Kavitha Launches 'Jagruthi Janam **Bata'Without KCR's Image**

TPN Bureau | October 15 Hyderabad: Kalvaku ntla Kavitha has announced the launch of her month-long tour across Telangana districts under the banner "Jagruthi Janam Bata," aiming to engage directly with people and understand grassroots social issues. Addressing the media, she outlined that the campaign will span four months, spend-

ing two days in each district to interact with residents from all comm unities. Kavitha emphasized that the initiative seeks actionable solutions for social Telangana rather than mere slogans. Remarkably, Kavitha confirmed that her campaign would not feature the image of former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR). "Telangana owes

much to KCR, but including his photo would be morally inappropriate. I am seeking my own path while continuing the work started under Jagruthi," she said. She added that even during the initial Jagruthi launch, KCR's photo was not used, with leaders like Jayashankar being highlighted inste ad. Kavitha addressed her suspension from BRS, explain-

ing that despite her dedication to Telangana's social progress, internal party politics led to her exclusion. She criticized the state government for ignoring key issues affecting citizens, including agriculture, education, infrastructure, and public services, and stressed her intention to consult the public before making political decisions. She also released

the official campaign poster, which features Telangana Mata and Jayashan kar, deliberately excluding KCR's image to assert her independent stance. Kavitha pledged to focus on problems ranging from irrigation and bus services to fertilizer supply, highlighting the need for practical solutions rather than political

Revenue Reforms Bring Relief to Telangana Farmers

Hyderabad: Telangana Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy announced comprehensive reforms in the state's revenue administration on Wednesday, aimed at resolving long-standing land disputes and expediting pending applications under schemes such as Sada Bainama, Addressing officials at the resolution of pending B.R. Ambedkar Secretariat, the minister congratulated 13 officers recently promoted from Deputy Collector to Special Grade Deputy

Collector, urging them to implement reforms efficiently at the grassroots level

Minister Reddy elaborated that under the previous government, 9.26 lakh applications related to Sada Bainama remained unresolved due to procedural gaps in the 2020 ROR Act, even though applications were accepted. "Our government has now streamlined regulations to ensure rapid cases. Clear guidelines have been issued for processing Sada Bainama applications, and officials are expected to work closely with citi-



tions," he said.

He stressed the importance of friendly administrative practices, including systematic promotions across departments to motivate

efficiently. The minister emphasized that these changes align with Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's vision of transparent, citizen-focused governance. "Resolving citizens' longstanding grievances at the earliest will strengthen public confidence in government initiatives," he noted. Officials were also in-

structed to coordinate

with local stakeholders, ensuring that land disputes are resolved in accordance with the law while maintaining accountability and public trust. Minister Reddy highlighted the government's commitment to continuous monitoring and periodic review to ensure reforms translate into tangible benefits for Telangana residents.

Uttam Reddy Vows to Defend Telangana's Water Rights

ber 15 Hyderabad: Telangana's Minister for Irrigation and Public Utilities, Captain N. Uttam Kumar Reddy, has made it clear that the state will not compromise on its rights over river waters and will push forward with the Banakacherla project under all circumstances. Speaking at a gathering attended by AICC observer Sarath Raut, Kodad MLA Uttam Padmavathi, district Congress president Cheviti Venkanna Yaday, and PCC delegates including Lakshmi Narayana Reddy and Dongari Venkateswarlu, the minister firmly rejected attempts by BRS leaders to create confusion among the public with misleading statements.

Minister Reddy emphasized that the government is prepared to take legal action against anyone trying to halt the project.

"We have communicated our objections directly to the Union Minister for Water Resources through letters and official channels," he said. He also stressed that raising the Almatti reservoir will not be accepted under any circumstances. He asserted that political alignments in neighboring states—Congress in Karnataka, BJP in Maharashtra, or TDP in Andhra Pradeshdo not affect Telangana's legitimate claim over Krishna and Godavari waters

Highlighting ongoing legal battles, Reddy noted that the state is vigorously pursuing its rights before the Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal and the Supreme Court. "I personally attended tribunal hearings in my capacity as minister, the first ever from Telangana, to safeguard our water allocations," he said. He contrasted this proac-

tive approach with BRS governance, criticizing the former administration for spending 1.8 crore on irrigation projects, including Kalwakurthi, Devadula, Nethan-padu, Koilsagar, Bhima, and SLBC, without yielding significant results.

The minister also outlined plans for pending projects, promising their completion before the next Assembly elections. Reddy highlighted Telangana's recordbreaking paddy production over the last two years, achieved through proper utilization of Krishna and Godavari waters, and asserted that irrigation development is central to ensuring food security and farmer welfare. "Our government is committed to finishing all pending irrigation projects and securing the state's rightful water allocations," he

Deepak Reddy is BJP candidate for Jubilee Hills by-election

Hyderabad: The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) on Wednesday announced Lankala Deepak Reddy as its candidate for by-election to Jubilee Hills Assembly seat in Telangana.The Central **Election Committee of** the party cleared the name of Deepak Reddy from the list of thr ee names recommended by the party's state

The names of Deepak Reddy, Juturu Keer thi Reddy and Veerapaneni Padma were reportedly sent to the party's central leadership by the state election committee.

Deepak Reddy will be contesting as the BJP candidate from Jubilee Hills in his second consecutive election. He had finished third in the 2023 elections

Maganti Gopinath of Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) had defeated former Indian cricket captain and



Mohammed Azharuddin by 16,337 votes to win the seat for the third consecutive term. In a multi-cornered contest, Gopinath had secured 80,54 9 votes while Azharuddin had polled 64,212 votes. Deepak Reddy was in third position with 25,866 votes.

Gopinath's demise in June this year necessitated the by-election. The BRS has fiel ded Gopinath's wife Maganti Sunitha.

