting next week that could revoke his suspension.

However, Aman admitted that he will likely miss the upcoming Senior National Wrestling Championships, with the venue yet to be announced. His focus now shifts to bigger goals, including the Asian Games next year and other international competitions.