The ruling Congress party announced Nave en Yadav as its candidate.

As per the schedule announced by the **Election Commission** of India, the official notification for the byelection was issued on

October 13. The last date for fil-

ing nominations is October 21. Scrutiny of nominations will be held on October 22, and withdrawal of candidature will be allowed until October 24. The polling will be held on November 11, while the counting of votes will take place on November 14.

Meanwhile, Hyderabad District Election Officer R.V. Karnan has announced that the Election Commission of India has issued a notification, prohibiting the conduct, publication, and publicity of exit polls in connection with the by-election.

The ban period will be from 7 a.m. on November 6 to 6:30 p.m. on November 11. During this time, no one is allowed to conduct, publish, or share any exit poll results or predictions, including on TV, radio, newspapers, websites, YouTube, WhatsApp, X, Facebo ok, Instagram, or any other digital platf

BRS Declares Full Support for BC JAC Bandh

Hyderabad: Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) has extended full support to the Telangana BC JAC's "Bandh for Justice" scheduled for October 18. BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) emphasized that the bandh is a legitimate demand to secure 42 percent reservation for backward classes (BCs), criticizing Congress for misleading the community with unfulfilled promises.

Leaders of BC JAC, including Chairman R. Krishnayya, Working Chairman Jajula Srinivas Goud, Vice-Chairman VGR Naragoni, and Co-Chairman Rajaram Yadav, presented a memorandum to KTR seeking party backing for the statewide bandh. Rajaram Yadav clarified that the agitation aims to protect BC rights rather than oppose any political party, highlighting dec-

ades of systemic neglect faced by the community. Senior BRS leaders,

MLAs, former ministers, former municipal chairpersons, and representatives from various BC organizations participated in the meeting, underscoring the collective de-

mand for social justice. KTR recalled previous instances where 42 percent reservation had been partially supported but noted that Congress lacks commitment to fully implement the quota. The bandh is expected to unite multiple communi-

ties, parties, and organizations in advocating constitutional safeguards for BCs. The leaders stressed that achieving justice requires a collaborative approach transcending political and caste lines, with legislative and constitution-

al measures necessary to secure BC entitlements. The BRS has committed logistical and political support to ensure the bandh proceeds smoothly, signaling the party's continued focus on social equity and inclusive governance in Telangana.

Telangana Records Historic Rice Yield, Sets New Procurement Benchmark

TPN Bureau | 15 October Hyderabad: The Telangana government has set a new benchmark in agricultural productivity, recording an all-time high rice yield of 148.03 lakh metric tonnes, according to the State Minister for Irrigation and Civil Supplies, Captain N. Uttam Kumar Reddy. He noted that this level of yield is unprecedented not only in Telangana but across India's 29 states, including the erstwhile united Andhra Pradesh.

The minister attributed this

the pro-farmer policies implemented under the leadership of Chief Minister K. Revanth Reddy and Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka. "The production surge is a direct result of the farmer-centric measures taken by the state government," he remarked.

On Wednesday morning, a video conference was conducted from the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Secretariat with district collectors to review the cess. Key participants included Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao, Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, Agriculture Secretary Surendra Mohan, Transport Commissioner Raghunandan Rao, and Civil Supplies Commissioner Stephen Ravindra, among

Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy emphasized that procurement is a sensitive and critical process. He instructed officials to ensure that farmers face no inconvenience at the procurement centers. With an ambitious target of 80 lakh metric tonnes of rice purchases, the government is preparing a record-scale operation, involving expenditure of ₹22,000-23,000 crore. This includes 40 lakh metric tonnes each of Sanna and Doddalu varieties.

To facilitate the process, 8,342 procurement centers have been established across the state, including 4,259 through primary agricultural cooperative societies,

3,517 through I-KP centers, and 566 via other agencies. Complete transport arrangements have been instructed to ensure smooth transfer of the purchased rice. Payment for procured rice is expected within 48 hours of registration, and farmers will receive bonus payments on Sanna rice in addition to the support price.

Already, 1,205 centers in Kamareddy, Nizamabad, Medak, Siddipet, and Nalgonda districts have started operations. The minister directed officials to maintain all necessary equipment at the centers and to act swiftly in case of any emergency, including weather-related contingencies. A 24hour helpline (1800-425-00333/1967) has been made available for farmers to report any issues.

This record harvest and the meticulous procurement plan mark a historic achievement for Telangana agriculture, reflecting strong government coordination and proactive administration.

Telangana Launches

Comprehensive Procurement and **Crop Review**

TPN Bureau | 15 October Hyderabad: As the kharif

crop harvest begins, the Telangana government has taken proactive steps to ensure efficient procurement and market operations. Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao reviewed crop collection strategies in consultation with agencies including MARKFED, HACA, and RIC. He emphasized the importance of clean and well-equipped centers for rice collection, with tarpaulins and other essential equipment readily available in each district.

Highlighting the government's commitment to farmers, Minister Rao stated that despite the Centre not actively supporting maize purchases, Telangana would begin procurement through MARKFED from tomorrow, ensuring farmers' interests are prioritized. Similarly, arrangements are being made to commence soybean procurement immediately. Cotton procurement will also start promptly, following completion of CCI tender processes, with collectors instructed to notify ginning centers without delay.

To streamline operations, each unified district has been assigned a Head of Department (HoD) as the coordinat-

ing officer for all crop purchases. These officers are tasked with liaising with district collectors to ensure smooth procurement and to resolve any issues at the centers without inconvenience to farmers.

Specific appointments include: MD & Warehouse heads for Nizamabad, Director Horticulture for Warangal, Director Agriculture for Nalgonda, MD HACA for Mahabubnagar, Director Marketing for Khammam, Director Seed Certification for Adilabad, MD AGROS for Karimnagar, MD MARKFED for Medak, and MD OILFED for Ranga Reddy.

The review also included a detailed discussion on crop collection and market readiness, including equipment availability and cleanliness of procurement centers. The Agriculture Department, along with HACA and MARKFED officials, participated in the deliberations to ensure readiness for large-scale procurement.

The minister reaffirmed the government's commitment to complete procurement efficiently, reflecting strong coordination among Civil Supplies, Agriculture, and Cooperative departments, and ensuring farmers face no hardships during the harvest season.

He contrasted this with the initiatives undertaken during KCR's tenure, including free water supply in Hyderabad's slums, Basti clinics, KCR kits for pregnant women, and pensions for elderly citizens, highlighting how BRS governance ensured tangible benefits for the poor.

Further, Rao condemned the demolition of homes under the "Hydra" beautification project, noting that thousands of families were displaced without adequate rehabilitation. He accused Congress of selectively criticizing BRS while ignoring failures in implementing welfare programs. Rao urged the electorate to reflect on these governance lapses, questioning the sincerity of Congress and BJP claims in

Two Women Arrested for Selling Alcohol in Jubilee Hills

Hyderabad: As part of intensified checks ahead of the Jubilee Hills Assembly by-election, the STF B Team, led by CI Biksareddy and SI Balaraju, conducted raids across several localities on Wednesday. During these inspections, the team discovered two women allegedly involved in illegal alcohol sales in Borabanda and Indiranagar

The police recovered 173 bottles of liquor from the women's possession. The haul included a mix of quarts, half bottles, and beer bottles, all reportedly being sold without a license. The arrested women, identified as Shwaramma and Mariyamma, were taken into custody and handed over to the Amberpet Excise Station along with the seized alcohol bottles.

Authorities emphasized that such unregulated sales not only violate excise laws but also pose a threat to public safety. The operation reflects the law enforcement's commitment to curb illegal liquor trade, particularly during the sensitive election period. The police have warned that stringent action will be taken against others found violating liquor regulations.

Officials further noted that these preventive measures aim to maintain law and order and ensure a fair election environment. Residents in the inspected areas expressed relief over the action, highlighting the impact of such operations on curbing local illegal trade

HYDRAA Removes Encroachments in Rajendranagar

ber 15 Hyderabad: In a significant move to reclaim public land, the Hyderabad Development Authority (HY-DRA) removed illegal encroachments in Rajendranagar mandal on Wednesday. The operation focused on four parks in Badvel and Upparapalli villages, part of the Janachetanya Layout Phases I and II, which had been illegally occupied. HY-DRA recovered 19,878 square yards of park land from encroachers. The land, estimated to be worth over Rs 139 crore, will now be re-

stored for public use.

Reports indicate that several sheds, rooms, and temporary structures had been built on the parks, with encroachers occupying plots ranging from 500 to 3,000 square yards. HYDRA personnel demolished these unauthorized constructions and cleared the land, while fencing and protective measures are now being implemented to prevent future encroachments.

Local authorities, including revenue and municipal officials, confirmed the encroachments after field inspections and coordinated with HYDRA to

ensure swift action. Residents of the area had previously lodged complaints, emphasizing the loss of public spaces due to illegal occupation.



Inter-State Theft of Sandalwood Trees Foiled in Nalgonda

Nalgonda: Nalgonda police, under the supervision of DSP K. Shivaram Reddy, arrested several inter-state criminals for illegally felling and transporting sandalwood trees cultivated by farmers over multiple years in Nalgonda and Secunderabad outskirts. The arrests were made following complaints regarding thefts in

Kanagal Mandal and surrounding areas. On September 30, 2025, thieves cut ten sandalwood saplings from the Chiluk Vidyasagar orchard and attempted to remove five more. Acting on the complaint, police organized coordinated checks along Nalgonda-Devarakonda highways. On Octo-

ber 15 at 6 a.m., officers intercepted two suspicious motorcycles carrying tools such as rumps, axes, fencing wire cutters, and mobile phones. The suspects—Annabahu Lakshman Gaikwad, Divana Pardi, Dadd Singh, Majan, and Javas—were interrogated and confessed to multiple thefts across six locations over two

months, causing an estimated financial loss of ₹1.66 crore. Investigations revealed that the criminals were guided by a Maharashtra-based mastermind who persuaded them to illegally cut high-demand sandalwood saplings, promising substantial monetary gains. Police have recovered eleven saplings, the motorcycles, cutting tools, and mobile phones used in the crimes. Cases have been registered across several police stations, including Kanagal, Narketpally, Gurrampode, Nalgonda Rural, and Chandur. Nalgonda SP, Sharat Chandra Power IPS, commended the efforts of CI-Chandur K. Adhi Reddy, SIs K. Rajiv Reddy, N. Venkanna, D. Saida Babu, and other

Nitish and Tejashwi: 11 Key Forces That Will Decide Bihar's 2025 Election



As Bihar heads into a high-stakes assembly election, the battle is far from straightforward. While the spotlight often falls on Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and opposition leader Tejashwi Yadav, this election is being shaped by a far more complex web of political forces. Shifting alliances, social welfare dynamics, caste arithmetic, and the emergence of a third front have all made this one of the most unpredictable elections in Bihar's recent history.

Here are the 11 major factors that will ultimately decide who forms the next government in the state.

1. Alliance Chemistry and Internal Friction

The NDA and the Mahagathbandhan (MGB) are both grappling with internal tensions. The NDA, led by BJP and JD(U), has brought in smaller players like the Lok Janshakti Party (LJP) and Rashtriya Lok Morcha (RLM), but these additions haven't come without complications. In 2020, a lack of effective vote transfer between BJP and JD(U) damaged their prospects. This time, the Jan Suraaj Party (JSP) may disrupt intra-alliance vote transfers further.

The MGB faces its own coordination hurdles with new allies like the Vikassheel Insaan Party (VIP) and the Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM), alongside a faction of the LJP. Seat-sharing remains unresolved, and friction is growing with the Congress asserting itself post its Voter Adhikar Yatra success.

Maintaining internal unity and ensuring seamless vote transfers across alliance partners will be key for both sides.

2. Leadership Preferences: Fragmented Loyalties

Tejashwi Yadav leads in Chief Ministerial preference polls, but only marginally. His appeal is mostly limited to the MY (Muslim-Yadav) vote and some segments of youth. Nitish Kumar, though still respected, is facing voter fatigue after nearly two decades in power. Prashant Kishor, once a strategist, now poses a fresh political challenge. Leaders like Chirag Paswan and Samrat Choudhary appeal to specific caste groups.

However, only 15% of voters base their decision on CM faces. A larger share is driven by development, caste, religion, and local issues. This diffused focus makes cohesive leadership appeal even more critical.

3. Pro- and Anti-Incumbency: A Split Verdict

VoteVibe surveys indicate that 48% of voters are antiincumbent, while 32% are pro-incumbent and 14% remain neutral. This near-even split creates a volatile environment where coalition cohesion and voter mobilisation matter more than overarching popularity.

Although discontent exists with Nitish Kumar's government, the opposition is fragmented. If MGB consolidates anti-incumbent sentiment effectively, it has a strong shot. But NDA's last-minute welfare schemes have boosted pro-incumbency sentiment from 18% in July to 34% in September, complicating the narrative.

4. The Welfare Push: Last-Minute Lifeline or Election Gimmick?

The NDA has launched a sop spree, targeting women, youth, farmers, senior citizens, and labourers. Key schemes include:

₹10,000 business grant for women

Unemployment allowance for youth

125 units of free electricity

₹5,000 for daily labourers

Increased pensions for elderly and widows

Despite these efforts, Bihar's per capita income remains one-third of India's average, the same as in 2005. Opposition parties argue that short-term welfare measures can't mask long-term underdevelopment. Whether voters buy into the immediate relief or punish the lack of structural change remains to be seen.

5. Modi vs Rahul: National Leaders in a State Battle

Unlike previous elections, national leaders are playing a significant role. The election is increasingly becoming Modi vs Rahul, rather than Nitish vs Tejashwi.

PM Modi holds a 52% approval rating in Bihar compared to Rahul Gandhi's 41%, per C-Voter. However, Gandhi is gaining ground through his Bharat Jodo Yatra and outreach among Dalits, minorities, and youth. His appeal complements Tejashwi's, creating a potentially powerful combination for the MGB.

Meanwhile, NDA banks heavily on Modi's charisma and welfare narrative, hoping it offsets any local dissatisfaction with Nitish.

6. Women Voters: Bihar's Silent Game Changers



Women account for nearly 50% of Bihar's voters, and in 2020, their turnout exceeded men's in 167 seats. The NDA won 99 of those.




Nitish Kumar has historically focused on female welfare — from bicycle schemes to police quotas and selfhelp groups. The new ₹10,000 Mahila Rozgar Yojana aims to expand this base.

The MGB, meanwhile, is attempting to woo women with a monthly ₹2,500 direct benefit promise. The question is: Will women choose trusted continuity or tempting alternatives?

7. Youth: Angry, Unemployed, and Politically Crucial

With 35% of voters under 35, young voters are a decisive force. They're less swayed by past governance vs. "jungle raj" narratives. Their focus is on jobs, education, and migration.



Tejashwi's promise of "a government job in every home" may sound utopian, but it resonates emotionally. Prashant Kishor appeals to educated and urban youth, especially via digital platforms.

The youth are angry, and their vote is split. Who wins this group could tip dozens of tight races.

8. Caste Dynamics: Still the Heart of Bihar Politics

Caste remains the strongest voting determinant in Bihar. The traditional NDA support base (Upper Castes, Non-Yadav OBCs, EBCs, Mahadalits, and Paswans) adds up to 68%. But their actual 2020 vote share was only 37%, showing leakages and cross-voting.

EBCs (26%) and SCs (20%) are the real swing voters. MGB is trying to counter with Mukesh Sahni (EBC) and Rajesh Ram (SC) as potential Deputy CMs.

The NDA's edge lies in its multi-caste leadership—

from Nitish (Kurmi) to Choudhary (Kushwaha) and Paswan (Dalit). How much caste leaders can pull their community votes remains to be tested.



9. The Dalit Vote: Diverse, Divided, and Decisive

Dalits, especially Paswans and Ravidas, make up 20% of the electorate. The NDA traditionally dominated these votes through Chirag Paswan and Jitan Ram Manjhi. But the Ravidas vote is showing signs of shifting to MGB and Congress, who are highlighting representation gaps and promising social justice.

Prashant Kishor is also trying to attract young, educated Dalits through development-focused messaging rather than caste identity. These shifts could influence up to 40 reserved seats, where 2020 saw NDA win 22 and MGB 18.

10. Muslim Voters: Reliable Yet Restless

Muslims, at 18% of the population, have long been a pillar of MGB support. But this bloc is no longer monolithic. AIMIM's emergence and JSP's appeal among young Muslims threaten to fragment it.

While traditional loyalty to RJD and Congress remains, underrepresentation (only 8% MLAs) has sparked community discontent. AIMIM offers assertive Muslim representation but risks acting as a vote-splitter in tight seats—especially in Seemanchal.

If Muslims consolidate behind MGB, it could sweep Muslim-heavy constituencies. If not, the NDA could benefit again, as it did in 2020.

11. The PK Wildcard: Spoiler or Kingmaker?

card in this election. He has created buzz, especially among urban, youth, and upper-caste voters. His 10% vote share in recent bypolls reduced the MGB's tally from 3 to 0 and handed the NDA key wins.

In over 83 seats with thin victory margins, even a small JSP vote could tilt the balance. Kishor's strategy may be to force a hung assembly, where he can play kingmaker.

The biggest test for JSP is turning social media support into actual votes.

Conclusion: A Battle of Margins, Not Waves

With no clear wave in sight, Bihar 2025 will be an election of wafer-thin margins. A mere 2-3% shift in women's votes, youth mobilisation, caste realignment, or minor party interference could decide the outcome.

More than Nitish or Tejashwi, it is the interplay of these 11 powerful factors—from alliance mechanics to demographic shifts—that will shape Bihar's political destiny in this high-stakes election.

India Needs a Trade Exposure Inflation Index to Tackle Global Price Shocks

India's inflation story is no longer confined to domestic monsoons or policy rate hikes. It now has a global dimension—from Indonesia's palm oil exports to freight costs on Red Sea routes. And yet, India lacks a dedicated tool to measure how much of its inflation is imported.

Despite recent moderation in headline inflation—retail inflation dropped to 3.16% in April 2025 and 1.55% in July—external factors like global commodity prices, rupee depreciation, and shipping disruptions continue to impact household costs. For example, over 85% of India's crude oil is imported, and a 1.2% rupee fall in FY24 raised input costs across sectors.

To address this, experts propose a Trade Exposure Inflation Index (TEII)—a new tool to quantify imported inflation. It would break down consumer prices into three trade-exposed components: imported goods (like electronics), imported inputs (like fertilisers), and exchange rate effects. Initial estimates suggest 40% of India's recent inflation may have come from external sources.

The TEII would not replace the Consumer Price Index (CPI) but act as a complementary lens, much like "core inflation." It could guide smarter policymaking—combining monetary tools with trade, tariff, or stockpile strategies. For instance, during 2022–24, when RBI raised rates by 250 basis points, a TEII might have revealed that much of the inflation was beyond

the central bank's control.

India already has the data infrastructure



needed for TEII—CPI weights (MoSPI), import exposure (DGCI&S), and exchange rate studies (RBI). A joint working group could

launch it within a year.

In a globalised economy, ignoring imported inflation risks misdiagnosing the problem—and us-

ing the wrong tools to fight it. With TEII, India could lead the way in building inflation transparency and smarter economic coordination.

Prashant Kishor Opts Out of Bihar Polls, Sets 150-Seat Target for Jan Suraaj

In a key political move ahead of the Bihar Assembly elections, Jan Suraaj Party founder and political strategist Prashant Kishor announced on Wednesday that he will not contest the upcoming polls, citing organisational priorities and the larger interest of the party.

Speaking to PTI in an exclusive interview, Kishor said the decision was taken collectively by the party. "If I were to contest, it would have distracted me from necessary organisational work," he explained. The party has fielded another candidate from Raghopur, where Kishor was expected to challenge RJD leader Tejashwi

Kishor, widely known for crafting several high-profile election campaigns—including PM Modi's 2014 victory—declared that anything less than 150 seats in the polls would be a personal defeat. "If we do well, we will have the mandate to transform Bihar.

If we don't, it means people haven't shown enough confidence in us," he said. "There will be no middle ground—either under 10 seats or more than 150.'

Kishor also ruled out the possibility of supporting either NDA or the IN-DIA bloc in case of a hung assembly, stating that he does not foresee a fractured mandate.

Reacting to his announcement, RJD spokesperson Mrityunjay Tiwary claimed Kishor has already accepted defeat. "He knows his party will be humiliated and has stepped back before the battle began," Tiwary said.

Bihar goes to polls in two phases on November 6 and 11, with results to be declared on November 14. Kishor predicted a defeat for the ruling NDA, pointing to its struggle in finalising candidates and seat-sharing arrangements.

The elections will serve as a crucial test for Kishor's political debut on the

The police termed this a major success in their continued efforts to weaken Maoist influence in south Chhattisgarh, particularly in the Sukma and Bastar regions which have long been hotbeds of Naxalite activity. Officials attribute the surrender to sustained pressure from security forces, along with intensified community outreach programs aimed at encouraging militants to rejoin mainstream society.

The surrendered Maoists were reportedly influenced by state rehabilitation policies, which offer financial support, employment assistance, and protection for those willing to give up arms and cooperate with authorities. Over recent months, the Chhattisgarh government has ramped up its efforts to create awareness about these schemes in remote tribal areas.



Photographs released by the police show the surrendered Maoists standing alongside security personnel, symbolizing a step forward in restoring peace in the region. The district administration is expected to begin the process of verifying their involvement and enrolling them in the state's surrender and rehabilitation program.

With this latest surrender, the state hopes to send a strong message to remaining insurgents, offering them a chance to return to a life of dignity while reinforcing its commitment to peace and development in conflict-affected zones.

Bihar Assembly Polls: JD(U) Releases First List of 57 Candidates

CM Nitish to Begin Campaign Oct 16

Patna: The Janata Dal (United) [JD(U)] on Wednesday released its first list of 57 candidates for the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections, with Chief Minister Nitish Kumar set to launch his campaign on October 16 from Samastipur district. The move comes amid ongoing seat-sharing discussions and confusion within both the ruling NDA and the Opposition's Mahagathbandhan.

The JD(U)'s candidate list reflects a mix of sitting MLAs, new faces, and loyal party workers, with sources indicating a focus on caste balance and winnability. The party is expected to release its second and final list of candidates by October 17.

Nitish Kumar, who is seeking another term as Chief Minister, will begin his campaign with a rally in Samastipur on Thursday. According to party insiders, he will focus on JD(U)'s development agenda, social

track record to connect with voters.

Significantly, poll strategist-turned-politician Prashant Kishor, who had previously been speculated to enter the electoral fray, will not contest the elections. His name was absent from the first list, and party sources confirmed he will play no direct role in the campaign.

With both the NDA and Mahagathbandhan still ironing out seat-sharing formulas, JD(U)'s early candidate announcement is seen as a strategic move to assert leadership within the alliance and gain early momentum.

The Election Commission is yet to officially announce the full schedule, but the polls are expected to be held in multiple phases across late October and November.

As political temperatures rise in Bihar, all eyes are now on Nitish Kumar's first campaign rally, which is expected to set the tone for the welfare schemes, and law-and-order JD(U)'s electoral messaging.

'Vijay Arrived 7 Hours Late...' MK Stalin Slams TVK Boss Over Karur Stampede

Tamil Nadu Chief Minister MK Stalin on Wednesday held actor-turned-politician Vijay and his party, Tamilaga Vettri Kazhagam (TVK), responsible for the tragic Karur stampede that claimed 41 lives on September 27. The CM made the remarks during a heated session in the state Assembly, pointing to "gross mismanagement" by the TVK.

Stalin said the police were informed that the event would begin at 3 pm and last five hours. However, TVK later told authorities that Vijay would arrive by noon, requiring changes to the security plan. Ultimately, Vijay arrived seven hours late, causing a massive crowd surge. "This was a key reason behind the stampede," Stalin said.

He also slammed the organisers for failing to provide basic amenities such as drinking water and toilets, particularly for women. The Chief Minister further revealed that two ambulance drivers were attacked by TVK workers, and emergency vehicles were vandalised while trying to help the injured.

In response to TVK's claim that the state cut power to the venue, Stalin clarified that the generator was shut off to prevent further mishaps during the chaos.

The stampede occurred as thousands waited for Vijay to appear. The crowd swelled to over 25,000, far exceeding the expected 10,000. The police had prepared for 20,000 people but were overwhelmed as barricades collapsed.

The Supreme Court has ordered a CBI probe into the incident, a move welcomed



by TVK. The investigation will be led by a three-member panel headed by former SC judge Justice Ajay Rastogi.

So far, two TVK functionaries have been arrested, and cases have been filed against

India Growing Force On World Stage: UK PM Keir Starmer After Mumbai visit



British Prime Minister Keir Starmer updated the House of Commons on Tuesday about his successful two-day visit to Mumbai last week, leading the largest UK trade delegation ever to India. The deal is expected to expand bilateral trade beyond the current £44 billion

annually. "India is a growing force on the world stage, projected to become the third largest economy by 2028, Starmer said. He highlighted the "living bridge" of family, history, and shared future opportunities that unite both nations.

Leading a delegation of 127 business leaders, entrepreneurs, and university heads, Starmer pledged to further open doors for British businesses in India, with the ambitious Free Trade Agreement set to make trade quicker, cheaper, and easier for both Prime Minister, Starm- nations.

Trump Labels BRICS an 'Attack' on U.S. Dollar, **Threatens Tariffs**

U.S. President Donald Trump has described the BRICS grouping as an "attack" on the U.S. dollar, asserting that his threats of tariffs forced nations to reconsider joining the bloc. Trump claimed that after he warned countries against aligning with BRICS, "everybody dropped out," underscoring his tough stance on what he calls the group's "anti-American" policies.

BRICS is an influential international coalition comprising Brazil, Russia, India, China, South Africa, and recently expanded to include Egypt, Ethiopia, Indonesia, Iran, and the United Arab Emirates. The bloc is seen as a counterbalance to Western economic dominance and has been exploring ways to reduce reliance on the U.S. dollar in global trade and finance.

Trump has frequently criticized BRICS, suggesting that its efforts to challenge U.S. economic supremacy threaten American interests. During his tenure, he repeatedly warned member countries of potential tariff increases and other trade restrictions in response to policies he deemed unfair or hostile to the United States.

'Their actions are a direct attack on the U.S. dollar and American economic leadership," Trump said in recent comments. He reiterated that his hardline approach was aimed at protecting U.S. jobs and industries from what he de-

scribed as "anti-American" economic moves by the BRICS nations.

The BRICS bloc has been pursuing initiatives to strengthen economic cooperation among member countries, including discussions on creating alternative payment systems and expanding trade in local currencies to reduce dependence on the dollar.

Trump's remarks highlight ongoing tensions between the United States and emerging global powers seeking to re-

shape international economic structures. While his approach has been controversial, it reflects broader concerns in Washington about maintaining America's economic influence in an evolving multipolar world.



India Drops to 85th in Henley Passport Index 2025; Singapore Tops

The latest Henley Passport Index 2025 has ranked the Indian passport at 85th position globally, offering visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to only 57 countries. This marks a decline for India in the annual ranking, reflecting growing challenges for Indian travelers amid changing global visa policies.

The Henley Passport Index, compiled by global citizenship advisory firm Henley & Partners, measures the strength of passports based on the number of destinations their holders can access without a prior visa. The index is widely regarded as an indicator of a country's global mobility and diplomatic reach.

Topping the list this year is Singapore, whose passport grants visa-free access to 194 countries, making it the most powerful passport in the world. Japan and Germany closely follow, with access to 193 destinations each.

Other top-ranking passports include South Korea (192), Finland and Italy (190), and Luxembourg (189). These countries benefit from strong diplomatic ties and open travel agreements

India's drop to 85th place contrasts sharply with regional neighbors like the United Arab Emirates and Qatar, which have steadily climbed the rankings in



recent years due to aggressive diplomatic and economic outreach.

The decline highlights the need for India to enhance bilateral relations and negotiate better travel arrangements to improve the global mobility of its citizens. Visa restrictions not only affect personal travel but can also impact business, education, and cultural

As global travel dynamics continue to evolve. India faces the challenge of boosting its passport's standing to keep pace with other emerging economies.

Deadly Cross-Border Clashes Erupt Between Afghan Taliban and Pakistan

Dozens of people have been killed and many more injured in the deadliest exchange of gunfire in years between Afghan Taliban forces and Pakistan's military along their shared border. The latest clashes, which took place early Wednesday, mark the second violent confrontation this week, escalating tensions between Islamabad and Kabul and raising fears of a broader regional conflict.

The fighting centered around Pakistan's Chaman district and Afghanistan's Spin Boldak district, a key border area in Kandahar province. Reports indicate that the Afghan Taliban forces destroyed a Pakistani border outpost and captured a tank used by Pakistani forces to target Taliban positions.

Both sides blamed each other for initiating the violence. Afghanistan claimed its forces killed 58 Pakistani soldiers during the overnight operations. In contrast, Pakistan asserted it had killed over 200 Afghan fighters while losing 23 soldiers.

Taliban spokesperson Zabihullah Mujahid shared details of the clashes on X (formerly Twitter), stating that Pakistani forces launched an early morning attack on Spin Boldak using light and heavy weapons. Mujahid said that this strike killed at least 12 civilians and injured

Responding to the attack, Afghan forces reportedly retaliated strongly, killing numerous Pakistani soldiers, seizing weapons and tanks, and destroying Pakistani military installations in the area. Muja-



hid emphasized the readiness of the Afghan fighters to defend their homeland and people against what they described as 'aggressor soldiers.'

The violence comes amid growing hos-

tility between the two neighboring countries and threatens to destabilize the already volatile region. Officials from both sides have yet to agree on a ceasefire, raising concerns of continued clashes in the

border region.

India's September Trade Deficit Hits 13-Month High of \$32.15 Billion

India's trade deficit surged to a 13-month high of \$32.15 billion in September 2025, driven by a sharp rise in imports compared to exports, official data revealed on October 15. The deficit widened from \$26.5 billion recorded in September last year, reflecting growing demand for foreign goods amid economic recovery and inflationary pressures.

Exports grew by 6.7% year-on-year to reach \$36.38 billion in September, showing steady improvement supported by strong global demand for Indian products such as pharmaceuticals, engineering goods, and textiles. However, imports climbed at a faster pace of 16.6% annually, reaching \$68.53 billion. This surge was primarily due to higher crude oil prices, increased purchases of electronic goods, and rising demand for raw materials and machinery.

The widening trade gap underscores the challenges India faces in managing its external balance, especially with volatile global commodity prices and geopolitical uncertainties impacting supply chains. Energy imports remain a significant contributor to the import bill, with crude oil and petroleum products accounting for a major share.

Economists suggest that while export growth is encouraging, the faster rise in imports is a cause for concern as it puts pressure on the country's current ac-



count deficit and foreign exchange reserves. The government has been focusing on boosting manufacturing and export competitiveness through initiatives like 'Make in India' and expanding free trade agreements to curb the trade imbalance.

Despite the trade deficit increase, India's overall trade volumes continue to recover from the pandemic-induced slump, signaling resilience in the economy. Policymakers will likely monitor these trends closely to balance

Gold Hits Record ₹1.27 Lakh Per 10 Grams on Fed Rate Cut Hopes



New Delhi:

Gold prices soared to an all-time high of ₹1,27,500 per 10 grams in domestic futures trade on Wednesday, as global investors rushed to safe-haven assets amid heightened geopolitical tensions and expectations of U.S. Fed-

eral Reserve rate cuts. On the Multi Commodity Exchange (MCX), December gold futures rose ₹1,244 or 0.98% to touch the new record. The February 2026 contract also surged by ₹943 to ₹1,28,435 per 10 grams. The rally was mirrored in the global markets, where Comex gold futures jumped nearly 2% to hit a record USD 4,211 per ounce.

Analysts attributed the sharp rise to increased safe-haven demand following renewed concerns over U.S.-China trade tensions and signs of a slowing U.S. economy. Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell recently hinted at the possibility of two rate cuts this year, saying a slowdown in hiring poses a significant risk to economic

"Gold prices climbed to USD 4,200 per ounce and extended their bullish run as investors sought safety and ramped up bets on additional monetary easing," said Jigar Trivedi, Senior Research Analyst at Reliance Securities.

The latest spike was also fuelled by U.S. President Donald Trump's accusations of "economically hostile" behavior by China, following Beijing's decision to halt soybean imports and impose sanctions on U.S.-linked firms. Trump warned of potential retaliatory measures, including a cooking oil embargo.

Silver prices followed suit, with MCX silver futures for December delivery rising ₹1,256 to ₹1,60,760 per kg. Global Comex silver touched USD 51.27 per ounce, inching closer to its Tuesday record of USD

Despite an optimistic global growth outlook from the IMF, the ongoing trade and geopolitical frictions continue to support gold and silver's bullish momentum.

Sensex, Nifty Open Higher Tracking Asian Market Rally

Indian stock markets opened on a positive note on Wednesday, buoyed by strong cues from Asian peers and rising hopes of an interest rate cut by the U.S. Federal Reserve later this month.

The 30-share BSE Sensex surged 354.57 points to 82,384.55 in early trade, while the NSE Nifty gained 109.55 points to reach 25,255.05. The rally comes a day after both indices ended in the red amid global uncertainty.

Gains in early trade were led by key Sensex constituents such as Asian Paints, NTPC, Bajaj Finance, Bharat Electronics, Bajaj Finserv, and Power Grid. On the other hand, Tech Mahindra, Axis Bank, Infosys, and Titan saw some profit booking and traded in the

The upbeat sentiment on Dalal Street mirrored broader gains across Asian markets, where indices such as South Korea's Kospi, Japan's Nikkei 225, Shanghai's SSE Composite, and Hong Kong's Hang Seng were trading higher. Investors appeared optimistic after Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell signaled the possibility of two rate cuts this year, citing concerns over a sharp slowdown in U.S. hiring and its potential impact on economic growth.

"Fed Chair Jerome Powell's comments have increased market expectations of policy easing, which is supportive for risk assets globally," said Jigar Trivedi, Senior Research Analyst at Reliance

Meanwhile, Brent crude prices dipped 0.19% to USD 62.27 per barrel, providing some relief for oil-importing countries like India.

On the institutional front, Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth ₹1,508.53 crore on Tuesday, while Domestic Institutional Investors (DIIs) remained net buyers, purchasing stocks worth ₹3,661.13 crore.

WhatsApp Tests Status Update Notifications for Selected Contacts

WhatsApp is reportedly testing a new feature on Android that lets users receive notifications when specific contacts post new status updates. This upcoming functionality aims to give users more control over whose updates they want to follow closely, enhancing the overall experience of staying connected.

Currently available in WhatsApp beta version

feature allows users to activate alerts directly from the status update screen. To enable it, users open a contact's status, tap the overflow menu, and select "Get notifications." After confirming, they will receive real-time alerts whenever that contact shares a new status. Notifications can also be muted at any time through the same menu.

When a chosen contact posts a status update, WhatsApp sends a notification showing the contact's name and, if the update includes an image or video, a small preview is displayed. This helps users quickly see important updates without needing to open the app, improving convenience and engagement.

The feature is being rolled out gradually to beta users, allowing WhatsApp to monitor its from selected contacts, performance and ensure stability before a wider release. Importantly, the contacts for whom notifications are enabled are not informed, allowing users to discreetly follow key updates without alerting others.

This new functionality fits into WhatsApp's ongoing efforts to provide a more personalised and user-friendly experience. By prioritising updates

users can better manage notifications and focus on the posts that matter most to them, avoiding distractions from less important status updates.

The feature is expected to roll out to a broader audience soon, with further enhancements likely as WhatsApp continues to refine its status update features across devices.







Norway Chess Launches Total Chess World Championship Tour



The organisers of Norway Chess have announced the launch of the Total Chess World Championship Tour, a groundbreaking new series that will crown a combined champion across three chess disciplines: Fast Classic, Rapid, and Blitz. The tour is set to begin in 2027 following a long-term agreement signed with the International Chess

Federation (FIDE). Norway Chess CEO Kjell Madland revealed that the tournament will be an annual event featuring four tournaments each year held in various global cities. The prize pool will total a minimum of USD 2.7 million annually, with USD 750,000 allocated for each of the first three events and USD 450,000 for the finals, alongside performance bonuses.

Madland said, "We expect the Total Chess World Championship Tour to become one of the most prestigious events in the chess calendar." The tour will complement the traditional World Chess Championship, which focuses on classical chess, as both formats have been officially approved by FIDE.

A key innovation is the inclusion of Fast Classic chess, a faster format of classical chess with time controls as short as 45 minutes, alongside Rapid and Blitz formats. The combined results across these three disciplines will determine the overall FIDE World Combined Champion.

The agreement between Norway Chess and FIDE was signed in early October 2025. A pilot

tournament is planned for the fall of 2026 to test the format before the first full season kicks off

This new championship tour aims to identify the most versatile and well-rounded player capable of mastering different chess formats, marking a significant development in the sport's competitive landscape.



The 40-yearold forward netted his 40th and 41st goals in World Cup qualifiers, breaking the previous record held by former Guatemala striker Carlos Ruiz.

His brace took his tally to 41 goals in 51 qualifying appearances, a remarkable achievement that sets him well ahead of other greats in the competition. Lionel Messi, for comparison, has scored 36 goals in 72 World Cup qualifiers for Argentina, placing him third on the alltime list.

The Al-Nassr striker also holds other major international records, including most international goals (143) and most appearances for a men's national team (over 215). Ronaldo's latest feat cements his status as one of football's greatest goal

Despite Ronaldo's heroics, Portugal could only manage a 2-2 draw as Hungary equalized in stoppage time through Dominik Szoboszlai. Portugal coach Roberto Martinez admitted the team failed to manage the final minutes effectively, costing them a crucial win.

Portugal leads Group F with 10 points, five ahead of Hungary, keeping their qualification hopes for the 2026 World Cup alive with t w o games remaining.

After the match, Ronaldo expressed optimism on X (formerly Twitter), saying, "We are getting closer to our goal! Let's go, Portugal."

The draw, while disappointing, highlights Ronaldo's continuing influence on the international stage as he pursues even more milestones late into his storied career.

Lahore: Pakistan secured a thrilling 93-run victory over World Test Champions South Africa in the first Test at Gaddafi Stadium on Wednesday, thanks to exceptional performances by left-arm spinner Noman Ali and pacer Shaheen Shah Afridi.

Chasing a challenging target 277 on a deteriorating pitch that offered sharp turn and variable bounce, South Africa was bowled out for 183 on day four. Noman Ali was the standout bowler, taking 4 wickets for 79 runs in the second innings and finishing with match figures of 10-191, marking his third tenwicket haul in Tests. The 39-year-old exploited the spinning track expertly despite a resilient 73-run partnership between Dewald Brevis and Ryan Rickelton in the morning



Brevis, who scored an aggressive 54 with six fours and two sixes, was eventually trapped by

Noman's turning delivery. Rickelton's stubborn 45 was ended by Sajid Khan just before lunch.
